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INTRODUCTORY AND PERSONNEL.

1. PUDUKKOTTAI is the third in importance of the Native States in direct political relations with the Government of Madras. It is bounded on the north and west by Trichinopoly, on the south by Ramanad and Madura, and on the east by Tanjore.

The area of the State is 1,178 square miles, and the population at the last Census, 4,11,878. Pudukkottai (population 26,852), the only town in the State is situated centrally 33 miles south of Trichinopoly. The State is agricultural and dependent on a somewhat precarious rainfall.

2. His Highness the Raja, whose full name is SRI BRIHADAMBA DAS RAJA SIR MARTHANDA BHAIKAVA TONDAIMAN BAHADUR, G. C. I. E., is eighth in descent from Raghunatha Tondaiman, the founder of the family. He is entitled to a salute of 11 guns. His Highness, who is 38 years of age and unmarried succeeded his grandfather Ramachandra Tondaiman in 1886 and was invested with powers of administration in 1894.

3. The Collector of Trichinopoly is ex-officio Political Agent for Pudukkottai. The administration of the State, under His Highness the Raja, is entrusted to a State Council of three members, Superintendent (the President of the Council), Dewan and Councillor. The various departments are constituted on the British India model.

4. His Highness the Raja returned to Pudukkottai from Europe in November, 1913. The improvement in His Highness' health enabled His Highness to stay in India and to devote his full attention to the affairs of the State till February 23, 1914, when he left for Europe in the interests of his health.

5. His Highness paid a State visit to His Excellency the Viceroy at Madras on November 25, 1913.

6. Mr. J. T. Gwynn, I. C. S., continued to be Superintendent throughout the fasli. M. R. Ry. Vijaya Raghunatha Durai Rajah Avergal, B. A., continued to be Dewan till May 11, 1914, when he went on combined leave; M. R. Ry. C. Rajagopala Pillai Avergal, B. A., B. L., Chief Judge and ex-officio Councillor acted as Dewan and M. R. Ry. G. Ganapathi Sastrial Avergal, B. A., B. L., Acting Chief Judge acted as ex-officio Councillor during the period.

7. Mr. L. E. Buckley, I. C. S., was Political Agent until December 29, 1913, when he was relieved by Mr. Lionel Vibert, I. C. S.

8. Receipts exceeded the Revised estimate by Rs. 1,03,232 and the Budget estimate by Rs. 1,49,587. The revenue under all heads was slightly higher than the estimate. The revenue of this year was less than that of the last year by Rs. 33,147. This apparent decrease was due to the fact that last years' revenue was swollen by three abnormal credits Rs. 50,405 representing the value of Public Works Store stock, Rs. 34,000 representing the value of the jewels of the late Chinnarammanai jaghire and Rs. 35,000 representing a payment of interest which should have been credited in the preceding fasli. There was thus a real rise of Rs. 86,000 in Fasli 1323. The principal factors in this rise were an increase of Rs. 37,000 under Land Revenue due mainly to the collection of a larger percentage of the demand both under arrears and current and a true increase of Rs. 20,000 under interest due to the larger sums invested and to the collection of some old outstanding arrears.

9. The expenditure fell below the Revised estimate by about a lakh and a half a fact which is accounted for chiefly by the failure of the Public Works department to carry out their programme. The expenditure for the fasli was higher than that of Fasli 1322 by Rs. 1,49,254 in spite of the absence of special expenditure incurred in the previous fasli under 'Silver Jubilee' and His Highness' tours and presents to other Native States and in spite of a decrease of Rs. 14,000 under 'Medical' owing to the late arrival of stores from England. The rise was mainly due (1) to the construction of a Railway saloon carriage and the purchase of a Motor Car for His Highness, (2) to the increase in His Highness' privy purse allowance (3) to the payment of arrears under Devastanam Paditharams and pay of vattam officials (4) to the more rapid progress on the construction of the New Palaces at Trichinopoly and Pudukkottai and (5) to an increase of Rs. 13,000 in the expenditure on Education.

10. Revenue again exceeded and expenditure fell short of the Budget estimates, and the fasli closed with a surplus of more than 2½ lakhs of rupees raising the State balances to 30½ lakhs of rupees. Of this sum Rs. 10,00,600 is invested in Government Promissory Notes and 8,50,000 in fixed deposits with the Bank of Madras.

11. The financial position of the State at the end of the fasli was satisfactory. In accordance with the advice of Mr. E.S. Hensman, late of the Accountant-General's office the expenditure of all departments undergoes audit in the Audit Branch of the Darbar office which is under the control of the Registrar of the Darbar office M. R. Ry. G. Krishnaswami Iyer Avergal, B.A. The great bulk of the expenditure is subjected to pre-audit. A local audit of the accounts maintained in the various offices was also undertaken by the Audit Branch during the fasli with wholesome results.

LEGISLATION.

12. The following Regulations were passed in the fasli under review :—

- (1) Regulation No. I of 1913—(Customary and compulsory labour Regulation amendment Regulation).
- (2) Regulation No. II of 1913—(Pudukkottai Regulation introducing certain acts of British Indian Legislature).
- (3) Regulation No. III of 1913—(The amending Regulation).
- (4) Regulation No. I of 1914—(Suits authorisation Regulation).
- (5) Regulation No. II of 1914—(Immunity from arrest Regulation.)

ADMINISTRATIVE DEPARTMENTS.

DEVASTANAM AND CHARITY.

13. In the year 1897 the lands and other endowments attached to temples, chattrams and other charitable institutions were taken over by the State and in lieu thereof money assignments granted, which were fixed according to their importance.

The department is controlled by the Dewan Peishkar.

Hitherto there was no exhaustive list maintained of the several religious and charitable institutions maintained either by State or by private parties or by both combined. In this fasli the task of compiling a complete list was begun, and according to the information so far gathered, it is found that there were 97 institutions in the management and control of the State in all respects and 105 in the management of private individuals. In addition, State "Katlais" were conducted in 25 temples situated in British territory, chiefly in the districts of Tanjore, Trichinopoly and Madura. It is hoped that a correct and complete list will be ready by the end of the Fasli 1324.

14. The total expenditure of the department was Rs. 1,55,931 against Rs. 1,36,583 in Fasli 1322; the increase being due mainly to the payment in this fasli of many old outstanding arrear items. Of this amount Rs. 15,702 represented the portion of the charges connected with the annual Dussara festival at Pudukkottai, debitable to this head and Rs. 9,894 the expenditure incurred in temples outside the limits of the State commonly known as "Pararashtram Katlais".

Receipts rose from Rs. 6,208 to Rs. 12,906, thanks chiefly to a more careful supervision of the transactions in the institutions.

15. *General remarks.*—Besides the expenditure shown above for the ordinary services of the Devasthanams a sum of Rs. 9,779 was spent in the fasli through the Public Works Department and other agencies on the repairs and improvements to the temples and cars of the gods. Some progress was made in the fasli with the important and difficult task of getting clear accounts for the income and expenditure of the various institutions but very much still remains to be done in this direction as is clear from the fact that Rs. 23,000 of the expenditure made in Fasli 1323 represents disbursements that should have been made in preceding faslis. The work of preparing registers to show the services due from landholders in the various villages to the local institutions has been undertaken but remains unfinished.

