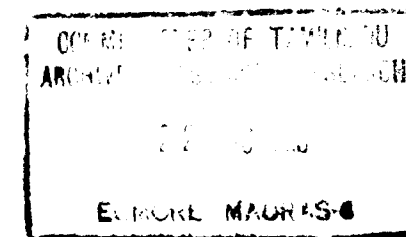

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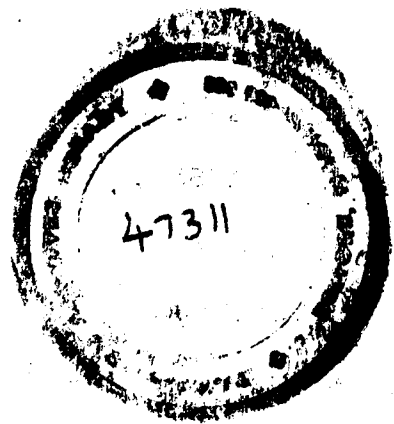
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PREFACE

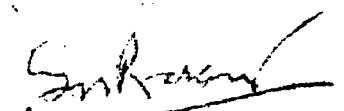
The present volume, which is seventh in the series contains information received during 1965-66 from the States of Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Bihar, Karnataka, Orissa, Punjab, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu and Uttar Pradesh. It contains much useful information about administrative, revenue, judicial and ecclesiastical activities in various areas which, it is hoped, would supplement the information available in official records.

In compiling this work an effort has been made to adhere to the pattern adopted in the case of earlier volumes in the series. The lists describe the documents and manuscripts of archival interest only, while the annexure contains information relating to the old and rare published works and manuscripts of non-archival value. The dates of documents, whether in Hijra, Bikram or Christian era, have been retained as given in the original.

Brief introductory notes have been added to the material received from different states and also to such individual collections which are fairly large and deserve special notice. Some of the lists furnished to this Department also contained information about the material presently in official custody. The authorities concerned do intend listing these at some future date, and such material has, therefore, not been listed here.

In compiling the present volume we were confronted with the same difficulties as experienced earlier also. The information supplied by the states relating to the dates and contents of several documents did not appear to be correct, or (in a large number of cases) the information supplied to this Department was incomplete, or there was no mention of the subject matter of the document at all. Besides, there were inaccuracies regarding personal and place names, and quite a number of items did not bear any date. It would be appreciated that in the absence of the original papers with us, it was not possible for us to verify or supplement all this. Under the circumstances, we have followed the usual practice of adhering closely to the original and identifying personal and place names to the extent possible, putting a mark of interrogation in the text wherever some doubt was felt, or putting the correct information in foot notes. It is hoped that despite such unavoidable shortcomings, the scholars will find the work useful.

In the earlier stages the work of compilation, identification and preparing index to the lists was done by Dr. T.R. Sareen and Shri S.S. Rekhi, and later on by Shri Suraj Prakash, on whose transfer the job was finally completed by Shri I.N. Varma assisted by Shri Krishan Lal. My thanks are due to all of them.

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LISTS OF DOCUMENTS

I. ANDHRA PRADESH

Listed below are 643 documents which belong to collections in the private custody of 16 different individuals in Andhra Pradesh. The documents cover the period 1463-1950 A.D., and consist of farmans, parwanas, sanads, iqar-namas, kharitas, court judgments, petitions, sale deeds, proclamations, circulars, notifications and various other kinds of papers. They throw a flood of light on the social, political, cultural, economic religious and almost every other aspect of life in Andhra Pradesh during the five centuries to which they relate. They are written mainly in Persian, Urdu and English, but there are a few documents in other languages also.

Collection of Hakim Nizamuddin, Retired Superintendent of Ayurvedic Unani General Hospital, Nizam Maskan, Mughalpura, Hyderabad.

1. Farman. 19 Safar 10 Julus 1078 A.H.; 31 July 1667. Issued by Emperor Aurangzeb to Qutbuddin Khan, directing him to proceed at once to Attock and join Muhammad Amin Khan who had been deputed to punish the Yusufzai Afghans. Persian.
2. Farman. 11 Shawwal 22 Julus 1089 A.H.; 16 November 1678. Issued by Aurangzeb to Muqim Khan, Qiladar and Faujdar of Antur Fort, directing him to hand over the charge of the Fort to Saiyid Zainul Abidin and proceed to the Deccan and join the army. Persian.

Collection of Mir Hussain Ali, Superintendent, Mecca Masjid, Mughalpura, Hyderabad.

3. Diaries (1884-1924 A.D.). Covering diplomatic, social, economic, cultural and political events in the erstwhile Hyderabad State. Urdu.

Collection of Yasin Shah Sahib, Sajjada, Dargah-i-Maskin Shah Sahib, Almas Mosque, near Aliabad, Hyderabad.

The papers in this collection relate largely to the construction of the Almas Mosque and a sarai in Aliabad and the arrangements made for their maintenance.

4. Farman. 13 Muharram 1022 A.H.; 23 February 1613. Issued by Sultan Muhammad Qutb Shah to the officers of Hyderabad city stating that Malik Almas constructed a mosque and a sarai in the locality of Aliabad and assigned one hundred huns for the maintenance of the mosque. Persian.
5. Tauliatnama (under the seal of Malik Almas). 20 Shawwal 1024 A.H.; 2 November 1615. Executed in favour of Saiyid Muhammad Qadri for the upkeep of the mosque and the sarai. Persian.
6. Tauliatnama (under the seal of Malik Almas). 19 Rajab 1028 A.H.; 22 June 1619. Executed in favour of Saiyid Hashim Hussain for the upkeep of the mosque and the sarai. Persian.
7. Parwana. 11 Shaban 1136 A.H.; 24 April 1724. From Inayatullah appointing Saiyid Karimuddin as a trustee of the mosque on the death of his father Saiyid Sibghatullah. Persian.
8. Sanad. 3 Jumada II, 10 Julus 1141 A.H.; 24 December 1728. Issued by Asaf Jah I and Iradat Khan appointing Saiyid Karimuddin as a trustee of the mosque on the death of his father. Persian.
9. Parwana. Rabi I, 1156 A.H.; April 1743. From Mir Muhammad Masum appointing Saiyid Sibghatullah as a trustee of the mosque on his father's death. Persian.
10. Decree. 27 Jumada II, 1176 A.H.; 23 January 1763. Issued by Qazi Shariatullah Khan and Mufti Abdul Qari Khan in favour of Saiyid Karimuddin confirming his title to the trusteeship of the Almas Mosque. Persian.
11. Statement. 17 Safar 1243 A.H.; 8 September 1827. Issued under the seal of Endowment Office, City of Hyderabad. Regarding Muhammad Sayeed's appointment by Raja Chandu Lal as a trustee of the mosque on Muhammad Makhfi, the former trustee, being sent to the prison. Persian.
12. Sanad. 21 Rabi I, 1243 A.H.; 12 October 1827. Issued by Raja Chandu Lal appointing Muhammad Sayeed as a trustee of the Almas Mosque. Persian.
13. Sanad. 29 Shaban 1264 A.H.; 31 July 1848. Issued by Nawab Sirajul-Mulk appointing Maulavi Muhammad Naeem alias Maskin Shah Sahib as a trustee of the Almas Mosque. Persian.
14. Sanad. 29 Zulqada 1281 A.H.; 25 March 1865. Issued under the seal of the Diwan (Salar Jang I) appointing Ghulam Muhammad (Taskin Shah) as trustee of the Almas Mosque and the property attached to it on the request of his father, Maskin Shah Sahib. Persian.

15. Sanad. 17 Safar 1331 A.H.; 26 January 1913. Issued by Sadaratul Aliya Office on the basis of a farman of H.H. the Nizam to the effect that on the request of Taskin Shah Sahib, his son, Ghulam Murtaza (Tahsin Shah), was appointed trustee of the Almas Mosque. Persian.
16. Sanad. 1950 A.D. Issued by Sadaratul Aliya Office on the request of Tahsin Shah Sahib to the effect that his son, Ghulam Hamid (Yasin Shah), be appointed trustee of the Almas Mosque and also of the property attached to it. Persian and English.

Collection of Damara Kumara Venkata Mahipala Bahadur, Zamindar Kalahasti, District Chittoor.

