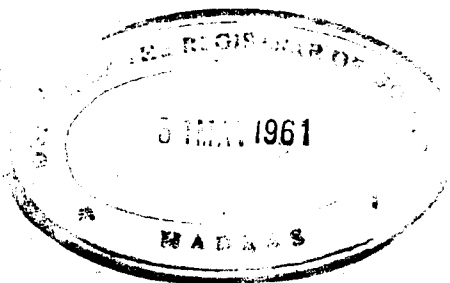

EDITORIAL

*The South India Teachers' Union's
51st State Educational Conference*

The Conference will be held at Tiruchirapalli under the auspices of the Tiruchirapalli District Teachers' Guild from Thursday, the 11th of May 1961 to Saturday, the 13th of May 1961.

Sri K. Kuruvilla Jacob, M.A. (Leeds), Headmaster, Madras Christian College High School, has kindly consented to inaugurate the Conference and Sri T. P. Srinivasavaradan, B.A., L.T., M.L.C. will preside over the Conference.

The General Body meeting and the election of office-bearers will be held on the second day of the Conference itself this year.

Sectional Conferences as per the programme published elsewhere in this journal will deal with the professional side and the academic side of each category of Teachers. The General session is to deal with all professional problems including the fixation of salaries on the revised scales.

The conference is expected to be attended by at least one thousand delegates, besides visitors.

Boarding and lodging arrangements are made by the Reception Committee office, National College High School, Tiruchirapalli-2.

Resolutions of great importance come up before the conference and the discussions are to begin even on the first day of the conference.

Those who wish to take part in the sectional conferences are requested to give prior intimation to the Conveners noted in the programme published in this journal.

As the number of delegates attending the conference may exceed the usual estimate, information to the Reception Committee beforehand as to the requirements with regard to boarding and lodging is highly necessary.

The Budget

The Budget has caused great disappointment to Teachers who eagerly expected provision in the Budget for payment of House-rent allowance, extension of medical concessions and grant of temporary increase of Rs. 10 to Teacher-pensioners. Teachers met at an extraordinary conference at Tanjore in December 1960 only to impress on the Government the need to provide in the Budget for these allowances and concessions. House-rent and medical concessions solve to a certain extent the problems of sanitation and health which are common to all Teachers and it is beyond one's comprehension how Teachers in aided institutions alone stand on a better footing than Teachers under the other agencies to get these problems solved without Governmental help.

As, by the very nature of the allowance, House-rent is limited to Teachers residing in cities, towns, municipalities, R.D.O. Headquarters and

Taluk towns, and, as the amount of allowance bears relation to the area in which Teachers are resident, about six lakhs of rupees a year will do for payment of this allowance.

We are sure Government will sympathetically consider the oft-repeated request of the Teachers for the above allowances and concessions.

Fixation

Fixation of salaries of Teachers on the revised scales has not been done in many cases, though ten months have passed since 1-6-1960, the date of effect. We request the Government to call for fortnightly reports of progress with regard to the implementation of the new scales, as was done in the case of Government employees. Orders that fixation should be based on the salaries noted in the service registers of Teachers as on the 31st of May '60 in all cases (elementary and secondary school teachers) and that weightage should be based on the total service of a Teacher as per his service register will clear all doubts which those responsible for fixing the revised pay have and will expedite payment with arrears at least before 31st May 1961.

All that Teachers want

Teachers desire to submit to the Government that they are national servants doing national work and entitled to benefits direct from the Government. It is a matter of accident that they serve under different agencies. They are all engaged in the same task of moulding the future generation, teaching the same books and working under the control of the same Education department, after undergoing the same general and professional courses prescribed by the Government. It is but right they should be paid the same scales of salaries and allowances.

If this principle of equal pay, allowances and concessions for equal qualifications irrespective of agencies is recognized and given effect to, it will create the way for peace of mind in the Teacher to give his undivided attention to the great and noble task of moulding the future citizens with full physical, mental and moral equipment to enable them to bear the burden of freedom and raise the Nation to its full stature of glory.

