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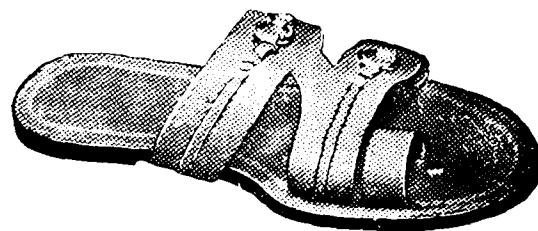

HIGH PRESSURE BOILER PLANT AT TIRUCHI

ANTICIPATED ANNUAL CASTINGS
AND FORGINGS REQUIREMENTS

OPPORTUNITY TO ENTREPRENEURS TO SET UP ANCILLARY UNITS

The High Pressure Boiler Plant that is being set up by Heavy Electricals (India) Limited is intended for the manufacture of high pressure boilers needed for thermal power stations as well as pressure vessels, heat exchangers and high pressure boiler fittings. This plant is being constructed at a place about 7 miles south-east of Tiruchirappalli town, the exact location being about 300 meters south of Tiruchirappalli-Tanjore Road and about 3 kilo metres from Tiruverumbur Railway Station.

2. Tiruchirappalli is well served by railways both on metre gauge and broad gauge. It is also on the National Highway. There is a civilian airport and hence from communication and transport points of view, it is an excellent location for the construction of the plant.

3. This Project, one of the four big industrial units under Heavy Electricals (India) Limited, will have collaboration with Messrs. Technoexport of Czechoslovakia. The machinery that will be purchased for this plant from Czechoslovakia will be procured against credit offered

by Government of Czechoslovakia. About 200 Indian engineers and technicians will be given training in various works in Czechoslovakia for periods varying between 3 and 24 months. The collaborators will further send their experts to this Project for bringing the plant into production and to offer technical assistance to us.

4. A separate broad gauge siding to a length of 11 kilo metres from Golden Rock to the plant is being put down to serve as the main means of transport for the raw materials and finished products. Electric power needed for this plant is proposed to

be drawn from the existing 66 KV lines passing adjacent to the plant. A sub-station to serve the factory has already been constructed. A main pumping station that is being constructed at Vengur on the banks of Cauvery and very near to the Grand Anicut will provide the water supply needed for the plant and the township.

5. The production programme of the plant consists of manufacturing high pressure boilers, packaged boiler units, high pressure boiler fittings, coal handling and ash handling equipment. In the first stage of its construction, it is proposed to manufacture 12 high pressure boilers of an average of 200 tons of steam per hour and 10 packaged boiler units of an average output of 6 tons of steam per hour, along with the valves and fittings needed for the above boiler units. In the second stage of its construction, it is proposed to produce boilers to a total capacity of 5000 tons of steam per hour including high pressure boilers even for the 200 MW turbosets while maintaining the same volume of production of packaged boiler units as in the first stage. Coal and ash handling equipments needed for all the boilers will also be produced at the second stage.

6. In order to build up the large man power that will be required in the way of skilled artisans, an apprentices training centre consisting of a school, workshop and hostels has been sanctioned and the construction is nearing completion. When working in full swing the centre will work in 2 shifts and 800 boys will be under training at any one time. The construction of the plant has commenced and the civil works relating to main production buildings are

expected to be completed by the end of the year 1964.

7. As regards machinery and equipment, every effort has been made to maximise on indigenous supplies and only the irreducible and unavoidable minimum will be imported. Of the imported equipment of machinery, Czechoslovakia will supply goods to the value of about 280 million rupees. These are expected to start arriving at site from the first quarter of 1964 and their erection will be taken up progressively with a view to completing the erection by middle of 1965.

8. The production of boilers will commence from early 1965 and it is hoped to complete the production of the first boiler by 2nd quarter of 1966. Target production of 12 boilers of the first stage may be achieved by the end of 1971.

9. Production of these high pressure boilers requires about 3,300 tons of steel and non-metallic raw materials for each of them. Excluding a quantity of about 800 tons per boiler which will be obtained as sub-deliveries (bought out items) from recognised fabricators and dealers, a total of 2,500 tons of fabricated steel items manufactured in this plant, will be needed for completing each boiler. The Government of Madras is setting up an ancillary Industrial Estate adjacent to this plant so that the bulk requirements of sub deliveries could be supplied by small scale industrialists.

10. To house the large number of essential staff of this project, a colony is being built up complete with medical facilities, shopping centres, schools and other necessary amenities.

Requirements of Castings and Forgings for Boiler Project

Statements of the broad parameters for the castings and forgings that would be purchased by this Project when it comes into full production. The figures have been given classifying the castings and forgings by weight. More detailed information on the type of castings or forgings would become available only when the designs for the boilers have been finalised and so, whoever puts up the foundry or forge shop would have to put up an establishment which will be flexible enough to handle all types of varying orders.

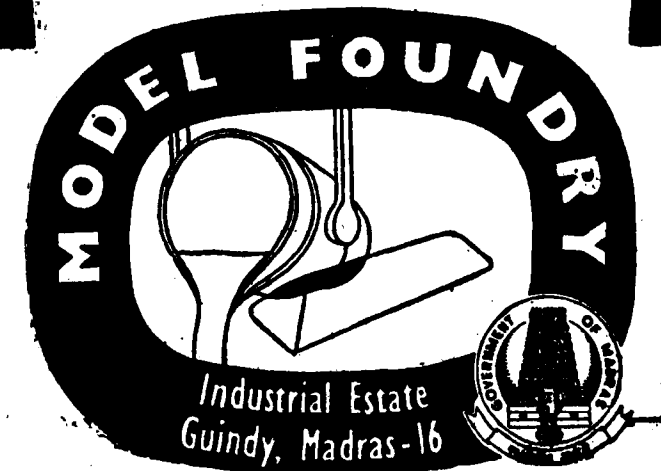
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INDUSTRIAL ESTATE AT AMBATTUR

DESIGNED TO ACCOMMODATE SMALL,
MEDIUM AND LARGE INDUSTRIES

CONSTRUCTION WORK FAST PROGRESSING

INTRODUCTION

During the Second Five-Year Plan Period, the programme of setting up a dozen Industrial Estates all over the State was taken on hand and the response from the entrepreneurs in the small-scale industries sector has been so encouraging that the Government have decided to set up 12 more Industrial Estates during the Third Plan Period. The ground work done in the various sectors of economy during the first two Plans has resulted in a considerable increase in the pace of industrial activity in and around Madras City and owing to the special advantages the city enjoys from the point of view of transport, availability of technical skills and other conveniences, industrialists from all over India are attracted towards this city. While the Industrial Estates have so far been catering to the needs of the small-scale industries, there has been no particular planned programme to cater to the needs of the medium and large industries. It was also increasingly felt that the juxtaposition of a large number of small industries with a few large and medium industries will result in mutual assistance and in greater productivity. Haphazard growth of industries in a sprawling city like Madras will have tremendous impact on transport problems and other civic amenities. The need for a planned industrial area in the suburbs of Madras which will cater to the small, large and medium industries and which will be a self-contained township in itself providing facilities for residence, recreation, commerce etc. has been felt for quite some time.

Location: The Ambattur Industrial Estate is designed to satisfy this need. An extent of about two square miles of land are being acquired in Ambattur, Patravakkam, Korattur, Mannur, Mogappair and Athipattu villages of Chingleput District at an estimated cost of Rs. 55 to 60 lakhs. The site is situated on both sides of the Madras—Avadi road and is at a distance of about 8 miles from Madras Fort and is about 3 miles from the Kilpauk water works. It has the following compass bearings:

The site is situated in one of the most important industrial belts in the city which contains such large-scale industries as the Integral Coach Factory, T. V. S. Group of Factories, Dunlop Tyre Factory,

Ultramarine Blue, T. I. Cycle Group of Factories, Omega Wires and Cables, Central Heavy Vehicles Factory (Tanks) etc, and has thus an excellent industrial tradition. The Madras—Arkonam broad-guage Railway-line is its northern boundary, while the Madras-Avadi road bisects it into two equal halves. The distance of the site from the Air-port at Meenambakkam and the Harbour are 17 and 11 miles respectively and the distance of the site from the various points of Rail-heads are given below :

with the completion of the proposed 120 feet outer ring road, which will pass through the Industrial Estate, Ambattur, the site will be connected with all the important industrial belts like the ones near Guindy, Ennore and Vandalur. The outer ring road will be connecting the site to all the 3

National Highways connecting Madras to Bangalore, Calcutta and Kanyakumari.

