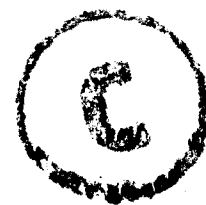


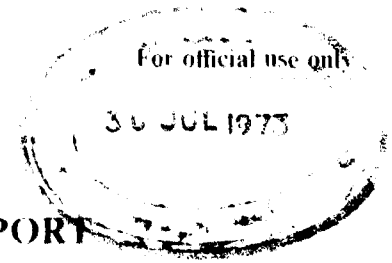

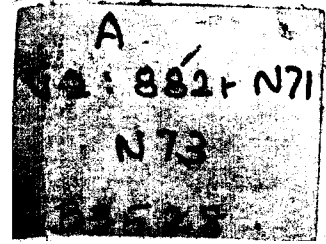

A. Some Highlights

During the year under report, the National Archives of India celebrated quietly its 80th birthday. It is senior in age to the National Museum by 58 years, and to the National Library by 6 months. When the National Archives of India took birth on 11th March 1891 as the Imperial Record Department, the Education Ministry itself was a "Branch" in the Home Department of the Central Government.

Prior to the creation of the Imperial Record Department, every Department of the Government of India used to look after its own records, and no uniform policy of Archives Administration could be evolved or pursued. The activities of the Imperial Record Department were limited in the beginning to collection, cataloguing, classification, and arrangement of records. The staff consisted of only 8 clerks. The Department was housed in half a dozen rooms on the ground floor of the Imperial Secretariat building at Calcutta.

Today the National Archives of India is considered the largest well-equipped archival repository east of the Suez, with over 25 K.M. of shelf length of records, and about 300 technical staff with different specialisations within the field of archivology. In 1971, it received 574 research scholars, including 83 foreigners, whereas only 352 scholars worked in the Archives from 1940 to 1948. No fee was charged, of course, for the assistance and facilities they received, including the servicing of 50,000 requisitions made by them for their research work.

The National Archives of India acquired during 1971 official records of the Government of India totalling 28,535 files, and private papers special collections totalling 1.7 lakh pages. The official files included important records of the late Foreign and Political Department, the Ministry of States, Home Department and the Railways. Among the private papers and special collections acquired, the voluminous records of the Meerut Conspiracy Case, the personal papers of Dr. Sampurnanand, and the private collection of Shri Banarsi Das Chaturvedi deserve special mention. In addition, micro-film copies of about 1 lakh pages were also acquired from within the country and from abroad.

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These massive acquisitions mean heavy additional work for the staff engaged in arranging, checking and listing them, since most of the papers received are in disordered state without any arrangement. Arranging and listing them would take time, but at least these valuable papers are now safe from the danger of decay and destruction. In 1971, 54,000 files and documents were checked and arranged. Against 43,000 files in 1970, 69,000 files were carefully examined and appraised in 1971 in different Government offices, and 31,000 of them were found valuable enough to be preserved permanently. More than 83,700 files had their check-lists or subject-lists prepared.

The National Archives has a well-developed Preservation Division, with facilities for all types of repairs to damaged or decaying records. In 1971, this Division deacidified, flattened or guarded about 4.4 lakhs sheets or leaves of documents, repaired 80,000 such sheets, and bound 65,000 volumes. The Photoduplication Division prepared microfilms, negative or positive, totalling over 8 lakh pages, for scholars and for the Department itself. The Department sold Rs. 45,000 worth of microfilm of old records to scholars and "learned institutions".

The above figures speak for themselves, and invite a comparison with the output, and budget allocations of other institutions, official or autonomous, engaged on similar work.

While looking back with some satisfaction on a year of "something attempted, something done", the National Archives of India is conscious of many problems yet to be solved. The existing building is overfull with records and staff. Construction of an Annexe has been sanctioned in 1971 at an estimated cost of 111 lakhs of rupees. Maintaining the overall elevation of the existing building, the Annexe will have five floors, with large air-conditioned halls for the storage of records and for accommodating the research scholars and some of the expensive and sophisticated photoduplication equipment. Construction is expected to begin during 1972-73.

