ANNUAL REPORT FOR 1966

Staff

The year under report witnessed some changes in the personnel of the Department, noteworthy among them being those mentioned hereunder.

Shri H. R. Ramchandra, Librarian, on being selected for a similar post in the University of Agricultural Sciences, Bangalore, left the Department on 12 February and Shri J. C. Srivastava, the seniormost Assistant Librarian, was promoted to officiate as Librarian in his place.

Dr. Dayal Dass, Archivist (General), was selected by the Union Public Service Commission for the post of Compiler (Gazetteers) in the Gazetteers Unit of the Ministry of Education, and he joined that post with effect from 7 June. Shri D. L. Kaka, who had been on deputation to that Unit since September 1965, consequently reverted to his substantive post of Archivist (General) in this Department.

Shri M. M. Siddiqi, Keeper of Records, Bhopal, retired from service on 13 July. Pending selection of his successor by the Union Public Service Commission, Shri K. L. Arora, Archivist (Oriental Records), was promoted to officiate in his place, and Shri J. A. Chishti, Assistant Archivist (Grade I, Oriental Records) was promoted as Archivist (Oriental Records) vice Shri Arora.

Shri N. C. Sinha, who was on deputation to the Sikkim Durbar and held a lien on the post of Archivist (General) in this Department, retired from service on 9 July.

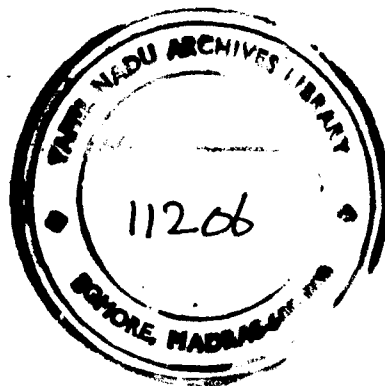
Shri R. K. Perti, Archivist (General), left for France on 19 October to undergo a course of training in Archive-Keeping at *Archives Nationales*, Paris.

For administrative reasons, 17 posts in the various cadres remained unfilled. The total strength of the establishment of the Department (excluding the Regional Offices at Bhopal and Panjim) on 31 December was 384.

Accessions

Public Records.—Acute shortage of storage space continued to hamper the record-retirement programme of the Department. The only accession worth mentioning was that of 86 authenticated copies of Bills passed by the various State Legislatures and assented to by the President of India. These copies were received from the Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India.

Private Papers and Manuscripts.—The programme of acquiring private papers of historical value was pursued with vigour. Some letters and other papers of Maulana Abul Kalam Azad were received from Shri M. Ajmal Khan, Private Secretary to the Maulana, and a few letters, photographs and press-cuttings of Subhas Chandra Bose and V. J. Patel from Mrs. Eileen M. Dey of Dublin. The Department also received some press-cuttings



relating to Jawaharlal Nehru and other Indian leaders from Shri P. S. Moorthy of Madras, and 8 original letters of R. C. Dutt from Mrs. Sushama Sen of Simla.

Microfilm Collection.—Further additions were made to the microfilm collection of the Department. 134 rolls of Western Indian States records and 81 rolls of Crown Representative's records and Residency files were obtained from the India Office Library, London.

Books and Periodicals.—On the advice of the Books Acquisition Committee, the Departmental Library added to its holding 1,546 books and 399 bound volumes of periodicals. Of these, 674 publications were acquired as gifts from individuals and institutions and the rest by purchase or exchange. Some of the rare and out-of-print works that deserve particular mention, are : (i) *An account of the Mutinies in Oudh and of the Siege of the Lucknow Residency* (1858) by M. R. Gubbins; (ii) *The Mutinies in Rajpootana : Being a Personal Narrative of the Mutiny at Nusseerabad*, (1860) by I. T. Prichard; (iii) *Notes on the Races, Tribes and Castes inhabiting the Province of Avadh* 1868) by Patrick Carnegy; and (iv) *Notes on the Routes of the Afghan Boundary Commission from Khwaja Ali to Kuhsan* (1885) by Captain Peacocke.

