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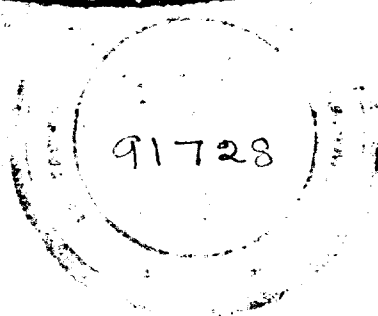

Salaries of Civil Servants in the East-Indies.

Abstract of an Act of Parliament, passed in the Thirty-third Year of the Reign of his present Majesty. Cap. 52. Sec. 57.

I. That no office, place, or employment, the salary, perquisites and emoluments, whereof, shall exceed £500. sterling per annum, shall be conferred on any civil servant, who shall not have been actually resident in India, in the Company's service, for the space of three years, in the whole, antecedent to the appointment to such office.

II. That no place or employment, the salary of which shall exceed £1500. sterling per annum, shall be conferred upon any of the said servants, who shall not have been actually resident in India in the civil service, for the space of six years, in the whole, antecedent to the vacancy to be supplied.

III. An office with a salary, &c. of £3000. sterling per annum, is not to be conferred on any servant, who shall not have been nine years in the whole, resident in India, in the Company's service.

IV. No office of £4000. sterling per annum, shall be conferred on any servant, who has not been twelve years, in the whole, resident in India, in the service.

V. No person in future shall be deemed capable of holding, in the civil line of the Company's service, two or more offices, places, or employments, the joint amount of the salaries, perquisites, and emoluments of which shall exceed, in the whole, the sums prescribed by these regulations.

Abstract of an Act passed in the Forty seventh Year of His present Majesty, Sess. 2. Cap. 68. S.c. 7

Whereas the East India Company have lately established a College in England, for the appropriate Education of young men designed for their Civil Service in India, and it will therefore be expedient that, under certain circumstances, the time spent by such young men in the said College, after they shall have attained the age of 17 years, should entitle them to the same privileges as they would have been entitled to if they had been resident such time in India; be it therefore enacted, that, from and immediately after the passing of this Act, all such time, not exceeding two years, as shall be bona fide spent in the said College, in the regular course of such Education as aforesaid, by any persons after they shall respectively have attained the age of 17 years, provided they shall bona fide spend, either before or after 17 years of age, two years at least in the said College, in the regular course of such Education, and shall afterwards go to India in the Civil Service of the said Company, shall be accounted as to the offices, places and appointments, which such persons are entitled to be appointed to, and to hold, as so much time actually spent in India.

ABSTRACT OF AN ACT

Passed in the Thirty-third Year of His present Majesty, Cap. 52. Sec. 70, precluding the Return to their Duty of the Civil and Military Servants, after an absence of Five Years.

And be it further enacted, that no person who shall have held any Civil or Military Station whatever, in India, in the Service of the said United Company, being under the rank or degree of a Member of Council, or Commander-in-chief of the Forces, and who, having departed from India by leave of the Governor General in Council, or Governor in Council, shall not return to India, within the space of five years next after such departure, shall be entitled to any rank or restoration of Office, or be capable of again serving in India, either in the European or Native Corps of Troops, or in the Civil Line of the Company's Service; unless, in the case of any Civil Servant of the Company, it shall be proved, to the satisfaction of the Court of Directors, that such absence was occasioned by sickness or infirmity, or unless such person be permitted to return with his rank to India, by a vote or resolution passed by way of ballot, by three parts in four of the Proprietors assembled in General Court, specially convened for that purpose, whereof eight days previous notice of the time and purpose of such Meeting shall be given in the London Gazette, or unless, in the case of any Military Officer, it shall be proved, to the satisfaction of the said Court of Directors, and the Board of Commissioners for the Affairs of India, that such absence was occasioned by sickness or infirmity, or some inevitable accident.

RESPECTING

Military Officers retiring from the Company's Service.

Every officer after twenty-five years service in India, three years for one furlough being included, is allowed to retire with the pay of the rank to which he has attained; but such pay is to be the same only as that allowed to officers of infantry.

A member of the Medical Board, who has been in that station not less than five years, and not less than twenty years in India, including three years for one furlough, is permitted to retire from the service, and allowed £500 per annum.

A surgeon of a general hospital, who has been in that station not less than five years, and whose period of service has been not less than twenty years, including three years for one furlough, as above, is permitted to retire from the service, and allowed £300 per annum for life.

All other surgeons and assistant surgeons attached to the military, are permitted to retire from the service on the pay of their rank, after having served in India not less than twenty years, including three for one furlough.

A chaplain after eighteen years service, including three years for one furlough, is allowed to retire with the pay of Major.

A chaplain having served ten years in India, whose constitution will not admit of his continuing in the service, may retire on the half pay of major; after seven years on the half pay of captain.

A commissary, or deputy commissary of ordnance, not being a commission officer, is allowed to retire on full pay, if he has served twenty-seven years in India, of which twelve must have been in the ordnance department; twenty-five years, fourteen of which in that department, or twenty-two years, seventeen years of which in the ordnance department.

A conductor of stores is allowed to retire on £60. per annum after twenty-five years actual service in India.

Every lieutenant colonel, major, captain, or captain lieutenant is allowed to retire with the half pay of the rank to which he has attained, in case his health shall not permit him to serve in India.

A lieutenant having served thirteen, or an ensign nine years in India, including three years for a furlough, may retire on the half pay of his rank, in case his health shall not permit him to serve in India.

A subaltern officer, or military assistant surgeon, having served six years in India, is permitted to retire on the half pay of ensign, if his constitution should be so impaired as to prevent the possibility of his continuing in India.

Every officer returning on furlough, and wishing to retire from the service, must make a declaration to that effect, within twelve months after his arrival in England; and in case of his neglecting so

to do, he must, at the expiration of his furlough, either return to India, or be held to have relinquished the service, and not be entitled to retire on pay, unless he has continued to serve in India, from his first arrival, for the space of *twenty-two years*, without having a furlough; in that case he is allowed *two* years before he shall be called upon to signify his intention of retiring, but he can only be allowed the pay of the rank he held at the expiration of twelve months from his arrival in Europe.

Promotion in consequence of officers retiring in England, takes place from the time when the requests of such officers to retire are laid before the Court.

FURLOUGH.

Officers (of whatever rank) must be ten years in India, before they can be entitled (except in case of certified sickness) to their rotation to be absent on furlough, and the same rule is applicable to assistant military surgeons. The furlough to be granted by the commander in chief at each presidency, with the approbation of the respective governments.

A chaplain after seven years residence in India, is allowed to come home on furlough and receive the pay of major. Should he come home from sickness prior to this period of service he is allowed the pay of captain only.

A conductor of stores is allowed furlough pay, only in case of coming home from sickness.

The period of furlough is three years, reckoning from its date to the day of the return of the officer to his presidency.

No officer on furlough can receive pay for more than two years and a half from the period of his quitting India.

AT A COURT OF DIRECTORS,

HELD ON

Wednesday the 23d January, 1811.

Resolved; That, in future, whenever the absence of a military officer from India shall exceed the period of his regular furlough, no further leave of absence shall be given to him, upon the mere production of a medical certificate, or other unauthenticated statement of circumstances; but that, previous to such leave being granted, proof of the statement made by the party, in support of his application, shall be adduced to the Committee of Correspondence, by personal examination, or by such other evidence, as shall be deemed fully satisfactory to the committee.

AT A COURT OF DIRECTORS,

HELD ON

Friday the 1st March, 1811.

A report from the Committee of Correspondence, dated this day, being read, calling the court's attention to the evident misapprehension of the meaning of the 70th section of the act of the 33d of his present Majesty, cap. 52,* as to the time of absence after which civil and military officers may return to the Company's service in India.

Resolved,—That military officers wishing to avail themselves of the provision above referred to, must arrive in India within five years from their departure from thence, or otherwise they will not be entitled to any pay, rank, or military authority, unless they shall have a permission by the Court of Directors to return to India, having previously proved to the satisfaction of the Court, and to the Board of Commissioners for the affairs of India, that their absence was occasioned by sickness or infirmity, or some inevitable accident.

REGULATIONS

RESPECTING THE

Retirement and Furlough of Officers in the Bombay Marine.

RETIRING.

Every officer of the marine who has served twenty-five years in India, including three years for a furlough is permitted to retire from the service with the following pay.

The commodore per annum	228 l.
A captain of the first class of vessels, 180 l.	
A captain of the smaller vessels	135 l.
A first lieutenant	80 l.

FURLOUGH.

A certain proportion of the marine officers (to be determined by the government with a due regard to the exigencies of the service) are allowed to come home on furlough for three years, with the pay only of their rank.

No officer under the rank of captain who has not actually served ten years in the marine, can be permitted to come home on furlough, unless in cases of ill health under the like certificates as required from military officers.

If the commodore is permitted to come home on furlough he is to be allowed the pay of a captain only, half the remainder of his allowance to be drawn by the senior captain in the service, who is to act as commodore during his absence, in addition to the pay of his rank as senior captain.

The regulations for drawing pay on furlough and retirement by the marine officers are, as far as circumstances will admit, the same as those for the military officers as established by the Honorable Court's orders dated the 22d April, 1794.

REGULATIONS

FOR THE

Admission of Pensioners on Lord Clive's Fund.

Every petitioning officer and soldier must produce a certificate from his commanding officer, of his being an invalid, and rendered incapable of further service in India, together with an approbation of such certificate by the governor and council of the presidency where he shall have served.

Every commissioned officer must previously make oath before the governor and council, viz. A colonel that he is not possessed of, or entitled to, real and personal property to the value of 4,000l. A licut. colonel, 3,000l. A major, 2,500l. A captain, 2,000l. A lieutenant, 1,000l. An ensign, 750l. Officers' widows must produce proof, on affidavit, that their husbands did not die possessed of property as above.

