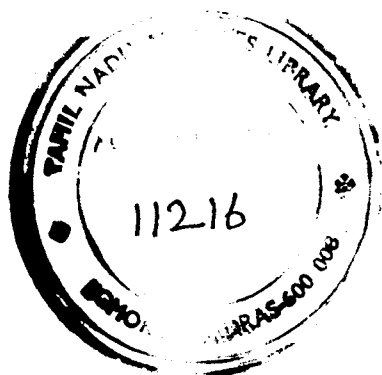
A. Some Highlights

The outstanding feature of the year under report was the decision of Government raising the status of the National Archives of India from a "Subordinate Office" to that of an "Attached Office" with effect from 15 September 1975. This enables the Department to correspond directly with the Ministries/Departments, State Governments, Government Undertakings, etc. and would greatly facilitate Record Management Work.

During the year two projects in the Fifth Five Year Plan were sanctioned. These were : School for Archival Training, and expansion of "Towards Freedom" Project. A total of 31 additional posts, belonging to different disciplines, were created under these schemes. These were among twelve projects included in the Fifth Plan for development of archival activities of the National Archives of India, for which a total Plan outlay of Rs. 224.00 lakhs was approved by the Planning Commission.

The other important highlights of the year were appointed by the Government of India of two special Committees. The first of these was to study the implications of the Antiquities and Art Treasures Act, 1972, and to make recommendations for enacting legislation regarding records of national importance which might be less than 75 years old, and the second Committee was to investigate into alleged indiscriminate destruction of public records in the States and to suggest suitable methods for scientific appraisal of semi-current and non-current records. The first Committee submitted its report to the Standing Committee of the Indian Historical Records Commission in October 1975 and also suggested the outlines of a draft Bill for Records of National Importance. The Committee on Record Management completed its country-wide survey in December 1975 and collected information about the system of record-keeping followed in the States and their appraisal. The report is presently being compiled.

On the recommendations of the Committee on Subordinate Legislation of the 5th Lok Sabha (14th Report), a draft of a comprehensive Bill on Public Records (of the Central Govt. and of such of the State Govts. as would like to come within its



purview) was also prepared and submitted to the Govt. The proposed Bill lays down the general procedure regarding management of records from the time of their creation, their appraisal and retirement to the Central repository, their proper storage, conservation and use.

Another significant development regarding exchange of microfilm copies of Records with foreign repositories was an agreement concluded with the India Office Library and Records, London for exchange of materials of mutual interest in microfilm.

The Department kept up its programme of imparting training in Archives Keeping & many developing countries have shown their increasing interest also in it. Besides private candidates and state nominees, one trainee from Malaysia successfully completed the course during the session, 1974-75, and two candidates from Malaysia and one from Nigeria have been admitted for the 1975-76 session.

Under the Colombo Plan the Department deputed Sh. R. C. Gupta, Deputy Director of Archives, to advise the Government of Singapore for constructing their Archives Building on scientific lines. Also Miss D. G. Keswani, Officer on Special Duty of this Department left for Accra to teach Archival Science in the School for Archival Training established under the aegis of UNESCO at the University of Ghana.

During the period under report 8,019 files, and 24 bundles belonging to the Ministries of External Affairs, Food & Agriculture and Home Affairs, Deptt. of Finance, the Viceroy's Executive Council, & the Office of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India, were accessioned. Besides, some more private papers of Raja Mahendra Pratap, Benarsi Das Chaturvedi, Gooroodas Banerjee, S.C. Dixit were received for permanent custody.

An exhibition entitled Sardar Patel-Satyagrahi to Statesman was organised on the occasion of celebration of Sardar Patel's birth centenary.

B. Archival Management

I. Accession

(a) *Official Records*—During the year, 8,019 files and 24 bundles were accessioned for permanent custody. The accession included the records of the Ministries of External Affairs (3,997 files), Food & Agriculture (450 files), Home Affairs (152 files), Ministry of States (77 files), Deptt. of Finance (39 files),

Deptt. of Food & Irrigation (24 bundles), the Viceroy's Executive Council (374 files), and Office of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India (2,950 files). Besides, 153 authenticated copies of Bills passed by the various State Legislatures and assented to by the President of India were received.

