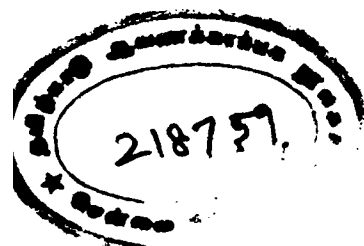
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FOREWORD

Publication of the District Census Handbooks (DCHs) was initiated after the 1951 Census and is continuing since then with some innovations / modifications after each decennial census. This is the most valuable district level publication brought out by the Census Organisation on behalf of each State Government / Union Territory administration. It *inter - alia* provides data / information on some of the basic demographic and socio-economic characteristics and on availability of certain important civic amenities / facilities in each village and town of the respective districts. This publication has thus proved to be of immense utility to the planners, administrators, academicians and researchers.

The scope of the DCH was initially confined to certain important census tables on population, economic and socio-cultural aspects as also the Primary Census Abstract (PCA) of each village and town (wardwise) of the district. The DCHs published after the 1961 Census contained a descriptive account of the district, administrative statistics, census tables and Village and Town Directories, including PCA. After the 1971 Census, two parts of the District Census Handbooks (Part-A comprising Village and Town Directories and Part - B comprising Village and Town PCA) were released in all the States and Union Territories. The third Part (C) of the District Census Handbooks comprising administrative statistics and district census tables, which was also to be brought out, could not be published in many States/UTs due to considerable delay in compilation of relevant material. In 1981, some new features alongwith the restructuring of the formats of Village and Town Directory were introduced in the DCHs. These were published in two parts for each district after the 1981 Census. While Part - A comprised Village and Town Directories, the PCA of villages and towns (wardwise) including Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe PCA upto tehsil /town level were provided in Part-B. To illustrate, all the amenities except electricity, were brought together in the Village Directory and if an amenity was not available in the referrent village, the distance in broad ranges from the nearest place having such amenity was given. Information on some new items such as adult literacy centres, primary health sub-centres and community health workers in the village were provided so as to meet some of the requirements of the Revised Minimum Needs Programme. Similarly, information on approach to the village was also

provided for the first time during 1981 Census in the Village Directory so as to give an idea about the number of inaccessible villages in each district. In case of Town Directories also, keeping in view the requirements of the Minimum Needs Programme, a Statement IV-A on slums was provided so as to enable the planners to chalk out the programmes for providing better civic and other amenities in the slums. In this statement, details on civic and other amenities were reported for the slums of Class I and Class II towns. Apart from this, one column on the Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe population and another on adult literacy classes / centres were added in Statement IV and V respectively.

The manner of presentation of the DCHs for the 1991 Census is by and large the same as followed in 1981. However, the format of PCA has been restructured slightly in the 1991 Census for the benefit of data users. Nine-fold industrial classification of main workers has been given as against four-fold industrial classification presented in the 1981 Census. In addition to this, the sex-wise population in the 0-6 age-group has also been included in PCA for the first time with a view to enabling data users to compute more realistic literacy rate as all children below 7 years of age have been treated as illiterates at the time of the 1991 Census. It is expected that the above mentioned modifications will help the planners in chalking out more effective developmental programmes.

One of the most important innovations in the 1991 Census is the Community Development Blocklevel presentation of data in the Village Directory and PCA instead of the traditional Tehsil/Taluk/PS level presentation. It is expected that the presentation of Village Directory and PCA data at C.D. Block level will help the planners in formulation of micro-level developmental plans, as the C.D. Block is the lowest administrative unit for developmental planning.

In order to facilitate the task of administrators, planners and researchers intending to use Village Directory/PCA data, either from the magnetic tapes/floppies or from the published records, both the computer and manual codes for each village have been provided for the 1991 Census along-with the corresponding codes of 1981.

This publication is a joint venture of the State Government / UT administration and the Census Organisation. The data have been collected and completed under the direction of Shri. K. Sampath Kumar, Director of Census Operations, Tamil Nadu, on behalf of the State

Government which has borne the cost of printing. The task of planning, designing and co-ordination of the publication was initiated by Dr. K.P. Ittaman, former Deputy Registrar General (Social Studies) and Shri. M.M. Dua, Joint Director, for the sake of uniformity in presentation of information / data and for preparation of analytical note depicting the salient features emerging from a micro-level analysis of census / non-census data, a model District Census Handbook from each State and Union Territory was thoroughly scrutinised in the Social Studies Division under the guidance of Shri. M.K. Jain, the present Deputy Registrar General (S.S.). This task was carried out by Shri. A.K. Singh, Deputy Director who was assisted by Shri. N.S. Soam, Assistant Director and his staff. Technical guidance in the preparation of the maps was initially provided by Dr. B.K. Roy, former Deputy Registrar General (Map) and later by Mrs. Minati Ghosh, the present Deputy Registrar General (Map).

I am thankful to all those who have contributed to this project.

P R E F A C E

The District Census Handbook is the most useful publication for the public, social workers, researchers, academicians, administrators, local bodies and the government officials for various official and non-official purposes. It gives data for the village / panchayat at the lowest level to the district level including panchayat union / taluk covering demographic, social, economic and cultural aspects. There had been an endeavour to make it as comprehensive as possible, to provide data on various aspects since its inception and by 1961, it reached the dimensions of a compendium for the district. The Registrar General, India, in his foreword has kindly traced out the improvements brought out from time to time since 1961 to the latest 1991 Census while the history of the District Census Handbook in this State is narrated in the Introductory Chapter to this volume.

The District Census Handbook is a joint venture of the Census Organisation and the Government of Tamil Nadu. The scope of District Census Handbook has been widely increased and restructured in 1981 to meet the Minimum Needs and Revised Minimum Needs Programmes of the Planning Commission. Broadly keeping up the 1981 main structure, the formats of the Primary Census Abstract have been restructured slightly for the benefit of data users. The nine-fold industrial classification of main workers as done at the 1961 and 1971 Censuses has been revived instead of the four-fold classification of the 1981 Census. Population in the age-group 0-6 by sex has been given in order to enable computation of realistic literacy rate as all children below 7 years are treated as illiterates. One of the most important innovations of the 1991 Census is the presentation of data at the community Development Block / Panchayat Union level to help planners in the formulation of micro-level developmental plans at the lowest administrative unit level. In this State, for development planning, the lowest administrative unit is the 'Panchayat Union'. This time, for the benefit of data users of Village Directory and PCA data from the magnetic tapes / floppies or from the published records, the computer code as well as the manual code as of 1991 Census and the corresponding location code of 1981 Census are given.

The District Census Handbooks are now being published in two parts - Part - A - Village and Town Directory and Part - B - Village and Townwise Primary Census Abstract. The two parts are being published in one volume as part A & B for smaller districts.

Part - A deals with a brief description of the district - its major characteristics in relation to the economic resources like forestry, agriculture, industries, social, cultural, religious and historical aspects apart from certain basic amenities like drinking water, education, medical, post and telegraphs, market day(s), communications, etc., and if any of

these facilities are not available to any village, distance range of the nearest place from where available; power supply, approach to the village, nearest town to the village, health and family planning centres, primary health sub-centres and community health workers in the village. Information on approach to village is also provided to identify inaccessible villages in the district. These exhaustive data on infra-structure in relation to amenities available to the villages and land-use pattern are meant to meet the requirements of 'Micro - level' local area development planning at the lowest administrative unit viz., C.D.Block/Panchayat Union level. This is the reason why this time data are being published at C.D. Block / Panchayat Union level instead of the traditional taluk level.

In the Town Directory, information on class of town, area of the town, number of households, population and growth rate of the population of the town at each of the censuses from 1901 to 1991, sex-ratio at the 1971, 1981 and 1991 Censuses, physical aspects of rainfall and minimum and maximum temperatures recorded, distance from State and District Headquarters, nearest city, communication facilities like railway station, bus-route, inland navigation, Municipal finance, civic and other amenities like protected water supply, electric connections by type, fire fighting service, road length by type, system of sewerage, number of latrines by type, total population and SC & ST population, medical, educational facilities by type, recreational and cultural facilities like stadia, cinema, drama, community hall, public libraries and reading rooms, adult literacy classes / centres, working women's hostels, three important commodities manufactured, exported and imported; a special table on civic and other amenities available in all notified slums in Class - I and Class - II towns have been included with a view to ascertain the availability of basic amenities and to meet the Minimum Needs and Revised Minimum Needs Programme.

Part - B deals with the Primary Census Abstract for all the villages in the rural areas and wardwise for urban areas. This time the PCA data like Village and Town Directory data are arranged C.D.Block / Panchayat Unionwise giving area of the village (in hectares), area of town (in Sq.Km), number of occupied residential houses, households, population by sex, Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe population, literates, main workers and their distribution into nine industrial categories (as against the four industrial categories published in 1981), marginal workers, non-workers, and the population in the age group 0 - 6 by sex.

Further, if a village is covering more than one Panchayat, break up figures for each segment of the village forming different Panchayat also are given.

It is hoped that with the modifications now brought out in the Village Directory, Town Directory and PCA and Publication of data at C.D. Block / Panchayat Unionwise would go a long way in helping the planners to chalk out more effective developmental programmes at

micro-level for local area developmental plans as the C.D. Block / Panchayat Union is the lowest administrative unit for developmental planning.

In the process of collection of data of this volume, various State and Central Government Departments have extended their kind co-operation particularly with regard to infra-structural amenities for Part - A - Village and Town Directory, history and general features of the district, etc., I convey my grateful thanks to all of them. The PCA data presented in Part-B of this volume were collected during the Census Operations in February - March, 1991, the reference date being sunrise of 1st March, 1991.

I remain grateful to the Director of Census Operations, Shri. K. Sampath Kumar, who closely guided us in every aspect of this work. He had been a source of strength and inspiration for us. We owe a deep sense of gratitude to him for his kindness in dealing with our practical difficulties, his patient advice and formula of solutions for even small problems, which we brought to his attention.

I wish to record my deep sense of gratitude to (late) Shri. M. Thangaraju, Joint Director of Census Operations and Shri. Ch. Purnachandra Rao, Deputy Director of Census Operations for overall direction and guidance to bring out this publication. I use this opportunity to mention my special thanks to Dr. D. Venkatesan, Assistant Director of Census Operations for scrutinising the draft report and presenting the data with meticulous care and accuracy. I am also thankful to Shri. S.P. Grover, Joint Director of Census Operations and Shri. Phool Singh, Deputy Director of Census Operations who have also provided overall guidance and supervision during their tenure in this regard.

