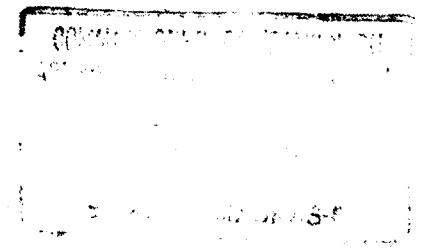

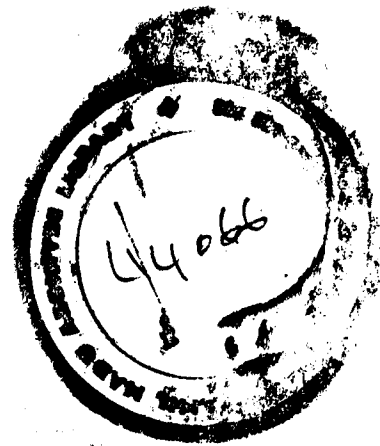

PREFACE

The proposal to compile an all-India inventory of the archival wealth of the country, termed as National Register of Records, was recommended by the Indian Historical Records Commission as early as 1947. Originally, it was proposed to include in these 'Registers' information about both Public and Private Records. Implementation of a scheme of such a magnitude meant considerable financial burden, which the Government of India was reluctant to meet, and the project, therefore, could not make any headway. The position was reviewed in 1957 and it was decided to confine the scope of the scheme to Private Records only, and the State Governments were invited to collaborate with the National Archives of India in compilation of these 'Registers'. It was thus only towards 1959-60 that we started receiving material from various states, and the first volume under the series was brought out only in September 1971. During these past six years, we have managed to bring out seven volumes (including Parts I-III for Vol. I and Parts I-II for Vol. IV).

The present volume is the eighth under the series comprising descriptive lists of the documents found in the custody of various individuals and private institutions in the states of Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Bihar, Karnataka, Kerala, Orissa, Punjab, Tamil Nadu and Uttar Pradesh, and it contains information received by us during the year 1966-67. Strictly speaking, the scheme should have covered only the records of archival value. But it so happened that in its early stages, the vast material that



flowed in from various states concerned an amorphous lot of archival and non-archival records, old and rare manuscripts and published works, historical as well as non-historical. Since all this data had been collected and was lying readily available with us, we preferred to bring it to light, on the assumption that the information contained in the lists would be useful to scholars, although verifying this information by physical identification of the documents was not possible. Accordingly, the text has been made into two parts: Main List, containing mostly records e.g. Sanads, Farnans, Deeds & Letters etc., and the Annexure, including old and rare published works and also manuscripts of non-archival value.

In compiling the present volume, we have followed almost the same pattern as in the preceding volumes of the series. While preparing descriptive lists of the documents, the original order in which the material was received from various states has been maintained, except in cases where the collection of the same individual, or those pertaining to the same area/institution, were found listed separately in the original list, and these have been put together at one place. The dates of documents, whether in Hijri, Bikram or Christian era etc. have been retained as given in the original. In general, each documents has been listed separately, but there are a few cases where the items have not been so listed; instead a self-explanatory note describing the main features of the collection has been given. For further details, readers are requested to consult the original lists available in

As in the past, our main difficulty in compiling the 'Register' arose from the fact that the information supplied by the states was in many cases inadequate, while in a number of cases the date or description given about a document appeared to be incorrect, or, as found in some cases, no details of the subject matter of the document were mentioned in the proforma sent to us. Besides, there were inaccuracies regarding some personal and place names, and a good number of items did not bear any date. It would be appreciated that in the absence of the original papers with us, it was not possible for us to verify or supplement the information. Under the circumstances, we have tried adhering close to the original and identifying personal and place names to the extent possible, putting a mark of interrogation in the text wherever some doubt was felt, or adding in foot-notes what appeared the correct version. It is hoped that inspite of such unavoidable shortcomings, the scholars will find the work useful.

The work of compilation and editing has been handled in stages by S/Shri S.S.Saxena, S.Sarkar and Suraj Prakash, Archivists, assisted by Shri Krishan Lal and Kri. Krishna Chowdhury. Shri S.N.Sharma, Asstt. Director, has painstakingly checked and revised the draft. To all of them I express my sincere thanks.

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LISTS OF DOCUMENTS

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Listed below are 976 documents which belong to the collections in the private custody of 20 different individuals in the State. These documents cover the period 1422-1950 A.D. and consist of bainamas, chaknamas, dastaks, farmans, fatwas, haqiqats, hukmnamas, istihshad-namas, nishans, parwanas, qaulnamas, sanads, siyahas, tajwiznamas and takids. Besides, there are letters, notifications, petitions, receipts, sale deeds, statements and various other kinds of papers. These collections contain material pertaining to the period of Adil Shahi, Bahmani, Qutb Shahi, Mughal Emperors and Asaf Jahi rulers. These documents throwing light on different aspects of life then prevailing in the region, mainly relate to grant of jagirs, lands, daily allowances, titles, trusteeship, mode of transactions of land and property etc. and the administration of Hyderabad Suba. The documents are mostly in Persian but some of them are in Urdu, English, Modi and Telugu. In majority of the cases the owners of the documents are agreeable to accord research facilities to the accredited scholars and some are even ready to part with their collections.

Collection of B. Ramakrishna Raju, Advocate, Chittoor.

1. Sanad. 24 August 1802. Issued by Lord Edward Clive, Governor of Madras, in favour of the Zamindar of Bommaraju Pallem (Karwaitnagar) granting permanent proprietary rights. It also contains the conditions required to be fulfilled by the Zamindar. English.
2. Letter. 24 August 1802. From Lord Edward Clive addressed to the Zamindar of Bommaraju Pallem discussing the proposal to relieve the Zamindars of the burden of maintaining the military establishments. The letter discusses in details various benefits likely to be derived under the new arrangement. English.

Collection of Dr. Ghiyasuddin Siddiqi, Charkaman, Hyderabad city.

Dr. Ghiyasuddin hails from the Nizam Royal family. With his deep interest in old documents, he preferred to acquire many documents while working in Kalyani. This collection of documents in Persian contains Adil Shahi farmans and some sanads relating to Asaf Jahi period and throw light on different aspects of grants.

3. Farman (bearing several seals). 16 Muharram 970 A.H.; 15 September 1562. Regarding grant of desai-giri, pargana Kalyani, to Mulasti.

4. Agreement (bearing the seal of Raja Chander Sen). 27 Rabi al-sani 1147 Fasli. Between Ram Chander Deshmukh and Abdur Rasul Deshmukh surrendering half of the sardeshmukhi rights by the latter to the former against payment.
5. Farnan (bearing the seal of Ali Adil Shah). Undated. Granting deshmukhi of pargana Partabpur (Partappur) to Abdur Rasul, son of Abdul Nabi.
6. Order (bearing the seal of Anjadul Mulk). 25 Jumada al-sani. Issued by Anjadul Mulk to Mir Nizam Ali Khan granting deshmukhi of pargana Partabpur to Raja Shyam Raj Bahadur.
7. Parwana. 21 Muharran 1190 Fasli. Issued under the seal of Ghazanfarud-Daulah granting Gannachari Taluk, pargana Kalyani, to Abduzzinda, Deshmukh of Kalyani and Partabpur. The taluk formerly belonged to the late Raja Chander Sen.
8. Order. 14 Rajab 1268 A.H.; 5 May 1852. Issued by Sirajul-Mulk to Muntazul-Umara Bahadur regarding income of Seri of Abdur Rasul (sic).
9. Receipt (bearing the seal of Amirud-Daulah). 12 Shawwal 1199 A.H.; 18 August 1785, issued by Amirud-Daulah(I) acknowledging receipt of the nazrana from Abduzzinda Deshmukh.
10. Receipt. 20 Zulhijja 1256 A.H.; 13 February 1841. Regarding receipt of nazrana from Abdur Rasul Deshmukh.
11. Yaddasht (bearing the seal of Raja Chandu Lal Bahadur). Undated. Issued under the seal of Raja Chandu Lal Bahadur for Rs. 1000/- received from Abdur Rasul Deshmukh for granting deshmukhi.
12. Sanad (bearing the seal of Nizamul-Mulk Asaf Jah I). 3 Zulhijja 1150 A.H.; 13 March 1738. Granting deshmukhi of pargana Kalyani to Abdur Rasul.
13. Order (bearing the seal of Raja Chandu Lal Bahadur). 7 Rabi al-awwal 1258 A.H.; 19 April 1842. Issued to Shamsuddin Khan asking him not to disturb the constituency of Abdur Rasul Deshmukh of Bore Sari, pargana Partabpur.
14. Parwana (bearing the seal of Nizam Ali Khan). 15 Ramazan 1196 A.H.; 24 August 1782. Dividing the deshmukhi of parganas Kalyani and Partabpur between Raja Chander Sen and Abduzzinda.

15. Order. 25 Zulhijja 1260 A.H.; 5 January 1845. Asking Abdur Rasul to pay Rs. 474 and annas 1½ as nazrana of the jagir of village Bore Sari, pargana Partabpur.
16. Yaddasht (bearing the seal of Raja Ram Bakhsh Bahadur). 28 Zulhijja 1260 A.H.; 8 January 1845. Regarding nazrana received.
17. Letter. 17 Rajab 1310 A.H.; 5 February 1893. From Nawab of Kalyani to Abduzzinda.

Collection of Nawab Mir Moinuddin Ali Khan, Shah Ganj, Hyderabad City.

Nawab Mir Moinuddin Ali Khan belongs to the Nizam Royal family. His grandfather was the cousin of Asaf Jah I and his grandmother was the daughter of Mir Nizam Ali Khan Asaf Jah II, and he is also related to the Paigah family from his mother's side. All these papers contained in this collection are in Persian and relate to the grant of jagir under different rulers. The seals and dates on the sanads help the scholars to determine the period of the Ministers correctly. The fact that Sher Jung was Diwan of Salabat Jung has been sometimes refuted by some scholars but the collection contains sanads issued under the seals of Salabat Jung and Sher Jung to corroborate this historical fact.

18. Sanad (bearing the seals of Nawab Asafud-Daulah Saiyid Muhammed (Khan) Zafar Jung (Salabat Jung) and Hyder Yar Khan, Sher Jung Munirud-Daulah). 17 Shaban 6 Julus 1172 A.H.; 15 April 1759. Appointing Hakimul-Mulk Abdul Latif (Khan) to the post of Faujdar of pargana Ladsankoi in Aurangabad. The sanad also carries the details of the post.
19. Sanad (bearing the seals of Asafud-Daulah Zafar Jung and Mir Abdul Hai Khan Samsaud-Daulah Samsam Jung). 29 Shawwal 8 Julus 1174 A.H.; 4 June 1761. Reinstating Muhammad Ali to the post of Muhtasib (censor). It also carries details regarding the duties of Muhtasib.
20. Memorandum. Safar 1222 A.H.; 1807 A.D. Stating that a sum of Rs. 11,100/- pertaining to Basmathnagar Taluk was deposited in the government treasury under the seal of Raja Chandu Lal. The amount is written in Raja's own handwriting.
21. Receipt. 18 Rabi al-awwal 1222 A.H.; 10 May 1807. Pertaining to an amount of Rs. 5,450/- for payment of salaries to the Jawans of Basmathnagar Taluk received in the government treasury under the seal of Raja Chandu Lal. The amount is written in Raja's own handwriting.

22. Receipt. 15 Rabi-al-sani 1222 A.H.; 1807 A.D. Pertaining to an amount of Rs.8,000/- for payment of salaries to the Jawans.
23. Receipt. 25 Rabi-al-sani 1222 A.H.; 1807 A.D. Pertaining to an amount of Rs.16,000/- for payment of salaries to the Jawans received under the seal of Raja Chandu Lal.
24. Siyaha (certified copy). 2 Jumada al-awwal I Julus 1167 A.H.; 25 February 1754. Issued under the seal of Iftikharud-Daulah granting Mansab Ek hazari and one thousand sawars to Abdur Rashid Khan.
25. Parwana (certified copy). 12 Rabi al-sani 1203 A.H.; 9 January 1789. Issued by Nizam Ali Khan and attested by Qazi Moinul Islam Khan under his seal.
26. List. 15 Zulhijja 1252 A.H.; 24 March 1837. Containing 14 names who were granted titles.
27. Documents. 1265-70 A.H.; 1848-53 A.D. Containing an account of presents received by the king during the period and the grant of Jagirs to Datagir Pasha Dilawar Jung II at the time of dispute with Qutbun Nisa Begam.
28. Memorandum. Undated. These are miscellaneous memorandum issued on receipt of presents by the king.
29. Note Books. Undated. Containing details of the jagir of Qutbun-Nisa.
30. Sanad (bearing the seal of Nawab Khurshid Jah Bahadur). 22 Shawwal 1313 A.H.; 7 April 1896. Granting Jagir of Tilut village, Zohara Taluk, Sarkar Nanded, to Zahurun Nisa Begam, daughter of Nawab Shamsul-Mulk.
31. Order. 22 Shawwal 1313 A.H.; 7 April 1896. Issued by Nawab Khurshid Jah Bahadur to his attendants.
32. Sanad. Rabi al-awwal 1286 A.H. Issued by Ahmad Yar Jung Jagirdar under his seal granting watan of Mukaddami to Ali Hussain in his Jagir.
33. Orders. 27 Zulhijja 1300 A.H. Issued under the seal of Asadullah appointing Ali Hussain as Mukaddam.
34. Receipt. 27 Zulhijja 1300 A.H. Issued by Sadasukh Jankidas acknowledging receipt of Rs.3,000/-.
35. Receipt. 9 Safar 1300 A.H. Issued by Sadasukh Jankidas acknowledging receipt of Rs.5,000/-.
36. Qaulnama. 29 Zulhijja 1300 A.H. Regarding assignment in favour of Ali Hussain.

37. Order. 5 Zulhijja 1301 A.H. Issued by Asadullah asking Ali Hussain to hand over the charge of Tipaiguda and Ramajiguda villages to Mohandas and Laxmidas as they had purchased these villages.
38. Letter. Undated. Issued by Asadullah to Laxmidas regarding the villages, Tipaiguda and Ramajiguda.
39. Mortgage Bond. 22 Ramazan 1303 A.H. Executed by Asadullah in favour of Azzam Jung.
40. Receipt. 22 Ramazan 1303 A.H. Issued acknowledging the amount remitted as mortgage money.
41. Sale Deed. 27 Shawwal 1303 A.H. Executed by Asadullah in favour of Azzam Jung regarding the sale of villages of Ramajiguda and Tipaiguda.
42. Receipt. 27 Shawwal 1303 A.H. Issued by Asadullah for the amount received on account of the sale of villages to Azzam Jung.
43. Acknowledgement. 27 Safar 1304 A.H. Regarding Asadullah standing surety for the amount that Khandas might claim.
44. Acknowledgement. 10 Rajab 1304 A.H. Asadullah agrees to pay half of the expenditure incurred for the release of villages sold to Azzam Jung.
45. Acknowledgement. Undated. Regarding various title deeds of loan.
- (*) 46. Parwana. 17 Muharram 49 Julus 1117 A.H.; 30 April 1705. Issued under the seal of Inayatullah granting four bighas of land to Shaikh Imam.
47. Chaknama. 25 Rabi al-awwal 50 Julus 1118 A.H.; 26 June 1706. Attestation by Muhammad Yusuf Khan regarding four bighas of land held by Shaikh Imam in Jiaguda.
48. Parwana. 7 Zulqada 3 Julus 1122 A.H.; 17 December 1710. Issued under the seal of Nizamul-Mulk granting the above land.

As per information contained in the proformas forwarded to us, the documents as listed under S. Nos. 46-70 belong to one Mir Mohiuddin Ali Khan, Davdi (Deorhi) Jakhir Pasha, Chauk, Hyderabad, but it appears that he and Mir Moinuddin Ali Khan of Shah Gunj, are one and the same person.

49. Parwana. 9 Jumada al-awwal 8 Julus 1139 A.H.; 22 December 1726. Issued under the seal of Nizamul-Mulk as above (This, most likely, relates to the renewal of above parwana).
50. Parwana. Undated. Copy of the above.
- 50A. Parwana. 9 Jumada al-awwal 8 Julus 1139 A.H.; 22 December 1726. Granting 12 bighas of inam land in village Opperpalli as madad-i-maash to Mst. Khanum.
51. Parwana. 19 Zulhijja 12 Julus 1143 A.H.; 14 June 1731. Issued under the seal of Khwaja Khurd for the above land.
52. Parwana. 20 Safar 28 Julus 1159 A.H.; 2 February 1746. Issued under the seal of Saiyid Qutb-i-Alam for the above land.
53. Parwana. 6 Zulqada 5 Julus 1166 A.H.; 4 September 1753. Transferring the land earlier granted to Shaikh Imam after his death to Muzaffar Hussain.
54. Parwana. 1 Rajab 3 Julus 1176 A.H.; 16 January 1763. Granting the above land as madad-i-maash to Muzaffar Hussain.
55. Parwana. 5 Rabi al-sani, 7 Julus 1180 A.H.; 10 September 1766. Issued under the seal of Hafiz Mumtaz Khan regarding the above land.
56. Sanad (copy). 17 Rajab 1181 A.H.; 9 December 1768. Regarding the land granted to Muzaffar Hussain. It is a copy attested by Mufti Hafiz Muhammad.
57. Parwana. 24 Shaban 1194 A.H.; 25 August 1780. Issued under the seal of Nizam Ali Khan regarding 12 bighas of inam land granted to Mst. Khanum.
58. Parwana. 30 Shaban 1213 A.H.; 6 February 1799. Issued under the seal of Muhammad Faizullah Khan regarding four bighas of land granted to Muzaffar Hussain.
59. Parwana. 10 Rabi al-sani 1226 A.H.; 4 May 1811. Issued under the seal of Saiyid Imamuddin Ali Khan granting four bighas of inam land to the heirs of Muzaffar Hussain.
60. Parwana. 10 Zulqada 1231 A.H.; 4 October 1816. Issued under the seal of Hifzullah Khan in favour of Abbas Ali Khan stating that Chiragh Ali Khan, the heir to Muzaffar Hussain, has bequeathed the inam land to him (Abbas Ali Khan).

