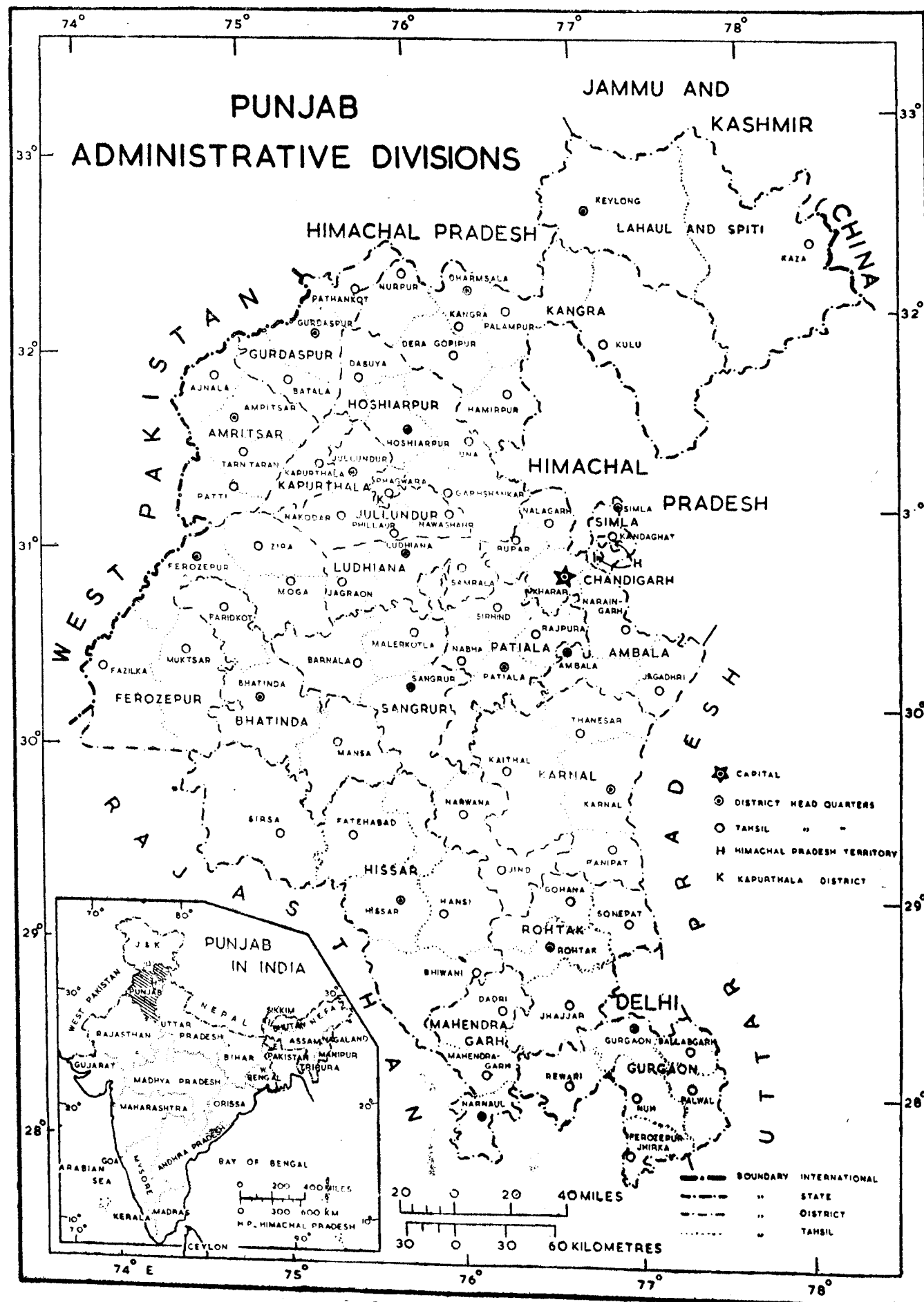

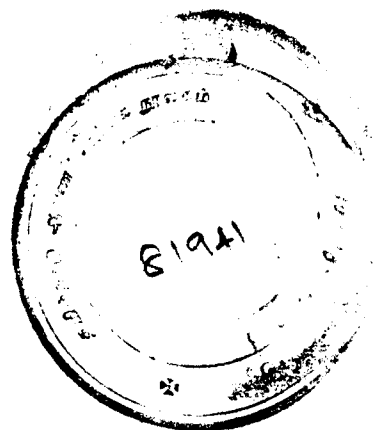

PREFACE

The amount of information collected during the 1961-census was so large and its processing into Tables has been in such detail as to require a number of books to present the results. An idea of the topics on which information was collected may be had by a glance at the three forms reproduced at pages 245, 258 and 259-260. The Tables have been grouped under six series, as explained on page 5. And the books that have been published or will be published, have been listed on the page opposite to this.

This book (Part II-A) contains four main Tables belonging to the A series and the Primary Census Abstract. **Table A-I** gives information in regard to area, number of villages and towns, number of occupied houses, and the 1961 population, for rural and urban areas of each District and Tahsil, and for each town. The Table is followed by three appendices. The first appendix shows the territorial changes in Districts, Tahsils and towns that took place during 1951-61. The second appendix shows the number and population of villages having 5,000 or more persons, and of towns having less than 5,000 persons. A list is also given of places with population less than 5,000 treated as towns for the first time in 1961, and places with population less than 5,000 which were treated as towns in 1951, but not so in the 1961-census. Appendix III gives figures for the houseless and institutional population.

Table A-II shows the population of each District at the time of decennial censuses held since 1901 and the inter-censal variations. This is followed by a statement showing the 1951 population for each District as composed in 1951 and in 1961.

Table A-III shows the distribution of inhabited villages and rural population according to villages of different population ranges. Towns have been arranged under six classes according to the size of their population in 1961. **Table A-IV** gives under each class, the population of each town in different census years since 1901, and decade variations. The area components and some other particulars about towns are given in the appendices following the Table.

In the **Primary Census Abstract** the following information is given in regard to the rural and urban areas of each District and Tahsil and for each town:—

- (i) Area;
- (ii) Residential houses and households;
- (iii) Population, by sex;
- (iv) Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes persons;
- (v) Literates and educated persons;
- (vi) Total workers and their distribution into nine industrial categories; and
- (vii) Non-workers.

I am deeply indebted to Shri Asok Mitra, I.C.S., Registrar General and *ex-officio* Census Commissioner, India, whose experienced handling of the 1961-census operations made the work at the State level less arduous. His affection gave us strength and confidence, and his devotion to work has always been inspiring.

I am grateful to Shri D. Natarajan, Deputy Registrar General, India, for his guidance in technical and administrative matters. I am thankful to Shri K. D. Ballal, Central Tabulation Officer and his staff, who checked the Tables for accuracy, and made valuable suggestions for their presentation.

(at Ambala), Shri Sukhdev Prasad, P.C.S. (at Patiala), Shri C. D. Khanna, P.C.S. (at Jullundur), and Shri V. P. Capoor, P.C.S. (at Chandigarh). In the final stages heavy work devolved on Shri Pawan Kumar, Tabulation Officer and Shri Goverdhan Dass Singla, Statistical Assistant, and mention need also be made of two of their helpers, Shri Dharam Pal Jain, Tabulation Assistant and Shri Sant Ram, Supervisor. 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INTRODUCTION

A country set on the path of planned social and economic development requires accurate information on a large number of topics. The consumer demand on the 1961-census Organisation was consequently very heavy, and the Registrar General must have been hard put to it for maintaining balance between this demand, and on the supply side the capacity of the enumerators, the ability of the common man, and the limitation imposed by time for completing the enumeration. The census questionnaires which he devised with extreme patience, were discussed at length over a number of times in meetings and conferences. These questionnaires were then tried in selected areas in different parts of the country with a view to examining the appropriateness of the questions and adequacy of space provided for recording the replies. The work of pretesting the questionnaires in Punjab was entrusted to the Economic & Statistical Adviser to Government, Punjab, whose services were later requisitioned for conducting the census in the State. With the assistance of his field staff he tried these questionnaires in selected localities of six towns and six villages. Later, in a conference of State Superintendents the questionnaires were remodelled and adopted finally.

The printing of Houselist Forms, Household Schedules, Individual Slips and allied schedules was a huge operation. The Registrar General arranged for the printing of questionnaires. The material was translated into Hindi, Punjabi and Urdu by the State Superintendent of Punjab.

Six Stages—The census operations were executed in six main stages. One, the available maps of the State, Districts, Tahsils, and Towns were secured and brought up-to-date by incorporating jurisdictional changes during the decade. On the Tahsil maps the village boundaries were drawn so as not to leave out any area unaccounted for. In the Town maps the wards and sub-wards were drawn so as to identify each locality. Maps for smaller areas on bigger scales were prepared and enumeration blocks were carved in them. Lastly, a code number was assigned to each District, Tahsil, Town and Village, and wherever necessary, sub-numbers were assigned to Enumerators' Blocks.

Two, the staff for census work was appointed in co-operation with the State Government. The State Superintendent had already been appointed by the Ministry of Home Affairs and to work under him were required: one District Census Officer (from P.C.S. cadre) for each District; a Charge Officer for each Tahsil (Tahsildar) and important Town (Secretary of the Municipality); a Supervisor for each census circle; and an Enumerator for each census block. Besides, four whole-time Deputy Superintendents were appointed (from I.A.S. or P.C.S. cadres) for giving training to the field staff and for general supervision of work in the zones allotted to them.

Three, each building and census house in it, whether vacant or occupied, was numbered and this number was painted on its main entrance. Particulars about the use and inmates of each census house were recorded on the Houselist. Simultaneously, notional maps were prepared, indicating the location of each building in the Enumerator's Block.

Four, arrangements were made for the training of staff. In the first instance, the District Census Officers were given thorough training in the concept of terms used in connection with census and method of filling in the questionnaires. The District Officers in collaboration with Charge Officers trained the junior staff. This training programme was supplemented by the Deputy Superintendents who toured extensively in their assigned zones.

Five, enumeration. The census moment, i.e., the point of time to which the population figures should relate, had been fixed as the sunrise of the 1st March, 1961. The enumeration, however, was spread over a period of 19 days, i.e., from the 10th February to 28th February, 1961. The houseless persons were enumerated during the night between the 28th February and 1st March, 1961.

Six, a revisional round was made by Enumerators to each household from the 1st to 5th March, 1961 verifying the record. Children born in the interval between the first visit to the household by the Enumerator and the sunrise of the 1st March, 1961, were then recorded. Similarly, the slips for

the persons who died during this very period were cancelled. During the revisional round slips were also filled in for such persons in households and houseless people who were ascertained as not having been recorded before.

Non-synchronous Census—In Kulu Tahsil and Bara Banghal area in the Kangra District, and Lahaul & Spiti District, which get snow-bound in winter, enumeration was, however, completed in September, 1960. Check-posts on the frequented routes to these areas were then established. To the persons travelling out were issued identification slips at these posts, testifying that they had been enumerated and should not be enumerated again; and those who moved into these areas were enumerated here up to the 1st March, 1961, if not enumerated before.

Data were recorded on (1) the Houselist, (2) the Household Schedule and Census Population Record, and (3) the Individual Slip; and their contents are explained below.

Houselist—The Houselist consisted of a broad sheet on which particulars could be recorded for twenty census houses. Besides, the space provided at the top for the name and code number for the District, the Tahsil/Town and the Village/Ward/Mohalla, there were the following eighteen columns on the Form :—

1. Line No. (referring only to line on the Form).
2. Building Number (Municipal or local authority or Census Number, if any).
3. Building Number (col. 2) with sub-number for each census house.
4. Purpose for which census house used, e.g., dwelling, shop, shop-cum-dwelling, business house, factory, workshop, school or other institution, jail, hostel, hotel, etc.

If this census house is used as an establishment, workshop or factory (cols. 5 to 8)—

5. Name of establishment or proprietor.
6. Name of product(s), repair or servicing undertaken.
7. Average No. of persons employed daily last week (including proprietor, or household members, if working).
8. Kind of fuel or power, if machinery is used.

Description of census house (cols. 9 and 10)—

9. Material of wall.
10. Material of roof.

In case the census house is used for dwelling (cols. 11 to 14)—

11. Sub-number of each census household with census house number (col. 3).
12. Name of Head of household.
13. No. of rooms in census household.
14. Does the household live in own or rented house?