Disparities

The Teachers' claim for parity may seem sound in the light of the removal of disparity recommended by the Pay Commission and accepted by the Government with regard to the salaries of Teachers of the same qualifications under the different Agencies.

We cannot but mention that there are still disparities in salaries as among Teachers of the same qualifications even under one and the same Agency, as in the case of Secondary Grade Teachers in a Secondary grade post and in a Higher grade post, disparities as among Teachers under different Agencies as Headmasters under Government, Local Board and Aided High Schools, disparities in allowances as House-rent allowance and medical concessions as among Teachers in Aided and other institutions, disparities in the matter of temporary increase in pension as among Teachers retiring from Government and non-Government institutions, disparities in the rate of pension as among Teachers of the B.T. grade and the other grades and disparities in the rules governing security of services among Teachers in Aided and other institutions.

It is the removal of these disparities that Teachers request for.

S. I. T. U. EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING

MEETING OF THE S.I.T.U. EXECUTIVE BOARD ON 7-4-1961

The Board approved the list of delegates to the conference and the programme of the conference.

The Board appointed a committee with Mrs. Saraswathi Srinivasan as Convener to go through the Post-Basic syllabus and the reports received from the District Guilds and submit a report to the Department by the end of April 1961.

The Board placed on record its appreciation of the help rendered by the Tanjore District Teachers' Guild in connection with the Extraordinary conference of the Union at Tanjore in December 1960.

Resolutions on the fixation of salaries of Teachers on the revised scales were then passed (as published elsewhere in this journal).

Sri D. Sebastian, a member of the Working Committee of the Union, and recipient of the State Award for Teachers was felicitated before the conclusion of the meeting.

Resolutions passed on 7th April 1961.

1. This Board views with concern the delay in the implementation of the revised scales in many High Schools and wrong fixation in respect of Teachers in many Elementary Schools and requests the Government to expedite the implementation of the revised scales and order payment at least by 31st May 1961.

2. This Board requests the Government to make it clear to the Managements and the Officers fixing the pay of elementary school teachers, that, for purposes of weightage, the total service of a teacher should be taken into account, irrespective of the different grades of institutions in which the teacher might have served, the different agencies he might have served

under, the different scales of salaries in which he might have been placed, the different revisions that might have taken place with regard to the salary scales on various dates, the different grades in which he might have served, the fact of re-employment after superannuation and the breaks he might have had in his service.

3. This Board regrets that, due to illiberal interpretation of the rules governing weightage, many teachers in the State both in the elementary and High schools have not got their legitimate dues, though nine months have passed since the date of effect of the revised scales and requests the Government to issue orders clarifying the position.

4. This Board regrets that the minimum guaranteed benefit of Rs. 5 has not been taken into consideration in the case of fixation of salaries of elementary school teachers in many places and salaries that were accepted for direct payment have been reduced in fixation in some cases and requests the Government to issue orders to the officers in charge of fixation of pay to take as basis for fixation the salaries as per service registers on 31st May 1960, take into account the increment, if any, due to them on 1st June 1960 and work out the revised scale as per G.O. 710 dated 10th July 1960 and pay the same as grant due to them.

5. This Board requests the Government to make it clear to Local Bodies that Headmasters of incomplete High Schools are eligible for Headmaster's scale of Rs. 225-375 and order payment of such scales.

6. This Board requests the Government to issue orders fixing the revised scales for untrained Graduate Assistants and exempted Pandits whose pay has been fixed by the Department as special cases.

7. This Board requests the Government to issue orders making it clear

that all allowances as allowance for Headmasters of High Schools, duty allowance in the case of elementary schools and the allowance of Rs. Ten drawn by Physical Training Instructors of secondary grade, are payable besides the benefits of revised scales.

8. This Board regrets that the secondary grade teachers' descending rate of increment should still be there in the revised scales and requests the Government to liberalise the same to Rs. 8.

9. This Board requests the Government to fix the pay of Pandits as per their qualifications, irrespective of the classes or periods handled.