61. Gift Deed. 1 Shaban 1247 A.H.; 5 January 1832. Executed by Saiyid Hussain Qadri gifting 12 bighas of land to his grandson Saiyid Shah Muhammad Qadri. The deed is attested by Mufti Muhammad Fatchullah Khan.
62. Takid. 21 Safar 1264 A.H.; 28 January 1848. Instructing the Patwaris that chauth worth Rs.33/- was exempted for the expenses of a shrine and that no such demand should ever be made. (Most probably it has reference to the land as mentioned above).
63. Receipt. 29 Rabi al-sani 1287 A.H.; 29 July 1870. Of Rs.50/-. It bears the seal of Saiyid Shah Muhammad Qadri.
64. Receipt. 11 Jumada al-awwal 1287 A.H.; 9 August 1870. Showing that Saiyid Shah Muhammad Qadri had mortgaged six bighas of land to Khwaja Bahauddin.
65. Receipt. 29 Jumada al-sani 1307 A.H.; 20 February 1890. Showing that Nawab Ezam Jung took a loan of Rs.200/- without interest from Mir Mahmud Hussaini and the latter in turn was allowed to take possession of the maktā of the Nawab.
66. Promissory Note. 29 Jumada al-sani 1302 A.H.; 15 April 1885. Bond relating to the above.
67. Letter. Undated. Issued by the office of Awwal Taluqdar, Nagarkarnool (Mahboobnagar), prohibiting intrusion of local people on the property of Opperpalli.
68. Letter. 20 Shawwal 1304 A.H.; 12 July 1887. Reply of Shiv Narayan to the above letter.
69. Receipt. 11 Safar 1318 A.H.; 10 June 1900. Given on behalf of Mir Mahmud Hussaini for Rs.100/-.
70. Bond. 11 Rabi al-awwal 1318 A.H.; 8 August 1900. Executed by Mir Mahmud Hussaini acknowledging repayment of loan.

Collection of Saiyid Junaidullah Sahib, Shah Ali Banda, Hyderabad City.

Saiyid Junaidullah is a trustee of Saiyid Abdullah Shah Sahib's shrine, situated at Shah Ali Banda. The papers under this collection are in Persian and relate to the grant of daily allowances and sale deeds etc. and throw light on the transactions for sale and purchase of lands and houses during the period. Such transactions were made before the Qazi, who used to attest the deed by affixing his seal on the document.

71-72. Bainamas. 17 Zulhijja 1140 A.H. and 2 Muharram 1141 A.H. Regarding purchase of land by Hazrat Abdullah Shah Qadri from Qazi Khalil (Khalilullah ?) under his own seal.

73. Parwana (attested copy under the seal of Mufti Masihuddin Khan). 4 Zulhijja 1191 A.H. Issued by Nawab Gufrani-Mab granting a daily allowance of 8 annas from pargana Medak.

74. Letter (copy). 5 Zulhijja 1217 A.H. From Azimud-Daulah, Amirul-Hind, Wala Jah III to Raja Govind Bakhsh granting a daily allowance of one rupee for the expenses of Dargah (Hazrat) Abdullah Shah Qadri.

75. Sanad. Zulhijja 1285 A.H. Issued under the seal of Nawab Mir Mahbub Ali Khan in favour of Saiyid Shah Hussamuddin Sajjada granting a daily allowance of one rupee as madad-i-maash from pargana Perbhani.

76. Order. 21 Shaban 1294 A.H. Issued by Nawab Mukhtarul-Mulk granting a daily allowance of one rupee as madad-i-maash to Saiyid Shah Hussamuddin Sajjada.

77. Fautnama (Certificate of Death). 17 Zulhijja 1295 A.H. Regarding Shah Amirullah Qadri attested by Mufti Masihuddin Khan under his seal.

78. Sale Deed. 11 Jumada al-awwal 1140 A.H.; 1727 A.D. Executed by Siddi Rehan in favour of Qazi Mir Khalilullah for the land sold for Rs.40/- only.

79. Sale Deed. 14 Rabi al-awwal 1154 A.H.; 1740 A.D. It is a sale deed for a piece of land.

80-81. Gift Deeds (certified copies). 1 Zulhijja 1159 A.H.; 1745 A.D. Executed by Fatima Bibi, wife of Hazrat Abdullah Shah.

82. Sale Deed (bearing the seal of Qazi Mir Azimuddin Khan). 19 Jumada al-awwal 1167 A.H.; 1753 A.D. Regarding sale of land by Mir Ibrahim, son of Mir Khalilullah.

83-84. Sale Deed (with duplicate copy). 2 Muharram 1173 A.H.; 1759 A.D. Regarding sale of land by Raziuddin Beg, son of Inayatullah Beg. It is attested by Qazi Saiyid Muazzam Khan.

85. Sale Deed. 1 Zulhijja 1203 A.H.; 1788 A.D. Regarding sale of property of Bahadurguda, Alum, Taziya and Ashir Khana (Ashur Khana) etc. by Mirza Ahmad, son of Mirza Muhammad.

86. Newsletter. 3 Zulqada 1204 A.H.; 1789 A.D. Relating to Dawdhi Ihtishamud-Daulah and other matters,

87. Mortgage Deed. 2 Remazan 1212 A.H.; 1796 A.D. Executed by Sulaiman Khan, son of Muhammad Khan Afghan, for the land situated at Mohalla Chinta Maha, Bolakutam(sic.).

88. Petition. 14 Jumada ul-sani (year not given). Of Kallu Kaniz duly attested by witnesses.

89. Sale Deed. 8 Shaban 1223 A.H.; 1807 A.D. Executed by Ruknuddin Shah, son of Amirullah, for land. The same has been duly attested by Abdullah Beg Khan under his seal.

90. Sale Deed (copy). 1 Rabi al-awwal 1227 A.H.; 1811 A.D. Regarding land located at Mohalla Chinta Maha, Balakutam. The same has been duly attested by Saiyid Fakhruddin Ahmad under his seal.

91. Sale Deed. 29 Jumada us-sani 1244 A.H.; 1827 A.D. Relating to the Haveli sold by Shaikh Imam, son of Muhammad Hussain.

92. Sale Deed. 14 Rabi al-awwal 1284 A.H.; 1866 A.D. Executed by Muhammad Salab Beg, son of Muhammad Shaif Beg for the land.

93. Receipts. Undated. Regarding various expenses incurred on Dargah of Hazrat Abdullah Shah and grants from Nawab Azam Jah Bahadur, Mukhtiarul-Mulk, Amirul-Hind, (Walaiah) IV.

94. List. Of documents pertaining to Dargah of Hazrat Abdullah Shah.

Collection of Mirza Mahmood Ali Baig, Himmatpura, Chau Mohalla, Hyderabad.

Mirza Mahmood Ali Baig is a 'mansabdar'. His forefathers were adventurers and fought battles and got high rank in the court of Asaf Jahi kings, whereas he himself also held Jagir. All these papers are in Persian and relate to the grant of Jagir and land. Sanads and orders have been issued under the seals of rulers and ministers and as such these papers are of great help to scholars to place out the exact period of these dignitaries.

95. Parwana (certified copy). 22 Rajab 50 Julus (year not given). Issued by Rustam Dil Khan for grant of land to Saheb (Shahar) Banu, grand-daughter of Mir Jumla (Prime Minister) Saiyid Muzaffar (Muhammad) of Qutb Shahi dynasty. The copy is attested by Qazi Khalilullah.

96. Parwana (certified copy). 1 Ramazan 50 Julus (year not given). Issued by Mulla Inayatullah regarding grant of land to Shahar Banu by King Abdullah Qutb Shah.

97. Mandate (certified copy). 10 Zulhijja 1080 A.H.; 1617 A.D. Issued by King Abdullah Qutb Shah granting village Khapra to Saiyid Muzaffar Shujaul-Mulk.

98. Parwana (certified copy). 1 Rabi al-sani 3 Julus (year not given). Issued under the seal of Mufti Qutb-i-Alam granting thirty bighas of land as madad-i-maash to Shaber Banu, wife of Saiyid Shah Qutbuddin Muhammadul-Hussaini, the well-known saint. It is attested by Mufti Atiqur Rasool.

99. Sanad (certified copy). 25 Zulhijja 1123 A.H.; 1710 A.D. Bearing order of Qazi Khalilullah for the above land. It is attested by Mufti Saiyid Saaduddin.

114. Parwana (bearing the seal of Nagad Ali Khan). 12 Jumada al-awwal 5 Julus (year not given). Regarding subsidy grant of 350 huns to Shaber Banu.

120. Parwana. Rajab 1093 A.H. Issued under the seal of Bahauddin and Mannan regarding grant of sole proprietary rights of a garden made by Halima Bibi, daughter of Khwaja Abdul Rahman, to her husband.

121-22. Parwanas (bearing the seal of Qazi Khalilullah). 12 Muharram 1126 A.H. and 22 Ramezan 1106 A.H. Regarding aid (grant) to Shaber Banu.

123. Istihshad. Undated. Witnesses testify to the loss of a farman issued by Abdullah Qutb Shah in connection with the inam of mauza Khapra to (?) Mir Rafiuddin Muhammad.

Collection of Ghulam Samdani, Char Minar, Hyderabad City.

Ghulam Samdani is a Sajjada and Trustee of Hafiz Shujauddin's shrine. Hafiz Shujauddin was a very religious and learned man during the periods of Nawab Sikandar Jah (1803-29) and Nawab Nasiruddaulah (1829-57). These

papers throw light on the administration of the period relating to the grant of land and daily allowances and trusteeship. A sanad relating to the trusteeship granted in 1950 showed that the Persian version was written in the text and it carried the English translation also alongwith.

133. Parwana. 17 Rabi al-sani 1176 A.H.; 1761 A.D. Issued by Nizam Ali Khan to Bala Ram, grandson of Roop Chand, for the services rendered.

Collection of Saiyid Karimullah, Hyderabad City. (The documents are in Persian)

Executed by Shaikh Muhammad Dastur Khan, son of Shaikh Haider Dastur Khan, for a plot of land located at mohalla Amarpur, pargana Khairatabad, Hyderabad. (The said land was occupied by Sultan Sahiba, daughter of Shaikh Sajan and wife of Shah Ali Hussaini, and was sold to Khwaja Hafiz Nurullah Gung Bakhsh, son of S. Amir Gung Bakhsh, for Rs.30/- only).

135. Gift Deed. 5 Rajab 1259 A.H.; 1842 A.D. Regarding a plot of land given to Gung Ali Shah by Khwaja Peeran (Piran), son of Khwaja Hafiz Nurullah Gung Bakhsh.

Collection of Saiyid Aziz Peeran Hussaini, 21-7-293, Mitti Ka Sher, Gulzar House, Hyderabad.

Saiyid Aziz Peeran Hussaini is a member of an old historical family of Mazandaran. His ancestors were highly learned personalities, and as many as four members of the family held the post of ~~min~~isters in the Qutb Shahi period. All these papers are in Persian and relate to the grant of daily allowance etc. And as they are in original they help the scholars in determining the exact period of the rulers and ~~min~~isters.

Issued under the order of Asaf Jah II regarding appointment of Maulana Saiyid Muhammad Mossavi (Saiden Sahib) as Mutawal of the mosque built by the Qutb Shahi Queen, Hayat Bakhshi Begam, inside the Dar Mohel. The said mosque was built exclusively for the use by women.

137. Sanad. 1 Jumada al-awwal 1211 A.H.; 2 November 1796. Issued by the office of Sadaratul Aliya under the seal of Siddiq Nawaz Khan for the tauliyat of the mosque mentioned in the document above.

138-39. Sanads (certified copies). 10 Rabi al-sani 1211 A.H.; 13 October 1796. Issued by Nawab Asaf Jah II in regard to the mosque mentioned at S.No.136 above. These copies bear the seal of Qazi Zulfiqar Khan and Qazi Moinul Islam Khan respectively.

Regarding grant of yaumiya (daily allowance) to Saiyid Qasimul Hussaini, son of Saiyid Azamul Hussaini. These copies bear the seals of different Qazis.

144. Order (copy). 27 Rajab 1236 A.H.; 30 April 1821. Issued by Maharaja (Raja) Chandu Lal granting inam to Saiyid Azamul Hussaini, son of 'Saiden Sahib'. The same is attested by Qazi Zulfaqr (Zulfiqar) Khan under his seal.

145. Order (copy). 1138 Fasli; 1828 A.D. Issued by Raja Gobind Bakhsh granting yaumiya of Rs.2/- for the family of 'Saiden Sahib'.

Collection of Saiyid Ahmadullah, Sajjada, Dargah Saiyid Muhammad, Chowk, Hyderabad.

Saiyid Ahmadullah belongs to a pious and old religious family of Hyderabad. His great grand-father, Saiyid Muhammad, was a famous saint and mystic in the Deccan during the time of Emperor Aurangzeb. He died in the early period of Asaf Jah I. After his death, he was succeeded by his sister's son as he had no issues. His successors were granted land and cash grant for their maintenance by the rulers and subadars of Deccan.

Some of these papers under this collection throw light on the administration of Hyderabad under the Asaf Jahi rulers. In this collection is also to be found a copy of parwana issued during the period of Mubariz Khan, Subadar of Hyderabad, which throws light on the administration of Hyderabad Suba after the fall of Golconda under the Mughals. All these documents are in Persian.

Also adds that in this document the early name of Hyderabad was mentioned as Hyder Nagar for the first time).

Collection of Hussain Alyafai, Mughalpura, Hyderabad.

Hussain Alyafai is a nephew of late Osmar Alyafai, who had keen interest in acquiring mss. books and documents. The collection, in Persian, contains Mughal documents, like farmans and parwanas, mostly pertaining to the grant of land in U.P. There is a copy of Humayun's farman attested under the seal of the Qazi which is rather unique. So far no such farman or copy has been available. The papers relating to Asaf Jahi period mostly deal with the sale deeds etc. throwing side light on these transactions. Through these documents, the early names of the localities can also be traced out e.g. the locality now called Moghalpura was known as Dastwar Khan locality and even before that this was called Khairat Khan locality. These documents throw light on the economic conditions of the day. The period-wise break up of documents under this collection is as follows: S.Nos. 166-72, Humayun; 173-96, Alamgir Aurangzeb; 197-99, Shah Alam I; 200-04 Farrukhsia; 205-15 Muhammad Shah; 216-22, Ahmad Shah; 223-30, Nawabs of Oudh; 236 onwards, relate to the period of ~~subadars~~ subadars and rulers of Deccan.

Saiyid Miran Hussaini is the Sajjada of Dargah Makhdoom Hussaini, popularly known as Jag Jahan. He is the great grandson of Hazarat Saiyid Makhdoom Jalal Baqari, the famous saint of Gujarat. The documents in the collection are in Persian and contain mainly judgements and sale deeds.

Collection of Saiyid Shah Khusro Hussaini, Himayathnagar, Hyderabad.

Saiyid Shah Khusro Hussaini belongs to the family of Saiyid Muhammad Gesu Daraz Hussaini, of Gulbarga. A famous Muslim saint Saiyid Muhammad Gesu was a disciple of Shaikh Naseeruddin Chiragh, of Delhi. He was born at Delhi on 30.7.1321. and his proper name was Sadruddin Muhammad Hussaini. He lived at Gulbarga in the reign

of Bahmani kings, Feroz Shah and Ahmad Shah. When Ahmad Shah ascended the throne, the credit of the saint became so great that from the Lord to the artificer all made it their glory to follow his instructions, and when he died in the Deccan at Gulbarga his tomb became a place of pilgrimage to all. During the reign of the Deccan Sultans, great sums of money were occasionally offered to his descendants and many villages were assigned by the kings to defray to expenses of the sacred tomb.

The documents under this collection are unique and contain farmans of Bahmani, Adil Shahi and Qutb Shahi kings, and sanads of Asaf Jahi period. Some Qutb Shahi farmans have been issued under the sign - manual of Muhammad Quli Qutb Shah and Muhammad Qutb Shah. A letter of Muhammad Adil Shah bears the hand-impression of the king and a few words on the top seem to have been written by the king himself. All Shahi farmans contain different types of seals, engraved for the kings. Mughal Farmans and Parwanas issued during the reign of Aurangzeb show that even before the fall of Bijapur, Mughal Emperor and his subordinates issued farmans in the capacity of a suzerain power. Parwanas have been issued under the seals of different officers from which one can determine their respective periods. Then, there are letters from private persons throwing light on the social and economic conditions of the time. These documents are in Persian, Modi and Telugu.

He married the daughter of Saiyids of Taramatipet and Nawab Jafar Ali Khan was born, who was later appointed to the Subadarship of Chicacole and Rajahmundry during the time of Asaf Jah I, and was also confirmed to the post in the reign of Salabat Jung. He was honoured with the appointment of private Diwan to Salabat Jung and after sometime he was appointed the Prime Minister, and titles of Moin Khan, Shaukat Jung were conferred upon him. His great grandson, Abul Hasan Khan Benazir Jang was given

charge of the Khammam Fort. During the ministry of Mir Alam, he was appointed Wakil in the Residency Court. His successors also held responsible posts during the reigns of various Nizams, as Nawab Kazim Jung also held the post of Collector and Commissioner of Settlement.

Darbhangra Raj Collection

IV. KARNATAKA

Listed below are 33 documents pertaining to 8 different collections received from Karnataka. These documents are mostly in the form of correspondence, sanad, petition, agreement, grant etc. It also contains three copper plates issued by King Basavaraja of Keladi, on the occasion of the religious ceremony of his mother queen Channammaji, to Sri Channaveera Swamiji and Smt. Gangadevi. From these plates it may be inferred that the Mutt at Banagadda (near Keladi) was built by the King Basavaraja.

Among all the Nayak Dynasty of Karnataka, Keladi and Ikkeri are of supreme historical significance for the study of history and culture of Karnataka. The chiefs or kings of Ikkeri and Keladi were distinguished for their exceptional valour, intellectual brilliance, fabulous wealth and religious fervour. They had developed intimate relations with the monarchs of the Vijayanagar Empire. For nearly 250 years from 1550 to 1763 A.D., this Hindu State was an acknowledged power in South India. The kingdom at its zenith extended from Goa to Cannanore.

It comprised the present Karwar, Shimoga and Mangalore districts. Parts of the Hassan, Chikmagalur, Chitradurga and Dharwar districts belonged to the Keladi kingdom. It included part of Kerala also.

The materials used in these documents are both palm-leaf as well as papers and the state of their preservation is satisfactory. The languages used in this collections are Kannada, Sanskrit and Marathi. The owners are agreeable to grant research facilities to the scholars.

V. KERALA

Collection of Sultan Ali (Ali), Raja of Arakkal,
Arakkal Palace, Cannanore, North Malabar.

The collection, consisting of 6 documents, is in
the form of correspondence, diaries, memoirs, minutes
and farmans. It covers the period from 1751 A.D. to
1868 A.D.

