Reports required to be made by Officers arriving at the Presidency from Europe or the Interior; and Forms of application for proceeding to Europe, &c. &c.

OFFICERS ARRIVING FROM ENGLAND.

Will report themselves at the Office of the Adjutant General of the Army, to whom they will deliver their Certificate of Permission from the Honorable the Court of Directors, to return to their duty in India. They will also report their arrival (if at the Presidency) to the Town Major of Fort St. George. It is the duty of every Officer coming to the Presidency, to attend the first Levee of His Excellency the Commander in Chief after their arrival.

MEDICAL DO.

Will in addition, report themselves at the Office of the Medical Board, where they will deliver their Certificates, or Indentures.

OFFICERS ARRIVING AT THE PRESIDENCY IN CHARGE OF TREASURE.

Will attend on the day of their arrival at the Office of the Adjutant General, and the Quarter Master General of the Army, with a present State of their Detachment; they will also report themselves to the Town Major of Fort St. George.

OFFICERS ARRIVING AT THE PRESIDENCY ON LEAVE OF ABSENCE, OR ON SICK CERTIFICATE.

Will report their arrival either personally, or in writing, to the Adjutant General of the Army, and Town Major of Fort St. George, stating particularly their place of residence.

Officers not belonging to the Garrison of Fort St. George, will deliver their Passports at the Adjutant General's Office.

MEDICAL DO.

Will in addition report themselves, at the Office of the Medical Board.

OFFICERS ARRIVING AT THE PRESIDENCY ON SICK CERTIFICATE, WHOSE CORPS ARE ON ACTUAL FIELD SERVICE.

Are required by the 24th and 25th Paragraphs of the 2d Section of the Code of Pay Regulations, under the Head "Batta" to report their arrival, by letter, to the Military Auditor General—A Certificate is also required from the Quarter Master General to accompany the Abstracts for Batta allowed to Officers thus situated, provided that their Corps, remain on actual service in the Field.

MEDICAL DO.

Are required to observe the same instructions.

OFFICERS PROCEEDING TO EUROPE ON SICK CERTIFICATE.

Are required to address The Right Honorable the Governor in Council, enclosing the Medical Certificate, which is to be forwarded to the Commander in Chief under a flying seal; the whole to be transmitted to the Adjutant General of the Army by the Officer Commanding the Division or Force in which the Corps the Officer belongs to, may be serving; and through the Quarter Master General of the Army if he is attached to the Pioneers, or to any branch of the Quarter Master General's Department; and if attached to the Commissariat, thro' the Commissary General of the Army.

MEDICAL DO.

Are also required to observe the same form of address, but to be transmitted to the Medical Board by the Sq.

perintending, or Senior Surgeon of the Division, or Force in which the Corps the Officer belongs to, may be serving.

OFFICERS PROCEEDING TO EUROPE ON FURLOUGH.

*Are required to address The Right Honorable the Governor in Council, soliciting the furlough desired, which is to be forwarded to the Commander in Chief under a flying seal—the whole to be transmitted to the Adjutant General of the Army, by the Officer Commanding the Division, or Force in which the Corps the Officer belongs to, may be serving; and thro' the Quarter Master General of the Army, if he is attached to the Pioneers, or belongs to any branch of the Quarter Master General's Department; and if attached to the Commissariat thro' the Commissary General of the Army.

Officers proceeding to Europe on Furlough or Sick Certificate, after adjusting their accounts at the Pay Office, obtain a Certificate from the Accountant General that there are no demands against them, which they forward to the Adjutant General of the Army, stating the name of the Ship in which they have arranged for their passage, and requesting that the necessary Order may be obtained for their being received on board; which order (and the Accountant General's Certificate) will be forwarded to them by the Adjutant General.

The above applications should be made several days previous to the sailing of the Ships to prevent inconvenience and disappointment.

The Official Certificate of leave to proceed to Europe signed by the Secretary to Government in the Military Department will be received through the Adjutant General of the Army.

MEDICAL DO.

Are required to observe the same form of address, but to be transmitted to the Medical Board by the Superintending, or Senior Surgeon of the Division or Force, in which the Corps the Officer belongs to, may be serving.

When a Native Servant is taken Home, a deposit of 100 £ or 875 Rupees, must be lodged in the Treasury for each Servant to answer any expenses which the Government may incur on his or her account; and the Sub-Treasurer's receipt must be produced at the Office of the Civil Secretary to Government, before an order can be granted for the Servant being received on board.

When the Servant returns to India, or his or her demise being satisfactorily proved to the Sub-Treasurer, the deposit will be refunded.

OFFICERS PROCEEDING TO SEA OR VISITING THE LIMITS OF THE PRESIDENCY OF PORT ST. GEO. ON FURLOUGH, OR ON SICK CERTIFICATE.

Are required to report to the Adjutant General of the Army by letter the date of their departure—as also notify their return; Officers neglecting this duty will be considered as having taken their departure from the date of the General Order granting them permission, and their return from the date of the first official report announcing it.—Vide General Order of the Commander in Chief, 6th July 1815.

MEDICAL DO.

Are required to observe the same instructions.

OFFICERS VISITING THE PRESIDENCY OF THEIR CORPS, OR STATIONS.

Will receive their Passports from the Office of the Adjutant General of the Army, and report their intended departure, either personally or by letter, to the Adjutant General of the Army, and Town Major of Fort St. George—stating the day on which they intend to leave the Presidency.

MEDICAL DO.

Are required to observe the same instructions.

FEES ON COMMISSION.

In consequence of the resolution of Government, under date 4th April 1797—as published in the Code of Pay Regulations, Paragraph 6, Page 118.—all Officers who may obtain retrospective Rank of thirty days (or more) by their Commissions being antedated, are to pay the Fees of the new Commission out of the arrears of Pay and Allowances, which they now draw from the date of their Commissions respectively.

MOST HONORABLE MILITARY ORDER OF THE BATH.

INSTITUTED 1399; REVIVED 1725; EXTENDED 1815.

Motto, *Tria Juncta in Uno*—Riband, *Red*.

By statute, Jan. 2, 1815, it is ordained, "for the purpose of commemorating the auspicious termination of the long and arduous contests in which this Empire has been engaged," that the order shall be composed of three classes, viz.

1st CLASS.—To consist of Knights Grand Crosses, number not to exceed seventy-two, exclusive of the Sovereign and Princes of the Blood Royal; twelve of the number may be appointed for Civil and Diplomatic Services. This dignity not to be conferred upon any Officer (except the above twelve) who shall not have attained the rank of Major General in the Army, or Rear Admiral in the Navy, and must have been previously appointed to the second class.

2d CLASS.—Knights Commanders, number not to exceed, upon the first Institution, one hundred and eighty exclusive of foreign Officers, holding British Commissions, of whom not exceeding ten may be admitted as honorary Knights Commanders; in the event of actions of signal distinction, or of future wars, the number of this class may be increased. To be entitled to the distinctive appellation of Knighthood; to have the same rights and privileges as Knights Bachelors, but to take precedence of them; to wear the badge, &c. pendant by a red riband round the neck, the Star embroidered on the left side. No person is now eligible to this Class under the rank of Major General in the Army, or Rear Admiral in the Navy.

3d CLASS.—Companions of the Order; not limited in number; they are to take precedence of Esquires, but not entitled to the appellation, style, &c. of Knights Bachelors. To wear the badge assigned to the third Class, pendant by a narrow red riband to the button-hole. No Officer can be nominated unless he shall have received a medal, or other badge of honor, or shall have been especially mentioned in dispatches in the Gazette, as having distinguished himself in action.

The new badge for the military classes of the order, is a gold Maltese Cross, of eight points, enamelled argent in the four angles, a lion passant guardant, or, in the centre, the rose, thistle, and shamrock, issuant from a sceptre between three imperial crowns, or, within a circle, gules thereon the motto of the order, surrounded by two branches of laurel, proper, issuing from an escrol azure, inscribed *Ich Dien* in letters of gold, worn by the Grand Crosses pendant from a red riband across the right shoulder. The collar is of gold, weighing thirty ounces of troy weight, and is composed of nine imperial crowns, and eight roses, thistle and shamrock, issuing from a sceptre, enamelled in their proper colours, tied, or linked together with seventeen gold knots, enamelled white, having the badge of the order pendant thereto. The star of the Military Grand Crosses is formed of rays or flames of silver, thereon a gold Maltese Cross, and in the centre, within the motto, branches of laurel, issuant as above described, three imperial crowns of gold, and is worn on the left side.

