ANNUAL REPORT, 1977

A. Some Highlights

Although no new projects in the Fifth Five Year Plan were sanctioned, the Department made good stride in the implementation of its several programmes. All except two schemes (viz. Development of Archival Consciousness and Automated Information Storage and Retrieval) were put into operation. The latter scheme is likely to be taken up in the current medium-term plan.

During 1977, due to acute shortage of shelf space in the National Archives of India only 827 files, 26 bundles and 51 maps belonging to the Ministry of External Affairs, Ministry of Home Affairs, Office of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India, Department of Science and Technology and Survey of India could be accessioned. Besides, some more private papers of Rajendra Prasad and Benarsi Das Chaturvedi, were received for permanent custody.

In the Research Room of the Department, 574 research scholars consulted records and books relevant to their subjects of research. As many as 19 scholars came from U.S.A., U.K., Australia, Afghanistan, etc.

Further progress was made in the work of re-arranging and regrouping of certain categories of records according to archival principles. As part of the Record Management programme, 91,584 files, 2,427 registers and 1,424 loose letters were appraised by the technical staff. In pursuance of the Archival Policy Resolution, the Department assisted various Government agencies in the formulation of retention schedules suitable for their various categories of records.

With the additional staff sanctioned under the Fifth Plan, further substantial progress was made in the work regarding preparation of reference media for the official records, private papers and microfilm of papers acquired from abroad. Besides listing of records, the Department has started the preparation of a comprehensive Guide to Records in the National Archives of India.



For William-India House Correspondence (Vol. VII), Department brought out the following publications:

Fort William-India House Correspondence (Vol. VII), Home (Public), 1773-76), *National Register of Private Records*, Vol. VIII, *Bulletin of Research Theses & Dissertations*, Vol. VIII, and *Guide to the Records in the National Archives of India* (Department/Ministry of Home Affairs (1748-1957). Besides, two issues of the Department journal. *The Indian Archives* (Vol. XXIV, Nos. 1-2 & Vol. XXV, No. 1) also came out of Press.

The Department kept up its programme of imparting training in Archives-keeping and many developing countries showed increasing interest in it. Besides, private candidates and state nominees, two trainees from Malaysia and one trainee from Nigeria successfully completed the course during the session 1976-77. Two candidates from Malaysia and one from Nepal have been admitted for 1977-78 session.

B. Archival Management

I. Accessions

(a) *Official Records*.—During the year 827 files, 26 bundles and 51 maps were accessioned for permanent custody. The accessions included the records of Ministry of External Affairs (765 files), Ministry of Home Affairs (9 files), Office of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India (53 files), Department of Science and Technology (26 bundles) and Survey of India, Dehradun (51 maps). Besides, 74 authenticated copies of Bills passed by the various State Legislatures and assented to by the President of India were also received.

(b) *Private Papers*.—A further instalment of papers of Dr. Rajendra Prasad was gifted to the Department by Shri H. K. Verma and Shri Rajesh Verma. The Department acquired some more papers from Shri B. D. Chaturvedi comprising letters and press-clippings etc. The Department also received by way of gift the following items: a document entitled 'Music before the Mosque' from Shri Hare Krishna Pattanayak of District Midnapore. It is a bilingual document (in English and Bengali) dated 22 February 1945, forming copy of the court proceedings in respect of an enquiry in connection with taking out the procession of Saraswati Pratima Bisarjani along with a music band near a mosque at the time of prayers. Besides, one negative

microfilm roll bearing transcription of taped interview with Shri B. P. Koirala from Shri Bhola Chatterjee; a photograph of martyr Sukhdev from Shri M. D. Thapar; list of passengers on board the famous ship 'Komagatamaru' from Shri Duli Chand, Archivist, National Archives of India; a passport issued in October 1947 to Dr. Rajendra Prasad were also received as gift to the Department.

