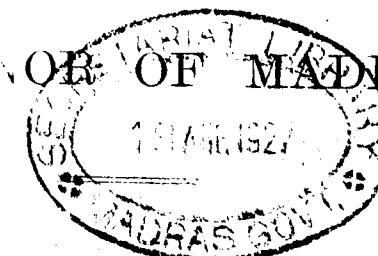

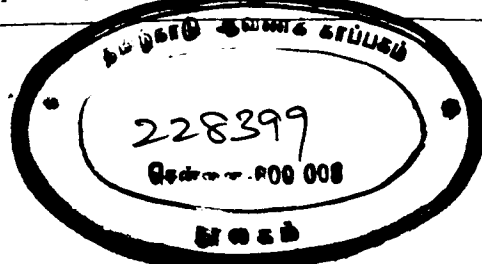

Add at the end of section 180 (a)— "In cases falling under section 179-A the loans advanced shall carry interest at a rate not exceeding three per cent and shall be recoverable in not less than five annual instalments." Proposed by the Kumara Raja of Venkatagiri and seconded by Mr. B. Ramachandra Reddi. Civil Works, which is incomplete on the 1st April and for which there is no provision in the ensuing year's budget, this Council authorizes the continuation of the work up to the limit of the previous year's sanctioned appropriation, on condition that the previous year's total grant for the head concerned has not been exceeded by the expenditure on the work up to that limit and that a supplementary demand for the amount to be expended in the current year is placed before the Council at its first meeting after the 1st of April. 18	Order of the day No. IV dated 29th March 1927.	<i>Adjournment motion regarding acquisition of the Andhra Ayurvedic Sanatorium and drug farm at Avadi.</i> That the business of the House be adjourned to discuss a definite matter of urgent public importance, viz., the indecent haste displayed by the Government of Madras to dispossess the Andhra Ayurvedic Pharmacy, Limited, Madras, of a portion of their land forming part of their drug farm and sanatorium at Avadi, with a view to assist the Malay-n Depot officers, by the application of the Emergency section of the Land Acquisition Act, and to urge upon the Government the necessity for taking immediate steps for withdrawing from the said acquisition. Proposed by Mr. G. Harisarvottama Rao and seconded by Mr. A. Kaleswara Rao. <i>Construction of a separate 'Hospital for Children' in Madras.</i> That this Council recommends to the Government that a special "hospital for children" may be established in the City of Madras, with effect from 1st April 1927, in a suitable rented building, that steps be taken to construct a new building as expeditiously as possible for the accommodation of such a hospital, and that, with a view to achieve the object, a suitable sum be provided in the budget for 1927-28. The resolution which stood in the name of Mrs. S. Muthulakshmi Reddi was Proposed by Dr. B. S. Mallayya and seconded by Mrs. S. Muthulakshmi Reddi. <i>Reduction of fees in the Medical Colleges.</i> That this Council recommends to the Government that the fees levied for a course in the medical colleges in the Presidency be reduced from Rs. 900 to Rs. 540. Proposed by Dr. B. S. Mallayya and seconded by Mr. T. Adinarayana Chettiyar. <i>Introduction of coloured ballot boxes in elections to local bodies.</i> That this Council recommends to the Government to introduce the system of ballot boxes with different colours representing different candidates in the election of members to the local boards and municipalities. Proposed by Sriman Biswanath Das Mahasaya and seconded by Mr. A. Kaleswara Rao Amendment. —For all the words that come after the words "Government to introduce" substitute the words "a system of voting which ensures secrecy even among illiterate voters." Proposed by Mr. K. Koti Reddi and seconded by Mr. G. Harisarvottama Rao. <i>Appointment of a Committee to enquire into the progress of the Co-operative movement in the Presidency.</i> That this Council recommends to Government to appoint a Committee to enquire into the progress of the co-operative movement in this Presidency and suggest ways and means to rectify the defects noticed in the present organization of the movement and to promote the credit and non-credit organizations along right lines. Proposed by Mr. C. Gopala Menon and seconded by Mr. Abdul Hamid Khan. Amendment. —After the word "Committee" insert the words "with a majority of non-official members from among the elected members of this Council." Proposed by Mr. P. Anjaneyulu and seconded by Mr. A. Kaleswara Rao. Amendment. —Add at the end of the words "and also to enquire into and report on the advisability of constituting the Telugu districts into a separate co-operative unit with a registrar of its own." 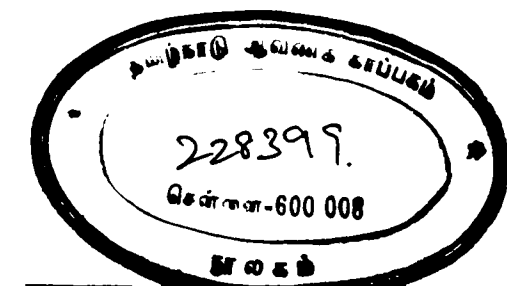

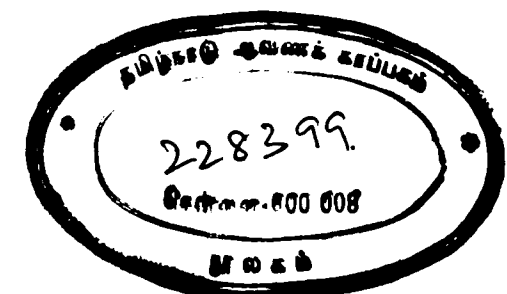
