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ANNUAL REPORT, 1978

A. Some Highlights

With almost all the projects already sanctioned earlier in the Fifth Plan and the current medium term plan, the Department during the period was mainly engaged in implementation of its several programmes.

The outstanding feature of the year was the celebration of the "Archives Week" during 7—13 August 1978 by the Department to familiarise the public with our activities. Apart from holding an exhibition entitled "Our Heritage" based on old public records and private papers, it also invited "Open House" visits where visitors were allowed to see the record rooms and the techniques employed in the preservation and rehabilitation of old and fragile papers. To promote this objective further, the Films Division, Government of India was commissioned to prepare a documentary film on the National Archives of India showing glimpses of its working in different ways and duly supported by an appropriate commentary. The film was released in the last quarter of the year.

Another significant event of the period under report was the preparation of an album of coloured photo-copies of select Persian documents from Humayun's times to the close of the 19th century bearing the theme "Persian in Indian Administration", and this album was presented to the Foreign Minister of Iran on 3rd February 1978.

In the field of archival training, a major step was taken by the Training Institute with the introduction of Correspondence Course in Archives Keeping in August 1978. This course has been designed for persons engaged in record management and consultation work in various Ministries/Departments of the Government of India and the States. It also caters to the needs of the students living in the distant parts of the country interested in the archival profession.

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With the proposal for the taking over of administrative control of the Pondicherry Archives on 1st January 1979 already approved by the Department of Culture, all arrangements were completed for the take over and manning of this new regional branch of the National Archives of India. Apart from preserving the pre-1954 French records, this office would also receive semi-current and non-current records of the Central Government offices in the southern region.

Acute shortage of storage space prevented the Department from undertaking any major acquisition programme and only 6,386 files and 7 indices pertaining to Survey of India, Ministry of Works & Housing and Ministry of Law were accessioned during the course of the year. Notable additions to the Department's collection of private papers were some files and documents of the eminent scientist late Shri Shanti Swarup Bhatnagar, relating to scientific activities in India during 1940-54.

To ease the space situation, the proposal for constructing an annexe to the present building, however, remained in its final phase of preparation and the construction work is still expected to start soon.

The Record Management Division of the Department projected its activities in several ways. Various aspects of the problems connected with the implementation of Archival Policy Resolution were clarified to the Ministries and Departments and a concerted plan was introduced by the Department to streamline the system of appraisal of records in various Ministries/Departments of the Government of India. Besides, scrutiny and study of record retention schedules of various Government agencies were pursued with greater vigour. In many cases preliminary and in some cases final studies of retention schedules were continued or concluded.

The year also witnessed an appreciable increase in the number of research scholars availing themselves of the facilities afforded by the Department. A total of 767 scholars visited the Research Room of the Department to consult published and unpublished sources relevant to their research topics.

Under the Publication scheme, one more volume of *Fort William—India House Correspondence* (Volume XII, Home Public, 1793-95) was brought out. The printing of the *Resolutions of*

the Indian Historical Records Commission Volume II (1948-1973) was completed. *National Register of Private Records* Volume IX was also brought out in cyclostyle form. Besides, two issues of the Departmental journal, *The Indian Archives* Volume XXV No. 2, Volume XXVI Nos. 1-2 also came out of the press.

As for its advisory functions, the Department rendered assistance to State/Union Territory Archives in finalising their plans for the next five years. Technical advice regarding repair and restoration of records was also given to as many as 57 institutions by the Preservation Wing of the Department.

B. Archival Management

I. Accessions

(a) *Official Records*.—During the year 6,386 files and 7 indices were accessioned for permanent custody. The accession included the records of Survey of India (742 files), Ministry of Works & Housing (1200 files), Ministry of Finance (67 files), Ministry of Home Affairs (33 files and 7 indices), Ministry of External Affairs (2 files), and Ministry of Law (4,342 files). Besides, 115 authenticated copies of Bills passed by the various State Legislatures and assented to by the President of India were also accessioned.

(b) *Private Papers*.—Keeping up its efforts to acquire private papers, the following papers were acquired by the Department: a manuscript of a book, "Sayanora Singapore"; papers of the eminent scientist late Shri Shanti Swarup Bhatnagar relating to the scientific activities in India during 1940-54, from his grandson Shri Arun Bhatnagar; and three files relating to the growth of labour movement in Tatanagar acquired from Shri M. K. Ghosh., ex-M.P. The Department also received as gift a rare book viz. *Dastan-i-Turktazan-i-Hind* (five volumes) from Dr. S. M. Hyder Raza Zaidi, of Hyderabad. The book primarily deals with the medieval period of our history upto the death of Bahadur Shah II.