Another basic improvement eagerly awaited is the adoption of an Archival Policy Resolution by the Cabinet, to regulate the proper management of all records of the Central Government and their eventual transfer to the National Archives, and to serve in lieu of the Archival Legislation urged by a high-powered expert Committee in 1960. The Government is also expected to raise soon the status of the National Archives from a "Subordinate" to an "Attached" Office of the Ministry of Education & Social Welfare,

which would facilitate the work of the technical officers of the Department in their constant dealings with various Ministries, and bring the Office Assistants and Clerks on par with their counterparts in the Ministries.

Additional staff was also sanctioned in 1970-71 for clearing the arrears of work in the valuable National Archives Library of 2,00,000 books, and in listing properly the growing accumulation of records.

The following sections of this Report give further details about the different activities of the National Archives of India in 1971.

B. Archival Management

(i) Accessions

(a) *Official Records*:—Chronic shortage of space continued to impede the record retirement programme of the Department. During the period under review, only such records could be accessioned which filled in the gaps in the existing series or could no longer be accommodated by the owning agencies. The fresh accruals consist of the records of the Foreign and Political Department (1559 files), Legislative Department (1,837 files), Department of Revenue and Agriculture, Education, Health and Lands (1,964 files), and Railway Board (23,175 files), and 399 authenticated copies of Bills passed by the various State Legislatures and assented to by the President of India.

(b) *Private Papers*:—A bunch of letters to C. F. Andrews by Mahatma Gandhi find a prominent place in the Banarsi Dass collection, which was acquired by the Department during the period under review. These letters are unique, in that Gandhiji had signed them with his first name—'Mohan'.

The papers of Dr. Sampurnanand, the late Chief Minister of Uttar Pradesh, were given to this Department as a gift by his son, Shri Sarvadanand of Varanasi. Other acquisitions include 61 bundles of papers relating to the historic Meerut Conspiracy Case (1929-33), made possible through the cooperation and kindness of the Chief Justice, Allahabad High Court, and the District-Judge, Meerut. The enquiry and the trial of the members of the Communist Party of India and others implicated in the above case took about 3 years and ten months. The charges made on behalf of the Crown were supported by a vast mass of documentary evidence, the like of which had probably never been handled in a single case in the whole history of Indian legal practice. The printed records of the case, covering about 10,000 pages, are a mine of information on the activities of the Communist

Party of India, its alleged links with international communism and the steps taken by Soviet Russia through Communist International to overthrow the British Government in India.

In addition to the above, 130 photocopies of correspondence of Dadabhai Naoroji with William Digby, correspondence ((11 items) of C.F. Andrews with S.G. Vaze and P. Kodanda Rao on the condition of Indians in East Africa, and Prof. N.K. Bose's collection comprising 600 letters, books, pamphlets, newspaper clippings, etc. pertaining to Gandhiji's activities during 1930-1946, were also acquired. Besides, 26 documents in Hindi and Persian regarding the History of Kumaon (1742-1873) were purchased on the recommendation of the Historical Documents Purchase Committee, along with two manuscripts in Persian, *Maasiri-i-Alamgiri* by Muhammad Saqi Mustaid Khan, and *Razm-Nama* by Nimat Ali Khan.

(c) *Microfilms*:—To supplement the official holdings, the Department continued the programme of acquiring microfilm copies of records pertaining to the various phases of British administration in India.

The microfilms of private papers received from the India Office Library, London, are those of the Governors-General, Viceroys and Secretaries of State for India, especially of Northbrooke (10 rolls), Zetland (9 rolls), Montagu (14 rolls), Birkenhead (9 rolls), and Durand (4 rolls). In addition, 11 rolls of microfilms of papers of the U.S. Consulate at Calcutta were acquired from National Archives, Washington. D.C.

(ii) Appraisal, Checking and Arrangement

(a) *Appraisal*:—Significant progress was made in the programme of appraisal of non-current records and drawing up of schedules of unimportant papers marked for destruction. As against 43,121 files appraised in 1970, 69,456 files of the late Departments of Education, Health and Lands (1923-46), Finance (1924-46) and Commerce (1932-46) were appraised during the year, and out of these 31,182 files were marked for permanent retention. To facilitate the task of appraisal, notes on the administrative organisation of the Departments/Ministries of Education, Health and Lands, Home and Commerce were prepared.

