

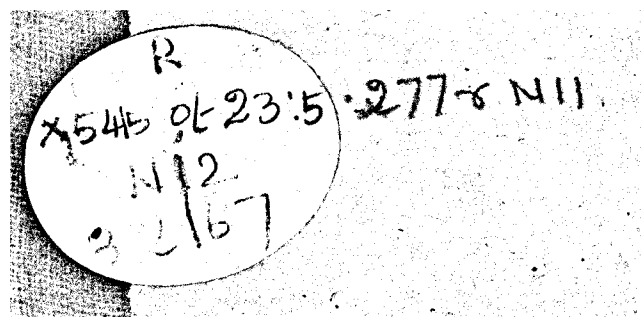

SHILLONG:

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Explanatory Note.

For the purpose of recording the trade carried by rail and river Assam is divided into three blocks, which are constituted as follows:—

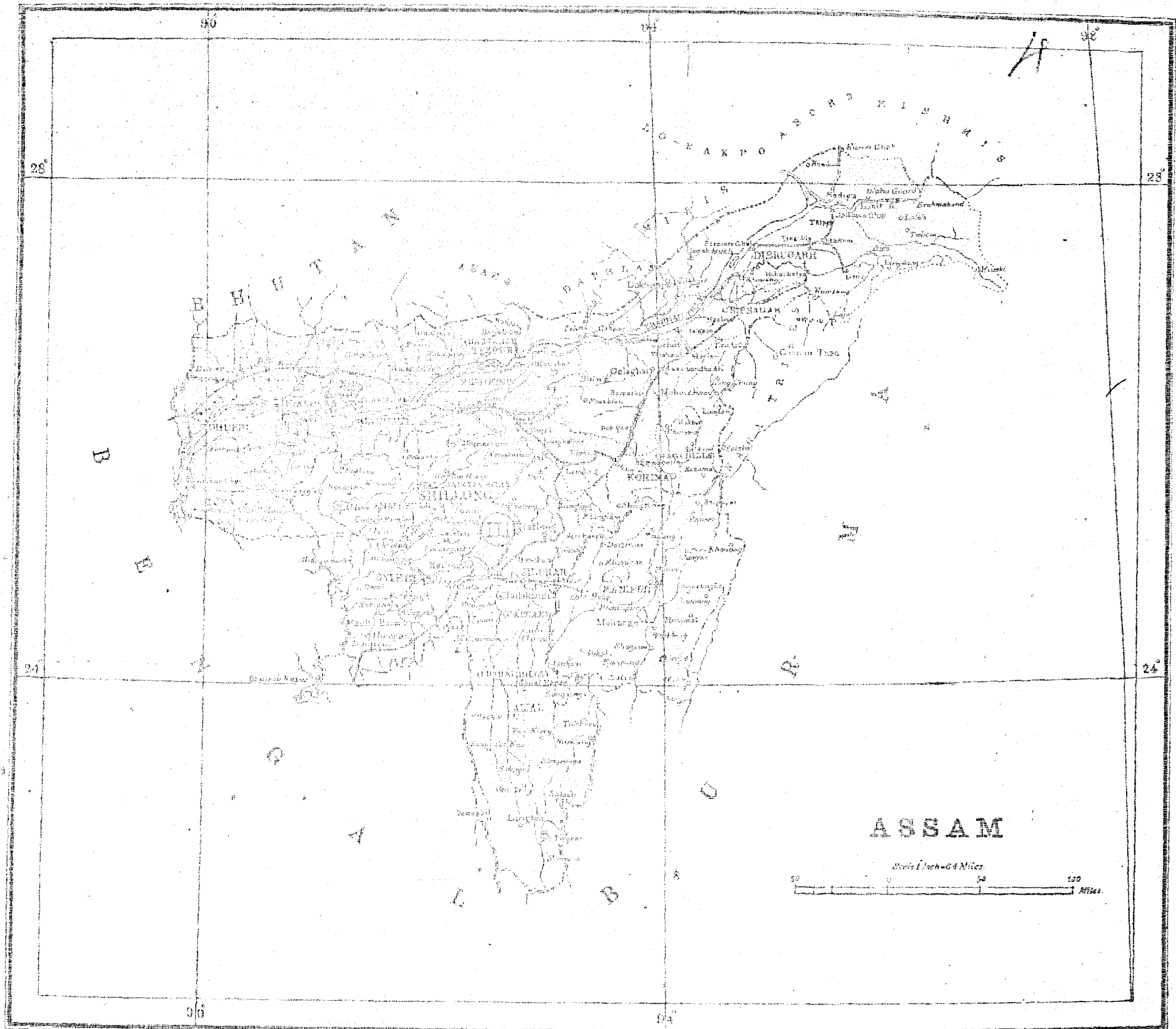
- (1) The Upper Assam block, comprising the districts of Lakhimpur, Sibsagar, Naga Hills and Tezpur subdivision of Darrang.
- (2) The Lower Assam block, comprising Mangaldai subdivision of Darrang and the districts of Nowgong, Kamrup, Goalpara and Garo Hills.
- (3) The Surma Valley block, which includes, in addition to the districts of Cachar and Sylhet, Khasi and Jaintia Hills, Lushai Hills and the State of Manipur.

