ANANTAPUR CIRCLE.

CHAPTER I.

DESCRIPTION.

Till 1897 the Anantapur district containing eight taluks formed a single circle, but with the introduction of the tree-tax system from 1st October 1897 this became too heavy a charge for one Inspector. Under sanction conveyed in G.O. Mis. No. 4225, Revenue, dated 13th August 1897, the district was accordingly divided into two circles, Anantapur and Penukonda, with effect from 1st October 1897.

Extent.

2. The circle comprises the four taluks of Gooty, Tadpatri, Anantapur and Kalyandrug. It has an area of 3,879 square miles containing 424 villages, of which 386 are ryotwari and 38 inam with a total population of 4,52,678. It is bounded on the north by the Bellary and Kurnool circles, on the east by the Nandyal and Cuddapah circles, on the south by the Mysore State and the Penukonda and Cuddapah circles and on the west by the Mysore State and the Bellary circle.

4. The circle is divided into eleven preventive ranges, for which the establishment originally sanctioned was 11 Sub-Inspectors, 11 first-grade peons and 55 second-grade peons, supervised by an Inspector with an orderly of 1 first-grade and 5 second-grade peons—G.O. Mis. No. 4225, Revenue, dated 13th August 1897. The strength of the first and second-grade peons in the eleven ranges was revised from time to time and it now consists of 23 first-grade peons and 28 second-grade peons including 3 first-grade and 3 second-grade peons with the Inspector.

5. The Anantapur and Kalyandrug taluks form a division for revenue and magisterial purposes in charge of a Deputy Collector with Headquarters at Anantapur. The Gooty and Tadpatri taluks form a division in charge of a Deputy Collector with Headquarters at Gooty. The four taluks are under four Tahsildars for revenue purposes. There are three Stationary Sub-Magistrates at Anantapur, Gooty and Tadpatri. The Tahsildar of Kalyandrug has also magisterial powers in the same taluk. The Deputy Tahsildars at Yadiki and Uravakonda have got both revenue and magisterial functions in portions of the Tadpatri and Gooty taluks, respectively. The Stationary Sub-Magistrate of Anantapur exercises jurisdiction throughout the taluk, whereas the Gooty taluk is, for magisterial purposes, apportioned between the Stationary Sub-Magistrate of Gooty and the Deputy Tahsildar of Uravakonda and the Tadpatri taluk between the Stationary Sub-Magistrate of Tadpatri and the Deputy Tahsildar of Yadiki.

6. The soil of the Gooty, Tadpatri and Anantapur taluks is generally black cotton soil though red loam is found in places, while that of the Kalyandrug taluk is mostly gravel. A considerable portion of the Gooty taluk is hilly, but hills are sparse in the remaining taluks. The circle is traversed by good roads, of which the Bangalore High road, Anantapur-Bellary road and Chittoor road are the chief.

The Guntakal-Bangalore and the Guntakal-Madras branches of the Madras and Southern Mahratta Railway pass through the circle. The former passes by Pamidi and Anantapur, and the latter touches Gooty and Tadpatri. Uravakonda which is also an important centre of trade is connected with Guntakal by a good road. Kalyandrug is reached from Rayadrug, Anantapur or Dharmavaram which are 22, 86 and 40 miles distant from it respectively, and are all connected with it by good roads.

7. (1) *Pamidi*.—This is a railway station and noted for cotton printing. Principal centres of trade.
- (2) *Uravakonda*.—Is the Headquarters of the Deputy Tahsildar, Uravakonda, and noted for weaving.
- (3) *Thimmancherla*.—Is close to Guntakal Railway Junction. Contains many cotton and oil presses and ginning factories. There is a big weekly shandy held every Sunday. It is the centre of cotton trade.
- (4) *Tadpatri*.—Two miles from the railway station; has two cotton presses and a distillery. There is a weekly shandy held every Saturday.
- (5) *Gooty*.—Is the Headquarters of the Divisional Officer. It has a brisk trade in groundnut, the produce of this and the surrounding villages.
- (6) *Beluguppa*.—Is noted for rough woollen blankets.

