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Staff

The year under report witnessed some significant changes in the personnel of the Department, noteworthy among them being those mentioned hereunder.

Dr. S. N. Prasad, Director, Historical Section, Ministry of Defence, selected for the post of Director of Archives, Government of India on the recommendation of the Union Public Service Commission, took charge of his new office on 29 September 1969. His predecessor Shri K. D. Bhargava reverted to his permanent post in the Selection Grade of the Central Secretariat Service with effect from 17 September 1969. During the interim period, Shri R. C. Gupta, officiating Deputy Director of Archives, held current charge of the duties of Director of Archives in addition to his own.

Shri Sourindranath Roy, Deputy Director of Archives, retired from service on 1 March 1969. Pending filling up of the vacancy on a regular basis, Shri R. C. Gupta, Assistant Director of Archives (Preservation), was appointed to the post on *ad hoc* basis.

Sarvashri S. N. Jaiswal and K. L. Kanjilal, Assistant Archivists (Grade I, General), Duli Chand and P. K. Ghosh, Assistant Archivists (Grade II, General), Om Prakash Bhugra, Assistant Microphotographer (Gr. II) and Roop Chand, Photo Assistant, were promoted as Archivists (General). Assistant Archivists (Grade I, General), Assistant Microphotographer (Grade I), and Assistant Microphotographer (Grade II), respectively.

Sarvashri A. B. Roy, Assistant Microphotographer (Grade I), Dr. Sarwat Ali, Assistant Archivist (Grade I, Oriental Records), L. Dewani, Assistant Archivist (Grade II, General), Basudev, Lower Division Clerk, and S. Balasundram, Stenographer, went on deputation, the first to the National Library, Calcutta, the second to the Institute of History of Medicine and Medical Research, New Delhi, the third to the Nehru Memorial Fund, New Delhi, the fourth to the Safdar Jang Hospital, New Delhi, and the last named to the Office of the Bank Note Press, Ministry of Finance.

Dr. Sarwat Ali mentioned above and Shri M. R. Sen Gupta, Assistant Archivist (Grade I, General) reverted to the Department from their deputation in the Institute of History of Medicine and Medical Research and the Gazetteers Unit, Ministry of Education and Youth Services, respectively.

Shri Y. P. Kathpalia, Scientific Officer, whose services were requisitioned by the UNESCO for a period of three months to advise the Italian Government in regard to the rehabilitation of their flood-damaged records, resumed his duties in the Department on 7 December 1969.

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Shri T. R. Sarin, Assistant Archivist (Grade I, General) who went to U.K. on a British Council scholarship for training in Archives-administration, returned to the Department on 19 December 1969.

Shri K. S. Anthony, Assistant Archivist (Grade I, General) went to Paris on a French Government scholarship for a course of training in Archives-keeping at Archives Nationales, Paris.

The sanctioned strength of the establishment of the Department was 406 (National Archives of India, New Delhi, 367; and Regional Office Bhopal, 39). For administrative reasons, 37 posts in the various cadres were left unfilled during the year under report.

Two posts of Archivist (General), 2 posts of Assistant Archivist (Grade I, General), 4 posts of Assistant Archivist (Grade II, General), and 1 post of Lower Division Clerk were created under the Fourth Five-Year Plan for the implementation of the Records Management Programme of the Department.

The administrative control of the Regional Office, Panjim (Goa) was transferred from the National Archives of India to the Goa Administration with effect from 1 April 1969.

Accessions

Public Records—The accessions worth mentioning included 8 bundles of Home (Political) Department (1946-47), 89 files of Home (Judicial) Department (1905-48), 185 files of Foreign and Political Department (1933-39), 32 files of the Department of Education, Health and Lands (1937-43), and 103 authenticated copies of Bills passed by the various State Legislatures and assented to by the President of India.

Private Papers and Manuscripts—Under the programme of acquiring private papers of historical value, the Department received 36 files relating mostly to the literary activities of Sardar K. M. Panikkar, a photo-copy of the letter dated 6 August 1937 written by Subhas Chandra Bose to Dr. S. S. Bhatnagar of Patiala, giving him advice regarding his duty to his family and the country, a copy of proceedings of the trial of Shri Hari Krishan, a freedom fighter, received from the Government of Pakistan, and a further instalment of photostat negatives of Gandhi documents (Nos. 9561-10350) received from the Gandhi Smarak Sangrahalaya, New Delhi.