(b) *Private Papers*—Further addition was made to the Collection of Sir Gooroodas Banerjee. The papers comprise 52 letters, mainly his correspondence with Lord Curzon, Sir Andrew Fraser, Lord Carmichel, Lord Lansdowne etc., covering the period 1887-1916. The Collection was received from Shri Bhola Chatterjee. Another batch of papers of Raja Mahendra Pratap was received. These comprise 677 letters in English, Urdu, Chinese, Japanese & German etc., one scrap book, a few pamphlets and some press-clippings, comprising his correspondence with Bertrand Russel, Jawaharlal Nehru in connection with World Federation. A few more letters, books, pamphlets, copies of *Daily Bangladesh Observer* and certain photographs were acquired & added to the main Collection of S. C. Dixit papers. To Benarsi Dass Chaturvedi collection were also added a few more letters, addressed by Sir V. S. Agrawala, Mahatma Gandhi, Dr. Rajendra Prasad, Nand Gopal, Sri Kamlapati Tripathi & Rabindranath Tagore. The Department also received as gift from Sh. D. R. Handa, one of the accused in the Punjab conspiracy case, a copy of the judgment as reproduced in all India Reporter (A.I.R.) 1935 and *Shaheed Smarika*, a journal brought out by Hindustan Freedom Fighters Association on the occasion of the Martyrdom Day Celebration of Shaheed Ganesh Shankar Vidyarthi; seven files relating to Trade Union Movement at Jamshedpur (1928-53) from Sri M. K. Ghosh, Jamshedpur; one book entitled *Bharat Me Communist Party Ki Asthapana* from Shri Satyabhakta; & one book entitled *Oaten Incident 1916—a Chapter in the life of Netaji Subhas Bose* from Shri Bhola Nath Roy. The National Archives, Washington, also presented to the Department one letter and one telegram addressed to President Wilson by Rabindra Nath Tagore, dated 9 and 13 May 1918, respectively, concerning conspiracy trial at San Francisco, wherein prosecution counsel had implicated Tagore and the latter sought protection against such lying calumny. Photocopies of three letters written in Gujarati by Mahatma Gandhi to Miss Bapsy Pavry were also received as a gift from Dowager Marchioness of Winchester. The Department also received as gift, 600 original documents in Persian & Rajasthani from the Haldiya family of Jaipur. These records, relating to the period 1710-1942, throw light on the diplomatic correspondence between some of the erstwhile princely states of Rajputana. Sayyid Muhammad Siyadat Maqvi, of Amroha, gifted to the National Archives 50 documents in Persian & Urdu

throwing light on the social and economic conditions of the people of Amroha. Photostat copies of 25 documents were also received as a gift from the Director, Department of Historical and Anti-quarian Studies, Gauhati. A few letters and a telegram from Gandhiji to Dr. B. C. Roy were also gifted by Shri Tarun Roy to the Department.

On the recommendation of the Historical Documents Purchase Committee, the Department purchased some rare manuscripts, printed books (in English & Urdu) and documents, mainly *parwanas*. Those deserving special mention are: Indian Independence League papers (1941-44); bulletins on the Quit India Movement (1942-43); collection of papers in Hindi throwing light on the freedom struggle and Kisan and labour movement in the erstwhile Gwalior State during 1919-47; correspondence between the rulers of Bhopal State and some officials of the East India Company (1827-62); *Firangnama*, a risala relating to the history of European powers in India; *Parwanas* relating to *Pargana* Amroha, issued during the reigns of Jahangir, Shah-jahan & Aurangzeb etc; and a collection of 19th century documents viz. *bainamas*, *hibanamas tamassuks*, *ijaranamas*, *gabz-al-wasuls* etc. belonging to *Suba* Bihar.

Microfilms: The Department's regular programme of acquisition of microfilms of records of Indian interest from abroad continued. In this connection, mention may be made of 3 rolls of microfilm of Baldwin papers (1923-29, 1935-37) from University Library, Cambridge; 23 rolls of Ilbert papers (1882-86); 14 rolls of 2nd Marquess of Linlithgow (1935-43); 37 rolls of Guy Fleetwood Wilson papers (1908-13) from India Office Library & Records; 30 rolls of despatches from Secretary of State for India (1932-40), from Inter Documentation Company, Postrasse, Switzerland; 3 rolls of Kitchener Papers (1900-16) from Public Record Office, London; and one roll of Attlee papers (1941-51) from the University College, Oxford.