Stages: The scheme of establishing this Industrial Estate is being implemented in two stages. In the first stage, about 630 acres of land on the southern side of the Madras—Avadi road is being acquired and developed. Out of this, about 200 acres of land is being utilised for setting up a Conventional Industrial Estate, intended for the small-scale industries, following the pattern of the Industrial Estate, Guindy. The remaining land on the southern side is being developed and the developed Plots are being allotted to large, medium and small-scale industries.

In the second stage, about 600 acres on the northern side of the Madras—Avadi road will be taken up for development.

Contour and Geology: The lands taken up are at an average height of +40 M.S.L. and the variation in level in the entire extent is only of the order of 8 feet. Apart from removing the field bunds, the site does not require any extensive levelling. The surface soil in this area is dark clay aluvium, while the underlying rocks consist of compact and

stiff clays of gondwana age. The thickness of the sand deposits between the surface and the gondwana clays is generally of the order of 23 feet. The maximum depth of sand in this area is about 35 feet while the minimum is 11 feet. The bearing capacity of the soil in many places exceeds one ton per square foot. The site is not in any seismic belt and is not subject to flooding at any time.

Lay-out: The tentative lay-out prepared for the first phase of this town-ship provides for a conventional Industrial Estate for small-scale industrialists and a number of developed plots varying in size from 1 to 10 acres for being allotted to large, medium and small industries. Space for about a dozen chemical industries and a dozen fruit based and canning industries, labour tenements and such amenities as administrative block, police station, fire station, telephone exchange, first aid post, godowns, garages, banks, post office, canteen, shopping area etc.

and also for a structural engineering workshop and a number of servicing units like tool room, common lease shop etc., is provided.

Factory Units for Small-Scale Industries: Four types of factory units are being built for being allotted to small-scale industries belonging generally to the light engineering type. 70 units are being built of which 10 will be of the type A, while there will be 20 buildings each in types B, C and D. Each building will have, besides space for factory and office, a garage, rest shed for male and female workers, a washing place and the necessary number of W. Cs. for men and women and cycle-stands. Each unit will also have adequate open space. The units are also so designed that a B type unit can be expanded into a A type unit by simply adding 2 more bays of 24×80 and that a D type unit can be converted into a C type unit by a similar procedure. The approximate data relating to the floor area of each unit is given below :

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Each unit will be provided with adequate water supply and will also be served by a good and well-designed under-ground sewerage system. Power supply will be given by the Department upto 75 H.P. per service connection. For connected loads higher than 75 H.P., the occupants will have to get the power supply direct from the Electricity Board, installing their own transformers etc. The factory buildings will have a clearance height of 14 feet and will have north light facility. Six of these units have been completed and allotted already. The remaining units will be completed in the course of the year 1963-64.

Rent: Considering the nature of industries coming up in this area and also the location of the Estate and other criteria, the Government have fixed the subsidised rent at 9 nP. per square foot of covered usable floor area. Based on this rate, the approximate rent for each building in the Industrial Estate, Ambattur will be as given below:

This rent is only a subsidised rent and is liable to be raised gradually to the economic rates of rent in the course of a few years.

Chemical Units: Space is being provided in this Estate for the location of about 12 to 15 chemical units. Attempts are being made to work out common design suitable

for chemical units. There is also a proposal that in respect of chemical units, the necessary amount of land can be provided by the Estate, leaving it to the allottee to construct his own buildings, suitable to his requirements either with his own funds or getting the aid from the State, under the State Aid to Industries Act.

Fruit-based Industries: There is also a proposal to construct about a dozen units for accommodating Industries engaged in fruit preservation and canning operations. Common services like the supply of steam, cold storage, tin can making unit etc. are also likely to be provided for this portion of the Estate. The designs for the fruit preservation industrial units are being prepared now and the construction will be taken up after getting orders of the Government in this regard.

Labour tenements: Space is being provided in the lay-out for the construction of a large number of labour tenements. The construction has not been taken up this year, owing to the National Emergency. It is expected that in the course of a few years, about a 1,000 labour tenements will be provided in this area for being allotted to the labourers employed by the small-scale industries occupying the units in the Industrial Estate.

Transport Facilities: The Estate is within two miles from the Korattur and Ambattur railway stations on the Madras-Arkonam broad-gauge railway-line and there is also a proposal to bring in a broad-gauge railway siding into the Estate. The Estate is connected to the city by well-laid roads and since it is only within 3 miles from Kilpauk water works, the industrialists occupying this Estate are not likely to meet with any special transport problems. The Estate will also have its own bus stand and terminus.

Action is being taken to increase the number of buses connecting the city to the Estate area.

The Madras-Avadi road which forms part of the northern boundary for the area selected for Stage-I will be widened and made into a 100 feet road. Besides this, the Developed Plot area will have 20,290 feet black topped road of 5 types of width viz., 50 feet, 60 feet, 80 feet, 100 feet and 120 feet to cater to the internal and external transport circulation needs of the area. The Small Industrial Estate portion also will have its own complement of 100 feet and 60 feet roads. The north-south 120 feet road passing through the Estate will form part of the greater Madras outer ring road which will connect all the National Highway roads to the site. The East-West 120 feet road will in the course of a few years be extended to the city limits, thus making the site more easily accessible from places like Aminjikarai, the roads within the Estate area are likely to be completed before March, 1964.

Power Supply: The Madras Electricity Board has agreed to provide power supply to the industries located in this area. 11 KV, 33 KV, 110 KV and 230 KV power lines pass through the Estate site and a sub-station situated at korattur is within a distance of one mile. There is also a proposal to set up a separate sub-station to cater to the needs of the Estate. The occupants of the Developed Plots will obtain power directly from the Electricity Board, while the occupants of the units intended for small-scale industries will be given power upto 75 H.P. per service connection through the Department of Industries and Commerce.

Developed Plots: In respect of the Developed Plots intended for small, medium and large industries, the land will

be assigned to the industrialists conditionally after collecting the cost of the land and the cost of development. The allottee will have to put up his own structure for the factory. The cost of the Developed Plot, after taking into account the cost of development has been fixed at Rs 16,000 per acre. This amount is payable in three instalments. The first instalment not less than one-half of the total amount is payable within 15 days from the date of allotment. The second instalment representing not less than 25% of the amount is payable within two years from the date of taking possession of the plot. The remaining amount is payable within a year from the date on which the second instalment falls due. No interest is charged on the outstanding amounts. The right of the parties to mortgage the plot is not in any way abridged. The parties will have to execute an agreement in favour of the Government of Madras. The Developed plots are provided with facilities like roads, street-lighting, drainage and sewage facilities, storm water drainage etc. Water will be supplied to them at a fixed tariff.

Water Supply: It has been estimated that the requirements of water for the Estate will be of the order of 3 million gallons/daily. Out of this, about 1 million gallons per day will be obtained from the underground water source within the Estate and it is proposed to obtain the remaining 2 million gallons per day of water from the Red Hill lake. The Government have acquired the ayacut of the Red Hill lake, thus making about 7 to 9 million gallons of water per day available for industrial purposes. Out of this, two million gallons per day required for the Estate will be obtained. The work relating to this will soon be taken on hand.