The circle office and the Inspector's quarters are situated on the Anantapur-Rudrampeta road, a mile and a half south of the Anantapur Railway station near the District Police Superintendent's quarters and one mile from the Collector's office.

CHAPTER II.

PREVENTIVE RANGES.

A.—Gooty Range.

The range is about 270 square miles in extent and is traversed by fairly good roads. It contains 50 ryotwari and 4 inam villages with a population of about 50,740. It is bounded on the north by the Kurnool circle, on the east by the Nandyal circle and the Yadiiki range of this circle, on the south by the Narpala range and on the west by the Narpala and Guntakal ranges. It has 17 arrack, 28 toddy, 2 ganja and 2 opium shops, 1 F.L.-2, 1 F.L.-9, 1-M.S.-1, 1-O-2 (a) and 1 I.D.-2 shops and 2 arrack wholesale depots. There is no sweet juice industry in the range. The number of trees marked annually averages 6,000 dates. The town of Gooty is 2 miles away from the railway station, contains a Post office and a Police Station and is the headquarters of the Deputy Collector, Tahsildar, Sub-Magistrate, District Munsif and Police Inspector. The area comprising the range was originally patrolled by a party consisting of a petty officer and 5 peons. The party was abolished from 1st October 1897 and a Sub-Inspector with one first-grade peon and five second-grade peons was appointed to the charge of the range. From 1st February 1914 the orderly of the Sub-Inspector was reduced to a first-grade peon and four second-grade peons. Pamidi, and from 1st April 1919 to two first and two second-grade peons. Pamidi, which is noted for its cotton printing, is in this range. Gooty contains an old hill fortress. There is no grave crime in the range. Yerragudi Thanda in the Kurnool circle which is notorious for illicit distillation is about 8 miles from Gooty. Salt crime does not exist. Five metalled roads pass from Gooty to Pamidi, Guntakal, Pirapalli, Pattikonda and Tadpatri. The Madras and Southern Mahratta Railway touches Pamidi and Gooty. There is in Gooty a big choultry built more than a century ago by Major-General Munro, K.C.B., the first Collector of the Ceded Districts and latterly Governor of Fort St. George.

B.—Guntakal Range.

Description.

The range is about 255 square miles in extent, is mostly hilly and contains only one road, that from Guntakal to Gooty. It contains 32 ryotwari and 8 shrotriyam villages, with a population of 29,212 inhabitants. It is bounded on the north by the Kurnool circle and the Bellary circle, on the east by the Gooty range, on the south by the Uravakonda and Gooty ranges of this circle and on the west by the Bellary circle and the Uravakonda range. It contains 11 arrack, 21 toddy shops, 1 ganja shop, 1 opium shop, 2-F.L.2, 1-F.L.-9, 1 M.S.-1, 1-O 2 (a), 1 I.D. 25 shops and 1 arrack wholesale depot. There is no sweet juice industry in the range. The number of trees marked annually averages 10,000 dates. Guntakal is a Railway Junction where the Madras-Bombay line crosses the Bezwada-Goa line and whence a line connects it with Bangalore. The establishment of the range originally consisted of one Sub-Inspector, one first-grade peon and five second-grade peons. The orderly of the Sub-Inspector was reduced to one first-grade peon and four second-grade peons from 1st February 1914 and was revised from 1st April 1918 as two first grade and three second-grade peons. The Sugalis who live in the thandas occasionally distil illicitly. The Ramagiri Thanda is noted for illicit distillation. There is no other grave crime in the range. Salt crime does not exist. Except the Guntakal junction, there are no important centres in the range.

C.—Uravakonda Range.

Description.

