SALARIES

OF

CIVIL SERVANTS IN THE EAST-INDIES.

*Abstract of an Act of Parliament, passed in the Thirty-third Year of the
Reign of his present Majesty. Cap. 52. Sec. 57.*

I. That no office, place, or employment, the salary, perquisites and emoluments, whereof, shall exceed £500. sterling per annum, shall be conferred on any civil servant, who shall not have been actually resident in India, in the Company's service, for the space of three years, in the whole, antecedent to the appointment to such office.

II. That no place or employment, the salary of which shall exceed £1500. sterling per annum, shall be conferred upon any of the said servants, who shall not have been actually resident in India in the civil service, for the space of six years, in the whole, antecedent to the vacancy to be supplied.

III. An office with a salary, &c. of £3000. sterling per annum, is not to be conferred on any servant, who shall not have been nine years in the whole, resident in India, in the Company's service.

IV. No office of £4000. sterling per annum, shall be conferred on any servant, who has not been twelve years, in the whole, resident in India, in the service.

SALARIES OF CIVIL SERVANTS.

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V. No person in future shall be deemed capable of holding, in the civil line of the Company's service, two or more offices, places, or employments, the joint amount of the salaries, perquisites, and emoluments of which shall exceed, in the whole, the sums prescribed by these regulations.

Abstract of an Act passed in the forty-seventh Year of His present Majesty, Sect. 1. Cap. 68. Sec. 7

Whereas the East India Company have lately established a College in England, for the appropriate Education of young men designed for their Civil Service in India, and it will therefore be expedient that, under certain circumstances, the time spent by such young men in the said College, after they shall have attained the age of 17 years, should entitle them to the same privileges as they would have been entitled to if they had been resident such time in India; be it therefore enacted, that, from and immediately after the passing of this Act, all such time, not exceeding two years, as shall be bonâ fide spent in the said College, in the regular course of such Education as aforesaid, by any persons after they shall respectively have attained the age of 17 years, provided they shall bonâ fide spend, either before or after 17 years of age, two years at least in the said College, in the regular course of such Education, and and shall afterwards go to India in the Civil Service of the said Company, shall be accounted as to the offices, places and appointments, which such persons are entitled to be appointed to, and so sold, as so much time actually spent in India.

RESPECTING

Military Officers retiring from the Company's Service.

Every officer after twenty-five years service in India, three years for one furlough being included, is allowed to retire with the pay of the rank to which he has attained; but such pay is to be the same only as that allowed to officers of infantry.

A member of the Medical Board, who has been in that station not less than five years, and not less than twenty years in India, including three years for one furlough, is permitted to retire from the service, and allowed £500 per annum.

A surgeon of a general hospital, who has been in that station not less than five years, and whose period of service has been not less than twenty years, including three years for one furlough, as above, is permitted to retire from the service, and allowed £300 per annum for life.

All other surgeons and assistant surgeons attached to the military, are permitted to retire from the service on the pay of their rank, after having served in India not less than twenty years, including three for one furlough.

A chaplain after eighteen years service, including three years for one furlough, is allowed to retire with the pay of Major.

A chaplain having served ten years in India, whose constitution will not admit of his continuing in the service, may retire on the half pay of major; after seven years on the half pay of captain.

A commissary, or deputy commissary of ordnance, not being a commission officer, is allowed to retire on full pay, if he has served twenty-seven years in India, of which twelve must have been in the ordnance department; twenty-five years, fourteen of which in that department, or twenty-two years, seventeen years of which in the ordnance department.

A conductor of stores is allowed to retire on £60. per annum after twenty-five years actual service in India.

Every lieutenant colonel, major, captain, or captain lieutenant is allowed to retire with the half pay of the rank to which he has attained, in case his health shall not permit him to serve in India.

A lieutenant having served thirteen, or an ensign nine years in India, including three years for a furlough, may retire on the half pay of his rank, in case his health shall not permit him to serve in India.

A lieutenant is permitted to retire on the half pay of ensign, if his constitution should be so impaired as to prevent the possibility of his continuing in India.

Every officer returning on furlough, and wishing to retire from the service, must make a declaration to that effect, within twelve months after his arrival in England; and in case of his neglecting so

to do, he must, at the expiration of his furlough, either return to India, or be held to have relinquished the service, and not be entitled to retire on pay, unless he has continued to serve in India, from his first arrival, for the space of twenty-two years, without having a furlough; in that case he is allowed two years before he shall be called upon to signify his intention of retiring, but he can only be allowed the pay of the rank he held at the expiration of twelve months from his arrival in Europe.

