With its Proceedings read above, the Board of Revenue submits its report on the settlement of land revenue of the Madras Presidency for fasli 1325 which ended on 30th June 1916.

2. *Land revenue and cesses.*—The following statement compares the income derived from land revenue and cesses during the period under review with the corresponding figures for the previous year:—

3. *Poramboke occupation.*—While the total area of poramboke land occupied decreased by 4,333 acres, the revenue derived from the occupation of such land increased by Rs. 0.61 lakh, the increase being due to the imposition of heavier penalties to secure the removal of encroachments which were really objectionable. The Government note with satisfaction that the work of reclassifying, as “assessed” or “unassessed”, lands not actually required for State or communal purposes, has been completed or nearly completed in most districts. They however agree with the Board of Revenue that a great deal remains to be done and trust that the matter will continue to receive the attention of Collectors and Divisional Officers.

4. *Coercion.*—The statistics of coercive processes given in paragraphs 24-29 of the Board's report show a satisfactory decline in the number of processes issued as compared with the previous year. The proportion of cases in which, after the issue of the demand notice, resort was had to actual distraint of moveable or attachment of immoveable property also fell. Out of a total land revenue collection (current and arrears) of over 768 lakhs of rupees the amount which had ultimately to be recovered by the sale of the defaulter's property was only Rs. 40,600 or about one-twentieth of one per cent of the whole.

5. *Transfer of registry.*—The effect of the new rules regarding the transfer of revenue registry, which is shown by the very considerable rise in the number of applications, is noted with satisfaction as is also the increase in the number of transfers dealt with by Revenue officers on their own initiative. The proportion of applications rejected, namely 8.58 per cent, seems high and the Government desire the Board of Revenue to enquire further into the reasons for these rejections.

6. *Loans*.—The aggregate amount of loans advanced under the Land Improvement and the Agriculturists' Loans Acts was Rs. 7.51 lakhs as against Rs. 8.18 lakhs in the previous year. The favourable character of the season under review tended to diminish the necessity for State loans.

For the purchase and installation of oil engines and pumps Rs. 34,900 was advanced against Rs. 20,200 in the previous year. The special rules to facilitate the grant of loans for the erection of pumping installations referred to in paragraph 10 of G.O. No. 486, Revenue, dated 2nd March 1916, were only introduced towards the close of the fasli under review and had not therefore come into full effect.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD OF REVENUE

(REVENUE SETTLEMENT, SURVEY, LAND RECORDS AND AGRICULTURE)

The Board submits its report on the settlement of land revenue in the Presidency for fasli 1325 (1915–16) together with the prescribed statements.

2. *Season, rainfall and prices*.—The total rainfall during the south-west monsoon was above the average in all the districts except Vizagapatam Agency, Kurnool and South Canara. The heavy rainfall during the monsoon in the Kistna district brought down floods in some of the rivers and necessitated the grant of remissions on a large scale in two taluks. The season as a whole was favourable to agricultural operations except in Chingleput and South Arcot. The rainfall in the north-east monsoon was above the average in all the districts except Anantapur, Chingleput, South Arcot, North Arcot, Trichinopoly and Tanjore. On the whole, the season was favourable and led to an increase in cultivation in many of the districts. But the dry weather rains were a comparative failure throughout the Presidency, there being no showers at all in many of the districts in January and March and only a very light rainfall in February. The hot weather rains were better and exceeded the average in the Vizagapatam Agency, Gōdāvari, Bellary, Anantapur and Madura.

The average annual retail prices of the staple food grains were lower than those of the preceding year but everywhere dearer than the normal rates. The prices of rice in Ganjām, Trichinopoly, Rāmnād and Tinnevely, of ragi in Ganjām and Vizagapatam and of cumbu in Vizagapatam and Trichinopoly were dearer than the warning rates fixed by Government in their order No. 1977, Revenue, dated 3rd July 1912.

3. *Cropped area*.—The total cropped area of the year under report was 39,175,000 acres against a normal area of 38,160,000 acres, showing an increase of 1,015,000 acres, as against an increase of 929,000 acres in the previous year. As compared with the normal there were large decreases under cotton and ground-nut owing to the difficulties of export, and a small decrease under gingelly, while the increases were large under paddy, cumbu, indigo and cholam. As compared with the previous year, the cultivation of ground-nut showed a further decrease by nearly two-fifths, while gingelly and tobacco fell off by about 5 per cent; there was a relatively trifling fall in cotton. Indigo improved by more than 200 per cent owing to the increased demand as the result of the war. Castors also showed a large relative increase, and there were large actual increases under paddy, cholam, cumbu and ragi.

In no case is the outturn of crops reported to have exceeded the normal. The yield of indigo was normal in the Coimbatore district and ranged from 50 to 91 per cent thereof in the remaining districts. The yield of paddy ranged from 58 to 97 per cent. The yield of cholam in Ganjām, of gingelly and "all other food-grains including pulses" in Tinnevely, of cotton in Chingleput and North Arcot, of castors in the Nilgiris, of ground-nut in Gōdāvari and of "other oil-seeds" in Vizagapatam and Rāmnād, was below 50 per cent. In all other cases, the outturn ranged from 50 to 97 per cent of the normal. As stated in the season and crop report for 1915-16, district reports of crop outturns can be accepted only with caution.

4. *Condition of cattle.*—The total number of deaths from diseases among horned cattle showed a decrease of 10,553 as compared with the preceding year, the total for the year being 57,472. The decrease occurred under every head, but it was most marked under "foot and mouth disease" and "other contagious diseases." The mortality under rinderpest, however, continued to be high, the districts which were affected most being Gōdāvari, Guntūr, Cuddapah and Nellore. The mobile veterinary corps worked during the year in the Nellore and Gōdāvari districts, and additional veterinary assistants were also at work in Guntūr and Cuddapah.