The range is about 370 square miles in extent. It contains 45 ryotwari and 1 inam villages with a population of 69,187. It is bounded on the north by the Bellary circle, on the east by the Guntakal range of this circle, on the south by the Bellary circle and the Atmakur range of this circle, and on the west by the Bellary circle. It has 22 arrack, 32 toddy shops, 1 ganja shop and 1 arrack wholesale depot. There is no sweet juice industry in the range. The number of trees marked annually averages 1,000 dates. Uravakonda is the head quarters of the Deputy Tahsildar. The area comprising the range was originally patrolled by a petty officer and 5 peons. The establishment of the range, which was formed on the introduction of the tree-tax system, consisted of a Sub-Inspector, a first grade peon and four second-grade peons. The orderly of the Sub-Inspector was reduced to two first-grade and two second-grade peons when the grade and pay of peons were reorganized in 1918 and 1919. The only grave crime is illicit distillation. It exists in the Pedda Chinna Piyapalli and Kadamalakunta Thandas. There is no salt crime in the range. Uravakonda, where the chief industry is cotton-weaving, is also a centre of trade. Vajrakarur which is known for the diamonds found during the rainy season is midway between Guntakal and Uravakonda. The Anantapur-Bellary road runs through the range. A branch road passes from Guntakal to Uravakonda.

Uravakonda is the only important centre of trade. Pennobulam and Gadaikal are noted for the important jatras that take place there between February and April.

D.—Yadiki Range.

Description.

The range is about 243 square miles in extent. It contains 38 ryotwari and 1 inam villages with a population of 33,974. It is bounded on the north by the Kurnool circle, on the east by the Nandyal circle, on the south by the Putlur and Narpala ranges of this circle and on the west by the Gooty range. It has 19 arrack and 27 toddy shops, 1 ganja shop, 1 opium shop and 1 arrack wholesale depot. There is no sweet juice industry in the range. The number of trees marked annually averages 2,000 dates. Yadiki is the headquarters of a Deputy Tahsildar. The range forms part of the area patrolled by the old 'Tadpatri party'. The strength of the range originally consisted of a Sub-Inspector, a first-grade and five second-grade peons. The strength of the orderly was revised from time to time and it now consists of two first-grade and two second-grade peons. The Rayalcheruvu-Tadpatri road runs through the range. Another road from Rayalcheruvu meets the Tadpatri-Koilkunta road at Bogasamudram. There is no grave crime in the range. Salt crime does not exist.

E.—Putlur Range.

Description.

The range is about 376 square miles in extent. It contains 54 ryotwari and 4 inam villages with a population of 75,300. It is bounded on the north by the Yadiki range of this circle, on the east by the Jammalamadugu circle, on the south by the Jammalamadugu circle and the Narpala range and on the west by the Narpala range. It has 37 arrack, 25 toddy, 2 ganja, 2 opium shops, 2 arrack wholesale depots and 1 F.L.-2 shop. There is no sweet juice industry in the range. The number of trees marked annually averages 1,000 dates. Tadpatri is the headquarters of a Tahsildar and a Sub-Magistrate. The town is noted for its cotton trade and has two cotton presses and a distillery. The area comprising the range was originally patrolled by a petty officer and five peons. The original establishment of the range consisted of a Sub-Inspector, a first-grade peon and five second-grade peons but the strength of the orderly has since been reduced to two first-grade and three second-grade peons. Illicit distillation prevails in the southern portion of the range, Vennapusapalli, Venkatampalli and other villages bordering the Cuddapah district being notorious for it. The only road that passes through the range is that from Gooty to Tadpatri and thence to Cuddapah so that during wet weather, the southern portion which consists of black cotton soil is almost inaccessible. Salt crime does not exist. The Madras-Bombay Railway line touches Tadpatri.

F.—Narpala Range.

Description.