An agreement has been concluded between the National Archives of India and the India Office Library and Records, London, for exchange of materials of mutual interest in microfilm.

II. Appraisal, Checking and Arrangement

(a) *Appraisal*—During the period under report, the Record Management Unit was able to complete appraisal of 75,679 files. Out of these 40,689 files were marked for permanent retention. These records belonged to Western Kathiawar Agency (1876-1938); Western India State Agency (1876-1947); Central India Agency (1876-1947); Mysore Residency (1921-22); Hyderabad Residency (1930-47); Ministry of External Affairs

(1932-50); Ministry of Defence (1875-85); President's Secretariat (1902-74); and Cabinet Secretariat (1938-45).

(b) *Checking and arrangement*—During the year under report, 12,303 files, 1,080 volumes of different Ministries, Departments & Office of the Viceroy's Council, and 200 packets, containing promissory notes received from the Reserve Bank of India, were checked and arranged. 4,452 files were amalgamated with their parent series and necessary entries were made in the relevant transfer lists.

Docketing as well as classification of the Inayat Jang Collection made steady progress. During the period 9,545 documents were docketed and 1,684 documents were classified according to their original order.

As regards the checking and re-arrangement of private papers, work was completed on 1,85,750 documents belonging to the collections of Dr. Rajendra Prasad, Dadabhai Naoroji, Benarsi Das Chaturvedi, P. K. Malaviya, P. D. Tandon, Inayat Jang, G. B. Pant, and Gandhiji. Papers relating to the History of Freedom Movement, Meerut Conspiracy case & Jamshedpur Labour Organisation, were also checked & arranged. Besides these, 68 rolls of microfilm of Guy Fleetwood Wilson papers, Attlee papers, Baldwin papers, Ilbert papers and Kitchener papers were also checked.

III. Compilation of Reference Media

(a) *Guide to Records in National Archives of India*—Compilation of an upto date and comprehensive Guide to Records was continued. Abstract lists as well as write-ups on organisational changes of the records series giving their contents (in brief), inclusive years, gaps & shelf-space occupied by them were compiled. The records covered are those from: Department/Ministry of Home Affairs; Foreign Department (Company period only); Office of the Private Secretary to Viceroy and its successor bodies; Education, Health and Lands Department; Reforms Office; and Despatches belonging to the Governments of Bombay, Madras and Strait Settlements.

(b) The preparation of summary inventories, cataloguing of maps, Descriptive listing of Persian Correspondence & subject listing of private papers made good progress. During the period under report, summary inventories of 17,130 files of the different branches of Finance Department (1860-1921); 28,230 manuscript pages of the Foreign (Secret) Deptt. (1799-1801-07); 2,269 Revenue Despatches to and from the Secretary of State for

India (1860-1921) were prepared. Under the programme of preparation of the Descriptive List of Persian Correspondence, collection of material for Vol. II (1802) was completed. In addition subject lists were also prepared of 42,746 documents belonging to the collections of Dr. Rajendra Prasad, Dadabhai Naoroji, Banarsi Das Chaturvedi, Gooroodas Banerjee, V. S. Srinivasa Sastri, P. K. Malaviya, Pherozeshah Mehta, and Jamshedpur Labour Organisation papers. 547 seal impressions found on the Inayat Jang Collection belonging to the reign of Muhammad Shah were catalogued. Index to Catalogue of Survey of Historical Maps in the custody of this Deptt. was prepared and sent to the Press. The volume is likely to come out of the Press shortly.

IV. National Register of Records

Compilation & editing work on the National Register of Private Records Vol. VI (1964-65) was completed and it has been since brought out in cyclostyle form. It covers the material received from Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Bihar, Karnataka, Kerala, Punjab, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu and Uttar Pradesh. Volume VII in the same series comprising the material received during 1965-66 from Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Bihar, Karnataka, Orissa, Punjab, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu and Uttar Pradesh is also likely to be ready shortly. The editing work of volumes VIII & IX is in progress.