Apart from that, Shri. Gummodi Bapuji in-charge of DCH Section took a meticulous care to arrange this volume in a systematic manner with the help of his colleagues S/Shri. A.V. Raman, K. Sambamoorthy, Investigators, P.G.Sankaran, and M. Thangavelu, Statistical Assistants and other section officials. The preparation of maps included in this volume were done under the supervision of Shri. Jogesh Das, Senior Geographer.

Sakunthala, Statistical Assistant is chiefly responsible for preparing the analytical notes, inset tables, draft write - ups and arrangements of the matter in order.

Rama Rao, Deputy Registrar General (C & T) who has been a source of strength and constant help and guidance on all technical matters like a "Ready-Reckoner". I also thank Dr. K.P. 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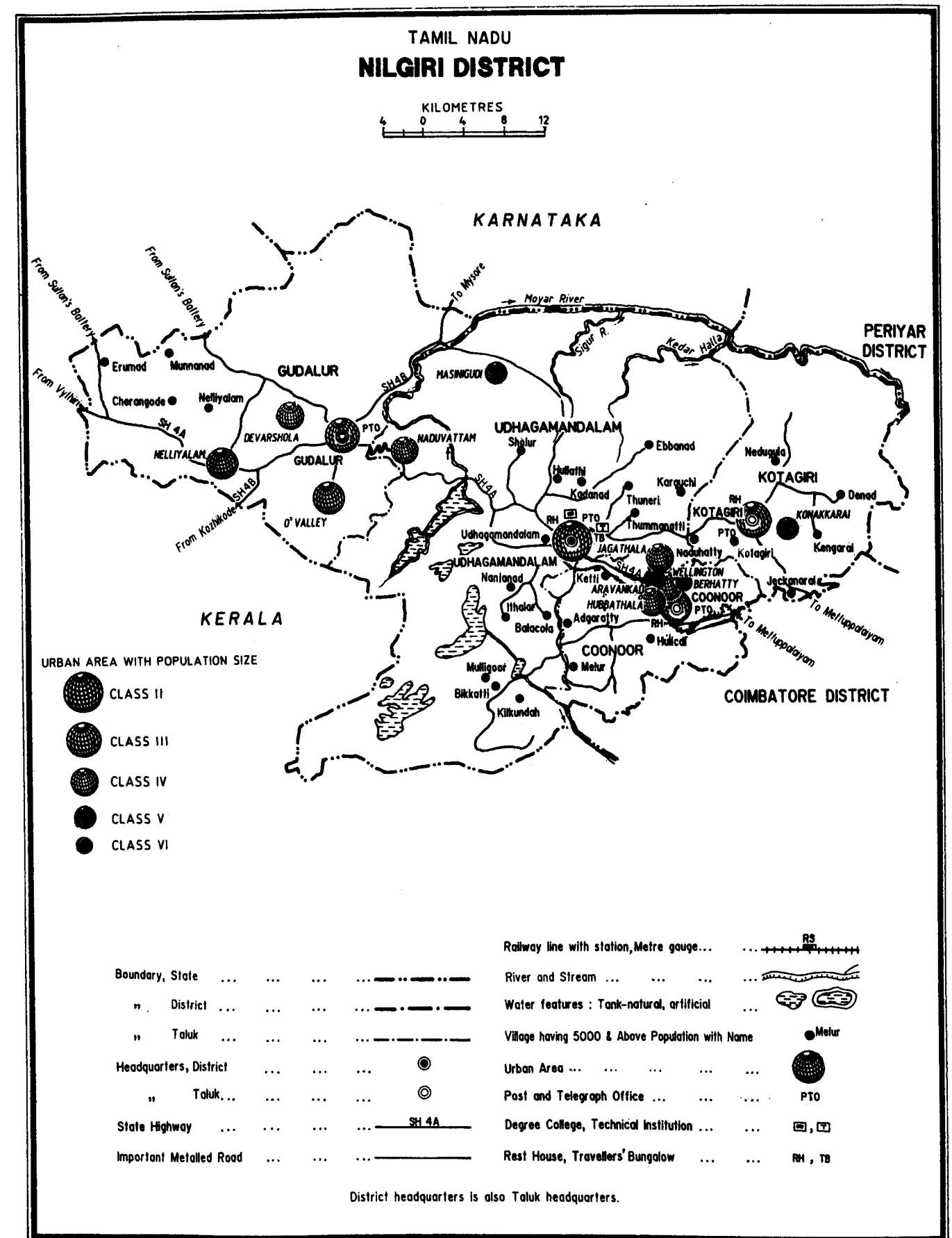

ANALYTICAL NOTE

Census concepts

Rural and Urban areas

It is customary to classify a place as rural or urban in every census and present data separately for rural and urban areas. Urban areas which are specifically defined for census purposes are determined on the basis of certain demographic and economic criteria. The rest are treated as rural areas. At the 1991 Census, the same criteria adopted for determining the urban areas at the 1981 Census have been continued. The urban areas of 1991 Census are :

- All places with a Municipality, Corporation or Cantonment Board or Notified Town area :
- All other areas which satisfied the following criteria :
 - A minimum population of 5,000;
 - At least 75 per cent of male main workers engaged in non-agricultural and allied activities; and
 - A population density of at least 400 per sq.km. (or one thousand per square mile)

The above definition adopted for both the 1981 and 1991 Censuses varies slightly from those of 1961 and 1971 Censuses. As of the 1961 and 1971 Censuses, the males engaged in the activities of fishing, logging etc., were treated as engaged in non-agricultural pursuits and hence have been taken into account with those engaged in non-agricultural pursuits for applying the test of the 75 per cent non-agricultural workers criterion. But in 1981 Census as well as in 1991 Census, they have been treated on par with agricultural activities for the purpose of the test for this criterion. Prior to 1981 Census, certain places with less than 5,000 population were treated as urban areas on the basis of certain consideration like density, social and historical importance etc., at the discretion of the Director of Census Operations in consultation with the State Government. On the other hand, the tests on demographic and economic criteria were strictly applied at the 1981 and 1991 Censuses and no area was classified as urban area on other considerations.

Urban Agglomeration

This concept was adopted for the first time in 1971 Census and continued in 1981 and 1991 Censuses also.

An urban agglomeration is a continuous urban spread constituting a city or town and its adjoining urban outgrowths (OG) or two or more physically contiguous towns together with continuous well recognised urban outgrowths, if any, of such towns. In certain cases, large housing colonies, university campuses, port areas, military camps, etc., would have come up around a city or town but falling outside the statutory limits of the city or town. They may be lying inside the boundaries of a village or villages which are contiguous to the city / town. These villages could not be treated as urban as they do not satisfy the urban criteria. But at the same time the colonies etc., mentioned above deserve to be treated as an integrated urban area. Therefore, all such towns together with their urban outgrowth will have to be treated as one urban unit and called urban agglomeration. All the constituent units of urban agglomerations are also independent urban units or towns.

Census House

A census house is a building or part of a building having a separate main entrance from the road or common courtyard or staircase etc., used or recognised as a separate unit. It may be occupied or vacant and may be used for residential or non-residential purposes or both.

Household

A household is a group of persons, who commonly live together and would take their meals from a common kitchen, unless the exigencies of work prevented any of them from doing so. There may be a household of persons related by blood or a household of unrelated persons or having a mix of both. Examples of unrelated households are boarding houses, messes, hostels, residential hotels, rescue homes, jails, ashrams etc. These are called Institutional Households.

Scheduled Castes / Scheduled Tribes

For the enumeration of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in census, the names of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes as recognised in Tamil Nadu based on the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes Orders (Amendment) Act of 1976 (Central Act 108 of 1976) was followed. The enumerators were instructed to record a person as belonging to Scheduled Caste or Scheduled Tribe provided the name given by the person was found in the list supplied to them.

Literates

In the 1981 Census, a literate was defined as a person who can both read and write with understanding in any language. A person who could merely read but cannot write was not a literate. It was not necessary that for a person to be considered as a literate must have received any formal education or have passed any minimum educational standard. In the 1991 Census, all the children of the age of 6 years or less are treated as illiterates where as in the 1981 Census all children of the age of four years or less were treated as illiterates.

Definition of work

Work may be defined as participation in any economically productive activity. Such participation may be physical or mental in nature. Work involves not only actual work but also effective supervision and direction of work. It also includes unpaid work on farm or in family enterprise.

Main and Marginal workers

The dichotomy of workers and non-workers of 1961 and 1971 Censuses had been dropped and the trichotomy of main workers, marginal workers and non-workers were introduced in the 1981 Census and has been continued in the 1991 Census also. A worker was identified with reference to a reference period preceding the census. The reference period prescribed was one year preceding the date of enumeration. Certain types of work such as agriculture, household industries like gur making etc., were carried on, either throughout the year or only during certain seasons or part of the year, depending on the local circumstances. In such cases what we were concerned with was the broad time spent during the agricultural season preceding the enumeration. Workers can be full-time workers or seasonal workers or marginal workers. If a person had done any work during the reference period and if he had worked for the major part of the year, i.e. if he had worked for 183 days or more, he was considered to be a full-time worker (Main worker). If a person had done any work during the reference period and if he had not worked for the major part of the year, i.e., if he had worked for less than 183 days, he was considered to be a marginal worker. Persons who had not participated in any economic activity even for a day during the last one year preceding the day of enumeration were considered as non-workers.

All the main workers and the marginal workers have been classified under one of the four main categories in the 1981 Census. While in 1991 Census, they have been classified under one of the nine industrial categories as was done in 1971

Census. They are : I) Cultivators (C), II) Agricultural Labourers (AL) III) Livestock, Forestry, Fishing, Hunting and Plantations, Orchards and allied activities, IV) Mining and Quarrying, V) (a) Manufacturing, Processing, Servicing and Repairs in Household Industry, V) (b) Manufacturing, Processing, Servicing and Repairs in other than Household Industry, VI) Construction, VII) Trade and Commerce, VIII) Transport, Storage and Communication and IX) Other Services.

The definitions of these nine industrial categories of workers are given below :

I. Cultivators (C)

For the purpose of census, a person is considered as cultivator if he/she is engaged in cultivation of land, owned or taken on lease from Government or from private persons or institutions for payment in money, kind or share. Cultivation includes supervision or direction of cultivation.

II. Agricultural Labourer (AL)

A person who works on another person's land for wages in money, kind or share should be regarded as agricultural labourer. He/she has no risk in the cultivation, but he/she merely works in another person's land for wages. An agricultural labourer has no right of lease or contract on land on which he/she works.

