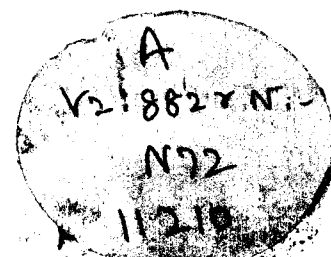

Accessions

Public Records.—Notwithstanding the acute paucity of space which hampered the record retirement programme, the Department accessioned 280 files of the Ministry of External Affairs (Foreign and Political Branch, 1913-42), 379 files of Home (Judicial) Department (1905-48), 37 files of Home (Political) Department (1946-47), 79 volumes of indexes of Home (General) Department (1858-1959) and 48 authenticated copies of Bills passed by the various State Legislatures and assented to by the President of India.

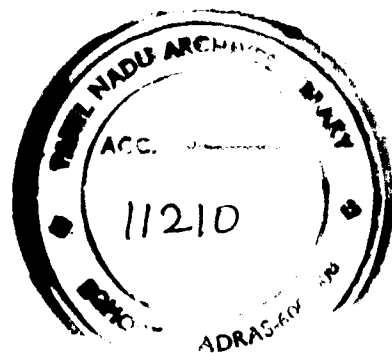
Private Papers and Manuscripts.—Under the programme of acquiring private papers of historical value, the Department received the private papers of Pt. Padma Kant Malaviya, a collection consisting of 61 volumes of old files of the *Abhyudaya*, one volume of *Sewa* and 39 files of correspondence, one album and two files of material on the life of the late Pt. Madan Mohan Malaviya. Other acquisitions include 15 letters of Lala Har Dayal, the noted Indian revolutionary, relating to his activities at Paris and Algiers during 7 May-15 June, 1910, copies of papers belonging to the National Integration Council (1968-69), a copy of the report by Babu Rajendra Prasad entitled 'Bengali-Bihari Question', together with a copy of the resolution of the Working Committee of the All-India Congress Committee, 1939, and a certificate regarding the conviction and death sentence of Madan Lal Dhillon, the noted revolutionary, obtained from the Central Court, Old Bailey, London.

Microfilm Collection.—Some significant additions were made to the microfilm collection of the Department which comprised 32 rolls of the Lytton Papers, 13 rolls of the Cross Papers obtained from the India Office Library, London, and 2 rolls of the Granville Papers from the Public Record Office, London.

Books and Periodicals.—1265 books and periodicals were added to the Departmental Library during the year. Some rare and out-of-print works acquired are:

- (i) *Historical Account of the British Trade over Caspian Sea*, Vol. I, by J. Hanway (1753);
- (ii) *The Narrative of the Life of a Gentleman Long Resident in India* by G. F. Grand (1814);
- (iii) *The Speeches Delivered in India, 1884-8*, by Marquis of Dufferin of Ava (1890);
- (iv) *Tea Machinery and Tea Factories* by A. J. Wallis-Taylor (1900);
- (v) *Problems of Indian Nationality* by Sukumar Dutt (1926).

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Checking and Arrangement

The normal work of checking and arrangement of the different series of records in the custody of the Department was continued. 5,091 proceedings of the Survey of India and 668 Despatches of Home (Public) Department (1882-91) were checked and re-arranged during the year. 3,323 documents of the Inayat Jang Collection relating to the reigns of Aurangzeb, Bahadur Shah I, Jahandar Shah and Farrukh Siyar were numbered and docketed. Some of the documents are highly interesting as, for instance, Sr. No. 1/17/44 belonging to the reign of Emperor Aurangzeb which reveals that a medical certificate was normally submitted by a *mansabdar* in case of absence from duty on grounds of illness and that in the event of non-compliance his *jagir mahal* or *tankwah* could be confiscated. Sr. Nos. 111/3/116 of the reign of Bahadur Shah I refer to an *arzi* of the *vakil* of Raja Sahu for the grant of *sardeshmukhi* of the six *subahs* of the Deccan. Besides completing stock-checking of the M. R. Jayakar, V. S. Srinivasa Sastri, Badruddin Tyabji, V. Krishnaswamy Aiyar, J. Coyaji, Inayat Jang, G. S. Khaparde, K. Santhanam, K. M. Panikkar, Sir Sita Ram, P. D. Tandon, Indian Independence League Collections, the work of classification, arrangement and docketing of Sir Sita Ram Papers was completed and that of the Dadabhai Naoroji, Pt. Padma Kant Malaviya, Sir P. S. Sivaswamy Aiyar, V. Krishnaswamy Aiyar and M. R. Jayakar Papers made further progress.