Sultan Ali Raja belongs to Mappilla Raja of
Cannanore. His Palace is situated in what is called the
old town of Cannanore, and is known as Arakkal palace. The
material used in this collection is both palm-leaf and
paper and the state of their preservation is far from
satisfactory. They are in Malayalam language.

1-6. Letters, Diaries, Memoirs, Minutes and Farmans.
926-1043 M.E.; 1751-1863 A.D. Relating to the palace
administration; relationship between the native chieftains
and the palace; correspondence between the East India
Company and the palace; ceding of the Arabian Sea Islands
to the British; slave trade, and taxation system under the
Adi (Sultan Ali) Raja etc.

Collection of Ramalingam Pillai, Government Servant,

No.68 N.G.O. Quarters, observatory compound, Trivandrum.

The Collection consists of 7 original letters,
written by the late Dr. Champakaraman Pillai (1891-1934),
a great freedom fighter of Kerala who took active part in
an anti-British propaganda. In 1915, the Indian
revolutionaries in Germany formed a provisional Government
of Free India and he was its Minister for Foreign Affairs.
He organised an exhibition of Indian Swadeshi goods in the
International Leipzig Fair at Germany.

The collection, in English, consists of correspon-
dence, mostly addressed to his family members and deals with
Indian Industrial Community towards overseas trade etc.
The documents are in English language. They are not in
a good state of preservation and are open for research.

7. Letter. 30 August 1923. From Dr. Champakaraman Pillai
to his brother regarding his plan for organising an
exhibition of Indian products at the Leipzig Fair.

8. Letter. 16 September 1924. From Dr. Pillai to his brother-in-law deploring the indifference of the Indian Industrial Community towards overseas trade etc.

11. Letter. 4 April 1928. From Dr. Pillai to his sister. Regarding family affairs. Five photographs are also enclosed with the letter.

12. Letter. 2 May 1932. From Dr. Pillai to A. Chatrabhala Pillai, Artist, Govt. Museum, Travancore, intimating change of address.

13. Letter. 21 June 1933. From Dr. Pillai to his sister regarding family affairs.

Collection of Venugopala Varma Raja, Vengant Palace, Kollengode (Kollangod), Malabar.

The Collection consisting of 4 documents has been inherited by the Raja and is located in the Palace itself. It is in the form of petitions, memorandum and letters. The documents are on palm leaves and their language is Malayalam and Tamil. They are not in good state of preservation, but are, however, open for research.

17A. Almanac. 1054 M.E. Original in Tamil.

Collection of Narayanan Potti, Thekkedathu Illom, Ummannoor, and Damodaran Potti, Kaviyoor Illom, Kaviyur, South Kerala.

The Collection consists of 7 documents. It covers the period from 1625-1700 A.D. They are in the form of mortgage deed, pledge deed, lease deed, sale deed etc. The documents are on palm leaves and their language is Malayalam (Malayazhma Script). They are not in a good state of preservation but are, however, open for research.

18 to 24. Deeds. 1625-1700 A.D. These relate to Mortgage deed in favour of the principal deity of the Kaviyoor temple; security for temple service; pledge deed, lease deed, permanent lease deed; sale deed and direct lease deed.

The collections from Orissa include about 160 documents covering the period 1713-1889 A.D., besides the annexure containing about 20 items. Among others it comprises papers of honoured Balasore Raj family of Orissa. Apart from this it contains papers of religious Institutions like Dakhina Parswa Math, Puri and Jagannath Temple, Puri. The collections, mostly, deal with personal as well as revenue matters. They are in the form of correspondence, sanads, robkars, orders and sale deeds, etc. The language in most of the cases is bilingual-Oriya and Persian, but some documents are in Bengali and English also.

Collection of Rai Mahasay family, Bhadrak.

The record is a geneology of the Rai Mahasay family of Bhadrak. Bhadrak was the headquarters of Bhadrak Sarkar, one of the three sarkars of the Mughal Orissa. Rai Mahasayas were appointed as Sadar Qanungos for collection of revenue in each Sarkar, as such Bhadrak Rai family is one of the oldest Zamindar families of Orissa. The record contains a list of family members who were Rai Mahasayas in different periods.

Collection of Nandadulal Dey, of Balasore Raj family, Barabati, Balasore.

The collection consists of 14 documents. It covers the period from 1867 A.D. to 1889 A.D. They are in the form of correspondence and sanads, relating to Babu Shyamananda Dey and his son Baikunthanath Dey, of the Balasore Raj family. It is one of the oldest and most respected zamindar families of Balasore. Shyamananda Dey contributed a lot during Orissa famine of 1873 A.D. and was awarded the title of 'Rai Bahadur' and later on 'Raja', and 'Raja Bahadur' by the Government of India for his valuable services. His son, Baikunthanath Dey, Zamindar and Honorary Magistrate of Balasore, was the most active member of all local committees and was very liberal in supporting every object of public improvement. He proved to be an excellent landlord and particularly distinguished himself for good and successful work as an Honorary Magistrate, and the title of 'Rai Bahadur' and

'Raja Bahadur' was conferred on him. The collection also contains correspondence of some of the Viceroys and Governors General of this period. The documents are in English language but the state of their preservations is not satisfactory. They are open for research purpose.

The study of these records reveals the following facts relating to the Math:

(i) names of the Mahants of the Math during the period, 1797-1880 A.D.;

(ii) transactions made during the period for enhancement of the landed property of the Math and that these transactions were subject to confirmation by the Raja of Puri (It appears that all transactions in Puri and neighbourhood and those relating to Lord Jagannath were duly recorded in the appropriate registers of the office of Raja of Puri and his orders were necessary for finalising them, and that the Math used to get some annual allowance from the Raja of Puri for some establishment charges e.g. thatching etc.) The documents are in Bengali, English Oriya and Persian, languages. The state of their preservation is not satisfactory. The documents are open for research purpose.

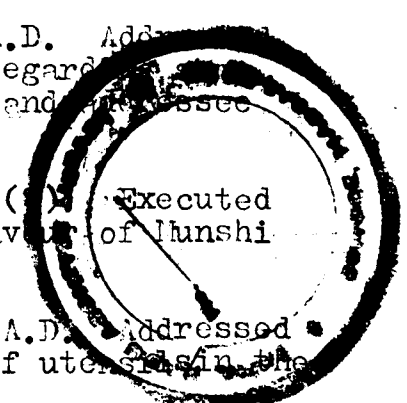

VII. PUNJAB

This collection consists of 242 documents comprising mostly farrans, murasalas, parwanas, sanads, robkars, letters, memoranda and sale deeds. These documents cover the period from 1586 A.D. to 1945 A.D. and throw light on the social, economic and political conditions of the region; the activities of the chiefs of different estates and the relations of Maharaja Ranjit Singh with native States and the British Indian Government.

The documents are in Persian, Urdu, English and Hindi.

Collection of Shiv Chand, son of Kanshi Ram, Lambardar, village Takarla, Tahsil Una, District Hoshiarpur.

The collection deals with the ancestors of Pt. Shiv Chand, resident of village Takarla, Tahsil Una, who played a prominent role during the reign of Mughal Emperors. Emperor Aurangzeb had conferred the title of 'Chaudhri' on Pt. Lachhmi Dhar, one of the ancestors of Pt. Shiv Chand. The members of this family were also in the good books of Maharaja Ranjit Singh and during the British regime, the prominent members of this family - Attra and Phina Ram - were loyal to the British Government and consequently titles and honours were conferred on them.

1. Robkar (bearing the seal of Aurangzeb). Undated. Issued by Mehar Khan Jafar, the Mughal Officer, intimating the Mutasaddian of Kotlehar about the conferment of title of 'Chaudhari' and grant of Chaudhariat to Lachhmi Dhar in recognition of his hereditary rights. The order further directs the Chaudhari to strive for the improvement of agriculture. Persian.

2. Murasala. 1674 A.D. From Aurangzeb to Mlil, pargana Kotlehar, ordering him to maintain law and order and also to reinstate Chaudhari Lachhmi Dhar who was forced by the dacoits to leave the territory. Persian.

3. Murasala. 1675 A.D. From Aurangzeb to Chaudhri Lachhmi Dhar commending the meritorious services rendered by him to the Delhi Darbar (Mughal Darbar). Persian.

The collection deals with the history of Kathgarh Estate in Hoshiarpur District. S. Jhanda Singh was the founder of Kathgarh Royal family. He died in 1797. His son and successor, S. Tara Singh acknowledged the paramountcy of the British Government and titles and honours were conferred by the British Government on the Chiefs of Kathgarh for their loyalty. S. Khushal Singh, the successor of S. Tara Singh, rendered valuable assistance to Maharaja Ranjit Singh in many expeditions.

29. Memorandum. Undated. Submitted by Rajinder Singh of Kathgarh Estate stating that S. Jhanda Singh took possession of the territory (Kathgarh) in 1757 A.D. and that the Kathgarh Chief also helped Maharaja Ranjit Singh in the battles of Kashmir and Peshawar. Further it states that the Kathgarh Chiefs rendered assistance to the British Government in 1857 A.D. Urdu.

31. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that Maharaja Ranjit Singh entrusted the command of the army to S. Tara Singh who conquered Kashmir(?). In 1827 A.D. the Maharaja sent S. Tara Singh on Peshawar expedition and on success bestowed on him an elephant, a Khilat and the territory of Kathgarh. Urdu.

32. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that Attar Singh introduced S. Khushal Singh of Kathgarh to Col. Long in 1845 A.D. and friendship was established between them. A Khilat, a necklace and a jagir of 22 villages was granted to Khushal Singh in recognition of his meritorious services. Urdu.

33. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that Maharaja Ranjit Singh reoccupied the estate of Kathgarh after the death of its chief S. Tara Singh, and asked Khushal Singh to pay Rs. 22,000/- as nazrana and supply 300 horsemen to the Lahore Darbar after which the territory would be restored to him. (Urdu ?).

34. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that Khushal Singh paid Rs. 22,000/- as nazrana as also 300 horsemen to Maharaja Ranjit Singh and got his territory restored. After the death of Maharaja Ranjit Singh this nazrana and supply of horsemen was discontinued. Urdu.

35. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that the title of 'Sardar-i-Sardaran' was conferred upon S. Rajinder Singh in 1847 A.D. (?) in accordance with the orders of the Governor General. Urdu.

36. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that every Jagirdar should inform the Tahsildar about the birth of a son and the name of that son should be included in the genealogical tables of that chief. It further states that this information should also be sent to the Deputy Commissioner (Hoshiarpur ?). Urdu.

37. Murasala. 28 August 1856. From D. F. McLeod, Finance Commissioner, to the Chief of Kathgarh (Rajinder Singh) intimating that the maintenance allowance sanctioned by the Government to the descendants of Khushal Singh was being sent. Urdu.

38. Murasala. 10 December 1856. From the Commissioner of Jullundur Division (Maj. Edward Lake) to Rajinder Singh, Chief of Kathgarh, informing him that the Government was lifting its control from the jagir of Rs. 3,000/- and that the control would now be exercised by the male issue after the demise of the present incumbent. Urdu.

39. Memorandum. 13 April 1857. Stating that the British Government awarded Rs. 782/- to the Chief of Kathgarh, being the income from the jagir comprising villages Latgarh, Chahil Kalan and Shampur in the Una Tehsil. Urdu.

40. Murasala. 7 January 1860. From the Commissioner of Jullundur Division to S. Rajinder Singh enjoining upon him to be present at Lahore Darbar to pay homage to the Governor General. Urdu.

41. Murasala. 8 December 1863. From Maj. R. Young, Deputy Commissioner, Hoshiarpur, to the Chief of Kathgarh asking him to attend the Darbar at Lahore being held in commemoration of the visit of the Governor General. He was further ordered to offer nazrana to the Governor General at Lahore Darbar in lieu of which Khilat would be bestowed upon him. Urdu.

42. Murasala. 2 January 1864. From Capt. R. F. Lake (sic), Deputy Commissioner, Hoshiarpur, to S. Rajinder Singh ordering him to attend the meeting to be held at Lahore Museum under the Chairmanship of the Governor General. Urdu.

43. Murasala. 4 January 1864. From Maj. R. Young, Deputy Commissioner, Hoshiarpur, to Sodhi Sahib of Anandpur asking him to attend the meeting to be held at Lahore Museum. Urdu.

44. Murasala. 26 September 1864. From the Officiating Deputy Commissioner, (Col. W. R. Elliot), Hoshiarpur, to Rajinder Singh intimating him that all the chiefs would offer nazrana to the Governor General in lieu of which khilats would be awarded to them according to their status. Urdu.

45. Murasala. 29 September 1864. From Officiating Deputy Commissioner, Hoshiarpur, (Col. W. R. Elliot), to S. Rajinder Singh asking him to offer nazrana of at least Rs. 400/- to the Governor (Governor General) as previously done by him at the Darbar in 1860 A.D. Urdu.

46. Murasala. 30 September 1864. From Col. Edward Lake Commissioner and Superintendent of Jullundur Doab (Division) to Rajinder Singh congratulating him on the award of the title of 'Sardar Bahadur Sarfaraz' by the British Government. Urdu.

47. Murasala. 20 December 1864. From Officiating Deputy Commissioner, Hoshiarpur (Col. W. R. Elliot), to Rajinder Singh asking him to attend the Darbar at the time of the visit of the Governor General. Urdu.

48. Murasala. 18 February 1865. From Deputy Commissioner, Hoshiarpur (Col. W. R. Elliot), to Rajinder Singh intimating him that all the chiefs of the district were required to assemble at Jullundur to receive instructions of the Government. Urdu.

49. Murasala. 7 March 1869. From Deputy Commissioner, Hoshiarpur (H. E. Perkins), to Rajinder Singh asking him to attend the Darbar to be held at Lahore in honour of Sher Ali, Amir of Kabul (Afghanistan). Urdu.

50. Murasala. March 1875. From the Secretary to the Punjab Government to Rajindar Singh asking him to attend the Delhi Darbar on 23 March 1875. Urdu.
51. Murasala. 14 October 1876. From Deputy Commissioner, Hoshiarpur (W.Coldstream), to Rajindar Singh informing him that the Governor General would arrive at Palampur to convalesce. He was also ordered to offer submission so as to be honoured with titles in return. Urdu.
52. Murasala. 29 December 1876. From Deputy Commissioner, Hoshiarpur (W.Coldstream), to S.Rajindar Singh asking him to attend the Darbar at Jullundur City, being held in honour of Queen Victoria assuming the title of 'Empress of India'. Urdu.
53. Murasala. 3 January 1876. From Deputy Commissioner, Hoshiarpur (Capt. G.Gordon Young), to Rajindar Singh asking him to attend the Darbar at Lahore (on 16 Jan. 1876) being held in honour of Prince of Wales. He was further asked to bring along some adorned horses to add to the pomp and show of the occasion. Urdu.
54. Murasala. 28 January 1876. From Deputy Commissioner, Hoshiarpur (Capt. G.Gordon Young), to S.Jogindar (Rajindar ?) Singh asking him to attend the cattle fair on 2 February 1876 and thus express loyalty to the British Government. Urdu.
55. Murasala. 3 November 1880. From Deputy Commissioner, Hoshiarpur, (F.D.O.Bullock), to S.Rajindar Singh asking him to come to Lahore to welcome the Governor General. Urdu.
56. Murasala. 20 July 1882. From the Deputy Commissioner, Hoshiarpur (C.A.Roe), to Rajindar Singh informing him that as he did not receive any share of the jagir in village Mander (tahsil Una), the case with recommendation for the release of the said jagir was being referred to the Settlement Commissioner for decision. Urdu.
57. Memorandum. 13 March 1885. From Col.J.B.Lake, Commissioner of Jullundur Doab (Division), to S.Rajindar Singh asking him to attend the Darbar at Rawalpindi to be held in honour of the Amir of Kabul (Abdur Rahman Khan) on 28 March 1885. Urdu.
58. Memorandum. 6 February 1885. Stating that the territorial jurisdiction of Kathgarh consisted of the villages of Jassowal, Bassi Kalan, Sultan Wind, Barkhan, Tanwl and Asadpur in District Amritsar. Urdu.
59. Sanad. 18 August 1886 (?). From Secretary to the Government of India to S.Narindar Singh (S.Rajindar Singh) granting a jagir of Rs.3000/-. Urdu.

60. Murasala. 11 December 1890. From Commissioner of Jullundur Division to the Chief of Kathgarh (S.Rajindar Singh) informing him that in accordance with the treaty of 1809 A.D., the male issue would only succeed to the jagir after the demise of the incumbent and no female would possess the right to succeed. Urdu.

61. Application. 29 December 1895. From S.Rajindar Singh (S.Narindar Singh) Chief of Kathgarh, to Deputy Commissioner, Hoshiarpur, seeking advice regarding the amount of nazrana to be offered to the Prince of Wales at the time of the Darbar. Urdu.

Collection of Rao Uttam Singh, Honorary Adviser,

Punjab State Museum, Krishna Gali, Sangrur.

The documents covering the period 1536-1847 A.D., under the collection consist of farmans, sanads and deeds. The farmans and sanads were granted by the Moghal Emperors and the British Indian Government to the Qanungo family of Sonapat from time to time in lieu of the meritorious services rendered by them. The deeds were executed between the members of Qanungo family and other persons of status in the area. The documents are in Persian.

62. Farman. 1586 A.D. Issued by Emperor Akbar, through the Amil-i-Sarkar, Delhi, in favour of Qanungo Tudor, son of Dev Saran Brahman, of pargana Sonapat, ordering him to collect revenue from the people of his territory and in lieu of which he would be paid 30,200 Dirhams equal to Rs.30/- p.m. (sic) as pay.

63. Sanad. 1649 A.D. Issued by Emperor Shah Jahan in favour of Chanderpur Dass, Chander Bhan and Shiv Ram, members of Qanungo family of pargana Sonapat, conferring the title of 'Qanungo' for their meritorious services.

64. Deed. 1669 A.D. Executed by Nathu, son of Sukhu Jat, of Sonapat, for the sale of 11 bighas and 1 biswa of well-irrigated land for Rs.175/- to Kishan Sahai, Kapur Singh and Ram Singh of Qanungo family, pargana Sonapat.

(*) Rajindar Singh died in 1891 A.D. and it was S.Narindar Singh who was the ruling Chief during this period vide Massy Griffin's 'Chiefs and Families of Note in the Punjab', Vol. I (1940 edition), p.154.