III. Livestock, forestry, fishing, hunting and plantations, orchards and allied activities

Persons who were reported as engaged in livestock, forestry, fishing, hunting and plantations, orchards and allied activities are treated as workers under this category.

IV. Mining and Quarrying

Persons who were reported as workers in mining and quarrying are classified under this category.

V. a) Manufacturing, processing, servicing and repairs in household industry

Household industry is defined as an industry conducted by the head of the household himself/herself and/or by the members of the household at home or within the village in case of rural areas and within the precincts of the house only in case of urban areas. The larger proportion of workers in household industry should consist of members of the household including the head. The household industry should not be run on the scale of a

registered factory which would qualify or has to be registered under the Indian Factories Act. Merely selling of food items or other edibles should not be regarded as household industry.

b) Manufacturing, processing, servicing and repairs in other than household industry

Persons reported as workers in manufacturing, processing, servicing and repairs other than those mentioned in V-(a) are treated as workers in this category.

VI. Construction

Persons working as plumbers, mason, electricians, painters and others engaged in construction work were treated under this category.

VII. Trade and Commerce

Persons engaged in work such as wholesale or retail business or trade are treated as workers in this category.

VIII. Transport, storage and communication

Persons who were reported as drivers, conductors, technicians, fitters, welders and other communication workers were treated under this category.

IX. Other Services

Persons engaged in services other than those mentioned in I to VIII categories are treated under this category. Workers who could not be classified in any of the above I to VIII categories are treated as those engaged in other services.

Non-workers

All persons who have not been treated as workers i.e., persons who have not worked any time at all during the reference period of one year preceding the date of enumeration have been considered as non-workers.

Thus, non-workers cover all persons who are engaged in his/her household duties and who do no other work or have not done any work at all during the last one year, full time students and children attending school, all dependants such as infants or children not attending school or a person permanently disabled from work because of illness or old age, persons retired from service or rentiers, beggars, vagrants, convicts in jails or inmates of a penal, mental or charitable institution and all non-workers who may not come under any of the above categories.

HISTORY OF THE DISTRICT CENSUS HANDBOOK

After the census of 1951, Government of India offered to hand over to the State Government the Census tables and other data prepared during the Census and suggested that they might be published along with any other useful information relating to each district. The State Government accepted the proposal and the first publication of the District Census Handbook was brought out at the cost of the State Government.

The District Census Handbook of 1951 was found to be very useful and it was therefore decided not only to continue the series for the 1961 Census but also to improve definitely on its content so that each District Census Handbook contained certain basic economic data for the smallest administrative unit in the district and be an useful reference book for scholars and other data users.

The publication of 1971 District Census Handbook was in three parts, viz., Part-A, Part-B, and Part-C; Part-A relating to Village and Town Directory, Part-B relating to Village and Townwise Primary Census Abstract and Part-C comprising District Census tables and certain administrative statistical tables.

The tradition of bringing out the District Census Handbook has been continued by the State Government during the 1981 Census also. In this series, some individual features besides restructuring the formats of the Village Directory have been adopted bearing in mind the national requirements of data for the socio-economic programmes of the Government. The comparability of data with the 1971 Census data has also been kept in view.

The present District Census Handbook will be published in two parts, viz., Part A - Village and Town Directory and Part B - Village and Townwise Primary Census Abstract.

SCOPE OF VILLAGE AND TOWN DIRECTORY STATEMENTS AND PRIMARY CENSUS ABSTRACT

The District Census Handbooks are the only publications which incorporate the data down to the level of a village and level of ward or division of a town which are constantly referred to by the data users.

The Village Directory statement gives the list of villages by C.D.Block and for each village the area, number of households and population, availability of amenities and land use. The information on amenities available in the village

includes educational, medical, drinking water, post and telegraph, market, rail / road or other communication facilities and power supply. Land use is shown as area under forests, irrigation, unirrigated land, culturable waste and area not available for cultivation.

Appendix - I gives C.D. Blockwise abstract of educational, medical and other amenities available viz., the number of villages having various levels and types of educational institutions such as middle schools, adult literacy centres, etc., various types of medical institutions such as dispensaries, primary health centres, maternity and child welfare centres, family planning centres, community health workers etc., and the number of such institutions, various types of sources of drinking water such as tap, well, tank, tube-well, river, fountain, canal, etc., post and telegraph offices, bus stops, railway station, power supply, etc., and also the number of villages not having such amenities.

Appendix - II gives for each non - municipal town (Census Towns) the area under forest, irrigated and unirrigated land, culturable waste (including gauchar and groves) and area not available for cultivation.

Appendix- III records list of villages where no amenities relating to education, medical, drinking water, post and telegraph, communication, power supply and market/hat and public health facilities etc., are available.

Appendix - IV gives list of villages according to the proportion of SCs/STs to the total population by ranges. Part-A of the Appendix lists out villages according to the proportion of SC population. The information is presented by the ranges in per cent, viz., 0-5, 6-10, 11-15, 16-20, 21-30 and 31 and above. Part-B provides similar data for ST population ranges in per cent, viz., 0-5, 6-15, 16-25, 26-35, 36-50 and 51 and above.

The Town Directory gives important and very useful information like civic and other amenities available in all the towns in the district, statutorily notified as well as non-municipal or census towns. The details relating to each of the towns have been presented in seven statements, viz., Statements I to VI and IV-A.

In all the statements, except IV-A, the towns are arranged in alphabetical order for the district. The Town Directory does not cover strictly military areas. It may, however, cover cantonment areas but not strictly military areas or military establishments within the cantonment which are required to be left out. However, basic statistics of the cantonment as a whole have been provided. In the Town Directory,

codes have been given for the data on amenities and civic administration for want of space. The relevant explanations for the codes adopted have been given in the beginning of the Town Directory statements.

The concept of "urban agglomeration" was introduced for the first time in 1971 replacing the concept of "town group" of 1961. The concept of urban agglomeration has been continued in 1981 and 1991 Censuses also. An urban agglomeration may be explained as "it must form a continuous urban spread constituting a town and its adjoining urban outgrowth or two or more physically contiguous towns together with continuous well recognised urban outgrowth, if any, of such towns".

An urban agglomeration includes two or more independent census towns. The names of the towns/urban agglomerations have been arranged in the alphabetical order. The particulars of the individual town which constitutes one of the units of agglomeration have not been furnished separately because the particulars have already been furnished, where they occur together under the name of agglomeration. The following remarks have been given against such town within brackets :

"(See the name of the main town of the agglomeration)"

By adoption of this method, the reader can get an idea of the particulars of the urban agglomeration in total and also separately.

Statement I - Status and Growth History

Statement - I provides some basic data based on the Primary Census Abstract for the towns and urban agglomerations of 1991 Census. For analysing the town directory data at the State level and all India level, some new columns, have been introduced in the 1981 Census. The new items are : class of town, area, number of households, population and growth rate at each census since 1901, density and sex ratio at the 1971, 1981 and 1991 Censuses are also provided in this statement. In 1991 Census, a new item, the name of C.D. Block is also provided in the statement.

Location Code Number of Towns

To distinguish the town from the village, the location code numbers for towns have been given in Roman numerals and these numbers have been assigned in a continuous order for the district as a whole. In 1991 Census, name of C.D. Block has been included with a view to locate the town in the appropriate C.D. Block.

Statement II - Physical aspects and location of towns, 1989

Under physical aspects, annual rainfall and temperature particulars are furnished. These particulars were obtained from the Commissioner of Statistics, Tamil nadu, Madras. If the information is not available for any particular town, the nearest town for which it is available is given. For Col.(9), nearest city with population of one lakh and more is furnished according to 1991 Census. For the other columns, figures obtained from the Municipal Commissioners and Panchayat Union Commissioners are given. The zero within brackets in columns 10 and 11 denotes that the referent town itself is enjoying road transport facilities. In column 12, name of the navigable river/canal and its distance is indicated as follows : "Cauvery (R)-5". In this case, 5 is the distance in Kms of the navigable river Cauvery from the referent town. In brackets, "R" for river and "C" for canal have been given.

Statement III - Municipal Finance, 1988 - 89

The civic administration status of the town, the receipt through tax, properties and powers, Government grants, loans, advances and other sources and the expenditure on general administration, public safety, public health, public works, public institutions and other public services are given in this statement. The receipts and expenditure are furnished in terms of rupees in hundreds.

Statement IV - Civic and other amenities, 1989

The civic and other amenities existing in the towns as in 1989 are given. The data were obtained from the Municipal Commissioners and Panchayat Union Commissioners of the concerned towns.

Column 3 - Civic administrative status : It is a new column introduced in this statement in 1981 to facilitate analysis.

Column 4 - Population : It is also a new column introduced in this statement in 1981 to measure the amenities in respect of population.

Column 5 - Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe population :

This column is also introduced in 1981 to know the size of the population of the weaker sections of the society in the towns based on Census.

In this statement, information on road length, system of sewerage, number of latrines, method of disposal of night soil, protected water supply (source of supply, system of storage with capacity) and fire fighting service are also collected from the Municipal Commissioners and Panchayat Union Commissioners and furnished.

Electrification

Electrification particulars obtained from the Tamil Nadu Electricity Board through the Municipal Commissioners and Panchayat Union Commissioners have been furnished as given below :

i) Domestic Connections

This refers to the number of services given to houses for domestic purposes like fans, lighting, etc.

ii) Industrial connections

This refers to the number of services effected to L.T. (Low Tension) Industries such as workshop, flour mills, oil mills, grinding machines, cotton ginning and engineering industries etc.

iii) Commercial connections

This refers to the services given to shops, business houses, public institutions like offices, schools and commercial establishments.

iv) Road lighting points

This refers to the number of points of street lights which are maintained by the board and for which consumption charges are paid to the board by respective local bodies. For some panchayats, the number of services effected alone has been furnished under street lights and not the points.

v) Other connections

This refers to the number of services effected for agricultural purposes, huts, public water supply systems, cottage industries, etc.

Statement IV-A - Civic and other amenities in notified slums, 1989

This is a new statement on civic and other amenities in the notified or recognised slums of Class I and II towns introduced during 1981 Census. Generally, in cities or towns having slums, the local authority such as Municipality or Municipal

Corporation or even the Development Authority have notified the recognised slums. Such notifications are linked up with the availability of funds from the State Government for slum clearance.

Name of the slum and the details of the area, population, length of the paved roads, system of sewerage, number of different types of latrines and method of disposal of night soil etc., are given in this statement.

