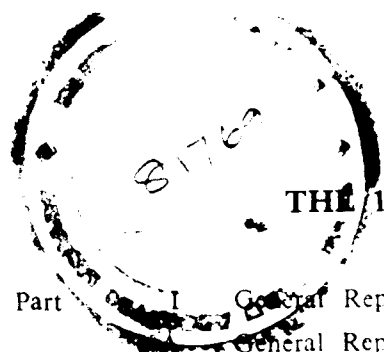

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INTRODUCTION

The Census of 1961 is distinguishable from the previous censuses in several respects. One of these in the introduction of household schedule through which economic data has been collected for the household as a whole and not in respect of each individual as has been the past tradition. This departure has been deemed necessary as in countries of such economic status as ours where not all the goods produced enter the money market and where a good proportion of the products is consumed by the family itself, collection of information on the basis of individuals is likely to be misleading unless it is supplemented by data for the entire household.

The household schedule of which a copy will be found at Appendix I of the Introduction was designed for the collection of data relating to the two chief economic activities of households of this country, namely, cultivation and household industry. Each schedule was to be filled up separately for every household and comprised three principal questions, one relating to cultivation, the other to household industry and the third to workers in cultivation or household industry or both.

Further, another schedule known as Census Population Record, a copy of which will also be found in Appendix I of this note, was printed on the reverse side of the Household Schedule and got filled up by the enumerators after the enumeration of each household had been completed. This schedule replaces the National Register of Citizens introduced at the Census of 1951 and it is hoped that, if the data given therein is brought upto date by periodical revisions, it would prove of immense use for selection of samples for future surveys. The Census Population Record contains the name of each member of the household, his/her sex, relationship with the head of household, age, marital status and nature of work in the case of a worker.

Instructions for filling up the household schedule will be found in Appendix II of the Introductory Note.

All the Household Economic tables have been

prepared on the basis of 20% sample of households which excludes institutional households. Unlike other States in whose cases the sorting of the household schedules and the tabulation of the data was assigned to the Mechanical Tabulation Officer attached to the office of Registrar General, India, the schedules of Jammu and Kashmir were sorted by hand by the Tabulation Office, Srinagar, which also attended to the tabulation work. The tables when prepared were, however, scrutinised by the Mechanical Tabulation Officer and the changes suggested by him were incorporated in them.

The following procedure was adopted for taking out the 20% sample of household schedules :—

1. All pads of household schedules of rural areas of one tehsil were arranged in order of ascending number of location codes of villages. If in a village more than one pad was used, these pads were arranged according to the serial number given to the pads for that village. Similarly all pads of urban areas in a district were arranged in ascending order of location code numbers. Within an urban area these pads were arranged in the order of block numbers.

2. After selection of the first sample schedule, the sample was continuously picked up without a break until the last pad of the tehsil was exhausted in the rural areas and the district in urban areas.

3. The sample households were indicated by stamping the selected schedule in the right hand top corner with a rubber stamp (S).

4. The sample schedules (i.e. those having rubber stamp mark) were carefully removed from the pad and tied together for a tehsil in the sequence of villages within the tehsil and in the sequence of towns in the case of urban areas, the slips having been arranged in the same order as when the samples were removed.

5. In case two or more household schedules had been utilised for a household on account of the large size of the household, all such schedules utilised for one household were con-

sidered as one schedule for the purpose of counting every fifth schedule in the pad for sample selection.

6. In counting every fifth household schedule, the schedule of institutional household was left out, the order of the sample being confined only to schedules of households.

The economic data collected at the census has been presented in seventeen tables in all. Of these, the first nine being Nos. B—I to B—IX and known as General Economic Tables, which have been built from the data collected through the enumeration slips are being printed in a separate volume. The remaining eight tables for which the household has been adopted as a unit and which are included in this publication consist of the following :—

With a view to facilitating a correct appraisal of the data, the definitions of some of the important terms which appear in the tables are given below :—

1. Household.

A household was defined as a group of persons whether or not related by blood who commonly live together and take their meals from a common kitchen unless the exigencies of work prevent any of them from doing so. If these persons were not related to each other by blood, such as members of boarding house, hostel, hotel, mess, jail or hospital, the household was classed as an institutional household.

For the purpose of census, the head of the household was defined as a person on whom fell the chief responsibility for the maintenance of the household. It was made clear that the head of the household need not necessarily be the eldest male member but may even be a female or a younger member of either sex, provided he or she was actually acknowledged as such. In the case of institutions, the manager or superintendent or the person who was regarded by common consent as the head was to be treated as the head of the household.