65. Robkar. 1700 A.D. From Ghias-ud-din Qazi to Saadat Akram and Khraititi, zamindars of the Saiyid family, granting them the village of Ghiaspur in pargana Sonapat as jagir, superseding the rights of Faizullah Khan.
66. Deed. 1707 A.D. Executed by Nathu, son of Sukhu Jat, of Sonapat, in favour of Badlee, resident of Sonapat, regarding sale of 9 bighas, 2 biswas and 8 biswansi of land.
67. Deed. 1707 A.D. Executed by Tarbank Rao, son of Bhagat Rao Brahman, in favour of Shiv Ram, son of Ram Singh, zamindar, regarding sale of a garden for Rs.180/-.
68. Deed. 1717 A.D. Executed by Outb-ul-Mulk (Saiyid Abdullah Khan) in favour of Ata-ullah, Qamungo, pargana Sonapat, regarding sale of 9 bighas and 2 biswas of land for setting up a garden.
69. Sanad. 1718 A.D. Issued by Delhi Durbar (Mughal Darbar) in favour of Hira Das Bairagi, granting 10 bighas of land for his maintenance.
70. Deed. 1720 A.D. Executed by Teja, son of Diba, in favour of Kewal Ram, son of Devi Dass, regarding sale of a plot of land.
71. Sanad. 1720 A.D. Executed by Qamaruddin Khan, Wazir of Emperor Muhammad Shah, in favour of Talok Chand, of Sonapat, granting a tract of land including one garden measuring 2 bighas.
72. Deed. 1731 A.D. Executed by Teja, son of Diba, of Sonapat, in favour of Kewal Ram, son of Devi Dass, regarding sale of a garden and a tract of land for Rs.157/-.
73. Deed. 1735 A.D. Executed by Talok Chand Brahman, of Sonapat, in favour of Hushang Singh, son of Sahib Singh, regarding sale of 50 bighas of land.
74. Deed. 1735 A.D. Regarding sale of a plot of land by Saiyid Ghulam Nasir, son of Saiyid Kamal, to Saiyid Husain, son of Aziz Ullah, of Sonapat.
75. Deed. 1735 A.D. Regarding sale of 40 bighas of land by Hari Singh, son of Nibhu, to Ghasi Ram, son of Ram Singh, of Sonapat.
76. Sanad. 28 April 1748. Issued by Safdar Jang in favour of Fazi-ul-Zaman, son of Rafi-ul-Zaman, granting a jagir worth 10,600 Dirhams per annum.
77. Robkar. 1746 A.D. From Talok Chand, Jit Singh, Qamungo, pargana Sonapat, rejecting the hereditary rights of Kishan Chand Brahman on his property.

78. Farman. 1751 A.D. Issued by Amalan-i-Ilaka, Sonapat, granting 10 bighas of land to Hira Dass Bairagi towards his maintenance.

79. Application. 1756* A.D. Seeking division of their ancestral property submitted by Lal Chand and Khraititi, Brahmans, sons of Bhagwat in the court of Qazi of Emperor Shah Alam.

80. Deed. 1761 A.D. Executed by Fateh Shah regarding sale of land to Talok Chand, black-smith of Sonapat.

81. Letter. 2 October 1847. From the Commissioner, Delhi Division, addressed to the Collector of Sonapat, granting him 1234 acres of land in recognition of his meritorious services.

Collection of Rao Savitra Chand, Village Bangarh,

Tahsil Una, District Hoshiarpur.

The collection, in English, deals with the history of one of the most prominent families of Bhabaur Estate. Bhabaur and Bangarh (District Hoshiarpur) were ruled by the Ladu Rajputs. Rai Rattan Chand attained prominence because of his being an owner of a big estate comprising Bhabaur and Bangarh. In appreciation of his meritorious services Rai Savitra Chand, the present owner, was granted sanads by the British Government.

82. Sanad. 31 July 1941. Issued by the Commissioner of Jullundur Division in favour of Rao (Rai ?) Savitra Chand appreciating his services in connection with recruitment to the Indian Army.

83. Sanad. 15 August 1942. Issued by the Superintendent of Police, Hoshiarpur, in favour of Rao Savitra Chand appreciating his services in assisting the Police authorities in patrolling, picketing and vigilance.

84. Sanad. January 1943. Issued by the Punjab Government in favour of Rao Savitra Chand commending his donation of Rs.300/- to the war fund.

85. Sanad. 5 January 1945. Issued by the Superintendent of Police, Hoshiarpur, in favour of Rao Savitra Chand in recognition of the assistance rendered to the police authorities in the prevention and detection of crime during 1944 A.D. He was also awarded Rs.20/-.

Jind Bari, Tahsil Una, District Hoshiarpur.

86. Memorandum. 5 January 1865. Stating that Raja Bir Chand, of Bilaspur, got erected a fort at Sohan Majri and renamed the village as Haripur. The village was further renamed as Jind Bari in commemoration of the fact of infusing new life in a dead cow by one of the ancestors of Hans Raj. Persian.

Collection of Subedar Narain Singh, Royal Granthi, Rupar.

The documents under the collection reveal that the ancestors of Subedar Narain Singh, S. Nanak Singh and S. Ganda Singh served the royal family of Rupar faithfully and were held in great esteem by the Raja. These documents, while narrating the history of Rupar State, also testify that Raja Bhup Singh (of Rupar) who rebelled against the British Government was deported to Saharanpur, where he actually died. He was a great friend of Maharaja Ranjit Singh. One of the documents under the collection also records the annexation of Punjab and Maharaja Dalip Singh's exile to England, while yet another narrates the arrival of Guru Tegh Bahadur at Handayaya and the erection of the tomb of Bhai Gurditta at Kiratpur. These documents are in Urdu.

87. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that the ancestors of Subedar Narain Singh - Mashain Singh and Fatch Singh - remained loyal to Raja Bhup Singh, of Rupar, when the latter was deported by the British to Saharanpur. The British took exception to their loyalty to the Raja and confiscated their property.

88. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that Ganda Singh, the famous poet and ancestor of Narain Singh, participated in the freedom movement, Bhai Mashain Singh, the father of Ganda Singh, served as Raj Granthi of Raja Bhup Singh of Rupar.

89. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that Ganda Singh fell from the bridge of the River Ravi and succumbed to his injuries on 2 April 1959 (?).

90. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that the foundation of the Congress was laid in Bombay in 1875. In 1876, Ganda Singh demanded that people should be allowed to keep weapons. Also at a meeting in Chhachhauri (Chhachhauri) in Ambala District it was decided that Indians should refuse to serve the British Government. At another meeting at Muzaffargarh in 1899, need for unity between the Hindus and Muslims was stressed.

(*) In 1875 there was no such organisation known as Congress. It may be the 'Indian Association' which was founded in Calcutta in July 1876, vide 'A Dictionary of India'.

91. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that Bhai Bag Singh, son of Nanak Singh, was a Thanedar and commandant of 50 horsemen and 50 foot soldiers in Patiala State and a village was bestowed on him by the Maharaja of Patiala (Sahib Singh) as a jagir in 1784 A.D.

92. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that Hari Singh, the son of Bhai Singh of Rupar State (sic), who was resident of village Dalla on the bank of River Ravi settled down at Handayaya along with Nanak Singh and a group of Sikhs.

93. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that Guru Har Govind, the sixth guru of the Sikhs, assisted by members of S. Nanak Singh's family, used to grind flour for a free kitchen at Handayaya. It further states that S. Hari Singh went to Dam Dama Sahib where he joined a band of Sikhs and equipped himself with bow and arrow.

94. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that in 1753 Hari Singh stayed with a friend at Suratpur and proceeded to Anandpur (Sahib ?) to celebrate the Hola festival there.

95. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that Hari Singh's army occupied Garhshankar and Mahalpur, attacked Phagwara and after crossing the River Sutlej, took possession of Rupar, Kharar and other neighbouring villages.

96. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that after being victorious in the battle of Chandausi, Hari Singh's army looted bags of gold coins and good horses.

97. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that Hari Singh drove away the Nawab of Rupar and established a new state there. He also fought against Patiala State.

98. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that the treaty between Maharaja Ranjit Singh and the British Government at Rupar in 1831 was arranged by Bhup Singh, to whom the Maharaja was very kind.

99. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that failure on the part of Raja Bhup Singh to attend the Darbar in 1849 A.D. led to his exile to Saharanpur. He was granted a pension of Rs. 50,000/-. One of his associates was hanged. The Raja died in exile on 27 June 1890.

100. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that the State of Rupar was divided between the sons of Bhup Singh - Dev Singh and Charat Singh in 1792 A.D. After the execution of Charat Singh, his minor son ascended the throne.

101. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that after the death of Maharaja Ranjit Singh, the British Government took possession of the Punjab. His (Maharaja's) son, Dalip Singh, was exiled to England.

102. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that Guru Tegh Bahadu visited Handayaya and delivered sermons. It further adds that the tomb of Baba Gurdita was built near Kiratpur in six years (1840-46).

Collection of Sheo Pershad Mathur, Landlord, Sohna,
District Gurgaon.

The documents under the collection narrate the brief history of Sohna (Gurgaon District). The Sanads were granted by the British Government to Rai Sheo Pershad in recognition of his meritorious services. The Qanungo family remained loyal to the British Government during the Mutiny of 1857 also.

103. Robkar. 26 December 1829.* From John Lawrence, Deputy Commissioner, Peshawar, to Lala Hardayal Singh, intimating him of his appointment as Head Munshi to the Collector dealing with the criminal cases in District Peshawar. Urdu. (*)

104. Letter. 30 November 1852. From John Nicholson, Deputy Commissioner, Dera Ismail Khan, to L. Hardayal Singh intimating him of his appointment as Naib-Sarishtedar. Urdu. (+)

105. Letter. 13 June 1855. From Deputy Commissioner, Dera Ghazi Khan, to L. Hardayal Singh, Sarishtedar, acknowledging receipt of his brother's application duly recommended by John Nicholson for the post of 'Wasil-baqi-navis'. Urdu.

106. Sanad. 2 January 1857. Issued by the Deputy Inspector, Eastern Range, in favour of Sheo Pershad and Brij Narain appreciating their meritorious services during the Mutiny. English.

107. Letter. 28 October 1857. From Collector, District Jhajjar, to Munshi Jiwan Lal intimating increase in his pay to Rs.100/- for protecting the life of William Ford during the Mutiny. Urdu.

108. Letter. 14 February 1858. From R.C. Lawrence, Political Agent, Jhajjar, to William Ford, Deputy Commissioner, Gurgaon, informing him that Munshi Jiwan Lal rendered meritorious services in the secret work during the Mutiny. English.

109. Sanad. 13 March 1858. Issued by the Collector, District Jhajjar, in favour of Munshi Jiwan Lal, appreciating services during the Mutiny. Urdu.

110. Murasala. 14 March 1858. From Robert Lawrence to Munshi Harjiwan Lal (Jiwan Lal) intimating him that doshala and carpets as also a certificate of loyalty to the British Government were being sent to him. Urdu.

111. Letter. 25 March 1858. From the Commissioner, Delhi, to Munshi Jiwan Lal informing him that he was awarded the best prize for meritorious services to the British Government. Urdu.

112. Sanad. 27 February 1871. Issued by H. Grey, Deputy Commissioner, Gurgaon, in favour of Munshi Harjiwan Lal (Jiwan Lal) appreciating services during the Mutiny. English.

113. Sanad. 21 February 1876. Issued by the Deputy Commissioner, Gurgaon, in favour of L. Hardayal Singh, Tahsildar and landlord, appreciating services rendered during the Mutiny. English.

114. Letter. 22 May 1877. A.D. From Deputy Commissioner, Gurgaon, to Munshi Harjiwan Lal (Jiwan Lal) appreciating services rendered during the Mutiny. English.

115. Sanad. 26 July 1895. Issued by the Deputy Superintendent of Police, Gurgaon, in favour of Sheo Pershad, son of Harjiwan Lal (Jiwan Lal) appreciating assistance in the investigation of an important judicial case. English.

116. Sanad. 25 August 1898. Issued by the Deputy Superintendent of Police in favour of Sheo Pershad appreciating assistance in a crown case. English.

117. Sanad. 11 March 1903. Issued by the Superintendent of Police, Gurgaon, in favour of Sheo Pershad, appreciating services in the investigation of a criminal case in the police station of Sohna. English.

118. Sanad. 20 September 1920. Issued by J.P. Thompson, Chief Secretary, Punjab, in favour of Sheo Pershad appreciating services rendered during the Mutiny. English.

119. Memorandum. Undated. Regarding grant of property in Sohna to Terlok Chand, Lachmi Ram and Khushal Singh by Shah Jahan. It also mentions about a grant of land for a garden in Sohna to Tudor Mal by Aurangzeb and Farrukhsiyar. Urdu.

120. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that Lord Gerard Lake, Commander-in-Chief attacked Bharatpur and occupied the fort of Dig, which was restored to the Raja after the treaty. Urdu.

121. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that the pargana of Rewari was bestowed upon Nawab Faizullah Beg by Lord Gerard Lake. Urdu.

122. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that Thakur Har Raj, an official of Firoz Shah Tughlak founded Sohna in 1354 A.D. The office of Qanungo was held by the members of this family upto 1825 A.D. and the income of each member of the family amounted to Rs.20 per mensem in September 1825 A.D. Urdu.

Collection of Rai Jagjit Singh Bhandari, Bhandari Street, Batala, District Gurdaspur. (*)

The documents under the collection reveal that Rai Jagjit Singh's ancestors, Rai Anand Singh Bhandari and his son, Rai Gobind Jas served as Maharaja Ranjit Singh's vakils to the British Government. They served the Maharaja commendably and in turn, they were duly rewarded, both by the Maharaja and the British Government.

123. Memorandum. 11 December 1814. Narrating the presentation of gifts by (Rai) Anand Singh Bhandari, vakil of Maharaja Ranjit Singh, to the Governor General, Marquess of Hastings, and exchange of mutual goodwill and confidence between them. English.

124. Sanad. October 1818. Issued by Maharaja Ranjit Singh in favour of Rai Anand Singh Bhandari conferring the title of Rai (+) in perpetuity, and also 7 robes of honour and 3 jewels. Persian.

125. Letter. 30 March 1818. From Rai Anand Singh Bhandari to Lord Hastings requesting for the grant of a sanad of approbation for future welfare of his family and a Rahdari pass for journey back to Lahore. Persian.

126. Sanad. 30 March 1818. Issued by Lord Hastings in favour of Rai Anand Singh Bhandari bestowing upon him high robes of honour and a 'Rahdari Parwana' in appreciation of meritorious services and deep friendship. The sanad was granted on the recommendation of Sir David Ochterlony, Resident at Delhi. Persian.

127. Sanad. 20 March 1821. Issued by Sir David Ochterlony in favour of Rai Anand Singh Bhandari commending sincerity towards the Maharaja (Ranjit Singh) and good behaviour towards the English. Persian.

128. Sanad. 9 November 1825. Issued by Sir Charles Metcalfe in favour of Rai Anand Singh Bhandari appreciating the role played by him in strengthening friendly relations between the Lahore Darbar and the British Government. Persian.

129. Murasala. 30 January 1827. From Capt. C.M. Wade, Political Agent, Ludhiana, to Rai Gobind Jas informing him (the latter) about his proposed visit to Shahjahanabad (Delhi) from Karnal and requesting an interview with the Governor General (Lord Amherst) for delivering the message of Maharaja Ranjit Singh. Persian.

130. Murasala. 4 October 1834. From Sir Frederick Grey to the Commissioner of Patna informing him that S.Gujar Singh Majithia and Rai Gobind Jas, two officials of Maharaja Ranjit Singh, along with Captain Chester were on their way to Calcutta to meet the Governor General (Lord William Bentinck). English.

131. Murasala. 1 January 1837. From Lord Auckland, Governor General of India, to Maharaja Dalip Singh, of Lahore, appreciating meritorious services of his two vakils, Attar Singh and Rai Kishan Chand. Persian.

132. Parwana. 22 June 1840. From Lord Auckland to Rai Gobind Jas granting a certificate in appreciation of his meritorious services. Persian.

133. Memorandum. 1890 A.D. Stating that Rai Anand Singh Bhandari and his sons Rai Gobind Jas and Rai Kishan Chand served as agents of the Lahore Durbar at Delhi, Ludhiana and Ambala respectively. Anand Singh, who accompanied Sir Charles Metcalfe on his successful expedition against Bharatpur, was granted the title of 'Rai' by the Maharaja Ranjit Singh on his return. After his death in 1827 A.D. his jagir was divided among his four sons. Persian.

Collection of Rai Bahadur Hari Chand, Chief of Bhallan, Tahsil Una, District Hoshiarpur.

These documents, besides revealing the information that the ancestors of Rai Hari Chand served the British Government faithfully and were duly awarded in lieu thereof trace the descent of Ladu Rajputs and also give us accounts of various Rajput Royal families of the Hill States.

134. Sanad. 1821 A.D. Issued by Rani Ghamanu Devi, widow of Rai Sukh Chand, Chief of Bhallan, in favour of Nasia Ram, a resident of Bhallan granting him village Sodon in pargana Dun, tahsil Una, District Hoshiarpur, in commendation of meritorious services. Persian.
135. Parwana. Undated. From John Ruskin, Superintendent of the Kohistan States (Simla Hill States) to Rai Nihal Chand Chief of Bhallan, intimating him that the Chiefs of Goler, Bilaspur and Bhallan had come under the British protection. Hindi.
136. Notification. 23 February 1846. Issued by the Superintendent of the Protected States to all the Chiefs of Jullundur Doab and Kohistan, intimating that the safety of their subjects in times of emergency would be the responsibility of the British Government. Persian.
137. Letter. 23 February 1846. From John Ruskin, Superintendent of Kohistan States, to Rai Nihal Chand, asking him to recall his soldiers and employees from Lahore Darbar and unite his army with that of the Raja of Bilaspur. He was promised due compensation for this act of collusion. Persian.
138. Murasala. 16 February 1846. From John Ruskin, Superintendent, (Simla) Hill States, to Rai Nihal Chand appreciating his meritorious services during the war in collusion with the army of Raja of Bilaspur. Hindi.
139. Murasala. 1846 A.D. From the Superintendent of the Protected States to Rai Nihal Chand enquiring of his health and the state of his territory. Persian.
140. Murasala. 17 June 1847 A.D. From the Commissioner, Jullundur Doab (Sir John Lawrence), to Rai Nihal Chand granting him village of Raisar on the condition that 1/4th of the income would be deposited in the Treasury. Further states that Tek Chand would continue to hold the right of biswadari. Persian.
141. Parwana. 1848 A.D. From G.C. Barnes, Deputy Commissioner, Hoshiarpur, to Rai Nihal Chand, Chief of Bhalla asking him to contact the Tahsildar of the ilaqa for the reward for his meritorious services during the disturbances at Jaswan and Dun in 1848 A.D. Urdu.
142. Parwana. 13 February 1848. * From Maj. S.A. Abbott, Deputy Commissioner, Hoshiarpur, to Nihal Chand, of Bhallan, appreciating services during the disturbances at Jaswan and Dun in 1848 A.D. Urdu.