5. *Number of villages.*—In the year under report, there was a net increase of 38 villages as a result of increases in Vizagapatam (36), Gōdāvari (1), Chingleput (2), North Arcot (3) and Madura (1) and of decreases in Ganjām (1), Chittoor (1), Coimbatore (2) and Salem (1). The highest increase which was in Vizagapatam is reported to be due to the rectification of errors in the figures of the previous fasli and to the re-clubbing of villages during resurvey. The increase in Gōdāvari was due to the inclusion of a village in Rajahmundry which was unsettled in fasli 1324, but settled and included under ryotwari in fasli 1325; that in Chingleput was due to a village in the Chingleput taluk which is partly ryotwari and partly shrotriem having been treated as ryotwari and of another shrotriem village in the Saidapet taluk as Izara; that in North Arcot was due to two hamlets in Polur and the ayan portion of Navalāk village in Walaja having been treated as separate villages at resettlement; and that in Madura was due to the correction of errors in the number of villages reported in fasli 1324. The decrease in Ganjām was due to the exclusion of a village from the Berhampur taluk as it had no ryotwari demand; that in Chittoor was due to the clubbing of two villages in Palmanēr into a single village; while that in Coimbatore was the result of the splitting up of one village in Bhavani into two villages and the exclusion of three jaghir villages in Kollegal at resettlement and that in Salem to the correction of errors.

6. The land revenue of the Presidency is derived from the undermentioned sources:—

- (a) Peshkash or revenue from permanently-settled estates;
- (b) Shrotriem jodi or quit-rent levied on inam villages;
- (c) Assessment, including water-rate, on lands held under the ryotwari system;
- (d) Miscellaneous revenue and;
- (e) Proprietary estates' village service.

7. *Peshkash or revenue from permanently-settled estates.*—The total amount of peshkash payable during the fasli was Rs. 49,86,531 against Rs. 49,87,350 in the preceding year.

9. *Holdings.*—The total extent of ryotwari holdings during the year was 25·68 million acres and exceeded that of the previous year by 129,447 acres. The increase was contributed by all the districts except the Nilgiris and it was noticeable in Anantapur and South Canara: in the former district, it was due to the growing demand for land and in the latter, to the extensive assignment of waste lands on darkhast.

10. *Assessment.*—The total assessment on holdings was Rs. 518·17 lakhs against Rs. 515·35 lakhs in the previous year showing an increase of Rs. 2,82,169. The increase was contributed by all the districts except Tinnevely and Anjengo.

It was marked in the districts of Guntūr, North Arcot, Madura and South Canara; these districts together contributing an increase of Rs. 1,93,829 or about 70 per cent of the total increase. The increase in Guntūr was due to the revenue derived from lands newly assigned on patta and to the additional revenue derived from lands transferred from dry to wet; that in North Arcot to the introduction of resettlement rates in the taluks of Wandiwash and Cheyyar; that in Madura to the favourable character of the season and that in South Canara to the extensive assignment of waste lands on darkhast. The decreases are too small to call for any remarks.

11. *Cultivation.*—The total area cropped on ryotwari holdings during the year was 20·540 million acres against 20·597 million acres in the previous year showing a decrease of about 57,000 acres. This figure is the net result of a decrease of 112,000 acres dry and an increase of 55,000 acres under wet. Under dry the decreases were large in North Arcot, South Arcot and Tinnevely in which districts one or both monsoons were defective and the increases large in Anantapur and Coimbatore. Under wet the most marked increases were in Guntūr, Anantapur and Chittoor and the largest decrease was in South Arcot. Dry waste charged showed an increase of 230,000 acres, the largest increase being in North Arcot, South Arcot and Tinnevely. Wet waste charged increased by 5,000 acres, South Arcot showing the largest increase; wet waste remitted fell by 48,000 acres, South Arcot alone showing a considerable increase. Including the area under "Miscellaneous cultivation" the total area cropped amounted to 21·81 million acres against 21·93 million acres in the previous year.

12. *Water-rate and second-crop charge.*—The revenue from these sources amounted to Rs. 34·78 lakhs against Rs. 32·72 lakhs or nearly Rs. 2,06,000 more than in the preceding year. There were large increases in Gōdāvari, Kistna, Nellore, Cuddapah, Anantapur, Kurnool, Chittoor and Madura. The increases were

generally due to the favourable character of the season in these districts; in Kurnool, the increase was also due to the closure of the breach in the Kurnool-Cuddapah canal in time. There were considerable decreases in Chingleput and South Arcot; in the former district, the decrease was due to the insufficient and uneven distribution of rainfall, while in the latter, it was due to the failure of the monsoons. The net increase, Rs. 2.06 lakhs, was the result of a decrease of Rs. 6,552 under "water-rate on dry lands," and of an increase of Rs. 2,13,113 under "second-crop charge." Under water-rate Guntūr (Rs. 22,538) and South Arcot (Rs. 71,456) showed the largest decreases, while Anantapur (Rs. 21,241) showed the largest increase under second-crop charge; Chingleput (Rs. 49,984) and South Arcot (Rs. 36,521) showed the largest decreases, while Gōdāvari (Rs. 47,057), Kistna (Rs. 49,885), Nellore (Rs. 38,157) and Anantapur (Rs. 32,058) showed the largest increases. In Guntūr the decrease was due to the conversion of bapat wet and other irrigated dry lands to permanent wet by the Special Deputy Collector during the revision of registration in Tenali and Repalle taluks. The increase or decrease in the remaining districts was due to the state of the season.

13. *Remissions*.—As compared with the previous year, there was a net decrease of Rs. 5,51,134. Season and fixed remissions showed a decrease, while beriz deductions showed an increase.

(i) *Season remissions*.—The remission under this head showed a net decrease of Rs. 5.69 lakhs. The decrease occurred under all the sub-heads except "Injury by floods" (mostly in Kistna) and "Other remissions."

(a) *Waste remitted*.—The remission under this head amounted to Rs. 1.76 lakhs or Rs. 2.22 lakhs less than that remitted in the preceding year. The decrease

was marked in the districts of Cuddapah, Anantapur, Bellary and Chittoor and it is reported to be due to the favourable character of the season. These districts together contributed a decrease of Rs. 1.80 lakhs or 81 per cent of the total decrease. There was however a large increase of Rs. 32,286 in South Arcot due to the failure of the monsoons. No remissions on dry lands were granted during the year under report.

(b) *Shavi or short crop*.—The total amount remitted under this head was Rs. 85,279 against Rs. 1,59,293 in the previous year showing a net decrease of Rs. 74,014; the decrease was marked in the districts of Cuddapah (Rs. 33,572), and Kurnool (Rs. 19,902), while in South Arcot (Rs. 31,332), there was a noticeable increase. In Cuddapah, the decrease was due to the favourable character of the season, while, in Kurnool, it was due partly to the timely closure of the breach in the Kurnool-Cuddapah canal and partly to copious supply of water in tanks; the increase in South Arcot was due to the failure of the monsoons. Of the total remissions under "Shavi" Rs. 83,951 related to wet lands and Rs. 1,328 to dry lands. A remission of Rs. 4,567 was granted under "Short-crop" during the year under report.