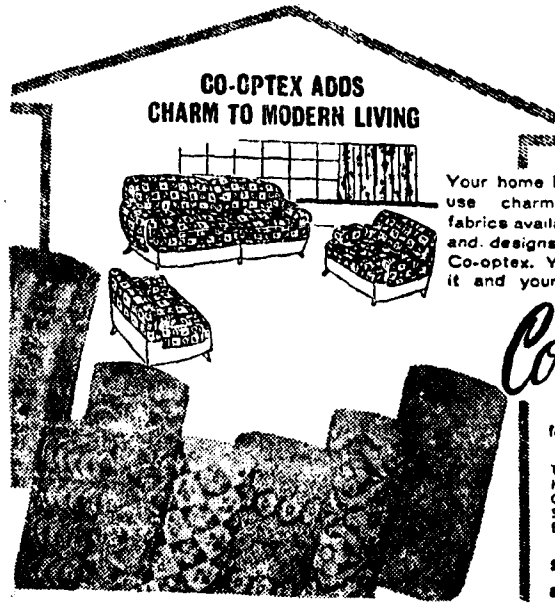
Other Facilities: There will also be an Industrial Training Institute within the premises of the Estate. It will train artisans in various trades. Petrol bunks and bulk depots supplying various lubricants required for the industries are also being provided in this Estate. A well equipped structural workshop is being located in the Estate and it will be able to handle a variety of engineering job work. The State Bank will shortly be opening a branch inside the Estate.

Residential Facilities: Out of the extent acquired for the Industrial Estate at Ambattur, a portion will be handed over to the Madras State Housing Board for the purpose of constructing houses. The Housing Board itself is acquiring about 200 acres of land in Korattur village for housing. The Housing Board will be putting up a

variety of houses which will be suitable for the managerial and the middle income groups. A large number of labour tenements are also to be constructed in this area and the industrialists occupying developed plots and the small-scale industrial units are likely to get preference in the matter of allotment. By this procedure, it is envisaged that all the workers of this industrial area will be able to find residence here itself, thus obviating the need for elaborate transport arrangements.

The form of application for the Developed Plots and the form of application for the small-scale industrial units can be had from the Office of the Administrative Officer, Ambattur Industrial Estate, Office of the Director of Industries & Commerce, Chepauk, Madras-5. 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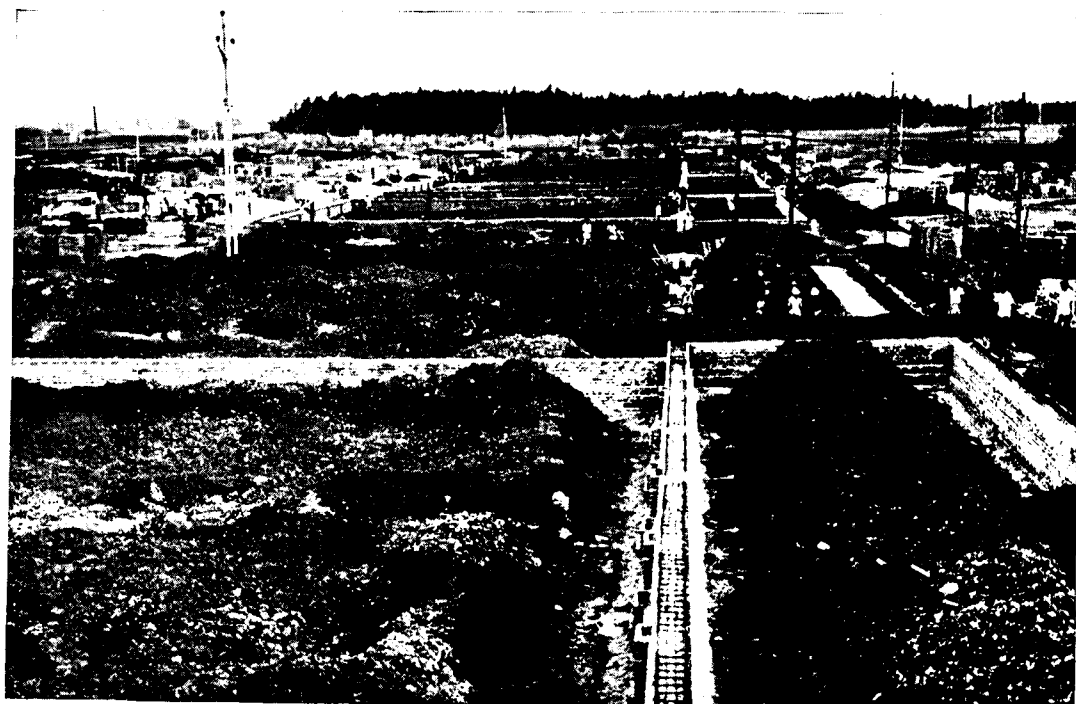

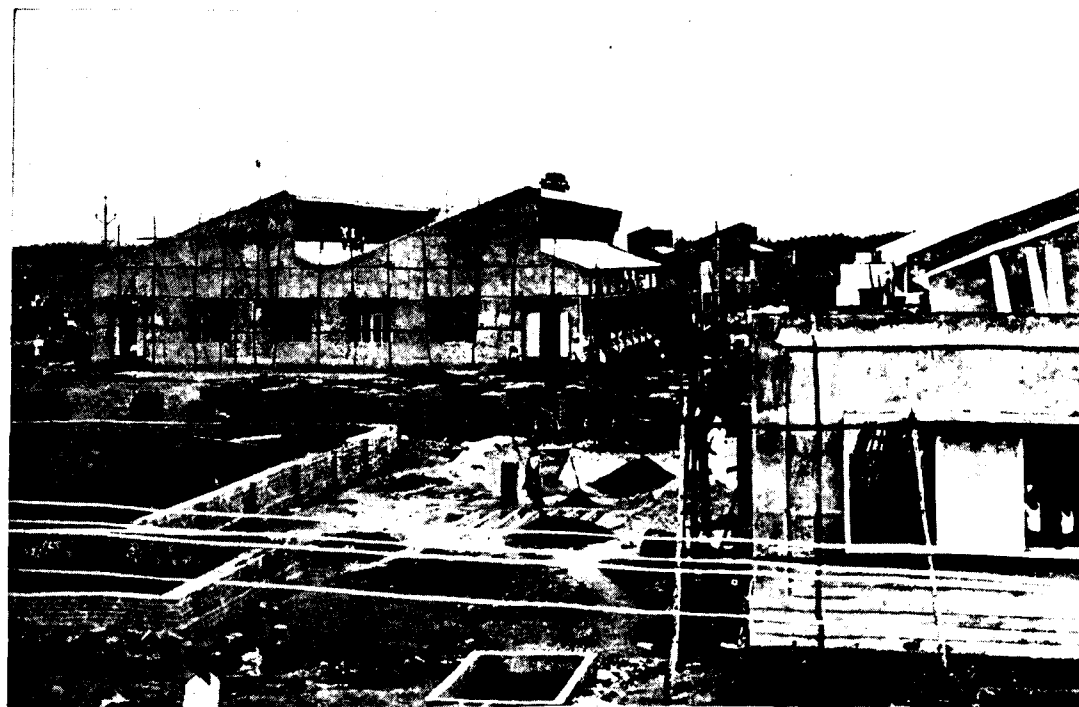


A factory building at the Estate.

Service Facilities to Ceramic Industry

ROLE OF GOVERNMENT CERAMIC CENTRE AT VRIDHACHALAM

The Government of Madras have established a Ceramic Training Centre with a Commercial Section at Vridhachalam. The purpose of establishing the Centre is to impart training to artisans in the manufacture of ceramic products, and to produce several types of ceramic wares. The Centre started functioning in the middle of 1959—'60.

Production : The Centre annually produces about 300 tonnes of finished goods such as sanitarywares, insulation etc., The main items of production at present are water closets-Indian and European types-urinals, wash basins, laboratory and kitchen sinks etc., besides L. T. shackles insulations. During Third Five Year Plan Period the Government have sanctioned a scheme for the expansion of the Centre, by which the production would be increased from 300 tonnes to 900 tonnes per annum. To cope up with the increased production, a continuous tunnel kiln at a cost of Rs. 7 lakhs will also be erected. The production of coloured sanitarywares has also been taken up in this Centre now.

Facilities are available in the laboratory attached to the Training Section to test the various ceramic raw materials such as quartz, felspar, ball clay, China clay etc.