On the recommendation of the Historical Documents Purchase Committee, the Department acquired by purchase an out-size copy of a *rubakar* (dated 26th January 1835) of the *Adalat-i-Alia* of Nawab of Oudh and a collection of private papers and documents pertaining to the period 1918-35 and relating mainly to the labour movement in the erstwhile Gwalior State.

Microfilm 5.—The Department kept up its regular programme of acquisition of microfilms of records of Indian interest from abroad and in this connection, mention may be made of the following important acquisitions: 29 microfilm rolls of records (1910-29) of the State Department relating to political relations between United States on the one hand and India, Burma etc., on the other from National Archives, Washington, 5 microfilm rolls of copies of despatches (1849-62) of the Governors and Lieutenant Governors of the Australian colonies and New Zealand addressed to the Governors, officials and private individuals in India from National Library, Canberra, and one microfilm roll of records from the Linlithgow collection and one roll of Persian manuscript entitled 'Paimayishi Zamini' of taluka Baldahi (Ahmedabad) from the India Office Library and Records, London.

II. Appraisal, Checking and Arrangement

(a) *Appraisal*.—In the sphere of Record Management, the programme of appraisal of unappraised records lying in the Department as well as in the various Ministries of the Government of India and their subordinate offices, was pursued with vigour. The Record Management Unit, during the period, completed appraisal of 91,584 files, 2,427 registers and 10,822 loose letters. Out of these 44,622 files, 458 registers and 1,424 loose letters were marked for permanent retention. These records belonged to the Ministry of Finance (1947-51) Department of Culture (1963-68), Department of Agriculture (1941-76), Department of Science and Technology (1901-52), Department of Health (1948-52), Department of Revenue (1917-46), Department of Expenditure (1924-51), and also the following agencies: Bundel-

khand Agency (1873-1911, 1913-46), Rajputana Agency (1826-47), Southern C.I. States and Malwa Agency (1876-1947), Bhopawar Agency (1874-1920), Bhopal Agency (1876-1942), Central India Agency (1872-52). I.R.D./National Archives of India series (1942-65).

While the Third Report of Director of Archives on the implementation of Archival Policy Resolution during 1975-76 was printed and distributed among the Ministries/Departments/Offices, the Fourth Report was submitted to the Ministry of Education & Social Welfare and is presently under print.

In pursuance of the Archival Policy Resolution (para 6) the preliminary/final studies of the Retention Schedules of records belonging to various Ministries/Departments were continued. Such schedules of the following Ministries/Departments were vetted after on the spot studies and reports sent to: Ministry of Finance (Gold Control Section), Department of Economic Affairs, Department of Science and Technology, Office of the Commissioner of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes, Directorate General of Health Services, Shipping Development Fund Committee and Central Reserve Police Force. Preliminary studies of Retention Schedule of records of the following Ministries/Departments were also undertaken and interim advice was given to: Ministry of Petroleum, Chemicals and Fertilizers, Ministry of Shipping and Transport; Ministry of Defence; Department of Food; Railway Board; Office of the Central Excise, Patna; Salal Hydro-Electric Project, Jyotipuram; Central Reference Library, Calcutta; Salt Commissioner, Jaipur; and National Saving Organisation, Nagpur. On-the-spot study of the records of C.G.D.A. and Prime Minister's Karyalaya in the same connection is presently in progress.

(b) *Checking and Arrangement.*—During the period under report the work regarding checking, arrangement and cataloguing of the following series was completed: 18,257 files of Foreign and Political Department/Ministry of External Affairs (1786-1967); 1,003 files of Department of Education, Health and Lands (1860-1946); 1,961 recorded files of National Archives of India (1969-78), 250 indices and 200 proceedings volumes of Home (Public) Department (1907-23), 310 indices and 265 bundles of Proceedings of Finance Department (1860-79, 1905-21), 742 volumes of the News Bulletins of All India Radio (1949-67); 150 indices and 186 Proceedings volumes of Revenue and Agriculture Department (1860-1919), 80 indices and 160 proceedings volumes

of Home (Police) Department (1864-1902), 918 packets of cancelled securities (Reserve Bank of India, Calcutta, 1830-54), 430 bundles of Public Works Department Proceedings (1860-1923), and 1,969 boxes of Foreign (Secret) Department. Besides, about 8,515 files of newly acquired records from the Ministry of External Affairs were amalgamated with their parent series and necessary entries made in the relevant transfer lists.