Besides the above, a collection of 38 documents in Persian, Urdu and Dogri bearing on the history of Jammu and Kashmir was acquired from Shri K. S. Thakur of New Delhi.

Microfilm Collection—Further additions were made to the microfilm collection of the Department. The acquisitions comprised one roll of microfilm of papers relating to the trial of Madan Lal Dhingra, the noted revolutionary, obtained from the Public Record Office, London, and 14 rolls of Reports on the Native Newspapers (Punjab and U.P.) and 7 rolls of proceedings of the famous San Francisco Trial, received from the India Office Library, London.

Books and Periodicals—3,205 books and periodicals were added to the Departmental Library during the year under report. These included some rare and out-of-print works among which the following deserve particular mention:

- (i) *Among the Celestials* by Younghusband 1898);
- (ii) *From Tonkin to India by the Source of the Irawati*, 1895-96, by P.H.D'Orleans (1898);
- (iii) *Sport in the Highlands of Kashmir* by H. Z. Darrah (1898);
- (iv) *Picturesque Kashmir* by Arthur Neve (1899); and
- (v) *Bishop's Conversion* by E. B. Maxwell (1892).

Besides, about 1,300 publications were received by way of gift or exchange.

Checking and Arrangement

The normal work of checking and arranging the different series of records in the custody of the Department was continued. 1,466 bundles, 749 volumes, 12 carton boxes and 32 files of the Marine Department (1845-59), Rajputana Residency, Foreign and Political Department, Hyderabad Residency, Home (Political) Department, Home (Straits Settlements) Department, and Department of Education, Health and Lands (1937-43) were checked and re-arranged during the year. (For details, please see Appendix I).

3,509 documents of the Inayat Jang Collection relating to the reigns of Aurangzeb and Bahadur Shah I, were numbered and docketed. The arrangement of K. Santhanam Papers was completed, and classification and arrangement of Sir Sita Ram Papers made good progress.

Compilation of Reference Aids

Steady progress was maintained in preparing reference media to the records in the custody of the Department. 961 despatches to and from the Secretary of State for India, Home (Public) Department (1869-80), 37,486 'B' Proceedings of the Military Department (1895-1902), 2,824 similar proceedings of the Department of Revenue and Agriculture (Agriculture Branch, 1878-1924), 3,921 proceedings of the Department of Revenue, Agriculture and Commerce (Revenue, Agriculture and Settlement Branch, 1867-78), 4,792 proceedings of the Department of Education, Health and Lands (Agriculture Branch, 1910-31) and 615 proceedings of the Home (Revenue) Department (1860-65), and 2,085 'A' proceedings of the Home (Education) Department (1860-70) were check-listed. Besides, 626 volumes of the Registers of cancelled securities of old bonds received from the Reserve Bank of India, Calcutta, and 55 Consultations of the Legislative (Up-country Department) (1852-54) were subject-listed. Listing of Sir Sita Ram Papers and K. Santhanam Papers made steady progress, and lists of the papers comprising the M. R. Jayakar Collection were revised and made up-to-date. Preparation of an exhaustive index to the inventory of microfilm copies of records acquired from the British Museum was taken up. Steady progress was made in the preparation of a general Guide to the microfilms available in the National

Archives of India. The printing of Volume II of the *Index to the Foreign and Political Department Records* (1781—83) came to an end and that of Volume II of the *Descriptive List of Secret Department Records* (1776—80) neared completion. The typescript of Volume III (1781—85) of the latter series was made ready for the press. Descriptive listing of the Original Persian Letters Received (1816—19) was completed and work on such letters belonging to the year 1820 was taken up. Persian Letters Issued during the year 1813 were also descriptively listed. Work on the preparation of a Catalogue of the seals found among the Original Persian Letters Received made further progress, the number of seals catalogued during the year being 421. In addition to the above work, Introduction to the volume of *Index to Titles (Alqabnamah)* was completed and made ready for the Press. Also the preparation of indexes to the proceedings of the National Archives of India for the years 1968 and 1969 was completed.