Promotion in consequence of officers retiring in England, takes place from the time when such officers are permitted by the Court to retire.

FURLOUGH.

Officers (of whatever rank) must be ten years in India, before they can be entitled (except in case of certified sickness) to their rotation to be absent on furlough, and the same rule is applicable to assistant military surgeons. The furlough to be granted by the commander in chief at each presidency, with the approbation of the respective governments.

A chaplain after seven years residence in India, is allowed to come home on furlough and receive the pay of major. Should he come home from sickness prior to this period of service he is allowed the pay of captain only.

A conductor of stores is allowed furlough pay, only in case of coming home from sickness.

The period of furlough is three years, reckoning from its date to the day of the return of the officer to his presidency.

No officer on furlough can receive pay for more than two years and a half from the period of his quitting India.

Retirement and Furlough of Officers in the Bombay Marine.

RETIRING.

Every officer of the marine who has served twenty-five years in India, including three years for a furlough is permitted to retire from the service with the following pay.

The commodore per annum..... 2291.

A captain of the first class of vessels, 1501.

A captain of the smaller vessels.... 1351.

A first lieutenant..... 801.

FURLOUGH.

A certain proportion of the marine officers (to be determined by the government with a due regard to the exigencies of the ser-

vice) are allowed to come home on furlough for three years, with the pay only of their rank.

No officer under the rank of captain who has not actually served ten years in the marine, can be permitted to come home on furlough, unless in cases of ill health under the like certificates as required from military officers.

If the commodore is permitted to come home on furlough he is to be allowed the pay of a captain only, half the remainder of his allowance to be drawn by the senior captain in the service, who is to act as commodore during his absence, in addition to the pay of his rank as senior captain.

The regulations for drawing pay on furlough and retirement by the marine officers are, as far as circumstances will admit, the same as those for the military officers as established by the Honorable Court's orders dated the 22d April, 1794.

FOR THE

Admission of Pensioners on the Military Fund.

Every petitioning officer and soldier must produce a certificate from his commanding officer, of his being an invalid, and rendered incapable of further service in India, together with an approbation of such certificate by the governor and council of the presidency where he shall have served.

Every commissioned officer must previously make oath before the governor and council, viz. A colonel that he is not possessed of, or entitled to real and personal property to the value of 4,000l. A lieutenant colonel, 3,000l. A major, 2,500l. A captain, 2,000l. A lieutenant, 1,000l. An ensign, 750l. Officers' widows must produce proof, on affidavit, that their husbands did not die possessed of property as above.

REGULATIONS

RESPECTING THE AGE OF

WRITERS AND CADETS.

Extract of the Act of the Thirty-third of His present Majesty GEORGE THE THIRD, respecting Writers and Cadets.

And be it further enacted, That no person shall be capable of acting or being appointed, or sent to India in the capacity of writer or cadet, whose age shall be under fifteen years, or shall exceed twenty-two years, nor until the person proposed or intended to be so.

appointed shall have delivered to the said Court of Directors a certificate of his age, under the hand of the minister of the parish in which he was baptized, or keeper of the registry of baptism of such parish: and if no such registry can be found, an affidavit of that circumstance shall be made by the party himself, with his information and belief that his age is not under fifteen years, and doth not exceed twenty-two years. Provided nevertheless, That the said restriction shall not extend to prevent the said Court of Directors from appointing any person to be a cadet, who shall have been for the space of one year at least a commissioned officer in His Majesty's service, or in the militia or fencible men, when embodied, and have been called into actual service, or from the company of cadets in the Royal Regiment of Artillery, and whose age shall not exceed twenty-five years.

PRELIMINARY VIEW

OF THE

ESTABLISHMENT OF THE EAST-INDIA COLLEGE,

FOR THE

Education of young Persons intended to be appointed to the Civil Service of the Honorable East-India Company in India.

The object of this establishment is, to provide a supply of persons duly qualified to discharge the various and important duties required from the civil servants of the Company, in administering the government of India.

Within the last thirty or forty years, a great change has taken place in the state of the Company's affairs in that country: the extension of empire has been followed by a great increase of power and authority; and persons of the same description, who, before, had acted in the capacity of factors and merchants, are now called upon to administer, throughout their respective districts, an extensive system of finance; and to fill the important offices of magistrates, ambassadors, and provincial governors.

