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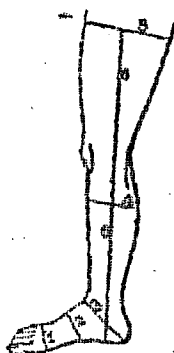
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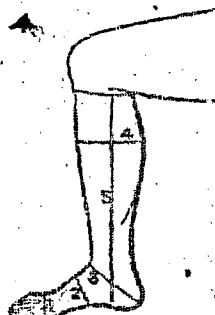
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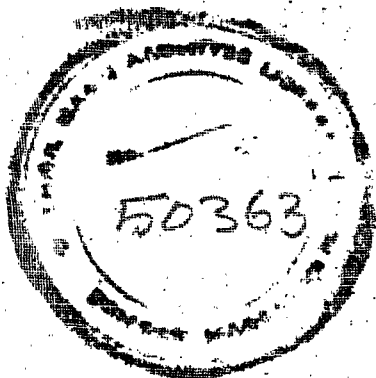
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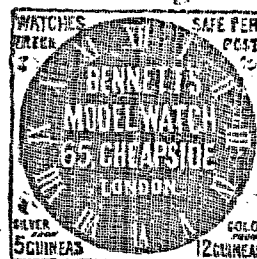
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REGULATIONS FOR THE OPEN COMPETITION OF 1873.

1. On Tuesday, 1873, and following days, an examination of candidates will be held in London. At this examination not fewer than Candidates will be selected; if so many shall be found duly qualified. Of these, will be selected for the Presidency of Bengal (for the Upper Provinces, and for the Lower Provinces, and for that of Madras, and for that of Bombay.)—Notice will hereafter be given of the days and place of examination.

2. Any person desirous of competing at this examination must produce to the Civil Service Commissioners, before the 1st February, 1873, evidence showing:—

- (a) That he is a natural born subject of Her Majesty;
- (b) That his age on the 1st March, 1873, will be above seventeen years and under twenty-one years. N.B.—*In the case of Natives of India this must be certified by the Government of India, or of the Presidency or Province in which the Candidate may have resided;†*
- (c) That he has no disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity, unfitting him, or likely to unfit him, for the Civil Service of India;‡
- (d) That he is of good moral character; he must also pay such fee as the Secretary of State for India may prescribe.§

3. Should the evidence upon the above points be *prima facie* satisfactory to the Civil Service Commissioners, the Candidate will, upon payment of the prescribed fee, be admitted to the examination. The Commissioners may, however, in their discretion, at any time prior to the grant of the Certificate of Qualification hereinafter referred to, institute such further inquiries as they may deem necessary; and if the result of such inquiries, in the case of any Candidate should be unsatisfactory to them in any of the above respects, he will be ineligible for admission to the Civil Service of India, and if already selected, will be removed from the position of a Probationer.

4. The examination will take place only in the following branches of knowledge:—

‡ Evidence of health and character must bear date not earlier than the 1st January, 1873.

§ The fee for this examination will be £5, payable by means of a special stamp according to instructions which will be communicated to the Candidates.

Moral Sciences; that is, Logic, Mental and Moral Philosophy, Sanskrit Language and Literature, Arabic Language and Literature.

Candidates are at liberty to name, before Feb. 1st, 1873, any or all of these branches of knowledge. No subjects are obligatory.

5. The merit of the persons examined will be estimated by marks, and the number set opposite to each branch in the preceding regulation denotes the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it.

6. No Candidate will be allowed any marks in respect of any subject of examination, unless he shall be considered to possess a competent knowledge of that subject.

7. The examination will be conducted by means of printed questions and written answers, and by *cirā roce* examination, as may be deemed necessary.

8. The marks obtained by each Candidate in respect of each of the subjects in which he shall have been examined will be added up, and the names of the Candidates who shall have obtained a greater aggregate number of marks than any of the remaining Candidates will be set forth in order of merit; and such Candidates shall be deemed to be selected Candidates for the Civil Service of India, provided they appear to be in other respects duly qualified.

¶ "Nothing can be further from our wish than to hold out premiums for knowledge of wide surface and of small depth. We are of opinion that a Candidate ought to be allowed no credit at all for picking up a subject in which he is a mere wanderer."—Report of Committee of 1854. A deduction of marks will be made under each subject, including Mathematics.

Should any of the selected Candidates become disqualified, the Secretary of State for India will determine whether the vacancy thus created shall be filled up or not. In the former case, the Candidate next in order of merit, and in other respects duly qualified shall be deemed to be a selected Candidate. A selected Candidate declining to accept the appointment which may be offered to him will be disqualified for any subsequent competition.

9. Selected Candidates, before proceeding to India, will be on probation for two years, during which time they will be examined periodically, with the view of testing their progress, in the following subjects:—

(1) Oriental Languages:—	Marks.

In these examinations, as in the open competition, the merit of the Candidates examined will be estimated by marks, and the number set opposite to each subject denotes the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it at any one examination. The examination will be conducted by means of printed questions and written answers, and by *cirā roce* examination, as may be deemed necessary. The last of these examinations will be held at the close of the second year of probation, and will be called the "Final Examination," at which it will be decided whether a selected Candidate is qualified for the Civil Service of India.

10. Any candidate who, at any of the periodical Examinations, shall appear to have wilfully neglected his studies, or to be physically incapacitated for pursuing the prescribed course of training, will be liable to have his name removed from the list of selected candidates.

11. The selected Candidates, who, at the final examination, shall be found to have a competent knowledge of the subjects specified in Regulation 9, and who shall have satisfied the Civil Service Commissioners of their eligibility in respect of age, health, and character, shall be certified by the said Commissioners to be an-

tioned to be appointed to the Civil Service of India, provided they shall comply with the regulations in force at the time for that service.

12. Applications from persons desirous to be admitted as candidates are to be addressed to the Secretary to the Civil Service Commissioners, London, S.W. From whom the proper form for the purpose may be obtained.

Note 1.—Selected Candidates will be permitted to choose, according to the order in which they stand in the list resulting from the open competition, as long as a choice remains, the Presidency (and in Bengal the Division of the Presidency); but this choice will be subject to a different arrangement should the Secretary of State or the Government of India deem it necessary.

Note 2.—No Candidate will be permitted to proceed to India before he shall have passed the final examination, and received a certificate of qualification from the Civil Service Commissioners, or after he shall have attained the age of twenty-four years.

Note 3.—The seniority in the Civil Service of India of the selected Candidates shall be determined according to the order in which they stand on the list resulting from the final examination.

Note 4.—It is the intention of the Secretary of State to allow the sum of £50 after each of the three first half years of probation, and £130 after the last half year, to each selected Candidate who shall have passed the required examinations to the satisfaction of the Commissioners, and shall have complied with such rules as may be laid down for the guidance of selected Candidates.

Note 5.—All selected Candidates will be required, after having passed the second periodical examination, to attend at the India Office for the purpose of entering into an agreement binding themselves, amongst other things, to refund in certain cases the amount of their allowance in the event of their failing to proceed to India. For a candidate under age a surety will be required.

Note 6.—After passing the Final Examination each candidate will be required to attend again at the India Office, with the view of entering into covenants and giving a bond for £1000 jointly with two sureties for the due fulfilment of the same. The stamps payable on these documents amount to £1 10s.

Note 7.—Candidates rejected at the final examination of 1873 will in no case be allowed to present themselves for re-examination.

This choice must be exercised immediately after the result of the examination is announced, on such day as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

CHAPELAINS.

REGULATIONS FOR THEIR ADMISSION.

Candidates for appointment as Junior Chaplains must have been two years in Orders, and be under thirty-four years of age, and must, prior to appointment, produce their letters of Orders, Brevet, and Priest, as well as testimonial, signed by three beneficed clergymen; the appointments are made subject to the approval of

the Archbishop of Canterbury or the Bishop of London.

Chaplains must proceed to their destination within four months from the date of their appointment, the Secretary of State, and in future thereof, without leave obtained from the Secretary of State for India in Council, their appointments will lapse.

CIVIL SERVICE FURLOUGH AND ABSENTEE RULES OF 1868.

DEFINITIONS.

1. In the following Rules

"Actual Service" includes the period during which an officer is on duty, also periods spent on Privilege and Subsidiary Leave, and periods during which an officer, not on leave, may be out of employ on subsistence allowance in India.

"Extraordinary Leave" means any leave granted otherwise than under these Rules.

"Long Extraordinary Leave" means extraordinary leave extending beyond a period of three months.

"Long Furlough" means furlough extending beyond a period of three months.

"Salary" includes acting allowances. An officer's "Station" means that station to which he stands appointed, or such other place as the Government to which he is subordinate may determine.

CHAPTER I.

FURLOUGH.

2. The maximum period of furlough which can be granted to any officer during the whole period of his service is limited to six years.

3. Subject to the above limit, furlough shall be placed to the credit of each officer, at the proportional rate of one year's furlough for every four years of actual service.*

4. No furlough shall be taken before the completion of eight years' actual service, except under Rule 8.

5. Furlough shall not be repeated, until five years from the date of the last return from Long Extraordinary Leave or Long Furlough, except under Rule 8. Leave taken under Chapters II. and III., but no

* A Civil Servant who has taken leave on medical certificate under leave rules prior to those of 1868, will not be entitled to such leave, up to the limit of one year, against furlough which would otherwise be at his credit. All such leave shall, however, be included in the maximum amount of six years fixed in Rule 2 of the Rules of 1868.

other leave, shall be reckoned as part of the said three years.

6. The maximum term of furlough to be taken at any one time shall be two years.

7. Except as hereinafter provided, an officer, when on furlough, shall retain a lien on his substantive appointment, or on an appointment of similar character and not less salary, and he shall be granted allowances at the rate of 50 per cent. of his average salary for the previous three years, or for the period which has elapsed since his last return from Long Furlough or Long Extraordinary Leave, if that period be less than three years.

In calculating such average, the time spent and the allowances drawn under any leave, excepting Privilege Leave under Chapter II., shall be omitted.

Provided that no officer on furlough shall draw more than £1,000, or less than £600 per annum, unless his salary is less than £500, in which case he shall draw an allowance equal to his salary.

8. Under medical certificate—

(a) Furlough may be taken on the above-mentioned conditions without reference to the amount at credit under Rule 3.

(b) Furlough for a period not exceeding one year may be taken, even if less than three years have elapsed since the last return from Long Extraordinary Leave or Long Furlough. When on furlough under this clause, an officer will not retain a lien on his appointment, and will be entitled only to subsistence allowance, unless he has completed six months' actual service since his last return from Long Extraordinary Leave or Long Furlough, and then retain some leave to his credit under Rule 3, in which case the officer will retain a lien on his appointment, and will draw allowances as calculated under Rule 7, until that credit be exhausted, he will not draw for a period exceeding one year.

(c) Furlough taken without medical certificate, or under clause (a) of this Rule, may be extended beyond two years for a period not exceeding one year. When on furlough under this clause, an officer

will not retain a lien on his appointment, and will be entitled only to subsistence allowance.

9. Furlough taken or extended under Rule 8 is subject to the provision of Rule 2.

10. Furlough taken in India will be reckoned from the date of the officer quitting his station to the date of his return thereto. Furlough taken out of India will be reckoned from the date of embarkation to the date of return.

In the event of the furlough being taken partly in India and partly out of India, the commencement and termination of the furlough will be determined by the above rules, according as the furlough begins or ends in or out of India.

11. For the interval elapsing between departure from the station and the commencement of furlough, and between the termination of furlough and the re-arrival at his station, an officer shall be allowed subsidiary leave not ordinarily exceeding in each case thirty days. During those periods his allowances will be calculated in the same way as his furlough allowances, but without limitation as to maximum and minimum. Provided that, if the officer has, under these rules, lost his lien on his appointment, he shall draw subsistence allowance of his rank. Subsidiary leave shall count as service and residence.

12. Applications for furlough will in all cases be submitted to the Government to which the applicant is subordinate, and will be dealt with in such manner as the Governor-General of India in Council may from time to time prescribe.

13. Subject to the exigencies of the service, both as regards the number of furloughs available at any one time, and as regards individual applications, of which the exigencies of the Government of India, Madras, or Bombay, as the case may be, shall be exclusively the judges, furloughs will be granted under these rules.

14. All applications for furlough under medical certificate, in accordance with these rules, will be granted without restriction.

15. If, owing to the exigencies of the service, it may be necessary to place any limit on the number of officers who may be absent on furlough at the same time, applications not supported by medical certificate will be granted in the following order—

est amount of furlough remains under Rule 5 shall have the preference.

If two or more applicants are on an equality in this respect, the preference shall be given to the applicant whose actual service in India is longest, reckoning, in the case of an officer who has been taken long extraordinary leave or long furlough, from the date of arrival in India, and in the case of an officer who has taken long extraordinary leave or long furlough, from the date of his last return from such leave or furlough.

If two or more applicants are equal in both respects, the preference shall be given to the senior in the Gradation List.

16. The term of residence qualifying for pension shall be twenty-one years, but no leave, except privilege leave and subsidiary leave, shall count as residence.

17. The term of service qualifying for pension shall be twenty-five years.

CHAPTER II.

PRIVILEGE LEAVE.

18. Subject to the exigencies of the state, an officer who has completed eleven months' continuous duty may take privilege leave for one month without deduction from his salary, retaining a lien on his appointment whether substantive or officiating. Provided that, in the case of his holding an officiating appointment, such lien and his acting allowance will cease on the resumption of charge by the officer to whom the substantive appointment belongs.

19. In the same manner, and under the same conditions, two or three months' privilege leave may be taken when an officer has completed continuous duty of twenty-two or thirty-three months respectively.

20. Privilege leave may, at the discretion of the local Government, be taken in separate instalments. No instalment shall be taken until after the expiration of six months' continuous duty from the expiry of the first instalment. In this case, the eleven months qualifying for fresh privilege leave will be reckoned from the expiry of the first instalment, the period of the second instalment being omitted from the calculation.

Provided that the whole privilege leave taken at any one time shall not exceed three months, and that no accumulation of privilege leave beyond that period shall be admitted.

21. If an officer shall overstay his privilege leave, he shall forfeit all salary during the time of his remaining so absent; and, if he shall so continue absent for more than one week, his office shall become vacant.

22. Privilege leave shall be reckoned as residence and service.

CHAPTER III.
SPECIAL LEAVE.

23. Special leave, on urgent private affairs, may be granted at the discretion of the local government for a period not exceeding six months. In respect of retention of a lien on appointment of allowances drawn during the leave, and of subsidiary leave, the conditions of special leave shall be the same as those prescribed for furlough. Special leave shall not be reckoned as residence.

24. Rule 21 shall, *mutatis mutandis*, apply to an officer on staying special leave.

25. Special leave may be repeated with out allowances after intervals of at least six years' actual service.

CHAPTER IV.
GENERAL.

26. Furlough, privilege leave, and special leave shall not be taken as such in continuation of each other; but, if an officer absent on one of these classes of leave be allowed to change it for another, the whole period of his absence shall be held to be under the class of leave for which it was changed.

27. Subject to considerations of State, there will be no restriction as to the place where an officer may reside when on leave.

28. Leave allowance shall be payable monthly, if payment is taken in India, and quarterly, if payment is taken in England.

CHAPTER V.
TEMPORARY RULES.

29. Whatever aggregate amount out of the three years' furlough and three years' sick leave under the rules now in force, at present remains to be taken by an officer under the said rules, shall remain to be taken by him under rules now promulgated.

RULES FOR THE REGULATION OF LEAVE OF ABSENCE TO THE JUDGES OF HER MAJESTY'S HIGH COURTS OF JUDICATURE IN INDIA.

DEFINITIONS.

1. In the following Rules, "Actual Service" includes the period during which a Judge is carrying on his duties in a High Court, also periods spent on Privilege and Subsidiary Leave, and periods of vacation during which the Judge is not on furlough or "Extraordinary Leave."

"Extraordinary Leave" means any leave granted otherwise than under these Rules.

CHAPTER I.
FURLOUGH.

2. One year's furlough shall be placed to the credit of each Judge after the completion of every four years of actual service.

31. Any officer now absent on leave, who has no appointment, may, on his return, and when he again holds an appointment carrying equal pay to that of the substantive appointment which he last held, draw the substantive allowance of his rank, together with 75 per cent. of the pay of any appointment in which he shall officiate. Provided that the total salary as drawn by him shall not exceed the pay of the appointment in which he is officiating. This rule shall apply to any officer who may have already returned from furlough.

Rules regarding Acting Allowances.

1. An officer holding a substantive appointment, and officiating in an appointment of a higher grade or class, shall draw acting allowance calculated at 30 per cent. on the first Rs. 2,000, and 20 per cent. on the remainder of the pay of the appointment in which he is officiating.

Provided that if the acting allowance so calculated do not amount to two-thirds of the difference between the pay of the two appointments, it shall be raised to two-thirds.

Provided further, that in no case shall the whole salary so drawn exceed the pay of the appointment in which the officer is officiating.

2. An officer holding no substantive, but only an officiating appointment, shall, subject to the provisions in Rule 1, draw, in addition to the substantive allowance of his rank, 50 per cent. of the pay of the appointment in which he is officiating.

3. In the case of an officer officiating in an appointment the pay of which is *pro-tem*, his acting allowances shall be calculated on the mean pay of the said appointment, provided that the whole salary so drawn shall not exceed the substantive pay of the said appointment.

4. Except under Rules 6 and 7, no furlough shall be granted *debt* at credit under Rule 2.

Provided that any Judge who may have been already in the service of the Government at the time of taking office in the High Court, and who was at that time entitled, under the Rules applicable to the branch of the service to which he belonged, to furlough without medical certificate, may be granted furlough for a term not exceeding that to which he was so entitled, upon the condition that such furlough shall not be taken until the completion of two years' actual service in the High Court, and shall not exceed one year.

4. Except under Rule 7, furlough shall not be repeated until after the completion

of three years' actual service from the date of the last return from furlough or extraordinary leave.

5. The maximum term of furlough to be taken at any one time shall be fifteen months.

6. Under medical certificate, furlough may be granted before it is at credit, under Rule 2.

7. On urgent private affairs, furlough may be granted before it is at credit, under Rule 2, and although three years of actual service have not been completed since the last return from furlough or extraordinary leave. Provided that furlough under this section shall not exceed six months, and shall be granted only once during the whole period of a Judge's service in the High Court.

8. The aggregate amount of all furlough which can be granted to a Judge during the whole period of his service in the High Court shall not exceed two years and a half.

9. Furlough taken in India shall be reckoned from the date of the Judge quitting his office to the date of his return thereon. Furlough taken out of India shall be reckoned from the date of embarkation to the date of return.

In the event of the furlough being taken partly in India and partly out of India, the commencement and termination of the furlough shall be respectively determined by the above Rules, according as the furlough begins or ends in or out of India.

10. For the interval elapsing between the date of quitting his office and the commencement of furlough out of India, and between the termination of furlough out of India and resuming his office, a Judge may be allowed subsidiary leave, not ordinarily exceeding thirty days, which in special cases may be extended.

11. A Judge, when on furlough or subsidiary leave, shall receive allowances at the rate of Rs. 333. 5. 4. per mensem, or £1,000 per annum.