(c) *Tirvakammi remission*.—(The remission of the difference between wet and dry assessment on wet land cultivated with dry crops owing to the insufficiency or failure of the water-supply) amounted to Rs. 1,87,469 against Rs. 4,50,642 showing a net decrease of Rs. 2,63,173. The decrease was noticeable in the districts of Guntūr (Rs. 18,692), Cuddapah (Rs. 45,775), Anantapur (Rs. 51,888), Kurnool (Rs. 25,300), Chittoor (Rs. 62,630) and Salem (Rs. 13,937) and was due generally to the favourable character of the season in these districts. In South Arcot, there was a remission of Rs. 5,131 under this head owing to the failure of the monsoons, while no such remission was granted in the district in the previous year.

(d) *Injury by floods*.—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 69,190 against Rs. 63,262 in the previous year, showing a net increase of Rs. 5,928, Kistna alone showing an increase of Rs. 6,280 due to crops on larger extents having been damaged by the floods of the Kollēru, Budamēru, etc.

(e) *Other remissions*.—A sum of Rs. 197 against Rs. 189 in the previous year was granted during the year under report; of this amount, Rs. 93 related to the reclamation of land in the district of Nellore.

(ii) *Fixed remissions*—(or abatement of the demand granted for reasons unconnected with the season) amounted to Rs. 1.30 lakhs against Rs. 1.32 lakhs in the previous year, showing a net decrease of Rs. 1,289. The decrease occurred

mainly under increment remissions (remissions allowed on the introduction of settlement or resettlement in cases where the increase over the old assessment is in excess of 25 per cent) in the districts of South Canara and Malabar owing to the cessation of these remissions in the former district and the reduction of such remissions in the latter district through lapse of time. Remission of assessment on lands newly assigned on patta on which no crop was raised during the fasli also showed the large decrease of Rs. 4,417, the district of Kurnool alone accounting for a decrease of Rs. 1,097. Remission for the maintenance of irrigation works, however, showed a large increase of Rs. 7,958, the district of Chittoor alone accounting for an increase of Rs. 6,246 owing to the favourable character of the season, the Dasabandhamdars participating in the enhanced revenue derived from the works they maintain under Board's Standing Order No. 56.

(iii) *Beriz deductions*—(deductions made from village collections in favour of inamdars and religious institutions) amounted to Rs. 9.10 lakhs against 8.91 lakhs in the previous year, showing a net increase of Rs. 19,150. The largest increases occurred in the districts of North Arcot (Rs. 10,508) and Tinnevely (Rs. 26,155). South Arcot district showed a large decrease of Rs. 12,163, as there was at the end of the fasli an undischarged balance of Rs. 12,923 due to the non-appearance of the concessionaires in time.

14. *Miscellaneous revenue*.—The revenue under this head amounted to Rs. 94.61 lakhs against Rs. 92.15 lakhs in the previous year showing a net increase of Rs. 2.47 lakhs. Gōdāvari showed the largest increase, Rs. 1,65,884 and South

Arcot the largest decrease, Rs. 28,978. The increase in Gōdāvari was due mainly to an increase in the revenue from the occupation of poramboke land (item 6) and charges for Government water used for zamindari and inam lands. The decrease in South Arcot occurred mainly under "Enhanced water-rate on lands irregularly irrigated" (item 4), occupation of assessed and unassessed wastes (item 5) and of poramboke lands (item 6) owing to the insufficiency of rain in the early part of the south-west monsoon.

Item 2.—"Water-rate on minor inams in ryotwari villages," *item 3*.—"charge for water in zamindari and inam villages including tirvajasti and fasaljasti" *item 6*.—"charges levied for occupation of poramboke land, etc.," and *item 13*.—"other items," showed the largest increases, Rs. 1,44,513, Rs. 83,677, Rs. 61,104, and Rs. 57,099 respectively, while *item 5*, "charges levied for occupation (with or without application) of assessed and unassessed lands for which no pattas have been granted," and *item 10*, "sale-proceeds of lands sold," showed the largest decreases, Rs. 42,825 and Rs. 46,975, respectively. These items are dealt with below. The increases or decreases in the remaining items, were small and call for no remarks.

Item 2.—Water-rate on minor inams in ryotwari villages amounted to Rs. 15.16 lakhs against Rs. 13.71 lakhs showing a net increase of Rs. 1.45 lakhs as compared with the previous year. Gōdāvari (Rs. 43,300) and Kistna (Rs. 28,824) showed the largest increases; in the former district, the increase was presumably due to the favourable character of the season, while in the latter, it is reported to be due to the usual fluctuations in the second-crop cultivation and to slight extensions of first-crop irrigation.

Item 3.—The revenue under the head "Charge for water in zamindari and inam villages including tirvajasti and fasaljasti" amounted to Rs. 21.90 lakhs against Rs. 21.06 lakhs or Rs. 0.84 lakh more than in the previous year. Gōdāvari (Rs. 21,638) and Kistna (Rs. 36,430) showed the largest increases for the reasons noted in respect of increases under item 2 above.

Item 5.—The revenue under the head "charges levied for occupation (with or without application) of assessed and unassessed lands for which no pattas have been granted" amounted to Rs. 8.05 lakhs against Rs. 8.48 lakhs or Rs. 0.43 lakh less than in the previous year. North Arcot and South Arcot showed the largest decreases of Rs. 0.17 lakh and Rs. 0.9 lakh respectively. In the former district, the decrease was due to a smaller extent cultivated with groundnut owing to the war, to a larger extent transferred to grazing ground porambokes at re-settlement and to the assignment of about 8,000 acres on patta during the year under report, while in the latter, it was due to the short rainfall in the early part of the south-west monsoon.

Item 6—Poramboke occupation.—The revenue under this head amounted to Rs. 6.24 lakhs against Rs. 5.63 lakhs or Rs. 0.61 lakh more than in the previous year but the total area occupied fell to 117,886 acres from 122,219 acres in the previous year showing a net decrease of 4,333 acres. The decrease was marked in the districts of Kurnool, North Arcot, Tanjore and Salem.