Checking and Arrangement

The normal work of checking and arranging the different series of records in the custody of the Department was continued. 11,792 Progs. of the Military Department, 1,661 Progs. of the Home Department, 2,000 registers of the office of A. G., Calcutta, 2,800 Bonds of the Reserve Bank of India, Calcutta and 400 files of the Survey of India were among the records checked and re-arranged during the year under report (For details, please see Appendix I).

Compilation of Reference Aids

Steady progress was maintained in preparing reference media in regard to the records in the custody of the Department. 200 volumes of cancelled securities received from the Reserve Bank of India, Calcutta, and 1,242 Foreign Department files (General Branch, 1933—48) were listed. Listing was also done of 4,502 papers of Purushottam Das Tandon, 52 files of Jayakar papers, 500 letters of V. Krishnaswamy Aiyar, Urdu letters of Badruddin Tyabji and xerograph prints of Macartney papers. Further progress was made in the preparation of the Descriptive list of acquired documents (Persian); catalogue of Cantonment plans (Revenue) and of seals found among Original Persian Letters Received; descriptive list of The Mutiny Papers at Bhopal (Vol. III) and of the Persian Correspondence; Vol. XII index to the *Alqab-namah* and of the historical maps of the Survey of India. Printing of the *Descriptive List of Secret Department Records*, Vol. II (1776—80) and the *Index to the Foreign and Political Department Records*, Vol. II (1781—83) also made good progress.

Appraisal

The Department's project of appraising non-current records, sorting out those worthy of permanent retention and drawing up schedules of

unimportant papers with a view to their eventual destruction, made good progress. 2,758 files of the Mysore Residency were appraised and 242 files out of these were found fit to be retained permanently. Appraisal was also done of a number of files of the Hyderabad Residency and the Department of Education, Health and Lands, out of which 332 were found suitable for permanent retention.

Research and Reference Service

As in previous years, the Research Room of the Department remained open from 9 A.M. to 8 P.M. on week days and from 10 A.M. to 5 P.M. on Sundays and second Saturdays. Scholars, both Indian and foreign, continued to be attracted by the research facilities offered by the Department. During the year under report, 338 scholars, including those from U.K., U.S.A., Australia and West Germany, consulted the original records and published materials in the custody of the Department, and the subjects of their research covered almost all the aspects of modern Indian History, particularly the national movement in India, economic developments and constitutional changes (Please see Appendix II).

The Department attended to requisitions for 112,121 documents from research scholars and members of the staff, and received back from them 92,840 documents which were restored to their proper places. Such requisitions from the various agencies of the Government of India were also attended to.

Besides the above, the Department dealt with a large number of enquiries referred to it by both public and private agencies, as also by individual scholars on a variety of topics involving laborious search among records and printed sources. Noteworthy among the enquiries attended to were those relating to the question of re-employment under Government, of the Chairman and members of Public Service Commission after retirement, postal system of the Hyderabad Residency, the Ghadr leader Nawab Khan, capture of Manila by the English from Spain in 1762, merger agreement between Baroda and the Dominion of India, transfer of the seat of Government of India from Calcutta to Delhi, and the Ganga Canal Colony in Rajasthan (For details, please see Appendix III).

Preservation and Photoduplication

The Department continued to experience difficulty in procuring imported repair materials owing to the tight foreign exchange position. Consequently, only 1,30,779 sheets of records could be laminated during the year under report. In addition, 18,031 document sheets, 8 *farmans* and 25 maps were repaired with tissue paper and 21 sheets with chiffon, and minor repairs were done to 35,948 sheets and 576 maps. 1,42,204 sheets and 8 maps were deacidified and freed from old patches of paste etc., 429 maps mounted, 1,560 sheets flattened, 1,53,019 sheets guarded, and 3,553 Original Consultations and 227 sheets docketed. Besides this, 1,312 volumes, 1,603 books and 288 miscellaneous items were bound, and leather preservative dressing was applied to 23,699 leather-bound volumes.

The normal work of air-cleaning and fumigation of records and books was continued. 96 carton boxes, 11 bundles of records, 49 folders, 20 volumes, 60 files and 494 books were air-cleaned, and 96 carton boxes, 141 bundles, 49 folders, 32 volumes, 2 boxes of cards and 501 books fumigated.

