SIR,

I have the honour to submit, for the information of Government, the Annual Returns of the Civil Hospitals and Dispensaries in the Presidency for the year 1908—the first of the current triennium—together with the following notes on the main points connected with them.

Number of institutions—Statement A.—Six hundred and thirty institutions were at work during the whole or a part of the year. Of these 1 State special, 13 Local Fund and 6 private non-aided dispensaries were opened; while 1 State special, 2 Local Fund, 2 Private non-aided and 3 Railway dispensaries were closed during the year. One Local Fund dispensary (Yeleswaram) in Gódvári District was transferred to Prathipadu, under G.O., No. 836 L., Mis., dated 20th June 1907. The Agency Hospital at Udayagiri (Ramagiri), 3 Local Fund dispensaries in the Chingleput District, and 1 dispensary in Malabar were closed for varying periods during the prevalence of cholera. The year closed with a balance of 622 institutions, comprising 287 hospitals and 335 dispensaries. For statistical purposes the several institutions are grouped as follows:—Group I.—State Public, Local Fund and Private aided, which are maintained or subsidised by the State for the general public; Group II.—State special and Railway; Group III.—Private non-aided.

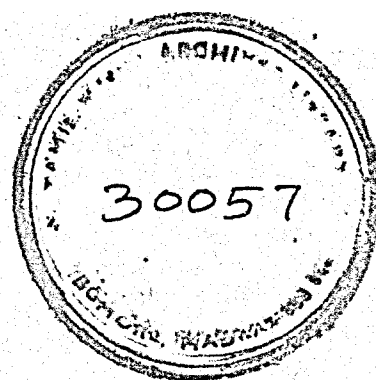
2. Number treated—Statements B—E.—One hospital and one dispensary in the third group furnished no statistics. In the other institutions 5,757,453 persons were treated as compared with 5,594,940, the number treated in the Presidency (excluding the Sandur State) during 1907. Omitting 5,060 cases of normal labour—included in the returns for the first time under G.O., No. 748, Public, dated 10th September 1908—the record is an increase of 28 *per mille* on that of the previous year. Groups I, II and III contributed respectively 93·3, 3·2 and 3·5 per cent. of the total—the ratios being almost identical with those of 1907. In-patients increased by 5,684 and out-patients by 156,929. The percentage of sexes seeking relief was 65·5 males and 34·5 females.

3. Nature of relief—(a) Treatment of disease.—The diseases treated are particularised in Statements C, D and E. Among these the most marked increases occurred in eye diseases (226,937), ulcers (72,260), abscesses and diseases of connective tissue (8,033), diarrhoea (6,638), dyspepsia (5,610), and cholera (5,777): the number of injuries was increased by 11,522: on the other hand considerable diminution occurred in malaria (60,569), disorders of the digestive system other than dyspepsia and diarrhoea (27,406), syphilis and gonorrhoea (849), and rheumatic affections (10,990). Cholera was epidemic almost throughout the Presidency for the greater part of the year, and catarrhal conjunctivitis—‘sore eyes’—was especially severe in its season; but for the rest it may be inferred that the prevailing high prices of food supplies, and the attendant poverty, were the main causes of the variations.

(b) Operations were performed in 205,686 instances, or 10,401 more than in 1907. Groups II and III contributed 5·4 per cent. of the total; the figures for Group I are separately dealt with below.

(c) Midwifery.—In addition to 5,060 normal and 3,172 abnormal labours conducted by the Medical staff, and included in the returns, there were 32,640

others in the mofussil districts, attended by 363 Local Fund and Municipal midwives. The average to each midwife in a district varied from 128.4 in South Canara to 55.7 in Anantapur, and was 89.9 for the Presidency. In the previous year 345 midwives attended 30,673 cases, with an average of 88.9 to each.

4. *The institutions in group I* furnish more detailed statistics, and the following paragraphs refer to this group only. They comprise 472 institutions open to both sexes (Class A), and 25 reserved for women and children (Class B).

