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PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD OF REVENUE

(REVENUE SETTLEMENT, SURVEY, LAND RECORDS AND AGRICULTURE).

Resolution—No. 45, dated 26th March 1920.

The Board begs to submit its report on the settlement of land revenue in the Presidency for fasli 1328 (1918-19), together with the prescribed statements. The delay in the submission of this review was due to the fact that the report from South Arcot was received so late as 12th March 1920. The circumstances that led to its late submission have already been explained in Board's Reference No. Gl. 317/20-1, dated 28th January 1920.

2. *Season, rainfall and prices.*—The south-west monsoon commenced unusually early about the middle of May with very heavy rains on the west coast and good showers in Ganjam, Vizagapatam, the Deccan, the Carnatic, the Hills and the central group of districts except Coimbatore and Trichinopoly. In June, the rainfall was in considerable defect in the majority of districts and the rains in July and August also proved disappointing in nearly all the districts with the result that transplantation was delayed almost everywhere. In September, however, there were good showers in Guntur, Nellore and the Deccan which gave fresh impetus to agricultural operations in those tracts. On the whole, the total rainfall during the south-west monsoon was below the average throughout the Presidency. The north-east monsoon was late and did not develop until November; the rainfall during that month was above the average in all the districts except Ganjam and Vizagapatam (Agency). In Tanjore, the rainfall was exceptionally heavy, and considerable areas in the lower parts of the delta were submerged with the result that seedbeds and lately transplanted crops suffered. The total rainfall during the north-east monsoon exceeded the average in the Carnatic, the South, Coimbatore, Trichinopoly, the west coast and the Hills and fell short of it elsewhere. In the majority of the districts, the dry weather rains were above, and the hot weather rains below, the average. On the whole, the season was unfavourable from an agricultural point of view. Generally the south-west monsoon was a failure and the north-east monsoon late, so that dry crops with few exceptions were poor all through. The conditions in the majority of the tracts which were affected most by these causes changed for the better subsequently on account of the useful showers in January. The only districts in which relief operations under the Famine Code were found necessary were Ganjam and Kistna. In Kistna, the distress was slight and was confined to a portion of one taluk, and did not however, pass the stage of test. In Ganjam, the distress was severe and more widespread covering an area of more than a thousand square miles in its northern portion; this area, after being kept under test for some time, was classed as famine area.

The average annual retail prices of the staple food-grains were higher than those of the preceding year and were also considerably above the normal rates. The price of rice was above the warning rates in all the districts except Godavari, Kistna, Salem and the Nilgiris and even above the scarcity rates in Madura and Tinnevely; that of ragi was dearer than the warning rates in all the districts except Ganjam, Vizagapatam and Chingleput and even dearer than the scarcity rates in Anantapur and Madras; that of cholam was dearer than the warning rates everywhere and dearer than the scarcity rates in all the districts except Godavari, Kistna, Trichinopoly, Madura and Ramnad; and that of cumbu was dearer than the warning rates in all the districts except Ramnad and dearer than the scarcity rates in Guntur, Kurnool, Anantapur, Cuddapah, Nellore, North Arcot and Salem. The normal, warning and scarcity rates here adopted for comparison were those fixed by Government in their Order No. 2108, Revenue, dated 31st May 1918. The standardized form of statement No. I provides columns for normal rates alone, but in the statement appended hereto, the Board has taken the liberty to depart from this form by showing warning and scarcity rates as well in order to furnish useful information which is required under present conditions.

3. *Cropped area*.—The total cropped area of the year under report (36,047,000 acres) fell below the normal area (39,032,000 acres) by 2,985,000 acres. As compared with the normal, all the crops except sugarcane, cotton and tobacco showed large decreases. The decrease was generally due to the unfavourable season. The decrease under cumbu was chiefly due to the preference shown by the ryots for cotton. As compared with the previous year, there was an increase under cholam and a large increase under cotton and a large decrease under paddy, cumbu, ragi, gingelly, groundnut and indigo. The increase under cholam was due to the preference shown by the ryots to grow cholam in the place of cumbu, while that under cotton is attributed to the high prices prevailing. The decrease under indigo was due to the fall in its price and that under groundnut to the preference given by the ryots to the cultivation of cotton.