The range extends over 481 square miles in area and contains 48 ryotwari and 6 inam villages with a population of 43,858. It is bounded on the north by the Gooty and Yadiki ranges of this circle, on the east by the Puttur range, on the south by the Penukonda circle and on the west by the Anantapur range. It contains 22 arrack and 35 toddy shops and 1 arrack wholesale depot. There is no sweet juice industry in the range. The number of trees marked annually averages 2,000 dates. Narpala, which is about 15 miles from Anantapur, and 20 miles from the Garladinne Railway station in the range, is the headquarters of the Sub-Inspector. The range underwent changes on the redistribution of the Anantapur, Dharmavaram and Gooty taluks by the transfer of some villages from the Gooty to the Anantapur taluk and from the latter to the Dharmavaram taluk. This range formed part of the old Anantapur range and was patrolled by a petty officer and five peons. The range was formed on the introduction of the tree-tax system. The establishment originally consisted of a Sub-Inspector, a first-grade peon and five second-grade peons but the orderly has since been reduced to two first-grade peons and two second-grade peons. The range is traversed by three metalled roads (1) the Tadpatri-Dharmavaram road, (2) Anantapur-Tadpatri road, (3) Anantapur-Pamidi road. There is no grave crime in the range. Salt crime does not exist.

Narpala is the only important centre of trade. There are no important jatras in the range.

G.—Anantapur Range.

The range extends over 302 square miles and contains 35 ryotwari and 7 inam villages with a population of 41,241. It is bounded on the north by the Gooty and Narpala ranges, on the east by the Atmakur range, on the south by the Penukonda circle and on the west by the Anantapur range. It has 9 arrack and 31 toddy shops, 1 ganja shop, 1 opium shop, 1 F.L.-1 shop, 1 F.L.-2 shop and 1 M.S.-1 shop. There is one arrack wholesale depot. There is no sweet juice industry in the range. The number of trees marked annually averages 12,000 dates. Anantapur is the headquarters of the district and contains the offices of the Collector, the District and Sessions Judge, the Superintendent of Police, the District Forest Officer, the District Medical and Sanitary Officer, Public Works Department Sub-divisional Officer, and the Local Fund Engineer. It is a Railway Station and a Municipality. It has a travellers' bungalow. The establishment which consisted originally of a Sub-Inspector, a first-grade peon and five second-grade peons has been reduced to a Sub-Inspector, three first-grade peons and two second-grade peons. Kuderu, which contains extensive date topes from which the Dharmavaram shops obtain today, is in the range. The range is traversed by several roads, (1) Anantapur-Tadpatri, (2) Anantapur-Kalyandrug, (3) Anantapur-Gooty, (4) Bangalore-Bellary, (5) Anantapur-Dharmavaram and (6) Anantapur-Kadiri. There is no grave abkari crime in the range. Salt crime does not exist. The Southern Mahratta Railway line touches Anantapur.

H.—Atmakur Range.

Description.

The range extends over 262 square miles and contains 20 ryotwari and 2 inam villages with a population of 21,032. It is bounded on the north by the Uravakonda and Guntakal ranges, on the east by the Anantapur and Narpala ranges, on the south by the Penukonda circle and on the west by the Kalyandrug range. It has 3 arrack and 21 toddy shops. There is no sweet juice industry in the range. The number of trees marked annually averages 15,000 dates. It contains extensive date topes from which the toddy shops of the Uravakonda range, and some of the Bellary circle shops obtain their supplies. The establishment, which originally consisted of a Sub-Inspector, a first-grade peon and five second-grade peons has been reduced to a Sub-Inspector, three first-grade peons and two second-grade peons. The Anantapur-Uravakonda and the Anantapur-Kalyandrug roads pass through this range. There is no grave abkari crime in the range. Salt crime does not exist. The Railway line does not pass through this range.

The range extends over 344 square miles and contains 28 ryotwari and 2 inam villages with a population of 38,539. It is bounded on the north by the Bellary circle, on the east by the Atmakur range and the Penukonda circle, on the south by the Kambadur range and on the west by the Bellary circle and the Shettur range. It has 6 arrack, 31 toddy shops, 1 ganja shop and 1 arrack wholesale depot. There is no sweet juice industry in the range. The number of trees marked annually averages 6,000 dates. Kalyandrug is the headquarters of the Tahsildar and Sub-Registrar. The establishment which consisted of a Sub-Inspector, one first-grade peon and three second-grade peons when the range was formed in 1897 was reduced by one second-grade peon from 1st February 1914. Recently, a few cases of illicit distillation were detected in the Varli Thanda. Otherwise grave crime does not prevail. Salt crime also does not exist. The range is traversed by a few roads—(1) Anantapur-Kalyandrug, (2) Kalyandrug-Raya-drug, (3) Kalyandrug-Dharmavaram, and (4) Kalyandrug-Kambadur roads.