No. of persons residing in census household on the day of visit (cols. 15 to 17)—

15. Males.
16. Females.
17. Total.
18. Remarks.

Household Schedule—The Household Schedule consisted of two parts: Part I, Household Schedule, and Part II, Census Population Record. One Form was filled in for each household. In Part I, after recording the name of the Head of a household and whether he belonged to a Scheduled Caste or Scheduled Tribe, the following particulars were noted about the household:—

- A. If the household was engaged in cultivation, the area of land cultivated as owner and tenant, separately, as also any owned area leased out for cultivation. The area let out for cultivation by non-cultivating owners was also recorded;
- B. If the household was engaged in a household industry, the nature of the industry, and number of months in a year it was conducted; and
- C. Number of members of the household and any hired workers pursuing household cultivation, household industry, or both these activities.

The Part II of the Schedule was filled in from Individual Slips. The following particulars were noted on it for each person in the household:—

Name;
Sex;
Relationship to Head;
Age;
Marital Status; and
Description of work in the case of worker.

The Household Schedules were utilised for compiling statements on the size and composition of households, activities of the working members, size of operational holdings, and working of household industries. The Census Population Record in Part II of the Schedule replaces the National Register of Citizens prepared in the 1951-census.

Individual Slip—This most important Form, printed on one side of a sheet measuring 6½"×5", was filled in for each individual living in the State. It contained 24 questions grouped under 13 items, as explained below.

- 1(a). **Name**—Name of the person enumerated.
- 1(b). **Relationship to Head**—This person was taken to be the one who bore the chief responsibility for the maintenance of the

household. For institutions the name of the Manager or the Superintendent was written.

2. **Age last birthday**—Age was recorded in years completed last birth day, and 'O' was recorded for infants below one year of age.
3. **Marital Status**—'NM' for never married; 'M' for married; 'W' for widowed; 'S' for separated or divorced person.
- 4(a). **Birthplace**—If born in the very village or town where enumerated, 'PL'; if born in another village or town of District in which enumerated, 'D'; if born in another District in the State, 'the name of District'; if born in another State in India, 'the name of District and State'; if born in a country outside India, 'the name of country'. Persons born at sea or in air or in railway carriages, were specified as such.
- 4(b). **Born R/U**—If born in village, 'R'; if born in a town, 'U'.
- 4(c). **Duration of residence if born elsewhere**—If born in the village or town or city in which enumerated, 'X'; and if born at a place other than the village or town or city of enumeration, the number of completed years of stay was noted.
- 5(a). **Nationality**—'I' for Indian nationals. For others it was written in full.
- 5(b). **Religion**—'H' for Hindu; 'M' for Muslim; 'C' for Christian; 'J' for Jain; 'B' for Buddhist; 'S' for Sikh. Other religions were written in full.
- 5(c). **Scheduled Caste or Scheduled Tribe**—If a person belonged to a Scheduled Caste or Scheduled Tribe as specified in the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes Lists Modification Order, 1956, the name of the Caste or the Tribe to which he/she belonged was noted.
6. **Literacy and Education**—If a person could neither read nor write, or could merely read but not write in any language, 'O'; if a person could both read and write, 'L'; if a person had passed a written examination, the name of the highest examination passed was also written.

7(a). *Mother tongue*—This was written in full. In the case of infants and deaf mutes, the language of the mother or mainly spoken in the household was recorded.

7(b). *Any other language (s)*—If a person knew any other languages, Indian or foreign, the names of those languages as told by him were written.

Items 8 to 11 were filled in only for workers.

8. *Working as Cultivator*—If a person was engaged in cultivation or supervision of cultivation of own or rented land, 'C'.

9. *Working as Agricultural Labourer*—If a person who worked on another person's land for wages in cash or kind, 'AL'.

10. *Working at Household Industry*—If a person was working in a household industry, the following particulars were noted:—

(a) nature of work; (b) nature of household industry; and (c) if working as a paid employee in the household industry 'EE'.

11. *Doing work other than specified in items 8, 9, or 10*—A worker not recordable against items 8, 9 or 10 was recorded under this head, showing:

(a) nature of work; (b) nature of industry, profession, trade or service; and (c) class of worker: 'MR' for employer; 'EE' for employee; 'SW' for single worker; 'FW' for family worker.

12. *Activity, if not working*—A person not gainfully employed was shown under one of the following eight categories:—

'ST' full-time student doing no other work; performing unpaid home duties, like housewife, 'HW'; dependent, including an infant or permanently disabled person, 'D'; retired person not employed again, receiver of agricultural or non-agricultural rent, royalty or dividend, 'R'; beggar, vagrant, independent woman without indication of source of income and others of unspecified source of existence, 'B'; inmate of penal, mental or charitable institution, 'I'; if seeking employment for the first time, 'NE'; a person employed before and now out of employment and seeking work, 'UN'.

13. *Sex*—'M' for male; 'F' for female.

The three census schedules, viz., (i) the Houselist, (ii) the Household Schedule, and (iii) the Individual Slip, and brief instructions for filling them, are reproduced in Annexure A and B, at the end of this book.

Special Features—The Census of 1961 claims several unique features and improvements as compared with the 1951 and previous censuses. It will be useful to mention them very briefly.

1. For the first time in the history of Indian Census the maps were prepared for each census block showing therein the location of individual houses. A complete set of these maps has been preserved in the Record Office of the State Superintendent of Census Operations, for use in future.

2. In the previous censuses every State prepared Houselists differently, showing the bare minimum information required for enumeration. This time, a uniform Houselist was adopted throughout the country. The data thus collected were compiled in five Housing Tables on the basis of which a separate report has been published, which is the first of its kind on the subject.

3. The Household Schedule is another unique feature of the 1961-census. In a country like India where much of the goods produced do not enter the money market but are consumed by the family itself, collection of information purely on the basis of individuals is not realistic and may be, in some respects, misleading. Therefore, this time the information about individuals was supplemented by information concerning the household as an entity. A series of eight Tables has been prepared from the Household Schedules showing size and composition of households, households engaged in cultivation and household industries, interest in and area of land cultivated, nature of household industries, and the number of workers in these two chief economic activities.

4. In the last few censuses income or economic independence was the criterion for measuring the economy of the country.

The application of this criterion unduly suppressed the number of workers by excluding those worked in family economic activities without receiving income and those whose work did not bring enough income for their maintenance. To remove this defect a shift was made in the 1961-census from 'income' to 'work', so that all people who worked (including family workers or working children) were classed among workers.

5. Economic activities of the people have been categorised in far greater detail than in any previous census. A two-fold classification has been made: according to the nature of industry based on the Indian Standard Industrial Classification (343 Minor Groups); and according to the nature of work done by individual workers based on the National Classification of Occupations (331 families).

6. In the 1961-census two additional questions were asked on migration: whether the place of birth was rural or urban; and the duration of stay of the migrant at the place of enumeration. The growing industrialization in the country, the increasing pressure of population on agriculture as a source of livelihood, and better facilities for travelling demanded inquiring into the subject in greater detail.

7. For Age Tables the five-year age groups, as recommended by the United Nations for Population Censuses, have been adopted. Besides, a single year Age Table has been prepared on full count.

8. Another new feature is that the literate workers and non-workers have been classified according to educational standards.

9. In the 1961-census a probe was made into the texture of the non-working group. This will enable the planners and social workers to focus their attention on the really unemployed persons whose number is substantial but not unmanageably high.

Arrangement of Tables—The various Tables prepared from the data collected during the 1961-census, have been arranged under six series, as mentioned below.

A Series—General Population Tables, relating to area, houses, population, variations in population since 1901, etc. This series of Tables is included in Part II-A (the present book).

B Series—Economic Tables. These are arranged under two groups: (i) Persons, showing the number of workers and non-workers, industrial classification, occupational classification, unemployment, etc.; and (ii) Households, showing households engaged in cultivation, household industries, and other activities. These two groups of Tables are presented in Part II-B and Part, III respectively.

C Series—Social and Cultural Tables, dealing with size and composition of households, and distribution of persons in respect of age, marital status, literacy, mother tongue, religion, etc.

D Series—Migration Tables, showing place of birth, migration with reference to place of birth, and duration of stay at the place of enumeration.

The C and D Series of Tables are presented in Part II-C.

E Series—Housing Tables, showing number of houses put to various uses, tenure status of households, chief materials for walls and roofs, rooms and occupants, and particulars of industrial units. These Tables are contained in Part IV-B.

Special Tables for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes, showing their industrial classification, age, marital status, education, religion, unemployment, etc. These Tables comprise Part V-A.

Where information is given down to the level of Tahsils, they are listed below the Districts to which they belong. The information for towns, wherever shown, is after the Tahsil figures. If two or more urban units are adjacent and together form a compact unit, figures are presented first for the town group and then for the constituent urban units.

The Part II-A (*the present book*) contains, besides the General Population Tables (A Series), the Primary Census Abstract. Each Table is preceded by an explanatory note.

AREA, HOUSES AND POPULATION

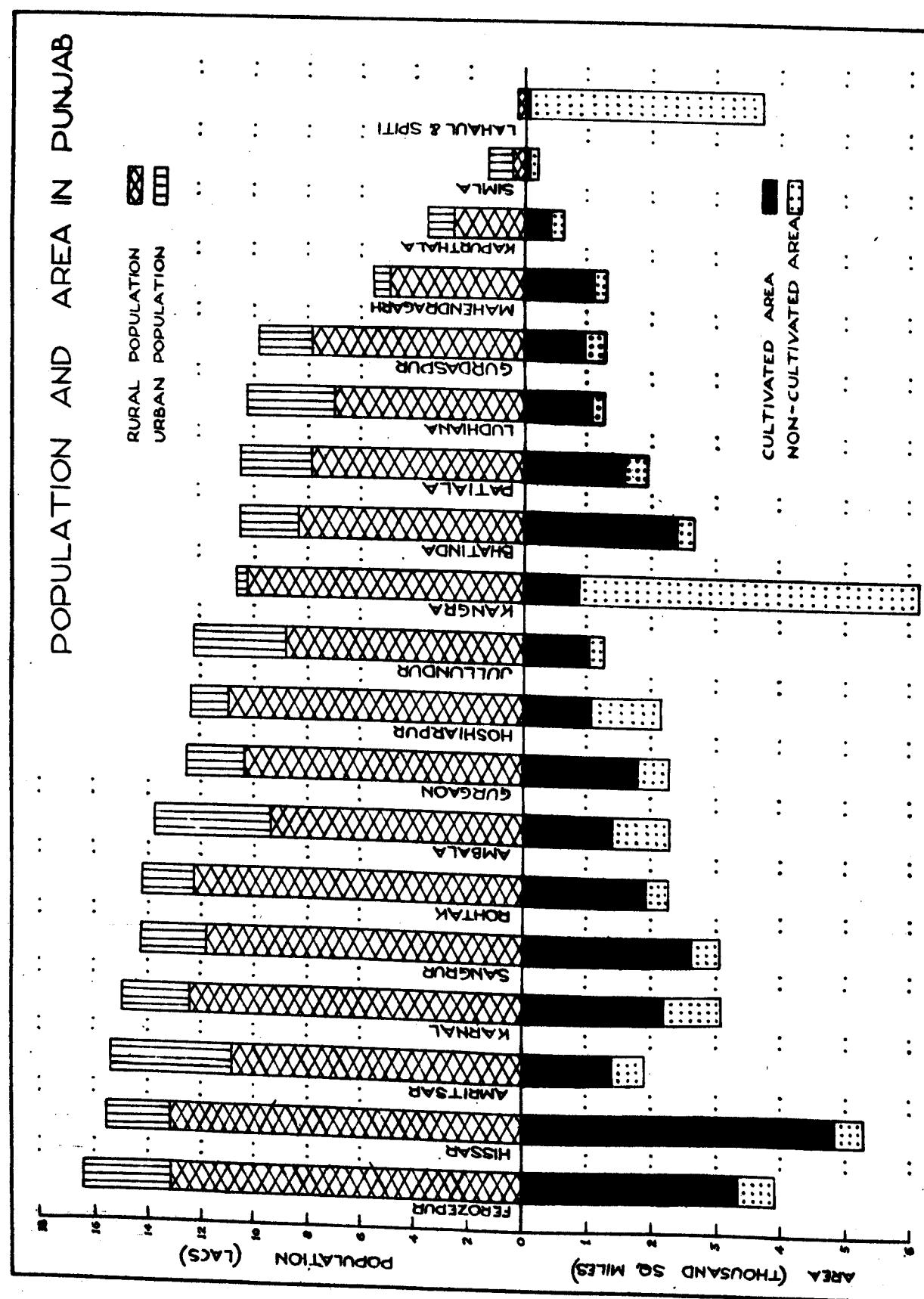

Two statements will be found on this subject. The Union Table gives information for the State, the Commissioners' Divisions and Districts, in the usual order they are listed in the State reports. In the second Table figures are given further for each Tahsil in a District and for each Town in a Tahsil.