17. Copper Plate (Translation). Salivahana era 1556, Tarana Samvat, Magha Sudi 12. Regarding grant of a village to the Archakas of Kalahasti temple by Rang Raj of the famous solar race. English.
18. Cowle. 28 December 1790. From the Governor of Fort St. George to Raja Damara Kumara Venkatappa Naidu Bahadur restoring to him the jagir of Sitharampur, zamindari of Kalahasti and the Hill Pollium on the terms of old mamul. English.
19. Promissory Note. 31 March 1822. Executed by the Governor-in-Council on behalf of the East India Company, for Rs.8,000/- in favour of the Raja of Kalahasti. English.
20. Sanad. 31 December 1875. Regarding conferment of the title of the Companion of the Most Exalted Order of the Star of India on Raja Damara Kumara Venkatappa Naidu Bahadur, zamindar of Kalahasti. English.
21. Report. 5 December 1929. Administrative Report of the estate of Raja Damara Kumara Venkata Bahadur, Raja of Kalahasti, from December 1919 to 1929. English.
22. Agreement. 28 April 1943. Between the present zamindar (of Kalahasti?) and his foster father, for the management of the estate. English.

Collection of Muhammad Ghouse, Sayeedia Library, Troop Bazar, Hyderabad-1.

23. Judgment. 20 Rabi II, 1186 A.H.; 11 July 1772. Regarding a suit filed by Syed Muhammad against the maid-servant of his brother. The gift deed in her favour was decided by the court to be valid. Persian.

24. Letter of authority. 12 Rajab 1186 A.H.; 9 October 1772. From Khairun Nisa appointing Hasan Ali as her Vakil. Persian.
25. Order. 23 Jumada II, 1187 A.H.; 11 September 1773. From the court regarding the property of Hakim Muhammad Amin, deceased. Persian.
26. Order (under the seals of the Qazi and the Mufti). 25 Jumada II, 1187 A.H.; 13 September 1773. From the court to distribute certain property according to the shares assigned to the claimants concerned. Persian.
27. Order. 16 Rajab 1187 A.H.; 3 October 1773. From the court at Arcot, punishing the son of Isa for abusing certain people. Persian.
28. Judgment (Copy). 29 Rabi II, 1191 A.H.; 6 June 1777. Passed by the court at Darulnur Muhammadpur alias Arcot. Persian.
29. Istihshad. 9 Zulqada 1198 A.H.; 22 September 1784. By M. Nasiruddin, Darogha of the Adalat of Muhammadpur, calling for testimony of those who knew that Rs. 90/- Arcot coins were assigned monthly to his father and afterwards to him and that the same continued till the attack of Haider Ali. Persian.
30. Notification (Draft). 7 Zulqada 1251 A.H.; 24 February 1836. Saying that the books written by Ismail Shaheed and Vilayat Ali were all useless and absurd. Persian.
31. Notification. 1262 A.H.; 1846 A.D. Confirming the appearance of the moon for the month of Shaban. Persian.
32. Judgment (under the seals of the Qazi and the Mufti). 1 Jumada II, 1273 A.H.; 27 January 1857. Given in the case of Abul Hasan, son of Ghazanfar Hussain, vs. Badshah Begam, wife of Azimud-Daulah, by the court under the Nawab of Arcot. Persian.
33. Letter. 10 Jumada II, 1283 A.H.; 9 October 1867. From Sir Salar Jang I to Madarul-Umara acknowledging receipt of 'Alqabnama Ali' and other books written by Mufti Muhammad Sayeed. Persian.
34. Istifta. Undated. By Qazi Irtiza Ali Khan Safari regarding the fostering of a child when there was a doubt whether the child could suckle or not. Says that there could be no fostering in the case of a doubt. Persian.
35. Decree. Undated. Decree sought whether to eat shrimp was allowed or not. There was difference of opinion about this among the learned men. Persian.

36. Letter. Undated. Addressed to Badrud-Daulah (writer's name not given). Offering his services for the transcription of the Quran and other religious books. Persian.
37. Letter. Undated. Regarding the endowed property of Amirun Nisa Begam. Persian.
38. Istifta (under the seal of Abu Muhammad Irtiza Ali Safavi). Undated. Arabic.
39. Religious Decree. Undated. Decision regarding offering of Zuhr prayer after Juma prayer according to Shafai sect. Persian.
40. Letter. Undated. From Qazi Irtiza Ali Khan Safavi to Mufti Badrud-Daulah about trusteeship of a mosque. Persian.
41. Letter. Undated. From Qazi Irtiza Ali Khan Safavi to Mufti Badrud-Daulah regarding some religious problem. Persian.
42. Chronogram. Undated. Indicating the date of sending a ladder to Mecca. Persian.
43. Petition. 24 Rajab 1261 A.H.; 29 July 1895. From Lal Bi (sic), wife of Shaikh Ibrahim, seeking permission to file a suit in the court against her son-in-law who had taken her house by force. Persian.
44. Document. Undated. Written by Aslami Sahib regarding accuracy in offering prayers. Persian.
45. Order (Copy). 24 Safar 1200 A.H. Issued under the seal of the Nawab of Arcot and certified by the Qazi regarding the grant of Re. 1/- daily to Shaikh Ali, son of Nizamuddin. Persian.
46. Fatwa. Undated. Regarding selling or giving to others as gift assigned lands and villages. Persian.
47. Letter. Undated. From Qazi Irtiza Ali Khan. Persian.
48. Consultation. Undated. Between the Qazis and the Muftis regarding the legality of a will. Persian.
49. Judgment. Undated. In a suit filed by Saiyid Ataullah against Sultan Singh about mortgaging of ornaments. The court decided against the former. Persian.
50. Judgment. Undated. Issued under the seal of the Mufti in favour of Arrar Shah Faqir against Rafiq. Persian.

51. Judgment. Undated. Given by the court of Arcot to the effect that the gift deed by a faqir in favour of his wife was not in keeping with the law. Persian.

52. Document. Undated. Regarding the marriage of a Muslim woman to an Englishman and acquiring property from the latter. The document states that entertainment of Muslims by her is not permissible. Persian.

Collection of Mahant Seva Dassji Varu, Mahant of Sri Hathiramji Matt, Tirumalai, Tirupati.

53. Sanad. 10 July 1843. From V. Bashyakacharlu, Acting Deputy Collector, to Sri Mahant Seva Dassji Varu, appointing him as Vicharanekarta to administer the Devasthanams of Tirumalai-Sri Venkateshwara Swami and Tirupati Govindaraja Swami. English.

54. Karanam. 16 July 1843. Executed by Sri Mahant Seva Dassji Varu giving a solemn promise to administer the above Devasthanams to the best of his ability. English.

Collection of Haroon Khan Sherwani, Himayat Nagar, Hyderabad.

The collection chiefly deals with matters such as grant of land for the maintenance of the tomb of Hazrat Shah Nimatullah Wali and that of Shaikh Muhammad Multani, etc. and appointment of its trustees.

55. Document. Undated. From Khwaja Jahan regarding the grant of 2,500 (?) of land in Bahura village for the maintenance of the tomb of Hazrat Shah Nimatullah Wali. Persian.

56. Farman (with seal). Jumada II. Regarding the appointment of Mirza Mohibullah and his descendants as trustees of land assigned for the maintenance of the tomb of Hazrat Shah Nimatullah Wali. Persian.

57. Farman. 2 Zulhijja 1066 A.H. Issued under the seal of Muhammad Adil Shah. Persian.

58. Farman* (with seal). Regarding (one) chawar of land assigned to Pirzada in Muhammadabad (Bidar). Persian.

59-60. Farmans (with seal). 1 Safar 941 A.H.; 12 August 1534. Regarding the grant of a village for maintaining the tomb of Shaikh Muhammad Multani in Kalatpur pargana. Persian.

61. Farman (with seal). 9 Jumada I, 942 A.H.; 5 December 1535. Appointing Shaikh Badruddin as trustee of the tomb of Shaikh Muhammad Multani. Persian.

62. Farman (with seal). 26 Jumada I, 966 A.H.; 6 March 1559. Granting two villages to Shaikh Badruddin free of charge. Persian.

63. Farman (with seal). 12 Rabi I, 994 A.H.; 21 February 1586. Granting a village for the expenses of (the tomb of) Shaikh Muhammad Multani. Persian.

64. Farman (Bearing the seal of Shah Jahan). 19 Rajab 15 Julus 1051 A.H.; 14 October 1641. Regarding the assignment of land to Bibi Saleem. Persian.

Collection of Mir Mehdi Hussain Khan, Jagirdar, Yakutpura, Hyderabad.