All commissioned, staff or warrant officers to have half the ordinary pay they enjoyed whilst in service, viz.

their widows one-half the above to continue during their widowhood.

Serjants of artillery to have nine-pence per day, and those that are lost a limb one shilling per day. Privates of the artillery six-pence per day, and those that have lost a limb nine-pence per day.

All other non-commissioned officers and privates to have four-pence three farthings per day.

Officers and privates to be entitled from the period of their landing in England.

REGULATIONS

RESPECTING THE AGE OF

WRITERS AND CADETS

Extract of the Act of the Thirty-third of His present Majesty GEORGE THE THIRD, respecting Writers and Cadets.

And be it further enacted, That no person shall be capable of acting or being appointed, or sent to India in the capacity of writer or cadet, whose age shall be under fifteen years,* or shall exceed

* 7th December, 1808. The Court of Directors resolved, that in future no Cadet be appointed for the Cavalry or Infantry under the Age of 16 Years.

twenty-two years, nor until the person proposed or intended to be so appointed shall have delivered to the said Court of Directors a certificate of his age, under the hand of the minister of the parish in which he was baptized, or keeper of the registry of baptism of such parish: and if no such registry can be found, an affidavit of that circumstance shall be made by the party himself, with his information and belief that his age is not under fifteen years, and doth not exceed twenty-two years. Provided nevertheless, That the said restriction shall not extend to prevent the said Court of Directors from appointing any person to be a cadet, who shall have been for the space of one year at least a commissioned officer in His Majesty's service, or in the militia or fencible men, when embodied, and have been called into actual service, or from the company of cadets in the Royal Regiment of Artillery, and whose age shall not exceed twenty-five years.

REGULATIONS

as to the Nomination of

STUDENTS AT THE EAST-INDIA COLLEGE,

With a View to their future Appointment as WRITERS in the Service of the UNITED EAST-INDIA COMPANY; and Preparatory Instructions to Persons who may be so nominated.

Candidates for the nomination of students are to obtain the extract from the parish register of their birth or baptism, certified agreeably to the Forms herein prescribed, previous to their attending at the East India House, to be called before the Court.

By an Act of Parliament of the thirty third of His present Majesty George the Third, it is enacted, "That no person shall be capable of acting, or being appointed, or sent to India in the capacity of writer, whose age shall be under fifteen, or shall exceed twenty-two years; nor until the person proposed, or intended to be so appointed, shall have delivered to the Court of Directors a certificate of his age, under the hand of the minister of the parish in which he was baptized, or keeper of the register of such parish;" which certificate, or extract from the register, if not be admitted unless countersigned by the churchwardens or elders, with a declaration at the foot thereof from the father, or, if nearest kin to the student, testifying, that the bearer of such certified register is the person described therein.

In addition to the above, the following form of a certificate is required to be written and signed by the parent, guardian, or near relation of the student, at the bottom of the parish register, agreeably to the above regulation, viz.

"I do hereby certify, that the foregoing extract from the register of baptisms of the parish of _____, in the county of _____, contains the date of the birth of my son _____, who is the bearer of this, and nominated a student at the East-India College, by _____ Esq.; and I do further declare, that I received the said appointment for my son _____ gratuitously, and that no money or other valuable consideration has been or is to be paid, either directly or indirectly, for the same; and that I will not pay or cause to be paid, either by myself, by my son, or by the hands of any other person, any pecuniary or valuable consideration whatsoever, to any person or persons who have interested themselves in procuring the said nomination for my son from the Director above mentioned."

"Witness my hand, this _____ day of _____, in the year of our Lord, _____."

In the event of no parish register existing or to be found, the before-mentioned Act of Parliament provides as follows, viz.

"That if no such registry can be found, an affidavit of that circumstance shall be made by the party himself, with his information and belief, that his age is not under fifteen years, and doth not exceed twenty-two years."

The following is the form of the affidavit to be made by the student and sworn to before a magistrate, viz.

"I, C. D., nominated as a student at the East-India College, by _____, do make oath and swear, that I have caused search to be made for a parish register, whereby to ascertain my age, but am unable to produce the same, there being none to be found; and, further, I make oath and swear, that from the information of my parents (and other relations), which information I very believe to be true, that I was born in the parish of _____, in the county of _____, on _____, in the year _____, and that I am not at this time under the age of fifteen, or above twenty-two years.

The parent, guardian, or near relation, must then add their certificate as to the truth of the affidavit, nearly similar to the one ordered to be annexed to the extract from the parish register.

The above-mentioned certificate (and affidavit, in cases where an affidavit shall be required) are to be annexed to the petition to be written by the student, who is to sign a declaration thereon,

that he has read these printed instructions. The same declaration is to be signed by the parent, guardian, or near relation of the student. The form of the petition is to be obtained at the Secretary's office.

The candidate will be expected to produce certificates from the persons under whom he has received his education, stating the nature of that education, and the proficiency he has made therein; and also certifying as to his mental ability, and his disposition and character.

The candidate will be examined in an open Court of Directors, as to his character, connections, and qualifications, conformably to the General Court's Resolution of the 6th of July, 1809.

On or before a student's appointment to be a Writer, a legal instrument is to be entered into by some one person (to be approved by the Court of Directors) binding himself to pay the sum of £3,000, as liquidated damages to the Company, for breach of a covenant to be entered into that the student's nomination hath not been in any way bought, or sold, or exchanged for any thing convertible into a pecuniary benefit.

Resolved, That any person who shall, in future, be nominated to a situation, either civil or military, in the service of this Company, and who shall have obtained such nomination in consequence of purchase, or agreement to purchase, or of any corrupt practice whatever, either direct or indirect, by himself or by any other person, with or without his privity, shall be rejected from the service of the Company, and ordered back to England, if he shall have proceeded to India before a discovery of such corrupt practice be made: and if such situation shall have been so corruptly procured by himself, or with his privity, he shall be rendered incapable of holding that, or any other situation whatever, in the said service. Provided always, that if a fair disclosure of any corrupt transaction or practice, of the nature before described, wherein any Director has been concerned, shall be voluntarily made by the party or parties engaged in the same with such Director, the appointment thereby procured shall be confirmed by the Court.

TERMS OF ADMISSION OF STUDENTS to the East-India College.

One hundred guineas per annum, for each student; a moiety whereof to be paid at the commencement of each term, there being two in the year, besides the expense of books and stationery.

Students to provide themselves with a table-spoon, tea-spoon, knife and fork, half a dozen towels, tea equipage, and a looking-glass; also, with not less than two pair of sheets, two pillow-cases, and two breakfast cloths.

Candidates for admission into the College will be required to pass an examination in, at least, two of the Latin classics usually read at schools, and in the easier parts of the Greek Testament; they will also be expected to be well grounded in arithmetic, and to pass an examination therein.

Ten guineas to be paid on leaving College by each student, for the use of the philosophical apparatus, and library.

No candidate for the College can be nominated a student, till he has completed the fifteenth year of his age.

REPORT from the Committee of College to the Court of Directors of the Examination of the Students at the East-India College, at the conclusion of the First Term, 1811.

The committee beg leave to acquaint the Court, that in pursuance of the notice given on the 7th ultimo, by the Chairman, the Committee proceeded to the College on the 30th ultimo, accompanied by several Members of the Court, and by the proper officers, in order to attend the result of the examination holden at the conclusion of the first Term 1811, and to present the medals and other prizes which had been awarded to the most meritorious and deserving of the Students by the College Council.

The Committee attended by the College Council proceeded to the Examination Room, where the Students having been previously assembled, several of them gave evidence of their acquirements in oriental learning by reading and construing various passages from different works in the

Persian,
Hindustanee,
Sanskrit, and
Bengallee

languages.

The several lists prepared by the College Council and annexed to this report were then laid before the Committee, viz.

A list of the Students who have gained prizes and otherwise distinguished themselves at the present examination.

Specimens of Drawings were also exhibited remarkably well executed; and which obtained the approbation of the Committee.

Upon the whole the Committee have great pleasure in stating, that the proofs of qualifications displayed at this examination by some of the Students in particular, and by most, in the various branches of learning before particularized, were such as to justify the Committee in reporting to the Court that the same cause for approbation both of Teachers and Students was shewn in the present instance as had, upon former examinations, been honoured with the commendations of the Court.

The Chairman of the Committee then presented the following prizes:

To Alexander Dick Lindsay, Student of the 4th term, *A Certificate of Superior Merit*, for Persian, having obtained the gold medal in that department at the preceding examination, and a prize of books for Hindustani.

After the prizes had been presented,

Robert Thornton, Esq. in the chair, addressed the Students. The Committee, he stated, had received great satisfaction from the proofs of talent which had that day been exhibited, talent which had been called forth by the exertion and industry of those who had so highly distinguished themselves.

It grieved him however to observe, that this desert was not universal; while some had so much honoured themselves, some few (and he was happy to say they were only few in number) had contra-distinguished themselves by idleness and irregular conduct; he happily contrasted the two characters, pointing out the advantage arising from the first, and the disgrace, as well as bad consequences, which would result from the latter course, unless immediately reformed; that, although *all* could not gain prizes, yet that was no reason why those who had not now been so fortunate, should not exert their best means for obtaining what should be the object of all. That industry would often supply the place of talent and could not fail of its reward: he exhorted them to emulate the praise-worthy conduct of those Students who had signalized themselves by their good conduct, no less than by their proficiency in knowledge; and as a proof how much may be acquired by perseverance and study, he instanced the case of those who had obtained prizes in so many different branches of learning.