Appraisal

Further progress was made in implementing the Department's programme of appraising non-current records and drawing up schedules of unimportant papers with a view to their eventual destruction. 32,300 files of the Jaipur Agency (1923—47), Western Rajputana States Agency (1924—47), Mewar and Southern Rajputana States Agency (1924—47), Western Kathiawar Political Agency (1927—47), Baroda Agency (1924—47), Gujarat States Agency (1946—47), Sabar Kantha Agency (1930—45), Bundelkhand Agency (1923—47), Office of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India (1945—55), Department of Education, Health and Lands (1928—47), Home Department (1933—37), and Political Department (1937—45) were appraised and, out of these, 6,024 files were marked for permanent retention.

Research and Reference Service

The Research Room of the Department continued to be kept open from 9 A.M. to 8 P.M. on week days and from 9 A.M. to 4.30 P.M. on Sundays and second Saturdays. Scholars, both Indian and foreign, availed themselves of the research facilities afforded by the Department. During the year as many as 412 scholars, including those from U.K., U.S.A., Australia, West Germany, U.S.S.R., Canada, Philippines, and Afghanistan, worked in the Research Room. The subjects of their research covered almost all the aspects of modern period of Indian History. (For the names of scholars and the subjects of their research, please see Appendix II).

The Department attended to requisitions for 74,945 documents from research scholars, and from the members of staff of the National Archives of India and the various Ministries of the Government of India. It received back from them 60,003 documents which were restored to their proper places. It also attended to requisitions for 1,145 rolls of microfilm copies of documents. The Department supplied 1,44,333 exposures of microfilm, 7,610 metres of positive prints, 2,870 copies of enlargement prints and 196 reflex copies to various institutions and individuals. The Departmental Library attended to 35,000 requisitions for books, periodicals, Parliamentary Papers and other

printed materials, from research scholars, members of staff, public and private agencies and individuals. Nine detailed bibliographies on various historical subjects were prepared and supplied to scholars and institutions during the year.

The Department dealt with a large number of enquiries referred to it by both public and private agencies as also by individual research scholars on a variety of topics involving laborious search among the records and the printed materials in its custody. Some of the interesting queries answered by the Department related to Robert Skinner; Macaulay's letters; management of the Jagannath Temple; Dr. Abani Mukherjee, the noted revolutionary; creation of the Board of Scientific Advice in 1903; Bedi Family of Una; Jallianwala Bagh Incident; Muslim Rule in Orissa; Mirza Ghalib's life from 1820 to 1830; Burma Medals; and Sir Edwin Lutyens. (For further details, please see Appendix III).

Preservation and Photoduplication

The Department continued to experience difficulty in procuring imported raw materials owing to the tight foreign exchange position. Consequently only 1,373 sheets of records were laminated during the year under review. In addition, 84,174 sheets were repaired with tissue paper and 2,756 sheets, 27 maps, 91 palm leaves and 9 birch-bark sheets with chiffon. Minor repair was done to 20,607 sheets and 463 maps. 98,406 sheets, 7 *farmans* and 12 maps were deacidified and freed from old patches of paste, etc., 500 maps were mounted, 43,441 sheets flattened, 1,75,589 sheets guarded and 329 Original Consultations docketed. 1,226 volumes, 704 books and 2,332 miscellaneous items were bound. leather preservative dressing was applied to 45,464 leather-bound volumes, and gold-letting was done on 161 volumes. Besides this, the flag unfurled by Gandhiji in South Africa at the time of launching the passive resistance movement in 1908 was repaired and mounted.

The normal work of air-cleaning and fumigation of records and books was continued. 291 volumes, 137 bundles, 88 books and 36 files were fumigated.

Under the microfilming programme of the Department the *Index to the Military Department Proceedings* (1859) was microfilmed and 1,409 exposures were taken.

With the permission of their respective owners, the Department also microfilmed copies of documents relating to Gandhiji; *Maryada*, the first Socialist journal in Hindi edited by Pt. Krishna Kant Malaviya; and a manuscript copy of Swami Dayanand's "*Satyarth Prakash*."

The Department prepared photocopies of documents relating to Afghanistan for presentation to the King of Afghanistan by the Prime Minister of India during the latter's tour of that country.