As this extension of dominion in India hath been gradual, the wants thence arising have not hitherto been provided in any way

fitted to supply them: for though the private and solitary studies of individuals have enabled them to discharge, with ability and honour, the duties devolved upon them; yet the growing exigencies of territories so enlarged have loudly called for an establishment at home, which, upon a wise and well-adapted system, might provide and prepare, in the most direct manner, a succession of civil servants, for their destined functions.

The necessity of such an establishment, so generally felt in England, induced the Company to expect that some institution would have arisen, immediately applicable to the supply of their wants. But all hopes from other quarters having been disappointed, they judged it to be a duty incumbent upon themselves to devise and to institute a plan, that might not only fill up the time of those young persons designed for the civil service of India with general advantage; but should also afford the best means of qualifying them to discharge the duties of their stations there; and to send them thither early enough to engage in all the concerns of active life.

This plan consists of a COLLEGE for the reception of Students at the age of fifteen, to remain till they are eighteen; or till they are sent by the Court of Directors to their respective destinations.

The Students will be instructed, by courses of lectures, upon a plan similar to that adopted in the Universities.

After having thus provided for the acquisition of learning in general, it is further intended to furnish them with the means of instruction in the Elements of Oriental Literature. For this purpose they will not only be taught the Rudiments of the Asiatic Languages, more especially the Arabic and Persian; but be made acquainted with the history, customs, and manners of the different nations of the East; and as the study of law and political economy is to form an essential part in the general system of education, it will be required that, in the lectures upon these subjects, particular attention be given to the explanation of the political and commercial relations subsisting between India and Great Britain.

Among the variety of studies which may be pursued with peculiar advantage in this country, it is not to be expected that any very great portion of their time can be allotted to the acquiring a knowledge of the several Languages of the East; but it is presumed that the main object of the institution will be attained, if the Students be well grounded in the Rudiments of the *three Languages* already specified; and that, on their leaving the College, such instructions be given them as may enable them to prosecute their oriental studies during their passage to India.

The College is to be under the direction and authority of a Principal and several Professors, according to the following arrangements.

Besides the general superintendence of the College, it will be the office of the Principal more especially to watch over the moral and religious conduct of the students; to instruct them in the principles of Ethics and Natural Theology; and in the evidences, doctrines, and duties of Revealed Religion. Whilst in this respect he is considered as discharging the duty of a Professor in Divinity, so, in the ordinary exercise of his clerical function, he will be required, in conjunction with such Professors as are in holy orders, to preach in the College Chapel, and, at the stated seasons, to perform the solemn rites of the established Church.

The LECTURES of the Professors may be arranged under four distinct heads, in the following manner:

1. *Oriental Literature.*

1. Practical Instruction in the Rudiments of the Oriental Languages, more especially in the Arabic and Persian.—2. A Course of Lectures to illustrate the History, Customs, and Manners of the People of India.

2. *Mathematics, & Natural Philosophy.*

1. A Course of Practical Instruction in the Elements of Euclid, Algebra, and Trigonometry; on the most useful properties of the Conic Sections, the nature of Logarithms, and the Principles of Fluxions.—2. A Course of Lectures on the four branches of

tural Philosophy; Mechanics, Hydrostatics, Optics, and Astronomy; illustrated by occasional experiments: and, if it should be thought necessary or proper, the Principia of Sir Isaac Newton will form a part of this course.

It is here of importance to observe, that the more abstruse parts of pure mathematics will be utterly excluded from these lectures, as altogether inconsistent with the object of the institution. The mathematical lectures will be made entirely subservient to the purposes of natural philosophy. The lectures in natural philosophy will have for their scope and end, the arts and objects of common life: and to render this department of these lectures more extensively useful, as soon as a proper collection of specimens shall be procured, it is intended to give the students some elementary instructions in chemistry, mineralogy, and natural history.

3. *Classical and General Literature.*

1. A course of lectures to explain the Ancient Writers of Rome and Greece, more particularly the Historians and Orators. 2. A course of lectures on the Arts of Reasoning and Composition; and on such other subjects as are generally understood by the "Belles Lettres."

These lectures will be altogether plain and practical. Peculiar care will be taken to make the students well acquainted with the English language, and with the merits of its most approved writers. They will be exercised also in every species of composition appropriate to their future occupations.

4. *Law, History, and Political Economy.*

1. A course of lectures on general History, and on the History and Statistics of the Modern Nations of Europe. 2. A course of lectures on Political Economy. 3. A course of lectures on general Policy, on the Laws of England, and Principles of the British Constitution.