2. Household cultivation.

A cultivator was defined as a person engaged either as employer, single worker or family

worker in (a) cultivation of land or supervision or direction of cultivation of land owned or held from Government and (b) cultivation of land or supervision or direction of cultivation of land held from private persons or institutions for payment in money, kind or share. A person who had given out his land to others for cultivation for payment in money, kind or share of crop and who did not even supervise or direct cultivation of land was not treated as a cultivator. Similarly, a person working in another person's land for wages in cash, kind or share was not also treated as a cultivator.

3. Household industry.

A household industry was defined as an industry which was being conducted by the head of the household himself and/or mainly by the members of the household at home or within the village in rural areas and at home only in urban areas. For the purpose of the identification of a household industry and to distinguish it from a commercial activity as also with a view to elucidating the difference between rural and urban household industry, it was laid down that a household industry should conform to the following three tests :—

- Household industry should embrace manufacture, processing or servicing and may include sales but should not be confined simply to buying and selling. At least part of the goods offered for sale from the household should be manufactured or processed by members of the household.
- Household industry should be on the household scale where the workers mainly consist of the head of the household himself and/or members of the household, the role of hired workers from outside being of secondary importance. A household industry could not, therefore, be on the scale of a registered factory even though it might use machinery and employ power like steam engine or oil engine or electricity to drive the machinery.

(c) Location of the industry was made an equally important condition for proximity decides participation by members of the household. In a village this participation is possible if the household industry is located at home or within the village, because village organization is such as makes it possible for members of the household to move about freely in the village to look after their work. In urban areas, such free movement is not possible and therefore, only those industries which were located at home were treated as household industries. Where, however, part of the work was being done outside the home, e.g. preparing and dyeing the yarn for weaving or winding into warp and wool and cleaning metal surfaces before electroplating in baths, it was considered a household industry even in urban areas, as the main operation of weaving or of electroplating was conducted within the house and only one or two operations were conducted outside.

4. Family Workers.

A person who worked without receiving wages in cash or kind in his own family in an industry, business or trade conducted mainly by members of family was treated as a family worker. Such of the members of the household as attended to household duties only were deemed as non-workers and were not included among family workers.

5. Hired Worker.

A person who was employed by a household other than his own to work in any of the activities connected with cultivation or household industry for payment in cash, kind or share of the produce was treated as a hired worker. An important condition for the classification of a person as a hired worker was that he/she should have been in whole time employment during last working season or in whole time employment during current season.

APPENDIX II

INSTRUCTIONS TO ENUMERATORS FOR FILLING UP HOUSEHOLD SCHEDULE

Following are the instructions issued for filling up the household schedule:

To begin with, the enumerators were required to record on the blank space provided for the purpose, the location code of the household consisting of the number of district/tehsil/town/village/mohalla/block/building/census house/household. The household number was to be supplied by the supervisor from the houselist concerned.

If the household was an institution, such as penal, charitable or mental institution, hostel, hotel, hospital, boarding house etc., the enumerator was required to record the nature of the institution, viz., jail, hospital, etc., in the rectangle at the right hand corner of the location code.

The name of the head of the household was to be written next in the blank space immediately below that provided for location code. If the head of the household was a member of any Scheduled Caste specified in the President's order dated 22-12-1956 for Jammu and Kashmir State, the fact was to be indicated by writing the letters "SC" within the parallelogram printed at the right hand side of the schedule against the full name of the head of the household marked "SC/ST". It was made clear to enumerators that there were no scheduled tribes in the State. In the case of those not belonging to any Scheduled Caste, the enumerators were instructed to write 'X' in the parallelogram.

As will be seen from the household schedule, it consists of three parts, viz. cultivation, household industry and workers at cultivation and/or household industry.

Sub-part 'A' relating to cultivation was to be filled in only where the household cultivated land or gave the land to private persons for cultivation for payment in cash, kind or share. Three categories of land are given in items 1 (I), 1 (II) and 2 of this part. It was made clear that items 1 (I) and 1 (II) relate to land actually cultivated by the household and that item 2 refers to such land which is not cultivated by the household, but has been

given by it to private persons for cultivation for payment in money, kind or share. In each of the three cases the total of separate plots or parcels of land in different places owned or held or taken or given were to be made and entered at the appropriate place provided in the schedule. If a household (a) cultivated land owned or held from Government or taken from private persons or institutions or (b) had given land to private persons or institutions, the local name of the right on such land was required to be ascertained and recorded in the column relating to 'local name of right on land.'

