PREFACE.

THE gentlemen who have favored me with this information, are all named in the body of the work and I take the first opportunity of thanking them for the readiness with which they complied with my requests. It is needless to mention however, how difficult it is for any individual to collect numerous statistical facts, or that a large mass of information can only be got together by the orders of authority. I leave those who have engaged in similar inquiries to decide as to the amount of credit due for what is here gathered, but I myself regard the information now acquired as but the initiatory step in an investigation of great importance, as a mere nucleus around which may be gathered other data until sufficient have been collected to allow of some one, at some future time, drawing legitimate deductions from the whole.

If my readers will favor me with any facts they may have to communicate it will give me pleasure to bring out a new and enlarged edition of this work so soon as additional materials have sufficiently accumulated for the purpose.

It is not pretended that the plan adopted in this volume for investigating the remote and proximate causes of epidemic cholera and the modes of its propagation or diffusion will certainly lead to our better knowledge of the disease, but forty years of inquiries directed to the examination of cholera fields and to the condition of the people attacked have not placed us in possession of any theory as to the source of cholera worthy of being received without question, and it is not impossible, therefore, that an examination of the refuge sites and of the physical condition of the races who have continued exempt from this malady may enable us to discover a cause which the previous form of inquiry has failed to do. The partial distribution of the morbid poison, as manifested in the early appearance of the disease in some places and its passing by others, has been a feature of the malady known from its origin, but these pages will satisfactorily prove, what I was the first to advance now seven years ago, that there are not only towns and villages but great tracts of country with cholera sweeping as an epidemic every year or endemic in

the places around them, which possess a power either to repel the poison from their borders or so to modify its virulence or to resist its action, that for forty years their inhabitants have enjoyed an immunity from a disease which all other parts of India have almost annually suffered from epidemic attacks of. The most recent report on cholera mentions six principal theories at present in vogue as to the remote cause of Asiatic cholera and the cause of its spreading, but acknowledges that an exclusive theory of the mode of propagation or diffusion of cholera cannot be maintained. I give these six theories below* because of the high standing of the public body that recognises them; but though in the very infancy of this form of the inquiry, it is needless to remark to those who are familiar with India, its people and their ways, that none of these six theories

The first theory considers that the disease spreads by an atmospheric influence or epidemic constitution.

The second, regards the cause of cholera as a morbid matter which undergoes increase only within the human body, and is propagated by emanations from the bodies of the sick, in other words, by contagion.

The third theory, that propounded by Dr. Snow, supposes that the poison of cholera is swallowed and acts directly on the mucous membrane of the intestines, is at the same time reproduced in the intestinal canal, and passes out, much increased, with the discharges, and that these discharges afterwards, in various ways, but chiefly by becoming mixed with the drinking water in rivers or wells, reach the alimentary canals of other persons, and produce the like disease in them.

The fourth theory also assumes that the cause of cholera is a morbid matter or poison, but supposes that it is reproduced only in the air, not within the bodies of those whom it effects, and that its diffusion is due to the agency of the atmosphere.

The fifth theory is a modification of the *fourth*; it admits that the cholera matter is increased by a species of fermentation or other mode of reproduction in impure, damp and stagnant air, but maintains that it nevertheless is distributed and diffused by means of human intercourse; it being carried in ships and other vehicles; and even in the clothes of men, especially the foul clothes of vagrants, and the accumulated baggage of armies.

The sixth combines the 2nd and 4th, assuming that the material causes of the disease, may be increased and propagated in and by impure air, as well as in and by the human body. nor any combinations of them suffice to explain some of the facts that this volume contains. In the present stage of this inquiry and although I consider that we are even now in possession of information sufficient to allow of valuable deductions being drawn, I nevertheless abstain from indicating what I believe to be the tendency of the facts here recorded, preferring to await the receipt of the more extensive information which I believe this publication will induce inquirers to place me in possession of, and I am encouraged in this belief by having already received a very interesting report on Honore from Dr. Montgomery, Zillah Surgeon of that Station, which is appended.

I would merely here add that though my efforts are chiefly directed to discover the remote cause of Cholera, this search must go hand in hand with an investigation into the proximate causes of the disease and with the modes of its propagation or diffusion, and any inquiry to be effectual, therefore, must embrace an examination of all connected with the topography of the refuge districts or towns. On the occurrence of an epidemic of Cholera in England, the severity with which it attacks particular localities is generally supposed to be regulated by the density of the population; by the amount of their traffic and their intercourse with other countries; the relation of the site to the sea coast, and to the mouths of rivers; by the presence or otherwise of alluvial soil: by the elevation of the locality, its drainage its sewerage and the dryness of its atmosphere and its soil; by the general salubrity of the place; the construction of the dwellings, the ventilation; the temperature and the winds.

The vastness of our Indian dominions and their varied features, the long continuance of Cholera in the country and the painful familiarity with this disease which every resident of any standing has acquired, furnish means of inquiry which other countries are happily not in possession of, and if the wonted energy of the several services be applied with unity of aim to discover the source of this disease and the causes of its propagation or diffusion, it is not probable that it will much longer escape detection. But even if success do not follow the present inquiry, it may safely be assumed that it will not close without placing us in possession of information of importance, advancing our knowledge of this malady and the means of preventing its occurrence.

"There are great differences in the rates of mortality from Cholera amongst soldiers in adjoining cantonments, and this difference, indeed, is equally observable amongst the troops of the same cantonments although their barracks or lines be not more than a few hundred yards apart."—STATISTICS OF CHOLERA, MADRAS, 1849, p. 61.

WHEN first I commenced investigating the causes of the exceeding unhealthiness of our soldiers in foreign climates I had not proceeded far in my enquiries when I ascertained that "the utmost care in selecting recruits or attending to the men's health when enlisted, seems unable to retain foreign troops in equal health with that enjoyed by soldiers who are natives of the countries, in which they are serving."* And the further prosecution of my enquiries, showed every island and almost every province within the tropics "furnishing us with instances of disease and death occurring with great frequency in one place, while in another, only a few miles distant, the mortality may scarcely exceed what the troops would be subject to in their native land."† It was not, therefore, wholly unexpected to find as the result of subsequent investigations that "there are great differences in the rates of mortality from cholera, amongst soldiers in adjoining cantonments, and this difference, indeed, is equally observable amongst the troops of the same cantonments although their barracks or lines be not more than a few hundred yards apart."‡

It became, therefore, a very interesting point to ascertain, if in India, where Cholera has so long and so generally prevailed, there still

exist places in which it never has appeared since its first outbreak in 1817; if there be, in fact, exempted or refuge villages, to which the neighbouring populations might flee for safety from the pestilence. In my letters of the 28th February, 19th March and 26th August 1852, I was able to adduce instances within my own knowledge of such exemptions, and in the annexed correspondence which I have been favored with during the past three years from the Madras Medical Board and direct from the several Medical and Revenue Officers in the three presidencies whose names are recorded within, there are the names given of several hundred places and even of large districts in the Madras, Bombay, and Scinde Presidencies in which Cholera has never yet appeared, although it has often been raging within a few hundred yards of the exempted sites.

The facts given in my "Statistics of Cholera" were such as naturally to lead enquirers into this line of discovery, regarding the laws which regulate the outbreaks of this hitherto seemingly inexplicable disease,* and three years after the "Statistics of Cholera" were published, my subsequent "Letters" published in 1852 on this subject, and the Registrar General of England's Report on Cholera appeared

At another place, the Registrar General thus remarks—"Armies suffer more from cholera on march or immediately afterwards than they do in station, and the fact is placed beyond doubt by the statistical analysis of Assistant Surgeon Balfour." In a note to this, Dr. Farr adds—"See some good observations on the movement of troops in the "Statistics of Cholera," by Assistant Surgeon Edward Balfour. He shows that of the Native Soldiers of the Madras Army, 32 died of cholera in cantonment, 86 when marching, to an average strength of 10,000. Dr. Lorimer's Reports show that the troops were more frequently attacked on long, than on short marches: thus the troops in 219 marches of 20—40 days were attacked 39 times; while in 14 marches of 100—120 days they were attacked 7 times. If we take 100 marches as the basis, they were attacked 18 times in about 30 days, in the one case; while in the other case they were attacked 50 times in about 110 days, that is, at the rate of 14 times in 30 days. This is no proof that fatigue increases the liability to attack; it only proves that, on the long marches, the men are exposed a longer time to the causes of the disease.

"Mr. Balfour would assuredly expect more men to be wounded in a battle of three days, than in a battle of one day's duration."

I would merely observe on the above remarks from the Registrar General that the point gained by Dr. Lorimer in his "Report" and shown by myself in the "Statistics of Cholera" was that by shortening the marches of troops, and thereby lessening the duration of their fatigue, their liability to be attacked by cholera diminished.

within a few days of each other, both of us satisfactorily proving the existence of many places permanently exempted from the attacks of this malady.

This is a discovery of so much importance in a sanatory point of view, that no apology is required for introducing here the remarks of the reviewer when noticing it.* The reviewer notices Dr. Farr as stating that in the epidemic which occurred in England in 1848-49, "the influence of locality on Cholera was extraordinary, and is well illustrated by the fact, that 46,592 of the 53,293 deaths from Cholera, in the year 1849, occurred in only 134 out of 623 districts. To put this in other words, 46,592 deaths occurred in an area of 7,839 square miles, on which four-tenths of the population dwelt, while only 6,701 deaths occurred on an area of 49,228 square miles, on which dwelt six-tenths of the population.

"Eighty-five districts in England escaped the Cholera altogether. These districts lie generally high, and are thinly peopled. Their population has scarcely augmented during the last 10 years; the average mortality in all during the 10 years has been very low, viz., 1.75 per cent.

"In 73 other districts, there was no Cholera, but some diarrhoea. In these districts, the average annual mortality for 10 years has been 1.905 per cent., and the population during that time has only augmented 3 per cent.

"The Cholera was three times more fatal on the coast than in the interior; and on further analysis it appeared that the fatality was greatest in the chief seaport districts. Thus 26,773 deaths, or more than half those of the whole country, occurred, in London, Liverpool, Hull, Bristol, Plymouth, Portsmouth, Southampton, and Tynemouth. Setting aside London, the sea districts may be divided into three groups:—

(a) *Including the large ports.*—Here a dense population is crowded on the low alluvial soils of the mouths of rivers; and the deaths from Cholera were as 125 to 10,000 persons living.

(b) *Including the secondary ports.* The mortality was as 47 to 10,000 persons living.

(c) *In the other coast districts, which included only small ports,*

often inaccessible to ships, the mortality was only as 15 to 10,000 persons living.

"On comparing more particularly sea coast and inland districts, it is found that in 47 districts on the river and sea margins, there were 85 deaths from Cholera in every 10,000 inhabitants; while in 41 inland districts, comprising the large towns (except London), whose aggregate population and whose average mortality are both greater than those of the 47 coast districts, there were only 38 deaths to 10,000 persons living. The fatality in the two groups was in fact as $2\frac{1}{4}$ to 1.

"In the rest of the kingdom, after the abstraction of these two groups, the mortality was only as 12 in every 10,000 inhabitants.

"This great prevalence of Cholera and mortality in the coast districts, has always been a strong argument for the contagionists doctrine, which referred the disease to intercourse with other infected ports. It is, however, extremely probable, if not certain, that too much stress has been laid on this argument, and that prevalence of mortality in the great ports is due in great measure to the low level in which they stand and to their position on alluvial soil. The influence of elevation on Cholera will appear more fully in considering the causes of the mortality in London.

"The coal districts suffered considerably; the deaths being 46 from Cholera, and 13 from diarrhoea, to 10,000 inhabitants. The marshy districts of Lincolnshire and Cambridgeshire suffered very little; North Witchford, Whittlesey, and Wisbeach escaped, so also did some of the marsh districts of Essex and Kent. In the Romney marsh only one death occurred.

