ANNUAL REPORT, 1974

A. Some Highlights

During the year, the National Archives of India accessioned 1,70,050 files and 25 volumes belonging to the Foreign Department/Ministry of External Affairs, Viceroy's Executive Council, Military Department and Home (Political) Department. Besides, some more private papers of Raja Mahendra Pratap and Benarsi Das Chaturvedi and records of the Gandhi Murder Trial, were received for permanent custody.

In the Research Room of the Department, 591 research scholars consulted records and books relevant to their subjects of research. As many as 88 scholars came from U.S.A., U.K., Australia, New Zealand, Canada, Federal Republic of Germany, Afghanistan, France, etc.

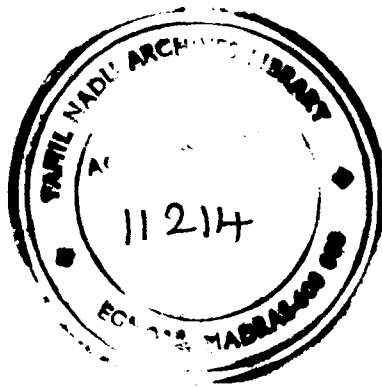
Further progress was made in the work of re-arranging and re-grouping of certain categories of records according to archival principles. As part of the Record Management programme, 86,774 files were appraised by the technical staff. In pursuance of the Archival Policy Resolution, the Department assisted various Government agencies in the formulation of retention schedules suitable for their various categories of records.

The preparation of reference media for the official records, private papers and microfilm of papers acquired from abroad was accelerated with additional staff sanctioned under the V Plan. Besides listing of records, the Department has started the preparation of a comprehensive Guide to Records in the National Archives of India.

Under the Publication schemes, one more volume of *Fort William—India House Correspondence* (Vol. XIX, Military Department, 1787—91) was brought out and printing of two more volumes in the same series neared completion. The printing of *Descriptive List of Mutiny Papers*, Vol. IV was completed. Volume IV, Part II of the *National Register of Private Records* was issued in cyclostyled form. Three more volumes of the National Register are in the various stages of compilation.

As for its advisory functions, the Department deputed a Deputy Director of Archives, under the Indo-Afghan Cultural Exchange Programme, to advise the Government of Afghanistan regarding

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opening of an archival repository at Kabul. The same officer also visited Hazarduari Palace at Murshidabad and submitted a detailed report on the proper maintenance and preservation of records housed therein, to the Department of Culture for further necessary action. On invitation from the Indonesian Government Shri Y. P. Katholia, Scientific Officer, visited Jakarta to advise that Government on setting up a Repair Unit. The Assistant Director of Archives (Record Management) inspected record rooms of several Government Departments and suggested ways and means of improving their up-keep.

Under the training programme, 17 persons successfully completed One-Year Diploma Course Training in Archives-Keeping Short term Certificate Courses of training in (a) Records Management and (b) Preservation of Records, were attended by 20 and 24 trainees respectively. In addition, 10 candidates selected under the 'Half-a-Million Jobs' Scheme were given training in a special course of 3 months' duration to enable them to take up jobs in the National Archives of India.

An exhibition entitled "Maulana Azad and the Provisional Government of India at Kabul, 1915—18" was organised at the National Archives of India on the occasion of the death anniversary of Maulana Abul Kalam Azad.

A five member delegation from Bangladesh consisting of Dr. K. M. Karim, Director of Archives, Prof. M. Kabir, Dr. A. M. Chowdhury and Dr. K. M. Mohsin of the Dacca University and Prof. A. F. Salahuddin Ahmed of the Jahangir Nagar University, Dacca, visited the Department. Other foreign dignitaries who visited the National Archives included Dr. Aziz Naim, envoy of the President of Afghanistan and Dr. Abdul Rahim Navin, Minister of Information and Culture, Afghanistan.