After complimenting the principal professors and masters, for their attention to the interests of that institution (on whose zeal he observed, so much of the good they had witnessed must depend), the honourable chairman concluded an energetic and appropriate address, by congratulating the Students who had gained such honourable marks of distinction as had that day been presented to them, and by inviting the rest to follow so laudable an example.

Notice for the Information of the Parents and Guardians of Young Men intended to be sent to the East-India Company's College at Hertford, and also of the Young Men themselves.

1. The design of the Institution, the branches of study to be pursued in it, and the regulations established for the government of it, should be known both to the parents of young men, and to the young men themselves, before their entrance into the College.

2. Although, from these sources, a general knowledge may be obtained of the objects of the Institution, and the conduct to be observed in it, yet experience has suggested the propriety of notifying a few things, by special communication, to the parties concerned.

3. Obedience and subordination are essential to the ends of the Institution. Although a Code of Discipline, and the means of enforcing it, are provided, yet without the voluntary submission of the students to the regulations of the College, their voluntary application to the learning which it is calculated to afford them, and their voluntary exertion of the service abroad, for which they are destined, it cannot be the wish of the Company that they should proceed thither, nor remain in the College; from which, therefore, insubordination, dissipation, or incorrigible idleness, will certainly exclude them, and they are not to expect that, if guilty of any irregularity or misconduct, they will be protected by those Members of the Direction through whose recommendation they shall have been admitted into the College; for all the Members of the Court, impressed with a sense of the importance of maintaining the discipline of this Establishment, will suffer no consideration of private connection to interfere with their public duty.

4. The College being intended to carry on, by the mode of lectures, students who are already somewhat advanced in classical learning, those who should repair thither, without possessing some proficiency in that way, could not profit by the lectures of the professors of classical and general literature, nor receive the individual tuition they might enjoy at a school. Young men, therefore, who have not acquired a tolerable acquaintance with the Latin language and the Greek Testament, should postpone their entrance into the College until they are thus furnished; and if they present themselves before, there will be an absolute necessity for sending them back to their school studies, until they are better qualified. Students, on admission into the College, must bring from the places at which they have been educated, certificates of their competency in the branches here mentioned.

ability during any subsequent period of his continuance in the Seminary.

8. Previous to the cadet's admission into the seminary, his parents or friends will be required to furnish him with the following articles, viz.

- One military great coat,
- One uniform jacket, waistcoat, and pantaloons,
- One military cap and feather, with plate in front embossed with the Company's arms,
- Ten shirts,
- Six pair of cotton stockings,
- Six ditto worsted ditto,
- Two pair of gaiters,
- Two pair of military gloves,
- Two pair of strong shoes,
- Six towels,
- Six night-caps,
- Six pocket handkerchiefs,
- Two black silk handkerchiefs, or velvet stocks,
- Two combs and a brush,
- A tooth brush,
- One foraging cap.

9. The parents or friends of the cadet will likewise be required to pay into the Company's Treasury, the sum of £30 per annum, and the payments must be made in advance for the first year, upon receiving his order for admission; and the second payment after the first vacation which may occur previous to the expiration of that day twelve-months; in consideration of which the Company will take the entire charge of him from his friends, and independent of his board, lodging, and education, to be provided for by the Company, they will further engage to keep up the above stock of cloathing, during his continuance at this institution, to supply him with books, stationery, drawing and mathematical instruments, pocket-money at the rate of two shillings and sixpence per week, medical attendance, and washing.

10. Should the cadet, at the expiration of the first six months, be reported by Colonel Mudge and Dr. Andrew as unlikely to be qualified for the Company's Artillery or Engineer service, within two years, either from his general inattention to his studies or want of capacity; or should he, during his probationary term of six months, or subsequent continuance at the Seminary, be appointed to any other line than that of the military in the Company's service, or should he resign or be dismissed, he will not be entitled to the return of any part of the said £30 paid in by his friends, but the balance will be retained for the general benefit of the institution.

11. The Court having resolved that public examinations of the pupils shall take place twice in the year, such pupils only as shall be reported (by Colonel Mudge and the professors at this institution) as prepared, will be publicly examined, without regard

That any person who shall, in future, be nominated to a situation, either civil or military, in the service of this Company, and who shall have obtained such nomination in consequence of purchase, or agreement to purchase, or of any corrupt practice whatever, either direct or indirect, by himself or by any other person, with or without his privity, shall be rejected from the service of the Company, and ordered back to England, if he shall have proceeded to India before a discovery of such corrupt practice be made: and if such situation shall have been so corruptly procured by himself, or with his privity, he shall be rendered incapable of holding that, or any other situation whatever, in the said service. Provided always, that if a fair disclosure of any corrupt transaction or practice, of the nature before described, wherein any Director has been concerned, shall be voluntarily made, by the party or parties engaged in the same with such Director, the appointment thereby procured shall be confirmed by the Court.

AT A COURT OF DIRECTORS,

Held on Wednesday, the 7th December, 1808.

RESOLVED,

That the age of fifteen, at which period young men have hitherto been eligible for appointments as cadets for the infantry and cavalry in the Company's service in India, is too early an age; and therefore, in future, the age of sixteen years be the earliest period at which cadets for those corps may be appointed.

The certificates required to be produced by the Act of Parliament, and the Court's several resolutions are as follow, viz.

1st. An extract from the register of the parish wherein the cadet was born or christened, signed by the resident clergyman, and countersigned by the churchwardens.

2d. A certificate from the father, mother, or nearest of kin to the cadet, (or his guardian, in the event of their death) agreeably to the following form. This must be annexed to the above extract.

" I do hereby certify, that the foregoing extract from the register of baptisms of the parish of _____, in the county of _____, contains the date of the birth of my son _____, who is the bearer of this, and nominated a cadet on the _____ establishment, by _____ Esq.; and I do further declare, that I received the said appointment for my son _____ gratuitously, and that no money, or other valuable consideration, has been or is to be paid, either directly or indirectly for the same; and that I will not pay, or cause to be paid, either by myself, by my son, or by the hands of any other person, any pecuniary or valuable consideration whatsoever, to any person or persons who have interested themselves in procuring the said nomination for my son from the Director above-mentioned.

" Witness my hand, this _____ day of _____ in the _____ year of our Lord _____."

3. A letter from the cadet's friend, who actually interests himself in procuring the nomination from the Director, certifying to the following effect, viz:

" To the Honorable Court of Directors of the United East-India Company.

" GENTLEMEN,

" I do hereby declare, upon my honor, that I received the nomination of a cadet for the _____ (infantry or cavalry) _____ from _____ Esq. gratuitously, and that I have given it gratuitously to Mr. _____, with whose family and connections I am well acquainted.

" I am, Gentlemen,

" Your most obedient servant."

Unless the whole of the above papers are delivered in by the cadet he will not be passed.

In the event of no parish register existing or to be found, the before-mentioned act of parliament provides as follows, viz.

" That if no such register can be found, an affidavit of that circumstance shall be made by the party himself, with his information and belief, that his age is not under fifteen years, and doth not exceed twenty-two years."

The following is the form of the affidavit to be made by the cadet, and sworn to before a magistrate, viz.

" I, CD, presented for the appointment of cadet by _____, Esq. do make oath and swear, that I have caused search to be made for a parish register, whereby to ascertain my age, but

" am unable to produce the same," there being none to be found ;
 " and, further, I make oath and swear, that from the information of my parents (and other relations), which information I verily believe to be true, that I was born in the parish of _____, in the county of _____ on _____, in the year _____, and that I am not at this time under the age of sixteen, or above twenty-two years.

" Sworn before me, } " Witness my hand, this _____ day
 " this _____ } " of _____, in the year of our
 " day of _____ } " Lord _____
 " C. D."

The father, mother, or nearest of kin, must then add their certificate as to the truth of the affidavit, nearly similar to the one ordered to be annexed to the extract from the parish register ; and the friend who obtains the nomination for the cadet must likewise furnish him with the declaration before-mentioned.

It is here necessary to remark, in consequence of several persons having been detected in attempting to pass under false certificates, when they have either been under or above the age prescribed by the act of parliament, that all persons who may in future be nominated as cadets, if there is any cause to suspect their certificate has been forged, or alteration made therein, or collusion made use of in obtaining the same, they will, on detection, be immediately dismissed the Company's service, and rendered for ever ineligible to hold any situation or employment in the Company's civil, military, or marine service, either abroad or at home.

Where the person to be appointed a cadet has held a commission in His Majesty's service, for the term of one year at least, or in the militia, or fencible corps when embodied, and shall have joined his regiment, and been called into actual service, or shall have been in the company of cadets of the royal regiment of artillery, such person is eligible for the appointment of cadet in the Company's service, provided his age does not exceed twenty-five years : of which circumstance he must, nevertheless, produce the several certificates before mentioned, as also his commission, together with a certificate from the war-office, or commanding officer of his regiment, of his having actually joined, and done duty with the regiment for the full term of one year or upwards ; and that he was neither dismissed or resigned his regiment in consequence of any misconduct.

Upon the cadet being approved of by the Court, he will be furnished with a card of necessities for his equipment, and the Court's regulations, as to the sums to be paid for his accommodation on board ship. And the Court expect, that he will take his passage in one of the first ships bound to the presidency to which

he is appointed. The cadet will also take notice, that the commanders are prohibited from demanding or receiving any greater sum than £95, for his accommodation at their table, and the third mates any greater sum than £55, to accommodate him in their mess, exclusive of the Charter-party passage-money to the owners, of £15, which the cadet will be required to pay, in both instances, into the pay-office.

When the cadet is ready to embark, he must apply to Mr. Abington, for a certificate of his having passed, who will point out the ship in which he is expected to proceed, which certificate will direct him to the pay-office, where he is to pay in the amount of his passage money : also to the private-trade office, to receive the order for his baggage ; and lastly, to the secretary's-office, where he will obtain the certificate of his appointment. He will then hold himself in readiness to embark, either previous to the ship's departure from Gravesend, or at the last port from whence the ship shall be ordered to take her departure from England.