"Geological formation appeared to influence it in some degree; the districts on the Granitic, Silurian, and Devonian systems nearly escaped Herefordshire on the old red sandstone escaped, while Cornwall and part of Devonshire on the same formation suffered severely;—still other circumstances were in play here, and the influence of geological formation cannot be very great. * * *

(b) *Elevation*.—Of all the causes influencing the spread and the mortality of Cholera, none has so great an effect as elevation. This fact, known for a long time, has been worked out by Mr. Farr so perfectly, that it may be received like the solution of a mathematical problem. We shall quote verbatim as much as possible of Mr. Farr's

statements on this point, referring to the book itself for the tables, and for the various proofs and calculations on which they are based:

"The mortality (and therefore, presumably, the prevalence, Rev :) from Cholera is in the inverse ratio of the elevation. The mortality of the 19 highest districts was at the rate of 33 in 10,000; and of the 19 lowest districts, 100 in 10,000. The elevation in the two groups was as 71 to 10 feet above the high-water mark of the Thames, or as 7 to 1, while the mortality was as 1 to 3, or in the inverse ratio. In the two groups of the six districts supplied with the waters of the Thames at Kew and Hammersmith, the mean elevation was 35, and 175 feet, the mortality from Cholera 19 and 11 in 10,000. In the two groups of 12 districts supplied with the Thames water between the Waterloo and Battersea bridges, the mean elevations were $\frac{1}{3}$ foot and 10 feet, the mortality 168 and 77 in 10,000. In the two groups of twenty districts, supplied with the waters of the New River and the sea, the mean elevation was 24 and $59\frac{1}{2}$ feet, the mortality from Cholera was 59 and 37. While the effects of the water and of the wealth of the districts are apparent, they do not in this analysis conceal the effects of elevation. Cholera was excessively fatal in all the four districts which lie on a level with, or below, the Trinity high water-mark; it destroyed 144; 161; 164; and 205 in 10,000 inhabitants. In the five districts which lie two to four feet higher, on an average, the mortality was at the rate of 68; 97; 120; 153; and 181 in 10,000. In 10 districts of an elevation of 50 feet and upwards, the mortality from Cholera was not higher than 8; 8; 17; 19; 22; 22; 25; 35; 35; and 53, in 10,000. The last mortality occurred in St. Giles, in which the beneficial effect of elevation was neutralized by other causes."—(pp. 61-2.)

"On further examination it is evident, that notwithstanding disturbing causes, the mortality from Cholera bore a constant relation to the elevation. Thus, on arranging the districts into terraces, the first under 20 feet of elevation, the second under 40, the third under 60, and so on, it is found that the mortality on the ground under 20 feet being estimated by 1, the mortality of each successive terrace may be represented by $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{1}{3}$, $\frac{1}{4}$, $\frac{1}{5}$, $\frac{1}{6}$, or the mortality on each successive altitude of 20 feet, was $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{2}{3}$, $\frac{3}{4}$, $\frac{4}{5}$, $\frac{5}{6}$, &c. of the terrace immediately below it. The following table will make this point clearer. The highest terrace (340-360 feet) is Hampstead:

"The wells and all the waters are infected. Where the houses are built on hill-sides and elevations, as in London, the sewage of each successive terrace flows through the terrace below it, and the stream widens, the ground becomes more charged, every successive step of the descent, until it is completely saturated in the parts lying below the high-water mark.

"The river, the canals, the docks, and the soil of a port may be viewed as a large basin full of an almost infinite variety of organic matters, undergoing infusion and distillation at varying temperatures; and as the aqueous vapour which is given off ascends, it will be impregnated with a quantity of the products of the chemical action going on below, variable in amount, but necessarily greatest in the lowest and foulest parts. The amount of organic matter, then, in the atmosphere we breathe, and in the water, will differ at different elevations, and the law which regulates its distribution will bear some resemblance to the law regulating the mortality from Cholera at the various elevations. It has been seen how rapidly in London the mortality from Cholera diminishes a few feet above the low ground on a level with the Thames, while several feet of elevation in higher regions produces no sensible effect.

"It is established by observation, that Cholera is most fatal in the low towns and in the low parts of London, where, from various causes, the greatest quantity of organic matter is in a state of chemical action; and it may be admitted that Cholera, varying in intensity with the quantity, is the result of some *change* in the *chemical action* of this matter. Further inquiry must determine whether in England that change is spontaneous, or the result of the introduction of a zymotic matter from beyond the seas; whether the poison enters the human frame in air or water, through the skin, the mucous membrane, or the air cells of the lungs."—(pp. 69-70.)

Let the above brief remarks and extracts suffice to introduce the second series of letters herewith appended on the subject of the sites in this country permanently exempted from attacks of Cholera and if, in my former brochure, I expressed the opinion that it would be interesting and might prove highly important, to have the fact of the existence of such refuge places established, now that their extensive existence is fully proved, I think that I am not over-sanguine

when I here express the belief that useful sanitary rules, as well for the benefit of the people of this country as for our soldiers, will be deduced from a careful prosecution of this subject. In order, however, that enquirers may readily learn the present state of our knowledge regarding it, an abstract is here given of the former letters and of those now appended.

There are facts in these papers which tell both for and against the doctrine of contagion, but there is one point so constantly the same that it is proper to notice it here. I allude to the circumstance that there are very few of the exempted villages through which troops have ever marched. Whether this have any connection with the exemption, will form a point for future investigation, but I notice it here, because, when the "*Lancet*" in 1849 reviewed my first brochure on this disease, the reviewer assumed that I was a contagionist. I had never taken up this part of the subject and did not offer an opinion regarding it, nor have I yet sufficiently investigated the matter to offer an opinion. I have seen the first cholera epidemics which occurred in England, and more or less of it, every year since I first reached this country in 1834, and am aware that whenever cholera is raging there is a tendency to attacks of diarrhoea, and a general feeling of depression felt by the people amongst whom it is occurring. I have been unable to decide, however, whether such depression be the effect of the alarm with which the occurrence of this malady in its virulent epidemic form must more or less excite in the beholders, or whether it be not caused by a minor degree of the choleraic influence or cause, acting on the body and affecting the bodily health. However this may be, I am inclined to consider, from the varying characters which this disease assumes, in its different outbreaks, that it may sometimes be propagated by contagion, and sometimes in other modes, but this is a mere opinion, for there do not seem to be sufficient data to establish either point, and I think that the facts in the following letters support this view.

More recently, another Reviewer, in the *Dublin Quarterly Review*, supposes me to have been supporting the position that one individual is more susceptible of cholera than another. He says, "on this point we quote from the able Report of Dr. Balfour, who, having dwelt on its influence on different races of men, and the greater susceptibility of Europeans to its attacks, adds:—

"It is possible, indeed probable, that several points which have hitherto been deemed inexplicable, connected with the manner that cholera develops itself, may be cleared up by the knowledge of this single fact; particularly the many instances which have occurred of regiments, when marching through districts perfectly free from cholera, being attacked with the disease in a virulent epidemic form and losing a great number of their soldiers; the possibility being that the agent, although present in the district, has no power over the less susceptible native inhabitants—but exerts its full influence on the stranger races of whom the regiment is composed; and the fact of two native regiments marching at the same time, along the same route, and through the same villages, and crossing each other on their journey, the one regiment suffering severely from cholera while in the other regiment not a single case occurs, may likewise be referrible to the same law." "This observation of Dr. Balfour," continues the Reviewer, "while clearly tending to support the view of an individual liability to the influence of this disease, may be responded to by another truth equally remarkable, that cholera having fatally prevailed in a localized community, for a time disappears and again returns to break out with greater violence amongst those previously unaffected."*

Now it may be true, as this Reviewer states, that one individual is more liable to be attacked with cholera than another, but I never possessed any data from which to draw such a conclusion. The whole of my enquiries have been as to great bodies of men, and to different races of men—for the aggregate strength of the armies from whose mortality the deductions were drawn by me, amounted to millions, and the races in the several armies and regiments, are as distinct from each other as are the nations of Europe, a fact of which the Reviewer does not seem to be aware. The result arrived at by me seemed rather another instance of the discovery which General Tulloch was the first to promulgate, that particular races are exempt from particular diseases—that the Negro races in the West Indies for instance, are not liable to the remittent fevers which sweep away Europeans and that the small pox and other skin diseases which harass the black races there, are with Europeans almost wholly unknown. My former letter addressed in

1849 to the Superintending Surgeon, Presidency Division, of the Madras Army, may now be given, as follows :

SIR,—I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of the letter from the Medical Board of the 3rd instant, and, in reply, beg leave to mention that it is at all times difficult for a private individual to collect numerous statistical facts and if these have to be obtained from the villagers of India almost insurmountable obstacles are encountered when any person, except the civil servants of the Government, makes the attempt. But notwithstanding these difficulties, a few facts had come to my knowledge which seemed to me sufficiently authenticated to justify me in forwarding my application of the 28th ultimo, and in obedience to the Board's request that I should name a few exempted villages, I solicit the favor of your transmitting the following remarks.

It is now well known that Cholera has never prevailed to an equal extent in the different stations which our troops occupy; but on the contrary, that the ratio of the strength attacked with it has been extremely varied; and this difference has been observable as well between places which are near, as between stations remote from each other; and observable, too, as well amongst the European soldiers as in the native army.

Indeed, when examining the tables in the Topographical Reports of this Presidency, the attention is almost immediately arrested by the difference in the ratio of admissions from cholera in places closely adjoining each other. It will be observed, for instance, that the Europeans stationed in Fort St. George from 1829 to 1838 had 28·03 per 1,000 of their strength admitted from cholera, while the Europeans at Poonamallee, 10 miles distant, had only 4·36 per 1,000 of their strength admitted during the same period.

A similar difference is observable amongst the Europeans at St. Thomas's Mount, the European Horse Artillery, there, having had 13·36 per 1,000 admitted from cholera, in the 10 years from 1829 to 1838, while the European Foot Artillery, a few hundred yards off, had only 2·5 per 1,000 admitted during the same years. And instances like these are so numerous that they may be arranged in the following tabular form.

Observing that these very great differences in the ratio of admissions from Cholera, have occurred in places often less than a mile, and seldom more than a few miles apart, it is not unreasonable to infer that there are places which have been altogether exempt from the disease.

It will be observed, accordingly, from the Topographical Reports referred to, that in five years, amongst the Native troops at Palaveram, only one admission took place from cholera, out of an

average strength of 792, while the admissions amongst the Golundauze at St. Thomas' Mount, only 3 miles distant, were 3.84 per 1,000 annually.

And, when examining the Topographical Report on the Neilgherry Hills, in the tables (pp. 41, 43, 46, 47, 48 and 49) embracing the period from 1826 to 1843, no case of Cholera is reported from the Jail or among the European soldiers, or the officers, or their wives, or children, residing there; and, although it is rumoured that cases have occurred on the Hills, since then, its long absence from the locality demonstrates the effect of physical circumstances in modifying the influence which gives rise to this disease.*

In continuation of this subject I may mention that there is a Pindaree hamlet on the right bank of the Gutpurba river, about a mile to the westward of the village of Kulladghee, in which I have known Cholera to break out with great virulence, and it was told me that if this disease appeared in any of the surrounding villages, it was almost certain to break out in that hamlet also:—but there is a village (Angilkai?) about 500 yards to the westward of it, in which, the villagers assured me only one case of Cholera had occurred up to 1842; and that, they said, was in the person of the Potal's brother or son; but even in his case they stated that the disease had not been contracted in their village for he had been (to Bagracottah?) where cholera was raging, and died the evening he returned. The villagers (of Anglikai?) ascribed this immunity to their strict observance of the worship of a hindoo deity at the eastern entrance of their village.

When passing through the hills between Naggery and Cuddapah, in 1845, as cholera was infecting nearly all the villages in the road, it naturally formed a frequent subject of conversation, and I was then assured that the people in the village of Nanarm near Pootoor, in North Arcot, had always enjoyed a complete exemption from cholera.

* While this is passing through the press there appeared in the *Government Gazette* of the 28th Sept. 1855, the following Extract from a Letter from the Medical Board to Government, dated 14th Sept. No. 274 of 1855, on the Returns of sick treated on the Neilgherry Hills during 1854. * * * "During the past year, it is observed, that a very destructive epidemic prevailed at Coonoor, resembling cholera, in the symptoms, but more fatal than that pestilence usually is observed to be, the mortality being no less than 71½ per cent. on the number of seizures." * * *

The only other instance that I can at present remember, came to my knowledge, in 1846, when I visited Ramunmulla, where I had been ordered, to report upon its value as a Sanatorium. It is a hill about 3,100 feet above the level of the sea, that separates the Soondoor valley from the valley of the Tumboodra, nearly 30 miles west of Bellary. The natives on the platform of the hill are of the Bheder tribe, a branch of the Ramossee family, and have resided there for some generations.

They stated that only four deaths from cholera had occurred in their recollection and that all four had contracted the disease in the low country, and died on the day, or day following, their re-ascent of the hill. The absence of cholera from the platform is remarkable, because the villagers on the west and east of the hill, at Naglapoor, Hoospet, &c., suffer from it almost every year; and this exemption is not to be accounted for by the mere height of the hill, because Bangalore has a higher elevation above the level of the sea, and yet cholera has repeatedly broken out there in a virulent epidemic form.

