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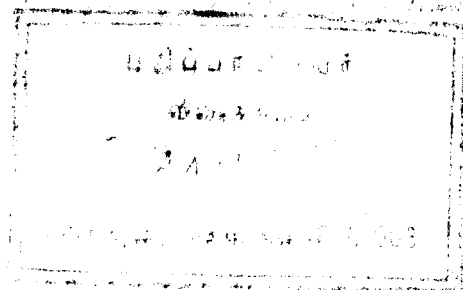

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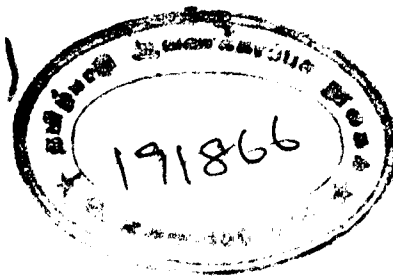
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PREFACE

The Government of India had decided to bring out Supplement for all ten year old District Gazetteers in 1976, so that they can provide latest statistical information relating to subjects discussed in their parent volumes. Accordingly Directorate of Gazetteers has published five Supplements so far. West Nimar is sixth in the series.

The District Gazetteers of West Nimar was published in 1970. There has been considerable development in the District over the past twenty four years. In the meantime five new tahsils i. e. Segaoon, Pansemal, Jhiranya, Thikri and Bhagwanpura were also created. In the collection of statistical figures in many cases we had to be satisfied with figures relating to select years only since some departments have eliminated old records after a certain period. The work was started during the tenure of former Director Shri K. R. R. C. Nair in 1992-93. In the preparation of this Supplement the Officers who contributed include Sarvashri V. K. Jain, A. M. 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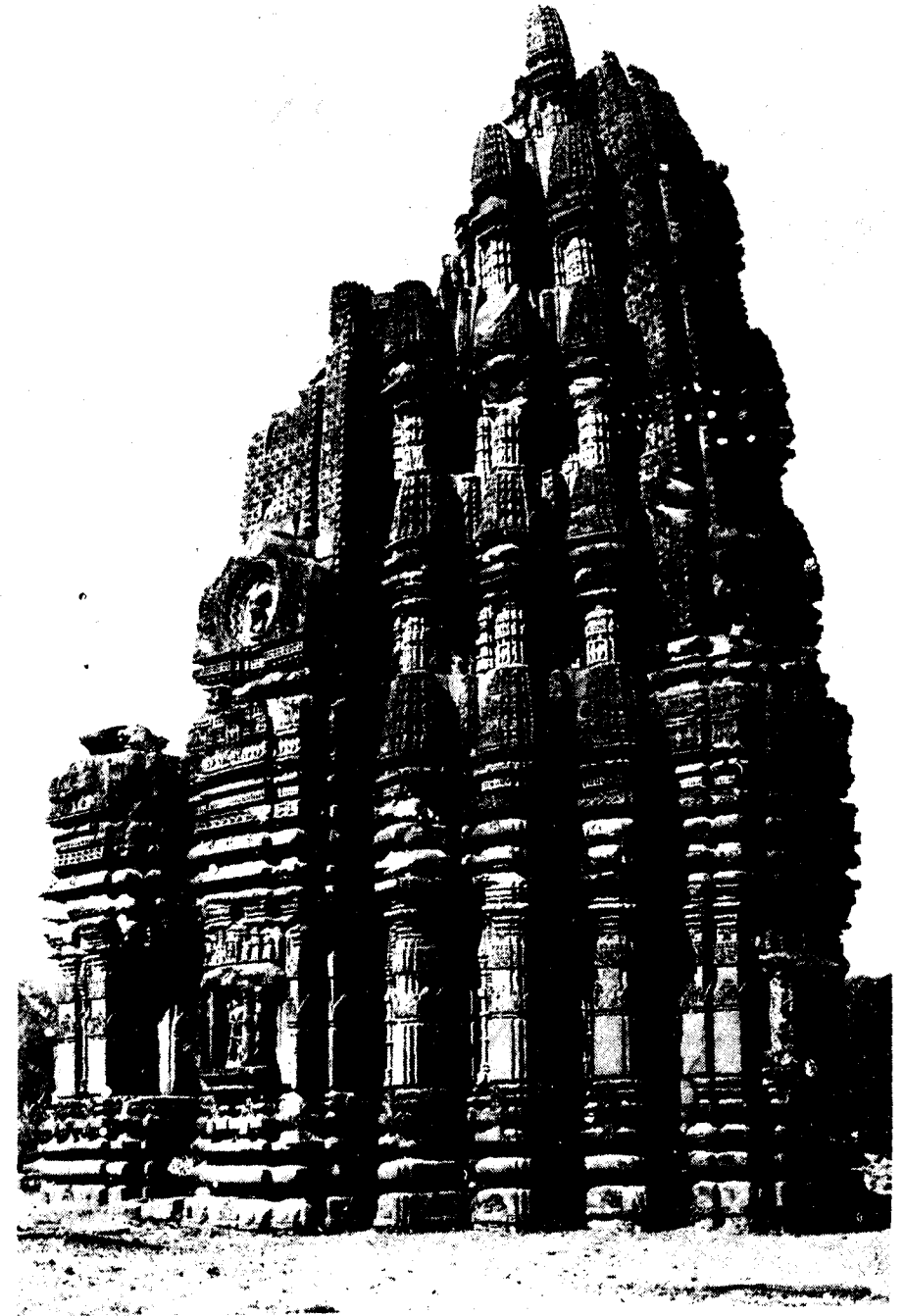