12. Except under medical certificate, the number of furloughs to be granted at any one time, and the grant of furloughs to individual Judges, shall be subject to, and limited by, the exigencies of the service, which exigencies shall be determined exclusively by the authority granting the furlough.

13. If, owing to the exigencies of the service, it may be necessary to place any Judge or the number of Judges who may be absent on furlough at the same time, applications not supported by medical certificate will be granted in the following order:—

The Judge to whose credit the greatest amount of furlough remains under Rule 2 shall have the preference.

If two or more applicants are on an

equality in this respect, the preference shall be given to the applicant whose actual service in a High Court is longest, reckoning in the case of a Judge who has not taken furlough or extraordinary leave from the date of his commencement of service in the High Court, and in the case of a Judge who has taken furlough or extraordinary leave from the date of his last return from such furlough or leave.

If two or more applicants are equal in both respects, the preference shall be given to the senior in the Court.

CHAPTER II.
PRIVILEGE LEAVE.

14. Subject to the exigencies of the service, a Judge who has completed eleven months' continuous duty, inclusive of vacations, may, if the Government be satisfied that there is an urgent necessity, but not otherwise, be granted privilege leave for one month without deduction from his salary or acting allowances.

15. In the same manner, and under the same conditions, an additional month of privilege leave shall be added to accrue to a Judge after each further period of eleven months' continuous duty.

16. Privilege leave shall not be taken in instalments, but any balance of privilege leave that may not have been taken shall be added to the next privilege leave which may accrue. Provided that the whole privilege leave taken at any one time shall not exceed three months, and that any accumulation of privilege leave beyond that period shall be forfeited.

CHAPTER III.
GENERAL.

17. Furlough and privilege leave shall not be taken as such in continuation of each other, but if a Judge absent on one of these classes of leave be allowed to change it for another, the whole period of his absence shall be held to be under the class of leave for which it was changed.

18. Applications for leave shall in all cases be submitted in such manner as the Government may, from time to time, prescribe.

19. Leave allowances shall be payable monthly if payment is taken in India, and quarterly if payment is taken in England.

20. No substantive appointment shall be vacated solely by reason of leave being granted under these Rules.

21. If a Judge shall *misemploy* any leave, he shall forfeit all salary during the time of his remaining so absent, and if he shall so continue absent for more than one week, his office shall be liable to become vacant.

22. To leave, except privilege leave and leave subsidiary to furlough, shall count

as service for pension. The period of service at present qualifying for pension as a High Court Judge shall be diminished by six months for full pension, and by three months for half pension.

23. Each Judge at present standing appointed to a High Court shall, on the first occasion of his taking leave, be given the option of accepting these Rules or abiding by those at present in force for Judges of the High Courts of Judicature.

24. If a Judge, who is a Covenanted Civil Servant, shall be permitted to resign his office and remain in the service, all leave which he may have taken as a Judge of the High Court shall be reckoned as if it had been taken under the Rules for the leave of absence of Covenanted Civil Servants.

The above Rules are, with the sanction of His Grace the Secretary of State for India in Council, hereby declared applicable, with the modifications below stated, to the following Officers—

Barister Judges of the Chief Court of the Punjab;

Recorders in Burmah;
first Judges of Small Cause Courts at the Presidency Towns;

Secretary to the Council of the Governor General for making Laws and Regulations.

Modifications above indicated.

1. The allowances of these Officers, while on furlough or subsidiary leave, shall not exceed half their salaries, and shall be limited also to the rate prescribed in Rule 11.

2. With reference to Rule 22, the pensions to which these Officers are entitled under medical certificate after nine years' service shall be due after eight years and eight months' actual service; and the pensions to which they are in like manner entitled after seven years' service shall be due after six years and nine months' actual service.

The following Notification is also published, for general information and guidance—

NOTIFICATION No. 3070

A question having been raised as to whether the Regulation of the Financial Department, No. 101, dated the 24th April,

1893, and published at page No. 917 of the "Gazette of India" of 1st May, 1893, on the subject of privilege leave, is applicable to Judges of Her Majesty's High Courts of Judicature, the Governor General in Council observes that privilege leave to these and certain other officers, under the Rules recently prescribed, differs from ordinary privilege leave, in that no Judge of a High Court is held entitled to such leave, unless Government be satisfied that there is an urgent necessity for it. Leave under Chapter II. of the Rules in question is therefore rather in the nature of short leave on urgent private affairs, while vacation takes the place of privilege leave.

On these considerations, His Excellency in Council is pleased to declare that the Resoluit on above quoted shall not be held to apply to Judges of Her Majesty's High Courts of Judicature, or to the other Officers to whom the Rules governing the leave of those Judges have been declared applicable.

NOTIFICATION No. 2,486.

With reference to the Notification of this Department, No. 3,070, dated the 24th instant, published on page 255 of the "Gazette of India," the Governor General in Council is pleased to explain that the Resolution No. 101, dated 24th April, 1893, shall not be held to apply to any High Court Judge or other Judicial Officer to whom the new Rules governing the leave of High Court Judges have been declared applicable, even though, under Rule 23 of those Rules, he may elect to abide by former Rules. Whatever Rules any of these Officers may elect, privilege leave will not be granted to him except on urgent necessity, being shown, since all of them have equally the benefit of vacation.

His Excellency in Council is further pleased to declare that the only exception will be the Secretary to the Council of the Governor General for making Laws and Regulations, since this Officer does not enjoy vacations. He will therefore be excepted from showing urgent necessity for privilege leave, but the Resolution No. 101, dated 24th April, 1893, will be applicable to him.

extraordinary leave extending beyond a period of three months.

"Long Furlough" means furlough extending beyond a period of three months.

"Salary" includes acting allowances.

A Chaplain's "Station" means that station to which he stands appointed, or such other place as the Government to which he is subordinate may determine.

CHAPTER I. FURLOUGH.

2. The maximum period of furlough which can be granted to any Chaplain during the whole period of his service, is limited to six years.

3. Subject to the above limit, furlough shall be placed to the credit of each Chaplain at the rate of one-fourth of his actual service after adding thereto one year.

EXAMPLE.—A Chaplain who has completed nine years' actual service, will be credited with one fourth of ten years, i.e. two and a half years' furlough.

4. Subject to the same limit, leave on medical certificate to the extent of one year taken prior to the promulgation of these Rules, shall not be deducted from the furlough credited to a Chaplain under Rule 3.

4a. Except under Rule 8' furlough shall not be taken until the completion of seven years' actual service, nor in excess of the period of furlough at credit under Rule 3, and 4.

6. Except under Rule 8 (b), furlough shall not be repeated until three years from the date of the last return from long extraordinary leave, or long furlough. Leave taken under Chapters II. and III., but no other leave, shall be reckoned as part of the said three years.

v. The maximum term of furlough to be taken at any one time shall be two years.

7. Except under Rule 8, a Chaplain whose on furlough shall be granted allowances at the rates noted in the margin.

8. Under medical certificate—

(a) Furlough may be taken on the above conditions, without reference to the amount at credit under Rule 3.

(b) Furlough for a period not exceeding one year may be taken, even if less than three years have elapsed since the last return from long extraordinary leave or long furlough. When on furlough under this clause, a Chaplain shall be entitled to only the allowances noted in the margin, unless he has completed six months' actual service since his last return from long extraordinary leave, or long furlough, and there remains some leave to his credit under Rule 3, in which case a Chaplain shall

draw the full allowances mentioned in Rule 7, until that credit be exhausted, but in no case for a period exceeding one year.

(c) Furlough taken without medical certificate, or under clause (7) of this rule, may be extended beyond two years for a period not exceeding one year. During the period of extension of furlough beyond two years under this clause, a Chaplain shall be entitled to the allowances mentioned in the margin of Rule 7 (b).

9. Furlough taken or extended under Rule 8 shall be subject to the provision of Rule 2.

10. Furlough taken in India shall be reckoned from the date of the Chaplain quitting his station to the date of his return thereto. Furlough taken out of India shall be reckoned from the date of embarkation to the date of return.

In the event of the furlough being taken partly in India and partly out of India, the commencement and termination of the furlough shall be determined by the above rules, according as the furlough begins or ends in or out of India.

11. For the interval elapsing between departure from his station and the commencement of furlough, and between the termination of furlough and the re-arrival at his station, a Chaplain shall be allowed subsidiary leave not ordinarily exceeding in each case thirty days. During those periods his allowances shall be the same as during the furlough to which the said leave is subsidiary.

12. Subject to the exigencies of the service, both as regards the number of furloughs available at any one time, and as regards individual applications, of which exigencies the Government of India, Madras, or Bombay, as the case may be, shall be exclusively the judge, furloughs shall be granted under these rules. Extension of furlough, other than furlough under medical certificate, will be granted by the Local Governments only.

13. All applications for furlough under medical certificate, in accordance with these rules, shall be granted without restriction.

14. If, owing to the exigencies of the service, it may be necessary to place any limit on the number of Chaplains who may be absent on furlough at the same time, applications not supported by medical certificate shall be granted in the following order:—

The applicant to whose credit the greatest amount of furlough remains under Rule 3 shall have the preference.

If two or more applicants are on an equality in this respect, the preference

shall be given to the applicant whose actual service in India is longest, reckoning in the case of a Chaplain who has not taken long extraordinary leave, or long furlough, from the date of his arrival in India, and in the case of a Chaplain who has taken long extraordinary leave, or long furlough, from the date of his last return from such leave or furlough.

If two or more applicants are equal in both respects, the preference shall be given to the senior in the Gradation List.

CHAPTER II. PRIVILEGE LEAVE.

15. Subject to the exigencies of the State, a Chaplain who has completed five months' continuous duty may take privilege leave for one month without deduction from his salary or house-rent, but with loss of conveyance and fuel allowances.

16. In the same manner, and under the same conditions, two or three months' privilege leave may be taken when a Chaplain has completed continuous duty of ten months and fifteen months respectively.

17. If a Chaplain shall overstay his privilege leave, he shall forfeit all salary during the time of his remaining so absent.

CHAPTER III. SPECIAL LEAVE.

18. Special leave on urgent private affairs may be granted at the discretion of the Government for a period not exceeding six months. In respect of allowances to be drawn during the leave and of subsidiary leave, the conditions of special leave shall be the same as those prescribed for furlough under Rules 7 and 11.

19. Rule 17 shall *mutatis mutandis* apply to a Chaplain over-staying special leave.

20. Special leave may be repeated without allowances after intervals of at least six years' actual service.

CHAPTER IV. GENERAL.

21. Applications for leave shall in all cases be submitted in such manner as the Governor General of India in Council may from time to time prescribe.

INDIAN MEDICAL SERVICE.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF CANDIDATES FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF SURGEON IN HER MAJESTY'S INDIAN MEDICAL SERVICE.

1. All natural-born subjects of Her Majesty, between 22 and 28 years of age at the date of the examination, and of sound bodily health, may be candidates. They may be married or unmarried. They must possess a diploma in surgery or a licence to practise it, as well as a de-

22. Furlough, privilege leave, and special leave shall not be taken in such continuation of each other; but if a Chaplain absent on one of these classes of leave be allowed to change it for another, the whole period of his absence shall be held to be under the class of leave for which it was changed.

23. Subject to considerations of State, there shall be no restriction as to the places where a Chaplain may reside when on leave.

24. Leave allowance shall be payable monthly, if payment is taken in India, and quarterly, if payment is taken in England. When furlough is taken in England, an advance of the first quarter's allowances may be made in India. Such advance shall not be recoverable in case of death. No advance of pay will be granted in England to a Chaplain returning to duty in India. No Chaplain on furlough in Europe will be allowed to return to duty in India until he shall have appeared before the Medical Board attached to the India Office, for a report upon the state of his health.

25.—The term of residence qualifying for pension shall be, in the case of Chaplains appointed before the 11th January, 1854, fifteen years, and in the case of Chaplains appointed on or after that date, seventeen years, but no leave, except privilege leave and subsidiary leave, shall count as residence.

26. The term of service qualifying for pension shall be, in the case of Chaplains appointed before the 11th January, 1854, eighteen years, and in the case of Chaplains appointed on or after that date, twenty years. Leave of absence in India taken prior to the 25th August, 1864 shall count as service for pension, and shall not be reckoned as furlough under these rules.

NOTE.—Chaplains who came to Europe under the furlough rules previously in force are allowed the benefits of the above rules, should they so elect, from the 1st August, 1868.

This declaration must be accompanied by the following documents:—

(a) Proof of age, either by extract from the register of the parish in which the candidate was born, or by his own declaration, pursuant to the Act 5 and 6 Will. IV., c. 62; such extract and declaration respectively bearing the stamps required by law.

(b) A certificate of moral character from a magistrate, or a minister of the religious denomination to which the candidate belongs, who has personally known him for at least two preceding years.

(c) A certificate of registration in accordance with the Medical Act of 1858, of the degrees, diplomas, and licences possessed by the candidate.

3. The physical fitness of candidates will be determined previous to examination by a Board of Medical Officers, who are required to certify that the candidate's vision is sufficiently good to enable him to perform any surgical operation without the aid of glasses. A moderate degree of myopia would not be considered a disqualification, provided it did not necessitate the use of glasses during the performance of operations, and that no organic disease of the eyes existed. Every candidate must also be free from organic disease of other organs, and from constitutional weakness, or other disability likely to unfit him for military service in India.

4. On producing the foregoing qualifications, the candidate will be examined by the Examining Board in the following compulsory subjects, and the highest number of marks attainable will be distributed as follows:—

a. Anatomy and Physiology	1,000
b. Surgery	1,000
c. Medicine, including Therapeutics, the Diseases of women and children	1,000
d. Chemistry and Pharmacy, and a practical knowledge of Drugs	100

The examination in medicine and surgery will be in part practical and will include operations on the dead body, the application of medical apparatus, and the examination of medical and surgical patients at the bedside.

The eligibility of each candidate for the Indian Medical Service will be determined by the result of the examinations in these subjects only.

6. Candidates, who desire it, will be examined in French, German, and Hindustani. Comparative Anatomy, Zoology, Natural Philosophy, Physical Geography, and Botany, with special reference to Materia Medica. The number of marks gained in these subjects will be added to the total number of marks obtained in

the obligatory part of the examination by candidates who shall have been found qualified for admission, and whose position on the list of successful competitors will thus be improved in proportion to their knowledge of modern languages and natural sciences. The maximum number of marks allotted to the voluntary subjects will be as follows:—

French, German, and Hindustani (150 each)	450
Natural Science	200

7. The subjects for this part of the examination will be taken from the following books:—

- "Animal Kingdom," by W. S. Dallas, F.R.S.
- "Outlines of the Structure and Functions of the Animal Kingdom," by Rymor Jones; or "Cours Elementaire d'Histoire Naturelle," par Milne Edwards
- Lindley's "School Botany," Lindley's "Medical and Economic Botany," Hensley's "Elementary Course of Botany."
- "Elements of Natural Philosophy," by Gording Bird and G. Brooks.
- "Physical Geography," by Mrs. Sowerby.

8. The Examiners in London will prepare a list in order of merit, with the marks attained in the different subjects, to be transmitted to the Director-General and communicated to the Professors of the Army Medical School. If any Candidate is found to be deficient in any particular subject, this shall be stated, in order that he may receive special instruction on the point at Netley.

9. After passing his preliminary examination, every candidate will be required to attend one entire course of practical instruction on the Army Medical School, before being admitted to his examination for a commission, on—

- (1) Hygiene.
- (2) Clinical and Military Medicine.
- (3) Clinical and Military Surgery.
- (4) Pathology of Diseases and Injuries Incident to Military Service.

These courses are to be of not less than four months' duration.

10. At their conclusion, the candidate will be required to pass an examination on the subjects taught in the school. The examination will be conducted by the professors of the school.

The Director-General, or any medical officer deputed by him, may be present and take part in the examination. If the candidate give satisfactory evidence of being qualified for the practical duties of an Army Medical Officer, he will be eligible for a commission as Surgeon. The commissions of Surgeons bear date from the day of joining at the Army Medical School.

11. During the period of his residence at the Army Medical School, each candidate will receive an allowance of Rs. per diem, with quarters, or Rs. per diem without quarters, to cover all costs of maintenance; and he will be required to provide himself with uniform (viz., the regulation dress uniform of a Surgeon of the British service, but without the sword).

12. All candidates will be required to conform to such rules of discipline as the Senate may, from time to time, enact.

The persons who shall be pronounced by the Examiners to be the best qualified in all respects will be appointed to fill the requisite number of appointments as Surgeons in Her Majesty's Indian Army. Their position on the list of Surgeons will be determined by the combined results of the preliminary and of the final examinations, and, so far as the requirements of the service will permit, they will have the choice of Presidency in India, according to their position in that list.

MILITARY FURLOUGH REGULATIONS OF 1796.*

Officers (of whatever rank) must be ten years in India before they can be entitled (except in cases of certified sickness and as hereafter specified) to their rotation to be absent on furlough, and the same rule is applicable to assistant surgeons and veterinary surgeons. The furlough to be granted by the commander-in-chief at each presidency, with the approbation of the respective governments.

13. All Surgeons who shall neglect or refuse to proceed to India under the orders of the Secretary of State for India within two months from the date of their appointment will be considered as having forfeited it, unless special circumstances shall justify a departure from this regulation.

14. Every Medical Officer appointed to the service must, as a condition of his appointment, subscribe to the Indian Service Family Pension Fund, designed to secure suitable provision for the widows and orphans of officers of the service, according to the regulations published in general order by the Government of India, No. 1315, of the 25th December, 1872.

15. All Surgeons who shall neglect or refuse to proceed to India under the orders of the Secretary of State for India within two months from the date of their appointment will be considered as having forfeited it, unless special circumstances shall justify a departure from this regulation.

* These Regulations do not apply to officers who entered the service after the 1st of February, 1854.—Vide Military Furlough Regulations of 1854, p. 21.

Officers coming to England on furlough are required immediately to report their arrival by letter, with their address, forwarding at the same time the certificates they received in India.

The period of furlough is three years, reckoning from its date to the day of the return of the officer to his presidency.

Officers are required to join the establishment to which they belong at the expiration of the three years' furlough, unless they shall have obtained an extension of leave, six months before the expiration of that period. No furlough will be extended, except in cases of sickness, certified in the manner hereafter mentioned; or in cases in which it shall be proved that a further residence in Europe is indispensably necessary.

All officers finding it necessary to solicit a further leave of absence on account of sickness, must, if resident in London or its vicinity, appear before the Medical Board appointed for that purpose, who will report their opinion on the state of such officer's health. And if resident in the country in any part of the United Kingdom, they must transmit with their letter of application for such leave, a certificate according to the following form, signed by at least two gentlemen, eminent in the medical profession, viz.:

I hereby certify, that I have carefully examined (state the nature of the case, as well as the name of the party), and I declare, upon my honour, that, according to the best of my judgment and belief, it is not prudent (state the nature of the case) to permit such officer to return to his duty, and that it is absolutely necessary, for the recovery of his health, that he should remain at least longer in this country.

Also, previously to such extension of furlough being granted, such further proof shall be adduced by personal examination, or by such other evidence as shall be deemed satisfactory.

Officers abroad in any part of Europe, applying to remain a further time from their duty on account of sickness, are to furnish

a certificate of two eminent physicians, in the above form, with the attestation of a magistrate, that the persons who signed the certificate are physicians.