In submitting the foregoing details, I am aware that the information, which the villagers furnished me with, may possibly have been given only to mislead, but the different rates at which our European and Native soldiers have been attacked by cholera, in adjoining localities, as shown in the preceding table, and its almost total absence from some places within a very short distance of others where it has extensively prevailed, naturally leads to the idea that there may be villages where it has never even appeared; and, if the names of these exempted villages could be ascertained, I think that the knowledge could be turned to great advantage. Indeed, even to ascertain that every hamlet, village and town, has suffered more or less from this fatal disease would be a very interesting fact; and, although we might not, in the present day, be able to turn this to much practical use, yet any addition to the knowledge which we now possess regarding this inexplicable disease must be considered of importance, as it may aid us to unravel the mystery which now surrounds it; and when, as in the present instance, the information can be collected without entailing any expense, I trust that the Board will recommend that the enquiry be made.

AHMEDNUGGUR, IN THE DEKHAN.

Ahmednuggur in the Dekhan is a Collectorate in the Bombay Presidency, formed from a portion of the ancient province of Aurungabad. It is about 1,700 feet above the level of the sea, and cholera, though perhaps never occurring in the district as a sweeping epidemic, does still break out frequently and generally. There is always a large European and native force, for it is the head quarters of the Bombay Artillery, and cases occur amongst both races. In the city itself, also, during the several years that I was there as Medical officer in charge of the Staff and Garrison, it occurred annually; notwithstanding this general character, Mr. Turquand, (Letter 26th January No. 76 of 1855), has favored me with the following return of three villages or hamlets in which cholera has never been known to occur, though all of them are within a mile or two of other villages where the disease has prevailed. Troops have only been in one village, and that only once, viz., in the year 1844. The whole district is part of the great trap formation of the Dekhan, described by Colonel Sykes, and the inhabitants are Mahrattas, with a few Mahomedans and small tribes of wild people, Ramoossies, &c.

ARCOT, NORTHERN DIVISION.

The district of North Arcot contains 5,790 square miles, has a large population of Teloo goo people, with a few Mahommedans, and, has generally a considerable force of european and native soldiers, both cavalry and infantry. Mr. Whittingham has sent me the following statement of 213 villages in this Collectorate, as reported by the Tahsildars and heads of Police, which have never been visited by cholera since its first outbreak in 1817.

These 213 villages contain, in the aggregate, 40,000 inhabitants, they are, therefore, of moderate size—the largest having only 240 houses and 1,490 inhabitants, and the average being 41 houses and 186 inhabitants. But their exemption attracts the more attention, because, within a quarter of a mile or one or two miles of each exempted site, there are villages where cholera has been occurring, leaving the exemption of the one and the liability of the other only to be explained by the supposition that there is, in their physical features, some differences leading to the happy immunity they enjoy. Out of these 213 villages there are only seven through which troops have marched, but two of these have been very often traversed by soldiers.

CANARA.

Owing to the small size of the villages in the Zillah of Honore, to their number, and their scattered position, it has been found by the authorities difficult to obtain any very definite information regarding their exemption from cholera; but from a report which Dr. Leslie received from the Tahsildars of the three talooks below the Ghauts, (viz. Ankola, Honore and Cundapore) cholera seems to have been but very little known in them, and the number of villages, in which it has never occurred is very great. From the small size of such villages, however, and the doubts regarding the accuracy of the information collected regarding them, Dr. Leslie has not thought himself warranted in returning their names as ascertained exempted places, and, for similar reasons, he has not, although such have also been exempted from attacks of cholera, recorded the names of the great number of small jungle villages in the talooks above the Ghauts, and he states that the large towns of those talooks have been occasionally attacked with the disease.

The town of Honore and its immediate neighbourhood, however, in Canara Paen-Ghaut, have been remarkable for their exemption from cholera, although at different times and to a greater or less extent, the disease has appeared all around it. Honore is surrounded on its land side by a broad and bare range of laterite, from two to three miles in width, rising to an elevation of about 150 feet above the level of the sea. It contains 913 houses with a population of 4,388, and Belcond is the village nearest to it where cholera has occurred, cholera having, about eight years ago, visited a small collection of fishermen's huts which are situated on the southern boundary of the mouth of the harbour on the opposite side of the marine lagoon to that on which Honore is built. This village is situated on a narrow neck of land, at the south side of the mouth of the harbour and the disease is said to have been brought by some travellers from the neighbouring talook of Cundapore: *Vide Dr. Leslie's letter and return, dated 9th July 1853.*

Canara* Balaghaut consists of three talooks containing 669 villages of which 351, or more than the half have never been visited with cholera.

In many villages of these three Bala-ghaut talooks which have been attacked, cholera has never broken out unless when previously prevailing in one or more of the neighbouring districts which border on the eastern frontier, from which direction it has, hitherto, always entered this division of Canara. These frontier villages are frequently severely visited with cholera in the months of April and May, and the disease usually spreads in a westerly direction along the chief roads but diminishing in virulence as it approaches the range of Ghauts which run north and south between bala-ghaut Canara and the talooks of Honore and Ankola beyond which it has seldom or ever found its way. Where such outbreaks do occur, the disease invariably disappears soon after the setting in of the monsoon. Before bala-ghaut Canara was so much opened by roads and cleared of forest as it has been of late years, cholera seems to have been an almost unknown disease, and even now when it breaks out, its severity apparently becomes mitigated in the deep jungles which cover so extensively this part of the country.

CANDESH.

Candesh, in the Bombay Presidency, lies below the western Ghauts in the almost level tract of low lands that skirt the peninsula of India. Mr. Mansfield (letter and return dated 11th January, No. 95 of 1855) has kindly favored me with the following return of hamlets and villages, with inhabitants varying from 9 to 90, which, though all within one or two miles of cholera sites, have never been visited by the disease since 1817. No troops have ever passed through them; and Mr. Mansfield is unacquainted with any circum-

stances which would enable him to explain why they have hitherto been free from cholera.

CHINGLEPUT IN THE CARNATIC.

Mr. Smollet has done me the favor of reporting that it has been satisfactorily ascertained after a full enquiry, that out of many thousand villages in the Chingleput collectorate few spots have escaped the ravages of cholera.

Amongst the few favoured localities is the Cantonment of Palaveram which is reported to have escaped the attacks of cholera, for the past 25 years; this cantonment is located on a dry soil, about two hundred feet above the level of the sea, from which it is distant about eight miles. Its population at present is not great, it having of late years been almost abandoned, as a Military station. It is distant from Madras 12 miles, on the high road to the south, and one thousand laden carts pass through it daily, going to and from this city, in which cholera is now endemic, being constantly present either as an epidemic, or occurring in sporadic cases.

* These two villages were deserted since the introduction of the British Government in this province in 1818, and have only been re-inhabited since the last four years.

At no great distance from Palaveram is Pullicarney. It is a considerable village, and for some years past has been the Head Quarter station of the Chingleput collectorate, and it too, Mr. Smollet mentions, has enjoyed a like immunity with Palaveram from the ravages of cholera.

Mr. Smollet likewise mentions that a number of small villages in the Ootramalore Talook, viz., Nelvally, Alunjary, Yolapaukum, Vengaram, Malepootoor, Paupanulloor, Colatoor, Mamboodoor, Coonnavaum, Thuttampoondy, Seroomyloor, and Thalagumpoondy, are reported to have been free from cholera for many years. These are all situated in a remote part of the Chingleput collectorate and are little visited by travellers, being remote from any great thoroughfares. Mr. Smollet regards it as possible that cases of cholera occurring in them are not reported, or are concealed, but adds that there is little reason to doubt that, in general, cholera has been very unusual in these localities. "But upon the whole," he adds, "it may be assumed that the disease is all but universal in its ravages, attacking all classes and conditions indiscriminately." The inaccuracy of this deduction by Mr. Smollet, however, is disproved by the result of his own observations which have shown that the disease is highly discriminating; that besides smaller and remoter places there is a cantonment exempted from its attacks through the town of which there is a great traffic, it being situated on a great high road, and in the neighbourhood of the City of Madras, containing 730,000 people, amongst whom cholera is endemic.

Palaveram is also within three miles of the Cantonment of Saint Thomas' Mount where cholera has often broken out. Dr. A. Loyd's and Mr. Smollet's letters both deserve perusal and are appended.

COIMBATORE.

I have been favored with letters from Mr. E. B. Thomas and Dr. Mackay dated 23d, 25th, and 29th January 1855, from which it appears that there are no villages in that large Collectorate, in which it can be safely and correctly asserted that cholera has never existed.

COORG.

Dr. Mackay in his letter of the 29th January 1855, mentions with regard to the station of Mercara, that from the enquiries he had time to make, he was inclined to believe that cholera had never broken out there; though it had frequently appeared, he believed that it had invariably been imported from other villages. But throughout the whole of this large province there seems to be only one village which has never been attacked with cholera.

The return regarding it has been made to me by Captain Gustard, the Superintendent of Coorg,* from which it appears that the village contains sixty houses, with twelve hundred people, twenty people to a house. Its name is Chembay Bellioor, in the Yedday Maknad Talook; and it is within a mile and a half of Cookaloor, where cholera has occurred. Like most of the other exempted villages this has not been often visited by troops, only once, indeed, in 1834, during the war.

CUTTACK.

In the Collectorate of Cuttack, cholera seems to prevail nearly all the year round: pilgrims are constantly traversing it, to and from Pooree, and there is not any place in all that Collectorate known to have been exempted from the ravages of this disease.—*Letters from W. Harrison, Esq., Acting Collector, and Surgeon G. S. Scott, dated 28th and 30th May 1853.*

GANJAM AND HILL TRACTS OF ORISSA.

Several returns and reports† have reached me from the Collectorate of Ganjam, and in one of† them, Colonel Campbell expresses his regret at being unable to throw any light on a topic of such importance, beyond the bare fact that cholera is unknown in any part of the Khond tracts of Boad, Goomsur, Soorada, Chinna Kimedya, and Jey-

pore.* At Russelcondah, Dr. Macdonald also instituted extensive enquiries on the subject of exemption and also prosecuted the investigation further with reference to the Hill Tracts of Orissa, and ascertained, from evidence which appeared sufficiently conclusive, that the mountain range inhabited by the Khonds has never been visited by this malady. He states that the facts he collected lead him to conclude that this exemption exists through a district of country stretching over 5,250 square miles lying between 19° 20' and 20° 30' N. Lat., and 83° 15' and 84° 30' E. Long., or 70 miles by 75, and he considers it probable that this immunity extends beyond the limits above assigned, through the hilly tracts running in a south westerly direction, though the difficulty of acquiring authentic information, from these scarcely known regions renders the idea little more than a not unlikely supposition, and he gives the return as follows:

The exemption of so very extensive a district is the more remarkable because cholera has raged frequently and with great severity throughout the low country on all sides, surrounding the mountain district, which has hitherto so fortunately escaped a visitation of the scourge.

* Colonel Campbell adds as follows:—"The great scourge of the inhabitants of these parts is small pox. For several years I have used every exertion to introduce vaccination through the Medical Officers from time to time doing duty with this Agency and those stationed with the Regiment at Russelcondah, and the native dressers permanently attached to me, but without success. I have procured matter from Calcutta, Madras, Vizagapatam and Ganjam, and three times this season from Chutterpore, but all have failed, even at Russelcondah where they were under the inspection of Dr. Macdonald.

Dr. Macdonald was not aware of any other locality, except the hill tracts, altogether exempt from cholera. But he mentions that the station of Russelcondah, has enjoyed hitherto an almost perfect immunity, inasmuch as, according to the accounts of the oldest inhabitants, the disease has appeared but twice in the place. On the first of these occasions, (about the year 1849) five cases occurred. The second instance occurred when the Head Quarters of the 36th Regiment M. N. I. having had cholera on the march to Russelcondah brought it, as he states, into that station in February 1851, and from twelve to fifteen cases appeared during the two or three weeks immediately subsequent to the arrival of the troops.

Another instance of exemption in Ganjam is reported by Mr. Fraser who says that Odaypaud, a village about 14 miles in a north-easterly direction from Chicacole, is well known to have been always exempted from cholera.

The village is situated on one of the highest parts of an extensive elevated tract of waste ground. The soil is red and clayey in some parts, and is very much infested with white ants, and large boulder looking masses of granite are scattered about in all directions on its surface. There are few trees, and none near the village, which on all sites is quite unsheltered from the winds, but the waste ground in the vicinity is covered with low thorny scrub from eighteen inches to three feet high. There is little but dry cultivation all round, water being scarce in the hot season and never plentiful at any time.