On the recommendations of the Historical Documents Purchase Committee, the Department acquired a collection of 72 documents, in the form of *bainamas*, *qubuliyatnames*, *qabalas*, *pattas*, *rubakars*, *ijaranamas* etc., relating to Gaya, Patna and Shahabad districts of Bihar and covering the period 1835-1935

A.D. Besides, the following were also acquired: an original *farman* of the reign of Aurangzeb, granting one-third of the share of the *Chaudharai* and *Qanungoi* of the *Parganas* of Haveli, Sarangpur and Shahjahanpur, Suba, Malwa, to Saadatmand; six manuscripts in Persian viz. *Diwan-i-Abul Faraj Rumi*; *Diwan-i-Khalis*, *Haft Aqlim*, *Jami-al-Barakat*, *Mulfuzat-i-Shah Ghulam Ali Mujaddidi*, and a family history of Salar Masud Ghazi; two manuscripts in Arabic viz. *Al-Arabian al-Wardivah-al-Suharawardiyah*; and a treatise on Islamic Prayers; seven rare printed books in Urdu viz. *Muin-al-Asar*, *Khayalat-i-Lajpat*, *Urdu-i-Mualla*; *Tarikh-i-Rashid al-din Khani*, *Gulbadan Begam Siyaa-i-Dakan* and *Tufang Ba Farhang*; sixteen documents mainly in the form of *parwanas* for the grant of *madad-i-maash* pertaining to the *Pargana* of Sandila, Sarkar Lucknow, Suba Oudh (1648-1761); and on original *farman* of the reign of Shah Alam II regarding an *Attamgha* grant.

The Committee also recommended the acquisition of rare books in English viz. *India's Services in the war* Volumes III, IV, V (United Provinces, Bengal and Punjab), *The Christian Conquest of India* by James Thoburn, *Glory and Bondage* by Edgar Snow, *Reminiscences* by Kalpana Dutt, *A Glimpse into a Maharaj's Life* by M. K. Karnik, *The Munshi—A Standard Hindustani Grammar* by M. A. Khan Haidari, *Expansion of England* by Sir J. R. Seelay, *Indian Travel Diary of a Philosopher* by Count Hermann Keyserling, edited by K. M. Munshi and Diwakar.

(c) *Microfilms*.—The Department kept up its regular programme of acquisition of microfilms of records of Indian interest from abroad through purchase, Exchange Agreements and Cultural Exchange Programmes. Under the Exchange Agreement signed with India Office Library and Records, London, 65 microfilm rolls relating to Factory Records were received. National Archives of India has reciprocated this gesture by sending 6 rolls of documents not available in the collection of India Office Library and Records, London.

Under the Cultural Exchange Agreement 3 microfilm rolls from Australia and 2 rolls from Hungary were received. Besides 4 microfilm rolls of records pertaining to the Indian National Committee in Sweden were purchased from Kungliga Biblioteket, Sweden and 3 microfilm rolls were acquired from Bibliotheque nationale, Paris.

II. Appraisal, Checking and Arrangement

(a) *Appraisal*.—Under the Record Management Programme, the appraisal of non-current records laying in the National Archives as well as in the various Ministries of the Government of India was pursued with greater vigour. The Record Management Unit completed the appraisal of 75,937 files. Out of these, 35,052 files were recommended for permanent retention. These records belonged to: Ministry of Agriculture (1895-1953), Department of Culture (1920-49), Ministry of Defence (1890-92), Central India Agency (1873-1947), Bundelkhand Political Agency (1873-1948), Chhatisgarh States Agency (1901-48), Kathiawar Political Agency (1873-1924), Eastern Kathiawar Agency (1906-44), Western Kathiawar Agency (1932-44), Malwa Political Agency (1875-1947), Orissa States Agency (1904-47), Eastern States Agency (1933-47), Gwalior Residency (1922-47), Madras Residency (1873-1937), Baroda Residency (1914-1944), Mysore Residency (1946-47), Public Works Department (1873-1923) and Railway Board (1905-52).