During the period under review, the records of the Director General of Supplies, Ministries of External Affairs, Labour and Rehabilitation, and Agriculture, were inspected by the officials of the Department and necessary advice regarding their proper upkeep and appraisal was given.

(b) *Checking and Arrangement*.—Besides checking and arranging the new accessions, the Department steadily continued the arrangement of records already in its custody. During the year, 2,059 Proceedings of the Survey Office (Field Office, 1865-73) and 27,000 files of the Home Department (Public) were checked and arranged; and 3,660 documents of the Inayat Jang Collection relating to the reign of Aurangzeb and Farukh Siyar were numbered and docketed; and 521 documents of the same collection were also classified.

As regards the private papers, 22,597 documents pertaining to the Collections of Dadabhai Naoroji, P.S. Sivaswamy Aiyar, Padma Kant Malaviya, Banarsi Das Chaturvedi, N.K. Bose, M.R. Jayakar, and C.F. Andrews—Munshi Ram correspondence were checked and arranged.

(iii) Compilation of Reference Media

During the year, steady progress was made in the programme of preparation of reference media. Subject-lists were prepared in respect of records of the Central Board of Revenue (1923-46), the Military Department ('B' Proceedings 1907-10), and Home (Public) Despatches (1892-98). In all 32,855 documents were subject-listed. Lists of 1,351 maps of the congregated Village Plans (Revenue) were also prepared. In addition, check-lists of 30,724 files of the 'A' Proceedings of Home Department were completed during the year.

Lists were compiled of 18,853 documents comprising the private papers of Dadabhai Naoroji, Padma Kant Malaviya, Banarsi Das Chaturvedi, N.B. Khare, N.K. Bose, P.S. Sivaswamy Aiyar. Lists were also prepared of the Private Papers (microfilms) of Morley, Chatham, Cross, Salisbury, Ripon, Grenville, Montagu and Birkenhead.

Descriptive List of the Secret Department Records Vol. IV (1783) was cyclostyled, and similar lists for the years 1781 and 1782 were edited and made ready for cyclostyling. The preparation of the List for 1787 was also completed. Descriptive listing of the Original Persian Letters (Received) for 1821, 1823 and 1825 was completed while that of 1824 made good progress. Lists of the Persian Letters (Issued) for 1823 and 1825 were also finished. 260 Mughal seals were classified and catalogued.

(iv) National Register of Records

The National Register Unit of the Department continued its compilation of reports on the material received from various States during 1959-60, 1960-61 and 1961-62. It brought out the first part of the compilation for

1959-60, which will be in three parts. This compilation comprises an important collection of Rajasthan-Kapad-Dwara Collection of Jaipur—covering 202 pages in cyclostyle, which includes besides descriptive list of 1,592 documents, a detailed introduction, a preface, a glossary and an exhaustive index. Compilation of Part II of the same series, covering the remaining material from Rajasthan, is progressing, while Part III, which will include material from 6 more States, was made ready for cyclostyling. The last named compilation will cover 1,908 documents. The text of the Register for 1961-62 covering 8 States, comprising 2,700 documents, was completed.

Preliminary scrutiny of 194 proformas received from 6 States containing information about 13,502 documents was also made during the year.

The Department maintained close contact with the various State Units regarding the survey of documents in private custody in general and collection of materials for the National Register in particular. The Union Territories were given special instructions with regard to the National Register Scheme. A number of States, including Delhi, Jammu & Kashmir, Kerala, NEFA, Punjab and U.P. have agreed to include a representative of the National Archives of India in their Regional Record Survey Committees. The Director of Archives attended the meeting of the Regional Records Survey Committee of Delhi Administration, and offered them the necessary help and guidance. Shri D.L. Kaka, Assistant Director of Archives, was deputed to attend the meeting of the Jammu & Kashmir Regional Records Survey Committee on behalf of the Director of Archives.

