GENTLEMEN,

1. I have the honor to transmit a statement of the revenues collected from the ten Chittoor Polliams, viz., Bungaure, Yedurkoandah, Narguntee, Goodeepauty, Pakal, Mogaraul, Pooloor, Kulloor, Poolecherla and Tomba, since their assumption in Fusly 1214 to the end of Fusly 1226. See A.

2. With view to the restoration of these Polliams to the Poligars, with the exception of those who have been declared to have permanently forfeited them by their misconduct, it is necessary to determine what may be considered the fair resources of these Polliams.

3. If this question were to be discussed with the sole object of ascertaining what might generally be expected from these Polliams, the answer to it is rendered easy by the discussions which have taken place at different times as to the revenues of the Northern Division of Arcot generally, which, in an equal degree, apply to the Chittoor Polliams in particular.

4. The Settlement which was made for the Districts on Villages from Fusly 1218 to 1220 inclusive has been admitted to be too high and ought therefore to be rejected. It amounted to Star Pagodas 50,209-19-76 for the Chittoor Polliams. It is more moderate to look to the average collections from Fasli 1214 to 1226, a period of thirteen years since the assumption of the Polliams. They will be found to amount to Star Pagodas 45,383-30-70; as the Polliams were however some little time before they recovered from the confusion into which the rebellion of the Poligars had thrown them, it is not necessary to adhere strictly to the amount of collections made shortly after the assumption, and it is not unfair to add the increase effected in the Decennial Settlement from Fasli 1221 to 1230 of Star Pagodas 503-31-79 thus taking the average rent of this period viz., 45,887-17-69 as the fair resources of the Polliams. *Vide column 144 of Stt A.* Do. 99 of St A. Do. 116 of St A.

5. To this amount may be added the sum of 2,172-12-24 being the assessment upon Rajabundoo or Umarum lands of the Polliams which, as they are held by relations of the Poligars who should support them out of their resources, may be resumed. Do. 127 of St A.

6. A further sum of Star Pagodas 2,159-39-40 may be added by the assessment of certain Chillur Enaums *vide* Statement No. 2 which being of modern date and given for the convenience or the personal state of the Poligars, the value of them may be paid out of the Poligars' private purse and the lands permanently resumed. Do. do.

7. In restoring the Poligars the power of resuming these and the Rajabundoo Enaums should be clearly declared in the Sunnud or Grant to be given to them.

8. Their lands however are not here rated at the full survey assessment of Fusly 1215; a deduction of one-fourth is made from that year's assessment for the Rajabundoo or Umarum, and one-third for Chillara Enaums as having as much, as, were the lands resumed, they would actually produce.

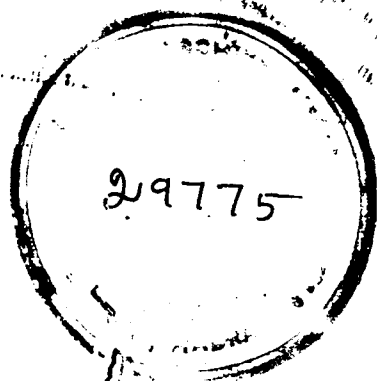
9. These additional sums make the average revenues amount to Star Pagodas 50,219-24-53. Do. 161 of St A.

10. It should be observed that the Polliam of Gudipauti has not at any time during this period been under assumption, but has been managed entirely by the Poligar from whose Curnams the accounts of the collections have been taken.

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11. This might be a fair revenue to calculate upon in letting out the country for a term of lease, or if the proportion which the Poligars are in future to receive were pledged to depend strictly upon the amount of the actual average of past collections, but the terms upon which the Poligars are to be restored demand discussion and consideration.

12. The Proclamation of Government dated November 1804, which was published under the authority of Government by Colonel Manypenny the Officer Commanding the Detachment sent against the rebellious Poligars, is the basis of the present arrangements with the Poligars.

