Number of estates under management.—Including Parlákimedi, there were 54 estates under management on the 1st July 1893. Of these the three estates noted on

the margin * were restored to their proprietors on their coming of age during the year under report. Though the Singavanam ward attained his majority on the 15th April 1894, his estate was retained

under management by the Collector till 4th July 1894; the delay is reported to have been for the purpose of adjusting certain arrears of peishush, but the Collector should have explained the circumstances more fully. The Court understands that a mortgagee refused to pay the share of peishush due from him and that the estate was retained under management pending its recovery till after the close of the fasli. Its transactions

are accordingly dealt with in this report. The five estates noted on the margin † were newly taken charge of during the year, thus raising the number of estates under control at the end of the year to 56. The Ventrapragada Rani was strongly

opposed to the Court's assumption of charge of her estate and presented a petition to the High Court under section 7 of Regulation V of 1804 seeking a declaration of her competency to manage her estate; a final decision has not yet been passed by the High Court. Meanwhile intimation has just been received of the lady's sudden death. As in the previous years, figures regarding Parlákimedi are given only in Statements I and IV, while Vadimitta, which continued in charge of the lessees, appears only in Statements I and VI. The Tiruválúr Chokkappa Mudaliyar's estate in Tanjore was ordered to be taken under management towards the close of the fasli and no figures are consequently entered against it in Statements II to VII.

The old zemindar of Parlákimedi and his eldest son applied to the Court of Wards during the fasli under report for the surrender of the movable property now under its charge, on the ground that the former was no longer an imbecile. Following counsel's advice, however, the Court of Wards decided to leave the petitioners to make the necessary application to a Civil Court.

2. *Estates handed over.*—The subjoined statement shows the condition of the surrendered estates at the time of their restoration as compared with their condition when they were taken charge of by the Court.

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3. *Statement No. I showing the names, &c., of the estates under management.*—Statement No. I appended to the report shows the names of the estates under management, the authority under which they were taken up, the sex of the wards and their disabilities, the period (calculated up to the end of the fasli under report) during which the estates have been under the Court, the ages of the wards at the end of the fasli, and the dates on which such of them as are minors will attain their majority. The succession suit relating to the Erumaipatti estate referred to in paragraph 3 of the previous year's report is still pending before the District Court, Salem. This estate as also Singavanam and Parlákimedi, above referred to, being left out of account, there were 53 wards, of whom 47 were minors (two being females) and six were incapacitated by sex.

4. *Season.*—The season was better than in the previous year, and favorable for both wet and dry crops in almost all the estates under management except in the following cases :—

In the *Pithápuram* estate the season, though not bad on the whole, was not as good as in the previous year; the south-west monsoon was favorable, but the rains of October and November were excessive and submerged the wet crops in parts of the Karapa and Samalkot tanas and affected the dry crops in the Kadium tana. The tobacco crops on the lankas of the Kadium and Palivela tanas suffered considerably and the yield was much below the average. The yield of paddy, which constitutes the main crop in the estate, was, however, but slightly below the average. In *Mailavaram* the principal dry crop—cholum—suffered somewhat from excessive rainfall and some other crops from disease. A portion of the lands in *Sithamalli* and *Palayavanam* were affected by floods. In *Gandarvakóttai*, though the season was better than in the previous year, the outturn of punjah (dry) crops, especially dhol and ground-nut, was very poor owing to heavy rains and the floods of November. The season was not a very good one in *Trichinopoly* owing to want of rain in the early part of the year and to floods later on. In *Mambarai* and *Elagiri* dry crops suffered owing to want of seasonable rains. In *Thalavankottai*, the season was unfavorable, most of the tanks fed by jungle streams not receiving a sufficient supply owing to scanty rainfall. For the same reason, the *kanni* (or first) crop of paddy in *Kavalpara* was poor.

5. *Holdings.*—The aggregate area of holdings of the ordinary villages in all the estates under management, excluding rented villages, was acres 786,136, of which acres 710,724, or 91·9* per cent. were cultivated. The extent of holdings in the estates which were under management in both the faslis was acres 740,256 in fasli 1303 against acres 717,311 in the previous fasli, thus showing an increase of acres 22,945, which is the net result of an increase of acres 25,095 in 23 estates and a decrease of acres 2,150 in 11 others. The marked variations are noticed below :—

The variations in the *Ganjám estates* are merely nominal, being due to changes in the tenure of villages from "rented" to "ryotwari." The increase in *Shulagiri* was due partly to the above cause and partly to the occupation of fresh lands on darkhast. The increase in *Medura* and *Royakota* was mainly due to the taking up of fresh lands for cultivation, while in *Timmajiammal's estate*, the increase was due to the recovery of two of the villages alienated by the mother of the ward. The decrease in *Etthiyapuram* is said to be due to the exclusion from Statement No. II-A of the extent of lands held by the estate on mortgage.