The village contains about thirty houses; and, when Mr. Fraser enquired for exempted sites, a Gomasta in his Cutcherry immediately named Odaypaud as a place where cholera had never appeared. The man had, himself, lived in the village for several months in 1849, during a time when cholera prevailed with great severity in many of the villages round about; while, in Odaypaud, there was none, and he had been assured by the villagers (among whom there was one man, an original inhabitant between 60 or 70 years of age and who remembered the first appearance of cholera in the country), that while many smaller villages in the vicinity of Odaypaud had been frequently attacked with cholera, not a case had ever been known in their village, though often prevalent all around them.

GWALIOR.

Dr. Steel the Superintending Surgeon of the Gwalior Contingent wrote to me, on the 25th August 1853, on the subject under enquiry. There does not appear to be any place, in all that large tract of country, exempt from cholera, although in one place, Seepree, this disease has been very rarely prevalent, and when it has prevailed it has been in no way virulent.

In 1847, there were admitted into the Seepree Hospital five cases of cholera; one of whom died within 6 hours after the first seizure, the others recovered. In 1851, there were two cases, both recovered. In 1852 there were none, and none up to the month of August 1853.

From 1847 to the above named date, the Military strength of the station in round numbers may be said to have been about one thousand (1,000). The number of inhabitants of the native town is not known, but it is a small place and the number in the Military bazaar may be roughly estimated from the Military strength of the station.

Seepree for many years has been considered one of the most healthy stations in that part of India. It is high in situation, and the soil, on the heights where the Military are located, ferruginous.

There is nothing of jungle or stagnant water for miles around. It is open and free on all sides. There is nothing apparently about the place likely to render the air impure. He likewise mentions that the Medical Officers stationed at Seepree from the end of 1847 to November 1852 report that during these years he did not see or hear of a single case of cholera as occurring among the inhabitants of the place or in the neighbourhood. There is a village called Tongra on the Bombay road, 7 miles from Seepree, to the westward of which there is said to be a large jheel or tank which dries up during the hot weather. In 1847 it was reported that this village suffered severely from cholera, and had frequently before so suffered to the extent that on the first appearance of the disease, the inhabitants became panic struck and deserted the place and did not return for a few months. Since 1847, nothing had been heard of the disease having been in that village.

From the above it will be observed that only seven cases and one death have occurred at Seepree between 1847 and 1853; showing a great freedom from the disease though far from an immunity.

HYDERABAD IN THE DEKHAN.*

TO THE SUPERINTENDING SURGEON, *Presidency Division, Madras Army.*

SIR,—In continuation of my letters, I have the honor to report, for the information of the Medical Board, that I solicited Lieutenant General Fraser to favor me with information from the Nizam's Territories, similar to what I had sought, in my letters of the 28th February and 19th March 1849, to obtain from the Madras Presidency, regarding the existence of places in this country where cholera had never appeared, from the period of its first outbreak in 1817.

2. Of the ten (10) Medical Officers, whose letters General Fraser has so obligingly favored me with copies of, five of them think that there is no exempted place, or know of none such; and four specify six places or districts where to their own knowledge and according to the statements of the oldest inhabitants cholera had either never been known to occur, or where a comparative immunity has been experienced.

Surgeon W. Thomson mentions "that a general belief exists, that the Cavalry Lines (at Aurungabad) has hitherto been exempt from cholera, whilst it prevailed epidemically both in the city, infantry lines and bazaars attached to the latter, and can assert from personal knowledge that such was the case in the years 1837 and 1838 and, so far as he can ascertain, the exemption still (1850) continues.

Surgeon Morrogh has "made all possible enquiry in this (Wurrungul) district, and, if the statements of the oldest inhabitants be correct, cholera has never been known at the villages of Timmumpett and Cummulpullee."

Surgeon Walker, after stating that, in the northern part of the Nizam's Telingana, the disease is notoriously of less frequent occurrence than in the southern, and adding that "the locality (of the Beder district) has always had a character for salubrity" remarks as follows.

Para. 7 "Timmumpett, a village in the Sircar with its dependent hamlet of Cummulpullee, a small collection of huts situated about two miles to the north-east, bears, over the whole country, the reputation of never having been visited by cholera; this, however, I have

"found not to be in strict accordance with fact, as, within the last twenty years, there have been three cases of the disease and as many deaths in the village and among its denizens, a brahmin child, a weaver, and a washerman, all occurring at a time when cholera was epidemic; still, this comparative exemption is sufficiently remarkable more especially as villages in its neighbourhood have been literally desolated by the disease and that, several times during the period that this village has enjoyed this all but immunity from its attack."

(b) "Senior Surgeon Young reports that the potail of Chikuldah, who is the oldest inhabitant of these hills, has stated that a case of cholera has never, within his knowledge or recollection, been heard of on the range of mountains."

I feel assured that the Board will coincide with me in regarding the information, which these letters contain, as of much value, corroborating, as they do, the views promulgated, in my letters of the 28th February and 19th March 1849 above quoted, that there are refuge places which have continued exempted from the ravages of cholera during the whole of the 35 years that it has been prevailing in this country. After much reflection on the subject of this disease, it still appears to me that it would be of very great importance to discover all

TO THE OFFICIATING SUPERINTENDING SURGEON NIZAM'S ARMY.

SIR,—In acknowledging the receipt of your Circular letter No. 25 of 1850, with an Extract of a letter from Edward Balfour, Esq., to the address of Major General Fraser, I greatly regret my inability to reply more fully to an enquiry of so interesting a nature.

I made (through the Military authorities) an application to the Soubah in the hope that some useful information might be obtained by his means from the Native Civil Authorities under his control, but found, in reply, that he had received instructions to institute an investigation of a similar nature and report the result.

In regard to the immediate vicinity of Aurungabad, I may mention that a general belief exists that the cavalry lines have hitherto been exempt from cholera whilst it prevailed epidemically both in the city, infantry lines and bazaars attached to the latter. I can assert from personal knowledge that such was the case during the years 1837-38 and, so far as I can ascertain (for there are no documents on the spot) this exemption has since continued; cholera patients were admitted into hospital during the two years already mentioned but they were cases of men returning from command, &c.

The cavalry lines, as you are aware, are situated nearly a mile from those of the Infantry and are placed east and west, on the crest and upper portion of a low ridge of undulating ground; which, from its natural slope on both sides, entirely precludes any lodgement of water. The lines are also devoid of all vegetation (beyond some well cropt grass) and are thus free from two of the most powerful causes of malaria. In other respects there is no apparent cause for the exemption that I believe to exist.

Although not within the limits defined in your Circular, I may, considering the importance of the subject, be excused for adding that, during the three years that the 5th Cavalry was stationed at Goolburgah, no case of cholera originated in the lines; and, from inquiries I made, I believe they were equally free from the date of their construction four years previously. Cholera had been prevalent many times during the eight years, both in the town of Goolburgah and

in the villages in the immediate vicinity. The lines, as here, run east and west, are free from all vegetation, and the ground slopes sufficiently to admit of a natural drainage.

2. I am on the eve of starting to examine a village in this Sircar where it has been reported to me the disease has never existed. I shall not fail to report to you the result of my investigation and to state precisely the condition of the village and of the neighbouring country: the name of the village is Timmumpett to the eastward of this place at a distance of twenty-five miles: another village in its vicinity bears the same character and these are the only two in this Sircar that do so.

TO MAJOR GENERAL J. S. FRASER, British Resident, Hyderabad.

SIR,—I have the honor to state that, since writing to you on the 14th instant, regarding the alleged exemption of two villages in this

Sircar, from the invasion of epidemic cholera, I have visited these places and shall now give the results from my enquiries and observation made on the spot. Previous to doing so however permit me to state some facts of a general nature respecting the disease, with reference to the geological structure and nature of the soil, where it appears in the southern part of the Hyderabad country.

The Nizam's Territory to the south of the Godavery and Manjera may be divided, for such a purpose as the present, into 1st, the granitic tract; 2nd, the black soil country; 3rd, the sandstone; 4th, the laterite.

Granitic tract.—Respecting the first, which is by far the most extensive, the soil covering the rock would seem for the most part to be composed of the debris of the rock itself decomposed in situ. On this tract fearful outbreaks of the disease have occurred: of this the City of Hyderabad has given too many examples and it was while marching over this country in 1844 that the 11th and 42nd Madras Native Infantry suffered so severely from the epidemic. The first of these corps proceeding to the westward towards Masulipatam and the other to the southward towards Madras. Other instances of Regiments marching through these districts being devastated by cholera might be cited. In the northern part however of the Nizam's Telingana, the disease is notoriously of less frequent occurrence than in the southern; there, a period of five, six or even seven years, has been observed between its aggressions. The only very marked circumstance of difference between the condition of the two sections is that there is a good deal of merchandize and many travellers that pass through the south, while the roads of the north are comparatively speaking but little frequented. The population of both tracts in density and condition is nearly identical.

Black soil country.—The black soil country comprehends the greater part of the Doab between the Kistnah and Tumboodra, a large portion of the Mulkair Sircar and the northern division of the Shorapore State. The subjacent rock here is partly granite, partly limestone, and partly trap. In these districts cholera is very prevalent, appearing usually once a year either at the Dussarah or in the hot weather: the population here is much denser than in the granitic soil. The villages have high walls of limestone or brick surrounding them; are situated on loamy flats which would render proper sewerage diffi-

cult even were it attempted, which it never is. There is a good deal of traffic too in these districts. This soil is in some parts saliferous, yielding not only sub-carbonate of soda but common salt—a tract twenty-five miles east of Shorapore is of this nature where there are several brine wells which afford very good culinary salt. At one of these villages, where I observed this salt to be particularly pure and where it was to be had for about a farthing a pound, I found that the inhabitants were as subject to the attacks of cholera as their neighbours. The village was small not containing above fifty houses and I learnt that while cholera was last in the country there had been thirteen deaths.

Sandstone country.—The sandstone country of the Godavery, a district extending in the Nizam's country west and east from the neighbourhood of Peddapully in the Ramjeer Sircar to Paloooucha, and north and south from Chinnoor to the Pakhal lake, is covered by a soil almost entirely of sand on which a forest jungle is rooted. The population here is very sparse,* in some districts, as in the Koorwah purgunnah of the Wurrungul Sircar, not amounting to more than two or three inhabitants to the square mile. The natives have a notion that this Koorwar country is in a great measure exempt from cholera, and it is very possible that some of the miserable hamlets of its inhabitants, the Koorwars, may have been passed over by the epidemic when it was desolating the adjacent more populous districts. On making enquiries however, I found that every collection of huts worthy the name of a village was subject to the general scourge; indeed it would be strange that one of the most unhealthy tracts in the Deccan should enjoy any such general immunity.

Laterite tract.—The laterite of Beder and the adjoining districts. The soil is here of a black and red clay and the locality has always had a character for salubrity. In 1847, while at Beder, I was informed that during the epidemic of the previous year, the few cases that occurred there were chiefly confined to parties who had come to Beder from the direction of Kulburgah or Hyderabad. I regret that at present I have no means of verifying or extending this information, but I deem it worthy of note as suggestive of further investigation.

Timmumpett, a village in this Sircar with its dependant hamlet of Cummulpullee, a small collection of huts situated about two miles to

the north-east, bears, over the whole country the reputation of never having been visited by cholera. This however I have found not to be in strict accordance with fact; as within the last twenty years there have been three cases of the disease and as many deaths in the village and among its denizens, a brahmin child, a weaver and a washerman, all occurring at a time when cholera was epidemic; still this comparative exemption is sufficiently remarkable, more especially as villages in its neighbourhood have been literally desolated by the disease, and that several times during the period that this village has enjoyed this all but immunity from its attack.

Timmumpett is situated 18 miles almost due east of Wurrungul and within a distance of 10 miles of the Pakhal lake which lies to the west.