The Union Table contains two figures for area : (a) as provided by the Surveyor General, India; and (b) as received from the Director of Land Records, Punjab. The two sets of figures do not tally in most cases. This is due partly to the different methods of measurement employed by the two agencies. The Survey Department calculates area figures mathematically by quadrilaterals of 15' of Latitude by 15' of Longitude for the whole of India, and within this framework, area figures for Districts are calculated from topographical maps, making no allowance for slopes, etc., and the area is taken as of level ground. The State Land Records Department on the other hand proceeds along the land surface, measuring it bit by bit. The discrepancies are due also to the time lag in the intimation of the changes in boundary alignments. Even the office of the Director of Land Records was found to be not in the know of some of these changes, and besides the Department lacks in machinery for scrutiny and verification of the land records in the District and Tahsil offices.

The figures of density of population (number of persons per square mile) adopted in the census report are based on the area figures supplied by the Director of Land Records, since the Survey Department does not deal with territorial units smaller than the District.

Territorial changes in different decades have been discussed at length in the relevant census reports and to describe them exhaustively here would not serve a useful purpose. Only the more glaring changes may be mentioned.

M/B(D)2SCOPunjab—3

1901 to 1911—In October, 1901, the North-West Frontier Province was carved out from Punjab taking away 16,466 square miles. The addition was 2,566 square miles from the Biloch Trans-Frontier which was not taken into account in the 1901- census report. These areas are now in West Pakistan. Among the Districts now in Punjab, Hissar lost two villages to Bikaner State, and Karnal lost one to Muzaffarnagar (U.P.) and gained one village from Saharanpur (U.P.).

1911 to 1921—In pursuance of the decision to shift the Imperial Capital to Delhi, Delhi District was remodelled. It had three Tahsils: Sonapat, Ballabgarh and Delhi. Sonapat was transferred to Rohtak District, and a part of Ballabgarh to Gurgaon District. The remaining portion of Ballabgarh, and Delhi Tahsil—an area of 547 square miles—was made into a separate Province.

Some small transfers also took place between Karnal and Gurgaon Districts on one side and the U.P. on the other, due to riverain action.

1921 to 1931—No major change took place. Difference in area, as between the two years, was due mostly to revision of area figures by the Survey Department.

1931 to 1941—No major change. Difference between the two years, was due mostly to remeasurement of area by the Survey Department. There were some very minor changes between Gurgaon and Karnal Districts on one side and the U.P. on the other.

1941 to 1951—Punjab was partitioned on the 15th August, 1947, and out of its 29 Districts, India received 12 complete Districts of Hissar, Rohtak, Gurgaon, Karnal, Ambala, Simla, Kangra, Hoshiarpur, Jullundur, Ludhiana, Ferozepur and Amritsar; Gurdaspur short of Shakargarh Tahsil; and 186 villages of Lahore District.

On the 5th May, 1948, eight Native States of Patiala, Kapurthala, Jind, Nabha, Faridkot, Malerkotla, Nalagarh and Kalsia were amalgamated into the State of Patiala and East Punjab States Union (PEPSU). Similarly, 17 of the Punjab Hill States were combined to form the State of Himachal Pradesh.

Under the Province and States (Absorption of Enclaves) Order, 1950, the following transfers were effected :—

- (i) Between Punjab and Rajasthan : Gurgaon gained 2 villages and lost 9 villages.
- (ii) Between Punjab and U.P. : Karnal lost 6 villages.
- (iii) Between Punjab and Himachal Pradesh: Simla lost 112 villages including Solan Cantonment, but gained the built up areas of Bharari, Sanjauli, Chakkar and Kasumpti.
- (iv) Between Punjab and PEPSU: Simla lost towns/villages of Dagshai, Bharauli (including Sabathu), Khallag and Kalha; Ambala lost Sanawar and Kasauli; Ludhiana lost 40 villages; Hissar lost 15 villages; Karnal lost 32 villages; Ambala lost 17 villages; Hoshiarpur gained 24 villages; Jullundur gained 4 villages; Ludhiana gained 63 villages; Ferozepur gained 7 villages; Ambala gained 121 villages and some forest area from Kalsia Tahsil; and Gurgaon gained 78 villages.

As a result of these changes the area of Punjab got reduced from 99,089 square miles in 1941 to 37,378 square miles in 1951.

1951 to 1961—The highlight of the decade was the States Reorganisation Act, 1956. Section 11 of the Act reads:

“As from the appointed day (1st November, 1956) there shall be formed a new Part A State to be known as the State of Punjab comprising the following territories, namely:—

- (a) the territories of the existing State of Punjab; and
- (b) the territories of the existing State of Patiala & East Punjab States Union;

and thereupon the said territories shall cease to form part of the said existing States of Punjab and Patiala & East Punjab States Union, respectively.”

A minor change in the jurisdiction of Punjab has been that in the settlement of some boundary dispute between India and Pakistan, an area of 7,162 acres from Fazilka Tahsil of Ferozepur District was made over to West Pakistan.

In area the gain to Punjab has been of 10,078 square miles as a result of Integration of Punjab and PEPSU, and a loss of 11 square miles (two complete villages and portions of twelve villages) made over to Pakistan. As a result of these changes the area of Punjab in 1961 should have been 47,445 square miles (37,378 plus 10,078 minus 11). But, the Surveyor General, India, intimated the area of Punjab as in 1961 to be 47,106 square miles. The difference is due to the revision of area figures by that Department.

Internal Changes in PEPSU : 1951 to 1956—At the time of 1951-census PEPSU had eight Districts. This number got reduced to five by the time of Integration, according to the changes described below.

- (1) Patiala District: This District expanded by absorbing Fatehgarh Sahib and Kohistan Districts. Amlah and Payal Tahsils of Fatehgarh Sahib were merged with Sirhind Tahsil. Dera Basi Tahsil of erstwhile Kohistan District was later abolished and merged with Rajpura Tahsil.
- (2) Barnala District: This District was abolished. It had four Tahsils; Phul, Dhuri, Malerkotla and Barnala. A portion of Phul Tahsil and the remaining three Tahsils were transferred to Sangrur District, and the remaining portion of Phul Tahsil was added to Bhatinda District.
- (3) Bhatinda District: This District gained a portion of Phul Tahsil from Barnala District and it was added to Bhatinda Tahsil.
- (4) Kapurthala District: It remained unaffected.
- (5) Fatehgarh Sahib District: This District was abolished and its area was transferred to Patiala District.
- (6) Sangrur District: This District, as stated above, gained Dhuri, Malerkotla and Barnala Tahsils, and a portion of Phul Tahsil from Barnala District. The portion of Phul Tahsil was linked with Barnala Tahsil, and Dhuri and Malerkotla were made into Malerkotla Tahsil. The original Tahsil of Sunam was also merged in Sangrur Tahsil.
- (7) Mahendragarh District: This District remained unaffected.
- (8) Kohistan District: This District was abolished and its area was merged with Patiala District.

Internal Changes in Punjab—Changes in the 13 Districts of Punjab from 1951 to 1956, and in the integrated Punjab from 1956 to 1961 are described below.

(A) *Inter-District Changes*—There was no change in the boundaries of eight Districts, namely, Hissar, Rohtak, Gurgaon, Jullundur, Amritsar, Gurdaspur, Kapurthala and Mahendragarh. The remaining ten Districts were affected in the following manner:—

Rural and Urban Population—All places served by local administration such as Municipal Committee, Cantonment Board, or Notified Area Committee, have been treated as towns. Three tests were applied on the claims of any other area to be treated as a town: (a) whether it had a minimum population of 5,000; (b) whether it had a density of not less than 1,000 persons to the square mile; and (c) whether three-fourths of its male working population followed pursuits other than agriculture. In previous censuses all places with local administration were uniformly taken as towns. For non-municipal areas the test of 5,000 minimum population was adopted, but beyond that it was left to the discretion of the State Superintendent to judge whether the place had urban character. In view of urbanisation going to be a major field of study in future, the Registrar General felt it desirable to import greater objectivity and uniformity in the definition of town in the interests of comparability. The definition adopted for the 1961-census makes the concept more precise by specifying the extent of agricultural pursuits and the density of population—the two essentials of urban characteristics.

Towns—There are in all 189 towns. They are predominantly small units, and many among the 43 towns with less than 5,000 population would not have been labelled as urban areas but for their having local administration. The distribution of towns according to size is shown below.

Twenty places taken as towns in the 1951-census do not appear as such in the 1961-census. In fifteen among them, Government had abolished the local administrations during the decade, and by personal visits the State Superintendent satisfied himself that they did not have the prescribed urban characteristics. In the remaining five cases these areas had been merged in the main towns of which they formed integral parts, including Pathankot Military Area to which the Municipal limits do not extend.

As compared to the list of towns adopted in 1951, fifteen additions have been made. The most conspicuous addition is of Chandigarh which came into being during the decade, and is still administered by the State Government directly.

According to size of population Chandigarh falls in class II, Nangal Township and Malout in class III, Rajpura Township in class IV, six towns in class V, and yet another five in class VI. Their particulars are given below.

Villages—The term 'Village' in all censuses from 1901 has been used for an area for which a separate record of rights is maintained, or which has been separately assessed to land revenue, or would have been so assessed if the land revenue had not been released or compounded or redeemed, or which the State Government may, by general rule or special order, declare to be an estate. This definition of village is identical with that of 'mauza' under Section 3(1) of the Punjab Land Revenue Act of 1887. The definition applies to a demarcated area of land and not to a group of residential sites. In the plains there is no dispute about a village which is the revenue estate and is known as *mauza*. A village has a central or main *abadi* wherein the inhabitants reside. The big villages are sometimes distributed into *thula*, *patti* or *taraf* according to that portion of the estate for which a separate *lambaradar* is responsible for the collection of land revenue. There may be some scattered houses in the fields which are normally used for living during the flush of agricultural operations, and in villages where holdings

are big, some owners build residential houses on their farms.

In hill areas cultivation is generally scattered and the population generally lives in homesteads built on individual farms or in groups of hamlets. In hill areas also the revenue estate is known as *mauza*, but the smaller units are called *tikas* in Kangra District except in Kulu Tahsil where the revenue estate is spoken of as *kothi* and the small unit as *phati*. In the Lahaul & Spiti District the revenue estate is referred to as *kothi* and its small components as *gaon*.

The following statement shows for each District the number of populated villages at each census since 1901, excluding the villages which were uninhabited (*be charagh*) or which formed part of towns. The variations over years in the number of inhabited villages are due to (a) settlement operations revising the boundaries and number of *mauzas*; (b) changes in the number of uninhabited villages; (c) absorption by towns of villages; and (d) changes in boundaries of Districts.

The position emerging for the State is as follows:— In all there are 22,849 *mauzas* borne on the jurisdiction lists. The 189 towns cover 180 *mauzas* fully and 291 partly. The number of villages partly covered by towns and those not thus affected is 21,269 (among them 5 *mauzas* do not bear regular *hadbast* number). Another 1,405 *mauzas* are uninhabited.

Occupied residential houses—Census house refers to a structure or part of a structure, inhabited or vacant, used as a dwelling, a shop, a shop-cum-dwelling, workshop, factory, or place of business, with a separate entrance. If a building had a number of flats or blocks which had separate entrances of their own and were independent of each other, giving on the road or a common staircase or a common courtyard leading to a main gate, they were considered as separate census houses. An entire building if used as one unit, though it may be having more than one entrances,

was taken as one census house. A census house which at the time of enumeration was being lived in by a household, and it was used as a dwelling, shop-cum-dwelling, workshop-cum-dwelling or for any other purpose conjointly with dwelling, was taken as an occupied residential house. An occupied residential house may be accommodating one or more than one census households. A household is a group of persons who commonly live together and would take their meals from a common kitchen unless exigencies of work prevented any one of them from doing so.