Compilation of Reference Aids

The programme of preparing reference media to the records in the custody of the Department made steady progress. 27,182 'B' Proceedings of the Military Department (May 1903-November 1907), 2,688 'A' Proceedings of the Home (Education) (1871-89) and 525 'B' Proceedings of Revenue and Agriculture (Revenue) Department (1886-87) were check-listed. 668 Despatches to the Secretary of State for India Home (Public) Department (1882-97) and 215 maps of Village Plans (Revenue) of Survey of India (1882-84) were subject-listed. Check-lists were also prepared of the papers of K. Santhanam, Maulana-Abul Kalam Azad and G. S. Khaparde. Descriptive listing of Sir Sita Ram, Padma Kant Malaviya and V. Krishnaswamy Aiyar collections was completed and that of Dadabhai Naoroji and P. S. Sivaswamy Aiyar made further progress. Steady progress was made in the preparation of a general Guide to the microfilms in the National Archives of India. In addition to the above the following collections were subject-listed: papers of Bantnick, Cowan, J. F. Stephen, Melville, Ripon, Curzon, George Hamilton, Minto, Hardinge, U. S. Attorneys and Marshals Records, General Records of the Department of Justice, Immigration and Nationalization Service Records, papers of U. S. Consulates at Madras and Bombay, papers entitled 'Hindu Conspiracy and Neutrality of the United States' and San Francisco Trial Papers bearing on the Ghadr Movement in the U.S.A.

During the year Volume II of the *Descriptive List of Secret Department Records* (1776-80) was printed and that for the year 1784 was cyclostyled. Preparation of a similar list for 1795 was completed and progress was made in that for the year 1787. Descriptive listing of the Original Persian Letters Received (1820) was completed and work on such letters of the years 1821-23 made progress. Work on the preparation of a catalogue

of the seals found among the Original Persian Letters Issued made further progress, the number of seals catalogued during the year being 378. Besides, 618 catalogue slips of Mughal seals were classified under various heads: (i) Kings, (ii) Crown Princes, (iii) Queens, (iv) Police, (v) Army, etc. Also the compilation of the Index to the proceedings of the National Archives of India for the year 1950 was completed.

Appraisal

The programme of appraising non-current records and drawing up schedules of unimportant papers, with a view to their eventual destruction made further progress. As many as 43,121 files of the Bundelkhand Agency (1922-47), Department of Education, Health and Lands (1927-48), Finance Department (1885-1946), and Foreign and Political Department (1911-46), were appraised and, out of these, 11,422 files were marked for permanent retention. Survey work of records lying in the custody of Ministry of External Affairs, Department of Expenditure of the Ministry of Finance, Army Medical Directorate and Office of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India was completed. After examining the records of the Department of Revenue and Agriculture the following series have been selected for transfer to the Department for permanent custody: 136 files (1871-1938) and 133 indexes to the proceedings of the Department of Revenue and Agriculture (1870-1921), 94 index-cum-proceedings (1872-1919), 13 volumes of the Monthly Rainfall in India (1911-22), 14 volumes of the Magnetical, Meteorological and Seismographic Observations.

Notes on administrative histories of the Office of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India and the Ministries of External Affairs, Finance, and Tourism and Civil Aviation were prepared to facilitate the work of appraisal.