The Civil Knights Grand Crosses retain the old badge and star of the order. No Knight can wear the collar before his installation.

The Star of the Commanders is in the form of a Cross patée, of Silver, having the same centre as the Grand Crosses, but no gold Maltese Cross thereon.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING FURLOUGH TO EUROPE.

Officers (of whatever Rank) must be ten years in India, before they can be entitled (except in case of certified sickness) to their rotation to be absent on furlough, and the same rule is applicable to Assistant Military Surgeons. The furlough to be granted by the Commander in Chief at each Presidency, with the approbation of the respective Government.

A Chaplain after seven years residence in India, is allowed to come home on furlough and receive the Pay of Major. Should he come home from sickness, prior to this period of Service, he is allowed the pay of Captain only.

A Conductor of Stores is allowed furlough pay, only in case of coming home from sickness.

The period of furlough is three years, reckoning from its date to the day of the return of the Officer to his Presidency.

G. O. BY GOVERNMENT.

FORT ST. GEORGE, April 10, 1821.

In order fully to inform the Officers upon this Establishment of the existing regulations with respect to Furlough to Europe as well as to check the practice which, to a certain extent, has lately prevailed, of Military Officers postponing their return to their duty for a period longer than is compatible with the good of the Service, the following Extract from a Letter from the Honorable the Court of Directors, under date the 13th of September 1820, is published to the Army.

"Officers coming to England on Furlough are required, as soon as they arrive, to report their arrival and address by Letter, to our Secretary; forwarding, at the same time, the Certificates which they received in India.

"In all cases of Furlough, whether it be granted for private affairs, or on sick certificate, Officers are required to join the Establishment to which they belong at the expiration of three years from the commencement of their furlough, unless they shall have obtained an extension of leave from us six months before the expiration of the said term of three years."

"Extensions of Furlough will not in future be granted except in cases of sickness, certified in the manner prescribed in our Despatch of the 3d January 1817, or in cases in which it shall be proved to us, that a further residence in Europe is indispensably necessary.

"When, under any such circumstances, an Officer shall have obtained an extension of furlough to a given period, he must at the expiration thereof, apply for and obtain permission, either to return to his duty or to reside a further term in Europe.

"The Act of the 33d Geo. 3d, Cap. 52, Sec. 70, as it respects Military Officers, applies only to cases of sickness, infirmity or inevitable accident, and no Officers will be hereafter considered eligible to return to the Service after five years absence, under that enactment, who has failed to obtain from us agreeable to the foregoing regulations an extension of Furlough under the circumstances referred to in the Act.

"The plea of ignorance of the Regulations will not hereafter be admitted as any justification of the breach of them, but Officers who shall come home on Furlough and who shall not, in due time, apply so as to effect their return to the Presidency to which they belong, within the period of three years from the commencement of their furlough, will subject themselves to the loss of the Service unless they shall be permitted by us to remain a further time in this Country."

EXTRACT from the Honorable Company's General Letter to Fort St. George, in the Military Department, dated the 3d January 1817,—published in General Orders on the 8th July 1817.

Para. 10.—Adverting to the frequent applications made to us by Military Officers for an extension of Furlough, and being of opinion that all such applications preferred on the ground of sickness, should be accompanied by the most satisfactory testimonials to prove that the parties are unavoidably compelled to make the same, we have resolved that it be required of all Officers whenever they shall find it necessary on account of sickness to solicit a further leave of absence, to transmit with their letter of application, a certificate signed by at least two Gentlemen, eminent in the Medical Profession, describing the nature of the applicant's complaint, and stating it to be their opinion that the circumstances of the case, render a compliance with his request absolutely necessary; also, that, previously to an extension of Furlough being granted, such further proof of the statement made by the party in support of his application, shall be adduced by personal examination, or by such other evidence as we may deem satisfactory.

11.—We have further resolved, that all Officers abroad in any part of Europe applying for permission to remain a further time absent from their duty, on account of sickness, be required to furnish a Certificate signed by at least two eminent Physicians, also the attestation of a Magistrate in support of the fact, that the persons who have signed the Certificate are Physicians.

12.—Whenever any Officer on your Establishment shall receive permission to come to Europe, whether it be on account of ill health, or of private affairs, we desire you to furnish him with a Copy of these Orders.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING PASSAGE MONEY TO AND FROM EUROPE.

At a COURT of DIRECTORS, held on Wednesday, the 6th June 1804.

RESOLVED.—That upon the Friends of each Cadet paying the regular amount of his passage money to the Company's Paymaster, such Cadet be required to sign a declaration, upon honour, that he has not paid, or cause to be paid, nor will not pay, or cause to be paid, either directly or indirectly, by himself, or by any person on his behalf, any further sum for his accommodation, either to the Commander or Mate, than those prescribed by the Court's Regulations.

That in the event of its appearing at any future time, that a further sum shall have been paid by, or for any Cadet, such Cadet will be placed at the bottom of the list of rank of the Season in which he was appointed; and That these last mentioned Regulations be printed and delivered to each Cadet, upon his appearing before the Court, to be approved.

At a COURT of DIRECTORS, held on Wednesday, the 11th July 1810.

RESOLVED.—That the following Regulation be established, respecting the passage and accommodation of persons of the undermentioned descriptions, to and from India, on the Ships in the Company's Service.

FOR THE PASSAGE FROM ENGLAND.

That the Commanders be not permitted to demand more than the under-mentioned sums, for the passage and accommodation at their Tables of Gentlemen proceeding to India, in the Company's Service, at their own expense, in the following stations :

That the Third Mates be likewise restrained from demanding more than the sum of £55, for the accommodation of any Assistant Surgeon or Cadet, who may proceed at their Mess to India, exclusive of the Charter Party Allowance to the owners.

That in order more effectually to prevent more than the allowance aforesaid being taken from Writers, Subaltern Officers, Assistant Surgeons and Cadets, the several sums stipulated for the outward-bound passage of those persons, whether the two latter shall be at the Captain's table or Third Mate's Mess, shall be paid by them respectively, to the Paymaster of Seamen's Wages; and the order for the reception of any person, in either of those stations, on board any of the Ships in the Company's Service, shall not be delivered, until they shall have produced the Paymaster's receipt for the amount so ordered to be paid him: and that the several allowances hereby directed to be deposited in his hands, be paid to the Commander, or to the Third Mate, or their respective Agents, properly authorized to receive the same.

That the Commanders be not permitted to demand more than the following sums, for the accommodation at their tables of Officers, in His Majesty's Service, proceeding to India in the following stations, viz.

That the Commanders of the Company's Regular Ships, be each constrained to receive on Board their respective Ships at least two Officers, of the description above-mentioned, returning to Europe, and that the larboard third

part of the great cabin, with the passage to the quarter gallery taken off, be appropriated to their accommodation.

That the Commanders of the Company's Extra Ships shall be likewise constrained to receive on board one Officer returning to Europe of the before-mentioned description, and that such Officer be accommodated with a cabin, on the starboard side abaft the Chief Mate's cabin, and abreast of the spirit room, of not less dimensions than seven feet long, and six feet wide.

That in the event of the return of the whole of one of His Majesty's Regiments to Europe the Governments in India shall, in such case allot the whole, or such part of the great cabin of each Ship for the accommodation of the Officers, as the Governments may deem proper, due notice thereof being given to the Commanders: and that the sums to be paid for the passage of each Officer be the same as those above stated for Officers returning on Military duty.

That the Commanders be not permitted to demand more than the following sums for the passage and accommodation at their Tables from India, of the following Gentlemen, who shall be certified by the Governor and Council to be under the necessity of returning to England, viz.

That in case any Commander shall, by any ways or means, directly or indirectly, either in England, or India, take or receive any further sum or sums of Money, or other gratuity or satisfaction, for the passage of any Writer, Subaltern Officer, Assistant Surgeon, or Cadet, to or from India, such Commander shall forfeit and pay to the Company, for the use of Poplar Hospital, treble the sum so taken beyond the sums before mentioned; and for the purpose of making himself liable to and securing such payment, the Commander of every Ship in the Company's Service, shall, before he is sworn in, give bond to the Company, in the penalty of one Thousand Pounds.