5. *In-patients—(a) Accommodation.*—In both classes accommodation was provided for 2,855 males and 2,301 females, exclusive of 27 beds in the contagious wards of the Government General Hospital, which are used for either sex as necessary. The most important variations were an increase of 18 beds in the Government Maternity Hospital, and of 24 beds in the Vizagapatam Hospital, while a reduction of 18 beds occurred from the Chatrapur hospital (Ganjām) and the Mimisal hospital (Tanjore) being converted into dispensaries. Other details are shown in Statement B.

(b) *Number treated and results.*—There were treated 73,911 in-patients, comprising 43,285 men, 26,910 women, and 3,716 children; and the daily average number was 3,294.45, including 1,976.46 men, 1,142.62 women, and 175.37 children. Of the total 57.6 per cent. were cured, and 18.58 per cent. were relieved. The death-rate was 6.25 per cent., but if 896 cases admitted moribund be excluded (largely cholera), the rate falls to 5.04 per cent.

6. *Out-patients.*—These numbered 5,296,431, of whom 6 per cent. were 'represented by friends.' The percentage of the sexes was 65.79 males and 34.21 females, the children contributing 15.87 and 12.49 respectively to the above. The daily average attendance was 33,170.06; the ratio of sex herein was 1 female to 1.8 males, and that of age was 1 child to 2.7 adults.

7. *The patients treated in Madras*—formed 30.72 per cent. of the in-patient, and 4.5 per cent. of the out-patient totals for the group; the daily average number comprised 1,159.97 in-patients, and 1,679.64 out-patients. Of the in-patients 53.08 per cent. were cured, and 15.17 per cent. were relieved; the death-rate was 5.81 per cent., falling to 5.25 after deducting 128 cases admitted moribund; but, owing to the comparatively large number admitted for observation or advice, the percentages of 'discharged otherwise' was 21.92, or half as much again as it was for the entire group.

8. *The institutions in Class B (women and children),* with accommodation for 561 beds, treated as in-patients 10,731 females and 494 children, and the daily average number comprised 364.35 women and 18.54 children. Of the total 68.56 per cent. were cured, and 10.63 per cent. were relieved, and the death-rate was 1.94 per cent. The out-patients included 141,340 women and 137,664 children, together with 1,701 males—hospital servants and relatives accompanying patients—treated at the Madura American Mission Hospital; the average daily attendance was 1,135.25 women, 900.25 children and 8.40 men. The total treated was an increase of 3,691 over that of the previous year.

9. *Classes and sexes—Statement F.*—Of the 5,370,342 patients treated, Europeans and Eurasians formed 1.27 per cent., Hindus 73.04 and Muhammadans 12.81, the remainder being of other classes. There was a slight increase in the number of Muhammadan females seeking relief.

10. *Operative surgery—Statement G.*—There had remained under treatment 1,112 subjects of operation at the commencement of the year. During the year 193,532 principal and 1,127 secondary operations were performed upon 193,500 patients. Of the total 96 per cent. were cured, 2.8 per cent. were relieved, 458 (0.24 per cent.) died, and 1,270 remained at the close of the year. The City Hospitals account for 10.37 per cent. of the operations performed; the death-rate in Madras was 0.86 per cent., evidence of the comparative severity of a large number. Both in the number and variety of operations the record contrasts favourably with that of the previous year; the results are up to the usual average.

11. *Finance (Statement H)—(a) Income.*—Government contributed Rupees 6,57,135, of which 38 per cent. was paid as salary; the contributions from Local Funds and Municipalities amounted, respectively, to Rs. 8,69,314 and Rs. 3,36,522; the income under these heads formed respectively 33.02, 43.68 and 16.91 of the total, varying but slightly from the proportions in the previous year. Subscrip-

tions from Europeans amounted to Rs. 19,816, a decrease of Rs. 182; those from Natives amounted to Rs. 19,086, an increase of Rs. 6,598 accounted for by large native subscriptions to the Victoria Caste and Gosha Hospital, and to the Tirupati Mahant's Hospital; on the whole the income under subscriptions was 1.96 per cent. of the total. Other items of income included the opening balance of Rs. 10,694; interest on investments, Rs. 20,812; and Miscellaneous receipts, Rs. 56,476.