By Thermometric admeasurement its height is about 1,500 feet above the sea level. It is built on a circular plain slightly elevated towards the centre where the village stands. The houses are of mud, wattle and dab, or simply of posts of wood with walls and thatch of palmyrah leaves. A square tower of sun-dried bricks rises in the middle of the village. The soil to the east is a thin sandy loam containing little vegetable or soluble matter with a dash of lime as is evinced by its effervescence with acids. The soil to the west is more sandy. It has one small tank in its immediate neighbourhood to the north-east under which rice is cultivated, and another much larger about two miles off in the same direction on the margin of which stands the hamlet of Cummulpullee. Sienitic rock of the usual ingredients, quartz, felspar and hornblende outcrops in several parts. It is a hard grey rock with quartz predominating, rendering it less susceptible of decomposition. Some fragments of greenstone and reddish sienite are found scattered about. It is ten miles distant from the nearest sandstone. There are several pukkah built wells in the village drawn by yatams, but the water of these being brackish is not used for drinking or cookery, the supply for such purposes being taken either from a well to the south of the village, but principally in the hot weather from the distant tank; the well at that period becoming dry. The drinking water I procured, when at Timmumpett on the 25th of this month, deposited, after a couple of days' rest, a little muddy sediment, and, on eight ounces of it being evaporated, a scarcely appreciable quantity of soda salt. The circular plain about the village is of the diameter of half a mile, and here dry crops are cultivated, chiefly In-

dian corn and a pulse called the rala moong; this space is enclosed by a tree jungle composed chiefly of the palas (*Butea frondosa*), a tree called the *Premna integrifolia* and stunted ebony, the last most abundant in the jungle on the Wurrungul side. Besides these trees there grow the *Cluytia collina*, the *Terminalia bellerica*, the *Cassia fistula*, and a common species of *Bignonia* with underwood of the *Trophis aspera*, *Monetia barlerioides* and wild date; the palmyra tree overlooking the whole forest. The rude and careless agriculture of the villages is shown by such shrubs as the *Cassia auriculata* and the *Zizyphus exiqua* growing up to the very borders of the village. From the Wurrungul side the approach is by a road for carts which, as soon as it emerges from the jungle about two furlongs from the village, divides itself into three; one leading direct to Timmumpett, another, the southern road to Pakhal, skirts the jungle leaving the village about 150 yards to the left, while the third to Madanapett runs about the same distance to the north. From the eastern side no road leads to the village. This distribution of the roads is to be noted, for as soon as cholera is heard of, the village road is forthwith blocked up with trees and thorn bushes. The Dhers get up on the watch tower and warn off by signs all carts and wayfarers from approaching the precincts of the village and point out the road to the right or left.* To this circumstance and to the protection of the lion-headed Avatar of Vishna Nursinga, to whom a mean temple has been erected, the population ascribe their deliverance from the pestilence.

10. According to the usual house average this will give about 470 inhabitants: besides these there are some Dhungurs who look after cattle but live chiefly in the jungle. The cattle belong to Zemin-

dars in the surrounding districts, and are sent to graze in the forest during the hot months. There is often a murrain among them: fever, rheumatism and guinea worm are common diseases among the inhabitants; the joowarree which forms the staple of their food is procured from other villages as is also thour, neither is grown on the lands of Timmumpett. No very favorable estimate of their sobriety is to be drawn from the number of Kullal's houses.

SIR,—In reply to your circular letter No. 25 of the 12th ultimo, I have the honor to inform you that the Potail of Chikuldah, who is the oldest inhabitant of these hills, having been there for the last 60 years, has stated that a case of cholera had never, within his knowledge or recollection, been heard of on this range of mountains. I may however observe that a bearer, who came a few days since from Nagpoor went to Chikuldah, and almost immediately after his arrival there, was attacked and carried off in a few hours by cholera; but as this was an isolated case, and the man had just arrived from another part of the country where the disease was prevalent, it is very evident, he had contracted it before he reached these hills.

KURNOOL.

The only report received from Kurnool consists of a return from Mr. Conway enclosed in a letter dated 1st July 1853, received through the late Dr. Simpson of the 25th Madras N. I. The Kurnool district lies low being in very few places more than from 500 to 1,000 feet above the level of the sea. Notwithstanding which, 35 towns have been returned as wholly exempt from cholera. The largest of those towns contains 895 houses and 3,767 inhabitants.

The population of these villages, it will be observed, varies from 19 to 3,767, and averages 440 in number, and the great majority of the towns, &c. are within half a mile of villages where cholera has prevailed. But it is a very remarkable circumstance that, in the town of Kurnool, which has a population of 23,313, there is one street leading to the Mogulpore gate and in the immediate vicinity of the place where the butchers slaughter sheep, which Mr. Conway mentions is asserted to have been invariably free from cholera.

Return showing the Villages in the Kurnool District in which it is stated that no cases of Cholera have occurred since its first outbreak in 1817.

MADRAS.

I have not been able to obtain any information, regarding this large city, worthy of being relied upon. It contains about 730,000 inhabitants, perhaps the highest part of it is not 50 feet above the level of the sea, and this disease has repeatedly broken out with virulence in different parts, carrying off Europeans as well as Natives. There seems to have been, at the Madras Club, only one casualty from cholera, since its establishment in 1832.

MADURA.

From Madura, a district bounded in part by the Bay of Bengal, Mr. Parker sent a list of eight exempted villages, in his letter dated 16th November 1854.

These villages are all of moderate dimensions containing 586 houses and 2,207 inhabitants, the largest village having 141 houses and 526 people. Through none of these refuge sites had troops ever marched, and they are all only from half a mile to two miles distant from places where cholera has occurred.

MALABAR.

Mr. Conolly in one letter mentioned that the only part of Malabar which has always been free from cholera is that embraced in the Koondah mountains and that this portion of the district, at least that portion which is inhabited, is on the same level with the Coimbatore portion, *i. e.* Ootacamund to Coonoor, where, as he believes, the disease is equally unknown. And he has since favored me with the following return showing the existence in Malabar of three small towns all adjoining each other in the Talook of Calicut, which have never been attacked with cholera; vide letter dated Calicut, 7th March, No. 446 of 1853.

MARWAR.

Colonel Malcolm writing from Gwalior on the 6th September 1853, mentions that a person for many years stationed in the Nagore district, upon whose statements every reliance could be placed, had informed him that Nagree, a town on the borders of the Bikanere desert, had never been visited with cholera, while Palee and Joudhpore, situated on soil of a very similar character, had not only suffered from this scourge, but also from plague of the same type as that prevalent in Egypt, and the parts of the Red Sea.

Another letter dated 15th November 1853, the signature in which I am unable to decipher but sent to me through Colonel D. Malcolm's interest, contains the following observations.

The cholera prevailed in the town of Nagree in ^{St. 1883.} A. D. 1825, and deaths occurred from the disease in just about the same proportion as in the other towns of Marwar.

From that time five or six visitations of the disease are stated to have occurred in other Marwar towns, but Nagree has invariably escaped without a single case.

A much more important instance of exemption from cholera however, is Mount Aboo. In cholera years large numbers of Pilgrims often bring the disease to the foot of the hill and some die on the top, but there has never been known a single instance of European or Native residing at Aboo suffering from cholera, nor of the disease spreading after the death of Pilgrims.

MASULIPATAM

Collectorate consists of 15 Talooks, comprising 1,525 villages, and from the returns furnished by Mr. Lushington it appears that 68 villages have hitherto remained free from cholera.

BELLARY.

In my former series of letters I described Ramanmulla as a hill nearly 30 miles west of Bellary, and about 3,100 feet above the level of the sea, separating the Soondoor valley from the valley of the Toombodra. It is inhabited by the Bheder tribe, a branch of the Ramoossie family, who have resided there for some generations. Having been ordered to report upon that plateau as a site for a Sanatorium, I visited the place several times in 1846, and in the course of my enquiries, it was stated by the inhabitants that only four deaths from cholera had occurred in their recollection, but that all four had contracted the disease in the low country, and had died on the day, or on the day following their re-ascent of the hill. The absence of cholera from the plateau was the more remarkable because the villages at the base, on the west and east of the hill, at Naglapoor, &c. had been suffering from it almost every year. It may be remarked that this exemption is not to be explained by the mere height of the hill because Bangalore has a higher elevation above the level of the sea, and yet cholera has repeatedly broken out there in a virulent epidemic form.

Mr. T. L. Strange has since mentioned to me however that there is an exempted village about five miles from Bellary at the foot of that hill lying to the east of the Copper mountain, on which the late Dr. Powell built a house, but I have also received a return from Mr. Pelly, the Collector of the district, naming a few exempted places, and may merely remark that Bellary has long had an ill fame, as regards this disease, which is indeed said to be more prevalent in this than in any other of the cantonments of the Madras Presidency. The places returned by Mr. Pelly as having continued exempt from cholera ever since its first outbreak, are only eight in number, but they are all of them considerable villages and are all within a mile or so of cholera sites.

would thus appear that in the Astagram Division of Mysore, there are 780 villages, hamlets, &c., which have continued exempt from Cholera, in the sixteen talooks of Hassan, Harnahully, Nursipoor, Yedditoora, Tulcode, Chamrajnuggur, Nagamungalam, Atteecooppa, Bannawaram, Goondulpet, Kickairy, Munzerabad, Mundium, Mysore, Chenroyapatam and Bailoor. Some of these talooks, however, have been more generally visited by Cholera than others, and in Nursipoor only seven places remain exempt; in Yeddatoora, five; and the Tulcode, Goondulpet, and Mysore talooks show only three places exempt in each.

The disease has been very general over all the Chittledroog Division, only 481 villages having escaped its attacks; and in the three talooks of Chittledroog, Davengherry and Mudgherry not one place has remained exempt. In the Kortegherry talook, also, there are but nine refuge places;—in that of Seerah, eight;—in Cuncooppah, five;—Molcalmooroo, three; that of Paugud contains but two places, and in the Doddairy talook, only one solitary village with 214 inhabitants has remained unvisited by this scourge; the talooks showing the more numerous exempted places being Herrioor; Hosdroog; Toomeoor; Koonghull; Cadul; Toorvikerray; Chickanaikanhully; Honnavully and Boodeehaul.

NAGPORE.

The Medical Officers* who favored me with letters &c., from Nagpore had not heard of any locality exempted from cholera.

NELLORE.

Mr. Ratliff has favored me with the following return of 50 villages in the Nellore Collectorate which have never suffered from Cholera. It will be observed that the largest village contains 446 houses and 2,800 inhabitants and the smallest 2 houses and 10 inhabitants, and that troops have never marched through any of them. Moreover the whole of these places are only from a quarter to four or five miles distant from others which have been attacked. It will be observed also that in the Cottah Talook alone there are 28 exempted villages and in that of Vencatagherry thirteen, while, amongst the other sixteen talooks, there are only five that show nine villages known to have escaped.

NELLORE.

Mr. Ratliff has favored me with the following return of 50 villages in the Nellore Collectorate which have never suffered from Cholera. It will be observed that the largest village contains 446 houses and 2,800 inhabitants and the smallest 2 houses and 10 inhabitants, and that troops have never marched through any of them. Moreover the whole of these places are only from a quarter to four or five miles distant from others which have been attacked. It will be observed also that in the Cottah Talook alone there are 28 exempted villages and in that of Vencatagherry thirteen, while, amongst the other sixteen talooks, there are only five that show nine villages known to have escaped.

PUNJAB.

Cholera (writes Mr. Temple, Lahore 5th January 1855) occasionally appears, in a mitigated form at least, in all parts of the Punjab Territories. It is probable that in every large city, several persons die of cholera during each year. Although perhaps, no year passes without the occurrence of such cases, yet no contagious or infectious influences arise, and the instances being quite isolated, no alarm ensues. In the Jails and Military Hospitals, and among the public establishments, cases of this kind are very rare. The European community are for the most part exempt. This province in short is almost free from the disease; more free than the North Western Provinces and much more so than Bengal.

But occasionally the Punjab has been scourged by temporary visitations of much severity. Such occurred in Sumbut 1860 (A. D. 1803) in 1877 (A. D. 1820); in 1884 (A. D. 1827); in 1890 (A. D. 1833) and in 1902 (A. D. 1845). On these occasions, the plague seems to have moved slowly from one end of the province to the other, destroying hundreds, and sometimes thousands, at every large place on its course. It departed, too, as suddenly as it came. The epidemic of 1902, Sumbut, was very destructive and is freshly remembered by the people. The seizures were sudden and were followed speedily by death. In the two populous capitals of Lahore and Umritsur, many thousands perished during the 30 days that the plague lasted.

The above occasions were prior to British connexion with the Punjab. Since that period there has been no visitation in the Punjab proper. But in the Cis Sutlej states (between the rivers Sutlej and Jummoo) the station of Umballa was attacked by the disease during the autumn of 1852. The evil extended to the Cantonments, the civil Jail and Officers, and to the city, but not much beyond. During that year much rain had fallen, and the season was generally sickly. Authentic particulars, Mr. Temple remarks, could doubtless be obtained by me from the Medical Departments.

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RAJAHMUNDY.

Five reports have reached me from this Collectorate.* In one of these, which Dr. Rankin sent me, two places are named as having been exempt, but he expresses himself as by no means certain that the report can be

SALEM.

