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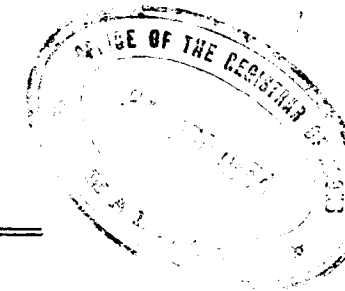

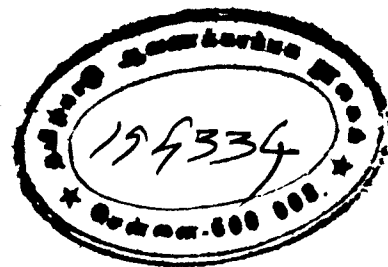

DIETETIC TREATMENT OF SPRUE

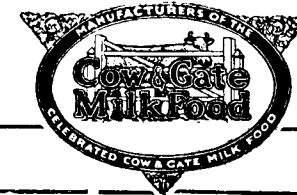


The difficulties of diet in Sprue have now been met by Sprulac, a scientifically prepared high protein milk food, which has been made specially for the Hospital for Tropical Diseases, London (Trans. Roy. Soc. Trop. Med., Vol. XXV., No. 4).

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Mrs. B., a Gujarathi lady aged 25, reported with history of low fever rising in the evening and subsiding with heavy sweating, as also loss of appetite, anæmia and pain in the abdomen. She weighed at this time only 82 lbs.

On examination of her sputum tubercle bacilli were detected. An X-ray skiagram of both the lungs was taken showing inflammation of the pleura and affection of both the bases of the lungs. On enquiry it was ascertained that previous doctors, under whose treatment she was, had tried several known injections for tuberculosis but to no purpose whatsoever. The fever refused to come down in the least and all other indications of tuberculosis remained.

She was therefore immediately put on calci hypophos and guiacol mixture. The diet consisted of fruit juice, and buttermilk and garlic was added to certain dishes. This internal treatment had necessarily to be supplemented with injections and it was indeed a problem as to which should be administered since most of them had been tried and had failed. It was found, however, that Biocholin (A. F. D.) was absent from this list. Merely as a speculation, therefore, a course of Biocholin, one ampoule every third day, was given her, but this proved the saviour of her life. Two injections did not bring the fever down. But on administering the third injection a fall in temperature by 2 degrees was registered. 8 further injections were given every 2 days at the end of which the temperature completely subsided. The patient appeared to be very active; the pain in the abdomen disappeared and she felt such a regular tone in her health that her weight increased by 5 lbs.

The patient, however, had further trials to undergo. On the advice of a consultant she was advised to go out of Bombay for a change. At that place the patient, in order to hasten her recovery, consulted other doctors who thought it advisable to alter the entire treatment given above. Several injections with gold as the basis were given her. But every injection produced a severe reaction and the fever gradually reappeared. In disgust the patient returned to Bombay immediately, with everything the worse in her condition.

As the treatment given in para 3 above had proved beneficial to the patient it was continued and Biocholin was injected every other day. As she was now dangerously anæmic also she was given Elixir Hemoglobin after food. This time the patient naturally took much longer to improve on account of the reactions produced at her health resort but in about 3 weeks time she regained the standard of health she had before proceeding for a change. The weight she had lost at her health resort was fully recovered. She was once more advised to go for a change but she swore that now she would not take any treatment at that place but resort to nature and live her life as much as possible in the open air. Her last communication shows that she is progressing very well indeed and is able to walk about without fatigue. It can hardly be an exaggeration if it is said that Biocholin alone has saved her from lingering death.

DR. VIJAYARAGHAVALU.

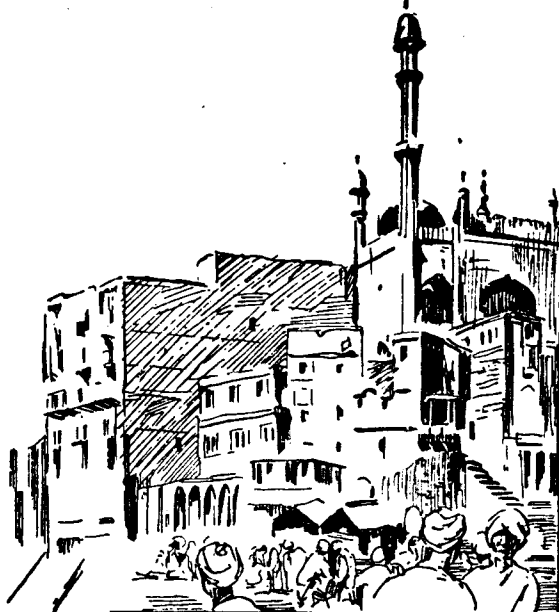
We regret very much to report the death of Dr. M. Vijayaraghavalu, B.A., M.B., C.M., a leading practitioner of Madras.

Dr. Vijayaraghavalu had a brilliant career in the Madras Medical College and after graduating settled down to private practice in the City. It is an open secret that every pressure was brought to bear on him to join the subordinate medical service as the Provincial Medical Service was then called. Dr. Vijayaraghavalu had no reason to be sorry for his selection. He very soon collected a large and lucrative private practice.

Bold-spoken and of independent character he neither spared friend or foe in his withering criticism. He was never content to restrict himself to his medical work. He took a keen interest in civic affairs and was successively returned as a councillor of the corporation where his intimate knowledge of civic affairs and his debating ability brought him to the fore-front.