LAND REVENUE.

16. For administrative purposes the State is divided into three Taluks, Alangudi, Tirumayyam and Kolattur each under the control of a Tahsildar.

17. The agricultural season of Fasli 1323 was favourable. The rainfall was good and the yield especially of wet crops was above the average.

18. The price of staple food-grains was a little lower than in last fasli. Pasture and fodder were generally available and the condition of cattle good except for an outbreak of anthrax in parts of the Alangudi Taluk at the close of the fasli.

19. The extent and tenure of the lands in the State is shown below :—

953 acres came to ryotwari patta during the fasli as a result of assignments of waste land and transfer of Inam to Ain, 809 acres were relinquished or bought in for arrears. The lands which have thus gone out of patta are mostly worthless lands the relinquishment of which was not permitted prior to the recent settlement. Experiments are being tried to accelerate the assignment of the assessed lands which have not yet come to patta.

20. Exclusive of the revenue derived from sale and redemption price of house-sites in chetty nathams the current demand for the fasli stood at Rs. 9,11,518. The items comprised in this sum are shown below :—

Of this demand, Rs. 8,92,223 or 97.88 per cent was either collected in the fasli or written off or adjusted from overpayments made in the preceding fasli.

Besides this demand a revenue of Rs. 48,408 was realised in the fasli from the sale of house-sites and redemption price levied on agricultural lands converted into house-sites in Chetty nathams.

21. *Arrears.*—The correct arrear demand at the opening of the fasli under all items was Rs. 1,39,117. Of this demand, Rs. 1,02,161 was either collected in the fasli or adjusted from excess collections made in previous fasli or written off, leaving a balance of Rs. 36,956 under all items or 26.56 per cent.

22. *Loans.*—Rs. 2,578 were lent by the State for agricultural purposes, and Rs. 4,425 for house building during the fasli. Useful work was done in reducing the loan accounts to order and collecting considerable sums which had been lent and lost sight of in previous faslis.

23. *Land Revenue charges.*—The expenditure under Land Revenue was Rs. 1,20,724 or 12.46 per cent of the actual collections.

24. *General remarks.*—Collection work showed a marked improvement during the fasli. Though the total current demand was larger in Fasli 1323 than in Fasli 1322 the balance remaining uncollected at the end of Fasli 1323 was less than half that left outstanding in Fasli 1322. Again though the total arrear demand at the opening of Fasli 1323 was less by Rs. 30,000 than the amount outstanding at the commencement of Fasli 1322, the total arrear collections in Fasli 1322 were greater by Rs. 10,000.

M. R. Ry. J. Dharmaranga Raju Garu, Rao Bahadur, reverted to British service at the opening of the fasli and was succeeded as Dewan Peishkar by M. R. Ry. M. K. Venkatachariar Avergal, B.A., whose services were lent by the Madras Government. The Village and the Taluk Account forms were revised to suit local requirements. A revised scale of pay for the village officials was given effect to in Tirumayyam Taluk in the fasli, and arrangements were made to avoid the serious delay which was occurring in the disbursement of their pay.

The Darbar are glad to recognize the energy and intelligence which the Dewan Peishkar has showed in the administration of the Revenue department and the assistance which he has received from his chief subordinates. But in spite of

the improvement in collection work the methods of the Revenue department are even now extremely dilatory in dealing with other business and a great reform has still to be made in them.

SURVEY AND LAND RECORDS.

25. There was an outlay of Rs. 8,319 on Land Records during the year incurred chiefly in the endeavour to produce a satisfactory field measurement book which should show the sub-divisions effected at the Settlement on the field plans prepared at the Survey which preceded it. The work was carried out in the fasli on a simpler plan than was originally contemplated. The field measurement books of 71 villages were revised on the new lines in the fasli, of which 20 were ferroprinted and 11 handed over to the Revenue department.

26. A sum of Rs. 6,891 was spent on Inam Survey during the fasli. There are about 1,50,000 acres of Inam land in the State bearing a quit-rent of about Rs. 1,36,000. There are now in existence no trustworthy and intelligible records to show the position or the ownership of these lands. Real difficulty is consequently experienced in collecting the quit-rent and it is found necessary to carry out as quickly as possible a simple survey or new paimash to facilitate the work of the Revenue officials. A start was made in this fasli and field work was completed in 27 villages on the new lines and for 6 villages fair accounts were handed over to the Revenue department. Progress was disappointingly slow owing partly to difficulty in securing and training a suitable staff, and partly to the unusual demands on the Karnams' time made by the Revenue department in the effort to get rid of arrears in the Revenue work. It is hoped that better progress will be shown in Fasli 1324 in this very necessary work.

27. *Natham Survey and Settlement.*—The settlement of 2 more Chetty nathams and one Union were completed and progress was made with the preparation of fair records of the latter together with those of the 2 Unions and of 8 Chetty nathams settled during last fasli. The more rapid completion of the fair records of the nathams where settlement has been effected is desirable.

CHINNARANMANAI INAM SETTLEMENT.

28. Settlement notices were issued in 569 cases to the parties concerned as against 210 cases in last fasli. 757 cases still remain in which settlement notices have still to issue. Rs. 6,191 were spent upon the work in the fasli.

REVENUE SETTLEMENT.

29. The work was completed in the last fasli itself and hence nothing remained to be done in the fasli except a few corrections necessitated by the appeals put in by the ryots. The expenditure of the department was Rs. 1,334 during the fasli.

30. *General remarks.*—The operations connected with Survey and Settlement were during the fasli in charge of the Special Inam Settlement Officer M. R. Ry. B. V. Kameswara Iyer Avergal, M. A., and were carried on with care and intelligence, but a special effort is required to expedite the Inam Survey and the settlement of the Chinnaranmanai Inams as the completion of these works is urgently required to facilitate Revenue administration.

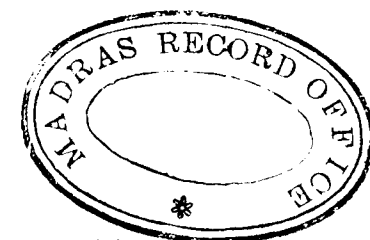
SALT AND ABKARI.

SALT.

31. By an agreement with the Government of Madras in 1887 the manufacture of salt is prohibited, the State receiving in compensation an annual payment of Rs. 38,000.

32. *Price and consumption of Salt.*—The price of salt ranged between 20.270 and 23.955 Madras seers per rupee. 43,006 maunds of salt manufactured in British salt factories were declared as purchased for sale in the State against 38,326 maunds in Fasli 1322. These figures cannot be taken as an index of the total consumption, as large quantities of salt declared as purchased for sale in other places are imported into the State through the agency of petty traders.

33. *Number and disposal of offences.*—There were no cases of illicit manufacture of earth-salt during the fasli.



ABKARI.

34. The arrangements for the manufacture and sale of country liquor, toddy, foreign liquor and intoxicating drugs are similar to those in Madras districts.