Research and Reference Service

The Research Room of the Department continued to be kept open from 9 A.M. to 8 P.M. on week days and from 9 A.M. to 4.30 P.M. on Sundays and other holidays. There was a significant addition to the number of research scholars who availed themselves of the facilities offered by the Department for consulting records and published works. As against 419 during 1969, as many as 550 scholars, including a good number from countries like Afghanistan, Australia, Canada, Ceylon, Iran, Denmark, Japan, Kenya, Nepal, Sweden, U.K., U.S.A., West Germany, and U.S.S.R., worked in the Research Room in 1970. Subjects bearing on the administrative, social, revenue and biographical studies continued to dominate the field of research. The study of some aspect of the Nationalist Movement in India remains for many a favourite subject. (For the names of scholars and the subjects of their research, please see Appendix I).

The Department attended to 1,02,590 requisitions for records from research scholars, members of the staff of the National Archives of India and the various Ministries of the Government of India and 65,472 documents were received back and restored to their places. 416 maps were supplied on requests and 702 maps were received back for restoration. It also attended to requisitions for 872 rolls of microfilm copies of records.

The Department also supplied 1,88,467 exposures of microfilm, 6,551 metres of positive prints, 3,190 copies of enlargement prints and 48 reflex copies to various institutions and individuals. The Departmental Library supplied 50,307 volumes which comprised books, periodicals, Parliamentary Papers and other printed material and 35,041 volumes were received back and restored to their respective places. 190 publications were obtained on inter-library loan for scholars and members of the staff.

A large number of enquiries referred to the Department both by the public and private agencies as also by individual scholars on a variety of subjects were dealt with. 29 such enquiries were from public agencies and 105 from private agencies. Besides, the Departmental Library answered 2,127 queries and supplied 1,728 references from the Gazettes and other publications. Some of the interesting queries answered by the Department related to the trial of Vasudev Balwant Phadke, political ideas of Sukracharya, *Bande Matram* and *Yugantar* newspapers, Khaksar Movement, religion of the Thugs, flags of the former Indian States, etc. (for further details please see Appendix II).

Preservation and Photoduplication

Due to shortage of raw material, repair work could not make much headway. Nevertheless 3,190 sheets of records were laminated, 53,811 sheets repaired with tissue paper and 5,709 sheets and 20 maps with chiffon. Minor repair was done to 36,143 sheets, 465 maps and 15 posters. 1,25,237 sheets and 33 maps were deacidified and freed from old patches of paste, etc., 482 maps were mounted, 70,905 sheets flattened, 1,85,713 sheets docketed. 717 volumes, 370 books, 164 Original Consultations, 4,021 booklets and 830 miscellaneous items were bound, and leather preservative dressing was applied to 36,565 leather-bound volumes.

The normal work of air-cleaning and fumigation of records and books was continued. 90 volumes, 60 bundles and 176 books, pictures, etc. were air-cleaned while 2,000 volumes of records, 28 bundles and 2,000 books were fumigated.

Research Laboratory

The Research Laboratory of the Department continued testing of repair materials like chiffon, handmade paper, tissue paper, long cloth, etc. in order to ascertain their respective suitability for use in repair and rehabilitation of records. Samples of naphthalene (for the Regional Office, Bhopal) were tested for suitability for use in stack rooms as deterrent to insects, pests, etc. Samples of duplicating paper were also tested to ascertain their suitability for stencil duplication jobs. A few samples of paper and card paper received from indigenous manufacturers were used as file covers and catalogue card paper.

Treatment of damaged seals in Persian Original Letters Received is in progress with a view to arrest further damage. Testing of processed microfilms, kept in storage in the Department, for their residual hypo content was continued with a view to wash and repair them if necessary to prevent deterioration of their image. Samples of microfilm for archival use manufactured by M/s. Hindustan Photo Film Manufacturing Co., Ootacamund, have been tested in the Research Laboratory and it is hoped that the

Company will be able to manufacture microfilm as per the required specification. A sample of the paper (blank) of the calligraphic copy of the Indian Constitution kept in the Lok Sabha Library was examined to determine if any treatment is necessary to preserve the text sheets. Preliminary studies to determine the effect of various plasticizers and oils on the flexibility of palm leaf have been taken in hand with a view to find out a suitable plasticizer to increase flexibility of the palm leaf manuscripts.