Research Laboratory

The Research Laboratory of the Department conducted tests on indigenous repair materials like chiffon, handmade paper, long cloth,

glue, etc., in order to ascertain their suitability for use in the repair and rehabilitation of documents, ensuring the latter's maximum durability and longevity. A few samples of paper received from the hand-made paper sector and paper manufacturing mills were also tested. Besides this, experiments to determine the effect of common insecticides on the Permalife Paper received as a gift from the International Council on Museum were concluded and a report on the work was presented at a seminar on 'Conservation' held at the National Museum, New Delhi, under the auspices of the Indian Association for the Study of Conservation of Cultural Property.

Spray deacidification of documents bearing water-soluble writings using magnesium bicarbonate solution was introduced in the Department and a number of documents were so treated. A thin paste with Sarcell Mv, an indigenous product, was used for the first time on a large scale for repair with tissue paper.

Technical Service

Owing to the acute shortage of imported raw film and repair materials, the Department could render technical service to a limited number of institutions and individuals. Repair facilities were extended, among others, to the Lok Sabha Secretariat, New Delhi; All India Kashiraj Trust, Varanasi; Shri Pyarelal Nayar, New Delhi; Shri P. K. Dev, M.P.; and the Maharaja of Kalahandi.

Photoduplication service was rendered to 130 outside agencies, including the Universities of California, Missouri, Michigan, Yale, Columbia, Chicago, Cambridge, Sussex, Heidelberg, Malaya, Sydney, and Western Austria, and those of Patna, Udaipur, Calcutta, Ranchi and Aligarh, the Oriental Institute, Prague; German Academy of Sciences, G.D.R.; State Archives of Andhra Pradesh, Jammu and Kashmir, and Punjab; Institute of Advanced Study, Simla; Victoria Memorial Hall, Calcutta; National Library, Calcutta; Allahabad Museum, Allahabad; Indian National Scientific Documentation Centre, New Delhi; Nehru Memorial Museum and Library, New Delhi; Ministry of Home Affairs; Gazetteers Unit of the Ministry of Education and Youth Services; and Historical Division of the Ministry of External Affairs, New Delhi.

Microfilming of the rare manuscripts belonging to the Raža Library, Rampur, was continued and 5,879 exposures covering about 40 manuscripts were taken.

Advisory Work and Inspection

Technical advice on different aspects of preservation of records and books was given to as many as 30 institutions and individuals, including Khuda Baksh Library, Patna; State Chakradhari Museum, Patna; Gandhi Smarak Sangrahalaya, New Delhi; Institute of Kannada Studies, Mysore; Oriental Research Institute and Library, Kerala; State Archives of West Bengal, Maharashtra, Tamil Nadu and Andhra Pradesh; Department of Horticulture, New Delhi; Lok Sabha Secretariat; Prime Minister's Secretariat; and India

Office Library, London. Several institutions and individuals were also supplied with copies, both in Hindi and English, of the brochure *Repair and Preservation of Records* brought out by this Department.

The Director of Archives inspected the collection of Swami Dayanand manuscripts in the custody of Shrimati Propakarni Sabha, Ajmer, and gave necessary advice for their proper preservation. He also inspected the collection of manuscripts at the Nagri Pracharni Sabha, Varanasi.

The Deputy Director of Archives inspected the collection of papers of Muhammad Ali and Dr. M.A. Ansari in the Jamia Millia Islamia, New Delhi, and suggested measures to check infestation of white ants.

One of the Scientific Officers of this Department inspected the record rooms under the control of Lok Sabha Secretariat and Department of Industrial Development and Internal Trade, and offered similar suggestions.

Some officers of the Department visited 31 Union Government offices located in New Delhi to make a survey of storage and preservation conditions prevailing in their record rooms and submitted a report thereon to the Committee on Record Management set up by the Department of Administrative Reforms, Ministry of Home Affairs.

Some other officers of the Department were deputed to Lucknow to help in the installation of Barrow's Laminator in the regional office of the U.P. State Archives located there.

Training in Archives-Keeping

The six trainees, admitted to the One-Year Diploma Course of training in Archives-keeping last year, successfully completed their training during the year under report and were awarded diplomas. A fresh batch of four trainees joined the new session which commenced in October.

Five trainees, two from the Punjab State Archives and one each from the State Archives of Jammu and Kashmir, Indian Museum, Calcutta, and Banaras Hindu University, Varanasi, were imparted short-term training in preservation and photoduplication of records.

One nominee of the Ministry of External Affairs, New Delhi completed his training in indexing and management of records.