Statement V - Medical, educational, recreational and cultural facilities, 1989

In this statement, medical, educational, recreational and cultural facilities of the towns as in 1989 are furnished. The data for educational and medical facilities were obtained from the Municipal Commissioners and Panchayat Union Commissioners for the concerned towns, and from the Director of Secondary Education and Director of Public Health respectively. Under medical facilities, number of hospitals/dispensaries/T.B. clinics etc, and number of beds in medical institutions etc., are furnished.

Under educational facilities, the number of Arts / Science / Commerce colleges, Medical Colleges, Engineering Colleges and Polytechnics obtained from the State Education Department are furnished.

Column 10 - Recognised shorthand, typewriting and other vocational training institutions :

Particulars were obtained from the District Industries Officers and from the Directorate of Employment and Training. The term recognised refers to institute recognised by some statutory authority like Education Department, Commerce Department, Labour Department etc., of the Government or by Semi-Government or autonomous bodies, public sector projects etc.

Column 16 - Number of working women's hostel with number of seats :

This is a new column introduced during the 1981 Census. Considering the increase in the employment of women in urban areas, the housing need of working women has been considered as an important subject for study.

Data presented under column 18 - refer only to the permanent cinema theatres and do not include the touring cinemas.

Statement VI - Trade, commerce, industry and banking in 1989

In this statement, trade, commerce, industry and banking facilities in the town as in 1989 are furnished. Banking particulars were obtained from

the Reserve Bank of India. The information on number of agricultural and non-agricultural credit societies were collected from the Registrar of Co-operative Societies through the Municipal Commissioners and Panchayat Union Commissioners of the concerned towns.

Scope of Primary Census Abstract

The Primary Census Abstract, as it is called, presents basic data for each village or segment of a village (in cases where such village segments form different Panchayats) in the "Villagewise Primary Census Abstract" and for each ward/division of a town in the "Urban Primary Census Abstract". The format of the Primary Census Abstract for the villages and towns in 1991 has been slightly modified as compared to the 1981 Primary Census Abstract.

The Primary Census Abstract will give the details on area, number of occupied residential houses, number of households, total population, population in the age-group 0-6, number of SC/ST population, literates, total main workers, distribution of main workers by nine industrial categories, marginal workers and non-workers in respect of each unit. In 1981, the main workers were classified into four categories whereas in the 1991 Census they are classified into nine industrial categories as in 1961 and 1971 Censuses. For the first time in this census, the population in the age group 0-6 with sex break up is presented in PCA in order to arrive at the realistic literacy rate as all the children below seven years are treated as illiterates in this census. The Urban/Village Primary Census Abstract gives this information for each village and each urban ward. Till 1981 Census, the Primary Census Abstract was presented for each taluk and for each town in a district. But, in the 1991 census, the Primary Census Abstract for each CD Block is presented for the first time in the Indian Census. Besides these, separate Primary Census Abstract for scheduled castes and scheduled tribes which contain similar details as those in the PCA for general population is presented for State/District/Taluk/Community Development Block/UA/City/Town.

With a view to ensure comparability and to enable data users to derive the figures either for a revenue village or panchayat according to their requirements, the data are presented for segments of villages also, wherever portions of one village happen to be in two or more panchayats. The segment-wise data have to be used separately or added with the data of concerned segments so as to derive panchayat data. For example, if portion of a revenue village bearing L.C.No.9, Thingalur, forms part of two panchayats, the figures are given

separately for each portion of the village against L.C. No.9 a/b and 9 b/b. The total figures for the entire revenue village can be arrived at by adding the figures given against both the segments viz., 9 a/b and 9 b/b given in the Village Primary Census Abstract. If, instead, the panchayat figures are required, the data for the concerned village segment or segments relating to the panchayats concerned are to be added up to arrive at the total figures for the respective panchayats. An appendix is presented in the case of the Urban Primary Census Abstract and it gives 1991 population, Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe population for each enumerator block of the town. This may be useful for administrative and election purposes in the urban areas. Such data are also required by urban planners and researchers for conducting other studies in selected blocks.

Mode of presentation

At the beginning, the District Primary Census Abstract containing data for District and C.D.Blocks (for Total, Rural, Urban areas) as also towns under each C.D. Block and at the end, all the towns/UAs in the district are presented. In 1991 Census, the C.D.Blocks is the main unit of presentation of data instead of taluk which was the main unit till 1981 Census. The District PCA is followed by alphabetical list of villages for each C.D. Block in the district. This is followed by Village / Urban PCA. In the Village / Urban PCA, data for the first C.D.Block for total, rural and urban areas separately, followed by data for villages and census towns falling under each C.D. Block are presented. Thereafter, similar data for second, third and subsequent C.D.Blocks in the district are presented. At the end of the last C.D.Block, the Urban PCA containing data at ward level for all the towns and cities besides the data for UAs are presented. In an appendix to the Urban PCA, total population and population of Scheduled Castes/ Scheduled Tribes for each Enumerator Block of every town/city in the district are given. After the appendix to Urban PCA, the Talukwise PCA containing data for the District and each taluk in the district with Total, Rural and Urban breakup is presented, as such data are also sought after. This is followed by two annexures. Annexe - I contains details of Community Development Blocks falling under each taluk and Annexe - II contains names of the villages/segment of villages constituting each town in the district.

Maps

Apart from the District Map given as frontispiece, maps for each taluk showing the villages, Location Code numbers and their

boundaries are presented. The boundaries of the C.D.Block falling in the taluks are also shown. As compared with the maps presented in 1971 and 1981 District Census Handbooks, some improvements have been effected in the maps presented in this volume. All towns are shown with shading screens and also spheres according to the population size of towns in the district and taluk maps.

Area Figures

In the District Primary Census Abstract, the area figures are given in Sq.Km for total, rural and urban areas. In the Village Primary Census Abstract, the area figures for each revenue village are given in hectares upto two decimals. The area figures for each town is given in Sq.Km. in the Urban Primary Census Abstract. In the District Primary Census Abstract, the area figures of the district total represent the "Geographical Area" figures supplied by the Surveyor General of India. Figures for urban areas and villages are those supplied by the local bodies and revenue authorities respectively. The total urban of the area of a district has been arrived at by adding the urban area figures of each town within the district. Area figures for the rural areas of the district are derived by subtracting the urban area figures from the total area of the district. The area figures of each C.D.Block represent the area figures that are published in the concerned departmental publication of the State Government. The area figures of the C.D.Blocks will not add up to the district area figures because, the C.D.Block area figures represent the "Land use" area, while those of the district represent "Geographical Area", supplied by the Surveyor General of India. The total of the village areas given in the Villages/Urban Primary Census Abstract may not tally with the rural area of the C.D.Block given, as the C.D. Block area figures include hills, forests, rivers etc. whereas the village area may not include the same. One Sq.Km is equal to 100 hectares.

It is hoped that the pattern of presentation of basic census particulars for each district as explained above and adopted in this volume would be found convenient by data users.

Part A & B

A Brief analysis relating to certain population characteristics is made utilising the information collected in the village and town directory and the Census Data in the PCA. A number of tables have been designed for this purpose. The tables are generated at the district/taluk/C.D. Block level for the rural areas and in regard to urban areas, townwise particulars are presented.

NILGIRI DISTRICT - AN OUTLINE

Introduction

The name Nilgiri derives from the words neel (blue) and giri (mountain) and the area covered with Blue Mountains has been brought under Nilgiri District. The area of the district is 2,549.00 sq.km.

Nilgiri District gains its charm from the natural setting. High above the sea level, situated at the junction of Eastern and Western ghats of the Sahyadri Hills, the Nilgiris provide a fascinating view. The steep hills and narrow valleys with numerous perennial rivers and river lets, running in all the directions with a few fine Water-falls here and there, provides a beautiful scenery. The grassy heights of the mountains and the thick forest along the lower ranges of these mountains add its beauty. Another important features of this district is its climate.

Historical background

The Nilgiri District is said to be one of those happy countries which have no history. Even had it been sufficiently rich or strategically important to tempt an invader, its inhospitable climate, the difficulties of the passes to its feverish jungle which hedged it round would have deterred any but the boldest. But, it never contained any towns worth sacking or fort worth capturing. The only inhabitants were poor graziers, the tribals, and cultivators.

The oldest inscription which mentions that the district belongs to about 930 AD. and states that Wynad was then part of the territories of Ganga dynasty of Mysore. Hoysalas ruled Wynad during the first quarter of 12th Century AD. and King Vishnuvardhana, ruled from 1104 to 1141, was the first to capture Wynad and the plateau. He was said to have frightened the Todas, driven the Kongus underground, slaughtered Poluvas, put to death the Malayalees, terrified the King Kala and entered into the Nilgiri mountain. Hoysala rulers were later overthrown by the Mussalmans of Delhi. Wynad and Nilgiri came under the Mysore Kings during the early part of 17th Century. Hyder Ali usurped the throne of Mysore in the later part of 18th Century. As a result of the last Mysore War, the Nilgiri Plateau, which was then known as "Dannayakankottai" district, was merged with the East India Company's territories. Though the plateau was transferred to the East India Company as early as 1799, no serious efforts were taken by any Englishmen to climb the hill until 1812.

In 1800, efforts were taken by Dr. Francis Buchaman to climb the hill from Dannayakankottai by walk. As he returned to Dannayakankottai on

the same day, it was assumed that he would not have climbed beyond Arakod which is below the Rangaswamy peak. In 1819, a serious attempt was made to climb up to the hill by a new party which included Mr. Sullivan, the then Collector of Coimbatore. This party surveyed the area and they have produced a good account of data of the area. Mr. Sullivan climbed the hill once again in 1819 and selected a place for his residence at Dimhatti. For the first time, he took efforts to construct a bridal path from Sirumugai near Mettupalayam to Kotagiri and Dimhatti with the financial assistance of the Board of Revenue.

Early in 1830, Mr. James Thomas succeeded Mr. Sullivan as the Collector of Coimbatore. In 1837, Lord Elphinstone became the Governor. His period saw the opening up of coffee estates over the hills for the first time. In 1873 and 1877, the Ouchterlony Valley and south-east Wynad were respectively merged with the district. In 1882, the status of the district was made equal to that of all other district. Designating the Commissioner of the district as Collector and the Assistant Collector, Commissioner became Head Assistant Collector. The Collector was also given the powers of an Additional Session Judge. The taluk administration came into being with the appointment of a Tahsildar. Gradually the status of the district was enhanced and today it yields considerable importance in several fields. The existence of extensive coffee, tea and cinchona plantations have increased the resource of the district. The recognition of the Nilgiris as summer capital has richly contributed to the glory of the district.