B. Archival Management

I. Accession

(a) *Official Records*—During the year, 1,70,050 files and 25 volumes were accessioned for permanent custody. The accession included the records of the Foreign and Political Department/Ministry of External Affairs (16,425 files), Office of the Viceroy's Executive Council (291 files), Military Department (223 files) and Ministry of Home Affairs (Political Branch 111 files). Besides, 54 authenticated Bills passed by the various State Legislatures and assented to by the President of India were received.

(b) *Private Papers*—The Department acquired by way of gift from Shri Bhola Chatterjee a collection of about 300 letters (1887—

1918) addressed to the late Sir Gooroodas Banerjee. A further instalment of papers of Banarsi Das Chaturvedi comprising 404 letters, 8 poems, 72 articles, 39 books, 68 photographs and some press clippings, received and added to the main collection. The Raja Mahendra Pratap Collection was augmented with 37 letters, a note book, 109 issues of "World Federation" and some rare pamphlets and newspapers (1928—42), a message on a piece of cloth, the passport issued to the Raja by the Ambassador of Turkey at Berlin in April 1918, two metal seals and an album of photographs of his visit to Tibet. Shri Malvinder Singh of Ludhiana donated 10 photographs of the freedom fighters connected with the Ghadr Movement. A Dutch sale deed, dated 26 October 1791 was gifted to the Department by Shri D. C. Mittra. Other significant acquisitions included records of the Gandhi Murder Trial comprising statements of N. V. Godse, V. D. Savarkar, Madan Lal and the judgment of the Special Trial Judge. issues of the newspapers "Bangladesh Observer" (Jan. 1971—Mar. 1974) received from Shri S. C. Dixit, 2 volumes of speeches of Subhas Chandra Bose received from the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting and 2 souvenir volumes on Rash Bihari Bose received from Shri K. C. Das.

On the recommendation of the Historical Documents Purchase Committee, the Department purchased some rare manuscripts and *parwanas*. Those deserving special mention are : *Hidayatnama-i-Malguzari*, *Amir Nama* and *Nadir-al-nikat*.

Microfilms—Under the programme of acquisition of microfilm of records of Indian interest from abroad, 4 rolls of microfilm of Willingdon Papers, 3 rolls of Sir Harry Haig Papers, 1 roll of Tod Mss (No. 82) entitled "Prithviraj Rasau", 1 roll of papers of Sir Anthony Macdonell (later Macdonell of Swinford), 5 rolls of the *Indian* and 1 roll of the *Indian Pioneer* were acquired from various institutions in the U.K.

II. Appraisal, Checking and Arrangement

(a) *Appraisal*—In the sphere of Record Management, the programme of appraisal of non-current records lying in the Department as well as in the various Ministries of the Government of India, and their Subordinate Offices, was pushed through with more vigour. As against 58,902 files appraised during 1973, this year the figure rose to 86,774 files. These records belonged to the Mysore Residency (1934—49), the Punjab State Agency (1945—47), the Rajputana States Agency (1874—1947), Ministry of External (1945—47) and Department of Agriculture (1945—47). Out of the total, 36,741 files were marked for permanent retention and the remaining recommended for destruction. Besides, 985 bundles of records belonging to the Department of Education, Health and Lands; Central Board of

Revenuc; Mysore Residency; and Punjab States Agency were also appraised. Those records which after appraisal were found to be of ephemeral interest were returned to the creating agencies for final disposal.

(b) *Checking and arrangement*—19,414 files, 107 volumes, 93 folios, 1,341 maps and 1,252 packets containing promissory notes from the Reserve Bank of India, cancelled securities, etc. were checked and 1,081 bundles, 856 boxes, 413 volumes, 10,430 files, 93 folios, 1,341 maps, 34 bills and 1,292 packets containing promissory notes from the Reserve Bank of India etc. were arranged in proper order.

1,174 files were amalgamated with their parent series after checking, and necessary entries made in the relevant transfer lists.

Docketing as well as classification of the Inayat Jang collection was continued. During 1974, 9,894 documents were docketed and 2,084 documents of the reigns of Aurangzeb, Farrukh Siyar and Muhammad Shah were classified according to their original order. Altogether about 6,000 documents of this important collection have been classified so far.

