ANNUAL REPORT, 1973

A. Some Highlights

During 1973, the National Archives of India accessioned over 12,000 files, volumes and other records of the Ministries of Home Affairs, External Affairs, Defence and Agriculture, and their predecessor bodies. It also acquired some more papers of the late Dr. Rajendra Prasad, Pandit Govind Ballabh Pant, Sir Sita Ram and Shri Benarsi Das Chaturvedi, besides copies of the trial proceedings of Udham Singh, B. K. Biswas, Bhagat Singh and certain other revolutionaries, and issues of some newspapers throwing light on the activities of the Indian National Army in Malaysia.

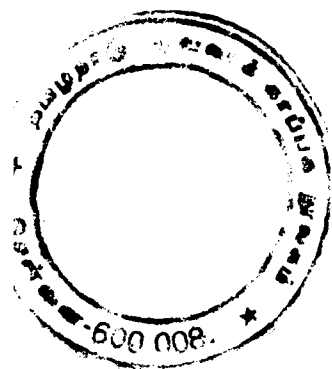
As many as 597 scholars availed themselves of the research facilities provided by the Department. Out of them, 66 scholars were from Canada, U.K., Denmark, Belgium, Italy, Greece, G.D.R., F.R.G., U.S.A., U.S.S.R., Sudan, Qatar, New Zealand, Japan, Australia, Afghanistan, Nepal and Bhutan.

The Department made considerable progress in implementing its various publication schemes. While the printing of three volumes of the *Fort William-India House Correspondence* was completed, that of as many volumes in the series neared completion. Vol. II of the *Calendar of Persian Correspondence* was reprinted, and Vol. IV of the *Descriptive List of Mutiny Papers* was sent to the press. Four miscellaneous publications were at various stages of printing. Besides this, one volume of the 'Descriptive List of Secret Department Records' and three volumes of the 'National Register' were brought out in cyclostyled form, and two more volumes in the former series were made ready for cyclostyling.

In performance of its advisory functions, the Department suggested to the Keladi Temple, after necessary inspection, the measures for the development of its Research Bureau. It also responded to the request of the Government of Kerala to inspect the State Archives and suggest the lines on which to reorganise it. At the request of the National Archives

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of Indonesia, the Department deputed an officer to advise it in regard to the setting up of a repair unit there.

The Department continued to conduct the One-Year Diploma Course of training in Archives-Keeping. In addition, it introduced for the first time two Short-term Certificate Courses of training, one in Record Management and the other in Preservation of Records. Nominees of 16 public, semi-public and private organisations availed themselves of these courses during the year under report.

To celebrate the 25th anniversary of India's Independence, the Department organised at its premises, in February 1973, an exhibition of significant records, photographs, press-clippings, etc. The exhibition was opened by the President of India. The Department also organised on the occasion of 104th birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi and exhibition of original documents and contemporary photographs concerning Gandhiji's mission in Champaran.

The Members of the Joint Committee of Parliament on the National Library Bill, 1972, as also the Chief Minister of Kerala and the Governor of Maharashtra, visited the Department during the year, and were shown round. Another distinguished visitor was Dr. Ivan Borsa, Deputy Director General of the National Archives of Hungary, who came to India under the Indo-Hungarian Cultural Exchange Programme and, besides establishing contacts with other archive centres in the country studied the work of the National Archives of India.

While the general picture outlined above is of steady progress, certain difficulties have persisted. The urgently needed Annex to the National Archives building remained on the drawing board in 1973. The proposal to raise the status of the N.A.I. from a Subordinate to an Attached Office of the Shiksha Aur Samaj Kalyan Mantralaya, to enable it to discharge effectively its new responsibilities under the Archival Policy Resolution, also continued to remain under consideration.

B. Archival Management

(i) Accessions

(a) *Official Records*— During the year, 12,300 official files,

volumes and documents were received for permanent custody. The accessions included the records of the Foreign and Political Department/Ministry of External Affairs (10,374 files), Army Department (455 files), Controller of Defence Accounts, Meerut (1,044 volumes), Department of Education, Health and Lands (166 files), Home (Political) Department (27 files), Ministry of States (149 files), and 85 authenticated copies of Bills passed by the various State Legislatures and assented to by the President of India.