65. Farman. 1 Safar 1017 A.H.; 17 May 1608. Issued by Sultan Abdullah Qutb Shah granting two chawar land in Kundapur village (Medak taluk) to Muhammad Baqar and Muhammad Rafi, grandsons of Hakim Nizamuddin Hakimul-Mulk. Persian.

66. Farman. 2 Rabi I, 3 Julus 1164 A.H.; 19 January 1751. Issued by Emperor Ahmad Shah to Saiyid Sharif Khan Shujaat Jang informing that Ghaziuddin Khan Feroz Jang had been appointed Subadar of Deccan in place of Nasir Jang and that he should cooperate with him as Naib Subadar. Persian.

67. Sanad (Copy). 29 Jumada II, 5 Julus 1165 A.H.; 3 May 1752. Issued under the seals of Zafar Jang Asafud-Daulah Saiyid Muhammad Khan (Salabat Jang) and Mir Muhammad Hussain Khan granting a jagir to Saiyid Sharif Khan alias Saiyid Sadruddin Khan, son of Sharif Khan (?) from Lonar pargana in Suba Berar yielding a revenue of 22 lakhs and 8000 dams. Persian.

68. Sanad (Copy). 29 Jumada II, 5 Julus 1165 A.H.; 3 May 1752. Issued by Zafar Jang Asafud-Daulah Saiyid Muhammad Khan (Salabat Jang) and Mir Muhammad Hussain Khan granting a jagir to Saiyid Sharif Khan from Jugal (Jukal) in Khandesh Suba yielding a revenue of 13 lakhs, 59 thousand dams. Persian.

70. Sanad (Copy). 15 Zulqada 1172 A.H.; 10 July 1759. Granting daily allowance and land to Muhammad Taqi for the maintenance of a mosque situated at Shakar Khera. Persian.
71. Sanad. Ramazan 17 Julus 1192 A.H.; September-October, 1778. Issued by Mir Nizam Ali Khan and Mir Abdul Hai Khan in favour of Sarbuland Jang granting him 3 bighas 2½ biswas of land from Shah Bagh near the tomb of Shah Nur Sahib in Khujista Bunyad (Aurangabad). Persian.
72. Sanad. 13 Rabi II, 1218 A.H.; 2 August 1803. Issued by Arastu Jah granting a jagir to Saiyid Najib Khan, Najib-ud-Daulah Shujaat Jang in Kotal pargana in Suba Berar. Persian.
73. Sanad. 11 Ramazan 1233 A.H.; 15 July 1818. Issued by Raja Chandu Lal to Saiyid Abdur Rahim, son of late Saiyid Najib Khan, granting a jagir in Kotal pargana. Persian.
74. Sanad. 21 Shaban 1266 A.H.; 3 July 1850. Issued by Raja Ram Bakhsh to Saiyid Abdur Rahim Khan granting a jagir in Kotal pargana. Persian.

76. Parwana. 22 Muharram 6 Julus 1167 A.H.; 19 November 1753. Issued by Salabat Jang and Haidar Yar Khan, Sher Jang, to Allahwardi Khan granting 45,000 dams as jagir after the death of his brother Subhanwardi Beg. Persian.
77. Sanad. Rabi I, 1193 A.H.; March 1779. Issued by Mir Nizam Ali Khan in favour of Saiyid Nazr Mohiuddin, granting him Re. 1/2 as daily allowance. Persian.
78. Sanad. 1 Shawwal 1259 A.H.; 25 October 1843. Issued by Talib-ud-Daulah in favour of Faiz Ali Shah, son of Masum Shah Darwish, assigning him a piece of land. Persian.

98. Sale Deeds. 1230 A.H.; 1815 A.D. Relating to property (including land) and the mosque constructed by Ghulam Sharif Haji Muhammad Maulana at Chandrakapur. Persian.

108. Letter. Undated. From Capt. T. Sydenham to Mir Alam accepting the invitation of the Nizam to meet him and asking the latter to send an elephant for the purpose. Persian.

The papers throw light on different aspects of the administration of the time and on many hidden transactions and palace affairs. The paigah papers and the peshkari papers reflect on the activities of the paigah nobles and the peshkars to gain power and to win the Resident on their side. There are also secret bulletins and letters from the Residency and other English officers outside the State which are quite interesting. The documents are in Urdu, Persian and English.

47. Nirup. Manmatha Samvat, Magha Sudi 1, C 1734-66 A.D. Issued by (Chikka) Krishna Raja Wodeyar to Chittalah of Tumkur, asking him to see that the thieves who were causing damage to people and property were captured and punished. Kannada.

The of documents cover the period 1652-1941 A.D. and consist of farmans, murasalas, deeds, robkars, memoranda, etc. They throw light on the Katoch family of Kangra-their relations with Maharaja Ranjit Singh and the Girkhas of Nepal; relations of the British Government with the Cis-Sutlej States and succession disputes among the Phulkian rulers etc. etc. These are in Persian, Urdu and English.

Collection of Raja Dhury Dev Chand of Lambagraon, Kangra,

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1. Farman. 1658 A.D. Issued by Emperor Aurangzeb to the Jagirdars, Chaudharies and Amla-i-Ilaka, Kangra, asking them to occupy and cultivate pargana Jaisinghwala in Kangra for which a grant of Rs.4,111/- had been sanctioned. Persian.

2. Murasala. 1829 A.D. From Khalsa Darbar to Raja (Mian) Ludhar (Ludar) Chand, of Lambagraon (Kangra), commending his loyalty towards the Darbar and hoping for the same to continue in future also. Persian.

3. Deed. 1842 A.D. Regarding sale of villages, Latha and Khera, for Rs.16,404/- by Mahan Singh Majithia to Mian Nauder (?) Chand, of Lambagraon. Persian.

4. Murasala. 22 April 1846. From Deputy Commissioner, Kangra, to Mian Ludhar Chand. Asking him to impress upon the people residing in the former Lahore Darbar territories to be loyal to the British Government. Persian.

5. Murasala. 27 May 1846. From Deputy Commissioner, Kangra, to Raja Ranbir Chand, Rais, Mahal-Morian (Mahal Mori) impressing supremacy of the British Government and the need to maintain law and order in that territory. Also adds that Rupees ten thousand still remained to be realized from the released rebels. Urdu.

6. Murasala. 22 December 1846. From Sir John Lawrence, Commissioner of Jullundur Division, to Raja Sahib of Lambagraon. Informing him of the grant of the territory of Rajgiri in his favour which was formerly under the rule of Katoch rajas. Persian.

7. Robkar. 8 January 1847. From Sir John Lawrence to the Jagirdars and Landlords. Advising them to give humane treatment to the poor subjects of their respective ilakas. Persian.

8. Sanad. 18 October 1847. Issued by Lord Henry Hardinge, Governor General of India, bestowing upon Mian Ludhar Chand the territory which formerly belonged to Raja Promodh Chand (Parmod Chand), the rebel. Persian.

9. Murasala. 1 December 1848. From Deputy Commissioner, Jullundur, to Raja of Lambagraon. Asking him to send his son with some soldiers for assisting Maj. Edward Lake to fight out the insurrection. Persian.

10. Murasala. 30 December 1848. From Deputy Commissioner, Jullundur, to Mian Ludhar Chand seeking supply of provisions to the army stationed in the Kangra hills. Urdu.

11. Murasala. 1848 A.D. From Deputy Commissioner, Jullundur, to Raja of Lambagraon. Seeking military reinforcement for the British troops stationed at Kotla (also known as Kotila) Fort. Persian.

12. Murasala. 1849 A.D. From Deputy Commissioner, Kangra, to Mian Partap Chand. Expressing disillusionment at the revolutionary activities of Mian Promodh Chand in Mahal-Morian. Persian.

13. Murasala. 15 June 1851. From Deputy Commissioner, Kangra, to Raja Sahib of Lambagraon. Informing about the programme for the ceremonial bestowal of the title of 'Raja' and 'Khilat' upon him. Persian.

14. Application. 6 June 1851. From the relatives of the Katoch family to G.C. Barnes, Deputy Commissioner, Kangra. Requesting him to bestow the title of 'Raja' upon Mian Partap Chand instead of Mian Promodh Chand. Urdu.

15. Murasala. June 1851. From Deputy Commissioner, Kangra, to Raja Partap Chand. Regarding confiscation of the territory of Mahal-Morian formerly belonging to Raja Promodh Chand and handing over the same to him with the title of 'Raja'. Urdu.