While the Fourth Report of the Director of Archives on the implementation of the Archival Policy Resolution during 1976-77, was printed off and issued to the Ministries/Departments, the Fifth Report has also since been printed off and is awaiting distribution.

In pursuance of the Archival Policy Resolution (Para 6) the preliminary/final studies of the retention schedules of records belonging to various Ministries/Departments were continued. These schedules of the following Ministries/Departments were vetted on the spot and reports were sent to: Ministry of Defence, Ministry of Works & Housing, Department of Agriculture, Department of Electronics, Department of Coal, Department of Cabinet Affairs, National Museum, Office of Land and Development, Prime Minister's Office and Election Commission.

Besides, preliminary scrutinies of the retention schedules of the following Ministries/Departments were made : Ministry of Labour, Ministry of Information & Broadcasting, Department of Statistics, Department of Supply, Union Public Service Commission, Ganga Basin Water Resource Organisation; Directorate General of Observatories and Kandla Free Trade Zone. Also, on the spot study of the records for formulating the retention schedules of the Ministry of Shipping & Transport, Department of Culture, Department of Food, and Indian Council of Agricultural Research, is presently in progress.

(b) *Checking and Arrangement.*— During the period the checking, arrangement and cataloguing of the following was completed: 600 files of Land & Overseas Branch (1932-39), 15795 files of War B (Secret) series (1914-19, 1922-23, 1930, 1949-57), 180 files of the Ministry of Agriculture (1948), 3452 files of the Ministry of Works & Housing (1912-52), 79 bundles of Public Works Department (Miscellaneous-Accounts, Railway Constructions, Establishment Project 1869 - 1923), 4821 bundles, boxes and Indices of Foreign Political/Political Department (Ministry of States, 1860-1954), 175 bundles of Central Board of Revenue (1860-1922), 800 bundles of the Department of Industry & Labour (1923-37), 3101 bundles, Indices & proceeding volumes of Ministry of Commerce (1860-1959), 126 bundles of Ministry of Railways (Construction, Coal & Accounts Branches) (1905-55), 893 bundles of Proceedings volumes of Finance Department (1860-79), 326 bundles of Revenue & Agriculture (1910-32), 852 Indices of Education, Health & Lands (Emigration) (1860-1948), and 1996 Proceedings volumes, Indices of Home General, Home Judicial (1860-1952).

Work on the chronological arrangement of the Inayat Jang Collection made slow progress due to shortage of men familiar with Persian written in Shikasta script. Still, about 8873 documents were arranged in their chronological order and 622 documents of the same collection were descriptively docketed.

As regards the checking and arrangement of private papers, work was completed on the following: 67,059 items and 222 files belonging to the Collections of Dadabhai Naoroji, P. K. Malaviya, M. R. Jayakar, Sitaram, P. S. Sivaswami Aiyar, B. D. Chaturvedi, Mahatma Gandhi, Raja Mahendra Pratap and Shanti Swarup Bhatnagar. Besides, 7 rolls of microfilm pertaining to records of "Indian Seamen's Union in Australia" and "The Swedish Indian Society" were also checked.

III. Compilation of Reference Media

(a) *Guide to Records in the National Archives of India.*— Compilation of the *Guide to the Records in the National Archives of India*, Part III made further progress during the year. This involved compilation of abstract lists of records, giving their contents in brief, bulk, inclusive years, annual gaps, the shelf space occupied by them and write-ups on the record series. The records covered were those of Foreign Department/Foreign & Political Department/External Affairs Department/Ministry of External Affairs (94 branches) and Political Department (6 branches).

(b) The preparation of summary inventories and subject lists of Public/Private papers also made steady progress. During the period under report, summary inventories of 18,301 manuscript pages of the Foreign Secret (1804-5) Consultations were prepared. Subject lists were also prepared of 4156 files pertaining to the various branches of Home Department (1896-1951). In addition, check lists were prepared of 27,401 files pertaining to P.W.D. (1869-1923) and Home Department (Separate Revenue 1790-1858).

Besides, subject lists were also prepared of 7,923 items of the private collections of Dr. Rajendra Prasad, Dadabhai Naoroji, P. K. Malaviya and B. D. Chaturvedi.