ARCHAEOLOGICAL EXCAVATIONS

Some recent surveys and excavations conducted by the State Archaeology Department have contributed towards the enrichment of historical and cultural traditions of the area that existed since pre or proto-historical period. In such surveys stone-implements of middle stone-age (mesolithic) have been found from village Mangawa. Similarly, other archaeological remains such as fossilized implements and clay wares, etc, related to chalcolithic civilization have also been recovered in Pitalnagar, Maheshwar, Navdatoli, Brahmangaon, Pichhori and Pipari villages.

In the Survey of Choli village implements like flakes, blades, scrapers and cores were found, while from Ravedkhedi cleavers and scrapers were recovered. The villages of Kirmohi, Sankot- Pipli, Bhilkhedi, Chota-vara, Bhakiya and Ghatpadya yielded more archaeological evidence in the shape of clay wares.

The historical remains, of Paramara era sculptures have been found or unearthed from the villages of Dev-Pipaliya, Pipaliya, Vandera, Rangaon road, Umedada, Bediya, Gogaon Samraj, Choli, Bijagarh, Nagadi, Dehri Phalian and others. In these sculptures Gods like, Ganesh, Vishnu, Bhairav, Har Gauri, Mahishasur-Mardini, Sapt-Matrikayen, UmaMaheshwar, Chamunda and Dikpals are included. The finding of these numerous sculptures of different Gods and Goddesses shows the prevalence of almost all the major hindu forms of worship viz., *Vaishnava*, *Shakt* and *Shaiva*.

Further, Umedada, and Choli villages have yielded some Jain sculptures also related to the Paramara period. As to the later period, the survey showed signs of change in the architectural pattern of these finds (after the 13th Century) as Indian kingdoms started falling and submitting to foreign invasions. Thus, the remains of Chimareshwar, Chandeshwar and Kaleshwar temples and an old palace found near the village Belsar appear, from their architecture, the 15th-16th Century.