35. *Country liquor.*—Arrack was as usual manufactured in the State distillery at Pudukkottai which was worked in Fasli 1323 by a contractor who supplied liquor at a uniform rate of 14 annas a gallon of 30° U. P. The quantity manufactured in the fasli fell from 13,936½ gallons to 12,850 gallons and the aggregate cost from Rs. 15,039 to Rs. 11,993.

The still head duty was Rs. 4—6—0 per gallon of 30° U. P. as in the preceding fasli. The quantity of liquor issued for sale from the depot fell from 14,228 to 12,792 gallons, yielding a duty of Rs. 55,965 against Rs. 62,249 in Fasli 1322. Shop rents were higher and brought in Rs. 22,903 for 77 shops against Rs. 19,669 for 84 shops in Fasli 1322.

The total revenue was Rs. 90,861 against Rs. 95,288 or a decrease of 4.6 per cent.

36. *Toddy.*—The number of cocoanut trees and date palms tapped rose from 14,778 to 15,959 while the number of palmyrahs tapped fell from 2,308 to 1,291. The tree tax was levied at the rate of Rs. 4 for cocoanut and date palms and Rs. 2 for palmyrahs and yielded Rs. 34,137 against Rs. 34,000 in Fasli 1322. There was a reduction in the number of toddy shops from 174 to 152 during the fasli: but the income from vend rents rose from Rs. 59,056 to Rs. 69,479 (of which Rs. 1,891 represented old arrears). The total toddy revenue was Rs. 1,03,616 an increase of Rs. 2,846 or .03 per cent over the figures of Fasli 1322.

37. *Foreign liquor.*—One shop was licensed for the sale of foreign liquor and one for beer which together yielded Rs. 2,050 as against Rs. 2,260 in Fasli 1322.

38. *Intoxicating drugs.*—The receipts from the single shop licensed for the sale of opium and ganja rose from Rs. 3,976 to Rs. 4,976.

39. *Number and disposals of offences.*—The number of offences decreased from 89 to 77, of which 67 were disposed of by departmental officers, 8 went before Magistrates and 2 were pending at the close of the fasli.

40. *Financial.*—The total revenue of the department under all heads aggregated to Rs. 2,41,875 compared with Rs. 2,41,346 in Fasli 1322. 99.9 per cent of the demand was collected during the fasli against 99 per cent in last fasli. The work of collection was simplified by requiring the lessees to pay their dues direct into the nearest Treasury without the intervention of the subordinate Revenue staff.

The cost of the department (including Salt preventive staff) was Rs. 31,225 against Rs. 33,891 in Fasli 1322.

41. *General remarks.*—The management of the department by the Salt Superintendent M. R. Ry. M. S. Gopalaswami Iyer Avl., continued to be satisfactory.

STAMPS.

42. The Stamp Department was under the charge of the Registrar of Assurances, the ex-officio Superintendent of Stamps.

43. Stamps to the number of 3,45,362 and to the value of Rs. 1,49,537 were manufactured as against 2,78,752 to the value of Rs. 2,27,075 in Fasli 1322. The issues to the Treasury were 4,19,691 stamps valued at Rs. 2,61,196.

44. *Financial.*—Receipts from Stamps rose from Rs. 2,04,807 to Rs. 2,07,929 or by 1.52 per cent.

The expenditure rose from Rs. 5,450 to Rs. 6,906; the net income under this head was therefore Rs. 2,01,023 as against Rs. 1,99,357 in Fasli 1322.

FOREST AND PLANTATIONS.

45. In addition to Reserves and Plantations, the Forest Department managed the valuable Stone quarries of the State which are worked on a system of licenses. The area under "Forest" was approximately 120 square miles including 7 game preserves covering an area of 55 square miles. The forest Reserves consist of several jungles containing no timber trees of value, but yielding considerable quantities of fire-wood, green leaves for manuring purposes and other minor produce. In addition, there were plantations consisting of casuarina trees, mangoes and other fruit bearing trees.

The executive staff consisted of a Forest Officer, two Rangers, three Foresters and a number of guards and watchers.

46. *Forest Operations.*—229 acres of land were prepared for casuarina, cashew and palmyrah topes and 93,960 seedlings were planted most of which are reported to be thriving. The process of reforestation went on with fair success in 9 scrub jungles.

47. *Forest Offences.*—The number of offences for disposal was 1344, against 1142 in Fasli 1322. 1236 cases were disposed of departmentally. 17 cases were sent for trial before Magistrates and 91 cases were pending at the end of the fasli. The compounding fees, etc., collected amounted to Rs. 4553.

48. *Financial.*—The gross receipts amounted to Rs. 68,498 and the gross expenditure to Rs. 29,966 the net revenue being Rs. 38,532 as against Rs. 38,308 in Fasli 1322.

49. *General remarks.*—The management of the department continued to be satisfactory under the care of the Forest Officer M. R. Ry. S. Venkataramiah Avergal.

REGISTRATION.

50. The number of Registry offices was 12 as in the preceding fasli. On an average the jurisdiction of each Registry office extended over 71 square miles of cultivable area and a population of 34,323 as in the preceding fasli.

51. *Number and value of Registrations.*—The number of registrations relating to immovable property fell from 16,905 to 15,744, a decrease of 6.86 per cent, while the number of registrations relating to movable property fell from 1333 to 1279 a decrease of 4.05 per cent. The aggregate value of documents registered was Rs. 49,32,927 against Rs. 54,13,635, a decrease of 8.88 per cent.

52. *Time taken to register.*—99.99 per cent of the documents brought for registration were registered on the day of presentation against 99.23 per cent in the previous fasli. The steady improvement in the promptitude of registration is satisfactory.

53. *Financial.*—The receipts of the department fell from Rs. 35,926 to Rs. 34,476 while the expenditure rose from Rs. 20,734 to Rs. 22,521.

54. *General remarks.*—The work of the department which was under the control of M. R. Ry. K. S. Dorai Rajah Avergal, B.A., continued to be satisfactory.

LAW AND JUSTICE.

55. The administration of Criminal and Civil justice is conducted and the various Courts are constituted on the British India model. The Chief Court exercises the powers of a High Court both in Criminal and Civil jurisdiction, except that in Civil suits a Second Appeal on points of law lies to a Special Court of two Judges who sit periodically to advise His Highness the Raja in their disposal. Subordinate to the Chief Court, for Criminal justice, there were 21 Magistrates Courts as against 20 in the previous fasli, exercising first, second and third class powers; and for Civil justice, Registrar, Chief Court, and 11 Sub-Registrars exercising the powers of judges of small causes. The increase in the number of Magistrates' Courts was due to the creation of a bench with five members for the Town of Pudukkottai with the Town Sub-Magistrate as its ex-officio president.

56. The Chief Court consists of a Chief Judge and two Puisne Judges. The Chief Judge, M. R. Ry. C. Rajagopala Pillai Avergal, B.A., B.L., acted as Dewan from May 12, 1914, to the end of the fasli and during his absence M. R. Ry. G. Ganapathi Sastri Avergal, B.A., B.L., Senior Puisne Judge acted as Chief Judge. M. R. Ry. A. Padmanabha Sastri Avergal, B.A., M.L., Junior Puisne Judge, was on privilege leave from November 1, 1913, to December 7, 1913, and M. R. Ry. K. Swaminatha Iyer Avergal, M.A., B.L., State Vakil, acted for him from November 19, 1913, to December 7, 1913.

