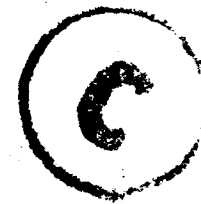
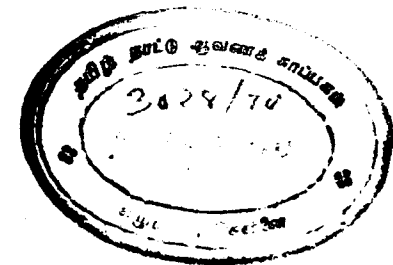

ANNUAL REPORT FOR 1965

Staff

There were a few changes in the administrative set-up of the Department during the year under review. Shri N. R. Ramanujachari, Microphotographer, and Shri D. L. Kaka, Archivist (General) went on deputation to the Indian National Scientific Documentation Centre and the Gazetteers Unit of the Ministry of Education with effect from 23 April and 16 September respectively. Kumari Eileen David who went to Italy last year to survey records of Indian interest available in the Vatican Archives returned in November 1965.

The year witnessed the passing away of Sarvashri S. K. Saxena, Assistant Director of Archives who was on deputation to the Gazetteers Unit of the Ministry of Education, and Sunder Singh, Record Attendant (Grade I).

On the recommendation of the Departmental Promotion Committee of the Ministry of Education Shri K. L. Kanjilal was promoted as Archivist (General) vice Shri D. L. Kaka, and Kumari Shobha Basu and Shri A. B. Roy were promoted as Microphotographer and Assistant Microphotographer (Grade I) respectively. Shri Dev Raj Shastri, Hindi Assistant was appointed to the newly created post of Archivist (Hindi).

Due to administrative reasons 20 posts (I Class II non-gezzetted, 12 Class III and 7 Class IV) remained unfilled. The total strength of the establishment at the close of the year was 384.

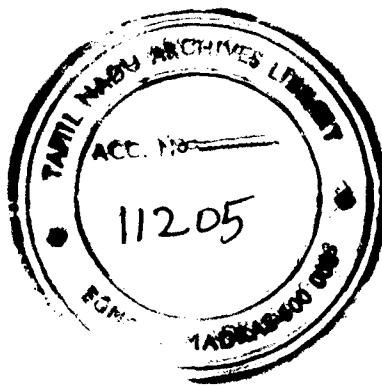
Accessions

Public Records.—Shortage of storage space continued to hamper the accession programme of the Department. Thus the only records worth a mention that could be accepted during the year were 122 authenticated copies of Bills passed by the various State Legislatures and assented to by the President of India, received from the Ministry of Home Affairs; 392 folios of Cantonment plans received from the Survey of India; registers of cancelled securities and bonds of old loans (1785—1865) received from the Reserve Bank of India, Calcutta and 24 files of Finance Department (Military, 1906—23). Private Papers and Manuscripts.—In pursuance of the policy of acquiring private papers of eminent nationalist leaders, the Department obtained further consignment of V. Krishnaswami Aiyar papers comprising, among others, letters written to him by G. K. Gokhale, Dadabhai Naoroji, D. Wacha, Lala Lajpat Rai, J. Keir Hardie, W. Wedderburn and A. O. Hume. Another acquisition worth a mention is the collection of papers of P. S. Sivaswamy Iyer, a reputed moderate leader from Madras.

On the recommendation of the Historical Documents Purchase Committee, a large collection of interesting documents throwing

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light on the political relations of the Portuguese with the Maratha Chiefs such as the Angrias of Colaba, the Siddis of Janjira and others was purchased. While most of the papers in the collection are in Marathi, there are several in Portuguese, Kannada and Persian languages as well.

Microfilm Collection.—Under the programme of acquiring microfilm copies of records of Indian interest available in the repositories outside India, the Department acquired 59 rolls of papers of Lord William Bentinck, Governor-General of India (1828—35), from the Nottingham University, England. While there are several other collections marked out for acquisition, it was not possible to place any firm orders due to difficult foreign exchange situation.