A paper containing an account of the activities of the State Units regarding the survey work and their achievements in collecting materials for the National Register of Records and the progress made by the National Archives of India in the compilation of the Register from 1959-60 to 1970-71 was prepared and placed before the Indian Historical Records Commission at its 41st Session held at Trivandrum in October 1971. The Director of Archives convened a meeting of the representatives of the State Units engaged in the National Register Project at Trivandrum, where progress made by the different States in the working of the scheme was reviewed and future plan of action for its proper implementation was formulated.

(v) Research and Reference Service

The Research Room of the Department continued to be kept open from 9 A.M. to 8 P.M. on week days and from 9 A.M. to 4.30 P.M. on Sundays and other closed holidays. More research scholars availed of the facilities offered by the Department for consulting records and published material.

As against 550 during 1970, 573 scholars from all over India and abroad worked in the Research Room. Their subjects of research covered almost every aspects of modern Indian History, the Indian National Movement continuing to be a popular subject with many scholars. (For names of scholars and the subjects of their studies, please see Appendix I).

The Department attended to as many as 76,551 requisitions for records from research scholars, staff of the National Archives of India, and the various Ministries of the Government of India. It received back 73,104 documents from them, which were restored to their proper places. Besides, 327 maps were supplied on requisition and 612 maps were received for restoration. During this period 1,133 rolls of microfilm copies of records were also supplied. In addition to the above, 1,65,146 exposures of microfilm, 10,593 metres of positive prints, 3,132 copies of enlargement prints and 91 prints of reflex copies were supplied to various institutions and individuals. The Departmental Library offered facilities for consultation of books and periodicals to 1,145 individuals, including research scholars, members of the staff of the various Ministries/Departments of the Government of India.

The Department also attended to a large number of enquiries from the public and private agencies and from individual scholars on a variety of subjects. Some of the interesting queries received by the Department related to the place of birth of Sri Aurobindo, date of birth of Raja Rammohan Roy, Babbar Akali Movement, Moplah Rebellion, Raja Rai Singh, General Zorawar Singh, mirror work in India, paintings of Paul Delaroch, Frazer's Notes on the education of Princes, etc. (For further details please see Appendix II).

(vi) Inspection, Liaison and Advisory Work

During the year, technical advice on preservation of records, rare books and manuscripts was rendered to many institutions and individuals. Mention may be made of the Director, National Archives, Colombo; Ministry of External Affairs, New Delhi; Indian Institute of Sciences, Bangalore; U.P. State Archives, Allahabad; Director, Historical Archives, Goa; Hoffkin Institute, Bombay; Himalayan Mountaineering Institute, Darjeeling; Military College of Telecommunication Engineering, Mhow; Director, Indian Pharmacopoeia Laboratory, Ghaziabad; Maulana Azad Library, Aligarh; Archaeological Survey of India, New Delhi; Government of Jammu and Kashmir, Srinagar; Signals Training Centre, Jabalpur; and University of Toronto Library.

The Scientific Officers of the Department inspected record-rooms of the Ministry of Labour and Employment, New Delhi; Signal Training Centre Museum, Jabalpur; and Hollerith Branch, Union Public Service Commission, New Delhi, and suggested preventive measures against the infestation of white ants, etc.

(vii) Training in Archives-Keeping

Under the programme for One-Year Diploma Course for training in Archives-Keeping, seven trainees successfully completed the course and were awarded diplomas.

M. Abdul Majid, Assistant Director, State Archives, Kerala and Dr. Safi Ahmad, Archivist, Maulana Azad Library, Aligarh, were imparted special short-term training in repair and preservation of records.