The Factory employs at present 300 workers and the strength is likely to be increased to more than 500 when the expansion scheme is fully implemented.

Training of Artisans : The Training Section attached to the Centre imparts training for 10 supervisory students and 15 artisan students.

The first batch of 10 students were trained in 1961-'62 and the second batch is being trained now and the third batch will be admitted shortly. 15 artisan trainees are also undergoing training now.

Service Facilities : In addition to the production and imparting training, the unit is also extending service facilities to the private factories engaged in the manufacture of ceramic articles. Supply of raw materials, processed and semi-processed materials and facilities for taking their articles in the factory furnace etc., are some of the main features of the servicing facilities offered to private units.

The facilities available at the Centre may be availed of by the small industrialists engaged in the production of ceramic wares and those who desirous of setting up new factories utilising the resources of the local raw materials for the production of standard and quality products.

GYPSUM DEPOSITS IN TIRUCHI DISTRICT

GOVERNMENT POLICY OF LAND LEASE

With a view to making the best use of the available gypsum deposits in Trichy District for the cement industries in the State and gypsum based chemical industries, it is proposed to make an assessment of the availability of this mineral in this district. As this assessment is likely to take some time, the Government have decided not to consider applications from private parties

for the grant of mineral concession for gypsum in Tiruchirapalli District temporarily upto 1st January 1964. Applications for the grant of mineral concessions from licensed industries which require gypsum for their own consumption and which have not secured adequate gypsum lands on lease to provide these requirements will however be considered on merits. ★

QUALITY OF FOUNDRY PRODUCTS

HINTS FROM S. I. S. I.

Methods of improving the quality of foundry products have been suggested to a foundry unit at Karukkampalayam in the Coimbatore District, by the Government of India Extension Centre for foundry at Coimbatore, during the month of April. ★

The Centre has advised that the rusting of iron boxes manufactured by the unit can be reduced by adopting improved melting methods, in suitable sands, changing the compositions of metal by adding the required adhesives to increase the fluidity of the metal, and by modernising the method of melting.

AGMARK GRADING OF WALNUTS

COMPULSORY PRE-SHIPMENT INSPECTION

The Government of India have decided that walnuts exported from India will have to be compulsorily graded under Agmark from August, 1963.

that quality control and pre-shipment inspection of walnuts are essential for stabilizing and promoting the export trade.

It has been felt in recent years by the trade as well as the Government

Walnuts worth about rupees one crore thirty lakh are exported every year from India

to the United Kingdom, Canada, U. S. A., Australia, etc. Both shelled and unshelled nuts are exported.

The main walnut growing areas are Jammu and Kashmir, the Kulu Valley, Himachal Pradesh and the Hill districts of Uttar Pradesh. But, at present, exportable

qualities of the nuts are available only from Jammu and Kashmir. Jammu and Delhi are the main packing centres, and Bombay is the main port of shipment.

The grading office will have its headquarters at Jammu. The necessary staff is already in position. ★

JOB ANALYSIS TO KNOW TECHNICAL NEEDS

STEPS FOR TRAINING MORE PERSONNEL

Diploma-holders can replace science graduates in several positions without affecting efficiency or output, according to a job analysis conducted at the instance of Home Ministry's Manpower Directorate.

The analysis was ordered when several Ministries put in their future demands for technical personnel. It was felt that probably some jobs did not require science graduates and could be effectively handled by persons with lesser qualifications.

Consequently, the requirements of different Ministries are being scrutinised so as to reduce the heavy demands for science graduates.

TECHNICAL MANPOWER COMMITTEE

Meanwhile, the Technical Manpower Committee under the Chairmanship of Prof. Thacker has reviewed the existing plans and programmes for training of technical personnel. Several steps for the augmentation of existing programmes and for

accelerated training courses have been initiated.

For craftsmen and related categories, an accelerated course of six months' duration has been introduced. The first course has started from the beginning of February in all States.

Similarly, from the beginning of February, the training of wireless operators has been started through a three-month course. A six-month course for training of radio mechanics was also started throughout the Country.

The States have also organised a two-month training course for vehicle drivers.

As regards degree and diploma courses in engineering, the training of students now studying in the third and fourth years, of the five-year degree course has been accelerated by reducing the holidays and vacations and working extra time. A two-year diploma course is being introduced in selected polytechnics. ★

ARMS FACTORY FOR MADRAS STATE

A major industry for the production of weapons to equip the Armed Forces of India will soon be established in Madras State. The State Government are taking necessary steps to make available 2,000 acres

of land near Tiruchirapalli where the factory will be erected. The cost of the project, which will be executed by the Defence Ministry, is estimated at Rs. 8 Crores. ★

NEW INSULATED CABLE FACTORY AT AMBATTUR

The foundation stone for the Rs. 3 Crores Omega Insulated Cable Company at Ambattur near Madras was laid by Sri K. Kamaraj, Chief Minister of Madras, on 15-5-'63. The factory, started with Canadian technical collaboration for the manufacture of insulated cables, is expected to go into production early next year. ★

MECHANISED BRICK PLANT TO BE SET UP NEAR POONAMALLEE

The Government of Madras have decided to set up a mechanised brick plant at Thirumazhisai, near Poonamallee at an estimated cost of Rs. 35 lakhs. The plant which will have a production capacity of 66,000 bricks a day is expected to go into production some time next year. A suitable site for locating the plant is being acquired and machinery is proposed to be obtained from Yugoslavia. ★

FIRE CLAY REFRACTORIES FACTORY PROPOSED AT VRIDHACHALAM

The State Government sanctioned a scheme for the manufacture of fire clay refractories at Vridhachalam at a cost of Rs. 22 lakhs. With a production capacity of 12,500 tons per annum, the factory when it goes into production will supply refractories required for the proposed Salem Steel Plant. Machinery will be acquire from West Germany. ★

SALT GLAZED PIPE FACTORY: PLANT SET UP AT VRIDHACHALAM

A salt glazed pipe factory is also being established at Vridhachalam at an estimated cost of Rs. 10 lakhs. The machinery for the factory had already arrived from Germany and is being erected. The factory, with a capacity of 6,000 tons per year, is expected to go into production during the current year.

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NEWS REVIEW

JUNIOR TECHNICAL SCHOOLS

A GOOD OPPORTUNITY FOR STUDENTS OF VIII STANDARD

The Government of Madras has so far started Junior Technical Schools in the Public Sector in Madras, Coimbatore, Vellore, Nagercoil and Tiruchirapalli. The managements of private polytechnics at Pollachi, Trichy and Talayuthu have also established similar schools. These technical schools are functioning as allied institutions to the respective polytechnics. The minimum qualifications for admission to these schools are "a pass in the integrated VIIIth standard under the re-organised secondary education, which was in vogue till 1962-'63 i.e. all candidates who are eligible for admission to the IXth standard of the new 11 year integrated secondary course, which is being introduced from 1963-'64, will be considered for admission to the first year class in these schools".

The Technical Schools are different from the Industrial Training Institutes. The of-study in the Junior Technical School covers a period of 3 years. During this period, the students will be given training in English, Tamil, Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry, History and Geography, Gen. Engineering, Drawing, Workshops etc., The boys will also be given practical training in the different branches of workshops, such as carpentry, smithy, foundry, fitting, welding, sheet-metal work, machine-shop etc., for about 12 hours per week in the second year. In the final year, the student will be given option to specialise in a particular trade of his choice, and the duration

of practical training in that year will be 20 hours per week.

The standard of training given in English and Tamil and in the other subjects (Mathematics Physics, Chemistry etc.,) is equal to the High School standard while in the case of workshop training the standard is more or less equal to that of Industrial Training Institutes, so much so, the students who complete the Junior Technical School course will be comparatively better equipped than those who complete the usual High School course and who seek admission to Polytechnics.

