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A. Some Highlights

During the year 1972, the National Archives of India, acquired files of the Ministry of States, Foreign and Political, Revenue and Agriculture and Legislative Departments, Railway Board and Office of the Salt Commissioner. Other significant acquisitions comprised the private papers of the late Shri G. B. Pant, papers relating to the famous 'Kanpur Bolshevik Conspiracy Case', 1924, and microfilm rolls (60) of papers, mostly of the British officials.

The number of research scholars who availed themselves of the facilities offered by the Department to consult records which has been steadily increasing for the past several years, reached a record level of 658 this year.

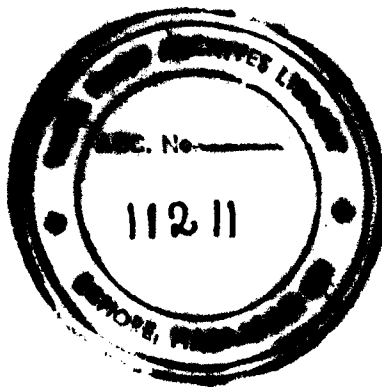
As a result of concerted efforts, the Department brought out fifteen publications. Besides, five volumes in the series *Fort William—India House Correspondence* are in various stages of printing.

The much awaited Archival Policy Resolution approved by the Union Cabinet was promulgated by the Department of Culture, Government of India on 11th December 1972. It defines the responsibilities of the Ministries, Departments and Offices under the Union Government regarding the proper management of records in their custody and selection and retirement of records of permanent value to the National Archives, lays down the responsibilities of the National Archives in respect of Public Record in its custody and also those with Ministries and other offices and prescribes the limits and conditions governing public access to the records retired to the National Archives.

Notwithstanding the inconvenience caused by the dismantling of D.C. circuit in room after room of the Department and rewiring of A. C. circuit, the normal function of the Department went on without any interruption. The output of the Preservation Division and other Divisions likely to be affected by the above changeover, remained steady throughout the

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period. With the higher voltage the lamination machine hitherto kept largely inactive started functioning again and pending orders for lamination of documents were practically cleared.

As part of its advisory functions the Department lent its good offices to the Ministry of Home Affairs to resolve the long-standing dispute between the Governments of Punjab and Haryana about the division of records of the erstwhile State of Punjab. A report after examining the records in the State Archives at Patiala, was drawn up in association with the nominees of the two Governments and sent to the Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India, for further action.

The plans to construct an Annexe to the existing building of the National Archives of India suffered a set back again, and it is now unlikely that construction will begin in 1973.

B. Archival Management

(i) Accessions

(a) *Official Records*:—The fresh accruals consist of the records of the Foreign and Political Department (5,731 files), Legislative Department (1,049 files), Department of Revenue, and Agriculture (1,311 files), Sikkim Political Agency (6,782 files), Railway Board (8,159 files), Ministry of States (12,050 files) and Salt Commissioner's Office (30 files) and also the Hind Series of Survey of India (1,778 maps), and 131 authenticated copies of Bills passed by the various State Legislatures and assented to by the President of India.

(b) *Private Papers*:—During the year under report the Department acquired the papers of "Kanpur Bolshevik Conspiracy Case, 1924". These consist of material filed by the prosecution and statements of the accused, opinions of assessors and judgement of Mr. Holmes, Sessions Judge, Kanpur. The Govind Ballabh Pant Memorial Society donated the papers of the late Shri G. B. Pant. This collection covers the period 1908-61 and comprises about 1,200 letters, 16 files containing speeches, 18 albums, 2 diaries (for the years 1908 and 1924 respectively) and a few miscellaneous items. Some papers relating to the Indian Communist Party were acquired from Shri Satyabhakta. Shri Bholanath Roy of Calcutta gifted to the Department some letters exchanged by him with Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose and his

brother Sarat Chandra Bose, and the draft of a letter in the handwriting of Subhas Chandra Bose regarding the "Oaten Affairs, 1916". The Department also received as a gift the papers of Apa B. Pant, High Commissioner of India in the U.K.