C. Preservation and Technical Services

(i) Preservation and Repair of Records

Shortage of raw material continued to handicap the repair programme. With the limited stock of cellulose acetate foil, only urgent repair of documents could be undertaken. As an alternative arrangement, repair of documents was done with tissue paper using a thin C.M.C. (Carboxy Methyl Cellulose Sodium Salt) paste developed in the Department, and with chiffon. In all 10,136 documents were laminated, 29,426 sheets were repaired with tissue paper, 1,788 sheets and 30 maps were repaired with chiffon. Minor repair was done to 39,494 sheets and 558 maps were mounted, and 1,62,903 sheets and 32 maps were deacidified and freed from old patches of paste, etc. Moreover, 97,946 sheets were flattened, 1,79,685 sheets were guarded and 313 Original Consultations were docketed. Besides, 493 volumes, 792 books, 182 Original Consultations, 4,483 booklets, 13 registers, 9 lists and 760 miscellaneous items were bound. 34,255 leather bound volumes were treated with leather preservative dressing.

(ii) Technical and Advisory Service

Among the institutions and individuals who availed themselves of the repair facilities, mention may be made of Nehru Memorial Museum and Library, New Delhi; the Librarian, Institute of Constitutional and Parliamentary Studies, New Delhi; Horticultural Department, C.P.W.D., Prof. N.K. Bose, Calcutta; and Shri Pyare Lal Nayyar, New Delhi.

(iii) Photoduplication

Photoduplication service was rendered to several agencies and individuals, including Gandhi Smarak Sangrahalaya, Delhi; Gazetteers Unit, Ministry of Education and Youth Services; Ministries of Home Affairs and External Affairs; Agricultural Economic Research Centre, Delhi University; Central Institute of English, Hyderabad; Air Force Central School, New Delhi; U.P. State Archives, Allahabad; International Academy of Indian Culture, New Delhi; Survey of India, Dehradun; and Nehru Memorial Museum and Library, New Delhi. Several individual research scholars from the Universities of Oxford, Cambridge, Sussex, Kent, Heidelberg, Toronto, British Columbia, Sydney, Harvard, California, Queensland, Western Australia, Ethiopia, Kyoto, and Tokyo also availed themselves of the service.

The Department also undertook the microfilming of Swami Dayanand Manuscripts belonging to Shrimati Paropkarni Sabha, Ajmer, papers of the late Sardar Patel, and *Kamayani*, the celebrated work of the late Jai Shankar Prasad.

(iv) Research Laboratory

The Research Laboratory of the Department conducted tests on repair materials like chiffon, handmade paper, tissue paper, long-cloth, etc. to ascertain their respective qualities and defects for use in the rehabilitation of records. A few samples of docket covers collected from indigenous manufacturers alongwith the samples of duplicating paper were tested to ascertain their suitability for practical use. Card paper obtained from indigenous manufacturers was also examined to arrive at tentative specifications for library catalogue cards.

Treatment of damaged seals on Persian Original Letters (Received) continued with a view to check further damage. Samples of microfilm manufactured by M/s Hindustan Photo Films Manufacturing Co., Ootacamund, were tested in the Laboratory.

(v) Workshop

The normal work of air-cleaning and fumigation of records and books was continued. About 800 volumes and 300 bundles were air-cleaned while 1,650 volumes and 350 bundles and 1 trunk full of records were fumigated.

D. Publications

(i) Fort William—India House Correspondence

Steady progress was made in the publication programme of the Department. Under Scheme I of the Programme, the printing was completed of Volume XX (Military Department, 1792—96; Honorary Editor: Dr. A.C. Banerjee) and Volume XXI (Military Department, 1797—1800; Honorary Editor: Prof. S.R. Kohli) in the series *Fort William—India House Correspondence*, and the printed copies were received from the press and released for distribution and sale. The printing of Vol. VII (Public Department, 1773—76; Honorary Editor: Prof. R.P. Patwardhan), Vol. X (Public Department, 1786—88; Honorary Editor: Dr. Raghubir Singh) and Vol. XI (Public Department, 1789—92; Honorary Editor: Dr. I.B. Banerjee) made further progress. Textual scrutiny of Vol. XVI (Foreign, Political and Secret Department, 1787—91; Honorary Editor: Prof. S.H. Askari) and Vol. XVIII (Foreign, Political and Secret Department, 1796—1800; Honorary Editor: Rev. Father H. Heras) was completed and the volumes were made ready for the press. Some progress was also made in the scrutiny of Vol. XIX (Military Department, 1787—91; Honorary Editor: Dr. B. Prasad).