Under the programme of microfilming important papers for the Department, the private papers of late Dr. Rajendra Prasad and the proceedings of the Indian National Congress (1886—1956) were microfilmed, the total number of exposures taken being 20,899.

Besides the above, photo-copies were prepared of some documents relating to Afghanistan for presentation to the Government of Afghanistan by the Vice-President of India during the latter's goodwill tour of that country. Such copies were also made of several documents for display at the exhibitions organised on the occasion of the 37th session of the Indian Historical Records Commission and the 2nd Sikh History Conference held at Delhi and Patiala respectively.

Research Laboratory

The Research Laboratory of the Department continued the work of testing indigenous substitutes of imported tissue paper and cellulose acetate foil in order to ascertain their suitability for repair purpose. None of the samples tested was found up to the mark. The Laboratory also took in hand testing of various types of indigenous paper for docket-covers with a view to drawing up specifications for a satisfactory material. Besides this, it continued its work of finding out the effect of some common fumigants and insecticides on the 'Permalife' paper approved by the ICOM Committee on Laboratories for the Museums, as well as of determining the suitability of carboxy methyl cellulose for use as an adhesive for binding jobs.

Technical Service

Because of shortage of imported raw film and repair materials, the Department could render technical service to a limited number of institutions and individuals, some of them being the Gandhi Smarak Sangrahalaya, New Delhi, Indian Museum, Calcutta, Library of the Ministry of External Affairs, New Delhi, Nehru Memorial Museum and Library, New Delhi, U.P. State Archives, Allahabad, and Shri Pyare Lal Nayar of New Delhi.

Photoduplication service was rendered to 108 outside agencies, including, among others, the Universities of California, Chicago, Harvard, Washington, London, Oxford and Cambridge, India Office Library, London, Institute of the Peoples of Asia, U.S.S.R., Tribhuvan University, Kathmandu, Nepalese Embassy in India, State Archives of Punjab and Rajasthan, Gandhi Smarak Sangrahalaya, New Delhi, Nehru Memorial Museum and Library, New Delhi, and the Education Commission, Government of India.

The programme of repairing, binding and microfilming the rare and valuable manuscripts belonging to the Raza Library, Rampur, could not make much headway during the year owing to the paucity of the materials required for the purpose.

Advisory Work and Inspection

Technical advice on different aspects of preservation of records and books was given to all the 21 external agencies which asked for it. Of such agencies, mention may be made of the Bhagalpur University, Bhagalpur, Adyar Library and Research Centre, Madras, Nehru Memorial Museum and Library, New Delhi, Orissa State Archives, Bhubaneswar, Kendriya

Sanskrit Vidyapeeth, Tirupati, U.P. Secretariat Library, Lucknow, National Library, Calcutta, Andhra Pradesh State Archives, Hyderabad, Publication Division, Geological Survey of India, Calcutta and the Ministry of External Affairs, New Delhi.

Training in Archives-Keeping

The nine trainees admitted to One-Year Diploma Course of Training in Archives-Keeping last year successfully completed their training during the year under report and were awarded diplomas. A fresh batch of eight trainees joined the new session which commenced in October.

One of the officers of this Department delivered a lecture on the "Preservation of Records" to the trainees of the Secretariat Training School, New Delhi. A lecture on the "Preservation and Storage of Books" was also delivered by him to the trainees of the Refresher Course for Book-Sellers organised by the All-India Hindi Publishers' Association, Delhi.

Exhibition

The Department participated in the Indo-Afghan cultural exhibition at Kabul and in the exhibition organised on the occasion of second Sikh History Conference and the thirty-seventh session of the Indian Historical Records Commission held at Patiala and Delhi respectively.