Another important period from the architectural point of view in the history of West Nimar is that of 17th-18th Century when the Maratha influence was on the rise. However, both the temples and mosques, etc., constructed during the period, are found in the area. In the villages of Maratha-Bakkhan, Nawa-khan and Bampur are located the shrines of saints and tombes of the 18th Century. Similarly, in Khargone, the 18th century Ganesh besides, the Nava-grahas which all belong to the 17th Century Parmara period, apparently devote its being a renovation work on the site of some old Parmara temple. In Dev-Pipaliya also, the Dev-Narayana temple (16th-17th Century) contains the Nandi and *Jilheri* belonging to 13th-14th Century A. D. In Khargone, the Jama Masjid (mosque) of Banedi, the mosque of Falani and the mosque of Kalali *Mohalla* (ward) and in Kasrawad, present the proof of Moghul influence in the area.

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The 17th Century temples have been found in the villages of Adajpur, Brahmanaon, Bhikkhedi and Chhotavara while Dantewada and Khegaon have 15th Century Shiva temples. Similarly, many Shiva idols from Mandwara (13th-14th Century A. D.) and temples (16th Century) at Kasrawad, Lobada and Mohipura have been found. The village Vishwanatha-Kheda has an 18th Century Shiva temple.

In the tahsil of Maheshwar the Samadhi of Peshwa Bajirao of Raverkhedi, an important 18th Century monument is located and protected by the Archaeological Survey of India.

ATOOT KHAS EXCAVATION 1984-85

The village Atoot-Khas lies on the banks of Chhoti-Kaveri, a tributary of Narmada. The Survey conducted by the Indian Archaeological Survey and the State Archaeology department, testifies to the ancient cultural heritage of this place. The archaeological finds and clay wares recovered link the history of the place with the mesolithic era i. e. the middle-stone-age.

The literary sources (such as Narmada Purana) too indicate that the area had come into prominence right since the later Vedic period. Very near to this place is situated the famous Omkareshwar Mandhata with its Jyotir Linga, referred to in the scriptures as one of the twelve such lingas in the country. Historically speaking, many of its monuments also indicate Mauryan architecture.

Thus, with a view to explore the possibilities of findings further evidence of the areas rich cultural heritage, Atoot Khas excavation was taken in hand by the State Archaeology department, in 1984-85. The excavation has yielded various archaeological remains and clay wares pertaining to medieval-Maratha, Paramara and the Maurya periods.

In the lower levels, clear proofs of the chalcolithic civilization have been found which included three black painted and grey wares, terracota-bull, ornaments and bangles, etc, and implements of the chalcolithic period. The nearby hill also has the remains of fortifications and rampart indicating the historical links of the area. This excavation has been conducted on private land lying south-east of the village and containing the above referred hill. In fact, though not all of the expectations from this excavation could fructify as two-thirds of this hill covered by the village was destroyed, yet enough has been found to underline the importance of this area.