H. D. Phillips, Esq., Collector and Magistrate of Salem has sent me a very interesting communication dated Salem Collectorate, Darampoory 31st January 1853, acknowledging the receipt of the pamphlet which I had recently published, and stating that the only town in the Salem district which would appear to have enjoyed total immunity from cholera, is Kistnagherry, on the high road from Madras to Bangalore. This circumstance, remarks Mr. Phillips, does not stand recorded in the Collector's Office, but from inquiries which he had made there seemed to him very sufficient reason for supposing that cases of cholera have never occurred at Kistnagherry itself, among such of its inhabitants as have resided in the town and have not left it during the prevalence of the disease in the neighbourhood or more distant localities. Kistnagherry, is close under a high rocky hill, which bounds it to the north. On its three other sides, are several small hamlets within the distance of a mile, more or less. Cholera has not been known to attack such of the native inhabitants of the Javady, and Shervaroy Hills in the Salem district, as have not descended into the plains, and the same may be said of the low country people and others who make the latter hills their permanent place of residence. People have died of cholera at Kistnagherry and on the hills, to Mr. Phillips' personal knowledge; but it has always been ascertained that they were either travellers passing through or others who had but recently arrived there.

SATTARAH.

The following communication, No. 672 of 1855, has reached me from J. N. Rose, Esq., Collector of Sattarah; dated Sattarah, Collector's Office, 20th September, 1855.

SIR,—In reply to your letter dated 8th November last, I have the honor of transmitting to you a statement according to the form which accompanied it.

The return furnished, it will be observed, contains the names of 59 villages in the four talooks of this Collectorate, which have remained exempt from Cholera, since the year 1817. Since that year, the people have been chiefly engaged in agricultural pursuits, and the country generally little traversed by armies, troops have never marched through any of these refuge villages. The disease, however, has been all but general over the whole district, for the Jowlee Talook shows only 35 villages free from it; that of Sattarah, only 20; while Kurrar contains only 3 exemptions, and in the talook of Wae, is a single village of 1008 inhabitants. But with this general diffusion over the whole district of the Cholera agent, it is not unworthy of remark that all these refuge sites are situated only from a quarter of a mile to five miles distant from places that have suffered from this disease.

The return furnished, it will be observed, contains the names of 59 villages in the four talooks of this Collectorate, which have remained exempt from Cholera, since the year 1817. Since that year, the people have been chiefly engaged in agricultural pursuits, and the country generally little traversed by armies, troops have never marched through any of these refuge villages. The disease, however, has been all but general over the whole district, for the Jowlee Talook shows only 35 villages free from it; that of Sattarah, only 20; while Kurrar contains only 3 exemptions, and in the talook of Wacee, is a single village of 1008 inhabitants. But with this general diffusion over the whole district of the Cholera agent, it is not unworthy of remark that all these refuge sites are situated only from a quarter of a mile to five miles distant from places that have suffered from this disease.

SAUGOR AND NERBUDDAH TERRITORIES.

I have been favored, through Dr. Buist, L.L.D. with a letter from Dr. Spilsbury dated Camp near Saugor 31st January 1853, and feel assured that all who know how indefatigably and zealously Dr. Spilsbury has laboured in the cause of science will be pleased to learn his views on this interesting subject. He says, "My dear sir, the *Times* of the 29th December reached me at Jubbulpoor, and I read with much interest your remarks and the extract from the *Athenæum* in reference to Dr. Balfour's enquiry as to whether there are localities exempt from that scourge cholera. I am not aware of ever having seen any notice of the queries propounded until the present time, and had they been sent to our side I should have been most happy to give the information, which urges me now to address you. I believe you are aware that for many years I was stationed at Jubbulpoor and during that time there was a village named Goruckpoor entirely exempt from the disease in question: I annex a sketch to explain localities. It is situated about $1\frac{1}{2}$ mile from the town of Jubbulpoor and when 30 or 40 deaths were daily registered in the town, no case occurred at this place. I called in my old Native Doctor and questioned him on the subject, and he confirmed my statement: but since I left in 1841, (this man has been now 30 years at the Jail) he informed me that, one year, 2 or 3 cases had occurred. In regard to the Lines and Bazar of the Cantonment, almost equal immunity was experienced, and if a case or so did occur, I found that the person had slept the preceding night in the town (may not this have been the case with those attacked in the forenamed village?). The jail, situated diagonally half way between the Lines and the Town, does not partake of this freedom and when it rages in the latter, so does it among the convicts.

During my sojourn at this station, Cholera came up the grand Duckhan road from Mirzapoor and often too when the stream of population was towards the Ganges, as in May and June, when thousands of Brinjara bullocks and carts are carrying Cotton to that mart. Slowly but surely did it progress; after passing Rewah (a dirty crowded populous city of H. H. the Rajah of that State, and where it com-

mitted great ravages) it divided into two streams. The Western one proceeding to Saugor, the S. Western to Jubbulpoor. On its being reported to prevail at Panagarh, a town 10 miles off, certain was its invasion next night, or that following, in Jubbulpoor; it then passed on to Gurrah and so to Tilwary Ghat on the Nerbudda, the then high road to Nagpoor. I remember one occasion marching with the Agent of the Governor General: one of our marches was Dumoh; but learning that great mortality prevailed we stopped on the banks of a river 3 miles off, warning all our people not to go into the town. Two of them disregarded the caution, stayed all night in the town, and by sunset next evening were both dead.

SCIND.

The most detailed information which has reached me, regarding this province, has been from the undermentioned officers through the kindness of Mr. Freere, Commissioner of Scind. It would appear (1) that Epidemic Cholera has not been known in Jacobabad nor in the villages in Bondica since troops were first stationed in this part of the province in 1842, and that the sporadic cases of Cholera have been very few.

In the Deputy Collectorate of the Thurr and Parkur (3), during the ten years 1843 to 1853, cholera has raged in Cutch once only (though a few deaths have been reported occasionally in other seasons, from the same cause), viz. in 1846. In this year, the pestilence swept over the desert, carrying off a considerable number of people, in the districts of both provinces, and creating great consternation by the depredations it committed in the larger and more populous towns. No details, however, of its progress are on record from which or on which, useful deductions or investigations into details, can be based.

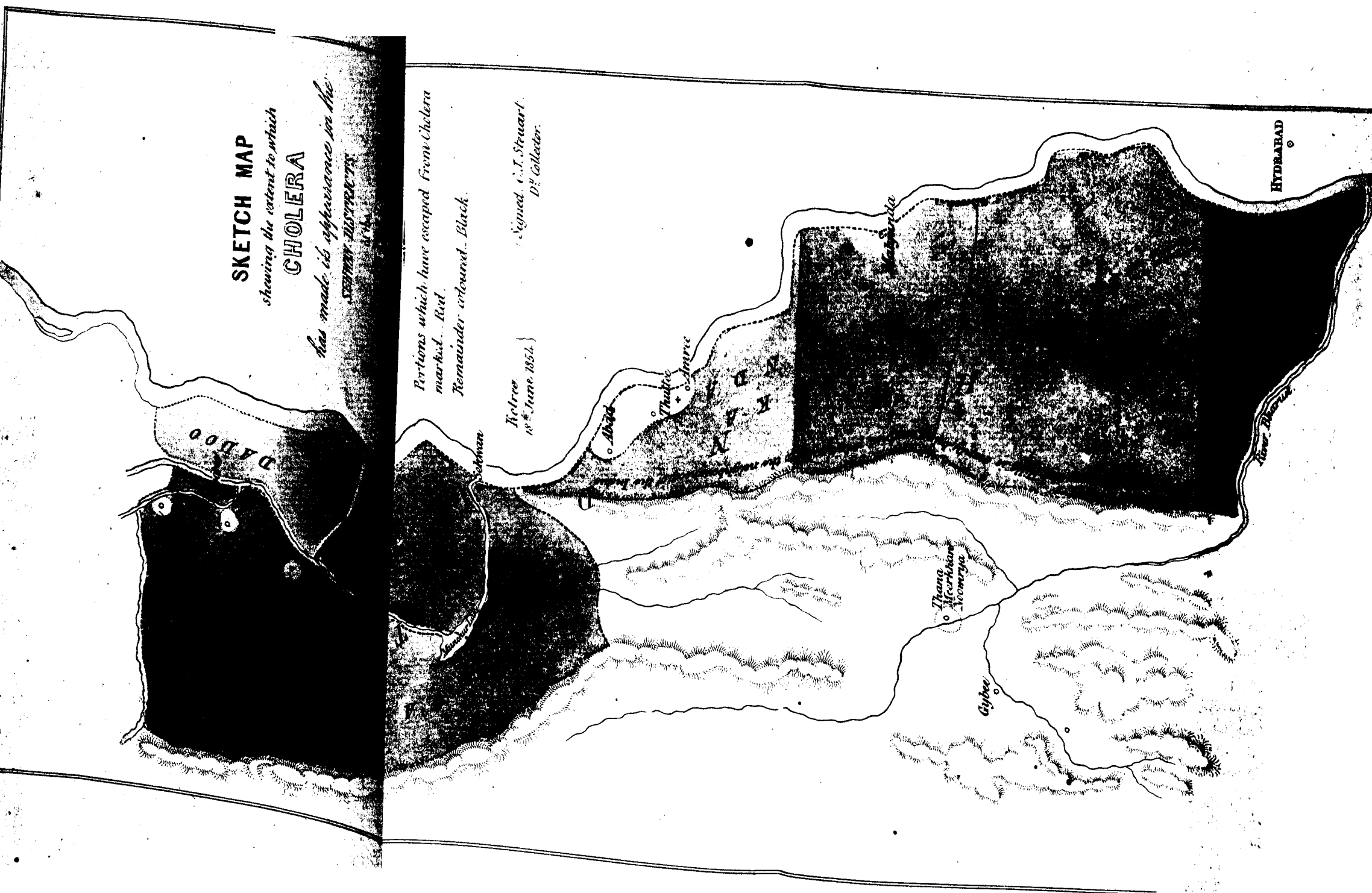

KURACHEE COLLECTORATE

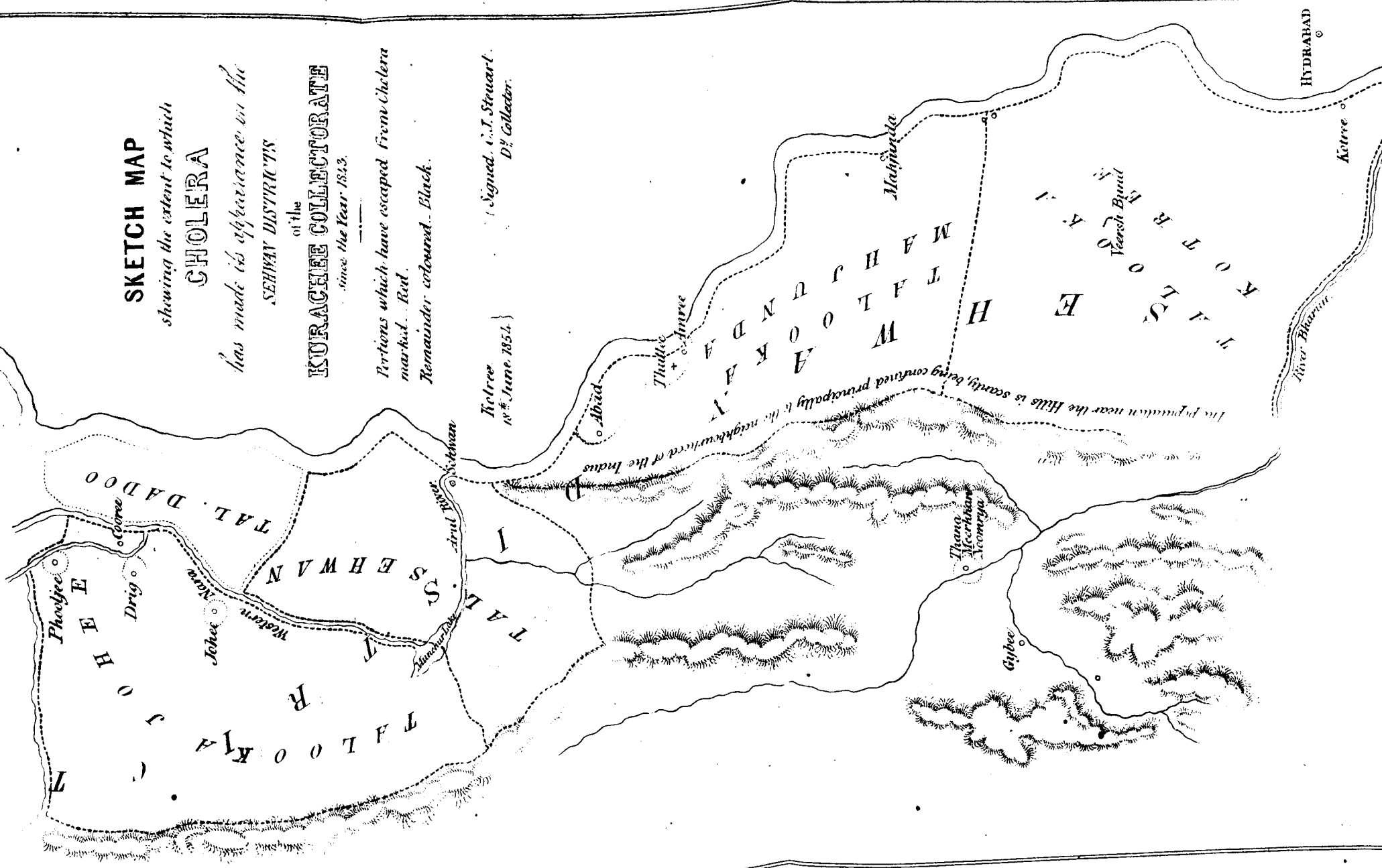

SHOLAPORE.