Officers having obtained an extension of furlough to a given period, must at its expiration apply for permission either to return to their duty or to reside a further time in England.

In every case in which an officer has had his furlough extended beyond the prescribed period on the ground of his health not being sufficiently restored, and shall apply for permission to return to his duty, he shall produce a certificate from the examining physician that his health is completely re-established, and that there is every probability of his being able to perform the active duties of his profession in India.

No officer who has failed to obtain an extension of furlough will be considered eligible to return to the service after five years' absence, under the Act of 33 Geo. III. cap. 52, sec. 70.

Every officer upon leaving India will receive a printed copy of the General Order on this subject, published agreeably to the instruction of the Secretary of State for India in Council, and the plea of ignorance of the regulations will not be admitted as a justification of the breach of them; officers, therefore, who shall come home on furlough, and who shall not in due time apply, so as to effect their return to the Presidency to which they belong within the period of three years from the commencement of their furlough, will subject themselves to the loss of the service, unless they shall be permitted to remain a further time in Europe.

No officer on furlough can receive pay for more than two years and a half from the period of his quitting India until he returns, excepting colonels of regiments and general officers; the latter are then allowed to draw the pay of their brevet rank beyond the above period.

MILITARY FURLOUGH REGULATIONS.—Nov. 17, 1854.

With the view of adapting the regulations to the present increased facilities of communication, and to correct, as far as possible, any tendency in them to deter officers from resorting to the places which may be most conducive to the restoration of their health, when a change of climate is required for that purpose, the following rules are established, and are to have effect from the 1st February, 1854:—

1. All regimental officers in the service on the 1st February, 1854, who prefer retaining what may be considered the advantages of the old regulations, may do so, provided they signify their wish to that effect when they next apply for furlough or leave of absence, without any limitation whether such leave be in India or elsewhere; and officers who once make their election will not be entitled to any other

choice, but will be afterwards subject to the new or old regulations, according to their decisions.

2. Staff officers, as such, have not the above option allowed them, but they may retain the advantages of the old regulations by giving up their appointments, which, in such cases, will be considered vacated from the date of such action.

3. To those officers who adopt them, the new regulations will apply retrospectively in respect of furlough and leave of absence beyond sea, and in computing their time of service for retirement, so that their furloughs or leaves of absence, whether under the old or the new rules, and whether on private affairs or sick certificate, within or beyond India, will count for service to the authorized extent only, in computing the time for retirement on full pay.

INDIAN MILITARY FURLOUGH RULES. xxiii

4. Officers who have availed themselves of the option of the old rules are allowed to consider the question under the modifications now sanctioned.

5. Officers who have not taken leave subsequent to the publication of the new rules on the 1st February, 1854, and who, consequently, may not have been called upon to declare whether they would abide by the old or the new regulations, will, on retirement from the service, be entitled to take full advantage of the privileges given by the new regulations.

FURLOUGHS ON PRIVATE AFFAIRS.

6. Every officer will be allowed a furlough in Europe, or elsewhere beyond sea, for a period of two years at the expiration of ten years' service, and for a second period of two years after twenty years' service in India.

7. The second furlough of two years will only be granted after ten years' service in India, from the date of the return to duty after the first furlough of two years. These furloughs are not to be cumulative, under any circumstances, but are limited to two years. Officers who have taken leave of absence on sick certificate to Europe, or elsewhere beyond sea, will be ineligible to a furlough on private affairs until they have served six years from their last return to duty. This rule does not apply to short leaves to sea.

Officers who take their first furlough after twenty years' service in India, may take their second furlough after an additional service of five years from the date of their first return to duty. (G.O. 18 June, 1856.)

8. All grants of furlough on private affairs are subject to the exigencies of the public service, and to the regulations framed for the preservation of the efficiency of each regiment by limiting the number of absences.

9. Officers holding staff or other detached appointments, may be allowed furlough for a period of six months without losing their appointments; but, during that period, they will not be entitled to any portion of their staff salary, which will be drawn in full by the officers officiating for them.

Absence for six months under this rule does not preclude an officer from taking his furlough to Europe after ten years' service. (G.O. 18 June, 1856.)

10. All officers, whether staff or regimental, while on furlough on private affairs, will be entitled to "Furlough Pay" only.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE ON SICK CERTIFICATE.

11. Leave of absence on sick certificate will be granted for a term not exceeding eighteen months, whether it be to any place in Europe, or elsewhere out of India.

12. Extension of such leave may be

granted, as at present, on production of medical certificates, for further periods not exceeding eighteen months in the whole.

13. An officer holding a staff or other detached appointment, will be allowed to be absent on sick certificate in England, or elsewhere beyond sea, for a period of twenty months, without losing his appointment; and, during the first six months only of such absence, he will be entitled to draw half the staff salary of his appointment, the officer officiating for him drawing the remaining half salary during the first six months, and the whole salary during the remainder of the time.

14. An officer's claim to half staff salary for six months, as sanctioned in the preceding rule, will not be affected by his subsequently retiring from the service in Europe or elsewhere.

15. No portion of command allowance, medical staff salary, or other similar allowance, which under the old rules was inadmissible to officers absent from their corps or stations, at the Cape or elsewhere, will be allowed to absent officers under these regulations.

16. All officers, whether staff or regimental, while on leave of absence on sick certificate, will be entitled for a period of six months to the same rate of Indian pay and allowances as was allowed under the old regulations to officers proceeding to the Cape on medical certificate, and for the remaining period of their leave they will receive furlough pay only.

17. If the leave on sick certificate be extended, furlough pay will be continued; but under no circumstances for a longer period than three years altogether, from the commencement of the absence.

STAFF OFFICERS.

18. The term "staff officers" applies to all officers holding staff or detached appointments, military (general or regimental), political, or civil; also to general officers commanding divisions, members of the Medical Board, superintending surgeons, and others who, under the old rules, were entitled to draw half staff allowance when absent at the Cape.

19. Staff officers absent on leave beyond the periods stated in Rules 9 and 13 respectively, cannot retain their appointments and allowances except on special grounds to be sanctioned by the Government of the presidency. Any such special grant of leave is to be reported at once, with the reasons for it, and to be subject to approbation.

20. The privilege of retaining staff appointments during leave of absence on sick certificate, or on furlough on private affairs will not be available a second time, if the

fresh leave is on sick certificate, until an officer has been three years, or, if on private affairs, until he has been six years, before discharge of the duties of his appointment, from the date of last return to it.

21. This rule, however, does not apply to leave of absence, whether on sick certificate or on private affairs in India, or for brief periods to Ceylon, the Mauritius, or other places out of India.

22. Officers commanding troops of Horse Artillery and Light Field Batteries, and officers generally in employment, will be allowed leave out of India under the same rules with respect to allowance and tenure of command or office, as regulated the grant of leave to the Corps to such officers under the old regulations, except as to the duration of those advantages, the time for their continuance being subject to the provisions of the new regulations.

DATE OF FURLOUGH AND ADVANCES OF PAY.

23. The period of furlough on private affairs, or leave of absence on sick certificate, is to be calculated from the date of the departure from India of the ship in which the officer proceeds.

24. Advances of pay and allowances, staff and regimental, to officers proceeding on leave of absence on sick certificate, who may be entitled to them, will be made in India for three months from date of embarkation. Payments in continuation will be made in England at the rates of exchange fixed annually for repayment of advances made on account of Her Majesty's Government. Furlough pay will continue to be issued in advance for six months when required by officers obtaining furlough on private affairs.

25. The existing regulations regarding passage-money to officers are not affected by these rules.

26. The certificates issued to officers who are granted furlough on private affairs, or leave of absence on sick certificate, are to specify the time each officer has been absent on leave within Indian limits, as well as the time of his previous absence in Europe; but will not include the periods allowed for proceeding to the presidency or port of embarkation, and to enable officers to rejoin their regiments or stations after their return to India, nor the leave of one month's absence in six months, as authorized by the regulations. The last pay certificate of all officers proceeding to England on sick certificate is to specify the rate of regimental pay and allowances and staff salary to which they would have been entitled under the old regulations, if proceeding to sea on medical certificate. This information is necessary in order that no error may arise in the Pay Department

of the India Office in adjusting the several payments which may be due.

OFFICERS OF HER MAJESTY'S REGIMENT.

27. Officers of Her Majesty's service in India, whether employed permanently in staff or detached situations, or sent to the advantages above laid down on respect to allowances and tenure of office when on furlough or leave of absence.

28. In the case of officers of Her Majesty's service on furlough or sick certificate, in England or elsewhere, who may return or exchange into regiments or battalions of the Indian establishment, the grant to those officers of Indian officers may be made from the date of their return or exchange, if it take place before the expiration of six months from the date of quitting India.

PERIODS OF ABSENCE ALLOWED TO BE COUNTED AS SERVICE FOR RETIREMENT PENSION.

29. In order that all officers entitled to leave on furlough or sick certificate may be counted on an exact equality as regards rate of pay, the period allowed by regulation for proceeding to the presidency, or to the port of embarkation, or to the first of the several officers to rejoin their regiments or stations after their return to India, will be counted as time counting for service for the retirement pension.

30. No furlough or leave of absence, as announced in General Orders, exceeding two years in twenty years' aggregate service, three years in twenty-five years' service, and four years in thirty years' service, shall be allowed to recent arrivals in the retiring pension; and no difference will be made in this respect between leave of absence taken in Europe or elsewhere, or out of India, or whether the leave is on sick certificate or on private affairs.

31. In the term "Leave of absence," as announced in General Orders, is to be included all leave of absence, except the period allowed in Rule 26, and the additional period of one month's leave in six months, as authorized by the regulations, and which may be taken by other officers of the same rank, and who are allowed to count as service for the pension. All leave to a greater extent, whether political and other advantages, which are not hitherto have been published in General Orders, must be so announced in General Orders.

32. Officers to be entitled to full pay of their regiments or battalions, as the regulations of 1849, must have been twenty-two years in India, or of twenty leaves of absence for two parts of the year, and not more, will be allowed to count as service for the rate of pension. 24. The privileged time of absence may, with the permission of the local government, be taken at any time, subject to these provisions. If, therefore, at the end of twenty years' service, of which eighteen had been counted as actual duty in India, an officer should be on furlough or sick certificate in Europe or elsewhere, he will be entitled to receive the full pay of a captain without returning to India, and so in the other terms of service for the higher positions. In like manner, a medical officer on furlough or sick certificate, in Europe or elsewhere, at the end of seventeen years' service, fifteen years and four months of which have been passed on actual duty in India, will be entitled to retire on the lowest rate of pension, without returning to India, and so in the other terms of service for the higher positions.

25. These rules do not in any way affect the existing regulations regarding the grant of leave in India for short periods to sea, whether on private affairs, or on sick certificate, except as to the period of such absence being taken into calculation in the time allowed to count as service for retirement on full pay.

For the purpose of reference "Furlough pay" will be understood as the half Indian rate of pay, and the advantage of half Indian pay for the first three years of the term of service, as the "Furlough pay" is the term used in the regulations for the rate of pay allowed in the case of furloughed officers.

4. Leave of absence will, in future, be of three kinds, viz:—

1. Furlough in or out of India.
2. General leave on private affairs or sick certificate in India or short leave to sea.
3. Privilege leave.

CHAPTER I.

FURLOUGH.

1. An officer drawing staff pay in addition to pay of rank, proceeding on furlough, will be allowed pay at the rate of 50 per cent. of the salary of his substantive office. For an officer on civil employ, and drawing consolidated salary, will be allowed 50 per cent. of the average salary drawn by him for three years prior to his proceeding on furlough. No absence shall in either case, draw more than 1,000, or less than 200 per annum. The term "salary" will signify the total amount drawn by an officer, whether as consoli-

dated pay or staff allowance, in addition to pay, but will not include any extra or special allowances. It is to be clearly understood that an officer absent on furlough who may be transferred to another office during his absence, shall be entitled, for the entire period of his furlough, to pay at the rate sanctioned to him when leaving India, provided that an officer whose term of office shall lapse during his furlough shall cease to draw his half staff salary from the date of such lapse. An officer will also be entitled to the benefit of his promotion to a higher staff corps or regimental rank whilst on furlough, subject to the maximum limit.

Officers not in staff employ will receive full the Indian pay of their rank, provided that in no case will an officer entitled to furlough receive less than the above minimum of 200 per annum.

NOTE.—Officers who may be entitled to income allowance from the Military Fund during absence in Europe, will draw their half salary or minimum allowance in accordance with the preceding clause, subject to a deduction equivalent to the amount of such income allowance.

2. All grants of furlough on private affairs are subject to the existence of the public service of which category the Government is to be exclusively the judge, and to any regulations that may be found necessary for limiting the number of absences.

3. The maximum amount of furlough on private affairs to be taken at any one time, exclusive pay and retention of appointment, will be two years.

4. A period of at least three years' service after return from last furlough, except furlough under Rule 11, must be completed before furlough can again be taken, unless obtained under medical certificate. (See Rules 13 and 14.)

5. An officer will be eligible for two years' furlough on the completion of eight years' actual service in India, for a third year after a further period of six years' actual service, and for a fourth and fifth year after similar intervals of six years. The grant of furlough to an officer eligible for it will be subject only to the conditions specified in Rules 6 and 7. The fact of having taken furlough on medical certificate will not affect the grant of these furloughs, except as to the condition laid down in Rules 4, 13, and 16. A military officer who has been not less than three years in the Staff Corps may, on his producing a medical certificate, take his first furlough before the completion of eight years' actual service in India without forfeiting his appointment or his claim to the allowances prescribed in the Rule 5. Rule 14 does not apply

to such cases. Officers formerly of Her Majesty's British Service, who may join the Staff Corps, will be allowed to count as service towards furlough, under the Regulations of 1898, the whole of their military service in India, provided that half of it (in no case less than four years) has been passed in the Staff Corps. Under no circumstances will leave under Rule 11 be granted in extension of furlough taken on P. A. or M. C.

10. An officer eligible for furlough need not take the whole amount to which his service entitles him, but may apply for any portion thereof as an instalment; and in that case the balance will remain at his credit in any future computation of the amount of furlough to which he may be entitled.

ILLUSTRATIONS.

- (1) An officer who has served nine years in India is entitled to two years' furlough. He takes only one year, and after his return remains in India for five years. He is then eligible for two years' furlough, as follows:—

- (2) An officer who has served 19 years in India without having furlough is entitled to four years' furlough. He can only take, however, two years at one time, retaining, *per se*, the balance remaining at his credit in any future computation of furlough to which he may be entitled. He can take that balance after completing three years' service from the date of his return from the first instalment.

11. Furlough on urgent private affairs for six months, with pay equivalent to the British regimental pay of his rank, may be granted when the officer is not eligible for ordinary furlough. The said period may form part of the periods of either eight or six years referred to in Rule 5. Leave under Clause 11 will not be extended except on M. C. in which case the whole of the leave will be considered as if taken under Clause 14.

12. Subject to Special Considerations, there will be no restrictions as to the places to which an officer may resort during furlough.

13. Absence on medical certificate for a longer period than two years at one time, or departure on such furlough within three years of the date of return from a previous furlough, except furlough under Rule 11, will involve forfeiture of the appointment.

Such furlough may, however, be extended to a third year on English furlough pay.

In the event of an officer not being able to return to his duty after an absence of three years, it will rest with the Right Honourable the Secretary of State for India in Council to order him to appear before a medical board, with a view to placing him on the Retired List, if entitled to pension, or on the Half-pay List.

Should the circumstances of the case warrant a further extension of leave, it may only be granted without pay.

14. Explanation of Rule 13. It is hereby notified that an officer who has any balance of furlough due to him, although he may not have served three years from date of last return to duty, will, on obtaining furlough on medical certificate, be entitled to receive half the Indian pay of his rank for the entire period not exceeding two years, but will forfeit any appointment he may be holding, as already laid down in the Rule above referred to, such furlough may be extended to a third year on English furlough pay.

15. An officer not entitled to furlough, whose health may necessitate his taking it within three years from the date of last return may, under the usual medical certificate, obtain such amount as may be duly certified to be necessary for the restoration of his health, but will only receive English furlough pay, and must vacate any appointment he may be holding.

It is further notified with reference to Rule 14, that it is intended that an officer who has not any balance of furlough to his credit, but who has served three years from date of last return to duty, should, on obtaining furlough on medical certificate, receive the prescribed 50 per cent. of his emoluments and retain his appointment.

16. An officer entitled to furlough, whose health may necessitate his absence from India, will be compelled to take leave as furlough under Rule 9, but without forfeiting any passage-money to which he may be entitled under Military Fund Rules, or if a Subaltern by Regulation when proceeding on medical certificate. Any extension of this furlough beyond the period to which he may be entitled under Rule 9, will be regarded in all respects as furlough on medical certificate. Such extension will not be allowed to take effect until the officer shall have exhausted the entire amount of his available furlough on private affairs. If the aggregate of two years' leave be exceeded, whether on M. C. or P. A. the officer will vacate his appointment, such extension being in the case of P. A. without pay, and in that of M. C. with English furlough pay for a third year only.

16. The aggregate amount of furlough

with pay and retention of appointment, whether on private affairs or on medical certificate, that may be granted to an officer during his service, will be limited to eight years.

The following will not form part of the aggregate of eight years of furlough on private affairs and medical certificate with pay and retention of appointment, to which an officer who may elect the Furlough Rules of 1868, is restricted by Rule 16:—

- I. All leave taken as local leave (not being furlough) in India.
- II. All leave necessitated by wounds received in action, or by sickness contracted on field service, which may have been, or may be, allowed to reckon as service for pension under the provisions of Government General Order No. 1113 of 1857.
- III. All leave duly granted to England or extension of furlough or leave on medical certificate granted in England, of without pay.
- IV. All sick leave in England that may have been taken under the Rules of 1796, on the old rates of Furlough pay.
- V. All sick leave granted to the Colonies eastward of the Cape of Good Hope under the Rules of 1796.

2. But the following will form part of the eight years referred to:—

- I. Furlough with pay on private affairs under whatever rules it may have been taken.
- II. Leave to England on medical certificate with pay under the Furlough Rules of 1868.
- III. If taken in India, furlough will be reckoned from the date of the absence quitting his station to the date of his return thereto; if taken out of India, from the date of the sailing of the vessel in which he may have embarked to the date of his disembarkation in India.

18. Preparatory leave to embark for Europe or elsewhere on furlough will be granted for any period not ordinarily exceeding thirty days. Leave to the same limit, to enable him to rejoin on his return from furlough, will be granted from the date of his disembarkation in India.

19. Furlough allowances shall be payable monthly if payment is taken in England, and quarterly if payment is taken in India.

20. Advances of furlough pay will continue to be made in India to those officers who desire it, for three months from date of embarkation. Payments in continuation will be made in England on the expiration of six months from that date.

21. The last pay certificate issued to each officer who may be granted furlough, whether on private affairs or on medical

certificate, will specify the rate of the pay and Staff salary of his last substantive appointment, and the rate to which he will be entitled in Europe in virtue of Rule 6.

22. An officer serving in India for an absence will be restricted for the entire period of such acting to the half Staff salary of the appointment in which he may be acting, in addition to the full pay of his rank, and the half Staff salary of his own appointment, if he possess one. The Staff salary granted to an acting officer will, however, in no such case be less than Rs. 100 per mensem.

