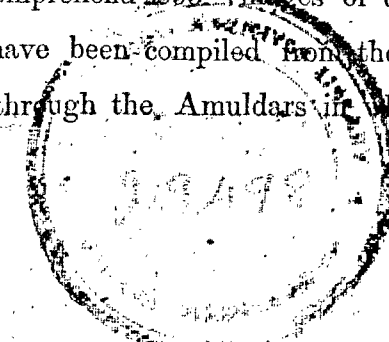
SIR,

Para 1. The disordered state of the office of Curnum in this District having attracted my notice, I beg to offer a few remarks on the subject.

Enclosure No. 1. The Statement accompanying shows the extent of land assigned for the office of Curnum, the emoluments derivable therefrom, and the other perquisites attached to the office. It also exhibits the shares according to which the lands are enjoyed, and the proportion of them appertaining to the sharers actually performing the duties of the office.

2. It is but reasonable to suppose that the original alienation of the Curnums' lands was intended solely for the support of the office; and therefore that the enjoyment and possession of such alienated lands as well as of any other subsidiary emoluments should follow the nomination to the office, and solely attach to the party actually holding it. If this supposition be correct, and the preamble of Regulation VI of 1831 fully supports this opinion, it will be seen that the objects and intentions of the State have been disregarded, and the alienated Curnums' lands misappropriated.

3. The Accounts submitted comprehend ~~859~~ villages of the Government and Management Estates. They have been compiled from those made out by the Curnums themselves furnished through the Amuldars in whose Cutcherries



they have been compared and examined. The aggregate number of persons actually performing the duties of Curnum in the villages herein comprised is 1,561. The number of sharers in the emoluments of the office 4,625, the latter

being nearly 3 to one of the former. The aggregate amount of the value of the income allotted for the support of the office is Rupees 1,36,961, while the portion enjoyed by the persons actually discharging the duty is (exclusive of Batta charges to be hereafter noticed) Rupees

In some villages the emoluments are enjoyed in equal shares, in others unequally and in others they are reduced to fractional parts or Visams of shares; the number of Visams attached to the members of the family varying.
72,113, thus leaving the large portion of 64,848 Rupees for the enjoyment of those who render no service to the State by whom they are paid. But large as is this proportion of emoluments without service there is every reason to suppose that they are in excess of what is here shown, and that they, as well as those with service, have been greatly underrated; for, in comparing the value assigned by the Curnums to their Inam lands with that given for the Zirayati lands of their villages, I find that the former invariably is stated to be considerably less than the latter and in many cases to the extent of one half. There are also fees included among the emoluments, the income from which has necessarily been admitted at the Curnums' calculation; which it is reasonable to presume falls short of the real income. The aggregate asserted value of the lands and emoluments being inferred to be below the real value, it follows that the proportion enjoyed by the unemployed is greater than the amount given.

4. Statements Nos 2 & 3 accompanying show villagewar the accounts of two Taluks, the one Amalapore, belonging to the Government Estates, the other Cocanada to the Pithapuram Zemindari; and in exemplification of what I have above said, I notice the following inconsistencies.

5. In Madupalli 28 and odd Puttis of Dumbala or quite free Inam land and nearly 20 of Kattubadi are said to be assigned for the office of Curnum, and the asserted value of these lands after payment of Kattubadi Tax on the portion held under that tenure is 875 Rupees. The pure Inam land is here valued at Rs. 20 per Putti, and the Kattubadi at the same rate, while the average of the Ziroyati lands of the same village is found to be Rs. 30 per Putti.

Inclusive of fees, also lowly estimated, the total emoluments for the support of the office of Curnum are 886 Rupees but the persons actually performing the duties receive only Rupees 92, twenty five out of the 27 sharers taking the remainder without service. The disproportion of these emoluments 886 Rupees to the Permanent Bériz Rupees 2535 of the village is also remarkable. In Chellúru in the Taluk of Cocanada of the Pithapuram Zamindari 7-10- Puttis of Dumbala and 22-7- Puttis of Kattubadi Inam have been alienated for the office of Curnum, and the estimated value thereof after payment of Kattubadi Tax is 1108 Rupees here, as in Madupalli, the average of Ziroyati land exceeds that of the Curnums' Inams, the latter being Rupees 48 per Putti, the former Rupees 52-12-0. Of the 19 persons enjoying these large emoluments amounting in total to 1112 Rupees, three only, holding portions amounting to 233 Rupees perform the duties of the office.

6. But, notwithstanding the very liberal scale on which the emoluments in these two villages have been fixed, it will be seen on reference to the 17th Column in the Statements Nos. 2 & 3 that on the average of the last * five years, the actual Accountants of Madupalli have had a sanctioned allowance in the shape of a deduction from the gross collections of the village of 18 Rupees per annum, and of Chellúru of 60 Rupees per annum as Batta when absent on duty from their villages.