Docketing as well as classification of the Inayat Jang Collection made steady progress. During the period 2,485 documents were descriptively docketed and 15,000 documents arranged in their original order.

As regards the checking and arrangement of private papers, work was completed on the following: 39,859 items and 940 files belonging to the Collections of Rajendra Prasad, Dadabhai Naoroji, P. K. Malaviya, M. R. Jayakar, G. K. Gokhale, Sir Sita Ram and G. S. Khaparde. Papers relating to the History of Freedom Movement, Meerut Conspiracy case and U.S. Club (Simla) were also checked and arranged. Besides, four rolls in microfilm relating to the following items were checked: Journal of Goodby Samuel, thesis of R. G. Lakshmana, Farooque, Wigmore Lionel, Partition of India and official language question etc. Furthermore, one roll containing New South Wales Colonial Secretary's Special bundles relating to India and the New South Wales Governor's despatches to the Governor General of India (1849-62) was also checked.

III. Compilation of Reference Media

(a) *Guide to Records in National Archives of India.*—Completing the work on Part II of the "Guide to Records in the National Archives of India" Home Department/Ministry of Home Affairs (1748-1957), work regarding compilation of the next part of the Guide to Records in the National Archives of India was continued. In this connection abstract lists as well as write-ups on organisational changes of the records series were compiled, giving the relevant information regarding their contents in brief, inclusive years, gaps and shelf-space occupied by them. The records covered are those of: Foreign Department (10 branches), Revenue and Agriculture Department (5 series), Military Department (26 series) and Education, Health and Lands Department (17 branches).

(b) The work regarding preparation of summary inventories and subject lists of Public/Private papers also made steady progress. During the period under report summary inventories of 22,548 manuscript pages of the Foreign Department (Secret-1802-4) was prepared. In addition, subject lists were also prepared of the following: 15036 pp of the different branches of Public Works Department (1860-1921) and 12,592 items of the collections of Rajendra Prasad, Dadabhai Naoroji, Raja Mahendra Pratap, B. D. Chaturvedi, P. K. Malaviya and P. S. S. Aiyar. Besides, about 191 seals relating to the Departments of Revenue, Judicial, etc. were catalogued during the year under report.

IV. National Register of Records

National Register of Private Records, volume VIII (1966-67) was brought out in cyclostyled form. It covers the material received from Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Bihar, Karnataka, Orissa, Punjab, Kerala, Tamil Nadu and Uttar Pradesh during 1966-67. It also contains a note on the material acquired by the National Archives of India from various private individuals. Besides, during the same period the preliminary compilation work on volume IX (1967-68) in the same series has been completed and the same is being presently edited. The work on volume X (1968-71) is in progress.

V. Research and Reference Service

During the year under report 574 research scholars availed themselves of the facilities offered by the Department for consulting records, published sources, microfilms and collections of private papers. Although the great majority of them were Indians, a fair number of scholars came from abroad also. (For names of the countries foreign scholars came from, please see Appendix I. Details about all the scholar and their subjects of research are given in Appendix II).

As usual, the Research Room was kept open from 9 A.M. to 8 P.M. on working days and from 9.30 A.M. to 4.30 P.M. on holidays.

The Department attended to 56,956 requisitions for records from the research scholars, members of the staff, and various private/public agencies of the Government of India. Requisitions for 1,675 rolls of microfilm copies of records were also attended to during the period under report. Among the 31

collections of private papers consulted by the research scholars, special mention may be made those of the following. Rajendra Prasad, B. D. Chaturvedi, P. D. Tandon, M. R. Jayakar, G. B. Pant, G. K. Gokhale and G. S. Khaparde.