The special feature of the scheme is that students of Junior Technical School will get a good grounding in all the different sections of workshops and they will also specialise in any trade of their choice. Consequently, the students who undergo the Junior Technical School Course will be particularly suited to take up in due course the responsible posts of chargemen and supervisors in industries. Further, after they complete their course of study in the Junior Technical Schools, they can if they so desire, join the Polytechnics, and qualify themselves for a Diploma. Boys passing out of the Junior Technical Schools will be given preference in future for admission to the first year of the three year Diploma Course in Polytechnics in the State. Therefore, all boys who intend joining industries either as apprentices or in other capacities will do well to avail themselves of the

special facilities for technical training and who successfully undergo, the course of training in the Junior Technical Schools will be sufficiently equipped to enable them to be employed in industries straightaway in suitable capacities, provided in these Junior Technical Schools.

In view of their intensive practical training in the institution they can further improve their skill in the trade in which they have specialised. When they are thus employed in any industry they can also attend part-time courses conducted in the polytechnics and qualify themselves for a diploma which will enable them to rise up

NEW INDUSTRIAL TRAINING INSTITUTES

Government have sanctioned the opening of two new Industrial Training Institutes, one each in North Arcot and South Arcot Districts at Tiruvannamalai and Ulundurpet respectively. These will be started from the next session in the Industrial Training Institute Viz., 1st August '63. The following are the salient features of the two Industrial Training Institutes.

In the Industrial Training Institute at Tiruvannamalai, training for electrician, fitter, machinist, motor mechanic, turner and welder will be taught. In the Industrial Training Institute at Ulundurpet, training for fitter, wireman, motor mechanic,

to higher positions in the Industrial Organisations in which they are employed.

No tuition fees are charged in the case of students joining the Junior Technical School. 50% of the students admitted, are also given stipends. It is therefore hoped that the parents who would like to have their children take up skilled jobs in industries in our country will take advantage of this opportunity and, have their children admitted in the Junior Technical Schools soon after they complete their higher elementary school course so that they will be assured of a well-planned and useful career in the industrial field. ★

sheet metal works, turner and welder will be taught. Training is free and no tuition fees are charged.

Except for electrician trade for which an applicant must have passed S.S.L.C., for all the other trades applicants should have studied IVth Form. Age should be between 16 and 25.

Stipends to 1/3 of the trainees in each Industrial Training Institute at the rate of Rs. 25 per month will be awarded to deserving trainees.

The number of seats available for training as on 30-6-62 in these institutes is 4,098. ★

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LOAN ASSISTANCE TO GOLDSMITHS TO SET UP

PETTY TRADES AND ALTERNATIVE AVOCATIONS

The Madras Government have formulated a scheme to be administered by the Director of Industries and Commerce for relieving the distress of the goldsmiths and their families who have been affected by the Gold Control Order and the Rules thereunder. This scheme is to grant loans to affected goldsmiths to enable them to set up petty trades and settle them down in alternative avocation in life. Under the scheme a single member of the affected goldsmith family can get as loan a sum not exceeding Rs. 1,000 (Rupees one thousand only) to set up any petty trade detailed below:—

1. Bakery and biscuit manufacture.
2. Dairy products trade.
3. Setting up egg stall.
4. Setting up fruit stall.
5. Setting up grocery shop.
6. Manufacture of aluminium vessels.
7. Setting up betel-nut and aerated water stall.
8. Manufacture of betel-nut and chewing tobacco.
9. Setting up tea shop.
10. Setting up oilman stores.
11. Setting up button manufacture (horn, plastic, nylon).

12. Setting up bangles shop.
13. Setting up cycle repair and hiring shop.
14. Cane articles manufacture and sale.
15. Electrical goods trade.
16. Fountain pens-repairing and selling.
17. Glass and ceramic wares trade.
18. Hardwares trade.
19. Plastic fancy goods trade.
20. Setting up ready made garments and tailoring shops.
21. Setting up stationery shops.
22. Scented materials manufacture and trade.
23. Setting up snuff shops.
24. Setting up kerosene shops.
25. Setting up vegetable shops.

Authority competent to sanction the loan: The Assistant Directors of Industries and Commerce of the Districts concerned will be competent authorities to sanction and recover the loans authorised in the scheme.

Conditions to be satisfied for the sanction of loan: Applicants for loan under the scheme should have been residents of this State for a period of at least two years as on 1st January '63. Only one member in the

family of a displaced goldsmith's family is eligible for the loan. Families of goldsmiths which have availed themselves of the loan assistance upto Rs. 2,000 to goldsmiths under the State Aid to Industries Act in relaxation of the existing standards will not be eligible for loans under this scheme. The loan will be disbursed in two equal instalments spread over a period of six months and will bear interest at the rate of 3% per annum. The first instalment will be disbursed immediately after the loan is sanctioned and the second instalment will be disbursed by the competent authority on his satisfying himself that the first instalment has been utilised for the purpose for which the loan was sanctioned. The entire loan is recoverable in twelve quarterly instalments commencing six months after the date of disbursement of the second instalment of the loan. The Assistant

Directors of Industries and Commerce in the districts will sanction the loan on the personal security to be furnished by the applicant to the satisfaction of the Assistant Directors and after obtaining a bond from the applicant in the prescribed form. This bond is free from stamp duty and registration. The Assistant Directors of Industries and Commerce have full powers to sanction the loan under the scheme within the financial limit prescribed in the scheme. The decision of the Assistant Directors are subject to revision by the Director of Industries and Commerce.

Further details about the scheme can be had from the Assistant Directors of Industries and Commerce concerned in the Districts.

This scheme is outside the purview of the State Aid to Industries Act. ★

and some of the Units of the Estate including Hindustan Teleprinters Factory.

The Vice-President was presented with a glass model of a ship made at the Government Glass Training Centre of the Industrial Estate.

At the conclusion of his visit the Vice-President recorded his impressions in the Visitors' book—"I wish there were many more Centres like this in the Country. I am very happy to see the progress made"

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DEVELOPMENTS ABROAD

**SPECIAL FITTINGS AND MACHINERY FOR
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The big number of newly-built plants in the paper and staple-fibre industries have led to a brisk demand for special fittings and machinery.

A fitting manufacturer in Styria has been turning out such special equipment for 12 years, mainly fabric sliders, three-way sliders and four-way refinder-sliders, all pieces of equipment with a long record of successful experiences. For the requirements of automation the fittings are delivered for electric distant control.

When establishing new paper and cardboard making plants, the treatment of the materials needed must also be carefully planned. Among others, machines are

needed for treating kaolin, alum, glues and dyes, the designing and building of which is also part of the enterprises's production programme.

The increased demand for coated paper and cardboard makes it necessary to have the coating spread on to the paper directly by the machine. Taking into account the requirements of the paper industry, the firm has been designing and manufacturing complete plants for the spreading of the cost of colour or colour paste, according to customer's requirements and wishes.

The equipment turned out by the enterprise has met with the approval of the national industry and is being increasingly exported. ★

NEW OIL AND GAS BURNERS FOR THE CEMENT INDUSTRY

An Austrian enterprise specialising in all types of thermo-technical equipment, has become well-known all over the world with its entirely new oil and gas burners for the cement industry, combined with the highest operational safety of the entire fire equipment, including the oil and gas supply.

According to most recent results of research oil-fire plants for tubular rotary cement kilns have to meet three main demands in order to be economical :—

1. They have to have a burner working according to the two-stream principle, with

the possibility to regulate with the highest precision the shape of the flames;

2. The lay-out of the kiln has to be kept very simple by means of a direct feeding of the burner from the oil tank through a ring conduit, over filters, pumps and continuous heaters;

3. An oil heat carrier has to replace the steam or hot water boiler;

The oil burners developed by this Austrian enterprise meet the highest demands of modern technology. Heat consumption figures are particularly low. Values of 760

to 820 kcal/kg clinker are no exception and are reached mainly by the low percentage of primary air, about 5% of the entire combustion air. One of the outstanding performances of the plant is the burning of dolomite where, under normal circumstances, temperatures upto 1900° are reached.

The new burner designs have proved moreover that oil firing presents no disadvantages, compared with coal-dust firing. Quite on the contrary, oil firing boosts considerably the nominal output of the kiln.