23. The privilege heretofore granted to military officers of counting the proportion years in 20 years of leave noted in the 3 " 25 " margin as service for 4 " 30 " pension is retained. The periods of service qualifying for pension remain unaltered.

24. In computing the furlough on private affairs to which an officer who has already enjoyed some portion of such furlough will be entitled under these rules, it will be necessary to deduct the total amount of the furlough on private affairs of which he may have availed himself during his service from the total period to which under Rule 9 he can lay claim. The balance will represent the leave to which he will be entitled on the expiration of not less than three years from his last return to duty.

ILLUSTRATION.

- (1.) An officer, who had obtained under the existing rules two years' furlough after ten years' service, returns to India on the date on which this order is promulgated. He accepts its conditions, and serves four years longer in India. On the expiration of that term, he can take one year's furlough, thus:—

CHAPTER II.

GENERAL LEAVE ON PRIVATE AFFAIRS AND SICK CERTIFICATE IN INDIA.

25. An officer will be eligible, as at present, to take leave on private affairs or sick certificate in India, for any period not exceeding six months, at the discretion of His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief, or of the Government under which he may be serving. During the entire period of his absence on this account, the officer will be entitled, as at present, to his full pay, and a moiety of his staff salary. Leave taken under this rule will form no part of the eight years' aggregate furlough. If this indulgence should be taken advantage of for a third year consecutively, the officer will lose his staff appointment.

26. Leave on sick certificate for a period exceeding six months, capable of extension, under renewed medical certificate, to a limit of one year, may be granted to any officer who, in the opinion of a medical board, may require it. Leave of this nature, taken after the promulgation of these rules, will be held to constitute a part of the maximum period of eight years' leave of absence to which an officer is entitled in his entire period of service, but will not be regarded as furlough, nor will it affect the intervals entitling to furlough laid down in Rule 9. During this leave the absence will draw a moiety of his staff salary in addition to the pay of his rank.

27. Short leave, not exceeding three months, on private affairs or sick certificate, may also be taken to sea, on the above condition, but absence from India for any longer period will be treated as furlough.

28. All general leave taken in India counts as part of the leave reckoning against service for pension.

CHAPTER III.

PRIVILEGE LEAVE.

29. Privilege leave may be granted, as at present, for sixty days in each year, to all officers in military employ, without deduction from the salaries and emolu-

ments drawn by them. General leave, in extension of privilege leave, can only be granted on the ground of sickness, or some other serious emergency which could not have been foreseen when the officer proceeded on privilege leave. Privilege leave may, however, be converted into general leave with the sanction of the Commander-in-Chief or the Government.

30. In the case of the stations noted in the margin, privilege leave may, as at present, be granted for 60 days to officers of local corps, or of corps which are usually employed in one or other of the districts named.

31. An officer is at liberty to proceed wherever he may desire on privilege leave, provided he can ensure his return before the expiration of his leave.

32. Privilege leave cannot be taken in continuation of furlough, nor can furlough be obtained in continuation of privilege leave. If furlough be obtained by an officer while absent on privilege leave, the privilege leave will be converted into general leave, the officer for that period sacrificing a moiety of his staff salary.

MILITARY OFFICERS IN CIVIL EMPLOY.
33. Military officers in civil or political employ taking leave in India come, as respects periods of leave obtainable and amount of pay to be granted, under the Civil Leave Rules. When they take leave out of India, they come under the Military Leave Rules.

SUBSIDIARY RULE.

34. Officers of the Indian military and medical services will be required generally to notify their intention to accept these rules, or to adhere to those now existing, on the first occasion of their taking furlough or general leave after the publication of this order. Such election must be considered final, and under no plea whatever will an officer be subsequently relieved from the choice thus made. Officers who may determine to abide by existing rules will be allowed to proceed on furlough on the conditions laid down in Rules 7, 8, and 13, to the extent to which they may be entitled under the furlough regulations of 1868, and on the rates of pay contemplated in those regulations, but retaining their appointments. The principle laid down in Rule 15 must, however, be applied in many cases.

If an officer under the Furlough Rule of 1796 elects the present rule, his service for pension will be reckoned under the former rules up to 1st July, 1868, and thenceforward under the rules of 1868.

All leave of absence granted by competent authority will henceforward involve retention of appointment. No officer will be allowed on the plea of private affairs, to extend his leave, upon whatever grounds such leave may have been originally granted, beyond three years, except upon satisfactory evidence of very urgent necessity.

The rule contained in the 2nd clause of paragraph 13 of the Furlough Rules of 1861 will be in all cases strictly observed.

It has been decided:—1st, that the furlough rules of 1868 shall apply to all warrant officers holding veteran or honorary commissions, the period of service qualifying for furlough being calculated from the date of the attainment of the commission. These officers will receive, during furlough, half their total receipts, without any reference to a minimum or maximum rate.

2nd.—That conductors and sub-conductors shall only be entitled to a furlough on sick certificate. The furlough will be for

two years and half of aggregate Indian allowances will be drawn during that period. Any leave on sick certificate not exceeding one year, granted in extension of the two years, or leave taken within less than three years from date of last return to duty, will be on English furlough pay only.

N. B.—These rules are equally applicable to warrant officers and those holding the honorary rank of Assistant Surgeons in the Subordinate Medical Department.

Warrant officers holding that rank on the 23rd August, 1872, may, should they elect to do so, continue on the scale hitherto in force, and reckon all leave in India as

service, and all leave out of India as against service. This option will not be given to men attaining warrant rank after this date.

Applications from warrant officers for leave to Europe must be accompanied by a duly certified statement of the applicant's service, and of the condition in respect to service, for pensions under which the furlough is taken.

Officers who have served less than three years in India, and have lost their health, are entitled to an allowance from the Fund of the late Lord Clive, if they shall be adjudged to be proper objects of that bounty, to the extent of:—
2nd Lieuts., Cornets, or Ensigns, 2s. a day,
or £36 10s. a year;

Lieutenants, 6d. a day, or £45 12s. 6d. a year; provided they are not possessed of, or entitled to, real or personal property, to the extent of, if an ensign, £250; if a lieutenant, £300.

Officers, on producing the prescribed medical certificate, countersigned by the commanding officer, that they are compelled to quit the service by wounds received in action, or by ill-health contracted on active service, or on detachment, outpost, or any military duty, in notoriously unhealthy localities, after 3 years' service in India, are permitted to retire on the half-pay of their rank, viz.:—

2nd Lieutenants, Cornets, or Ensigns, 3s. a day, or £54 lbs. a year.

A subaltern officer, having served six years in India, is permitted to retire on the half-pay of *casim*, if his constitution should be so impaired as to prevent the possibility of his continuing in India.

A lieutenant having served ten, or a second lieutenant, cornet, or ensign, six years in India, may retire on the half-pay of his rank, in case his health shall not permit him to serve in India.

Regimental captains, majors, and lieutenant-colonels, whose ill state of health renders it impossible for them to continue to serve in India, are allowed to retire on the half-pay of their rank, viz. :—

Captains. 7s. a day, or £127 15s. a year.
Majors. 9s. 6d. a day, or £173 7s. 3d. a year.
Lieut.-colonels, 11s. a day, or £204 15s.
a year.

All officers who have actually served twenty-two years in India, are allowed to retire on the full pay of their respective ranks. This does not apply to officers of the Staff Corps.

* When officers on furlough receive more than the pay or half-pay of their rank, they are allowed, during a period of two years and a half from their quitting India, when authorized furlough, the benefit of the regimental rank they may have respectively attained up to the date of their retirement.

Officers retiring from the service will be considered to have retired from the date of their application for leave to retire, or from the expiration of two years and a half from their quitting India, whichever shall happen first.

A Surgeon-General, after five years' active employment in India in that grade, will be entitled to retire upon a pension of £350 per annum, in addition to that to which he may be entitled under the above scale.

A Deputy Surgeon-General will, after five years' active employment in India in that grade, be entitled to retire upon a pension of £250 per annum, in addition to the pension to which he may be entitled under the above scale.

In each of these cases six months' absence on medical certificate will be allowed to

count towards actual service in those grades.

RETIREMENT REGULATIONS.

11 December, 1872.

Henceforth, the following rules shall be applicable to all officers of the Staff Corps, and of the Medical Service, and of the General List, of and above the rank of captain.

1. Pay shall be regularly issued up to

the full period of leave allowed, not exceeding three years.

2. An officer shall be allowed to retain any rank he may have attained previous to date of retirement.

3. He shall receive any half-pay pension allotted to him in virtue of that rank.

4. The date of retirement shall be the date of the officer's application to retire.

5. The retired pay shall be issued from the date of retirement or the date when pay on full strength ceased, whichever may first happen, except in the following case,—

6. An officer who attains an advanced rank after the cessation of pay, and then retires on half-pay pension in virtue of that rank, shall receive his retired pay from the date of his promotion only.

The above rules will not apply to the officers of the Local Army, or to officers on the General List, who will remain under former regulations.

The rule as to retirement on pension of rank after 22 years' service is not applicable to officers of the General List.

REGULATIONS FOR THE ADMISSION OF PENSIONERS TO THE BENEFITS OF THE FUND LATELY CALLED LORD CLIVE'S.

Every petitioning officer and soldier must produce a certificate from his commanding officer of his being an invalid, and rendered incapable of further service in India, together with an approbation of such certificate by the Governor and Council of the Presidency where he shall have served.

Every commissioned officer must previously make oath before the governor and council, viz:—a colonel, that he is not possessed of, or entitled to, real and personal property to the value of £2000; a lieutenant-colonel, £1000; a major, £500; a captain, £200; a lieutenant, £100; an ensign, £100. Officers' widows must produce proof, on affidavit, that their husbands did not die possessed of property as above.

Pensioners residing in England may be admitted if adjudged to be proper officers. All commissioned, staff, or warrant officers, to have half the ordinary pay they enjoyed whilst in service, viz:—

Their widows one-half the above, to continue during their widowhood. Sergeants of artillery to have absence per day, and those that have lost a limb one shilling per day. Gunners of the artillery sixpence per day, and those that have lost a limb sixpence per day.

All other non-commissioned officers and bombardiers to have 4 pence three farthings per day.

Officers and privates to be entitled from the period of their landing in England. Pensioners neglecting to claim the pension for three half-years will be considered as dead, and no arrears for a longer period than two years back from the date of application for admission or re-admission, as the case may be, will be allowed either to claimants or to pensioners after admission.

N.B.—Officers admitted to the benefit of the Retiring Regulations are not entitled to participate in Lord Clive's Fund.

ROYAL WARRANT

FOR THE FORMATION OF THE STAFF CORPS.

VICTORIA R.

WHEREAS it is expedient to provide a body of Officers for Our Service in India, by whom various offices and appointments hitherto held by Officers borne on the strength of the several Corps or Regiments of Our Forces in India shall hereafter be held; and whereas Our Secretary of State for India in Council has recommended to change upon the Revenue of India the sum necessary to provide the pay, half-pay, and pensions of such body of Officers on the scale hereinafter contained, Our will and pleasure is that a Corps be formed in each of the Presidencies of Our Indian Dominions, to be denominated the Bengal, Madras, and Bombay Staff Corps respectively, to consist of such Officers as may

be received for such employment, and are selected for such purpose by Our Government in India, with the approbation of Our Secretary of State for India in Council.

It is also Our will and pleasure that all Officers now holding, or who immediately before the commencement of their present unexpired Periods may have held such appointments, and in future Officers, belonging to any of Our Land Forces serving in India, under the rank of Regimental Field Officer, who shall have served three years with a Regiment, of which two shall have been in India, shall be eligible to enter such Staff Corps; but such Officers will not be permanently transferred to the Staff Corps unless fully qualified, and until they shall have passed such periods of probation as may be determined on for the branch of the Indian Service for which they may be selected. Officers will receive Commissions in the Staff Corps on their names being submitted to us by Our Secretary of State for India.

It is Our further will and pleasure that the promotion and pay of the Staff Corps shall be regulated as follows:—

1. Ensigns, when permanently transferred to the Staff Corps, to have the rank of Lieutenant. Other Officers to have the rank which they may hold in their Regiments.

2. Promotion in the Staff Corps to be governed by length of service. Officers after twelve years' service, of which four must have been in the Staff Corps, to become Captains.

After twenty years' service, of which six must have been in the Staff Corps, to become Majors.

After twenty-six years' service, of which eight must have been in the Staff Corps, to become Lieutenant-Colonels.

Five years' service in the Staff Corps as Lieutenant-Colonel to entitle the Officer so employed to the Brevet rank of Colonel.

3. Officers now in Staff employment in India, joining the Staff Corps on its formation, shall count their previous Staff service towards promotion to the following extent:—

One step of rank will be given to every Officer whose period of service would qualify him for it, according to the above Rules. An interval of two years at least must intervene between each succeeding step.

4. Officers in the Staff Corps will be eligible for Brevet rank in common with the rest of the Army.

5. Officers of the Staff Corps holding Military appointments will take Military Command according to their Army rank, but Officers whilst holding only Civil appointments will not be entitled to assume such Command.

6. Exchanges may be allowed between Officers of the Staff Corps under the substantive rank of Field Officer and Regimental Officers of the same rank on the recommendation of the Indian Governments. Officers of the Staff Corps exchanging into a Regiment will become the Juniors of their Regimental rank.

7. The power of removing Officers from the effective List of the Staff Corps will be exercised by us through Our Secretary of State for India.

8. Officers of the Staff Corps will receive pay according to the following scale:—

Every officer when in active employment will also receive, in addition to the above pay, such a sum as will make his total pay and allowances up to the sum assigned by the Government in India, with the approval of the Secretary of State for India in Council, as the consolidated pay of the office which he may hold. Eventually a certain proportion of the under Officers of the Staff Corps will receive Colonel's allowance.

9. Officers of the Staff Corps will be allowed to retire on the following scale of pension,

* This portion of the Royal Warrant has been revised by another Royal warrant, dated 24 May, 1868, which declares that—“Our will and pleasure is that from and after the date of this Our Warrant, Officers of Our Land Forces serving in India, under the rank of Regimental Field Officer, who shall have served two years with a Regiment, of which one shall have been in India, shall be eligible to enter the Bengal, Madras, or Bombay Staff Corps.”

Officers of Her Majesty's Indian Forces joining the Staff Corps will be entitled to pension under the Regulations of the Indian Service.

10. Officers of the Staff Corps in England who may not wish to retire, but who are unable to return to India, and Officers removed from the effective List who may not be entitled to retire on the above scale of pension, will be placed on a half-pay list, provided they have served three years in India in the Staff Corps on the same rate of half-pay and on the same conditions as Officers of a similar rank in Our Army.

11. It is also Our will and pleasure that this Warrant shall be administered and interpreted by Our Secretary of State for India in Council, who shall be the sole and standing Authority upon the matters therein contained.

Given at Our Court at Windsor, this Sixteenth day of January, 1861, in the Twenty-fourth year of Our Reign. By Her Majesty's Command, (Signed) CHARLES WOOD.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PROMOTION OF INDIAN OFFICERS SO FAR AS RELATES TO RANK IN THE ARMY.

VICTORIA II.

Whereas it has been represented to Us that it is expedient to make further Regulations for governing the Promotion in the Army of the Officers of Our Indian Forces, Our will and pleasure is, that the Regulations annexed to this Our Royal Warrant be established, and be the sole Regulations under which the Promotion in the Army of such Officers shall be effected.

Given at Our Court at Windsor this 21st day of December, 1871, in the Thirty-fifth Year of Our Reign. By Her Majesty's Command, ALFRED.

1. Field Marshals shall be appointed at the will of the Sovereign, and the rank shall be conferred without reference to seniority.

2. The names of General Officers shall be borne upon three separate lists. The first shall contain the names of those on the first establishment; the second, those who having been promoted out of their regular turn are supernumerary to the fixed establishment; and the third, those who have returned from the service with the honorary rank of general officers.

3. The fixed establishment of General Officers shall be the following:—

Major-Generals	87

4. Promotion on the establishment from

the rank of Lieutenant-general to that of general, and from the rank of major-general to that of Lieutenant-general, shall be made as vacancies occur, according to seniority, subject however to the provision laid down in the last paragraph of clause 11.

5. Every vacancy on the establishment of general officers shall be filled by the promotion of the senior colonel, subject to the provision in the last paragraph of clause 11, or by the transfer of a general officer from the supernumerary list as provided in clause 8.

6. Temporary rank and command as general, lieutenant-general, or major-general, may, for the convenience of Our service, be conferred, without regard to seniority, on lieutenant-generals, major-generals, or colonels respectively; and if the officer during the continuance of such temporary rank and command shall have conducted

years being inclusive of any time he shall have been obliged to pass upon half-pay or leave in consequence of ill-health contracted in the service (as established by a Board of Medical Officers), or in consequence of wound received in action.

An Officer of the Staff Corps promoted to the rank of Field Officer by Brevet for service in the field, who shall continue to serve uninterruptedly on full pay from the date of his promotion by Brevet to the date of his obtaining the rank of Major-General, is entitled to the unexpired pay of that rank, notwithstanding he may not have served five years, with the regimental rank of Field Officer with a regiment, or in one of the situations specified in Clause 8 of the Royal Warrant of 31 Jan., 1859.

himself to Our satisfaction, the rank so held may, upon the recommendation of Our Governor-General in Council, be converted into permanent rank after having been held for five years in time of peace, or for any shorter period in the field during war. A colonel who shall vacate an appointment as temporary major-general and whose temporary rank shall not have been made permanent, may, upon the recommendation of Our Governor-General in Council, be made an honorary major-general, and shall retain that rank until he succeeds to the establishment in virtue of his seniority on the list of colonels.

7. Promotion may be conferred upon a lieutenant-general, major-general, or colonel without regard to seniority, for distinguished service in the field, and in such case the recommendation of Our Governor-General in Council, detailing the services for which the officer is promoted, shall be published in the General Orders of Our Indian military forces, and in the "London Gazette."

8. An officer not below the rank of colonel, promoted for temporary service in a higher rank, or for distinguished service in the field, shall be borne as supernumerary, and shall not be placed on the establishment in his new rank until the time when he would have attained such rank by seniority; that is to say, when the surviving officer who stood next senior in the list to the officer promoted under clause 6 or 7, shall have attained the same rank on the establishment, the next vacancy shall be filled by the transfer of the supernumerary general officer to the establishment.

9. A supernumerary major-general, who has been promoted for temporary service, and absorbed, under clause 8, into the establishment, shall have seniority according to the date of his permanent rank as major-general, and shall rise to be lieutenant-general and general, whether before or after his absorption into the establishment, in accordance with that seniority. A supernumerary general officer who has been promoted for distinguished service in the field, and absorbed under clause 8, shall take his seniority from the date of his promotion as published in the "London Gazette."

10. The officers of the Staff Corps on the Indian List having been transferred to the general list of the British army according to the regulations contained in clause 29 of Our Royal Warrant of the 25th of December, 1873, their names shall be returned on the Indian List in India, until their death or retirement, for the purpose of regulating the promotion of the officers below them on that list.