V. Manual of Indian Archives

An Advisory Committee was formed under the Chairmanship of Dr. Bisheshwar Prasad to advise the Officer on Special Duty in the final selection of the material to be incorporated in the proposed Manual. The Committee held its first meeting on 23 September 1975. The compilation of Manual was taken up on the lines recommended by the Advisory Committee. State Records Offices of West Bengal and Uttar Pradesh, as well as the Offices of the Board of Revenue, Uttar Pradesh and those of Commissioner and Deputy Commissioner, Lucknow Division, were inspected with a view to examine their physical bulk and their appraisal practices followed and to study the system of record-keeping, documentation, classification & registry.

VI. Research and Reference Service

During the year under report, 573 research scholars availed themselves of the facilities offered by the Department for consulting records, published sources, microfilms and collections of private papers. The great majority of scholars were Indians but a good number of scholars came from abroad also. (For

names of the countries foreign scholars came from, please see Appendix I).

As usual, the Research Room was kept open from 9 A.M. to 8 P.M. on working days and from 9.30 A.M. to 4.30 P.M. on holidays. (For names of scholars and subjects of their research, please see Appendix II).

The Department attended to 59,631 requisitions for records from research scholars, members of staff, and the various agencies of the Govt. of India. Requisitions for 1,539 rolls of microfilm copies of records were also attended to. Among the 31 collections of private papers consulted, those of Dr. Rajendra Prasad, M. R. Jayakar, P. D. Tandon, B. D. Chaturvedi, V. S. S. Srinivasa Sastri & Sita Ram were much in demand by the scholars.

The Departmental library afforded facilities for consultation of books and periodicals to 1,568 individuals, including research scholars and members of the staff of the various offices of the Govt. of India as well as State Governments.

Apart from rendering service to those who personally visited this Department, a number of enquiries received from the various Government Departments, semi-Government organisations, private and public institutions and individuals involving detailed search among records and published materials were attended to. (For further details, please see Appendices III & IV).

VII. Inspection, Liaison and Advisory Work

On the request of the Govt. of Maharashtra, Dr. S. N. Prasad, Director of Archives, visited Bombay to advise them on the design for the proposed new building for the State Archives. Shri S. A. I. Tirmizi, Deputy Director, visited Bhopal to examine records of the erstwhile Gwalior State. He also inspected the family library of Mohammad Amir Khan, Lucknow. As part of the follow up action on the Archival Policy Resolution, the Asstt. Director of Archives (Record Management) assisted the Planning Commission in the compilation of their records retention schedule. To study the diverse problems connected with record management, he also inspected the record rooms of the Forest Research Institute and College, Dehra Dun and the President's Secretariat. An officer of the Record Management division also inspected various record rooms of the Ministry of Defence, New Delhi (*viz.* Electrical Mechanical Engineering Corps, Armed Service, Selection Committee Secretariat and General Staff, Geological Section) & necessary advice with regard to record management was given to them.

The work of compilation of data of archival assets of different Ministries/Departments of the Government of India was continued. In this connection circular letters were issued to 431 offices of the Union Government in order to collect information regarding the progress made by them in recording, indexing and appraisal of files. The information received from the Ministries of Home Affairs, Shipping and Transport, Steel and Mines, Communication, and offices of the Planning Commission, Central Bureau of Narcotics, Gwalior, and Govt. Opium and Akaloid Works at Ghazipur were scrutinised and necessary advice was given to the agencies concerned.

The Department continued its endeavours to reactivate the State Units of the Regional Records Survey Committee in their work of survey of records in private custody for the National Register. The Director of Archives attended a meeting of the Regional Records Survey Committee in Assam held on 16 December 1975. Delhi Regional Records Survey Committee was reconstituted and a meeting of this Committee was held on 4 September 1975 which was attended by an Asstt. Director of this Department.

VIII. Training

Under the programme for One-Year Diploma Course for training in Archives-Keeping, twelve trainees successfully completed the Course and were awarded diplomas. A new batch of 15 trainees has been admitted for 1975-76 session.

The Department conducted two short term certificate courses in Record Management of 8 weeks duration. 19 candidates from various State Govts. were imparted training. Another session of the course in Repair of Records of 6 weeks duration has also been started on 1 December 1975 and training to 8 candidates for this course is being imparted.