N. B.—The cadet's baggage is limited to a chest and two trunks of necessities, a liquor case, a hat box, and a cot and bedding.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING PASSAGE-MONEY.

AT A COURT OF DIRECTORS,

Held on Wednesday, the 6th June, 1804.

RESOLVED, — That upon the friends of each cadet paying the regular amount of his passage money to the Company's paymaster, such cadet be required to sign a declaration, upon honor, that he has not paid, or caused to be paid, nor will not pay, or cause to be paid, either directly or indirectly, by himself, or by any person on his behalf, any further sum for his accommodation, either to the commander or mate, than those prescribed by the Court's regulations :

That in the event of its appearing at any future time, that a further sum shall have been paid by, or for any cadet, such cadet will be placed at the bottom of the list of rank of the season in which he was appointed ; and

That these last-mentioned regulations be printed and delivered to each cadet, upon his appearing before the Court to be approved.

5. It is prescribed by the College Regulations, that students shall not, during the first two terms of their attendance, have more than three guineas for pocket money in each term, nor afterwards more than four guineas in each term. There is reason to believe, that in many cases parents and relations, ignorant of this rule, or inattentive to it, have supplied young men with pocket allowances upon a much larger scale, to the detriment of the discipline of the College, and of the young men themselves. Parents and relations are therefore hereby earnestly exhorted to conform punctually to the regulations on this head, by which they will save young men from temptation to negligence, irregularity, and inexpedient indulgences, and from setting a bad example to others.

6. Two vacations, amounting to three months in each year, being allowed to the students, they will be expected, during term time, steadily to apply to their studies, and not permitted to accept invitations to entertainments or parties of pleasure out of College, the hours of relaxation in which are sufficient for health and recreation.

COLLEGE SCHOOL.

Besides the College above described, the Company patronize a School subordinate to it, and under the superintendence of the Principal, into which boys may be admitted at an early age, and in which they will be taught the elements of general learning, and such other accomplishments as are the usual objects of instruction in the larger seminaries of this country. Especial attention will be paid also to such parts of education as may serve to qualify them for public business, and for the higher departments of commercial life.

Though this School be designed as introductory to the College, it is not to be understood that the Company is pledged to make it the sole channel of an appointment to the College itself; but it is nevertheless proper to observe, that those who shall have passed through both institutions will enjoy the advantage of a uniform system of education, begun in early youth, and continued to their departure for the duties of their public stations.

Notwithstanding that an intimate connection is intended to subsist between the College and the School, it is nevertheless to be understood, that, whilst the College is exclusively appropriated to persons designed for the civil service of the Company abroad, the School will be open to the public at large.

The Rev. M. H. Luscombe, A.M. of the University of Cambridge, is appointed Head Master of the School; to whom the annual sum of seventy guineas is to be paid for each pupil; which, without any additional charge, will include, besides the usual course of classical instruction, the French language, writing, arithmetic, mathematics, drawing, and dancing.

XXXVIII. MILITARY SEMINARY REGULATIONS.

REGULATIONS for the Admission of Cadets into the East-India Company's Artillery and Engineer Seminary.

PRELIMINARY REGULATION.

It is necessary that the Cadet, as well as his parents or friends, should be fully aware, that he is admitted into the above Institution, during the first six months, as a probationary Student only; that after this period he will be examined by Colonel Mudge, the Company's Public Examiner, and Dr. Andrew, the Head Master at the Seminary, who are to report to the Seminary Committee whether he has made that progress in his studies, and evinced that application and talent, as to insure his being qualified, in two years from the date of his first admission. Upon his being so reported on by the above gentlemen, he will be considered as an established pupil for the remainder of the term: but should the above officers report to the contrary, the said Committee will order him to return to his friends, and his appointment will be filled up by some other Candidate.

Upon the perfect understanding of the above condition by the Cadet, his parents or friends, he will be admitted into the Company's Seminary under the following regulations, viz.

1. No Cadet to be admitted until he has been examined by the Medical Attendant at the Institution, as to the state of his health.

2. No cadet to be admitted under fourteen, or above eighteen years of age, or who has any mental or bodily defect, which may disqualify him for military service.

3. Cadets, from the age of fourteen to sixteen years, not to be under four feet nine inches, and from seventeen to eighteen years, not to be under five feet two inches.

4. A certificate of every candidate's birth, taken from the parish register, and signed by the minister and churchwardens, with a declaration from the father, mother, or nearest of kin, agreeably to the forms in the Preparatory Instructions for the cadets in general, must be delivered in at the time of nomination.

5. Upon the cadet being nominated, he will be sent to the head master for examination: it is therefore necessary to apprise him, that he must be well grounded in arithmetic, including vulgar fractions, write a good hand, and must have acquired a competent knowledge of the English and Latin grammars. If he is found deficient in any of these preparatory parts of learning, he will not be admitted into this seminary.

6. The above-mentioned qualifications are indispensable at the time of examination; but the future studies of each candidate would be materially forwarded, with a view to his obtaining a commission, if he has also learnt to draw, and has acquired some knowledge of the French language, mathematics, and fortification, before he is appointed to this seminary.

7. Upon the cadet passing his examination for admission, his friends will be required to sign a bond in the secretary's office, engaging to indemnify the Company for the expenses incurred on his education, in the event of his being removed at the end of the first six months, from want of talent and application, or of his resignation, or dismissal on account of misconduct or want of

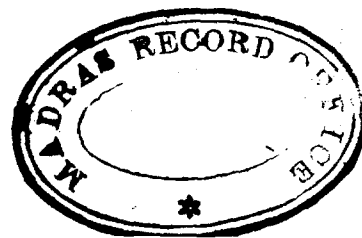

Regulations respecting Furlough and Retirement.

Officers must have served ten years on the island (except in case of sickness, of which satisfactory proof will be required), before they can be allowed a furlough, the period of which is two years and a half, reckoning from the time of their leaving the island until their return to it. During this time they are allowed the pay of their rank.

Officers having served twenty-six years, including two years for one furlough, or twenty-four years without any furlough, are allowed to retire on the full pay of their rank.

The Superintending Surgeon, when on furlough is to draw pay as Lieut. Colonel; the Chaplain and Head Surgeon (the latter having served twenty years) as Major; Surgeon as Captain; and Assistant Surgeons as Lieutenant. The pay of these officers on retirement also is regulated in the same manner. The period of servitude to entitle them to which, is twenty-two years, including one furlough.

BENGAL CIVIL FUND,

*Instituted October, 1804.**An Abridgement of the Rules of this Institution.*

1.—The immediate object of this fund is to provide for the maintenance of the widows and children of such of the subscribers to it as may not, at their demise, leave property sufficient for the subsistence and education of their families; also to assist in maintaining such of the subscribers themselves, as may be compelled by sickness or infirmity to return to Europe for the recovery of their health, without an adequate provision for their support.

2.—It is at all times, at the option of the civil servants already appointed, or who may be hereafter appointed, to this establishment, either, to subscribe thereto, or otherwise.

3.—The contributions of the fund are proportioned to the monthly salary, or other public allowance of whatever description, receivable by the subscribers respectively; and the following are the rates; viz.

If the salary or other public allowance of the subscriber, be not more than 1000 Sa. Rs. per mensem,	Sicca Rupees.
his monthly subscription to be.....	10
If more than 1000 and not above 2000.....	20
If more than 2000 and not above 3000.....	30
If more than 3000 and not above 4000.....	40
If more than 4000.....	50

4.—When a question shall arise in any case, respecting what is to be considered a public allowance on which the contribution is chargeable; or if any question whatever shall occur respecting the contribution demandable from a subscriber; it is at his desire, to be submitted to a general meeting of the subscribers, and the determination of such meeting, regularly passed, shall be final.

5.—The rate of contribution payable by each subscriber is with the permission of government deducted from his monthly allowances by the sub-treasurer, collector, or other officer, paying the same; and be transferred or remitted to the treasurer of the fund. The committee of managers, shall take the necessary measures for the execution of the Article, and, may, in particular cases, admit a deviation from it, if a different mode of payment shall be desired by any subscriber, and be equally advantageous to the fund.

6.—The sub-treasurer of government acts as treasurer to the

fund; and all monies, and securities for money, belonging to the fund in India, are kept in the public treasury, subject to the direction and controul of the trustees and managers of the fund.

7.—The unappropriated receipts of the fund, exceeding the sum of 2000 Sicca Rupees (to be reserved for current expenses), are vested in the securities of government, made payable to the trustees of the civil fund, on account of the fund, and the signatures of three of the trustees of the fund are requisite for the transfer of such securities, or to grant discharges for the principal amount thereof. But the treasurer of the fund is competent to pass receipts for the interest receivable thereupon.

8.—The managers and trustees of the fund in India nominate such persons as may appear to them proper to act as agents for the fund in England; and any money, that may be required for the disbursement of the fund in Europe, is to be remitted to the agents in England to be disposed of according to the instructions they may, from time to time receive from the managers and trustees of the fund in India. A duplicate copy of all rules and resolutions of a general nature, which may pass relative to this fund is also to be transmitted to the agents in England, for their information, and that of all persons who may apply to them upon this subject.

9.—A quarterly general meeting of the subscribers to the fund is appointed to be held at the presidency of Fort William, on the last Monday of the months of January, April, July and October, of each year; but if any circumstance should occur to prevent the quarterly general meetings being held on the days stated, the day of meeting, in such cases, is to be fixed by the committee of managers, and notified in the Calcutta Gazette. The committee of managers or any nine members of the institution, may also convene a special general meeting at the presidency by public notice in the Calcutta Gazette, if, at any time, there shall be found occasion for it, provided that the days fixed for holding such special meeting, and the objects of them be advertised at least six weeks before the same are held, for the general information of the subscribers.