Photocopies of the letters of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose, V. J. Patel and Mrs. E. Schenkel were acquired from Shri S. V. Patel, Ambassador of India in Dublin, through the courtesy of the Minister of External Affairs, Govt. of India. Shri S. Roy, former Deputy Director of Archives, offered as gift, photocopies of two letters of Raja Ram Mohan Roy addressed to Dale Owen and to the Minister of Foreign Affairs, France. Materials pertaining to Bangla Desh in the form of books, booklets, and newspaper clippings were received from the Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India.

(c) *Microfilms*:—The programme of acquiring microfilm copies of records of Indian interest from abroad was continued. The microfilms of private papers received from India Office Library, London, are those of C. W. Malet, Resident at Poona, (1786-97; 3 rolls). Lord Erskine, Governor of Madras (1934-40: 5 rolls), Elgin II, Viceroy and Governor General of India (1894-99: 12 rolls), A. P. Hume I.C.S. (5 rolls), and Sir H. H. Risley, Home Secretary to Government of India (1902-1909: 7 rolls). In addition, 8 rolls of microfilms of the records of the U. S. Consulate at Bombay (1838-1906) were received from the National Archives, Washington.

(ii) Appraisal, Checking and Arrangement

(a) *Appraisal*:—During the period under report, the Records Management Unit was able to complete the appraisal of 68,587 files. These included files housed in the National Archives of India which were transferred to this Department without appraisal by the transferring agencies, and they pertained to the following series: Overseas (1931-47), Agriculture (1923-45), Forest (1923-36), Local Self-Government (1923-31), General Branch (1927-42) and Agriculture Deposit (1923-29) of the late Education, Health and Lands Department. Files of the General (1929-35), Agriculture 'B' (1939-45), General 'B' (1933-45), Establishment Proceedings (1937), Proceedings of the Sugar Institute (1937-38), Customs I (1931-46) and Custom Duties (1935-36) branches of Imperial Council of Agricultural Research and Central Board of Revenue were also appraised. The above number also include the files of the Ministry of External Affairs

appraised in the record room of that Ministry. These pertain to the General Branch (1936-46), Foreign Office (1941-46), Overseas (1945-46), Passport (1946-47), Frontier (1941-45), External (1932-47), Near East (1935-42), Middle East (1941-42), Far East (1944-47), etc.

(b) *Checking and Arrangement*:— During the year, 6,340 documents of the reigns of Farrukh Siyar, Shah Jahan II and Muhammad Shah were docketed descriptively and 2,389 documents of the reigns of Aurangzeb, Farrukh Siyar and Muhammad Shah were classified under other respective *daftars* or departments.

As regards the private papers, 15,524 documents, pertaining to the collections of Banarsidas Chaturvedi, Dadabhai Naoroji, P. S. Sivaswami Aiyer, Rajendra Prasad, G. B. Pant, N. K. Bose, P. K. Malaviya, K. M. Panikkar and the Meerut Conspiracy Case were checked and arranged.

(iii) **Compilation of Reference Media**

The Department pursued with vigour the programme of compiling reference media to the records in its custody with a view to facilitating research among its holdings. The reference media prepared during the period under review included Descriptive Lists of Secret Department Records for the years 1781, 1782, 1785 and 1786, Inventory of the files of the Central Board of Revenue (1925-46) and Letters to Secretary of State (1860-81) and check-list of files of the Home Department (1860-1918) and Original Persian Correspondence Received (1819-30).

Besides, 2,517 documents and 280 seals of the Inayat Jang Collection were catalogued and list of Persian Correspondence (1801 and 1803) was completed. A total of 1,495 maps of the congregated Village Plans (Revenue), Survey of India, were also catalogued.

The work of preparation of reference media of microfilms acquired from abroad was continued, and subject lists of papers of Erskine, Elgin II, Zetland, Northbrooke, Malet, Foster, A.P. Hume and the U.S. Consulate papers were prepared.