(b) *Private Papers*—A further instalment of papers of Dr. Rajendra Prasad was gifted to the Department by his son Shri Mrityunjay Prasad. The batch included, among other papers, the manuscript of Dr. Prasad's *India Divided* and the statement of ryots recorded during the Champaran Satyagraha. A large number of papers pertaining to Dr. Prasad were received from Shri H. K. Verma also. Further additions were also made to some other collections of private papers acquired by the Department. The Govind Ballabh Pant Memorial Society, New Delhi, transferred two tapes of Pt. Pant's speeches and six files of correspondence relating to the period 1919-60. Some more letters, press-clippings, articles and photographs of revolutionaries were received as gift to supplement the Benarsi Das Chaturvedi Collection. Dr. Satish Chandra, Deputy Chairman, University Grants Commission, made a further donation of 32 letters, articles, tracts, etc. of his late father, Sir Sita Ram. Besides, the Department acquired copies of the trial proceedings of Udham Singh, B. K. Biswas, Amir Chand, Bhagat Singh, B. K. Dutt and a few other revolutionaries. Shri Satya Bhakta donated a further collection of Gandhiji's tracts embodying his articles published in 1921 and a Hindi translation of his *Sarvodaya*, etc. A valuable collection of several issues of *Azad Hind*, *Voice of India*, *Young India*, etc., bearing on the activities of the Indian National Army in Malaysia, was received from Shri Jai Singh of Haravara.

(c) *Microfilms*—The Department acquired from the India Office Library and Records, London, 4 rolls of microfilms of the papers (1846-85) of Sir Charles Wood, and one roll of papers (1932-47) of Frank Owen Bell, I.C.S. Through the courtesy of Dr. Ivan Borsa, Deputy Director General, Hungarian National Archives, a strip of microfilm containing material of Indian interest available in the National Archives, Budapest, was received.

(ii) Appraisal, Checking and Arrangement

(a) *Appraisal*—During the year, the Records Management Unit completed the appraisal of 58,902 files of the following Government agencies: Imperial Council of Agricultural Research (Sugar, 1940-47; Animal Husbandry, 1937-45; Oil-seeds, 1934; Locust, 1930-38; Planning, 1945; Development, 1943-45; Veterinary, 1930-36; Library, 1933-45; and Research and Development, 1929-46); Central Board of Revenue (Custom 1, 1939-45); Education, Health and Lands (Lands 'B', 1925-28); Department/Ministry of Education (A. 2, 1947-51; D 3 U, 1948; Education I, 1947; Planning and Reconstruction, 1940-47); Department of Health (Public Health, 1940-47); Department of Agriculture (Policy, 1940-47; Fisheries, 1945-46; Crops, 1947); Mysore Residency (War, 1939-43; General, 1855-89; 'E' series, 1887-1939; Confidential, 1933-37; D. Dis., 1939-47; Sundoor and Banganapalle, 1946-47). Some series of the records of the Ministry of External Affairs were also appraised.

270 bundles containing a total of 12,840 files belonging to the Indian Council of Agricultural Research, were picked out for destruction and sent to the Council for final disposal.

In pursuance of the Archival Policy Resolution, the Records Management Unit issued circular letters to the various Ministries and their Attached and Subordinate Offices, requesting them to take appropriate action for implementing the recommendations of the said Resolution. The replies received were tabulated and embodied in the Director of Archives' first report on the implementation of the Archival Policy Resolution.

(b) *Checking and Arrangement*—During the year, 18,982 files received from the different Ministries were checked and amalgamated with their parent series. Docketing and classification of the Inayat Jang Collection were continued. 11,534 documents of the reigns of Aurangzeb, Farrukhsiyar and Muhammad Shah were docketed, and 2,127 documents of the reigns of Bahadur Shah I, Farrukhsiyar and Muhammad Shah were classified departmentwise.

In addition, 19,682 documents belonging to the collections of G. B. Pant, Dr. Rajendra Prasad, P. S. Sivaswamy Iyer, Benarsi Das Chaturvedi, P. K. Malaviya, and Dadabhai Naoroji, papers of the Freedom Movement Unit, and trial proceedings of the 'Meerut Conspiracy Case' were checked and arranged.