That if any third Mate should directly or indirectly, either demand or receive from any Assistant Surgeon or Cadet, accommodated at his Mess, a larger sum than the rate fixed by these regulations, he be fined treble the amount of the excess, for the use of Poplar Hospital, and that such fine be deducted from his wages, or his account of private trade, as the Court may direct.

That the several sums above-mentioned be established for the passage outward and homeward, of the several persons of the descriptions above stated; and that the same do apply only to such accommodations as those persons are respectively entitled to, under the existing Regulations of the Company; and that any additional accommodation or cabin may be engaged for with the Commander, and paid for separately, without being considered as a deduction from the sum fixed by the Court, for the passage Money of each person.

REGULATIONS respecting the EMBARKATION of BAGGAGE proceeding to EUROPE.

ADVERTISEMENT,

MARINE DEPARTMENT,

Notice is hereby given, that an Office for the Survey and Shipment of the Baggage of Passengers proceeding to England on the Honourable Company's Ships, has been established, by order of Government, at this Presidency, and that Mr. GASCORNE has been appointed, under the designation of Surveyor of Baggage, to superintend the duties of the said Office.

The following rules which have been framed for the guidance of the Surveyor, are published for general information.

Gentlemen proceeding to England in the undermentioned Stations, are restricted from taking with them a larger tonnage of Baggage and Stores than the following, exclusive of their Bedding, a Table, and a Sofa or two Chairs, for their respective Cabins, viz.

Gentlemen proceeding to England in either of the above-mentioned Stations, who may be permitted to carry home their families, are restricted from taking more tonnage than one half of the preceding allowance in addition, as the Ladies' Baggage.

Married Ladies proceeding to their Husbands in England, are restricted from taking more than two-thirds of the Tonnage prescribed for a Gentleman of the same rank as their Husbands.

Writers, Lieutenants, Ensigns, and other Cabin Passengers are restricted from taking a larger quantity of baggage and stores than one ton each, exclusive of their Bedding, a Table and Sofa or two Chairs.

Married Ladies proceeding to their Husbands in England of either of these last mentioned descriptions, are restricted from taking more than a similar quantity of baggage.

Gentlemen of these last mentioned descriptions who may be permitted to carry home their Wives, are restricted from taking more than one Ton in addition as the Ladies' Baggage.

Single Ladies are restricted from taking more than the same quantity of Baggage and cabin furniture.

Passengers not in the King's or Company's service, will, on application to the Marine Board, be informed of the quantity of baggage allowed to be shipped for them, freight free.

The Surveyor shall measure the square contents of all packages, &c.; the Packages shall be shipped in communication with the Commanding Officer on board, at such times as may be most convenient and agreed upon. Charter Party freight shall be charged on all baggage surplus to the established allowance of the respective ranks in the King's and Company's Service—the Surveyor shall report to the Marine Board such excess of baggage, with the name of the parties and computed tonnage thereof, in order that freight may be collected on the same.

A Warehouse is allotted to the Surveyor near the Custom House for the reception of baggage within the hours of nine A. M. and five P. M. during the time of despatch.

No baggage shall be shipped, without a permit from the Surveyor, describing the number, nature, and tonnage of the baggage of each Party.

All baggage shall be shipped previous to the Survey of the Ships for final despatch, and no permit granted afterwards.

Each person, on his final departure, is permitted to take with him a small Trunk and an Esacutoire under his own custody.

To meet the contingent expenses of the Office, a fee at the rate of five Pagodas per ton of 40 cubical feet, shall be levied from the parties, on obtaining from the Surveyor a receipt for their baggage.

No Package shall be received, without a direction, and unless the name of the Ship to which it is to be sent be distinctly written upon it.

Baggage, if left to be shipped by the Surveyor, will be sent on board without additional expense to the Parties.

Each child is allowed half a ton baggage.

REGULATIONS respecting the CLEARANCE of BAGGAGE at the INDIA-HOUSE.

EXTRACT of a GENERAL LETTER from ENGLAND in the COMMERCIAL DEPARTMENT, dated 7th September 1838.

Para. 229.—In our letter of the 31st October 1799, we informed you that we had appointed Messrs. Hyde and Marter, Clerks in our Accountant's Office, to act as Agents in the Clearance of Baggage, Wines, and Presents, from the Company's Warehouses, and that we had been induced to appoint from our own Servants to conduct this business, in order that they might be accountable to us for the propriety of their conduct.—The increase which has taken place in the Civil and Military Establishments of our several Presidencies, and the consequently augmented number of persons returning to Europe, have determined us to make a separate department for the purpose of clearing Baggage, Wines and Presents, and we have appointed Mr. William Marter and Mr. William Evans to be Warehouse-keepers of baggage, subject to our immediate inspection and control, and we have made such arrangements with His Majesty's Board of Customs for ascertaining and paying the duties on baggage, &c. as will ensure the greatest possible despatch in the delivery of the articles to the respective proprietors.

230. We have also sanctioned a table of fees and allowances to be received for the discharge of this duty and for re-imbursing the expenses attending it, and we have prohibited the Baggage Warehouse-keepers from receiving any other than the authorized allowances, upon pain of our severest displeasure.

231. As we have erected this establishment for the sole purpose of the convenience of our Servants and others who may return to Europe, we direct that our intentions in this respect be made public, and be constantly affixed up in the export offices of our several Presidencies, and that it be signified to all our Servants returning to Europe, that it is our desire that they apply to our said Warehouse-keepers Messrs. Marter and Evans, to clear and to our said Warehouse-keepers Messrs. Wines and Presents, as we have directed Messrs. Marter and Evans, to transact every branch of business connected with this department, which will render the agency of all other persons unnecessary.

232. Passengers arriving from India are liable to inconvenience from being ignorant of the law which prohibits Calicoes being printed, painted, or stained or dyed, and also silk goods from being worn or used in this country, and such goods altho' made into apparel are of necessity taken out of their Baggage and detained by the Officers of the Revenue; We direct therefore, that notice hereof be made generally public, and further that napkins, &c. which contain a coloured stripe however small, are considered to be prohibited and cannot be passed in England as part of their baggage.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING MILITARY OFFICERS RETIRING FROM THE COMPANY'S SERVICE.

EVERY Officer after twenty five years service in India, three years for one furlough being included, is allowed to retire with the Pay of the Rank to which he has attained; but such pay is to be the same only as that allowed to Officers of Infantry.

A Member of the Medical Board, who has been in that station not less than two years, and not less than twenty years in India, including three years for one furlough, is permitted to retire from the service, and allowed £500 per annum.

A Surgeon of a General Hospital, or Superintending Surgeon who has been in that station not less than two years, and whose period of service has been not less than twenty years, including three years for one furlough, as above, is permitted to retire from the Service, and allowed £300 per annum for life.

All other Surgeons and Assistant Surgeons, attached to the Military, are permitted to retire from the Service on the pay of their Rank, after having served in India not less than twenty years, including three years for one furlough.

A Chaplain after eighteen years Service, (ten of which at a Military Station,) including three years for one furlough, is allowed to retire with the pay of Major.

A Chaplain having served ten years in India, whose constitution will not admit of his continuing in the service, may retire on the half pay of Major, after seven years on the half pay of Captain.

A Commissary, or Deputy Commissary of Ordnance, not being a Commissioned Officer, is allowed to retire on full pay, if he has served twenty seven years in India, of which twelve must have been in the Ordnance Department, twenty five years, fourteen of which in that Department; or twenty two years, seventeen years of which in the Ordnance Department.

A Conductor of Stores is allowed to retire on £60 per annum after twenty five years actual Service in India.

Every Lieutenant Colonel, Major, Captain, or Captain Lieutenant is allowed to retire with the half Pay of the Rank to which he has attained, in case his health shall not permit him to serve in India.

A Lieutenant having served thirteen, or an Ensign nine years in India, including three years for a furlough, may retire on the half Pay of his Rank, in case his health shall not permit him to serve in India.