Mr. Loughnan has informed me (Letter No. 6 of 1855) that, from the returns received from the several District officers, it does not appear that there is any village in the Collectorate of Sholapore, in the Bombay Presidency, in which cholera has never appeared from the period of its first outbreak in 1817.

SOUTHERN MAHRATTA COUNTRY.

In my former brochure, I mentioned that, in the Southern Mahratta Country, on the right bank of the Gutpurba river, about a mile to the westward of the village of Kulladghee, is a small Pindaree hamlet, and that, if cholera appeared in any of the surrounding villages, it was almost certain to break out in that hamlet also. I myself witnessed its great virulence in the year 1842, both in that hamlet and in the town of Kulladghee and surrounding country. But there is another village named Uncilgherry, about 500 yards to the westward of that Pindaree hamlet, in which the villagers assured me that only one case of cholera had occurred up to 1842. The person then attacked was the Potal's brother or his son, who had been to the town of Bagracottah, about 12 miles distant, where cholera was raging and died on the evening of his return. This village is reported to me to be still (5th December 1855) exempt from cholera. And the villagers ascribe their immunity to their strict observance of the worship of a Hindoo deity at the eastern entrance of their village, and to their prohibiting the residence within the village of Barbers, Washermen, Shoe-makers, Potters, Carpenters, and other low Hindoo castes.

TANJORE,

A Collectorate in Southern India, is a flat alluvial country, irrigated by the river Cauvery. There are upwards of 6,000 villages in the Collectorate, regarding which Mr. Forbes (17th January 1855), has sent me the return given below. Like most of the other localities exempt from cholera, troops have never marched through these hamlets but there is nothing else, Mr. Forbes reports, in their position, soil, cultivation, or neighbourhood, to show why only these three villages, all within a mile of others where cholera every year rages, should have continued for 37 years exempt from its attacks.

TANNA.

Mr. Seton Karr has favoured me with the following interesting return from the Collectorate of Tanna, in the Bombay Presidency, showing the presence of 21 hamlets and villages, which have continued exempt from attacks of cholera. There is nothing noticeable in this return except the fact that troops have never marched through any of these villages and that all the non-cholera sites have cholera places in their immediate neighbourhood.

April 1853 and 12th December 1854, gives the return as per margin, and mentions that one village, the Cusbah of Ottapedarum Talook, had never been attacked by cholera. The Tahsildar

who furnished the information had, however, reported to him that persons have occasionally died by cholera in the villages, but such had invariably contracted the disorder abroad. Mr. Bird adds moreover, that only the mother village of Ottapedarum is reported to have enjoyed the exemption, for its dependent hamlets, on every side, are admitted to have suffered like all other places in the district.

TRICHINOPOLY.

Mr. John Bird reports* to me that so far as information has reached him, from the Tahsildars of the Trichinopoly Collectorate, not a town or village in that part of the country has been exempt from a visitation of cholera. And the only other letter received from this Collectorate is one from Dr. Innes,† who does not believe that there can be any exempted site.

VIZAGAPATAM.

Three communications* have reached me from Vizagapatam, one of which is a compendious statement by the Honourable Mr. Walter Elliot. In this it is shown, that in the seventeen talooks of Vizagapatam there are 2,322 villages, in 2,200 of which, cholera has prevailed, but 122 have, all along since 1817, escaped being attacked with cholera: the statement is as follows:

Report on the sanatory condition of Honore with reference to the appearance of Cholera in an Epidemic form : From 1843 to 1855 (inclusive.)

By HOWARD B. MONTGOMERY, A.B., M.D., Zillah Surgeon. Dec. 12th, 1855.

In continuation of the Report of Dr. Leslie, formerly Zillah Surgeon of this town, I have to record the almost perfect immunity from Epidemic Cholera enjoyed by the town of Honore.

In the letter of Dr. Leslie to the Superintending Surgeon, Malabar and Canara, dated July 9th 1853, a general account is given of the non-existence of cholera here. I have, at the request of the additional Sub-Collector of this district, carefully investigated all events antecedent and subsequent to that date with reference to this point. I regret that the short time that has elapsed since his request was made was not sufficient to allow of my extending the field of investigation,

so as to include within it the villages of the surrounding district. It will however be seen that in more than one of the adjacent villages cholera is known to have occurred, and I should hesitate very much to believe in the immunity of the others unless it was clearly proved.

"The two Talooks below the Ghauts" alluded to by Dr. Leslie, are two of the three, Bilghee, Butcul and Ankola: but I have no means of knowing to which of these three particularly he refers. From information I have received, however, I believe that *all* of them have been subject more or less to cholera, especially during March, April and May 1854, when it was rife in all the villages extending from the Ghauts *downwards* to this town.

With a view to rendering the observations of Dr. Leslie as valuable as possible I propose submitting in detail all the points in medical practice at this station likely to be useful in estimating how far the *general statement* continued in his letter is borne out by the documents left here by the various Medical Officers of Honore. I shall also in a subsequent portion of this paper continue the history of the subject from the date of his letter down to the end of last month.

I first propose making such extracts as seem to me to have been the probable sources whence he derived his Report, and in doing so I shall in the first instance proceed in order through the Annual Returns and Reports of the Jail and Zillah and Regimental Detachment Hospitals.

By this means it will be easy to determine as to the accuracy or not of Dr. Leslie's conclusions. I am further induced to do so as I find that there is considerable reason to doubt the correctness of popular rumours on such points as the appearance or non-appearance of cholera. There is indeed a natural desire on the part of Natives of this country to meet your inquiries with universal affirmation or negation, as they perceive you may prefer the one or the other.

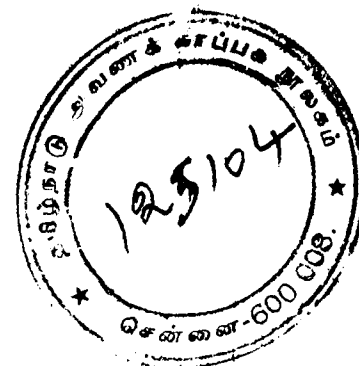
I think therefore that the proposed analysis of records carefully kept up will be *more likely* to allow a deduction that can be confidently relied upon.

The Jail and Zillah records show (as by the tabular statement appended) that in 10 years, from 1843 to 1852 (inclusive), during which time there were under observation prisoners of the three kinds, with an average daily numerical strength of 151 $\frac{1}{4}$ and with an average sick list including 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ persons daily, there was complete exemption from the disease of cholera in every form, although during *all* those

years, as at all times, the jail was occupied by a class of persons amongst whom diarrhœa and dysentery are by no means uncommon diseases, and many of whom also from habits of dissipation and impaired constitutions, are rendered extremely liable to all diseases of debility.

The following abstract I have compiled after consulting every book of record which refers to the jail of Honore, and I have every reason to believe in the perfect accuracy of the result as there shown, namely, the entire freedom from cholera for a period of 10 years.

I may also remark that the large proportion borne by the number of sick to the number of prisoners in the years 1843, 1847 and 1852, can be referred to no cause that would not equally tend to produce cholera.

In a subsequent part of this report shall be noted the results exhibited by the records both of Jail and Regimental Detachment Hospitals up to the 30th ultimo (November 1855)—and it will be seen that the same freedom from cholera indicated by them as above has since continued uninterrupted. I have named the different Regiments furnishing Detachments in order that no confusion may occur should the facts enumerated here have been previously incorporated in Regimental Returns and should it be proposed to draw any deduction from this Table in connection with such Head Quarter records.

The foregoing Tables are satisfactory as establishing that the Jail and Detachment of this station were for many years free from cholera, not a single case of that disease being recorded. But as the cases occurring among the general inhabitants would not appear in these returns, I append extracts from all annual reports showing that cholera did not exist either in an epidemic or sporadic form among the population of Honore.

On this point Dr. Leslie's own experience must be peculiarly valuable.

"Extract from annual and other reports as to the existence of cholera in an epidemic form." Dated December 15th, 1843. No mention of cholera made although both diarrhoea and dysentery are alluded to as occasionally proving fatal.

1st January 1845.—Cholera not mentioned although the general bad health of the prisoners and its causes (the situation of the jail and the uniformity of their diet) are enlarged upon.

1st January 1846.—Cholera not mentioned but diarrhoea and dysentery enumerated as amongst the most frequently occurring diseases.

1st January 1853.—" No epidemic has occurred during the past year," cholera not alluded to.

The foregoing Reports are from the Jail Hospital, and from the Regimental detachment I find similar ones. Thus in those dated January 1st, 1847 (Dr. Pritchard); 1st January, 1848, (Dr. Pritchard and Mr. Colebrook); January 1st, 1849, &c., there is an entire omission of either mention of, or allusion to, cholera. Also in the latter occurs the following " no epidemic has appeared at or near the station (Mr. Colebrook and Dr. Leslie).

In the subsequent annual Report from the last named Medical Officer the same assertion is repeated.

From Dr. Leslie's Report for 1850-51. " No epidemic has appeared at this station; Cholera has been prevalent for the last two months in some of the villages two stages off, both to the North and South* of Honore, but it is remarkable that this place seems to escape although the communication is constant."

1st April 1853.—No epidemic has appeared at the station.

In evidence of the entire absence of cholera from Honore for the many years over which the foregoing reports extend we may accept the following passage of a letter from Dr. Leslie to J. Silver, Esq., Additional Sub Collector, Canara, dated April 9th 1853.

* Probably Coompta on the North and Cassercode on the South.—(H. B. M.)

"I would beg leave to bring to your notice that the town and immediate neighbourhood of Honore appear to be peculiarly exempt from such attacks: I have not seen a case of cholera since I have been here, a period of nearly 5 years."

We can scarcely require more valuable or positive evidence on the point than this affords. For when we consider the long time Dr. Leslie was here and his consequent acquaintance with all facts concerning the sanatory condition of the town we can scarcely fail to consider his experience as tantamount to a disproof of the existence of the disease in any thing like an epidemic form for 5 years. And knowing, as we now do, the readiness with which the people avail themselves of the medical advice of the Civil Surgeon we must feel assured that if cholera had during the 5 years appeared, recourse would have been had immediately to Dr. Leslie.

Of still greater importance, it appears to me, is the following memorandum drawn up by the Sheristadar of the Judge's Court here.

"There are 15 Christian and about 34 Hindu and Mahommedan servants employed in the Judicial Courts at Honore, exclusive of the class of Peons, the families of the Christian servants comprising about 100, and those of the Hindu and Mahommedan servants about 200 individuals. There has not been a single case of cholera amongst any of these families for the last two and twenty years of my residence at Honore."

Therefore we have as ample proof as could well be afforded of the entire absence of cholera up to the middle of July 1853. I shall next examine the details afforded by public documents and personal evidence relating to the period intervening between that date and the present time. There have been, however, as we shall find, some few cases of cholera in the hot weather of last year (April and May 1854) but I think very few in number really.

Before entering upon this point, I think it well to give a brief detail of the situation and size of the town of Honore and the relative position of surrounding villages.

The term "Honore" is applied generally to both the town and village of that name, but I shall speak of them separately for the remaining portion of this paper.

The town of Honore is situated upon a marine lagoon or back water on the coast of North Canara in Latitude 14. 15° North, Longitude 74. 30° East. It lies on an angle bounded on the West by the Bay in the lagoon and on the South by the large expanse of water caused partly by the flowing from the East of the Gairsoppa river and partly by the sea water. On the N. N. W. of Honore and about 1 mile from it and $\frac{1}{2}$ a mile from the sea shore is the commencement of a broad bund of laterite which taking its origin here, passes round the town at a distance varying from $1\frac{1}{4}$ to 2 miles, passing first North for a short space, bending gradually to the East, then turning slightly South, and then directly South until it approaches and runs on to the coast of the lagoon near the point where the Gairsoppa river flows into it.