Categories 1 (I) and 1 (II) were to include only those plots and parcels of land which were cultivated by the household itself, i.e. lands which lie within the village or in adjacent villages, or within such a distance as would enable the household to work on the land or actively supervise the cultivation. Lands owned or held in distant places where distance itself was a bar to active cultivation or its supervision or direction were not to be included in either of these items. On the other hand, category 2 was to include land in any part of the country whatsoever. In such cases the aggregate area of all lands, no matter where these were situated, was to be recorded in the appropriate column.

With regard to households which actually cultivate land, the enumerators were asked to ascertain the extent of land in each category of local right in acres and to record the same in the column relating to 'area in acres'. In the case of separate plots or parcels of land under the same right situated in different places, the aggregate area was to be written.

This sub-part did not apply to households which did not possess any land. Thus, it did not apply to households consisting of agricultural labourers only without any land(s). In such case, an 'X' was to be recorded in all the spaces provided in the right hand side and a bold cross was to be drawn on the sub-part.

Sub-part 'B' relates to household industry.

This part was to be filled up only where a household industry was being conducted by the head of the household himself and/or mainly by members of the household at home or within the village in rural areas and at home only in urban areas. The enumerators were instructed not to treat as household industry an industry which was of the scale of a registered factory.

The enumerators were asked to ascertain from the head of the household whether there were any household industries and if so, to write the nature of industry(s) in the column provided for the purpose. He was next to enquire the number of months in a year for which these were being conducted and to record the same in the appropriate column.

If no household industry was being conducted by a household, the enumerators were required to write 'X' in each of the places in the right hand corner and to put a bold cross on the sub-part.

Sub-part 'C': In the case of households engaged only in cultivation, if the head of the household was working, the figure '1' was to be written under the column 'head'. Similarly, the numbers of male and female numbers of the family who were also working in cultivation were to be recorded in the respective columns provided for the purpose. The total of all the three columns was to be recorded next. The enumerator was then to ascertain the number of hired workers, if any, employed and to enter the same in the last column. It was, however, impressed on the enumerators that a hired worker was a person who was in wholtime employment during the last or the current working season.

Similar entries were also to be made in the case of households engaged in household industry only.

If a household was engaged both in cultivation and household industry and not in one of these only, the digit '1' for the head of the household and the sex-wise number of family workers, if working, were to be written in the appropriate columns against item 3. The total of all the family workers including the head of the household was to be recorded next. Here again, the number of hired workers engaged by the family both for cultivation and household industry, if any, was to be noted in the last column against this item.

The letter 'X' was required to be written in all the columns against 'household industry only' and 'both in household cultivation and household industry' in the case of such of the households as were engaged in cultivation only. Similarly the letter 'X' was to be written in the columns relating to 'household cultivation only' and 'both in household cultivation and household industry' in respect of households engaged in household industry only. With regard to the third category, namely households engaged both in cultivation and household industry, the letter 'X' was to be entered in the columns against 'household cultivation only' and 'household industry only'. Where, however, the household was not engaged in household cultivation or in household industry or in both, letter 'X' was to be recorded in all the columns of the three categories and a bold 'X' drawn across the sub-part.

The table has been prepared upto district level for all areas and the urban sector and upto tehsil level for rural areas only and accounts for all households except those classified as institutional households. It gives the distribution of the households according as they are engaged in cultivation only, household industry only or both or neither.

According to the data given in this table, 18% households in the State are engaged in activities other than cultivation and household industry. The proportion of households which do not run any household industry and are engaged in cultivation only stands at 62%. In striking contrast with this, the proportion of households which do not cultivate any lands but are engaged in household industry only is 4%.

Srinagar, Jammu and Kathua are the only districts in the State where the proportions of households engaged neither in cultivation nor household industry exceed the corresponding proportion for the State. In other districts, the proportion of households of this category varies from 5% of Doda district to 11% of Udhampur.

The highest proportion of households engaged in cultivation only has been returned from Poonch district. Baramulla ranks next with 77% households as against 80% of Poonch. Except for Ladakh, the corresponding proportions in the remaining districts

of the State vary from 55% to 70%. In district Ladakh, however, no more than 6% of the total number of households are engaged in cultivation only. This is because the proportion of households which besides cultivating lands also run some household industry, is exceedingly high.