6. *Cultivation.*—The extent of actual cultivation in the year under report was acres 710,724, or 91·9 per cent. of the holdings, against 574,730, or 78·9 per cent. in the previous year, the rise in the percentage being due to the more favorable character of the season during the year under report. For want of cultivation accounts

the entire holdings have been returned as cultivated in *Kurupam*, *Munagala* and *Ventrpragada*, while for the same reason no figures under actual cultivation have been given by the Collector for the *Ankusagiri* estate, the last-mentioned three estates having come under Court's charge only during the year under report. It is observed with regret that though the *Kurupam* estate has been under management for over three years the local officers have not been able to get the karnams to write up the cultivation accounts for want of sufficient control over them.

The entire holdings were cultivated in the 10 estates noted in the margin. The percentage of cultivation to holdings was above 90 in 20 estates, between 75 and 90 in 15 others, while it was below 75 only in four estates, viz., *Singavanam* (33·5), *Palayavanam* (65·2), *Mambarai* (55·2), and *Kavalpara* (70·4). The low percentage in the first three estates has not been explained by the Collectors concerned, apparently because the percentage in the year under report was an improvement over the previous years. The extent of holdings in *Kavalpara* includes, as in the previous year, uncultivable waste and jungles mostly held by tenants on various tenures.

7. *Demand of Estates*.—Statement II-B appended to the report shows the gross demand of all the estates under the Court's management, the remissions granted and the net demand. The gross demand of the year amounted to Rs. 29,93,484, of which Rs. 24,640 were remitted, leaving a total net demand of Rs. 29,68,844. The following abstract compares the figures under these heads, as regards the estates which were under management both in faslis 1302 and 1303:—

Explanation for large variations under net demand, as compared with the preceding year, has been given in column 21 of Statement No. II-B.

8. *Demand, Collection and Balance*.—Statement No. III appended to the report shows the demand, collection and balance of the estates under the management of the Court during the year. The arrear demand at the beginning of the fasli amounted to Rs. 27,60,000, of which Rs. 4,99,416 were collected and Rs. 3,06,145 written off, leaving at the end of the fasli a balance of Rs. 19,54,439. Deducting subsequent collections and remissions amounting to Rs. 10,10,339, the net recoverable balance amounted to Rs. 9,44,100 or 34·2 per cent. of the arrear at the beginning of the fasli under report, against Rs. 18,20,349 or 67 per cent. of the arrear demand, as shown in the previous year's report.

The percentage of the arrear balance to the demand has thus fallen very considerably; but it would appear that this marked improvement in the state of arrear collections is due, not so much to a general improvement in collections as to the treatment of a large sum (Rs. 7,04,605) in Pithapuram as irrecoverable. If the figures of this estate be left out of account for the purpose of comparison, the percentages work out as under, showing that there still has been a slight, though much smaller, improvement in the fasli under report:—

percentage of balance to demand on which the Court had to remark in the previous report has increased further (from 70·2 to 90·5) and that in the case of some other estates noted in the margin, the percentage this year is such as to call for special

marks though none was required in the previous year. But as will be seen from the remarks made in the following paragraphs, the large arrear balance in these estates is due to causes more or less unavoidable.

In the nine estates noted on the margin the outstanding balance on the date of the report was *nil*, while in six others it was practically so. In three it was below 10 per cent. while in twelve others it ranged between 10 and 25 per cent. In nine other estates it ranged between 25 and 50 per cent. In the undermentioned fourteen estates it was above 50:—

Nearly half the outstanding net balance in *Dhárakóta* and *Bodogodo* and almost the whole of that in *Aska* are said to be doubtful of recovery, and will have to be recommended to be written off the accounts after the reconciliation of taluk and huzur balances (which appears to have been delayed owing to the difficulty of procuring an intelligent clerk) is completed. Out of the remainder in *Dhárakóta* suits have been filed for Rs. 2,263 and Rs. 4,946 are covered by decrees. Repeated attempts to execute the decrees are said to have proved abortive; it is believed that most of the judgment-debtors concealed their property, though reliable evidence of the fact could not be secured. In *Bodogodo* suits have to be filed for Rs. 2,457 while Rs. 1,544 are considered irrecoverable. Rs. 4,000 out of the balance shown against *Pedda Kimedi* are adjustable towards claims under "*katcheri patros*" (notes of hand) referred to in the last year's report, some of which have not yet been settled owing to the non-production of heirship certificates by the representatives of the deceased holders of the notes in question. The bulk of the remainder is either covered by processes or has to be sued for.