A nominee of the Government of Philippines under the T.C.S. Colombo Plan completed his training in the technique of preservation and photoduplication of rare books and manuscripts.

Exhibition

The documents of the historical importance displayed in the showcases in the Department continued to attract a large number of visitors. The Department organised an exhibition on 'Ghalib and the English' and also participated in the exhibition organised at Vigyan Bhawan, New Delhi by the Defence Scientific Information and Documentation Centre, on the 'methods of preservation of records and microfilms'.

Publication

Steady progress was made in the implementation of the Publication Programme of the Department. Under Scheme I of the Programme, Vol. XXI (Military Department, 1797—1800; Honorary Editor: Prof. S. R. Kohli) in the series *Fort William—India House Correspondence* was published. The printing of Vol. XX (Military Department, 1792—1796; Honorary Editor: Dr. A. C. Banerjee) in the same series neared completion and that of Vol. VII (Public Department, 1773—1776; Honorary Editor: Prof. R. P. Patwardhan) made further progress. The scrutiny of the editorial work of Vol. X (Public Department, 1786—1788; Honorary Editor: Dr. Raghubir Singh) was completed and that of Vol. XI (Public Department, 1789—1792; Honorary Editor: Dr. I. B. Banerjee) taken in hand.

Volumes I and II of the *Calendar of Persian Correspondence* having run out of stock, their reprinting by the photo offset process was undertaken. It is expected that the two volumes would be out next year. The printing of Vol. XI (1794-1795) in the same series was completed and the work relating to the compilation of Vol. XII (1796—1800) made good progress.

Under the scheme of publishing *Selections from Educational Records of the Government of India*, the printing of Volume IV of the series, dealing with the development of technical education in India (1854—1907), was completed, and the work relating to the collection of materials for the volumes on female education in India (1860—1947) and development of technical education in the provinces (1860—1907) was continued.

Volume XVII (January 1967—December 1968) and Vol. XVIII—No. 1 (January—June 1969) of the Departmental journal *The Indian Archives* were sent to the Press during the year. Some of the interesting articles contained in Volume XVII are: "Materials relating to Eighteenth and Nineteenth Century Indo-American Trade and Consular Relations in Private Archives in the United States" by G. Bhagat; "Collections of Papers relating to India in the British Museum" by L.J. Gorton; "Two Firmans of Aurangzeb" by B.P. Saxena; and "How Does one Collect Archives?—The Oregon Experience" by David C. Duniway; and those in Vol. XVIII—No. I are: "Records Appraisal: A Demanding Task" by Lewis J. Darter, Jr., "Materials of Indian Interest in Soviet Archives" by Devendra Kaushik; and "Sources for Arya Samaj History: An Exploratory Essay" by Kenneth W. Jones.

National Register of Private Records

The programme of survey of private records suffered a set-back during the year on account of stoppage of Central grants-in-aid to the States participating in the National Register Scheme. Only 9 proformas covering 123 documents were received from the State of Andhra Pradesh. However, the work of consolidating and editing the survey reports and lists of records received in the Department during the years 1959 and 1960 neared completion.

Advisory Bodies and Committees

Indian Historical Records Commission—The Fortieth Session of the Indian Historical Records Commission and Twenty-fourth Meeting of the National Committee of Archivists, which were scheduled to be held at Madras in November 1969 under the auspices of the Government of Tamil Nadu, could not be held due to unavoidable circumstances. It was decided to hold the same early next year. However, formalities connected with the appointment of new Ordinary and Corresponding Members of the Commission were completed.

Historical Documents Purchase Committee—The Committee met in New Delhi twice during the year—on 25 June and 19 December—to consider the acquisition of archival documents and private papers offered for sale by various parties. Among the important items selected for purchase were the Malaviya Papers, 38 documents bearing on the history of Jammu and Kashmir, and a collection of 15 letters of Har Dayal, the noted Indian revolutionary.

Hindi Section

Besides supplying translations of official correspondence from English into Hindi and *vice versa* as and when required, the Hindi Section of the Department translated into Hindi the *Annual Reports of the National Archives of India* for the years 1964, 1965 and 1966; Vol. II of the *Descriptive List of Mutiny Papers in the National Archives of India, Bhopal*; the brochure entitled *Diplomatic of Sanskrit Copper-Plate Grants*; 210 pages of *Indian Travels of Thevenot and Careri*; and 45 pages of the *Index to the Land Revenue Records, Vol. II (1838—59)*.