Of a total of 398 cases, the outturn was above normal in 63 cases and was normal in 16. It ranged from 75 to 99 per cent of the normal in 253 cases and from 40 to 74 per cent in 65 cases and 17 per cent in the remaining one case.

4. *Condition of cattle*.—The total number of deaths from diseases among horned cattle showed an increase of 6,096 as compared with the previous year, the total for the year being 76,114. The increase was due to rinderpest, there having been a fall in the number of deaths from other diseases. The mortality under rinderpest alone was 44,164 against 30,733 in the previous year. The districts which were affected most by this disease were Anantapur, North Arcot, South Arcot, Chingleput, Tanjore, Madura and Tinnevely; additional Veterinary Assistants were posted to combat the disease.

5. *Number of villages*.—In the year under report, there was a nett decrease of ten villages as a result of decreases in Kistna (2) and Madura (13) and increases in Nellore (3) and Chingleput (2). The decrease in Kistna was due to the clubbing of four villages in the Bezvada taluk into two for account purposes, and that in Madura to the regrouping of villages at resettlement. In Nellore, Ipūr village of the Nellore taluk and Kōta and Gūdūr villages of the Gūdūr taluk were split into two bits each, while in Chingleput the inam village of Erivakkam in the Conjeeveram taluk was resumed and transferred to ryotwari and Conjeeveram village was split into two for administrative conveniences.

6. The land revenue of the Presidency is derived from the undermentioned sources:—

- (a) peshkash or revenue from permanently-settled estates;
- (b) shrotriyam jodi or quit-rent levied on inam villages;
- (c) assessment including water-rate on lands held under the ryotwari system;
- (d) miscellaneous revenue; and
- (e) proprietary estates village service.

7. *Peshkash or revenue from permanently-settled estates*.—The total amount of peshkash payable during the fasli was Rs. 49,85,666 against Rs. 49,92,012 in the preceding year. The decrease of Rs. 3,346 is the net result of:—

8. The quit-rent payable on villages held on shrotriyam or favourable tenure was Rs. 7,56,320 or Rs. 335 less than in the previous fasli. The following are the reasons for the change:—

9. *Holdings*.—The total extent of ryotwari holdings during the year was 25·97 million acres which exceeded that of the previous year by 78,001 acres. The increase was contributed by all the districts except Cuddapah, Kurnool and Salem, Kurnool alone showing a decrease of 7,370 acres owing to the relinquishment of considerable extents of dry lands of poor soil in some of the taluks of the district during the year. The increase was marked in the districts of Anantapur, South Arcot and South Kanara.

10. *Assessment*.—The total assessment on holdings was Rs. 531·14 lakhs against Rs. 522·60 lakhs in the previous year, showing an increase of Rs. 8,54,331 which was contributed by all the districts except Cuddapah and Kurnool. South Arcot and Madura alone were responsible for an increase of Rs. 7,73,963 or about 90 per cent of the total, which was due mostly to the introduction of resettlement rates during the year in portions of the two districts.

11. *Cultivation*.—As compared with the previous year, the total area cropped on ryotwari holdings showed a decrease of 973,397 acres under dry and 243,987 acres under wet. There were noticeable decreases in Anantapur and Bellary under dry and in Tanjore under wet, which were due generally to the unfavourable character of the season. Tinnevely, however, showed a large increase of 24,936 acres under dry which was due to the favourable north-east monsoon. Dry waste charged showed an increase of 998,302 acres, the increases in Anantapur and Bellary having been particularly large. Wet waste charged increased by 105,872 acres, the districts of South Arcot, Tanjore and South Kanara alone contributing 60,578 acres. Wet waste remitted also increased by 194,279 acres. The increase in Anantapur (22,011 acres), North Arcot (44,927 acres) and Tanjore (52,671 acres) was marked. Including the area under 'Miscellaneous cultivation,' the total area cropped amounted to 19·96 million acres against 21·53 million acres in the previous year.