As regards the checking and re-arrangement of the private papers collections, 15,128 documents belonging to the collections of P. K. Malaviya, Dr. Rajendra Prasad, Benarsi Das Chaturvedi, Gooroodas Banerjee, Sivaswamy Aiyar, Freedom Movement Board were re-arranged. Subject lists of 21,910 documents belonging to these collections were also prepared.

III. Compilation of Reference Media

(a) *Guide to Records in National Archives of India*—Compilation of an upto date and comprehensive Guide to Records, giving their bulk, their inclusive years and gaps, shelf space occupied, contents in brief, organisational changes and other connected details in order to facilitate access to them, was started in June 1974. The spade work began with the survey of Home Department records, and during the period under report, data on as many as 22 branches of the said Department was compiled. The material for write-ups on organisational changes within the Home Department is being collected.

(b) The programme of compilation of Summary Inventories, cataloguing of maps, and descriptive listing of Persian Correspondence made good progress. Summary Inventories of 3,335 files of the Central Board of Revenue (Customs I: 1937—46), Foreign (Secret) Department Consultations (1799—1807), 1604 Home (Public) Department Despatches from the Secretary of State (1881—1922; 1925—27), 794 Home

(Public) Department Despatches to the Secretary of State (1894-95, 1903—06, 1908), and 2,130 Home (Education) Department Despatches from and to Secretary of State (1858—1907) were prepared. In addition, subject listing of 16,391 files of the Finance Department/Finance (Commerce) (1860—1904) and cataloguing of 4,026 maps of the Survey of India was completed.

IV. Manual of Indian Archives

A Manual of Indian Archives to serve as a guide on the principles and practices of archives management for professional Archivists in India was a long-felt need. The project assumed a concrete shape with the appointment of an Officer on Special Duty in April 1974. As a first step, collection of material was started from all State Archives with a view to eliciting information on the organisation and administration of their records-bulk, with their inclusive years, system of arrangement, registry, classification, appraisal, retention schedules, conservation, etc. Later in the year the OSD-in-charge of the project visited State Archives of Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh and Karnataka and held discussions with their Keepers and staff. The work is continuing and is expected to be finished in 1976.

V. Research and Reference Service

591 research scholars availed themselves of the facilities offered by the Department for consulting records, published sources, microfilms and collections of private papers. The great majority being Indians, of course, a fair number of scholars came from abroad also. (For names of the countries foreign scholars came from, please see Appendix I).

As usual, the Research Room was kept open from 9 A.M. to 8 P.M. on working days and from 9-30 A.M. to 4-30 P.M. on holidays. (For names of scholars and subjects of their research, please see Appendix II).

The Department attended to 60,865 requisitions for records from research scholars, members of staff, and the various agencies of the Government of India. Requisitions for 1,286 rolls of microfilm copies of records obtained from abroad were attended to. Among the 27 collections of private papers consulted, those of G. K. Gokhale, G. S. Khaparde, Dr. Rajendra Prasad, M. R. Jayakar, Srinivas Sastri, Krishnaswamy Aiyar and P. D. Tandon were much in demand.

Documents received back and restored to their proper places numbered 66, 424.

The Departmental Library catred to the requirements of 1,597 individuals, research scholars and members of staff and of various Government agencies, for books, periodicals and official reports.

A large number of inquiries received from the various Government Departments, semi-Government organisations, private institutions and individuals were attended to, many of which involved detailed search among the records and published sources. (For further details, please see Appendices III & IV).

VI. Inspection, Liaison and Advisory Work

As in the past, a few Central Government agencies located in Delhi solicited the Department's advise on the preservation of records, manuscripts and books. The Assistant Director of Archives (Record Management) also inspected the record rooms of several offices and gave advice in regard to the upkeep of their records.