13. By the fourth clause of the English Proclamation, it is declared that, upon the restoration of the Poligars, the amount of the assessment payable to the Government shall be fixed at $\frac{2}{3}$ ths of the produce of the lands.

14. The wording of the Gentoo and Malabar Proclamations, which were transmitted at the same time and to the same authority from Madras, is, to the effect, that two shares, out of five, shall be reserved for Government out of the Mailwaram or Government share, which is receivable from the lands.

15. These terms are the same which were offered to the Poligars by the Commissioners Messrs. Webb Hardis, and Stratton who were deputed by Government in 1804 for the settlement of the affairs of the Chittoor Polliams.

16. The sixty per cent. held out to the Poligars is about the proportion which Mr. Stratton relinquished to them in forming the first settlement with, and fixing their tribute, taking the accounts which he received from the Poligars' Curnams, of the collections of Fusly 1210, as the revenues of the Polliams, and valuing the Amarum or Rajabundoo and Kutbudee lands as if they were to be resumed and their produce available to the Poligars.

17. If we look to the specified revenues of Fusly 1210, not including the rent of the Katbudee lands, the Poligar's share was left at only between 38 and 39 per cent.

18. It is evident from the avowed principle of the settlement with the Zemindars of Bomaranz, Calustry, Venkutgherry, and Sydapoor, which was to make a commutation for Military Service, and from the intention understood to conduct the settlement with the Chittoor Poligars on the same principle as that with the Western Zemindars; from the discussions which appear in the Proceedings of the Commissioners; and from the difficulty an application at first met with, which I submitted to the Right Honorable the Governor in Council, to be permitted to continue their lands to the Kutbudee peons, an objection founded upon the offence which such a measure might give to the Zemindars with whom the condition of their resumption had been insisted upon; these circumstances render it clear that it was considered that Government had a right to calculate upon the value of the Katbudee lands as an available revenue, and that so large a proportion as 60 per cent. to be relinquished to the Poligars was offered to them upon this consideration.

19. It could scarcely however have been unforeseen that there were difficulties in the way of the entire resumption of their lands and that they could not for a long time, if ever, be considered available to the extent stated in the accounts. Their revenues were taken from the estimate of a year, not upon a series of collections for years back, the reluctance of the Poligars to shake off abruptly their old Military adherents was known, even if they could have done it without danger to the peace of the country, and as those who might be deprived of their lands even if they did not rise in open rebellion, would most probably have abandoned the cultivation of them under any thing like a heavy assessment, the nominal resumption could not have been attended with the advantage to the Poligars, which appears in the accounts.

20. The other lands were in the same manner valued upon the collections of one year, which must be looked upon as a very unjust standard by which to determine the resources of a country, where it is intended that Government shall receive the usual share that has prevailed in making a settlement with Zemindars.

21. There were exactions made that Fusly by the Poligars of a most arbitrary nature, arising from the spirit of extravagance and dissipation which could never

be thought likely to be continued beyond the year in which they were imposed, and which should of course be rejected.

22. In the third Paragraph of Mr. Stratton's Report to the Board of 15th November 1802 he thus alludes to these "I have explained the nature of various Imposts levied by the Poligars under different pretences and denominations which, as you will perceive on reference to the accounts, are in some instances levied on Sirkarteerwa on others by a percentage on the Ryots' waram. These collections, though long made, are generally considered grievous in their nature and in the event of arrangements being hereafter made for a permanent settlement of the Peschush of the Chittoor Poligars, it may be advisable to interdict all collections beyond what the Ryots are bound to pay as a fair teerwa".

23. It must be said that it was natural to suppose that the Poligars, still possessing the entire power in the management of their Polliams, would not have allowed their Curnams to overrate these resources, and that on the contrary there was reason to suspect that their accounts would not approach the fair revenues.