12. *Water-rate and second-crop charge*.—The revenue from these sources amounted to Rs. 30·92 lakhs against Rs. 39·40 lakhs or Rs. 8,48,125 less than in the previous year. There were large decreases under both the heads together in Anantapur, North Arcot, South Arcot and Madura; in the first three districts, the decrease was due to the unfavourable character of the season and in Madura to the fact that almost all "dry to wet" lands in the Periyar area were transferred to wet at resettlement in the taluks of Madura, Melūr and Nilakkōttai. There was, however, a large increase in Kistna due to an extension in the second crop area irrigated.

13. *Remissions*.—As compared with the previous year, there were increases under all the three heads 'season remissions', 'fixed remissions' and 'beriz deductions', resulting in a total increase of Rs. 20,77,395.

(i) *Season remissions*.—The remissions under this head showed a nett increase of Rs. 10·46 lakhs. The increase occurred under all the sub-heads except 'Injury by floods'.

(a) *Waste remitted*.—The remission under this head amounted to Rs. 11·66 lakhs or Rs. 9·98 lakhs more than in the previous year. The increase was marked in

the districts of North Arcot and Tanjore and was due to the unfavourable character of the season. A sum of Rs. 5,130 was remitted on 2,904 acres of dry land in Ganjam under G.O. Mis. No. 1026, Revenue, dated 2nd May 1919.

(b) *Shavi or short crop*.—The total amount remitted under this head was Rs. 6,38,475 against Rs. 40,058 in the previous year, showing a nett increase of Rs. 5,98,407. The increase was due generally to the unfavourable character of the season and was marked in the districts of Ganjam (Rs. 1,24,746) and North Arcot (Rs. 1,06,416). Of the total remission under the head, Rs. 6,30,631 related to wet lands and Rs. 7,844 to dry lands. A remission of Rs. 41,891 was granted under 'short crop' during the year under report.

(c) *Tirvakanni remissions* (i.e., the remission of the difference between wet and dry assessment on wet land cultivated with dry crops owing to the insufficiency or failure of water-supply) amounted to Rs. 6,29,132 against Rs. 1,20,866 in the previous year, showing a nett increase of Rs. 5,08,266. The increase was due to the abnormal failure of rains and was marked in North Arcot (Rs. 1,14,816) and Salem (Rs. 94,176).

(d) *Injury by floods*.—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 11,845 against Rs. 91,334 in the preceding year, showing a nett decrease of Rs. 79,489. The decrease in Kistna (Rs. 79,546) was marked.

(i) *Fixed remissions* (i.e., abatement of the demand granted for reasons unconnected with the season) amounted to Rs. 1.49 lakhs against Rs. 1.32 lakhs in the previous year, showing a nett increase of Rs. 16,897. The increase occurred under increment remissions (i.e., remissions allowed on the introduction of settlements or resettlements in cases where the increase over the old assessment was in excess of 25 per cent). It was marked in the Madura district (Rs. 28,338) and was due to the introduction of the resettlement rates of assessment in the taluks of Madura, Melur, Tirumangalam and Periyakulam and in the Periyar areas of Nilakkottai.

(ii) *Beris deduction*.—(Deductions made from village collections in favour of inamdar and religious institutions) amounted to Rs. 8.98 lakhs against Rs. 8.62 lakhs in the previous year, showing a nett increase of Rs. 16,035. The increase occurred mainly under the head 'payment for religious institutions in lieu of cash payments' and was particularly large in South Arcot (Rs. 11,056) and Tinnevely (Rs. 11,988).

14. *Miscellaneous revenue*.—The revenue under this head amounted to Rs. 95.54 lakhs against Rs. 98.02 lakhs in the previous year, showing a nett decrease of Rs. 2.48 lakhs.

Among the several sub-heads under this head, item 4 'enhanced water-rate on lands irregularly irrigated' and item 5 'charges levied for occupation (with or without application) of assessed and unassessed lands for which no pattas have been granted' showed large decreases, Rs. 1,51,592 and Rs. 1,91,287 respectively, while item 13 'other items' showed a large increase, Rs. 1,70,389. The decrease of Rs. 49,765 under item 6 'charges levied for occupation of poramboke land' demands notice. All these items are dealt with in detail below. The decreases or increases under the remaining items were small and call for no remarks.