(b) *Expenditure.*—The expenditure amounted to Rs. 19,78,956; and the cost per patient was As. 5-10 as in 1907. Under salary to medical officers and subordinates was paid Rs. 5,74,515; to nurses Rs. 1,11,431; and to inferior servants Rs. 2,79,427; these items compared with the similar ones of 1907 show increases of Rs. 10,849, Rs. 3,788 and Rs. 31,873, respectively; the increases are accounted for by the promotion to higher grades of medical subordinates, by the additions to nurses and servants in several institutions, and by the 'Compensation' allowance distributed under orders of Government. Medicines and instruments cost Rupees 2,83,530, of which 7.5 per cent. was spent on bazaar medicines. The charge for diet was Rupees 2,44,598, the daily average cost of a diet having risen from As. 2-10 to As. 3-3 in the general scarcity of provisions. Miscellaneous charges cost Rs. 2,44,204 or 8.1 pies per patient, as contrasted with 7.3 pies in 1907—an increase mainly due to the enhanced prices of articles purchased. Buildings and repairs cost Rs. 2,38,318, of which over 52 per cent. was spent in the City institutions; among these the extensions and improvements made in the Government General Hospital and the Government Maternity Hospital cost respectively Rs. 22,152 and Rs. 25,925.

12. *Invested capital (Statement J).*—An addition of Rs. 4,502 was made to this item; but withdrawals also occurred; and the closing balance was slightly higher than that of 1907.

13. *Service books and registers of stock* have been duly checked and found correct.

14. *General remarks—(a) Inspection.*—The Surgeon-General visited the City institutions and the head-quarter stations of all the districts except Nellore, as well as the stations in charge of Civil Surgeons, except Negapatam. Inspections by the District Medical and Sanitary Officers were made of all institutions in Kistna, Nellore, Kurnool, Anantapur, Chingleput, South Arcot, Salem, Trichinopoly, Madura, Nilgiri, Malabar and South Canara; an aggregate of seventeen units was not inspected in Ganjām, Guntūr, Bellary, Cuddapah, North Arcot, Coimbatore and Tanjore; while in Vizagapatam, Gódayari and Tinnevely, the prevalence of cholera impeded inspection work considerably.

(b) *Hospital Assistants.*—In pursuance of G.O., No. 633, Public, dated 28th July 1904, an addition of 17 was made to the number of 'independent charges' held by Hospital Assistants of higher grades than the third.

(c) *Lending libraries of medical books.*—On application made by Surgeon-General Browne at the beginning of 1908, Government approved of the proposal to establish lending libraries of medical books in each district for the benefit of medical subordinates, to be managed by the District Medical Officers in each case, and were pleased to authorise contributions by District Boards and Municipalities towards the same—G.O., No. 436 L., dated 20th March 1908; and in G.O., No. 400, Public, dated 12th May 1908, a donation of Rs. 6,600 (Rs. 300 for each district) was ordered from Provincial funds, to be distributed as soon as books are received from England. A first supply of 149 books at a cost of Rs. 1,186-11-0 was purchased from Messrs. Higginbotham & Co., Madras; further indents were forwarded to the Superintendent of Stationery during the year, and 587 books to the value of £340-4-9 were received in February 1909.

CLASSES I AND II.—These include all institutions maintained by provincial funds and under Government management. The fact that an institution possesses endowments or receives contributions from local funds or private subscriptions should not be regarded as a reason for not classing it as 'State' so long as provincial and imperial funds are practically responsible for all the charges connected with it. Class I—'Public' are State dispensaries which are open to the poorer classes of the public. Class II—are State dispensaries which serve only a special section of the public as indicated in the sub-classification attached.

CLASS III.—Local fund dispensaries include all institutions which are vested in local boards or municipalities or guaranteed or maintained by local or municipal funds. The fact that such an institution is aided by private subscriptions, or receives assistance from Government in the shape of part of the salary of the medical officer, grants of medicine, or otherwise, should not be regarded as a reason for not classing it as a local fund dispensary so long as its existence is practically dependent upon local funds.

CLASS IV.—Comprises institutions supported by private subscriptions or guarantee, but receiving aid from Government or local funds.

CLASS V.—Comprises institutions maintained entirely at the cost of private individuals or associations. The fact that Government supplies superior inspection or registers should not be regarded as a reason for not treating it as a private non-aided dispensary.

CLASS VI.—Comprises all railway dispensaries whether maintained by State-railways or others.
