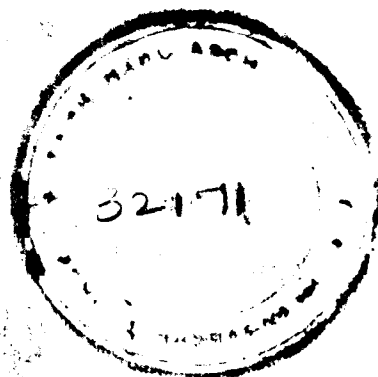

Explanatory Note.

For the purpose of recording the trade carried by rail and river Assam is divided into three blocks, which are constituted as follows:—

- (1) The Upper Assam block, comprising the districts of Lakhimpur, Sibsagar, Naga Hills, the Tezpur subdivision of Darrang, and the Central and Eastern Section of the North-East Frontier district (from the beginning of 1915-16).
- (2) The Lower Assam block, comprising the Mangaldai subdivision of Darrang and the districts of Nowgong, Kamrup, Goalpara and Garo Hills.
- (3) The Surma Valley block, which includes, in addition to the districts of Cachar and Sylhet, the Khasi and Jaintia Hills, Lushai Hills and the State of Manipur.

A record of the trade of these three blocks by rail with one another and with other provinces is prepared in the Railway Audit offices from invoices of goods despatched. Through-booked trade carried partly by rail and partly by steamer is also recorded in the Railway offices and counted as if it were carried the whole way by rail. Similarly, statistics of the trade carried by steamers between Assam and other provinces are compiled from the invoices preserved in the offices of the Steamship Companies. The trade carried by steamer between Calcutta and the several blocks of Assam is registered separately.

All traffic by country boat between Assam and Calcutta is recorded by special agencies maintained by the Calcutta Port Commissioners. The registering stations at Dhubri and Bhairab Bazar record all trade which enters or leaves the Brahmaputra and Surma Valleys by country boat. The control of the traffic registration office at Bhairab Bazar has been transferred to the Government of Bengal.

The weights stated in the tables of this report represent net weight, that is to say, a reduction at a fixed conventional rate is made from the actual gross weight of the goods as recorded on the invoices by Railway or Steamer Companies. A list of the rates at which deduction is made appears in the appendix.

The value of goods despatched by rail and steamer is not recorded in the invoices, and consequently average values have to be assigned to each article when the accounts are made up. These average rates are determined in a variety of ways. In the case of certain articles values as calculated for Bengal are adopted for Assam. In the case of the great majority of articles of local produce or manufacture value rates are calculated quarterly from reports of the prices ruling in the principal marts for each article. The value-rate for tea has been calculated on the average prices realised in Calcutta and London after making allowance for cost of shipment from a garden situated at an average distance from Calcutta.

REPORT

ON THE

TRADE OF ASSAM CARRIED BY RAIL AND RIVER

DURING THE YEAR

1914-15.

For the year the rainfall of the Province as a whole was considerably below the average and conditions were not generally very favourable to the growth of crops. Spring rice in Sylhet and sugarcane in the Brahmaputra Valley were exceptions.

The year, however, was not a bad one; though, according to our estimates, there was some decrease in outturn as compared with the previous year in the case of oil-seeds and sugarcane, there was an increase in that of rice, tea, and jute.

2. Calculated on the wholesale rates reported from important marts, the average prices per maund of the chief staples of local production during the last three years were:—

The prices of rice and tea rose, apparently because there was an increased demand. The rise in the price of mustard is apparently due to the fact that there was a large demand outside the province. The outbreak of the European war resulted in a disturbed market and low prices for jute.

It will be observed that the import and export trade of Assam has advanced during these three years both in quantity and value. The total quantity and value of the trade of Assam with other provinces increased by 4 per cent. and 10 per cent., respectively. Among the imports which contributed to this increase may be mentioned rice, manufactured cotton, manufactured wood and refined sugar. Tea was mainly responsible for the increase in the quantity and value of exports. Mustard seed, rice in the husk, fresh fruit and vegetables and raw cotton each had some share in it. The total trade was with Bengal, 42 per cent. with Calcutta and 10 per cent. with Bihar and Orissa. The trade with other provinces is insignificant.

23.4 lakhs of rupees represent the value of the foreign twist and yarn imported as against 19.3 lakhs of rupees in the previous year. Corresponding figures for foreign piece-goods are 138.2 and 124.3. The total value of Indian twist and yarn imported was 8.8 lakhs and Indian piece-goods 23.3 as against 7.7 and 22.1 last year.

Grain and pulse.—Assam, as usual, imported from Bihar and Orissa most of its gram and pulse; both the quantity and value declined as compared with those of last year. Import trade in husked rice rose in quantity from 11.8 lakhs of maunds to 15.4 lakhs of maunds and in value from Rs. 68.1 lakhs to Rs. 86.0 lakhs. Bengal including Calcutta despatched most of this, the largest recipient being the Upper Assam block. The quantity of husked rice imported rose from 22 lakhs of maunds to 68 and the value from Rs. 68 to Rs. 2.16. Most of this came to the Lower Assam block.

Iron and steel.—The value of imported machinery and mill work and other manufactures including hardware and cutlery fell from Rs. 33.9 lakhs to Rs. 28.4 lakhs and from Rs. 77.4 lakhs to Rs. 61.4 lakhs, respectively. An increase of Rs. 5.1 lakhs occurred under the sub-head of iron bars and sheets.