Shri S. A. I. Tirmizi, Deputy Director of Archives, visited Kabul from 25th March to 4th April 1974 under the Indo-Afghan Cultural Exchange Programme to advise the Government of Afghanistan about setting up their archival repository. He also visited Hazarduari Palace at Murshidabad and advised the authorities regarding maintenance and preservation of records housed therein.

As part of the follow-up action on the Archival Policy Resolution and to study the diverse problem connected with record management, the Assistant Director of Archives (Record Management) visited record rooms of the office of Director General of Supplies and Disposal, Department of Company Affairs, Office of the Settlement Commissioner, Office of the Controller and Auditor General of India and the Union Public Service Commission.

The Department issued circular letters to 417 official agencies eliciting information in respect of the manuals on record management used by various offices for their respective record holdings. The manuals received from the Railway Board, Central Public Works Department, Indian Council of Agricultural Research, Post and Telegraph Board, Director General of Supplies and Disposal, Soil and Land Survey Organisation, and Director General of Mines and Safety were scrutinized and necessary advice given to the agencies concerned. The Retention Schedules of the Department of Culture and the Department of Family Planning were scrutinized and suggestions for their modification were given. The Government of Madhya Pradesh was advised on the framing of rules for weeding of their records.

The Department continued its endeavours to reactivate the State Units of the Regional Records Survey Committees in their work

of survey of records in private custody for the National Register. Shri I. N. Verma, Archivist, attended a meeting of the Gujarat Unit of the Committee at Ahmedabad in December 1974.

VII. Training

During the year, 17 trainees completed the one-Year Diploma Course of Training in Archives-Keeping and awarded diplomas after passing the qualifying examination. This was a record number.

As in the previous year, the Department conducted two short term Certificate Courses of training, one in Record Management and other in Repair of Records. For the former course 20 and for the latter 24 candidates, representing various Government agencies, availed themselves of the facilities.

Besides, 10 candidates selected under the 'Half-a-Million Jobs' scheme were given training in a specially designed course of three months' duration to fit them to take up jobs in the National Archives of India. (For names of successful candidates the marks obtained by each as also the lists of other categories of trainees under various schemes, please see Appendix V).

The Department also provided facilities to Miss Songsarn Nilkumhaeng a UNESCO nominee from Thailand and Mr. U. Paw Thein, Director General of Archives, Government of Burma, for studying management of archives and preservation techniques.

C. Preservation and Technical Service

I. Preservation and Repair of Records

Under the programme of preservation and repair of records, 1,724 sheets were repaired by machine lamination, and 62,774 sheets with tissue paper, 34,133 sheets and 670 maps were given miscellaneous repairs. 58,338 sheets were deacidified and 25,210 sheets and 677 maps were freed from old patches of repair. Besides, 827 maps and 8 charts were mounted and 77,233 sheets guarded, 518 volumes, 153 books and 710 miscellaneous items were bound and Leather Preservative Mixture was applied to 14,100 volumes.

1,268 bundles, 36 volumes and 70 files were aircleaned and 134 bundles, 2,650 publications and 78 files fumigated.

II. Technical and Advisory Service

The Department, besides attending to the normal conservation and restoration work, extended repair and rehabilitation facilities.

to a number of institutions and individuals. Among such institutions the names of Nehru Memorial Museum and Library, New Delhi, and the Libraries of Central Secretariat and Parliament Secretariat, deserve special mention.

Technical advice on problems connected with the repair and preservation of records, procurement and specifications of lamination and photoduplication machines, cellulose foil, tissue paper and other repair materials was given to a number of institutions and individuals. Of those who sought advice on these problems, mention may be made of Director, Rajasthan State Archives, Bikaner, Joint Secretary, Darul Masannefin Shibli Academy, Azamgarh (U.P.), Archaeological Survey of India, Hyderabad, National Library, Calcutta, Adyar Library, Madras, Tamil Nadu State Archives, Madras, Commissioner, Ambala Division, and Central Vigilance Commission, New Delhi.

