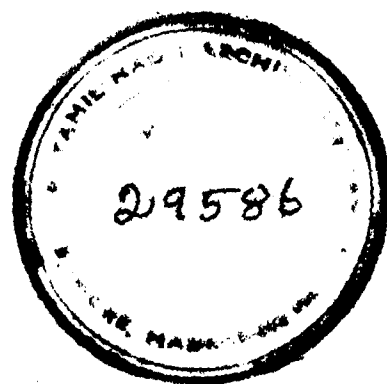

INTRODUCTORY NOTE.

I.—GENERAL.

On 31st December 1910 there were in the Madras Presidency the following Courts. Criminal Courts, viz. :—

- the High Court,
- 25 Sessions Courts (including 3 for Agency Tracts),
- 3 Additional Sessions Courts (including 2 for Agency Tracts),
- 24 District Magistrates' Courts,
- 2 Additional District Magistrates' Courts,
- 4 Presidency Magistrates' Courts,
- 105 Sub-Divisional Magistrates' Courts,
- 32 Joint, Assistant and Deputy Magistrates without divisional charges,
- 496 Subordinate Magistrates' Courts (including 173 Tahsildars),
- 62 Benches of Magistrates (on which 372 Honorary Magistrates had seats),
- 65 Special Magistrates' Courts and
- 4 Cantonment Magistrates' Courts.

On 1st June 1910 a new Sessions Court and a new District Magistrate's Court were established for the Ramnad district, which was constituted from that date, and at the same time the Madura Additional Sessions Court and Additional District Magistrate's Court were abolished. The Additional Sessions Court at Coimbatore was abolished from 10th December 1910, its place being taken by an Assistant Sessions Judge's Court early in the present year. As the result of the re-arrangement of divisions and taluks in several districts the number of Sub-divisional Magistrates was increased by 8 and that of Subordinate Magistrates by 31 (including 10 Tahsildars) in the course of the year. Besides Magistrates of the grades already mentioned 3,990 Village Magistrates actually tried cases in the year, i.e., 231 less than the average of the five preceding years. The largest number of Village Magistrates tried cases in the Tanjore district (614), the fewest in Anantapur (31), Cuddapah (32) and Bellary (33).

2. The total number of original cases instituted in the Criminal Courts in 1910 was 284,363. This was 6,104 less than the number in the previous year and 15,678 less than the average of the five preceding years, during which with the exception of 1907 there had been a continuous decrease. The total number of appeals preferred was 9,351, i.e., 759 less than in 1909 and 527 less than the average for the years 1905–1909.

II.—ORIGINAL CASES.

3. The number of cases instituted in Village Magistrates' Courts was 10,660 or 733 less than 1909. The number of persons tried was 17,388, of whom 4,220 were convicted.

4. In other Magistrates' Courts in the mufassal 219,665 cases were instituted, 7,710 less than in the previous year. In spite of the decrease of work the number of cases left pending at the end of the year was 3,844 or 512 more than at the end of 1909. The average number of days from the beginning to the end of a trial in these Courts was 6 against 7 in 1909.

Presidency
Magistrates.

5. In the Presidency Magistrates' Courts the total number of cases instituted, which between 1907 and 1909 had fallen by nearly 16,000, increased by 2,349, reaching 52,683. Only 69 cases were left pending at the end of the year.

Sessions
Courts.

6. The number of cases committed to Sessions Courts in the mufassal was 1,320 against 1,329 in 1909. The Courts to which the largest number of cases were committed were those of Coimbatore (129), where there was an additional Sessions Judge almost throughout the year, Tinnevely (115) and Salem (95): at the other end of the scale came the Courts of Ganjām (23), Chingleput (30) and Kistna (30). The number of cases left pending at the end of the year was 80, which was considerably more than usual. The average period between committal and the conclusion of the trial was 36 days against 40 in 1909.

The High
Court.

7. The number of cases committed to the High Court Sessions was 34 against 36 in 1909. Two cases were left pending at the end of the year.

III.—APPEALS.

Magistrates'
Courts.

8. The number of persons who appealed to First-class Magistrates against the decisions of Second and Third-class Magistrates was 15,015 or 1,028 less than in the previous year. At the end of the year the appeals of 947 persons were pending against 899 at the end of 1909. The average period which elapsed between the presentation of an appeal and its disposal was again 19 days.

Sessions
Courts.

9. The number of persons who appealed to Sessions Courts against the decisions of First-class Magistrates was 2,010, i.e. 216 less than in the previous year. The appeals of 153 persons were left pending at the end of the year against 196 at the end of 1909. The average duration of an appeal in these Courts was reduced from 31 days in 1909 to 30 days.

The High
Court.

10. To the High Court 1,132 persons appealed against 1,290 in the previous year. The number of persons whose appeals were left pending at the end of the year was 164 against 194 at the end of 1909. The Government appealed against the acquittal of 43 persons, the average of the five preceding years being 71.

IV.—REVISION AND REFERENCE.

Magistrates'
Courts.