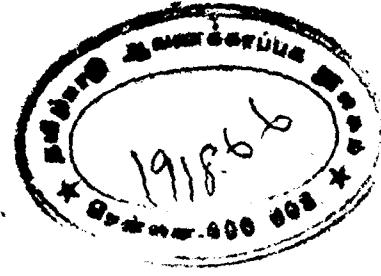

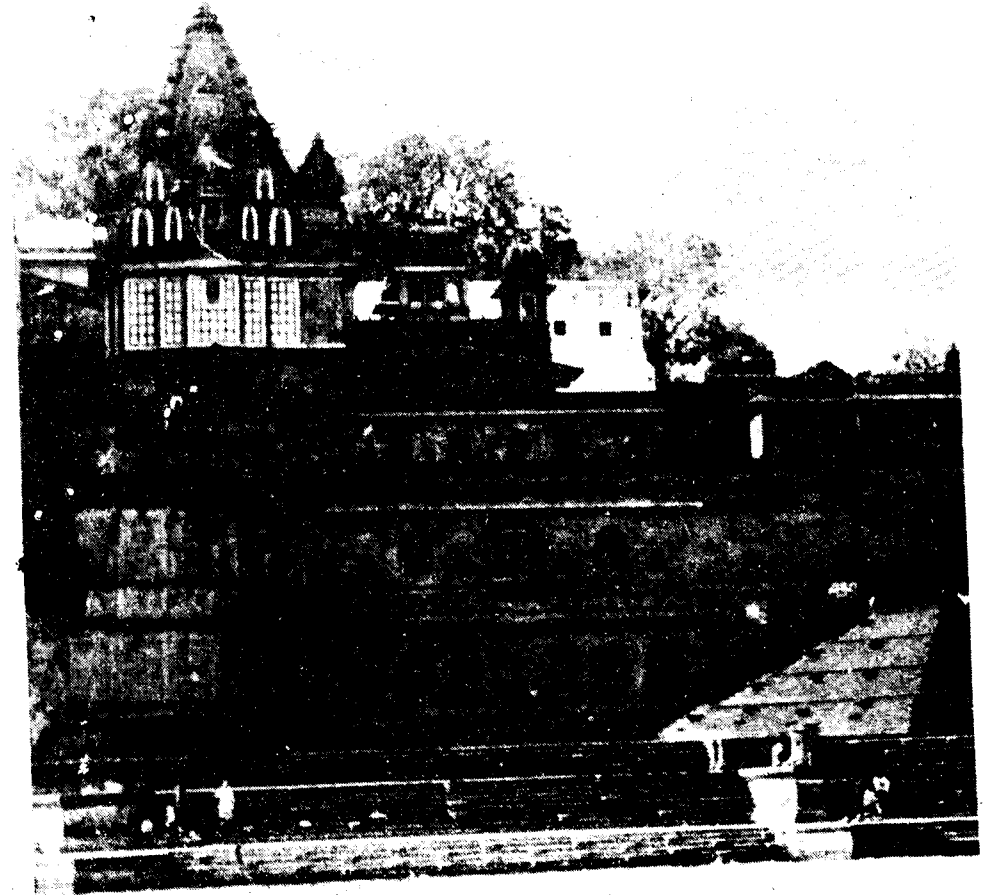
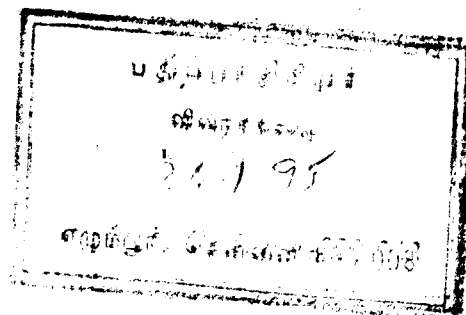