Technical Service

Shortage of imported raw film and repair materials incapacitated the Department from rendering technical service to institutions and individuals on a large scale. However, such services were extended, though on a limited scale, to a few institutions and individuals. Among the beneficiaries mention may be made of the Lok Sabha Secretariat and the Ministry of External Affairs for whom some books and records were fumigated. Work on repair and rehabilitation of (1) Gandhiji's papers received from Shri Pyare Lal Nayyar, New Delhi, and Prof. N. K. Bose, Calcutta, (2) files of the *Independent* received from the Nehru Memorial Museum and Library, New Delhi, is being continued. Mention may also be made of the Intelligence Bureau, Ministry of Home Affairs, Survey of India, Dehra Dun, Horticulture Department, C.P.W.D., New Delhi, Dr. V. S. Sastri, Department of Oriental Studies, Agra University, Agra, 5th Maratha Light Infantry, Gazetteer Unit, Ministry of Education and Youth Services, who availed themselves of the repair facilities.

Photoduplication service was rendered to several outside agencies including the Universities of Oxford, Cambridge, Sussex, Heidelberg, Queensland, Duke, Chicago, Oregon, Hamilton, Kabul, Nanyang, Agricultural Economic Research Centre, Delhi University, Embassy of Iran, Government of Argentina, Government of Goa, Ministry of Defence, Gazetteers Unit of the Ministry of Education and Youth Services, Registrar General of India, New Delhi, Orissa State Archives and All-India Kashi Raj Trust, Varanasi.

Photocopies were prepared for display at the exhibition of the rare books and manuscripts of Fort William College Collection organised at the India International Centre, New Delhi. Similar copies were prepared of documents relating to Tagore and Ramanujam for display at the exhibition of Expo '70 in Japan.

With the permission of their respective owners, the Department microfilmed Swami Dayanand Manuscripts belonging to Shrimati Paropkarni Sabha, Ajmer, and papers of the late Sardar Patel.

Advisory Work and Inspection

The Department rendered technical advice on the different aspects of preservation of records, rare books and manuscripts to as many as 30 institutions and individuals. From among them mention may be made of Adyar Library and Research Centre, Madras, Jammu University Library, Jammu, Vishvasranand Institute of Sanskrit Studies, Hoshiarpur, Survey of India, Dehra Dun, Municipal Corporation of Surat, Himalayan Mountaineering Institute, Darjeeling, Central Glass and Ceramic Research Institute, Calcutta, Tamil Nadu State Archives, Madras, National Archives of Malaysia, Nepal Government, Space Science and Technology Centre, New Delhi, Indian National Scientific Academy, New Delhi, and Himachal Pradesh

University Library, Palampur. Several institutions and individuals were supplied with copies, both in Hindi and English, of the brochure *Repair and Preservation of Records*.

The Deputy Director of Archives inspected the reprography and repair section of the National Library, Calcutta, and discussed their staff requirement. He also inspected vacuum fumigation plant installed at the Plant Quarantine and Fumigation Centre, Calcutta. The Scientific Officer of the Department inspected white ant damaged records in the Lok Sabha Secretariat and recommended measures for their safe preservation. He also inspected the store rooms of the Commission for Scientific and Technical Terminology, New Delhi, and record rooms of the offices of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India, New Delhi, and Director General of Supplies and Disposal, New Delhi, and suggested measures to check infestation of white ants. Some other officers inspected the record rooms of the Ministries of Foreign Trade and Labour and Jaipur Udyog, Ltd., New Delhi, and tendered advice on record management.

Training in Archives-Keeping

The four trainees admitted to the One-Year Diploma Course of training in Archives-keeping last year, successfully completed their training during the year under report and were awarded diplomas. A fresh batch of 8 trainees joined the new session which commenced in October.