10. This Board requests the Government to sanction the Upper Division Clerk's scale to Clerks in Aided Institutions and fix such posts as one for every five hundred of strength.

11. This Board requests the Government to liberalise the scales of salaries of Commercial Instructors and other specialist teachers handling Upper Forms, to Rs. 125-5-175.

Detailed Report of the S. I. T. U. for the year ending 31st March, 1961

The Executive Board of the South India Teachers' Union has great pleasure in presenting the 52nd Annual report. The report pertains to the period 1st April 1960 to 31st March 1961.

Finance : The year under report has been a very successful one. The crisis caused by the deficit of Rs. 2,000 odd which the Executive Board had to face when taking charge in July 1960 was tided over. The Union has been brought to a sound position with regard to finance in a period of nine months. The continuance of the present economic drive with regard to establishment and other office expenses and the collection of arrears of affiliation fees and rent for the Golden Jubilee Building will enable the Executive to begin discharge of the debt of about Rs. 7,000 on the Golden Jubilee Building that has been standing there ever since the construction of that Building in 1957.

A Reserve is now being built to meet the cost of paper and printing in respect of journals during the lean months when the subscriptions for the journals do not generally come forward. It is proposed to build this reserve which stood at Rs. 441.55 on 31-3-1961 to Rs. 1000 very soon. The amount got through the one-rupee appeal forms this Reserve. Such amount as will be got in excess of Rs. 1000 will go to discharge the debts on the Golden Jubilee Building.

Properties : This year, the Executive has begun to maintain an inventory of articles with the Union and revive the catalogue of Books with the Union.

The presentation of a statement of assets and liabilities of the Union is another new feature of the Annual Report.

Journals : Members will be glad to hear that a number of new schools have begun to subscribe to the South Indian Teacher Journal this year.

The *Balar Kalvi*, though not self-supporting, is being continued and the *South Indian Teacher* is able to finance it and support it, under the policy of limited pages for both the journals.

Professional problems are dealt with prominently in the Editorial, with which the contents of both the journals begin. All useful statistics with regard to the Profession and the new schemes of benefits are brought to the light of the Readers then and there. The Editorial brings out the position of the Teacher with regard to the latest Government Orders and this has earned the appreciation of Teachers.

Particulars have been called for through the journals for gathering statistics with regard to the number of secondary grade teachers drawing higher grade salaries and the number of teachers retired before 1-4-1955 without eligibility for pension.

Correspondence : Members must be satisfied with the response to their correspondence with the Union. The policy of replying each individual letter was introduced and letters are being replied to in as short a period as possible. This has resulted in the receipt of 75 letters a month on an average. The number of letters about grievances received during the year is 900.

The registration of grievances of Teachers under various heads is to be begun shortly. This system, when introduced, will prove a ready-reckoner in respect of the number of Teachers affected under each head as termination of service, delay in grant of pension, delay in closure of Provident Fund account and so on.

To be able to meet the postage on the volume of correspondence the system of reply on postcards, as far as possible, has been introduced.

Subscription : The rates of subscription or affiliation fees have not been increased, though salaries have

been revised. The policy of the Union is to get for the teachers and not get from the teachers, unless there be an emergency. This step of not linking subscriptions with salaries is encouraged by the ready response of the teachers to the call of the Union in an emergency.

The 50th State Educational Conference : This conference was held at Madura from 19th to 21st May 1960 under the able presidentship of Dr. A. Chidambaranathan Chettiar, M.L.C.

The inaugural address was delivered by the Hon'ble the Minister for Education, Government of Madras.

The Sabesan Memorial Lecture was delivered by Sri P. Doraikannu Mudaliar, M.A., L.T., Principal, Dr. Alagappa Chettiar Training College, Karaikudi.

Sectional conferences were held as usual, and the General session passed as many as 44 resolutions. Our thanks are due to the Reception Committee under the able guidance of Sri Sundaram Chettiar, the President of the Guild, Sri S. Krishna Iyengar, the Secretary, Sri K. S. Krishnan and the team of teachers that contributed to the great success of the conference.