11. On the occurrence of a vacancy in the fixed number of General Officers on the Indian List, specified in clause 3 of this

Warrant, whether among those who remain effective on that list, or among those whose names are merely retained in India, and who shall be considered as forming part of the said fixed establishment, the name of the senior officer in each grade on the Indian List below that in which the vacancy may occur (with the exception of the grade of lieutenant-general, shall be moved up to the next higher grade; but in the case of the officers whose names remain in India, there shall be no actual promotion, the arrangements being limited to the transfer of the names for the purpose of regulating the promotion of those officers who remain effective on the Indian List; and the promotion of an effective colonel on the Indian List to the rank of major-general shall in no case be affected by casualties among the general officers of the staff corps, until the number of general officers to be added to the British Establishment under clause 25 of Our said Royal Warrant of the 25th of December 1870, shall be complete.

12. The rank of brigadier-general shall be held as temporary only.

13. A lieutenant-colonel may attain the rank of colonel—

(a.) By regimental seniority in the case of officers on the Indian List of cavalry and infantry whose substantive commissions, as lieutenant-colonel, are dated prior to the 1st of January, 1862;
(b.) By 12 years' service in the substantive grade of lieutenant-colonel;

(c.) By brevet, after five years' satisfactory service in a staff situation in India, with the substantive rank of lieutenant-colonel;

(d.) By brevet, on appointment to be one of Our aides-de-camp;

(e.) By brevet, as a reward for distinguished service in the field;

(f.) By brevet, after five years' service as lieutenant-colonel in the command, or as second in command, of a regiment;

(g.) By brevet, after five years' satisfactory service as substantive major with the brevet rank of lieutenant-colonel, in the following appointments:—

Adjutant-general.

Deputy adjutant-general.

Assistant adjutant-general.

Quartermaster-general.

Deputy quartermaster-general.

Assistant quartermaster-general.

Secretary to the Government of India in the Military or Public Works Department.

Secretary to the Military Department to the Government of Madras or of Bombay, in the Lieutenant Governor of the Punjab, to the Chief Commissioner of Mysore, or to the Resident at Hyderabad.

Deputy secretary to Government in the Military Department.

Assistant Secretary to Government of India in the Military Department.

Military secretary to the Governor-General, or Commander-in-Chief in India, or at Madras or Bombay.

Deputy judge advocate-general.

Commissionary-general.

Superintendent of the ordnance manufacturing department.

Superintendent of a gun foundry.

Agent for the manufacture of gun powder.

Agent for gun carriages.

Chief engineer.

Superintending engineer.

Chief inspector of musketry.

Surveyor-general.

Controller of military accounts.

Examiner of commissariat and stud accounts, or—

First examiner of the pay department, subject always to the approval of the Governor-General in Council, or governor-in-council, and commander-in-chief of the presidency in which the officer belongs.

(h.) By brevet, after eight years' satisfactory service as a substantive lieutenant-colonel or substantive major, with the brevet rank of lieutenant-colonel, in a civil situation under Government; provided the appointment be of a nature considered by Our Governor-General in Council and Commander-in-Chief in India to be calculated to afford the officer such practical experience as may afterwards prove advantageous to the corps or service to which he belongs;

(i.) By brevet, after eight years' service, with the brevet rank of lieutenant-colonel conferred for distinguished service in the field.

14. A substantive major with the brevet rank of lieutenant-colonel, who shall fall into temporary command of a regiment for a continuous period exceeding one calendar month, shall reckon each continuous period as part of the five years required to qualify for the rank of colonel.

15. When a regiment shall be so divided as to constitute two distinct commands, and one portion shall be under the command of a substantive major who is also a brevet lieutenant-colonel, or when he shall draw the command part of such command for any period in consequence of the death or removal of the commanding officer, or when a brevet lieutenant-colonel (irrespective of his substantive rank) shall be in command of a mixed force of at least 400 men of different corps in the field for a consecutive period

of not less than one calendar month, such service, or portions of such service, shall be allowed to reckon as part of the period required to qualify for the rank of colonel, subject to the approval of Our Commander-in-Chief in India and Governor-General of India in Council.

16. No period of acting staff service shall reckon towards the rank of colonel, unless it be converted into actual staff service by subsequent confirmation.

17. A major may attain the rank of lieutenant-colonel—

(a.) By regimental seniority;

(b.) By 26 years' service in the army in the case of officers whose appointment to Our Indian forces was made subject to the conditions prescribed in the general order of Our Governor-General of India in Council, dated the 9th of December 1859, No. 1637;

(c.) By brevet, after 26 years' service in the army, so long as there remain any majors on the list of cavalry and infantry in Our Indian forces;

(d.) By brevet, in succession to a vacancy on the establishment of general officers;

(e.) By brevet, for distinguished service in the field.

18. A captain may attain the rank of major—

(a.) By regimental seniority;

(b.) By 26 years' service in the army in the case of officers whose appointment to Our Indian forces was made subject to the conditions prescribed in the General Order of Our Governor-General of India in Council, dated the 9th of December, 1859, No. 1637;

(c.) By brevet, after 26 years' service in the army, so long as there remain any captains on the list of cavalry and infantry in Our Indian forces;

(d.) By brevet, in succession to a vacancy on the establishment of general officers;

(e.) By brevet, for distinguished service in the field.

19. A lieutenant may attain the rank of captain—

(a.) By regimental seniority;

(b.) By promotion on the general list, on the occurrence of a vacancy in the cadre of a regiment of cavalry or infantry in which no lieutenant remains, in the case of officers whose appointment to Our Indian forces was made subject to the conditions prescribed in the General Order of Our Governor-General of India in Council, dated the 9th of December 1859, No. 1637;

(c.) By brevet, after 12 years' service in the army, so long as there remain any lieutenants on the list of cavalry and infantry in Our Indian forces.

REGULATIONS FOR THE OPEN COMPETITION OF 1876.*

1. On Tuesday, April 4, 1876, and following days, an examination of candidates will be held in London. At this examination not fewer than Candidates will be selected, if so many shall be found duly qualified. Of these, will be selected for the Presidency of Bengal (for the Upper Provinces, and for the Lower Provinces), and for that of Madras, and for that of Bombay.†—Notice will hereafter be given of the days and place of examination.

2. Any person desirous of competing at this examination must produce to the Civil Service Commissioners, before the 1st of February, 1876, evidence showing:—

(a) That he is a natural born subject of Her Majesty;

(b) That his age on the 1st March, 1876, will be above seventeen years and under twenty-one years. N.B.—*In the case of Natives of India this must be certified by the Government of India, or of the Presidency or Province in which the Candidate may have resided;*

(c) That he has no disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity, unfitting him, or likely to unfit him, for the Civil Service of India; ‡

(d) That he is of good moral character; he must also pay such fee as the Secretary of State for India may prescribe. §

3. Should the evidence upon the above points be *prima facie* satisfactory to the Civil Service Commissioners, the Candidate will, upon payment of the prescribed fee, be admitted to the examination. The Commissioners may, however, in their discretion, at any time prior to the grant of the Certificate of Qualification hereinafter referred to, institute such further inquiries as they may deem necessary; and if the result of such inquiries, in the case of any Candidate should be unsatisfactory to them in any of the above respects, he will be ineligible for admission to the Civil Service of India, and if already selected, will be removed from the position of a Probationer.

4. The examination will take place only in the following branches of knowledge:—

* The Regulations are liable to be altered in future years.

† The number of appointments to be made, and the number in each Presidency, &c., will be announced hereafter.

‡ Evidence of health and character must bear date not earlier than the 1st January, 1876.

§ The fee for this examination will be £5, payable by means of a special stamp according to instructions which will be communicated to Candidates.

Candidates are at liberty to name, before Feb. 1, 1876, any or all of these branches of knowledge. No subjects are obligatory.

5. The merit of the persons examined will be estimated by marks, and the number set opposite to each branch in the preceding regulation denotes the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it.

6. No Candidate will be allowed any marks in respect of any subject of examination, unless he shall be considered to possess a *competent knowledge* of that subject.

7. The examination will be conducted by means of printed questions and written answers, and by *visu voce* examination, as may be deemed necessary.

8. The marks obtained by each Candidate in respect of each of the subjects in which he shall have been examined will be added up, and the names of the Candidates who shall have obtained a greater aggregate number of marks than any of the remaining Candidates will be set forth in order of merit; and such Candidates shall be deemed to be selected Candidates for the Civil Service of India, provided they appear to be in other respects duly qualified.

Should any of the selected Candidates

1. "Nothing can be further from our wish than to hold out premiums for knowledge of wide surface and of small depth. It is our opinion that a Candidate ought to be allowed no credit at all for taking up a subject in which he is a mere smatterer."—Report of Committee of 1864. A deduction of marks will be made under each subject, including Mathematics.

become disqualified, the Secretary of State for India will determine whether the vacancy thus created shall be filled up or not. In the former case, the Candidate next in order of merit and in other respects duly qualified shall be deemed to be a selected Candidate. A selected Candidate declining to accept the appointment which may be offered to him will be disqualified for any subsequent competition.

9. Selected Candidates, before proceeding to India, will be on probation for two years, during which time they will be examined periodically, with a view of testing their progress, in the following subjects:—

(2) The History and Geography of India	850

In these examinations, as in the open competition, the merit of the Candidates examined will be estimated by marks, and the number set opposite to each subject denotes the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it at any one examination. The examination will be conducted by means of printed questions and written answers, and by *visu voce* examination, as may be deemed necessary. The last of these examinations will be held at the close of the second year of probation, and will be called the "Final Examination," at which it will be decided whether a selected Candidate is qualified for the Civil Service of India.

10. Any candidate who, at any of the periodical Examinations, shall appear to have wilfully neglected his studies, or to be physically incapacitated for pursuing the prescribed course of training, will be liable to have his name removed from the list of selected Candidates.

11. The selected Candidates who, at the final examination, shall be found to have a competent knowledge of the subjects specified in Regulation 9, and who shall have satisfied the Civil Service Commissioners of their eligibility in respect of age, health, and character, shall be certified by the said Commissioners to be entitled to be appointed to the Civil Service of India, provided they shall comply with

the regulations in force at the time for that service.

12. Applications from persons desirous to be admitted as candidates are to be addressed to the Secretary to the Civil Service Commissioners, London, S.W., from whom the proper form for the purpose may be obtained. 17th June, 1876.

The Civil Service Commissioners are authorized by the Secretary of State for India in Council to make the following announcements:—

(1) Selected Candidates will be permitted to choose, according to the order in which they stand in the list resulting from the open competition, as long as a choice remains, the Presidency (and in Bengal the Division of the Presidency) to which they shall be appointed; but this choice will be subject to a different arrangement should the Secretary of State or Government of India deem it necessary.

(2) No Candidate will be permitted to proceed to India before he shall have passed the final examination, and received a certificate of qualification from the Civil Service Commissioners, or after he shall have attained the age of twenty-four years.

(3) The seniority in the Civil Service of India of the selected Candidates shall be determined according to the order in which they stand on the list resulting from the final examination.

(4) It is the intention of the Secretary of State to allow the sum of £50 after each of the three first half years of probation, and £150 after the last half year, to each selected Candidate who shall have passed the required examinations to the satisfaction of the Commissioners, and shall have complied with such rules as may be laid down for the guidance of selected Candidates.

(5) All selected Candidates will be required, after having passed the second periodical examination, to attend at the India Office for the purpose of entering into an agreement binding themselves, amongst other things, to refund in certain cases the amount of their allowance in the event of their failing to proceed to India. For a candidate under age a surety will be required.

(6) After passing the Final Examination, each candidate will be required to attend again at the India Office, with the view of entering into covenants and giving a bond for £1,000 jointly with two sureties for the due fulfilment of the same. The stamp payable on these documents amount to £1 10s.

(7) Candidates rejected at the final examination of 1876 will in no case be allowed to present themselves for re-examination.

* This choice must be exercised immediately after the result of the open competition is announced, on such day as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

CHAPLAINS.

REGULATIONS FOR THEIR ADMISSION.

Candidates for appointments as Junior Chaplains must have been two years in Orders, and be under thirty-four years of age, and must, prior to appointment, produce their letters of Orders, Doncon, and Priest, as well as testimonial, signed by three beneficed clergymen; the appointments are made subject to the approval of

the Archbishop of Canterbury or the Bishop of London.

Chaplains must proceed to their destination within four months from the date of their nomination by the Secretary of State; and in failure thereof, without leave obtained from the Secretary of State for India in Council, their appointments will lapse.

CIVIL SERVICE FURLOUGH AND ABSENTEE RULES OF 1868.

DEFINITIONS.

1. In the following Rules

"Actual Service" includes the period during which an officer is on duty, also periods spent on Privilege and Subsidiary Leave, and periods during which an officer, not on leave, may be out of employ on subsistence allowance in India.

"Extraordinary Leave" means any leave granted otherwise than under these Rules.

"Long Extraordinary Leave" means extraordinary leave extending beyond a period of three months.

"Long Furlough" means furlough extending beyond a period of three months.

"Salary" includes acting allowances.

An officer's "Station" means that station to which he stands appointed, or such other place as the Government to which he is subordinate may determine.

CHAPTER I.

FURLOUGH.

2. The maximum period of furlough which can be granted to any officer during the whole period of his service is limited to six years.

3. Subject to the above limit, furlough shall be placed to the credit of each officer, at the proportional rate of one year's furlough for every four years of actual service.*

4. No furlough shall be taken before the completion of eight years' actual service, except under Rule 8.

5. Furlough shall not be repeated until three years from the date of the last return from Long Extraordinary Leave or Long Furlough, except under Rule 8. Leave taken under Chapters II. and III., but no

* A Civil Servant who has taken leave on medical certificate under leave rules prior to those of 1868, will not be debited with such leave, up to the limit of one year, against furlough which would otherwise be at his credit. All such leave shall, however, be included in the maximum amount of six years fixed in Rule 2 of the Rules of 1868.

other leave, shall be reckoned as part of the said three years.

6. The maximum term of furlough to be taken at any one time shall be two years.

7. Except as hereinafter provided, an officer, when on furlough, shall retain a lien on his substantive appointment, or on an appointment of similar character and not less salary, and he shall be granted allowances at the rate of 50 per cent. of his average salary for the previous three years, or for the period which has elapsed since his last return from Long Furlough or Long Extraordinary Leave, is that period be less than three years.

In calculating such average, the time spent and the allowances drawn under any leave, excepting Privilege Leave under Chapter II., shall be omitted.

Provided that no officer on furlough shall draw more than £1,000, or less than £500 per annum, unless his salary is less than £500, in which case he shall draw an allowance equal to his salary.

8. Under medical certificate—

(a) Furlough may be taken on the above-mentioned conditions, without reference to the amount at credit under Rule 3.

(b) Furlough for a period not exceeding one year may be taken, even if less than three years have elapsed since the last return from Long Extraordinary Leave or Long Furlough. When on furlough under this clause, an officer will not retain a lien on his appointment, and will be entitled only to subsistence allowance, unless he has completed six months' actual service since his last return from Long Extraordinary Leave or Long Furlough, and there remain some leave to his credit under Rule 3, in which case the officer will retain a lien on his appointment, and will draw allowances as calculated under Rule 7, until that credit be exhausted, but in no case for a period exceeding one year.

(c) Furlough taken without medical certificate, or under clause (a) of this Rule, may be extended beyond two years for a period not exceeding one year. When on furlough under this clause, an officer,

will not retain a lien on his appointment, and will be entitled only to subsistence allowance.

9. Furlough taken or extended under Rule 8 is subject to the provision of Rule 2.

10. Furlough taken in India will be reckoned from the date of the officer quitting his station to the date of his return thereto. Furlough taken out of India will be reckoned from the date of embarkation to the date of return.

In the event of the furlough being taken partly in India and partly out of India, the commencement and termination of the furlough will be determined by the above rules, according as the furlough begins or ends in or out of India.

11. For the interval elapsing between departure from his station and the commencement of furlough, and between the termination of furlough and the re-arrival at his station, an officer shall be allowed subsidiary leave not ordinarily exceeding in each case thirty days. During those periods his allowances will be calculated in the same way as his furlough allowances, but without limitation as to maximum and minimum. Provided that, if the officer has, under these rules, lost his lien on his appointment, he shall draw subsistence allowance of his rank. Subsidiary leave shall count as service and residence.

12. Applications for furlough will in all cases be submitted to the Government to which the applicant is subordinate, and will be dealt with in such manner as the Governor-General of India in Council may from time to time prescribe.

13. Subject to the exigencies of the service, both as regards the number of furloughs available at any one time, and as regards individual applications, of which the exigencies the Government of India, Madras, or Bombay, as the case may be, shall be exclusively the judge, furloughs will be granted under these rules.

14. All applications for furlough under medical certificate, in accordance with these rules, will be granted without restriction.

15. If, owing to the exigencies of the service, it may be necessary to place any limit on the number of officers who may be absent on furlough at the same time, applications not supported by medical certificate will be granted in the following order:—

The applicant to whose credit the great-

est amount of furlough remains under Rule 3 shall have the preference.

If two or more applicants are on an equality in this respect, the preference shall be given to the applicant whose actual service in India is longest, reckoning, in the case of an officer who has not taken long extraordinary leave or long furlough, from the date of arrival in India, and in the case of an officer who has taken long extraordinary leave or long furlough, from the date of his last return from such leave or furlough.

If two or more applicants are equal in both respects, the preference shall be given to the senior in the Gradation List.

16. The term of residence qualifying for pension shall be twenty-one years, but no leave, except privilege leave and subsidiary leave, shall count as residence.

17. The term of service qualifying for pension shall be twenty-five years.

CHAPTER II.

PRIVILEGE LEAVE.

18. Subject to the exigencies of the state, an officer who has completed eleven months' continuous duty may take privilege leave for one month without deduction from his salary, retaining a lien on his appointment whether substantive or officiating. Provided that, in the case of his holding an officiating appointment, such lien and his acting allowance will cease on the resumption of charge by the officer to whom the substantive appointment belongs.

19. In the same manner, and under the same conditions, two or three months' privilege leave may be taken when an officer has completed continuous duty of twenty-two or thirty-three months respectively.

20. Privilege leave may, at the discretion of the local Government, be taken in separate instalments. No second instalment shall be taken until after the completion of six months' continuous duty from the expiry of the first instalment. In this case, the eleven months qualifying for fresh privilege leave will be reckoned from the expiry of the first instalment, the period of the second instalment being omitted from the calculation.

Provided that the whole privilege leave taken at any one time shall not exceed three months, and that no accumulation of privilege leave beyond that period shall be admitted.

21. If an officer shall over-stay his privilege leave, he shall forfeit all salary during the time of his remaining so absent; and, if he shall so continue absent for more than one week, his office shall become vacant.

22. Privilege leave shall be reckoned as residence and service.

CHAPTER III.
SPECIAL LEAVE.

23. Special leave, on urgent private affairs, may be granted at the discretion of the local government for a period not exceeding six months. In respect of retention of a lien on appointment of allowances drawn during the leave, and of subsidiary leave, the conditions of special leave shall be the same as those prescribed for furlough. Special leave shall not be reckoned as residence.

24. Rule 21 shall, *mutatis mutandis*, apply to an officer over-staying special leave.

25. Special leave may be repeated with out allowances after intervals of at least six years' actual service.

CHAPTER IV.
GENERAL.

