SIR,

I have the honour to forward the Annual Returns of the Lunatic Asylums in the Presidency for the year 1912.

2. The point most worthy of note is the appreciation by the public of the relief afforded under Act IV of 1912. Five males and one female were admitted as "voluntary boarders" during the year; the particulars relative to them are separately shown in statements I and III to VII.

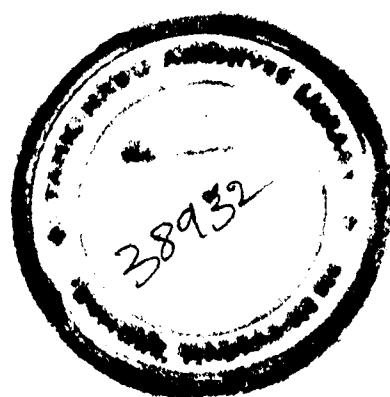
3. On the whole the figures display no characteristic differences among the admissions, from those of previous years, in regard to sex, age, class or occupation.

4. The number brought under relief continues steadily to increase, the daily average strength having been 772 as compared with 750 and 714 in the last two preceding years. The general health of the inmates was fair. One hundred and twenty-five, or 12.29 of the total treated, were discharged as cured and improved. A slight rise in the daily average sick at Madras is explained as due to the relatively larger number of new admissions that were treated in hospital for relief of acute symptoms. The percentage of deaths to daily average strength was 11.26, the high rate being due to the number of old and infirm insanes that died during the year.

5. The introduction of a new form for statement VI has afforded opportunity for enumerating afresh the asylum population according to the types of insanity exhibited by them at the commencement of the year. The statistics vary considerably from those shown as "remaining" in the last statement, owing to—(1) the distribution under new headings of cases formerly grouped together for want of such convenience; and (2) the fact that several cases, especially of mania, pass through or terminate in other types of insanity while under observation, but are retained in statistical statements as of the type under which they were admitted. In view of the latter reason a similar enumeration may advantageously be ordered at the beginning of each triennium.

6. The new statement VII allows for the possibility of both "predisposing" and "exciting" causes being ascertained in regard to any admission; the totals under these headings are not therefore to be checked by the number of admissions in the other statements.

7. *Finance.*—Statements VIII to X exhibit particulars thereof. Under "Receipts from paying patients" the decrease recorded against Madras is explained by the Superintendent as due to certain payments arriving after the close of the year. In the same asylum the expenditure was increased—(1) under "Establishment," owing to the appointment of an Assistant steward and three additional Indian male attendants, the increased rate of pay drawn by the present Civil Apothecary, and the half-pay allowance granted in January 1912 in connection with His



Majesty's Coronation; and (2) under "Superintendence," because of the increment of pay sanctioned to the Superintendent under G.O. No. 808, Public, dated 13th December 1911.

8. *Inspections, etc.*—Except at Vizagapatam in January the official visitors met regularly and their remarks were satisfactory. His Excellency the Governor visited the institutions at Madras and Vizagapatam. All three asylums were duly inspected by me. The service and stock registers in all have been properly maintained.