143. Sanad. 13 February 1849. Issued by John Ruskin in favour of Rai Nihal Chand commending services of Rai Talim Chand, of Bhallan, who was fatally wounded in the disturbances at Nagran (hilly area) in 1848 A.D. Urdu.
144. Sanad. 21 April 1854. Issued by the Deputy Commissioner, Hoshiarpur (Maj. S.A. Abbott), in favour of Rai Amar Chand awarding a medal in appreciation of services to the British Government. English.
145. Sanad. 14 August 1858. Issued by the Secretary of State in Council in favour of Rai Amar Chand, Chief of Bhallan, awarding a jagir yielding Rs.67/- p.a. in commendation of his services and loyalty to the British Government. English.
146. Parwana. 19 November 1869. From Capt. Marshal to Rai Talim Chand, of Bhallan, appreciating his services in supplying provisions to the Gurkha Battalion at Bhallan. Urdu.
147. Sanad. 4 March 1870 A.D. Issued by the Deputy Commissioner, Jullundur Division (sic) in favour of Rai Talim Chand regarding remittance of Rs.68/- from the revenue paid by Bhallan Estate as per orders of the British Government. Urdu.
148. Murasala. 14 April 1870. From the Deputy Commissioner, Hoshiarpur (H.E. Perkins), to Tahsildar, pargana Una, intimating regarding grant of 5 acres of land in favour of Rai Talim Chand as muaafi in village Saman alias Kahanpur in pargana Una in perpetuity. Urdu.
149. Parwana. 8 July 1872. From Capt. Rodgers to Rai Talim Chand asking for 16 labourers for loading and unloading of the baggage to be sent to Phillaur. English.
150. Parwana. 1 March 1906. From P.J. Fagan, Deputy Commissioner, Hoshiarpur, to Rai Amar Chand, appreciating his loyalty to the British Government. English.
151. Sanad. 27 July 1917. Issued by Akram Ali Khan, Deputy Superintendent of Police, Hoshiarpur, in favour of Rai Hari Chand, Zaildar of Bhallan, appreciating his assistance in a crown case and granting a reward of Rs.10/-. English.
152. Sanad. 12 December 1917. Issued by A. Longley, Deputy Commissioner and President, War Association, Hoshiarpur, in favour of Rai Amar Chand, Chief of Bhallan, commending his services in collecting the subscription for War Fund. English.
153. Sanad. 12 December 1917. Issued by A. Longley in favour of Rai Amar Chand thanking him for the subscription of Rs.25/- to the War Fund. English.

154. Letter. 27 August 1918. From A.Longley to Rai Amar Chand intimating his enrolment as member of the War Association of District Hoshiarpur for which Rs.25/- were deposited by him as membership fee. English.
155. Letter. 5 July 1920. From Lord Chelmsford, Viceroy and Governor General, to Rai Amar Chand, Chief of Bhallan, condoling the death of his son, Mangal Singh, in the First Great (World) War. English.
156. Letter. 5 July 1920. From His Majesty King George(V) to Rai Amar Chand condoling the death of his son, Mangal Singh during the First World War. English.
157. Letter. 18 January 1922. From E.Abraham, Deputy Commissioner, Hoshiarpur, to Rai Amar Chand commending sacrifice of his son's life in Mesopotamia in the First Great War. English.
158. Letter. 14 November 1922. From Maj. D.Pott, Private Secretary to the Governor of Punjab, to Rai Amar Chand commending suitable arrangements made at the time of the Governor's tour of Hoshiarpur. English.
159. Sanad. 19 March 1925. Issued by E.M.Jenkins, Deputy Commissioner, Hoshiarpur, in favour of Rai Hari Chand, Zaildar of village Bhallan, Tahsil Una, commending services in fostering the Co-operative Movement. English.
160. Letter. 29 September 1927. From C.F.Stricland, Registrar, Co-operative Societies, Punjab, to Rai Hari Chand appreciating his work in the Co-operative Movement during the 1926-27 A.D. English.
161. Sanad. 21 November 1927. Issued by Akram Ali Khan, Deputy Superintendent of Police, in favour of Rai Hari Chand appreciating services in facilitating arrest of Hazara Singh, an accused in a crown case. Akram Ali was also given a cash reward of Rs.10/- towards the same. English.
162. Sanad. 10 May 1929. Issued by A.Longley, Commissioner of Jullundur Division, in favour of Rai Hari Chand appreciating his sense of loyalty to the British Government and services rendered to the Police Department. English.
163. Letter. 14 July 1930. From E.M.Jenkins, Deputy Commissioner, Hoshiarpur, to Rai Hari Chand informing about the peaceful condition at Kiratpur and also commending his services in the maintenance of law and order. English.
164. Sanad. 16 June 1937. Issued by the Chairman, District Board, Hoshiarpur, in favour of Rai Hari Chand commending interest in looking after the bulls during the year 1930-31 A.D. The Sanad was issued in accordance with the wishes of the District Civil and Veterinary Department. English.

165. Letter. 3 March 1933. From H.W.C.Bakhla, Chairman, District Board, Hoshiarpur, to Rai Hari Chand appreciating assistance in the assessment of the District Board profession tax during the year 1932-33 A.D. English.
166. Sanad. 2 January 1934. Issued by Bunyad Hussain, Deputy Commissioner, Hoshiarpur, in favour of Rai Hari Chand appreciating assistance to the Medical Officer, Hoshiarpur, in the vaccination campaign. English.
167. Letter. 22 February 1934. From Bunyad Hussain to Rai Hari Chand appreciating services in giving relief to flood-stricken people in the district. English.
168. Sanad. 18 December 1934. Issued by E.Sheepshanks, Commissioner of Jullundur Division, in favour of Rai Hari Chand, Zaildar of Bhallan and Junior Vice-Chairman, District Board, Hoshiarpur, appreciating assistance in running the administration of the Board. English.
169. Letter. 6 May 1937. From the Viceroy and Governor General of India (Lord Linlithgow) to Rai Hari Chand, awarding a medal on the occasion of the silver jubilee of Their Majesties. English.
170. Sanad. 2 June 1943. Issued by Lord Linlithgow in favour of Rai Hari Chand conferring the title of 'Rai Bahadur'. English.
171. Notification. Undated. Issued by the Government of India, to the Chiefs of Trans-Sutlej States mentioning sacrifice of Mangal Singh, of the 10th Duke of Cambridge's Lancers, who got killed during the First Great War. English.
172. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that, after the death of Raja Narindar Chand of Kangra, who was issueless, his Rani, who was then pregnant, took shelter in the house of a potter in order to save her life from the successor of the Raja. She gave birth to a son and proceeded to her father's house in Satara. Urdu.
173. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that the son of the Rani (widow of Raja Narindar Chand, of Kangra) attained maturity and in collusion with his maternal grand-father, invaded Kangra, killed the Raja and ascended the throne as Raja Bir Chand. He summoned the potter and asked him to accept the reward for giving shelter to his mother and the potter demanded that his instrument 'Chak' should be worshipped by Raja's family in future. The Raja renamed his family as Ladu Rajputs as a mark of gratitude to the potter, Ladu. Urdu.
174. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that the Katoch Rajput, who were descendant of Raja Bir Chand, worshipped the 'Chak' on the occasion of the marriage ceremony of their children. Urdu.

175. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that Sahni Chand, successor of Raja Uttam Chand, ruled over the Bhabaur territory and married his daughter to Biney Chand. The latter killed his brother-in-law and father-in-law and took possession of the Bhabaur Estate. Urdu.
176. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that each Rani of Raja Biney Chand bore nine sons. The eldest son of each Rani was styled as Tikka Sahib. Biney Chand alone bore the title of 'Raja' because according to the custom of Katoch Rajput, only the person who sat on the throne was called a Raja. Urdu.
177. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that according to Katoch custom none of the sons of Raja Biney Chand was styled as Raja during his father's life. Raja Biney Chand gave the territory of Bhabaur to Raja Prithi Chand and the villages of Bangran, Kalmut and Bussi were given to Karam Cha who afterwards, renounced the world. Urdu.
178. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that Rai Hari Chand was a Ladu Rajput. The descent of the family is traced from Sasarama Chand, (Susarama Chand) who lived in Kangra Fort and fought against the Pandus. Raja Lachhmi Chan became a ruler of Kangra a thousand years ago and his family assumed the name of Katoch. Urdu.
179. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that Purab Chand and Padam Chand, sons of Raja Lachhmi Chand, were rulers of Jaswan and Kangra respectively. Raja Hari Chand and Karam Chand were descendants of Raja Karam Chand (sic). After the death of Hari Chand, Karam Chand became the Raja. One of Hari Chand's sons, Siba (Sibarn Chand) laid the foundation of Siba State (Estate) and the family was renamed as "Dada Siba". Urdu.
180. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that Raja Lachhmi Chan Dada, a lineal descendant of Raja Hari Chand, succeeded Raja Bahman Chand. He was called Dadhwal (Dadwal) Rajput. Raja Datar Chand ascended the throne of Datarpur. Urdu.
181. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that Biney Chand killed the Dadhwal Rajput Raja of Bhabaur Estate and the estate remained under control of his successors upto thriteen generations. His 13th lineal descendant, Raja Bhag Chand, was killed by Dadhwal Rajput in collusion with Jaswal Rajputs. The Rani of Bhag Chand gave birth to a posthumous son named Rup Chand who on attaining age sought Delhi's help in securing the throne of his ancestors. Urdu.
182. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that Umar Khan who was sent by the King of Delhi to restore Rup Chand to his ancestral estate, returned after receiving presents from the Raja of Jaswal. The King then sent Raja Todar Mal, who killed the Raja of Jaswal and restored to Rup Chand his ancestral estate. Urdu.

183. Memorandum. Undated. Stating the history of the Katoch family up to the defeat of Raja Jagdish Chand of Kangra at the hands of Mahmud of Ghazni who captured the Kangra Fort in 1009 A.D. The document further adds that the branches of Katoch family, the Jaswal, Golar, Siba etc. descended from Raja Bhumi Chand, who ruled Kangra in ancient times. Raja Susarma Chand (Chandra), a lineal descendant of Raja Bhumi Chand, built the Kangra fort and fought in the war of Mahabharat. Urdu.

Collection of Rai Jagjit Singh Bhandari, Bhandari Street, Batala, District Gurdaspur.

A study of these documents reveals that Rai Kishan Chand and Gobind Jas, ancestors of Rai Jagjit Singh served as vakils of Maharaja Ranjit Singh with the British Government. They were held in great esteem in the Lahore Darbar, even during the reigns of Maharaja Kharrak Singh and Nau Nihal Singh. It was due to the mediation of Rai Kishan Chand that the case of Raja Jagat Chand, of Bilaspur, was decided in the latter's favour by the Lahore Darbar after rejecting the claims of the widow Ranis of Bilaspur.

184. Memorandum. 30 June 1840. Stating assistance by Rai Kishan Chand, the wakil of Maharaja Ranjit Singh, to Raja Jagat Chand against the rebellion of Dowager Ranis of the late Raja Kharrak Chand. The wakil also got orders passed in favour of the Raja from Maharaja Kharrak Singh and Kanwar Naunihal (Nau Nihal) Singh of Lahore Darbar for which he was adequately rewarded. Persian.
185. Sanad. 30 June 1840. (?) Issued by Raja Jagat Chand in favour of Rai Kishan Chand, wakil of Maharaja Ranjit Singh, awarding a jagir of village Behli with authority to collect revenue. It was in recognition of the services rendered to the Raja in his dispute with the dowager Ranis of Bilaspur State. Persian.
186. Memorandum. 1846. A.D. Stating about the cordial relationship between Rai Gobind Jas, the wakil of the Maharaja (Ranjit Singh) and Faqir Aziz-ud-din, the Foreign Minister of the Maharaja. English.
187. Memorandum. 1846 A.D. Stating that the British forces occupied Ludhiana under the command of Sir David Ochterlony. Maharaja Ranjit Singh sent Rai Anand Singh (Bhandari) as wakil to Sir David Ochterlony. Rai Gobind Jas and Rai Kishan Chand, sons of Rai Anand Singh succeeded their father and also served as vakils with the Political Agents - Murray and Wade respectively. English.

188. Sanad. 7 August 1847. Issued by Maharaja Dalip Singh with the approval of Col.(Sir) Henry Montgomery bestowing a title of "Worthy of Favour, Loyal, Sincere and True-Sprited Old Special Confident Envoy of Lahore Sarkar" on Rai Kishan Chand for his meritorious services. Persian.

189. Memorandum. Undated. Stating deputation of S.Gujar Singh Majithia as Ambassador to the (British) Government of India, by Maharaja Ranjit Singh, for sending presents to the king of England. The Maharaja also sent Gobind Jas to act as a check on the fickle-minded Gujar Singh. Persian.

Collection of Harnarain Singh, Chief of Bhadaur, Patiala.

The documents under this collection reveal that during the British regime Bhadaur was a protracted estate till 1857, when the overlordship of the estate was granted to Maharaja of Patiala in lieu of his meritorious services rendered during the Mutiny. The Chiefs of Bhadaur remained loyal to the British Government and helped them with men, money and provisions during the Anglo-Sikh Wars, Afghan War, Mutiny and other such emergency periods. Sardar Attar Singh, a learned Chief of Bhadaur, rendered singular service to the British Government, which were highly acknowledged and appreciated also. The strategic position of Bhadaur, because of its being on Delhi-Ferozepur route, made the loyalty and services of Bhadaur Chiefs to the British cause all the more valuable.

190. Memorandum. 15 September 1808. Regarding meeting held at Kasur between Sir Charles Metcalfe and Maharaja Ranjit Singh. While the Trans-Sutlej Chiefs accompanied the Maharaja, Sir Metcalfe's party comprised of Raja Bhag Singh of Jind, Raja Jaswant Singh of Nabha, Sardar Dip Singh, son of S.Chuhar Singh, Chief of Bhadaur and Sardar Fateh Singh of Malaud. It also states that Maharaja Sahib Singh of Patiala did not attend the meeting. Persian.

191. Memorandum. 7 October 1809. Narrating that Sardar Dip Singh and Sardar Bir Singh, of Bhadaur, presented to Sir David Ochterlony two bows, a horse, and Rs.160/- at the time of interview with him at Ludhiana. English.

192. Memorandum. 1 October 1830. Stating that the British Government deputed Sir David Ochterlony and Charles Metcalfe to settle the compensation liable to be paid to the Chiefs of Bhadaur for their two villages - Saidoke and Bhagta forcibly occupied by Maharaja Ranjit Singh after the treaty with the British Government. English.

193. Memorandum. 4 February 1820. Stating that (Capt.) G.Birch visited Bhadaur where he was introduced to Sardar Dip Singh and Sardar Bir Singh and their sons. English.

194. Letter. 28 June 1822. From Capt. Murray to Sardar Dip Singh and Sardar Bir Singh, asking them to visit village Madni near Bhadaur in connection with Government business. English.

195. Sanad. April 1830. Issued by the Governor General of India in favour of Sardar Kharak Singh and Sardar Khazan Singh, of Bhadaur, and Sardar Mit Singh and Sardar Fateh Singh of Malaud, granting a bow and a sanad to each Sardar in lieu of their meritorious services to the British Government. English.

196. Letter. 8 June 1835. From Sir George Russel Clarke (Clerk), Agent of Governor General (Political Agent, Cis-Sutlej States) to the Maharaja of Patiala (Karam Singh) informing that the Chiefs of Bhadaur were under the protection of the British Government and enjoyed the same status as maintained by the Cis-Sutlej Chiefs. English.

197. Memorandum. April 1838. Narrating that Lord Auckland invited the Chiefs of Bhadaur, Sardar Kharak Singh and Sardar Khazan Singh and Fateh Singh and Mit Singh, the Chiefs of Malaud, to Pinjaur. English.

198. Murasala. 3 September 1838. From Maharaja Karam Singh to Sarfraz Ali, the British wakil at Ludhiana, informing him that in accordance with the orders of Capt. Wade, the Amin of Bhadaur was requested to send camels for conveyance during the Kabul campaign in 1838-39 A.D. Persian.

199. Memorandum. 20 December 1838. Regarding grant of sanad to the Chiefs of Bhadaur for supplying provisions to the army when the (British) Commander-in-Chief visited Bhadaur on his way to Delhi. English.

200. Memorandum. 13 January 1839. Stating that the Sardars of Bhadaur presented a bow, a horse, a khilat and jewels to the Governor General of India (Lord Auckland) as a token of loyalty during his visit to Barnala. English.

201. Parwana. 20 November 1839. From Sir G.R.Clark (Clerk), Political Agent, Ambala, to Thandi Ram and Paras Ram, vakils of Bhadaur Estate, requesting them to accumulate provisions for the troops stationed at Dod in Bhadaur. Also states that he would visit Dod along with Maulvi Rajab Ali. English.

202. Parwana. 10 December 1839. From Clarke (Sir G.R.Clerk) to the vakils of Bhadaur, asking them to accumulate supplies at Bhadaur for the troops on way from Ferozepur to Karnal and expected there in January 1840. English.

203. Parwana. 29 December 1839. From Clarke (Sir G.R.Clerk) to the vakil of Bhadaur, requesting him to accumulate supplies at Bhadaur for the troops numbering 971 men and 300 horses expected there on 8th June 1840 on their way from Karnal to Ferozepur. English.
204. Parwana. 29 October 1840. From Clarke (Sir G.R.Clerk) commanding the vakils of Bhadaur to accumulate provisions for the 10th Cavalry on their way to Ferozepur and expected to reach Bhadaur on 23 November 1840. English.
205. Murasala. 10 January 1841. From Maharaja of Patiala (Karam Singh) to all the Chiefs of Bhadaur requesting them to collect 30 carts for the British forces. Persian.
206. Parwana. 24 January 1841. From Maharaja of Patiala to the Chiefs of Bhadaur, requesting for supplies for the regiment marching from Ferozepur to Karnal via Bhadaur. Persian.
207. Parwana. 2 May 1841. From the Political Agent (British) to the vakil of Bhadaur requesting for supply of 4000 beams of wood at Basian, in Ludhiana District for constructing hutments for Government officials. English.
208. Murasala. 18 October 1841. From Maharaja Karam Singh, of Patiala, to Bhadaur Chiefs asking them to keep their forces in readiness for helping the British Government. Persian.
209. Murasala. 31 October 1841. From Clarke (Sir G.R.Clerk) to the Chiefs of Bhadaur requesting for supply of provisions for a battery of artillery, which would camp there on 13th and 14th November 1841. English.
210. Murasala. 28 November 1842. From Clarke (Sir G.R.Clerk) to the Bhadaur Chiefs inviting to attend the Durbar at Ferozepur and offer presents to the Governor-General (Lord Auckland) in conformity with their positions. English.
211. Murasala. 1843 A.D. From Maharaja Karam Singh, of Patiala, to S.Kharak Singh, of Bhadaur, requesting him to provide means of communications for the British troops at Bara near Faridkot. Persian.
212. Murasala. 1844 A.D. From Maharaja of Patiala (Karam Singh) to S.Kharak Singh intimating scheduled arrival of the Commissioner (?) of Saharanpur at Bhadaur, in November 1844 on his way to Ferozepur and asking him to supply provisions and make security arrangements. Persian.