Kerosine oil.—Imports of this oil fell by 44,093 maunds; this was apparently due to the decline in the importation of foreign oils. During several years past there had been a continual increase in the import of kerosine oil.

Mustard oil.—There was a very slight rise in the imports of this commodity.

Salt.—The import trade in salt decreased from 964,903 maunds to 892,909 maunds. Last year there was a big import and it is probable that consumption this year was largely met from the stock of that year.

Betelnuts.—1,76,678 maunds of betelnuts were brought in against 1,33,909 maunds in the preceding year. Bengal, as usual, was the largest exporter of this article.

Sugar.—Imports of unrefined sugar declined from 4,23,090 to 4,21,500 maunds, but those of refined sugar rose from 2,03,169 to 2,54,674 maunds. The Surma Valley received by far the largest share of the former and is mainly responsible for the increase in the latter.

Tobacco.—Assam received 1,47,378 maunds of unmanufactured tobacco against 149,442 in the previous year. The largest quantity was received by the Surma Valley block.

Manufactured wood.—Imports of manufactured wood rose from 1,98,295 to 2,28,504 maunds. The large increase was mainly confined to the Upper Assam and Surma Valley blocks.

Tea is by far the most important article of export and its value represents about 75 per cent. of the total value of exports by rail and river. Figures for its export during the last 3 years were 23,20,388 maunds in 1912-13, 22,16,545 maunds in 1913-14, and 25,26,058 in 1914-15. That there was a rise in spite of the disturbance of trade which accompanied the war, is apparently due to the fact that there was an increase in the demand of the United Kingdom. Consumption there rose from 6.46 to 6.61 lbs. per head of the population.

Next in importance to tea comes paddy. Exports of it declined in quantity from 39,93,924 to 39,45,131 maunds, but their value increased from Rs. 108.6 lakhs to Rs. 116.7 lakhs.

Jute.—Export trade in this article fell in quantity from 11,21,182 to 8,97,637 maunds and in value from 121.3 to 61.4 lakhs of rupees. The cause of the decline in prices has already been mentioned. Though there was an increase in outturn, stocks were held up with the hope of an improved market.

Mustard seed.—Exports of this article expanded from 4,00,636 to 6,16,911 maunds. A good harvest in 1913-14 was mainly responsible for the increase. As already observed, the increase in the import of mustard oil was slight.

Raw cotton.—Though exports of cotton rose by 30,388 maunds its value declined. The price was very low owing to the closure of a large part of the foreign market.

Timber.—The trade in this article showed a decline. Figures for the last three years were 1,45,173 maunds, 17,03,966 maunds and 10,70,404 maunds respectively.

Raw silk.—832 maunds of it were exported as against 4,184 maunds in the previous year, the only recipient being Calcutta. The demand was affected by the war.

Hide.—Assam exported 38,967 maunds of this article against 61,378 maunds in the previous year. The cause of the contraction is apparently the same as that in the case of cotton.

7. River-borne trade amounted to 49.7 per cent. of the imports and 67.9 per cent. of the exports of the total trade by rail and river. The corresponding figures for the previous year were 47 and 71. The value of imports and exports by river rose by 125 and 58 lakhs of rupees, respectively. Among the chief articles of imports were apparel, manufactured cotton, medicinal preparations, gram and pulse, rice, wrought iron, mustard oil, betelnuts, sugar and manufactured wood. The principal articles of export include fresh fruits and vegetables, paddy, jute, mustard seed, tea and timber.

The chief articles of trade were coal and coke (11,82,367 maunds against 9,46,439 ; maunds in the preceding year), rice, paddy, kerosine oil, mustard oil, mustard seed, betel-nuts and timber.

Upper Assam received largely rice, paddy, limestone, and betel-nuts; Lower Assam coal, kerosine oil, and timber; the Surma Valley coal, mustard seed, and timber; Upper Assam exported largely coal, kerosine oil and timber; Lower Assam rice, paddy, and mustard seed; the Surma Valley rice, limes and betel-nuts.

9. Tables VI and VII record statistics of some articles of local importance. The total value of import trade in corrugated iron, galvanized iron, lead and tea chests was Rs. 34,70,586 against Rs. 29,52,672 in the previous year. Cocoanuts worth Rs. 2,31,712 against Rs. 1,43,033 in the preceding year were brought in. The export trade in silk cocoons fell from Rs. 2,45,619 to Rs. 48,868; the figure for the preceding year was Rs. 68,110. Of other items 55,289 maunds of unginned cotton (against 38,817 maunds), 10,05,456 maunds of lime (against 10,50,387 maunds), 12,475 maunds of tea seed (against 5,885 maunds) and 10,997 maunds of wax (against 6,776 maunds) were exported. The export and import trade in potatoes expanded by 71,445 maunds and 21,590 maunds, respectively. 27,127 maunds of dried fish against 21,255 maunds in the previous year were sent to Bengal, and 1,158 maunds against 393 maunds were brought in. Exports of mats and bamboos increased in value by Rs. 8,29,211 and Rs. 1,88,931, respectively, while those of cane decreased by Rs. 5,53,758.
