RAGHURAMIAH Kotha, M.A. LL.B., Bar-at-Law M.P.,—Called to the Bar from the Middle Temple, London in 1937; Practised in Madras High Court from 1937 to 1941; In 1941 entered service of the Madras Government as District Munsiff and as Assistant Secretary to Government in Legal Department; In 1946 as Assistant Director of Employment and as Publicity Officer in the Regional Directorate of Resettlement and Employment, Government of India at Madras and later as Assistant Solicitor in the Central Ministry of Law; In 1947 as Deputy Secretary, Joint Secretary and for a while as Secretary in the Legal Department, Government of Madras; Resigned from Government service in August 1951 and elected to the House of the People; Member, Railway Corruption Enquiry Committee; Associated member, Madras Delimitation Commission; Member of the Indian Central Tobacco Committee representing tobacco consumers since May 1953 being elected by the House of the People.