Enhanced charges amounting to Rs. 4,47,472 were levied on 40,390 acres against Rs. 3,77,393 on 39,837 acres in the previous year yielding an incidence of Rs. 11 per acre against Rs. 10 in the preceding year. Gōdāvari, Tanjore and South Canara showed the highest average rates of charge, namely, 163, 44 and 53 per acre respectively. The high incidence in the Gōdāvari district was due to the imposition of a penalty of Rs. 89,020 on an extent of 247 acres in the Sanapallilanka, Amalapur taluk; that in Tanjore, to heavy penalties imposed on encroachments on real porambokes with reference to the instructions already conveyed and that in South Canara to the imposition of high rates of penalty on a large number of cases of objectionable encroachments of very small extents of poramboke land with a view to secure their removal. The only Collectors who state definitely that they have had recourse to section 6 of Madras Act III of 1905 are those of Ganjām, Cuddapah and Trichinopoly. Other Collectors have not stated what use they have made of the section. All Collectors are requested to refer to the point in future reports.

On receipt of the orders of Government on its report on the land revenue settlement for fasli 1324 (G.O. No. 486, Revenue, dated 2nd March 1916), the Board in paragraph 2 of its Proceedings No. 100, dated 18th April 1916, called for a detailed report on the action taken by Collectors in pursuance of B.P. No. 157, dated 2nd April 1910, towards differentiating between real porambokes and assessed or unassessed wastes and strictly enforcing the provisions of Act III of 1905 as regards eviction in the case of really objectionable encroachments. From the replies to this reference and the information furnished by Collectors on the subject in their jamabandi reports for fasli 1325 it is seen that the work of reclassification as "assessed" or "unassessed" waste of lands not really required for State or communal purposes was completed or nearly completed in all the districts except Ganjām, Gōdāvari, Guntūr, Nellore, South Arcot, Tanjore, Trichinopoly and Madura. The Collector of Ganjām observes that the work cannot be rapidly pushed through as Tahsildars and Divisional Officers are heavily worked. The Collector should see that the work is brought to a speedy completion by the district staff. A decrease in the area penalized, a rise in the incidence of the penal assessment charged for the occupation of objectionable porambokes and the progress which the work of classifying porambokes not really required for State or communal purposes as "assessed" or "unassessed" waste has made in several districts, indicate that some attention has been paid by district officials during the fasli to the repeated orders issued on the subject. But a good deal more remains to be done and until the provisions of section 6 of Act III of 1905 are regularly applied, no real repression of the occupation of objectionable porambokes can be looked for.

In this connection Collectors have brought to notice that in several districts there exist certain classes of porambokes or variants thereof which have to be retained as such and cannot be converted to "assessed" or "unassessed", but the occupation of which it is unnecessary and even undesirable to repress. Examples of such porambokes are (1) tank and river beds, (2) vāgu beds, (3) hills, (4) swamps required for drainage, (5) backwater reclamations, (6) Railway and canal B class lands and (7) lands within half a mile of Railway stations. These classes of porambokes are generally permitted to be occupied or cultivated annually on payment of single assessment, so long as they are not required for a definite State or communal purpose. In the Ceded districts and in Chittoor permission to cultivate melons on river tank and vāgu beds are usually granted during unfavourable seasons. Collectors consider that temporary occupation of such lands may be permitted, although their permanent assignment on patta cannot be made. Other important classes of porambokes are (1) attached and detached backyards and (2) village-sites occupied for straw ricks and manure heaps. The former class of cases will be dealt with in future under G.O. No. 2185, Revenue, dated 23rd September 1916, and the entries against this class

will shortly disappear. The latter class may be dealt with on similar lines. The Board agrees with Collectors that the other classes of poramboke land mentioned above cannot be transferred to unassessed but considers that they may be permitted to be occupied temporarily, authorized occupation being charged with single assessment and unauthorized occupation with enhanced assessment as well.

Item 10.—The revenue under the head "sale-proceeds of lands sold" amounted to Rs. 2.23 lakhs against Rs. 2.70 lakhs or Rs. 0.47 lakh less than in the previous year. South Canara showed the largest decrease of Rs. 0.72 lakh and it was due to the sale of a large number of valuable river accretions and reclamations and house sites during the previous year, the proceeds of which were credited to the accounts of that year. Kistna showed the largest increase of Rs. 0.23 lakh and it was due to the collection in the fasli under report of the sale-proceeds of lands in the Divi taluk sold in the previous fasli.

Item 13.—The revenue under "other items" amounted to Rs. 6.21 lakhs against Rs. 5.64 lakhs or Rs. 0.57 lakh more than in the previous year. South Canara showed the largest increase (Rs. 93,272) and Kistna the largest decrease (Rs. 98,376). The increase in South Canara was mainly due to the higher prices realized by the sale of Laccadive coir owing to the very heavy demand for it from the Royal Marine dockyard, Calcutta. The decrease in Kistna was due to the back assessment for four years relating to the village of Rustumbāda in Narasapur, which was not settled until fasli 1324, having been credited to the accounts of that fasli.

15. The net ryotwari demand excluding remissions but including water-rate, second crop charge and miscellaneous revenue amounted to Rs. 631.91 lakhs against Rs. 619.05 lakhs in the previous year. The details for the increase of Rs. 12.86 lakhs are given below:—

There is a net increase under item (1). The increase is marked in Gōdāvari, Kistna, Trichinopoly and Ganjām districts. The increase in Gōdāvari and Trichinopoly was mainly due to the levy of the railway-cess in the fasli under report. In Kistna and Ganjām districts, the increase was due to the revision of the land-cess due on estates. The increase under item (2) is marked in Trichinopoly and Gōdāvari and

the explanation of the increase in these districts under this item is the same as that given for item (1). The increase under item (3) is due in part to the increase in the revenue and in part to the levy of railway cess in the districts of Gōdāvari, Trichinopoly and Cuddapah.

18. *Demand and collection of land revenue and cesses (current).*—The current demand under land revenue and cesses was Rs. 7,67,09,971; Rs. 7,58,29,261, or 98·9 per cent, were collected within the fasli and a sum of Rs. 1,253 was written off the accounts.

19. *Demand and collection of arrears.*—The total arrear demand under all heads was Rs. 10,61,827; Rs. 10,32,995 or 97·3 per cent were collected within the fasli and Rs. 9,828 or 0·9 per cent were written off the accounts.

