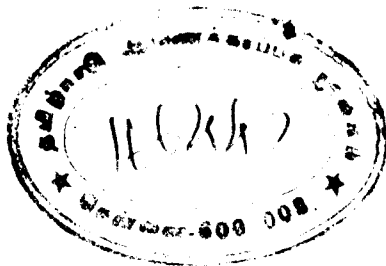
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PREFACE

The title 'Supplement' speaks for itself. The purpose of this volume therefore is to supplement the statistical data contained in the parent volume.

Sagar Gazetteer was published in 1967. In pursuance of a decision of the Government of India in 1976 that all ten year old volumes of District Gazetteers must have their supplements giving up-to-date statistical data, our Department in Madhya Pradesh started preparing supplements of Gwalior, Sagar and Jabalpur during the tenure of former Director, Shri A. M. Sinha. The work had to be discontinued for some time owing to unavoidable reasons.

The compilation and updating work was restarted during the tenure of former Director, Shri S. D. Guru, but continued to remain under pruning, verification and revision even during the period of one of my immediate predecessors Shri P. K. Bhatnagar. One practical difficulty we had had to face was the non-availability of figures in the desired framework as some of them were either already eliminated by the concerned departments or their formats changed. It was at last sent to the Press in February, 1991. And during the intervening period Sagar not only became a Commissioner's headquarters in 1972 but got two more tahsils added to it, namely, Garhakota the sixth in July, 1987 and Bina the seventh in November, 1989.

Besides two of my predecessors mentioned above, the officers who laboured to bring this volume out include Shri M.P. Dubey, former Director, Shri S. M. Rastogi, former Deputy Director, Dr N.P. Pandey, Joint Director, Sarvashri Vijay Jain, Dr K.S. Sharma, A.M. Sharma, Nawal Kishore, S.C. Chaturvedi (all Deputy Directors), and Dr Suresh Tiwari, S.S.C. Kerketta, Dr Prabir Kumar Jha, Smt. Vandana Pandey and H.R. Ahirwar (all Assistant Directors). Dr Prabir Kumar Jha supervised the printing under the guidance of Dr N.P. Pandey. I am thankful to all of them for their valuable assistance.

I am also thankful to the Collector, and other officers of the District administration, Sagar, for making available all statistical data needed for this supplement and to the Deputy Controller, Government Central Press, Bhopal for completing the printing work early.

It is hoped that this volume will be of great use to all those who desire to refer to the District Gazetteer of Sagar.

CHRONOLOGY (CALENDAR) OF IMPORTANT HISTORICAL EVENTS

Year (A. D.)	Historical Event
1	2
510-11	A memorable battle was fought at Eran during the reign of the Gupta emperor, Bhanugupta.
1182(about)	The Chahamana ruler Prithviraja III defeated Paramardi grandson of Madanvarman, the Lord of Mahoba, and over-ran Jejakabhukti, Mandla.
1202	Battle of Kalinjar. Paramardi was assassinated by his minister on account of Parmardi's ignominious alliance with Qutb-ud-din Aibak.
1548	As the son of Dalpat Shah, Bir Narayan was about 3 or 5 Years of age, dowager queen Durgavati assumed the reins of Government.
1564	Asaf Khan (the Mughal Governor at Kara-Manikpur, invaded the kingdom of Durgavati. After being wounded, she preferred a heroic death by stabbing herself.
1634	After the treacherous assassination of Gond Raja Prema Narayan, Fort of Chauragarh was seized by Jhujhar Singh.
1688-1696	Chhatrasal captured Dhamoni. In the course of his conquest of this region Chhatrasal defeated many Muslim Commanders.
1728	Mohammad Khan Bangash invaded Jaitpur near Mahoba, and captured it.
4 Dec. 1731	Chhatrasal expired.
1780	The Region was brought under the direct control of Saugor dynasty.
1799	Pindari leader Amir Khan, plundered Sagar.
1818	On the deposition of Peshwa, the tract of Saugor and Damoh were ceded to the British.
10 March 1818	British issued a proclamation assuring security and safety of the people of Sagar.