10.—All questions proposed at a general meeting, whether quarterly or special, are to be determined by a majority of votes. But the concurrent voices of at least nine members shall be requisite to determine upon any question whatever; and upon all general questions, involving any increase or diminution of the fixed rate of contribution, or any essential addition to, or alteration in, the original rules and principles of the institution, all subscribers in India, who may not be able to attend the meeting in person, are allowed to deliver their sentiments and votes, by a written communication, signed by them, and addressed to the chairman of the meeting.

11.—The annual accounts of the fund are appointed to be made up to the end of April, and submitted by the trustees and mana-

gers at the quarterly general meeting of the subscribers, held in the month of July in each year. After being approved by the meeting, a general statement of the fund is to be published, for the information of the subscribers at large, in the *Calcutta Gazette*. A committee of managers and trustees for the fund is, at the same meeting, to be appointed for the ensuing year; and shall consist of the chief secretary to the government, the accountant general, the sub-treasurer, and the civil auditor, for the time being; with five other members to be elected at the general meeting.

12.—The committee of managers, or the majority of those present at a meeting of five or more, or if less than five be present, any three members of the Committee who may concur in opinion, are competent to decide, in the first instance, upon all matters relative to the receipts and disbursements of the fund; as well as generally upon all subjects connected with the management of the fund, and the due execution of the rules established for it, which, by such rules, may not have been expressly reserved for determination by the general meetings of the subscribers to the fund. But the decisions of the committee of managers, in all cases, are liable to revision and controul by the resolutions of the subscribers duly passed at a regular general meeting.

13.—The secretary and accountant to the fund, act under the direction of the committee of managers and attends the general meetings of the subscribers; the proceedings of which, and of the committee of managers, and generally all papers appertaining to this institution, which may be intrusted to the treasurer in India, or to the agents in England, are kept under the charge of the secretary and accountant to the fund; and on application to him, or to the committee of managers, are open to the inspection of any of the subscribers to the fund.

14.—In the event of any of the five managers who may be elected annually, being subsequently removed from the presidency without an intention of returning to it during the year of their election, it is to be communicated to the subscribers at the next general meeting; and in such instances, as well as in all instances of vacancy in the situation of manager, by death or otherwise, a new election, if it appears necessary, shall take place for the unexpired part of the current year.

15.—All applications for admission to the benefits of the fund are to be made to the committee of managers; and to be accompanied with the necessary information, documents, and proofs, to enable the committee to ascertain the circumstances and situation of the party in whose behalf the application is made. The managers, after calling for any further information or evidence which may appear to them requisite, are to submit the application, with the whole of the papers received by them, for the determination of the subscribers, at the next general meeting. In cases of emer-

gency and distress, however, when the managers may consider the party, for whom the application is made, entitled to the benefit of the fund, they are authorized to advance such proportion of the fixed allowances hereafter specified, as may appear to them indispensably requisite, a determination can be passed by the subscribers.

16.—Any subscriber to the fund, who may be compelled by sickness or infirmity to quit his station in India, and to proceed to Europe for the recovery of his health, and shall not be possessed of sufficient means to pay for his passage to Europe, and support himself and family during his necessary absence from India, on his making a declaration upon oath to this effect, or otherwise establishing the fact, to the satisfaction of a general meeting of the subscribers, and producing a certificate of the necessity of his return to Europe, solemnly attested by the surgeon who has attended him, and countersigned by a member of the medical board, with the consequent permission of government for his proceeding to Europe, will receive from the fund a donation, equivalent to the company's allowance for a twelvemonth to a servant of his rank when out of employ, viz. if he be a senior merchant, 4000 sicca rupees; if a junior merchant 3000 sicca rupees; if a factor or writer 2000 sicca rupees. This donation is to be considered to include all claims upon the fund for the period of one year after the subscriber's embarkation from India; at the expiration of which period, if he be in Europe, a further donation shall be made to him, on his application to the agents for the fund in England, equal to that advanced to him, upon his embarkation from India; at the exchange rate of two shillings and sixpence for the sicca rupee, viz. £500, £375, or £250, according to his rank in the service at the time of his leaving India. This donation to be considered to include all claims for the second year after his embarkation from India, with the expence of his voyage back to India, in the event of his returning at any time in the course of that year, or of his prolonged stay in Europe, not being necessarily occasioned by the state of his health. But should the imperfect recovery of his health render it necessary to protract his stay in Europe beyond the second year; and besides his own declaration upon oath to this effect, he shall produce to the agents for the fund in England, a certificate solemnly attested by a respectable physician, or other professional gentleman of established practice, that the state of his health has not admitted of his previous return to India, he will, at the commencement of the third year after his embarkation from India, receive, from the agents in England, a donation equal to a moiety of the amount paid to him in the preceding year, and another moiety, on a similar declaration and certificate at the end of six months, viz. two years and a half after his embarkation from India, if he be still in

Europe, which is to be considered to include all claims, whatever upon the fund to the period of his return to India, passage money is granted, in cases appearing to require it, in addition to the sums above specified, and in such cases, the amount is to be determined by a general meeting of the subscribers.

18.—On the death of any subscriber to the civil fund, who may not be possessed of property sufficient to provide for his family, and may, consequently, leave a wife, cohabiting with him, or maintained by him and living under his protection to the period of his decease, without an adequate provision for her support, as hereafter specified; if, on the information, documents, and evidence which may be submitted by her, or in her behalf, to the managers of the fund, it shall appear to the satisfaction of a general meeting of the subscribers that she is a proper object of the fund, a pension is to be assigned to her from the fund, under the provisions and limitations stated in the following article. Provided that nothing contained therein, or in any other part of the rules for this institution, shall be considered to entitle to the benefits of it, any widow, who may have been legally divorced or separated from her husband for adultery; or who, at the period of her husband's demise may have quitted his protection, and be living in a state of notorious adultery, though not divorced or separated from him by law.

19.—First. If the widow, at the time of her husband's death, be resident in India, and be left without an income exceeding one hundred rupees per mensem, a pension to be assigned to her from the fund, of three hundred rupees per mensem, during her residence in India. If the widow be not resident in India at the time of her husband's death, or shall afterwards quit India, and her income, from her husband's estate or otherwise, shall not exceed one hundred pounds per annum, the pension to be assigned to her from the fund to be three hundred pounds per annum.

Secondly. If the income of the widow, resident in India at the death of her husband, be more than one hundred sicca rupees per mensem, but exceed not four hundred rupees per mensem, during her residence in India; or if the widow be not resident in India at the time of her husband's demise, or shall afterwards quit India, and her income be more than one hundred pounds per annum, but shall not exceed four hundred pounds per annum, the pension to be assigned to her from the fund is to be such as will make up her income to four hundred rupees per mensem, during her residence in India, or four hundred pounds per annum in Europe, or elsewhere.

Thirdly. In the event of a widow, to whom a pension may have been assigned from the fund, acquiring subsequently by inheritance, bequest, or otherwise, any property or income which, with the property left to her at her husband's decease, and the pension re-

ceived by her from the fund, may render her total income including her pension from the fund more than five hundred rupees per mensem, during her residence in India, or more than five hundred pounds per annum in Europe, or elsewhere, her pension from the fund is liable to abatement, proportioned to the excess of her entire income, including the pension, above the sum specified; or to be altogether discontinued, in the event of her property or income, exclusive of the pension assigned to her from the fund, being equal to the full sum of five hundred rupees per mensem in India, or five hundred pounds per annum in Europe, or elsewhere.

Fourthly. All pensions of widows are also liable to discontinuance on their remarriage. But in the event of their being again left in a state of widowhood, without an adequate provision for their support, and of their appearing to be proper objects of this fund, they may be again admitted to the benefits of it, under the same provisions and limitations as on their original admission.

Fifthly. The pensions to widows, who may be admitted to the benefits of the fund, are to be paid in advance half yearly to themselves or to their authorized agents. But the acknowledgment of the widow herself shall be taken for all sums paid in her behalf; and shall contain a solemn declaration that her entire income including the pension received by her, does not exceed the sum of five hundred rupees per mensem, if she be resident in India, or five hundred pounds per annum, if she reside in Europe or elsewhere.

20.—Widows who may be in India when admitted to the benefit of the fund and may subsequently return to Europe, are, if they have no means of paying for their passage to Europe, on this being established to the satisfaction of a general meeting of the subscribers, supplied from the fund with such sum as may appear requisite as passage money in addition to the half year's advance of their pension.

21.—If any subscriber to the fund shall die without the means of providing for his family, and shall consequently leave a child or children, born in wedlock, without an adequate provision for their maintenance and education: and on the information, documents, or evidence which may be submitted in their behalf to the managers of the fund, it shall appear to the satisfaction of a general meeting of the subscribers, that they are proper objects of the fund, an allowance for their maintenance and education shall be assigned from the fund, under the provisions and limitations contained in the following article:

22.—First. If the child or children of the deceased subscriber be left without any provision, from his estate or otherwise; the allowance for the education and maintenance of each child, to be granted from the fund, in India or in Europe, is to be according to the age of the child, as follows, viz.

F f

Till five years of age, thirty rupees per mensem in India; or thirty pounds per annum in Europe.

From the commencement of the sixth year, to the end of the eighth, forty rupees per mensem in India; or sixty pounds per annum in Europe.

From the commencement of the ninth year, to the end of the eleventh, fifty rupees per mensem in India; or eighty pounds per annum in Europe.

From the commencement of the twelfth year, sixty rupees per mensem, in India; or one hundred pounds per annum in Europe.