The number of persons per occupied census house varies according to the average size of household in different Districts; this number is smaller in hills and larger in some southern Districts. In the towns there are less persons per house than in rural areas.

In Punjab males outnumber females. The only exception is the rural area of Kangra District where men go out for employment in large numbers. The position depicted for Lahaul & Spiti is not realistic since during the enumeration period the District had a large contingent of labour from outside for the construction of roads and bridges.

Urbanity is an index to the development of non-agricultural activities. The proportion of urban population is comparatively high in the central Districts because of development of industry and commerce, as also in Ambala and Simla Districts since Chandigarh and Simla Towns have a large number of Government offices.

Density of population is influenced by various factors, such as climate, fertility of soil, industrialisation and general economic development and the high density in some Districts can be traced to one or more of these factors.

APPENDIX I TO TABLE A-I

Statement showing the 1951 territorial units constituting the present set up of each District and Tahsil of Punjab and details of net area gained or lost in the changed territories during the decade 1951-61.

The territorial changes which occurred between 1951 and 1961 and have already been described are presented in the form of a statement in Appendix I to Table A-I. A Sub-Appendix shows the area changes in towns during the decade. It will be noted that as many as 23 Municipal towns expanded their jurisdiction as against two which reduced in size.

APPENDIX II TO TABLE A-I

No. of villages with population of 5,000 and above and Towns with population under 5,000

As many as 154 villages have a population of 5,000 or more and they contain 6.48 p.c. of the total rural population of the State. There are 43 towns with population less than 5,000 and they accommodate 3.71 p.c. of the total urban population. Rohtak, Karnal and Hissar Districts are conspicuous for having large-sized villages, and it is quite common for a number of villages having a common habitation site, reminiscent of the disturbed conditions of the last century inducing people to live in large groups for security reasons. The small-sized Municipalities to a large extent are in hill areas or in the Patiala Division. Besides,

the seat of a ruler enjoyed the status of a town. In the Kangra District the *mauza* (revenue estate) is generally an extensive area with population scattered over a large number of hamlets.

APPENDIX III TO TABLE A-I

Houseless and Institutional Population

Members of wandering tribes, tramps, *sadhus*, pavement dwellers and others who do not live as households comprise the houseless population. Enumerators had instructions to keep a note of such persons in their blocks during the period of census. On the night between the 28th February and the 1st March, 1961, the Enumerators took a round of their areas to record particulars of houseless persons. During the revisional round on the 1st and 2nd March, 1961, also any houseless person who stated that he had not been enumerated before was recorded. It is felt that the enumeration of such persons was fairly complete.

Residential institutions such as jails, orphanages, hostels, mental hospitals and boarding houses were treated as households and their inmates were treated as members of those households. Defence personnel and policemen living in barracks or under canvas and taking their meals from common kitchens were also treated as institutional population.

Appendix III to Table A-I gives particulars about the houseless and institutional population for each Tahsil and further distributes them according to sex, and living in rural and urban areas.

This Table furnishes data on the population of Districts for seven censuses from 1901 to 1961 and the absolute and percentage variations in each decade. This is a very important Table as it gives the growth of population from decade to decade, and in the absence of reliable vital statistics, this Table forms the main source for estimation of population. The 1951 population figures for each District were rebuilt on the basis of the population of the area which a District lost or gained during 1951-61. The figures for years previous to 1951 could not be calculated in this way because the village-wise data for these years are not available. As an alternative the population figures, as contained in Table A-II of the 1951-census Report, were inflated or deflated proportionately to the gain or loss in area during 1951-61. There does not exist a succinct record of area changes for the eight Princely States which were combined into the PEPSU in 1948. To build comparative figures for the Districts of PEPSU for years prior to 1951 proved an impossible task. Hence this information is not given.

The changes in the composition of Districts during the last sixty years have been described at length in the fly leaf to Table A-I. The more important changes in the population figures consequent upon changes in area are shown below for the various Districts. The number of persons involved is shown within brackets under each decade.

The five Districts of erstwhile PEPSU, namely, Kapurthala, Bhatinda, Sangrur, Patiala and Mahendragarh lost collectively 21,474 persons during 1941-51, and during 1951-61, Bhatinda gained 120,080 persons, Sangrur gained 468,666 persons, and Patiala gained 253,251 persons.

The Appendix to Table A-II shows for each District: (1) the area as in 1961 and 1951; (2) the 1961 population; (3) the 1951 population on the area as it was in 1951 and as it became in 1961; and (4) the difference between the two sets of 1951 population figures. As a result of Integration Punjab acquired 9,950 square miles of land area and 3,493,685 persons from the erstwhile PEPSU. The extent to which each District gained or lost in population due to changed jurisdiction is shown in this Appendix and the area changes have also been explained in the footnotes.

The Table, given on the next page, shows decennial as also cumulative growth from 1901 to 1961 in rural and urban population of each District. Two sets of figures are given. The top figures relate to the towns of 1961-census. For previous years, these very towns were taken into consideration, ignoring such among them as were not taken as towns in previous censuses. Figures within brackets take into account the towns as were adopted in the respective censuses. In all cases, the jurisdiction of Districts has been taken as it obtained at the time of the 1961-census.

Three per cent of the rural population in the State as a whole resides in hamlets having a population less than 200 persons. Another 12 p.c. of the people live in villages each having 200 to less than 500 persons. Fifty-five per cent of the villagers live in villages having a population ranging from 1,000 to 4,999 persons. One hundred and forty-two villages each having between 5,000 to 9,999 persons accommodate six per cent of the rural population. while one per cent live in twelve villages each having more than 10,000 persons.

Of villages having a population of 10,000 and above there are two in Hissar, one in Amritsar, and nine in Kangra District. The statement does not bring out the correct position in the Kangra and Lahaul & Spiti Districts where the *de jure* village (revenue estate) consists of a large number of small villages and hamlets. The hilly areas of submontane Districts also partake this feature.

The region comprising of Rohtak, Hissar, Karnal, Bhatinda, Sangrur and Ferozepur are noted for villages with large *abadis*: 57 p.c. of the rural population in Rohtak District lives in villages each having 2,000 or more persons, the corresponding figure for Hissar is 46, Karnal 39, Sangrur and Bhatinda 38 each, and Ferozepur 34. Proximity to Delhi, developing trade connections for the supply of agricultural produce, dry climate, the low depth to water, the large size of holdings and some historic and cultural traits have variously been given to as the reasons for these large sized villages.

The four statements given on the next pages show the percentage distribution of (i) villages, and (ii) rural population according to population size of villages, in 1961, 1951, 1921 and 1901. It will be observed from these statements that in most of the Districts the villages of size group below 500 and the population they supported, increased during 1901-21 but declined thereafter. In the size group of 500-999 persons the number of villages showed a mild decline during 1901-21 but thereafter had a mild increase. The population distribution remained steady up to 1951 and declined thereafter. The percentage of villages with 1,000 and above persons showed a steady increase both in number and population after 1921. This indicates villages steadily becoming bigger units of population.

The term 'town' has been discussed in the note to Table A-I. If two or more adjacent towns form a compact unit, the entire area has been labelled as one town group. The term has been innovated in the 1961-census with a view to bringing out such areas as are so close to one another that in practical life they behave as one unit, though they are served by separate local administrations. In the present report, twenty-two towns have been lumped into ten town groups as shown below.

In Table A-IV, towns and town groups are arranged under these classes, and particulars are given about their area, civic status, population

in different census years since 1901, decennial variations in population, and sex break up as in 1961. For town groups population figures are given also for the constituent towns.

Area figures relate to 1961, and are expressed both in square miles and square kilometres.

Towns are arranged in descending order of population under the six classes. Where a number of towns are treated as constituents of town groups, they are placed just below the respective town groups, and the latter are shown according to their order of importance.

Besides the figures for individual towns and town groups, totals are given also for the six classes. These totals for different years have been worked out taking the towns according to the classes to which they then belonged according to their population.

The main purpose of the Table is to depict the growth of the 1961 towns as towns, and not to show how certain places grew into towns from villages. The following method of presentation has been followed:—

- (i) The population of a place which was not treated as a town in a particular census year is not shown.
- (ii) Towns treated as such for the first time in 1951 bear an asterisk (*) on their left.
- (iii) Towns treated as such for the first time in 1961 are printed in italics.
- (iv) Towns treated as such in any census year prior to 1951, but not so in an intervening census year, are described as 'declassified' against the year they were not treated as town.
- (v) Places not treated as town in 1961, even though they were treated as town in any previous census years have not been mentioned in this Table.

The statement given on the next page shows the class to which each town group or town belonged in different censuses since 1901. For the years a town was not treated as an urban area, (..) is given

In the above Table, for the year 1961 the constituent towns of a town group have not been taken as separate units, but the town group has been taken as one unit. This explains the difference between these figures and those given in Table A-I. The constituent towns of 1961 have been treated similarly even for previous census years if they were then taken as towns; and their combined population has been taken into account while distributing them among six population size classes.

The towns not taken as constituents of town groups in 1961 have been shown according to the status assigned to them in different census reports.

The difference in the number of towns in different years and their classification is due to (i) a formerly rural area being taken as a town; (ii) reversion of a town to a village; (iii) crossing of a town from one class to another; and (iv) amalgamation of a number of satellite towns with the main town, or in a town group.

The statement given on the next page shows (i) percentage of towns in each class to total number of towns, and (ii) percentage of population in each class of towns to total urban population, during 1901—1961.

PRIMARY CENSUS ABSTRACT

This document, in its 50 columns, presents information on the following aspects:—

- (i) Area of each District, Tahsil and Town;
- (ii) Occupied residential houses and households living in them;
- (iii) Total population;
- (iv) Persons belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes;
- (v) Literate and educated persons;
- (vi) Workers (classified in nine categories); and
- (vii) Non-workers.

The area units for which information is given are the State, the three Commissioners' Divisions, Districts, Tahsils and Towns in each Tahsil. Figures for human beings are shown for males and females separately. Similar information for individual villages will be found in the District Census Handbooks.

The figures relate to all those persons who were alive at the sunrise of the 1st March, 1961, and were present within the territory of the State of Punjab. People were enumerated as at their residence and not at their place of work. The main figures for the entire State and also for Rural and Urban Areas are shown below.

The terms used in the Abstract are explained below.

Column 1

Districts are listed in the order usually followed in the State Government reports. Figures are displayed first for the State as a whole; then for each Commissioner's Division followed by Districts and Tahsils within each District. Towns are shown under the Tahsils in which they are located.

Column 2

Figures have been shown first for the entire geographical unit and then for its rural and urban parts.

Column 3

The area figures are in square miles, as supplied by the Director of Land Records, Punjab. Similar figures for urban units were furnished by the local authorities, e.g., Municipal Committees, Cantonment Boards. Rural area figures were

obtained by deducting from the totals the figures for urban areas.

Columns 4 and 5

'Occupied Residential House' refers to a structure or part of a structure, with a separate entrance, and used as dwelling, exclusively or jointly with any other use.

'Household' is a group of persons who commonly live together and take their meals from a common kitchen unless exigencies of work prevent any of them from doing so. It includes any domestic servant residing and eating at the employer's house, as also any guest who remained absent from his own house during the entire enumeration period. On the other hand any member of the family who resides away from it, is excluded.

Households per hundred occupied residential houses in rural areas of Mahendragarh and Bhatinda Districts are more numerous, as also in the Tahsils of Narnaul (Mahendragarh District), Jind (Sangrur District), Mansa (Bhatinda District), and Muktsar (Ferozepur District). Among urban areas the number of households per hundred houses is the highest in Kapurthala District, and the figures are still higher among the towns of Phagwara Tahsil (Kapurthala District) and Sonepat Tahsil (Rohtak District).

'Inmates of Institutions' are groups of unrelated persons residing in institutions such as jails, charitable institutions, hostels and messes.

'Houseless Person' is one who has no fixed place to pass his night and does not normally reside in a house, e.g., pavement dweller, member of a wandering tribe, tramp, *sadhu*.