The college year is to be divided into two terms, the first consisting of 22 weeks, and the latter of 18 weeks. In the last week of the first term of each year, public examinations of all the students will be holden by the Professors in the different departments of literature and science, as arranged in the preceding sections, under the superintendence of the Principal.

1. In Oriental Literature.
2. In Mathematics and Natural Philosophy.
3. In Classical and General Literature.
4. In Law, History, and Political Economy.

At the conclusion of the examinations, the Principal and Professors will, at a general meeting appointed for the purpose, arrange the Students in four separate lists, according to their respective merits in these departments. A copy of these lists will be transmitted

by the Principal to the Honourable Court of Directors, for insertion in the Public Records of the Company. On this occasion, the Honourable the Chairman, Deputy Chairman, College Committee, and such other of the Directors as may think proper, will attend, to distribute among the most deserving Students in the several classes, such prizes and medals as may be agreed upon with the Principal by the College Committee.

Having thus pointed out what provision has been made for the literary and intellectual improvement of the Students, it remains to add some observations on the moral and religious discipline of the College. Concerning this important subject, a code of regulations has already been presented to the Honourable Court of Directors, subject to such improvements and corrections as time and experience may hereafter suggest. But as the efficacy of these regulations will entirely depend upon the actual exertions of those Professors who, in subordination to the Principal, are more immediately concerned in the discipline of the College, it may be proper to mention, that the persons selected for this purpose have, for many years, filled situations of trust and authority in the two Universities: and they have undertaken to carry into effect these regulations, under the strongest impressions of the importance of the charge committed to them.

The compensation to be made to the Company by the Students of the College at the commencement of each term, is fifty guineas; for which they will be supplied with every requisite accommodation during that term, a few articles excepted of private convenience. The utmost attention will be given, in every instance, to the economy of the institution, consistent with the comfort of its members. All extravagance among the Students will be discouraged: and on this account, it is much to be desired that their pecuniary allowances may be moderate; as a misjudged liberality in this respect might be highly injurious.

The foregoing plan, it is presumed, is founded upon the soundest principles of wisdom and judgment; and may be eventually expected to produce the happiest effects upon the concerns of the Company in the East. The education of those destined to fill the important offices of magistrates, ambassadors, provincial governors, and other high situations, should certainly be laid on the firm basis of learning and science; on a knowledge of the principles of ethics and civil jurisprudence; of general history, and the laws of nations. To this should be added, a more particular acquaintance with the language, history, and manners of those nations, among whom they are to exercise their respective functions. The cultivation and improvement of their intellectual powers should be accompanied with such a course of moral discipline as may tend to excite and confirm in them habits of application, prudence, integrity, and justice: and to render this system of education fully efficient, it is essential that it be inculcated and enforced under the sanction and

influence of the Christian religion. An institution conducted upon these principles may reasonably be expected, under the favour of Providence, to be productive of a benign and enlightened policy towards the native subjects of British India, to improve their moral condition, and to diffuse the happy influences of Christianity throughout the Eastern world.

Terms of Admission for Students.

One hundred guineas per annum, for each Student; a moiety whereof to be paid at the commencement of each term, there being two in the year, besides the expense of books and stationary.

Students to provide themselves with a table-spoon, tea-spoon, knife and fork, half a dozen towels, and some other small articles, to be mentioned to them at the time of their admission into the College.

Candidates for admission into the College are expected to be well grounded in arithmetic, and qualified to be examined in *Cæsar* and *Virgil*, the *Greek Testament*, and *Euclid*.

Ten guineas to be paid on leaving the College by each Student, for the use of the philosophical apparatus, and library.

The ceremony commenced by an address from the Principal, Dr. Hentley, who represented the great progress made by the Students in general, in the different branches of their studies, and their exemplary conduct in the past year; and on finishing his speech, delivered to the Deputy Chairman, Charles Gair, Esq., (who presided in the absence, occasioned by indisposition of his honourable colleague, Edward Parry, Esq.) a list of the Students recommended by the Principal and Professors as deserving of Prizes, which were accordingly awarded by the Committee, and presented by the Deputy Chairman as follows, viz.

The Honourable Deputy concluded a speech admirably adapted to the occasion, with earnestly recommending the Students to continue the same good conduct and persevere in the same industrious search after knowledge, as had procured them the unanimous approbation of their Superiors.