A Subaltern Officer, or Military Assistant Surgeon, having served six years in India, is permitted to retire on the half Pay of Ensign, if his constitution should be so impaired as to prevent the possibility of his continuing in India.

Every Officer returning on furlough, and wishing to retire from the Service, must make a declaration to that effect, within twelve months after his arrival in England; and in case of his neglecting so to do, he must at the expiration of his furlough, either return to India, or be held to have relinquished the Service, and not be entitled to retire on pay, unless he has continued to serve in India, from his first arrival, for the space of twenty two years, without having a furlough, in that case he is allowed two years before he shall be called upon to signify his intention of retiring, but he can only be allowed the Pay of the Rank he held at the expiration of twelve months from his arrival in Europe.

Officers retiring from the Service after two years furlough, will be considered to have retired at the expiration of two years from the date of their landing in England, unless they shall have previously obtained an extension of their furlough, and Officers who shall retire after having obtained an extension of furlough, will be considered to have retired from the date of the expiration of such additional furlough, or from the time when the requests of such Officers to retire or resign, are laid before the Court, whichever shall happen first.

REGULATIONS for the Management of the MADRAS MILITARY FUND.

SECTION I.

ADMISSION OF SUBSCRIBERS.

ART. I. The following description of persons, and they alone, are eligible to become Subscribers to the Madras Military Fund.

- 1st. Officers or Cadets in the Military Service of the Honorable Company, under the Presidency of Madras.
- 2d. Chaplains on the Madras Establishment.
- 3d. Officers of the Medical Establishment, under the Presidency of Madras.
- 4th. Officers of the Madras Establishment, belonging to the Senior List.

ART. II. Cadets or Officers, shall be admissible as Subscribers, without paying any arrears, provided that they signify their wish to become Subscribers, within six months after the date of the G. O. admitting them on the Establishment.

ART. III. Chaplains and Medical Officers who may signify their wish to become Subscribers within six months after the date of the G. O. admitting them on the Establishment, shall be admissible on the same terms as Cadets and Officers, provided they are not Married, and have not any legitimate Offspring.*—But Chaplains or Medical Officers, being married or having legitimate Offspring, shall be required, (provided their application be made within six months, as above,) to pay the Donation and Subscription of their actual Rank, as married; with arrears to be calculated from the date of the G. O. admitting them on the Establishment, or from the date of the birth of the eldest surviving Child, if the latter date be anterior, such arrears to be paid with interest accumulated half yearly.

ART. IV. Individuals of the descriptions enumerated in the 1st Art, who may not have signified their wish to become Subscribers, within six months after their admission on the Establishment, shall only be admissible as Subscribers on the following conditions.

1st. That the application for admission be accompanied by the Certificate of two Surgeons upon oath, that the Person desiring to subscribe is then to the best of their knowledge in good health, this Certificate being confirmed by the declaration to the same effect, also on oath, of the Person so applying to be admitted.

2d. That Donation and arrears of Subscription according to the Rank at the time of admission be paid with compound interest on those sums accumulated half yearly.—The arrears to commence from the date of the institution of the Fund, or from the entrance of the Person into the Service, if subsequent to the institution of the Fund, and in the case of a Candidate having legitimate Offspring, from the birth of the eldest surviving child, if prior to either of the foregoing periods.

ART. V. A Subscriber withdrawing from the Fund, forfeits, *ipso facto*, all claims to its benefits, as also the amount of his Donation and Subscription, and all other sums which he may have paid, up to the period of his secession. Should he afterwards be desirous of again becoming a Subscriber, he will be admissible on the same terms as a new Subscriber, as described in the fourth Article.

ART. VI. Subscribers who may retire from the Service, or who may return permanently to Europe, shall not forfeit their title as Subscribers, to the eventual benefits of the Fund, provided they continue the regular payments of monthly subscription equal to one day's pay of the Rank they had attained at the period of retiring, calculated at the English rate.

* NOTE.—This regulation has been introduced for the purpose of obtaining some equivalent from those Subscribers who may enter the Service at an advanced age with families, consequently is not applicable to Cadets, who are not admissible to the Service at an advanced age.

SECTION II.

DONATIONS AND SUBSCRIPTIONS TO BE PAID TO THE MADRAS MILITARY FUND.

ART. I. All Persons subscribing to the Madras Military Fund, shall pay a Donation or Premium upon entering into the Fund; equal to 30 days Pay if unmarried, and 60 days pay if married, calculated at the rate of Garrison allowances received by Officers of Infantry; and shall also allot for the support of the Fund, so long as they shall continue Subscribers, one day's pay and allowances in each month if unmarried, and the pay and allowances of one day and half if married, calculated as above, agreeably to the following Tables.—Widowers having legitimate Offspring to be considered and to pay as married. The Donation and Subscription of Cadets to be calculated on the Rank of Ensign.

ART. II. The subscription of General Officers and Colonels on the Senior List to be the same as that of Colonels.

ART. III. The donation may be paid at once, or by monthly instalments not exceeding eighteen, at the option of the Subscriber. If the Subscriber, however, be promoted during the payment of these instalments, he must pay all instalments subsequent to the date of that promotion, at the rate of the donation of the higher Rank.

ART. IV. Subscribers who may have applied to the Secretary for permission to subscribe within six months after their admission on the Establishment, will be entitled at any time to the benefits of the Fund.

ART. V. But although a period of eighteen months is also granted as an indulgence for the payment of the donation and arrears of subscription due by a person who may not have applied to subscribe to the Fund within six months after his admission on the establishment; it is to be clearly understood that any arrears either of donation or subscription at the period of the death of such Subscriber, or at the date of the sick certificate on which he may have obtained leave to proceed to Europe, shall be deemed a forfeiture of all claims upon the Fund either for himself or family.

ART. VI. Nevertheless on the death of any Subscriber whose family may be excluded from the benefit of the Fund by the preceding Paragraph, such family will be entitled to receive from the Fund the full amount of subscription with interest, accumulated half yearly, that may have been paid by the Subscriber on whose behalf they claim, provided the subscription shall not have been previously forfeited under the 5th Article of this Section.

ART. VII. Donation is in no case to be returned.

ART. VIII. All Subscribers marrying after their admission into the Fund, and who may be desirous that their Widows or Children shall possess claims to the eventual benefits of the Fund, are required to inform the Secretary of their marriage and of the payment of the additional donation; and unless this information be given and payment of the additional donation made within six months after such marriage; the Subscriber shall be required to pay double the amount with interest added half yearly.*

ART. IX. An arrear, not sanctioned by the 3d and 5th Paragraphs of this Section, of six months instalments of donation, or of subscription, shall subject the Subscriber owing it, to the payment of double the amount of the arrear (unless it shall be made to appear to the satisfaction of the Directors that such arrear arose from unavoidable accident), and in failure of the payment of the forfeitures specified in this and the preceding paragraph within twelve months after it shall be demanded, to the exclusion of himself and family from the benefits of the Fund.

ART. X. Subscribers who may be in the actual receipt of any periodical aid from the Fund, shall during such period be exempted from the payment of monthly subscription.

ART. XI. Subscribers who may be prevented from drawing pay by a temporary cause, such as captivity, extended furlough, suspension from pay, or the like, shall during such period be exempted from the payment of monthly subscription without forfeiture of the rights of the subscription, but upon the removal of such incapacity, and upon the receipt of pay, the subscription is to be made good at the rate of one thirtieth part of any arrears of regimental Garrison pay and allowances so received, or of the amount of arrears due to the Fund.

SECTION III.

PERSONS ENTITLED TO THE BENEFITS OF THE FUND.

ART. I. The Persons entitled to claim the benefits of the Madras Military Fund are,
1st. All Subscribers to the Fund, for such benefits as are personal, under the restrictions prescribed by the Regulations.

* NOTE.—This Article is applicable to the Marriage of Widowers, as well as to that of Bachelors.

2d. All Widows and legitimate Children of those who were Subscribers and were married on the 1st of April 1808, and the Children of such previous marriages are entitled, without distinction, to the full benefits of the Fund, either in quality of Orphans, or in future as Widows.

ART. II. With regard to marriages contracted subsequent to the 1st of April 1808, it shall be an indispensable qualification that both the Parents of any and every Claimant shall have been European or of unmixed European blood, though born in other quarters of the world; four removes from an Asiatic or African being considered as European blood.