(ii) Descriptive Lists

During the year Vol. III of the *Descriptive List of Mutiny Papers* was published and printing of the *Index to Titles* (Alqab Nama) was taken up.

Under the scheme of publishing *Selections from Educational Records of the Govt. of India*, Vol. V of the series "Technical Education in the Provinces" (1860—1907) was compiled. Consequent on the transfer of the above publication programme by the Ministry of Education and Social Welfare to the Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi, the Educational Records Branch in National Archives of India was wound up with effect from 1 December, 1971.

(iii) Indian Archives

Volume XVIII, Nos. 1-2 for 1969 and Vol. XIX, Nos. 1-2 for 1970 of *The Indian Archives*, were published during the period under report. Vol. XX, No. 1 (January—June 1971) of the journal was made ready for the press. Two of the interesting articles contained in the above volumes are: "Western Commercial Enterprizes in the East: Some Oriental Archival Sources, 1500—1558" by Miss D.G. Keswani and "A Note on the Thivy Papers in the University of Malaya Library" by S. Arasaratham. A special feature of last issue of the journal is that it contains an article in Hindi by I.N. Verma of the National Archives of India.

E. Personal and Miscellaneous Matters

(i) Staff Changes

There have been a number of changes in the personnel of the National Archives staff during the year 1971. Dr. S.V. Desikachar and Shri U.N. Sarkar, Assistant Directors of Archives, Shri D.P. Das Gupta, Archivist, and Sardar Sant Singh, Office Superintendent, retired from service. Sarvashri N.R.R. Chari, Microphotographer, and B.D. Saxena, Asstt. Archivist (Gr. II) (General) returned from their deputation. The services of Sarvashri I.N. Verma, Archivist (General) and Ranbir Kishore, Scientific Officer, were placed at the disposal of Jawaharlal Nehru University and the Cabinet Secretariat respectively. One Assistant Archivist (Gr. I) (General), 2 Asstt. Archivists (Gr. II) (General) and 2 Lower Division Clerks went on deputation to other offices. On the recommendation of the Departmental Promotion Committee of the Ministry of Education and Youth Services, Sarvashri P.C. Majumdar, Scientific Officer and N.R.R. Chari, Microphotographer, were appointed Assistant Directors of Archives (Preservation). Shri T.R. Sareen, Assistant Archivist (Gr. I) (General) was appointed Archivist (General) on the recommendation of the U.P.S.C. The following appointments on an *ad hoc* basis were also made to Class I and Class II Gazetted posts during the year: Miss D.G. Keswani, Assistant Director of Archives (Records) as Deputy Director of Archives; Shri D.L. Kaka (Archivist) (General) as Assistant Director of Archives (Records); Shri M.L. Ahluwalia (Archivist) (General) as Assistant Director of Archives (Records Management); Shri K.L. Arora (Archivist) (Oriental Records) as Assistant Director of Archives (Oriental Records); Sarvashri M.R. Sen Gupta and B.N. Das Gupta, Assistant Archivists (Gr. I) (General) as Archivists (General); Shri J.A. Chisti, Assistant Archivist (Gr. I) (Oriental Records) as Archivist (Oriental Records); Shri C.P. Mehra, Assistant Chemist (Gr. I) as Scientific Officer; Kum. S. Basu, Assistant Microphotographer (Gr. I) as Microphotographer; and Shri S.R. Hira, Assistant Librarian as Librarian. In addition, 5 Assistant Archivists (Gr. II) (General), 1 Assistant Archivist (Gr. II) (Oriental Records), 2 Assistant Microphotographers (Gr. II), 2 Assistant Chemists (Gr. II) were also promoted on an *ad hoc* basis to the next higher grades in their specific cadres.