Mohammad Ishaq of Aligarh Muslim University Library was imparted short-term training in repair and preservation of records. Training in various aspects of photoduplication was given to Shri Bala Ram Chitrakar, a trainee from Nepal under Colombo Plan.

Exhibition

An exhibition of the rare books belonging to the defunct Library of Board of Examiners of the Fort William College was organised at the India International Centre, New Delhi, in March-April 1970.

The Department's permanent exhibition of select documents and manuscripts illustrating different aspects of modern Indian History continued to attract visitors in large numbers, including students from various schools and colleges.

Publication

The Publication Programme of the Department made steady progress. Under Scheme I of the programme, the printing of Vol. VII (Public Department, 1773-1776; Honorary Editor: Prof. R. P. Patwardhan) and Vol. XX (Military Department 1792-1796; Honorary Editor: Dr. A. C. Banerjee) in the series *Fort William-India House Correspondence* made further progress and it is expected that the abovementioned volumes will be out of the press by the middle of the next year. Vol. X (Public Department, 1786-1788; Honorary Editor: Dr. Raghubir Singh) and Vol. XI (Public Department, 1789-1792; Honorary Editor: Dr. I. B. Banerjee) were sent to the press. The scrutiny of the editorial work of Vol. XVI (Foreign, Political and Secret Department, 1787-1791; Honorary Editor: Prof. S. H. Askari), Vol. XVIII (Foreign, Political and Secret Department, 1796-1800; Honorary Editor: Rev Father H. Heras) and Vol. XIX (Military Department, 1787-1791; Honorary Editor: Dr. B. Prasad) was taken up.

The reprinting by photo offset press of Vols. I and II of the *Calendar of Persian Correspondence* neared completion. During the year *Descriptive List of Secret Department Records*, Vol. II (1776-1780) was published, that for the year 1784 cyclostyled, and for the year 1795 prepared.

Under the scheme of publishing *Selections from Educational Records of the Government of India*, the preparation of the volumes on *Technical Education in Provinces* and *Female Education* was continued.

The printing of the Departmental journal *The Indian Archives* Vol. XVIII, No. 1 (January-June 1969) was completed and that of Vol. XVIII, No. 2 (July-December 1969) neared completion. Vol. XIX, No. 1 (January-June 1970) of the same was sent to the Press. Some of the interesting articles contained in the Volume are: "Archival Considerations regarding Reference Materials accessioned with Records" by Dr. Chester Guthrie; "Archival Handling of Printed and Published Materials" by Dolores Renze; "On Some Historical Records in Possession of Old Families of Priests" by Dr. B. N. Goswami, and "An Approach to Preservation of Photographic Materials" by R. C. Gupta.

National Register of Private Records

The Department received 160 proformas covering 194 documents/collections, 250 bundles of papers and 300 account papers as well as 14 lists covering 143 items from the States of Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Bihar, Mysore, Maharashtra, Tamil Nadu and Uttar Pradesh. Besides, two survey reports on 120 bundles of papers were also received, and are under scrutiny. The proformas received from the Regional Records Survey Committee, Bihar, include *sanads*, *parwanas* and *farmans* of the Mughal period. The Maharashtra State Archive supplied notes on two collections (1800-50), acquired by them from the Sangli State. The proformas from the Uttar Pradesh State Archives mentioned 33 letters of Wajid Ali Shah (November 1855-February 1857) and *farmans* of Emperor Aurangzeb. Another significant item registered are the letters from Shah Jahan to the Sultan of Bijapur in 1644 in the custody of Dr. Mohammad Ghouse of Tamil Nadu. Steady progress was maintained in the work of compilation and editing of materials received during 1959-62 for the National Register. The work on the Kapad Dwara Collection of the Maharaja of Jaipur was completed.