ART. III. Legitimate Children of those who were married Subscribers on the 1st April 1808 (provided they be the offspring of such marriages), as also the legitimate descendants of those Children shall be entitled to the full benefits of the Fund either as Orphans or hereafter as Widows, notwithstanding the restriction contained in the preceding Article.

ART. IV. Marriages, subsequent to the 1st April 1808, with Persons of mixed blood (who may not be included in the third Article), exclude the Widow and Children from the benefits of the Fund; but Subscribers contracting such marriage will continue to enjoy all the personal advantages of the Fund, and will besides have the option of paying the additional donation on marriage; which payment, and the continuance of subscription will entitle the Widow and Children of such Subscriber to receive from the Fund the amount of nett subscription paid by him with compound interest, accumulating half yearly, after deducting therefrom with similar interest, the amount of any advances which he may have previously received from the Fund on account of sickness or other cause.

SECTION IV.

BENEFITS DERIVABLE FROM THE MADRAS MILITARY FUND.

ART. I. The benefits derivable from the Military Fund are two-fold.

1st. Such as are granted by the Regulations to Subscribers while living.

2d. Such as are granted to the Widows and legitimate Children of deceased Subscribers.

ART. II. The benefit granted to Subscribers while alive are considered personal, and subject to the decision of the Directors for the time being; who will be guided in their decision on each claim, by the Regulations of the Fund, except when they have reason to entertain doubts with respect to any such claim. It will in such cases be their duty to call for further information from the Claimant; and if this information should not be satisfactory to the Directors, they are authorized to withhold the payment of the claim until the pleasure of the Army at large be known, to whom the case will be immediately referred.

ART. III.—A Subscriber who may proceed to Europe on sick certificate, in conformity to the Regulations of the Army, and who may not be allowed passage money by Government shall be authorized to apply to the Military Fund for the passage money regulated for his Rank.

Vide Form No. 3 of the Appendix. provided his application shall be accompanied by a Declaration on oath that he does not possess the means of paying for his passage; and also shall be entitled on his return to India to receive from the Agents in England, the sum regulated for the outward passage on the production of a similar Affidavit.

ART. IV.—A Subscriber, so proceeding to England on sick certificate, shall be authorized to apply for the further sum of Pagodas 200 for his equipment, his application being accompanied by an Affidavit of his not possessing funds for the purpose; *Vide Form No. 4 of the Appendix.* but no allowance will in any case be made for equipment to a Subscriber returning to India.

ART. V. Subscribers proceeding to England on sick certificate who shall make oath that they do not possess property which will produce an annual income, including their pay, equal if a Subaltern to £140, or if a Captain Lieutenant to £160, shall be allowed such sum annually, as, with their pay and other income, will make up 160£ to a Captain Lieutenant, or £110 to a

Subaltern, during the period of receiving English pay on furlough, as regulated by the Court of Directors.

ART. VI.—Much inconvenience having arisen from the unrestricted grant of the personal benefits above enumerated, it has been found necessary to set limits to the claims for gratuitous passage money, equipment allowance, and income to Subscribers proceeding to England on sick certificate. No Subscriber, therefore, shall be eligible to such indulgence more than once in eight years, but in cases of urgent sickness which may occur within that period, the Directors will be competent to grant a Loan under the Regulations established in the 6th Section.

ART. VII.—Subscribers proceeding to England on sick certificate from any place not under the Presidency of Fort St. George, shall be entitled to the personal benefits which have been above enumerated, provided they shall have complied with the local Regulations, and shall make immediate communication of the circumstances to the Directors of the Fund.

ART. VIII.—The Second Class of benefits, namely, those granted to Widows and Children of deceased Subscribers, are absolute, not dependant on the decision of the Directors, but controlled solely by the Regulations of the Institution.

ART. IX.—The Widows and legitimate Children of deceased Subscribers, shall be entitled to receive the annuities specified in the annexed Table, provided their claims be not affected by the amount of property possessed by such Subscriber at his death; by the income they themselves derive from other sources; or by the disqualifications stated in the second Article of the 2d Section.

ART. X. The property possessed, from whatever source, by Widows and Children becoming claimants on the Fund, will be ascertained on Aff-

* NOTE.—The Pension payable to the Widows of Subscribers, in all cases, to be subject to a deduction equal to the Amount of Lord Clive's Pension, accordingly an Amount equal to the Pension payable by Lord Clive's Fund, shall, in all cases, be deducted from the Income, which might otherwise be claimed from the Madras Military Fund by the Widow of a deceased Subscriber.

davit, and all income which may exceed the privilege of half the Pension to which they are entitled, shall form a deduction from their annuities, so that income equal to one Pension and an half, will wholly exclude them from all title to the benefits of the Fund.

ART. XI.—Should a Subscriber at his death leave less than two-thirds of his property to his Widow and Children, and they claim the benefits of the Fund, a deduction to that amount shall nevertheless be made in relative proportions from their annuities; it being intended that the Funds shall not be burthened with the families of Subscribers possessing property, two-thirds of which would exclude them from the benefits of it; but a Subscriber shall be entitled to alienate from his Widow and Children, one-third * of the property which he may possess at his death, without affecting the claim of his Widow and Children.

ART. XII.—In calculating the annuities to be granted and privileged to be allowed to families consisting of several persons; the following further rules shall be observed.

- 1st. The privilege to the Widow and Children of a deceased Subscriber, when the Children are under the protection of the Widow, shall be half the amount of the annuity to which the Widow may be entitled; the Children in this case being allowed no privilege; and deduction being made for the whole income the Widow is actually in the receipt of from any source, and for the income derived collectively by herself and Children from her deceased Husband; or for two-thirds of the property possessed by such deceased at his death, should the Widow and Children, have been jointly left less.
- 2d. A Widow not having charge of the Children whilst they are of an age to require protection, whether she be their Step Mother or otherwise, shall be allowed no privilege, which in such case is transferred to the Children.
- 3d. Children bereft of their Mother, or placed, for reasons which shall be satisfactory to the Directors, under separate Guardianship, shall be allowed a privilege equal to half the amount of their respective

* As it cannot be supposed that in justice to the Fund it will be the wish, or that from interested motives it can be the object of any Subscriber, to alienate from his Wife and Children property yielding a permanent income, in order to render them dependant on temporary annuities, ceasing on their marriage, their attaining certain ages, or on their death, this Regulation is intended to provide for the case of a Subscriber, having perhaps no Children of his own, who has Step-Children or other near relations dependant upon him, whose claims are of such a nature, as to induce him to provide for them to the detriment of his more immediate family. It is also to be observed, that the present outline for the Regulations of the Fund appears to admit of a Subscriber alienating two-thirds of his property from his Wife.

+ Form of Account illustrating the principle detailed in the Twelfth Article, for calculating the privilege allowed to a Widow with Children, who may be under her care or Guardianship.

annuities, but income derived by any of the Children from their deceased Father, or by the Widow (not having charge of the Children) from her deceased Husband, which may be in excess of one and a half of their individual Pensions, while the income of others of the family, derived from the same source, is below one and a half of their Pensions, shall form a deduction in relative proportions from the annuities of the other members of the family, who may be Claimants on the Fund; a further deduction also being made on the principle of *Article Eleventh*, should the deceased Subscriber not have left two-thirds of his property amongst his family.

4th. Property derived by any individual of the family, otherwise than from their Husband or Father, shall affect the claim of such individual alone.

ART. XIII. The Pensioned Sons of Subscribers, shall be entitled to receive from the Fund a portion of £300 each to assist their establishment in life; on the completion of their eighteenth year.

ART. XIV. The proportion of £300 may be advanced at an earlier period than the age of eighteen on the application of Guardians, if there be an immediate prospect of any eligible establishment in life; but in all cases the payment of the portion precludes any subsequent demand for Pension.

ART. XV. If a Widow, Pensioner on the Fund, marries, her Pension is to cease during her coverture; but in the event of her becoming again a Widow and not possessing property to the amount that would exclude her claim, she shall be re-admitted to all the benefits she may have enjoyed from the Fund, during her first widowhood, in like manner as if she had not re-married, but subject of course to all the limitations and conditions prescribed by the Regulations in the first instance. If the Second Husband shall also have been a Subscriber to the Fund, the Widow will receive how-ever only one annuity; taking that which may be the greatest, that is to say, according to the rank of the first or second Husband, whichever may have been the highest.