Scheduled Castes are fairly well distributed among Districts. Their comparative strength in towns is about half of what it is in villages, forming about one-ninth of the urban population. In Shamchaursi (Hoshiarpur District) and Alawalpur (Jullundur

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District) their proportion is conspicuously high.

Bhots, Gaddis and Swanglas living in Lahaul & Spiti District are the only Scheduled Tribes in Punjab. In that District they account for 60 p.c. of total males and 80 p.c. of females.

Columns 15 to 17

'Literate' is one who can read and write a simple letter. If such a person has also passed a written examination or examinations as proof of educational standard attained, he is classed as educated. The following statement shows the

percentage of literate and educated persons. Percentages have been worked out on total population and not the population above the age of five which is admittedly a more rational way of expressing literacy rate.

Literacy rate is substantially higher in towns than in villages, the more so for females. Ludhiana, Jullundur, Hoshiarpur and Simla Districts stand out for literacy in rural areas. Literacy rate in some hill towns, and towns having large Government offices & establishments is surprisingly high. It is 73 p.c. in Palampur, 72 in Dalhousie Cantonment, 68 in Bakloh, 65 in Simla and Jutogh, 64 in Naya Nangal, Dalhousie and Dagshai, 62 in Sabathu, Amritsar Cantonment and Dharmasala, and 61 in Chandigarh and Kasauli.

Columns 18 to 50

At the 1951-census the population was distributed among two broad categories: Agricultural and Non-Agricultural, further subdivided into eight broad livelihood classes, as follows:—

Agricultural—

I. Cultivators of land wholly or mainly owned.

II. Cultivators of land wholly or mainly unowned.

III. Cultivating owners.

IV. Non-cultivating owners of land; agricultural rent receivers.

Non-Agricultural—

V. Production other than cultivation.

VI. Commerce.

VII. Transport.

VIII. Other services and miscellaneous sources.

Both the economically active and inactive persons were lumped together under the aforesaid main livelihood classes on which they depended. The subclassification of each of these classes into (i) self-supporting persons, (ii) earning dependents and (iii) non-earning dependents, to a certain extent helped to distinguish the economically active from the inactive persons. At the 1961-census a clear-cut distinction was made between the workers and non-workers without bringing in the vague element of adequacy of earnings.

'Worker', according to the 1961-census, is a person who does any productive work to augment family's resources. Work includes not only actual work but effective supervision and direction of it. In the case of seasonal work like cultivation, livestock, dairying household industry, the basis of work is satisfied if the person had some regular work for more than M/B(D)28COPunjab—12(a)

an hour a day throughout the greater part of the working season; in the case of regular employment in trade, profession, service, business or commerce, the basis of work is satisfied if the person was employed during any of the fifteen days preceding the day on which the enumerator recorded the particulars. An adult woman engaged in household duties but doing no other productive work to augment the family's resources has not been considered a worker. The workers have been classified into nine industrial categories.

'Cultivator' is a person who is engaged in cultivation or its supervision on his own or rented land.

'Agricultural Labourer' is a person who works on another person's land for wages in cash, kind or share of produce.

'Household Industry' is an industry conducted by the head of the household himself and/or mainly members of the household at home or within the village in rural areas, and only at home in urban areas.

'Construction' refers to construction and maintenance of buildings, roads, railways, bridges, canals, etc.

The other five categories of workers are self explanatory.

'Non-worker' is a person who is not a worker, as defined above. He may be a (i) full-time student doing no other work; (ii) person engaged in unpaid home duties like housewife; (iii) dependent such as an infant or child not attending school, a person permanently disabled from work because of illness or old age; (iv) retired person who is not employed again, rentier or any other person of independent means for securing which he does not have to work; (v) beggar, vagrant, or an independent woman without indication of source of her income; (vi) convict in jail or an inmate of a penal, mental, or charitable institution; (vii) person seeking employment for the first time; or (viii) person employed before but now out of employment and seeking work. The comparative numerical strength of workers in the various categories and non-workers is shown in the statement that follows.

ANNEXURE A

INSTRUCTIONS FOR FILLING UP THE HOUSELIST

Column 1*—*Line Number.*

Only one digit of the line number has been printed in this column. The line numbers should be continuous for your block. Where the line numbers exceed 9 write the earlier digit(s) yourself.

Column 2—*Building Number (Municipal or Local Authority or Census Number, if any).*

In areas, e.g., urban, where the buildings are already numbered by the municipal or other authorities, the enumerator may adopt the existing numbers in the Houselist. In such cases, column 2 will carry the established municipal or local authority number which will facilitate identification. Where there are municipal or local authority numbers but there are reasons to believe that the number is incomplete or unsatisfactory, the municipal or local authority number may still be entered in column 2. In those cases where there are no municipal or local authority numbers in existence, all buildings will have to be serially numbered for the census and column 2 will contain entries of this census serial. This number will have to be repeated in column 3 with sub-numbers for census houses, if any.

Column 3—*Building Number (Column 2) with sub-numbers for each Census House.*

If a building itself is a census house, then it will have only one number, namely, that of the building. If within a building there are a number of census houses, then each census house will have two sets of numbers, e.g., the number of the building and the sub-number of the census house. The census house number should be written after the building number in arabic numerals in brackets such as 2(2), 3(2), etc. A census house may contain more than one household, in which case, each household will have to be denoted by a separate alphabetical sub-number (see instructions for column 11 below).

Column 4—*Purpose for which census house used, e.g., dwelling, shop, shop-cum-dwelling, business, factory, workshop, school or other institution, jail, hostel, hotel, etc.*

The actual use to which a census house is put should be written here.

In the case of a factory or workshop 'Factory' should be written for a large factory, if registered under the Indian Factories Act and 'Workshop' for a small unregistered workshop. A workshop is a place where some kind of production, repair or servicing goes on or where goods or articles are made and sold. Similarly, a shop is a place where articles are sold for cash or for credit. Business houses are those where transactions in money or other articles are taking place, e.g., bank, etc. But rooms or apartments where professional consultations are held such as by doctors, *hakims*, pleaders, etc., should be described as 'professional consultation rooms' and not workshops. In the case, however, of a dispensary where, in addition to consultation by a doctor, medicines are prepared and sold, the house should be described as a dispensary. Write also if used for place of worship or congregation or if unoccupied, 'vacant'. If the census house is a shop, business house, bank, etc., but is not a factory or workshop as defined above, the name of the proprietor, manager or director should be entered in column 18.

Columns 5 to 8—*If this Census House is used as an establishment, workshop or factory.*

These columns apply only in cases where the census house is a factory or a workshop, i.e., where some kind of production, processing, repair or servicing is undertaken or where goods or articles are made and sold. If the census house is not used for purposes of a factory or workshop write 'X' in each of the columns 5 to 8.

Column 5—*Name of establishment or proprietor.*

Write the name of the establishment in the case of factories or large manufacturing concerns and write the name of the proprietor in the case of small workshops and establishments like confectioneries where no distinct name has been given to them like *Halwai* shop, etc. If the census house is not used for the purpose of a factory or workshop put 'X' in each of the columns 5 to 8.

Column 6—*Name of product(s), repair or servicing undertaken.*

Enter the actual work that is being done in the establishment, factory or workshop, like paper making, shoe making, cycle repairing, motor servicing, etc.

Column 7—*Average number of persons employed daily last week (including proprietor or household members, if any).*

The total number of workers including apprentices, either paid or unpaid, employed in the factory or workshop, including the owner or proprietor and any of his family members (if working), should be entered. The average number of persons working per day during the week preceding the date of your visit should be entered.

In case more than one product is produced it is not necessary to enquire the number of persons employed in the production of each product. It may not be possible to get this information in cases where the operations may be composite.

Column 8—*Kind of fuel or power, if machinery is used.*

If the factory or workshop uses steam or diesel engine or fuel, e.g., kerosene, soft coke, electricity, water-mill, etc., for running the machinery used for production, servicing or repairs, write what fuel or power is actually used.

Columns 9 & 10—*Description of Census House.*Column 9—*Material of wall.*

Under this column the material out of which most of the walls of the house are made, i.e., grass, leaves, reeds, bamboo, unburnt bricks, mud, burnt bricks, stone, cement concrete or timber should be written. Where a house consists of separate structures each of different materials, the material out of which the walls of the main bedrooms are made are to be recorded.

Column 10—*Material of roof.*

The material out of which most of the outer roof exposed to the weather and not the ceiling is made, i.e., tiles, thatch, corrugated iron, zinc or asbestos cement sheets or concrete, etc., should be written. In the case of a multi-storeyed building the intermediate floor or floors will be the roof of the lower floor.

Column 11—*Sub-number of each Census Household with Census House Number (Column 3).*

There may be one or more households in a census house. Each household should be separately

numbered. This can be done by using the alphabets as (A), (B), (C), etc. For example, if building No. 2 is also a census house and has three households, the household numbers will be 2(A), 2(B) and 2(C). If building No. 4 has two census houses, the houses will be numbered as 4(1) and 4(2). If within each house there are respectively 3 and 2 households, then they will be numbered as 4(1A), 4(1B), 4(1C) and 4(2A) and 4(2B).

Column 12—*Name of Head of Household.*

The name of the Head of each household given in Column 11 should be written here. The Head of a household, for census purposes, is the person on whom falls the chief responsibility for the maintenance of the household. The name of the person who is actually acknowledged as Head of the household should be recorded. In the case of places like messes, boarding houses, chumeries, etc., where people live together with no ties of relationship, the manager or superintendent or the person who by common consent is regarded as the Head should be recorded as Head of the household.

If the census house is used as a sitting place, cattle shed, etc., write the use to which it is put (and add the name of the owner).

Column 13—*Number of rooms in Census Household.*

If a census house is occupied by one household the enumeration of rooms should be simple.

If a census house consists of a number of households the number of rooms occupied by each household should be entered on each line against the name of Head of the household. In cases where more than one household occupy a single room or share more than one room in such a way that it is not possible to say the number of rooms occupied by each household, the number of rooms should be given together within brackets as common to both the households.

A room should usually have four walls with a doorway with a roof overhead and should be wide and long enough for a person to sleep in, i.e., it should be at least 6 ft. long. Unenclosed verandah, kitchen, store, garage, cattle shed and latrine which are not ordinarily used for living and sleeping should not be treated as rooms. An enclosed room, however, which is used for living, dining, storing and cooking should be regarded as a room.

*The columns have reference to the Houselist Form, appearing on page 245

Column 14—Does the Household live in own or rented house?

If the household lives in own house write 'O'. If the household lives in a rented house write 'R'.

In the case of public buildings like schools, hospitals, etc., or places of worship, put 'X' in this column.

Columns 15 to 17—Number of persons residing in Census Household on day of visit.

Write the number of males residing in the household in column 15, the number of females residing in the household in column 16 and the total number of persons in column 17.

Column 18—Remarks.

In this column should be entered any useful or significant information about the building or the census house or the census household that

has not been entered in any other column. For example, if the census house is a shop, the name of the proprietor or owner should be recorded in this column. If a census house is vacant at the time of houselisting but there is reason to believe that the house will be occupied in the course of the next few days and almost certainly before the census enumeration period, then the word 'Vacant' should be entered in column 4 and a remark should be entered in column 18 to the effect 'likely to be occupied shortly'. Thus, the Remarks column should be utilised for recording all significant information relating to the building or census house or census household.

Each person engaged in housenumbering of one block will have to make out an abstract at the conclusion of houselisting and housenumbering. This abstract will be in the form shown below.

ANNEXURE B INSTRUCTIONS FOR ENUMERATION

The 1961 Census count will relate to the sunrise of 1st March, 1961. The count will be spread over a period of 19 days, beginning on the 10th February and ending on the 28th February, 1961. During this period you should visit every household in your block for enumeration. On the night of the 28th February you will have to go round your enumeration block and enumerate all persons who are houseless. (In large cities the enumeration of houseless persons will have to be undertaken in a different manner for which more elaborate arrangements will be made). During the period 1st March to 5th March you will have to pay a revisional round to every household and verify that your earlier work of enumeration has been completed in every respect. If during this revisional round you find that a birth has taken place in any household between the time of your first visit and the sunrise of 1st March, 1961, you will have to fill up a new slip for this birth; if there has been a death in any household during the same period you will have to cancel the slip of the dead person; if there is a visitor in any household who has come to stay during the same period and has not been enumerated elsewhere, you will have to fill up a new slip for this visitor. But you will not have to take notice of any birth or death or visit occurring after sunrise of 1st March, 1961.