The highest proportion of households engaged in household industry only has been returned at 11% from Srinagar district. In other districts the proportion ranges from 1% to 4% only.

The high incidence of households engaged both in cultivation and household industry in district Ladakh is due to the non-availability of alternative avenues of employment. What is more, due to the inaccessibility of the area, the size of imports made from outside the district is insignificant and almost every household is engaged on a small scale both in cultivation and household industry but the produce is just sufficient for domestic consumption only.

Srinagar and Jammu are the only districts where the percentages of households engaged both in cultivation and household industry are comparatively very small, being 9% in the case of Srinagar and 3% so far as Jammu is concerned. In other districts, the corresponding proportions vary from 12% of Poonch to 34% of Doda.

The table consists of two parts, one dealing with the Rural sector and the other pertaining to Urban areas only. The former has been prepared upto tehsil level and the latter down to districts only.

As is clear from column 1, the data given in the table relates only to such of the households which actually cultivate lands (i) owned or held from Government (ii) held from private persons or institutions for payment in money, kind or share or (iii) partly held from Government and partly from private persons for payment in money, kind or share. The table does not include households which give their lands to private persons for cultivation for payment in money, kind or share.

Further, cultivating households referred to in column 2 of the table represent both such of the households as are engaged in cultivation only as also those which, besides cultivating land, also run some household industry. In other words, the figures given in column 2 of this table are the sum total of corresponding figures of columns 5 and 7 of the previous table for Rural and Urban sectors.

Appendix II appearing at the end of the Introductory Note gives the detailed definitions adopted for the classification of lands according to the interest of household concerned in the land cultivated.

According to the table, 58% cultivating households in the Rural sector own or hold

from Government the lands cultivated by them. This is by far less than the All-India proportion of rural ownership holdings which stands at 76% of the total number of cultivating households. The main reason for this disparity is that in Jammu and Kashmir only 53% cultivated land is owned or held from the Government whereas the All-India average of similar areas is as high as 77.6%.

Mixed tenancies rank next, the corresponding percentage of such rural households being 34% of the total number of cultivating households. The size of the land cultivated by these households is, however, proportionately larger and equal to about 40% of the total cultivated area. The proportion of households of this category in India as a whole does not exceed 15% but the area of the land cultivated is proportionately higher than that of ownership holdings.

Pure tenancies claim only 8% of cultivating households in the State. This is almost the same as the corresponding proportion of such households in the whole of India which stands at 7.7%. The area under the cultivation of pure tenancies in the State is proportionately larger, being 7% of the total cultivated land as against the All-India proportion of 4% only.

The subjoined table gives the size of land, the percentage of households and of the land cultivated according to interest in land separately for rural and urban areas of the State :—

According to the data given in the statement, over 75% rural households cultivate lands of varying sizes not exceeding 5 acres. The aggregate area cultivated by households of this category is about 44% of the total cultivated area. It is also clear that this area is shared almost in equal proportion by households with ownership rights and pure and mixed tenancies. The second important sector consists of households whose holdings vary from 5 to 15 acres. They comprise 23% of the total number of cultivating households only, but the area under cultivation in this case is proportionately much larger, being about 46% of the total cultivated land. As in the case of holdings with less than 5 acres, the proportions of land cultivated by the three categories of households are more or less the same in this case also.

Among urban cultivating households, 83% cultivate lands measuring less than 5 acres in

each case. The proportion of land cultivated by this category is comparatively very small and stands at only 47% of the total cultivated area. Except for pure tenancies, which claim a slightly higher proportion, the cultivated area is more or less equally shared by households with ownership rights and mixed tenancies.

Households whose holdings vary from 5 to 15 acres are smaller in number, being only 15% of the urban cultivating households but the area cultivated by this category is relatively much larger and stands at 36% of the total cultivated area. Another distinguishing feature of these households is that the proportion of pure tenancies is smaller than those of ownership and mixed tenancies.

This table has also been prepared separately for the rural areas upto tehsil level and for the urban sector down to districts only. The data given in the table relates to households which are engaged in cultivation only and not to those engaged both in cultivation and household industry. As before, the institutional households have not been accounted for while taking out the sample.