In addition to the above mentioned regular training programmes of the Department, a special course in Repair and preservation of Records for 4 weeks was organised. There were 8 candidates including two from Bangladesh and one from Indonesia. Training facilities were also provided in microphotography and Preservation to the nominees of the Geological Survey of India, Calcutta, and Visva-Bharati, Santiniketan. C. Preservation and Technical Service

I. Preservation and Repair of Records.

The programme of repair and rehabilitation of records was continued with vigour. 34,212 sheets were repaired by machine lamination; 33,526 sheets by solvent lamination process; 65,552 sheets were repaired with tissue paper; 57,119 sheets were deacidified and 50,534 sheets, 63,764 slips & 443 maps were freed from old patches of repair. Besides, 655 maps were mounted; 1,20,108 sheets were guarded & 747 volumes, 777 books, 113 original consultations and 1,359 miscellaneous items were bound. In addition minor repairs were also carried on 12,751 sheets and 717 maps.

II. Technical and Advisory Service

As usual, the Department, besides attending to its normal conservation and restoration work, rendered technical service and advice to a number of institutions and individuals for preservation and rehabilitation of documents. Important among the documents which were repaired during the year are : *Masnavi Maulana Roome* and *Holy Quran* for Ghalib Institute, New Delhi, Accession Registers of Indian Painting for Indian Museum, Calcutta; manuscripts of Swami Dayanand Saraswati for Smt. Paropkarni Sabha, Ajmer, letters of Ghandhiji addressed to Dr. B. C. Roy; *Diwan-i-Ghalib* for Indian Institute of Islamic Studies; *Guru Granth Sahib* for Khalsa Diwan, Kanpur.

Technical advice on the problems connected with the repair and procurement of cellulose, tissue papers, etc. were given to Fertilizers Corporation of India; M/s. William Tombay Parchment Papers Works, England; Bhabha Atomic Research Centre, Bombay; National Museum; Library of Archaeological Survey of India; Central Museum, Jakarta; State Archives offices in Bihar, Goa, Kerala and Orissa; and National Library, Calcutta.

Shri V. V. Talwar, and Shri Rajendra Prasad, Scientific officers in the Department, inspected the collection of Dairatul-Ma-arifil Osmania, Hyderabad, and records of the office of the Chief Commissioner, Ambala; and the library of the Archaeological Survey of India. These institutions were advised on scientific conservation of records.

III. Photoduplication

Photoduplication services were rendered to a number of institutions and individuals in India and abroad. Among those

who availed of these services, mention may be made of the following: School of Oriental & African studies, U. K.; Indian Council of Historical Research; Nehru Memorial Museum and Library; National Museum; Institute of Mass Communication, New Delhi; State Archives Offices of U. P., Andhra Pradesh, Gujarat, Tamil Nadu, Karnataka & Bihar; Dr. B. R. Tomilson, U. K.; Mr. W. T. Roy Hamilton, Newzealand; Mrs. R. H. M. Tons, London; Mr. Robert E. Mclean, U. S. A.; Shri K. Kripalani, M. P.; Shri S. N. Sen, Calcutta; Mr. C. M. Taylor and Mr. Paul C. Winther, U. S. A.; and Dr. Ashok Mitra, Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi.

As part of the regular programme, microfilming of records of the Foreign Department (Secret); Foreign Miscellaneous; Home Deptt. (Political); Home Deptt. (Law); Finance Deptt. & Index to Foreign Deptt. Progs; was continued. Also manuscripts from the Raza Library, Rampur; papers of the Kanpur Bolshevik conspiracy case (1924); & Intelligence Reports on Political situation were microfilmed.

The total output of photoduplication work is represented by the following figures : 2,62,440 exposures of microfilms; 10,410 metres of positive printing; 2,611 enlargement prints; and 6,378 xerox copies.