(iv) **National Register of Records**

During the period under review three Registers were compiled. These included Parts II and III of the materials received

in 1959-60 and a volume covering the period 1961-62. Part II of 1959-60 Series covers information about private record collections, available in 3 principal zones of Rajasthan, viz., Bikaner, Jaipur and Udaipur, including the erstwhile Princely States of Tonk, Kotah and Banswara. It contains a descriptive list of 839 documents. Part III covers materials received from the States of Rajasthan, Mysore, Orissa, Punjab and Tamil Nadu. This volume also contains information about three important private collections of documents acquired by the National Archives of India during 1959-60, viz., Macartney Papers, Fuller Collection and Sarojini Naidu Papers. This Register covers 1,908 documents. The Register for 1961-62 covers materials received from 8 States, viz., Bihar, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, Orissa, Punjab, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu and Uttar Pradesh. The documents listed in this compilation number 2,700.

Besides the descriptive lists of documents, each volume is provided with detailed introductory notes on various major collections, a preface, a glossary and an exhaustive index. The work on three more Registers i.e., 1960-61, 1962-63 and 1963-64, is presently in progress.

During the period under review, only 28 proformas comprising 460 documents were received from the States of Jammu and Kashmir, Andhra Pradesh and Punjab. It is obvious that the salvaging of records in private custody in the States has considerably slowed down. This appears to be due to inadequate financial assistance extended by the State Governments to their respective units engaged in this work.

(v) **Research and Reference Service**

There has been a steady increase in the number of scholars who availed themselves of the facilities offered by the Department for consulting records for their research. As compared to 592 scholars who worked in the National Archives of India in 1971, the number rose to 658 in 1972. Many of the scholars came from foreign universities and institutions. The countries they represented were Afghanistan, Australia, Belgium, Burma, Canada, Denmark, France, Iran, Japan, Nepal, New Zealand, Tanzania, the U.K., the U.S.A., the U.S.S.R., and the Federal Republic of Germany.

The Research Room was renovated during the year and some additional fluorescent tube lights were fixed to improve the lighting

in the room. A few more fans were also provided. It was kept open, as usual, from 9 A.M. to 8 P.M. on week days and from 9.30 A.M. to 4.30 P.M. on holidays. (For names of scholars and subjects of their studies, please see Appendix I).

Apart from rendering service to those who personally visited this Department, a number of enquiries received from the various government departments, semi-government organisations, private institutions and individuals were attended to, which included detailed search amongst the records and other published materials. (For further details please see Appendix II & III).

(vi) **Inspection, Liaison and Advisory Work**

The Record Room of the Post and Telegraph Board was inspected on 9th February 1972 by the Deputy Director of Archives and the Assistant Director of Archives (Record Management). It was decided that the confidential proceedings from 1885 onwards and the files and index registers from 1900 onwards should be listed and sent to the National Archives of India.

The Department also deputed from time to time its officers to several Central Government Departments located in Delhi as well as outside to inspect the respective records rooms and to advise them as to the best method of keeping the records. Among the offices visited and to whom inspection reports were sent, mention may be made of the Office of the Accountant General, Central Revenues, New Delhi; Department of Social Welfare, New Delhi; Office of the Comptroller and Auditor General, New Delhi; State Trading Corporation, New Delhi; Mormugao Port Trust, Goa; and the Controller of Defence Accounts, Central Command, Meerut.

Further, at the request of the Gujarat State Archives, the records of the Gujarat State lying in different places were inspected by an officer of this Department and a report recommending the steps to be taken for developing the State Archives, for appraisal of records, etc., was prepared and sent to them for necessary action.

Officers of the Department also visited the record rooms of the Ministries of Home Affairs and Information and Broadcasting: the former for checking up the pre-1947 files of the Home Department which might fill in the gaps in the existing series of the records already transferred to the National Archives of India,

and the latter for examining the Kashmir Publicity Section records, with a view to their eventual transfer to the National Archives of India.

A Scientific Officer of the National Archives of India inspected, at the request of Dev Samaj, Solan, Simla Hills, their records and suggested means for their repair and preservation.