(iii) Compilation of Reference Media

The programme of compiling reference media to the records in the custody of the Department received further stimulus. During the period under review, Volume VII of the 'Descriptive List of Secret Department Records, 1787-88', was cyclostyled, and compilation of two volumes (Vol. VIII, 1789-90 & Vol. IX, 1791-95) in the series neared completion. Besides this, summary inventories of 4,366 files of the Central Board of Revenue (Customs, 1928-37; Establishment, 1946), 4,668 Home (Pub. & Jud.) Despatches to and from the Secretary of State for India (1876-95), and 2,750 manuscript pages of the Secret Department records (1798-99) were prepared. Also prepared were the subject-lists of 14,673 files of the Department of Commerce and Industry (1905-20), Department of Revenue and Agriculture (1871-1923), Department of Education, Health and Lands (1923-32), Legislative Department (1869-1923) and Finance Department (1860-76).

Volume I of the 'Descriptive List of Persian Correspondence' was edited and made ready for cyclostyling. 1,120 seals of the Inayat Jang Collection were catalogued. 2,182 Village Plans (Rev.), Survey of India, were also catalogued.

The work of preparing subject-lists of microfilms acquired from abroad was continued, and the microfilm copies listed during the year were those of the papers of Sir Charles Wood and F. O. Bell.

(iv) National Register of Records

Numbers 2, 4 (Pt. I) and 5 of the 'National Register of Private Records' were brought out in cyclostyled form during the period under review. They cover the materials received from the various States during the years 1960-61, 1962-63 and 1963-64 respectively. The Register for 1960-61 contains information about 1,442 documents, as furnished by the States of Bihar, Orissa, Punjab, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu and West Bengal. That for 1962-63 covers 1,328 documents and other items, information regarding which was received from the States of Bihar, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, Punjab, U.P. and Tamil Nadu. It also includes information about the private collections acquired by the National Archives of India. The Register for 1963-64 covers the materials received from Bihar, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Mysore, Punjab, Rajasthan, Uttar Pradesh and Tamil Nadu, and the number of documents listed in it is 1,842. Besides the descriptive lists of documents, each of these compilations contains introductory

notes to important collections, an informative glossary and an exhaustive index.

(v) Research and Reference Service

597 research scholars availed themselves of the facilities offered by the Department for consulting public records, published sources, microfilms and collections of private papers. Some of the scholars came from foreign universities and institutions. Some of the countries they came from were Afghanistan, Australia, Burma, Canada, France, Japan, Nepal, U.S.A., U.K., U.S.S.R., and the Federal Republic of Germany.

As usual, the Research Room was kept open from 9 A.M. to 8 P.M. on working days and from 9.30 A.M. and 4.30 P.M. on holidays. (For names of scholars and subjects of their studies, please see Appendix I).

The Department attended to 62,923 requisitions for records from research scholars, staff of the National Archives of India, and the various agencies of the Government of India. Requisitions for 994 rolls of microfilm copies of records from research scholars were also attended to. 61,357 documents, which were received back, were restored to their proper places.

The Departmental Library offered facilities for consultation of books and periodicals to 1,145 individuals, including research scholars and members of staff of the various offices of the Government of India.

Besides rendering service to those who personally visited the Department, a large number of enquiries received from the various Government departments, semi-government organisations, private institutions and individuals were attended to, some of which involved detailed search among records and published materials. (For further details, please see Appendices II and III).

(vi) Inspection, Liaison and Advisory Work

As usual, several institutions and individuals sought the Department's technical advice on the preservation of records, rare books and manuscripts. Officers of the Department visited several Central Government Departments located in and outside Delhi to inspect their respective records and to advise them as to the best method of preserving them. Among the record rooms inspected, mention may be made of those of

the Union Public Service Commission, the Accountant General, and the Ministry of External Affairs. Advice was given to the Ministry of Law and Justice, Ministry of Education and Social Welfare, Director General of Supplies and Disposals, and Regional Settlement Commissioner, Department of Rehabilitation, New Delhi, on the preservation and appraisal of their respective records.

The Director of Archives visited the Keladi Temple Museum and Research Bureau, Keladi (Karnataka) at the request of its Honorary Secretary, and advised on matters relating to the development of the Research Bureau and preservation of the temple records.