213. Memorandum. 21 January 1845. Stating that the Chiefs of Bhadaur and Malaud Estates were invited by the Governor General to attend the proposed Darbar at Sirhind. Also states that all Cis-Sutlej Chiefs were asked to put up their best contingents for inspection by the Governor-General. Bhadaur Chiefs furnished a Contingent of 100 horsemen and provisions on the occasion. English.
214. Murasala. 12 December 1845. From Maj. George Broadfoot, Agent to the Governor General, to the Chiefs of Bhadaur requesting them to supply troops, animals, carts and provisions through the Maharaja of Patiala (Narindar Singh). English.
215. Letter. 12 December 1845. From (Maj. George) Broadfoot, to Maharaja of Patiala (Narindar Singh) informing him that the Cis-Sutlej Chiefs were asked to send their contingents and provisions through him. English.
216. Murasala. 18 December 1845. From Maharaja Narindar Singh to S.Kharak Singh intimating that the Bhadaur Chiefs had been asked to send a Contingent of 180 horses to be placed under the command of Bhai Deva Singh, who was being deputed to Ferozepur. Urdu.
217. Murasala. 27 December 1845. From Maharaja Narindar Singh to S.Kharak Singh, Chief of Bhadaur, informing that Fateh Beg, vakil, had been deputed to supply means of communications and provisions to the British troops at Basian (District Ludhiana) and Ferozepur. Urdu.
218. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that the Bhadaur Chiefs supplied 20 camels and 30 carts to Clarke (Sir G.R.Clerk) for conveying the baggage of Lady W.Macnaughten. Also states that Ferozepur was a frontier Military Station for commencing the British expedition and that all troops coming from Delhi and Karnal passed through Bhadaur. English.
219. Murasala. 1846. A.D. From Maharaja Narindar Singh, of Patiala, to S.Kharak Singh, Chief of Bhadaur, asking him to supply the provisions on the Commissioner's proposed arrival at Bhadaur. Persian.
220. Memorandum. Undated. Stating in details the provisions and conveyance supplied by the Bhadaur Chiefs to the British Government during the Sutlej campaign. Urdu.
221. Murasala. 1846 A.D. From Maharaja Narindar Singh of Patiala, to S.Kharak Singh asking him to supply provisions for 1600 troops to be stationed at Bhadaur. Urdu.

222. Murasala. 1846 A.D. From Maharaja Narindar Singh of Patiala, to S.Kharak Singh informing him about the expected return of sawars from Ferozepur. Urdu.

223. Memorandum. 24 March 1846. Stating that every Chief of Bhadaur, Malaud and other States was granted a sanad, a bow, a horse, a khilat, jewels and five gold mohars at the Durbar held at Ludhiana after the conquest of Lahore. English.

224. Memorandum. February 1847. Regarding visit of Frederick Mackeson, Commissioner and Superintendent, Cis-Sutlej States, to Bhadaur. English.

225. Murasala. 1847 A.D. From Maharaja Narindar Singh of Patiala to S.Kharak Singh asking him to furnish an account of the provisions and conveyances supplied for submission to Col. (Frederick) Mackeson. Urdu.

226. Robkar. 5 September 1849. Issued by Col. Frederick Mackeson in connection with the dispute between the Raja of Jind (Sarup Singh) and the Sardar of Badru Khan, his feudatory, regarding supply of contingent to the British and stating that all objections be kept pending for future consideration. English.

227. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that T.D.Forsyth, Deputy Commissioner, Ambala, and (G.C.) Barnes, Commissioner of Ambala, asked the father of S.Atar Singh (S.Kharak Singh) to co-operate with the Maharaja of Patiala and help the Britishers. English.

228. Memorandum. May 1857. Stating that S.Kharak Singh of Bhadaur was at Hardwar when the Mutiny broke out. He later arrived at Thanesar and on the orders of the Maharaja and the British Government proceeded to Ferozepur where he was wounded. English.

229. Memorandum. 28 January 1860. Stating that Lord Canning granted one khilat, two gold mohars and one horse with silver trappings to Atar Singh and every chief of Bhadaur. English.

230. Memorandum. February 1860. Stating that Lord Canning granted a khilat to Atar Singh at a Durbar held at Sirhind. Also states that the Maharaja of Patiala (Narindar Singh) along with other Chiefs also attended the Darbar. English.

231. Murasala. 5 May 1860. From the British Government to the Maharaja of Patiala (Narindar Singh) granting a Sanad and promising not to interfere in the disputes between the Sikh Chiefs and their feudatories of entertain any complaint from his (Raja's) subjects. English.

232. Murasala. 26 July 1861. From Lord Canning to the Raja of Nabha (Bharpur Singh) informing that the British Government would not intervene on behalf of the Sunti Sikhs as the latter had rejected the proposal for compromise suggested to them. English.

233. Memorandum. 1 November 1861. Stating that at a Darbar held at Allahabad the title 'Star of India' was conferred on the Maharaja of Patiala (Narindar Singh) and he was also appointed a member of Governor General's Council. Further states that Sardars of Bhadaur and Malaud also attended the Darbar. English.

234. Murasala. 30 March 1863. From the Governor General (Lord Elgin) to the Secretary to State (Sir C.Wood) regarding his decision in the case of Sunti Sikhs versus the Maharaja of Nabha (Bharpur Singh), upholding the specific feudal relations between the two. English.

235. Memorandum. 1 November 1871. Stating that the Maharaja of Patiala (Mohindar Singh) was invited by Lord Mayo to Calcutta to receive the order of the 'Star of India'. Also states that the Bhadaur Chiefs were also invited. English.

236. Memorandum. 4 February 1872. Regarding S.Atar Singh, Chief of Bhadaur, being introduced to Sir Robert Henry Davies, Lieutenant Governor of Punjab, at a Darbar held at Patiala. English.

237. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that in September 1838 Maharaja Karam Singh asked the father of Atar Singh, the Bhadaur Chief, to send camels to Capt. Wade to carry his baggage during the Kabul campaign. English.

238. Memorandum. Undated. Stating that the Bhadaur Estate comprised the villages of Bhadaur (Dip Garh), Ramgarh, Talewala, Randasan, Gahai, Mun, Dhaner, Dhurkot, Gagewal, Sadowal and Naraingarh etc. Urdu.

239. Memorandum. 30 March 1875. Stating that Atar Singh, with other Bhadaur Sardars, attended the Durbar at Diwan Khana in Patiala for laying the foundation stone of Mohindar College, Patiala. English.

240. Petition. 11 February 1892. From Atar Singh to Lord Lansdowne requesting him that in accordance with the orders of Sir (Charles) James Lyall, the Chiefs of Bhadaur Estate comprising of 58 villages, which were under the British protection, acquiesced to the overlordship of the Maharaja of Patiala in lieu of the services rendered during the Mutiny and that this relationship should not be changed any further. English.

241. Memorandum. 1892 A.D. Stating that the Chiefs of Bhadaur rendered service to the British Government during the First Afghan War and supplied 106 sawars at Ferozepur and 20 Kahars at Ludhiana during the First Anglo-Sikh War. English.

242. Memorandum. 1892 A.D. Stating that (G.C.) Barnes had written to the Maharaja of Patiala informing him that the grant of Narnaul pargana out of the confiscated territory of the Nawab of Jhajjar instead of Bhadaur was a just compensation for the Maharaja's services to the British Government. English.

VIII. TAMIL NADU

Listed below are 66 documents belonging to 43 different Collections covering the period from 1600 A.D. to 1925 A.D. They are mostly in the form of correspondence, deeds, suvadis, memoirs etc. relating to social and religious matters. The material of these documents are palm leaf as well as paper and are open for research purposes. Good many subject details under various collections have been culled out from the report sent to us by the Survey Committee Media alongwith the duly filled up proformas.

Collection of Nilgiris Library, Ootacamund, District Nilgiri.

1. Letter 1603 A.D. Written by Fr. Fencicio (Jesuit priest Ferreisa or Finicio) regarding his observations on the hill tribes, their customs, manners and religious faiths etc. Portuguese.

Collection of R.T.S. Darling, Lushington Hall, Ootacamund.

2. Correspondence. 1840-1860 A.D. Between Fredrick P. Rice and Major General H. Rhoades Margan regarding early European settlers (of Ooty) and development of town during 1840-60 A.D. English.

3. Letter 1850-1857 A.D. Relating to the association of Lord Dalhousie with the Kottah Hall (Ooty?). English.

Collection of Ahlehadees Mosque, Ootacamund.

4. Gift Deeds. 18th Century. Relating to the construction of Ahlehadees Mosque some 170 years ago. It also refers to the migration of Muslims from Mysore to Ooty. Persian.

Collection of Abdul Kareem, Mosque Street, Ootacamund.

5. Monograph. 1780-1792 A.D. Tracing the rise and fall of Haidar Ali and Tipu Sultan. It also states that Tipu was a very pious man who respected all religions and he gave a gift to a Hindu temple worth Rs. 30,000/-. The document gives a full account of the Mysore Sultans; political activities.

6. Correspondence. 1780-1792 A.D. Regarding Mysore Sultans battery (artillery) near Gudalur and the account of remunerations paid to those incharge of it (The battery was kept ready to march against Kerala). Urdu.

Collection of Chaplain Iliff, St. Stephen's church,*

Ootacamund.

7. Church documents. 1823 and 1830 A.D. These refer to the construction of St. Stephen's church which was the first European church built at Ooty with the full support of the Government. The materials used in the construction of the Church such as beams, doors etc. are said to have been brought from Seringapattam after Tipu's fall. The papers also throw light on the pioneer settlers in Ooty and their interest in tea plantation industry. English.

8. Document. 1830 A.D. Regarding judicial administration of Tipu Sultan. English.

Collection of A.K. Subbiah Gowder, Kalnan, Coonoor, District Nilgiri.

9. Settlement Register. 1864 A.D. Regarding migration of the Badagas from Mysore. (There is no record available to give the exact date of their migration or the reasons for it. These records, however, reveal that Thunerri (?) was the first place of settlement of the Badagas and the temple there is their principal place of worship). Tamil and English.

10. Court Proceedings. 1861 A.D. Regarding a civil suit between the Badagas of Coonoor and the church authorities throwing light on the social set up of the Badagas. It also mentions that there were five Nadus where the Badagas lived. English.

* The cemetery attached to the church also contains information re. British Officers who were then serving on the Queen's forces and the East India Company's at Bombay, Calcutta and Madras. Details about the Maratha & Mysore war may also be obtained in fragments from the grave stones.

Collection of Mr. Guchen, Headman, Village Jagathala,District Nilgiri.

11. Judgments. 18th and 19th century A.D. Documents relating to the local administration of justice and community living amongst the Badagas with special reference to the settlement of disputes amongst them. Tamil.

Collection of J.M.Johi Gowder, President, GoodumaniSangam, Jagathala, District Nilgiri.

12. Lease Deed. 1820 A.D. Signed between East India Company and the Badagas regarding the first Badaga settlement and establishment of the Madras Regimental Centre at Wellington. English.

13. Lease Deed. 1820 A.D. Regarding military and revenue matters. Tamil and English.

Collection of H. Sevana Gowder, Maniakar (Maniyakaran),Kotagiri, District Nilgiri.

14. Inspection report. 1862 A.D. Reflecting the attitude of the British towards the Badagas (It appears that all defaulters of taxes were referred to the village community leaders and the head leader at Thunerri and no direct action was taken by the British Govt. Tamil and English.

Collection of Fr. William, Cathedral Church, Coimbatore.

15. Note. 2nd half of 18th century A.D. On the social history of Kongu country (Written out by the Parish priests, it records the day to day activities of the church and the people around Coimbatore. A list of various communities living in Coimbatore and Nilgiri Districts is also appended and the note thus is of great value for the social history of Coimbatore District). French.

16. Correspondence. 1666 A.D. Regarding local set-up of the Kongu country and the characteristics of its people (Written out by Fr. Anne, it describes the Kongu people as innocent, honest and hard - working with implicit obedience to their masters. Of course, there are exaggerated reports about religious faiths and customs). Portuguese.

Collection of Diocesan Archives, Coimbatore.

17. Annual reports. 1600-1775 A.D. and 1865-73 A.D. Regarding social and religious matters (These reports, though mainly concerning religious affairs, record practically every event that had any impact direct or indirect, on the church mission and thus important politically during the period e.g. Haider Ali's and Tipu's military activities). French and English.

Collection of Perur Devasthanam, Perur, District Coimbatore.

18. Title deeds. Undated. Of lands given by the East India Company to the lease holders in appreciation of their bravery in defending the crops from Tipu's invasions. These also furnish information regarding the topography of Perur. Tamil and English.

Collection of Sri Krishna Raja Kalinga Rayar, Zamindar II,Samathur (Samattur), District Coimbatore.

19. Documents (Palm leaf). 1780 A.D. Relating to the history of Samathur (Samattur) Palayam. Tamil and English.

Collection of Zamindar of Uthukuli, Uthukuli (Uttukuli),Pollachi, District Coimbatore.

20-21. Documents (Palm leaf). Undated. Relating to the history of the Uthukuli (Uttukuli) Zamin from the date of its inception to the last century (various political activities with which the Gowder (Gowder) family of Uttukuli was associated is discussed at length). Tamil.

22. Correspondence. 1790 A.D. Diplomatic (details not known). English and Tamil.

Collection of S. Raju, President, Historical Society,
Erode, District Coimbatore.

- 22.A. Memoirs (Palm leaf). 11th and 12th centuries A.D. Containing details about construction, maintenance and remodelling of the Kalinga Rayar Chammal (Kalinge River Canal?) in Erode Taluk. Tamil.

- 22.B. Memoirs (Palm leaf). 11th and 12th centuries A.D. Containing general history of the Kongu country (It mentions of the Vettuvans (Vettuvans) as the original inhabitants of the Kongu country who were afterwards superseded by the Vellalas (Vellabas ?). Tamil.

- 22.C. Ballad. 14th to 18th centuries A.D. Giving history of the Palayakottai Zamin together with the geneological list of the Pattagars (Zamindars) and topography of the Kongu country. Tamil.

23. Monograph (Palm leaf). 16th to 18th centuries A.D. Regarding history of Uthukuli (Uttukuli) zamindari and the Gownder community. Tamil.

Sacred Heart College, Shembagapur, Kodaikanal-4.

24. Correspondence. 1699-1705 A.D. Regarding the State of affairs in the Nadurai country (The owner also possesses English translation of these French letters of Fr. Martin written to Rome during the period). French.

25. Correspondence. 1750 A.D. Dealing with social and political matters (details not available). Portuguese

26. Correspondence. 2nd half of 18th century A.D. Dealing with diplomatic matters (details not available). French.

Collection of Zamindar, Kantharavakottai (?) District Tanjore.

27. Revenue Records (Palm leaf). 1600 A.D. Relating to Ramand (Ramanathapuram) and Sivaganga. Tamil.

28. Title Deeds and Settlements (Palm leaf). 17th and 18th centuries A.D. Regarding social history of Kallars (Kallans). Tamil.

Collection of V.R. Kulanadavivel Kalingarayar, Eachankottai,
District Tanjore.

29. Ballad (Palm leaf). Undated. Throwing light on the relations between the Kallar community and the Chola kings of Tanjore (The ballad is in honour of one of his ancestors and it narrates the war in which the hero played an important role and obtained the title of "Kalingarayar" from the Chola king). Tamil.

Collection of Vadivela Thanjai Rayar, Headman, Kasa Nadu,
District Tanjore.

30. Copper plate and Palm leaf. 17th and 18th centuries A.D. Regarding social structure of the Kallar community and code of conduct approved by the leader of the community and the king of Tanjore (These give an insight into the social structure of the Kallar community living around Tanjore. Kallar country was divided into divisions, viz. 4 nadus, 7 nadus and 11 nadus. Kasa Nadu of the 4 nadus was the chief among them. The copper plate charter is signed by the leaders of all the nadus and counter-signed by the king of Tanjore. It is more or less a social code of conduct. The Chieftain was vested with the power of administration among the Kallars and was answerable to the king only). Tamil.

Collection of H.K. Gadhadharan, Melamaganam (District
Tanjore).

- 30A. Court Proceedings. 1914 (?). Regarding a civil suit (Sri Vidya Varnthi Thirtha Swanigal vs. Balusamy Iyer) and the judgement of Privy Council thereon (These papers furnish the history of the Mutt in Mysore, relations and powers of the head of the Mutt and an account of Mutt properties. In appendix to these proceedings deals with the gift of lands by the Nayakan dynasty of Madurai). English.

Collection of Gopals(w)ani Thenkondar, Chennampatti,
Vallam (District Tanjore).

30B. Court Proceedings (Paper and Palm leaf). 18th to 19th Centuries A.D.(?) Throwing light on the social customs of the Kallars of the area (Information regarding Odayar community and the relations between the Kallars and the Odayars is also available in these papers). Tamil and English.

Collection of Somasundara Vanniar, Pulavanatham,
(District Tanjore).

31. Gift Deed (Palm leaf). Undated. Regarding gift of land to the owner's ancestors by the Raja of Tanjore as compensation for lifting the statue of a deity from Kanchipuram (Kanjeevaram). (This particular temple is still under the custody of the Kanchi Acharya, while other temples in Tanjore belong to the Palace Devasam Board). Modi.

Collection of Balaguru Natter, Kallar Perambur(District
Tanjore).

32. Suvadi (Palm leaf). Undated. Giving details about the Kallar villages all over Tamil Nadu and their religious and social affairs. Tamil.

Collection of Jumma Mosque, Adhirampatnam (Adirampatnam),
District Tanjore.

33. Document. 17th century A.D. Stating that the Muslims of the said village were merchants even before 300 years and they were receiving the royal patronage from the king of Tanjore. Also states that the mosque was built with the financial help of the king. Tamil.