The Departmental Library continued to offer facilities for consulting books, old periodicals etc., and 1,675 individuals, including research scholars and members of the staff of various offices of the Government of India as well as the State Governments, availed of the facilities offered.

A large number of inquiries received from the various Government Departments, semi-Government Organisations, private institutions and individuals were attended to, many of which involved detailed search among the records and published sources (For full details, please see Appendix III).

VI. Inspection, Liaison and Advisory Work

Dr. S. N. Prasad, Director of Archives, accompanied by Shri I. B. Roy (Archivist) visited Vrindaban (U.P.) to survey the records of the Vrindaban Research Institute, Vrindaban and advised them on the proper maintenance and preservation of records. He also visited Maharashtra State Archives to advise them regarding the scheme for preparing transcribed copies of pre-1750 records in their possession. Besides, he also visited Sitamau (M.P.) to examine the records of Natnagar Shodh Samsthan, Sitamau.

Shri R. C. Gupta, Deputy Director of Archives, visited Bombay to advise Central Board of Film Censors regarding preservation of their records. He also visited Maharashtra State Archives and advised them regarding safeguards against insect damage to records.

To study the diverse problems connected with record management, Assistant Director of Archives (Record Management-I) inspected the record rooms of the Ministry of Works and Housing, Ministry of Home Affairs, Departments of Education and Culture, Prime Minister's Secretariat and Historical Division of Ministry of Defence and reports suggesting further necessary action on their part were forwarded to them. Besides, he also advised Madhya Pradesh Government, Supreme Court of India, Institute of Secretariat Training and Management and Air Headquarters on record management problems. Officers of the Record Management Division also inspected record rooms

of Ministry of Works and Housing; Ministry of Defence; Ministry of External Affairs; Department of Culture; Shipping Development Fund Committee; Commission on Prices and Wages; Director General of Posts and Telegraphs; Directorate General of Observatories; Office of the Commissioner of Income Tax, Ernakulam; Central Institute of Fisheries, Cochin; Central Board of Film Censors, Bombay; Indian Security Press, Nasik; Archaeological Survey of India, New Delhi and advice with regard to their proper record management was given to them.

The work of compilation of data of archival assets of different Ministries/Departments of the Government of India was continued. In this connection circular letters were issued to various offices of the Union Government with a view to collecting information regarding the progress made by them in recording, indexing and appraisal of files. About 124 Ministries/Departments/Offices had replied so far.

The Department continued its endeavours to reactivate the Regional Records Survey Committees in the work of survey of records in private custody for the National Register. The Director of Archives attended a meeting of the Regional Records Survey Committee in New Delhi, held on 8th February 1977. Also the Assistant Director of Archives (Publication) attended the meeting of the Gujarat Survey Committee held at Gandhinagar on 22nd September, 1977.

VII. Training

A special attraction of the period was a 'Workshop on Care and Preservation of Library Materials' organised by this Department in collaboration with National Research Laboratory. The workshop was organised at the Institute of Archival Training during 2nd—5th November, 1977. About 15 candidates deputed from the various libraries participated in it.

Under its programme of imparting training in the science of Archives-keeping, 18 trainees of the 1976-77 Session of the One-Year Diploma Course, successfully completed the course and were awarded diplomas. A new batch of 15 trainees was admitted for the 1977-78 session. Besides, twenty-four trainees for a 6-week course in Repair & Reprography and 28 trainees for the 8-week course in Record Management, deputed both by the Central and various State Governments, completed their training in August 1977 and November 1977 respectively.

In addition to the abovementioned training programmes of the Department, special facilities for observation-cum-training in the various techniques of repair & reprographic methods employed in the Department were also provided to the two nominees of the Maharashtra State Archives. Besides, the Department continued extending facilities for the study of records and micro-films to a Burmese scholar who had come under the Indian Technical and Economic Cooperation Programme of the Ministry of External Affairs in September 1976. (For names of the successful candidates and marks obtained by each in the One-Year Diploma Course as also the lists of other trainees under various schemes, please see Appendix IV).