20. *Total balance of land revenue and cesses.*—The balance outstanding at the end of the fasli, including both arrears and current, was Rs. 8,98,461. As finally reported in the monthly demand, collection and balance statements for October 1916, the balance on 1st July 1916 was Rs. 8,99,734. Up to the end of October 1916, Rs. 7,60,532 or 84·5 per cent had been collected. Rs. 3,400 written off the accounts, and Rs. 264 were considered to be irrecoverable. The net recoverable balance on 1st November 1916 was Rs. 1,35,533. Steps have been taken to collect this amount.

21. *Reconciliation of differences between the collection of land revenue and cesses as shown in the jamabandi and the Accountant-General's statements and overpayments.*—Information on these points has not yet been received from the Collectors. The subject will be dealt with in a separate report.

22. *Distribution of collections between land revenue and cesses.*—Land revenue and cesses are not collected separately and no attempt is made to exhibit the collections separately under these heads in the village accounts. The total collections are distributed between land revenue and the several cesses in the Collector's office. The process consists of two stages, of which the first, or the provisional distribution, is effected by crediting to each head month by month such portion of the lump collections as will bear the same proportion to the demand under the head as the total collections bear to the total demand under all the heads. The second stage is the final adjustment which consists in correcting the provisional credit by transfer from one head to another, where necessary, after the demand for the year under all the heads has been collected or written off.

The statements of distribution for fasli 1325 received from Collectors show that, except in the districts of Ganjām, Gōdāvari, Kistna, Nellore, Anantapur, Chingleput, Chittoor, South Arcot, Tanjore and Tinnevely, the variations between the amounts due to the cesses in fasli 1325 and the amounts actually credited were inconsiderable. The accounts of fasli 1324 remained unadjusted in five districts.

23. *Charges debitable to land revenue.*—The charges of district administration, including salaries, etc., of Revenue Inspectors, but excluding those of village establishments, were Rs. 51,94,268, or 6·8 per cent of the land revenue and cesses realised, as was the case in the preceding fasli. The village service charges (including proprietary estates) during the fasli were Rs. 55,45,039. Including this sum the total charges were Rs. 1,07,39,307 or about 14 per cent of the collections of land revenue and cesses.

24. *Processes under Act II of 1864.*—Statement No. 12 shows the particulars of the coercive processes issued for the realisation of Government dues under Act II of 1864. The following abstract compares the number of processes of each kind issued during the year with the figures for the three preceding faslis:—

There is a marked decrease in the total number of processes issued in the year under report as compared with the preceding fasli.

25. *Demand notices.*—The instruction that these notices should only be issued when absolutely necessary has been kept in view. There was a decrease in 19 districts and an increase in six districts. The increase is marked in the districts noted in the margin. The Collector of Guntūr reports that the increase in his district is due to the fact that the demand notices issued by village munsifs were included in the return for the fasli under report while they were not so included in the returns for the previous faslis. The increase in Tinnevely is attributed to the less favourable character

of the season and the consequent inability of the poorer ryots to raise money in the market promptly. The Collector of Malabar states that the increase in his district is due to the fall in the price of coconuts owing to the war.

26. *Distrain or attachment.*—The number of processes under this head was 79,446 in the year under report against 109,712 in fasli 1324 and 87,461 in fasli 1323. There was a decrease in 16 districts.

27. There was a decrease in the percentage borne by the number of distrains and attachments to that of demand notices as compared with the previous fasli. The number of defaulters whose immoveable property was attached in the year was 14,871, against 18,339 in fasli 1324. In the Madura district, a large disproportion is noticeable, as in previous years, between the number of defaulters whose personal property was distrained (852) and the number of those whose real

property was attached (5,633); it is due as in former years to the large number of absentee pattadars in the area irrigated by the Periyār.

28. *Sale notices.*—Out of 79,446 defaulters whose property was attached, 28,133 or 35·41 per cent paid the arrears before the sale notices were issued. The percentage was 36·41 in fasli 1324, 45·00 in fasli 1323 and 47·58 in fasli 1322.

29. *Sales.*—The number of defaulters whose property was sold was greater than in fasli 1324. The percentage of actual sales to sale notices was 4·22, against 2·92 in fasli 1324, and the percentage of defaulters whose property was actually sold to the total number of pattas was 0·05, as in the previous fasli. The subjoined statement compares the particulars of sales in fasli 1325 with the figures for the three preceding faslis:—

Value of lands sold.—Immoveable property of the estimated value of Rs. 1,20,235 was sold for the recovery of arrears amounting to Rs. 24,336 and realized Rs. 53,350. The price fetched by lands sold to private individuals was on the average six times the assessment in the case of dry lands and seven times the assessment in the case of wet lands. In fasli 1324, immoveable property of the estimated value of Rs. 1,40,604 was sold for the recovery of arrears amounting to Rs. 25,217 and the average prices fetched by lands sold to private individuals were six times the assessment in the case of dry lands and ten times the assessment in the case of wet lands.

Extent of lands sold.—The extent of lands sold during the year was 7,290 acres under “dry” and 1,337 acres under “wet,” against 8,406 acres under “dry” and 1,608 acres under “wet” in fasli 1324. The corresponding figures for fasli 1323 were 5,783 acres under “dry” and 1,331 acres under “wet.”

Land bought in by Government.—The total area of lands bought in by Government for want of bidders was 3,025 acres of dry and 361 acres of wet, against 2,136 acres of dry and 290 acres of wet in fasli 1324. More than one-half of the total area bought in was in Cuddapah, Anantapur, Bellary and Madura.

30. *Process-service establishment.*—Statement No. 13 gives the particulars of processes served by the ordinary village agency or by special establishments and the fees realised during the year. The total number of processes served was 1,226,658, or 193,086 less than in fasli 1324. The number of processes served by the special agency (51,971) was also less than in the previous fasli (57,756).

Special establishments were employed in the same districts as in fasli 1324, except Guntūr. Their cost was covered by the fees realized, except in Vizagapatam and Tinnevely, where there were small deficits.