Secondly. If any provision be left by a subscriber for his child or children; or if after his death they shall at any time become possessed of property or income by inheritance, bequest, or otherwise; but not such as to afford the sums specified for their education and maintenance; the allowances to be granted from the fund are to be such as, in addition to the property or income possessed by them, will make up the several sums above specified, according to their respective age; and as they may be resident in India or in Europe.

Thirdly. In the event of the property or income left to the child or children, of a subscriber, at his demise, or which may subsequently devolve, or be in any wise acquired by them, being such as to afford the full amount specified for their education and maintenance, they are not considered entitled to any allowance from the fund; and any allowances which may have been granted before such accession of property or income are to be discontinued.

Fourthly. The allowances granted from the fund, for the maintenance and education of children, are to be paid in advance half yearly, to their guardians or relative having the care of them; or to such persons as may be intrusted with the disbursement of the sums allotted for them, either by the managers of the fund in India, or by the agents to the fund in England; who from time to time are to adopt such measures as may appear necessary for the purpose of ascertaining any accession of Property, which would render the allowances from the fund liable to abatements or discontinuance.

Fifthly. The provision so made from the fund, for the maintenance and education of female children, ceases on their marriage, or on their being settled in any profession or employment; and the provision for male children ceases on their being settled in any profession or employment or on their attaining the age of twenty-one years. But any requisite sum, not exceeding five hundred pounds, may be appropriated to the benefit of male or female children by the managers of the fund in India; or under their direction, by the agents of the fund in England, at the time of their marriage, or of their being settled in any profession.

22.—For children who may be in India when admitted to the

fund, and who may be sent to England for their education, with the concurrence of the managers, passage money, if requisite, is to be supplied from the fund, not exceeding one thousand Sicca Rupees for each child. An allowance for passage money, not exceeding one hundred pounds, also to be granted if it appear necessary, for the return to India of any children admitted to the fund, who, after completing their education in Europe, may return to India with the permission of the honourable Court of Directors.

23.—The true intent and object of this institution being to provide for the widows and children of such only of the subscribers to it as may not at their demise leave property sufficient for the subsistence and education of their families, and it being the obvious duty of all persons who have families, and possess property sufficient to provide for them, to make a proper testamentary provision for them; it is requisite, in all cases of application being made to the fund for assistance to the family of a deceased subscriber, that an authenticated copy of the will of the deceased, or if he shall have died intestate, that a full authentic statement of any property left by him, and of the legal heirs thereto, be submitted for the information of the managers and subscribers. And a general meeting of the latter, duly held according to the rules of the institution, has full power to reject the application for aid from the fund, in any instance wherein it may appear, that a subscriber, leaving property at his death, has made an improper devise of it, with a view to throw his family upon the fund, or have purposely neglected to make a disposition of his property for the benefit of his family, whereby they have been left without a provision, which it was in his power to have made for them.

24.—A subscription book for the signature of subscribers to the fund is deposited at the general treasury. Those who may arrive in India, and subscribe to the fund, are considered subscribers from the time of their arrival at Fort William, or from the commencement of any allowances receivable by them as civil servants of the Bengal establishment. But no civil servant of this presidency in India, who shall not have availed himself of the option given of becoming a member of this fund before the first of January, 1807, nor any civil servant who may not accept the invitation given to him by the preceding article, within six months after his arrival in India, shall be admitted on any plea or excuse whatever to become a subscriber to the civil fund.

25.—All persons are at liberty at any time to withdraw their names as subscribers to the fund and discontinue their contributions, relinquishing at the same time, all future title on the part of themselves and their families, to the benefit of the institution, and forfeiting to the fund, all sums that may have been subscribed by them.

26.—The contribution of every subscriber to the fund, ceases

upon his leaving India, to return to Europe, and the consequent discontinuance, of his allowance from the company, but in the event of his returning to India, and again receiving allowance from the company, he is to renew his contribution from the commencement of such allowance.

28.—If a subscriber to the fund, at the time of his retiring from the service to return to Europe, shall have contributed, by his previous monthly payments to the fund, the principal sum of five thousand sicca rupees; or if, on his quitting the service, he shall pay to the fund what may be wanting to complete his contribution to that amount; such contribution shall entitle the family of the subscriber, on his demise, to the benefits of the institution, under the several provisions herein-stated, or such as may be hereafter established, in like manner as if his death had taken place during his residence and actual subscription to the fund in India. The family of any subscriber to the fund, who may die during his temporary absence from India for the recovery of his health, are also considered entitled to the benefits of the fund, under the existing rules of it, whether such subscriber may have contributed more or less than five thousand sicca rupees. In all other cases, if the deceased member of the institution shall not have been an actual subscriber to the fund at the time of his death and shall not have contributed five thousand sicca rupees to the fund, it shall be at the option of the subscribers to admit his family to the benefits of the fund or otherwise.

29.—If a subscriber to the fund shall be dismissed from the service of the Honorable Company, he shall cease to be entitled to the benefits of the institution, and in the event of his death, his widow and children, shall in like manner, have no claim to the benefit of the institution.—But in such case the amount of his actual contribution to the fund, shall be returned to him with interest, at the rate of ten per cent per annum.

30.—If a subscriber to the fund shall be suspended from the service of the Honorable Company, he shall, during the period of his suspension, cease to be entitled to his own person to the benefits of the institution: but in the event of his restoration to the service, he shall be restored to his former right to the benefits of the institution.

31.—A subscriber suspended from the service, shall however, have the option of receiving back the amount of contributions, in the same manner as in the case of persons finally dismissed from the service, but if he should take advantage of this clause, he shall cease to be entitled to the benefits of the institution, either for himself or family, as in the case of persons finally dismissed from the service.

32.—If a subscriber to the fund being suspended from the service of the Honorable Company, shall die during the period of suspen-

sion, his widow and children shall be entitled to the full benefits of the institution, excepting in the case of his receiving back the amount of his contribution, in which case his widow and children shall have no claim to the benefits of the institution.

NEW CODE OF REGULATIONS,

For the Bengal Military Widow's Fund,

Instituted January 1, 1806.

Rules and Regulations.

1.—All persons making donations to the fund shall be considered as patrons and friends of the Institution.

2.—Members and unmarried subscribers shall pay the following monthly subscriptions from the first of January, 1809, viz:—

7th.—No Married Officer shall be admitted as a Member, whose wife is not actually in Bengal at the time he makes his application.

8th.—All married Officers who may wish to become Members of this Society, must signify their intentions to the Committee of Managers, through their Secretary, within three months after their Marriage, or after the arrival of their Wives in Bengal.

9th.—Married Officers, who may neglect to apply for admission within three months after their Marriage, or after the arrival of their Wives in Bengal, shall pay double the monthly Subscription of Members of their own Rank, for the months which have elapsed since their Marriage, or the arrival of their wives in Bengal; and also, in addition to the Donations which they are liable to pay by the foregoing regulations, shall contribute in the following proportions.

10th.—Three years continued Subscription in any rank, commencing before the first of January 1809, shall entitle an Officer to admission as a Member of that rank, without paying any Donation, agreeably to the 6th Article of the original Regulation.

11th.—Five years continued Subscription in any rank, commencing on or after the first of January, 1809, shall entitle an Officer to admission as a Member of that rank, without paying any Donation.

12th.—All applications for the admission of new Members generally, and also for admission to a higher rank than that actually held by a Member so applying, must be accompanied with certificates of health, according to the following form, to be signed by two Medical Gentlemen, with a declaration to be signed by the person applying for admission.

FORM OF CERTIFICATE.

at the date hereof, is free from any bodily complaint of a dangerous tendency, and that, from my knowledge of his constitution, and general state of health, I believe him to be a good life.

13th.—All applications from Married Officers for admission into the Society must be accompanied with certificates of Marriage, except when the marriage has not taken place in Bengal, in which case a reasonable time will be allowed for procuring certificates of marriage.

14th.—Members subscribing to a higher rank than their own shall, in addition to the Donation of their own rank, pay the following sums.

And officers who, under the old Regulations, had subscribed to a higher rank than their own, shall, on the adoption of the code,

have the option of receding to the subscription of their own, or any intermediate rank. When promoted in the service, they shall not be obliged to pay additional donation, till they have passed the rank to which they had originally subscribed; but in case of their death, their Widows will only be entitled to the pension of officer's Widows, in the actual rank to which they may be subscribers, at the time of their decease.

15.—Members who subscribe to their own Rank, shall, when promoted to the next higher, pay the following sums—

16.—Monthly Subscriptions of Members shall be paid within four Months after they become due, on pain of exclusion from the Society, or forfeiture of double the arrears of Subscription, except satisfactory reasons can be assigned for the delay of payment. Officers, authorising their Paymasters to deduct their Subscriptions from their monthly Pay, shall not be subject to the above Penalty; but shall nevertheless be responsible for the arrears, in case it shall appear, that the Paymaster has neglected to make the proper deductions.

17.—New Members who shall have been three years subscribers shall pay their donations within four months; those who shall have been two years Subscribers, within Eight months; and those who shall not have been two years Subscribers, within twelve months after admission, on pain of exclusion from the Society, or forfeiture of Interest on their donations, at the rate of twelve per cent. from the day of their becoming members of the Society.

18.—Members retiring from the service, or returning to Europe, at any period after entering the Society, may continue by their Agents, their Monthly subscriptions in Bengal; or be considered as permanent Members, on paying, according to their rank, and the time during which they have been Members in that rank, the sums specified in the following Table.

Permanent Members promoted in Europe to a higher rank, without returning to India, shall be considered as still belonging to the rank in which they retired, and in the event of their death, their Widows be entitled to the pension of that rank on'y.