Books and Periodicals.—On the advice of the Books Acquisition Committee of the Department 1,390 books and periodicals were added to the Departmental Library, noteworthy among them being (i) *Tarikh-i-Tajganj* (MS., 1837) by Syed Inayat Ali; (ii) *Glossary of Revenue Technicalities in Vernacular Language* (1840); Sir John Login and Duleep Singh (1890) by Lady Login; Larousse's *Encyclopaedia of Modern History* and *Encyclopaedia of Ancient & Medieval History; Vocabulary: Persian, Arabic and English* (1785).

Checking and Arrangement

The work of checking and arranging the different series of records in the custody of the Department was continued. 36,927 files, 1,200 volumes and 482 folios covering the period 1860—1955 and belonging to the various branches of the late Home Department, Political Department, Ministry of States, Foreign and Political Department, Central India States Agency, Reserve Bank of India, Department of Revenue and Agriculture (Statistics), Survey of India and Department of Archaeology were checked and arranged. (For details please see Appendix II). Further, checking and arrangement of about 1,000 documents of Dadabhai Naoroji and 14 volumes of Xerograph prints of the Macartney papers were completed. Photostat copies of Gandhiji's letters received from the Gandhi Smarak Sangrahalaya were checked and restored to their proper places. Arrangement of the Parliamentary Papers which had been started earlier was completed. Arranged chronologically and according to provenance, it has become very easy to trace the required papers at an instant's notice. Finally 345 bags of records belonging to the late Bombay Government (Military and Political Branches) were transferred to the Government of Maharashtra.

Compilation of Reference Aids

The Department pursued with vigour the programme of compiling reference media with a view to facilitating research. Completed under listing programme were: 10,908 files of the Military Proceedings (January 1889—January 1893); 450 files of the Foreign Department (Political, 1933—35); 4 bundles of records of the Customs Departments of the Governments of Bombay and Madras; 773 files of the Foreign and Political Department (Federation I Branch, 1935—38); and 52 boxes of the registers of cancelled bonds and securities received from the Reserve Bank of India, Calcutta. Further, listing of the post-1860 records of the late Department of Education, Health and Lands, and the pre-1860 records of all other Departments with

the exception of the Military Department, was completed. Subject-lists of 1,193 files of the Home Department (Political, 1944—46), 9 bundles of the Home Department (Jails, 1945—46) and 42 folios of maps of the Survey of India were prepared. Besides this, the work relating to the preparation of a "Guide to Records" made satisfactory progress.

The listing of the private papers acquired by the Department from various individuals and institutions also made substantial progress. 1,940 documents belonging to the Jayakar Collection were checked, and preparation of the subject-list of Purushottamdas Tandon papers was continued.

Descriptive listing programme made steady progress. While descriptive listing of xerographic prints of Macartney papers received from America made good progress, that of the Persian Correspondence for the years 1804—06 was completed and for the years 1807—08 taken in hand. The work of preparing an index to the volume of *Alqab-nama* (1807—67) comprising the names and titles of Indian chiefs and rulers made further progress.

The Department launched a new project of cataloguing seal impressions found on the Persian Correspondence (Original Receipts) among the Foreign Department records (1778—1857). As a first step, such seals as were found on the letters issued by the imperial family at Delhi and the Court officials and notables were catalogued. Moulded in various shapes and sizes, they provide interesting clues to historical research. While the majority of legends on the seals are in Persian, there are several in Hindi, Bengali, Marathi, Burmese and Arabic as well. Some of the legends are in the form of verses. The projected catalogue of seals is to contain, among other details, English version of the legends.

Compilation of Volume III of the *Descriptive List of Secret Department Records* (1781—85) having been completed, work on Volume IV of the series covering the years 1786—90 was taken up. The printing of Volume II (1776—80) of this series made some progress during the period.

The compilation of *Index to the Foreign and Political Department Records*, Volume II (1781—83), was continued and a part of the manuscript sent to the press.