The Household Schedule*

At the top of the Schedule you will find the Location Code. You will have to write the Location Code of the household here. Your supervisor will give you the Code numbers representing your district, tahsil/thana/town, village/ward/block. You should take care to write these three numbers connected together by oblique strokes in between on every Household Schedule.

When you are visiting each household for enumeration you should write the code number of the household also on the Household Schedule.

At the right hand corner of the Location Code you will find a question "Is this an institution?" with a rectangle below it. If you are enumerating any penal, charitable or mental institution,

hostel, hotel, hospital, boarding house, etc., you should write the nature of the institution within the rectangle like jail, hospital, etc.

Below the Location Code you will find a column for recording the full name of the Head of the household. The Head of the household for census purposes is a person on whom falls the chief responsibility for the maintenance of the household. The Head of the household need not necessarily be the eldest male member but may even be a female or younger member of either sex.

Institutions like boarding houses, messes and chummeries should also be regarded as census households but of 'un-related persons living together'. In such a Household the manager or superintendent or the person who has administrative responsibilities or who by common consent is regarded as the Head, should be recorded as Head of the household. If in an institution separate families are also living, each such family should be treated as a census household and a separate household schedule should be filled. In such cases the full name of the recognised Head of the household should be written.

If the Head of the household is a person who spends the week-days in town and spends the week-ends at home, he should be recorded as Head of Household and entered for enumeration at his home. If he should be away for a fairly long time which covers the entire enumeration period then the person who is incharge in his absence should be recorded as the Head of the household.

You will find a parallelogram at the right hand side against the Full Name of the Head of the household marked "S.C./S.T." If the Head of the household is a member of a Scheduled Caste or a Scheduled Tribe obtaining in your State or in your district you should write the name of the particular Scheduled Caste or Scheduled Tribe to which the Head of the Household belongs within the parallelogram. If the Head of the Household does not belong to Scheduled Caste or Scheduled Tribe you should put 'X' within the parallelogram.

Sub-part 'A' relating to Cultivation will have to be filled in only where the household cultivates land. (Land includes all land normally used for cultivation purposes including temporary fallows). Three categories of land are given in items 1(i) 1(ii) and 2. Items 1(i) and 1(ii) relate to land actually cultivated by the household. Item 2 relates to land which is not cultivated by the household but has been given by it to private persons for cultivation for payment in money, kind or share. In each of the three cases the total of separate plots or parcels of land in different places, owned or held, or taken or given should be made and entered. A number of lines has been provided for this purpose in 1(i) and 1(ii) to account for separate plots or parcels of land held or owned or taken under different recognised local rights. If the household (a) cultivates land owned or held from Government or taken from private persons or institutions or (b) has given land to private persons for cultivation purposes you should ascertain the local name of the right on such land and record in the column relating to 'local name of right on land'. Category 1(i) land owned or held from Government, will include the total of all pieces of land owned or held in owner-like possession, e.g., land held directly from Government under a grant, lease or assignment, (i) with rights of permanent, heritable and transferable possession, (ii) with rights of permanent and heritable possession, but without the right of transfer and (iii) temporary or conditional leases of any kind with the Government. Category 1(ii) land taken from private persons or institutions for payment in money, kind or share, will include land (i) with rights of permanent, heritable and transferable possession, (ii) with rights of permanent and heritable possession but without right of transfer; (iii) held in a variety of tenancies or tenures which may be broadly classified as follows:—

- (a) tenants holding land with permanent and heritable rights whose land cannot be resumed by the owner on grounds of personal cultivation (such tenants may in some cases have the right of transfer also);
- (b) tenants who have been given permanent rights subject to the right of resumption by the owner (in some cases the tenant has the right to acquire ownership of the non-resumable area. In other cases he does not possess the right);
- (c) tenants holding land in areas where interim measures have been enacted for

stay of ejectment or for continuing the leases for a specified period;

- (d) tenants holding land on temporary leases who are liable to ejectment; and

- (e) areas held on condition of rendering services either to a village community or to Government (This also includes cases where labourers on plantations are given some land for cultivation with permanent rights); and

(iv) the following:—

- (a) land taken for a fixed amount of money,
- (b) land taken for a fixed amount of produce,
- (c) land taken for a share of the produce,
- (d) land for which money is paid partly in one and partly in any other form mentioned above; and
- (e) land held free of consideration.

Category 2—Land given to private persons for cultivation for payment in money, kind or share will include the classifications mentioned in category 1(ii).

Categories 1(i) and (ii) will include only those plots or parcels of land which are cultivated by the household itself, that is, lands which lie within the village, or in adjacent villages, or within such a distance as enables the household to work on the land or actively supervise the cultivation. They will not include land owned or held in distant places where distance itself is a bar to active cultivation constant supervision or direction. But Category 2 will include land in any part of the country whatsoever. You should ascertain the extent of land in each category of local right in acres and record in the column relating to 'Area in acres'. You should write the total of separate plots or parcels of land under the same right if they are situated in different places. If it is not possible to ascertain the extent of land in acres you should, if possible, make a conversion from the local measure given to you. Even if this is not possible write the area in local measure giving invariably the name of the measure adopted.

This sub-part will not apply to households which do not possess any land. Thus, it will not apply to households which consist of only agricultural labourers without any land. In such cases put an 'X' in all the spaces provided in the right hand side and put a bold cross on this sub-part.

*See at pages 259-260

Land under any of the items in sub-part 'A' includes rent free land, lands enjoyed in permissive possession or gifts without encumbrance or consideration. A household which is a member of a co-operative farm will record only that amount of land in the co-operative farm which had belonged to it before and under right enter 'co-operative farm'. Labour hired by such a co-operative farm should not be entered for this household.

Sub-part 'B' relates to Household Industry. This part will be filled up only where there is a Household Industry conducted by the Head of the household himself and/or mainly by members of the household at home or within the village in rural areas and only at home in urban areas. The industry should not be on the scale of a registered factory. The participation of the Head of the household and/or members of the household is an essential feature of the Household Industry. In a rural area the Household Industry can be located either at home or within the village. But in an urban area the Household Industry or at least the major part of its work must be located only at home. A Household Industry should relate to production, processing, servicing or repairing and includes makers and sellers of goods.

The test for a Household Industry is mainly threefold :

- (a) Household Industry should embrace manufacture, processing or servicing and may include sale but should not be confined simply to buying and selling. At least part of the goods offered for sale from the household should be manufactured or processed by members of the household.
- (b) Household Industry should be on the household scale where the workers mainly will be the Head of the household himself and members of the household, the role of hired workers from outside being of secondary importance. Thus, in any Household Industry, members of the household should be in a position to lend a hand in the industry whenever they find the time in the course of their daily chores. Household Industry cannot, therefore, be on the scale of a registered factory but can use machinery and employ power like steam engine or oil engine or electricity to drive the machinery.
- (c) Location also is important, for proximity decides participation by members

of the household. In a village this participation is possible if the Household Industry is located at home or within the village, because village organisation is such as makes it possible for members of the household to move about freely in the village to look after their work. In urban areas such a free movement is not possible and, therefore, for Household Industry in urban areas we should consider only those industries which are located at home. Where, however, part of the work is done outside the house, e.g., preparing and dyeing the yarn for weaving or winding into warp and wool or cleaning metal surfaces before electroplating in baths, it should still be considered a Household Industry, even in urban areas, as the main operation of weaving or electroplating is conducted within the house and only one or two operations are conducted outside.

The following activities should also be regarded as illustrative of Household Industry. Biri-makers who either alone or with the help of members of the family roll biris at home, for wages at piece rates, while the contractor supplies the materials. Certain processes like buttoning and handsewing of tailored clothes, dyeing and printing of cloth, are carried out at home by members of the household both at residence and at 'place of work' or where women-folk of the household fill in at home with lac gold ornaments prepared at the shop by male members of the household.

Ascertain from the Head of the household whether there are any Household Industries and write the nature of the industry(s) in the column provided, if there are any. Then ascertain for how many months in a year roughly they are conducted and put down the number of months in the appropriate column. If the industry is conducted throughout the year write '12'. If there is no Household Industry of any sort put an 'X' in each of the places in the right hand corner where the answers will be written and put a bold cross on this sub-part.

Sub-part 'C' relates to Workers in Cultivation or Household Industry.

In the case of households which are engaged only in Cultivation, if the Head of the household is working, write '1' under the column 'Head' and ascertain how many other male and female members of the family are working. Write the numbers in the

respective columns. Write the total number of family workers including the Head, if he is working, in the column relating to 'Total'. Then ascertain whether any hired workers are employed and, if so, write the number of such workers in the column allotted for it. The hired workers should have been in wholtime employment during last working season or should be in wholtime employment during current working season.

Similarly in the case of households engaged in Household Industry only, if the Head of the household is working write '1' in the column relating to the 'Head', and also ascertain how many male members and female members of the family are working and write the numbers in the respective columns. Write the total number of family workers including the Head, if he is working, in the column relating to 'Total' and then ascertain the number of hired workers, if any, and then write the number of hired workers in the appropriate column.

If a household is engaged both in Cultivation and Household Industry ascertain whether the Head is working and write '1' under the column relating to the Head and also ascertain how many male and female members of the family are working both at Cultivation and the Household Industry and write the numbers in the respective columns. Write the total number of family workers in the column relating to Total. Ascertain the number of hired workers engaged by the family both for Cultivation and Household Industry and write the number in the appropriate column. In a household engaged both in Household Cultivation and Household Industry, you need not ascertain how many are engaged in Household Cultivation and Household Industry separately.

Even if any of the members of the family working or hired labourers are absent during the period of the census count they should be counted for the purposes of the Household Schedule.

In the case of households engaged in Cultivation only, put 'X' in the columns relating to 'Household Industry only' and 'Both in Household Cultivation and Household Industry'. Similarly, in the case of households engaged in Household Industry only, put 'X' in the columns relating to 'Household Cultivation only' and 'Both in Household Cultivation and Household Industry'. If a household is engaged both in Household Cultivation and Household Industry, put 'X' in the columns relating to 'Household Cultivation

only' and 'Household Industry only'. If a household is not engaged in either Household Cultivation or Household Industry or both put 'X' in all the columns and a bold 'X' on this sub-part.

The test for a worker is whether a person is actually working in Cultivation or Household Industry or supervising or directing work thereon.

Important Points for filling in Household Schedule

(1) For sub-part A, please note that 1 (iii) is the total of 1(i) and 1(ii). All these three sets of figures should be given separately.

(2) Arbitrary rounding up of area figures should be avoided. If the extent of holding is less than 1 acre, the exact fraction of the acre should be recorded. If it is above 1 acre, the number of the complete acres together with approximately correct fractions should be recorded.

(3) When a household is shown to be doing cultivation in sub-part A or/and following some household industry in sub-part B, corresponding entries should invariably be made in regard to the number of workers in sub-part C.

(4) The nature of the household industry should be described accurately and in enough detail in sub-part B.

(5) In sub-part B the blank column without any heading in between columns "Nature of industry" and "Number of months in the year during which conducted" is not to be filled in by you. It will be used at the tabulation stage for giving appropriate code numbers for different types of household industries.

(6) In sub-part C please note that :

workers in such households as are engaged in cultivation exclusively are to be recorded against line 1;

workers in such households as follow household industry exclusively are to be shown in line 2;

workers in such households as follow both cultivation and some household industry are to be shown in line 3;

do not by mistake give the total figures of lines 1 and 2 against line 3.

Instructions for Enumerating Individual Members of Households

1. Enumerate all persons who are normally resident in the household, i.e., those who live in the household and also those who have recently

become members of the household through marriage or birth or other vital social or domestic ties and are present at the time of your visit.

2. Enumerate also all persons who are normal residents in the household even if they are absent at the time of your visit, provided they left the household on or after the 10th February, 1961, or if they had left earlier than 10th February, 1961, are likely to return before the sunrise of 1st March, 1961.

3. Enumerate a visitor, a boarder, or a guest found in the household at the time of your visit *if he had not been enumerated before and if he will be away from his household between the 10th and 28th February, 1961*, and warn him not to permit any other enumerator to enumerate him even if he goes back by 1st March, 1961.