On the recommendation of the Staff Inspection Unit of the Ministry of Finance, 4 posts (non-Gazetted) were abolished. For the different Fourth Five Year Plan Schemes, the Government sanctioned an additional staff of 2 Officers on Special Duty, 1 Deputy Director of Archives, 1 Assistant Director of Archives (Preservation), 1 Archivist (General), 3 Assistant Archivists (Gr. I) (General), 2 Assistant Archivists (Gr. II) (General), 1 Archivist

(Oriental Records), 4 Assistant Archivists (Gr. I) (Oriental Records), 1 Assistant Archivist (Gr. II) (Oriental Records), 1 Librarian, 10 Assistant Librarians, 1 Scientific Officer, 1 Assistant Chemist (Gr. I), 1 Assistant Microphotographer (Gr. I), 4 Assistant Microphotographers (Gr. II) and 25 posts of Lower Division Clerks, Preservation Assistants, Record Attendants, etc.

Consequent on the appointment of another Deputy Director of Archives, the Department's working was reorganized. The Preservation Division, Reprography, Oriental Records Division, Administration, the Keeper of Records, Bhopal, and the Hindi Section were brought under the administrative supervision of Deputy Director of Archives (I) (Shri R.C. Gupta) and the Records, Publications, Records Management Divisions and the Library came under the supervision of the Deputy Director of Archives (II) (Miss D.G. Keswani).

The sanctioned strength of the establishment of the Department was 443 (New Delhi Office, 404, and Regional Office, Bhopal, 39) against 401 last year. For administrative reasons, 64 posts (Class I-3, Class II-5, Class III-40 and Class IV-16) remained vacant during the period under report. The statement showing actual expenditure for 1970-71 and 1971-72 under the Plan as well as non-Plan head has been appended (Please see Appendix IV).

(ii) Conferences, Committees and other activities

Dr. S.N. Prasad, Director of Archives, was appointed Member Secretary of the Committee appointed to decide the date of the birth of Raja Ramohan Roy. He attended the meetings of the Committee held in November 1971 at Delhi and on 5th and 6th December 1971 at Calcutta. The Director of Archives attended the first General Conference of the South East Asia Regional Branch of the International Council on Archives and also of the International Association of Historians of Asia held in Manila from 24th May to 28th May 1971. The Deputy Director of Archives, Shri R.C. Gupta, attended a meeting of the Documentation Sectional Committee of the Indian Standards Institution, New Delhi, and a meeting held at Santiniketan regarding repair and rehabilitation of records of Rabindra Sadan. Shri P.C. Majumdar, Scientific Officer, attended the third Conference on Photographic Science and Technology organised by M/s. Hindustan Photo Film Co. Ltd. at Ootacamund.

Dr. S.V. Desikachar, Assistant Director of Archives, attended the 46th Annual Meeting of the Inter-University Board of India and Ceylon held at Patna in February 1971. A resolution on opening of Archival Cells in the Universities sponsored by this Department was adopted unanimously by the Board.

(iii) Indian Historical Records Commission and National Committee of Archivists

(a) *Indian Historical Records Commission*:—The forty-first session of the Indian Historical Records Commission was held at Trivandrum during 9-11 October, 1971. The session was inaugurated by Shri V. Viswanathan, Governor of Kerala. Prof. S. Nurul Hasan, Union Minister of State for Education and Youth Services, presided over the business meeting. It was largely attended by historians, scholars, and archivists from all over India, representatives of the Central and State Governments, Universities and learned institutions. By two resolutions, the Commission placed on record its appreciation of the steps taken by the National Archives of India during the last two years for expediting the compilation of reference media to the various series of records in its custody and appraisal and management of records of the Union Government. Among the important resolutions passed by the Commission, mention might be made of the following: (i) The State Government should be requested to open Regional or Divisional Archives in each Commissioner's Division; (ii) all State Archives should provide facilities for the supply of microfilms or typed copies of records to *bona fide* scholars and (iii) Archives departments in India should compile lists of their old publications which are still in demand and try to get a limited number of their copies reprinted. Further, the Commission appealed to all the concerned authorities of the temples, gurdwaras, churches, *khankahs*, *waqfs*, etc. to allow *bona fide* research scholars access to their respective records. These bodies were also requested to ensure proper preservation of their records and, if possible, to deposit them in the various archival institutions.