In accordance with the provisions of Regulation I of 1910, M. R. Ry. J. Krishna Row Avergal, Bar-at-law and Khan Bahadur Sayyed Tajuddin Sahib Bahadur were appointed Special Judges for the disposal of Second Appeals for a period of one month during the vacation of the Chief Court.

CRIMINAL JUSTICE.

ORIGINAL JURISDICTION.

57. *Court of Sessions.*—Of the 16 cases committed to Sessions 9 ended in conviction.

58. *Magistrates' Courts.*—Of the 21 Magistrates including the Town Bench, 3 (including the Chief Magistrate) exercised the powers of the first class, 9 of the second class and nine of the third class.

The total number of cases for disposal was 4,079, 404 cases less than in Fasli 1322. Of these, 2,082 were cases under the Indian Penal Code compared with 1919 in the preceding fasli. Both the cognizable and non-cognizable offences under the Indian Penal Code brought to Court during the fasli showed an increase; while there was a decrease of offences under other laws.

3,938 cases or 96.54 per cent were disposed of as against 4,309 cases or 96.12 per cent in the previous fasli, leaving a balance of 141 cases pending at the end of the fasli. The average duration of cases decided by Magistrates was 71 days against 1.59 in the previous fasli.

59. *Extradition*.—8 persons were extradited by the Political Agent for trial in the State Courts and 15 by the Darbar for trial in British Courts.

APPELLATE JURISDICTION.

60. There were 17 appeals filed on the Original side of the Chief Court. The decision of the Lower Court was confirmed in 7 cases, modified in one case, reversed in 8 cases and application rejected in one case.

On the appellate side, there were 8 appeals of which the original decision was confirmed in 6 cases, modified in one case and reversed in one case. Criminal revision petitions were 51 including 4 of the previous fasli, of which 4 were pending at the end of the fasli.

In the Court of the Chief Magistrate there were 124 appeals for disposal including 23 of the past fasli, of which 121 were disposed of leaving a balance of 3 cases. In 68 cases the original decision was confirmed, in 18 cases modified and in 34 cases reversed while one case was remanded for further enquiry.

Of the 76 revision petitions including 4 of the previous fasli, 75 were disposed of leaving a balance of one petition at the close of the fasli.

61. *General remarks*.—In point of promptitude there was a very satisfactory improvement in the work of the Magisterial Courts during the fasli. At the close of Fasli 1322, 20 cases had been pending between 3 and 6 months, 23 between 6 and 12 and 2 cases above one year. At the close of Fasli 1323, only 4 cases had been pending over 3 months and none over 6 months. This result was due not to a feverish effort of the Magistrates to atone for past neglect in the last month of the fasli but to the Chief Magistrate's continuous scrutiny throughout the year and to the readiness of the subordinate Magistrates to act up to his instructions.

CIVIL JUSTICE.

62. The number of Courts was 12, the Chief Court with its Registrar and 11 Small Cause Courts.

ORIGINAL JURISDICTION.

63. The number of suits instituted rose from 7,451 to 8,285. Including arrears and re-admissions the total number of suits for disposal was 9,463 against 8,645 in Fasli 1322. 8,522 suits were disposed of leaving a balance of 941 pending at the close of the fasli, against 1,016 suits at the end of the preceding fasli.

64. *Regular suits*.—Regular suits are tried by the Chief Court only. The number of regular suits for disposal was 2,913 of which 2,299 were disposed of leaving a balance of 614 suits at the end of the fasli as against a balance of 688 at the end of the previous fasli out of a total of 2,788 suits. 8 suits were pending over one year and 404 above 3 months and under one year, the figures for the previous fasli being 38 and 425 respectively. The average duration of contested suits fell from 236 to 219 days.

65. *Small Cause suits*. (i) *Judges' file*.—The number of suits for disposal was 2,129, of which 1,880 suits were disposed of leaving a balance of 249. The percentage of disposal was 88.30 as against 88.00 in the previous fasli. The average duration of contested suits was 95 days.

(ii) *Registrar's file*.—The number of suits for disposal rose from 1,381 to 1,503 of which 1,457 suits or 96.93 per cent were disposed of leaving a balance of 46 suits. The average duration of contested suits fell from 49 to 39 days.

(iii) *Rural Small Cause Judges' (Sub-Registrars') files*.—The number of suits for disposal was 2,918, an increase of 207, of which 2,886 or 98.90 per cent was disposed of leaving a balance of 32 suits as against 83 pending at the close of Fasli 1322.

APPELLATE JURISDICTION.

66. The number of regular appeals for disposal rose from 298 to 321, of which 211 were disposed of leaving a balance of 110 as against 108 of the past fasli. The average duration of appeals rose from 211 to 233 days.

67. *Second Appeals*.—The number of Second Appeals including the balance of the previous fasli was 77: out of these 72 were posted for hearing in the fasli. 55 were disposed of leaving a pendency of 22 at the end of the fasli. The decision of the 1st Appellate Court was upheld in 39 cases, modified in 4 and reversed in 7. The total value involved was Rupees 1,26,276-11-0 as against Rs. 27,177-3-1 of the previous fasli.

68. *General remarks*.—Litigation increased in the fasli under review but the work of the Courts well kept pace with the incoming business. Of the 2,225 regular suits filed or readmitted during the fasli, 1,275 were instituted by Nattukottai Chetties. Of these, 742 were directed against agriculturists.

PRISONS.

69. The Central Jail is located in Pudukkottai.

At the beginning of the fasli there were 77 prisoners (including lunatics) in confinement. Admissions were 256 against 251 in Fasli 1322 and discharges 275, leaving 58 in confinement at the end of the fasli. Of these 58, 49 were convicts, 5 under trial prisoners, one civil debtor and 3 lunatics.

The average daily population of the Central Jail fell from 87.01 to 69.27 and the accommodation for the prisoners was ample. There were two deaths during the fasli one from fever and one from old age. One civil debtor and one remand prisoner had to be released as they were certified by the Chief Medical Officer to be in a dangerous state of health. But there were no other cases of serious illness though the daily average of sick in the Jail rose from .84 to 1.11 and the health of the Jail population was on the whole good. A Sub-Assistant Surgeon was in direct charge of the health of the prisoners and the Jail was besides constantly visited by the Chief Medical Officer.

The number of Jail offences declined from 10 to 2 during the fasli. One life convict escaped.

70. *Industries*.—In addition to the work in the Jail garden, prisoners were employed in oil pressing, weaving and aluminium metal work. Juvenile convicts were given instructions in useful trades in the workshop apart from the ordinary convicts. The cultivation of the Jail garden was very well done.

71. *Financial*.—Under Jail industries the expenditure was Rs. 10,539 and the receipts Rs. 11,349 leaving a net profit of Rs. 810 as against a net profit of Rs. 1,786 in the preceding fasli. Other expenditure on the Central Jail amounted to Rs. 6,000 or Rs. 87 per head of the average population. Dieting charges were as. 2 per head.