11 March 1818	Vinayak Rao, the agent of the Marathas surrendered the fort of Sagar to the British.
1842	Two Bundela Thakurs of Sagar, Jawahir Singh of Chandrapur, and Madhukar Shah and Ganeshju of Nerhut attacked the police against the decree which led to Bundela Rising against the British.
1857	The Great Upsurge. By July 1857 the entire district passed into the hands of the 'rebels'.
15 Sept. 1857	Mardan Singh, the Raja of Garhakota, repulsed a force commanded by Lt. Col. Dalryell.
2nd Nov. 1861	Central Provinces was formed and Saugor-Nerbudda Territories formed a part of it.
1874	Hitakarini Sabha (Hita Sabha) was formed in Sagar, which created national awakening among the masses.
1877-1900	Famines in Sagar District in 1877, 1892, 1897, 1898-99 and 1900.
1907	Asvini Kumar Datta, a terrorist leader, visited Sagar.
May, 1907	Dada Shab Khaparde and Dr. Moonje visited the District and a branch of the extremist wing of the Congress (associated with Lokmanya Tilak) was established at Sagar.
1916	A branch of Home Rule League of Annie Besant, was established at Sagar.
1920	Ratauna Slaughter house movement. It achieved success when the Provincial Government was forced to order the closure of the Slaughter House.
27 Nov. 1921	Newly formed C. P. Provincial Congress Committee met at Sagar under the Presidentship of Dr. Raghavendra Rao and Satyagraha was launched.
1921	Branches of Hindu Sabha and Gandhi Seva Sangha were started at Sagar.
10th April 1923	The Sagar Municipal Committee passed a resolution supporting the Flag Satyagraha initiated by the members of Jabalpur Municipal Committee. A batch of Satyagrahis was sent to Nagpur from Sagar.
1925	The Tanzim Committee, a Muslim Organisation of considerable political influence, was founded at Sagar.

1926	(i) <i>Kisan Sabha</i> was formed (ii) Lala Lajpat Rai visited Sagar in connection with his extensive tour of the area.
1930	During the Civil Disobedience Movement, Sagar District was also infiltrated by the activities of the Hindustan Socialist Republican Army.
1931	The Mahakoshal Political Conference, The Mahakoshal Women's Conference and The Mahakoshal Navajavan Bharat Sabha were held at Sagar. Nasir-ul-Islam , new Muslim organisation, was founded in the same year.
June, 1932	In the context of failure of the Round Table Conference the Sagar District Political Conference was held to chalk out the future course of action.
1934	Mahatma Gandhi visited Deori, Anantapura, Garhakota and Sagar.
1935	The newly formed Congress Socialist Party established a branch in Sagar District and gave a new direction to the political life in the District.
9th Aug. 1942	Consequent upon the passing of "Quit India" resolution on the 8th August, the Political situation worsened rapidly in Sagar. On 24th August police opened fire at Garhakota.
1946	The University of Sagar was established.
30th October 1952	Pt. Jawaharlal Nehru delivered the Convocation Address in the University of Saugar.
Oct. 1956	Formation of Damoh District by separating the Damoh Sub-division, which formed part of Sagar District since 1932.
1st Nov. 1956	The District formed part of the re-organised State of Madhya Pradesh.
1960-65	Remains of a township of 2150 B. C. were excavated at Eran. Seals of Indra Gupta 300 B. C., T. C. coin moulds and sealings of Saka rulers and copper coins of Ramagupta were unearthed.
1960-61	Rock shelters of Abchand (near Garhakota) were discovered. Rock paintings, ranging from the Mesolithic period to the historical period were discovered.
1970	Medieval temples at Bina, Barha, Kanamarh and Balcha discovered.
1976-1982	Painted rock shelters at Naryaoli, Khanpur, Bhopal and Barodia were discovered.
1985-1988	Excavations at Eran. Remains of Neolithic settlements, Kayatha culture besides the well known Chalcolithic cultures unearthed