Item 4.—'Enhanced water-rate on lands irregularly irrigated'.—The revenue under this head amounted to Rs. 4.68 lakhs against Rs. 6.19 lakhs in the previous year, showing a nett decrease of Rs. 1.51 lakhs. The decrease was marked in Kistna (Rs. 1,10,249) and was due to the non-imposition of an enhanced charge on lands irregularly irrigated on account of the grant of general permission to irrigate lands whenever possible.

Item 5.—'Sivayi-jama assessment on assessed and unassessed lands'.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 5.63 lakhs against Rs. 7.59 lakhs in the previous year, showing a nett decrease of Rs. 1.91 lakhs. The decrease was marked in the districts of Kistna (Rs. 37,996) and Anantapur (Rs. 45,944). In the former district, it was due to the decrease in the extent encroached upon Government waste as the ryots left their own lands waste on account of the bad season, while, in the latter, it was the inevitable result of the failure of the monsoons.

Item 6.—'Poramboke occupation'.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 5.16 lakhs against Rs. 5.66 lakhs or Rs. 0.50 lakh less than in the previous year. Largest decreases occurred in Kistna (Rs. 12,105) and Coimbatore (Rs. 9,454) and

they were due to the giving up of encroachments to a great extent on account of heavy penalties in previous years; while Trichinopoly (Rs. 5,368) showed the largest increase and it was due to the increase in the area of poramboke lands occupied during the year in the taluks of Perambalur, Udaiyarpalayam and Karur.

Enhanced charges amounting to Rs. 3,01,567 were levied on 23,750 acres against Rs. 3,59,147 on 32,463 acres in the previous year, yielding an incidence of Rs. 13 per acre against Rs. 11 in the preceding year. Tanjore, Madura and South Kanara showed the highest average rates (Rs. 60, Rs. 41 and Rs. 47 per acre), and this was due to the imposition of heavy penalties to compel the occupants to give up their encroachments.

As regards the progress made in the reclassification of porambokes, there are no such lands to be reclassified in Madras, Malabar and Anjengo; it is completed or nearly completed in all the districts except Ganjam, Godavari, Anantapur, Kurnool, Chittoor, Tanjore, Trichinopoly, Rannad, and The Nilgiris, where reclassification is reported to be in progress. In the matter of dealing with encroachments on real porambokes, the provisions of section 6 of Madras Act III of 1905 were resorted to in the districts of Ganjam, Guntur, Kurnool, Nellore, Chingleput, North Arcot, Tinnevely, Salem and South Kanara. The Collectors of most of the remaining districts have furnished no specific information on the point.

Item 13.—'Revenue under other items'.—The amount under this head was Rs. 7.05 lakhs against Rs. 5.35 lakhs in the previous year, showing a nett increase of Rs. 1.70 lakhs. Nellore (Rs. 93,782) and South Kanara (Rs. 69,556) together contributed an increase of Rs. 1,63,338. The increase in the former district was mainly due to the collection of a large amount of Rs. 87,981 under mica revenue against a sum of Rs. 800 in the previous year and in the latter to the realization of an amount of Rs. 74,967 by the sale of Laccadive coir against Rs. 14,424 in the previous year.

15. The nett ryotwari demand excluding remissions but including water-rate, second crop charge and miscellaneous revenue amounted to Rs. 622.38 lakhs against Rs. 645.57 lakhs in the previous year. The details for the decrease of Rs. 23.19 lakhs are given below:—

The variations are small and call for no remarks.

18. *Demand and collection of land revenue and cesses (current).*—The current demand under land revenue and cesses was Rs. 7,61,13,151. Rs. 7,38,42,146 or 97 per cent was collected within the fasli and a sum of Rs. 1,786 was written off the accounts.

19. *Demand and collection of arrears.*—The total arrear demand under all the heads was Rs. 13,43,983. Rs. 11,95,716 or 89 per cent was collected within the fasli and Rs. 86,200 or 2·7 per cent was written off the accounts.

20. *Total balance of land revenue and cesses.*—The balance outstanding at the end of the fasli including both arrears and current was Rs. 23,81,286. As finally reported in the monthly demand, collection and balance statements for January 1920, the balance at the beginning of fasli 1329 was Rs. 23,51,268.

Up to the end of January 1920 Rs. 20,30,335 had been collected, Rs. 58,005 written off the accounts, Rs. 636 ordered to be written off and recommendation had been made to write off Rs. 1,274. The nett recoverable balance on 1st February 1920 was Rs. 2,60,968. Steps have been taken to collect this amount.