72. *General remarks*.—The management and discipline of the Central Jail which was under the charge of M. R. Ry. S. Narayanasawmi Iyer Avl., M. A., was satisfactory.

Besides the Central Jail there were 7 small Sub-Jails in the State under the control of the Chief Magistrate. In these there were 2 prisoners at the opening

of the fasli and 10 at its close the average daily population being 6.9. The health of the Sub-Jail population was good. The expenditure on the Sub-Jails was Rs. 1,010.

POLICE.

73. The District Superintendent of Police, Trichinopoly, is ex-officio Superintendent of the State Police. Under him are a Deputy Superintendent, 3 Inspectors, 10 Sub-Inspectors and 230 Head Constables and Constables. At the end of the fasli the force was 37 short of its full complement.

Mr. T. W. Blackstone was Superintendent of Police throughout the fasli. 7 out of the 8 investigating centres and 11 of the 14 outposts besides the office and stores, were inspected by him.

74. *Crime*.—There was a decrease in the number of cases reported during the fasli from 2,480 to 2,072. This is due to a decrease in the number of cases under special laws. The number of cases under the Indian Penal Code, rose from 433 to 476. Of these cases 196 were detected.

75. *Grave crime*.—5 cases of murder, 10 of dacoity, 7 of robbery, and 87 of house-breaking were reported. All the murder cases remained undetected. Of the dacoity cases 6 remained undetected, one was reported false and 3 were thrown-out by the Courts, no case resulting in conviction. Of the robbery cases one ended in conviction, one was thrown-out by the Court and 5 remained undetected. 16 of the house-breaking cases were detected. 134 grave thefts were reported in the fasli as against 99 in Fasli 1322. The number in Fasli 1322 was however abnormally low and the rise in Fasli 1323 merely represents a return to the normal.

76. *Preventive measures*.—10 cases were charged under the security sections of the Criminal Procedure Code and including those pending at the end of the last fasli, 15 cases involving 21 persons were tried during the fasli. In 6 cases involving 6 persons the parties were bound over to be of good behaviour, 4 cases involving 10 persons were withdrawn and in 3 cases involving 3 persons the Magistrate declined to ask for security. A vigorous use of the preventive sections has undoubtedly had in the past considerable effect in restraining the criminal classes in the State and action should be taken promptly under them as soon as need arises.

77. *Conduct of the Force*.—The conduct of the force was on the whole good. There were few cases of grave misconduct in the whole force and none in the higher ranks. The number of serious punishments was much smaller than in previous faslis, though the number of petty punishments have increased. Rewards for good work to the amount of Rs. 156 were distributed to members of the force and to outsiders who assisted them.

78. *General remarks*.—The management of the force by the Superintendent Mr. T. W. Blackstone and the Deputy Superintendent, M. R. Ry. A. G. Krishnaswami Iyer Avergal, continued to be satisfactory. The co-operation of the State Police with the British Police of the neighbouring districts was effective. The post of prosecuting Sub-Inspector was added to the Cadre during the fasli. Difficulty continued to be felt in securing a sufficient number of suitable recruits to keep the force up to strength. The scale of pay of the Constables was revised so as to attract men for the force, but as the new scale came into effect only towards the close of the fasli, there was no sufficient time to judge of the effects of the improvement in the scale of pay of the force.

EDUCATION.

79. The Educational institutions under direct State management consisted of a Second grade College, two Lower secondary, 3 Special and 164 Primary schools. The schools under private management were 1 Lower Secondary and 124 Primary schools which received grants-in-aid from the State and 66 unaided schools. Elementary Education is free throughout the State except in the Capital.

GENERAL EDUCATION.

80. *Secondary schools*.—The strength of the Secondary school at Tirumayyam at the close of the fasli rose from 128 to 138 and the average attendance from 106 to 115 while in Alangudi school, the strength at the close of the fasli fell from 171 to 126 and the average attendance from 120 to 83.

The working of the Lutheran Mission school in Pudukkottai was satisfactory.

81. *Primary schools*.—The number of State schools increased from 145 to 164 while the number of aided schools decreased from 145 to 124 and of unaided schools from 74 to 66.

Male Education.—The number of boys receiving instruction in State and aided schools was 10,120 against 11,526 in last fasli. Adding 1,650 boys in unaided schools, the total number of boys under instruction was 11,770 against 13,155 in Fasli 1322. Taking the school-going population at 15 per cent of the total male population the percentage of boys actually attending school was 39.90.

Female Education.—There were 18 schools set apart exclusively for the education of girls of which 15 were State and 3 aided schools. 8 of the State schools were reserved for the Mohammedan girls. The total number of girls under instruction in all schools was 1,424 against 1,292 in Fasli 1322. Taking the school-going female population at 15 per cent of the total female population the percentage of girls actually under instruction was 4.41 against 4 in last fasli.

82. *Accommodation*.—The general condition of the school houses was far from being satisfactory. The progress made towards providing accommodation to schools was disappointingly slow. Funds have been provided for 3 faslis for the construction of pucca school houses but there has been regrettable delay in construction.

83. *Teaching staff*.—There were 155 trained teachers and 141 teachers holding permanent or temporary licenses besides 4 drawing-masters and 2 drill instructors.

Besides there were 113 teachers who had neither licenses nor teachers' certificates. 73 licenses were granted in the year to the teachers, 15 permanent and 58 temporary for varying periods. 38 teachers were under instruction in the Training School at the end of the fasli. The working of the Training school is reported to be unsatisfactory but efforts were made at the close of the fasli to improve the tone and its working. There were 15 teachers' associations with a membership of 373. Most of these associations met regularly once a month and subjects of educational interest and importance were discussed at their sittings.

84. *Special institutions*.—10 Stipendiary students were under instruction in the Weaving school, at the end of the fasli. The Vani Vilasa Veda Sastra Patasala had 28 students on the rolls at the end of the fasli.

85. *Financial*.—The expenditure under all heads exclusive of College was Rs. 58,565 against Rs. 49,334 in last fasli.

86. *General remarks*.—The department was in charge of M. R. Ry. R. Ramachandra Row, Inspector of Schools, till February 26, 1914, when he was relieved by M. R. Ry. B. V. Sankarakamesvara Iyer Avergal, B. A.

The improvement of education in a State so rural as Pudukkottai is necessarily a slow and difficult task requiring thought and patience on the part of the educational officers who have to face it.

COLLEGE.

87. The staff consisted of the Principal, 2 Lecturers, 8 Assistants, 6 Teachers, one tutor and 2 Pandits besides Drawing-Masters and Gymnastic Instructors.

The number of pupils on the rolls on the last day of the fasli was 663 (Brahmins 538, non-Brahmins 117, Christians 3 and Mohammedans 5), an increase of 57 over the figures of Fasli 1322. The average strength on the rolls increased from 646.8 to 713 and the average daily attendance from 615 to 665.