Appraisal

The Department continued to assist the various Ministries of the Government of India in appraising their non-current records and sorting out those that are worthy of retirement and permanent retention in the National Archives and drawing up of schedules of unimportant papers with a view to their eventual destruction. 9,195 files—541 files of the late Finance Department, 344 files of the Department of Education, Health and Lands, 1,779 files of the Eastern States Agency, 328 files of the Kolhapur Agency, and 6,203 files of the Mysore Residency—were thus reviewed and, out of these 1,003 files—14 files of the Finance Department, 20 files of the Department of Education, Health and Lands, 213 files of the Eastern States Agency, 6 files of the Kolhapur Agency, and 750 files of the Mysore Residency—were found fit for permanent retention.

Research and Reference Service

The practice of keeping the Research Room open from 9 A.M. to 8 P.M. on week days and from 9 A.M. to 4.30 P.M. on second Saturdays and Sundays was continued. There was a marked increase in the number of scholars—337 as against 273 of last year—who availed themselves of the facilities provided by the Department for consulting original records and other source materials in its custody. Quite a few of them were from foreign countries like United Kingdom, United States of America, Australia and Germany. Their subjects of research touched almost all aspects of Modern Indian history with particular reference to the Indian National Movement and struggle for freedom. (Please see Appendix III).

The Department continued to render service to public and private agencies as well as individual scholars in the matter of supplying copies of records of interest to them. During the year under report 14,710 typed pages of excerpts, 25,259 exposures of negative microfilm, 48 photo-copies, 195 metres of positive prints were prepared for them. Besides this, numerous enquiries involving laborious search among records were attended to and requisite information supplied. The enquiries covered subjects such as Indian Civil Wrongs Bill drafted by Sir Frederick Pollock in 1889, Indian immigration and settlement in Fiji, career of Hardayal, the Indian revolutionary, and several others. (For details, please see Appendix IV).

The increase in the number of research scholars was reflected in the tremendous increase in their requisition for papers. The Department attended to 97,727 requisitions from both research scholars and Government Offices. Besides records the scholars were supplied with private papers of Gokhale, Tyabji, Naoroji, Jayakar, Sastri, Lala Lajpat Rai and Gandhiji, on specific requisition from them. There were, in addition, requisitions for 719 microfilm reels of papers of Indian interest abroad acquired by the National Archives.

The Departmental Library attended to 1,33,618 requisitions for books, periodicals, Parliamentary Papers and other printed materials from research scholars, members of the staff and Government and Semi-Government agencies.

Restoration of papers to their proper places, returned by the borrowing agencies, was also continued side by side. As many as 73,409 files, volumes, and maps were thus restored, and reminders sent to those against whom such material was outstanding for a long time.

Preservation and Photoduplication

Tight foreign exchange position and resultant paucity of imported materials hampered the repair work of the Department. However, the normal routine functions of air-cleaning, fumigation, deacidification and binding of records and printed materials continued to be attended to. The lamination press being out of order for some time the lamination programme was considerably slowed down during the year and only 83,184 sheets were laminated. Another 26,519 sheets of records were repaired by hand lamination process. Minor repairs were also carried out to 38,900 sheets and 480 maps. 2,91,828 sheets and 14 maps were deacidified and freed from old patches of repair

and paste, etc., while 1,233 sheets, 3 palm leaves and 12 birch bark leaves were repaired and mounted. In addition, 1,88,843 sheets were guarded, 75,151 original consultations docketed, and 1,258 sheets flattened.

Besides the above, 964 volumes, 1,159 books and 623 miscellaneous items were bound and leather preservative dressing was applied to 23,022 leather-bound books and volumes, 147 boxes of records, 33 books and 23 files were air-cleaned, while 141 boxes of records, 60 books, 392 map folios and 23 files were fumigated.

Under the microfilming programme 81,803 exposures were taken, 9,272 metres of films processed and 402 microfilm reels checked. Besides this, the Microfilm Unit made 5,760 metres of positive microfilm and 5,871 enlargement prints.