21. *Reconciliation of differences between the collection of land revenue and cesses as shown in the jamabandi and the Accountant-General's statements and overpayments.*—The subject will be dealt with in a separate report.

22. *Distribution of collections between land revenue and cesses.*—Land revenue and cesses are collected together and no attempt is made to exhibit the collections separately under these heads in the village accounts. The distribution of the total collections between land revenue and the several cesses is effected in each Collector's office. In this process there are two stages: first, a provisional distribution is effected by crediting to each head month by month so much of the total collections as will bear the same proportion to the demand under the head as the total collections bear to the total demand under all the heads. The second stage is the final adjustment, which consists in correcting the provisional credit by transfer from one head to another, where necessary, after the demand for the year under all the heads has been collected or written off.

The statements of distribution for fasli 1323 received from Collectors show that, except in the districts of Kistna, Guntur, Nellore, Bellary, Anantapur, Chittoor, Chingleput, South Arcot, North Arcot and Tanjore, the variations between the amounts due to the cesses in fasli 1328 and the amounts actually credited were inconsiderable. The accounts for fasli 1327 were not finally adjusted except in five districts.

23. *Charges debitable to land revenue.*—The charges of district administration, including salaries and allowances of revenue inspectors but excluding those of village establishments, were Rs. 57,37,333 or 7·8 per cent of the land revenue and cesses realized. The ratio was 6·8 in the preceding fasli. The village service charges (including proprietary estates) during the fasli were Rs. 70,09,431. Including this sum, the total charges were Rs. 1,27,46,814 or 17·3 per cent of the collections of land revenue and cesses.

24. *Processes under Act II of 1864.*—Statement No. 12 shows the particulars of the coercive processes issued for the realisation of Government dues under Act II of 1864. The following abstract compares the number of processes of each kind issued during the year with the figures for the three preceding faslis:—

There has been a gradual decrease in the total number of processes.

25. *Demand notices.*—The rule that these notices should only be issued when absolutely necessary has been kept in view. There was a decrease in sixteen districts and an increase in nine districts. The increase is marked in the district of Madura.

26. *Distrain or attachment.*—The number of processes under this head was 89,868 against 71,941 in fasli 1327 and 51,216 in fasli 1326. There was an increase in fourteen districts. It was marked in the districts of Nellore, Anantapur, North Arcot, South Arcot, Trichinopoly and South Kanara.

The increase in Trichinopoly is due to the adoption of the number of defaulters instead of the number of notices as in the previous year. The increase in the remaining districts was chiefly due to the unfavourable character of the season.

27. Compared with the previous fasli there was a further increase in the percentage borne by the number of distrains and attachments to that of demand notices.

The number of defaulters whose immovable property was attached in the year was 16,833 against 10,752 in fasli 1327. In the Madura district a large disproportion is noticeable, as in the previous years, between the number of defaulters whose personal property was distrained (331) and the number of those whose real property was attached (4,375): it is due, as in former years, to the fact that many of the owners of the lands irrigated by the Periyar are absentee pattadars.

28. *Sale notices.*—Out of 89,868 defaulters whose property was attached, 55,020 or 61·22 per cent paid the arrears before the sale notices were issued. The percentage was 38·45 in fasli 1327, 23·42 in fasli 1326 and 35·41 in fasli 1325.

29. *Sales.*—The number of defaulters whose property was sold is less than in fasli 1327. The percentage of actual sales to sale notices was 12·54 against 9·95 in fasli 1327 and the percentage of defaulters whose property was actually sold to the total number of pattas was 0·10 against 0·11 in the preceding fasli. The subjoined statement compares the particulars of sales in fasli 1328 with the figures for the three preceding faslis:—

Value of lands sold.—Immovable property of the estimated value of Rs. 2,59,940 was sold for the recovery of arrears amounting to Rs. 49,081 and realized Rs. 84,677. The price fetched by lands sold to private individuals amounted on the average to four times the assessment in the case of dry lands and seven times the assessment in the case of wet lands. In fasli 1327 immovable property of the estimated value of Rs. 1,52,456 was sold for the recovery of arrears amounting to Rs. 36,971 and the average price fetched by lands sold to private individuals was five times the assessment in the case of dry lands and six times the assessment in the case of wet lands.