The whole space included within the laterite bund may be said to be an irregular ellipsis its long axis lying N. N. E. and S. S. W.—within it are three places densely inhabited viz., the town of Honore, the village of Honore, and the village of Royall.

The town of Honore is situated to the West of the axis and principally on the Southern portion of it. The village of Honore occupies the portion to the East of the axis and lies along the edge of the backwater in the direction of the Gairsoppa river. The village of Royall lies within the bund of laterite and to the North of the town of Honore which thus intervenes between it and the village of Honore.

The population of both town and village is calculated conjointly in the following table computed in 1852, (a new Census will be taken in 1856).

The village of Royall is, however, much less extensive not numbering much more than a seventh of the inhabitants in Honore as will be apparent from the table subjoined.

The bund of Laterite within which these places are situated is in itself perfectly barren, only a few trees having taken root in it, but on its inner side it is lined by a deep fosse, of a width varying from $\frac{1}{4}$ mile to a few yards, which is planted with cocoanut trees as thickly as possible. This fosse is well marked especially in the portion lying to the West and North: on the Eastern side it is gradually obliterated.

Within this fosse is an elevated plateau of land of irregular shape bounded by the fosse on the N. and N. W., and running up to the laterite bound on the Eastern side.

On the Western side of this elevated plateau are placed the houses of the European inhabitants.

The town of Honore is situated partly on the elevated plateau and partly in the fosse where it is bounded by the termination of the laterite bund and by the vacant space intervening between the end of it and the edge of the water.

The village of Honore lying along the Southern Coast of the back-water near the mouth of the Gairsoppa river is situated upon an extensive flat and low portion of ground, also thickly planted with cocoanut and plantain trees. This low ground runs in an irregular zigzag line along the Southern and Western side of the elevated ground and at length becomes continuous with the low ground intervening between the commencement of the laterite belt and the sea.

The importance of this minute detail is found in the facts that "over the Laterite bund Cholera has never passed" and "the town of Honore and the village of Royall which are almost entirely enclosed within it and beyond which it stretches both to E. and W., and which it bounds on the N. entirely, have never had Cholera in any form." This latter is the more remarkable as from the situation of many of the houses it might be expected to commit fearful ravages.

The as perfect immunity of the village of Honore is not quite so undoubted.

Adopting the same plan as before, I exhibit in the accompanying table, the numbers of sick and of those under observation both in the Jail and Regimental Detachment Hospitals from 1st January 1853, and 1st April 1853 respectively, both being carried down to 30th November 1855.

From them it will be seen that no cholera was present in any instance in these two Hospitals for a space of nearly 3 years. Thus our experience of them is extended to 13 and 11 years (nearly).

The only remaining return is that of the Dispensary established last year, having been opened on the 1st January 1854.

I find here that in January 1854, an out patient was admitted under treatment for cholera and died. In November of the same year an in-patient was admitted with cholera and recovered.

With reference to these cases I find Dr. Leslie reports the first to have been that of a sailor brought from on boardship, and as concerns the latter, the following is in Dr. Maitland's Record of Practice extending from September 28th to December 15th, 1854. "No Epidemic during the above period. Cholera has been said to prevail in "villages at a little distance* but only two somewhat doubtful cases "have been seen at the station, both occurring in the crew of a Native vessel which had come down the coast."

Dr. Brett in sending in a report dated January 1st 1855 does not mention any subsequent cases.

I find however by the Annual Record, of all the cases under treatment both as extern and intern patients, that the number of cases of cholera which came under observation was very considerable in 1854, but it is also to be remarked that *not a single case is recorded in the present year (1855).*

Dr. Brett, in his Annual Report for 1854, (written however after an experience of less than a month) says "There is no record of any epidemic having prevailed during the past year: there is none at the present time."

The contradiction between the above and the return in juxtaposition to which I have placed it was so great and so utterly irreconcilable that I made the most particular inquiries as to the accuracy of the record of cases in the Dispensary.

I believe that the following gives a connected account of those cases upon the accuracy of which we may rely.

The solitary case (recovered) among the in-patients is one of those alluded to in Dr. Maitland's "Record of Practice" one of the cases (died) among the out-patients is the one reported by Dr. Leslie in January 1854. The remaining 68 cases are *said* to have occurred in April and May of the same year.

It seems that in these months cholera was raging at Gairsoppa from which the inhabitants fled in dismay. A number of them came to Honore and so escaped contagion, but some people from Honore going up afterwards to trade at Gairsoppa became infected and returned to Honore *labouring under the disease.*

The effect of this was to induce very general alarm, and eventually 68 cases were reported as of cholera. There is not a single case of it entered in the journal for out-patients, and I think it is extremely probable that under the excitement and depression caused by the presence of some undoubted cases brought down from Gairsoppa, many persons affected with simple diarrhoea sent to the Dispensary for medicine for cholera. This conclusion is forced upon one from observing that the ratio of the number of deaths to that of the number of persons attacked forbids the idea of malignant cholera. April is of all months in the year the one in which diarrhoea is most prevalent here. Yet I find that in April 1854 the number of cases of this disease does not equal that in each of three other months in the same year. In this opinion I am confirmed by the fact that upon my first enquiries I was told "cholera had not appeared in Honore" and it was only upon my personally seeking out information at that part of the village of Honore where it really occurred that I found out that undoubtedly some few cases were witnessed.

This *very partial* appearance of cholera was exclusively confined to the village of Honore situated on low ground along the backwater.

Not a single case occurred in the town of Honore or in the village of Royall, nor can I find the slightest reason to believe that one *ever* did appear in these two places.

I may here remark that hitherto cholera has always approached Belcond from Kirkee, the latter place being about $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles N. W. from Honore, and the former lying between the two places at the distance of one mile from Honore.

But into the town it has never come, and it is worthy of remark that the cases which have ever approached nearer the town of Honore have yet never been found to come within the Laterite bund. The point where the course of the cholera ceased lies almost in the line which would most directly continue the Laterite bund (from what I have termed as its origin) to the sea. By permission of the Civil authorities the natives are now erecting a temple to mark the spot where the "destroying angel" stays his course.

The brief narrative I have given of the visitation of cholera said to have taken place in 1854, in the village of Honore, I have derived from what I consider undoubted authority. It is a matter much to be regretted that the frequent changes among the Medical Officers at the station combined with the brief spaces of time for which they respectively held office, have resulted in the entire omission from the Medical Journals of Record of any mention whatever of that period of time which was signalized by the unexpected epidemic I have detailed. But I cannot believe that such omission would have possibly occurred if malignant disease were known to be prevalent on any thing of a large scale. Whatever be the cause it is to be hoped that should similar occurrences again take place, a full and satisfactory account of them may be drawn up *at the time*.

Regarding therefore the exemption of the town of Honore and of the village of Royall from visitations of cholera as proved, I have endeavoured to discover to what it may be attributed. I may however add that I have utterly failed to arrive at any satisfactory conclusion. To facilitate others in their efforts to do so it may be well to notice briefly such points as have, with reference to other places, been held as accounting for the appearance or absence of cholera or as modifying or increasing its virulence.

1st. Origin of the disease.—The few cases of cholera that have ever been witnessed in Honore have either been brought in from a distance or have arisen apparently from contact with cases of this description so brought in.

This agrees with the fact recorded by Mr. Hall in his letter (dated January 28th, 1853, para. 2).

2nd. Cessation of the disease.—No cases appeared after the commencement of the monsoon (vide Mr. Hall's letter para. 3).

3rd. Course of the disease (direction of.)—We have already seen at the only time that it is even possible that any number of cases of cholera occurred in Honore (namely 1854), the disease appears clearly to have been brought from Gairsoppa which lies due E. and about 20 miles off. Though cholera appeared often to the N. W. in Kirkee and Belcond, never was it brought into Honore from *that* direction.

4th. Food of the inhabitants.—A number of the poorer people subsist principally on raggie and the bark of the wild palmyra tree. The better classes on rice and fish chiefly, with currysuffs. A great deal of fish is eaten and little animal food, vegetables (brinjalls and pumpkins) are to be had in the bazaar in small quantities all the year round, except in October, November, and December: cocoanuts are abundant and much used for food by all classes.

5th. Occupations of the inhabitants.—Fishing, Cultivation of the soil, dealings in cocoanuts and rice, making of oil, coir ropes and mats, no special trades are carried on, the peculiar manufacture of the place is in carved woods, but the number carrying on this is very small indeed.

6th. Comparative numbers of different castes.—There is no record on this point, but all the different castes of Hindoos and Brahmins are more or less represented in Honore.

7th. Time of appearance of the disease.—The surrounding villages are generally attacked about April and May, the disease ceasing when the monsoon commences. The *village of Honore* was thus slightly attacked in 1854, there being 68 cases (67 in April and 1 in May) reported of this disease.

Cholera generally occurs annually or biennially at Gairsoppa and Kirkee.

8th. Nearest place where cholera has been.—The village of Honore distant $\frac{3}{4}$ mile off. In the attack above mentioned (if it be regarded as such) 3 out of 68 persons seized with the disease died. This attack was the first ever experienced by this village. For the reason I have already given I do not think that we can be perfectly certain as to the number of cases occurring, but we may at least remark that the cholera must have been of a very modified type where the results are such as are afforded by the returns already quoted.

Leaving out of question the village of Honore, we shall enumerate the various other places where cholera is known certainly to have been. 1st, Belcond, 1 mile off.—2nd, Kirkee, $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles off; this town is almost intirely inhabited by Brahmins.—3rd, Chanduren, 9 miles off.—4th, Coompta, 12 miles off.—5th, Gairsoppa, about 20 miles distant to the east.

9th. *Average range of Thermometer.*—This is shown for some years in the following Extracts. Dr. Leslie writes that during November and December 1848, the Thermometer in the house during the day “stood as high as 90° and averaged 85° .”

In the following year “the thermometer in the house at noon during the monsoon averaged 84° and varied but very few degrees in the mornings and evenings. In the dry weather it stands higher in the day and varies more at night owing to the prevalence of land winds.”

In the following year (1850); the Thermometer placed in a verandah about 11 feet from the ground and slightly exposed to the land wind (though facing N. W.) gave the following results.

10th. Duration of the seasons.

Hot weather. March, April and May.....3 months.

Monsoon. June, July, August and September...4 do.

11th. *Atmospheric phenomena.*—I have no means of ascertaining the amount of moisture in the atmosphere but find the following facts relative to other points of interest. A violent storm is recorded as occurring in April 1846, succeeded by an unusually early and heavy monsoon. In 1848 the monsoon did not commence until after the end of May and was remarkably light “with frequent intervals of clear sunshine and the temperature was moderate. The land winds which seem to be generally dreaded by the natives were very slightly felt and that principally during the month of November.”

The year 1851 was remarkable for the equability of temperature and general absence of any atmospheric phenomena. 1852, the heat of the months of November and December is remarked upon. “The land wind blowing strongly across the Ghauts and thick jungle becoming afterwards heated to a great degree by contact with the powerful radiating surface of the plain from 3 or 4 miles in breadth which intervenes at this part of the coast between it and the Ghauts. This is the only part of the year in which the thermometer indicates any decided difference in the temperature during the 24 hours. The climate in general being remarkable for its equability of temperature.”

11th. *Amount of rain fallen in the year.*

Beyond the foregoing, I do not know of any point of information likely to afford us a clue to the cause why Honore should be exempted from cholera. Its position alone seems a *possible* source of it. But beyond this vague assertion we can scarcely venture confidently to go. There is no material difference between the food of the inhabitants of Honore and of those of many places along the Western Coast, yet Mangalore and Cannanore have both at times been visited with cholera which can scarcely be said to be unknown at any of the larger stations along this coast. If we were to make *any* remark on the food it would be to the effect that it was *extremely likely* to induce cholera.

The occupations pursued here are no wise different from those of thousands of persons who are annually visited by this disease.

Honore embraces people of all castes within it.

Cholera is witnessed on every side of Honore, yet never attacks it in, at least, anything of an epidemic form.

There are many places along the coast where *more* rain falls and some where *less* rain falls, and all are nevertheless equally liable to attacks of this disease.

The sole remaining difference between Honore and all other of these places is that of position, and it comes to be considered whether its immunity from this peculiar form of disease is referable to *this* cause. But how far it can be traced to the fact of the almost complete isolation from other villages resulting from the intervention of the broad belt of Laterite, which, as being entirely uncultivated, allows a free current of air to circulate at all times around the town, is a question which under present circumstances we are scarcely enabled to determine.

We have however entered at sufficient length into the established facts relative to the subject to be able to declare an inference strongly confirmative of the former and unanimous experience of others. And the most careful enquiry fails to afford any *greater* insight into the cause of them than others before us have acquired.