31. *Costs in civil suits.*—Rupees 15,233 were awarded to Government as costs during the year. Including Rs. 14,164, the revised opening balance, the total demand was Rs. 29,397, of which Rs. 18,495 were collected, Rs. 932 were written off the accounts and Rs. 1,304 were reported to be irrecoverable. The net recoverable balance at the end of the year was Rs. 8,666 made up as follows:—

32. *Interest on arrears of land revenue (Statement No. 14).*—The total demand on account of interest on arrears of land revenue, including the balance at the beginning of the fasli, was Rs. 35,264, of which Rs. 30,959 were collected and Rs. 91 remitted, leaving a balance of Rs. 4,214, against Rs. 8,264 (revised figure) at the end of the previous fasli. The largest arrears are in Chittoor (Rs. 958) and Chingleput (Rs. 880).

33. *Sale of land under Standing Orders Nos. 15, 16, 20, 21, 22, 45, 90 and 91.*—Under the rules for the sale of occupancy rights in assessed waste lands (Standing Order No. 15), 1,141 acres, assessed at Rs. 1,806, were sold for Rs. 95,248; 28 acres of tank-bed lands, assessed at Rs. 103, were sold for Rs. 6,306 under Standing Order No. 16; 437 acres of waste lands assessed at Rs. 224 were sold for Rs. 18,088 under Standing Order No. 20; 28 acres of house-sites in towns were sold for Rs. 14,055 under Standing Order No. 21; 0.24 acre of house-site was sold under Standing Order No. 22 for Rs. 985; 1,337 acres assessed at Rs. 1,600, which had been bought in by Government at sales for arrears of revenue, were resold under Standing Order No. 45 for Rs. 8,114; 61 acres assessed at Rs. 201 which had been acquired for public purposes and were subsequently relinquished were sold under Standing Order No. 90 for Rs. 6,772; 39 acres assessed at Rs. 106 which had been acquired for railways and subsequently relinquished were sold under Standing Order No. 91 for Rs. 10,025; 22 acres of waste lands in Madras assessed at Rs. 157 were sold for Rs. 7,584, under the rules in G.O. No. 61, Revenue, dated 10th January 1902.

34. *Sub-division of quit-rent.*—No applications were received during the year under Standing Order No. 58 for the sub-division of the joint liability of shareholders

in whole inam villages or minor inams in any of the districts except Nellore, where the quit-rent of a shrotriem village of the Rapur taluk was split up and apportioned according to a decree of the District Munsif, Kavali.

35. *Transfer of registration of holdings.*—Transfers of revenue registration fall under the one or the other of the following three heads:—

- (1) Transfers applied for through officers of the Registration Department.
- (2) Transfers applied for direct to Revenue officers.
- (3) Transfers proposed by Revenue officers *suo motu*.

(1) Under the first head, 242,743 applications were received during the fasli against 85,409 in the previous fasli, an increase of 157,334 or 184.21 per cent. The increase, which is due to the introduction of the revised rules relating to transfer of revenue registry sanctioned in G.O. No. 3150, Revenue, dated 3rd November 1914, is distributed over all districts except Madura, and is especially large in Kistna (9,523), Guntūr (17,232), Cuddapah (6,878), Kurnool (6,004), Chingleput (9,976), Chittoor (5,022), North Arcot (10,286), South Arcot (14,041), Tanjore (12,312), Trichinopoly (12,672) and Tinnevely (12,929). In Madura, the fewness of the applications received is due to the fact that special staffs were working in the district during the fasli. Cases dealt with by the special staffs are excluded from the jamabandi return.

(2) The number of applications presented direct to Revenue officers was 70,372 as against 49,315 in fasli 1324, an increase of 21,057 or 42.69 per cent. Here also the increase is due to the introduction of the revised rules relating to transfer of revenue registry. There was an increase in 19 districts, the greater part of which occurred in Kistna (2,277), Guntūr (1,101), Anantapur (1,104), Kurnool (1,588), North Arcot (2,413) and Malabar (3,715).

(3) The number of cases which revenue officers dealt with on their own initiative under paragraphs 5 and 7 of Board's Standing Order No. 31 rose from 19,794 in fasli 1324 to 27,414 in fasli 1325. The largest increase was in Tanjore (2,700).

The total number of applications of all kinds to be dealt with in the fasli under report including the number pending disposal at its beginning was 379,474; of these 297,977 were disposed of during the fasli, leaving a balance of 81,497 pending at the close of the fasli; of these 4,134 have since been disposed of. Of the total number of applications disposed of during the fasli, 25,576 or 8.58 per cent were rejected and the rest accepted.

36. *Ruined tanks.*—During the year under report, no tanks were handed over to private individuals for repair under Board's Standing Order No. 8.

37. *Settlement by Collectors.*—The rule laid down in paragraph 2 of Board's Standing Order No. 12 that the settlement of each taluk should be conducted by the Collector himself once in five years, was complied with except as regards Narasapur and Nandigama in the Kistna district. The Collector of this district will be requested to take these taluks up for settlement during the current fasli.

38. *Loans and advances.*—The advances made under the Land Improvement Loans Act during fasli 1325 amounted to Rs. 2.40 lakhs and those under the Agriculturists' Loans Act to Rs. 5.11 lakhs. The aggregate amount advanced under both the Acts was thus Rs. 7.51 lakhs as against Rs. 8.18 lakhs in the previous year. The decrease is the net result of decreases in seventeen districts and of increases in seven districts. The decreases were considerable in Guntūr, Bellary, Anantapur, North Arcot, Salem, Trichinopoly, Madura and Rāmnād, while the increases were large in Tanjore and Coimbatore. While the decrease in most of the districts is ascribed by the Collectors to the favourable character of the season, that in Rāmnād is due mainly to the withdrawal of the Special officer to whose work in this district reference was made in the last year's report. The increase in Tanjore is explained to be due to the special attention paid to the subject of loans by the Collector Mr. Wood. The increase in Coimbatore has not been explained.

The effect of the relaxation of the loans rules to which attention was invited in the last year's review has not had time to manifest itself owing to the fact that the favourable character of the season under review tended to diminish the necessity for State loans.

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In order to facilitate the erection of pumping installations in this Presidency Government delegated to the Director of Agriculture towards the close of the fasli certain powers with regard to the grant of loans for that purpose. This delegation is independent of the powers to grant loans already possessed by officers of the Revenue Department under the ordinary loans rules. A Special Revenue officer of the rank of Tahsildar has also been attached to the Director of Agriculture as a temporary measure towards the furtherance of this work.