IV. National Register of Private Records

Compilation and editing work on the National Register of Private Records, Volume IX (1967-68) was completed and it has been since brought out in cyclostyle form. The volume covers the material received from Andhra Pradesh, Bihar, Karnataka, Punjab, Tamil Nadu, Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal during 1967-68. The work on Volume X comprising the material received during 1968-71 from the States of Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Bihar, Karnataka, Kerala, Punjab, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu and Uttar Pradesh has been completed and it is expected to be brought out shortly. The work on Volume XI (1971-77) is also in progress.

V. Research and Reference

The Department offered facilities to 766 research scholars for consulting records, published sources, microfilms and collections of private papers. Most of the scholars were Indians, but a good number of scholars had come from abroad also. (For names of the countries the foreign scholars came from, please see Appendix I. Details about all the scholars and their subjects of research are given in Appendix II). As usual, the Research Room of the Department was kept open from 9 A.M. to 8 P.M. on working days and 9.30 A.M. to 4.30 P.M. on holidays.

The Department attended to 62,290 requisitions for records from the research scholars, members of the staff and various agencies of the Government of India. Requisitions for 1,707 rolls of microfilm copies of records were also attended to during the period under report. Among 31 collections of private papers consulted

by the research scholars, special mention may be made of the following collections: Rajendra Prasad, B. D. Chaturvedi, P. D. Tandon, M. R. Jayakar, G. B. Pant, Gopal Krishna Gokhale and G. S. Khaparde.

The Departmental Library catered to requisitions from 1,609 individuals including research scholars and members of the staff of various offices of the Government of India as well as State Governments and afforded them facilities for consulting books and old periodicals etc.

Apart from rendering service to those who personally visited this Department, a number of enquiries received from the various Government Departments, semi-Government organisations, private and public institutions were also attended to, many of which involved detailed search among records and published materials. (For details please see Appendix IV).

VI. Inspection, Liaison and Advisory Work

To study the diverse problems connected with record management, Assistant Director of Archives (Record Management I) inspected the records of the Military Engineering College, Pune, and Offices of the Collector of Customs and Textile Commissioner, Bombay. Other officers of the Record Management Division inspected record rooms of following agencies; Ministry of External Affairs; Rail India Technical Economic Service Ltd., Shipping Development Fund Committee, Study Group on Wages, Incomes & Prices; Krishna Godawari Water Dispute Tribunal (all in New Delhi); Gujarat High Court, Ahmedabad; Sessions & District Court Surat; and Controller of Insurance, Simla. Reports regarding proper record management of their respective records were forwarded to them. Besides, an officer of the Record Management Division visited Ministries of Defence and External Affairs for inspection of records relating to Supply Mission, Washington.

The work of compilation of data of archival assets of different Ministries/Departments/Offices was continued. In this connection circular letters were issued to various offices of the Union Government with a view to elicit information regarding the progress made by them in recording, indexing and appraisal of files. About 81 Ministries/Departments/Offices had replied so far, and the data is being tabulated.

The Department also continued its endeavours to reactivate the State units of the Regional Records Survey Committee in the work of survey of records in private custody for the National Register. About 769 proforma of survey work done by the various units were received from various States and Union Territory of Delhi during the period under report. An Assistant Director of Archives attended the meeting of Regional Records Survey Committee held at Bhopal on 21-22 August 1978 and suggested general steps to expedite the survey work of records in private custody.

VII. Training

The major event of the year in this field has been the introduction of the correspondence course in Archives Keeping for the benefit of the officers of Central/State Government Departments who are engaged in or likely to take up record management as a profession. It will also benefit the students living in the distant parts of the country interested in the archival profession. The first session of the Course commenced with 154 candidates on roll.

Under the regular programme of imparting training in the science of Archives-Keeping, 13 out of 14 trainees of the 1977-78 session successfully completed the course and were awarded Diplomas. A new batch of 16 candidates joined the 1978-79 session of Diploma course.

Besides, the Department conducted certificate courses of training for the benefit of the officers of the Central/State Government Departments. One Session of Record Management, and two sessions of Repair of Records of 8 weeks' and 6 weeks' duration respectively were organised, in which 15 and 19 candidates respectively participated.