26. Furlough, privilege leave, and special leave shall not be taken as such in continuation of each other; but, if an officer absent on one of these classes of leave be allowed to chance it for another, the whole period of his absence shall be held to be under the class of leave for which it was changed.

27. Subject to considerations of State, there will be no restriction as to the places where an officer may reside when on leave.

28. Leave allowance shall be payable monthly, if payment is taken in India, and quarterly, if payment is taken in England.

CHAPTER V.
TEMPORARY RULES.

29. Whatever aggregate amount out of the three years' furlough and three years' sick leave under the rules until now in force, at present remains to be taken by an officer under the said rules, shall remain to be taken by him under rules now promulgated.

RULES FOR THE REGULATION OF LEAVE OF ABSENCE TO THE JUDGES OF HER MAJESTY'S HIGH COURTS OF JUDICATURE IN INDIA.

DEFINITIONS.

1. In the following Rules, "Actual Service" includes the period during which a Judge is carrying on his duties in a High Court, also periods spent on Privilege and Subsidiary Leave, and periods of vacation during which the Judge is not on furlough or "Extraordinary Leave."

"Extraordinary Leave" means any leave granted otherwise than under these Rules.

CHAPTER I.
FURLOUGH.

2. One year's furlough shall be placed to the credit of each Judge after the completion of every four years of actual service.

31. Any officer now absent on leave, who has no appointment, may, on his return, and until he again holds an appointment carrying equal pay to that of the substantive appointment which he last held, draw the subsistence allowance of his rank, together with 75 per cent. of the pay of any appointment in which he shall officiate. Provided that the total salary so drawn by him shall not exceed the pay of the appointment in which he is officiating. This rule shall apply to any officer who may have already returned from furlough.

Rules regarding Acting Allowances.

1. An officer holding a substantive appointment, and officiating in an appointment of a higher grade or class, shall draw acting allowance calculated at 30 per cent. on the first Rs. 2,000, and 20 per cent. on the remainder of the pay of the appointment in which he is officiating.

Provided that, if the acting allowances so calculated do not amount to two-thirds of the difference between the pay of the two appointments, it shall be raised to two-thirds.

Provided further, that in no case shall the whole salary so drawn exceed the pay of the appointment in which the officer is officiating.

2. An officer holding no substantive, but only an officiating appointment, shall, subject to the provisions in Rule 1, draw, in addition to the subsistence allowance of his rank, 50 per cent. of the pay of the appointment in which he is officiating.

3. In the case of an officer officiating in an appointment the pay of which is progressive, his acting allowances shall be calculated on the mean pay of the said appointment, provided that the whole salary so drawn shall not exceed the minimum pay of the said appointment.

3. Except under Rules 6 and 7, no furlough shall be granted until at credit under Rule 2.

Provided that any Judge who may have been already in the service of the Government at the time of taking office in the High Court, and who was at that time entitled, under the Rules applicable to the branch of the service to which he belonged, to furlough without medical certificate, may be granted furlough for a term not exceeding that to which he was so entitled, upon the condition that such furlough shall not be taken until the completion of two years' actual service in the High Court, and shall not exceed one year.

4. Except under Rule 7, furlough shall not be repeated until after the completion

of three years' actual service from the date of the last return from furlough or extraordinary leave.

5. The maximum term of furlough to be taken at any one time shall be fifteen months.

6. Under medical certificate, furlough may be granted before it is at credit, under Rule 2.

7. On urgent private affairs, furlough may be granted before it is at credit, under Rule 2, and although three years of actual service have not been completed since the last return from furlough or extraordinary leave. Provided that furlough under this section shall not exceed six months, and shall be granted only once during the whole period of a Judge's service in the High Court.

8. The aggregate amount of all furlough which can be granted to a Judge during the whole period of his service in the High Court shall not exceed two years and a half.

9. Furlough taken in India shall be reckoned from the date of the Judge quitting his office to the date of his return thereto. Furlough taken out of India shall be reckoned from the date of embarkation to the date of return.

In the event of the furlough being taken partly in India and partly out of India, the commencement and termination of the furlough shall be respectively determined by the above Rules, according as the furlough begins or ends in or out of India.

10. For the interval elapsing between the date of quitting his office and the commencement of furlough out of India, and between the termination of furlough out of India and resuming his office, a Judge may be allowed subsidiary leave, not ordinarily exceeding thirty days, which in special cases may be extended.

11. A Judge, when on furlough or subsidiary leave, shall receive allowances at the rate of Rs. 833. 5. 4. per mensem, or £1,000 per annum.

12. Except under medical certificate, the number of furloughs to be granted at any one time, and the grant of furloughs to individual Judges, shall be subject to, and limited by, the exigencies of the service, which exigencies shall be determined exclusively by the authority granting the furlough.

13. If, owing to the exigencies of the service, it may be necessary to place any limit on the number of Judges who may be absent on furlough at the same time, applications not supported by medical certificate will be granted in the following order:—

The Judge to whose credit the greatest amount of furlough remains under Rule 2 shall have the preference.

If two or more applicants are on an

equality in this respect, the preference shall be given to the applicant whose actual service in a High Court is longest, reckoning in the case of a Judge who has not taken furlough or extraordinary leave from the date of his commencement of service in the High Court, and in the case of a Judge who has taken furlough or extraordinary leave from the date of his last return from such furlough or leave.

If two or more applicants are equal in both respects, the preference shall be given to the senior in the Court.

CHAPTER II.

PRIVILEGE LEAVE.

14. Subject to the exigencies of the service, a Judge who has completed eleven months' continuous duty, inclusive of vacations, may, if the Government be satisfied that there is an urgent necessity, but not otherwise, be granted privilege leave for one month without deduction from his salary or acting allowances.

15. In the same manner, and under the same conditions, an additional month of privilege leave shall be held to accrue to a Judge after each further period of eleven months' continuous duty.

16. Privilege leave shall not be taken in instalments, but any balance of privilege leave that may not have been taken shall be added to the next privilege leave which may accrue. Provided that the whole privilege leave taken at any one time shall not exceed three months, and that any accumulation of privilege leave beyond that period shall be forfeited.

CHAPTER III.

GENERAL.

17. Furlough and privilege leave shall not be taken as such in continuation of each other, but if a Judge absent on one of these classes of leave be allowed to change it for another, the whole period of his absence shall be held to be under the class of leave for which it was changed.

18. Applications for leave shall in all cases be submitted in such manner as the Government may, from time to time, prescribe.

19. Leave allowances shall be payable monthly if payment is taken in India, and quarterly if payment is taken in England.

20. No substantive appointment shall be vacated merely by reason of leave being granted under these Rules.

21. If a Judge shall overstay any leave, he shall forfeit all salary during the time of his remaining so absent, and if he shall so continue absent for more than one week, his office shall be liable to become vacant.

22. No leave, except privilege leave and leave subsidiary to furlough shall count

as service for pension. The period of service at present qualifying for pension as a High Court Judge shall be diminished by six months for full pension, and by three months for half pension.

23. Each Judge at present standing appointed to a High Court shall, on the first occasion of his taking leave, be given the option of accepting these Rules or abiding by those at present in force for Judges of the High Courts of Judicature.

24. If a Judge, who is a Covenanted Civil Servant, shall be permitted to resign his office and remain in the service, all leave which he may have taken as a Judge of the High Court shall be reckoned as if it had been taken under the Rules for the leave of absence of Covenanted Civil Servants.

The above Rules are, with the sanction of His Grace the Secretary of State for India in Council, hereby declared applicable, with the modifications below stated, to the following Officers:—

Barrister Judges of the Chief Court of the Punjab;
Recorders in Burmah;
First Judges of Small Cause Courts at the Presidency Towns;
Secretary to the Council of the Governor General for making Laws and Regulations.

Modifications above indicated.

1. The allowances of these Officers, while on furlough or subsidiary leave, shall not exceed half their salaries, and shall be limited also to the rate prescribed in Rule 11.

2. With reference to Rule 22, the pensions to which these Officers are entitled under medical certificate after nine years' service shall be due after eight years and eight months' actual service; and the pensions to which they are in like manner entitled after seven years' service shall be due after six years and nine months' actual service.

The following Notification is also published, for general information and guidance:—

Notification No. 3070.

A question having been raised as to whether the Resolution of the Financial Department, No. 101, dated the 24th April,

1869, and published at page No. 917 of the "Gazette of India" of 1st May, 1869, on the subject of privilege leave, is applicable to Judges of Her Majesty's High Courts of Judicature, the Governor General in Council observes that privilege leave to these and certain other officers, under the Rules recently prescribed, differs from ordinary privilege leave, in that no Judge of a High Court is held entitled to such leave, unless Government be satisfied that there is an urgent necessity for it. Leave under Chapter II. of the Rules in question is therefore rather in the nature of short leave on urgent private affairs, while vacation takes the place of privilege leave.

On these considerations, His Excellency in Council is pleased to declare that the Resolution above quoted shall not be held to apply to Judges of Her Majesty's High Courts of Judicature, or to the other Officers to whom the Rules governing the leave of those Judges have been declared applicable.

NOTIFICATION No. 2486.

With reference to the Notification of this Department, No. 3070, dated the 2d instant, published at page 253 of the "Gazette of India," the Governor General in Council is pleased to explain that the Resolution No. 101, dated 24th April, 1869, shall not be held to apply to any High Court Judge or other Judicial Officer to whom the new Rules governing the leave of High Court Judges have been declared applicable, even though, under Rule 23 of those Rules, he may elect to abide by former Rules. Whatever Rules any of these Officers may elect, privilege leave will not be granted to him except on urgent necessity being shown, since all of them have equally the benefit of vacation.

His Excellency in Council is further pleased to declare that the only exception will be the Secretary to the Council of the Governor General for making Laws and Regulations, since this Officer does not enjoy vacations. He will therefore be exempted from showing urgent necessity for privilege leave, but the Resolution No. 101, dated 24th April, 1869, will be applicable to him.

RULES REGARDING LEAVE OF ABSENCE TO CHAPLAINS.

DEFINITIONS.

1. In the following rules, "Actual Service" includes the period during which a Chaplain is on duty, also periods spent on privilege and subsidiary leave, and periods during which a Chaplain not on leave may be out of employ in India.

"Extraordinary Leave" means any leave granted otherwise than under these rules.
Fr. "Long Extraordinary Leave" means

extraordinary leave extending beyond a period of three months.
"Long Furlough" means furlough extending beyond a period of three months.
"Salary" includes acting allowances.
A Chaplain's "Station" means that station to which he stands appointed, or such other place as the Government to which he is subordinate may determine.

CIVIL FURLOUGH REGULATIONS (CHAPLAINS). xvii

CHAPTER I. FURLOUGH.

2 The maximum period of furlough which can be granted to any Chaplain during the whole period of his service, is limited to six years.

3 Subject to the above limit, furlough shall be placed to the credit of each Chaplain at the rate of one-fourth of his actual service after adding thereto one year.

EXAMPLE.—A Chaplain who has completed nine years' actual service, will be credited with one-fourth of ten years, i.e. two and a half years' furlough.

4 Subject to the same limit, leave on medical certificate to the extent of one year taken prior to the promulgation of these Rules, shall not be deducted from the furlough credited to a Chaplain under Rule 3.

4a. Except under Rule 8, furlough shall not be taken until the completion of seven years' actual service, nor in excess of the period of furlough at credit under Rules 3 and 4.

5. Except under Rule 8 (b), furlough shall not be repeated until three years from the date of the last return from long extraordinary leave, or long furlough. Leave taken under Chapters II and III, but no other leave, shall be reckoned as part of the said three years.

6. The maximum term of furlough to be taken at any one time shall be two years.

7. Except under Rule 8, a Chaplain when on furlough shall be granted allowances at the rates noted in the margin.

8. Under medical certificate—

(a) Furlough may be taken on the above conditions, without reference to the amount at credit under Rule 3.

(b) Furlough for a period not exceeding one year may be taken, even if less than three years have elapsed since the last return from long extraordinary leave or long furlough. When on furlough under this clause, a Chaplain shall be entitled to only the allowances noted in the margin, unless he has completed six months' actual service since his last return from long extraordinary leave, or long furlough, and there remains some leave to his credit under Rule 3, in which case a Chaplain shall

draw the full allowances mentioned in Rule 7, until that credit be exhausted, but in no case for a period exceeding one year.

(c) Furlough taken without medical certificate, or under clause (a) of this rule, may be extended beyond two years for a period not exceeding one year. During the period of extension of furlough beyond two years under this clause, a Chaplain shall be entitled to the allowances mentioned in the margin of Rule 7 (b).

9. Furlough taken or extended under Rule 8 shall be subject to the provision of Rule 2.

10. Furlough taken in India shall be reckoned from the date of the Chaplain quitting his station to the date of his return thereto. Furlough taken out of India shall be reckoned from the date of embarkation to the date of return.

In the event of the furlough being taken partly in India and partly out of India, the commencement and termination of the furlough shall be determined by the above rules, according as the furlough begins or ends in or out of India.

11. For the interval elapsing between departure from his station and the commencement of furlough, and between the termination of furlough and the re-arrival at his station, a Chaplain shall be allowed subsidiary leave not ordinarily exceeding in each case thirty days. During those periods his allowances shall be the same as during the furlough to which the said leave is subsidiary.

12. Subject to the exigencies of the service, both as regards the number of furloughs available at any one time, and as regards individual applications, of which exigencies the Government of India, Madras, or Bombay, as the case may be, shall be exclusively the judge, furloughs shall be granted under these rules. Extension of furlough, other than furlough under medical certificate, will be granted by the Local Government only.

13. All applications for furlough under medical certificate, in accordance with these rules, shall be granted without restriction.

14. If, owing to the exigencies of the service, it may be necessary to place any limit on the number of Chaplains who may be absent on furlough at the same time, applications not supported by medical certificate shall be granted in the following order:—

The applicant to whose credit the greatest amount of furlough remains under Rule 3 shall have the preference.

If two or more applicants are on an equality in this respect, the preference

shall be given to the applicant whose actual service in India is longest, reckoning in the case of a Chaplain who has not taken long extraordinary leave, or long furlough, from the date of his arrival in India, and in the case of a Chaplain who has taken long extraordinary leave, or long furlough, from the date of his last return from such leave or furlough.

If two or more applicants are equal in both respects, the preference shall be given to the senior in the Gradation List.

CHAPTER II. PRIVILEGE LEAVE.

15. Subject to the exigencies of the State, a Chaplain who has completed five months' continuous duty may take privilege leave for one month without deduction from his salary or house-rent, but with loss of conveyance and gao allowances.

16. In the same manner, and under the same conditions, two or three months' privilege leave may be taken when a Chaplain has completed continuous duty of ten months and fifteen months respectively.

17. If a Chaplain shall overstay his privilege leave, he shall forfeit all salary during the time of his remaining so absent.

CHAPTER III. SPECIAL LEAVE.

18. Special leave on urgent private affairs may be granted at the discretion of the Government for a period not exceeding six months. In respect of allowances to be drawn during the leave and of subsidiary leave, the conditions of special leave shall be the same as those prescribed for furlough under Rules 7 and 11.

19. Rule 17 shall, *mutatis mutandis* apply to a Chaplain over-staying special leave.

20. Special leave may be repeated without allowances after intervals of at least six years' actual service.

CHAPTER IV. GENERAL.

21. Applications for leave shall in all cases be submitted in such manner as the Governor General of India in Council may from time to time prescribe.

22. Furlough, privilege leave, and special leave shall not be taken as such in continuation of each other; but if a Chaplain absent on one of these classes of leave be allowed to change it for another, the whole period of his absence shall be held to be under the class of leave for which it was changed.

23. Subject to considerations of State, there shall be no restriction as to the places where a Chaplain may reside when on leave.

24. Leave allowance shall be payable month by month, if payment is taken in India, and quarterly, if payment is taken in England. When furlough is taken in England, an advance of the first quarter's allowances may be made in India. Such advance shall not be recoverable in case of death. No advance of pay will be granted in England to a Chaplain returning to duty in India. No Chaplain on furlough in Europe will be allowed to return to duty in India until he shall have appeared before the Medical Board attached to the India Office, for a report upon the state of his health.

25.—The term of *residence* qualifying for pension shall be, in the case of Chaplains appointed before the 11th January, 1864, fifteen years, and in the case of Chaplains appointed on or after that date, seventeen years, but no leave, except privilege leave and subsidiary leave, shall count as residence.

26. The term of *service* qualifying for pension shall be, in the case of Chaplains appointed before the 11th January, 1864, eighteen years, and in the case of Chaplains appointed on or after that date, twenty years. Leave of absence in India taken prior to the 25th August 1864 shall count as service for pension, and shall not be reckoned as furlough under these rules.

INDIAN MEDICAL SERVICE.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF CANDIDATES FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF SURGEON IN HER MAJESTY'S INDIAN MEDICAL SERVICE.

1. All natural-born subjects of Her Majesty, between 22 and 28 years of age at the date of the examination, and of sound bodily health, may be candidates. They may be married or unmarried. They must possess a diploma in surgery or a license to practise it, as well as a degree in medicine, or a license to practise it in Great Britain or Ireland.

2. They must subscribe and send in to the Military Secretary, India Office, Westminster, so as to reach that address at least a fortnight before the date fixed for the examination, a declaration according to the annexed form.

3. This declaration must be accompanied by the following documents:—

(a) *Proof of age* either by the candidates' own declaration, form of which can be obtained at the India Office pursuant to the Act 5 and 6 Will. IV., c. 62; or by extract from the register of the parish in which he was born. (A certificate of baptism which does not afford proof of age will be useless.)

(b) *A certificate of moral character* from a magistrate, or a minister of the religious denomination to which the candidate belongs, who has personally known him for at least two preceding years.

(c) *A certificate of registration* in accordance with the Medical Act of 1858, of the degrees, diplomas, and licenses possessed by the candidate.

4. The physical fitness of candidates will be determined previous to examination by a Board of Medical Officers, who are required to certify that the candidate's vision is sufficiently good to enable him to perform any surgical operation without the aid of glasses. A moderate degree of myopia would not be considered a disqualification, provided it did not necessitate the use of glasses during the performance of operations, and that no organic disease of the eyes existed. Every candidate must also be free from organic disease of other organs, and from constitutional weakness, or other disability likely to unfit him for military service in India.

5. On producing the foregoing qualifications, the candidate will be examined by the Examining Board in the following compulsory subjects, and the highest number of marks attainable will be distributed as follows:—

a. Anatomy and Physiology ...	1,000
b. Surgery ...	1,000
c. Medicine, including Therapeutics, the Diseases of women and children ...	1,000
d. Chemistry and Pharmacy, and a practical knowledge of Drugs ...	100

(The examination in medicine and surgery will be in part practical, and will include operations on the dead body, the application of surgical apparatus, and the examination of medical and surgical patients at the bedside.)

6. The eligibility of each candidate for the Indian Medical Service will be determined by the result of the examinations in these subjects only.

7. Candidates, who desire it, will be examined in French, German, and Hindustani, Comparative Anatomy, Zoology, Natural Philosophy, Physical Geography, and Botany, with special reference to Materia Medica.

8. The number of marks gained in these subjects will be added to the total number of marks obtained in the obligatory part of the examination by candidates who shall have been found qualified for admission, and whose position on the list of successful competitors will thus

be improved in proportion to their knowledge of modern languages and natural sciences.