In the College classes, pupils are taught only in Group III (Ancient History, Modern History and Logic or Sanskrit). 18 students appeared for the Intermediate examination of whom 7 came off successful, as against 9 out of 20 in last fasli. The percentage of passes was 39 as against 38 the average of the Presidency. In the High School classes students are taught under the Secondary School Leaving Certificate scheme of the University of Madras. 54 students appeared for the Secondary School Leaving Certificate examination of whom 35 were declared eligible for admission to the University Course. The percentage of marks obtained compares favorably with that of the previous year, the school average being above the Presidency average in almost all the subjects.

The expenditure of the College was Rs. 23,322 (of which Rs. 18,248 was recovered as fees against Rs. 13,237 in the previous fasli), the net expenditure thus showing a decrease of Rs. 1,170.

88. *General remarks.*—The institution was under the management of M. R. Ry. S. T. Ramachandra Sastri Avl., B. A., Principal. The conduct and health of the students was satisfactory throughout the year. Under encouragement and assistance from the staff they made full use of the fine recreation grounds attached to the College.

HEALTH.

VITAL STATISTICS.

89. Public health was on the whole good in Fasli 1323. There were sporadic outbreaks of cholera and small-pox in places but no serious mortality. No moderately accurate statistics of birth and deaths are yet available except for Pudukkottai Town where the birthrate was 34.04 and the deathrate 26.92 per mille.

MEDICAL.

90. The Medical institutions in the State are a Town Hospital with 50 beds, a Women and Children's Dispensary and 9 Rural Dispensaries. The establishment consists of a Chief Medical Officer, a Lady Apothecary, 15 Sub-Assistant Surgeons, 1 Native Vaidyan, 20 Compounders and 13 Midwives.

91. *Town Hospital.*—The number of in-patients rose from 605 to 793, and the daily attendance from 30.5 to 43.6. 39,154 out-patients were treated, and 1,084 surgical operations performed, the figures for the preceding fasli being 37,874 and 1,163 respectively. The expenditure amounted to Rs. 16,985 against Rs. 23,454 in Fasli 1322.

92. *Dispensary for Women and Children.*—The staff consists of a Lady Apothecary, 2 Midwives and 2 compounders. The number of patients treated rose from 19,277 to 22,120 and the daily average from 106.7 to 118.1 which shows the continued popularity of the institution.

93. *Rural Dispensaries.*—The number of patients treated rose from 56,689 to 63,008.

94. *Financial.*—The total expenditure of the department fell from Rs. 41,646 to Rs. 27,401, the decrease being due mainly to the non-arrival within the fasli of the medical stores ordered from England.

95. *General remarks.*—The number of beds in the Town Hospital was found to be insufficient and sanction has been accorded for the construction of a ward with 12 more beds for low caste people. The new Dispensary building at Annavasal was completed and the new Women and Children's Hospital in the Town was nearing completion at the end of the fasli. From August 13, 1913, the department was under the control of M.R. Ry. T. Sundara Reddi Garu., F.R.C.S.I., L.R.C.P. & S. (Edin.) and L. F. P. S. (Glas.), who has worked in the Town Hospital with untiring energy and good success.

VACCINATION.

96. Vaccination is now compulsory throughout the State. The staff consists of one Inspector, one Dy. Inspector and 10 vaccinators.

Vaccination in the town is direct from the calf to the arm. For work outside the town, Lanoline paste to the extent of 20,003 grains were prepared in the Vaccine Depot against 26,905 grains in the preceding fasli.

97. *Number of cases vaccinated.*—Including 151 re-vaccinations 10,573 cases were vaccinated against 10,720 in the previous fasli showing a decrease of 147 cases. 96.35 per cent of the vaccinations are reported to have been successful. Of the 1,441 vaccinations performed on infants under one year of age, all were reported successful.

98. *Financial.*—The cost of the department was Rs. 3,422 as against Rs. 3,004 in the previous fasli. The average cost of each successful vaccination was 5 annas 3 pies as against 4 annas 7 pies in the previous fasli.

99. *General remarks.*—The result of the fasli's work was disappointing and the staff must show more energy in visiting the remotest villages.

THE MUNICIPALITY AND TOWN CONSERVANCY.

100. The conservancy of the Town of Pudukkottai was controlled by the Municipal Council which was called into existence on April 1, 1912.

101. *The constitution of the Municipal Council.*—The Municipal Council consists of a paid Chairman and 8 members, 4 official and 4 non-official, of whom one is elected.

The number of meetings held during the year was 29; of which 8 meetings were adjourned for want of quorum.

The general health of the town was satisfactory and the sanitary arrangements on the whole adequate while the upkeep of the roads and streets received due attention.

102. *Town water-supply scheme.*—The town water-works under the management of the Municipal Council, gave an uninterrupted supply of water to the main part of the town, but the filtering system attached to the water-works still proved unsatisfactory and arrangements are being made to install a new set of filters.

103. *Financial*.—Including the grant of Rs. 19,184 from the State Funds, the receipts from all heads of Municipal Revenue aggregated to Rs. 64,154 including the opening balance of Rs. 5,003 and the expenditure amounted to Rs. 47,542, leaving a surplus of Rs. 16,612 to the credit of the Municipal Fund. The large surplus is due mainly to savings under Sanitary establishment charges and the non-execution of certain works. The incidence of taxation per head of population was as. 7 ps. 7 as in the previous fasli.

104. *General remarks*.—M. R. Ry. B. V. Sankarakameswara Iyer Avergal, B.A., vacated the office of Chairman of the Municipality during the fasli and was succeeded by M. R. Ry. P. R. Ramachandra Row Avergal, B.A. The first elected non-official member M. R. Ry. A. Mahalinga Iyer Avergal, B.A., took his seat on the Council during the fasli. Under the commands of His Highness a second vacancy is to be thrown open to election.

The Council continued to work without friction. The Darbar are glad to observe a real improvement in the work of collection of the Municipal taxes. There is however room for a further advance in the same direction.

VILLAGE CONSERVANCY.

105. The conservancy of the villages outside the town except those for which there are Union Panchayats is controlled by the Revenue department. In a few of the large villages a small staff is maintained for scavenging and lighting purposes. Important villages are inspected from time to time by the Chief Medical Officer and on his recommendations and by those of other touring officers minor sanitary improvements are from time to time carried out. The expenditure of the fasli, which included Rs. 979 spent on the upkeep of village roads amounted to Rs. 11,932 compared with Rs. 7,691 in Fasli 1322.

The working of the five union Panchayats at Tirumayyam, Ponnamaravathi, Arimalam, Karambakkudi and Annavasal, was on the whole satisfactory.

SCIENTIFIC AND OTHER MINOR DEPARTMENTS.

AGRICULTURE.

106. The demonstration farm which consists of 7 acres of dry and 4 acres of wet lands is situated near the Weekly Market and has attracted many ryots on fair days.

Two Coimbatore trained agriculturists were at work during the fasli in managing the farm and touring in the villages explaining and giving practical instruction.

The efforts of these officers are chiefly directed to the introduction of single seedling planting of paddy and the use of green manure crops and something has been done to acquaint the ryots in their villages with the possibility of these innovations though few have yet been induced to risk experiments on their own lands. But there is a tendency on the part of the ryots to pay more heed to the suggestions of the Instructors and the Darbar expect to see the use of green manure crops and the practice of single planting widely spread in the State within a few years. Facilities are also given to the more venturesome ryots for obtaining new seeds and improved ploughs.