In addition, special facilities for observation-cum-training in Record Management, Repair of Records and Microfilming were provided to a nominee each of Regional Record Centre, Jaipur, Radhasoami Satsang Sabha, Agra and National Archives of Malaysia. Besides, one nominee each of the Governments of Tanzania and Guyana sponsored by the UNESCO were given training in various techniques of conservation of records for a period of 6 weeks' and 6 months' respectively w.e.f. 1st December 1978. (For names of the successful candidates and the marks obtained by each candidate in one year Diploma Course, as also the lists of other trainees under various schemes, please see Appendix III).

C. Preservation and Technical Service

I. Preservation and Repair of Records

Under the programme of repair and rehabilitation of records. 84,628 sheets were repaired by machine lamination, while 25,651 sheets and 838 maps were repaired by solvent lamination process, 57,528 sheets were repaired with tissue paper, and 19,500 sheets and 981 maps were freed from old patches of repair. Besides, 801 maps were mounted, 66,506 sheets were guarded, and 1,204 volumes, 1387 books, 1 map and 1424 miscellaneous items were bound, and leather preservative mixture was applied to 14,850 volumes. In addition, minor repairs were made on 1077 sheets. In all, 75 volumes and 28 bundles were air cleaned and 445 books, 75 bundles and 2 volumes were fumigated.

II. Technical and Advisory Service

As usual, the Department also provided technical service and advice to a number of institutions and individuals for preservation and rehabilitation of documents. Important among the institutions and individuals who availed of such facilities during the year were: Shrimati Paropkarni Sabha, Ajmer; Oriental Research Institute, Tonk; Indian Council of Cultural Relations, New Delhi, Bombay University Library, Bombay; Bhartiya Jnanpith, New Delhi, Guru Nanak University, Amritsar; Bihar State Archives, Patna and Department of History, M.S. University, Baroda.

Technical advice on problems connected with the repair and, restoration of records and on procurement of cellulose acetate foil, tissue paper etc. was also given to the following; Director, Rajasthan State Archives, Bikaner; Commissioner of Archives and Historical Research, Tamil Nadu, Madras; Director General, National Archives, Malaysia; Rabindar Bhawan, Visva Bharati; Principal Scientific Officer, Department of Science & Technology, New Delhi; Vrindaban Research Institute, Vrindaban; Librarian, Raza Library; Rampur; Thapar House, New Delhi; Sikkim State Archives, Gangtok; National Library, Calcutta; Director of State Archives & Museum, Srinagar; University Library, Hyderabad National Museum, New Delhi and Haryana State Archives, Chandigarh.

Besides, a Scientific Officer of the Department inspected the 'Record' Rooms of the Loknayak Jayaprakash Hospital, New Delhi and advised the authorities regarding proper maintenance

of records. He also inspected the records of *Takniki and Utpadan* Directorate, Ministry of Defence; Power Wing, Government of India; Library of the Planning Commission, New Delhi, and Central Secretariat Library, and gave necessary advice for proper maintenance of the records.

III. Photoduplication

Reprographic services were rendered to a number of institutions and individuals in India and abroad. Among those who availed of these services, mention may be made of the following, India Office Library, London, Australian National University Canberra, Reid Library, University of Western Australia, The Fisher Library, University of Sydney, Australia, Academy of Science of the German Democratic Republic, Berlin; The General Staff Branch, Army Head Quarters, New Delhi, Rajasthan State Archives, Bikaner, National Library, Calcutta, Raza Library, Rampur, The Nehru Memorial Museum & Library, New Delhi, Pay Revision Commission, Finance & Planning Department, Hyderabad, Archaeological Survey of India, New Delhi, Department of Official Languages, New Delhi, Shahji Chhatrapati Museum & Trust, Kolhapur, the Western Railway Headquarters, Bombay, The Vidyajyoti, Institute of Religious Studies, Delhi, Calico Museum of Textiles, Ahmedabad, D.A.V. College, Siwan (Bihar), Dr. Jagdish Raj, University of Queensland, Australia, Dr. Abbas S. Tashkandy, King Abdul Aziz University, Jeddah, Mr. E. Brown, United States Educational Foundation in India, New Delhi, and Major H.P.S. Ahluwalia, New Delhi.

Besides, the mobile microfilming unit of the Department visited Punjab State Archives, Patiala, to microfilm Persian records of Delhi's interest.

As part of the regular programme, microfilming of the records of Foreign Department Political Consultations, Military Department Proceedings & Finance (Mint & Finance) Department order books was continued.