7. In Panasapudi in the Cocanada Taluk where the Permanent Assessment is Rupees 4,518, the estimated value of the Curnums' lands is Rupees 1,080; and as if this were not sufficient, a ready money annual allowances of 12 Rupees is granted to the Curnums by a remission from the Government demand for the lands they cultivate, and Rupees 25 per annum on average of the last * five years have been allowed to be reserved from the gross collections of the village as Batta to the two out of the five sharers, who actually keep the village

accounts and whose shares amount to 438 Rupees out of the total emoluments of 1100 Rupees.

8. In Jagannádhapuram, a ready money payment is annually made from the Treasury of Rupees 181 to the four sharers in the office of Curnum, the duty being performed by one only whose share is 47 Rupees. The land Revenue of this village is 4 Rupees, and the Moturfa and other collections have on average of the last 4 years been Rupees 225 per annum. This village is one of those transferred from the Dutch Government, and the allowance would appear to have remained on the same scale as previous to the transfer, though the importance of the office must necessarily have diminished; and I am not aware of any necessity for continuing a payment so disproportioned to the Revenue derived from the village and to the services required or performed.

9. A reference to the accounts will show that ready money payments or rather deductions from the Government Demand are made in many other villages. In some where the emoluments assigned are insufficient, but mostly where they are ample and some times superfluous.

10. In my letter to Government of the 18th March reporting generally on the affairs of this District, I have adverted to the abuses arising from permitting the appropriation of any portion of the collections of the village to other purposes than the Government Revenue, and I have proposed that all allowances for Batta to Curnums should be abolished. The item under the head of ready money allowances requires to be regulated, and in no case should be admitted where alienated lands or other emoluments sufficiently provide for the support of the Curnums' office. But though thus much is done, there will still remain much that it would be desirable to correct. The accounts of Taluks submitted give ample instances, of disproportionate emoluments attached to the office of Curnum in some villages in reference to the Revenue they yield and the duties required, while in others the reverse is observable. Thus in Nédunúr the value of the Curnums' Inam lands is estimated at Rupees 1,566, while the Permanent

Bériz is fixed at Rs. 4006, the extent of land alienated being 70 per cent on the culturable Zirayati land. So also in Tammavaram the value of the Curnums' Inam lands is estimated at Rs. 310 while the Permanent Bériz of the village itself is only Rupees 861; and in Sarpavaram Rs. 842, the Permanent Bériz being only Rs. 1747. In Garagaparru where the Zirayati land extends to Puttis 94 and the Permanent Bériz is Rs. 6,536, the Inams of the Curnum are only 15 Tooms estimated at Rs. 15 per annum also in Gollalakódéru where the Zirayati land extends to Puttis 55 and the Permanent Bériz is Rs. 3,264, the Inam of the Curnum is only 10 Tooms or half a Putti estimated at 10 Rupees per annum, in both latter cases leaving the remuneration to the Curnum insufficient.

11. The absence of control over the office of Curnum which the Regulations have secured to it in Districts permanently settled accounts for the abuses which have been above represented. I have also in my letters to Government adverted to the encroachments by Inamdars on Zirayati land, and to the unauthorized alienation of new Inams. The position of the Curnums has enabled them to participate in such undue advantages, and in many villages where the examination of the accounts has been instituted, large increase is found in the Curnums' Inams as they are now reported to be in comparison with the amount given in the original Bhúband accounts. Thus the Curnums' in Madupalli the village noticed in para 5 of this letter amount ac-

to the Bhúband accounts of the permanent Settlement to 32 13 12 P. T. M. whereas now they are reported to be 47 18 13, and it can hardly be supposed that so considerable an increase can have arisen from else than encroachment

12. The separation from the office of the emoluments attached to it, and the sub-division of property among the members of the family claiming shares in the family property, have in many instances been confirmed by Decrees of the Courts, and thus the property of Government allotted for a particular purpose has been under the sanction of the Courts of Law misappropriated; and this anomaly can only be accounted for by the position under which the Regulations have hitherto placed the office. By Regulation