19th.—Should any permanent Member return to Bengal, and resume his rank in the army; he shall, in case of promotion to a higher rank than that to which he had before subscribed, be obliged to pay the difference of donation prescribed by article 15th, and also the difference of monthly subscription between his former and his new rank, from the first day of the month in which he arrives in Bengal, or subsequent to his promotion.

And such Member, on returning to Europe a second time, may become a permanent Member in his new rank, by paying a sum which shall bear to the sum which he would have paid if then retiring for the first time as exhibited in the Table annexed to article 16, the same proportion as his present monthly contribution bears to the entire contribution of his rank.

20th.—If a Member should become a Widower, he shall still be considered as a Member of the Society, provided he continue to pay the monthly subscription of unmarried officers of the same rank; and should he marry again, and from the period of such marriage pay the monthly subscription of a married officer of his rank, his wife will be entitled to the pension allotted to the widow of an officer of the same rank.

21st.—The property of the Fund shall be vested in Company's paper, in the names of the President and Managers of the Fund, and lodged in the Public Treasury.

22d.—The Widows of Members shall receive, from the day of their Husband's decease, and during their continuance in Widowhood, the following Pension.

Provided that nothing contained herein, or in any other part of the rules of this Institution, shall be considered to entitle to the benefits of it, any widow who may have been legally divorced, or separated from her Husband, for adultery; or, who, at the period of her husband's demise, may have quitted his protection and be living in a state of notorious adultery, though not divorced, or separated from him by law.

23d.—Pensions in Bengal shall be paid monthly, by the respective Paymasters at the Military Stations of the Army; and at the Presidency by the Treasurer of the Society. Pensions in England shall be paid half yearly by the Managers appointed to transact the Society's business in London.

24th.—To enable a y Widow to receive her Pension from the Paymaster of any Military Station, she must have a certificate of her having been admitted to the benefits of the Fund; and when she changes her station, she must obtain, from the Paymaster of the station she leaves, a certificate of the period to which she has received her Pension, to be presented to the Paymaster of the new station where she may choose to reside.

25th.—Widows on the Fund, when going to England, must take a certificate, signed by the Treasurer of the Society, specifying the period to which their Pensions have been paid in Bengal, and the amount which they will be entitled to receive in England, to be presented to the Managers in England on making applications for their Pensions.

26th.—Widows in Europe must accompany their applications for Pensions with a receipt, and with a certificate in the following form.

CERTIFICATE.

" This is to certify, that Mrs. A. B. Widow of C. D. late of the Bengal Establishment, or of H. M. _____ Regiment, is living in the Parish of _____ in the County of _____ in England, Scotland, or Ireland, and, to the best of our knowledge and belief, is in a state of Widowhood.

" Signed by the Minister and Church Wardens, " or by two Justices of the Peace."

Should a Widow entitled to a Pension from the Fund reside in any other country, her Pension will be paid in London, to an attorney duly authorized by her, on the production of a certificate to the foregoing purport, signed by two persons in the characters of parochial clergymen, or of magistrates, in the place where she resides.

27th.—The business of the Society shall be transacted by a Committee, consisting of a President and six other Managers, to be

elected by the Members of the Society, from the Members resident at the Presidency; the election to be closed within two months after the votes have been called for: the majority to bind the minority: three to constitute a quorum: the Committee to be allowed a Secretary, Accountant, Sircar, and Stationary. The accounts to be settled annually, and published for general information.

28th.—The Committee of Managers shall enact such By-Laws, from time to time, as may appear necessary for conducting the Business of the Society, provided such By-Laws be not inconsistent with any of these regulations.

29th.—Whenever it shall appear necessary to the Committee of Managers that any new regulation should be enacted, or any of the old regulations amended or annulled; This necessity shall be laid before the Members at large, for their decision on the question.

30th.—All questions referred to the Members at large, shall be decided upon, within three months after the date of the circular letters, by a majority of votes; reckoning those Members who have not answered the circular letter, on the affirmative side of the question.

31st.—All those who are now either Members or Subscribers to the Bengal Military Widow's Fund, as well as those who may in future become so, shall be at liberty, at any time, to withdraw their names; relinquishing, at the same time, all claims to the benefit of the Institution, and forfeiting to the Fund, all sums that may have been previously contributed by them; as well as what arrears are due at the period of their withdrawing.

32d.—These amended Rules and Regulations shall not be subject to any essential alteration, but continue in full force, for three years, from the 1st of January 1809; at the expiration of which period, they may again be revised by the Members, at the suggestion of the Managers, and such alterations then made as further experience shall have evinced to be necessary.

EXPLANATIONS.

Article 2d.—Exhibiting the Monthly Subscriptions to be paid by Officers of every rank respectively.

On this Article which is the most important of all, being that on which the efficiency and Security of the Fund depend, the Managers have bestowed the most diligent attention; and have deduced the quota of each rank by accurate calculation, from such data as it was in their power to obtain.

It is plain that the annual payments, of Members in each rank

must depend on four circumstances, the amount of the Pension to be enjoyed by the Widow, the age of the Husband, that of the Wife and the chances of life in the country where the parties live. Of these data, only the first is certain, and for the others we are under the necessity of taking the best approximation in our power. In a scheme like this, which takes equal subscriptions and gives equal pensions in any given rank, without regard to difference of age, we must take an average age in each rank. To obtain this, as nearly as possible, the average residence in India of Officers of each rank, has been taken from an Army list: supposing the average age at which young men enter the Service to be 17, that number was added to each of the others, and the result was as follows, Colonels 58, Lieutenant Colonels 50, Majors 42, Captains 34, Subalterns 24.

For the ages of the Wives our data is still more imperfect; but supposing that between Subalterns and their Wives there may be, on an average, a disparity of five years, and that this will naturally be greater in the higher ranks, the average ages of the Wives in each rank have been assumed as follows. The Wives of Colonels 38, those of Lieutenant Colonels 35, those of Majors 32, those of Captains 24, those of Subalterns 19:

No registers have hitherto been kept, that are capable of furnishing materials for calculating the chances of life in this Country; and, as the European population here is fluctuating, this would require a different method of calculation from that employed in Europe. For want of such materials, the Managers have been obliged to use some of the Tables adapted to places in Europe; and they have taken, as the most convenient, those derived from the Register kept at Northampton. Calculating then by these Tables, with the average ages of Husbands and their Wives in each rank as assumed above, they obtained the results exhibited in the following Table.

The numbers in the 5th Column exhibit, in integers and decimal parts, the sums, which at one payment would be necessary to secure to the Wife in each rank the pension, as payable in England, to the Widows in that rank. The next Column exhibits the same sums as diminished by the donations of each rank

respectively. The seventh Column contains the sum, which paid annually during marriage, will be equivalent to those sums paid down at once. The eighth and ninth Columns shew the Total annual Contributions of each rank, and exhibit the sum of 96,045 Sonaut Rupees as requisite from 249 Members. Now, as the Contributions of Un-married Subscribers and the extra Donations amount to Sicca Rupees 28,664, leaving 67,381 to be provided for by the monthly Subscriptions of Members, each of the numbers in the ninth Column has been reduced in that proportion, and these are exhibited in the tenth Column. These divided by the number of Members in each rank, give the numbers in the eleventh Column for the annual Subscription required from each; yielding Monthly ones so nearly approaching to those proposed in the paper already circulated to the Members, and which has been approved of by a Majority, that the Managers deem it unnecessary to propose any alteration, except the substitution of 25 instead of 24 as the Subscription of Majors, and 16 instead of 12 as that of Captains.

Articles 4th and 5th.—The alleviation of the monthly Subscriptions of Members described in the last paragraph, being derived from the contribution of unmarried Subscribers, it is reasonable and necessary that those who have not subscribed while unmarried, should pay for their share of that alleviation by extra donation, and that such donation should be gradually diminished according to the length of time during which any new Member may have subscribed while unmarried.

Art. 9th.—It having been remarked that many circumstances of hurry and want of information may prevent officers from signifying their desire to become Members of the Fund in so short a period as one month, and that the penalty operates as a hardship on such officers, the Managers hope that the extension of time here proposed will remove any such objections.

Art. 18th.—The Sum paid by a permanent Member, on his retiring ought to be equivalent to the continued payment of his annual contribution, during the joint lives of himself and his wife. Accordingly, the numbers in the first Column of the above table are found, by multiplying the values of the joint lives of husband and wife, at entering the Society (Col. 2 of the Table in the preceding Page) into the annual payments of each rank, and taking the nearest round number. This value of the joint lives continually decreases, as the parties have been longer members, and consequently advance in years; and, strictly speaking, the sums to be paid, after every period of five years, ought to be computed in the same manner, by finding the values of the joint lives at each of those periods. But as this would require a very laborious calculation, the following mode has been taken, as approaching near enough for practical use. Divide the sum

to be paid at entering by the value of the Husband's life at that time, and multiply the quotient by the value of his life at any subsequent time, to give the present value of the Contributions remaining to be paid to the end of his life. Thus, the average Ages of a Major and his wife, on entering the Society, are supposed to be 42 and 32. The value of their joint lives is 7,369. This multiplied into his annual Subscription gives 2210.7 Sonaut Rupees, as the value of his contributions, during the joint lives of himself and his wife.

Suppose I require the sum to be paid, if he wish to retire, after being a member for ten years; when his age, by supposition, will be 52.

In order to estimate, by one instance, how far the results of these calculations vary from those deduced more strictly, from the values of the joint lives of husband and wife, at any given period; let it be required what sum shall be paid by a Captain, a member of eight years standing.

In order to ascertain the pensions, to which the widows of those permanent members, who paid agreeably to the old regulations, are entitled; take the sums paid by them on retiring; and (as such Members have a right to share in the advantage obtained by the contributions of unmarried Subscribers and extra donations) augment those sums in the ratio of 67,381 to 96,045, (see page 337). Add the donation, and divide by the value of the widow's expectation; the quotient will be the amount of the pension, as in the following Table.