The table is designed to give the classification of cultivating households according to the size of land cultivated, each such class being further cross-tabulated with reference to the number of hired workers and sexwise number of family workers. Ten class ranges of land have been devised ranging from less than 1 acre to 50 or more acres. An additional class has been provided to cover households in whose cases the size of land could not be ascertained.

The definitions of family workers and hired workers adopted for the Census of 1961 are given in the Introductory Note.

It is clear from the part of the table relating to rural areas that the overall proportion of hired workers to total number of workers is less than 3%. There is no material disparity between this proportion and of holdings of smaller size measuring less than 7.5 acres. In the case of households cultivating lands the size of which varies from 7.5 to 12.4 acres, the corresponding proportion stands at 4%. In other size classes, except 12.5 to 14.9 acres and over 50 acres, the proportion of hired workers to the total number of workers does not exceed 6%.

Households with holdings from 12.5 to 14.9 acres are, however, conspicuous for the employment of 10% workers as agricultural labour. This high incidence is particularly reflected in the districts of Srinagar and Jammu where the big landed estates of many people have been scaled down and limited to about 23 acres inclusive of the land in residential occupation, vegetable and flower gardens and the like.

The proportion of hired workers in respect of land exceeding 50 acres stands at 30% of the total number of workers. This is, as it

should be, in view of the large size of land which needs substantial external assistance besides employment of family workers.

It is clear from the table that the proportion of households with one worker only to total number of cultivating households is about 30%. The corresponding proportion of workers of this category to the total number of family workers is, however, very low and does not exceed 12%.

The proportion of households which employ 2 persons for cultivating their lands is even higher and stands at about 33% of the total number of cultivating households. Unlike households with one worker only who consist mostly of males in all size classes of land, the proportion of female workers in households employing 2 persons is fairly large and in certain cases about half of the corresponding male proportion. The table shows that the number of hired workers in this category is exceedingly small and represents a very small fraction of the total number of workers.

The proportion of households with 3-5 persons engaged in cultivation is also about 33% of the total number of cultivating households. An important feature of this category with holdings of less than 12.5 acres is that the proportion of female workers is more than half the corresponding proportion of male workers. The incidence of hired workers is, however, more pronounced in this case than in households with lesser number of workers.

Households with 6 to 10 workers employ even a greater proportion of females. In this case the overall proportion of females is about 75% of the corresponding proportion of males. In certain size classes such as 12.5 to 14.9, the proportion is even higher.

As households of this category do not constitute more than 4% of the total number of cultivating households, the number of hired workers employed is numerically small but their proportion to the total number of workers is relatively high and stands at 4%.

In this case also two sets of tables have been prepared upto district level, one for the rural and the other for urban areas of the State. The table gives the code numbers and detailed description of household industries according to Indian Standard Industrial Classification upto major groups except industries under such other major groups which claim less than 10% households in the respective divisions. The latter have been given in an abbreviated form in the appendix accompanying the table. The divisions thus affected are marked with an asterik (*).

The statistics given in the table relate to households engaged both in cultivation and household industry and not to households which are engaged in cultivation only. It shows by cross-tabulation the distribution of households, engaged in a particular household industry, by the size classes of land referred to in Table B—XII.

The definition of Household Industry is given in the Introductory Note.

A comparison of the rural parts of Tables B-XII and B-XIII shows that the number of households engaged both in cultivation and household industry is comparatively small and does not exceed 21% of all kinds of households engaged in cultivation.

It is clear from the rural part of Table B-XIII that over 73% households manufacture various products falling under Manufacturing Industries (Division 2 & 3) and not more than 27% cultivating households run industries relating to agriculture, forestry, fishery, hunting, etc. (Division 0). Except for a very small number of households all the households of latter category are engaged in production and rearing of livestock and hunting. In the case of Manufacturing, 54% households produce Woollen textiles only. Of these, about 89% have been returned from the districts of Anantnag, Baramulla, Ladakh and Doda alone. Other important Manufacturing industries in which more than 10% households are engaged, consist of Foodstuffs and Textile-miscellaneous.

The table consists of two parts. Part A gives the distribution of households for all areas of the State, its territorial divisions and districts and their rural and urban sectors by the number of persons employed and the divisions and major groups under which the principal household industries are classifiable according to the Indian Standard Industrial Classification. Part B of the table indicates the names of the industries by minor groups and the distribution of households engaged in such industries for all areas down to the districts and their rural and urban sectors. It does not, however, give the classification of households by the number of persons employed.