A Scientific Officer of the Department was deputed to inspect and make suggestions for the preservation and storage of books and documents in the library of Ministry of External Affairs, and library and record room of the Hazarduari Palace, Murshidabad. S/Shri Ranbir Kishore and V. V. Talwar, Assistant Director of Archives (Preservation) and Scientific Officer respectively, inspected the laboratory of the Department of Psychology, Delhi College, Delhi and Library of the Indian Council of Cultural Relations, New Delhi to give advice on problems connected with the preservation of records and books.

III. Photoduplication

As part of the regular programme, microfilming of records of the Miscellaneous and Secret series of the Foreign Department was continued, as also of press-clippings from the Jayakar Collection, Dayanand Saraswati Mss from Smt. Paropkarni Sabha, Ajmer, rare manuscripts from the Raza Library, Rampur, G. B. Pant Papers, Punjab Conspiracy Case Proceedings and the newspaper 'Abhyudaya'. Mobile Microfilm Unit of the Department visited Bangalore to microfilm the records of the Sringeri Mutt.

Reprographic services were rendered to a number of institutions and individuals in India and abroad. Among those who availed of these services may be mentioned the universities of Malaya; Singapore; New South Wales, Australia; Ethiopia; Northern Iowa, U.S.A.; and Jammu; Czechoslovak Oriental Institute of Academy of Sciences, Prague; National Archives of Malaysia; Library of National Australian University, Canberra, School of Oriental Languages, Paris; Fisher Library, Sydney; Embassy of State of Qatar, New Delhi; Embassy of India, Muscat; Karanataka State Archives, Bangalore; Government of

Mizoram; Government of Nagaland; Indian Statistical Institute, Calcutta; University of Agricultural Science, Bangalore; Nehru Memorial Museum and Library, New Delhi; Indian Institute of Mass Commucintaion, New Delhi; Dr. B. R. Tomlinson, Trinity College, ambridge; Dr. Judith Brown, Manchester University; Dr. D. A. Low, National Australian University, Canberra; Shri Muhammad Aziz Naim, Kabul University; Dr. R.P. Vyas, University of Phdhpur; Shri Edward Haynes, Duke University; North Carolina; Dr. A. Wezles, Hamburg University; and Dr. T. R. Metcalf, University of California, U.S.A.

The total output of photoduplication work is represented by the following figures: 2,17,462 exposures of microfilms, of which 10,662 metres constituted positive printing 2,439 enlargement prints, 3,821 xerox copies and 8 reflex copies.

IV. Research Laboratory

The Research Laboratory of the Department undertook testing of the various materials available in the country like chiffon, ledger paper, adhesives, long-cloth, log line, etc. to find out their suitability for use in the repair and rehabilitation of records. Testing of leather samples was taken up to ascertain their suitability for binding of volumes. Some samples of adhesive powders for making thick paste were also subjected to tests in the laboratory.

D. Publication

I. Fort William—India House Correspondence

Under Scheme I of the Publication Programme of the Department, the printing of Vol. XIX (Military Department, 1787—91; Honorary Editor: Dr. Bisheshwar Prasad) was completed. But for the indices of the two volumes whose typescripts have been made ready, the printing of Vol. XVI (Foreign, Political, Secret Department, 1787—91; Honorary Editor: Prof. S. H. Askari) and Vol. XVIII (Foreign, Political, Secret Department, 1796—1800; Honorary Editor: Rev. Father H. Heras) has also been completed.

II. Descriptive Lists and Calendars, etc.

Volume IX of the *Descriptive List of Mutiny Papers* was brought out during the year. Two more volumes (Vols. VIII & IX) of the *Descriptive List of Secret Department Records* were cyclostyled, thus bringing the series to a close. Little progress was reported by the Press in the printing of *Index to Titles*. The reprinting by the photo-offset process of the *Calendar of Persian Correspondence*, Vol. II was also completed.

The printing of the Proceedings of the *Indian Historical Records Commission*, Vol. XLII neared completion. The Annual Reports for the years 1972 and 1973 were also published during the period under report.