At the request of the Government of Kerala, an experienced officer of this Department was deputed to the Kerala State Archives in March 1973 for the purpose of studying its working and suggesting the lines on which to reorganise it. The report submitted by him was forwarded to the State Government for necessary action.

The Department continued to maintain close contact with the various State Units in the work of survey of records in private custody and collection of materials for the National Register. In September 1973, the Director of Archives attended the meeting of the Regional Records Survey Committee, Delhi, and offered necessary help and guidance.

(vii) Training

During the year under review, nine trainees completed the Diploma Course of training in Archives-Keeping and were awarded diplomas after passing the prescribed tests. (For names of successful candidates and the marks secured by each, please see Appendix IV).

Apart from the One-Year Diploma Course the Department conducted for the first time two short-term Certificate Courses of training, one in Record Management and the other in Preservation of Records. The following 14 trainees, nominated by the organisations indicated within brackets against their names, received training in Record Management and qualified for award of a certificate each:—

Singh (Banaras Hindu University), S. L. Kavadia (Hindusthan Zinc Ltd.), N. S. Srinivasan (Bharat Heavy Electricals Ltd.), B. K. Padhi (Sri Jagannath Temple, Puri), and Shrimati S. Bali (Delhi Administration).

Two trainees underwent the short-term Certificate Course of training in Preservation of Records. They were Shri Partap Singh, nominated by the Department of Education, Ministry of Education & S. W., and Shri Budhai Ram, nominee of the University Grants Commission.

Besides conducting the courses mentioned above, the Department provided facilities to a nominee of the Namgyal Institute of Tibetology, Gangtok, for acquainting himself with the various methods of photoduplication of records.

C. Preservation and Technical Service

(i) Preservation and Repair of Records

During the year under report, the programme of repair and rehabilitation of records was pursued with vigour. 21,094 sheets were laminated by machine lamination and 18,801 sheets by solvent lamination process. Besides, 33,586 sheets were repaired with tissue paper, and miscellaneous repairs were carried out to 28,229 sheets and 846 maps. 94,316 sheets and 762 maps were deacidified and freed from old patches, 1,244 maps were mounted, and 1,02,451 sheets guarded. In addition, 691 volumes, 740 books, and 376 miscellaneous items were bound, and Leather Preservative Mixture was applied to 24,605 volumes.

The normal work of air-cleaning and fumigation of records and books was continued. About 100 bundles were air-cleaned, and 50 bundles and 2,945 volumes fumigated.

(ii) Technical and Advisory Service

A number of institutions availed themselves of the repair facilities offered by the Department. Among such institutions mention may be made of the Archaeological Survey of India, Government of Mizoram, Mysore State Archives, Bangalore, Nehru Memorial Museum and Library, New Delhi, Jamia Millia Islamia, New Delhi, and Shrimati Paropkarni Sabha, Ajmer.

Technical advice on problems connected with the repair and preservation of records, procurement of lamination and

photoduplication machines, cellulose acetate foil, tissue paper and other repair materials was given to a large number of institutions and individuals. Of those who sought advice on these problems, mention may be made of the Superintendent, Archaeological Survey of India, Hyderabad; National Library, Calcutta; Goa State Archives; District Magistrate, Murshidabad; Orissa State Archives; Birla Institute of Technology, Calcutta; Khuda Bakhsh Oriental Public Library, Patna; Panjab Agricultural University, Ludhiana; and Sri Aurobindo Ashram, Pondicherry.

A Scientific Officer of this Department was deputed to Indonesia for helping the National Archives of that country in setting up a repair unit.

(iii) Photoduplication

During the year under report, reprographic services were rendered, among others, to the Universities of California, Missouri, Queensland, Hiroshima, Tokyo, Canterbury, London, Malaysia and Tanzania; Jawaharlal Nehru University and the Universities of Calcutta, Lucknow and Kurukshetra; Academy of Sciences, Moscow; Australian National Library, Canberra; and Kavi Guru Museum, Shelaidaha, Bangladesh. The work involved preparation of 1,75,426 exposures of microfilm, 9,210 metres of positive prints, 5,991 enlargement prints, and 41 reflex copies.

