CEYLON

(a) **Experimental plot proves a success** :—The experimental plot of tobacco at Paraḡahakella, in the Gal Oya valley has been found a success. It is understood that soil in that sector was rich for tobacco plantation and larger scale plantation of the finest tobacco would be considered in the immediate future. Experts and trained personnel for this industry are likely to be recruited by the Gal Oya Development Board shortly.

(b) **Appeal to cut beedi imports** :—Bidi workers in Ceylon have urged Government to

restrict the import of Indian Bidis to Ceylon. In a memorandum, referring to the quota system fixed by the Government in 1950 for the import of Bidis, they state that after this step the local industry showed signs of development. "Nearly 5000 workers were absorbed by this industry" the memorandum adds. "But unfortunately, this restriction was removed, causing hardship and unemployment to those engaged in the trade."