Description.

The range extends over an area of 188 square miles and contains 13 ryotwari and 4 inam villages with a population of 17,120. It is bounded on the north by the Kalyandrug range, on the east by the Penukonda circle, on the south by the Mysore State and the Penukonda circle and on the west by the Shettur range. It has 2 arrack and 15 toddy shops. There is no sweet juice industry in the range. The number of trees marked annually averages 2,000 dates. The establishment which consisted of a Sub-Inspector, a first-grade peon and four second-grade peons was reduced to a Sub-Inspector, a first-grade peon and two second-grade peons from 1st October 1912. The only road that passes through the range is that from Kalyandrug to Kambadur. This range borders on the Mysore State, but illicit traffic in arrack, toddy or ganja, is not common. Salt crime and grave abkari crime do not exist.

It has 24 toddy shops. The number of trees marked annually averages 1,000 dates. The establishment of the range was reduced from a Sub-Inspector, one first-grade peon and four second-grade peons to a Sub-Inspector, one first-grade peon and two second-grade peons from 1st October 1912. This range borders on the Mysore Province. Illicit traffic in ganja, arrack or toddy is not common. Grave abkari crime or salt crime does not exist. There are no metalled roads in the range. The famine road from Kalyandrug to Kundurpi runs through the range.

The rest are in the names of private individuals. The retail selling price varies from 2 annas 6 pies to 3 annas 6 pies per dram of 35° U.P. and is 2 annas 6 pies per dram of 60° U.P.

The issue strengths of arrack was reduced to 35° U.P. with effect from 1st April 1918. Three shops in the circle, one in each of the Gooty, Tadpatri and Kalyandrug taluks were opened from 1st April 1919 for the sale of 60° U.P. only.

The supply of toddy is ample throughout the circle and date trees are found in all parts. Only date trees are tapped in the circle and the consumers do not like any other toddy. The trees are tapped once in two days or once in three days according to the demand. The tappers are generally poor and depend upon the monthly wage of Rs. 12 to Rs. 20 paid by the shopkeepers. Tappers are numerous in the circle. Manufacture of sweet juice is not carried on in the circle. Toddy is transported in skins on donkeys when the quantity is small; in other cases in casks by cart. The shopkeepers lease the trees directly from the tree-owners and the tappers have no interest in the matter. The usual fee charged by tree-owners is from 4 annas to Re. 1; and was raised from 4 annas to 8 annas, in the case of Government trees from 1st November 1914. Cases of (1) illicit tapping (2) illicit transport and (3) unlicensed sales are prevalent in the circle.

The few coconut trees that are to be found in the circle are in small topes.

Palmyras are found in topes, in a few places in the circle. The tappers do not know how to tap them. No sago trees are to be found in the circle.

The private date trees bear the proportion of 2 : 1 to the Government date trees.

The retail selling price of toddy is 6 annas per gallon.

Opium.

There were nine opium shops in the circle up to 31st March 1911, viz., (1) Gooty, (2) Guntakal, (3) Pamidi, (4) Uravakonda, (5) Yadiki, (6) Tadpatri, (7) Yellarur, (8) Anantapur, (9) Kalyandrug. Numbers 4 and 9 were closed from 1st April 1911. The retail price of opium varies from Re. 1 to Rs. 1-8-0 per tola. In the shops of the Mysore Province which border on this circle the retail price is 12 annas, to Rs. 1-8-0 per tola. Muhammadans, Kapus and Boyas use the drug. The consumption averages about 107 seers per annum. There are, however, no facilities or temptation to smuggle the drug and crime relating to opium is rare.

GANJA.