Extent of lands sold.—The extent of lands sold during the year was 14,314 acres under 'dry' and 2,450 acres under 'wet' against 8,156 acres under 'dry' and 1,700 acres under 'wet' in fasli 1327. The corresponding figures for fasli 1326 were 5,399 acres under 'dry' and 1,188 acres under 'wet'.

Lands bought in by Government.—The total area of lands bought in by Government for want of bidders was 5,567 acres of 'dry' and 456 acres of wet against 2,092 acres of 'dry' and 469 acres of 'wet' in fasli 1327. More than half the total area bought in was in Bellary, Kurnool and Cuddapah.

30. *Process-service establishments.*—Statement No. 13 gives the particulars of processes served by the ordinary village agency or by special establishments and the fees realized during the year. The total number of processes served was 842,366 or 108,653 less than in fasli 1327. The number of processes served by special agency (29,002) was also less than in the previous fasli (30,354).

Special establishments were employed in the same districts as in fasli 1327. Their cost was covered by the fees realized, except in Vizagapatam where there was a deficit.

31. *Costs in Civil Suits.*—Rupees 16,046 were awarded to Government as costs during the year. Including Rs. 70,253, the revised opening balance, the total demand was Rs. 86,299 of which Rs. 16,587 were collected, Rs. 260 were written off the accounts, and Rs. 350 were reported to be irrecoverable. The nett recoverable balance at the end of the year was Rs. 69,102 made up as follows:—

32. *Interest on arrears of land revenue (Statement No. 14).*—The total demand on account of interest on arrears of land revenue, including the balance at the beginning of the fasli was Rs. 17,933 of which Rs. 8,291 were collected and Rs. 95 remitted leaving a balance of Rs. 9,547 against Rs. 5,911 at the end of the previous fasli. The largest arrears are in Nellore (1,257), Chingleput (1,067), Chittoor (1,663), Tanjore (1,219) and Salem (1,265).

33. *Sale of land under Board's Standing Orders Nos. 15, 16, 20, 21, 45, 90, 91 and 197.*—Under the rules for the sale of occupancy rights in the waste lands (Standing Order No. 15) 4,873 acres assessed at Rs. 14,610 were sold for Rs. 4,34,903; 363 acres of tank-bed lands assessed at Rs. 2,423 were sold for Rs. 1,82,909 under Standing Order No. 16; 36 acres of waste lands assessed at Rs. 49 were sold for Rs. 515 under Standing Order No. 20; 40 acres of house-sites in towns were sold for Rs. 15,714 under Standing Order No. 21; 1,131 acres of land assessed at Rs. 966, which had been bought in by Government at sales for arrears of revenue, were resold under Standing Order No. 45 for Rs. 1,864; 50 acres assessed at Rs. 71 which had been acquired for public purposes and were subsequently relinquished were sold under Standing Order No. 90 for Rs. 3,570; 160 acres of land assessed at Rs. 326 which were acquired for railways and subsequently relinquished were sold under Standing Order No. 91 for Rs. 22,454; 10 acres of escheated land assessed at Rs. 13 were sold under Standing Order No. 197 for Rs. 11; 2 acres of waste lands in Madras

assessed at Rs. 54 were sold for Rs. 9,552 under the rules published with G.O. No. 61, Revenue, dated 11th January 1902.

34. *Subdivision of quit-rent.*—No applications were received during the year under Standing Order No. 58 for the subdivision of the joint liability of shareholders in whole inam villages or minor inams in any of the districts of the presidency.

35. *Transfer of registration of holdings.*—Transfers of revenue registration fall under one or other of the following three heads:—

- (1) transfers applied for through officers of the Registration department,
- (2) transfers applied for direct to Revenue officers, and
- (3) transfers effected by Revenue officers of their own motion.

(1) Under the first head, 295,028 applications were received during the fasli against 272,931 in the previous fasli, an increase of 22,097 or 8.09 per cent. The bulk of the increase occurred in the districts of Gōdāvari, Kistna, Guntūr, North Arcot, Trichinopoly, Madura, Tinnevely and Salem.