Vigilance Committee : This Committee which is formed by the Convener elected at the General Body meeting every year has to be given facilities to carry on vigilance work. At present, this work is carried on at Union Headquarters as complaints are received only there. A practical suggestion to have vigilance committee members in each district to help such work at Headquarters is worth consideration.

The Education Week : The inauguration of the week by the S.I.T.U. at Madras was carried out this year also, the second year in succession. Reports of the celebration of the week in many places were received.

The inauguration of the week under the auspices of the S.I.T.U. was done by Sri C. R. Pattabhiraman, M.P., under the presidentship of the Hon'ble the Chief Minister of Madras, at the

Hindu High School, Triplicane, Madras.

The S.I.T.U. Benevolent Fund : A drive to popularise this most useful fund has to be undertaken and the conditions for relief have to be enlarged in scope. The position of this Fund is given in the Accounts.

The S.I.T.U. Profession Trust Fund : The position of accounts under this Fund has been given under the Audited Statement of accounts.

The All India Educational Conference : This conference was held at Kanpur in December, 1960, under the presidentship of the Hon'ble the Education Minister of Madras. The representatives of the Union attended the conference.

The S.I.T.U. Council of Educational Research :

This Council has not sent its accounts for publication along with our accounts. It has sent its report only.

WORK OF THE UNION

At Guild level : The Union works through Guilds functioning at the Headquarters of each district normally. The South Arcot District Teachers' Guild has not been functioning for the last four years and steps to revive this Guild have not borne fruit this year. A tour of the area seems necessary to revive this Guild.

The Nilgiris District Teachers' Guild has been revived this year and members will be glad to hear this.

The Salem District Teachers' Guild is functioning only with regard to Salem Town and its activities have to be spread out at District level. It is hoped the present Secretary will take steps to hold elections and revive the Guild with the help of the new office-bearers.

All the other District Guilds have been functioning well and reports are being received of their regular meetings and conferences.

The Kanyakumari District is yet to get affiliated with us. A regular Guild has to be formed. The Private Secon-

dary School Teachers' Guild that has been functioning there has not responded favourably in this matter, though they once expressed their desire to get affiliated. A tour of this district seems necessary. The State Clerks' Association and the State Commercial Instructors' Association have got themselves affiliated with us. Their representatives are attending our Executive Board meetings on invitation.

The Madura District Teachers' Guild organized the 50th State Educational Conference in May 1960 in a grand manner. The Tiruchirapalli District Teachers' Guild accepted to invite us for the 51st State Educational Conference and have since organized the same (the present conference).

The Madras Teachers' Guild organized a Special Conference recently to create public opinion in favour of the demands, House rent allowance, medical concessions and temporary increase in pensions.

The Tanjore District Teachers' Guild celebrated its Golden Jubilee in a grand manner. The work of the District Guilds has to be intensified by propaganda. The office-bearers of the Union will have to undertake this work in the next few months.

At Executive Level: The Executive Board met 5 times during the year under report, and transacted the following business, besides business of a routine nature :—

The recommendations of the Pay Commission were discussed in detail and a memorandum was submitted to the Government in the light of the discussion.

A decision was taken to improve the finances of the Union by appeal to its members.

The admission of the State Clerks' Association was ratified.

Thirteen resolutions demanding relief in respect of the grievances of Teachers were passed on 8-10-1960 and communicated to the Government.

The Board passed a number of resolutions at its meeting on 7-4-1961 and

gave concrete suggestions to the Government in the matter of expediting the implementation of the revised scales of salaries.

Extraordinary Conference: A special feature of this year's work is the holding of an extraordinary conference. This extraordinary conference was held in December particularly with a view to impress upon the Government the demands of Teachers not met through the recommendations of the Pay Commission and request them to provide for the same in the Budget that was on the anvil. The Tanjore District Teachers' Guild, which practically bore the cost of arrangements for this conference helped to make the conference the great success that it proved to be. Only three main demands, viz., House-rent allowance, medical concessions and temporary increase in pensions were concentrated upon at this conference, besides the fixation of the revised scales.