C. Preservation and Technical Service

I. Preservation and Repair of Records

Under the programme of repair and rehabilitation of records, 56,541 sheets and 6 maps were repaired by machine lamination while 23,750 sheets and 9 maps were repaired by solvent lamination process; 44,399 sheets were repaired with tissue paper; 93,955 sheets and 86 maps were freed from old patches of repair. Besides, 623 maps and 16 pictures were mounted, 81,042 sheets guarded and 1,018 volumes, 1,113 books, 9 maps and 761 miscellaneous items were bound and leather preservative mixture was applied to 13,474 volumes. In addition, minor repairs were made on 10,814 sheets and 774 maps and 65 boxes. In all, 460 files, 280 maps, 28 bundles, 63 boxes, 6 books were air-cleaned and 1,262 books, 280 maps and 28 bundles were fumigated.

II. Technical and Advisory Service.

The Department beside attending to its normal conservation and restoration work, rendered technical service and advice to a number of institutions and individuals for preservation and rehabilitation of documents. Important among the institutions and individuals who availed themselves of such facilities during the year were: Smt. Paropkarni Sabha, Ajmer; Oriental Research Institute, Tonk; Indian Council of Cultural Relations, New Delhi; University of Bombay; Dr. Zakir Husain Library, Jamia Millia, New Delhi; Archaeological Survey of India, Agra; Central Secretariat Library, New Delhi; Ministry of Defence Library, New Delhi; Prof. Lokesh Chandra (M.P.); Rabindra Bhawan, Santiniketan; Shri Krishna Kripalani (M.P.) New Delhi; and Shri Gideon M. Matwale of Kenya. Similar treatment was given

to brittle documents in the collections of Rajendra Prasad, Dadabhai Naoroji, P. K. Malaviya, M. R. Jayakar and B. D. Chaturvedi.

Technical advice on problems connected with the repair and procurement of cellulose tissue papers etc. was also given to the following: Inspector General Border Security Force Academy, Gwalior; State Archives of Punjab, Haryana and Madhya Pradesh; Institute of Indology, New Delhi; National Physical Laboratory, New Delhi; Salar Jang Museum, Hyderabad; Department of Rehabilitation, New Delhi; Nehru Memorial Museum and Library, New Delhi; Victoria Memorial Museum, Calcutta; Kurukshetra University; Lok Sabha Secretariat Archives, New Delhi; M/s Instrumentation Ltd, Kota; Ballarpur Paper Mills; Punjab University Library, Chandigarh; M/s Voltas, Ltd, New Delhi; Public Library, Allahabad; Dacca Museum, Bangladesh; Indian Institute of Islamic Studies, New Delhi and Radha Swami Satsang Sabha, Agra.

Scientific Officers of the Department were also deputed to inspect the records and manuscripts of the Chemical and Fertilizer Department, New Delhi; Roorkee University; Parliament House Library, New Delhi; Victoria Memorial Hall, Calcutta; Institute of Public Administration, New Delhi, and Library of Indian Council of World Affairs, New Delhi. They studied the damage caused by insects and gave advice on problems connected with preservation of records. An officer also visited the Rajasthan State Archives, Bikaner and recommended measures for the setting up of a document conservation Laboratory there.

III. Photoduplication

Photoduplication services were rendered to a number of institutions and individuals in India and abroad. Among these who availed themselves of these services mention may be made of the following: Rangoon University, Burma; Fisher Library, University of Sydney; Reid Library, University of Western Australia; University of Queensland, Australia; Mr. Thomas R. Metcalf, University of Pennsylvania, Bawa Satinder Singh, Florida State University; Islamic University of Medina; Dr. Gail Minault, University of Texas, Mr. Abdul Wahab Tarzi, Kabul; Smt. Simanti Dutta, University of London, Dr. Joseph J. Brenning, New York; Dr. L. V. Mitrokhin U.S.S.R; Mr. Razabin Nasan Mati, Saudi Arabia; Mr. Reiz Ahmed, Pakistan; Mrs. Joan