Shastri Indo-Canadian Institute :—An agreement of significant research value to the Scholars, both in India & Canada, was concluded between the Govt. of India and the Shastri Indo-Canadian Institute. The project envisages microfilming of documents in serious danger of decay and destruction. A Microfilm Project Committee has been constituted with the Director of Archives as one of its members. Besides, microfilm copies made available for use in Canada, copies, including a set of negatives, will be deposited in India in the National Archives and a few other institutions. The expenditure on the microfilming will be borne by the Shastri Indo-Canadian Institute. To implement the programme a microfilm camera was installed (October 1975) in the National Archives of India and the following series were microfilmed : (i) General Administrative Reports submitted to the Viceroys (1869-1926); (ii) Proscribed Publications (Assamese, Bengali, Burmese, Gujarati, Tamil, Kanada, Marathi, Malayalam, Telugu, Oriya) of the British Government of India. The Microfilm of the General Administrative Reports comprising 5,040 exposures was completed whereas the work on proscribed publications continued, 9,340 exposures of proscribed publications were microfilmed so far.

IV. Research Laboratory

To find out their suitability for use in the repair and rehabilitation of records, the Research Laboratory of the Department continued testing of the various materials available in the country like chiffon, ledger paper glues, long cloth (course and fine), logline, naphthaline, cellulose acetate foil, tissue paper etc. Testing of ledger paper, cover paper, waxed paper, bond paper, was also done to ascertain their durability for binding of volumes. A few samples of a paper brought by Miss Songsarn Nilkumhaerg, a trainee from Thailand, were scientifically examined to investigate the cause of their discoloration.

D. Publications

I. Fort William—India House Correspondence

Under the Publication Programme of the Department, the typescript of vol. XII (Home Public, 1793-95; Honorary Editor; Dr. A. Tripathi) was sent to the Press. The printing of Vol. XVI (Foreign, Political & Secret Department, 1787-91; Honorary Editor; Prof. S.H. Askari); and Vol. XVIII (Foreign, Political & Secret Department, 1796-1800; Honorary Editor : Rev. Father H. Heras) was completed; & these two volumes are expected from the Press shortly.

II. The Indian Archives

Having completed the editing work on *The Indian Archives* Volume XXIII, Nos. 1-2 (January-December 1974) and Vol. XXIV, No. 1 (January-June 1975) the typescript for these volumes was sent to the Press during the year under review. The printing of the proceedings of the Indian Historical Records Commission, Vol. XLII was completed and it is expected to be released shortly. Vol. XLIII of the same series was sent to the Press. The annual report for the year 1974 was also published during the period under report.

III. "Towards Freedom" Project

Under the Project 'Towards Freedom', the records for the years 1937-45 of the Fiance Department; Education, Health & Lands; Legislative Department; Foreign and Political Department office of the Viceroy's Executive Council; President's Secretariat; Cabinet Secretariat; Govind Ballabh Pant papers; Padmakant Malaviya papers; Purushottam Dass Tandon papers; Sampurnanand papers, Jayakar papers; Khare papers; P.S. Sivaswamy Aiyer papers, Indian Independence League papers

and microfilm rolls of Zetland paper; Haig papers; Eraskine papers and records of the office of the Crown Representative were examined and the relevant portions were marked out for typing. 5,600 pages of material were typed out during the year under report.

E. Personnel and Miscellaneous Matters

I. Staff Changes

For the Fifth Plan Schemes, additional staff comprising 5 Asstt. Directors of Archives, 5 Archivists, 7 Asstt. Archivists (Gr. I), 1 Microphotographer, 1 Scientific Officer, 3 Stenographers, 8 Lower Division Clerks and 1 Farash-cum-Chowkidar, was sanctioned for implementing the various programmes.

Shri P. C. Majumdar, Asstt. Director of Archives (P), Shri D. L. Kaka, Asstt. Director of Archives (R & P) and Shri D. R. Shastri Hindi officer, retired from service on 31-1-75, 28-2-75 and 31-12-75 respectively. And on the recommendation of the U.P.S.C. Shri S. N. Sharma, Archivist, was appointed as Asstt. Director of Archives (R & P) with effect from 3 December 1975.

The Sanctioned strength of the Department during the year under report was 486. For administrative reasons 67 posts [Class I, Class II (Gazetted)-12, Class II (Non-Gazetted)-6, Class III (Establishment)-37, Class IV (Establishment)-12] remained unfilled during the year.