The Department continued the microfilming of newspaper clippings belonging to the Jayakar Collection and took up that of the issues of *Abhyudaya* available among other collections of private papers. Microfilming of the rare manuscripts from Raza Library, Rampur, and Swami Dayanand Manuscripts belonging to Shrimati Paropkarni Sabha, Ajmer, made steady headway. The Mobile Microfilm Unit of the Department visited Ahmedabad to complete the microfilming of Sardar Patel Papers. It also visited Mysore, at the request of the Archaeological Survey of India, to microfilm copies of inscriptions at the office of the Chief Epigraphist.

In order to expand the reprographic services, a new portable camera and a xerograph copier were installed in the Department.

(iv) Research Laboratory

The Research Laboratory of the Department conducted tests on materials like chiffon, handmade paper, long-cloth,

etc., with a view to evaluate their suitability for use in the repair and rehabilitation of records. Samples of ledger paper, sent by the Copyright Office, Ministry of Education and Social Welfare, were tested to determine their keeping quality.

D. Publications

(i) Fort William—India House Correspondence

Under Scheme I of the Publication Programme of the Department, Volume VII (Public Department, 1773-76; Honorary Editor: Prof. R. P. Patwardhan), Volume X (Public Department, 1786-88; Honorary Editor: Dr. Raghunath Singh) and Volume XI (Public Department, 1789-92; Honorary Editor: Dr. I. B. Banerjee) were completely printed off. As regards the printing of Volume XVI (Foreign, Political, Secret Department, 1787-91; Honorary Editor: Prof. S. H. Askari), Volume XVIII (Foreign, Political, Secret Department, 1796-1800; Honorary Editor: Rev. Father H. Heras), and Volume XIX (Military Department, 1787-91; Honorary Editor: Dr. Bisheshwar Prasad), it made steady progress.

(ii) Descriptive Lists, Calendars, etc.

During the year, Volume IV of the *Descriptive List of Mutiny Papers* was sent to press; Volume VII of the 'Descriptive List of Secret Department Records, 1787-88', was cyclostyled; and Volume II of the *Calendar of Persian Correspondence, 1767-69*, was reprinted by photo-offset process. As regards *Proceedings of the Indian Historical Records Commission*, the printing of Vol. XLI was completed and that of Vol. XLII neared completion. The Department compiled its Annual Report for 1972 and sent it to the Press.

(iii) The Indian Archives

Volume XXI (No. 1) of *The Indian Archives*, covering January-June 1972, was sent to the press during the year under report. Among the interesting articles contained in the issue

are: "The State Archives of Uttar Pradesh" by K. P. Srivastava; "The Literature of Confrontation: An Introduction to Banned Publications in British Punjab" by Norman G. Barrier; and "Benarsi Das Chaturvedi Collection" by Shrimati Sudharani Sarma.

(iv) 'Towards Freedom' Project

Materials relevant to the project were collected for 3 volumes pertaining to the period 1937-40. They comprised 4,000 typed pages covering selections from the records of the Home (Political), Foreign (Political), and Political (Secret) Departments and the Reforms Office.

E. Personnel and Miscellaneous Matters

(i) Staff changes

Shri S. A. I. Tirmizi, who had gone on deputation as State Editor (Gazetteers) to Jammu and Kashmir, returned to the Department on promotion as Deputy Director of Archives. Also Kumari E. David, Archivist (General) and Shri S. C. Tarneja, Lower Division Clerk, who were on deputation, reverted to their parent office. Sarvashri T. R. Sareen, Archivist (General), L. Dewani, Assistant Archivist (Gr. I, General), B. D. Saxena, Assistant Archivist (Gr. I, General), B. M. San-khdhar, Assistant Archivist (Gr. II, General), C. B. Pandey, Assistant Archivist (Gr. II, General), and K. R. Parwana, Stenographer, went on deputation to other departments/institutions during the year.

On the recommendation of the Union Public Service Commission, Shri S. N. Jaiswal was appointed to the post of Archivist (General), and on the recommendation of the Departmental Promotion Committee (Junior) of the Department of Culture, Shri S. R. Mitra was appointed on regular basis as Archivist (General), and Sarvashri Duli Chand, P. K. Ghosh, I. B. Roy, P. R. Malik and B. D. Saxena as Assistant Archivists (Gr. I, General).