Specimens of the acquirements of a considerable majority of the Students in the Persian, Sanscrit and Bengallee languages, both written and oral, were produced to the Committee, who signified their very great satisfaction at the extraordinarily rapid progress made by the Students in question, in these branches of oriental learning.

COLLEGE SCHOOL.

Besides the College above described, the Company patronize a School subordinate to it, and under the superintendence of the Principal, into which boys may be admitted at an early age, and in which they will be taught the elements of general learning, and such other accomplishments as are the usual objects of instruction in the larger seminaries of this country. Especial attention will be paid also to such parts of education as may serve to qualify them for public business, and for the higher departments of commercial life.

Though this School be designed as introductory to the College, it is not to be understood that the Company is pledged to make it the sole channel of an appointment to the College itself; but it is nevertheless proper to observe, that those who shall have passed through both institutions will enjoy the advantage of an uniform system of education, begun in early youth, and continued to their departure for the duties of their public stations.

Notwithstanding that an intimate connection is intended to subsist between the College and the School, it is nevertheless to be understood, that, whilst the College is exclusively appropriated to persons designed for the civil service of the Company abroad, the School will be open to the public at large.

The Rev. M. H. Luscombe, A.M. of the University of Cambridge, is appointed Head Master of the School; to whom the annual sum of seventy guineas is to be paid for each pupil; which, without any additional charge, will include, besides the usual course of classical instruction, the French language, writing, arithmetic, mathematics, drawing, and dancing.

REGULATIONS

FOR THE

Admission of Gentlemen Cadets into the Royal Military Academy at Woolwich, on the East-India Company's Establishment.

No cadet to be admitted under fourteen or above sixteen years of age, or below the height of four feet nine inches; a certificate of every candidate's birth taken from the parish register, and signed by the minister, to be delivered to the Secretary of the East-India Company: as likewise an address where he may be sent for on a vacancy.

CADETS REGULATIONS.

- II. Every candidate, previously to his admission, must be well grounded in arithmetic, including vulgar fractions, write a very good hand, and be perfectly master of the English and Latin Grammars.
- III. All candidates are publicly examined by the proper masters in the Royal Military Academy; and, if found deficient in any of these preparatory parts of learning, will be rejected.
- IV. The above qualifications are indispensable at the time of examination; but, the future studies of each candidate will be very materially forwarded, with a view to obtaining a commission, if he has also learnt to draw, and acquired a knowledge of the French language before he is appointed a Cadet.

CADETS REGULATIONS.

REGULATIONS

RESPECTING

Cadets for the East-India Company's Artillery or Engineer Corps, who cannot be admitted into the Royal Military Academy at Woolwich.

That the cadets for the artillery and engineers who undertake to qualify themselves at private academies, be directed to study mathematics from Dr. Hutton's Course, published in two volumes, for the use of the Royal Military Academy; which if they regularly pursue from the commencement, and enable themselves to pass an examination under Dr. Hutton, as far as Conic Sections (not included), besides acquiring some knowledge of the principles of mechanics, so as to judge of the power of machines in general, they may be considered as possessed of the same mathematical qualifications as the cadets of the Academy.

That they should be well-grounded in practical geometry, as introductory to drawing plans of fortification, which may be learned from Professor Landmann's work on the subject, published for the use of the Academy; also, that they should be acquainted with the construction of Vauban's, and some other systems contained in Muller's Treatise, and be able to produce at least twenty plans and sections, of their own drawing. An examination to this extent, under Mr. Landmann, to be deemed sufficient, for which he may be qualified by any intelligent person, conversant in plan drawing, with the help of the books above-mentioned: Professor Landmann also examining each candidate in the practical part of surveying, and ascertaining that he knows how to lay down and describe on paper whatever he has surveyed.

Several candidates will be sent to the academy for examination at the same time, viz. from four to eight; and, as their regular examination will probably employ the private time of the professors for several days, that each professor be paid by each candidate such a sum for his examination as may be thought equitable by the lieutenant-governor and inspector of the Royal Academy, not exceeding three guineas each candidate to each professor.

CADETS REGULATIONS.

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With a view of affording encouragement to the young gentlemen now to be appointed cadets for the artillery or engineer corps in India, to exert themselves in attaining the necessary qualifications above detailed, the sum of two hundred guineas will be presented to each of them, who shall pass his examination at the Royal Academy, and be reported qualified for a commission, each person giving bond to refund the same, if he shall not proceed to India, according to the appointment given him by the Court. It being clearly understood, however, that no cadet reported qualified on private education, can take rank from an earlier period than the day on which he shall attain the age of seventeen years.