During the period under report, the Department maintained close contact with the various State Units in the work of survey of documents in private custody in general and collection of materials for the National Register in particular. In the month of November 1972, the Director of Archives participated in the meeting of the Regional Record Survey Committee, Delhi, convened by the Delhi Administration, and offered them the necessary help and guidance.

(vii) **Training in Archives-Keeping**

Under the programme for One-Year Diploma Course for training in Archives-Keeping, fifteen trainees successfully completed the course and were awarded diplomas. (For the names of successful trainees and the marks obtained by them, please see Appendix IV).

C. Preservation and Technical Service

(i) **Preservation and Repair of Records**

During the period under review, work in the Preservation Division was restricted due to the repairs being carried on in the entire building of the National Archives. Still, 17,639 sheets were laminated by machine as well as solvent lamination processes. In addition, repair was done to 36,936 sheets with tissue paper; 520 sheets and 106 maps with chiffon (silk), and to 49,653 sheets and 636 maps by full pasting and half margin processes of repair. Besides, 1,03,780 sheets and 402 maps were deacidified and freed from old patches of repair; 26,414 sheets and 56 maps were flattened, and 1,43,065 sheets were guarded. 400 volumes of the Home, Finance and Military Departments 1,211 books, 580 Original Consultations, 6 lists, 404 booklets, 7 maps and 247 miscellaneous items were bound and Leather Preservative Mixture was applied to 24,605 volumes.

(ii) Technical and Advisory Service

Among the institutions and individuals who availed themselves of the repair facilities extended by the Department, mention may be made of the Archaeological Survey of India, Jamia Millia Islamia, Smt. Paropkarni Sabha, Ajmer, Library of the Ministry of External Affairs, New Delhi and the Prime Minister's Office.

Technical advice regarding problems of repair and rehabilitation of documents—preservation of records, lamination programme, procurement of laminating and photoduplication machines and other related equipments, specification and availability of cellulose acetate foil and tissue paper and restoration techniques was rendered to a large number of institutions during the year. Among them may be mentioned the Shri Aurobindo Birth Centenary Library, Pondicherry; U.P. State Archives, Allahabad; the Government of Orissa; Tamil Nadu State Archives; National Archives of Ceylon, Colombo; Ministry of Education and Social Welfare, New Delhi; National Library, Calcutta; Librarian, Institute of Jamaica, West Indies; Signal Training Centre, Jabalpur; ASC Records (Supply), Bangalore Librarian, University of Jammu, Jammu; East Anglia Plastics (India), Ltd., Calcutta; Director, Rajasthan Oriental Research Institute, Jodhpur; Central Library, Jawahar Lal Institute of Post-Graduate Medical Education and Research, Pondicherry and the Director, State Archives, Hyderabad.

(iii) Photoduplication

During the year, reprographic services, like microfilming, negative and positive, and preparation of enlarged photocopies, were continued and services were also rendered to about 200 agencies in India and abroad. Among the foreign institutions, mention may be made of the Universities of South Wales and Western Australia, Australia; Universities of Manitoba, Dalhousie and Lake Head, Canada; University of Missouri (Columbia), Temple University (Philadelphia), Universities of Wisconsin, California, and Harvard, U.S.A; University of Bergen, Norway, Universities of London and Leicester; U. K. and the Oriental Institute of Czechoslovakia; and Prague. In India the Universities of Punjab, Agra, Kashmir, Jodhpur, Aligarh and Calcutta; the Governments of Gujarat, Punjab and Mizoram; the State Archives of U.P. and Jammu and Kashmir, the C. F. Andrews Centenary Committee, Calcutta, Sri Aurobindo Ashram, Pondicherry, Gandhi Smarak

Sangrahalaya, Ahmedabad, the Institute of Advanced Studies, Simla, International Academy of Indian Culture and Nehru Memorial Museum and Library, New Delhi, availed themselves of the facilities.

Under the microfilming programme of the Department, filming of 'Fortnightly Reports' of Home (Political) Department and news-papers clippings from the Jayakar Collection was taken up. The microfilming of the rare manuscripts from the Raza Library, Rampur, the Swami Dayanand Mss. from the Smt. Paropkarni Sabha, Ajmer and of Sardar Patel Papers at Ahmedabad was continued during the year.