The greater portion (Rs. 79,280) of the arrears in *Kapileswarapuram* (since restored to its proprietor) is recoverable only gradually with reference to the stipulations in the bonds and decrees which cover the amount: Rs. 9,236 due from the *agraharamdars* of *Sayapuram* had to be recovered by means of civil suits and it was considered expedient that the proprietor should file the suits on attaining his majority. Suits have been filed in regard to a sum of Rs. 11,415. Out of the balance outstanding in *Meduru* a large portion (Rs. 60,278) has, it is stated, to be recovered by instalments fixed under bonds and through civil courts. For the recovery of a sum of Rs. 27,219 plaintiffs have either been filed or are under preparation. Out of the balance in *Munagala*, an estate taken under management during the year under report, Rs. 2,041 has been classed as irrecoverable, and the remainder could not be recovered as the tenants complain that their rents are excessive and that the actual area of their holdings is less than the recorded extent. The enquiry into these matters should be expedited. In *Ventrpragada*, likewise taken under management in the year under report, Rs. 20,788 have been classed as irrecoverable, being for the most part barred by limitation before the Court's intervention: Rs. 21,894 are involved in litigation, Rs. 10,939 are covered by bonds and decrees, and Rs. 3,201 are adjustable towards fees due to village officers who have not furnished the necessary accounts. The remainder is in course of collection.

Almost the whole of the balance outstanding in *Timmajiammal's* estate is, as stated last year, recoverable in the shape of damages from Mr. Cavendish, the Superintendent of the Vellore Jail, who illegally released a debtor of the estate: and the necessary steps are said to have been taken in the matter.

The recovery of much of the large balance outstanding in *Gandarvakottai* (since restored to its proprietor) is reported to be unlikely. The small balance in *Karuvalakarai* is reported to be probably irrecoverable and the matter is under investigation. In *Sithamalli* the balance is due by the ex-lessee and maternal uncle of the minors against whom a suit has been ordered to be filed. A portion of the balance in *Kadakavinayakanallur* is adjustable towards the *varam* (cultivator's share) due to the porakudis and the remainder is reported to be irrecoverable.

The arrear demand and the balance in *Punnathur* must be treated as provisional pending the settlement of several claims advanced by the tenants against the estate. Such settlement can conveniently be made only at the time of the renewal of old demises. But this matter is beset with various difficulties, and much improvement cannot therefore, the Court fears, be expected in the state of arrear collection in this estate for some time to come.

The report called for in Government Order, dated 28th November 1892, Mis. No. 5160, is delayed pending receipt of information from the Collector of Kistna which should be submitted without further delay.

9. *Current Collections.*—The total current demand of the year amounted to Rs. 29,75,185, of which Rs. 24,57,518 were collected and Rs. 447 remitted, leaving at the end of the fasli a balance of Rs. 5,17,220 or 17·4 per cent. of the demand. Subsequent collections and remissions (Rs. 1,95,033) being deducted, the net recoverable balance on the date of the Collector's reports is Rs. 3,22,187 or 10·8 per cent. of the total current demand against 13·4, the corresponding percentage for the preceding year.

The whole of the current demand was collected in the six estates noted in the margin, while the balance was practically nil in *Chidikada, Singavanam, Erumaipatti and Royakota*. In sixteen estates the net balance was below 5 per cent., while in sixteen others it was between 5 and 20 per cent. and in seven between 20 and 35. In the undermentioned four estates it was above 35 per cent. :—

The recovery of the bulk (Rs. 11,689) of the amount due in *Ventrappagada* has had to be deferred, pending decision of certain suits; Rs. 2,000 are adjustable towards fees due to village officers, while the necessary action has been taken to recover a greater portion of the remainder.

Steps appear to have been taken to recover the small balance in *Palayavanam*. The attention of the Collector of Tanjore is drawn to paragraph 18 of the Court's Administration report for fasli 1301 directing that explanation for outstanding balances should be given separately for "arrears" and "current."

Nearly half the balance in *N. Rangaswami Aiyar's estate* really fell due under the terms of the leases only in November and December last, and the remainder could not be easily collected owing to the poor harvest due to damages caused by floods. The unsatisfactory state of collection in *B. Chockalingam Pillai's estate*, which was noticed in the last year's report also, is again attributed in a measure to laxity on the part of the Estate manager. If there is no marked improvement at an early date, the Collector should consider the advisability of removing the Manager in favour of a more efficient man.