Research Laboratory

The Research Laboratory of the Department continued its work of ascertaining the effect of some common fumigants and insecticides on 'permalife' paper, a standard variety of paper approved by the ICOM Committee on Laboratories for the Museums. Experiments for determining the utility of carboxymethyl cellulose as an adhesive for binding made good progress. Tests were carried out to find out the extent to which certain indigenous materials were suitable for repair work. Also various types of paper for docket covers were tested with a view to drawing up specifications for a suitable materials. The Handmade Paper Institute, Poona and the Khadi and Village Commission's Zonal Office, Bangalore, continued their efforts to produce tissue paper comparable to the imported variety being used in the Department.

Technical Service

Technical assistance to external agencies in preserving their documents and manuscripts could not make much headway owing to the shortage of imported raw films and repair materials. For instance, usual repair, binding and microfilming of rare books and manuscripts of Raza Library, Rampur could not be done on a large scale. 27 documents and 2 rolls belonging to the Nehru Memorial Museum and Library and Shri Gulab Chand Jain of Delhi were repaired. From among Gandhiji's documents belonging to the Gandhi Smarak Sangrahalaya, Ahmedabad, only 300 pages were microfilmed. Microfilming was also done of the private papers of Badruddin Tyabji and Srinivas Sastri. In addition to this, the Department rendered photoduplication service to a few institutions and individuals in India and outside, among whom mention may be made of the Universities of Cambridge and Oxford (U.K.), the Duke University (U.S.A.), the Commonwealth Relations Office, London, the Tribhuvan University, Kathmandu, and the Turkish Ambassador in India.

Besides rehabilitation and photoduplication, the Department helped outside agencies in other matters connected with preservation of papers. 233 books of the Lok Sabha Library infested with *gastralus indicus* were fumigated. Fumigation was also done of 15 old and brittle registers belonging to the Indian Museum, Calcutta.

Advisory Work and Inspection

Technical advice on various aspects of preservation and rehabilitation of records and books was rendered to 31 institutions and individuals who referred their problems to the Department. The Manager, Gandhi Smarak Sangrahalaya, New Delhi, the Government of West Bengal and the Director of Archives, Kerala were supplied with information regarding specifications of cellulose acetate, acetone and tissue paper used in hand-lamination of records. The Chief Controller of Printing and Stationery, New Delhi, was advised on the repair and rehabilitation of partially burnt files. A sketch of standard size carton box and a sample carton box made in this Department were sent to the Government of Bihar to give an idea of how records ought to be stored. Information on testing equipment, chemicals, etc. used in archival laboratories was sent to the Librarian, National Library, Calcutta. Tentative specifications of paper for use in folders and docket covers together with information in regard to the availability of xerographic equipment were supplied to the Director, Nehru Memorial Museum and Library, New Delhi. The Cabinet Secretariat, the Lok Sabha Secretariat, the Library of the Historical Division, Ministry of External Affairs, and the Government College for Women, New Delhi were visited and precautionary measures suggested for checking the damage to records by insect pests.

The Department continued to collaborate with the Indian Standards Institution on its various committees such as Committee on Inks, Library Building Committee, Documentation Sectional Committee, and Reprography Committee. Further, it has accepted representation on the Technical Committee of the Nehru Memorial Museum and Library, New Delhi and the Advisory Committee of the National Film Archives of India, Poona.

Training in Archive-Keeping

The trainees admitted to the One-Year Diploma Course in Archive-Keeping last year completed their training during the year under report and on passing the examination held in August-September they were awarded diplomas. An observation tour of the State Archives of Madras and Bombay was arranged for them to give them an opportunity to study the working of these archival repositories and to acquaint them with the methods of appraising and weeding records followed there.

The fresh session of the Diploma Course commenced in September with 9 trainees on the rolls. 6 of them were nominated by the various Ministries and State Governments and the remaining three were selected from among private candidates.

Besides the regular batch, 8 nominees from Assam, U.P., West Bengal, Andhra Pradesh and Madras joined the Department for short-term course of training in preservation.