31. Memorandum. Undated. Eulogising the eminent position and status of Raja Jai Chand in the academic and military circles and the part he played in the Hazara and Chitral expeditions. English.
32. Memorandum. Undated. Describing Raja Jai Chand's geneology and tracing its lineage to Susarma Chandra (?) of the Mahabharat period who had held and consolidated the territory known as Jullundur Doab. English.
33. Memorandum. Undated. Describing the life and the activities of Raja Sansar Chand, a contemporary of Maharaja Ranjit Singh, who wrested the ancestral fort of Kangra from the Mughal Governor (1774 A.D.) and annexed several parganas in the Jullundur Doab including Hoshiarpur, Bajwara, portion of Mandi, Kotla, Chamba, Jaswan and Bilaspur. English.
34. Memorandum. Undated. Regarding the position and status enjoyed by the Kangra Rajas before the advent of Mughals, as also during the Mughal period. English.
35. Memorandum. Undated. Regarding Gurkha invasion of 1806 on Raja Sansar Chand's territories and the consequent treaty with Maharaja Ranjit Singh resulting in loss of power by the former. English.
36. Memorandum. Undated. Regarding conferment of title of 'Raja' on Raja Jai Chand and the right of adoption in his favour. (His mother belonged to the ruling family of Sirmur State. His sister was married to Raja Ram Singh of Jammu and Kashmir and he was married to the daughter of Raja of Bilaspur. English.
37. Memorandum. Undated. Regarding Katoch Rajputs who had to abandon Jullundur and the neighbouring territory in the plains and shift their capital to Kangra during Muslim invasions. (Adds that Raja Jai Chand was the 485th in lineal descent). English.
38. Memorandum. Undated. Regarding founding of the Siba State (estate). (Adds that a scion of the Goler family named Sibaran Chand took possession of some talukas south of the Beas and established himself as an independent raja calling the State (estate) Siba after his own name. Raja Lal Singh was the former head of the State). Urdu.

39. Memorandum. Undated. Regarding Anirudh Chand (Anroth Chand) succeeding his father, Raja Sansar Chand, in 1824 A.D. (He however, died in exile at Hardwar, Maharaja Ranjit Singh having taken offence to his refusal to give his sister in marriage to Hari Singh, son of Raja Dhian Singh, a Minister of the Maharaja). English.

40. Memorandum. Undated. Regarding Raja Ranbir Chand being awarded the ancestral title of 'Raja' and a jagir of fifty thousand rupees in Mahal-Morian on the intervention by Lord William Bentinck. English.

41. Memorandum. Undated. Regarding meritorious services rendered by Raja Ranbir Chand and his brother Promodh Chand to the British Government during the (First) Sikh War (1845-46) by raising Rajput troops and conquering several forts belonging to the Sikhs. English.

42. Memorandum. Undated. Regarding grant of Mahal-Morian jagir to Raja Ranbir Chand and re-imbursement of expenditure incurred by him in the Second Sikh War. (Also deals with the succession of Promodh Chand to the jagir and his differences with the British for their preferential treatment towards the trans-Sutlej Chiefs). English.

43. Memorandum. Undated. Regarding Raja Promodh Chand's differences with the British (after the defeat of the Sikhs by the British in the I Sikh War) and ultimately joining the Sikhs in the II Sikh War. Raja was, however, made a prisoner and died issueless as a prisoner at Almora in 1851. English.

44. Memorandum. Undated. Regarding Raja Pratap Chand (father of Raja Jai Chand) succeeding Raja Promodh Chand and his recognition as the head of the Katoch Rajputs. English.

45. Memorandum. Undated. Regarding the role of the British Government in restoring Independence to the Sutlej Chiefs from the Gurkhas while the Cis-Sutlej chiefs, on the contrary, were deprived of this privilege. English.

(Also submits in the court of Muazzam Khan and Qadar Shah that the office of the Kanungoi was filled by nomination since times immemorial). Persian.

55. Parwana. Undated. From Muhammad Akram, son of Shaikh Abdullah, to the present and future jagirdars, chowdharies and muqaddmas of Kangra, announcing that Ved Ram, Vakil of Kangra, had been rewarded with a Sanad of Kanungoi. Urdu.

56. Sanad. 1737 A.D. Issued by Emperor Muhammad Shah, granting the entire uncultivated land of village Sladha, pargana Kotla Dharam Chand, to Dev Raj Kanungo, and asking him to deposit the tax in the Pota-khana. Persian.

57. Robkar. 1818 A.D. Issued by Maharaja Ranjit Singh to the Amla, present and future of Kangra, affirming the grant of the office of Kanungoi to Sukhchain. Persian.

Collection of S. Amarjit Singh, Chief of Malaud (Malaudh) Estate, Ludhiana District.

These documents (Nos. 58-127) give a brief history of the Malaud Estate and throw light on the family and their Chiefs. Prominent among them, were Sardars Man Singh, Dalel Singh, Uttam Singh, Bhag Singh, and Badan Singh. They were awarded 'sanads' and medals for their loyalty to the British Government.

58. Murasala. 26 March 1836. From Sir G.R. Clerk, Superintendent and Agent Cis-Sutlej States/Sardar Fateh Singh, Chief of Malaud (Malaudh). Commending his services to the British Government by chastising the mutineers at Balanwali (Malaud territory). Persian.

59. Murasala. 15 December 1845. From Maj. Broadfoot Agent to the Governor General, ~~now~~ to W.R. Gilbert of the British Army. Asking him to compensate Sardar Hazura Singh, son of Sardar Fateh Singh, for the expenditure incurred by him in meeting the requirements of the British Army. English.

60. Sanad. 24 December 1845. Issued by Capt. J. Seesan (?) (of the 2nd Commanding Infantry) to Raja Fateh Singh, of Ramgarh (Malaud Estate), appreciating his hospitality. English.

61. Sanad. 25 December 1845. Issued by Edward John Lake, Assistant Agent to Cis-Sutlej States, to the Rais of Malaud, appreciating his help to the British Government by supplying reinforcements. English.

62. Letter. 9 January 1846. From Capt. C. Mills, Assistant/Cis-Sutlej States, to Sardar Fateh Singh, of Ramgarh. Asking him to prepare a list of articles obtained from Mahilan and Chiniwal, previously in occupation of Lahore Darbar, and to collect provisions for the army. English.

63. Notice. 11 January 1846. From Capt. C. Mills informing zamindars, bankers and the inhabitants of Akalgarh and Mahilan about the occupation by the British of that territory and asking Sardar Rattan Singh of Malaud to establish a thana on behalf of the British Government. English.

64. Sanad. 7 November 1847. Issued by Capt. B. Melville of 54th Regiment, to Sardar Mit Singh, Chief of Malaud, commending services of the thanedar of his Ilaka while camping at Chandaniwala. English.

65. Sanad. 6 December 1847. Issued by Brig. Sir Hugh Massy Wheeler, to Sardar Fateh Singh, of Ramgarh and Malaud, commending his services during the Anglo-Sikh War at Mudki in 1845. English.

66. Parwana. 26 July 1848. From Maj. C.B. Mackeson, Commissioner and Superintendent, Cis-Sutlej States, to Sardar Fateh Singh. Thanking him for the offer of help for suppression of the rebellion at Multan. Persian.

67. Sanad. 13 September 1848. Issued by Lt. Col. J. Stogter to Baris Khan, Thanedar (Malaud territory), thanking him for assistance in procuring supplies for the regiment under his command. Persian.

68. Sanad. 16 September 1848. Issued by Maj. J.H. Grant, Commanding 9th Lancers, to the Thanedar, Chandaniwala (Malaud Estate), thanking him for assistance in procuring Rasad for the 13th N.I. (Native Infantry). Persian.

69. Sanad. 29 September 1848. Issued by Maj. T.I. Thorton, Commanding 13th N.I., to Baris Khan, Thanedar, Chandaniwala, commending his services for procuring supplies for the 13th N.I. Persian.

70. Sanad. 28 October 1848. Issued by Maj. J.S. Corbeth Commanding 25th N.I., to Baris Khan thanking him for assistance in procuring supplies for the 25th N.I., at Chandaniwala. Persian.

71. Sanad. 29 October 1848. Issued by Lt. Col. J.S. Corbeth to Gurmukh Singh, Thanedar of Chandaniwala, appreciating his services for procuring supplies for the 25th N.I. Persian.

72. Sanad. 1 November 1848. Issued by Maj. J.E. Jumpur Commanding 22nd N.I., to Diwan Singh and Gane Khan, 'Kardars' at Chandaniwala, thanking for procuring supplies to the 22nd N.I. Persian.