Advisory Bodies and Committees

Indian Historical Records Commission—The Fortieth Session of the Indian Historical Records Commission was held at Madras in February 1970 under the auspices of the Government of Tamil Nadu. The Session was presided over by Dr. V. K. R. V. Rao, Union Minister of Education and Youth Services. It attracted a large number of scholars, historians and archivists from all over India, including representatives of the Central and State Governments, universities and learned institutions. At the Business Meeting of the Commission a number of resolutions were passed, important among them being those relating to publication by the Government of India of records pertaining to transfer of power and partition of India, inclusion of development of archives in the Central and State Plans, access to old records of the State Bank of India, obtaining from U.K. copies of such records bearing on the military history of India as are not available in the

country, set up by the National Archives of India of mobile microfilm units for taking copies of private papers in different parts of India, centralization in the State Archives of records bearing on the National Movement in India, liberalization of rules governing access to records and amendment of the Antiquities Export Control Act.

The Twenty-fourth meeting of the National Committee of Archivists was also held at Madras in February 1970 along with session of the Commission. Among the subjects discussed were: setting up of scientific laboratories in the State Archives, visit by the Director of Archives, National Archives of India, to the State Archives with a view to assist them in improving the working of their repositories, and desirability of arranging radio talks by members of the Committee from various stations of the All India Radio on the need to preserve private archives.

The forty-first session of the Indian Historical Records Commission and the twenty-fifth meeting of the National Committee of Archivists, which were scheduled to be held in November, 1970 under the auspices of the Government of Kerala, could not be held due to some unavoidable circumstances. These are now likely to be held sometime in May 1971.

Historical Documents Purchase Committee.—During the year the Historical Documents Purchase Committee met twice on 25 April 1970 and 17 December 1970 and recommended purchase of 46 letters in Persian relating to Mysore; 4 *qabalas* (sale-deeds) in Persian relating to Lucknow, 42 documents in Persian relating to West Punjab from 1845 to 1849; R. C. Dutt's papers comprising 26 letters, a note-book and 11 documents in Oriya.

Staff

The staff of the Department underwent some changes during the year under report, noteworthy among them being those mentioned hereunder.

Shri S. A. I. Tirmizi, Assistant Director of Archives (Oriental Records) went on deputation to the Jammu and Kashmir Government as State Editor of District Gazetteers.

Shri K. S. Anthony, Assistant Archivist (Grade I, General) who went to France on a French Government scholarship for training in Archives-keeping, returned to the Department.

On the recommendations of the Staff Inspection Unit of the Ministry of Finance, 12 posts (non-gazetted) were abolished. After abolition of the said posts the sanctioned strength of the establishment of the Department was 401 (National Archives of India, New Delhi, 362 and Regional Office, Bhopal, 39). For administrative reasons 34 vacancies (Class I—2, Class II—4, Class III—19 and Class IV—9) remained unfilled at the end of the period under report.

One post of Archivist (General), 1 post of Assistant Archivist (Grade I, 3 posts of Assistant Archivist (Grade II, General) and 2 posts of Lower Division Clerk were created under the Fourth Five-Year Plan for the implementation of the various programmes of the Department. Posts required for the several other Plan schemes of the National Archives of India remained under the consideration of the Government.

Hindi Section

Besides supplying translations of official correspondence from English into Hindi and *vice versa* as and when required, the Hindi Section of the Department translated into Hindi the *Annual Reports of the National Archives of India* for the years 1967-68 and 1969 and the brochure entitled 'Archives and Reports—What are they?' The Hindi version of the *Annual Report* for 1964 was cyclostyled and distributed and those of the years 1967-68 and 1969 were sent to the Press.