24. The tender of such statements can only be accounted for by the supposition that the object of the enquiry was not fully penetrated by the Poligars; at least they may not have been able to perceive that the partial collections of a single year would be taken as the general standard by which to regulate the demand upon them, and at all events they do not appear to have been called upon to explain, what one year with another might be considered the fair resources of their country.

25. That the revenues were in point of fact estimated too high may, I think, be concluded from the reduced amount of the subsequent collections since the resumption of the Polliams (a means of information which was not laid open at the time of fixing the tribute) and also from the circumstance of the tribute so soon having fallen into arrear.

26. The Settlement was made with the Poligars in Fusly 1211 for Star Pagodas 37,525-0-0 and in Fusly 1212 there was a balance outstanding against them of Star Pagodas 7,666-36-77; at this time they had not been deprived of their resources from Kauvellee lands and fees, and from the collection of customs or duties on articles of merchandize they were not resumed till Fusly 1213.

27. But though the revenues may be said to have been overrated, it does not appear that the settled tribute was exorbitant, for, calculating even upon the reduced amount Star Pagodas 45,383-30-70 resulting from the average collections from Fusly 1214 to Fusly 1226 and valuing the Kauvellee resources at 7,801-12-41 and the customs at Star Pagodas 4,634-22-14, the share relinquished to the Poligars was about 35 per cent. a proportion which in later Settlements with large proprietors has been considered quite adequate. If we look at the revenues of Fusly 1210, deducting the Kutbudee lands, Mr. Stratton's Peishcush bear the proportion to them of about 38 per cent.

28. The Kauvellee lands and fees having been consolidated since their resumption with the land rent, and no separate account having been kept of them, the exact amount of collections from them is not known, and the customs which were formerly levied in various places and at various rates have been absorbed in the general system which has established only particular places for the levy of town or Frontier duties and has made the rates of collection uniform throughout the Company's territories. As the places where they used to be levied in the Polliams have not come under the principle of this system, they have most of them been abolished, and other places substituted, not perhaps lying within the Polliams, though the collections in the new places may, in some degree, be dependent upon the traffic in the Polliams, and, at all events, the amount of their collections has been increased according to the number of places reduced in the Polliams, yet the proportion which is furnished by the Polliams cannot under this arrangement be ascertained. The valuation specified in the statement of Fusly 1210 is therefore taken as the revenue of these branches and admitting that these, in common with the other items, may have been valued too high it may on the other hand be said that the Poligars might have derived some advantage from their Kutbudee lands which in the present comparison has not been supposed, for, though they could not have

proceeded to an entire resumption without danger they might easily have made a few extra assessments.

29. When however the Kauvellee and the Sayar were resumed in Fusly 1213 this same Peishcush which the Poligars were still obliged to pay may be considered as having been too high as it only left them 16 per cent. upon the revenues as they now appear. In this however as in the former case, the revenues were not suspected at the time to be overrated and it was reasonable to suppose that more advantage would have been derived to the Poligars from their Kutbude lands and if they failed to take the advantage it must be ascribed to the inveterate reluctance in the Poligars to relinquish any former splendour and state, and to their disinclination to deprive themselves of the means of independence by hazarding the attachment of their Military adherents.

30. On the whole it may be inferred from the terms of the Government Proclamation of November 1804, and from the proceedings of the Chittoor Commissioners, that Government are left at perfect liberty to determine what shall be considered the resources of the Polliams without any restriction as to any mode of assessment or any system of collection, and that from the unusually large proportion relinquished to the Poligars by Mr. Stratton in his settlement of Fusly 1211 and that agreed to by Government through the Commissioners and latterly by the proclamation published by the Officer Commanding the Detachment sent against the Poligars, it was considered expedient to assess this proportion upon the capability which the Polliams might be found to possess in any one year, rather than upon a reduced average of a long series of years.