10. *Financial condition of estates under management.*—The aggregate cash receipts of all the estates under management during the year amounted to Rs. 39,11,647. Adding to this Rs. 10,64,359 (the aggregate cash balance at the beginning of the year), the total cash assets of the fasli amounted to Rs. 49,76,006, of which Rs. 35,06,728 including a sum of Rs. 4,34,074 invested in Government securities and Rs. 5,52,261 devoted to payment of debts were expended during the year. The cash balance at the close of the fasli was thus Rs. 14,69,278. Adding to this the Government securities of the nominal value of Rs. 54,21,300 held on behalf of certain estates, and the value of grain on hand (Rs. 71,149) at the close of the year, the total balance to the credit of the estates on the 30th June 1894 was Rs. 69,61,727, showing an increase of Rs. 8,16,901 over the opening balance of the year. Excluding the unusual items noted below, the receipts and charges of the year amounted to Rs. 34,78,475 and Rs. 25,20,393, respectively, against Rs. 31,56,286 and Rs. 26,13,968, the corresponding figures for the previous year :—

11. *Utilization of surplus balances.*—The estates under management, which on the 30th June 1894 had surplus balances exceeding Rs. 10,000—*vide* column 31 of Statement No. IV appended to the report,—are shown below. *Paridkimeri, Tangellamudi and Erumaipatti* are omitted as the circumstances of these estates are peculiar :—

In regard to the investment of the balances to the credit of such of these estates as were dealt with in paragraph 11 of the previous year's report, the remarks made therein hold good now also, except in the case of Maruthanthanallur, a small ryotwari property, of which the liabilities have since been cleared and the available surplus balance will in future have to be devoted to the purchase of additional lands, when opportunity offers. Until then the purchase of pro-notes will be the only course open.

Turning to the other estates mentioned above, the Court observes that *Dhárakóla* will remain under management for only two years more, so that there is little time to take in hand large irrigation projects, which are not urgently called for, as one-sixth of the total number of villages in the estate are commanded by the Rushikulya canals. Steps have been taken by the Collector to improve the irrigation of a few villages. A scheme for improving the irrigation of the *Bodogoda* estate is still under investigation. *Aska* is a small estate, commanded by the Rushikulya canals and having other good sources of irrigation; its surplus can therefore only be utilized in the purchase of pro-notes or of lands, as occasion arises.

The balances in *Appikonda* and *Munagala* will be required to discharge their liabilities, while the balance in *Belgam* will have to be devoted to the payment of charges relating to pending law suits. The Collectors concerned have taken steps to purchase additional lands from the surplus balances of *Agali Basappa's estate* and *N. Duraiswami Aiyar's estate*—two small ryotwari properties. The further reports promised by the Collectors concerned in regard to *Saptur* and *Kavalpara* should be expedited. No further delay should be allowed to occur in replying to Court's Proceedings, dated 15th August 1892, No. 2824, so far as the *Ettiapuram* surplus balance is concerned. It is observed that the Collector does not touch on the point in his report.

In *Kakangarai* a portion of the surplus has to be devoted to the payment of debts, and unless there is a prospect of an early settlement of the claims against the estate, the available balance should, as proposed by the Collector, be invested in pro-notes.

Some of the Collectors concerned have not given full information as to the action taken to give effect to the instructions already issued in regard to the profitable investment of surplus funds. The omission should not be allowed to recur.

Most of the Collectors have not reported on the question of advances to tenants, apparently because Court's Proceedings, dated 8th September 1894, No. 18, Press, reached them after the close of the fasli under report.

12. *Percentage of establishment charges and Government commission to normal receipts.*—Column 33 of Statement No. IV appended to the report shows the percentage of establishment charges and Government commission to normal receipts, abnormal income, such as debt recovered, amount borrowed, sale-proceeds of property and refunds, advances recovered, &c., included in column 13 of the statement, being left out of account. Taking all the estates together, the percentage was 10.0 against 11.3 in the previous year. Explanation is furnished below in regard to the under mentioned estates in which the percentage exceeded 15—

The circumstances which render it difficult to reduce the cost of the establishments in *Appikonda*, *V. U. Ayyanna's estate*, *Pulicherla* and *Sáptúr* have been adverted to in previous reports. The fall in the percentages of the first three of these estates has been due, in a measure, to larger receipts during the fasli under report, while such reduction, as was found practicable, has been ordered in *Pulicherla* since the close of the fasli. A reduction was made in the establishment of the *Kurupam* estate, which has brought down the percentage from 21.9 in the previous fasli to 16.7 in the fasli under report.