4. Do not enumerate pavement dwellers or others who do not form part of the household, when you are enumerating the households. These along with persons who do not normally reside in houses, *i.e.*, members of wandering tribes, tramps, sadhus, etc., would be separately enumerated on the night of the 28th February and on the 1st and 2nd March, 1961.

5. Each individual has to be enumerated in one slip. Before commencing enumeration of an individual make sure to fill the Location Code in each case. The Location Code in the slips will be the same as in the Household Schedule to which the individuals relate.

6. The questions have been briefly printed in the slips, *but only briefly*, and you should study the detailed question forms and instructions for answering them without which you will be liable to miss some of the range and implications of the questions. You should ask the questions *in the order in which they are given in the slips* and proceed to record the answers in their given order. You should make use of the abbreviations recommended in these instructions for recording the answers to the various questions. All abbreviations required to be entered within the geometric designs should be written well within the designs.

7. Make repeated enquiries about new born babies and very young children for they are liable to be missed because they neither talk nor walk and no meals are usually cooked for them.

8. Before leaving one household for the next make doubly sure that all the persons that are to be enumerated in the household have been enumerated. As soon as you have completed the enumeration of the household, fill up the Census Population Record at the back of the Household

Schedule for that household before you proceed to the next household. Strike the total for the number of males and females in the household and check it with number of enumeration slips used before you sign the Census Population Record.

9. You should re-visit every household in your block during the period of final check (1st to 5th March) when you should enumerate every birth that has taken place in the household since your visit but before sunrise of 1st March. You should cancel the slip for any death that might have taken place since your last visit but before sunrise of 1st March by drawing a bold line diagonally across the slip and write DEATH along the diagonal line. You should enumerate any visitor who may have arrived to stay since your last visit and who says he has not been enumerated anywhere else. But you should not take notice of any birth or death or visit occurring after sunrise of 1st March, 1961. After your revisit if you have added any new slip or cancelled any slip already prepared you should make corresponding changes in the Census Population Record at the back of the Household Schedule.

10. As soon as you have completed a pad, you should fill up the enumerator's abstract on the cover of the pad. After you have completed the enumeration of your block and filled up all the abstracts in the pads, you should total up your figures and prepare your abstract for your entire block and hand it over to your supervisor along with your pads.

11. Under the Census Act, every person is legally bound to furnish you with the information you need for recording your answers. You must not ask information on any matters not necessary for the purposes of the census, for example, the amount of any person's income. Nor must you disclose to any unauthorised person any information given to you or the results of the enumeration. All census entries are confidential and cannot be admitted as evidence in any civil proceeding whatever or in any criminal proceeding other than a prosecution for a census offence.

The Individual Slip*

In each household you should first enumerate the Head of the household followed by other members of the household in the most convenient order and see that none of the persons in the household are left out. Please make repeated enquiries about infants and very young children, for they are liable to be left out of count. Count near relatives first, such as wife, son, daughter-in-law,

daughter, son-in-law, grandchildren, then distant-relations and then domestic servants or other employees living in the household, boarders, visitors, etc.

Location Code—Write the Location Code of the household in each slip.

Q. 1(a) Name—Write the name of the person enumerated. For newly born infants who have not yet been given a name write 'Baby' and write 'father's or mother's name'.

Q. 1(b) Relationship to the Head of the household—In the case of the Head of the household write 'Head' for other persons relationships should be recorded in respect of that person. In the case of visitors, boarders or employees write 'visitor', 'boarder', or 'employee' as the case may be.

In the case of places like messes, boarding houses, chummeries, etc., where people live together with no ties of relationship, the manager or superintendent or the person who by common consent is regarded as the Head should be recorded as Head of the household. Other members should be recorded as 'unrelated' in this question.

Q. 2 Age in completed years last birthday—Write age in years completed last birthday. For infants below one year of age, write '0'.

Q. 3 Marital Status—

For never married	write	NM
Married	write	M
Widowed	write	W
Separated or Divorced	write	S

Write 'M' also for persons who are recognised by custom or society as married and for persons in stable *de facto* union. For a widowed person whose husband or wife is dead, and who has not been married again, write 'W'. For a person who has been divorced in a lawful manner, either by decree of a law court or by a regular social or religious custom but who has not remarried or a person who has been separated from wife or husband and is living apart with no apparent intention of living together again, write 'S'. For a prostitute return her marital status as declared by her.

Q. 4(a) Birthplace—

1. If born in village or town in which enumerated	write	PL
2. If born in another village or town of district in which enumerated	write	D
3. If born in another district in the State of enumeration	write name of district	
4. If born in another State in India	write name of district and State, if name of district is known; otherwise write name of State.	

5. If born in a country outside India, *e.g.*, Pakistan or any other country write name of country.
6. Persons born at sea or in air or in railway carriages or on road transport, *e.g.*, buses, etc., should be entered as such.

Q. 4(b) Whether born in Village or Town—

1. If born in a village	write	R
2. If born in a town which is considered a town at the present time even if it was not so considered at the time of birth	write	U

Q. 4(c) Duration of Residence—

1. For a person born in village or town or city in which enumerated	write	X
2. For a person born in another village or town or city of district of enumeration or who was not born in the district of enumeration	write the number of completed years this person has been in the village/town/city of enumeration. (Do not take into account periods of temporary absence on leave or holiday or tour or business).	

Q. 5(a) Nationality—

1. For Indian nationals	write	I
2. For other nationals	write the nationality in full.	

Q. 5(b) Religion—

For Hindu	write	H
Muslim	write	M
Christian	write	C
Jain	write	J
Buddhist	write	B
Sikh	write	S

For others write the answers actually returned.

Q. 5(c) Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribes—

If the person belongs to a Scheduled Caste or Scheduled Tribe obtaining in your State, or in your district write the name of the caste or tribe to which he belongs. For all others, write 'X' in this column.

If the person belonging to a Scheduled Caste or Scheduled Tribe returns his caste or tribe by a synonym or a generic name of a caste or tribe as given in your list, write the name as returned and the name of the relevant caste or tribe, as per printed list, within brackets.

Do not write the names of Scheduled Castes in general terms as 'Harijan', 'Achhut'. You should ascertain the name of the caste when it is returned and write it. If a person is negligent and insists on calling himself merely 'Harijan' tell him that this description will not earn the person any benefits under the Constitution permissible to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes. This may persuade him to give out the correct name.

Scheduled Castes can belong only to the Hindu or Sikh religions. If a person belongs to a Scheduled Caste, there will be either 'H' or 'S' in the answer to question 5(b). Scheduled Tribes may belong to any religion.

Q. 6 Literacy & Education—I. Illiterate or Literate

For a person

The test for reading is ability to read any simple letter either in print or in manuscript, i.e., if the person can read one of the examples in the Enumerator's Handbook with felicity he may be taken to have passed the test for reading. The test for writing is ability to write a simple letter. The test for literacy is satisfied if the person can with understanding both read and write.

II. Standard of Education

If the person can both read and write and has also passed a written examination or examinations as proof of an educational standard attained, write the highest examination passed instead of L.

Q. 7(a) Mother Tongue—Write the mother tongue in full including dialect as returned by the person enumerated. Mother tongue is language spoken in childhood by the person's mother to the person or mainly spoken in the household. If the mother died in infancy write the language mostly spoken in the person's home in childhood. In the case of infants and deaf mutes give the language usually spoken by the mother.

Q. 7(b) Any other Language(s)—After recording the mother tongue enquire whether the person knows any other language(s), Indian or foreign, and write the language(s) reported by him against this question. In case he does not know any other language put 'X'.

The number of languages recorded against this question should not be more than two. These languages should be other than his mother tongue which he speaks and understands best and can use with felicity in communicating with others. Such language or languages will exclude dialects of the same language.

Qs. 8 to 11 Working—These questions apply only to workers. A person who is working may be working as a Cultivator, as an Agricultural Labourer, at a Household Industry or may be doing any other work. You have to record the

answers in questions 8, 9, 10 and 11 according as the person is working as a Cultivator or as an Agricultural Labourer or at Household Industry or doing any other work. He may be engaged in only one of the above four categories or in more than one. Thus a person can be working both as a Cultivator and an Agricultural Labourer, in which case he should be entered both in Q. 8 and Q. 9. Or, he may be working both as Cultivator and at Household Industry in which case he will be entered in Q. 8 and Q. 10. Or, he may be working in any possible combination of 8, 9, 10 and 11, in which case he will be entered in the appropriate places. Or, he may be doing just one kind of work in which case he will be entered in only one of the four Questions 8 to 11.

For an undertrial prisoner enumerated in a Jail he should be recorded for the work or kinds of work he was doing before he was apprehended. Similarly, for a person temporarily in a hospital or similar institution he should be recorded for the kind of work he was doing before he was admitted into hospital or institution. But for a convict in a prison or for long term inmates of penal or charitable or mental institutions, the person's previous work should not be recorded but 'I' should be recorded in Q. 12 below.

The basis of work will be satisfied in the case of seasonal work like cultivation, livestock, dairying household industry, etc., if the person has had some regular work of more than one hour a day throughout the greater part of the working season. In the case of regular employment in any trade, profession, service, business or commerce the basis of work will be satisfied if the person was employed during any of the fifteen days preceding the day on which you visited the household. If on the check or revisional round such a person is found to be unemployed no change in the original entry should be made. A person who is working but was absent from his work during the fifteen days preceding the day on which enumerated or even exceeding the period of fifteen days due to illness or other causes should be treated as worker. A person who has been offered work but has not actually joined should be treated as non-worker. Work includes not only actual work but effective supervision and direction of work.

Persons under training as apprentices with or without stipend or wages will be regarded as working.

An adult woman who is engaged in household duties but doing no other productive work to augment the family's resources should not be considered as working for purposes of this question. If, however, in addition to her household work she engages herself in work such as rice pounding for sale or wages, or in domestic services for wages for others or minding cattle or selling firewood or making and selling cowdung cakes or grass etc., or any such work she should be treated as a worker.

Persons like beggars, pensioners, agricultural or non-agricultural royalty, rent or dividend receivers, who may be earning an income but who are not participating in any productive work should not be treated as working unless they also work in cultivation, industry, trade, profession, business or commerce.

A public or social service worker who is actively engaged in public service, activity or a political worker who is also actively engaged in furthering the political activity of his party will be regarded as a worker and entered fully in Q. 11.

After you have filled up the answers to questions 8 to 11, if you find that in the case of any person more than one productive activity has been recorded, i.e., more than one of the questions 8, 9, 10 and 11 has been filled up by some work, you should ask him which one of the activities that have been recorded for him is his principal work. The principal work is the one on which the person spends most time. Put a ring round the number of question, 8, 9, 10, or 11, according to the work on which the person says he spends most time. You should invariably ask for the principal work where more than one work is recorded and put a ring round the question relating to the principal work.

It may be that in a few cases you find that you have recorded more than two productive activities in questions 8 to 11, i.e., more than two of the questions, 8 to 11, would have been filled up by some work. In such cases you should first ascertain the principal work, i.e., the one on which the person spends most time and put a ring round the number of the question. You should then ascertain the work which is the next in importance to his principal work, i.e., the work after his principal work which occupies most time. You should put a tick against the question number of that work on the right hand side of the question number. The ring and the tick should be put clearly so that any difficulty will not be left to recognise them clearly.

Q. 8. Working as Cultivator—For a person working as cultivator write C. For a person not working as cultivator and for a person not working at all put X.

For purposes of the census a person is working as cultivator if he or she is engaged either as employer, single worker or family worker in (a) cultivation of land or supervision or direction of cultivation of land owned or held from Government and (b) cultivation of land or supervision or direction of cultivation of land held from private persons or institutions for payment in money, kind or share.

Cultivation involves ploughing, sowing and harvesting and does not include fruit growing or keeping orchards or groves or working for plantations like tea, coffee, rubber, cinchona and other medicinal plantations. Persons engaged in fruit growing or orchardry or plantations like tea, coffee, rubber, cinchona and other medicinal plantations should be entered in Q. 10 or Q. 11 as the case may be.

Some of the examples of 'Cultivation' and 'Other field produce and Plantation Crops' to be classified under questions 8 and 11 respectively are given below:—

Under Q. 8. (Cultivation, involving ploughing, sowing and harvesting).