NARMADA VALLEY DEVELOPMENT PROJECT

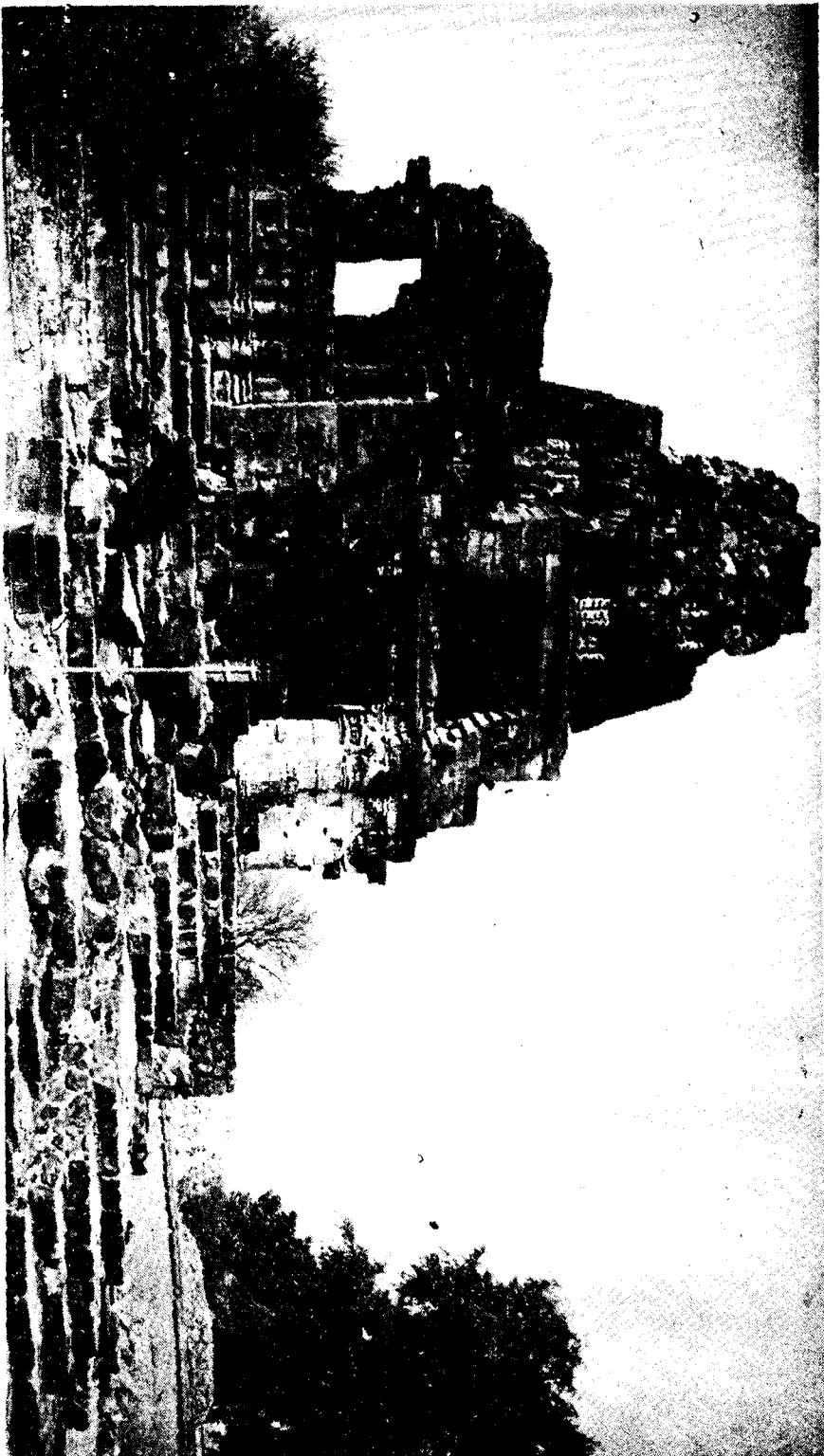
Madhya Pradesh has received boundless gifts from mother nature. This State is knocking at the door-step of progress for prospective investors not merely for itself but for the general well being of mankind. The aim is to harness these resources to accelerate the wheel of progress in a judicious manner so that the state may acquire the capability to meet the growing requirements of irrigation and power. The river Narmada flows through the West Nimar District in Barwaha, Maheshwar and Kasrawad Tahsils for about 72 km. and then for about 121 km. along the district boundary in the north. With the creation of Narmada Valley Development Authority, the vast potentialities of the river in respect of irrigation and power in the area has been opened.

For the proper utilization of water allotted to Madhya Pradesh in all 29 Major, 135 Medium and 3,000 Small Irrigation Projects have been prepared. Our State will also get the share of 57% generated power from Sardar Sarovar Project which is being constructed near Kevadia in Gujarat. Under Narmada Sagar Project a Major Maheshwar Project has been taken in hand in West Nimar District. The estimated cost of the Maheshwar Project will be Rs. 736 Crores and 400 MW. hydel power generated. This project will open a new phase of development in the District.