J. Roland, U.S.A; General Staff Branch, Army Headquarters, New Delhi; National Gallery of Modern Art, New Delhi; Punjab Agriculture University, Ludhiana; Mr. Imdad Hussain, North Eastern Hill University, Shillong; Institute for Socialistic Education, New Delhi; Nagpur Vidyapith Library, Transport Museum, New Delhi; Maulana Azad Library, Aligarh; Indian Institute of Management, Calcutta; Imperial Embassy of Iran, New Delhi; International Airport Authority, New Delhi; National Library, Calcutta; Gokhale Institute of Politics and Economics, Poona; Statistical Institute, New Delhi; Indian Council for Cultural Relations, New Delhi; and the State Archives of Rajasthan, U.P. and Haryana.

As part of the regular programme, microfilming of records of the Finance Department, Public Department (Legislative and Law Branches) Home Department (Public), Military Department, and Foreign & Political Department, was continued. In addition, some old Urdu and Persian News-papers of early 19th century were microfilmed.

The following figures would speak for themselves about the total output of photoduplication work attended to during the period: 2,93,685 exposures of microfilm, 5,923 metres of positive printing, 1,813 enlargement prints, 9,505 xerox copies and 40 reflex copies.

Shastri Indo-Canadian Institute.—Under the agreement concluded between the Government of India and the Shastri Indo-Canadian Institute, New Delhi, the work of microfilming of records was continued and during the year under report 96,085 exposures of Jayakar Papers were taken.

IV. Research Laboratory

To find out their suitability for use in the repair and rehabilitation of records, the Research Laboratory of the Department continued testing various materials available in the country, like chiffon, ledger paper, glue, naphthalene, cellulose acetate foil, tissue paper etc. Testing of waxed paper, cover paper and leather, was also carried out to ascertain their durability for binding of volumes. A few samples of acetate foil, tissue paper, handmade paper, ledger paper and synthetic fabrics, received from Haryana State Archives, M/s Ballarpur Paper Industries Ltd., M/s Anand Bazar Patrika, Calcutta, etc. were also tested.

D. Publications

I. Fort William-India House Correspondence

Under Scheme I of the publication programme of the Department, Volume VII (Home Public, 1773-76, Honorary Editor: Prof. R. P. Patwardhan) of the series, was printed and printing of text and prelims of Volume XII (Home (Public) 1793-95, Honorary Editor: Dr. A. Tripathi) was completed. Compilation of Index to the volume is presently in progress.

II. The Indian Archives

Volume XXIV Nos. 1 & 2 (Jany-Dec. 1975) and XXV, No. 1 (Jany-June 1976) of the departmental journal, *The Indian Archives* were published and the typescript of Volume XXV, No. 2 (July-December 1976) was sent to the press.

IV. "Towards Freedom" Project

Under "Towards Freedom" Project, search for material from the records was continued and as many as 12,810 pages in typescript of relevant material were extracted from the collections of: Rajendra Prasad (1938-40), M. R. Jayakar (1937-47), Lord Linlithgow, (1937), Sir H. Haig (1937-39), Lord Erskine (1938) and from the records of Departments/Ministries of Defence (1937-47), Labour (1937-47), Home (Political, 1942-45) Department, Political (Secret, 1941-45) Department, Reforms Office

(1941-42), Madras State Agency (1937-47) and Bhopal Agency (1937-47). The records housed in the Delhi State Archives were also examined in this connection.

E. Personnel and Miscellaneous Matters

I. Staff Changes

For the Fifth Plan Schemes the following additional staff was sanctioned: 1 Archivist, 2 Assistant Archivists (Gr. I), 1 Record Survey Officer, 2 Record Survey Assistants, 1 Superintendent, 2 Assistants, 2 Librarians, 5 Assistant Librarians, 2 Upper Division Clerks, 2 Typists, 1 Senior Record Attendant, 1 Record Holder and 6 Farashes.