The Teacher and his lot during the year: The year under report brought in relief to the teachers by way of revised scales of salaries from the 1st of June 1960. The Union, while thanking the Government for such relief afforded to the teachers, feels that the disparities in the matter of allowances and concessions as among teachers of the same qualifications under the different agencies should still persist. The delay in the implementation of the revised scales has caused disappointment in teachers and the illiberal interpretation of the rules with regard to the fixation of the revised scales has added to this disappointment. The Union's request to the Government to clarify the position by orders to the effect that the total service of a teacher irrespective of other considerations should be taken for purposes of weightage and to issue orders to the Departmental Heads in Districts to call for fortnightly reports as to the progress in fixation will, it is hoped, be considered by the Government in expediting the implementation of the revised scales. The Press statement issued on the recommenda-

tions of the Pay Commission, the detailed memorandum submitted to the Government in 1960 and the demands made at the Extraordinary conference at Tanjore in December 1960 have posted the Government with the real position of the teacher in spite of the relief afforded by the revised scales and it is hoped the Government will consider this position and provide further relief to enable the teacher to give his undivided attention to his task of moulding the Nation.

Work ahead: — Professional side: Persistent work is necessary in the coming year in respect of our demands for House-rent allowance, medical concessions and suitable pensions. The anomalies in the fixation of revised scales have got to be set right. Uniform leave rules and security of service in respect of teachers in Aided Institutions have to be secured. The Acts that are expected in respect of Elementary and Secondary Education are expected to provide security of service for teachers in Aided Institutions and the Union has to create public opinion in respect of this longstanding demand of teach-

ers. The age of super-annuation has to be raised to 60 in the case of teachers under all agencies and all disparities in the matter of salaries, allowances, concessions, pension relief, leave rules and security have got to be removed. The future office-bearers, it is hoped, will take suitable steps to achieve these for teachers.

Academic side: There is every possibility of teachers of various categories as Higher grade teachers, Secondary grade teachers, B.T. grade teachers, Tamil Pandits, Sanskrit Pandits, Hindi Pandits and specialist teachers and Headmasters being affected and retrenched to a small extent in some cases and to a large extent in cases like Sanskrit Pandits on account of the re-organized schemes. The Union has to see that no teacher of any grade is affected by any new policy or scheme brought in by the Government. It is hoped the Union office-bearers in the coming year will take note of all the problems enumerated above and prove a strong pillar to support the teachers. May God raise the Union year by year to render fruitful service to teachers and the Nation!

THE S. I. T. U. 51st STATE EDUCATIONAL
CONFERENCE 11th to 13th May, 1961

DRAFT RESOLUTIONS

Felicitations

1. This conference offers its felicitations to Sri N. D. Sundaravadivelu, M.A., L.T., Director of Public Instruction, Madras, for the award of PADMASHRI conferred on him on the last Republic Day.

2. This conference congratulates the four recipients of the National Award and the forty-seven recipients of the State Award for teachers this year.

Salaries and Allowances :

1. This conference regrets that even after the recommendations of the Pay Commission, disparities should exist in the matter of salaries and concessions as among teachers of the same qualifications under the various agencies and requests the Government to remove the disparities.

2. This conference views with grave concern the disappointment caused in teachers by the denial of house rent allowance to a section of teachers (teachers in aided institutions) since 1946 and urges on the Government the need to grant the same, to avoid frustration in teachers. It also resolves to observe on a state level the fourth of July 1961 as *house rent allowance day*.

3. This conference regrets that the medical concessions have all along been denied to teachers in aided institutions and urges on the Government the need to extend the same to this section of teachers.

4. This conference regrets that the temporary increase of Rupees Ten in pension granted to teachers retiring from Government schools is denied to teachers retiring from local Board and aided institutions and urges on the

Government the need for the grant of this increase to teachers retiring from Non-Government institutions.

5. This conference regrets that, in the case of secondary grade teachers, the rate of increment in the second slab should be lower than the rate in the first slab and urges on the Government the need to liberalise that rate to Rs. 8.