Sarvashri A. D. Khan, Archivist (Oriental Records), Y. C. Gaur, Archivist (General), Hassanand T. Jeswani, Assistant, and N. Chakravarty, Record Attendant (Gr. I) retired from service, while Shrimati A. Gupta, Assistant Librarian, Shri Mohan Lal, Assistant Chemist (Gr. II), and Sarvashri M. L. Bhomik and A. K. Khurana, Stenographers, resigned from service.

Sarvashri Lok Nath, Mender (Gr. I), and Bahadur Singh and Purshotam Das, Peons, breathed their last.

The sanctioned strength of the Department during the year under report was 451 (New Delhi Office, 412 and Regional Office, Bhopal, 39) as against 449 last year. For administrative reasons 49 posts (Class I-1, Class II-3, Class III-27, and Class IV-18) remained unfilled during the year.

(ii) Conferences, Committees, and other Activities

Dr. S. N. Prasad, Director of Archives, attended, by invitation, the 3rd session of the Bangladesh Itihas Parishad held at Dacca from 12 to 14 May 1973. He also attended the meetings of the Executive Committee of the International Council on Archives held at Brussels from 20 to 23 May and meeting of the Committee for Archival Development at Paris from 25 to 30 May 1973.

Kumari Sobha Bose, Microphotographer, visited the German Democratic Republic for six weeks under the Indo-GDR Cultural Exchange Programme, to study the reprographic techniques being used in the Archives and Libraries in that country.

Shri I. N. Verma, Archivist, represented the Department at the 34th session of the Indian History Congress held at Chandigarh from 29 to 31 December 1973, and read a paper on "Mrs. Besant's Scheme for the Establishment of a National University in India".

Dr. N. H. Kulkarnee, Archivist, read a paper on "Source Material in the National Archives of India for Modern History of Maharashtra" at the 11th Annual Conference of the Institute of Historical Research held at Kolhapur from 17 to 20 October 1973.

(iii) Indian Historical Records Commission and National Committee of Archivists

(a) *Indian Historical Records Commission*—The forty-second session of the Indian Historical Records Commission was held at Panaji (Goa) on 5-7 January 1973. The session was

inaugurated by Shri S. K. Banerji, Lt. Governor of Goa, Daman and Diu. Prof. S. Nurul Hasan, Union Minister of State for Education and Social Welfare, read the Presidential Address and later presided over the first Business Meeting. The second Business Meeting was presided over by Prof. O. P. Bhatnagar, a senior member of the Commission, in the unavoidable absence of the Union Minister for Education. The session was attended by historians, scholars and archivists from all over India, including representatives of the Central and State Governments, Universities and learned Institutions. A number of resolutions were adopted, and, among the significant recommendations made, mention may be made of the following: (i) The Standing Committee of the Commission should review the membership and the working of the Indian Historical Records Commission; (ii) The Central and State Governments should take notice of the meritorious services of those who had carefully preserved private papers; (iii) The balance sheets deposited by business houses with the Registrar of Companies should be properly preserved; (iv) Use should be made of standard quality paper for records of permanent value; (v) Suitable measures should be taken for preserving the records of Municipal Corporations; (vi) State Governments should enact legislation to bring archival services, and records preserved by private bodies like maths, mosques, churches, libraries, and universities, under State supervision; and (vii) The State Governments should prepare Retention Schedules for records on the lines of those prepared by the central Government.

(b) *Standing Committee*—The Standing Committee of the Commission held its second and third meetings in New Delhi under the chairmanship of Shri Mohan Mukherji, Additional Secretary, Department of Culture, on 1 September and 30 November 1973 respectively. At its second meeting the Committee considered the Commission's resolution regarding its membership and working, and made suitable recommendations. One of its recommendations was that the Assistant Director of Archives concerned with the work of the Commission be appointed as *ex-officio* Joint Secretary of the Commission. This recommendation has since been accepted by the Government of India and the constitution of the Commission amended accordingly.