In *Ventrappagada* taken under management during the fasli under report, a large amount of arrear salaries had to be paid, and a somewhat large establishment had to be maintained in the first year of its management by the Court. No reduction was possible in the case of *Gandarakóttai* which has since left the Court's hands. The whole cost of the estate establishment in the Tanjore Collectorate is said to have been provisionally, i.e., subject to adjustment after the close of the fasli, debited to the *Sithamalli* estate. If the charges incurred on account of other estates be left out of account, the percentage would be 27.1. Even this is high, but the existing establishment has been retained to collect the large amount of debts still outstanding, and to supervise the cultivation which has had to be carried on under *amani*, i.e., directly by the estate officials.

13. *Public Works.*—Enclosure A to Statement No. IV shows the amounts sanctioned for, and expended on, public works in the several estates under management. The total allotment was Rs. 5,53,903, of which Rs. 2,11,658 or 38.2 per cent., was spent against Rs. 1,84,629 or 52.4 per cent. The expenditure is classified below:—

The expenditure on public works was 6 per cent. of the total charges of the year. If the debts repaid and amounts invested in promissory notes be excluded from the latter, the percentage rises to 8.4 per cent., against 7.0 per cent. in the previous fasli. The expenditure fell below 50 per cent. of the budget allotment in 21 estates, of which the cases in which the unutilised allotments were large and which call for special remarks are noticed below:—

The short expenditure in *Pithapuram* was due partly to the works being scattered over a large number of villages, partly to the establishment having been occupied in settling the accounts of previous years which were in confusion, and partly to certain budgeted works being postponed in favour of an emergent work which had eventually to be given up on account of objections raised by an adjoining proprietor.

The short expenditure in *Mailavaram* is said to be due to the supineness of the estate supervisor, who has since been warned that if no improvement was shown at an early date he would be replaced by a more competent person.

In the *three Nuzvid estates*, account has not been taken of several works said to have been executed but not paid for within the fasli, nor of the works that had to be abandoned, nor of the savings effected. If these items be taken into consideration the ratio of expenditure to allotment would be respectively 72.1, 98.5 and 52.0. In *N. Duraiswami Aiyar's estate*, a proposal to erect certain buildings, for which a sum of Rs. 10,500 had been allotted, was subsequently given up as unnecessary. In *Marungapur*, good contractors could not be had to undertake the proposed works, while two estimates, amounting to Rs. 2,665, could not be carried out on account of a dispute between the estate ryots and those of the adjoining territory of *Pudukkóttai*. In *Sáptúr* the short outlay was due mainly to non-preparation of estimates, &c., in time. As regards *Ettiapuram*, the Court negatived the proposal to construct certain roads for which a sum of Rs. 17,500 had been provided, while an irrigation project which had an allotment of Rs. 5,000 has not yet been matured. Even after making allowance for these the percentage rises only to 42.0 and a large sum (about Rs. 45,000) has been surrendered. The Manager reports however that there is difficulty in finding contractors to carry out works in the estate, and that the question of entrusting them to the (Government) Public Works Department will be separately reported on. Most of the works for which provision had been made in

Elagiri were since found to be unnecessary. In the case of *Kavalpara*, it appears that all the costly works have been entrusted to contractors who have not been able to finish them within the fasli.

In *Chidikado*, *Lakkavaram*, *Tangellamudi* and *Karuvallakkarai* the total expenditure (column 9) is in excess of the allotment (column 10). This might have been avoided by obtaining additional allotments within the fasli.

The Court observes that in several cases the short expenditure is ascribed to delay in the preparation of estimates. Collectors are again requested to make special arrangements for the early preparation of estimates for works entered in estate budgets and for ensuring that such estimates are passed sufficiently early in the fasli to admit of work being commenced without loss of time.

14. *Debts due to estates*.—Statement V-A appended to the report shows the debts due to the several estates under the management of the Court during the year. The total debts outstanding at the beginning of the year amounted to Rs. 12,62,756. Including those newly contracted (Rs. 30,465) or brought to account (Rs. 18,429), as also the interest that accrued during the year (Rs. 68,763), the total sum due was Rs. 13,80,413, of which Rs. 1,98,523 were collected, and Rs. 68,594 written off, leaving a balance of Rs. 11,13,296 at the end of the year distributed among 38 estates. The outstanding amounts were large in the following estates:—

As stated in the last year's report the greater portion of the amount outstanding in *Aska* is due by Surangi, another estate under the Court of Wards, and arrangements have been made for the liquidation of the debt in a manner beneficial to both the estates.