73. Sanad. Undated. Issued by Lieut. D.W. Phillpot, Commanding 16th (Native) Infantry, to Sardar Fateh Singh, appreciating his assistance in sending 78 camels to Maj. C.B. Mackeson, Commissioner and Superintendent, Cis-Sutlej States, at Ferozepur. Persian.

74. Letter. 17 December 1848. From Capt. W. Bell, commanding Detachment of H.M. Recruits, to Sardar Fateh Singh, for the supplies. Persian.

75. Sanad. 1 January 1849. Issued by Capt. James Bornie, Commanding No. 7 L.B., to Fateh Singh, appreciating his services for providing Rasad to the British during the Anglo-Sikh War, 1848. Persian.

76. Sanad. 1 January 1849. Issued by Capt. James Bornie Commanding No. 7 L.B., to Chief of Malaud, for supplying ration to the cavalry stationed at Chandaniwala. Persian.

77. Sanad. 14 January 1849. Issued by Maj. Drought, Commanding 60th Regiment, to Mehtab Singh, for supplying Rasad at Rampur. English.

78. Sanad. 30 June 1849. Issued by H.H. Larkins, Deputy Commissioner, Ludhiana, to ~~xxxxxxx~~ Sardar Fateh Singh, of Ramgarh (Malaud Estate), commending his services during the battle of Mudki and Ferozepur. English.

79. Sanad. 7 January 1850. Issued by Capt. T. Gaihken, Commanding Artillery Detachment, to the Chief of Malaud, certifying that his Kardar furnished all kind of supplies to the army at Raipur. English.

80. Memorandum. 21 December 1850. By Sir George Campbell, Deputy Commissioner, Ludhiana, regarding the hospitality by the Chief of Malaud while he was at Malaud for three days for a game. English.

81. Sanad. 21 December 1850. Issued by E.T. Simpson, certifying that Bhem Khan, the Kardar, supplied every kind of provision for use of His Excellency, the Commander-in-Chief, during his halt at Raipur. English.

82. Sanad. 16 December 1853. Issued by Philip Goldney, Deputy Commissioner, Ludhiana, to Sardar Mit Singh (Malaud Chief) certifying his lineage and his right of a chair in the Darbar. English.

83. Sanad. 7 December 1855. Issued by G. Barnes, Commissioner and Superintendent, Cis-Sutlej States, to Sardar Mit Singh, commending his services to the British Government. English.

84. Murasala. 12 October 1857. From G. Ricketts, Deputy Commissioner, Ludhiana, to Sardar Uttam Singh, of Ramgarh (Malaud Estate). Intimating him that 18 horsemen who had rendered meritorious service during mutiny in the Ludhiana District were being sent back. Persian.

85. Murasala. 16 October 1858. From Stuart Hogg, Deputy Commissioner, Ludhiana, to Sardar Uttam Singh. Intimating him that as recommended by his predecessor, the estate might be released from the Court of Wards. Persian.

86. Sanad. 16 October 1858. Issued by Stuart Hogg, Deputy Commissioner, Ludhiana, to Sardar Uttam Singh, certifying his good conduct and ability. Persian.

87. Sanad. 22 May 1867. Issued by Charles P. Elliott Deputy Commissioner, Ludhiana, to Sardar Uttam Singh, of Ramgarh, regarding the robe of honour which was bestowed on him at the last Viceregal Darbar held at Ambala. Persian.

88. Letter. 5 February 1872. From C.W. Cowan, Deputy Commissioner, Ludhiana, to Sardar Mit Singh. Expressing his delight at the recovery of his son, Badan Singh, from the wounds which were inflicted on him by the rebel Kukas. English.

118. Memorandum. Undated. By the former Secretary to the Chief of Malaud, stating that Tilokha (Tiloka) the eldest son of Chaudhary Phul, founded the royal house of Nabha and Jind while Rama and his other brothers laid the foundation of Rampura (Nabha State) in the year 1680 A.D. English.

119. Memorandum. Undated. By the former Secretary to the Chief of Malaud, narrating that the village Bhai Rupa was founded by Tilokha* and was shared by the Chiefs of Phulkian States till 1851 A.D. The Malaud Chief relinquished his share of this estate in lieu of another village Chakrahi. The title of Chaudhary conferred upon Tilokha was also inherited by his descendants. English.

120. Memorandum. Undated. By the former Secretary to the Chief of Malaud, stating that Rama shifted to Bhadaur where his sons, Ala Singh and Bakhat Mal (Bakht Mal), were left with their brother, Duna. English.

121. Memorandum. Undated. By the former Secretary to the Chief of Malaud. Regarding Ala Singh's ascendancy to the throne of Patiala; & founding of Bakhatgarh by Bakhat Mal, some eight miles off Bhadaur (Bakhat Mal died in 1757). English.

122. Memorandum. Undated. By the former Secretary to the Chief of Malaud. Regarding Bakhat Mal's attack on Nawab of Malerkotla and occupation of the territory of Malaud which, was inherited by his two sons, Sardar Dalel Singh and Sardar Bhag Singh. English.

123. Memorandum. Undated. By the former Secretary to the Chief of Malaud, narrating that Sardar Man Singh, with the combined forces of Patiala and Malaud, fought against Abdul Ahad, Minister of Shah Alam who wanted to recover the Malwa territory from the Sikhs. English.

124. Memorandum. Undated. By the former Secretary to the Chief of Malaud. Mentions that Sardar Dalel Singh, along with other Phulkian Chiefs, fought against the Nawab of Malerkotla. Sardar Chuhr Singh (Chuchar Singh), of Bhadaur and Diwan Nanu Mal, of Patiala, both made an attack on the Nawab and defeated him. In 1807 A.D. Sardar Dalel Singh also conquered some villages from the Rai of Raikot. English.

125. Memorandum. Undated. By the former Secretary to the Chief of Malaud, speaking of relations with the British after the Treaty of Rupar@ in 1809 A.D. and Sardar Dalel Singh's services to the East India Company during the Gurkha war (1815). English.

@ In 1809 was concluded the Treaty of Amritsar between Ranjit Singh and the British. Treaty of Rupar was concluded in 1831.

127. Memorandum. Undated. By the former Secretary to the Chief of Malaud, speaking of British hold in the state administration and Sardar Dalel Singh's death in 1824 A.D. and founding of the family of Ber (Bir) by his younger brother, Bhag Singh, in Malaud. English.

130. Sanad. 9 September 1849. Issued by the Deputy Commissioner, Hoshiarpur, in favour of Kahan Singh, Ram Singh and Sham Singh, the priests of Gurdwara Sahib at Kiratpur, granting 160 bighas of land in Kiratpur in Tahsil Una for the upkeep of the Gurdwara. Persian.

Collection of Pandit Bham Dev, village Bhunopli, Tahsil Una, Hoshiarpur District.

131. Sanad. 15 March 1919. Issued by Maj. S.L. Wolley, Recruiting Officer at Jullundur, in compliance with the orders of the Commander-in-Chief, in favour of Pandit Bhagat Ram of Bhunopli, in appreciation of his valuable services to the Indian Army during the First Great War. English.

132. Sanad. 14 August 1933. Issued by Bunyad Hussain, Offg. Deputy Commissioner, Hoshiarpur, to Pandit Bhagat Ram for his valuable services in combating the small-pox epidemic. English.

133. Sanad. 4 May 1942. Issued by Mr. Brown (F.C. Bourne), Chief Secretary to Punjab Government, to Pandit Bhagat Ram for his valuable assistance in connection with the rural uplift work. English.

134. Sanad. 31 January 1942. Issued by Mr. Brown (F.C. Bourne) to Pandit Bhagat Ram in recognition of his valuable services during the Second World War (1939-45). English.

135. Sanad. 1 January 1943. Issued by Lord Linlithgow, Viceroy and Governor General of India, to Pandit Bhagat Ram, landlord of Bhunopli, awarding him the title of Rai Sahib as a personal distinction. English.

136. Sanad. 30 July 1946. Issued by R.H.C. Rayner, Recruiting Officer at Jullundur, to Pandit Bhagat Ram in recognition of his valuable assistance to the recruiting staff at Jullundur during the Second World War. English.

Collection of Mahant Laxmi Dass, Chela Mahant Harnam Dass, Beragi Sadh, Village Behlana, Tahsil Kharar, Ambala District.