ART. XVI. The application for the benefit of the Fund, which may be made by a Widow on behalf of herself and Children, or by a Guardian on behalf of Children, shall be accompanied by an Affidavit

Vide Forms No. 7 and 8 of the Appendix. sworn before a Magistrate, specifying the full amount of the property of which the deceased Husband or Father died possessed, the proportion of such property which has been left by Will or otherwise to the Widow or Children respectively, and the total amount of property possessed at the time or by any other Person on their account.

ART. XVII. In calculating the income possessed by Persons applying for the benefit of the Fund, real or personal property yielding income is to be estimated at the rate of its actual produce; plate, jewels or other moveable property (which may exceed a reasonable allowance for personal use, according to the rank in life) is to be estimated as income, at the usual rate of interest in the country where it may be.

ART. XVIII. Money, Houses, Lands, or other property capable of yielding annual interest rent, shall be considered as permanently yielding such interest or rent, unless it shall be made to appear to the satisfaction of the Directors that the property has been actually unproductive, from unavoidable accident or other cause not within the control of the party claiming the benefits of the Fund. It being intended that no deduction shall be made from the Pensions to Widows or Children of Subscribers, on account of property, unless such property shall have been rendered unproductive by fraudulent design or evident mismanagement.

ART. XIX. In the event of the unavoidable failure of any income on

* *Note.*—This Clause is intended to protect the Fund from the effect which would be produced by a Subscriber vesting an unreasonable proportion of property in dead stock and thereby reducing the income and apparent property of his Widow and Children.

account of which an abatement may have been made from the annuities payable by the Military Fund, such failure being certified by the Affidavit of the Party or Guardian, and arising from the loss or deterioration of property which could not have been invested in Public Securities; then the amount of such abatement shall be made good from the date of the failure so certified. And in like manner if any Annuitant on the Fund shall at any period acquire property, a proportionate abatement of the annuity, shall take place from the date at which such property was acquired. It being intended that the Widows and Children of deceased Subscribers shall always respectively enjoy an income not less than the annuity prescribed by the Regulations of the Fund, and not exceeding the amount of one and a half of such annuity.

ART. XX. Therefore every half yearly application for the appointed annuity shall be accompanied by a fresh Declaration on oath, specifying the actual property and income for the time being of the Parties respectively, in whose behalf the application is made; and in the event of a variation from the former income, the circumstances which occasioned such variation are to be fully stated.

ART. XXI. If the Widow or the Children of a Subscriber are left in such circumstances as may exclude all, or any of them from the benefits of the Fund; then the claim of such Widow or Children shall be admissible at any future period, on the unavoidable failure of the income which originally excluded them or any of them; it being intended that the Widows and Offspring of Subscribers to the Fund shall in all circumstances derive from it, protection from distress.

ART. XXII. Every Widow benefitting by the Military Fund, and not provided with a passage to Europe at the expense of Government, shall be entitled (for one passage only) to the allowance allotted for the rank of her Husband. Unless the property left by her Husband, shall exceed the amount which excludes a claimant from Lord Clive's Fund, in which case there shall be no claim on the Military Fund, on the part of the Widow for her passage.

ART. XXIII. The passage money for Children is fixed at £100 or Pagodas 250 for each Child proceeding with its Mother, provided the number does not exceed three, and for any collective number exceeding three, proceeding as above £350 or Pagodas 875. For each Child proceeding without its Mother £100 or Pagodas 250, provided the number does not exceed four, and for any collective number exceeding four proceeding thus £450 or Pagodas 1125.

SECTION V.

EVENTUAL BENEFITS OF THE FUND.

ART. I. Independent of the benefits which have been recited, the Madras Military Fund is considered as holding out the prospect of eventual benefits under the following circumstances.

ART. II. If at any future period it shall be found, that the Funds of the Institution afford a considerable surplus, after providing for the actual and probable applications for relief under the preceding Articles, it shall then, and not otherwise, be competent for the Directors of the Institution, provided the permission of the Honorable Court of Directors be obtained, to afford the aid of the Fund in the following cases.

1st.—To Subscribers compelled by ill health to abandon the Country after ten years Service and before they are entitled to retire, on full pay, the regulated passage money of their rank, and an annuity which shall render their total income, from whatever source derived, equal to the full pay of their rank.

2d.—To Officers who may have served twenty two years in India and may be obliged by ill health to retire from the Service, without having obtained the rank of Major, the regulated passage money of their rank and such assistance from the Fund as will render their whole income from whatever source, equal to the pay of Major; and as in the case of Widows, the possession of an income not exceeding half the pay of a Major of Infantry, shall not occasion an abatement from the provision to be made from the Fund.

3d.—In the event of a still further surplus, it shall be competent for

the Directors of the Military Fund, at their discretion, to assist Officers retiring from the Service on full pay in limited circumstances, with a sum equal to the regulated passage money of their rank; provided always that the resignation of such Officer shall actually have been accepted previously to his embarkation.

ART. III. Should the Fund however, at any period fall short of the demands upon it, so that the annual income will not defray the amount of the annuities and other claims, then it shall be in the power of the Directors to make a proportionate deduction from the annuity of each Annuitant, and from the payments to other Claimants *above the rank of Subaltern*, until the state of the Fund shall afford the means of complete payment; when, if a surplus income exists, the arrears shall be made good from the amount of surplus, but not otherwise.

SECTION VI.

LOANS TO BE ADVANCED BY THE FUND IN CERTAIN CASES.

Subscribers who shall have subscribed to the Fund for a period not less than eight years, shall be entitled to Loans under the following circumstances.

- 1st. A Subscriber being desirous to send his Wife and Children, or either of them to Europe, shall be allowed, should the state of the Fund admit it, a Loan equal to the amount of 20 months subsistence of the rank he then holds, provided he shall have previously deposited with the Directors an irrevocable order, engaging to repay the amount so borrowed, with interest at 8 per cent. within twenty-two months immediately succeeding the date of the advance. He shall also be required to deposit for the ultimate security of the Fund, a personal Bond, in which he shall be joined by two Securities to be approved by the Directors, and assignment on any property he may possess.
- 2d. A Subscriber who may be desirous to remit money to his Wife or Children in Europe, shall be allowed to receive an order on the Agents of the Fund in England for any amount which he may have previously paid into the Fund here, either by instalment or otherwise, provided always that any loss by exchange or otherwise, shall be borne by such Subscriber.
- 3d. A Subscriber proceeding to England on sick certificate with his Wife and Children, shall be authorised to apply for the regulated passage money for such Wife and Children, to be advanced by the Military Fund as a Loan—such Loan however can only be advanced upon the personal Bond of the Subscriber, including two Securities to be approved by the Directors.—The amount to be repaid with interest at eight per cent. within two years after the Subscriber's return to India, provided he may have attained the rank of Captain, otherwise within two years after he shall have attained that rank—and the Securities to be bound to make good any balance or deficiency in the event of the Subscriber's ceasing to be a Member of the Fund before the Bond is discharged.
- 4th.—In urgent cases of the certified sickness of a Subscriber who may have already received the benefits of the Fund, on sick certificate, within the term of eight years; the Directors shall, if they see just cause, be competent to advance to such Subscriber, the amount of the regulated passage money, as a Loan under the conditions recited in the preceding Article.

SECTION VII.

GENERAL REGULATIONS.

ART. I.—The management and appropriation of the receipts, and the admission of Persons to the benefits of the Fund, and in fact all matters whatever relating to the Fund, shall be vested in thirteen Directors as at present, the senior being President. When vacancies shall occur in the Direction, the Adjutant General of the Army on receiving notice of the same, will, with permission of His Excellency the Commander in Chief, circulate to Corps a list of Officers, Chaplains and Medical Officers, Subscribers to the Fund, who, from residing at the Presidency, are eligible to

be Directors, Officers in the actual Command of Corps will then communicate to the Directors the name of the Person selected by the majority of the Subscribing Officers of their respective Corps to fill the vacancy.—Absent Officers to send their votes to their Corps, Colonels to the oldest Corps of their Brigades or Regiment.* The vote of the Corps will be considered as one vote; that of Chaplains as one, and that of unattached Medical Officers as one, and the Officer elected by the majority of Corps, will be informed that he has been chosen as a Director of the Military Fund.