(b) *National Committee of Archivists*:—The twenty-fifth meeting of the National Committee of Archivists was also held at Trivandrum on 12 October, 1971. Among the subjects discussed were: reorganization of State Archives, deputation of Directors/Archivists of State Archives to the International Congress on Archives to be held in Moscow in August 1972, compilation of selections of descriptive lists of the old Urdu, Persian and other records in the Oriental languages, and preparation of indices of records in regional languages in the State Archives.

(iv) **Training in Record Management and Preservation of Records**

During the period under review, steps were taken to start a short-term certificate Course in Record Management and Preservation of Records. The course is meant for the officers of the Ministries/Govt. Departments, Subordinate and Attached Offices, etc. The syllabus of the above course was prepared and a proposal for starting the course was made to the Government of India.

(v) **Exhibition**

The Department's permanent exhibition of select documents and manuscripts illustrating different aspects of modern Indian history continued to attract visitors in large numbers, including students from various schools and colleges. The Department also participated in the exhibition organised at Vigyan Bhawan in January 1971, in connection with the Fourth Commonwealth Law Conference.

(vi) **Hindi Section**

The Hindi Section, in addition to supplying translations of official correspondence from English into Hindi and *vice versa* as and when required, prepared also the Hindi version of the booklet entitled *Archives and Records—What are They?* Some pages of the book entitled *Indian Travels of Thevenot and Careri* were translated into Hindi along with the Annual Report of the Department for 1970.

(vii) **Library Section**

350 books were added to the Library and 247 periodicals were subscribed, exchanged or received as complimentary copies. Among the rare and out-of-print works acquired by the Library are:—

- (v) *Trial of Dooneakhoty Moodelier, Head Native Manager of the Commissionariate in the Dakhan etc.* (1820).

During the period, 9,502 books were accessioned, 8,450 classified and 5,095 catalogued.

F.—National Archives (Bhopal)

- (i) **Accession:**—7 books were acquired and added to the Library.

(ii) **Checking and Arrangements:**—2,951 files of the erstwhile Bhopal State (Political and External Affairs Departments), 1,364 files of the Finance Department (Central Board of Revenue) of the Government of India, and 5,288 files of other Departments were checked and arranged.

(iii) **Compilation of Reference Aids:**—Lists specifying the references and subjects of 2,951 files of the Political Department, Bhopal (1945-58) and 1,364 files of the Department of Finance and Commerce (Separate Revenue Branch: 1860—96; 1911-23) were prepared. The typescript of *Descriptive List of Mutiny Papers*, Vol. IV was completed.

(iv) **Reference Service:**—A number of requisitions from the Government of Madhya Pradesh were attended to.

(v) **Preservation:**—Apart from the usual dusting of records and books, 1,348 volumes and 510 bundles were fumigated with paradichlorobenzene. Besides, 890 files of *Daftar-i-Insha* were repaired, 72,620 sheets paginated, 21,387 sheets flattened, 38,965 sheets guarded, 16,629 sheets repaired with tissue paper and 8,254 sheets were laminated.

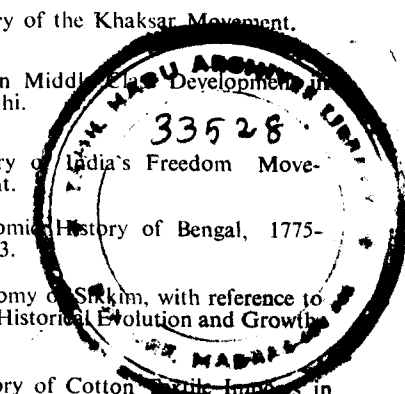

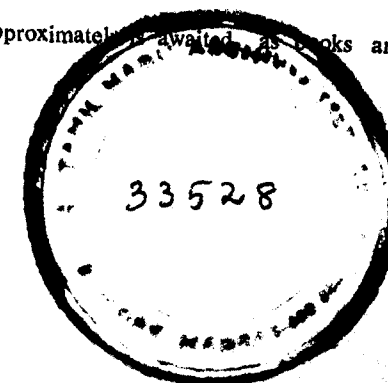