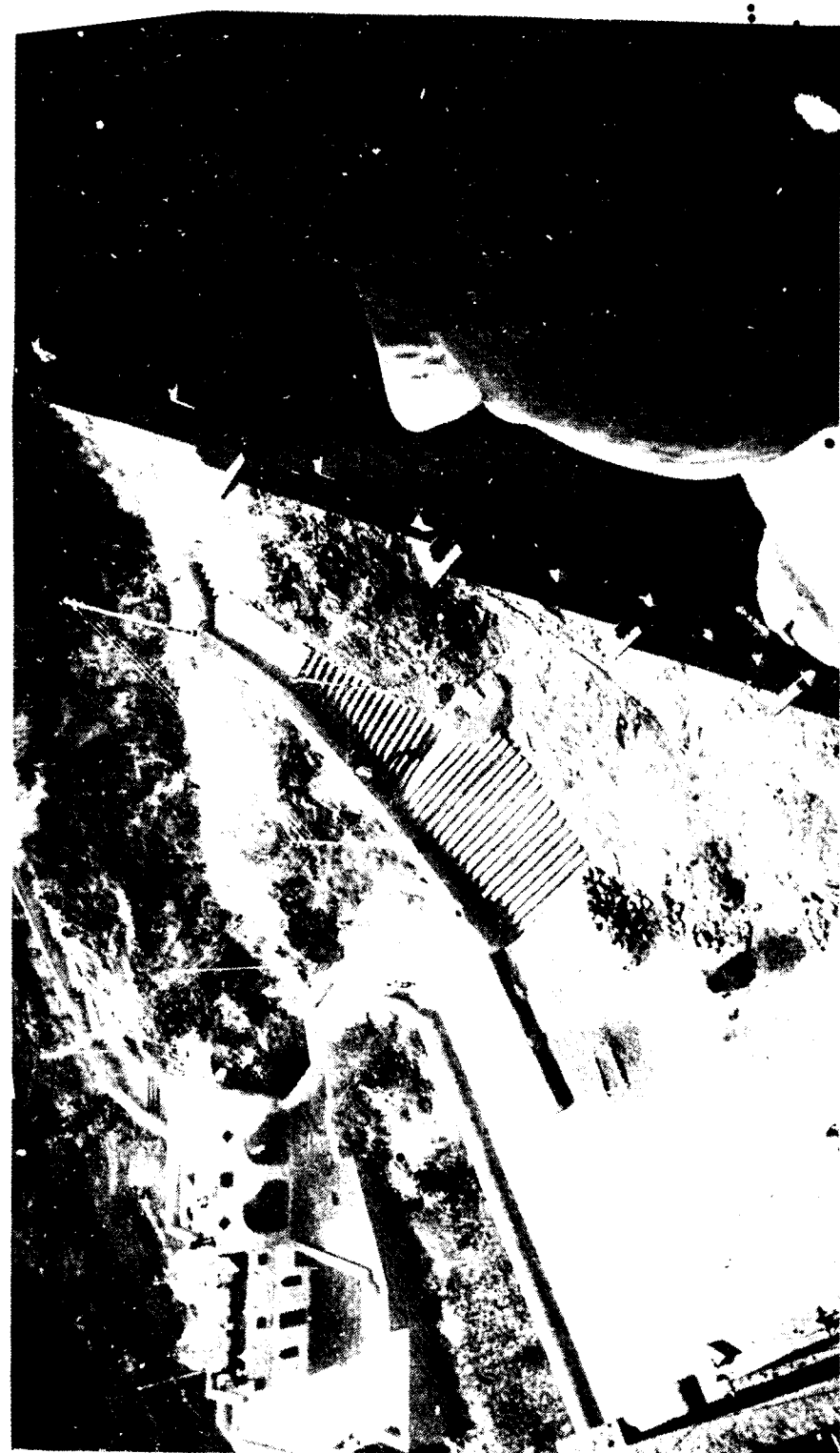