137. Sanad. 1859 A.D. Issued by Raja Gurbux Singh, of Manimajra, granting 40 bighas and 12 biswas of land for the upkeep of Thakurdwara at village Behlana in pargana Manimajra (near Chandigarh). Urdu.

138. Memorandum. 14 August 1850. Narrating that Guru Har Gobind, the sixth Guru of the Sikhs, was saved from the clutches of Mughal Army by the efforts of Bhai Roop Chand. Urdu.

139. Sanad. March 1877. Issued by the Deputy Commissioner, Ambala, to Mahant Gareeb Dass (Gharib Dass) granting 126 bighas and 4 biswas of land in Behlana, for his livelihood and also to meet the expenses of the Thakurdwara. Urdu.

Collection of Jatinder Parkash Bhatnagar, Village Bara, Tahsil Sirhind, Patiala District.

140. Sanad. 1865 A.D. Issued by Maharaja of Patiala (Mohindar Singh) to Bansil Lal Kayasth bestowing on him 25 bighas of land in Sirhind and Rs. 500/- for the maintenance of the temple of Nainadevi in Sirhind. Persian.

Collection of Mahant Niranian Dass, Village Badal Tuha, P.O. Amloh, Nabha.

141. Sanad. 1853 A.D. Issued by Raja Bharpur Singh, of Nabha, to Bawa Nihal Dass Udasi Sadh of Dehra Badal Tuha granting land for his sustenance. In gratitude the Mahant was required to deposit Rs. 225/- in the Nabha Treasury as Nazrana to the Raja. Persian.

Collection of Mahant Gopal Dass, Village Rayan, Tahsil Samrala, Ludhiana District.

142. Sanad. 16 April 1853. Issued by the Commissioner of Jullundur Division, to Mahant Nihal Dass granting 150 bighas of rent-free land in perpetuity in village Rayan (Rahon) for the maintenance of the Dharamsala. Urdu.

Collection of Rajwant Singh, Village Ladhran, Tahsil Samrala, Ludhiana District.

143. Robkar. 25 November 1843. From the Agent to the Governor General at Delhi to the Sodhis of Machhiwara (Ludhiana), Urging them to settle the dispute regarding property of Budh Singh and Mam Chand Sindhanwalla amicably. Radha Kishan, the Vakil of Lahore Darbar, was asked to help in the amicable settlement of the dispute of the Sindhanwalla Sardars. Persian.

144. Application. 25 November 1843. From Lachhman Singh to the Agent, Cis-Sutlej States, regarding settlement of the disputed property of Sardar Budh Singh Sindhanwalla. Urdu.

145. Application. 1884 A.D. From Sardar Thakur Singh Sindhanwalla (Sindhianwalla), son of Sardar Lehna Singh Sindhanwalla, a General of Maharaja Ranjit Singh, to the Secretary, Punjab Government, submitting his resignation due to differences with the Deputy Commissioner, Ludhiana. Urdu.

Collection of S. Gurdev Singh, Samanah, Village
Balasur (Bilasur ?), Tahsil Moga, Ferozepur District.

146. Deed (bearing the seals of the courtiers of Lahore Darbar-Sardars Lehna Singh, Lal Singh, Gulab Singh, Khazan Singh and Dhian Singh). 1824 A.D. Executed by Mst. Bhagan, issueless widow of Sardar Mohar Singh, son of Sardar Bhagat Singh of Nishanwalia Misl in favour of Budh Singh son of her brother. Conferring on him the right of occupation of all her territories and estates at village Singhanwala and Daudhar in Ferozepore after her death. Persian.

Collection of S. Amarjit Singh, Jagirdar of Dhiromajra
Village Paut, Tahsil Samrala, Ludhiana District.

147. Memorandum. Undated. Regarding gift of property by Mehar Chand, landlord of village Ghanupur, Tahsil Amritsar, to Bhoom Chand, his eldest son and succession of Rai Singh and Run Singh (Ram Singh) to their father's (Bhoom Chand) ancestral estate. Urdu.

148. Memorandum. Undated. Regarding the territory comprising Jabomajra, Dhiromajra, and Roorkee being under the rule of Rai Singh and Ram Singh and construction of a Jabomajra fort. Urdu.

149. Memorandum. Undated. Regarding occupation of village Jarg, near Khanna, by Rai Singh and Ram Singh, and felicitations by the Chaudhries of Jarg over the same. Urdu.

150. Memorandum. Undated. Regarding plunderous raids by Rai Singh and Ram Singh leading to the death of Zain Khan, the Mughal Subadar of Sirhind and their occupation of some villages of suba Sirhind. Urdu.

151. Memorandum. Undated. Regarding plunderous assaults on the neighbouring territories by Ajit Singh and Ram Singh, and people's ready submission to them. Urdu.

152. Memorandum. Undated. Regarding Sardar Ajit Singh's frequent visit to Malaud and festivities there. (It also describes that Sardar Ram Singh had three sons—Fauja Singh, Gurdev Singh and Gurbux Singh but Ajit Singh had only one son, named Uttam Singh). Urdu.

153. Memorandum. Undated. Regarding Ram Singh and Rai Singh accepting the overlordship of Ahluwalia Misl, and conferment of Khilat and other privileges in their favour. Urdu.

154. Memorandum. Undated. Regarding services by Sardars Ram Singh and Ajit Singh to the Ahluwalia Misl and dissatisfaction of the Chaudhries of Jarg with them and latter's feelings of attachment to Maharaja of Patiala. Urdu.

155. Memorandum. Undated. Regarding dissatisfaction of the Chaudhries of Jarg with Sardar Ajit Singh and their appeal for help to the Maharaja of Patiala. Urdu.

156. Memorandum. Undated. Regarding arrest of Sardar Ajit Singh during his visit to the fort of Malaud on Sardar Dalel Singh's invitation (At the request of the Chaudhries of Jarg, the Maharaja of Patiala had deputed Nanu Mal, his General, to arrest Ajit Singh and the former had laid a trap to the effect in connivance with Sardar Dalel Singh, Chief of Malaud). Urdu.

157. Memorandum. Undated. Regarding Sardar Dalel Singh's Chief of Malaud, league with Diwan Nanu Mal for the arrest of Sardar Ajit Singh. Urdu.

158. Memorandum. Undated. Regarding Ajit Singh's imprisonment in Dhodan fort and his later release and services to the Maharaja of Patiala in suppressing Diwan Nanu Mal's revolt. Ajit Singh was awarded for his meritorious services and was permitted to govern his estate. Urdu.

159. Memorandum. Undated. Regarding Ajit Singh's death soon after his release by the Maharaja of Patiala and Ram Singh's succession and grant of khilat to him by the Ahluwalia Chief and his relations with the neighbouring Chiefs. Urdu.

160. Memorandum. Undated. Regarding Sardar Uttam Singh succeeding his father, Ajit Singh after the latter's murder by the zamindars of Bhurthala and their ultimate exoneration by the former. Urdu.

161. Memorandum. Undated. Regarding Sardar Uttam Singh's occupation of half of Dhiromajra Estate and succession dispute regarding the other half between Ram Singh's successors i.e., Gurbux Singh Gurdev Singh and Fauja Singh and the overtures made by the latter to the Maharaja of Patiala for help. Urdu.

162. Memorandum. Undated. Regarding Maharaja of Patiala's great regard for the late Ajit Singh, and Hira Singh's (Patiala General) mission to arrest all the claimants to the estate including Fauja Singh who had sought Maharaja's assistance against his brothers. Urdu.

163. Memorandum. Undated. Regarding Hira Singh's (General of Patiala State) attack on the fort of Dhiromajra, and arrest of Uttam Singh and Daya Singh and Gurbux Singh joining service in Kapurthala State. Urdu.

164. Memorandum. Undated. Regarding Fauja Singh's and Uttam Singh's (the Sardars of Dhiromajra) imprisonment in Dhodan Fort. (Fauja Singh, however, later expressed regret to Uttam Singh for bringing the calamity on the Dhiromajra family). Urdu.

165. Memorandum. Undated. Regarding award of titles by British Government to Daya Singh and Ganda Singh, the Sardars of Dhiromajra. Ahluwalia Chiefs treated them amicably but the said Sardars never liked to serve under any Government. Urdu.

166. Memorandum. Undated. Regarding Ahluwalia Sardar's assistance to Gurbux Singh, of Dhiromajra, urging him to proceed to Delhi to seek the assistance of the British Government to bring about the release of his brothers, who were kept confined by the Maharaja of Patiala. Urdu.