The Austrian enterprise has moreover developed oil/natural gas burners, natural gas burners with oil carburization and burners for natural gas only. In this field again the requirements of the cement industry made it necessary to develop a natural gas burner specially designed for tublar rotary cement kilns. The new burners together with the experiences gained in

the field of pressure regulating equipment in the course of the last few years, are the pre-requisites for the construction of most up-to-date natural gas plants with a very high profitability. Natural gas firing meets especially the general trend in the cement industry, i.e. to achieve highest profitability with lowest fuel and energy consumption and the lowest possible number of labour. Among the foreign buyers of oil and gas burners we find mainly the Federal Republic of Germany, Switzerland, Great Britain, France, Spain, the countries of the Near East (mainly Turkey), some overseas countries and some Eastern countries mainly Yugoslavia.

QUICK DRYING METAL PRIMER

A high-quality metallic primer with special quick drying properties has been produced by a British firm of paint and chemical manufacturers. The makers say that the primer dries in one hour and can be recoated in two hours with all normal types of white spirit-solvent-based paints.

The primer, which is claimed to have exceptional qualities of rust inhibition and

resistance to weather and salt water, is formulated on a chlorinated rubber base to a consistency that prevents the heavy metallic lead pigment from settling in the container, thus permitting the product to be easily stirred, even after long storage. Despite the semblance of thick consistency the primer brushes out easily to a film of conventional thickness.

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To help the age-old Brassware Industry at Kumbakonam, the Government of Madras has started a Brassware Servicing Centre to give technical assistance to artisans with modern machinery.



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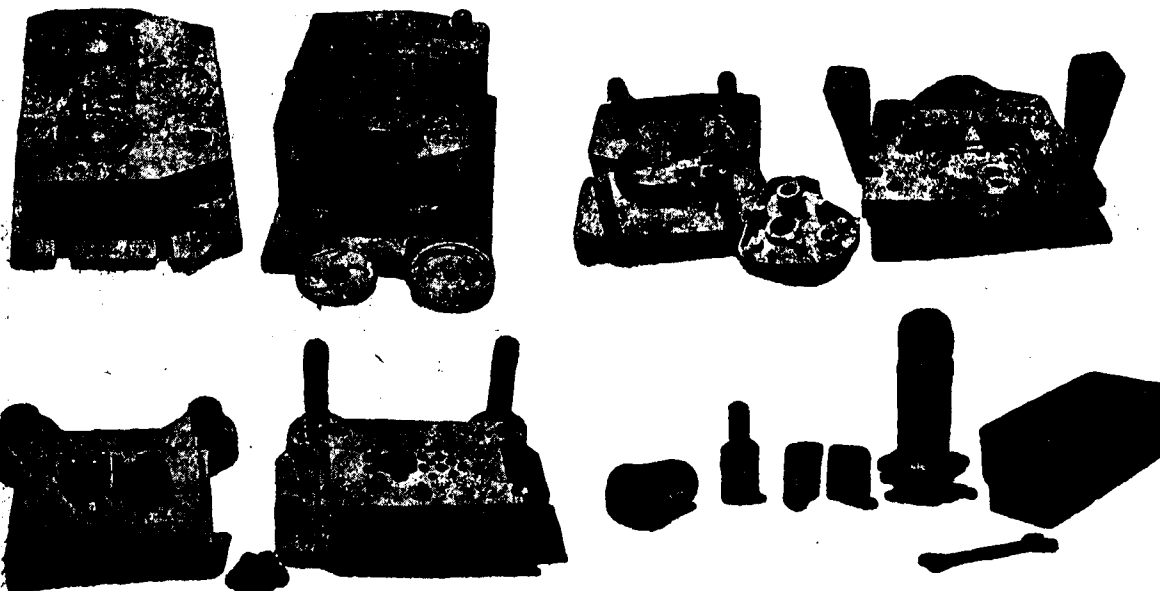
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**MACHINE TOOL RESEARCH PRODUCES
NEW CUTTER DESIGNS**

New types of tools for lathe turning and face milling that not only last longer but cut metal at higher speeds than existing types, it is claimed, have been designed in the Production and Industrial Administration Department of Britain's College of Aeronautics (Cranfield, Bedfordshire). They have been used for machining steels of 120 ton tensile strength that are difficult to cut with ordinary tools.

The basic element of the new tools is a disc of metal, carbide or ceramic which is about the size of a penny but about twice as thick. The surface of the disc is hollowed out by grinding to form a sharp edge. For turning, this disc is attached by a bolt to a thick bar of metal so that the edge of the disc projects beyond the end of the bar

and can be brought up to the metal to be turned. This device allows the metal to be removed from the bar smoothly and quickly with freedom from chatter or vibration.

For face milling, six of these discs are attached in a star formation to projections on the end of a circular tool so that each disc is vertical but out of alignment with the radius of the tool end. With this tool, cutting speeds twice as great as those attainable with ordinary tools can be achieved and again the freedom from vibration gives long tool life even with hard materials.

In both cases, when the tool becomes blunt, a new cutting edge can quickly be obtained by slackening the bolt and turning the wheel to a new position. ★

HIGH GRADE SODIUM CHLORIDE

Very surprisingly the production of high grade sodium chloride required for pharmaceutical and dairy industries should be not merely chemically pure but also bacteriologically pure. Conditions for the production of such high grade quality salt

were standardized, and during the last two years about 50 tons of dairy salt were manufactured in the Central Salt and Marine Research Institute and were supplied to various dairies. The process has not been handed over to the Hindustan Salt Co. Ltd.,

at Sambhar, where the necessary plant has been installed for the manufacture of dairy salt and free flowing table salt. Processes for production of A. R. and B. P. quality sodium chloride have also been standardized. ★

POTASSIUM CHLORIDE FROM MARINE BITTERN

The Central Salt and Marine Chemicals Research Institute, Bhavanagar has evolved three processes for the recovery of potassium chloride from marine bittern. All the three processes have been tried on pilot scale.

The Institute is setting up a plant for the recovery of potassium chloride and magnesium sulphate from marine bitters, at the site of Kandla Salt Works. This unit is expected to start working in the course of the next few months.

The State Trading Corporation is understood to have agreed to finance the setting up of a unit at Tuticorin for the production of potassium chloride, magnesium sulphate and sodium sulphate.

The third process is for the production of light basic magnesium carbonate, sodium sulphate and potassium chloride.

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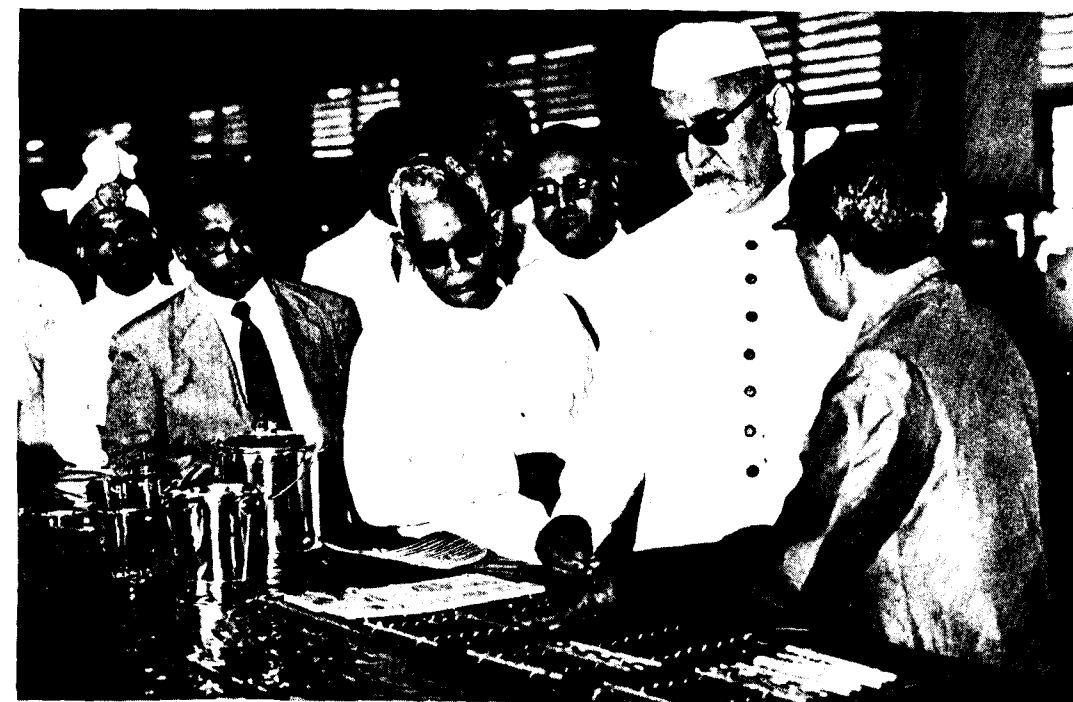