THE SRI MARTHANDA INDUSTRIAL, AGRICULTURAL AND EDUCATIONAL EXHIBITION.

107. In former years there used to be held at the Capital during the Dussara an annual Exhibition known as the Sri Saraswathi Exhibition which was purely

Educational in its object. With a view to stimulate in the people a desire for fresh knowledge regarding things agricultural and industrial, the Darbar decided in 1911 to enlarge the scope of the Exhibition by adding to it separate sections for Fine arts, Agriculture, and Industries. The first enlarged Exhibition was held at the Capital in December, 1911, under the new designation of "The Sri Marthanda Industrial, Agricultural and Educational Exhibition". The Exhibition of this year was held in the Town Hall and was opened on December 19, 1913. The exhibits were varied and interesting. Objects of art, agricultural and industrial products both foreign and local and agricultural implements and industrial machines were on show. Besides, there were lectures, demonstrations, conferences and competitions organised to interest and amuse the people of the State.

The Exhibition was kept open for a month. The closing ceremony took place on the January 23, 1914, when His Highness the Raja was pleased to preside and give away the prizes to the successful exhibitors and competitors.

VETERINARY HOSPITAL.

108. The Hospital, which has accommodation for 4 horses and 10 cattle was under the control of a duly qualified Assistant.

The number of in-patients treated decreased from 82 to 67 while that of out-patients rose from 660 to 1024, the daily average being 36.63 against 32.22 in Fasli 1322. The number of operations performed rose from 60 to 120 including 5 castrations.

The services of the Assistant were used by the people both of the Town and rural parts.

MUSEUM.

109. The institution was visited by 34,793 persons against 36,311 in Fasli 1322. A number of interesting exhibits were added to the collection.

CO-OPERATIVE SOCIETIES.

110. The Dewan Peishkar was ex-officio Registrar of Co-operative Credit Societies. During the latter part of the fasli he was allowed a Special Assistant for his ordinary duties to enable him to pay more attention to fostering and watching the growth of the co-operative movement throughout the State. Six new societies were started, and with the five already in existence, there were 11 societies at work at the end of the fasli. The necessary capital was provided mainly by State loans at reasonable rates of interest.

PRESS AND STATIONERY.

111. The Press and the Stationery departments were amalgamated during the fasli and placed in charge of a full timed officer.

112. The value of work turned out by the State Press was Rs. 6,681 against Rs. 7,286 in Fasli 1322. The apparent difference is mainly due to the raising of the standard of the outturn in all sections. The work of the Press was satisfactory.

113. The value of the stock on hand and the purchases made during the fasli was Rs. 20,277 and the issues amounted to Rs. 11,156.

ARCHÆOLOGICAL.

114. The work of deciphering and copying the inscriptions in running hand progressed to some extent during the fasli. 35 inscriptions were taken and copied.

The thanks of the Darbar are due to M. R. Ry. Dewan Bahadur L. D. Swamikkannu Pillai Avergal, M. A., L. L. B., for having fixed the dates of certain inscriptions during his tour to this place.

PUBLIC WORKS.

115. For executive purposes the Public Works Department was organised in three divisions, one for Roads and two for Irrigation and Buildings. The town was constituted temporarily as a separate division chiefly for the New Palace which is now under construction. The executive staff consisted of an Engineer, an Assistant Engineer, two Divisional and nine Sub-divisional officers.

In addition a Minor Irrigation establishment consisting of one Overseer, one Sub-overseer and six maistries worked under the control of the Dewan Peishkar.

116. The total expenditure under Public Works rose from Rs. 2,66,412 to Rs. 3,23,120 as shown in the following table in which the figures of Faslis 1323 and 1322 are compared.

IRRIGATION.

117. The expenditure of the Public Works Department fell from Rs. 51,028 to Rs. 37,223 which represents 44.43 per cent of the Budget estimate.

Minor Irrigation.

118. The expenditure on the repairs and improvements to minor tanks irrigating 50 acres and less rose from Rs. 16,740 to Rs. 22,216 or 68.8 per cent of the Budget estimate. The operations were under the control of the Dewan Peishkar, M. R. Ry. M. K. Venkatachariar Avergal, B. A.

119. The complete failure of the Public Works Department to spend an adequate sum on Irrigation is very regrettable as the State tanks are very numerous and important and their condition is far from satisfactory. The Divisional officer most to blame in the matter has since resigned.

The experiment of strengthening the Minor Irrigation staff and transferring a main share of the Irrigation work to the Dewan Peishkar is now being tried.

CIVIL BUILDINGS.

120. The expenditure including that incurred by the Minor Irrigation staff rose from Rs. 91,996 to Rs. 1,39,161 or 56.63 per cent of the Budget allotment. The short expenditure under this head was largely the result of slow progress with the New Palace at Pudukkottai. Special arrangements were made towards the close of the fasli for the prompt execution and proper supervision of this work by the appointment of M. R. Ry. A. Nilakanta Sastri Avergal, B. C. E., Retired Assistant Engineer of the Madras Public Works Department.

COMMUNICATIONS.

121. Expenditure rose from Rs. 51,205 to 61,654 or 77.50 per cent of the Budget allotment. The work on the roads was better than in the preceding fasli but leaves much room for improvement if the former excellent condition of the roads is to be restored.

WORKSHOP AND STORES.

122. The value of the out-put of work rose from Rs. 13,868 to Rs. 14,113; of this Rs. 8,439 represented the cost of material. The Sri Marthanda Industrial School attached to the Workshop had 12 apprentices on the rolls at the end of the fasli, who received instructions in carpentry, painting, tailoring and blacksmith work.

GENERAL REMARKS.

123. Establishment charges rose from Rs. 44,115 to Rs. 47,530 which represented 14.7 per cent of the outlay on works. Mr. H. C. Gill was in charge of the Public Works Department throughout the fasli. Mr. E. R. Logan was Mechanical Engineer for a major portion of the year and was also deputed to supervise the construction of the Trichy Palace works from September to May.

MILITARY.

124. The strength of the Military force was the same as in Fasli 1322, 110 (Infantry) and 19 (Cavalry). The Commandant was M. R. Ry. K. S. Dorai Rajah Avergal, B. A. The health of the force was good. The expenditure of the department was Rs. 22,771.

MISCELLANEOUS.

TRADE AND INDUSTRY.

125. The State is entirely agricultural and there are no manufactures of importance.

The principal articles of import were sea-salt and timber from Negapatam and paddy from the Cauvery delta.

Export consisted chiefly of minor forest produce (such as accacia bark for distilleries and avaram bark for tanneries), of ground-nuts, and of silk cloths woven in one of the suburbs of Pudukkottai. The State is rich in deposit of high grade magnetic ore, but until the proposed Pudukkottai-Trichinopoly Railway Line is constructed, the cost of transport renders the commercial exploitation of the mineral impracticable. Motor Car Services ran from Tirumayyam to Trichinopoly and from Pudukkottai to Tanjore.