II. Conferences, Committees and other Activities

Dr. S. N. Prasad, Director of Archives, visited Kiev (USSR) on 1 September, 1975 to attend XVI International Conference of the Round Table on Archives. He also attended a meeting of the Executive Committee of the International Council on Archives held at Varna (Bulgaria) on 6-9 September, 1975. He visited Kabul on 16-23 October 1975 for attending the Seminar on 'Indo-Afghan Relations through the Ages', organised under the Cultural Exchange Programme. He read a paper at the seminar on "Afghanistan as a Centre for Indian Nationalists and Revolutionaries." He also attended the meeting of the Art Purchase Committee of the National Museum held at Jaipur on 8-9 March 1975.

Shri R. C. Gupta, Dy. Director of Archives, was deputed to Singapore for three months (November 1975-January 1976) under the Colombo Plan for advising the Govt. of Singapore in constructing their archives building on scientific lines. During this period he also attended SARBICA General Conference and Seminar on Record Management held at Jakarta on 1-6 December 1975.

Km. D. G. Keswani, Officer on Special Duty, National Archives of India, has left for Accra to teach Archival Science in the School for Archival Training established under the aegis of UNESCO at the University of Ghana.

Shri M. L. Ahluwalia, Dr. N. H. Kulkarnee and Shri Ranbir Kishore, Assistant Directors of Archives attended the ninth meeting of the Punjab History Conference held at Patiala on 26-27 April 1975; the thirteenth Annual Conference of the Institute of Historical Studies, Calcutta held at Goa on 7-10 November 1975; and the Regional Seminar on Museum Architecture in South and South-East Asia held at New Delhi on 6-8 March 1975 respectively.

Shri V. V. Talwar, Scientific Officer, attended a seminar on Conservation of Cultural property in India held on 4-15 April 1975 at New Delhi. He read a paper on 'Fumigation Techniques commonly applied for sterilisation of paper and allied material.'

Shri Satyapal, Archivist of this Department also attended the 36th session of the Indian History Congress held at Aligarh on 29-31 December 1975.

Shri J. C. Srivastava, Librarian of this Department attended the tenth Conference of the Indian Association of Special Libraries & Information centre at Lucknow. He also attended meetings of the Committee of Experts to assess the Financial Requirements of the Library of Indian Council of World Affairs, New Delhi, and the meetings of the Standing Co-ordinating Committee of the Librarians, New Delhi.

III. Indian Historical Records Commission and National Committee of Archivists

(a) *Indian Historical Records Commission*—The 43rd session of the Indian Historical Records Commission was held at Lucknow on 28-29 January 1975. The session commenced with an inaugural address by Dr. M. Chenna Reddy, Rajyapal, Uttar Pradesh, Prof. S. Nurul Hasan, Union Minister of Education and

Social Welfare, in his presidential address laid stress on the problem of preventing illegal export of documents and the need for formulating a well-defined Record Management Programme for both the Public and Private sectors. The forenoon and afternoon academic sessions were presided over by Dr. Raghubir Singh and Prof. G. H. Khare respectively. The session was attended by historians, scholars and archivists from all over India. A number of resolutions were adopted, among which the following deserve special mention: (i) top priority to be given for construction of annexe to the National Archives of India; (ii) formation of a sub-committee to investigate into the reported destruction of valuable records in the States/Union Territories; & (iii) constitution of sub-committee to study the implementation of the Antiquities and Art Treasures Act, 1972.

(b) *National Committee of Archivists*—The 27th meeting of the National Committee of Archivists was held at Lucknow on 30 January 1975 under the Chairmanship of Dr. S. N. Prasad. While discussing problems of record administration and other matters of common interest, the Committee made two important recommendations on the following subjects: (i) that top priority should be given to the construction of Archival buildings; & (ii) formation of a sub-committee to consider the creation of a single cadre of Archivists in the country.