Industries under such major groups which claim less than 10% households of their respective divisions have been omitted from Part A of the table and listed in an abbreviated form in the appendix accompanying the table. The divisions thus affected are marked with an asterik (*).

A distinguishing feature of the table is that it relates to households engaged in household industry only and excludes all others engaged in cultivation only or cultivation and household industry.

The definition of Household Industry has already been given in the introductory note. The following observations are deducible from the data given in the table:—

(a) No less than 88% households in the State, as a whole, are engaged in Manufacturing Industries (Division 2 & 3) and a substantial proportion of these produce Miscellaneous Textiles (Major Group 27). Part B of the table shows that among the industries falling under this major group, the largest number of households is engaged in Embroidery Patch-work.

(b) Of the total number of households engaged in household industry, about 52% belong to the urban sector. These are particularly reflected in Manufacturing Industries and are mostly engaged in Embroidery Patch-work, one of the industries under Textile-Miscellaneous. This is also true, though not to the same extent, of the production of traditional garments.

Other industries in which relatively larger number of households is engaged fall under Major

groups 25, 28, 36 and 39 and consist of (1) Weaving of woollen cloth in Handloom (2) Spinning of wool by Charkha or Takali (3) Embroidery with various colours, combination of various threads and artwork in woollen textile (4) Manufacture of wooden furniture and fixture (5) Manufacture of structural wooden goods (including treated timber) such as, beams, posts, doors, windows (6) Lacquerware (if on wood) (7) Manufacture of agricultural implements, such as plough-share, khurpi, kudal, etc. (8) Nickel plating and electroplating (9) Goldsmithy (10) Silver art-ware, etc.

(c) The most important industry in the rural sector is rearing of cows for milk and animal power which falls under Livestock and Hunting (Major group 04). Other industries which provide employment to a comparatively large number of households consist of (1) Production of traditional garments (Major group 27) (2) Making of earthenware (Major Group 34-35) (3) Making of leather boots, etc. (Major group 31) (4) Spinning of wool by Charkha (Major group 25) (5) Production of flour by village Chakkies (Major group 20) (6) Manufacture of wooden furniture (Major group 28) (7) Manufacture of agricultural implements (Major group 36).

(d) In the State as a whole, 53% households consist of those which employ one person only. Households engaging 2 persons rank next, the corresponding proportion being 28%.

(e) In the rural sector, the proportion of households engaging one person only is the same as of similar households for the entire State but the corresponding proportion in the case of households employing 2 persons is 29%.

(f) Urban households employing one and two persons are in the proportion of 2 : 1, the aggregate proportion of both the categories to the total number of urban households being about 80%.

(g) Households employing only one person mostly manufacture Miscellaneous-textiles. Other numerically important households of this category consist of those engaged in manufacture of wood and wooden products, textile-wool, foodstuffs, livestock and hunting, leather and leather products, basic metals and their products and miscellaneous manufacturing industries.

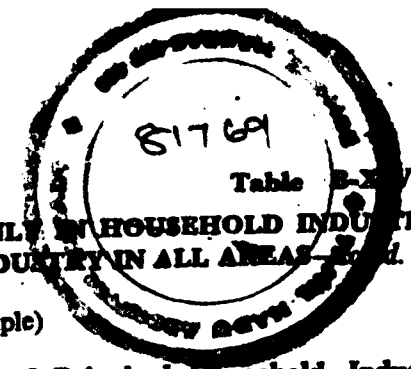

The table has been prepared upto tehsil and district level for rural and urban areas respectively. It indicates the distribution of households by various size classes of land classified by the number of persons employed in both cultivation and household industry. The definitions of family and hired workers have already been given in the Introductory Note.

Column 2 of the rural part of the table shows that about 62% households cultivate lands varying from 1 to 4.9 acres. These include about 32% households with 3 to 5 workers. The proportions of households with less than 1 acre and of those with 5 to 7.4 acres holdings are also high, but whereas the former are dominated by households with 2 workers the latter mostly consist of households with 3 to 5 workers.

It also transpires from the table that the number of hired workers is not related to the number of households. That is why 96 households only with more than 10 workers employ 1355 hired workers as against 9586 households with 3 to 5 persons which do not engage more than 425 hired workers in the aggregate.

The number of urban households engaged both in cultivation and household industry is exceedingly small. Of these, 72% have land holdings of less than 2.5 acres.

An important feature of the urban part of the table is that except for households with holdings above 15 acres, the incidence of hired workers in all other size classes is insignificant.