11. In District Magistrates' Courts 561 applications for revision were presented or 123 more than 1909. The number of cases taken up *suo motu* by District Magistrates or on reports from their Sub-divisional Magistrates fell from 55 in 1909 to 32.

Sessions
Courts.

12. The number of applications presented to Sessions Judges for revision was 386 against 425 in 1909, and the number of cases taken up by them *suo motu* 56 against 64.

The High
Court.

13. In the High Court 585 revision petitions were received, 84 cases were reported by Sessions Judges or District Magistrates, and 28 cases were taken up *suo motu*. Death sentences on 68 persons were referred to the High Court for confirmation under section 374 of the Code of Criminal Procedure: 45 were confirmed, 12 were reduced to some other punishment and 11 were reversed. Under section 307 Sessions Judges referred to the High Court what they considered to be wrong verdicts by juries on 48 persons. The verdicts on 14 persons were upheld, and those on the remainder (12 of "guilty" and 22 of "not guilty") were reversed.

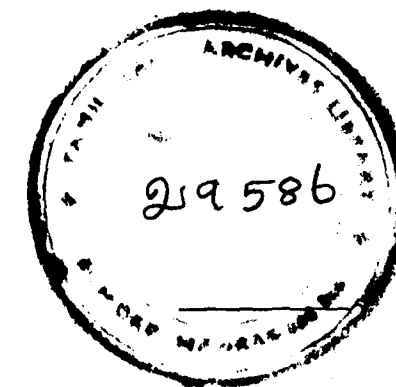

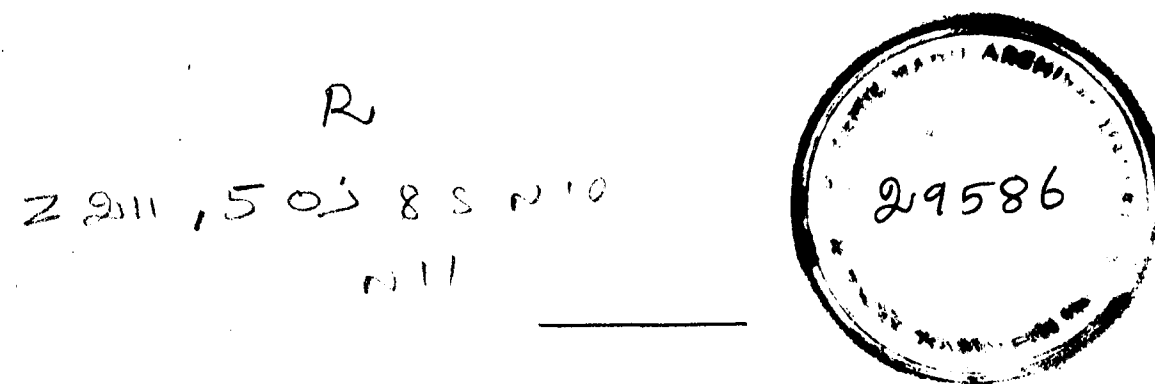

whippings to the total number of all punishments was 15.40, while in 1909 it was 19.92, in 1908 it was 21.46, and in 1907 it was 28.09. In 199,118 of the 215,073 fines imposed the amount was Rs. 10 or less. Out of a total of 26,657 sentences of imprisonment imposed during the year, no less than 9,412 (or about 30 per cent.) were for periods not exceeding fifteen days. Of these 4,220 were imposed by Village Magistrates. Sentences for very short periods are obviously not reformatory in character, and they can be intended only as punishments. It is probable, however, that a fine would be more keenly felt by most of the offenders upon whom such trivial sentences are inflicted, than a week in a sub-jail; while in many cases it would be sufficient to release the offender on probation of good conduct. The folly of short sentences of imprisonment in the case of the majority of first offenders has already been commented on by the Government in reviewing the report on the administration of Jails.

The present report does not distinguish between adults and juveniles among the persons who were punished by the courts during the year. But from the Jail Administration report it appears that 619 juveniles were admitted to jail during the year, while the report now under review shows that the alternative modes of dealing with juvenile offenders, viz., by release on probation under section 562, Criminal Procedure Code, by whipping, and, by detention in the Reformatory, were applied in 153, 620 and 23 cases, respectively, making a total of 796 (of whom not all were juveniles) against 619 youthful offenders sent to jail.

9. *Juries and assessors.*—The High Court have not remarked upon the working of the jury system during the year, but the figures compare not unsatisfactorily with those of previous years. The number of cases tried by jury was 1,184, and the verdict of the jury was approved by the judge in all but 48 cases. Coimbatore, Bellary, Kurnool and Salem provided the largest number of disagreements between judge and jury, while in Tinnevely, the judge approved of all but a single verdict. There was less unanimity between judge and assessors, and here also the disagreements were very frequent in the districts above mentioned and also in the Vizagapatam Agency and in Tinnevely.

10. *Appeals—Revisions.*—The total number of appeals and revision applications was less than in 1909, the diminution being concurrent with a general decrease in original trials.