The Nilgiri District is divided into the revenue divisions namely Coonoor and Gudalur with four taluks under each with a total of 45 revenue villages. Udhagamandalam is the headquarters of the district and it is popularly known as the "Queen of the Hill Station". For local administration the district have categorised into two Municipalities, one township, four Panchayat Unions, 9 Town Panchayats and 2 Village Panchayats. Geographical area of the district is 2549.00 Sq.Km. and the population is 710,214. It has a density of 279 persons per sq.km. which is less than the State average of 429 per sq.km. Among the four taluks viz. Gudalur, Udhagamandalam, Kotagiri and Coonoor, Udhagamandalam is the largest taluk covering 92,653.25 hectares with a population of 2,40,039 persons. Kotagiri is the smallest taluk covering 21,949 hectares with a population of 114,374. Kotagiri taluk was formed separately on 1st May, 1978 from Coonoor taluk.

The district represents with 3 Constituencies to State Legislative Assembly viz., Gudalur, Udhamandalam and Coonoor of which Gudalur constituency is reserved for Scheduled Caste. The Nilgiri Parliamentary Constituency covers the entire district. There were 23 Police Stations and 5 Outposts in the district as on 1990. There is no jail in this district.

Location and Physiography

Nilgiri is a mountain district situated in the Northwestern part of the State bordering Kerala and Karnataka State. It lies between 11°, 10' and 11° 43' North Latitudes and 76°, 14' and 77°, 02' east longitude.

trees on the western slopes grow tallest, which reach an average height of 200' to 250'. Apart from the normal plants and trees a number of trees and plants from various parts of the world have been introduced in this district.

One of the important Sanctuary of India, the Mudumalai Wildlife Sanctuary is situated in this district. Karnataka and Kerala highways pass through this forest. There are five Wild-life sanctuaries situated in this district, namely :

Forestry

Nilgiri District consists of greater forest wealth. The magnificent forest play vital role for economic development of this district.

The forest may be divided into four types namely green woods (Sholas), the artificial plantations (for firewood), Australian trees, deciduous forests of the northern slopes including Moyur valley. Majority of the trees that grow here are found to be more or less deciduous in character and hence during dry season (January to March) these forests have a bare appearance. The

Flora and Fauna

Chital population is high and seen especially in the Masinigudi area. Samba, though not plentiful, are found plenty in numbers. One can also see Guar (Indian bison), wild bear, barking deer, mouse deer, Indian porcupine etc., in the sanctuary. Packs of wild dogs can be seen chasing Chital. Other animals commonly seen are Malabar squirrel, flying squirrel, common langur, bonnet monkey, blacknaped hare etc. Panther and tiger may also be seen occasionally. Bears may be seen mostly in the early hours of morning and late in the evening.

Pythons are among the advertised reptilian attraction of the sanctuary, but here are a number

of snakes more commonly seen, including cobras, rat, snakes and saw scaled viper. Monitor lizards are a special feature of the Masinigudi forests where they attain a large size.

For bird watchers, the sanctuary is a paradise. Their chorus at dawn is a delight to the visitor. One can see a variety of birds such a grey jungle fowl, peafowl, spur fowl, grey partridge and quill crossing the forest roads. Sham, common lora, golden oriole and scarlet minivet entertain the visitors with their sweet melodies. Racket tailed dronge Malabar grey hornbill, Malabar dragon, paradise fly catcher, light jar, hill mynah, woodpeckers, pigeons etc., are also seen. The majestic peacock can be seen very commonly here.

The sanctuary will appeal as much to people interested in the flora as to those who care for wild animals. The vegetation within the sanctuary varies from deciduous to evergreen type. In the drier localities of the sanctuary species of Acacia and Albizzia, with a low undergrowth of lantana and other thorny bushes and short grasses are seen with sprinkling of sandal wood. In other areas of Mudumalai, one comes across valuable timber, species such as rose wood, teak, ventek, vengai etc. Screw pine can be found along the streams and streamlets. Bamboo growth is a special feature of the sanctuary and they grow in the moist regions.

Apart from the wildlife sanctuaries, there is a National Park situated in Udhamandalam taluk, covering an area of 78.46 sq.km. Inside the forest, Forest Department has undertaken a number of schemes for promoting forest wealth and climate control through intensive tree planting such as Extensive Forestry Programme, Hill Area Development Programme, Pulpwood scheme, Western Ghat Development Programme. Outside the forests, intensive tree planting and extension of forestry under social forestry scheme like supply of seeding and raising plantation have been taken up in village porambokku land.

Hills

The Nilgiri District or the plateau is surrounded by Bhavani river in Southern side and the Moyar

river in the northern frontier which joins the Bhavani near the mouldering fort of Dannyakankottai very close to Rangaswami peak, the eastern-most part of the Nilgiris.

The Nilgiri is spread on the north with Mysore State, a plateau some 4,000 feet lower which is upheld on either side by the Eastern and Western ghats and merged by insensible degrees into the Wynad. The plateau is a true table land. Its surface is being broken by endless undulations which in places swell into considerable and distinct ranges. It is divided as East and West into two fairly equal but dissimilar parts by a range of heights running through North and South, of which Doddabetta is the tallest point i.e., 8,640 feet above the sea. Other noticeable points in the mountain mass are Nilgiri Peak (8,122 feet) Deva Betta (8,375 feet), Mukurthi Peak (8,380 feet) and Pichal Betta (8,395 feet). Apart from these, there are three noticeable points including Cone 8,299 feet, Club Hill 8,030 feet and Elk Hill 8,090 feet. The lake at Udhamandalam is 7,288 feet above the sea. Devachola (the devine wood) Hill is 7,417 feet height prominent for blue gum trees and its centre, coffee- growing area, further-East Kulakambai Hill 5,601 feet commands glorious views across the Bhavani Valley at its foot to the Lambton Peak range (so called from Colonel William Lambton., Superintendent of Great Trigonometrical Survey in Coimbatore District). Midway between Udhamandalam and Kotagiri, the Rallia Hill (7,375 feet) amidst the reserve forest on the same name and near to it, Dimhatti Hill (6,903 feet) on the extreme East are situated in the district.

Soil

The soil in Nilgiri District is dominantly composed of Pyroxene gneisses interbanded with Pyroxene granulites and garnetiferous quartzofelspathic gneisses. The relatively low country around the massif is made up of hornblende biotite gneiss, biotite gneiss, micaceous and ferruginous quartzites with emplacement of ultrabasics like dunite, peridotite, pyroxenite, gabbro and anorthosite. All these are introduced by younger granites, vein quartz, gabbros and diorites. On the Nilgiri plateau there are a number of aluminous laterites capping.

Being hill area with steep slopes, rate of soil creep and erosion is quite high and hence soil thickness does not exceed more than a metre in slope. Light yellow to reddish brown clay soils are of common occurrence. Humus soil of about 0.5 m thick are confined to the areas covered by thick vegetation.

Minerals and Mining

The regional foliation trend of rocks varies from ENE-WSW to East-West with steep dips varying from

60 degrees to vertical on either side, indicating synforms and antiforms. Three sets of steep dipping joints tending 1) NNE-SSW, 2) NNW-SSE, and 3) East-West are prominent. All the prominent escarpments on the hills are developed along one or more of these three joint directions.

A total area of 1,78,900 sq.km with a maximum thickness of 6m of primary bauxite and 1,70,000 sq.km of detrital bauxite have been located in these areas.

In the Kotagiri Taluk bauxite deposits are seen near Mathurai, Kotagiri, Kerkombai and Lliyada areas. A total reserve of 0.18 million tonnes with 40% A12 O3 content has been estimated in these areas. Some of the bauxites from Kotagiri are being utilised by the A.C.C. Cement factory at Madukarai.

A large number of gold bearing quartz reefs occur in Devala-Pandular area of Gudalur Taluk. This area was the scene of intense mining activity during the second half of the 19th Century. Organised mining continued intermittently upto 1950. There are a number of old mines. The mines like Alpha, Victoria, Harewood, Solomon Resedenmalai, Richmond, Phoenix and Glenrock are well known. The ore is generally of very poor grade with less than 2 gms/tonne. Exploratory drilling carried out in recent years indicated a possible reserve of 1,603,800 tonnes of ore with an average gold content of 1.9 gms tonne in Alpha-Victoria mines.

Low grade iron-ores (magnetite-quartzite) are reported from near Devala, East of Vedapalli near Coonoor, Illithorai on Coonoor-Kotagiri Road, Kodaperumond, Showdown, Tettanuvedu, Trichigudi, Karudugalai, Masinagudi, Madapad and Ajrur. Most of these have 35 to 38% total Fe but sample from the surface have analysed even upto 58% Fe due to the Oxidation of the magnetite to hematite and enrichment near the surface. The total reserves of Devala occurrences are estimated to be of the order of 11 million tonnes. The reserves are only a few lakhs or a few thousand tonnes in each of the other areas.

Thin veins of magnesite in dunties peridotites and Pyroxemites are recorded from Thengumarahada in Moyar Valley. Probable reserves of about 1,00,000 tonnes were estimated upto 20m depth.

Muscovite mica is seen in a number of pegmatites in Gudalur Taluk. About nine old working and one new mine are located in Cherambadi area. A few workable deposits of muscovite mica of 15 to 20m., across in size occur in pegmatites near Bokkaipuram, Chembanattam, Pandalur and Cherambadi (Geological Survey of India, 1859, M.H.F., Blanford).

Rivers

Bhavani and Moyar are the two important rivers. The Bhavani originate in the South and the Mouyar in the North. In the southern portion drainage is mainly by Bhavani and Kundha rivers which flow Southwards. In the Eastern portion, Katar river flows eastwards into the Bhavani river.

The water of the monor streams as well as major rivers of the Nilgiri Plateau have been excellently harnessed by drawing them at several points under the Kundah, Mukurthi, Pykara, Cholathipuzha and Moyar hydro-electric schemes.

Under the kundah scheme, reservoirs have been constructed at Parson's valley, Emerald, Avlanche and Kundah rivers and these are interconnected by tunnels.

Electricity and Power

The copious rains in this district feed a good number of streams and rivers. It leads for the establishment of a number of hydro-electric projects in this district.

Pykara Electricity system

There are 14 dams constructed for different purposes in this district. The Pykara Hydro-Electric Scheme (with a height of 3,080 Sq.ft) was the first power project undertaken by the Government of Tamil Nadu in 1929. It utilises the water of the Pykara river which drains a portion of the Nilgiri plateau in catchment area of 9 Square miles with an average rainfall of over 80 inches per annum.