Shri J. L. Bhatnagar, Asstt. Engineer, retired from service on 31-10-77. On the recommendations of the Union Public Service Commission, Sarvashri I. N. Verma, T. V. Harnatha Babu and Sukumar Sarkar, were appointed Assistant Directors of Archives (R&P) with effect from 29-4-77, 18-6-77 and 14-7-77 respectively and Shri S. K. Khatri, Km. Krishna Choudhury, Km. M. K. Sharma were appointed Archivists (General) the first two with effect from 11-8-77, the third from 26-11-77. Dr. Rajpal was appointed as Scientific Officer with effect from 23-6-77. Similarly, on the recommendations of the Departmental Promotion Committee of the Department of Culture, Smt. Shukla Singh and Dr. R. K. Perti were appointed as Assistant Directors of Archives (R&P) with effect from 29-4-77 and 30-8-77 respectively and Sarvashri Suraj Prakash, Duli Chand, P. R. Malik, K. S. Talwar, I. B. Roy and N. Kant were appointed as Archivists (General) with effect from 24-8-77.

The sanctioned strength of the Department during the period under report was 499. For administrative reasons 109 posts were lying unfilled on 31st December 1977.

II. Conferences, Committees and other Activities.

The Minister for Education and Social Welfare, Shri P. C. Chunder visited the Department on 10th May 1977.

With a view to bringing Archives closer to the public Dr. S. N. Prasad, Director of Archives, delivered a talk on May 5, 1977 over the All India Radio entitled—'The National Archives—A Nation's Memory'.

Shri S.A.I. Tirmizi and Shri R. C. Gupta, Deputy Directors of Archives and Shri M. L. Ahluwalia, Assistant Director of

Archives have been appointed members of the Siglography Committee, Training Committee and the Business Archives Committee respectively of the International Council on Archives.

Dr. N. H. Kulkarnee, Assistant Director of Archives and Secretary General, SWARBICA, attended the 8th annual meeting of the International Council on Archives, Committee on Archival Development held at Cagliari (Sardinia) on 3-4 October 1977. He also attended the XVII Round Table Conference on Archives which met at Forte Village Hotel, Santa Margherita di Pula near Cagliari on 5-8, October, 1977. Through these meetings, Dr. Kulkarnee was able to project the role of developing countries, particularly India's, in the development of Archives. Besides, he also attended the 38th session of the Indian History Congress held on 26-28 December 1977 at Bhubaneswar.

III. Indian Historical Records Commission and National Committee of Archivists

(a) *Indian Historical Records Commission*.—The 45th Session of the Indian Historical Records Commission was held at Mysore on 1-2, February 1977. The session commenced with the welcome address by Shri P. R. Nayak, Education Commissioner, Government of Karnataka and this was followed by the inaugural address by Shri D. V. Urs, Vice-Chancellor, University of Mysore. Prof. Nurul Hasan, Union Minister for Education & Social Welfare, in his capacity as ex-officio President of the Indian Historical Records Commission delivered the address. At the academic session, presided over by Prof. G. M. Moraes, several papers pertaining to the post-1600 period of Indian History were presented by the members and other scholars. The session was attended by historians and archivists from all over India. At the Business Meeting, a number of resolutions were adopted, among which, the following deserve special mention: (i) Creation of an Archival Cell in the Universities, (ii) Provision of special grants for the development of State Archives and (iii) Introduction of National Readers' Cards.

(b) *National Committee of Archivists*.—The 29th meeting of the National Committee of Archivists was held at Mysore on 3rd February 1977 under the Chairmanship of Dr. S. N. Prasad. The Committee adopted six resolutions. Significant among them were: (i) Supply of publications brought out by the different State Archives to all State Archivists, (ii) Organisation of 'Archives Week' (iii) Introduction of a Refresher Course of Training and (iv) Holding of bi-annual meetings of the National Committee of Archivists.