39. *Recoveries.*—Of the sums of Rs. 3.78 lakhs and Rs. 4.22 lakhs repayable during the year under the Land Improvement and Agriculturists' Loans Acts respectively on account of principal, Rs. 3.42 lakhs or 90 per cent under the former Act and Rs. 3.69 lakhs or 87 per cent under the latter Act were collected. Advances amounting to Rs. 19,157 under the former Act and Rs. 18,628 under the latter Act were repaid by borrowers on account of loans, the repayment of which had not fallen due while sums amounting to Rs. 2,573 under the former Act and Rs. 402 under the latter Act were written off the accounts as irrecoverable.

40. *Coercive processes.*—The aggregate amount of principal and interest repayable during the year under both the Acts was Rs. 11,34,708, of which a sum of Rs. 2,69,278 or 24 per cent was collected without resort to coercion and a sum of Rs. 6,89,373 or 61 per cent after the issue of demand; a sum of Rs. 39,294 was realized after attachment but before sale, a sum of Rs. 1,859 by the sale of moveable property and a sum of Rs. 13,466 by the sale of immoveable property. The balance outstanding at the end of the year was Rs. 1,21,438, the arrears being heaviest in Tanjore (Rs. 24,039), Madura (Rs. 19,861), Anantapur (Rs. 16,689) and South Arcot (Rs. 13,577).

41. The following statement shows the amount of interest payable by the Local Government to the Government of India for fasli 1325:—

43. With the aid of loans under the Land Improvement Loans Act, 433 wells capable of irrigating 2,076 acres of land were constructed during the fasli at an aggregate cost of Rs. 1,21,777 against 435 wells costing Rs. 1,21,375 during the

previous year and 326 wells designed to benefit 1,600 acres were repaired at a cost of Rs. 73,490 against 349 wells costing Rs. 75,567 in the preceding year; Rs. 34,595 were spent on the reclamation of 1,200 acres against Rs. 52,157 in the previous year; Rs. 34,900 were expended on the purchase and installation of oil-engines and pumps in the districts of Cuddapah, South Arcot, Coimbatore, Madura and Rāmnād against Rs. 20,200 in the year previous, and Rs. 21,273 were spent on other improvements benefiting about 1,275 acres. The Coimbatore district shows the largest number of wells constructed and repaired (138) and it is followed by Rāmnād (129) and Tinnevely (108). Under the Agriculturists' Loans Act, 7,871 head of cattle were purchased at an aggregate cost of Rs. 5,14,980 against 7,167 head of cattle at a cost of Rs. 4,67,671 last year while 36 houses were rebuilt at a cost of Rs. 7,585 against 119 houses rebuilt at a cost of Rs. 22,991 in the preceding year. Seed-grain was purchased for Rs. 1,965 against Rs. 2,382 expended last year in the same direction, while Rs. 1,150 were expended on sugarcane mills against Rs. 500 incurred under the same head last year. A sum of Rs. 14,363 was spent for other purposes against Rs. 25,290 under the same head last year.

44. *Survey advances.**—The advances drawn by Collectors during the year under the head "Revenue Survey advances—Collectors" amounted to Rs. 54,201 against Rs. 63,300 in the previous year. The decrease in the total amount drawn by Collectors as compared with the previous year was due to the fact that at the beginning of 1915 the Board issued special instructions for the revision of survey advances prescribing at the same time a definite scale for the stocking of stones in depots and requiring Collectors to avoid fresh indents for stones till the stock in depots was brought down to the prescribed scale.

Of the total amount of advances outstanding against Collectors under this head, a sum of Rs. 64,284 was adjusted during the year leaving the net debit under "Revenue Survey advances—Collectors" at Rs. 3,60,116.

Under the head "Cost of survey marks—Collectors" Rs. 40,225 were collected during the year leaving a balance of Rs. 7,448 to be realized.

The arrears outstanding at the beginning of the year under the head "Cost of Survey marks—Survey Officers" were Rs. 1,22,054.† Fresh landholders' bills to the amount of Rs. 1,67,500 were received from survey officers during the year. Of the total demand of Rs. 2,89,554 under this head, Rs. 1,91,736 were collected during the year leaving a sum of Rs. 97,818 to be collected at the end of the year.

47. *Growth of subletting in ryotwari tracts.*—Subletting is chiefly resorted to by those engaged in professions other than agriculture and by large landholders. It is reported to be on the increase in Ganjām, in the area under the Periyār in Madura and in the Hosdrug division of the Kasaragod taluk of the South Canara district where lands are sublet for the cultivation of pepper. In the remaining portions of the South Canara district, the system of subletting is reported to be on the decrease as the landlords find home-farm cultivation more profitable. The tendency to increase the number of subordinate interests in a particular piece of land seemed greater in North Malabar than in South. Subletting is the general practice in Tinnevely and in the delta taluks of Guntūr. In parts of Kistna, a tendency though not very marked was noticed among land-owners to decrease subletting as they apprehended the initiation of legislation similar to the Estates Land Act conferring occupancy rights on tenants.

48. *Effect of recent legislation on the people.*—No legislation affecting the people generally was introduced during the year under report. The provisions of the Madras Estates Land Act (I of 1908) are becoming better known to the people and this and the Madras Land Encroachment Act (III of 1905) appear to have been working smoothly on the whole. The Madras Decentralization Act (VIII of 1914) which empowered tahsildars and deputy tahsildars to pass orders on unauthorised occupation and water-rate cases has minimised a large amount of scriptory work both in the divisional and taluk offices and has resulted in the prompt disposal of B. memoranda and water-rate statements. It has also contributed to the speedy collection of revenue and prompt preparation of jamabandi accounts. The system in general has not affected the ryots adversely and there have not been any serious complaints against the orders of tahsildars and deputy tahsildars passed under these powers. It is reported that the Act worked satisfactorily.

49. *Co-operative Societies.*—Two hundred and sixty-three societies were registered under the Co-operative Societies Act during the year under report; of these, 1 was a central bank, 11 were administrative unions, 221 agricultural and 30 non-agricultural societies. During the same period, 63 societies were dissolved; of these 62 were agricultural and 1 was non-agricultural. The total number of societies in the Presidency at the end of the year 1915-16 was 1,800 against 1,600 at the end of 1914-15.