Collection of S.N.Syed Muhammad Annaviar, Adirampatnam,
District Tanjore.

34. Suvadi(Palm leaf). 18th century A.D. Giving topographical information (about Pattukkottai area) and census of the village (Adirampatnam). Tamil.

Collection of Muhammad Ibrahim, Adirampatnam, District
Tanjore.

35. Suvadi (Palm leaf). 17th century A.D. Giving account of the history of the village (Adirampatnam) and showing list of commodities exported from the port of Adirampatnam (Adirampatnam). Tamil.

36. Documents. 1814 A.D. Relating to the construction of the tower of Manora marking the fall of the French. English.

Collection of Krishna Iyer,Rajenadam, District Tanjore.

37. Correspondence (Paper and Palm leaf). 17th century A.D. Regarding salt trade of Adirampatnam and the attempts by the East India Company to wrest the trade from the Raja of Tanjore. Tamil and English.

Collection of Ganapathy Rao, West Street, Tanjore.

38. Correspondence. 18th century A.D. Connected with the adoption of Sarfoji (Sarbhaji) to the Tanjore kingdom (The Correspondence throws light on the Tanjore polity). Modi and English.

Collection of S.Subramaniam, Krishnapuram (District Tanjore).

39. Memoirs (Palm leaf). 1750-1780 A.D. Containing details regarding dispute between the Raja of Ramnad and the Raja of Tanjore over the possession of Arantangi and the important role played by the Zamindar of Singavanam in favour of the Raja of Tanjore. Tamil.

Documents relating to the history of the Chettiar
Community in the Ramnad District.

The documents listed below under S.Nos.40-47 A pertain to the history of the Nattukottai Chettians (also called Nagarthars). These Chettians occupied a specific area called Chettinad around Karaikudi and Devakottai (District Ramnad). These documents are very useful source material for understanding the social history of the Chettiar community during the last 600 years. These Chettians were mainly divided into seven main divisions, called 'Koils'. 'Koil' for them used to mean 'Gotra' and every 'Gotra' had its own temples and deities to whom they owed their respective allegiance. 'Koil' was a part and parcel of the social life of the Chettians. Births, deaths and marriages were registered in these 'Koils'; cases of any nature were tried by the Panchayatars in the 'Koils'; as also festivals and ceremonies were recorded there. While the documents against S.Nos.40-43 are in the possession of sa(w) Ganesan, ex-M.L.A., Karaikudi, the documents listed at S.Nos.44-46 are available with the Nagarthar Koil at Karaikudi, Ilayathangudi (Ilayathakudi ?) and Eluppaikudi respectively; the document listed at S.No.47 is available with Ilayathangudi (Ilayathakudi ?) Koil, Ilayathangudi, and the document at S.No.47 A is in possession of the Velangudi Rock Temple, Velangudi.

40. Documents. 1600-1900 A.D. Dealing with the social structure of the Nattukottai chettians, their internal divisions called 'Koils', and other activities. Tamil.

41. Document (Palm leaf). 15th century A.D. Depicting social customs and describing in detail how the community assembles for the selection of brides and bridegrooms. (The ceremony is somewhat akin to that of Swayamvaram) Tamil.

42. Proceedings. 1600 A.D. Relating to the maritime trade and banking business of the Chettians. Tamil.

43. Minute Books. 17th to 20th century A.D. Containing details about the business interests of the Chettians, as also about their community interests of the Chettians; as also about their community interests in collective 'Mahamai'. Tamil.

44. Minute Books. 17th to 20th century. A.D. Containing information about the customs and manners of the Nagarathar Chettians. Tamil.

45. Minute Books. 1600-1925 A.D. Containing details about village panchayat and the administration of justice along with a list of crimes and punishments. Tamil.

46. Marriage Register (Palm leaf). 17th century A.D. Describing the custom of child marriage. Tamil.

47. Minute Book. 16th century A.D. Giving information about the various religious faith of the people (These records state that before coming to Nattarasankottai, they were followers of Jainism and Buddhism). Tamil.

47A. Copper Plate. 12th century A.D. Regarding origin and migration of Nagarathar Chettians from Kavripocapattinam to Nattarasankottai during the reign of the Pandians. Tamil.

Collection of Durai Raja Pandian, Karutha Pandian Palace,
Maniyachi, District Tirunelveli.

48. Letter. 1867 A.D. From the Sub-collector, Tirunelveli, to the widow of the Zamindar of Maniyachi requesting her to send 'Kavalkarars' (Kavalgars) to quell the disturbances. (The letter reveals as to how effective was the Kaval system of local administration). Tamil and English.

49. Letter. 1801 A.D. From the East India Company to the Marava Zamindar of Maniyachi making a gift of 32 villages as reward for helping the British against the revolting Poligars of Panchalankurichi. English.

Collection of the Zamindar of Ellavinam Pannai, Maniyachi,
District Tirunelveli.

50. Reports. 1865-66 A.D. By the Collector of Tirunelveli on the Political state of affairs of the district (These reports give details about the Poligars of the Tirunelveli area and classifies them into rebellious and loyal types from the British point of view). English.

Collection of Immudi Kanga (Kunaga ?) Raniah, Shanmuga
Raja Pandiar, Zamindar, Velliankunram, District Madurai.

51. Copper plate. 17th century A.D. Issued by Tirumalai Nayak, Nayak King of Madurai, granting lands & privileges to the Zamindar (Immudi Kunaga Raniah) for assisting him in his wars against the king of Mysore (Details about the war are also given). Telugu.

52. Copper plate. 13th to 16th century A.D. Regarding confirmation of Palayans to the Canarese Gownders (Gowders) who had migrated from the Deccan to Madurai and earned the Palayan from the Pandya King, Sundarapandiayan (Sundera Pandya) for repelling the attack of the Kalabhas near Alagarkoil. Telugu.

Collection of Krishnamoorthy Pandiar, Velliankunram,
District Madurai.

53-55. The collection relates to many olai Suvadis (Palm leaf documents) in possession of Krishnamoorthy Pandiar. Besides the 'olugu olais' commonly found with all the Zamindars, 'Suvadis' on the political, economic and social history of Zanin and various other communities that existed in the surrounding villages are also in his possession. It is revealed therein that these Poligars were Gowders but all their armed retainers and 'Kavalikars' were Kollar Chieftains. These documents help us to know the widespread nature of feudalism in South India during the 16th to 18th centuries. They throw light on the loyalty of the subjects to their feudal lords. One of these 'Suvadis' provides interesting information about the Valyar community that was entrusted with the duty of offering human sacrifice on behalf of the Zamindars. Minute details about the village administration, with 'Kaval' as its pivot, are available in these 'Suvadis'. Similarly, a copper Plate dealing with the oath of allegiance by the Asari community to the Zamindar furnish details about the various services rendered to the public and the Poligar.

Collection of Sivanandi Ambalan, Appan Thirupathy, District
Madurai.

56. Documents (Palm leaf). 16th century A.D. Regarding irrigation system in the Madurai country during Nayak period (They also speak of the Muslim invasion of Madurai and the famine that followed it). Tamil.

Collection of Hariappa Thevar, Pattenathur, via
Virudhunagar.

57. Correspondence. 17th and 18th centuries A.D. Containing information about the steps taken by Rani Mangammal of Madurai to maintain balance of power with the Raja of Ramnad (The documents relate to the Marugapuri Zamin records. They reveal that the Zamin was created by Rani Mangammal to counter check the Marava incursions into the Nayak territory. It is also suggested therein that the Raja of Ramnad besides refusing to pay any tribute to the Nayak, indulged in predatory expedition and also conferred certain Palayams on Marava Chieftains ignoring the authority of the Nayakas (1695-1730) and it was with a view to maintain balance of power that some Ighambadiya Palayams were created. Tamil.

Collection of Perumal Servai, Tiruppattur, District
Ramnad.

58. Legal Proceedings. 1700-1760 A.D. Containing particulars of the Kollar kingdom at Pirannalai (It is found from these records that the Kollars at one stage formed a small but independent kingdom at Pirannalai defying the authority of the principal Power at Madurai and ran the government successfully till the emergence of Yusuf Khan as the Commander of Madurai Fort. Yusuf Khan brought them to terms by making liberal concessions in their favour). Tamil.

Collection of Bhaktha Duruvan, Planter, Pannaikkadu, Kodai
Hills.

59. Olai Suvadi (Palm leaf). 17th century A.D. Relating to the social history of the 24th Manai Chettiers (The community, 24th Manai Telugu Chettiers, belongs to Kodai Hills and Kumbakonam. Though these records do not speak about the origin of the name of the community, they suggest that these people came from the northern plains about 300 years ago seeking asylum with the natives of the Hills). Telugu.

Collection of Parish Priest, Idaiikkattur, via Mana Madurai

60. Correspondence. 17th century A.D. Regarding impact of social customs amongst the Hindus on Christianity in the 17th century (The documents reveal as to how social inequalities amongst the Hindus influenced these conversions). Tamil.

Collection of Catholic Church, Kamayanayakanpatti.

61. Proclamation. 1688 A.D. Dealing with the religious tolerance of the Poligars of Kamayanayakanpatti (The proclamation by the Poligars contains among other instructions to the subjects, an assurance of protection to the chapel and the X'ians so long as they did not change their political affiliations). Tamil.

62. Correspondence. 1667-1686 A.D. Containing topographical information about Kamayanayakanpatti. (The correspondence amongst its other items, contains a letter dated 1686 A.D. written by Fr. Louis De Netto to Rev. Fr. De Moyable, General of the Society of Jesus, wherein Kamayanayakanpatti has been referred as belonging to the Poligar of Ettaiyapuram (Tinnevely District). The city of Ettaiyapuram is said to have been built in 1667 A.D. and this letter furnishes the information about the boundaries of Ettaiyapuram and also a general estimate of the Palayan). Latin.

Collection of the Zamindar, Ayakudi, District Madurai.

63. Documents. 16th to 19th centuries A.D. Regarding origin and growth of the Ayakudi Zamin (These records show that, like many other Poligars, the Ayakudi Zamindars also came from Vijayanagar. They have a geneology list from the period of Visvanatha Nayak. But an old suvadi record found in the Velliankunram Zamin office states that there was dispute between the Thottis and the Nayakers during the reign of Muthukumarappa Nayak, who directed the Velliankunram Zamindar to settle the dispute and which the latter decided in favour of the Thottis. Later, during the Company's period, the Palayan was restored to the ancestor of the present Zamindar). Tamil.

Collection of the Zamindar, Bodinayakanur, District Madurai.

64. Muchalika. 13th to 18th centuries A.D. Deals with the association of the Zamindars with the East India Company (These records furnish information about the origin of Bodinayakanur Zamin and its day-to-day affairs). Tamil.

Collection of N. Sankaranarayana Pillayan, President of the Pillayan Kattalai, Tirunelveli-6.

65. Legal Proceedings. 16th to 19th centuries A.D. Containing history of Tirunelveli. English.

Collection of Muthiah Pillay, Seragulam, District Tirunelveli.

66. Cowle. 1754 A.D. Speaks of the association of Dalavoy Mudaliars, renters of Tinnevely, and Yusuf Khan, East India Company's General (The 'Cowle' is said to be issued in 1754 A.D. by Yusuf Khan for the western part of Tirunelveli, when the country was rented out to Alagappa Mudaliar. The only possible explanation for Yusuf Khan issuing out the Cowle when Mudaliars were the authority could be that the latter had become too weak and the power had been usurped by Yusuf Khan). Tamil.

There are 118 documents belonging to the collections in the private custody of seven different individuals. These comprise arziz, bainamas, farmans, mahzarnamas, nishans, parwanas, shuqqas and yaddashts etc. Farmans were issued by Emperors Akbar, Shah Jahan, Aurangzeb, Muhammad Shah or Shah Alam II. Nishans were issued by Sultan Jahangir when he was the Governor of Allahabad during Akbar's reign. Parwanas etc. were issued under the seals of different Nazims, Diwans, Qazis and other officials of Nawabs of Oudh. The documents cover the period 1545 A.D. to 1901 A.D. and throw light on the liberality shown to the scholars and trustees of the shrines. The language is mostly Persian and Urdu. The owners of the documents are agreeable to accord research facilities to the researchers.

Collection of S.M. Akmal Ajmal, Daira Shah Ajmal, Allahabad. (The Documents are in Persian and Urdu).

The documents listed below under S.Nos.1-101, which are in Persian and Urdu and relate to the period 1599-1901 A.D., belong to S.M. Akmal Ajmal, who is a descendent from the old priestly family of Shah Muhammad Afzal (1628-1712 A.D.), who had come to Allahabad from mauza Saidpur (Ghazipur Dist.) during Emperor Shah Jahan's reign. In recognition of his great divine powers, the Emperor asked Shah Muhammad Afzal to stay on at Allahabad and granted him a piece of land where the present Daira Shah Ajmal is situated. It was in 1650 A.D. that Muhammad Afzal laid the foundation of the Daira. In 1677 A.D. he built there a mosque and in 1681 A.D. a 'Khanqah' (monastery). After his death in 1712 A.D. his son-in-law, Shah Khubullah became the 'Sajjada' and the 'Daira' was named after him, and it was later on renamed as Daira Shah Ajmal after the name of his grandson. The owner of the collection, S.M. Akmal Ajmal is in the sixth line of direct succession of Shah Muhammad Ajmal.

89. Receipt. 12 November 1829. Issued by Bechoomal, Government Treasurer, for Rs.12/- as revenue income of mauza Kanha, pargana Chail, Suba Allahabad, remitted in the treasury by Shah Ikramullah through Mirza Hajjoo Beg.

90. Receipt (with seal). 31 November 1839. Issued by Bechoomal for Rs.105/- as revenue income of mauza Kanha, pargana Chail, Allahabad, remitted in the treasury by Shah Ikramullah through Mirza Hajjoo Beg.

91. Receipt (with seal). 1 December 1829. Issued by Bechoomal for Rs.45/2/- as revenue income of mauza Kanha, Suba Allahabad, remitted in the treasury by Shah Ikramullah.

101. Sanad (copy, with seal of Qazi Karim Ali and also signatures of witnesses). Undated. Executed by Shah Muhammad Afzal giving all movable and immovable property as 'mahr' to his wife, Bibi Mikhani.

102. Mahzarnama (with various seals). Undated (but dates in the seals range from 1213-58 A.H.; 1787-1842 A.D.). Regarding appointment of Saiyid Sadullah as Qazi of the city after the death of Qazi Saiyid Sarfraz Ali.

103. Parwana. 15 Muharram 9 Julius; 10 January 1714. Issued by Sadrus-Sadur, Mahmood Khan, regarding appointment of Maulavi Muhammad Mehdi, son of Maulavi Muhammad Hafiz, as Qazi of pargana Shahjahanpur.

104. Parwana. 22 Rabi al-sani 4 Julius; 9 June 1710. Regarding grant of daily allowance of Rs.-/8/- to Wakil Muhammad Hadi, son of Abdul Hafiz, from the revenue of pargana Shahjahanpur.

105. Parwana (with Qazi's seal). 10 December 1818. Decision by Qazi Sadullah in a case between Sohi and Mst. Maala regarding some money.

114. Nishan (copy). 1584 A.D. Issued by Sultan Jahangir transferring the grant of Mauza Jirauli Jiraula as madad-i-maash to the sons of Shaikh Hasan.

115. Farman (with seal). 2 Shaban 2 Julus; 6 October 1708. Issued by Anjad Khan granting Rs.151/- from the income of mauza Jirauli Jiraula to Shaikh Mangal, son of Shaikh Abdul Wahid.

116. Farman (copy). 22 Jumada al-awwal 13 Julus; 22 November 1730. Issued by Emperor Muhammad Shah regarding transfer of income of Rs.151/- from mauza Jirauli Jiraula to Shaikh Yahiya, son of Mangal Shaikh after the latter's death.

117. Mahzarnama. 1225-31 A.H.; 1713-18 A.D. Narrating the incident of robbery in Shaikh/Shah Muhammad, was injured.

118. Mahzarnama. 979-83 A.H. Describing how the grant of Jirauli Jiraula and various lands was given to Shaikh Fathullah and then later on transferred to Shaikh Hasan and further adding as to how these were to be distributed among different inheritors.

X. NATIONAL ARCHIVES OF INDIA

During the period 1966-67, the National Archives of India acquired the undermentioned collections and papers of eminent persons besides some press photographs. Since exhaustive lists of these are maintained separately by the Department, the documents have not been listed here. Instead, notes giving general information about their contents are given hereunder.

1. Photocopy of a letter purported to have been written by the ancestors of Nawab of Maler Kotla to the Emperor Aurangzeb.

2. Woods Collection

A collection of 42 letters written by Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose, Emile Schenkhele (wife of Subhas Chandra Bose), V.J. Patel and C. Despard to Mrs. Woods, Hony. Secretary, Indian Irish Independence League, was presented to the Ministry of Education in 1966, for preservation in the National Archives of India. The presentation was made by the then Ambassador of Ireland in India, on behalf of Mrs. Eileen M. Dey, daughter of Mrs. Woods.

The collection covering the period 1931-1946 includes also 14 newspaper cuttings, 11 photographs of V.J. Patel, Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose, Emile Schenkhele and Anita Bose as well as a resolution passed by the Indian Irish Independence League. The contents reflect clearly Ireland's sympathy and support for India during her struggle for independence.

3. Press Photographs

Five photographs of Shri Jawaharlal Nehru, Subhas Chandra Bose and Maulana Abul Kalam Azad were received from Shri P.S. Moorthi, Madras, through the Ministry of Education. These bear the following captions:

- (a) "Subhas Chandra Bose, the new President and Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru the retiring President.
- (b) Mr. Bose and Pandit Jawaharlal at the house of Mr. Jammalal Bajaj at Wardha.
- (c) The Chariot in which Mr. Subhas Bose was taken in procession to Haripura was drawn by 51 bulls. It was lent by the Maharaja of Bansda and has a legendary story relating to it.
- (d) A view of the procession with the historic rath drawn by 51 bulls in which Mr. Subhas Bose was brought to Vithalnagar.
- (e) 'Considering the next step'
The President-elect Mr. Abul Kalam Azad during an interview only the other day observed: we cannot wait indefinitely. The absence of communal settlement will not deter us from taking the next step forward".

4. 'Hari Kishan Papers

One photograph of Hari Kishan, one press cutting from 'Patriot' dated 5.6.66 and a short biographical sketch of Hari Kishan, young martyr in Freedom struggle were received in 1966. from Shri K.L. Talwar, brother of Hari Kishan.