(c) *Standing Committee*.—The Standing Committee of the Commission held its 7th meeting in New Delhi on 28th November 1977 under the Chairmanship of Shri A. S. Gill, Additional Secretary, Department of Culture. The Committee reviewed the action taken on resolutions/recommendations passed at the previous sessions of the Indian Historical Records Commission and expressed its view on various resolutions sent by the members for 46th Session.

IV. Exhibition

In response to a request made by the Jawaharlal Nehru University on the occasion of the First Summer Institute for Persian Teachers organised by the University in collaboration with the Iranian Cultural Foundation, Tehran, the National Archives of India organised an exhibition (3rd May-1st June 1977) of Persian documents and manuscripts covering the period 1289-1885.

V. Hindi Section

The Hindi Section, as usual, supplied translation of official correspondence from English into Hindi and *vice-versa* as and when required. The Annual Report for 1976 was also translated into Hindi from English and sent to the press during the period under report.

VI. Library

During the year under report, the Library added to its collection 305 books, 18,500 journals and periodicals and 10,200 issues of the Gazette of India, Calcutta Gazette, Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha Debates.

In all, 1,675 individuals, including research scholars members of the staff of various Ministries and offices of the Government of India and States, consulted books, periodicals, Gazettes, etc. The Library also attended to queries made by individuals and private agencies on a variety of topics.

F. National Archives (Bhopal)

(i) *Accession*.—14 books were added to the Library.

(ii) *Checking and Arrangement*.—3,667 files of the Home Department (Jails, Revenue, Judicial, 1860-81, 1911-33) were checked and arranged.

- (iii) *Research and Reference Media*.—Subject lists of 9,555 files of the Department of Home, Commerce and Industry, Communications, Telegraph and Judicial (1860-1934) were prepared.
- (iv) *Preservation*.—Apart from usual dusting of records and books, special cleaning of 59,668 shelves, 1,13,330 bundles, 2,32,301 volumes, 12,518 files, 5,011 maps and 2,609 carton boxes was carried out. About 1,151 volumes of Daftar-i-Insha and 448 bundles of records were fumigated; 71 bundles labelled; 23,159 sheets flattened; 546 sheets & 638 files stitched; 24,346 sheets guarded; 16,562 sheets repaired with tissue paper 457 sheets laminated and 137 volumes, 18 books, and 44 maps bound during the period under report.

G. National Archives—Record Centre (Jaipur)

Set up to house non-current records of the Central Government offices in the region, the National Archives of India, Record Centre, Jaipur commenced functioning on 3rd January 1977. The sanctioned strength of the office was 23 with the Assistant Director as its head.

After completion of the work regarding checking of files with the transfer lists and duly arranging them, the work regarding preparation of subject lists for 3,839 files of the Tariff Commission transferred to the Centre from National Archives of India was taken up. Subject listing of more than 1,000 files was completed. Further, a circular letter was addressed to various Central Government Departments and Offices in the region eliciting information on their archival assets. The information thus received was tabulated.

M/s Hindustan Salt Limited, Jaipur, having indicated their intention to transfer their non-current records to the Centre, a team of officials was deputed to compile a check-list of these records before their actual transfer. About 1,000 files were listed.

The Preservation Unit was equipped in stages and during the period under review, besides attending to minor repair jobs on 4,596 sheets, the unit laminated 91 sheets and repaired 17 sheets with tissue papers, flattened 21,399 sheets, stitched 205 sheets, and guarded 11,325 sheets.

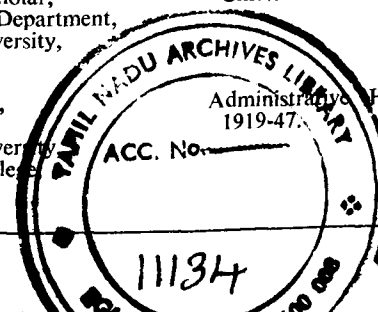