Out of the balance in *Appikonda*, Rs. 32,650 have not fallen due and Rs. 8,882 have been since collected. Proceedings taken under a decree for the recovery of the greater portion of the balance in *Belgam* (Rs. 9,900) have been stayed under the orders of the Civil Court pending the disposal of an appeal to the Privy Council. Rs. 1,955 have since been ordered to be written off the accounts, while Rs. 2,047 have not yet fallen due. The remaining sum of Rs. 3,008, being the arrears of rent covered by bonds and decrees, should, as pointed out in the previous year's report, have been taken over to Statement No. III. In *Kurupam*, Rs. 39,829 have since been written off as irrecoverable, while Rs. 20,079 are apparently arrears of rents covered by bonds which ought not to have been included under debts proper. Suits filed for a sum of Rs. 45,000 were since decided partly in favour of the estate, and an appeal has been preferred to the High Court in regard to so much of the decree as is adverse to the ward. A sum of Rs. 11,029 has not yet fallen due, while the remainder (Rs. 34,634) is made up of small items which are in course of recovery. The greater portion of the debt in *Pithapuram* (Rs. 69,504) is covered by decrees. In regard to a sum of Rs. 21,836 out of this amount, it has been found in execution that the debtors concerned have no tangible assets that could be attached; while the remaining amount, viz., Rs. 47,548, is recoverable from the personal property of one Chinna Chellayamma Garu, which has to be specifically ascertained before steps for the execution of the decree are taken. In *Meduru* debts amounting to Rs. 1,53,947 have not yet fallen due according to the stipulations of the bonds by which they are secured, while time has been allowed for the payment of Rs. 22,467 due by Chellayamma Rao Garu and Raja Papamma Rao Garu. The rest is either irrecoverable or in course of collection. Out of the amount outstanding in *Telaprole*, Rs. 36,017 have not yet fallen due, while in regard to a sum of Rs. 31,785, the decrees obtained are in different stages of execution; steps have been taken for the recovery of the balance. Enquiry is being made in regard to the debts due to the *Munagala estate* taken under management during the year under report. The greater portion of the amount due to *Singavanam* (since restored to its proprietor) was due by a pauper who was living in

Burma. Full information has not been given as to the steps taken for the recovery of the amount outstanding in *Sithamalli*. It has been merely stated that Rs. 17,910 are due under hypothecation bonds, Rs. 3,268 under mortgages and Rs. 3,155 under Court decrees. Information should have been furnished as to what portion of these amounts has fallen due, and what steps have been taken to recover it. In *Kadakavinayakanallur* it is stated that most of the outstandings is due from purakudis (cultivating tenants) under *Kanakaruppus* (settlements of account). But if the Court's surmise in the last year's report in regard to the outstanding amount, viz., that it consists mainly of arrear rents, be correct, the amount of debts proper due to the estate, which alone should be shown in the statement in question, would be small. The Collector is requested to report on the point. Advances made to cultivating tenants which are in course of recovery account for most of the remainder. Of the amount outstanding in *Saptur* Rs. 5,802 have since been written off the accounts, and steps have been taken to realize the remainder which has been to a great extent secured by decrees. In *Ettiyapuram*, Rs. 35,615 have been secured by mortgages with possession; instalments have not fallen due for Rs. 71,135; decrees have been obtained and are being executed in regard to Rs. 24,750; and steps are being taken to collect the remainder, which is secured by bonds. As stated in the last year's report, no legal steps could yet be taken to recover the greater portion of the amount due to *Thalavankottai*. Steps are being taken to collect the amounts due to *Kakangarai*.

15. *Debts due by estates*.—Statement No. V-B shows the debts due by the several estates under management. The total amount due at the beginning of the fasli was Rs. 23,15,097. Adding thereto the debts contracted (Rs. 1,47,319), those newly brought to account (Rs. 2,187) and the interest that accrued during the year (Rupees 1,14,390), the total amounted to Rs. 25,78,993, of which Rs. 5,74,703 were repaid, and Rs. 12,248 struck off, leaving a balance of Rs. 19,92,042 due by 24 estates. In the year under report *Dharakotta* was cleared of its liabilities. The debts outstanding at the close of the year were large in the undermentioned estates:—

As regards the estates marked with an asterisk, the Court has nothing to add to the remarks in paragraph 15 of the previous year's report. *Munagala* and *Ventrappagada* were taken under management during the year under report; the liabilities of the former are being inquired into, while those of the latter will be discharged as funds accrue. Nearly one-half of the amount outstanding against *Edamandal* and about one-third of that against *Kadakavinayakanallur* have since been paid off, while the remainder in both the estates is expected to be liquidated during the current fasli. In *Anavaradam Pillai's estate* Rs. 10,527 are covered by mortgage with possession, and the balance will be discharged during the current fasli. The surplus annually available for payment of debts in *Royakota* is very small, viz., Rs. 1,000 only; and as it must take a long time for the estate to get clear of its liabilities, steps have been ordered to be taken to consolidate them on more favorable terms or, if that be found impracticable, to discharge them by the sale of a portion of the estate. The Collector of Malabar has not yet reported the result of the inquiries which he was making into the debts due by *Punnathur*, and he is requested to submit a full report at an early date.