III. The Indian Archives

The Indian Archives, Volume XXI (Nos. 1 & 2) and Vol. XXII (Nos. 1-2) were published. Some of the interesting articles the issues contained are: "Source Material in the National Archives of India for the Modern History of Maharashtra" by Dr. N. H. Kulkarnee, (2) "The Security Classification of Records in the United States" by James E. O'Neill and (3) "C. F. Andrews' Letters to Rabindra Nath Tagore" by Anil Samarth.

IV. 'Towards Freedom' Project

Started in 1973 in collaboration with the Indian Council of Historical Research, the project envisages publication of basic documents on the partition of India and transfer of power (1937-47). During the period under report, 8,000 pages of materials were typed from the records of the Home Department (1937-42), Political Department (1941-43), Office of the Secretary to the Governor General (1941-42) and Dr. Rajendra Prasad Collection.

E. Personnel and Miscellaneous Matters

I. Staff Changes

On the recommendation of the Union Public Service Commission, Shri H. N. Mathur, Archivist, was appointed to the post of Officer on Special Duty (II) with effect from 26th April 1974 for the implementation of the Fourth Plan Scheme "Compilation of Manual of Indian Archives" and Dr. N. H. Kulkarnee, Archivist, was appointed as Assistant Director of Archives with effect from 1st June 1974.

Additional staff comprising 5 Archivists, 4 Assistant Archivists (Gr. I), 6 Assistant Archivists (Gr. II), 3 Typists, 1 Lower Division Clerk and 4 Record Attendants (Special Grade) was sanctioned for implementing the various developmental programmes.

Shri Bhawani Dass, Administrative Officer, retired from services on 18th March 1974 and Shri Lachman Das Ajmani took over the office on *ad hoc* basis.

Shri J. R. Gupta, Archivist (Oriental Records), retired from service on 31st October 1974 and was re-employed as Assistant

Archivist (Gr. I) (Oriental Records) for the period 12th December 1974-28th May 1975.

The Library Arrears Clearance Unit having completed its sanctioned period of work, the posts of 1 Librarian, 10 Assistant Librarians, 6 Lower Division Clerks and 2 Record Attendants (Gr. II) were retrenched with effect from 31st December 1974.

The sanctioned strength of the Department during the year under report was 451. For administrative reasons 50 posts [Class I, Class II (Non-Gazetted)—3, Class III—27, and Class IV—19] remained unfilled during the year.

II. Conferences, Committees and other Activities

Dr. S. N. Prasad, Director of Archives, attended the meeting of the Art Purchase Committees held at Calcutta during 18-20 January 1974 and at Madras during 23-25 February 1974. He participated in the International Seminar on Public Records Management at Washington from 14 March 1974 to 31 March 1974. He also attended a meeting of the Committee for Archival Development of the International Council on Archives at Darmstadt (West Germany) in May 1974. S/Shri M. L. Ahluwalia, Assistant Director of Archives and Dr. N. H. Kulkarnee, were deputed to represent the Department at the 6th Meeting of the State Advisory Board of Archaeology, Gujarat, held at Gandhi Nagar on 27 May 1974 and at the 12th Annual Conference of the Institute of Historical Studies, held at Shillong from 7 to 10 October 1974, respectively.

III. Indian Historical Records Commission and National Committee of Archivists

(a) *Indian Historical Records Commission*—In order to make it more effective, the Indian Historical Records Commission was re-constituted on 1 November 1974 for a period of five years.

The 43rd Session of the Commission was held at Lucknow from 28 to 30 January 1975. The inaugural session and the Business Meeting were presided over by Prof. S. Nurul Hasan, Union Minister of Education and Social Welfare. The forenoon and afternoon academic sessions were presided over by Dr. Raghubir Singh and Prof. G. H. Khare respectively. The session was attended by historians, scholars and archivists from all over India. A number of resolutions were adopted and among the important recommendations made the following deserve special mention: (1) that no pre-

1947 State records be destroyed till the investigation of the Sub-Committee of the Commission on the subject has been completed and its report submitted, (2) that State Archives should take immediate steps to declare open their respective records upto December 1945 to *bona fide* research scholars; (3) on conducting a Correspondence Course in Archives Administration by the National Archives of India for the staff working in offices outside Delhi.