The following figures indicate the output of photoduplication work during the period under report: 2,65,666 exposures of microfilm, 6,514 metres of positive printing, 1,785 enlargement prints and 1,664 xerox copies.

IV. Research Laboratory

With a view to find out their suitability and use in repair and rehabilitation of archival documents and their conservation, the Research Laboratory of the Department continued testing various preservative material available in the country, like chiffon, ledger paper glue, naphthalene and cellulose acetate foil etc.

In this connection, samples of printing paper, received from the Government of India Press, Coimbatore; cellulose acetate foil received from the International Academy of Indian Culture, New Delhi; and ledger paper received from the Ministry of Education and Social Welfare were tested in the Laboratory.

D. Publications

I. Fort William-India House Correspondence

Under Scheme I of the publication programme of the Department, Volume XII (Home Public 1793-95 Honorary Editor, Amal Tripathi) of the series was printed.

II. The Indian Archives

Volume XXV No. 2 (July-December 1976) and Volume XXVI Nos. 1-2 (January-December 1977) of the departmental journal, *The Indian Archives* were published and the typescript of Volume XXVII No. 1 (January-June 1978) was sent to the press.

III. Other Publications brought out during the period are :

IV. "Towards Freedom" Project

Search for material from the records was continued and 14,271 typescript pages of relevant material were extracted from the collections of; Home Political Records (1940-47); Ministry of External Affairs (1941-44); Rajputana Residency Records (Jaipur) (1937-47);

Central India States Agency Records (Judicial Branch) (1936-47); Central India States Agency (General Branch) (1937-38); Reforms Office (1941-45); Jayakar Papers (1937-47); Dr. Rajendra Prasad Papers (1940-41); Haig Papers (microfilm) (1937-39); and Linlithgow Papers (microfilm) (1937-38).

The records housed at the State Archives of Orissa, Uttar Pradesh and Rajasthan were also examined.

E. Personnel and Miscellaneous Matters

I. Staff

For the expansion of the Record Management Programme, a new post of Deputy Director of Archives (Record Management) was sanctioned. Besides, additional staff comprising a Hindi Translator, 2 posts of Watchman and a Saffaiwala-cum-Farash was sanctioned.

Shri L.D. Ajmani, Administrative Officer, retired from service on 31-5-78 and Shri B.S. Kalra, assumed charge as Administrative Officer on 1-6-78. On the recommendations of Union Public Service Commission, Shri M.S. Khan was appointed as Archivist (General) from 30-3-78. On the recommendations of the Departmental Promotion Committee, Shri C.P. Mathur and Shri S.S. Rekhi were appointed as Archivist (General) w.e.f. 24-8-77 and 8-11-78 respectively and Shri Rajendra Prasad as Scientific Officer w.e.f. 6-11-78.

The sanctioned strength of the Department during the period under report was 494, but for administrative reasons 80 posts were lying unfilled on 31st December 1978.

II. Conferences, Committees, and other Activities

With a view to bring archives closer to the public, an 'Archives Week' was celebrated by the Department from 7-13 August 1978 when "Open House" visits were also invited. Under this programme, 2,500 persons and school children visited the premises and acquainted themselves with the working of the Department. As part of these celebrations, an exhibition of documents was also organised entitled "Our Heritage". Besides, the Department renewed its request with the Ministry of Information & Broadcasting to prepare a documentary film on archives. The film was completed and released in the last quarter of the year.

Dr. S.N. Prasad, Director of Archives participated in the "Archives Symposium", sponsored by Committee on Archival Development, and attended International Council on Archives Bureau meeting held at Princeton, U.S.A. from March 21-24, 1978. He also attended meeting of the Executive Committee of SWAR-BICA held at Srinagar from April 6-10, 1978. As a special representative of International Council on Archives Executive Committee, Dr. Prasad attended the 'Colloquium on Oral History' at Penang, Malaysia from May 8-11, 1978, and the General Conference of SARBICA from May 12-13, 1978. He visited India Office Library and Records, London in March 1978 to discuss certain matters relating to the acquisition of microfilm copies of records of Indian interest under the Exchange Agreement which was concluded in 1975. The Director of Archives attended the 16th Annual Conference of the Institute of Historical Studies held under the auspices of the Dibrugarh University from 25-28 October, 1978 and the "Seminar on Indo-Portuguese History" held at Panaji (Goa) from 27-30 November 1978 under the auspices of the Heras Institute of Indian History & Culture.