The table gives for all areas and their respective rural and urban sectors upto district level the number of households, their family workers by sex and hired workers classified by the number of months in a year for which each household industry is being run by the households concerned. The data has been shown collectively and separately in respect of the households engaged in both cultivation and household industry and households engaged in household industry only. In this case also the code numbers and names of industries have been given according to the Indian Standard Industrial Classification upto Major groups. Such of the industries which claim less than 10% households of the Division concerned have, however, been omitted from the table and listed in the appendix. The divisions thus affected are marked with an asterik (*). The terms Household Industry and Cultivation have already been defined in the Introductory Note.

It is clear that the incidence of hired workers is more pronounced in category 'a' viz, households engaged both in household industry and cultivation than in category 'b', namely, households engaged in household industry only. Further, female family workers in category 'b' claim a much lesser proportion than that of female family workers in category 'a'.

In the State as a whole, the largest proportion of households of categories 'a' and 'b' put together consists of those which run industries for more than 10 months in a year. Those working for 1 to 3 months and 4 to 6 months are more or less in equal proportion but others which carry on the industries for 7 to 9 months only claim

a small proportion. This is also true of all households in the State engaged in both cultivation and household industry. In the case of households engaged in household industry only, the corresponding proportion of households running industries for more than 10 months in a year is still higher and stands at 73%.

What has been stated in the preceding paragraphs regarding the collective position of both the categories of households for the State as a whole holds good in the case of all households of rural sector.

There are very few households engaged in both cultivation and household industry in the urban sector. Others engaged in household industry only claim relatively a very high proportion. Most of these run industries for over 10 months in a year.

It is also clear from the table that 73% of the aggregate number of households, engaged in Agriculture, Livestock, Forestry, Fishing and Hunting, etc. (Division 0) are reflected in the Major group 04—Livestock and Hunting and run this industry from 10 to 12 months in the year. All these have been returned from the rural sector and mostly consist of households engaged both in cultivation and household industry.

Of the total number of households in all areas which fall under Manufacturing (Division 2 and 3), those belonging to the rural sector and engaged in Textile-Wool (Major group 25) claim 42%. More than half of these run household industries for not more than 3 months in a year.

Other household industries which claim a large number of households consist of Textile-Miscellaneous (Major group 27) and Foodstuffs (Major group 20). In the former case, majority of households run the industry for more than 10 months in a year. Most of these have been returned from the urban

sector and are engaged in household industry only. In the case of Foodstuffs, over 40% households run industries for more than 10 months. These are mostly reflected in the rural sector and consist of households engaged both in cultivation and household industry.

The table gives the distribution of rural households other than those classed as institutional households according as they are (a) engaged neither in cultivation nor in household industry (b) engaged in household industry only (c) engaged in cultivation only and cultivation and household industry. Category (c) has further been sub-classified into ten holding groups according to the size of land cultivated by them.

The table also gives the total and sex-wise population of the sample households of each category and their distribution by five size classes of households. In the case of category (c) this classification has also been shown in respect of each size class of land. The table further indicates the distribution of urban households of all categories put together by the number and sex-wise population of each size of households.

The actual number of all households and their population (except institutional population) as returned at the 1961 Census for the State, its Divisions and Districts and their respective rural and urban sectors is given in the table at the end of the data relating to each territorial unit.

The terms Cultivation and Household Industry have already been defined in the Introductory Note.

It is clear from column 2 of the table that about 90% households in the rural sector are

engaged in cultivation. These include over 56% households whose holdings vary from 1 to 4.9 acres. Further, the average population of a household engaged in cultivation stands at 5.7 persons. Similar averages for those engaged in household industry only and for those engaged neither in cultivation nor in household industry work out to 4.8 and 4.3 persons respectively.

Households with a population of 4 to 6 members each constitute the largest size class and claim 43% of the total number of the households in the State. Households with 7 to 9 members rank next, the corresponding proportion being over 22%. This is also true of the rural sector as a whole and of rural households engaged in cultivation.

The distribution of households according to size of land cultivated shows that majority of households in all size classes of land generally consist of those with 4 to 6 members. Households with 7 to 9 members rank next except in the case of households whose holdings do not exceed 2.4 acres. In this case 2 to 3 member households claim the next highest majority.

Of the total number of households in the State 15% have been returned from the urban sector. Like rural households, most of these consists of 4 to 6 members.