It will be expected, that every cadet, when nominated, shall be well grounded in vulgar fractions, shall write a good hand, and shall have gone through the Latin grammar.

And it is strongly recommended, that all cadets should acquire some knowledge of the French language.

No cadet can be nominated to study under the above Regulations who has not attained the age of fourteen years.

REGULATIONS.

OF THE

Royal Military College at Marlow.

In conformity to His Majesty's regulations for this institution no cadet can be admitted who is under thirteen, or above fifteen, years of age; or who has any mental or bodily defect, which may disqualify him for military service.

Every cadet is to produce a sufficient certificate of the time of his birth.

He is to be well grounded in a knowledge of grammar and of common arithmetic, and shall write a good hand.

Should he be found deficient in any of these elementary parts of learning, he will not be qualified for admission.

Cadets admitted in that class, by whom the sum of £100 *per annum*, is to be paid for education, board, and cloathing, are to pay a moiety of that sum half-yearly, in advance, during their continuance at the college. An army agent in London is to be named by such cadets, from whom the half-yearly payments are to be received by the treasurer; and should a cadet leave the college before the expiration of any half year, he will be accounted with for the six months in advance.

Each cadet is to come provided with eight shirts, eight pocket handkerchiefs, eight pair of cotton and eight pair of worsted short stockings, six towels, four night-caps, two black velvet stocks, four pair of webbs drawers, three pair of shoes, a looking-glass, a bible and prayer book, a large comb, a small tooth-comb, a comb-brush, a cloaths-brush, and a tooth-brush, all deficiencies in which are to be made good, at his charge, at the yearly vacation.

No cadet is to join the junior department with a greater sum of money in his possession than one guinea; and this regulation is considered to be so indispensable, that any deviation therefrom will subject the cadet to be sent away from the college. The parents may, however, if they think proper, make an arrangement for the cadet's receiving an allowance, not exceeding half-a-crown a week, for pocket-money.

All repairs of cloathing, linen, shoes, and other articles belonging to the cadets, will be made at the expense of the college.

No perquisites or presents, of any kind, are allowed to be received by the Masters, or any other persons from the cadets.

As a certain number of cadets for the Royal Military College, in that class for which the sum of £100 each *per annum* is to be paid, are to be nominated by the East-India Company, the Court of Directors of the said Company have agreed, that one-half of such expense, or £50 *per annum* for each cadet, and no more, shall be paid by the Company, on an engagement, in writing, being entered into by the friends or parents of the cadet, being responsible persons, on his appointment to the college, to refund the amount of the Company's expenses on his account, provided he shall enter into any other service or line whatsoever, after his being received into the college, or, if he shall not proceed to India, in the Company's military service, on receiving an appointment for that purpose.

The above-mentioned annual payment of £100, to be regulated in the following manner, *viz.*

The friends or parents of the cadet are to make the first half-yearly payment of £50, and the Company to advance the second half-yearly payment, in like manner; and the subsequent half-yearly payments to be made alternately, by the friends of the cadet and the Company, during the time he shall continue at the college, which payments from the friends of the cadets are to be made into the Company's Treasury.

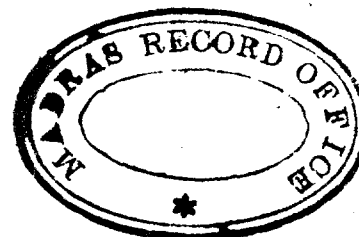

Regulations respecting Furlough and Retirement.

Officers must have served ten years on the island, (except in case of sickness, of which a certificate must be required) before they can be allowed a furlough, the period of which is two years and a half, reckoning from the date of their leaving the island until their return to it. During this time they are allowed the pay of their rank.

Officers having served twenty-six years, including two years for one furlough, or twenty-four years without any furlough, are allowed to retire on the full pay of their rank.

The Superintending Surgeon, when on furlough is to draw pay as Lieut. Colonel; the Chaplain and Head Surgeon (the latter having served twenty years) as Major; Surgeon as Captain and Assistant Surgeons as Lieutenant. The pay of these officers on retirement also is regulated in the same manner. The period of service to entitle them to which, is twenty-two years, including one furlough.

To reduce Indian Cawnies to English Acres; multiply the given number of Cawnies by 160, and divide the product by 121, the quotient will give the number of Acres, and the remainder by the Fractional part of an Acre.—Or multiply the Cawnies by 1,3223, and the product (cutting off 4 places to the right hand) will be the same, and the figures so cut off are the Decimal parts of an Acre.