6. This conference regrets that the qualification of training for a period of two years has been overlooked in fixing the scales for Secondary Grade teachers and requests the Government to liberalise the scale to Rs. 125—5—175.

7. This conference regrets that the qualifications and the nature of work have not been taken into consideration in fixing the salaries for physical training instructors, Commercial instructors and other specialist teachers handling upper forms and requests the Government to liberalise their scales to Rs. 125—5—175.

8. This conference requests the Government to fix the salaries of language Pandits on the basis of their qualifications irrespective of the number of periods or classes handled.

9. This conference requests the Government to fix the uniform scale of Rs. 300—15—450 for all Headmasters of High Schools irrespective of the strength of the High Schools.

10. This conference urges on the Government the need to fix Rs. 100 as the basic pay of Lower and Higher Grade teachers (the minimum pay prescribed for a white-collared job) and liberalise the rate of increment to at least Rs. 3 in their cases.

*Implementation with weightage**(Revised Scales)*

1. This conference regrets the extraordinary delay of over 11 months in the implementation of the revised scales of salaries for teachers and requests the Government to call for reports of cases of non-Implementation with reasons from each district.

2. This conference requests the Government to issue orders that the total service of a teacher irrespective of any consideration, should, as calculated for the purpose of pension, be taken for the purpose of weightage in fixing the salaries of teachers on the revised scales.

3. This conference requests the Government to give teachers the right of option to enable them to continue in the old scales so long as it is advantageous to them.

4. This conference views with concern the wrong fixation of salaries on the revised scales in the case of teachers in aided elementary schools in the State and urges on the Government the need to issue orders to set right the same.

5. This conference wishes to point out that many Secondary Grade teachers are denied the benefit of the revised scales for reason of their appointment in Higher Grade posts and requests the Government to treat all posts occupied by Secondary grade teachers in Lower Elementary schools as Secondary Grade posts.

6. This conference requests the Government to issue orders making it clear that all allowances and special pay paid to Headmasters and certain categories of teachers and Head Clerks in Institutions are payable besides the benefits of the revised scales.

7. This conference requests the Government to provide for posts of Clerks on the Upper Division Scales in Aided Secondary Schools at the rate of one per every five hundred of strength in such schools.

Dues to Teachers on account of problems that arose on 1-6-1959 :

1. This conference requests the Government to pay teachers in aided elementary schools that opted as non-fee levying from 1-6-1959 salaries as per their service registers and enable them to get the full benefit of the revised scales.

2. This conference urges on the Government the need to pay salaries to aided elementary school teachers who were retrenched on 1-6-1959 and who could not be provided employment by the Government for a period ranging from 1 to 3 months for the period of break in their service.

PENSIONS

This conference requests the Government to grant pension :—

- (a) to B.T. Grade teachers on the formula of 30/120 of the last three years' average salary;
- (b) to all retired living teachers, retired before 1-4-1955;
- (c) to the non-teaching staff in non-Government institutions inclusive of Librarians, Attenders and other permanent menials;

and wishes to submit that Clerks who have to prepare the pension papers of teachers are denied their own pension now.

Provident Fund, Age of Retirement, Leave Rules & Security of Service :

1. This conference requests the Government to liberalise the teachers' Provident Fund Rules to provide for :

- (a) a contribution of 10 Naya Paise in the rupee by a teacher;
- (b) grant of loans for any reasonable cause;
- (c) grant of loans upto 80% of the amount at credit for purchase of plots for or construction of houses.

2. This conference requests the Government to remove the disparities in the age of retirement as among teachers under the various agencies and

fix 60 as the age of retirement for all teachers.

3. This conference urges on the Government the need to prescribe uniform leave rules for teachers in non-Government Secondary Schools and Local Board Elementary Schools to provide for :—

- (a) 15 days' earned leave with full salary per year;
- (b) Medical leave on full salary for one year for the total service of a teacher;
- (c) 15 days casual leave in a year and
- (d) Maternity leave of three months in the case of lady teachers.