XXIX of 1802 the dismissal of Curnum in villages under Zamindari tenure can only be effected by the Decree of the Zillah Court on a regular suit filed either by the Zamindar or by the Collector acting for him. Instances may possibly have occurred of suits for deprivation of office being preferred against Curnums by Zamindars, but I believe none, or if any they are extremely rare, are on record brought by a Collector when Estates have been under management. The duties of a Collector are generally too onerous to admit of his engaging in a suit for such purpose where if he succeed, the punishment is nearly nugatory by the obligation imposed by the same Regulation of nominating as the successor, the brother, son, or next of kin, of the person dispossessed. But even success can hardly be expected when the whole energies of the accused are naturally directed to baffle by chicanery and falsehood the measures of the Collector who can devote but passing attention to numerous other duties to the prosecution of a suit, and under such unequal terms it is not surprising that the attempt is seldom, if ever made—neither would it appear to be the interest of the Zamindar to venture on prosecutions against the Curnums of his villages, but rather to conciliate them and connive at their encroachments; and so long as the Zamindar and Curnum are not at variance, the Collector has no cause of interference, the Courts cannot take cognizance of complaints against the Curnum unless on a regular suit filed, and thus the Curnum in Zamindari, and Proprietary has been left uncontrolled in the village with power to encroach and reg by his Dictum the emoluments of his office according to the opportunity afforded him. But though these difficulties present themselves on any proceeding against the holder of the office so careful has the practice of the Courts been towards the protection of his rights; that Judges are empowered to take summary notice of all complaints brought by Curnums against the Zamindar or the Collector when acting for him of either improper removal or suspension from office, or irregular nomination to it excluding the person supposing himself aggrieved.

13. The enjoyment of the emoluments by numerous sharers operates

against the detection of frauds on the part of those holding the office; or rather aids the combination of all parties interested to conceal them; whereas, were these emoluments enjoyed, as they ought to be, by those performing the duty, the unemployed members of the family in which the office is hereditary would serve as a check against abuses and tend to ensure attention to, and honest performance of, the duties of the office by the person holding it.

14. In many instances, the office is held by a female the widow or daughter of a former incumbent, thus making the right of succession to pass out of the family in which it was originally vested. In such cases, the duties are performed by a Gumasta, who has but little incentive to honesty, and cares little for loss of service.

15. The inconvenience of the provisions of Regulation XXIX of 1802, which placed the office of Curnum so far beyond the control of the Government, and as far as the abuses of the office were concerned, the late Zillah Judge Mr. Anstruther, who has particularly adverted to the variety of practice which the Courts have followed in decisions respecting succession and enjoyment of emoluments. Indeed so inconvenient, if not mischievous, has this Regulation been found, that it has been neglected and it could be done with an impunity for which the practical in its provisions as in some degree formed an excuse.

The operation of Regulation XXIX of 1802 is fortunately annealing in consequence of the reversion to Government of Zamindari Proprietary Estates, the Curnums of which on their conversion to Government Estates become subject to the more suitable provisions of Regulation VI of 1831. But the objections urged against the earlier Regulation will attach to a portion of each District where it would be desirable to have a uniformity of practice. The revival under late orders from the Sadr Court of adherence to the provisions of this Regulation after they have for a period been partially in abeyance must be productive of litigation and subversion of the by-gone acts of the Revenue Officers which

will prove injurious to the interests of the Government and the Zamindars by exhibiting to the Curnums themselves, the difficulty, if not the impossibility, of controlling them, and by restoring to office men who though deservedly rejected have not been dismissed by the Court's Decrees according to the strict letter of the law.

17. The provisions of Regulation VI of 1831 amply provide against arbitrary deprivation of hereditary office, as well as for due succession to it, while they give to the superior officers entrusted with the Revenue management of the country, who naturally are most interested in the efficiency of the minor institutions of each village, a power to suppress abuses in the important, and to pursue them with punishment which under the provisions of Regulation XXIX of 1802 is known to be rarely if ever attempted.

hitherto been considered, the main obstacle to the application of Regulation VI of 1831 to districts or parts of them styled Permanently settled, the perpetuation of those obstacles might well be avoided in all future issues of such Sannads, and a reformation in the condition of the office of Curnum may be introduced in those parts where that Regulation is in force.

19. The first step would seem to be a provision that the emoluments of the office are not to be alienated from the person who is to be exclusively by those actually performing the duty.

Second. where the Inam lands are excessive and out of proportion to the Revenue of the village and the duties required, the excess might be resumed, and the wants of other villages where the emoluments are deficient supplied in the same manner as was done in the Ceded Districts and thereby constituted what are denominated Kambharti Mainams.

Third. On satisfactory proof of conviction of extensive fraud the collateral heirs of the offender should be excluded from succession.

Fourth. In all cases where females are next of kin

incumbent, the nearest male member of the original family should be selected to succeed, and only in default of any competent male should the office be allowed to pass into the family of the female, and then only as an act of favor not as a right should it be conferred on a male capable of conducting the duties and responsible in his own person for their due performance.

20. Where these rules or others of a similar tendency which a more attentive investigation of this important subject might suggest enforced, the hereditary office of Curnum would be greatly improved in efficiency, and would become, when Regulation VI of 1831 applied what the object of that Regulation XXIX of 1802 states to be the object of that Regulation. Experience however has proved that those objects have not been attained, under its provisions have been in vain, and that Regulation XXIX continues to prove a bar to full reformation in the office of Curnum under Zamindari tenure to the injury of all parties concerned. It is entirely abrogated or superseded in its injurious effects by the extension of Regulation VI of 1831.