SILVER.

The old Bombay Rupee is the same as was coined at Surat under the Mogul Government.

It weighed 178,314 grains, and contained 1,24 per cent. of alloy. By an ancient agreement with the Nabob of Surat, the Rupee of both Governments was to circulate through both, at an equal value ; while they mutually pledged themselves to keep up the coin to its exact standard of fineness and weight. The Nabob however did not keep to this agreement, for his Rupees were found soon afterwards to contain, instead of 1,24 per cent. of alloy, not less than 10,12, and even 15 per cent. The consequence of this was, that all the Bombay Rupees were carried to Surat to be re-coined, this mint was entirely stopped in its silver coinage for more than 90 years, and the whole of the circulation of silver was occupied by the Surat Rupee.

In this situation of things, the merchants could not afford to coin their bullion here, and Bombay was long without a silver coinage of its own ; when Government, in 1800, ordered the Surat Rupee to be struck in this mint, and since that time the Rupees have been kept at an equal value in both mints. In both, the silver Rupee weighs 179 grains, and contains 7,97 per cent. of alloy.

GOLD.

In the year 1774 the gold Mohur was made of the same weight with the silver Rupee ; it was ordered to be of the fineness of a Venetian, and to pass for 15 silver Rupees. In this coinage therefore 14,9 grains of silver represented one grain of gold ; for such is the proportion between the quantity of gold in this gold Mohur, and the silver in 15 old Bombay Rupees. When the Surat silver cur-

gency had occupied our circulation, this proportion, between gold and silver, was quite destroyed ; so that gold coined according to the regulation of 1774, was now exchanged for no more than 13 times its weight of silver, and often for much less.

In order to remedy this, and to bring back the coins of gold and silver to nearly their ancient proportions, and their relative value in the market, it was ordered in 1800, that the gold Mohur should be of the same weight as the silver Rupee, that it should contain the same quantity of alloy, and that it should pass for 15 Rupees. At present, therefore, in our coins, 15 grains of silver represent one of gold.

Coins of gold have never circulated as a coin either at Surat or in the Mahratta states on this side of India. They are occasionally carried to those parts, but it is only as bullion.

The following Table was drawn from actual assays ; the first column contains the alloy in one hundred parts of each of the different coins ; the second column contains their weight in grains. From these two columns the value of the whole of the coins may easily and with perfect accuracy, be ascertained.

Although the foregoing tables represent the commonly received standard of the gross weights at Bombay and Surat, it is not only impossible to lay down a rule whereby to judge what commodities in the market are separately governed by them; but there is a great variety of articles, too numerous to distinguish here, in the sale of which the foregoing relations do not obtain, particularly with respect to the *Surat Maund*, which, notwithstanding it is said to contain only 40 Seers, or 37 Pounds, 7 Ounces, and 6 Drains, is sometimes 41, 2, 3, through all the intermediate gradations up to 46 Seers: nor is the Candy uniformly confined to 20 Maunds: for example, Pepper and Sandalwood are sold by the *Bombay Candy* of 21 Maunds, and Cotton, the great staple commodity of their market, by the *Surat Candy* of 21 Maunds.

The finest gold among them is 100 touch, called Sycee, i.e. pure gold without alloy: so that if a shoe of gold touch 93, then it hath 93 parts of fine gold and 7 parts alloy.

Gold is bought by 10 tale weight, for upon that quantity they make their price in silver.

When gold is sold above or under touch, you must add to, or subtract from the touch. As if it touch 96, and is to be sold at 4, under touch, then from 96 take 4 the remainder is 92; then is 9, two tenths of silver to be paid for one of that of gold. If gold is at 96 touch, and to be sold at 8 above touch, then add 8 to 96, the sum is 104; then are 10, four-tenths of silver to be paid for one of gold.

In China all sorts of provisions, as milk, fowls, hogs, greens, &c. are sold by the Catties.

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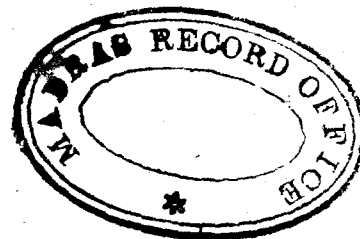

EAST-INDIA COLLEGE.

AT A COURT OF DIRECTORS, held on Wednesday, 30th November, 1808.—*Notice for the Information of the Parents and Guardians of Young Men intended to be sent to the East-India Company's College at Hertford, and also of the Young Men themselves.*

1. The design of the Institution, the branches of study to be pursued in it, and the regulations established for the government of it, should be known, both to the parents of young men, and to the young men themselves, before their entrance into the College.