4. This conference requests the Government to provide for statutory security of service for teachers and the non-teaching staff in aided institutions through the Secondary Education and the Elementary Education Acts on the anvil.

MISCELLANEOUS

1. This conference wishes to point out to the Government the possibility of retrenchment of teachers of various categories on account of the introduction of the reorganized course of studies and requests the Government to issue orders that no teacher of any grade or category should be retrenched from any school under any agency.

2. This conference requests the Government to prefer Higher Grade teachers failed in the Secondary Grade T.S.L.C. Examination and pre-1947 Higher Grade teachers to raw S.S.L.Cs. in the appointment of teachers to teach English in Elementary Schools.

3. This conference requests the Government to reduce the pupil-Teacher ratio to 20:1 in Elementary Schools and 30:1 in Secondary Schools.

4. This conference requests the Government to appoint committees of

teachers handling the respective classes to go into the syllabus and revise the same suitably, distributing the load and changing the content to suit our national genius.

5. This conference requests the Government to permit language Pandits and B.T. Grade teachers of 10 years' experience to handle the XI Standard, when it comes into existence.

6. This conference requests the Government to treat teachers in Aided Institutions on a par with teachers in Government Institutions in respect of advance payment of and rates of allowances, while being deputed for extra work like elections.

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FROM OUR ASSOCIATIONS

THE MADRAS TEACHERS' GUILD
PROCEEDINGS OF THE SPECIAL
CONFERENCE

A special conference of the Madras Teachers' Guild was held at the Hindu High School, Triplicane, on the 2nd of April, 1961, to create public opinion in favour of the demands of Teachers in respect of House-rent allowance, Medical Concessions and Temporary Increase in Pensions.

Sri P. S. A. Krishnappa, Vice-President, Thiagarayanagar Cultural Association, inaugurated the Conference and Sri G. Krishnamoorthy, M.L.C., presided over the conference.

Sri P. S. A. Krishnappa stated that the demands of the Teachers were very modest and they should be met by the Government in the interest of the Community. He stressed that conditions necessary to enable the Teacher to live a respectable life without worry should be provided by the Government. Teachers in Aided Institutions, he said, should have security of tenure and the conditions of service should not fall short of those in other professions.

Sri G. Krishnamoorthy, M.L.C., in his presidential address referred to the need for the grant of House-rent allowance and medical concessions to Teachers in aided institutions who formed 45 per cent of the total number of Teachers in the State and pointed out that while disparity in the matter of salaries of Teachers of the same qualifications under the different Agencies had been removed, disparity in the matter of allowances and privileges still continued. Already Teachers had been denied House-rent allowance for the past fourteen years and the question of finance cannot arise in these days when Government had come forward to spend thousands of crores of rupees on developmental plans. It was but right that Government should come forward to help the

Aided School Teachers with this allowance, when they had expanded the scope and area and provided for additional funds in the case of Government employees. The speaker pointed out that the temporary increase of Rs. 10 given to all pensioners had been denied to Teacher-pensioners—Teachers retired from Aided and Local Board institutions—and this relief which would cost the Government only five and a half lakhs of rupees a year was nothing for the Government, but a great help to the Teacher-pensioners who in most of the cases were to draw a pension of less than ten rupees a month as pension. That the Nation-builder should be treated in this respect inferior to the inferior servant of the Government was beyond the understanding of the Teachers.

He hoped that with public opinion in favour of these legitimate and overdue demands of Teachers, relief would be forthcoming to Teachers to enable them to concentrate only on academic problems, so vital in these days of developmental plans.

In conclusion, he appealed to the Government to issue orders clarifying the points with regard to weightage in the re-fixation of scales with regard to the total service of a Teacher and to call for fortnightly reports as to the number of Teachers in each District yet to be placed on the revised scales.

After speeches by Teachers of different grades on the anomalies in fixation and the need for House-rent allowance, medical concession and Pensions, the following resolutions were unanimously passed.

With a vote of thanks by Sri K. A. Manavalan, the Secretary, the conference came to a close.