167. Memorandum. Undated. Issued by the British Government asking the Patiala Government to release the Chiefs of Dhiromajra and to explain the reasons for invading their estate. Urdu.

168. Memorandum. Undated. 170. Deed. 7 October 1857. Regarding mortgage of 65 bighas of land by Diwan Singh, son of Ram Chand in Dhiromajra to Sardar Uttam Singh for Rs.104/- only. Urdu.

171. Robkar. 3 March 1858. From Deputy Commissioner, Ludhiana, to Sardar Daya Singh, Jagirdar, permitting him to occupy the ruined Issru (Isru) Fort (near Khanna) and the land adjacent to it. Urdu.

172. Deed. 1 November 1859. Regarding sale of land belonging to Sardars Bir Singh and Gurmukh Singh (16 and 17 bighas respectively) to Sardar Uttam Singh, of Dhiromajra. Urdu.

173. Deed. 29 July 1861. Regarding mortgage of 65 bighas and 8 biswas of their land by Dasaundhi and Naudha, the sons of Diwan Singh, to Daya Singh, son of Uttam Singh, Jagirdar of Dhiromajra. Urdu.

174. Memorandum. 3 September 1862. Regarding proposed division of Dhiromajra Estate, founded by Sardar Daya Singh, among his successors after his death. Urdu.

175. Deed. 28 November 1865. Regarding mortgage of 14 acres of their land by Kanhya, son of Karam Singh, Uttar Singh son of Ram Das, Mst. Lachhmi Devi, wife of Kahan Singh, and Gulab Singh, the residents of Kaler and Ghanupur, to Sardar Daya Singh for Rs.150/-. Urdu.

176. Deed. 12 November 1869. Regarding sale of 17 bighas and 15 biswas of their land by Bhola and Hamama sons of Dharma to Daya Singh. Urdu.

177. Deed. 19 October 1870. Regarding sale of 87 bighas and 6 biswas of land by Sukhchain, son of Bhaga, the resident of Ladhowal, to Daya Singh. Urdu.

178. Sanad. 18 May 1875. Issued by Maj. E.P. Gurdon, Deputy Commissioner, Ludhiana, to Sardar Ganda Singh, son of Daya Singh, in appreciation of his donation of a large amount of money to a school. (He was given the khilat and the sanad by the Governor General in an open darbar). Urdu.

179. Deed. 25 December 1880. Regarding sale of 50 bighas ~~of land~~ by Ghula, son of Hukmi, resident of Dhiromajra, to Sardar Ganda Singh. Urdu.

180. Deed. 23 February 1881. Regarding sale of 16 bighas and 12 biswas of land by Sukha, resident of Dhiromajra to Sardar Ganda Singh. Urdu.

181. Deed. 4 July 1882. Regarding sale of 21 bighas and 13 biswas of land by Jiwan Singh, son of Nihala, and Nand Singh, the lambardar of Dhiromajra, to Sardar Ganda Singh. Urdu.

Collection of Sirjang Bahadur, Advocate, Dalalpora Street, Patiala.

182. Memorandum. Undated. By Sardar Umrao Bahadur, former Deputy Secretary to Maharaja Rajindar Singh, of Patiala, narrating briefly the history of Patiala State. Urdu.

183. Memorandum. Undated. Narrating that during the reign of Prithvi Raj Chauhan in 1185 A.D. Rao Hem Hail (Hemhel), hailing from Jaisalmer, took possession of Bhatinda and Bhatner (old name of Hanumangarh, in Rajasthan ?) and built a fort at a place where Hissar city is presently situated. Rao Hem Hail died in 1214 A.D. Urdu.

184. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that the fort (of Bhatinda) which was in the possession of the Chauhans at the time of Mahmud Ghazni's invasion, was also called Bikramgarh after the name of Maharaja Vikramajit. Urdu.

185. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that since Diwan Nanu Mal, the Commander of the Patiala forces, had revolted against the State, Maharaja Amar Singh requested Bibi Amar Kaur to negotiate with the Mahrattas (Marathas) ~~seeking withdrawal~~ of their troops from Patiala. Urdu.

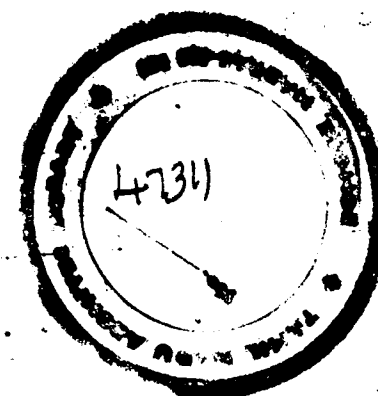

IX. UTTAR PRADESH

The 100 documents listed below belong to collections in the private custody of three different individuals in Uttar Pradesh. The documents cover the period 1046-1878 A.D., and consist of farmans, nishans, bainamas, parwanas, deeds etc. They deal with sale and grant of land, appointment of qazis, award of titles and other sundry matters. Amongst these papers is to be found an interesting letter issued by King George III of England to the Nawab of Carnatic assuring the Nawab of the sincere friendship of the British. The documents are in Persian, Turkish, Arabic and English.

Haft Hazari - A Commander of seven thousand, a military title and rank conferred by the Mughal Governments.

Hakeem - A Physician.

Hakim - A high Officer, Governor, the supreme administrative authority in a district.

Haveli (Havali) - House, mansion.

Hukmnama - A written order.

Hun - Gold coin current in South India.

Hazur - The royal presence, or presence of a supreme authority, also abstractly the state or Government.

Ijara - Contract, monopoly.

Ilahi-yard - The standard yard, of 46 fingers, instituted by Akbar, authoritatively fixed by the British Government at 33 inches.

Ilaka (Illaga) - Dependency, estate, district.

Inam - A gift, a benefiction in general.

Iqramama - Deed of assent or acknowledgement; agreement.

Istifta - Consulting a Muhammadan lawyer, particularly in religious affairs.

Istihshadnama - Written document summoning witnesses and taking evidence.

Jagir (Jagheer) - Hereditary or personal assignment of land and its rent with or without conditions of service.

Jagirdar - Holder of a jagir.

Jarida - A register, a Gazette notification.

Jumah (Juma) - Friday, the day of public prayer for the Muhammadans.

Kabuliatnama - A written agreement; especially one signifying assent, as the counterpart of a revenue lease.

Kaifiyatnama (Kaifiyat) - Written statement, description, report, account.

Kanungo (Qanungo) - Expounder of laws, a village, or district revenue officer who records all facts concerning landed property and realisation of revenue.

Karbala - A place of pilgrimage for the Muslims in Saudi Arabia.

Kardar - An agent, especially of the Government.

Kartika (Katik) - The seventh month of the Hindu year (Oct.-Nov.)

Khaji - See Kazi.

Khalsa (Khalisah) - Land of which the revenue remains the property of the Government and which is not made over in jagir or inam to anyone, the exchequer under the Muhammadan Government, collective denomination of the Sikh-Government or people.

Khan - A title borne by Muhammadan nobles.

Kharita (Kharita) - A bag, a purse, the envelope of a letter, a small silk bag in which letters for great men are enclosed.

Khera - A village, a measurement of land in Bundelkhand, land immediately adjacent to a village.

Khilat (Khalat) - Dress of honour presented by superior to an inferior as a mark of distinction.

Lambardar - A cultivator who, either on his own account, or as representative of other village members, pays the Government dues and is registered in the Collector's roll according to his number.

Madad-i-maash- Assignment of revenue for the support of learned or pious persons.

Madarul Umra- Chief or senior noble, a title conferred on its nobility by the Nizams.

Mahajari A particular hereditary officer in village.

Mahajaru- Testimonial or certificate in favour of a public functionary.

Mahakma Khas, Chief Department.

Mahant- The head of the Hindu religious establishment.

Mahimai (Mohamoi)- A cess, a fee.

Mahzamama- A written collective attestation, a list or a roll of persons present.

Mal- Riches, money, property, rent or revenue arising from land.

Majlis-i-Sarf-i-Khas- An inner Cabinet.

Makta (Maqta)- Fixed customary rate either in money or in kind.

Mamla- Trade, commerce, business, agreement, suit; also collection of revenue and management of a district.

Mamul- Established, customary, usual.

Mana- Measurement in general, whether of length, capacity, or weight; a land measure equal to 25 gunthas.

Mansab- Civil or military rank under the Mughal rulers.

Mansab-i-Haft Hazar- A rank of seven thousands horse.