2. Although, from these sources, a general knowledge may be obtained of the objects of the Institution, and the conduct to be observed in it, yet experience has suggested the propriety of notifying a few things, by special communication, to the parties concerned.

3. Obedience and subordination are essential to the ends of

the Institution. Although a Code of Discipline, and the means of enforcing it, are provided, yet without the voluntary submission of the students to the regulations of the College, their voluntary application to the learning which it is calculated to afford them, and their voluntary election of the service abroad, for which they are destined, it cannot be the wish of the Company that they should proceed thither, nor remain in the College; from which, therefore, insubordination, dissipation, or incorrigible idleness, will certainly exclude them, and they are not to expect that, if guilty of any irregularity or misconduct, they will be protected by those Members of the Direction through whose recommendation they shall have been admitted into the College; for all the Members of the Court, impressed with a sense of the importance of maintaining the discipline of this Establishment, will suffer no consideration of private connection to interfere with their public duty.

4. The College being intended to carry on, by the mode of lectures, students who are already somewhat advanced in classical learning, those who should repair thither, without possessing some proficiency in that way, could not profit by the lectures of the professors of classical and general literature, nor receive the individual tuition they might enjoy at a school. Young men, therefore, who have not acquired a tolerable acquaintance with the Latin language and the Greek Testament, should postpone their entrance into the College until they are thus furnished; and if they present themselves before, there will be an absolute necessity for sending them back to their school studies, until they are better qualified. Students, on admission into the College, must bring from the places at which they have been educated, certificates of their competency in the branches here mentioned.

5. It is prescribed by the College Regulations, that students shall not, during the first two terms of their attendance, have more than three guineas for pocket money in each term, nor afterwards more than four guineas in each term. There is reason to believe, that in many cases parents and relations, ignorant of this rule, or inattentive to it, have supplied young men with pocket allowances upon a much larger scale, to the detriment of the discipline of the College, and of the young men themselves. Parents and relations are therefore hereby earnestly exhorted to conform punctually to the regulations on this head, by which they will save young men from temptation to negligence, irregularity, and inexpedient indulgences, and from setting a bad example to others.

6. Two vacations, amounting to three months in each year, being allowed to the students, they will be expected, during term time, steadily to apply to their studies, and not permitted to accept invitations to entertainments or parties of pleasure out of College,

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EXTRACT REPORT of the COMMITTEE OF COLLEGE to the Honour-
able COURT OF DIRECTORS, dated the 21st December, 1808, on
the subject of the Committee's Visit to the East India College, at
Hertford, for the purpose of attending the Close of the Third
Annual Examination of the Students, and for distributing the
Gold Medals, and other Prizes, awarded by the College Council
to the most meritorious and deserving Students, for their superior
Attainments in the several Branches of Learning in the past
Year.

The Report then states, that the business commenced by
the reading of two essays, the one composed by Mr. Molony, and
the other by Mr. Stokes: the subject, "The Influence of Com-
merce upon the Character and Prosperity of Nations."

The compositions of both those gentlemen were highly cre-
ditable to their abilities and information.

Several of the students then gave specimens of their proficien-
cy in Oriental learning, by reading and construing various pas-
sages from different authors, in the Arabic, Persian, Sanscrit,
Bengalee, and Hindû Stanni languages.

A list of the names of students, who have distinguished them-
selves in Persian writing, was then laid before the Committee and
publicly announced: as was also,

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A list of those who had acquired eminence in their knowledge
of the French language.

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Specimens of drawing were also submitted to the Committee's
inspection; in all of which several branches of instruction the
Committee have great satisfaction in acquainting the Court, that
a degree of talent and industry has been displayed, no less honour-
able to the students and honourable to their teachers, than gratify-
ing to the Committee.

The Chairman, previous to his presenting the prizes, addressed
students in a concise and apposite speech, expressed his gra-
tification in performing the task which now devolved on him, re-
presented the importance of the situations they would be called
to fill in India, where merit would be the surest pledge of
merit; communicated to them as a stimulus to equal ex-
ertion, the case of Mr. Sotheby, lately a student at the College
re, and honoured with a Gold Medal at the Examination of
1817, for his proficiency in Oriental learning, and who had since
received from the Governor General in Bengal, a similar mark of
favour and honour, for his superior attainments in the same
studies there.