(iv) Research Laboratory

The Research Laboratory of the Department continued the testing of various repair materials available in the country i.e. chiffon, ledger paper, long cloth (coarse as well as fine) logline, etc. for their suitability and use in repair and rehabilitation of archival documents and for conservation work. Samples of docket covers sent by the Central Stationery Office, New Delhi, were tested for their durability and permanence while samples of ledger papers sent by the Copyright Office, Ministry of Education and Social Welfare, were tested for determining their 'keeping' qualities. Tests were also conducted on various microfilms of the Department with a view to prevent their deterioration during storage and any damage to the image.

About 87 seals on Persian documents were treated to prevent damage to them during handling and storage and broken seals were strengthened to preserve them over a longer period of time.

Experiments were carried out to test the efficacy of the various deacidification processes with a view to develop a quicker and cheaper process. Sample of magnesium methoxide solution used in the so-called Chicago Process, developed in U.S.A., was tested as to its efficacy for deacidification purposes.

(v) Workshop

In all 1,762 volumes, 640 books and 860 bundles were air-cleaned and 1,762 volumes, 720 books and 1220 bundles were fumigated during the period.

D. Publications

(i) Fort William—India House Correspondence

Under Scheme I of the Publication programme, Volume VII (Public Department, 1773-76; Honorary Editor: Prof. R. P. Patwardhan) and Volume X (Public Department, 1786-88; Honorary Editor: Dr. Raghubir Singh) neared completion. Besides, Vol. XI (Public Department, 1789-92; Honorary Editor: Dr. I. B. Banerjee), Volume XVIII (Foreign, Political, Secret Department, 1796-1800; Honorary Editor: Rev. Father H. Heras) and Volume XIX (Military Department, 1787-91; Honorary Editor: Dr. B. Prasad) have been sent to the press. The printing of these three volumes is progressing satisfactorily.

(ii) Descriptive Lists, Calendars and Bulletins, etc.

During the year Vol. III of the *Descriptive List of Mutiny Papers* was published and Vol. IV was made ready for the press; Volume I of the *Calendar of Persian Correspondence* (1759-67) was reprinted. Two volumes (Vol. III and Vol. VI) of the *Descriptive Lists of Secret Department Records* for the years 1780-81 and 1785-86 as well as Nos. V and VI of the *Bulletin of Research Thesis and Dissertations* covering the period 1966-71 were cyclostyled. Volumes XXXVIII, XXXIX, and XL of the *Proceedings of the Indian Historical Records Commission* were printed and copies of the same were distributed among the members of the Commission. The *Annual Reports of the National Archives of India* for the years 1970 and 1971 were also brought out during the period.

(iii) Indian Archives

Volume XX (Nos. 1-2) for 1971 of the *Indian Archives* was published during the period under report. Among the interesting articles contained in the above volume are "Meerut Conspiracy Case and its records" by L. Dewani and "The Scandinavian Institute of Asian Studies," by K. R. Haellquist.

E. Personnel and Miscellaneous Matters

(i) Staff Changes

On the recommendations of the Union Public Service Commission Dr. S. N. Prasad, Shri H. N. Mathur and Shri S. N. Sharma, were appointed on substantive basis as Director, Archivist and Asstt. Archivist respectively, while Km. D. G. Keswani

was appointed Officer on Special Duty and Shri M. L. Ahluwalia as Assistant Director of Archives (R & P) on temporary basis. Union Public Service Commission also approved the following appointments of Sarvashri S.M.R. Baqar, M. S. Khan, L. Dewani, K. S. Talwar and B. M. Sankhdher as Assistant Archivists (Gr. I) and Swapan Kumar Sarkar as Assistant Chemist (Gr. I). On the recommendations of the Departmental Promotion Committees (Senior and Junior) of the Ministry of Education, Shri A. I. Tirmizi and Shri S. N. Paul (on deputation) were appointed as Deputy Director of Archives and Microphotographist respectively on temporary basis under Next Below Rule, and Shri K. D. Gupta was confirmed as Archivist. Sarvashri S. R. Mitra, S. C. Bose, and M. R. Sen Gupta were confirmed as Assistant Archivists (Gr. I), Shri Rajendra Prasad was appointed as Assistant Chemist (Gr. I) and Sarvashri A. B. Roy, Om Prakash Bhugra and D. K. Chaudhary as Assistant Microphotographists (Gr. I) on temporary basis by the same Committees.