In view of the orders passed in Court's Proceedings, dated 11th December 1894, No. 26, all Collectors are requested to furnish in their future annual reports particulars of the debts paid off and full information, especially in the case of heavily involved estates, as to the steps taken for, or the prospects of, the repayment of outstanding amounts.

16. *Education of wards.*—Statement No. VI appended to the report shows the educational progress of the wards and of such of their relations as were under instruction during the year. Of the 69 wards shown in the list, sixty were males and nine females.

Of the three boys that were at Newington at the beginning of the fasli, the *Kapileswarapuram* minor was sent back to the district at the end of December 1893 to learn the details of estate management, while the *Dhárakota*, *Elagiri* and *Sáptúr* minors were, during the fasli under report, committed to the care of Mr. Ellison, the Court's European tutor at Madras; there were thus five minors under him at its close. One of these (the *Siripuram* minor) has since returned to the district. It was deemed advisable for several reasons to withdraw the boys from school at the end of the Christmas holidays and place them entirely under private tuition at home. They were examined at the end of the fasli in the several subjects taught in schools by Mr. P. Vijiaranga Mudaliar, a retired Assistant Inspector of Schools, and the results of the examination were on the whole satisfactory. The minors are also given lessons in Drawing by a teacher trained in the local School of Arts. They spent three months of the last hot weather at Ootacamund.

The eldest *Appikonda* minor studied commercial business at Madras under Mr. Appalaraju, and has since the close of the fasli returned to the district to learn the particular branches of business with which the family has been connected for a long time. The *Kurupam* minor is said to have made remarkable progress both physically and mentally under Mr. Moss, and the Collector says: "The boy promises to become a model zemindar." He recently visited Madras, Ootacamund, Mysore, and a few other places, but could not, owing to the prevalence of cholera, visit the southern districts of the Presidency as originally contemplated. There was no improvement in the progress of the *Pulicherla* ward and the Collector has arranged since the close of the year to instruct him at least in revenue business. The *Gandarvakóttai* minor remained at Madras reading English and Tamil newspapers and the Rent Recovery Act. The *Singavanam* ward, who could not be sent to school for want of funds, learnt revenue work under his brother-in-law, the zemindar of Papanad. The elder ward of *N. Duraiswami Aiyar's* estate was preparing for the M.A. Degree examination of the local University in English literature, while the two sons of the late *Singam Aiyangar* were studying in the Christian College at Madras for the Matriculation and F.A. examinations, respectively. The younger ward has since passed the latter examination. The *Vadagarai* minor was prosecuting his studies at Madura for the same examination.

Other male wards, as noted in the margin, were studying under private tutors;

Bodogodo, Surangi, Pedda Kimedi, Tangellamudi, Pithapuram, Meduru, Telaprole, Munagala, Thumba, Kadakavinayakanallur, N. Rangaswami Aiyar's estate (younger ward), and Ankasagiri

of the rest, six were reading in the Upper Secondary and the remaining 27 in the Lower Secondary classes. The progress and behaviour of all these minors is said to be on the whole satisfactory, except in the case of the wards of Surangi, Pedda

Kimedi, Appikonda, Lakkavaram, Mailavaram, Edamanal, Mambarai, Anavaradam Pillai's estate, and Shulagiri, who are said to be either backward in their studies or irregular in attendance. The question of removing the two first-named minors and placing them under a special tutor is now under the Court's consideration. The Mambarai wards have since been ordered to be removed to Palni for education. In regard to the other minors the matter is receiving attention.

Besides the wards of Pulicherla, Gandarvakóttai and Singavanam above referred

to, the wards named in the margin received instruction in Revenue Law and Accounts, while the *Vadagarai* minor, who was reading for the F. A. examination, has received lessons in Rent law since the close of the fasli.