(c) *Committee on Record Management*—In pursuance of resolution III of the 43rd session of the Indian Historical Records Commission, a sub-committee on Records Management was constituted by the Govt. of India in March 1975 to investigate into alleged indiscriminate destruction of public records in the States. The committee was constituted of the following: Prof. B. P. Saxena, Chairman, Prof. P. M. Joshi, Dr. S. V. Desikachar, Shri Badri Nath, Shri A. T. Govindarajan—Members; and the Deputy Director of Archives, Shri S. A. I. Tirmizi, Member-Secretary. The first meeting of the Committee was held on 7 May 1975 to discuss problems concerning appraisal and weeding of non-current records in the States and subsequently four other meetings were also held. During the period under report the Committee visited the following States/Union Territories to collect necessary data and to record the evidence of eminent archivists, historians and administrators: Jammu and Kashmir (Srinagar), Punjab (Chandigarh and Patiala), Uttar Pradesh (Lucknow), Rajasthan (Jaipur and Bikaner), Delhi Administration (Delhi), Maharashtra (Bombay), Goa (Panaji), Gujarat (Ahmedabad), Kerala (Trivandrum), Tamil Nadu (Madras), Pondicherry, Karnataka (Bangalore and Mysore), Andhra Pradesh (Hyderabad), Assam (Gauhati and Shillong), West Bengal (Calcutta) and Bihar (Patna).

(d) *Committee for Legislation on Records of National Importance*.—A committee was constituted by the Government of India in pursuance of the resolution V of the Indian Historical Records Commission 43rd session held in January 1975 to study the implication of the Art Treasures Act 1972 and make recommendations for enacting legislation on records which are less than 75 years old but are of national importance. The Committee included Dr. Bisheshwar Prasad, Chairman, and a nominee each of the Ministry of Law & Justice, Archaeological Survey of India and Jawaharlal Nehru University as members, and Miss D. G. Keswani officer on Special Duty, National Archives of India, as Member-Secretary. During the period under report the Committee met twice, on 9 April and 6 May 1975, and drew up a draft Bill for records of National Importance. The Committee submitted its report as well as the draft Bill on 24 October 1975 to the Secretary to the Government of India, Ministry of Education and Social Welfare. Draft of a comprehensive Bill on Public Records in the country was also prepared and submitted to the Government.

IV. Exhibition

As a mark of homage to the memory of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel on the occasion of his birth centenary celebration, the National Archives of India organised an exhibition of contemporary photographs and documents called from billions of pages of Public Records, Private Papers and proscribed publications preserved in the Department. The exhibition entitled Sardar Patel-'Satyagrahi to Statesman' was inaugurated by the Vice-President of India, Shri B. D. Jatti on 19 May 1975 and proved to be a big success.

V. Library

The library of the National Archives accessioned 3,623 books, 262 periodicals, 2,000 University calenders, 15,200 issues of the Gazettes of India, and Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha Debates.

1,568 individuals, including research scholars, members of the staff of the various Ministries and Offices of the Government of India and States consulted the books, periodicals and Gazettes, etc. The Library also attended to several queries referred to by individuals and private agencies on variety of topics relating to historical and administrative interest.

An expert Committee was appointed by the Ministry of Education to review the working of the library and to suggest ways & means for the improvement of the functioning and clearance of arrears and the Committee submitted its report to the Ministry of Education and Social Welfare on 17 May 1975.

F. National Archives (Bhopal)

(i) *Accession*— 20 books were added to the Library.

(ii) *Checking and Arrangement*—2,995 files of the Home Department (1899-1917) and 2,272 files of the Department of Commerce and Industry (1865-1935) were checked and arranged.

(iii) *Research and Reference Media*.—Subject lists were prepared of the files of Home (Establishment) and Deptt. of Commerce and Industry.

(iv) *Preservation*.—Apart from usual dusting of records and books, special cleaning of 2,13,427 volumes, 32,052 files, 58,139 bundles and 2,629 maps was done; 905 bundles were labelled; 489 bundles and 977 volumes of *Daftar-i-Insha* were fumigated; 258 volumes were repaired; 2,98,736 sheets were paginated; 31,622 flattened; 13,111 files stitched; 38,100 guarded and repaired with chiffon; 1,448 repaired with tissue paper; and 2,800 laminated.

Under its Publication Programme compilation of the 'Descriptive list of Mutiny Papers', Vol. V made steady progress.

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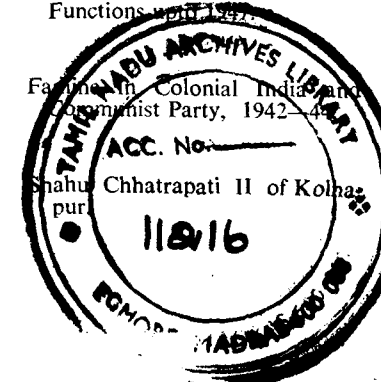