Publication

Implementation of the different schemes included in the Publication Programme of the Department was pursued with vigour. Printing of the *Fort William—India House Correspondence*, Vol. III (Home Department, 1760—63; Hony. Editor, Dr. R. R. Sethi), Vol. VII (Home Department, 1773—76; Hony. Editor, Prof. R. P. Patwardhan), Vol. XX (Military Department, 1792—96; Hony. Editor, Dr. A. C. Banerjee) and Vol. XXI (Military Department, 1797—1800; Hony. Editor, Prof. S. R. Kohli), included in Scheme I of the said Programme, made satisfactory progress. Scheme II has already been fully implemented. Under Scheme III-A, the printing of the volume of *Persian Akhbars*, being published in collaboration with the University of Delhi, neared completion. Editing of the volume of *News-Letters* (1839—42), to be brought out in collaboration with the Panjab University under Scheme III-B of the Programme, made further progress.

Under the Scheme of publishing *Selections from Educational Records of the Government of India*, work on Vol. III dealing with the history of educational administration (1859—97) was continued. Collection of materials for Vol. IV of the series dealing with the development of technical education (1854—1907) was also continued. Besides this, Part II (1840—59) of the earlier series, edited by J. A. Richey, was reprinted during the year.

As regards the *Calendar of Persian Correspondence*, printing of Vol. XI (1794—95) made steady progress.

Vol. XV of the Departmental Journal, *The Indian Archives*, covering the period January 1963-December 1964, was published and Vol. XVI

(January 1965-December 1966) was made ready for the Press. Some of the interesting articles in the former volume are : (i) Study of the State Archival Programmes in the United States, by Ernst Posner; (ii) Modern Cartography in India, by S. P. Chatterjee; (iii) Problems of Modern Records in English Boroughs, by Edwin Welch; and (iv) Recent Trends in Indian Research Activities in Modern Indian History, by S. Roy.

National Register of Records

For collecting information to be included in the National Register of Records, Central grants-in-aid were made available to the 14 State Governments participating in the National Register Scheme. Reports of work done in this connection were received from the States of Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Bihar, Kerala, Maharashtra, Madras, Mysore, Orissa, Punjab, Rajasthan and Uttar Pradesh. The work of consolidating and editing the survey reports and lists of records received in the Department during the years 1959 and 1960 was taken in hand and satisfactory progress made therein.

Advisory Bodies and Committees

Indian Historical Records Commission.—The thirty-seventh session of the reconstituted Commission was held under the auspices of the University of Delhi in October 1966. Dr. C. D. Deshmukh, Vice-Chancellor of the University, inaugurated the session, and Shri P. N. Kirpal, Educational Advisor to the Government of India, presided over it in the unavoidable absence of the ex-officio President, Shri M. C. Chagla, Union Education Minister. The Commission made a number of recommendations, chief among them being that relating to further liberalisation of the rules governing access to records in the country.

An exhibition of historical documents organised on the occasion was declared open by Dr. Deshmukh. Among the exhibits displayed were documents depicting the various phases of the life of Shri Gopal Krishna Gokhale and these attracted the special attention of the visitors.

National Committee of Archivists.—The nineteenth meeting of the Committee was held at New Delhi in October 1966 and was presided over by Shri K. D. Bhargava, Director of Archives, Government of India. The Committee discussed a number of problems and made several recommendations, chief among them being : (i) that a Manual of Archives be compiled by inviting contributions from specialists in different fields of archival science; (ii) that cellulose acetate foil and tissue paper, two important materials required for repairing records, be imported by the Government of India on behalf of the State Governments; and (iii) that procedure be laid down for utilising the 5 lakhs of rupees provided by the Centre for the development of the various State Archives.

Other Activities of the Director and other Officers of the Department

Shri K. D. Bhargava, Director of Archives, Government of India, attended the congress of the International Council on Archives held at Washington on 9—13 May, 1966. He also attended the meetings of the Boards of Trustees of Khuda Baksh Oriental Public Library, Patna and Raza Library, Rampur. Besides this, he participated in the deliberations of the Advisory Committee for the protection of Cultural Property in the

event of armed conflict and of the Art Purchase Committee of the National Museum, New Delhi.

Shri R. C. Gupta, Assistant Director of Archives (Preservation) and Sarvashri P. C. Majumdar, Ranbir Kishore, Y. P. Kathpalia and J. L. Bhatnagar contributed interesting papers which were read at the seminar on the "Conservation of Cultural Property" organised by the National Museum, New Delhi on 23—25 February, 1966.