Mansabdar- Holder of a civil or military rank under the Mughal Government.

Marathub- See Muratib.

Math (Mutt)- A Hindu shrine; a monastic institution, generally carrying a large endowments of property.

Maulavi (Maulvi)- A learned man, a teacher, especially of Arabic, and expounder of Muhammadan law.

Mauza- A village.

Milkiat Istimrari- Right of proprietorship or possession in perpetuity.

Misl- A term applied to the Sikh confederacies in Punjab.

Motmid- A confidant, a Wakil.

Muaafi (Muafi)- Remission or exemption from the demands of the state; a grant of land free from assessment.

Muchalka (Muchilka)- A written obligation or agreement, a bond, a deed.

Mufti- A Muhammadan law officer whose duty was to expound the law which the Qazi was to execute.

Muhar (Mohar)- A seal, a seal ring, a gold coin.

Muharram- The first month of the Muhammadan year.

Mukhtar- An agent, a representative, an attorney.

Mukhtamama- A deed appointing a representative or agent, power of attorney.

Mundari- Language spoken by the aboriginal tribes of Ranchi in Bihar.

Munsarim- Clerk or Superintendent of judicial court, superior official.

Munshi- A writer, a secretary, applied by Europeans usually to teachers or interpreters of Persian and Hindustani.

Muqaddam (Mukaddam)- A village headman responsible for management of village affairs including collection and payment of revenue.

Murasala- Communication; writing a letter; sending a message.

Muratib- Dignities, honours.

Musammata- A title pre-fixed to the names of respectable women in public documents and judicial proceedings.

Mushrif- An examiner, an inspector, an officer of the treasury who authenticates accounts and documents.

Mutasaddi- A clerk, a writer, an accountant.

Nagaram- A small town.

Naib Suba (Naib Subadar)- The deputy governor of a province.

Nakarkhana- A place where drums are beaten.

Naubat- Instruments of music or a band sounding at a gateway of a great man at intervals.

Nawab- A Muhammadan title of distinction.

Nayak- A leader, a chief in general; a military chief under the Rajas of Vijayanagar; head of a small body of soldiers.

Nazar (Nazr)- A present, an offering, generally from an inferior to a superior.

Nazim- Administrator; inspector, but commonly an officer charged with the administration of criminal law and police.

Nazrana- Fees paid to government as acknowledgement for grant of land or any public office; gift offered and received when people of rank meet or pay their respect to a prince; a kind of tribute.

Nirup- Order.

Nishan- A sign, a mark, an emblem, a signet, an ensign, a flag.

Nizamat- Office of Nazim or Governor.

Olai- Palm leaf or any deed or document written on palm leaf.

Pagoda- The European designation of a Hindu temple in South India; also a gold coin.

Paigah- Household guards in Nizam's service, hence anything pertaining to this.

Pakka (Pucca)- Ripe, mature, complete.

Pargana- Subdivision of a district.

Parupatyagar (Parupattegars)- Superintendent or the manager of a temple under a superior.

Parwana- An order, a written command, a letter from a man in power to a dependent for the possession of an estate or an assignment of revenue.

Parwarish- Protecting, fostering, bringing up, also used laxly meaning subsistence allowance.

Patta- Deed of lease, document given by the Collector to the zamindar or some other receiver of revenue to the cultivator, specifying conditions on which land is held.

Peshi- Presence in the court on the basis of summons.

Peshkar- An agent, a deputy; a subordinate officer in court of law who puts up cases before the judge; a subordinate revenue officer.

Peshkash (Peishcush)- Offering or tribute paid to a superior or to government.

Prasadam- Food offered to an idol which, after the worship, is distributed amongst the devotees.

Punjab- Dry or unirrigated lands.

Purabias (Purbiyas)- Men from eastern provinces, esp. meant for people from eastern districts of U.P., Bihar and Orissa.

Purganah- See pargana.

Purohit- Family priest, one who conducts the domestic ceremonies of a tribe, household or family.

Purwanah- See parwana.

Qaladar- See qiladar.

Qasba- A small town.

Qasida- A poem or an elegy.

Qaul- A promise, an agreement.

Qaulnama (Kaulnama)- The written voucher granted to the revenue payers specifying the terms of their payments and amount; any written contract or engagement, also written rules on the subject of rent.

Qazi (Kazi)- A Muhammadan judge under the Muslim governments to administer civil and criminal laws according to Quran.

Qiladar- Commandant of a fort.

Raijul-Waqt- The practice or custom of the times.

Rajab- The seventh month of the Muhammadan year.

Ramazan- The ninth month of the Muhammadan year.

Rasad- Ration or provision for the army.

Robkar- Court official; proceedings (of a case), warrant.

Rozana- Daily.

Rozina (Rojinee)- Daily allowance.

Ruqqa (Rukka)- A letter, a note, a draft or a bill, written promise or contract.

Sadagatnama- True copy.

Sadar Taluqdar- Chief Taluqdar.

Sadr-us-sadur- Head of judiciary.

Safar- The second month of the Muhammadan year.

Samadhi- A small and low shrine or tomb erected over the grave of a jogi or a famous man.

Sanad- Deed of grant; patent; document conveying to an individual the titles, privileges and rights to revenue from land etc.

Sarai- A palace, a building for the shelter and accommodation of travellers.

Sardar- A chief, a headman.

Sarkar- Government, tract of territory under Muslim rule, corresponding to district or division under the British.

Sati- Self immolation by a woman on the funeral pyre of her husband.

Sawar- A rider, a horseman.

Shafai- The teacher or founder of one of the four great schools of Muhammadan law; a follower of the Shafai school.

Sikka- Coining die; royal signet, stamped coin.

Sikka Siyah- An account of the coins.

Sirajul Umara- A Muhammadan title.

Siyah- An account book or inventory.

Suba (Sooba)- Province, also used as shortened form for Subadar.

Subadar (Subedar)- The governor of a province; viceroy under the Mughal Government; a native officer in the Company's army holding a rank equivalent to that of captain under the European officers.

Sultan- A sovereign prince, a king, an emperor.

Suvadi- A palm-leaf document.

Swami- A master, an owner, a husband, a lord, a title given to idols in the south of India.

Tahsil- Collection, especially of the public revenue derived from the land; the revenue collected: division of a district.

Tahsildar (Tahasildar)- Collector of revenue.

Tajviznama- A written decree, judgment, or resolution.

Taluq (Taluk)- Estate smaller than zamindari.

Taluqdar- Holder of a taluq.

Tamassuk- Bond; note of hand written acknowledgement or engagement.

Tamilnama- A deed of transfer, whether of gift or conveyance.

Tanaha- See Thana.

Tauliyatnama (Tauliatnama)- A deed of trusteeship, one appointing a person to the management of a religious endowment.

Thakurdwara- A temple, a place of worship.

Thana- A station, a military post, a police station.

Thanedar- Incharge of a thana.

Thikana- Small estate, residence or place of dwelling.

Tola- A measure of weight, for gold and silver.

Toshakhana (Toshekhana)- A store room, a wardrobe, chamber in which objects of curiosity or value are kept.

Tughra (Tugra)- Imperial signature, sign-manual on a royal grant, royal titles usually prefixed to a public document written in ornamental characters.

Udak- Grant of land in muafi.

Umara- Nobility under the Muslim rule.

Vakil (Vakeel)- An attorney, an authorised representative, a political agent of an Indian chief.

Varaha- A gold coin, the signet of the Rajas of Vijayanagar.

Yatra (Jatra)- Journey for religious purposes.

Yomiah- A daily allowance to pensioners of any kind.

Zaildari- Office of the zaildar (a revenue official who was mainly concerned with the collection of irrigation tax).

Zakat- Alms, contribution of a portion of property or capital obligatory for every Muslim.

Zamindar- Landlord, occupant of land.

Zamindari- Office of the zamindar as well as tract of land in his possession.

Zuhr- Afternoon prayers.

Zulhijja- The last month of the Muhammadan year.

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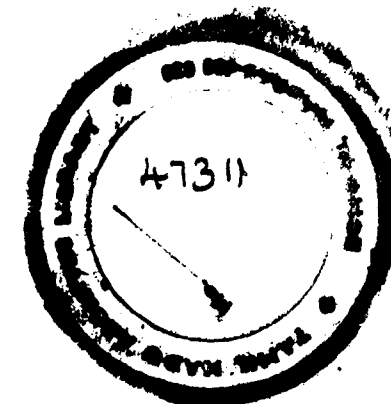
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