31. Under the interpretation and the impression that Government have not deprived themselves of the power to exercise this right by any pledge given to the Poligars which would be violated by it, I beg to recommend that the Settlement of Fusly 1215 be taken as the basis upon which to fix the proportion of Peishkush in future to be paid by the Poligars, adding to it the Rajabundoo or Umarum Enaum lands, and certain Chillur Enaum lands, which, as I have before stated, may be resumed and assessed the former at three-quarters and the latter at two-thirds of the full Survey rent of Fusly 1215, the full rent is not placed upon them because one year with another they would not yield so much, and the actual collections would be found to fall short of the estimate.

32. The result would be nearly the same in point of amount, if, to the average revenues of the Decennial Settlement were to be added besides the other fair resumptions here reckoned upon, two-thirds of the full survey assessment of Fusly 1215, of what remains, after deducting the usual quit-rent which has usually been paid upon the Kutbude lands, which have been continued to the Kutbude Peons.

33. But, though this mode of assessment might be satisfactory, with reference to the original intention of including the Kutbude lands as a part of the resources, yet it would be deceptive, as the continuance of the lands in the hands of the Peons was authorized by Government, and their resumption, having in view the permanent tranquillity of the country, would not be sanctioned. It would only therefore be giving credit for resources, which it is not intended should be available.

34. The proportion, which each Polliam will contribute to the amount of the proposed Peshkush, is shewn in the subjoined abstract, in column 10, but the professional taxes, variously denominated Sournauthayem Pullaputtada, or Mohturfa, being deducted, that is, credit being given to the Poligars for 60 per cent. upon the total of them, St. Ps. 360-9-23, leaves the Peshkush at Star Pagodas 23,880-33-14.

35. By the regulations, the right of regulating these taxes rests with the Government, but, as the proclamation of November 1804 does not make the Poligars' proportion independent of this item of revenue, it appears fair to allow them their share of the advantage derivable from it. A settlement may be made annually, or for a term of years, by the Collector's Cucherry with those subject to the payment of the taxes, but the amount being clearly defined by written agreements, there will be little inconvenience in permitting the Poligars to collect it with their other items of Revenue, which will save the expense, on the part of Government, of a distinct establishment for the collection, and leave the Poligars free from unpleasant interference in their management.

36. For the sake of comparison with the statements of the Revenues of former years, the resources of the whole ten Polliams of Chittoor have been here submitted, but it is only the 6 Polliams of Goodeepatee, Bungauree, Naragunttee, Kulloor, Pooleecherla, and Tombah, which are pledged to be restored to, or to be continued in, the possession of the Poligars—the remaining Polliams of Paukaul, Mogaraul, Poloor, and Yedurekondah have been declared to be permanently forfeited to Government, in consequence of the continued rebellion of these Poligars, and their not availing themselves in time of the terms held out by the proclamation. The Yedurekondah Poligar suffered capital punishment for his conduct, and no provision is made for any allowance out of the Revenues of his Polliam, but the Poligars of the other permanently forfeited Polliams have been granted by Government, in consequence of their ultimate submission, though tardy, an allowance of 18 per cent. upon the Revenues of their Polliams, calculated upon Mr. Stratton's statement of Fusly 1210.

37. With a view to limit the Poligars' authority as much as possible, to ensure their own stability, and the welfare of the inhabitants, by lessening the probability of mismanagement, I have always had it in contemplation to propose that a certain number of Villages, free of assessment, should be assigned to the Poligars, whose revenues should be equal to the amount of the proportion pledged to them. To procure the assent of the Poligars themselves to this arrangement, I suggested that the Cusbah, or principal Villages of their Polliams, and the Villages contiguous to them, should be transferred to them for their residence and management, and it is upon this consideration, that the Poligars have uniformly delivered their written assent to the plan; but the advantage to be expected from it is not sufficiently great, when it is considered, how large the proportion is, which is to be relinquished to the Poligars: that they will still retain the greater part of their Polliams, and that, consisting of the Villages the most certain in their resources: that the necessity of keeping up a number of distinct small establishments, divided from each other, in consequence of the intermixture of so many Poligars' Villages, will augment beyond the usual proportion the expenses of managing the Villages retained in the hands of Government. It must not be omitted too, that a small portion only of the Polliams becomes security for that, for which Government formerly possessed the whole as a pledge.