A record of the trade of these three blocks by rail with one another and with other provinces is prepared in the Railway Audit offices from invoices of goods despatched. Through-booked trade carried partly by rail and partly by steamer is also recorded in the Railway offices and counted as if it were carried the whole way by rail. Similarly, statistics of the trade carried by steamers between Assam and other provinces are compiled from the invoices preserved in the offices of the Steamship Companies. The trade carried by steamer between Calcutta and the several blocks of Assam is registered separately.

All traffic by country boat between Assam and Calcutta is recorded by special agencies maintained by Calcutta Port Commissioners. The registering stations at Dhubri and Bhairab Bazar record all trade that enters or leaves the Brahmaputra and Surma Valleys by country boat.

The weights stated in the tables of this report represent net weight, that is to say, a reduction at a fixed conventional rate is made from the actual gross weight of the goods as recorded on the invoices by Railway or Steamer Companies. A list of the rates at which deduction is made appears in the appendix.

The value of goods despatched by rail and steamer is not recorded in the invoices and consequently average values have to be assigned to each article when the accounts are made up. These average rates are determined in a variety of ways. In case of certain articles values as calculated for Bengal are adopted for Assam. In the case of the great majority of articles of local produce or manufacture value-rates are calculated quarterly from reports of the prices ruling in the principal marts for each article. The value-rate for tea has been calculated on the average prices realised in Calcutta and London after making allowance for cost of shipment from a garden situated at an average distance from Calcutta.



REPORT 5

ON THE

TRADE CARRIED BY RAIL AND RIVER OF ASSAM

DURING THE YEAR

1911-1912.

This report deals with the Rail and River-borne Trade of Assam, under the instructions conveyed in Eastern Bengal and Assam Government memorandum No. 1890M., dated the 26th March 1912, forwarding a copy of letter No. 1889M. of the same date to the Director General of Commercial Intelligence.

2. The climatic conditions of the year under report were on the whole favourable for cultivation. Spring rainfall was generally plentiful. The summer rains were more copious than usual and were accompanied by floods which caused some damage to early rice, mustard, sugarcane, jute and cotton crops. Autumn and Winter rainfalls were not well distributed.

3. Taking the rates which ruled at important marts the average wholesale prices of the chief staples of local production per maund during the last two years were :—

The rise in the prices of jute and mustard was chiefly due to insufficient outturn. The price of tea rose because the demand abroad was greater.

4. The statistics of the trade of Assam have been compiled in the following tables :—

(a) *Tables I and II.*—Trade of each block of Assam with (i) other provinces, (ii) Calcutta, (iii) Eastern Bengal blocks, and (iv) the rest of Bengal.

(b) *Tables III and IV.*—Trade of each block of Assam with Calcutta and the rest of Bengal by river only.

(c) *Table V.*—Trade of the internal blocks of Assam with one another by rail. Trade carried partly by steamer is also included.

(d) *Tables VI and VII.*—Trade of each block of this province with Calcutta and the rest of Bengal in certain articles of provincial importance which are not exhibited separately in the preceding tables.

Statistics of rail-borne trade (including trade carried partly by rail and partly by steamer) can be obtained by subtracting the figures in Tables III and IV from those in I and II.

5. The total value of the trade of Assam with other provinces in the year under review was 1,858 lakhs of rupees, of which 581 lakhs represent imports and 1,277 lakhs represent exports. Sixty-four per cent. of the exports and about 73 per cent. of the imports of Assam go to and

come from Calcutta. Eastern Bengal blocks and the rest of Bengal received 35 and 0·4 and sent nearly 22 and 5 per cent., respectively, of our exports and imports. The trade with other provinces is insignificant.

6. The quantities and values of the principal articles imported into Assam are shown below in thousands of maunds and lakhs of rupees :—

Cotton twist and yarn.—Of the cotton twist and yarn imported, 56 per cent. by weight and 68 per cent. by value was foreign.

Cotton piece-goods.—Of the cotton piece-goods imported, 78 per cent. in value were manufactured in foreign countries and only 22 per cent. in India. The Surma Valley received the largest quantity.

Gram and pulse and wheat flour.—Of gram and pulse and wheat flour, the largest share in proportion to population was taken by the Upper Assam block to meet perhaps the requirements of the immigrant population.

Rice not in the husk.—The largest quantity of rice was imported by the Upper Assam block.

Iron and steel.—The Upper Assam block imported a larger quantity of machinery and cutlery, etc., than in the preceding year (153,496 maunds against 130,992 maunds).

Kerosine oil.—The imports decreased in quantity from 351,162 to 329,215 maunds. The decrease is due to the increasing out put of kerosine oil from the Digboi refinery in the Lakhimpur district.