During the period under report, Shri V. C. Joshi, Assistant Director and Shri Basudev, L.D.C., resigned from the Department while Sarvashri K. L. Kanjilal, Archivist, S. C. Kaushik, Superintendent, R. G. Jain, Foreman, (Mech.), M. S. Chauhan, Preservation Assistant, Devi Chand, Mender (Gr. I), Kharak Singh, Binder and Jalaluddin, Laboratory Attendant, retired from service.

Shri L. Dewani, Assistant Archivist (Grade II), Km. Salma Ajmeri, Assistant Archivist (Gr. I) and Shri B. R. Ajmani, Assistant, reverted from their foreign service. The latter two again went on deputation.

The sanctioned strength of the Department was 449 (New Delhi-410 and Regional Office, Bhopal-39) as against 443 last year. 49 posts (Class I-2, Class II-2, Class III-28, and Class IV-17) remained vacant due to administrative reasons.

(ii) Conferences, Committees, and other activities

The Director of Archives, Dr. S. N. Prasad, attended the Meetings of the Executive Committee and the 7th Congress of the International Council on Archives which were held at Budapest and Moscow respectively in Aug. 72. In the plenary session of the Congress devoted to assistance to Archives of developing countries, the Director of Archives acted as the Rapporteur and presented a paper on "Technical Assistance for Archival Development—The Viewpoint of Developing Countries". Later

at a seminar in Moscow the Director was selected as one of the Lecturers and spoke on Archival Management in India.

The Director of Archives was also specially invited as a consultant, along with seven other leading archivists, to a Collective Consultation on Archives Planning organised by the UNESCO at Paris from 4th to 6th December 1972. Shri R. C. Gupta, Deputy Director of Archives, visited Hungary and German Democratic Republic under Indo-Hungarian Cultural Exchange and Indo-German Democratic Republic Cultural Exchange programmes during the period under report.

Earlier the Director, attended the meeting of the Art Purchase Committee held at New Delhi from 15th to 17th February 1972. He also attended the inaugural ceremony of the Indian Council of Historical Research held on 27th March 1972 at Vigyan Bhawan, New Delhi.

Shri N. H. Kulkarnee, Archivist, was deputed to represent the Department at the 10th Annual Conference of the Institute of Historical Studies, Calcutta, held at the Kurukshetra University (Haryana) from 28th to 31st October 1972. He read a paper on "Religious Reform Movements in Medieval Maharashtra". Shri Satya Pal, Archivist, was deputed to represent the Department at the 33rd Session of the Indian History Congress, held at Muzaffarpur (Bihar) from 27th to 29th December 1972.

(iii) **Indian Historical Records Commission and National Committee of Archivists**

(a) *Indian Historical Records Commission*:— The Indian Historical Records Commission was reconstituted for another term of five years, vide Ministry of Education and Social Welfare (Department of Culture) Notification No. F. 22-7/69-CAI(2) dated 10th March 1972. The salient features of the new constitution are the following: (i) The category of corresponding members within India has been abolished, while the corresponding members from outside India will continue as usual; (ii) The Government of India will nominate upto twenty eminent historians and archivists on the Commission on the basis of their specialised knowledge of archives or their original contribution to the modern period of Indian History; (iii) The State Government/Union Territories with no organised Archives Departments but having Regional Records Survey Committees can also nominate their representatives on the Commission; and (iv) A standing Committee of seven members with the Secretary, Ministry of

Education and Social Welfare (Department of Culture), Government of India, as its ex-officio Chairman, has been set up for reviewing the action taken on the earlier resolutions of the Commission as well as for other items placed before it from time to time, so as to make the working of the Commission more effective and purposeful.