A few lectures on 'Preservation of Records' were delivered by the Scientific Officer of the Department to the trainees at the Central Secretariat Training School, New Delhi.

Exhibition

The permanent exhibition of select documents and manuscripts at the National Archives of India continued to attract a large number of visitors. The visitors, 537 in number, included, among others, trainees from the Central Secretariat Training School, and INSDOC, New Delhi, and students of the University of Calcutta and of the Government Higher Secondary School, Model Town, Delhi.

On the occasion of the 27th session of the Indian History Congress held at Allahabad from 29—31 December 1965 the Department organised an exhibition of select documents, manuscripts and publications of historical interest. Exhibitions were also organised under the auspices of the Kerala History Association, Ernakulam on 16—18 May and at the first annual session of the Punjab History Conference held at Patiala on 12—14 November 1965. At each of these exhibitions historical documents relating to the region concerned were displayed.

Publication

The Publication Programme of the Department made further headway during the year under review. Under Scheme I, which envisages publication of *Fort William-India House Correspondence* in 21 volumes, there was steady progress in the printing of Volume III (Home Department, 1760—63; Honorary Editor: Dr. R. R. Sethi), Volume VII (Home Department, 1773—76; Honorary Editor: Professor R. P. Patwardhan), Volume XX (Military Department, 1792—96; Honorary Editor: Dr. A. C. Banerjee), and Volume XXI (Military Department, 1797—1800; Honorary Editor: Professor Sita Ram Kohli).

The volume of *Persian Akhbars* being published in collaboration with the University of Delhi under Scheme III-A made good progress.

Editing of the *News Letters* (1839—42), which is being published in collaboration with the Punjab University under Scheme III-B of the Publication Programme was continued.

Progress was also maintained in the compilation of Volume III of *Selections from Educational Records of the Government of India*, dealing with the history of educational administration (1859—97). The work of collecting materials for volumes IV and V of the series dealing with the technical education in India and the growth of technical education in the various 'provinces' respectively also made further progress. Reprinting by photo-offset process of the *Selections from Educational Records*, Part I (1781—1839) edited by Sharp was completed and that of Part II (1840—59) edited by Richey neared completion.

As regards the *Calendar of Persian Correspondence*, Volume XI (1794-95), its printing made steady progress.

Volume XIV (January 1961—December 1962) of the Departmental journal *The Indian Archives* was published during the year, while the printing of Volume XV (January 1963—December 1964) of the journal neared completion. Some of the interesting articles contained in the former are: "Four Path-Finders: A Tribute to Flower, Jenkinson, Buck and Sen" by S. Roy; "Seals of Ancient India" by Dr. Bahadur Chand Chhabra; and "The Training of Archivists in Germany" by Dietmar Rothermund.

Advisory Bodies and Committees

Indian Historical Records Commission.—Held in abeyance for quite some time, the Government of India have now decided to revive and reconstitute the Indian Historical Records Commission. The question of appointing new members of the Commission has already been taken up.

National Committee of Archivists.—The eighteenth meeting of the Committee was held at New Delhi on 19-20 November 1965. Among the important recommendations of the Committee were those relating to the standardization of paper to be used for records of permanent value and construction of suitable buildings by such State Archives as did not have them. Another recommendation of the Committee was that the Inter-University Board might be requested to move the Universities to include Marathi, Rajasthani, Tamil and other regional languages in their syllabus for students of medieval Indian history at the post-graduate stage, since knowledge of these languages is of great advantage in conducting research in the field. At the close of its meeting the Committee organised a symposium on "Protection of records and other cultural property during an armed conflict."

National Register of Records.—The compilation of National Register of private and semi-private archives made steady progress. Exhaustive survey reports, describing the historical documents and manuscripts in private possession were received from the Governments of Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Bihar, Madras, Mysore, Orissa, Punjab, Rajasthan and Uttar Pradesh. The total amount sanctioned by the Government of India during the year to the State Governments cooperating in the National Register work was Rs. 27,800.