5. N.B. Khare Papers (4th and 5th Instalment)

Dr. Khare donated to this Deptt. 5 more letters of his collection. These include letters addressed to Mrs. Indira Gandhi, dt. 28.4.66, 3.5.66, 31.5.67 & 3.6.67 and one letter to Shri Y.B. Chavan dated 3.6.67. Dr. Khare comments on Leonard Mosley's book "Last days of the British Raj", Indian secularism, the Maharashtra-Mysore border dispute and Shri Chavan's speech in the Parliament on 'Shivaji'.

6. Virendranath Chattopadhyaya Papers

The Deptt. received as a gift from Mr. S. Stromgren, President of Swedish Indian Society, Stockholm, photostat copies of 12 documents and 1 photograph of Virendranath Chattopadhyaya, when he was in Sweden, 1917-1921. The papers consist of pressclippings newspaper articles etc. dealing with India.

7. Santhanam Papers

Shri K.S. Santhanam donated to the N.A.I. 40 files of his collection of Private Papers. These consist of his correspondence, articles, speeches, notes etc., as Union Minister of State for Railways, 1948-52, Lt. Governor, Vindhya Pradesh, 1952-56; Chairman, Finance Commission, 1956-57 & Member, Official Language Commission, 1954-55; Member, States Reorganization Commission, 1954-58; Member, Community Development and Panchayati Raj Elections Committee and University Grants Commission, 1964-65. The collection also contains his editorials, articles, and book reviews in Hindustan Times. Principal correspondents are J.L. Nehru, C. Rajagopalachari, K. Gopalaswami, Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, Dr. Rajendra Prasad, G.B. Pant, and Devdas Gandhi.

8. Kommerzialrat Otto Faltis Collection

The Deptt. acquired from Kommerzialrat Otto Faltis one file containing 9 letters, 10 photographs of Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose and printed documents and pamphlets all pertaining to the activities of the Indian Central European Society, Vienna, 1934-37 and 1941.

The collection also includes letters from Dr. Rahaswamy, Y.D. Gundevia and the Indian Security Unit at Vienna to Otto Faltis on reactivation of the Indian Central European Society after the 2nd World War in 1945-1954.

9. R.C. Dutt Papers

15 original letters of R.C. Dutt were donated to this Department by Shrinati Sushma Sen, grand-daughter of R.C. Dutt. These cover the period 1904-06 and 1908. These letters were written while he was in England and contain, besides personal matters, an account of his meetings with the friends of India and efforts made by him for 'modifying partition of Bengal' and 'extended Legislative Councils'.

10. Maulana Azad Papers

The papers of Maulana Abul Kalam Azad have been received as a gift from Dr. Tara Chand. These comprise 218 letters, covering the period 1950-55. A large number of these letters do not bear any date. It, however, appears that these also pertain to the same period. These are all copies of letters written by Maulana Azad, as Union Education Minister, to his eminent contemporaries like, Dr. Rajendra Prasad; Shri Jawaharlal Nehru; Dr. S. Radhakrishnan; Ajit Prasad Jain, K.N. Katju; G.B. Pant, B.G. Kher, Mohammad Ali, Prime Minister of Pakistan, G.L. Nanda, R.R. Diwaker, T.T. Krishnamachari; K.M. Munshi, B.R. Ambedkar, C. Rajagopalchari, B.C. Roy, Sardar Swaran Singh, Shaikh Abdullah and others. In his letters to Shri Jawaharlal Nehru, Maulana Azad writes about the benefits of life insurance to the rural population, the efforts made by the Govt. to improve the economic condition of the people after independence, Foreign Christian Missionaries and their preaching of Christianity in India. While appreciates Dr. Radhakrishnan's plan to provide employment to the jobless educated youngmen of the country, advises Ajit Prasad Jain, Minister for Rehabilitation, to lay down general principles for compensation to the refugees from West Pakistan; asks K.N. Katju to consult Law Ministry in respect of amendment of Delhi Muslim Waqf Board and approves of G.B. Pant's proposal for reforming Devnagri script. In his letter to Mohammad Ali, Maulana Azad expressed his desire for the establishment of friendly relations between India and Pakistan.

11. Gandhiji's Letters

Two letters of Gandhiji dated 14.5.35 and 31.5.40 address to Ramaswami Iyengar were received as a gift from the 'Collected Works of Mahatma Gandhi'. Gandhiji wishes him success and exhorts him to finish what he had begun.

12. Helfferich Papers

Dr. Erilo Helfferich, President, East Asia Society of Hamburg-Bremen, was an agent of the German espionage system and was in touch with a number of Indian revolutionaries during World War I. These papers were received from the Ministry of External Affairs and comprise-(i) extracts from two letters of Helfferich of December 1916 and August 1918 and (ii) photocopy of a report by him on the Indo-German collaboration on South-East Asia during World War I.

13. Trial of Bhagat Singh

A typed copy of the judgment of the trial of Bhagat Singh and B.K. Datta was received from Shri D. K. Datta.

G L O S S A R Y

Adhikari - One who holds a superior office or authority; a superintendent, a ruler, a governor.

Ahalkar(Ahl-i-~~kar~~)- State official.

Altamgha - Grant under royal seal conferring title of rent-free land in perpetuity, hereditary and transferable.

Amalan- Revenue officials.

Amaldar- Officer, manager, agent, collector of revenue; farmer of revenue invested with supreme authority, both civil and military, in district farmed by him.

Amil - Collector of revenue.

Amin - A trustee, a confidential agent, a commissioner, a revenue officer, a judge and arbitrator.

Amir - Nobleman, a Muhammadan of high rank.

Amritmanohi- Funds for the support of the temple of Jagannath; allowance to the Brahmans for offering sweets to the idol, which after presentation are distributed among devotees.

Amriul-Umara- Chief of Chiefs; Muhammadan title conferred by the sovereign, at his pleasure, on some noble of the State or high ranking officer.

Ardhakar- Semi-circle.

Arzi - A petition or representation.

Arz-Mukarrar- Confirmation order.

Bainama - A deed of sale.

Basti- A Jain temple, Kanara; a village or collection of huts.

Bigha- A measure of land varying in extent in different parts of India.

Biswa - Twentieth part of bigha.

Biswadari - Proprietary tenure in biswas, or shares so designated.

Biswansi - Fraction of a biswa, usually the twentieth.

Brahman - The first of the four castes or divisions of the Hindu Society or an individual of it.

Chak - Divided portion of land.

Chaknama - A deed of land grant.

Chaudhri (Chaudhari) - The headman of the village.

Chaudhariat - Office of a Chaudhri.

Chauki - Police post.

Chaukidar - Watchman, a police or custom peon.

Chawar (Chavar)- A measure of land, 120 square bighas.

Cowle - Lease, agreement to hand over land without payment for certain period.

Daftar-i-Diwani- Revenue and Finance Department. Since Asaf Jah I, it controlled the Civil and Military administration of the four Subas of the Deccan viz. Aurangabad, Berar, Bijapur and Khandesh including Burhanpur. The hereditary custodian of this Daftar was called Sardaftar and belonged to an old noble Brahman family, known under the title of Raja Rai Rayan, Bahadur Asafjahi.

Daftar-i-Sadarat-ul-Aliya - Prime Minister's Secretariat.

Dakhal-Kharaj- Erasure of an entry, alteration of entry of names.

Dam - A coin, originally of copper, but adopted as money of account. It varied in value during different regimes.

Darbar - A Court, executive Government of any Indian State.

Dargah - A Muhammadan shrine, or the tomb of some reputed holy person, and the object of worship and pilgrimage.

Darvesh - A Muhammadan mendicant, a fakir.

Dastak - Passport, permit license etc.

Deorhi (Dewdhi) - Post.

Desai - The superintendent or ruler of a pargana or province, the principal revenue officer of a district.

Desaigiri - Office of Deasi, emoluments or fees attached to it.

Deshmukh - A hereditary officer exercising chief police and revenue authority over a district and responsible for the revenue.

Deshmukhi - The office or duty of Deshmukh.

Dharam Court - Religious court.

Dirhamp - Silver coin, usually weighing from 45 to 50 grains.

Diwan (Dewan) - A Minister, chief officer of State under Muhammadan Government; head financial minister.

Dushala (Doshala)- A woollen wrapper.

Falus - Small coin.

Farnan - A mandate, a command, a royal grant or order.

Fasli - Belonging to harvest; era introduced by Emperor Akbar.

Fatiha - A ceremony consisting of distribution of alms to the poor, accompanied with prayer for the welfare of the souls of deceased persons.

Fatwa - A Judicial sentence; a judgement; a religious decree.

Faujdar - Military Governor of a district.

Gumashta - An agent, a steward, a confidential factor, a representative, an officer employed by Zamindars to collect their rents.

Guntha - A measure of land.

Guru - A spiritual teacher or guide.

Hafiz - Keeper, preserver, guardian; a learned Muslim theologian.

Hakin - A ruler, a governor, the supreme administrative authority in a district.

Haqiqat- Statement; account; representation of circumstances as they are.

Haveli - House; mansion; land attached to a capital town or administered headquarters.

Hijri - Islamic era which dates from Muhammad's flight from Mecca.

Hukmama - A written order; award or judgement; decree of court.

Hun - Gold coin current in South India.

Huzur - Royal presence; presence of superior authority; court; government.

Id al-Zuha - Muslim festival, the festival of victims or sacrifices, held on the 10th of Zulhijja in commemoration of Abraham's offering up his son Isaac or Ismail.

Ilaka (Ilaqa) - Dependency; estate; district.

Inam - Religious head.

Inam - Gift; grant of land exempted completely or partially from payment of land revenue.

Iqrarnama - Deed of assent or acknowledgement; agreement.

Istihshadnama - Written document summoning witnesses and taking evidence.

Jagir - Hereditary or personal assignment of land and of its rent with or without conditions of service.

Jagirdar - Holder of a jagir.

Julus - Regnal year, the accession of a sovereign to his throne, his sitting on the masnad.

Junada I (Junada-al-awwal)- The fifth month of the Muhammadan year.

Junada II (Junada al-sani) - The sixth month of the Muhammadan year.

Kachcha - Unbaked.

Kahars - Potters.

Kaifiyatnama - Written statement, description, report, account.

Kahanas - Value of money.

Kalan - Great, used as the designation of a village or town.

Kaniz - A maid servant.

Kanungo(Qanungo)- Expounder of laws; a village or district revenue officer who recorded all facts concerning landed property and realisation of revenue and was paid by rent-free lands, allowances and perquisites.

Kardar- An agent, especially of the Government.

Kavalkar- A guardian, a village watchman, a protector.

Kayastha- A caste or a member of it.

Khadin- A servant, an attendant who is employed in the care of a shrine or mosque.

Khairat- Alms, charity; lands given in charitable endowments.

Khan - A title borne by Muhammadan nobles.

Khanqah - A place where a religious and holy person resides along with his followers.

Khateeb - Preacher.

Khazanchi - Treasurer.

Kheda - Elephant catching operation.

Khilat - Dress of honour presented by a superior to an inferior as a mark of distinction.

Khurd - Little, small, used as designation of village or town, in opposition to Kalan.

Khutba - A public prayer or discourse pronounced in the mosques at the Friday service, in which the ruling prince is prayed for.

Kotwal - The Chief of police in a town or city.

Lagan - The rent or revenue charged on a field or estate.

Lakhiraj - Rent-free land; land exempted for some particular reason, from paying any part of the produce to the State.

Lambardar (Numberdar)- A cultivator who, either on his own account or as the representative of other members of the village, pays the government dues and is registered in the Collector's roll according to his number.

Lambardari- The Office of Lambardar.

Madad-i-naash- Grant of means of subsistence, assignment of revenue for the support of learned or religious Muhammadans or the benevolent institutions by the government.

Mahanai- Fee levied by the Chettiar community on the total turn-over of business and which was used by them for the community welfare.

Mahant- The head of the Hindu religious establishment.

Mahr- Dower, marriage-gift or portion settled upon a wife before marriage.

Mahzarnama- A written collective attestation, a list or roll of persons present.

Makta(Magta)- Fixed customary rate either in money or in kind.

Malguzari- Revenue assessed on the estate.

Malikana- Rights, dues or allowances of zamindar or proprietary cultivator.

Manas- A measurement of land.

Mansab- Civil or military rank conferred by the Mughal rulers.

Mansabdar- Holder of a mansab.

Masjid- Mosque.

Math(Mutt)- A Hindu shrine; a monastic institution, generally carrying a large endowments of property.

Maulavi- A learned man; a teacher specially of Arabic and expounder of Muhammadan law.

Mauza- A village, hamlet, township

Mir- A Chief, a head or leader under the Muhammadans; the title of the head of department; it is also a title borne by Saiyids or those persons who claim descent from the family of Muhammad.

Mohalla - A division of a town, a quarter, a ward.

Mohar- A gold coin.

Muaafi- Remission or exemption from the demands of the state; rent-free land.

Muazzin- A public crier to prayers among Muslims.

Muchalka(Muchalika)- Bond or written agreement.

Mufti- A Muhammadan law officer whose duty was to expound the law which the Qazi was to execute.

Muharram- The first month of the Muhammadan year.

Muhtasib- Superintendent of markets and police; officer appointed to take cognisance of improper behaviour, as of indecency, drunkenness, gambling; also of sale of intoxicating drugs and liquors, and correctness of weights and measures.

Mukhtarnama- A deed appointing a representative or agent, power of attorney.

Muquaddan(Mukaddan)- A village headman responsible for management of village affairs, including collection and payment of revenues.

- Muqaddami- Relating to the office of a Muqaddam; dues paid to him by the cultivators.
- Murasa- Memorandum or despatch.
- Mutasaddi- Revenue Officer.
- Mutavalli- A person appointed to the care and management of a religious building and endowment.
- Mutt- See Math.
- Muzzin- See Muazzin
- Naib- Assistant or deputy.
- Nayak- A leader, a chief; head of a small body of soldiers.
- Nazin- Administrator, governor, or viceroy or superior officer of a province charged with the administration of criminal law and the police.
- Nazrana- Fees paid to government as acknowledgement for grant of land or any public office; gifts offered or received when people of rank meet, or pay their respects to a prince; a kind of tribute.
- Ninaz- Muslim prayer.
- Nirup- Order.
- Nishan- Mark, sign, armorial bearing, address; a letter written by a prince or any other member of the royal family.
- Pargana- Subdivision of a district.
- Parwana- An order, a written command, a letter under royal seal; licence or pass.
- Pathshala- A school, a college
- Patta- Deed of lease, document given by the Collector to the zamindar or by some other receiver of revenue to the cultivator specifying conditions on which land is held.
- Pana- Value of money.
- Peshkar- An agent, a deputy; a subordinate officer in court of law who puts up cases before the judge; a subordinate revenue officer.
- Poligar- A local chieftain in Southern India.
- Qadin- See Khadin.
- Qanungo- Village and district revenue officer; expounder of laws; official who records facts concerning landed property.
- Qaulnama- Voucher granted to revenue payers specifying terms of payment and amount; also written contract or engagement.
- Qazi- A Muhammadan judge under the Muslim governments to administer civil and criminal laws according to Quran.
- Qiladar- Commandant of a fort.
- Rabi- Spring harvest or crop sown after the rains and reaped in the first three or four months of the ensuing year.
- Rabi I (Rabi al-awwal)- The third month of the Muhammadan year.
- Rabi II (Rabi al-sani)- The fourth month of the Muhammadan year.
- Rahdari- Passport; customs pass or permit; also duties or toll collected at inland stations.
- Rajab- The seventh month of the Muhammadan year.
- Ranazan- The ninth month of the Muhammadan year.
- Robkar- Proceedings (of a case); a warrant.
- Rouza(Rauza)- A tomb; a garden.
- Rozina - Daily allowance.
- Ryot- A tenant, a cultivator.
- Sadrus-Sadur- Head of judiciary.
- Safar- The second month of the Muhammadan year.
- Sahibzada- Son of a noble or respectable man.
- Sajjada- Trustee of a shrine.
- Sajjad-gi- Trusteeship of a shrine.
- Sanad- Deed of grant; patent; document conveying to an individual the titles, privileges and rights to revenue from land etc.
- Sarai- A palace, a building for the shelter and accommodation of travellers.
- Sardar- A chief, a headman.
- Sardeshmukhi- Levy of 10% in addition to chauth exacted by Marathas from revenues of Muhammadan territories of the Deccan.
- Sarishtadar- Head officer of a court or Collector's office.
- Sarkar - Government, tract of territory under Muslim rule, corresponding to district or division under the British.
- Sawar - A rider, a horseman.
- Sepoy - A soldier.
- Shaban - The eighth month of the Muhammadan year.
- Shawwal - The tenth month of the Muhammadan year.
- Shuqqa- Royal letter, letter from a superior.
- Sikka - Coining die; royal signet; stamped coin.
- Siyaha- An account book or inventory.
- Suba - Province; also used as shortened form for Subadar.
- Subadar(Subedar)- The governor of a province; viceroy under the Mughal Government; also an Indian Officer in the East India Company's army.
- Suvadi - A palm leaf document.

Tahsildar - Collector of revenue.

Tajwiznama(Tajviznama)- A written decree, judgement or resolution.

Taka- A coin.

Takid- An order from a superior, warning, direction.

Taksimnama- Deed of partition among joint proprietors.

Taluq(Taluk)- Estate smaller than zamindari.

Taluqdar- Holder of a taluq.

Tamassuk- Bond; note of hand written acknowledgement or engagement.

Tanliknama- A deed of transfer, whether of gift or conveyance.

Tanka- A weight of silver equal to four mashes; specific coins in different metals.

Tankha (Tankwah)- Order or draft to money; bill of exchange; assignment by ruling authority of revenue of any particular locality in payment of wages; pay; gratuity or pension.

Tauliyat- Trusteeship.

Umara- Nobility under the Muslim rule.

Urs- Offerings of food, incense or lamps made by Muhammadans on various occasions at the shrines of reputed saints; it also refers to a festival held annually at the Dargah of Khwaja Muinuddin Chisti at Ajmer.

Vakil- An attorney, an authorised representative, a political agent of an Indian Chief.

Vazir(Wazir)- The principal minister under Muhammadan rule.

Vakalatnama(Vakalatnama)- Credentials, letter of authority, power of attorney.

Watan- Native country, place of residence, home.

Yaddasht- A note, a memorandum, a memorial, a petition.

Yaumiya- A daily allowance to pensioners of any kind.

Zaildar- The headman of a group of villages; revenue official mainly for collecting irrigation tax.

Zaildari- The office and rights of a Zaildar.

Zamindar- Landlord, occupant of land.

Zulhijja- The last month of the Muhammadan year.

Zulqada- The eleventh month of Muhammadan year.