At the invitation of UNESCO, Shri S.A.I. Tirmizi, Deputy Director of Archives attended a meeting of a Consultative Group at Paris on 1-2 June 1978.

Under Cultural Exchanges Programme, Shri M.L. Ahluwalia, Assistant Director of Archives, visited U.S.S.R. and Hungary for a period of two weeks in each country from 17 November 1978 to 16 December 1978.

Dr. N.H. Kulkarni, Assistant Director of Archives, attended the annual meetings of the Committee on Archival Development of the International Council on Archives and XVIII Round Table on Archives held at Nairobi (Kenya) from 7-13 October 1978.

Shri Ranbir Kishore, Assistant Director of Archives, was deputed to Nairobi to attend a seminar and conduct a "Conservation Workshop" organised by Kenya Archives from 13-11-78 to 25-12-78.

III. Exhibition

On the occasion of Archives Week Celebrations (August 7-13, 1978) an exhibition entitled "Our Heritage" comprising selected public records, private papers, manuscripts and photographs was organised.

IV. Hindi Section

The Hindi Section, supplied translation of official correspondence from English into Hindi and vice-versa as and when required. The Annual Report of 1977 was also translated into Hindi.

VI. Library

During the period under report, the library added to its collection 1468 books and 7376 journals, periodicals, Gazettes of India, Calcutta Gazettes, Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha Debates, etc.

In all 1679 persons including research scholars and members of the staff of various Ministries and Offices of the Government of India and States consulted books, periodicals, Gazettes etc. The Library also attended to queries made by individuals and private agencies on a variety of topics.

Besides, the Library collaborated with the Parliament Library New Delhi, in organising an exhibition on "Freedom Movement in India" by lending out books and other proscribed material. The said exhibition remained open to public from 15 to 23 December, 1978.

F. National Archives of India Regional Office, Bhopal

- (i) *Accession*.—114 books were added to the Library.
- (ii) *Checking and Arrangement*.—627 files of 20 year Revenue Settlement were checked and arranged.
- (iii) *Research and Reference Media*.—Subject lists of 4588 files pertaining to the following series were prepared : Home Judicial 'A' (1899-1910); Commerce, Telegraph, Establishment (1889-1903); Revenue & Agriculture (1861-1913).
- (iv) *Preservation*.—Special cleaning of 20,017 volumes, 88641 bundles, 9006 files, 5190 maps and 3924 carton boxes was carried out. About 1224 volumes and 412 bundles of records were fumigated; 34 bundles were labelled; 45,849 sheets and 20 maps were flattened; 3,010 sheets and 2495 files were stitched; 42,686 sheets

were guarded; 16031 sheets were repaired with tissue paper, 141 maps were mounted and 212 volumes, 25 files and 53 maps were bound during the period under report.

G. National Archives of India Record Centre, Jaipur

Accession—During the period under report the Record Centre accessioned 2,531 files pertaining to Salt Commissioner's Office, Jaipur (1908-1969), and Hindustan Salt Limited, Jaipur (1939-1969). The Record Centre also acquired 28,201 files and volumes from the Controller of Insurance, Simla. Besides, a set of 2044 published census reports (1951, 1955-61) from the Census Department, Jaipur was also accessioned.

The Record Centre also made efforts to acquire private papers lying with the former rulers/Thakurs/Zamindars of Rajasthan, and obtained 116 documents, 126 rare books and some photocopies, of documents from Shri Ram Chandra 'Vyakul', Thakur of Samod, Shrimati Laxmi Devi Kala and Shri Amar Singh.

Checking and Arrangement.—3,839 files of Tariff Commission were checked and arranged.

Reference Media.—Subject lists of 3,839 files pertaining to Tariff Commission were prepared. Besides, subject lists were also prepared of 2,531 files pertaining to Salt Commissioner's Office, Jaipur, (1908-69) and Hindustan Salt Limited, Jaipur (1939-69).

Preservation.—The formalities for the purchase of various items of preservative material and equipment were completed, and Preservation unit was equipped in stages. Besides, attending to minor repair jobs, the unit laminated 782 sheets and repaired 159 sheets with tissue paper, flattened 47,703 sheets, and stitched 566 files and 93 volumes.