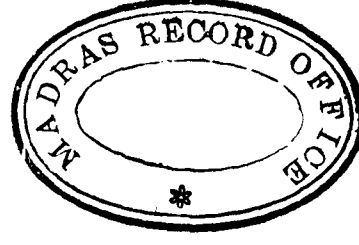

Detailed memorandum explanatory of the important differences between the
Revised Estimate and the actuals of Fasli 1323.

RECEIPTS.

1. The increase under "Special offerings to Devasthanams" was due to the realisation of larger amounts of vasakkattu arrears than was anticipated.
2. The increase under "Land Revenue" was mainly due to better collection than was anticipated both under "Current" and "Arrears".
3. The increase under "Natham Settlement" was due to the greater activity of the Department.
4. The increase under "Jails" was due to larger transactions under industries.
5. The increase under "Miscellaneous" was mainly due to the value of unclaimed deposits lapsed to the State which could not be correctly estimated.

EXPENDITURE.

1. The decrease under "Allowances to the members of His Highness' family" was the net result of the payment of Rs. 50 in the fasli, the house rent for May 1914 to M.R.Ry. B. R. Durai Rajah Avl., not provided for in the estimate and the non-payment of Rs. 250, the allowance of M.R.Ry. V. R. Durai Rajah Avl., B.A., for June 1914.
2. The increase under "Allowances to the Ranees or Ranees of the State" and under "Privy Purse to His Highness" was due to the remittance in this fasli itself of the allowance for July 1914.
3. The savings under "Medical" and "Veterinary" were due to the non-arrival within the fasli of the medical stores indented for.
4. The decrease under "Civil Works" is explained in the body of the report under Public Works.
5. The decrease under "Tools and Plant" was due to the provision made for a steam road roller not having been utilised within the fasli.
6. The increase under "Civil Works-Miscellaneous" mainly represents the loss in the manufacture of lime for Sirkar works.

Detailed memorandum explanatory of the important differences between the
actuals of Faslis 1322 and 1323.

RECEIPTS.

1. The increase under "Special offerings to Devasthanams, etc.," was due mainly to the realisation of large amounts of vasakkattu arrears and to offerings to certain temples by private parties.
2. The increase under "Palace other items" was mainly due to the credit in this fasli of the amounts realised by the sale of old materials of the Chinnaranmanai buildings at Tirugokarnam.
3. The increase under "Land Revenue" was due to the high percentage of collection both under "Current" and "Arrears".
4. The figure under "Interest on Government Securities" is only normal, the last year's figure having been swollen by the realisation of the interest for 2 years in last fasli.
5. The increase under "Interest on money deposited in Bank" was the result of the investment of larger sums in this fasli.
6. The increase under "Interest on loans and advances" was due to the collection of old arrears.
7. The increase under "Jails" was due to the gross transactions under "Industry" having been shown in this fasli instead of net results only in last fasli.
8. The rise under "Education" was due partly to the credit in this fasli of a portion of the fees due in last fasli and partly to the increased strength of the College.
9. The rise under "Medical" was due mainly to the recovery at an increased rate of the stipend paid to a medical student.
10. The receipts under "Miscellaneous" represented a return to the figure of Fasli 1321 the last year's revenue having been swollen by the credit of the value of the jewels of the late Chinnaranmanai Jaghire.
11. The increase under "Tolls" mainly represented the collection of old arrears held over pending decision of a Civil suit.
12. The decrease under other items of Civil Works was due to the last year's revenue having been swollen by the credit of the value of store stock and of the amounts realised by the sale of Annan Sannadhi shops.

EXPENDITURE.

1. The increase under "Assignments to Religious and Charitable Institutions" was mainly due to the payment of old arrears in the fasli.

2. The increase under "Chinnaramanai allowances" in spite of the savings owing to the demise of the 2nd wife of the late Jaghirdar in January 1914 was due to the grant of (1) Rs. 7,500 for the marriage and Rs. 700 for Seemantham marriage of the 1st son of the late Jaghirdar (2) a monthly allowance of Rs. 100 to the wife of the member for September 1914 (3) the consolidated carriage allowance for 3 years in advance to the 3rd wife of the late Jaghirdar and (4) Rs. 1,500 for the funerals of the 2nd wife of the late Jaghirdar.

3. The increase under "Stables" was mainly due to the charges on account of the construction of a Railway Saloon and the purchase of a motor car in this fasli.

4. The receipts under "Gardens" are normal, the last year's figure having been low owing to non-adjustment of certain items of expenditure.

5. The increase in the "Western Palace allowances" was due to the grant of Rs. 5,000 for the marriage of the daughter of the 1st son of the late Jaghirdar.

6. The increase under "Allowance to Rances of the State" was due to the remittance to His Highness in this fasli of the allowance for July 1914.

7. The increase under "Land Revenue" was due mainly to the payment of arrears of pay of the vattam establishment.

8. The fall under "Excise" was due to the decrease in the quantity of arrack manufactured in the fasli owing to decreased consumption and to economy in manufacture through the agency of a contractor.

9. The increase under "Privy Purse allowance" was due to the raising of the Privy Purse allowance by ½ lakh per annum from January 1914 and to the debit in the fasli of the Privy Purse allowance for July 1914.

10. The increase under "Law and Justice" was due partly to the heavy law charges incurred and partly to the cost of furniture purchased for the Chief Court during the fasli.

11. The increase under "Jails" over that of last fasli's which was swollen by the debit of the expenditure incurred in Fasli 1321, was due to a change in the system of accounting by which gross transactions under "Industry" were shown instead of net results only.

12. The decrease under "Police" was due mainly to savings under establishment charges owing to unfilled vacancies in the force.

13. The increase under "Education" was due to the last year's expenditure under "General Education" having remained abnormally low.

14. The savings under "Medical" were due to the medical stores ordered not having arrived within the fasli.

15. The increase under "Political-other items" represented the increase in the allowance of Atta Ullakhan from Rs. 50 to Rs. 75 per mensem.

16. The fall under "His Highness' tours outside the State" was due to the fact that there was no State tour in North India.

17. The fall under "Agriculture" was due to the absence of initial expenses such as cost of acquisition of land, incurred in last fasli.

18. The fall under "Veterinary" was due to the medicines ordered not having arrived within the fasli.

19. The increase under "Exhibition" was due to the adjustment in this fasli of a portion of the expenditure incurred in the last Exhibition.

20. The decrease under "Stationery and Printing" was due to the portion of the cost of Stationery indented for for this fasli having been paid for in last fasli.

21. The increase under "Miscellaneous" represented mainly the writing off as irrecoverable of the survey stone advances outstanding in the accounts.

22. The explanation for the differences under "Civil Works" is given in the body of the report under "Public Works".

DEBT HEADS.

These are fluctuating items and therefore call for no remarks but the large difference between the Revised estimate and the actuals of Fasli 1323 under "Advances" was mainly due to the loan of one lakh of rupees sanctioned to a Military Sirdar not having been drawn within the fasli.

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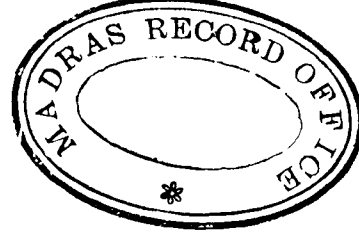