Moyar Project

The Movar Hydro-Electric station was the first hydro-electric project executed under the Five year Plans. It utilises the tail end water of the Pykara Station over a drop of 1,300 ft.

Kundah Project

The Kundah Hydro-Electric Scheme is one of the biggest projects undertaken by the State Government. The scheme envisages the utilisation of all hydropotential available in the Kundah basin in the Nilgiris by the construction of five power houses which was completed during the Second and Third Five Year Plans. The Government of Canada provide aid under the "Colombo Plan" for construction of the project by way of machinery and material.

The Parson's valley Dam

It is 10 miles from Udhagamandalam and is 480 feet long at the top, 15 feet wide and 115 feet height above the foundations. It has gross capacity

of 680 million cubic feet drinking water supply from this reservoir.

The Avalanache Dam

The Spilway Type dam is 2km away from Emerald camp bus stop. The length of the Dam is 1,200 feet with breadth of 21 feet and height of 186 feet. The Non-Over Flow type Dam is two furlongs from the Emerald Dam bus stop. The water storage capacity of both dams is 5,500 million cubic feet and the catchment area of the both reservoirs cover 22.6 sq.miles.

The Upper Bhavani

It is about 7 miles away up the Bhavani river from Emerald Camp bus stop. The dam measures 1,030 feet long, 20 feet wide and 246 feet height. The water storage capacity is 3,047 million cubic feet and the catchment area covered is 12.8 square miles. The Kundah Forebay Dam is 560 feet long, 15 feet wide and 95 feet height located in this district. The water storage capacity of the Dam is 55 million cubic feet.

Agriculture and Plantations

The net area under cultivation in this district is 1,15,640 acres. The main food crops are Paddy, Ragl, Samai, Wheat and Potatoes. The Tea and Coffee Plantations were introduced in these hills during 1863. The area now under tea plantation is 21,900 hectares and average annual yield is 34 million kilograms of tea. Coffee is planted over 8,200 hectares in the district.

With the objective of rehabilitating people of Indian origin who migrated to Tamil Nadu, the Government of Tamil Nadu embarked upon many schemes, one of which is raising tea plantations in the Nilgiri District. The project was commenced in the year 1968. The project was implemented by the forest department upto 31.3.1976 and it was converted into a Corporation on 1.4.1976.

Sri Lankan repatriates, allotted by the Director of Rehabilitation, Madras, are absorbed in this Corporation. Two members in each family are provided with work. So far, 2,325 repatriate families have been absorbed in this Corporation. As a whole, 2,763.52 hectares of tea plantation is being maintained by this Corporation.

The Corporation has two C.T.C. Tea Factories at Cherangode and Cherambady. As per the Tea Trade Associations rules, TANTEA (Tamil Nadu Tea Plantation Corporation Limited) is selling upto 75% of the production through auctions. The auctions are periodically held at Cochin, Coonoor and Coimbatore. The tea produced in these factories is a very good quality fetching good price in auction sales in South India. A sizable quantity of Tiger Hill Tea is exported to countries like U.S.A., Canada, U.K. and Switzerland.

The Nilgiri District has always had the reputation of being one of the finest tea growing tracts in the world. In the field of crop husbandry,

although raising by seedlings was the prevalent technique at that time, this Corporation has adopted raising plantations by clones. TANTEA is a pioneer Society having raised extensive clonal plantations (2,770 hectares) which is one of the few largest clonal holdings in the world. Planting was carried out in 3 phases, as given below :-

The establishment of tea in the grass lands (Phases II and III) requires special mention which were once considered unsuitable for raising tea by the traditional planting companies.

Though the tea bushes are young, by careful scientific crop husbandry, TANTEA have crossed the Nilgiri average of 2,100 Kg. of Made-tea per hectare in Phase-I which is incidentally the world's highest yield. In certain plantations, TANTEA have production crossed 3,000 Kg. of made-tea per hectare per annum.

TANTEA has formulated two new schemes to step up the productivity in the following manner.

- Stepping up of productivity by supplementary irrigation and improving soil health, moisture retention and soil conservation measures.
- Raising pepper over an area of 1,000 hectares in Phase-I division i.e., raising pepper in the tea gardens as intercrop.

For economic viability of the above schemes, NABARD has aided the projects. Further under the crop diversification programme, to utilise the lands unsuitable for tea which are under the threat of encroachments, Cardamom and other Commercial crops like arecanut etc., are being raised. About 45 hectares of Cardamom have already reached the yielding stage (in 1989). There is another programme of raising Cardamom plantation in 100 hectares, (Tamil Nadu Tea Plantation Corporation Limited, 1989)

Apart from the plantation crops, other crops such as cereals, pulses and other food and non-food crops are cultivated in this district. The sub-joined statement shows the break-up of the areas under different food and non-food crops.

The total area under food crops in 1990-91 was 17,216 hectares as against 17,586 hectares in 1989-90 indicating a fall of 2.1 percent in this district.

Irrigation

There are no major sources of irrigation in this district. Two monsoon seasons help cultivation of different crops in this district. South-West monsoon from June to September and North-West monsoon between October and November play crucial role for the agricultural activities. According to the Directorate of Statistics, Government of Tamil Nadu, there are 193 private wells in this district used for irrigation purpose only. In this, 181 and 12 are masonry and non-masonry. There are 621 wells used for domestic purpose, of which 60 wells are not in use. There are 421 hectares of land irrigated by canals. Tube wells and tanks are not reported in this district. It is reported that 150 hectares of land is being cultivated by the help of spring channels. There are 193 dug wells in this district, of which 171 used for industrial purpose.

Animal Husbandry

Hill Area Development Programme is implemented in this district. Under this programme, a sheep breeding co-operative society has been formed. There are two Veterinary Hospitals, nine Veterinary Dispensaries and 27 branch dispensaries render medical services and technical assistance for cattle development. In addition, there are bull stations to supply semen to the Veterinary Institutions for carrying out artificial insemination. A poultry extension centre is working at Masinigudi. Above all, there is a mobile veterinary dispensary in this district.

District livestock in a farm at Nilgiri, where the breed of Friesian, Jersey crosses, Red dane crosses are maintained under the Hill Area Development Programme.

Fisheries

Nilgiri District is an undulating plateau with a minimum height of 750 metres and a maximum of 2,580 metres. Water sources are mainly hill streams and small rivers. The indigenous fish in these water are minnows and other uneconomic species. Game fish like trout were introduced in these water. Efforts to introduce the game fish, the trout in the hill streams of the Nilgiri were made as early as 1863 by Dr. Francis Day by importing

eyed ova of the fish from New Zealand. Henry C. Wilson Fish farm of the Fisheries Department is named after Mr. H.C.Wilson, the founder of the Department, who was deputed in July, 1906 by the Ceylon Fishing Club. Exotic fish like Mirror Carp, Golden Carp and Leather Carp are reared and sold to the public.

Industries

Nilgiri District has only a few Industries, most of them are tea industry. The tea leaves plucked from tea bushes are processed and packed in these factories. Apart from the main tea factories, the wooden tea chests are manufactured in these factories as an ancillary industry. Unlike tea, coffee crop produced in the Nilgiri District is not processed within the district. The processing is done in the plains, either at Mettuppalayam or Coimbatore. Of 8 big industries in this district, some of them are : The Needle Industries (India) Ltd., The Hindustan Photo Films. The Cordite Factory etc. Certain industries like manufacture of photo films cordite etc., are located in this district because of its climate and high altitude. In Nilgiri District, there are 394 cottage industries registered. The list is given below :-

In Coonoor, Udhagamandalam and Kotagiri, there are a number of automobile servicing factories. As the functioning of a large number of these automobiles servicing units, a large number of lorries ply for transporting goods from one place to another. (Office of the Director of Industries and Commerce, Tamil Nadu, 1991)

Trade and Commerce

The major items involved in trade in this district are tea, coffee, potatoes, vegetables, fruits, timber, eucalyptus oil, wattle bark, garlic, pepper etc. Coffee seeds are sent to Mettupalaiyam and Coimbatore for processing and the seeds are purchased by Coffee Board. Agricultural produce and other items grown in the district are marketed both at Udhagamandalam and Mettupalaiyam. The consumer goods like rice, other food grains, clothing etc., are brought from the plains.

Transport and Communications

Roads

Nilgiri District has a good network for transportation. Road covers almost all directions connecting the important regions. The Kotagiri ghat road connecting Mettupalaiyam, Coonoor ghat road connecting Mettupalaiyam to Coonoor are the main communication link to Udhagamandalam from the plains. The Sigara ghat road starts from the northern crest of the plateau and passes through Masingudi and Teppakadu and joins the Gudalur-Mysore road. From Udhagamandalam another ghat road leads to Aralanke. The road from Karamadai in Coimbatore is extended upto Perumbahalla due to expansion of Kundah Power House No.11, Naduvattam and Gudalur are connected by the Gudalur ghat road. The road to Mysore beyond Gudalur passing through

Mudumalai Wild Life Sanctuary serves as the main communication link to Mysore. Access to Kozhikode on the West is also possible from Gudalur by a state highway passing through Cherambadi which is the western most village in this district. A significant improvement in transport facilities in the past decades have been notified. Most of the buses in Nilgiri District are operated by the State Government. Apart from this, a number of tourist buses and taxis are available in the district.

Railways

A railway line is being connected to this district from Mettupalaiyam in Coimbatore district to Udhagamandalam covering a distance of 46 Km of which 8 Km lie in plains. There are six railway stations in the district.

Post and Telegraph

The Nilgiri District is well connected by Post and Telegraph facilities. Telephone connection such as ISD/STD/PCO are available in all the taluk headquarters. Apart from the above, television facilities are also extended to this district.

Rainfall

The driest period in the district is from January to March. In April and May, rainfall appear impartially all over the district and every station. The unequal distribution of rainfall is of the greatest importance from an agricultural point of view - plants and trees which will do well on the moisture West side refusing to flourish on the drier eastern slopes - and also provides the resident in the district with a wide choice of climate.

In Udhagamandalam the total rainfall is only 991.0 mm; the highest (359.9 mm) in July, no rainfall in January and February during 1989. Yet Udhagamandalam is popularly known as rainy spot. The average annual rainfall at the district headquarters is 82.58 mm per month during 1989.