9. The maximum number of marks allotted to the voluntary subjects will be as follows:—

French, German, and Hindustani (150 each)	...	450

Text Books.

10. The subjects for this part of the examination will be taken from the following books:—

- "Animal Kingdom," by W. S. Dallas, F.L.S.
 "Outlines of the Structure and Functions of the Animal Kingdom," by Rymer Jones; or "Cours Elementaire d'Histoire Naturelle," par Milne Edwards.
 Lindley's "School Botany," Lindley's "Medical and Economic Botany," Henfrey's "Elementary Course of Botany."
 "Elements of Natural Philosophy," by Golding Bird and C. Brooks.
 "Physical Geography," by Mrs. Somerville.

11. The Examiners in London will prepare a list in order of merit, with the marks affixed in the different subjects, to be transmitted to the Director-General and communicated to the Professors of the Army Medical School. If any Candidate is found to be deficient in any particular subject, this shall be stated, in order that he may receive special instruction on the point at Netley.

Course at Netley.

12. After passing his preliminary examination, candidates will be required to attend one entire course of practical instruction at the Army Medical School, before being admitted to examination for a commission, on—

- (1) Hygiene.
- (2) Clinical and Military Medicine.
- (3) Clinical and Military Surgery.
- (4) Pathology of Diseases and Injuries incident to Military Service.

These courses are to be of not less than four months' duration; but candidates who have already gone through a course at Netley as candidates for the Army or Navy Medical Service may, if thought desirable, be exempted from attending the school a second time.

Pay while at Netley.

13. During the period of his residence at the Army Medical School, each candidate will receive an allowance of 5s. per diem, with quarters, or 7s. per diem without quarters, to cover all costs of maintenance; and he will be required to provide himself with uniform (viz., the regulation dress uniform of a Surgeon of the British service, but without the sword).

Uniform while at Netley.

14. All candidates will be required to conform to such rules of discipline as the Senate may, from time to time, enact.

Examination at Netley.

15. At the conclusion of the course, candidates will be required to pass an examination on the subjects taught in the school. The examination will be conducted by the professors of the school.

The Director-General, or any medical officer deputed by him, may be present and take part in the examination. If the candidate give satisfactory evidence of being qualified for the practical duties of an Army Medical Officer, he will be eligible for a commission as Surgeon.

Position on List of Surgeons how determined.

16. The position of the candidates on the list of Surgeons will be determined by the combined results of the preliminary and of the final examinations, and, so far as the requirements of the service will permit, they will have the choice of Presidency in India, according to their position in that list.

N.B. The examinations for admission to the Indian Medical Service will usually take place twice a year, viz., in February and in August.

NOTE.—The next examination will take place in August, 1876, for 13 appointments.

MEMORANDUM REGARDING THE POSITION OF MEDICAL OFFICERS TO BE APPOINTED TO HER MAJESTY'S INDIAN FORCES.

INDIA OFFICE, May, 1876.

1. The regulations are those in force at the present time. They are subject to any alteration that may be determined on.

PASSAGE TO INDIA.

2. Passage allowance to India on appointment will be given, or a passage provided. When passages are provided on board the Indian troop ships, a charge for messing will be made at the rate laid down in the Royal Passage Warrant of 1865 viz., 3s. 6d. a day, but, when wine and beer are not included in the mess, and it is so stated on the messing certificate, the daily contribution required will be 3s. 6d. only.

3. All Surgeons who shall neglect or refuse to proceed to India under the orders of the Secretary of State for India within two months from the date of leaving Netley, will be considered as having forfeited their appointment, unless special circumstances shall justify a departure from this regulation.

PAY PREVIOUS TO EMBARKATION.

4. Pay at the rate of 10s. a day will be allowed from date of passing final examination at the Army Medical School, until date of embarkation when a passage is provided, or for a period of two months when the Surgeon is permitted to make his own arrangements for passage. An advance of two months' pay will also be made on embarkation.

GRADES AND RELATIVE RANK.

5. The grades of Medical Officers in the Indian Military Forces are four in number, viz.:—

1. Surgeon-General, ranking as Brigadier-General, according to the date of his Commission; if with an army in the field, or after three years' service in India as Surgeon-General, as a Major-General, from the date of his joining such army in the field, or according to the date of the completion of such service.

2. Deputy Surgeon General, as Lieutenant Colonel according to the date of his Commission; and after five years' service as Deputy Surgeon-General, as Colonel according to the date of the completion of such service.
3. Surgeon-Major, as Major according to the date of his Commission; and after twenty years' service as Surgeon and Surgeon-Major, as Lieutenant-Colonel, but junior of that rank except for choice of quarters.
4. Surgeon as Lieutenant according to the date of his Commission; and after six years' service as Captain according to the date of the completion of such service.

6. A Surgeon is promoted to Surgeon-Major on completion of twelve years' service from date of first Commission, subject to his passing the prescribed examination.

7. In cases, however, of emergency, or when the good of the service renders such alteration desirable, it is competent for the Secretary of State for India, on the recommendation of the Viceroy and Governor-General of India in Council, to shorten the period of service above mentioned, in such manner as he shall deem fit and expedient.

8. The examination for promotion may be taken at any time after the Surgeon has served nine or more years.

9. When Surgeons have served the requisite time, they will be examined in the following manner:—

A series of printed questions prepared by an examining board, consisting of the Principal of the Medical College and any two or more of the professors he may associate with himself for the purpose, will be sealed and sent by the Surgeon-General to the principal medical officers of stations where Surgeons may be eligible for examination. It will be the duty of the principal medical officer of the station to deliver these sealed questions to the Surgeons, and to see that they are answered without the assistance of books, notes, or communication with any other person. The answers are to be signed and delivered, sealed, to the Principal Medical Officer, who is to send them, unopened, to the Surgeon-General, together with a declaration from the Surgeon himself, or certificate from a superior medical officer, if there is one, that he has availed himself of every opportunity of practising surgical operations on the dead body.*

10. The Surgeon is also required to transmit together with his answers to the Surgeon-General a medico-topographical account of the station where he may happen to be at the time, or of some other station where he may have been resident sufficiently long to enable him to collect the necessary information for such a report. Failing this, he will send a medico-statistical report of his charge for a period of at least twelve months.

11. If the examining board is satisfied with the replies to the questions, and the Surgeon-General is satisfied with the certificates and with the medico-topographical or statistical report, the Surgeon will be held qualified for promotion.

12. All promotion from the rank of Surgeon-Major to that of Deputy Surgeon-General, and from the rank of Deputy Surgeon-General to that of Surgeon-General, is given by selection for ability and merit.

TENURE OF OFFICE IN ADMINISTRATIVE GRADES.

13. The tenure of office of Surgeons-General and Deputy Surgeons-General is limited to five years.

14. Deputy Surgeons-General, if not disqualified by age, are eligible either for employment for a second tour of duty in the same grade, or for employment in the higher grade of Surgeon-General by promotion thereto.

16. On first appointment they will only come into receipt of Indian pay and allowances from the date of their arrival within the limits of the Presidency to which they have been gazetted. When provided with passages on the troop ships, they draw Indian pay and allowances from date of disembarkation at Bombay.

18. The salaries of other medical appointments in the Civil and Military Departments are consolidated, and vary from Rs. 1,800 to Rs. 400 per mensem.

19. Qualified officers of the Medical Service are also eligible for appointments in the Assay Department. The salaries of these appointments are from Rs. 600 to Rs. 2,250 per mensem.

20. A Medical Officer will, however employed, be restricted to the rate of pay laid down in paragraph 15, until he shall have passed the examination in Hindustani, known as the "Lower Standard."

21. Surgeons-General and Deputy Surgeons-General on vacating office at the expiration of the five years' tour of duty, will be permitted to draw in India respectively an unemployed salary of Rs. 1,200 per mensem in the former, and Rs. 900 in the latter case, for a period of six months from the date of their vacating office, after which they will be placed while unemployed on the following scale of pay:—

MILITARY FURLOUGH REGULATIONS OF 1796.

Officers (of whatever rank) must be ten years in India before they can be entitled (except in cases of certified sickness, and as hereafter specified) to their rotation to be absent on furlough, and the same rule is applicable to assistant surgeons and veterinary surgeons. The furlough to be granted by the commander-in-chief at each presidency, with the approbation of the respective governments.

Officers who have not served ten years in India, but whose presence in England is required by urgent private affairs, may be allowed a furlough for one year without pay.

Officers coming to England on furlough are required immediately to report their arrival by letter, with their address, forwarding at the same time the certificates they received in India.

The period of furlough is three years, reckoning from its date to the day of the return of the officer to his presidency.

Officers are required to join the establishment to which they belong at the expiration of the three years' furlough, unless they shall have obtained an extension of leave, six months before the expiration of that period. No furlough will be extended, except in cases of sickness, certified in the manner hereafter mentioned; or in cases in which it shall be proved that a further residence in Europe is indispensably necessary.

All officers finding it necessary to solicit a further leave of absence on account of sickness, must, if resident in London or its vicinity, appear before the Medical Board appointed for that purpose, who will report their opinion on the state of such officer's health. And if resident in the country in any part of the United Kingdom, they must transmit with their letter of application for such leave, a certificate according to the following form, signed by at least two gentlemen, eminent in the medical profession, viz.:

I hereby certify, that I have carefully examined (state the nature of the case, as well as the name of the party), and I declare, upon my honour, that, according to the best of my judgment and belief, is at present unfit for military duty, and that it is absolutely necessary, for the recovery of his health, that he should remain at least longer in this country.

Also, previously to such extension of furlough being granted, such further proof shall be adduced by personal examination, or by such other evidence as shall be deemed satisfactory.

Officers abroad in any part of Europe, applying to remain a further time from their duty on account of sickness, are to furnish a certificate of two eminent physicians, in the above form, with the attestation of a magistrate, that the persons who signed the certificate are physicians.

Officers having obtained an extension of furlough to a given period, must at its expiration apply for permission either to return to their duty or to reside a further time in England.

In every case in which an officer has had his furlough extended beyond the prescribed period on the ground of his health not being sufficiently restored, and shall apply for permission to return to his duty, he shall produce a certificate from the examining physician that his health is completely re-established, and that there is every probability of his being able to perform the active duties of his profession in India.

No officer who has failed to obtain an extension of furlough will be considered eligible to return to the service after five years' absence, under the Act of 33 Geo. III. cap. 52, sec. 70.

Every officer upon leaving India will receive a printed copy of the General Order on this subject, published agreeably to the instruction of the Secretary of State for India in Council, and the plea of ignorance of the regulations will not be admitted as any justification of the breach of them; officers, therefore, who shall come home on furlough, and who shall not in due time apply, so as to effect their return to the Presidency to which they belong within the period of three years from the commencement of their furlough, will subject themselves to the loss of the service, unless they shall be permitted to remain a further time in Europe.

No officer on furlough can receive pay for more than two years and a half from the period of his quitting India until he returns, excepting colonels of regiments and general officers; the latter are then allowed to draw the pay of their brevet rank beyond the above period.

MILITARY FURLOUGH REGULATIONS.—Nov. 17, 1854.

With the view of adapting the regulations to the present increased facilities of communication, and to correct, as far as possible, any tendency in them to deter officers from resorting to the places which may be most conducive to the restoration of their health, when a change of climate is required for that purpose, the following rules are established, and are to have effect from the 1st February, 1854:—

1. All regimental officers in the service on the 1st February, 1854, who prefer retaining what may be considered the advantages of the old regulations, may do so, provided they signify their wish to that effect when they next apply for furlough or leave of absence, without any limitation whether such leave be in India or elsewhere; and officers who once make their election will not be entitled to any other choice, but will be afterwards subject to the new or old regulations, according to their decisions.

2. Staff officers, as such, have not the above option allowed them, but they may retain the advantages of the old regulations by giving up their appointments, which, in such cases, will be considered vacated from the date of embarkation.

3. To those officers who adopt them, the new regulations will apply retrospectively in respect of furlough and leave of absence beyond sea, and in computing their time of service for retirement, so that their furloughs or leaves of absence, whether under the old or the new rules, and whether on private affairs or sick certificate, within or beyond India, will count for service to the authorized extent only, in computing the time for retirement on full pay.

4. Officers who have availed themselves of the option of the old rules are allowed to reconsider the question under the modifications now sanctioned.

5. Officers who have not taken leave subsequent to the publication of the new rules on the 1st February, 1854, and who, consequently, may not have been called upon to declare whether they would abide by the old or the new regulations, will, on retirement from the service, be entitled to take full advantage of the privileges given by the new regulations.

FURLOUGHS ON PRIVATE AFFAIRS.

6. Every officer will be allowed a furlough to Europe, or elsewhere beyond sea, for a period of two years at the expiration of ten years' service, and for a second period of

two years after twenty years' service in India.

7. The second furlough of two years will only be granted after ten years' service in India, from the date of the return to duty after the first furlough of two years. These furloughs are not to be cumulative, under any circumstances, but are limited to two years. Officers who have taken leave of absence on sick certificate to Europe, or elsewhere beyond sea, will be ineligible to a furlough on private affairs until they have served six years from their last return to duty. This rule does not apply to short leaves to sea.

Officers who take their first furlough after twenty years' service in India, may take their second furlough after an additional service of five years from the date of their first return to duty. (G.O. 16 June, 1854.)

8. All grants of furlough on private affairs are subject to the exigencies of the public service, and to the regulations framed for and preservation of the efficiency of each regiment by limiting the number of absences.

9. Officers holding staff or other detached appointments, may be allowed furlough for a period of six months without losing their appointments; but, during that period, they will not be entitled to any portion of their staff salary, which will be drawn in full by the officers officiating for them.

Absence for six months under this rule does not preclude an officer from taking his furlough to Europe after ten years' service. (G.O. 16 June, 1854.)

10. All officers, whether staff or regimental, while on furlough on private affairs, will be entitled to "Furlough Pay" only.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE ON SICK CERTIFICATE.

11. Leave of absence on sick certificate will be granted for a term not exceeding eighteen months, whether it be to any place in Europe, or elsewhere out of India.

12. Extension of such leave may be granted, as at present, on production of medical certificates, for further periods not exceeding eighteen months in the whole.

13. An officer holding a staff or other detached appointment, will be allowed to be absent on sick certificate in England, or elsewhere beyond sea, for a period of twenty months, without losing his appointment; and, during the first six months only of such absence, he will be entitled to draw half the staff salary of his appointment, the officer officiating for him drawing the re-

maintaining half salary during the first six months, and the whole salary during the remainder of the time.

14. An officer's claim to half staff salary for six months, as sanctioned in the preceding rule, will not be affected by his subsequently retiring from the service in Europe or elsewhere.

15. No portion of command allowance, medical staff salary, or other similar allowance, which under the old rules was inadmissible to officers absent from their corps or stations, at the Cape or elsewhere, will be allowed to absent officers under these regulations.

16. All officers, whether staff or regimental, while on leave of absence on sick certificate, will be entitled for a period of six months to the same rate of Indian pay and allowances as was allowed under the old regulations to officers proceeding to the Cape on medical certificate, and for the remaining period of their leave they will receive furlough pay only.

17. If the leave on sick certificate be extended, furlough pay will be continued; but under no circumstances for a longer period than three years altogether, from the commencement of the absence.

STAFF OFFICERS.

18. The term, "staff officers," applies to all officers holding staff or detached appointments, military (general or regimental), political, or civil; also to general officers commanding divisions, members of the Medical Board, superintending surgeons, and others who, under the old rules, were entitled to draw half staff allowance when absent at the Cape.

19. Staff officers absent on leave beyond the periods stated in Rules 9 and 13 respectively, cannot retain their appointments and allowances except on special grounds to be sanctioned by the Government of the presidency. Any such special grant of leave is to be reported at once, with the reasons for it, and to be subject to approbation.

20. The privilege of retaining staff appointments during leave of absence on sick certificate, or on furlough on private affairs will not be available a second time, if the fresh leave is on sick certificate, until an officer has been three years, or, if on private affairs, until he has been six years, in the discharge of the duties of his appointment, from the date of last return to it.

21. This rule, however, does not apply to leaves of absence, whether on sick certificate or on private affairs, in India, or for brief periods to Ceylon, the Mauritius, or other places out of India.

22. Officers commanding troops of Horse Artillery and Light Field Batteries, and

officers generally in employment, will be allowed leave out of India under the same rules with respect to allowance and tenure of command or office, as regulated by the grant of leave to the Cape to such officers under the old regulations, except as to the duration of those advantages, the time for their continuance being subject to the provisions of the new regulations.

DATE OF FURLOUGH AND ADVANCES OF PAY.

23. The period of furlough on private affairs, or leave of absence on sick certificate, is to be calculated from the date of the departure from India of the ship in which the officer proceeds.

24. Advances of pay and allowances, staff and regimental, to officers proceeding on leave of absence on sick certificate, who may be entitled to them, will be made in India for three months from date of embarkation. Payments in continuation will be made in England at the rates of exchange fixed annually for repayment of advances made on account of Her Majesty's Government. Furlough pay will continue to be issued in advance for six months when required by officers obtaining furlough on private affairs.

25. The existing regulations regarding passage-money to officers are not affected by these rules.

26. The certificates issued to officers who are granted furloughs on private affairs, or leave of absence on sick certificate, are to specify the time each officer has been absent on leave within Indian limits, as well as the time of his previous absence in Europe; but will not include the periods allowed for proceeding to the presidency or port of embarkation, and to enable officers to rejoin their regiments or stations after their return to India, nor the leave of one month's absence in six months, as authorized by the regulations. The last pay certificate of all officers proceeding to England on sick certificate is to specify the rate of regimental pay and allowances and staff salary to which they would have been entitled under the old regulations if proceeding to sea on medical certificate. This information is necessary in order that no difficulty may arise in the Pay Department of the India Office in adjusting the several payments which may be due.

OFFICERS OF H.M.'S SERVICE.

27. Officers of Her Majesty's service in India, whether employed regimentally or in staff or detached situations, are entitled to the advantages above laid down in respect to allowances and tenure of office when on furlough or leave of absence.

28. In the case of officers of Her Majesty's

service on furlough or sick certificate, in England or elsewhere, who may retire or exchange into regiments not on the Indian establishment, the grant to these officers of Indian allowances will cease from the date of their retirement or exchange, if it take place before the expiration of six months from the date of quitting India.

PERIODS OF ABSENCE ALLOWED TO BE COUNTED AS SERVICE FOR RETIRING PENSIONS.

29. In order that all officers quitting India on furlough or sick certificate may be placed on an exact equality as regards time, the period allowed by regulation for proceeding to the presidency, or to the nearest port of embarkation, as well as the time to enable officers to rejoin their corps or station after their return to India, will be considered as time counting for service for the retiring pension.

30. No furlough or leave of absence, as announced in General Orders, exceeding two years in twenty years' aggregate service, three years in twenty-five years' service, and four years in thirty years' service, shall be allowed to count as service for the retiring pension; and no difference will be made in this respect between leave of absence taken in Europe or elsewhere, in or out of India, or whether the leave be on sick certificate or on private affairs.