Other Activities of the Director and other Officers of the Department

Dr. S. N. Prasad, Director of Archives, attended the 13th International Congress of Historical Sciences held in Moscow on 16-22 August 1970 and the meeting of the Executive Committee of the International Council on Archives in London on 7-9 September 1970. During his stay in London he also visited Public Record Office and India Office Library to arrange for microfilms of records of Indian interest. He attended a meeting of the Board of Management of the Khuda Bakhsh Oriental Public Library, Patna, on 30 March 1970. He also attended the meeting of the Art Purchase Committee held in the National Museum, New Delhi, on 22-24 December 1970. The Deputy Director of Archives, Shri R. C. Gupta, attended the 20th meeting of the Inks and Allied Committee of the Indian Standards Institution at Calcutta and the 20th meeting of the Library Building, Fitting, Furniture Sectional Committee of the Indian Standards Institution, New Delhi. He and the Scientific Officer attended the Documentation Sectional Committee of the Indian Standards Institution, New Delhi. They also delivered a series of talks on preservation and storage of records to the trainees of the Secretariat Training School, New Delhi. The Deputy Director of Archives and some other officers attended the 5th seminar on Conservation organised by the Indian Association for the Study of Conservation of Cultural Property at the National Museum, New Delhi. The papers read at the seminar were: "Effect of Alternate Heating and Cooling on Physical Properties of Paper under Dry Conditions" by Sarvashree Ranbir Kishore and R. C. Gupta; 'Control of Rat Menace in Libraries, Manuscript Repositories and Archives' by Sarvashree Ranbir Kishore and C. P. Mehra, and "My Impressions of Restoration of the flood-damaged Manuscripts at Florence" by Shri Y. P. Kathpalia.

Dr. S. V. Desikachar, Assistant Director of Archives (Record Management) attended the 8th Annual Conference of the Madhya Pradesh Itihas Parishad held at Bhopal on 21-22 November 1970. Shri N. H. Kulkarni, Archivist, read a paper entitled 'History in Marathi Novel and Drama' at the Conference of the Institute of 'Historical Studies, Calcutta', held at Jodhpur on 20-23 October 1970. Shri H. N. Mathur, Archivist, participated in the 32nd session of the Indian History Congress at Jabalpur on 28-30 December 1970.

Regional Office, Bhopal

Accession.—19 books were acquired and added to the Office Library.

Checking and Arrangement.—2,214 files of the Political Department (1944-45) of the erstwhile Bhopal State and 1,716 files of the Department of Finance and Commerce (Separate Revenue Branch, 1899-1910) were checked and arranged. 135 bundles of records mainly of the Political Department of the erstwhile Bhopal State and 258 volumes belonging to the

Daftar-i-Insha were labelled; 440 files of the Political Department were docketed.

Compilation of Reference Aids.—Lists, giving subjects and references, were prepared of 2,214 files of the Political Department, Bhopal (1944-45) and 1,716 files of the Department of Finance and Commerce (Separate Revenue Branch, 1899-1901). Work on the preparation of Vol. IV of the *Descriptive List of Mutiny Papers* made further progress.

Reference Service.—Besides attending to a number of requisitions from the Government of Madhya Pradesh, 2,336 files of Political Department (External Affairs Branch, 1946-49) were issued for consultation to Shri R. S. Sharma, Assistant Survey Officer of the Madhya Pradesh Government. 408 bundles and 1,073 volumes were received back for restoration.

Preservation.—Apart from the usual dusting of records and books, 1,569 volumes were fumigated with paradichloroabenzene. Besides, 249 volumes of *Daftar-i-Insha* were repaired, 1,73,705 sheets paginated, 9,615 sheets flattened, 36,182 sheets guarded, 15,591 repaired with tissue paper and 5,618 sheets laminated.

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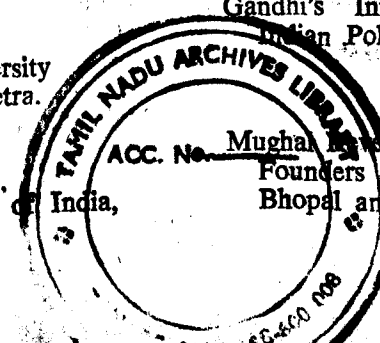

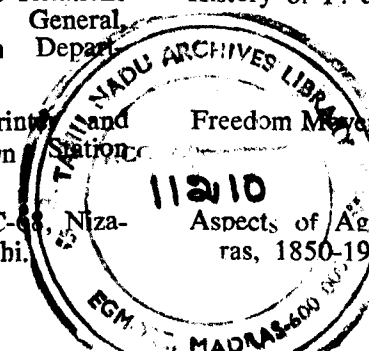