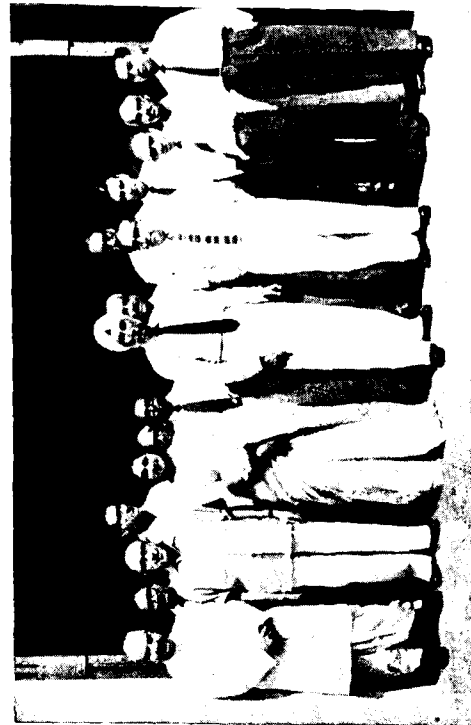

SCHEMES

Manufacture of Epsom Salt

SCHEME FOR 500 KG PER DAY

INTRODUCTION

Epsom Salt is mostly used in tannery and B. P. quality can be used in pharmaceuticals.

Process: Magnesite is dissolved in hot dilute sulphuric acid (40%), filtered to remove calcium sulphate. Traces of iron are removed by boiling the filtrate with little precipitated magnesium carbonate and again filtered. The filtrate on evaporation and cooling yields crystals of $MgSO_4 \cdot 7H_2O$. All the reactions have to be carried in lead lined vessels. Contamination with iron should be avoided.

Raw materials: The chief raw materials used in the process are magnesite, sulphuric acid and a little precipitated magnesium carbonate.

Magnesite is available in fairly large quantities in Salem district. It contains about 96-99% magnesium carbonate.

Sulphuric acid (sp. 1.84) can be had from any chemical firm.

Materials required per day for the production of 500 KG Epsom Salt per day.

Magnesium carbonate (98-99%)	153 Kgs.
Sulphuric acid (40%)	446 „
Precipitated magnesium carbonate	5 „

Some points for consideration:

1. The magnesite should be broken into small pieces of 1"—1/2" size by manual labour.

2. The acid should be added to the magnesite pieces but not the pieces to the acid (in the reaction vessel).

3. The purest available variety of magnesite should be used such that the magnesium carbonate content should be of the order of 97-99%.

Manufacture of Sodium Sulphide

CAPACITY OF PLANT ONE TON PER DAY

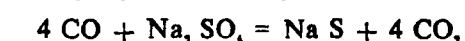
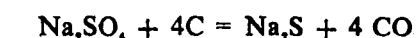
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Sodium sulphide has a wide use prominent among which are the textiles, paper, rayon, leather and other chemical industries. It is widely used as a depilatory in the leather industry. It is sold as solid broken lumps, flakes or in crystal form.

2. The annual demand for this chemical is of the order of 4,000 tons. About 1,000 tons are used by the leather industry, the rest by textile, paper and other chemical industries. There had been shortage of this material during the past few years and sometimes it was sold as high a price as Rs. 1,200 per ton. Considerable quantity is also being imported into the Country.

3. Since there is good prospects and the process of manufacture is simple, it can be made on small industry basis. As estimate for a small unit with a capacity of one ton per day is worked out in this scheme. The main raw materials required are coal and sodium sulphate. Coal is available in plenty. Sodium sulphate can be obtained from the natural deposits of Rajasthan. However, the best sodium sulphate for our purpose is that attained as salt cake by the action of sulphuric acid on salt. Salt cake is also a by-product of rayon, bichromate, hydrochloric and nitric acid plants. Bituminous coal of less than 5% ash content is used. Higher ash content results in lesser yield.

4. *Process of manufacture:* The principle of manufacture depends upon the reduction of sodium sulphate by coal at elevated temperature, the chemical reaction of which can be written as follows:—



The temperature must be over 860°C for the above reaction.

5. Sodium sulphate and coal in the ratio 2:1 are mixed together and well ground. Thorough mixing is necessary; otherwise a part of the coal for reduction simply burns away without helping the process at all. Very frequently a certain quantity of soda upto 50% of the sulphate is added to the mixture which acts both as a flux and as a neutralising agent for any free acid that may be present in the sulphate.

6. The reduction is carried out in a reverberatory furnace at about 1000°C and usually takes 2 to 2½ hours. The furnace usually has a preheating zone of the same size as the main chamber, where the mixture is kept for about an hour before being raked into the furnace. The roof of the furnace is kept low. Fairly thick bed is maintained as it appears that the presence of carbon monoxide in the flue gases increases the efficiency of the process. The furnace is

lined with basic refractory brick wherever the wall comes into contact with sodium sulphide. Below this lining a layer of asbestos paper soaked in sodium silicate is laid:

The substance issuing from the furnace is called "Black Ash". Black ash is transferred directly into cooling bogies. After cooling it is crushed, leached in hot water and dilute liquor from previous batch. The leaching is done several times and the combined extract is well settled at a temperature of about 50°C and the clear liquor is run into shallow pans crystallising tank or vessels containing sets of water cooled tubes. The commercial variety obtained thus are usually yellowish brown but white crystals can be obtained by the addition of 0.5% sodium cyanide to the liquor before crystallisation.

For obtaining concentrated sulphide either the crystals are fused and more water evaporated until the required concentration is obtained or the dilute liquor is directly concentrated in evaporating pans. The

concentration pans are usually made of cast iron and the sodium sulphide is concentrated from 25% to 60% between 115°C to 175°C. Care should be taken that local hot spots are not formed to sulphate precipitated during fusion. By thorough cleaning between each batch and ensuring complete reduction before leaching this difficulty can be very much reduced.

Equipment required:

1. Open hearth furnace; (reverberatory type) for the reduction of sale cake to sodium sulphide.
2. Hammer mill-for coal crushing.
3. Ball mill-for grinding mixture of coal and salt cake.
4. Storage bin-for ground mixture.
5. Cooling bogies-for cooling melt.
6. Jaw crusher-breaking.
7. Agitators.

* The furnace, the evaporation pot and the leaching tanks will have very short life and all equipment handling sodium sulphide will require very frequent maintenance. To provide for these, a very high depreciation and equipment has been assumed.

The present price of sodium sulphide is about Rs. 60 cwt. This is due to extraordinary and abnormal situation arising out of lack of indigenous production and import restrictions. Usually at normal times it is sold at about Rs. 32 cwt. The price for consumer as assumed above is quite realistic for normal times. Based on fairly good working the unit can make a profit of Rs. 12,800 which is about 8% on the total investment apart from providing for interest on total investment of capital.

EXPORT - IMPORT NEWS

EXPORT PROMOTION SCHEME FOR PROCESSED FOODS

(Reproduced from the I.T.C. Circular No.
27/63 dated 5th March 1963).

In order to promote the export of processed foods, the following export promotion scheme has been drawn up.