It will be satisfactory to examine, by this process, the sums above assigned, as payable by permanent members, under the new regulations. Let it be required what pension should be received by the widow of a Lieutenant Colonel, who has paid donation 600 Rupees and immediately retired paying Sonant Rupees

Art. 19.—To illustrate this rule by an example; suppose an officer at the age of 24 to have attained the rank of Captain, and go home as permanent Member, soon after his marriage, paying (as by the table) 1530 Rupees. Let him soon return to India, and by the time he is 30, be promoted to the rank of Major.

After remaining 10 years in that rank, suppose he is desirous of returning again to Europe, as a permanent Member. The whole sum payable by a Major of 10 years standing is 1970 Rupees, and his monthly contribution is 25. The Member about to retire pays monthly 9 rupees. Therefore 25:1970::9:709½; the sum which will entitle him to the privileges of a permanent member in his new rank.

Article 22d.—The abolition of all difference between pensions in India and in England, is a measure both of necessity and of equity; of necessity, because it appears clearly, both by our past experience and by the above calculations, that the Subscriptions, even on the enlarged scale now proposed (which are as high as the income of Officers can well bear), are insufficient to provide the pensions now allotted to Widows in India; and of equity, because it is unjust, that when two Members contribute equally to the fund, the widow of one should receive nearly twice as much as the widow of the other, merely because at her own option she remains in India, instead of proceeding to Europe.

On perusing the foregoing observations, it may probably occur, that the present funded property of the Society has not been taken into the account, but the Committee of Managers are very sorry to remark, that the present fund, though it amounts to 2,10,000 Sicca Rupees, is not nearly sufficient to pay the Pensions of the Widows at present on the establishment, as will be evident from the following statement. In the first place, there must be deducted from the funded property the amount of the donations of 240 members, viz. St. Rupees 89,550 or Sicca Rupees 85,690, leaving only 1,24,310 Sicca Rupees, to provide for the pensions of the Widows at present on the establishment.

The amount of the present pensions payable in England, is £5162,5 which supposing the widows to average 33 years, requires a capital of £48620, or Sicca Rupees 3,88,960. Now as 3,88,960:£5162,5::1,24,310:£1649,91 or Sicca Rupees 13,199,28 which being deducted from 41,300 Sicca Rupees, the whole amount of the pensions, leaves an annual deficiency of 28,100,28 or £. sterling 3512,59.

If then the Pensions of the present Widows should be continued at the rate payable in England, there will be occasion for extraordinary aid to the amount of 2,64,650 Rupees. In the hope of obtaining this aid, through the Patronage of Government and the liberality of the Army, the Committee of Managers have deter-

mined not to propose a reduction of the pensions of the present Widows below the English standard, till they can judge whether they are likely to obtain extraordinary aid or not. They feel it however their duty to observe, that they cannot long defer proposing this painful measure, as the longer it is delayed the greater the reduction must eventually be.

The Committee, in order to cut off all fallacious hopes founded on the proposed increase of Monthly Subscriptions, deem it necessary to observe, that the new plan proposed, is barely adequate to the maintenance of *future* Widows (on the supposition that the assumed data shall prove nearly correct) but cannot afford any assistance to those at present on the foundation, who must depend entirely on the *present* fund, together with such extraneous aid as has been already alluded to. Indeed, it would be unjust to tax the present Members for the maintenance of those Widows who have already come upon the Society's books, nor could they in general bear such increase of Monthly Subscriptions as would answer the purpose.

Before they conclude, the Managers are desirous of obviating an objection which may arise from the above statement. It may be said, that as the former contributions, even with the aid of the original donations by Patrons, of 22,650 Sicca Rupees, have proved inadequate to afford more than about one third part of the stipulated pensions, the Subscriptions now proposed, which, without such aid, are only about double the former, will not afford the full pensions. But it is to be recollected, that a considerable majority of the Widows, by remaining in India, were hitherto drawing about double their English pensions, which necessarily tended in a high degree to reduce the capital, and that this cause of deficiency will no longer exist.

Art. 31.—The equity of this article is so obvious, that, implied or expressed, it must have a place in every fund of this nature; and its insertion appears merely requisite to remove any shadow of doubt, that might possibly exist.

Those who have been hitherto members, have received the value of their contributions, in the security, that had they died in any part of the period elapsed, their widows would have been supported by the fund. The subscriptions of every year provide for the widows who enter in that year; and consequently, the survivors can have no possible claim on such subscriptions.

Any UNMARRIED OFFICER becoming a Subscriber shall, upon his marriage, pay up the additional donation attaching to Subscribers who are married; that is, he shall pay ten day's allowance of the rank he may then hold.

Any Officer proceeding to Europe on Sick Certificate, in conformity to the existing Regulations of the Government of Fort St. George, or such as may be hereafter framed (always provided that the declaration of two Surgeons, upon oath, shall certify a voyage to England to be in their judgment absolutely necessary for the recovery of his health) such Officer not being provided with passage-money, by the Regulations of the Service shall, on making oath that he does not possess the means of paying for his passage, be entitled to receive from the Military Fund the passage-money regulated for his rank, and on a similar declaration, on oath, to the Agents in England, he shall be entitled, on his return to India, to receive the sum regulated for the outward passage.

Any Officer so proceeding to Europe on Sick Certificate, being provided with a passage, either at the public expense, or as above recited, who shall moreover make oath that he does not possess the means of purchasing the requisite clothing and equipment for the voyage, shall be entitled to receive from the Fund a farther sum not exceeding 200 pagodas; but not to any further sum on account of equipment on his return to India.

Officers who may proceed to England on Sick Certificate, after having served four years in India, and who shall make oath, that they do not possess property which will produce an income, including their pay, equal, if a Subaltern to £140, or if a Captain Lieutenant to £160, shall be allowed such sum annually, as with their pay and other income will make up £160 to a Captain Lieutenant, or £140 to a Subaltern during the period of furlough, as regulated by the Court of Directors.

Advances from the Fund cannot be granted to any Subscriber coming home on furlough, while in the receipt of India allowances; but he will be entitled to relief from the Fund, during the full period of such allowances being at English rate.

Cowries or sea shells, made use of for paying coolies, &c. are reckoned thus:

SILVER.

The old Bombay Rupee is the same as was coined at Surat under the Mogul Government.

It weighed 178,314 grains, and contained 1,24 per cent. of alloy. By an ancient agreement with the Nabob of Surat, the Rupee of both Governments was to circulate through both, at an equal value; while they mutually pledged themselves to keep up the coin to its exact standard of fineness and weight. The Nabob however did not keep to this agreement, for his Rupees were found soon afterwards to contain, instead of 1,24 per cent. of alloy, no less than 10,12, and even 15 per cent. The consequence of this was, that all the Bombay Rupees were carried to Surat to be re-coined, this mint was entirely stopped in its silver coinage for more than 20 years, and the whole of the circulation of silver was occupied by the Surat Rupee.

In this situation of things, the merchants could not afford to coin their bullion here, and Bombay was long without a silver coinage of its own; when Government, in 1800, ordered the Surat Rupee to be struck in this mint, and since that time the Rupees have been kept at an equal value in both mints. In both, the silver Rupee weighs 179 grains, and contains 7,97 per cent. of alloy.

GOLD.

In the year 1774 the gold Mohur was made of the same weight with the silver Rupee; it was ordered to be of the fineness of a Venetian, and to pass for 15 silver Rupees. In this coinage therefore 14,9 grains of silver represented one grain of gold; for such is the proportion between the quantity of gold in this gold Mohur, and the silver in 15 old Bombay Rupees. When the Surat silver cur-

rency had occupied our circulation, this proportion, between gold and silver, was quite destroyed; so that gold coined according to the regulation of 1774, was now exchanged for no more than 13 times its weight of silver, and often for much less.

In order to remedy this, and to bring back the coins of gold and silver to nearly their ancient proportions, and their relative value in the market, it was ordered in 1800, that the gold Mohur should be of the same weight as the silver Rupee, that it should contain the same quantity of alloy, and that it should pass for 15 Rupees. At present, therefore, in our coins, 15 grains of silver represent one of gold.

Coins of gold have never circulated as a coin either at Surat or in the Mahratta states on this side of India. They are occasionally carried to those parts, but it is only as bullion.

The following Table was drawn from actual assays; the first column contains the alloy in one hundred parts of each of the different coins; the second column contains their weight in grains. From these two columns the value of the whole of the coins may easily and with perfect accuracy, be ascertained.

Although the foregoing tables represent the commonly received standard of the gross weights at Bombay and Surat, it is not only impossible to lay down a rule whereby to judge what commodities in the market are separately governed by them; but there is a great variety of articles, too numerous to distinguish here, in the sale of which the foregoing relations do not obtain, particularly with respect to the *Surat Maund*, which, notwithstanding it is said to contain only 40 Seers, or 37 Pounds, 7 Ounces, and 6 Drams, is sometimes 41, 2, 3, through all the intermediate gradations up to 46 Seers: nor is the Candy uniformly confined to 20 Maunds: for example, Pepper and Sandalwood are sold by the *Bombay Candy* of 21 Maunds, and Cotton, the great staple commodity of their market, by the *Surat Candy* of 21 Maunds.

Gold is bought by 10 tale weight, for upon that quantity they make their price in silver.

When gold is sold above or under touch, you must add to, or subtract from the touch. As if it touch 96, and is to be sold at 4, under touch, then from 96 take 4 the remainder is 92; then is 9, two-tenths of silver to be paid for one of that of gold. If gold is at 96 touch, and to be sold at 8 above touch, then add 8 to 96, the sum is 104; then are 10, four-tenths of silver to be paid for one of gold.