RESOLUTIONS

1. This conference expresses its great disappointment at the denial for the last FOURTEEN YEARS of House

Rent Allowance to a large section of Teachers (Teachers in all Aided Institutions) in spite of repeated representations and urges on the Government the need to grant the same with retrospective effect; it also resolves to request the S.I.T.U. to create, by suitable steps public opinion in the state in favour of the grant of this allowance.

2. This conference urges on the Government the need to extend the benefit of medical concessions to Teachers in Aided Institutions on a par with Teachers in Government and Local Board Institutions.

3. This conference requests the Government to grant a Temporary Increase in pension of Rupees Ten to Teacher-pensioners on a par with Teachers retired from Government Institutions; quarter pension based on the last three years average salary for B.T. grade Teachers pension for all retired living Teachers and pension for the Non-Teaching staff inclusive of Attenders and menials at the same rate.

4. This conference resolves to authorize the President and Secretaries to submit another memorandum to the Government on the fixation of revised Scales, the memorandum to be based on the suggestions made at this conference.

THE TANJORE DISTRICT
TEACHERS' GUILD

The General Body meeting of the Guild was held at 3 p.m., on 17-3-1961 at the C.S.I. High School, Nagapattinam, with Sri J. A. Paul Raj, B.A., L.T., President of the Guild, in the chair.

The Annual Report, the accounts of the Guild from 23-1-1960 to 15-3-1961 and the Audit Report were approved by the General Body.

The following resolutions were passed unanimously:—

(1) The General Body feels that the panel prepared for the election of office-bearers and Members

of the Executive Board on 10-9-1960 is invalid, in as much as the preparation of the panel was not done in accordance with the rules.

(2) The General Body requests the present personnel to continue in office till 31-8-1961 and arrange for the election of the new Executive for the year 1961-62 in time, as per the rules.

The General Body then thanked all those who contributed to the success of the Golden Jubilee celebrations.

Sri N. D. Sundaravadivelu, M.A., L.T., Director of Public Instruction, Madras, was then congratulated for the award of PADMA SHRI conferred on him. The National and State Awardees among Teachers were also congratulated.

VALPARAI PANCHAYAT HIGH
SCHOOL TEACHERS' ASSOCIATION

The Valparai Panchayat High School Teachers' Association entertained Sri N. Mahalingam, B.Sc., A.M.I.E., M.L.A., at a tea party in the High School premises on 12-2-1961 when he visited Valparai after his foreign tour. Sri K. Ramaswamy Mudaliar (Chairman, Anamallais Planters' Association) presided.

Sri Mahalingam, in his reply to the welcome address given by the Association, narrated the experiences of his foreign tour. He said that teachers in foreign countries occupied a high position in society. Educational Institutions in those countries, unlike in India, did a lot of Scientific Research and big industries often referred their technological problems to such institutions for solution.

Sri Mahalingam realized the difficulties of the teachers in the Anamallais area and the many handicaps they had to work under. He promised to move the Government to redress their grievances.

SRI S. NATARAJAN'S SHASHTI- ABDHI PURTHI CELEBRATION

To felicitate Sri S. Natarajan, M.L.C., Vice-President, W.C.O.T.P. and Director of Projects, S.I.T.U. Council of Educational Research, a very pleasant function was got up on the 5th March 1961 at the P.S. High School, Mylapore, Madras. Dr. A. Lakshmanaswamy Mudaliar, Vice-Chancellor, University of Madras, presided.

After prayer, Sri T. P. Srinivasavaradan, M.L.C., welcomed all on behalf of the Committee of Hosts. He enumerated the services rendered by Sri S. Natarajan to the South India Teachers' Union, to Education and to various Teachers' Organisations. He also referred to the able guidance and inspiration the late Prof. Yegnanarayana Iyer and Prof. M. S. Sabhesa Iyer gave to Sri S. Natarajan. He praised the professional integrity, loyalty and courage of conviction of Sri S. Natarajan.

Otherwise we will be letting loose on the public at large thousands of students, who have no future to look forward to, in these days of severe competition."