Dr. Vijayaraghavalu was a erudite scholar. His researches into astrology and applied mathematics are well known. He was in indifferent health for some time past and died suddenly of heart failure. In him the City of Madras has lost a practitioner of the highest ability and the Independent Medical Profession of a keen fighter for its welfare.

To his bereaved family we tender our heartfelt sympathy.

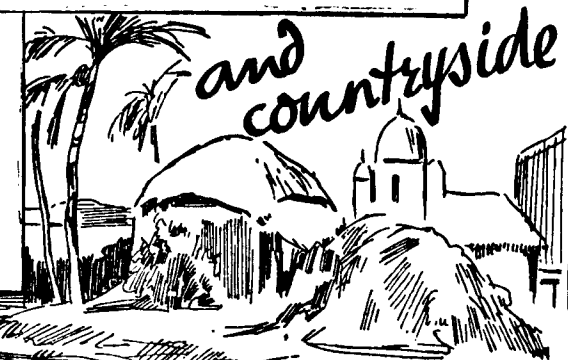

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ASSOCIATION NOTES.

Punjab Medical Council.

*The following is an extract from the
summary of the proceedings of the
meeting of the Punjab Medical
Council held on the 10th November,
1934.*

1. Decided that a panel of mem-
bers be appointed annually as visitors
for the various medical examinations
held in the Province and the following
be appointed as visitors for one
year:—

1. Lt. Col. J. J. Harper-
Nelson, I.M.S.
2. R. B. Dr. Maharaj Krishna
Kapur.
3. Dr. Mirza Yaqub Beg.

2. The Council resumed considera-
tion of the adjourned case of Mr.
Sundar Das, L.M.P., who it was alleged
had resorted to advertising his practice.
He was called upon to appear before
the Council personally but did not
appear. The Council decided that his
name should be removed from the
Register for a period of three years.

3. Decided that the representation
of Licentiates on the Punjab Medical
Council should remain as it is at
present.

4. Court judgments in the following
cases of bogus doctors were recorded
and it was ordered that in future the
information of the conviction of such
bogus practitioners should also be sent
to the Director of Information Bureau
for publication:—

Mr. A. H. Arif Asfani of Lahore,
fined Rs. 150.

Offence "Indicated Letters
M. D. after his name."

Mr. S. M. D. Kazim of Rewari,
fined Rs. 150.

Offence "declared himself a
registered medical prac-
titioner while he was a
quack."

5. The request of the Principal,
Ludhiana Medical School (a private
institution for male students) asking
for recognition of his school and also
the report of Lt.-Col. Amir Chand
recommending that the 1st Professional
Examination for the present be recog-
nised was considered and the Council
resolved that the opinion of Legal
Remembrancer be sought in the matter
as to which body is competent to deal
with the recognition of the first profes-
sional examination of the School and
the President be authorised if so
advised by the Legal Remembrancer
to appoint any member of the Council
to visit the School and report.

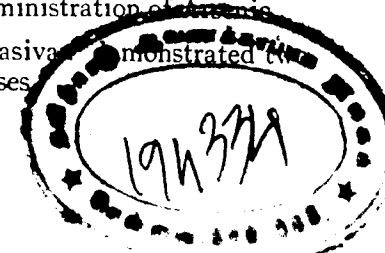
6. Resolved that the qualification
of "Diploma in Laryngology and
Otology" (granted by the Royal
College of Physicians of London and
the Royal College of Surgeons of
England) be brought on to the Sched-
ule of 'additional qualifications.'

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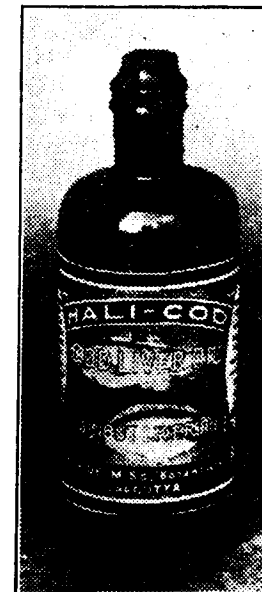

The Dr. B. S. Shroff Memorial Gold Medal
OF THE
BOMBAY MEDICAL UNION.

The following subject has been selected by the Bombay Medical Union for competitive thesis for the above Prize for 1934:—

**" OLD AND NEW REMEDIES
IN
THE TREATMENT OF MALARIA."**

The award will be in the form of a Gold Medal called the DR. B. S. SHROFF MEMORIAL GOLD MEDAL OF THE BOMBAY MEDICAL UNION.

The competitor must be (i) a duly qualified member of the Medical Profession holding a degree or degrees and diplomas from Indian and other Universities created by statute, or (ii) a duly qualified member of the Medical Profession holding the diploma of Membership of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Bombay.

The thesis must be sent in six typed copies so as to reach the Honorary Secretaries, Bombay Medical Union, Blavatsky Lodge Building, French Bridge, Chowpatty, Bombay, on or before the 2nd January 1935, the latest.

The thesis should be designated by a motto instead of the writer's name, and should be accompanied by a sealed cover containing the name of the writer and his Post Office Address.

The name of the Prize, the year of competition, the subject of the thesis and the writer's motto should be superscribed on the cover.

No study or essay that has been published in the medical press or elsewhere will be considered eligible for the Prize, and no contribution offered in one year will be accepted in any subsequent year unless it includes evidence of further work.

The accepted thesis shall be the property of the Bombay Medical Union.

All other thesis shall be returned if not accepted provided the return postage expenses are paid in advance by the writer.

In the award of the Prize to the successful candidate, the decision of the Committee, shall be final.