Other Activities of the Director and Other Officers of the Department

The Director of Archives, Shri K. D. Bhargava, inspected the Library of the Gazetteers Unit of the Ministry of Education and suggested measures for protecting the books against damage by white ants.

Shri R. C. Gupta, Assistant Director of Archives (Preservation) represented the Department on the Advisory Committee of the Nehru Memorial Museum and Library, New Delhi, as well as on the Advisory Committee of the National Film Archives of India, Poona. He also attended the Indian Standards Convention at Bangalore from 13—18 December 1965 and read a paper on "The Role of an Archivist in implementing the Indian Standard Code of practice relating to primary elements in the design of buildings for Archives, I.S.:2663-1964."

Regional Office, Bhopal

Compilation of Reference Aids.—Lists specifying the subjects Department (1934—37) and 700 files of the Chamber of Princes (1931—47) of the erstwhile Bhopal State were checked. 195 bundles, 23 carton boxes, 422 volumes and 155 library books were labelled.

Compilation of Reference Aids.—Lists specifying the subjects and references were prepared of 2,679 files of the Political Department (1934—37) and 695 files of the Chamber of Princes (1931—47).

Research and Reference Service.—4 research scholars availed themselves of the facilities provided by the Office for consulting records in its custody. Also several queries received from the Madhya Pradesh Government were attended to.

Preservation.—The work of repairing and rehabilitating the records of *Daftar Insha* was continued. 13,040 sheets were flattened, 57,634 sheets full-pasted, 3,536 sheets repaired with cellulose acetate foil and tissue paper, and 8,969 sheets repaired with tissue paper only. Besides, 289 volumes, one register and 3 books were bound, 46 maps mounted and 2,259 volumes fumigated.

Apart from daily dusting of records, special cleaning of 62,964 volumes, 1,711 files and 16,294 bundles was done. The stack area and the library were disinfected with Pip insecticide.

Exhibition.—The permanent exhibition of historical documents in the Office continued to attract visitors. Among the visitors mention may be made of Shri R. P. Nigam, Deputy Director of Industries, Bhopal, Shri H. N. Banerjee, Collector of Damoh and a batch of American Peace Corps volunteers.

Regional Office, Panjim (Goa)

Accession.—The Office accessioned, among other records, 13,995 files of the Judicial Courts of Diu and Salcete, 992 files of the former Military Court, 1,154 notarial registers of Panjim, Bardez, Pernem and Salcete, 713 village community books, 6 truck-loads of records from the Panjim Secretariat, 13 boxes of military records and 63 boxes of selected records from Daman offices. Due to shortage of storage space the work of centralisation of records could not proceed on a large scale. The Central Government, however, has under its active consideration the question of extending the present building.

Compilation of Reference Aids.—Preparation of the subject index of Volumes IV and V of the series "Assentos do Conselho do Estado", i.e., Proceedings of the State Council, was completed.

Research and Reference Service.—Several research scholars visited the Office in connection with their studies and were provided with necessary facilities. The scholars included some from foreign countries like Germany, Netherlands and U.S.A. The Office attended to enquiries involving search among records, made by a number of institutions and individuals, noteworthy among them being Dr. Duncan Derret and Professor C. R. Boxer, London, Shri K. M. Cherian, Editor, "Malayala Manorama", Kottayam, Superintendent, Arabic and Persian Inscriptions, Nagpur, and Director, Southern Circle, Survey of India.

As a further facility for research scholars and others, the Office has taken up the work of organising a reference library. About 60 historical publications were purchased for the library during the year under report.

Preservation.—About 450 manuscripts forming part of the collection of Village Community Section were bound in 200 volumes. The Office has purchased a "Recordak" Camera which will be set up as soon as the necessary staff is appointed.

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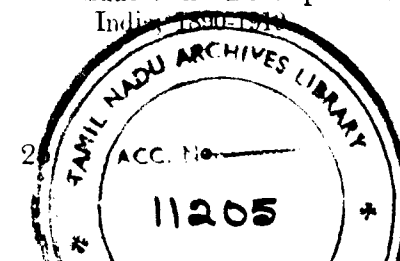