There were 11 ganja shops in the whole circle distributed in all the ranges except Shettur range. They were (1) Gooty, (2) Guntakal, (3) Pamidi, (4) Uravakonda, (5) Yadiki, (6) Tadpatri, (7) Yellanur, (8) Narpala, (9) Anantapur, (10) Kalyandrug, (11) Kambadur. Numbers 8 and 11 were closed from 1st April 1915. The shops get their supply usually from the storehouse at Vetapalem and occasionally from the storehouse at Santavasal. Ganja is consumed by the lower classes. The consumption averages about 18 maunds per annum. The retail selling price is Re. 1 a tola. In shops of the Mysore province on the borders of this circle the retail selling price is 12 annas per tola. There are no temptations or facilities to smuggle and ganja crime is not prevalent to any great extent. There were two ganja depots, one at Tadpatri and the other at Guntakal. The depots were abolished from 1915-16, as a result of malpractices on the part of the depot-keepers. Charas and bhang are not consumed in the circle.

FOREIGN LIQUOR.

Foreign liquor is consumed chiefly by Europeans, Anglo-Indians and by a few well-to-do Indians. There are Fl.2 shops at Tadpatri, Gooty, Anantapur and Guntakal. There are also refreshment rooms attached to the Railway Stations at Gooty and Guntakal. There are no taverns or beer shops in the circle.

FRONTIERS.

I.—Extent.

The circle adjoins the Mysore Province. The Mysore frontier commences at Polehalli on the west, runs east up to Kurukulapalli, both villages belonging to the Kalyandrug taluk. The length of the frontier is nearly 76 miles. The frontier adjoins the two ranges, Shettur on the west and Kambadur on the east.

II.—Facilities for crime.

Smuggling of any sort of intoxicants from British territory to the Mysore State or vice versa is unknown in the circle, ganja, opium and arrack are not used to any great extent on either side of the frontier. Toddy is not smuggled. The prices of the intoxicants do not vary to such an extent as to offer any inducement for smuggling.

III.—Rates of tree-tax.

The Mysore lease runs from 1st July to 30th June and the British lease is from 1st October to 30th September.

In the Mysore State, the duty on arrack which was fixed at Rs. 4 12-0 for a gallon of 25° U.P. with effect from 1st July 1911 was raised to Rs. 7-8-0 per proof gallon in 1917-18. In 1918-19 the duty remained the same as in the previous year; but in 1919-20 it was again enhanced to Rs. 6 for the Bangalore city and Rs. 5-4-0 elsewhere per gallon of 25° U.P. The cost price in 1919-20 was Rs. 0-15-8 for a gallon of 35° U.P.

The duty on ganja is the same in the Mysore State as in British territory and the minimum price per tola of ganja is 12 annas in the Mysore against Re. 1 in British territory. The limit of possession of ganja without licence is 4 tolas in Mysore as against 5 in British territory.

VIII.—Source of supply of arrack, ganja and opium for the shops of the Mysore State.

Arrack is distilled in the Bangalore Government Central Distillery and transported under bond to bonded depots and thence distributed to the various shops attached to the said depots. Issues are made to shops on the production of treasury receipts in token of having paid the duty and cost price. Bonded depots are located at taluk headquarters.

Ganja is cultivated in the Goribidanur taluk and supplied in pressed cakes to the Taluk treasuries whence the shop-keepers obtain their supply.

Opium is purchased by the Huzur treasury from the Madras Taluk Kacheri and is supplied through the Taluk treasuries in the State.

IX.—Extent of ganja cultivation within the State.

Ganja is cultivated in the villages of Kavanahalli, Doddakivingadi, Kalludi, Chikkuvugode and Nagasudra of the Goribidanur taluk of the Kolar district.

The stuff is more or less the same in quality as that sold in the Madras Presidency.

Nature and extent of restrictions on the transport, possession, sale, etc., of cocaine, morphia and drugs of a similar nature and also notes of general information about their administration.

The rules that apply to intoxicating drugs and opium are all equally applicable to cocaine and its salts and morphia, respectively. Cocaine and morphia are generally used in medical preparations by a few medical practitioners in very limited quantities.