38. If however Government should prefer the division of the Polliams, it should be made on the principle that the average revenues of the portion retained by Government, taking either the Decennial lease, or the actual collections since the resumption, including items fairly resumable, should be equal to the amount of the Peshkush thought proper to be demanded, that is, Star Pagodas 24,240-41-37. The Government revenue must otherwise be considered very fluctuating and uncertain—

39. A statement will be transmitted of the Villages, which may be transferred to the exclusive management of the Poligars, if this division of these Polliams is determined upon.

40. Previously to the restoration of the Poligars to the possession of their Polliams, it would add to their own ultimate stability, to the welfare of the inhabitants, to the tranquillity of the country, and to the security of the revenue, if another settlement were made with the Ryots, collectively, or with the Head Inhabitants for a term of years. It is not overrating the merits of the Heads of Villages to admit that they are a strong barrier against the incroachments of Poligars, a description of people whose habits are licentious, and indolent, despotic, and incapable of steady application to the business of administration, where all restraints are withdrawn from their unruly passions; an annual Ryotwaur settlement would still leave the necessity of a continued interference on the part of Government, and the inconvenience of a fluctuating revenue, if permanency as to amount is considered to be a matter of any importance.

41. The right of imposing such a restriction may perhaps be founded, equally with the benefit of the measure, upon the principle of the 6th clause of the Government proclamation of November 1804, which provides that, "The amount of the land rent to be paid by the Ryots of the Polliams of Chittoor shall be in future defined by fixed Puttahs, in order that they may be freed from the vexatious demands, to which the Ryots have been hitherto subject."

42. The conditions, upon which the Poligars are to be restored, seem to be left perfectly free to the wisdom of Government, with reference to future public benefit, and it would not be prudent to relinquish the fulfilment of the best objects of Government, by an over-anxiety not to deviate from a particular system of permanent settlement.

43. It being of consequence to detach the Kutbude Peons sufficiently from the Poligars, and to connect their interest with that of Government, they should be declared subject to the control of the Government servants in all matters of police, and the Poligars should be expressly restricted from raising the assessment upon the lands, without the consent of Government, beyond the rates which are now fixed, or may be hereafter fixed by the Sirkar, and which will be defined by written Puttahs under the signature of the Collector.

44. There would be considerable danger that the Poligars would very soon be thrown back into their former difficulties and embarrassments, unless some judicious arrangements were previously made for the liquidation of the debts, in which they are involved, of long standing. Some of the creditors prosecuted the Poligars for them in the Civil Court, and the business was referred to my investigation after a tedious and intricate inquiry; the Creditors and Poligars have prepared the enclosed Statements, Nos. 1 to 10, exhibiting the whole amount of their debts a Star Pagodas 33,750-26-4, the Creditors agreeing to give up all demand for interest, provided Government guarantee the payment to them.

45. Of this amount, however, the sum of Star Pagodas 242-5-24 seems deserving of being rejected altogether, as of too old a date, and having no documents whatever to support them.

46. The sum of Star Pagodas 22,382-22-26 is not composed of such debts, as can be recommended to be paid immediately. The Poligars do not fully admit them, and they are suggested to be reserved for future inquiry, or for trial in the Civil Court—some of their debts are upon account only, without agreements, some are upon Bonds, not executed by the present Poligars, but by their ancestors, and liable from their antiquity to suspicion and demur, being of thirty and forty years standing.