50. *Enhanced water-cess for irregular irrigation.*—G.O. No. 684, Revenue, dated 7th March 1913, directed that ryots who had rendered themselves liable to the imposition of enhanced water-cess for the irregular use of Government water should be given previous notice of their liability. The system was tried in all the districts except Madras, Malabar, Anjengo, South Canara and the Nilgiris to which it is not applicable. The system is reported to have worked well and to have resulted in the prompt investigation of objections and consequent reduction in the number of water-rate appeals. The Collector of Guntūr, however, states that in his experience the notice is an empty formality to which the ryots pay no attention and adds that until the maximum penalty is levied it is usually well worth their while to go on taking the water irregularly if they cannot get it otherwise. The Collector of Anantapur reports that many ryots being illiterate do not profit by the system but it is gradually coming to be understood. On the whole, the Collectors are of opinion that the system is advantageous to the ryot as it serves to inform him in time of his liability to pay the enhanced charge and gives him facilities for making such representations as he may consider necessary, and they suggest its continuance till the average ryot thoroughly understands the necessity to put in his application in time.

51. *Tank-bed cultivation.*—During the year under report, permission was accorded by Collectors for the cultivation of tank-bed lands with dry food crops or cucumbers in the districts of Cuddapah, Anantapur, Trichinopoly, Madura and Tinnevely. In Cuddapah, the conditions of the permission were transgressed and indigo crops instead of dry food crops were raised with the result that the occupation was heavily penalised. The cultivation was not, however, beneficial to the ryots as the crop was submerged. Unauthorized cases of cultivation of tank-bed lands in Cuddapah, Trichinopoly, Madura and Tinnevely were all penalised. In North Arcot and Coimbatore also, there were cases of unauthorized occupation of tank-bed lands; in the former district, the occupation was dealt with by eviction and by the imposition of severe penalties. In cases of authorised occupations the highest dry rate of the village was charged. It is reported that the cultivation did not in any way affect the tank-beds.

52. *Examination of village and taluk accounts.*—The accounts were found to have been fairly well maintained and disclosed generally no serious errors. The defects noticed were generally pointed out and rectified at the time.

53. *The Taluk and Village statistical registers.*—Taluk statistical registers prescribed in the manual issued with B.P. No. 475, dated 15th October 1912, are maintained in the districts of Nilgiris, South Canara, Malabar and Anjengo as village statistical registers are inapplicable to them. Village statistical registers have to be

maintained in all the other districts except Madras, which is not a rural district. The subjoined statement shows the progress made in the writing up and checking of these registers up to and during fasli 1325 (1915-16):—

The work has been completed or practically completed for fasli 1325 in the districts of Vizagapatam, Guntūr, Cuddapah, Kurnool, Chittoor, South Arcot, Trichinopoly, Rāmṇād, Tinnevely, Coimbatore and Salem. While in the following districts it is still largely in arrears in spite of special attempts made by the Board during the fasli for its completion:—Ganjām, Godavari, Kistna, Anantapur, Chingleput, North Arcot, Tanjore and Madura. Some Collectors seem to be under the impression that the entries in these registers relating to a particular fasli cannot be checked till after the completion of the jamabandi for the next fasli. This impression is erroneous. There is no reason why these registers cannot be fully written up at the time of the final jamabandi and checked by the taluk staff with a view to the result of the check being reported to the Collector simultaneously with the submission of the other jamabandi returns. Necessary instructions will be issued separately on this matter to Collectors.

54. *Minor irrigation.*—Statement No. 19 shows the number of irrigation works in charge of the Revenue Department, the number repaired and the amount spent on them during the official year ending 31st March 1916. It also shows the number proposed for repairs during the official year ending 31st March 1917. This statement was prescribed by Government in paragraph 2 of their Order No. 532, Revenue, dated 8th March 1916, and takes the place of the quinquennial statement of irrigation works, the publication of which in this report was abolished in G.O. No. 2577, Revenue, dated 5th September 1914.

55. *Pattas.*—Statement No. 20 shows the number of pattas of various values held in the several districts of the Presidency for fasli 1325 (1915-16). Excluding Madras where revenue derived consists mainly of quit-rent imposed on house-sites, the total number of pattas held during the fasli amounted to 4,222,543 or 409,722 more than in the quinquennium ending fasli 1320 (1910-11). The increase occurred in all the districts except Nellore and Malabar and was large in the following five districts: (1) Guntūr (39,052), (2) Chittoor (36,150), (3) North Arcot (74,368), (4) South Arcot (39,852) and (5) Madura (29,154). These districts together contributed an increase of 218,606 or 53 per cent of the total increase. In

Chittoor and North Arcot the increase was due to the introduction of resettlement; in Guntūr, South Arcot and Madura it was due to the revision of revenue registry made by the Special Revenue staff working in the districts. The decreases in Nellore and Malabar are too small to call for remarks. Of the total increase, 210,831 relate to single pattas and 198,891 to joint pattas. The bulk of the increase under single and joint pattas is confined to pattas paying Rs. 10 and less a year, which amount to 327,047 or about 80 per cent of the total increase. Of the total number of pattas held, more than two-thirds were assessed each at Rs. 10 and less; the gross assessment thereon being Rs. 1,02,56,846. The average rate for a patta works out to Rs. 3½. The bulk of the lands covered by these petty holdings are dry (7,559,379 acres) and the average area of a patta paying Rs. 10 and less comes to about 2.6 acres.

56. *Conference with ryots.*—In almost all districts conferences with ryots were held by Collectors and Divisional officers during their tours or at the time of the jamabandi.

NOTE.—(1) The area and the assessment thereon given in this statement differ from those given in columns 27, 29 and 32 of statement No. 3 against Chingleput, Chittoor, North Arcot, Tinnevely and Malabar. In Chingleput, the variation is due to the exclusion from this statement of these particulars for rented villages; in Chittoor, it is due to the exclusion from this statement of the particulars relating to the Punganur division; in North Arcot, it is due to the exclusion from this statement of these particulars for Arni and Kuppam divisions; in Malabar, it is due to the exclusion from this statement of these particulars for lease-hold lands in Cochin. The Collector of Tinnevely has not explained the variation.

(2) The number of ryotwari pattas given in this statement differs from that given in Collector's statement No. 1 against Tinnevely and Malabar. In Malabar, the variation is due to the cause mentioned in note (1). The Collector of Tinnevely has not explained the variation.