(b) *Standing Committee*—The Standing Committee of the Commission held its 4th Meeting in New Delhi on 19 April 1974 under the Chairmanship of Shri Mohan Mukherjee, Additional Secretary, Department of Culture. The Committee discussed *inter-alia* the membership of the Commission and decided that some important Ministries of the Central Government, including the Department of Administrative Reforms, should be represented on the Commission. It was also decided to increase the strength of the Standing Committee by inclusion of some more scholars and archivists of eminence.

(c) *National Committee of Archivists*—The 27th Meeting of the National Committee of Archivists was held on 30 January 1975 at Lucknow under the Chairmanship of Dr. S. N. Prasad. It discussed problems of record administration and other matter of common interest.

(d) *International Symposium*—In pursuance of a resolution passed by the Commission, the Department undertook to organize an International Symposium on Historical Sources of Mutual Interests in the littoral countries of the Indian Ocean region. A good deal of preparatory work was done but the symposium had to be postponed *sine die* due to unavoidable circumstances.

IV. Exhibition

An exhibition entitled "Maulana Azad and the Provisional Government of India at Kabul—1915—18" was organized on the occasion of the death anniversary of Maulana Abul Kalam Azad. It was inaugurated by Prof. S. Nurul Hasan, Minister for Education and Social Welfare. The Department's permanent exhibition of select documents and manuscripts continued to attract visitors.

V. Hindi Section

The Hindi Section carried on, as usual, the work of translation of official correspondence from English to Hindi and *vice-versa* as required. 80 pages of the book entitled "*Indian Travels of Thevnot and Careri*".

VI. Library Section

435 books, 264 periodicals, 4,452 issues of Gazette of India, Calcutta Gazette, Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha Debates were added to the Departmental Library. Besides, 304 Annual Administration Reports were received from the State Governments and Union Territories.

1,597 individuals, including research scholars, members of staff of the various Ministries and other offices, consulted books, periodicals, Gazettes, etc. The Library also attended to several queries referred to by individuals and private agencies.

The re-organisation work of the Library undertaken in March 1970 continued upto 31 December 1974. The task of clearing the back-log had to be suspended unfortunately as the term of the additional staff employees on the job came to an end by 31 December 1974. However, efforts are being made to get the posts renewed for completing the job.

In order to facilities access to periodicals the nucleus of a documentation Cell within the Library has been created to compile indices to archival and historical journals as well as prepare subject bibliographies.

F. National Archives (Bhopal)

Checking and Arrangement—2,308 files of the Home Department (1874—1904) and 1,684 files of Ministry of Commerce and Industry (1863—1935) were checked and arranged.

Reference Service—In addition to attending to requisitions from the Government of Madhya Pradesh, the office supplied records to some research scholars as well.

Preservation—Besides the usual dusting of records and books, special cleaning of 1,77,612 volumes, 9,542 files, 101,658 bundles and 2,771 maps was completed. 218 bundles were labelled and 2,066 files were docketed; 8,510 bundles were checked and re-arranged; 510 bundles, 843 volumes, 116 files and 136 maps were fumigated with paradichlorobenzene. During the year 1,93,804 sheets were paginated, 30,565 flattened, 45,076 guarded, 4,307 repaired with tissue paper and 1,675 laminated.

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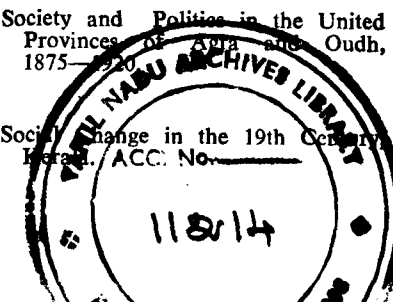