1. Production of cereal crops (including bengal gram), such as rice, wheat, jowar, bajra, maize, roots and tubers like potato, yam, beet etc., sugarcane etc.;
2. Production of pulses, such as arhar, moong, masur, urd, khesari, other gram;
3. Production of raw jute and kindred fibre crops;
4. Production of raw cotton and kindred fibre crops.

Under Q. 11

A. Other Field Produce

1. Production of other crops including vegetables not covered in Q.8.
2. Production of fruits and nuts in plantations, vines and orchards (like cocoanut, arcanut etc.)
3. Production of wood, bamboo, cane reeds, thatching grass, etc.
4. Production of juice by tapping palms.
5. Production of other agricultural produce (including fruits and nuts not covered by Sl. No. 2 and flowers) not covered above.

B. *Plantation Crops*

1. Production of tea in plantation.
2. Production of coffee in plantation.
3. Production of rubber in plantation.
4. Production of tobacco in plantation (does not include tobacco which is cultivated in rotation with other cereal crops, in which case it would go under cultivation).
5. Production of ganja, cinchona, opium, poppy, saffron etc.
6. Production of other plantation crops not covered above.

A person who has given out his land to another person or persons for cultivation for money, kind or share of crop and who does not even supervise or direct cultivation of land, will not be treated as working as cultivator. Similarly a person working in another person's land only as a labourer and has no right or lease or contract on land on which he works, nor is responsible for taking decisions as to which crops to sow and when, or taking the risks of cultivation and is paid for wages in cash, kind or share such as share of the produce (agricultural labourer) will not be treated as cultivator in this question.

Q. 9. *Working as Agricultural Labourer*—Write AL for a person working as agricultural labourer i.e., a person who works in another person's land only as a labourer without exercising any supervision or direction in cultivation, for wages in cash, kind or share such as share of produce. For others put X. The labourer should have no right or lease or contract on land on which he works nor should he be responsible for taking decisions as to which crops to sow and when, or taking the risks of cultivation. A share of the produce goes to him only as wages. He should have been working as agricultural labourer in the last or current cultivating season.

Qs. 10(a) and 10(b) *Household Industry*—If a person is working in a Household Industry write (1) the nature of work done by him in the Household Industry against question 10(a) and (2) the nature of the Household Industry against question 10(b). Otherwise put X in both the questions 10(a) and 10(b). A Household Industry is defined as an industry conducted by the Head of the household himself and/or mainly members of the household at home or within the village in rural areas and only at home in urban areas. The industry should not be run on the scale of a registered factory. Thus the main criterion for a Household

Industry is the participation of one or more members of a household in rural areas. In the urban areas the industry should be confined to the house. You should carefully keep in mind the definition of Household Industry in the rural area if you are enumerating a rural area and the definition in the urban area if you are enumerating an urban area.

A Household Industry should relate to production, processing, servicing, repairing or making and selling of goods. It does not include professions such as pleader or doctor or barber or waterman or astrologer.

A person though he may not be working in his own Household Industry may be working as a paid employee in another Household Industry. You should, therefore, enquire whether the person who is not working in his own Household Industry is working in any other Household Industry and if so, write the nature of the work done by him against question 10(a) and the nature of the Household Industry against 10(b).

Q. 10 (c) *If Employee in Household Industry*—This question will be filled up only for a person who is working as a paid employee in another person's Household Industry. In his or her case write EE. For all others put X.

Q. 11 *Doing Work other than 8, 9 or 10*—If a worker is not working as a cultivator or as an agricultural labourer or at any Household Industry write the actual work he is doing. If a person is working as a cultivator or as an agricultural labourer or at Household Industry and also does some other work (including dairying or livestock raising, orchard or plantation, etc., as distinct from cultivation of crops) which does not relate to any of the above categories, write the other work he does in this question. If he is engaged in more than one work and neither of them relates to any of the three categories mentioned above write here the work on which he devotes more time.

Q. 11 (a) *Nature of Work*—In the case of persons not working or who work only as cultivator or as agricultural labourer or at Household Industry, put 'X'.

Describe fully the nature of the work done by the person himself. Full and precise information as to the nature of work done by the person should be given either in the vernacular or in English or in vernacular transliteration of English. At previous censuses much trouble had been caused by inadequate answers, and if you do not succeed

in obtaining satisfactory information on the individual slips, you will be required to make a further visit for that purpose.

Q. 11 (b) *Industry, Business, Trade, Profession or Service*—In the case of a person who is working and the nature of whose own work has been recorded in Question 11(a) you should write here the nature of industry, business, trade, profession or service in which the person works.

As in the case of Question 11 (a), you should describe in detail the nature of industry, business, trade, profession or service in which the person works. Vague answers should be avoided. In the case of industries, the articles which are produced or serviced or repaired, should be given. If more than one article is produced the chief article produced or serviced or repaired should be given. In the case of business or trade the principal article of trade should be described. In the case of service describe the nature of the service to which the person's work belongs. The description should be such that it would be possible to classify the establishment in which the person is working for purposes of industrial classification of the population. The description should be either in the vernacular or in English or in vernacular transliteration of English.

In the case of a person for whom an X is put in Question 11(a), put an X in this question also.

Important points to remember in Questions 11(a) and 11(b)

1. Women or children who help with work, such as rice pounding or doing domestic service for wages or minding cattle or selling firewood or making and selling cowdung cakes, grass, etc., should be described fully even if they work part-time. *In the case of married or grown-up women who do any of the work mentioned above in addition to the usual household duties such work should be fully described and HW written in brackets after the full description.*

2. If a person makes the articles he sells, he should be entered as maker and seller of them.

3. Wherever convenient, for complete description, the work should be expressed by the vernacular name by which it is known.

4. *Labourers*—For an unskilled labourer usually employed on one sort of work alone, give also the sort of work done, e.g., railway porter, market or bazar porter, labourer employed on road digging, bricklayer's labourer. If accustomed to work on various jobs, write general labourer.

5. *Machine Operators*—Always state the kind of machine giving its recognized name, if any.

6. *Shop-keepers, Retail Dealers, Shop Assistants*—If wholly or mainly engaged in selling, write, 'Dealer' (if principal) or, 'Shop Assistant' or 'Salesman' (if assisting) and state whether the business is wholesale or retail or both. For shop assistants and salesmen in stores with several departments, state the particular department in which engaged (e.g., Ship and Railway Parts, Fans and Sewing Machines, Grocers and Confectioners).

7. *Transport Workers*—Describe fully the nature of the transport, e.g., air transport, rail transport, transport by motor car or motor cycle, or vehicles drawn by horse, etc.

8. *Services*—For a person engaged in the Defence Services write 'Service of Central Government'.

9. If the job is known in the trade or industry by a special name use that name. Manager, Foreman, etc., should be given the department/branch wherever applicable, e.g., Sales Manager or a Manager of Hardware Department, Machine Shop Foreman or Boiler Room Foreman, etc. The following terms are insufficient by themselves:—

Manufacturer, merchant, agent, broker, refractor, dealer, engineer and iron works, etc.

10. *Domestic Services*—In the case of any private servant, e.g., a cook or domestic servant, write only 'private cook or domestic servant'. There is no industry in his case but in the case of persons employed in hostels, restaurants, boarding houses, institutions, etc., the words hotel, restaurant, etc., should be added.

For persons in the employ of firms carrying on two or more businesses, if the businesses are carried on in separate premises then the business carried on at the premises in which the person is employed should be given. If the businesses are carried on in the same premises but each has a separate organisation (i.e., they have separate records of employment, production, etc.) then the appropriate business should be quoted. If, however, the two activities are carried on side by side then the major activity of the firm or establishment should be given.

11. *Commerce*—Special care should be taken to see that the distinction between retail and

wholesale business is clear. As in industries, the goods handled should be clearly indicated.

Q. 11 (c) *Class of Worker*—For a person who is:

1. an *Employer*, that is, who hires one or more persons in his work described in Q. 11 (a) write MR
2. an *Employee*, that is, who does his work described in Q. 11 (a) under others for wages or salary in cash or kind write EE
3. a *Single Worker*, that is, who is doing his work described in Q. 11(a) without employing others except casually, and without the help of other members of the family except casually. This will include workers working as members of co-operatives write SW
4. a *Family Worker*, that is, who is doing his work described in Q. 11(a) in own family without wages or salary in cash or kind write FW

For a person for whom an 'X' is put in Qs. 11(a) and 11(b) put an X in this question also.

Explanation:—

(i) An *Employer* is a person who has to employ other persons in order to perform the work entered in Q. 11(a). That is to say, such a person is not only responsible for his own personal work but also for giving work to others in the business mentioned in Q. 11 (a). But a person who employs domestic servants for household duties or has subordinates under him in an office where he is employed by others, is not an employer, even if he has the power to employ another person in his office on behalf of his own employer or employers.

(ii) An *Employee* is a person who usually works under some other person for salary or wages in cash or kind. There may be persons who are employed as managers, superintendents, agents, etc., and in that capacity employ or control other workers on behalf of their own employers. Such persons are only employees, as explained above, and should not be regarded as employers.

(iii) A *Single Worker* for the purpose of Q. 11(c) is a person who works by himself but not as Head of household in a Household Industry. He is not employed by any one else and in his turn does not employ any body else not even members of his household except casually. This definition of a *Single Worker* will include a person who works in joint partnership with one or several persons hiring no employees and also a member of a

producers' co-operative. Each one of the partners or members of such producers' co-operatives should be recorded as 'Single Worker'.

(iv) A *Family Worker* is a member who works, without receiving wages in cash or kind, in an industry, business or trade conducted mainly by members of the family and ordinarily does at least one hour of work every day during the working season. For the purpose of the entire Q. 11, such an industry should be on a scale larger than what has been covered in 'Household Industry' in Q. 10 whether run at home or away from home in town or village and even away from village in rural area and should ordinarily be in the nature of a recognised partnership, joint stock company or registered factory. For the purpose of this definition members of a family may be drawn from beyond the limits of the household by ties of blood or marriage. The family worker may not be entitled to a share of the profits in the work of the business carried on either by the person or Head of the household or other relative.

Members of the household who help solely in household duties should not be treated as family workers.

Q. 11 (d) *Name of Establishment*—Describe in detail the name of the factory, workshop, business house, company, shop, etc. If a person has no fixed place of work, write 'No fixed place of work'.

For a person for whom an 'X' is put in Qs. 11(a), 11(b) and 11(c) put an X in this question also.

Q. 12 *Activity, if Not Working*—This question will apply to a person NOT Working. Write 'X' in this question for a person who is working, that is, for whom you have recorded the work in any of the questions 8 to 11 above.

The following activities should be recorded in the case of persons NOT Working:

1. For a full time student or child attending school who does no other work, such as make articles at home for sale, nor even help part-time in his own family cultivation, industry, trade or business write ST
2. For a person engaged in unpaid home duties (like housewife or other adult female) who does no other work, such as make articles at home for sale or wages, nor help regularly even part-time in family cultivation, industry, trade or business write HW

3. For any dependent, including an infant or child not attending school, a person permanently disabled from work because of illness or old age write D
4. For a retired person who is not employed again, rentier, person living on agricultural or non-agricultural royalty, rent or dividend or any other person of independent means for securing which he does not have to work and who does no other work write R
5. For a beggar, vagrant or independent woman without indication of source of income and others of unspecified source of existence write B
6. For a convict in jail (an undertrial prisoner will be shown as a worker if he used to work before he was apprehended) or an inmate of a penal, mental or charitable institution write I

7. For a person who has not been employed before but is seeking employment for the first time write NE
8. For a person employed before but now out of employment and seeking work write UN

*Explanation:—*If a person, who does not work, cannot be readily classified in any of the above categories, put him in category 5 and write B in this question. A retired person who has taken up regular work again should not be entered in this question as he would have been entered for his new work in Questions 8 to 11.

A person who is not working but has been offered work which he has not joined should be included in item 3 and 'D' should be written. He should not be included in items 7 or 8.

Q. 13 *Sex*—Write 'M' for Males; 'F' for Females. For eunuchs and hermaphrodites, write 'M'.

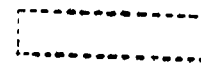

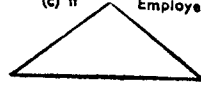