The Department continued to collaborate with the Indian Standards Institution on the latter's various committees, such as Ink and Allied Products Sectional Committee, Committee for Library Buildings, Documentation Sectional Committee and Reprography Committee. Co-operation was also extended to the INSDOC by accepting its nomination of Shri R. C. Gupta as a member of the Board of Studies for the course of training in documentation and reprography conducted by it.

Regional Office, Bhopal

Staff.—Shri K. L. Arora, Archivist (Oriental Records), took over charge of the office of the Keeper of Records on the retirement of Shri M. M. Siddiqi with effect from 13 July, 1966. The strength of office establishment at the end of the year was 39.

Accessions.—The Office received from the National Archives of India, New Delhi, for custody 2,008 bundles of duplicate records of various Departments of the Government of India covering 1860—1938.

12 books were acquired and added to the Office Library.

Checking and Arrangement.—2,212 files of the Political Department (1937—39) and 50 files of the External Affairs Section of the same Department of the erstwhile Bhopal State were checked and arranged. Checking and arrangement was also done of 1,574 files of the Customs and Excise Departments of the Central Board of Revenue (1871—1922). In addition to this, 400 files and 8,106 volumes of *Daftar-i-Insha*, 2,320 files of *Moin-ul-Mohami*, 1,000 files of Judicial Secretariat, 1,200 files of Political Department and 797 volumes of Administrative Reports of Bhopal State were checked with their lists. 125 volumes, 160 bundles and 900 shelves were labelled and 100 files of the Political Department (Chamber of Princes Section), Bhopal were provided with captions.

Compilation of Reference Aids.—Lists, giving subjects and references, were prepared of 2,212 files of the Political Department, Bhopal (1937—39), 50 files of the External Affairs Section of the same Department (1947), and 1,574 files of certain Branches of the Central Board of Revenue (1871—1938).

Preservation.—Besides daily dusting of records and periodical, disinfection of the stack area and the Office Library with 'Pip' insecticide, special vacuum-cleaning was done of 23,827 volumes, 6,378 files and 12,269 bundles. 1,882 volumes and 220 bundles were fumigated with paradichlorobenzene. 5,628 document sheets were flattened, 1,061 sheets repaired with cellulose acetate foil and 10,499 sheets with tissue paper, 808 volumes bound and 12 maps repaired and mounted.

Visitors.—Several persons visited the Office during the year, most distinguished among them being Shri N. K. Sinha, Minister, Bihar Government, and Shri B. J. Sandesara, Director, Oriental Institute, Baroda University. Besides showing them round the office, various methods of archival administration and preservation were explained to them.

Regional Office, Panjim (Goa)

Staff.—The designation of the Head of the Regional Office was changed from the Director of Historical Archives to the Keeper of Records. Total strength of the Office establishment at the close of the year was 12.

Accessions.—The accessions during the year consisted of 29 truck-loads of unclassified Portuguese Military records, over 15,000 files of the Judicial Court of Salsette and the Military Court (since abolished), 256 Village Community Books of Ponda and 692 Books of Pernem, and 32 Travel Registers. The Office Library acquired 25 historical publications.

Preservation.—The work of binding into volumes the files forming the Village Community Collection was taken in hand and substantial progress was made therein. Similar work in respect of certain records of the former Diu Government also made satisfactory headway. In addition to this, microfilming was done of 3,300 pages of the collection of *Moncoes*.

Research and Reference Service.—Five scholars visited the Office in connection with their research work and they were rendered the help needed by them. The Office also attended to enquiries involving search among records, made by the Settlement Officer, Dadra, and Nagar Haveli, Silvassa, the Government Epigraphist for India, Mysore, and the Deputy Director (Extension), Coffee Board, Mysore.

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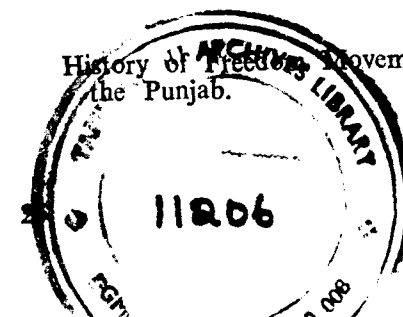