ART. II. The Directors shall as at present have a Secretary to conduct their Proceedings, who shall also be the Accountant of the Fund.

ART. III. The Secretary must be an Officer of the Army and a Subscriber to be nominated by the Directors, and liable to removal by the same authority.

ART. IV. A monthly aggregate allowance of one hundred Star Pagodas issued as the amount of the Salary and Office establishment of the Secretary.

ART. V.—The Directors of the Fund will hold Regular Monthly Meetings, but no Meeting of the Directors consisting of a smaller number than five, shall be competent to the transaction of business. Special Meetings will be held whenever required by any urgent or particular business; and it will rest with any Director, or with the Secretary, to represent the occurrence of such necessity to the President, who will convene a Special Meeting within ten days from the date of his receiving the application; but no Special Meeting shall be called with the view of reconsidering Resolutions which may have been already adopted by a former Meeting of Directors, unless at the requisition of a number of Directors greater than that which attended such Meeting.

ART. VI. The Secretary will invariably lay before the Directors, either at the Regular or Special Meetings, all letters that may have been received by him since the last Meeting. Minutes of the Proceedings of all Meetings will be recorded and authenticated by the signatures of the Directors present. The Secretary will also submit to the Directors who attend, Drafts of all the Letters which in these Meetings he may have been desired to write.—Letters demanding an immediate answer, when such may be of an ordinary nature, may be replied to by the Secretary without waiting for a Meeting of the Directors; but every Letter proposed to be dispatched by the Secretary, must previously receive the special sanction of three Directors signified by their initials to the Drafts, which will be sent to them for consideration.

ART. VII. The Secretary will keep the following Books:—

- An Annual Ledger, exhibiting the Account of Donations and Subscriptions as rendered by Paymasters.
- A Cash Book, shewing the Monthly Receipts and Payments, and balancing the Accounts of the Fund, at the end of each month.
- A Book containing an Annual Account Current of the transactions of the Fund in Europe, also annually made up.
- A Book containing an Annual Statement of Account arising from the union of the two preceding Accounts Current.
- A Book shewing in Abstract the Payments of Subscriptions.
- A Book of the Proceedings of the Directors.
- A Book containing Copies of all Letters dispatched.
- A Book containing a List of Subscribers.

ART. VIII. All the Books, Correspondence, &c. of the Fund are open to the inspection of any Subscriber at the Military Fund Office in Fort Saint George, from 11 to 3 o'clock every day (Sundays excepted.)

ART. IX. When any new Regulation shall appear to the Directors to be advisable, such Regulation shall be circulated to Corps for consideration, in the manner detailed in the 1st Article of the Section, and the affirmative or negative of the majority of Corps shall decide its adoption or rejection.

ART. X. If any Subscriber or Claimant on the Fund shall be desirous

* Chaplains and Medical Officers not attached to Corps to send their votes to the Secretary of the Fund.

to appeal from the decision of the Directors to that of the Subscribers at large, upon any subject which may not be specifically defined by the Regulations, such appeal, provided it be approved by three Directors, shall be referred and decided upon in the manner prescribed in the preceding Article, and the decision shall be final in all cases whatever, any further agitation of the question by process of law or otherwise, being deemed in itself to be an absolute forfeiture of all claim on the Fund.

ART. XI. When a reference shall be made to the Subscribers at large respecting either a proposed Regulation, or an appeal, the result of such reference shall be communicated to Corps for the information of Subscribers.

ART. XII. In order to prevent litigation respecting the disposition of this Institution, it shall be required that every application for the benefit of the Fund, shall be accompanied by an obligation of the Party applying to conform and submit to the decision of the Directors, and of a majority of the Army in cases which admit a reference to the general suffrage.

ART. XIII. Generally all payments due from the Fund are to be made half yearly, on the 30th June and on the 31st December, but in cases when Pensioners or Claimants on the Fund are about to embark for Europe, all arrears are to be paid up to the latest date practicable.

ART. XIV. Any arrear which may be due to the Fund by a Subscriber or by an Annuitant who may have received an overpayment, loan or advance, shall in all cases be deducted from the first payments to be made from the Fund to the person owing such arrear.

ART. XV. All income derived from the Madras Military Fund is declared to be unalienable, and the fact of attempting the alienation of such income in any manner or under any pretence, shall be deemed in itself a forfeiture of all future benefits from the Fund.

ART. XVI. Dismission from the Service shall be in all cases, considered a forfeiture of all claims on the Fund, and of all Subscriptions already paid, but temporary suspension from Rank or Pay is not to be considered a forfeiture of such claims, provided the subscription be continued during such suspension; or if the subscription be discontinued, provided the arrears so arising and interest on the amount shall be paid up within a period equal to that of the suspension immediately succeeding it.

ART. XVII. If a Subscriber, who may be dismissed from the Service, by a Court Martial or otherwise, shall afterwards be restored to the Service—He shall be re-admissible to the Fund, on payment of the arrears that may have accumulated, with interest thereon, in the same manner as if he had suffered only temporary suspension.

ART. XVIII. All property belonging to the Military Fund at any period, shall be invariably vested in the Honorable Company's Securities.

ART. XIX. When interest may be chargeable according to these Regulations, on sums either receivable or payable by the Military Fund in account with Subscribers to that Fund, or their Families or Representatives, that interest shall be always calculated according to the highest rate which may be allowed on the Honorable Company's Securities at this Presidency, at the time when such sums may be received or paid.

ART. XX. The existence of the Military Fund must be known to all Persons entering the Madras Service; and in the course of six months they must necessarily have various opportunities of learning the tenor of the Regulations; it will nevertheless be the duty of the Secretary to communicate to each Cadet, Officer, Chaplain, or Assistant Surgeon, entering the Service, the advantage of a speedy declaration of his intention to subscribe, and the penalty of his delaying it for more than six months, —this communication is to be made immediately on the promulgation of the Order admitting to the Service, any individual of the class above mentioned, and is to be repeated at the expiration of three months; but the miscarriage or non-receipt of such communication will not be admitted in bar of any existing Regulation.

ART. XXI. For the management of the affairs of the Fund in England, it is proposed, that the Court of Directors shall be solicited to allow the Paymaster of Lord Clive's Pension, or some other Officers of the Home Establishment, to make all payments on account of the Military Fund, upon Cer-

tificates to be passed by an Officer acting as Auditor and Secretary, who will be appointed by the Directors of the Fund, and who will be guided by Regulations to be framed for the purpose.—It is also proposed, that the Honorable Court of Directors shall be further solicited to appoint an Officer to conduct the duties of Auditor and Secretary provisionally, in the event of the death or absence of the Person holding that Office, until the appointment of a Successor by the Directors of the Fund.

EXTRACTS FROM THE REGULATIONS OF THE MALE ASYLUM.

ADMISSION.

I. The Sons of European Officers alive, whose circumstances may not enable them to provide otherwise for their Sons, shall be eligible to be admitted into the Asylum, as Boarders, but the number so to be admitted shall not exceed ten.—These Boys are to be precisely on the same footing with respect to their diet, dress and treatment, as the Boys on the Foundation, and on arriving at a proper age they will be provided for in a similar manner unless it shall be the wish of the Parent or Guardian, to remove them from the Guardianship of the Directors.—Previous to their admission as Boarders, the sum of 35 Rupees shall be paid by the Parent, or other acting for him, as entrance money, for each Boy,—there must likewise be forwarded to the Secretary an accepted order of some House of Agency, or respectable individual at the Presidency, for the payment of fourteen Rupees per month, on account of the Boy's maintenance, clothing and education.—A Governed Bond may be placed in deposit in lieu of the above-mentioned accepted order, from the interest of which will be deducted, the stipulated sum for the Boy's board, &c. and the overplus of interest, if any, will be carried to the credit of the Boy, to be delivered to him, together with the Bond, or otherwise, as may be desired by the Parent, on his leaving the institution.