1. Title, scope and commencement:

1. (1) This scheme shall be known as the Export Promotion Scheme for Processed Foods, and shall cover the export of processed foods mentioned in Annexure I.

1. (2) This scheme shall come into force from the 1st January 1963 and shall apply to exports of products covered by the scheme, made on or after the 1st January 1963.

2. Administering authority:

This scheme shall be administered by the Processed Foods Export Promotion Council, Calcutta, hereinafter referred to as the "Council". For this purpose, the Council shall constitute a committee on which the Deputy Chief Controller (Export Promotion), Calcutta or in his absence, the Controller (Export Promotion), Calcutta shall be a nominee.

3. Registration:

3. (1) Benefits under this Export Promotion Scheme shall be admissible against exports of all the products covered by the Scheme, effected by exporters registered in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

3. (2) Exporters desiring to be registered under the Scheme should apply to the Council for registration under the Scheme in the form in Annexure III.

3. (3) Only exporters of processed foods fulfilling the following qualifications will be considered for registration:—

(i) The Council should be satisfied that the exporter is a manufacturer of standard quality products.

(ii) In case the exporter is not himself the manufacturer, the Council should be satisfied that the exporter has made satisfactory arrangements with the manufacturer(s) of quality products.

(iii) The exporter should undertake to subject his export consignment to such quality control or pre-shipment inspection as may be decided upon by the Council.

(iv) The exporter shall generally agree to abide by the advice and decisions of the Council in matters relating to trading practices, adopting standard contract forms, arbitration etc.

- (v) The exporter should undertake to furnish to the Council monthly figures of exports of goods covered by the Scheme.

3. (4) The Council shall, if satisfied about the qualifications of the applicant, issue a registration certificate in the prescribed form (Annexure IV) with copies to the (i) licensing authority having jurisdiction over the place of business of the exporter; (ii) the Development Council for Food Processing Industries, C/o. Development Wing, Udyog Bhavan, New Delhi; and (iii) the E. P. (Agriculture) Section, Department of International Trade, Ministry of Commerce and Industry, Udyog Bhavan, New Delhi.

4. Import entitlement:

4. (1) The import entitlement against exports of various products under the scheme shall be as specified in Part A and B of Annexure I.

4. (2) The import entitlement as in 4-1 may be utilised for:—

- (a) Import of raw materials as per Annexure II.
- (b) Import of tools, spare-parts, machinery and equipment for replacement or for better finishing, modernising, packing, or for balancing existing machinery and required in the manufacture of processed foods, which are not indigenously available not exceeding 10% of the f.o.b. value of exports within the overall import entitlement specified in Parts A and B of Annexure I.

5. Application for import licence:—

5. (1) Applications for import licence shall normally be made on a quarterly basis in respect of payments received during the preceding quarter. There is, however, no

objection to an exporter claiming the import entitlement immediately after an export, provided the necessary documentation is available.

5. (2) The import applications should be sent to the Council who, after scrutiny, will forward them to the licensing authority concerned, for issue of licence. The Council shall maintain proper registers in respect of individual registered exporters to ensure that import entitlements are not claimed more than once against the same export

6. Further Provisions:

The Provisions of Appendix 23 of the Red Book shall, to the extent not in consistent with any specific provision in this scheme, be applicable to this scheme also. In particular, the following provisions of Appendix 23 should be read as part of this Scheme:

- (a) the provisions regarding entitlements on exports to Afghanistan, Tibet, Nepal and Sikkim;
- (b) the provisions regarding exports to rupee payment countries;
- (c) the provisions regarding documents to be submitted along with the import applications; and
- (d) the provisions regarding advance licensing.

7. Use of import entitlement:

7. (1) Any exporter can use the articles imported against entitlements wholly or partly (a) in the exporter's own factory or factories or (b) can sell wholly or partly to any other factory or factories which are either engaged in export of any of the products covered by this scheme or in selling any of such products for export provided that the Council certifies that such other factory or factories are so engaged.

8. Returns:

The Council shall furnish to the E. P. (Agriculture) Section, Department of International Trade in the Ministry of Commerce and Industry, with a copy of the Development Officer (Food), Development Wing, a

quarterly return, separately in respect of each of the processed food covered by the scheme. The return should be forwarded by the 15th of the month following the end of the quarter and should give the following information:—

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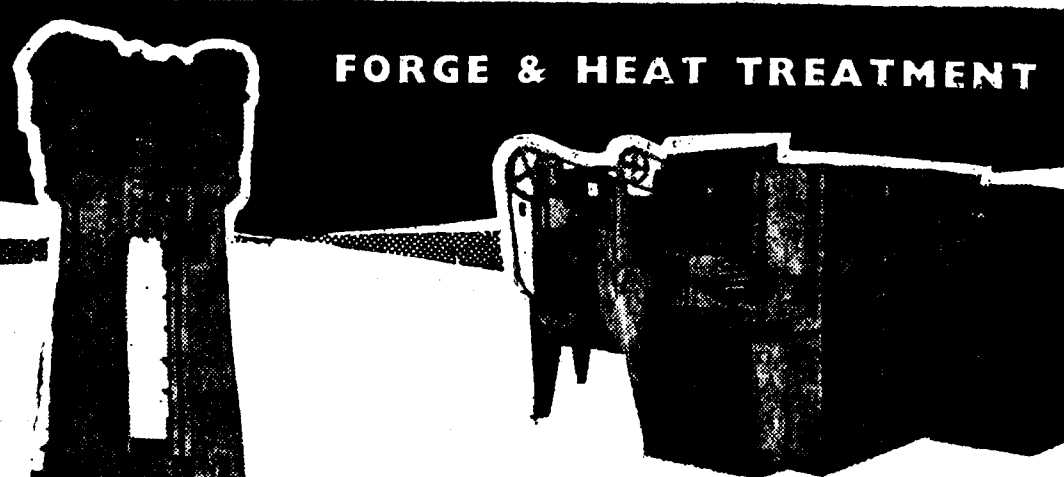
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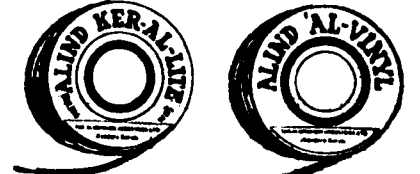

IMPORT OF CONSUMERS' GOODS

BY CONSUMERS' CO-OPERATIVES

New rules have been framed to enable consumers' stores to import consumer articles like milk powder, baby food, certain types of drugs and medicines, books, photographic material and X-ray films. will have membership from 10 to 50. As for the primary stores, it has a minimum membership of 100.

Originally, three conditions were laid down for the consumers' co-operatives to become eligible for the import of consumer goods. A consumer society should have a membership of not less than 100 and minimum annual turnover of Rs. 20,000; secondly, it should have been in operation during the last two co-operative years; and thirdly, licences for import were restricted to fourteen items. In order to save foreign exchange a 50 per cent cut was imposed on licence issued from October 1962 to consumers' co-operatives against their entitlement.

It has now been decided that a society should be eligible to import consumer goods, if recommended by the Registrar of Co-operative Societies of the State concerned and no condition about it having imported the goods in the past is to be imposed.

The requirement that a consumers' store should have a minimum membership of 100 has also been relaxed. Many of the wholesale stores which will act as bulk buyers on behalf of their constituent primary stores

Wherever wholesale stores have been organised, they will be permitted to import on behalf of their affiliated primary stores and retail branches upto the aggregate entitlement of the affiliated units or branches.

For a primary store having less than 1,000 members and a sales turnover of Rs. 50,000 the maximum value of import licences has been fixed at Rs. 5,000 for all items put together and upto Rs. 1,000 for any individual item. As for the apex society or wholesale store, the combined annual sales turnover of the small units working under it will be taken into account for calculating the entitlement provided the number of such units does not exceed 100. The maximum entitlement of a society, however, cannot exceed Rs. 25,000 in the aggregate and Rs. 2,500 for any individual item.

It has also been agreed that the State Trading Corporation should distribute imported consumer goods earmarked for consumers' co-operatives through wholesale societies wherever they are in existence.