Climate and Temperature

Nilgiri experiences with one of the most pleasing equable climate on the face of the globe. The first three months of the year are almost rainless and are a possession of bright and clear days during which a dry wind blows from the north-east through January and February and veers round to the south-east in March. This is perhaps the pleasant and healthy of the seasons; the hoar-frosts which are common at night between December and February turns the grass on the downs an unlovely brown and the absence of rain and the dry wind check vegetation. In April and May, good rainfall appear and the grass, the flowers and the trees that start into life again; but the temperature rises to its highest point and the climate is less bracing.

Education

In Nilgiri District, there are 211 primary schools and 57 middle schools, 43 secondary schools, 16 higher secondary schools, one college and 6 other educational institutions, while 826 mid-day meal centres run by the State Government.

The literacy rate, according to 1991 Census, for the district is 71.70%; 81.79% males and 61.47% females.

In this district, 67.02% of the rural population to total Population are literate; 78.75% males and 55.26% females. While the urban population literacy accounts to 76.45% of which, female literacy is 67.84% against 84.84% male literacy. The following table shows educational expenditure for the district included in the VIII Five Year Plan and for the Annual Plan 1990-91.

People

The plateau is traditionally divided by the inhabitants into four regions. Peranganad, Merkund, todanad and Kundahnad.

The Todas claim to have been the owners of parts of plateau, a fact which is acknowledged by the other hill tribes by their contribution in grain or "Goodoo" (tribute) and also by the British by the

payment of compensation in money for lands taken up for the formation of Udhagamandalam settlement. But there is no proof that the Todas have actually been exercised any sovereign rights over the plateau. King Vishnuvardhan seized the Nilgiri plateau in 1117 A.D. His general Punis is said to have frightened the Todas and driven the Kongas underground and entered into 'Nila' mountain offered up the peak to Lakshmi of victory. This is the first mention hitherto discovered of the names 'Todas' and 'Nilgiris'. The title 'Subduer of the Nilgiri' (Nilgiri-sadaran) was borne hereditarily for a long time by the Hoysalas and their successors. They considered the Nilgiris as Holy and it is said that even a sight of their summit was held to be sufficient to remove sin.

The Nilgiri is renowned for its original inhabitants, the tribals. They include the Todas, Kotas, kurumbas and Irulas. With their unique customs and ways of living, the tribals of the Nilgiris are of great interest, particularly to the anthropologist. Besides, the Badagas, who were once belonged to Scheduled Tribe, are the agricultural community inhabited in majority of the Nilgiri district.

The Todas

The Todas are considered by the other tribes to be the lords of the soil and are accordingly paid tribute. They live in small hamlets known as 'Muds' consisting of small dome-shaped thatched roofs with a low door through which one has to crawl in and out. Their women wear fancy ringlets and beads. The most ancient and sacred place of worship for Todas is called 'Pho', located at Muthunad Mund in Udhagamandalam taluk. 'Pho' is circular in shape with height of about 4' while walls are made of granite slabs all round. Its roof is conical in shape and 20' high is covered by dry grass. There are no idols in the 'Pho' (temple) of Todas, except a lamp lit with ghee prepared from buffalo milk.

The Mukurthy peak is a spot held very sacred as the residence of a person whom the Todas believe to be the keeper of the portals of heaven. Their idea is that the spirits of deceased Todas, together with the souls of the buffaloes killed by their friends to accompany them to heaven and supply them with milk there, take a leap from this point as the nearest way to the celestial regions, which they call 'the other district'.

A belief in witchcraft is common to all the hill tribes. The Todas fear over the practice of witchcraft by the Kurumbas. The Todas and the Kurumbas keep the Badagas in a state of perpetual terror by threatening a similar resort to supernatural agency.

The ceremonies observed by the Todas on the occasion of their marriage are few and simple. The feasting which is customary in such occasion being given primary attention. On the day of nuptial, the bride is brought to the house of the groom, who place first their right and then their left foot upon bride's head, while the bride leans down for the purpose. Dissatisfaction with the wife justifies the husbands in sending her back to her parents, and the wife may desert her husbands with impunity. Instances have frequently occurred, in which, a girl has fled from two or three houses until she has at length found one in which she has been contended to remain for rest of her life.

The Todas are divided into five clans namely Peiky, Pekkam, Kuttan, Kenna and Tody. The first is considered to be the most aristocratic, and they do not even intermarry with each other. This practice may lead to decline of population growth.

The custom of polyandry, or that of a woman marrying more than one husband is peculiar among them. A Toda woman becomes a wife of all brothers of a family and children are apportioned to her husbands according to seniority. The eldest of the brothers being considered the father of the first child and so on. This system also under process of changing by virtue of civilisation and their association with outer world.

The Todas have two funeral ceremonies, one is performed immediately after death, and the other, about twelve months later soon after the spirit has left its earthly tenement, they remove the corpse of the deceased to one of their groves, lay it on the funeral pyre for cremation. They then slaughter a few buffaloes to accompany the deceased to the world of spirits and furnish him with milk there. They collect and preserve the ash of the deceased. This ritual is called 'green funeral'. The ceremony observed a year after is considered much more important. The neighboring Badagas, Kurumbas and others are invited for this ceremony.

Badagas

The Badagas are more industrious than the Todas. They are found mostly in Udhagamandalam and Coonoor taluks with different walks of life. They speak a language called Badaga which must have originated from Kanarese. They are divided into six or more sects of which three are reported to be superiors. One section follow the Linga's at faith and are vegetarian. They allow divorces and remarriages. They confirm the marriage tie only after a woman becomes pregnant.

Funeral ceremonies of Badaga differ from that of Todas. When there is no hope of recovery and the person is at the point of death, a small gold

coin is dipped in ghee and placed between his lips for him to swallow if he is able; if not, it is wrapped in a piece of cloth and bound to his arm. Like the Romans of old, the old Badagas thus provide their departing friends with money for the supposed purpose of paying their expenses on the road to the other world, and this coin they think is sufficient for the journey till they have passed over the thread-bridge which they suppose separates the valley death from the invisible world. When the funeral car is completed the corpse is placed on it. If the deceased is a male, his personal belonging like walking stick, flute etc., are laid near the corpse, as well as the dry skin a pumpkin to serve as drinking vessel in the other world. On the following morning, people assemble from all sides and then begins the death dance, in which all the males join and go round and round the corpse. After the sun has passed the zenith, the spirit of deceased as supposed to have entered heaven and the dancing ceases. Then burn the corpse. It is considered very bad omen if it rains during the funeral. It is believed that the deceased must have committed some very great crime. Next morning the ash of the corpse is collected and thrown into the stream.

Kurumbas

The Kurumbas are the least civilised tribal group in the Nilgiri. Their villages are termed as 'Moothas'.

They live, not on the plateau of the hills, like the Todas and Badagas, but on the slopes and in the most feverish places. They are however, in constant intercourse with other two tribes, for whom they act as priests and musicians. The Kurumbas are classified into three categories:- the Mulla Kurumbas, the Naya Kurumbas and the Panias. The latter two live in the Wynad. The Kurumbas call their deity Kuribattaraya meaning lord or possessor of sheep. Now and then, they sacrifice a goat or a fowl.

Kotas

The Kotas formerly lived on the mountain in Mysore called 'Kollimala' and they named the first village they built on the Neilgherries. They now occupy seven large villages, all of which are known by the general name of 'Kotagiri', or 'cow killers' hill. They are agriculturists, musicians and metals artisans for other tribes. They worship Gods which are not represented by any image. Their temple is known as "Aynor Gudi" and the most important Aynor Gudi is in "Kotta Maidhan" at Kotagiri in Coonoor taluk. The bow and arrow are kept as a memory of their traditional practice of hunting. Their common name for the God and Goddess is "Kaubatta Raya".

Panias (Paniyan)

The Paniyans are one of the Tribal communities living in Gudalur taluk of the Nilgiri district. The word "Paniyan" means "servant" in Tamil. They were traditional farm labourers for Chetty landlords who owned extensive lands (with district). With the introduction and abolishing bonded labour system the Paniyan freed themselves from this system.

The Paniyan number less than 3000 in the district. The infant mortality rate among the community is said to be very high and the reason attributed is lack of adequate medical care. To compound these troubles the paniyans do not freely mingle with the people of other communities. Their hamlets are mostly situated on the fringes of jungles. Thatched roof huts with mud walls offer poor shelter from torrential rains experienced during the wet season. To make a living, they collect fire wood in the jungle and sell it in the nearby bazaar. Occasionally, they go for hunting and fishing. Crabs are a delicacy for them.

The women are proud of wearing their traditional dress. They are highly superstitious. They worship goddess 'Kattu Bhagarathi'.

Irulas

The Irulas, like the Kurumbas, live by cultivation in the district. They speak in Tamil. They live on the lowest slopes and are hardly recognised as a hill tribe. Like the other tribes, they are also fond of ornaments and wear strings of red and white beads on their necks, wear bracelets and ear and nose rings.

Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe welfare work in Nilgiri district.

The population of Scheduled Caste in the district is about 2.14 lakhs out of the total district population of 7.10 lakhs as per 1991 Census. They are mainly engaged as agricultural and Plantation labourer.

In this district, 67.02% of the rural population to total population are literate; 78.75% males and 55.26% females. While the urban population literacy accounts to 76.45% of which female literacy is 67.84% against 84.84% male literacy.

There was a proposal for a sum of Rs. 51.44 lakhs for constructing hostels and school buildings by Adi-Dravidar and Tribal welfare. For another sum of Rs. 100 lakhs to construct dormitory, pucca link roads for remote tribal areas and for construction of a foot bridge across the Moyar river at Kallampalayam have been sent for inclusion in annual Plan 1989-90 under Hill Area Development Programme. Out of the above the sum of Rs. 21.44

lakhs has been sanctioned for the year 1988-89 and the balance of Rs. 30 lakhs included in the annual Plans for 1989-90.

Tribals

The total population of Scheduled Tribe in this district is 25,048 which constitutes 15.98% of the total Population of the district. The Scheduled Tribes inhabited in the district are Todas, Kotas, Kurumbas, Irulas, Paniyas, Kattunaickans etc., The break up Scheduled Tribe population is given below:

The main occupations of the tribes are agricultural, agricultural labour and rearing of milch animals. A few Kota tribes are employed in Hindustan Photo films and Banks.