2. The Children of Officers who may be Boarders, and by the death of their Parents be deprived of further support, shall be considered as having the first claim: The Sons of Officers and Soldiers killed or dying upon foreign service, the second claim; and the Orphan Sons of Officers who may be left destitute, the third claim, for admission into the Asylum.—The next in order for admission, shall be the Orphan Sons of Non-Commissioned Officers, & Private Soldiers; and when these are provided for, the Children of Non-Commissioned Officers and Soldiers alive, may be received into the Asylum.—Legitimate Children shall be considered as having a superior claim to illegitimate, and the Sons of European Parents, a superior claim to those whose Mothers may be of any other description.

3. As no Boy whose Father is not European, can be admitted to the benefits of the Charity, the Recommendation Certificate must be signed either by the Commanding Officer of the Regiment to which the Father of the Boy belongs or had been attached, or by an Officer acquainted with the Boys parentage.

4. A Certificate from a Medical Officer stating that the candidate is free from mental and bodily disease, and that he is not lame nor deformed, is required to accompany the Certificate of Recommendation.

5. No Boy under the age of 4 years or more than 10, shall be admitted into the Asylum, and none shall be kept on the Foundation after the age of 16, unless he be employed as a Teacher, or in some other department of the Institution.

6. The Select Committee shall determine what profession or trade the Boys shall be brought up to, when they arrive at an age proper for leaving the Institution.

7. In case the Parent or Guardian of any Boy on the Foundation shall wish to withdraw him from the Asylum, with the view of otherwise providing for him, the same shall be signified by a letter to the Secretary, who will communicate the circumstances to the Select Committee, and should they be satisfied with the provision proposed, the Child may then be transferred to the Parent, or other person making the application.

8. When the Superintendent shall at the recommendation of the Surgeon, allow any sickly Boys to be taken from the School by their Parents or Friends for change of air, it shall be intimated to them that if such Boys are not returned to the Asylum at the expiration of the time for which such permission was granted, they will not be re-admitted, unless an extension of that leave appears to the Surgeon and Superintendent, to be necessary; leave of absence, under any other circumstances, shall not be granted to any Boy, without the sanction of the Select Committee. When there are no Friends to receive and answer for the re-appearance of any Boy recommended by the Surgeon, to be sent out of the Asylum, the case shall be submitted to the Select Committee.

EXTRACT FROM THE REGULATIONS OF THE FEMALE ASYLUM.

ADMISSION.

That the Children of Officers of His Majesty's and Company's Service being boarders at the Asylum, and who, by the death of Parents, may be deprived of the means of paying for their support, and who may have no relation, Guardian or Friend who can maintain them, shall be considered as having a claim to the benefits of the Institution; also the Orphan Children of Officers if left destitute.

That the Orphan Children of the Non-Commissioned and Privates of His Majesty's, and Company's Service shall also be entitled to be on the foundation of the Charity, provided they have no other means of being maintained.

That the Orphans of Europeans not in His Majesty's or the Company's Service left destitute shall be entitled to the benefits of the Charity.

That no Child shall be eligible whose Father is not an European; legitimate to have the preference of Illegitimate Children; and that in the admission of Candidates prior date of application be next attended to.

That no Child under four, or more than ten years of age shall be admitted, except in particular cases: the exception to apply solely to those under four years of age.

That all applications for admission must be addressed to the Secretary according to the annexed Form, to be accompanied by a letter from the person making application, stating that every enquiry had been made of the circumstances of the deceased, or living parents: that they were or are totally destitute, and that the Child has no relation, guardian, or friend, whose protection it can claim or have recourse to.

In all cases when applications are made on behalf of Orphans or Children of the Army, the application must be made by the Officer Commanding the Corps and in cases of Europeans not in His Majesty's or Company's Service, by some known respectable character.

That Boarders be admitted into the Institution upon a monthly charge to the parent, relative, guardian, or friends of five Pagodas, or a Company's Bond may be lodged with the Secretary who will receive the Interest and carry it to the credit of the Charity: that they be in all respects upon the same footing with the Children on the foundation of the Charity.

Every application for the admission of a Boarder, when Company's Paper

is not deposited, is to be accompanied by a reference to some responsible person for the payment of the Monthly board, and in cases when the payment may fall in arrear three months, such Boarder will be returned to the parties.

FUNDS.

That the funds, the exclusive property of the Institution, not wanted for current use, be henceforward kept vested in Company's paper, in the name of the person holding the Office of Secretary to the Female Asylum, described as such, distinct and separate from all others the property of Individuals belonging, or who have belonged to the Institution, and which have been deposited with it for their benefit; and that on every security so made over to him he do endorse a declaration of Trust, so as in the event of his death, to preclude it from being considered as forming any part of his assets.

That the funds of all such Individuals be also kept invested so far as fractional Sums will admit, in Company's Paper in the same manner as directed by the preceding Regulations respecting those belonging to the Institution, the declaration of Trust to be endorsed by the Secretary, specifying the property; such Securities belonging to Individuals to be subject to the use (when any shall have been expressed) for which the respective Sum may have been deposited, or otherwise of such settlements as shall have been made upon their Marriages, in instances in which Marriages and Settlements thereupon have taken place.

That in all future cases, in which deposits of Money may be offered on account of Children belonging to the Asylum, or about to be received into it, the proposal for the purpose be in writing to the Secretary, stating the wishes of the party making it, as to its application, with a view to the present maintenance and future advancement of the child for whom it is intended; and that before any such deposit be received, the application be sent by the Secretary in circulation to the Select Committee, who will be at liberty to propose any alteration in the terms that they may think proper; which being finally settled, that the Money be received by the Secretary, and forthwith invested, as before mentioned, in trust for the Child, to whom it belongs, according to the intention of the Donor.

All fractional parts are to be carried to a separate account with each Individual, to be kept by the Secretary, such fractions to be paid from time to time into the Bank, the Secretary to circulate with the Monthly accounts a Memorandum of the total sum so deposited.

LORD CLIVE'S FUND.

REGULATIONS FOR PENSIONS TO WIDOWS IN INDIA.

1. Widows of Officers and Soldiers admitted to share in this Fund, are pensioned on a sum equal to one quarter, or fourth part of the ordinary stated Pay their respective Husbands were entitled to, when in the Service of the Honourable Company.

2. The Widows (being Europeans or of European parents) of which an Affidavit is required of European Officers, Non-commissioned Officers or Soldiers, desirous to claim the benefit of Lord Clive's Bounty, are to make application by letter to the Adjutant General of the Army, stating the Name, Rank, Age, Country, and the date of the decease of her deceased Husband, in whose rights she claims.

3. The application is to be accompanied by a certified Copy of Certificate of Marriage, and a Declaration on Oath before a Magistrate, (or where no Magistrate resides, before the Person holding the Chief Civil or Military Authority) that the deceased, from whom she derives her claim, did not die possessed of, or entitled to property, amounting in value, in the aggregate, to the sums regulated as excluding the claim of the several Ranks, and which are as follows:—

4. The letter is also to state the place of the Claimant's residence, to facilitate a communication of the result of the application.

5. Widows of Non-commissioned Officers and Private Men, are required to prove their Marriage to the satisfaction of the Governor in Council, previous to their being admitted to partake of the Pension.

6. Widows, in the enjoyment of the Pension, desirous of changing their place of residence, are to signify the same, by letter to the Military Auditor General, who will give the necessary directions for the payment of the Pension at the Station to which they may remove, on the production of the prescribed Certificate.

7. Widows are accordingly to obtain a Certificate from the Paymaster who made the last payment to them, otherwise the Pension cannot be paid at the new Station.

8. The Pension granted to Widows to continue during their Widowhood, and no longer.

9. The Pensions to be paid net, without any fee or deduction whatever, and are to commence from the day succeeding that on which the Husband died.

10. Native Women, although lawfully married to European Soldiers, are not considered entitled to the Pension granted to Widows from Lord Clive's Donation.

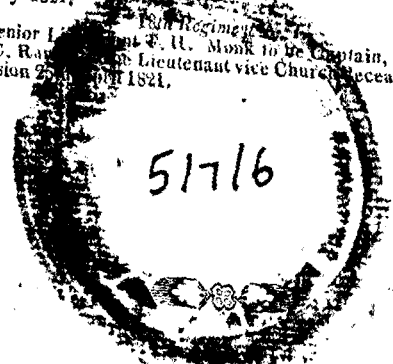