(c) *National Committee of Archivists*—The twenty-sixth meeting of the National Committee of Archivists was held at Panaji (Goa) on 8 January 1973. The Committee adopted

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some resolutions, the following being important among them: (i) The Central and State Governments should take steps to appoint trained Archivists in place of Weeding Assistants in each Administrative Department; (ii) Documentary films on archives be prepared in English, Hindi and other regional languages; (iii) The Government of India should hold an international seminar on historical sources of mutual interest available in the countries of the Indian Ocean.

(iv) Exhibition

The Department's permanent exhibition of select documents and manuscripts continued to attract visitors in large numbers. To celebrate the 25th anniversary of India's Independence, the Department organised an exhibition ('March Towards Freedom', 1919-47) of records, photographs, press-clippings, etc. It was opened by the President of India and visited by a large number of students, teachers and intelligentsia in general. Also on the occasion of 104th birth anniversary of Gandhiji the Department mounted an exhibition of interesting documents and contemporary photographs relating to his mission in Champaran.

(v) Hindi Section

The Hindi Section, as usual, supplied translation of official correspondence from English into Hindi and *vice-versa* as and when required. It also continued the translation into Hindi of the *Indian Travels of Thevenot and Careri* brought out by the Department under Scheme I of its Publication Programme.

(vi) Library Section

517 new books and 261 periodicals were added to the Departmental Library. The Library also received about 2,600 books of the History of Freedom Movement Unit consequent on the winding up of the latter. In addition to this, 14,101 issues of the Gazette of India, Calcutta Gazette, Rajya Sabha & Lok Sabha Debates, and 3,373 Annual Administration Reports of the various State Governments and Union Territories were accessioned.

Cataloguing of the Fort William Collection of valuable books in Persian and Arabic was completed during the year.

(i) *Accession*—32 books were added to the Library.

(ii) *Checking and Arrangement*—1,655 files of the erstwhile Bhopal State (*Daftar-i-Chaudhrahahat*, 1862-1925; *Boundary Disputes*, 1841-91; and *Dafatar-i-Wazarat*, 1876-1905), and 2,235 files of the Government of India (certain branches of the Departments of Home, 1880-1913, and Commerce and Industry, 1863-1935) were checked and arranged.

(iii) *Compilation of Reference Aids*—Lists specifying subjects and references were prepared of the files mentioned above. The work of seeing the 'Descriptive List of Mutiny Papers', Vol. IV, through the Press was undertaken, and that of collecting material for the next volume in the series was taken in hand.

(iv) *Reference Service*—A number of requisitions from the Government of Madhya Pradesh were attended to. Some queries from research scholars, involving search among records, were also answered.

(v) *Preservation*—Apart from usual dusting of records and books special cleaning of 1,76,344 volumes, 17,162 files, 1,26,940 bundles, and 2,705 maps was done. 590 bundles of records and 898 volumes were fumigated with paradichlorobenzene. Besides, 56,878 sheets were paginated, 21,115 flattened, 38,448 guarded, 11,479 repaired with tissue paper, and 3,344 laminated.

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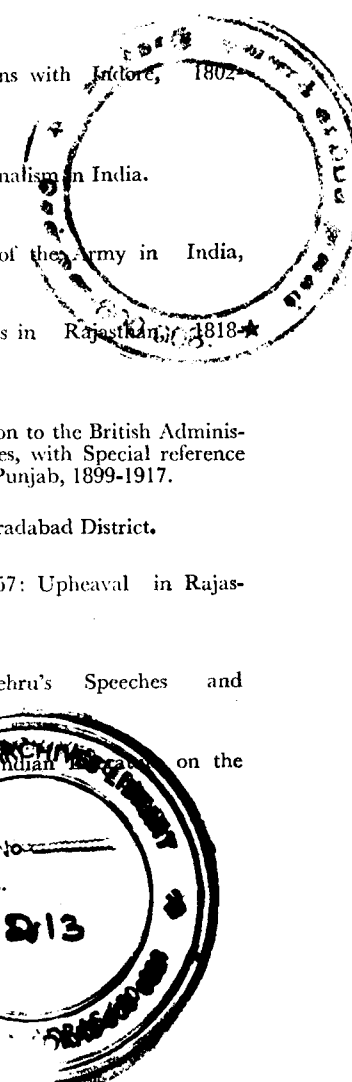