(b) *Standing Committee*:— The Standing Committee of the Commission held its first meeting on the 16th December 1972 in the room of Shri I.D.N. Sahi, the Union Education Secretary, who presided over the meeting. The meeting was attended by Prof. O. P. Bhatnagar, Prof. Satish Chandra, Shri V. G. Khobrekhar, and Dr. S. N. Prasad, Member-Secretary of the Committee. The Standing Committee considered and finalised its comments on the resolutions received from the members for the 42nd Session of the Commission to be held at Panaji (Goa), from 5th to 7th January 1973. It also reviewed the conspectus of action taken on the earlier resolutions of the Commission.

(iv) **Advisory Function**

On the request of the Director, Central Tibetan Archives and Library, Dharamsala, the Director of Archives, Govt. of India inspected the manuscripts and records preserved there from 18th to 22nd June, 1972. He also visited the Rajasthan State Archives, Bikaner, from 18th to 20th July 1972 at its request.

(v) **Training in Record Management and Preservation of Records**

Keeping in view the recommendations of the Estimates Committee of the 4th Lok Sabha (1968-69) the Department in consultation with the Department of Administrative Reforms decided to start two short-term Certificate Courses on "Record Management" and "Preservation of Records" in the National Archives of India. The syllabus of the courses has been finalised. The courses will commence as soon as staff is sanctioned by the Government.

(vi) **Hindi Section**

During the period under report, the Hindi Section attended to the routine translation and Hindi typing work of the Department.

(vii) **Library Section**

In all 677 books were added to the Department's Library. 378 Administration Reports of State Governments and Union Territories and 259 periodicals were subscribed, exchanged or received as gifts. Besides, the Library has also received 13,292 issues of Gazetteers, Lok Sabha Debates, Catalogues, etc. About 214 publications have been transferred to this Library from the Ministry of External Affairs, New Delhi. 2,163 proscribed publications were accessioned and catalogued during the year under report, bringing this item of work to an end. The cataloguing of the confidential publications has now been taken up.

F. National Archives (Bhopal)

(i) **Checking and Arrangements**—2,224 files of Political Department and Political Agency, Judicial Branch of the Chief Justice, High Court of erstwhile Bhopal State and 1,521 files of the Central Board of Revenue and Department of Finance were sorted, checked and arranged before their listing was taken up.

(ii) **Compilation of Reference Aids**:—Lists were prepared of the references and subjects of 1,430 files of Political Department (External Affairs Department) (1924-1949), 794 files of the Bhopal Political Agency, Judicial Branch of the Chief Justice High Court Bhopal (1898-1947) and 1,521 files belonging to the Central Board of Revenue, Separate Revenue Branch, Salaries, Establishment and Accounts for the years 1864 to 1921.

(iii) **Preservation**:—In addition to the daily dusting, special cleaning of 2,10,251 volumes, 1,07,370 bundles, 61,044 shelves, 14,707 files and 2,654 maps was carried out. 331 bundles were retied and 187 bundles and 162 maps were labelled. 560 bundles and 1,087 volumes were received back duly fumigated.

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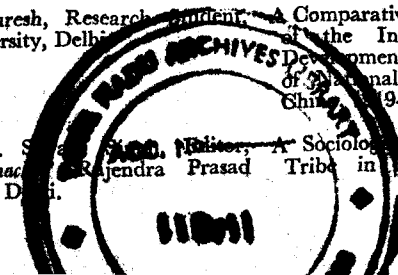

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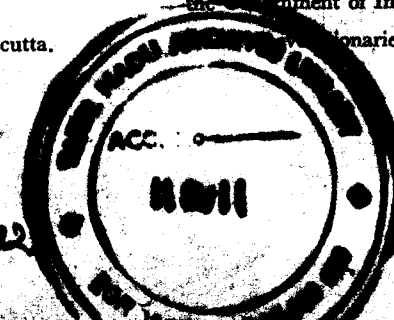