About 19,810 house site pattas have been issued to Scheduled Castes and scheduled Tribes. Of this, 714 house sites were granted by way of acquisition of private lands. In addition, there are 15 land acquisition cases on hand to provide house sites to Scheduled castes, Scheduled Tribes and Backward Classes covering an area of 29.12 acres. For the socio-economic upliftment of Scheduled castes and Scheduled Tribes scheme like free supply of tools and appliances to technically trained scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes are implemented. Details of Tools and appliances supplied free of cost to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes are given below :

Drinking Water

In most of the Adi-Dravidar colonies and Tribal areas protected water supply is provided. The Tamil Nadu Water Supply and Drainage Board is taking up the work of Provision of drinking water supply to all the residential areas including Adi-Dravidar colonies and Tribal Settlements. Many drinking Water wells have been construct by this department.

Road

Most of the Adi-Dravidar colonies and Tribal settlements are connected by road from the Taluk and District headquarters. Very few tribal

settlements in the eastern slopes of this District are not connected by roads. The steepness of the area prevents formation of link roads to these settlements. However, foot path have been provided for the remote areas to reach the main road by walk.

Department of Adi-Dravidar and Tribal welfare is running 6 Adi-Dravidar Welfare Schools; 2 middle schools and 4 elementary schools in the district. All schools are facilitated with Chief Minister's Noon meal Programme. The Total students in the 6 schools are 1024; 892 Scheduled Castes, 53 Scheduled Tribes, 53 Backward Classes and 26 Other Castes.

For development of Scheduled Tribes Various schemes such as issue of milch animals, construction of work sheds, construction of community halls, raising of plantations etc., are sanctioned for the welfare of Primitive Tribes.

Tribal Education

In the district, for the benefit of the tribal children, 23 Tribal residential Schools are being established; one high school, five middle schools and 17 primary schools. The number of students studying in these schools are 3,009; 874 Scheduled Castes, 1799 scheduled Tribes, 241 Backward classes and 95 Others.

During the year 1988-89 the Government have sanctioned the following schemes for the welfare of primitive Tribes.

The Poonery Temple, Nelliyalam

This Vishnu temple was constructed about 300 years ago by the Senior Raja of Vittathoor. The story reveals that one day one of Raja's cow while out at grazing separated itself from the herd and returned without milk in its udder. The cowherd followed it one day stealthy and on reaching the spot which is 200 feet east of the present temple, a beautiful calf came out of a bush and drank the cow's milk. The cowherd made his appearance suddenly and the calf turned into a stone. He reported the fact to his master, the Vittathoor Raja, who constructed a temple and installed the Idol in it. The deity is in standing posture, with four hands holding a conch shell and discuss in two of his hands. This private temple is 21 miles away from Gudalur, the taluk headquarters.

Sri Mahalingeswar Temple, Melur

The temple is 500 years old, built by the residence of Melur and its neighboring villages. A youth of Meriban (a small hamlet near Melur) married a girl in Melur. The parents of the girl presented her a cow which gave birth to calf in due course. The cow gave up half of her milk to the calf and let out the other half on a stone in the forest nearby. The people realised that the stone was an idol and built a temple around it. It was worshipped as a Sivalingam. This temple is 15 miles away from Coonoor which is managed by trustees appointed by HR & CE Board.

Places of Tourist Importance

The Nilgiri, the paradise of holiday makers, nestles among hills at a point where the Eastern Ghats meet the Western Ghats and sprawls among a beautiful plateau. One can see many profiles of natures each with district grandeur. Excepting July the other months are pleasant and enjoyable. This hill station attracts visitors from all over the country in all seasons.

Botanical Garden

The Botanical Garden is one of the loveliest spot in Udhagamandalam. Started as Kitchen garden which was given final shape by the Marquis of Tweeddale in the year 1847. Good maintenance and availability of variety of exotic and ornamental plants bestow on this garden a unique position among the several gardens in India. Flowers and seedling are available for sale in the Botanical Garden. There is a wood-hut (Log House) at the top from where panoramic view of Udhagamandalam can be had. The annual spring flower club is held every year during May, attract large number of visitors. The Botanical Garden have been maintained by the Tamil Nadu Agricultural Department since 1920. In the midst of the gardens just below the small lake there is a fossil tree trunk of 20 million years old.

Doddabetta

Doddabetta is said to be the highest peak in Tamil Nadu. On the top, there is an attractive glass pavilion. On a clear day one can have a bird's eye view of Udhagamandalam, Coonoor, Wellington and Kundal and even the distant Coimbatore plains and the Mysore Plateau.

Tiger Hill

Branching off after 3 miles from main road to Coonoor a path leads to the Tiger Hill Reservoir, a beautiful picnic spot. From the reservoir one can reach nearer to Tiger Hill Rock, precipice and some

caves situated above the valley view. The edible nest swiftlet breeds in the cave hill.

Udhagamandalam Lake

This is an artificial lake, constructed during 1824 by Mr. Sullivan. Pleasure boating facilities is available in the lake. Row boats as well as Motor boats are also available for visitors. Pony rides near the Lake is a major attraction particularly for children. Every year during Summer Festival (May) boat races are conducted in Udhagamandalam Lake.

Wilson Fish Farm

A fish farm maintained by the Fisheries Department is named after Mr. H.C. Wilson, the founder of the Department, who was deputed in July 1906 by the Ceylon Fishing Club. Exotic fish like Mirror Carp, Golden Carp and Leather Carp are reared and sold out for consumption of the local people.

St. Stephen's Church

This Parish Church was built in 1829, the Rt. Hon. S.R. Lushington, then the Governor of Madras laid the foundation stone. The oldest in Nilgiri, its wooden arches are said to have been brought from the place of Tippu Sultan at Srirangapatnam in Mysore State.

The Wenlock Downs

It is named after Lord Wenlock, a former Governor of Madras. The undulating landscape covering 40 square miles of grass and shola lying immediately west of Udhagamandalam are officially called by this name. The sun-set seen from the Golf Links on the Downs specially in September and October is indeed glorious. The Golf Links are laid out over an area of 193 acres which consists of 18 hole at a height of 7,400 feet with a par over 6,207 yards. The Government of India's Raw Film Factory (Messrs. Hindustan Photo Films) is located here. The Kamaraj Sagar (Sandynallah Dam) is built on the Downs. The Government's Sheep Farm, the Udhagamandalam Kennel Club and the Golf Links of Gymkhana Club are all in the Downs.

Sims Park

Located in Upper Coonoor, Sim's Park opened in 1874 as a pleasure ground for the inhabitants and visitors of Coonoor and Wellington, has become a Botanical Garden in the course of its evolution. This park is named after a member of the Governor's Council, J.D. Sim (1870-75), who was

its chief architect. Many species of trees and shrubs which do not thrive in Udhagamandalam are grown here. Annual fruit and vegetable show is held here.

Dolphin's Nose

It is about 12 Kms from Coonoor bus stand situated near Tiger Hills. Enjoy the micro climate of the Shola Forest criss crossed by the winding to road, one can take a glimpse of Catherine Falls from there. The area is also abundant with wildlife.

Government Museum

The Government Museum located on Mysore Road in Udhagamandalam was set up in 1989 with a view to provide education about Nilgiri to the residing and visiting population. The Museum has items of tribal objects, district's ecological details and representative sculptural arts and crafts of Tamil Nadu.

The Mukurthi Peak and Mukurthi National Park

Mukurthi Peak is about 40 Km away from Udhagamandalam. The Mukurthi National Park is located on the South Eastern Corner of the Nilgiris Plateau.

The area contains a viable population of Nilgiri Thar (*Hamitragus hilocrius*). The Kollaribetta and the Nilgiris Peak are other major peaks around. The area is chained by innumerable beautiful and perennial little streams, which falls into Bhavani Puzha. The silent Valley in the Western ghat is located on the Western side of these range. A fascinating feature of the Mukurthi Sanctuary is its endemism and relationship with Himalayan flora and Fauna.

Pykara

It is situated about 21 Km away from Udhagamandalam on the Udhagamandalam-Mysore Roads with well protected fenced sholas. Toda settlements, undisturbed grassy meadows and also a good wildlife habitat. The Pykara Dam

and reservoir attracts many tourists. There is a forest Rest House at Pykara.

Avalanchi

It is located at distance of 28 Km away from Udhagamandalam a beautiful lake surrounded by very good forest cover. A thick forest where even sunlight cannot penetrate and is abundant with a wide variety of avifauna which is called a Nature Lover's paradise. The road leading to Lakkidi and Upper Bhavani from Avalanchi is an ideal wildlife habitat and has vast stretch of undisturbed forests.

Mudumalai Wildlife Sanctuary

Lying in the Nilgiri District, abutting Kerala and Karnataka State, this is situated at an elevation of 1000 metres and extends over an area of 321 sq. km. A variety of habitats, ranging from tropical ever green forest to moist deciduous forest, moist teak forest, dry teak forest, secondary grass lands and swaps are found. The wildlife includes Elephants, Gaur, Tiger, Panther, Sambar, Spotted Deer, Barking Deer, Mouse, Wild Bear, Porcupine etc. The avifauna is varied with minerals, Hornbills, Fairy Blue birds, Jungle fowls etc. The reptillions are represented by Python, Monitor Lizard, Flying Lizards etc. It is approachable from Udhagamandalam by road via two different routes via Kalhatty 36 km away from Udhagamandalam and the other route is via Gudalur which is 67 km away from Udhagamandalam. It can also be approached from Mysore which is at a distance of 91 Km. Other picturesque spots in the sanctuary include the Moyar Water falls, the Chief Minister's watch tower, Ombetta Swamp, Theppakad elephant camp etc.

Law's Falls

It is situated in the Ghat Reserve Forest of Coonoor range. It is about 7 Km away from Coonoor. The height of the Falls is about 180 Feet. There are vast stretches of undisturbed forests.

The above table shows the decadal changes of population in Nilgiri district during 1981-1991. The district as a whole recorded growth of 12.70 per cent. Among all the taluks, Gudalur (28.71 per cent) and Kotagiri 5.09 per cent. Percentage of Urban Population in all the four taluks are significant. Gudalur taluk has the largest Urban Population i.e., 1,12,865 which accounts for 62.04 percent.

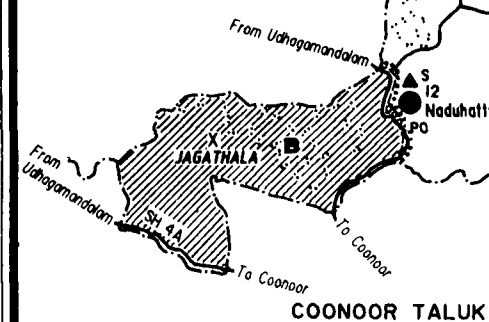