The Hindi version of the *Annual Report of the National Archives of India* for 1963, prepared earlier, was cyclostyled and distributed.

Other Activities of the Director and other Officers of the Department

Dr. S.N. Prasad, Director of Archives, represented the Department on the Indian History Congress and attended the thirty-first session thereof held at Varanasi on 28—30 December. He and the Deputy Director of Archives, Shri R. C. Gupta, attended a seminar on 'Information' organised by the Defence Scientific Documentation Centre, New Delhi at Vigyan Bhawan on 4—6 December. Shri Gupta and some members of the staff of the Preservation Division participated in the 4th seminar on 'Conservation' held at the National Museum, New Delhi in October under the auspices of the Indian Association for the Study of Conservation of Cultural Property. The following three papers were presented by the Department: (i) Effects of Clenofix and other Common Insecticides on Permalife Paper; (ii) Performance of Thin Paste with Sarcell Mv for Repair with Tissue Paper; and (iii) An approach to the Preservation of Photographic Materials.

Dr. S. V. Desikachar, Assistant Director of Archives (Records Management) represented the Department at the 7th annual conference of the Institute of Historical Studies, Calcutta, held at Bangalore on 4—7 November.

Shri S. A. I. Tirmizi, Assistant Director of Archives (Oriental Records), read a paper entitled "Persian Archives in Indian Repositories" at a seminar on the 'Development of Persian Studies in India' held at Azad Bhawan, New Delhi on 25—27 December.

The Department continued to collaborate with the Indian Standards Institution on the latter's various committees, including the one on Ink and Allied Products. As Convenor of the Sub-Committee on Reprography (S.C. 2:2) of the said Institution, Shri R.C. Gupta presided over its meeting held at Ootacamund in October.

The Librarian, Shri J. C. Srivastava and Assistant Librarian, Shri S.K. Bhatnagar, represented the Department at the meeting of the Indian Association of Special Libraries and Information Centres and at the conference of the Indian Library Association held at Bombay and Tirupati respectively.

Regional Office, Bhopal

Accession—90 books were acquired and added to the Office Library.

Checking and Arrangement—2,388 files of the Political Department (1942—44) of the erstwhile Bhopal State and 1,130 files of the Department of Finance and Commerce (Separate Revenue Branch, 1889—98) were checked and arranged. In addition to this, 7,869 files of the *Daftar-i-Insha* and the Political Department were checked with their lists. 475 bundles of records mainly of the Political Department, and 1,464 volumes of the *Daftar-i-Insha* and of the Acts and Rules pertaining to the State were labelled. 369 files of the Political Department and of the Municipal Board, Bhopal, were docketed.

Compilation of Reference Aids—Lists, giving subjects and references, were prepared of 2,383 files of the Political Department, Bhopal (1942-43) and of 1,030 files of the Department of Finance and Commerce (Separate Revenue Branch, 1889—98). Work on the preparation of Volume IV of the *Descriptive List of Mutiny Papers* made further progress.

Preservation—Apart from the usual dusting of records and books and disinfection of the stack area and the Library with 'Pip' insecticide, 1,524 volumes, 490 bundles and 353 files were fumigated with paradichlorobenzene. Besides 11,510 sheets were flattened, 30,163 sheets guarded, 10,654 sheets repaired with tissue paper, and 1,941 sheets laminated.

APPENDIX II

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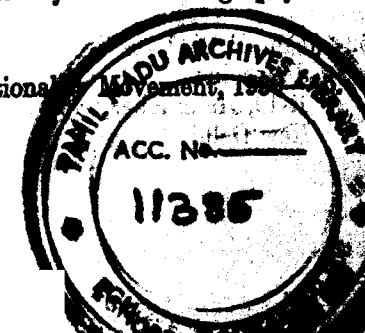

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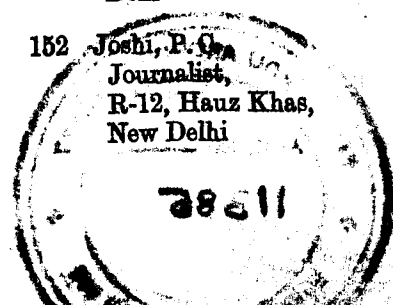