Of the female wards, the *Pithapuram* minor's sister made satisfactory progress under her governess Miss Sarah Govindarajulu. Owing to ill-health ward *Timma-jammal* made no progress in her studies, and under medical advice she was sent to Ootacamund for the last hot weather under the charge of an European governess. Her health improved considerably and she was since the close of the fasli married to

the nephew of the ex-poligar of Tarikere in the Mysore State and is now living there with her husband. The daughter of the late *Ayyanna* was attending the 2nd class of Government girls' school at Hospet, while the daughter of the *Kavalpara Nethiar* passed the Primary School examination held in December 1893 and is being taught music. The other female wards, viz., the sisters of the *Telaprole*, *Pulicherla* and *Thumba* minors, and the daughter of the late *Minakshi Ayal*, were being taught by private tutors.

17. *Suits.*—The zemindar of Bobbili's appeal to the High Court, referred to in paragraph 17 of the preceding year's report, was, since the close of the fasli, dismissed, and he has obtained permission to appeal to the Privy Council. The Court is awaiting from its counsel the records, &c., relating to the appeal to that tribunal in connection with the Ungarada and other estates. The Boyyanagudem suit was decreed in the Lakkavaram ward's favour and an appeal therefrom is now pending in the High Court. The suit by the Nidadavólu Rani is still undisposed of. That instituted on behalf of the Pithapuram minor was recently dismissed by the Sub-Court and, owing to want of funds for an appeal, the Court has dropped the matter. The suit by the adopted son of the late Rajah of Pithapuram having been recently decided in his favour, the Court has, with the sanction of Government, preferred an appeal to the High Court. The litigation relating to the late Minakshi Ayal's estate has come to a close and the terms of the compromise have been fully carried into effect. Permission has recently been granted to the step-brother of the Court's ward to file an appeal to the Privy Council in the Sáptúr partition case, and the necessary action in the matter will be taken on the ward's behalf on receipt of the transcript of records from the Advocate-General. The records connected with the Belgam zemindar's appeal to that tribunal have not yet reached the Court of Wards; but the question of further prosecuting that appeal has to be reconsidered on receipt of the Vizagapatam District Court's judgment declaring the will of the late zemindar to be not genuine and the adoption of the present ward made under it to be invalid in consequence. This decision was passed in connection with the resistance offered on the ward's behalf to the execution of the decree in the Belgam partition suit. The Court has recently been advised that the High Court's decree, referred to in the last year's report, leaves the question of the impartibility of Kurupam an open one.

During the fasli under report one S. Gopalaram has instituted a pauper suit claiming the Surangi estate as the adopted son of the late zemindar; it is still pending. The Rani of the Ventrapragada estate filed a petition, as already stated, under section 7 of the Court of Wards Regulation seeking a declaration of her competency to manage her estate; the matter was inquired into by the Sub-Judge of Ellore and his report is now before the High Court.

18. *Religious and charitable institutions attached to estates.*—A statement (No. VII) showing the demand, collection and balance and the financial condition of the several religious and charitable institutions attached to estates under management is appended to the report.

19. *General Remarks.*—In *Kapileswarapuram* and *Meduru* the accounts of the fasli were prepared with reference to the new survey areas; but owing, it is said to the non-receipt of field registers with sketches, the same could not be done in *Telaprole*. The Collector of Kistna having reported that it was inexpedient to extend the Forest Act to the Nuzvid estates at present, the Court has left it to his discretion to bring forward the question later on, if necessary. The separate report on the working of that Act in Sáptúr, promised by the Collector of Madura, has not yet reached the Court. The Shulagiri forests were in good condition. In *Kapileswarapuram*, *Meduru* and *Telaprole* the village accounts were maintained according to the village manual; but no information on this point has been given in regard to *Marungápur* and *Shulagiri*. In *Ettiapuram* and *Elagiri* there is said to be some improvement in the maintenance of village accounts.

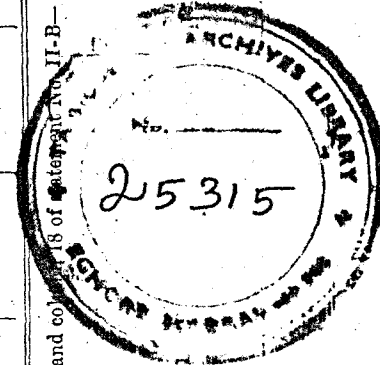

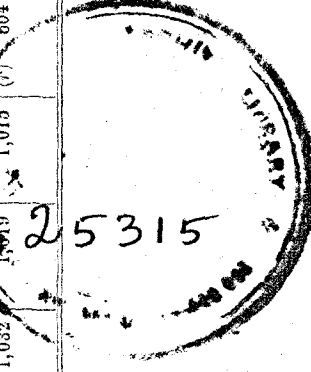