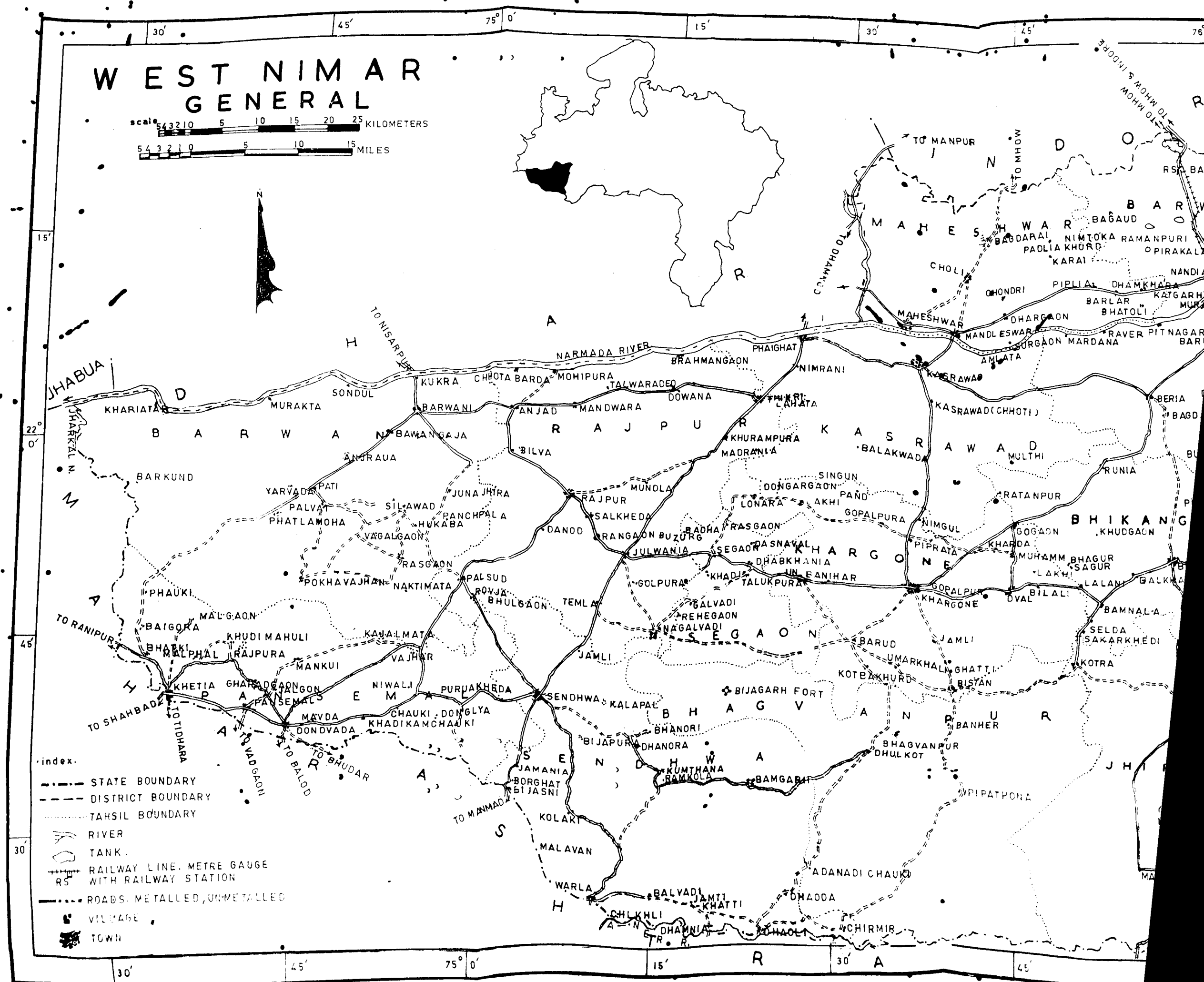