47. There are others, however, to the amount of Star Pagodas 11,125-43-34, which, from the nature of them, their modern date, and being contracted many of them by the present Poligars, and the purposes for which they were given being within the memory and evidence of several now living, seem satisfactorily proved. The debt due to Narain Chitty, a very respectable old merchant of Chittoor, amounting to Star Pagodas 2,802-38-75, is in particular very clear and ought to be liquidated the first, for it is known to the Collector's Cutcherry that he paid a great part of it, if not into the treasury himself, certainly for the express purpose of discharging the Balance of Peshkush, due by the Poligars, and he had that kind of direct communication with the Collector's Cutcherry, that Government may be considered in a manner pledged to pay the readiest attention to his claim, though not strictly responsible for the debt contracted.

48. I beg to recommend that 40 per cent. out of their share, or, for the Polliams to be restored, Star Pagodas 9,224-40-29 be required to be paid by the Poligars into the Collector's Treasury every year, for the discharge of their private debts, and for the satisfaction of the Government demand against them for arrears of Peshkush, until these two items are liquidated.

49. That it shall be declared that no claim for debt against the Chittoor Poligars shall be valid, of which an account is not given into the Zillah Court within one year.

50. That the fund so deposited, and no other, shall be answerable for the debts.

51. That the amount of debt, agreed upon between the Poligars and the Creditors to be just, shall begin to be paid immediately upon their restoration to their Polliams.

52. And that if the remainder cannot be amicably adjusted, it be left to be decided by the Civil Courts.

53. That as soon as the whole debts, claimed within the prescribed period, and the amount of arrears of Peshkush are discharged, the payment by the Poligars of 40 per cent. into the Collector's Treasury be discontinued.

54. That the proportion to be paid for the arrears of Peshkush be 20 per cent., and that for the discharge of private debts 20 per cent.

55. The same proportion assigned for the discharge of private debts may be applied to those Poligars also, whose Polliams are declared to be permanently forfeited, and who will continue to receive 18 per cent., calculated upon the revenues of Fusly 1210, out of which the debts should be discharged.

56. With respect to any arrears of Peshkush, as the Government derive all the benefit of the permanent resumption of these Polliams, I presume they must be exempted from all responsibility, and demand for them.

57. The Balance of Peshkush, which was outstanding against the Polliams to be restored in Fusly 1213, the year of their resumption, was Star Pagodas 22,546-36-77.

58. If they are to be considered in the light of permanently settled estates, which have been assumed temporarily, and liable to payment on restoration, of what remains due of the fixed assessment, after deducting all charges of collection, then a further balance has accumulated against them of Star Pagodas 42,027-4-73, being the difference between the actual net collection from Fusly 1213 to 1226, and the amount of Peshkush fixed by Mr. Stratton on this Estate, as a matter of account, and for the consideration of Government, not as giving a decided opinion on the propriety of Government making a Demand on this account. It was probably considered that the profit and loss, attending the management during the resumption, should rest with Government, and that the Poligars were to have nothing to do with the one, or the other.

59. The Yedurkoandah Poligar's debt, amounting to 2,405-9-42, forms a distinct question from that of the rest. The Poligar himself, who was capitally punished, has left no family of his own. His father was the Poligar of the Bungee Polliam. There is no person belonging to the late Poligar to confirm, or disprove the debt satisfactorily. The claims rest upon assertions. It is probable that the Creditors would agree to a compromise, and agree to receive 1,000 for the amount claimed, that is, if Government conceive themselves under obligation to discharge these debts.

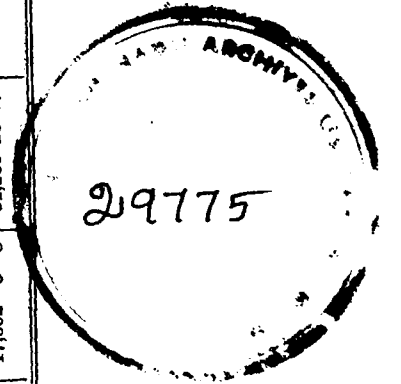