31. In the term "Leave of Absence as announced in General Orders," is to be included all leave of absence, except the period allowed in Rule 29, and the ordinary indulgence of one month's leave in six months, as authorized by the existing regulations, and which are, in all cases, whether of regimental or staff officers, to be allowed to count as service for the pension. All leave to a greater extent, granted by political and other authorities, which may not hitherto have been published in General Orders, must be so announced hereafter.

32. Officers to be entitled to retire on the full pay of their regimental rank (under the regulations of 1796), must have served twenty-two years in India, out of which leaves of absence for two years in the aggregate, and not more, will be allowed to count as service for the retiring pension.

33. Officers to be entitled to retire on the full pay of captains and majors (under the regulations of 1835-37) must have served twenty and twenty-four years respectively;

out of which time leaves of absence for two years in the aggregate, and not more will be allowed to count as service.

34. Officers to be entitled to retire as lieutenant-colonels must have served twenty-eight years; out of which leaves of absence for three years in the aggregate, and not more, will be allowed to count as service.

35. Officers to be entitled to retire as colonels must have served thirty-two years; out of which leaves of absence for four years in the aggregate, and not more, will be allowed to count as service.

36. The scale for medical officers and veterinary surgeons of privileged furlough and leave of absence as counting for the retiring pension, will be as follows:—

Years.	Months.	1 & under 20 yrs. service
1	8	in 17 & under 20 yrs. service
2	0	in 20 " 25 "
3	0	in 25 " 30 "
4	0	in 30 " 35 "
5	0	in 35 " 38 "
6	0	in 38 & 39 yrs. service

37. It is to be distinctly understood, that under no circumstances whatever will an officer be permitted to retire on full pay until he has completed the full time of service above specified, whether he be in England at the close of his service or elsewhere.

38. The privileged time of absence may, with the permission of the local government, be taken at any time, subject to these regulations. If, therefore, at the end of twenty years' service, of which eighteen had been passed on actual duty in India, an officer should be on furlough or sick certificate in Europe or elsewhere, he will be entitled to retire on the full pay of a captain without returning to India, and so in the other terms of service for the higher pensions. In like manner, a medical officer on furlough or sick certificate, in Europe or elsewhere, at the end of seventeen years' service, fifteen years and four months of which have been passed on actual duty in India, will be entitled to retire on the lowest rate pension, without returning to India, and so in the other terms of service for the higher pension.

39. These rules do not in any way affect the existing regulations regarding the grant of leave in India, or for short periods to sea, whether on private affairs or on sick certificate, except as to the periods of such absence being taken into calculation in the time allowed to count as service for retirement on full pay.

INDIAN MILITARY FURLOUGH RULES OF 1868.

FURLOUGH.

The following General Order by the Government of India, dated 25th February, 1874, No. 17, is republished:

"No. 171 of 1874.—The Furlough Rules of 1868, as revised by various subsequent decisions, are republished for general information; and in future this General Order shall ordinarily be referred to in any matter depending on these rules. The rules previously in force will be designated, as heretofore, the Furlough Rules of 1796 and 1854.

The following G. G. O. are cancelled prospectively from the 1st January, 1875:—

G. G. O. No. 630 of 1869 (1st clause).

G. G. O. No. 627 of 1870.

G. G. O. No. 613 of 1871.

2. These rules are applicable to all officers who, on the 1st July, 1868, belonged to the several Indian Staff Corps, or to the Indian Army, and who have elected, or may elect to adopt them; officers of the British Army who entered the Staff Corps after that date are of course subject to them.

Rules apply to Officers of Staff Corps and Indian Army.

In regard to the periods of leave

Also to Officers of R. A. and R. E., late of Indian Army, when holding permanent non-regimental appointments.

played on the staff in India.

But should an officer of the British Service, holding such permanent staff appointment, be allowed to proceed on leave under circumstances which, by these rules, would involve loss of appointment, he cannot take leave under them, but simply as a British Officer holding no appointment.

3. These rules are not applicable to officers on the Invalid or Invalid Pension Establishment, even if previous to their transfer they should have elected them, being intended solely for officers on the effective list.

Do not apply to Invalid Officers.

4. They are not applicable to Regimental Officers generally of the British Service, whether formerly belonging to the Indian Army, and now in the Royal Artillery, Royal Engineers, and new Line Regiments, or on the old Line Establishment; nor are they applicable to officers of the British Army holding staff appointments the tenure of which is limited to five years, except in the sense in which the rules of 1854 were made applicable, viz., as regulating the amount of absentee allowance to be granted to such officers holding staff appointments, when they are absent on furlough on medical certificate.

Nor to Regimental Officers of the British Service, even though formerly of Indian Army.

Only partially to Officers of the British Service holding 5-year appointments.

Do not apply to Officers of the British Medical Staff.

5. They are applicable to Officers of the Royal Engineers on the Imperial Establishment, who are employed in the Public Works Department, or who are receiving a staff salary as on the fixed establishment of the Sappers and Miners; these will count service towards furlough from the date of their arrival in India.

These officers, therefore, and other Royal Engineer Officers of the Imperial list on permanent staff employ under the Government, will be entitled to a furlough of two years after eight years' service in India, or at the expiration of one year from the date of their return (for a second tour of service in India) on the completion of the prescribed home service after the first period of seven years' service in India.

The English rate of pay of his rank only will be passed to such an officer during this leave; but on his return to India for a second tour of service, the difference between that pay and "Furlough Pay" will be admitted to him; and if he should not return to India, his passage money to England will be paid to him.

Royal Engineer Officers on the Imperial Establishment, who are merely doing duty with, or attached to, the Sappers and Miners, but not on the fixed establishment and drawing staff salary, will, in regard to these rules, be on the footing of Regimental Officers of the British Service—see preceding paragraph. If, however, they afterwards accept staff employ, they also will count their service for furlough from date of arrival in India.

6. Officers of British Regiments who may join the Staff Corps, can count as service towards furlough all their military service in India, provided that half of it (in no case less than four years) shall have been passed in the Staff Corps. But any leave to England they may have taken during service so counted will be reckoned as furlough already taken. Officers of the British Service who formerly belonged to the Indian Armies are exempted from the above proviso.

7. These rules apply also to all Warrant Officers holding Veteran or Honorary Commissions, who may elect them; the period of service qualifying for furlough being calculated from the date of the attainment of a Commission. They will receive during furlough half their total receipts, calculated as laid down in Rule V., but without any reference to a minimum or maximum rate. Warrant Officers not holding Commissions can obtain furlough under these rules only on medical certificate.

Such furlough may be for two years with retention of appointment and half of the aggregate allowances; but any extension of such leave (which will not be granted for more than one year in excess of the two years), or any leave taken within less than three years from the date of last return to duty, will be on "English furlough pay." [See Note to para. 9.]

8. Every Warrant Officer who attained warrant rank before the 19th February, 1869, and who has not made his election, will be required, on the first occasion of his applying for leave out of India, to state whether he desires to take the leave under these rules, or under those previously in force applicable to Warrant Officers, viz., G. G. O. Nos. 518 and 531 of 1854, G. G. O. No. 1559 of 1867, and subsequent orders. That election will be considered final.

Those who became Warrant Officers after 19th February, 1869, are subject to these rules, and cannot elect any of the previous rules.

Leave on medical certificate on Indian pay and allowances to places eastward of the Cape, as allowed to Commissioned Officers under the Furlough Rules of 1796, is not in any case admissible to a Warrant Officer.

These rules respecting Warrant Officers apply to Honorary Assistant Surgeons and Warrant Officers in the Medical Department.

9. The term "Furlough Pay" having now a changed and two-fold significance, in all future orders and references "Furlough Pay" will be understood as the half Indian salary within the prescribed limits, specified in paragraph 5 of these rules, converted at the rate of exchange fixed by the Secretaries heretofore allowed to the several grades as English pay under the rules of 1796 and 1854.

xxxii MILITARY FURLOUGH REGULATIONS.

NOTE.—Where in these Rules English furlough pay is mentioned as that to which an officer is to be restricted, the rates laid down in paragraph 11 of G. G. O. No. 69, dated 22nd January, 1868, and (for Medical Warrant Officers) paragraph 22 of G. G. O. No. 550 of 1868, are to be understood as intended in the cases of Warrant Officers.

RULES.

I.—The distinction with respect to allowances which has been hitherto drawn between furlough on private affairs and sick leave, is abolished, both kinds of leave being included under the general term furlough, provision, however, being made for the obtaining of furlough under medical certificate, without all the restrictions applicable to furlough when taken without medical certificate.

II. Leave taken under the rules now proscribed will not involve forfeiture of appointment, except in the cases herein specially provided for. Officers of the Staff Corps and local Indian Service, and Officers on the General List, can retain their appointments during all leave of absence granted by competent authority. But their pay during such absence will be the same as they would obtain under these rules had this exemption from forfeiture of appointment not been granted.

Certain officers retain appointments during all leave duly granted.

III.—The Rules now proscribed do not affect the provisions of Act XXXIII. of George III., Chapter 52, Section 70; * but an absentee cannot retain his appointment and draw absentee allowances, except under the rules now proscribed. Nor do they affect the regulations by which General Officers Commanding Divisions and Brigades can only obtain limited periods of leave without forfeiting their Commands.

IV.—Leave of absence will in future be of three kinds, viz. :—

1.—Furlough in or out of India.

II.—General leave on private affairs or sick certificate in India, or short leave to sea.

III.—Privilege leave.

CHAPTER I.

Furlough.

V.—An officer drawing staff pay in addition to pay of rank, proceeding on furlough, will be allowed pay at the rate of 50 per cent. of the salary of his substantive office.

But an officer in civil employ and drawing consolidated salary, will be allowed 50 per cent. of the average salary during the three years prior to his proceeding on furlough, or during his actual service in India should that be less than three years; and the time spent and the allowances drawn during any leave "other than privilege leave," will be omitted in the calculation of average salary.

* The section referred to is quoted below:—

Section 70.—"And be it further enacted that no person who shall have held any civil or military station whatever in India, in the service of the said United Company, being under the rank or degree of a Member of Council or Commander-in-Chief of the Forces, and who, having departed from India by leave of the Governor-General in Council, shall not return to India within the space of five years next after such departure, shall be entitled to any rank or restoration of office, or be capable of again serving in India, either in the European or Native Corps of Troops or in the civil line of the Company's Service, unless in the case of any Civil Servant of the Company, it shall be proved to the satisfaction of the Court of Directors that such absence was occasioned by sickness or infirmity, or, unless such person be permitted to return with his rank to India, by a vote or resolution passed by way of ballot by three parts in four of the proprietors assembled in General Court, specially convened for that purpose, whereof eight days' previous notice of the time and purpose of such meeting shall be given in *The London Gazette*, or, unless, in the case of any Military Officer, it shall be proved to the satisfaction of the said Court of Directors and the Board of Commissioners for the affairs of India that such absence was occasioned by sickness or infirmity, or some inevitable accident.

No absentee shall in either case draw more than £1,000, or less than £250 per annum.

The term "salary" will signify the total amount drawn by an officer, whether as consolidated pay, or staff allowances in addition to pay, but will not include any extra or special allowances. But in the case of a military officer in civil employ, his acting allowances shall be taken into account as a part of his salary in calculating his furlough pay.

§ 2. An officer absent on furlough, who may be transferred to another office during his absence, shall be entitled, for the entire period of his furlough, to furlough pay at the rate sanctioned to him when leaving India, whatever the salary of the office to which he may be transferred may be. This furlough pay will be continued to an officer in military employ after his return to India and until he joins his appointment, provided it is not less than the military pay, or pay and allowances, of his rank.

But an officer whose term of office shall lapse, who shall vacate his appointment, or whose appointment shall be abolished during his furlough, will revert at once to the furlough pay which he would draw in virtue of his rank, as laid down below, in § 4. Any case of sudden abolition of appointment may, however, be specially considered in the department of the Government under which the officer may have been employed. An officer will also be entitled to the benefit of his promotion to a higher rank, whilst on furlough, subject to the maximum limit.

§ 3. Officers holding regimental medical charges will be allowed to retain such charges during the authorized periods of furlough, as if they were medical staff appointments. And the difference between the unemployed* grade pay of the officer holding the substantive charge and the consolidated salary of the charge will be considered the staff salary divisible between the absentee and the officer officiating for him.

Regimental medical charges retained during furlough.

§ 4. Officers not in staff employ will receive half the Indian pay of their rank, provided that an officer entitled to furlough shall in no case receive less than the above minimum of £250 per annum.

Minimum furlough pay.

NOTE.—Officers who may be entitled to income allowance from the Military Fund during absence in Europe, will draw their half salary or minimum absentee allowance under the foregoing clause, subject to a deduction equivalent to the amount of such income allowance.

VI.—All grants of furlough on private affairs are subject to the exigencies of the service.

All furlough on private affairs subject to the exigencies of the service.

NOTE.—It is therefore within the competency of local Governments and of the Commander-in-Chief to decline to forward the application of any officer whose absence would, in their opinion, be detrimental to the interests of the public service, until such time as arrangements can be made for removing the difficulty; and it is the duty of every head of a department to decline to forward any application for furlough, whenever the services of the officer cannot be spared without risking the efficiency of the department, any doubtful case being referred for the orders of Government.

VII.—The maximum amount of furlough on private affairs to be taken at any one time, carrying pay and retention of appointment, will be two years: any extension of such furlough will be without pay unless it is on medical certificate, see Rule XIII. (But see Notes (3) and (4) Rule IX.) And no extension on private affairs beyond two years will be granted, though without pay, except upon satisfactory evidence of very urgent necessity.

Applications of officers who cannot be spared need not be forwarded.

Furlough on private affairs limited to two years at one time.

VIII.—A period of at least three years' service after return from last furlough, except furlough for a period not exceeding six months under Rule XI. (and excepting also, in the case of an officer in civil employ, ordinary furlough not exceeding three months) must be completed before furlough can again be taken, unless obtained under medical certificate (see Rules XIII. and XIV. and Note 3 of Rule IX.).

But an officer who may be ordered to return to duty before the completion of his furlough for the purpose of proceeding on field service may be allowed to take the balance of such furlough at any time.

NOTE.—An officer in civil employ cannot reckon in this interval of three years any period of absence from actual duty, excepting those spent on privilege leave.

IX.—An officer will be eligible for two years' furlough on the completion of eight years' actual service in India (see para. 6 of this order); for a third year after a further period of six years' actual service, and for a fourth and fifth year after similar intervals of six years, and so on, up to the maximum prescribed in Rule XVI. The grant of furlough to an officer eligible for it will be subject only to the conditions specified in Rules VI. and VII. But see notes to this Rule.

§ 2. No furlough, or extension of furlough, if without pay, will reckon as "furlough already taken" in calculating the balance at an officer's credit, as shown in Rule X. But furlough on private affairs under the Rules of 1796 will of course so reckon.

How far previous furlough on medical certificate bars furlough on private affairs.

§ 4. If an officer appointed to any duty in England draws his Indian allowances, with or without any portion of his staff salary, he can count the period of such employment as service towards furlough; but if he is appointed to an office in England to which a fixed consolidated salary is attached, he cannot reckon the time of such employment as service towards furlough.

NOTE. (1).—But an officer of less than eight years' service in India may obtain furlough not exceeding two years, on medical certificate, with furlough pay and retention of appointment, provided he has been three years in the Staff Corps, or—in the case of a Royal Engineer officer holding a permanent staff appointment, or an officer not in the Staff Corps—has served for three years in India.

NOTE (2).—If the officer has not been three years in the Staff Corps, or served three years in India, as the case may be, he will receive "English furlough pay" only, and must vacate his appointment, unless entitled to retain it under Rule II.

This rule and the provision in Note 1, however, are not applicable to officers of the Indian Army who entered the new Line Regiments, or Royal Artillery, and subsequently the Staff Corps.

NOTE (3).—Unemployed General Officers of the Staff Corps or local service can be granted furlough without serving the intervals of three and six years, respectively, prescribed in Rules VIII. and IX., and they can remain in Europe after Rule XVI. (eight years on the whole) on the English furlough pay of their rank.

NOTE (4).—And a Major-General of the Staff Corps—if he has so much furlough at his credit, and proceeds to England within a year of his being promoted to that rank, or of his ceasing to be employed—can continue, after the expiration of the two years' furlough to receive half his Indian pay until he completes the period of three years during which he would be entitled to draw his Staff Corps pay if he were in India.

MILITARY FURLOUGH REGULATIONS. xxxv

X.—An officer eligible for furlough need not take the whole amount to which his service entitles him, but may apply for any portion thereof as an instalment; and in that case the balance will remain at his credit in any future computation of the amount of furlough for which he may be eligible.

Illustrations.
1. An officer who has served nine years in India is entitled to two years' furlough: he takes only one year, and after his return remains in India for five years.

He is then eligible for two years' furlough as follows:—

Total service in India.....	14 years.
Furlough due on that service.....	3 "
Furlough already taken.....	1 year.
Balance for which he is eligible.....	2 years.

2. An officer who has served 20 years in India without taking furlough is entitled to four years' furlough. He can only take, however, two years at one time carrying pay, the balance remaining at his credit in any future computation of furlough to which he may be entitled. He can take that balance after completing three years' service from the date of his return from the first instalment.

NOTE.—An officer is said to have furlough at his credit,—even though he may not be able to obtain it owing to the number of absentees, or other causes,—when the calculation of his service, as in illustration 1 above, shows a "balance for which he is eligible."

XI.—Furlough on urgent private affairs for six months on pay equivalent to the British regimental pay of his rank, maybe granted when the officer has no furlough at his credit, or when from other causes, e.g. the number of absentees, or his not having served three years since his last return to duty, he is not able to take it. The said period may form part of the periods of either eight or six years referred to in Rule IX., and also—except in the case of an officer in civil employ, see Rule VIII. note—of the three years which are required to intervene between two periods of furlough by Rule VIII.

This leave cannot be given in extension of furlough of any description. It cannot be extended beyond six months unless on medical certificate and on the same pay; in which case the officer will be deemed to have vacated his appointment, unless entitled to retain it under Rule II.; the whole period will be reckoned in the maximum amount of furlough (8 years) allowed by Rule XVI., and no portion of it can form any part of the periods referred to in Rules VIII. and IX.

NOTE.—Ill-health is not considered as warranting furlough under this rule to any officer who under the provisions of these rules can obtain furlough on medical certificate without forfeiting his appointment.

XII.—Subject to State considerations, there will be no restriction as to the places to which an officer may resort during furlough. But, if he desires to spend in England the rest of a "furlough in India," or vice versa, he must obtain permission to do so from the Government of his Presidency, or from the Secretary of State for India, as the case may be; and on landing in either country, he must report his arrival accordingly to the Military Department of his own Presidency, or to the India Office, forwarding a copy of the permission granted him to change his destination. He must also communicate his address. An officer who, on his return to India, reports his debarkation, without forwarding at once a copy of the permission granted him to change his destination, or submitting an application for such permission, will be considered to have returned to his duty.

Special permission needed for change of residence from England to India and vice versa during furlough.

Reports, &c., required.

XIII.—Furlough on medical certificate is obtainable as indicated in Notes (1) and (2) of Rule IX. and in Rule XIV. Absence on such furlough for a longer period than two years at one time will involve forfeiture of appointment. [But see exceptions in Rule II.] Furlough may, however, be extended on medical certificate up to a third year on

Consequence of extension of furlough on medical certificate over two years.