Mustard oil.—The import trade of mustard oil contracted from 117,161 to 112,774 maunds. This is due to the greater outturn in the oil-mills in Assam. It is, however, instructive to note that Assam imported 112,774 maunds of mustard oil and 137,267 maunds of oil-cake, though it exported 454,145 maunds of mustard seed. There is a very good opening for large oil-mills in Assam as the markets would be close to their doors.

Salt.—The trade in salt expanded from 781,796 maunds to 929,799 maunds on account of increased demand. The local dealers owing to high prices allowed their stocks to run down in the previous year.

Betelnuts.—The total quantity of betelnuts received into Assam was 118,100 maunds. Eastern Bengal blocks alone contributed 81,713 maunds.

Sugar.—The import of unrefined sugar was 306,543 maunds and of refined sugar was 141,481 maunds. The export of refined sugar was only 144 maunds and of unrefined sugar only 17,378 maunds. These figures clearly indicate one direction in which the resources of Assam could be developed with greater advantage.

Tobacco.—Manufactured tobacco was 46 per cent. of the total value of the imported tobacco and the Lower Assam block was the receiver of the largest quantity of it.

Apparel.—The import trade of this commodity rose from 10,679 maunds to 17,647 maunds. The increase occurred in the Brahmaputra Valley.

Principal exports : Table II.

Tea is the most important article of export and its value represents about three-fourth of the total value of exports by rail and river. Of the total quantity exported, 1,886,769 maunds and 723,195 maunds went to Calcutta and Chittagong, respectively, for sale and shipment to foreign countries. The exports increased by 307,030 maunds. The expansion was due to better outturn and offer of higher prices.

Timber.—Next in importance to tea comes timber. Eastern Bengal blocks alone received 96·5 per cent. of the exports.

Jute.—There was no fluctuation of importance in the quantity exported. The Lower Assam block, as usual, was the largest exporter of jute.

Rice in the husk.—The export trade in rice fell from 2,612,924 maunds to 2,023,232 maunds. The depression is due to the bad harvest in the previous year.

Hides.—The Surma Valley block despatched the largest quantity of cattle hides to Calcutta and Dacca.

Cotton.—Exports of cotton were less by 40,794 maunds. The decrease was due to the failure of the crop.

Lac.—Almost all the lac produced in Assam was exported from the Lower Assam block to Calcutta. The quantity of exports fell by 7,649 maunds.

Mustard seed.—The export trade in mustard seeds fell in quantity by 372,035 maunds. The contraction was due to small outturn and to the much larger proportion of seed being crushed in the local oil-mills.

8. River borne trade amounted to 53·4 per cent. of the imports and 48·7 per cent. of the export of the total trade by rail and river. It seems therefore that waterways are, as they will probably always remain, the most important trade routes between Assam and other provinces. The principal articles of imports by river were apparel, manufactured cotton, medicinal preparations, gram and pulse, wheat flour, manufactured brass, wrought iron, mustard oil, salt and sugar. The chief articles of exports were fresh fruits and vegetables, jute, mustard seed and tea.

Internal trade : Table V.

9. The trade of each internal block of Assam with the rest in the year under report is given below in lakhs of maunds :—

The principal commodities of trade were coal and coke, rice, kerosine oil, mustard oil and betelnuts. Upper Assam received most largely oil cake, gram and pulse, rice, and betelnuts; Lower Assam kerosine oil, and coal and coke; Surma Valley coal. Upper Assam sent chiefly wood, kerosine oil, rice, paddy and coal to all other blocks and gur, silk and cotton to Lower Assam. The exports from Lower Assam consisted principally of ghi, mustard seed, mustard oil, manufactured brass, rice, fresh fruits and vegetables, oilcake and gram and pulse. The Surma Valley largely exported cotton, other provisions and betelnuts.

10. Tables VI and VII record statistics of some articles of local importance. The total value of the import trade in corrugated iron, galvanized iron, lead and tea chests was Rs. 15,83,228. The export trade of tea seed increased by 7,358 maunds, but that of lime and limestone and mats decreased by 21,340 maunds and 59,909 maunds, respectively: 4,413 maunds of dried fish against 30 maunds in the previous year were sent to Bengal and 654 maunds against 555 maunds were brought in from Calcutta. The potato trade showed an increase in exports of 25 per cent. and a decrease in imports of 45 per cent. Exports of oranges and cane remained practically the same as in the previous year.

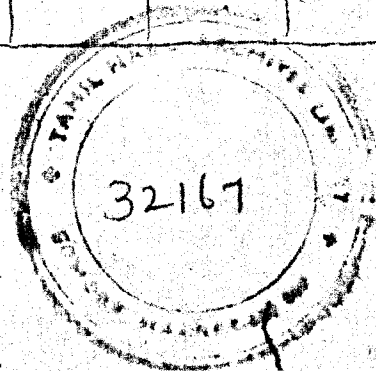