(2) The number of applications presented direct to Revenue officers was 54,501 as against 54,456 in fasli 1327.

(3) The number of cases which Revenue officers dealt with on their own initiative under paragraphs 5 and 7 of Board's Standing Order No. 31 fell from 23,125 in fasli 1327 to 21,375 in fasli 1328. The largest decrease was in Tanjore but this district continues to give by far the largest number of cases.

The total number of applications of all kinds to be dealt with in the fasli under report, including the number pending disposal at its beginning was 489,349; of these 335,149 were disposed of during the fasli, leaving a balance of 154,200 pending at the close of the fasli. Of the total number of applications disposed of during the fasli 4,710 were transferred to the Special Settlement staff for disposal and 14,003 or 4.44 per cent were rejected.

The percentage of pendency is high in the districts of Ganjām, Guntūr, Nellore, Cuddapah, Kurnool, Trichinopoly and Madura.

36. *Ruined tanks.*—In the year under report a tank in the Chittoor district was handed over to private persons for repair under Board's Standing Order No. 8. Its area was 13.70 acres and was assessed at Rs. 2 per acre.

37. *Settlement by Collectors.*—The rule laid down in paragraph 2 of Board's Standing Order No. 12 that the settlement of each taluk should be conducted by the Collector himself once in five years was complied with except as regards (1) the Government villages of the Udayagiri Agency in Chokkapad khandam of Ganjām, (2) the Golconda taluk of Vizagapatam, (3) Chodavaram and Polavaram of Gōdāvari, (4) the taluks of Narasapur, Gannavaram, Nandigama, Bezvada, Bandar, Tiruvur and Bhimavaram of Kistna and (5) the taluks of Tiruchengōdu and Namakkal of Salem. As regards items (1) and (2), the Board, on reports made to it in 1919 by the Collectors concerned, permitted them to postpone conducting jamabandi personally until fasli 1330 in the former case and for one year in the latter; while as regards item (3), the Collector of Gōdāvari states that he was unable to conduct the jamabandi himself, as he was obliged to tour in areas where scarcity prevailed and famine threatened. With regard to the non-observance of the rule in Kistna—item (4)—the Collector states that, as the district is a heavy one consisting as it does of 12 taluks and two independent Deputy Tahsildar's divisions, the headquarters Sub-Collector was entrusted with the settlement of some of the taluks. He has, however, selected the taluk of Bhimavaram for settlement by himself personally for the current fasli. The Collector of Salem is requested to arrange for the settlement of the two taluks referred to in item (5) being conducted by himself at the earliest opportunity.

38. *Loans and advances.*—The advances made under the Land Improvement Loans Act during the year amounted to Rs. 2.84 lakhs and those under the Agriculturists' Loans Act to Rs. 7.55 lakhs. The aggregate amount advanced under both the Acts was thus 10.39 lakhs against Rs. 8.25 lakhs in fasli 1327. The difference

was the nett result of an increase in the amount advanced in thirteen districts and a decrease in eleven. There were no transactions in Madras during the year. The advances granted in Ganjam, Bellary, Anantapur, Chingleput, North Arcot and Chittoor were considerably in excess of those given in fasli 1327, while the amounts advanced in Kistna, South Arcot, Tanjore and Madura showed a decrease over those of fasli 1327. The increase was largest (2.41 lakhs) in Ganjam where, owing to local failures of crops, loans for the purchase of seedgrain were taken on a large scale. In Bellary, Anantapur and Chittoor the increase was due to the efforts of the Special Deputy Collector who was appointed during the latter half of the year under review to promote the grant of loans for sinking wells in the Ceded districts. The increase in North Arcot also was due to the working of the special staff employed for a similar purpose, while the unfavourable character of the season accounts for the increase in Chingleput. The decreases have not been explained by the Collectors.

Towards the close of the fasli, the general rules framed under the Loans Acts were revised so as to allow the grant of a consolidated loan or of more loans than one under the two Acts on a single security, provided the value of the security was sufficient to cover the whole loan. The rule governing the period of repayment of loans advanced under the general rules for the installation of oil engines and pumps was also amended.

When the collateral security covers the oil engine and pump the period of repayment has been fixed under the revised rule at 2, 5 or 20 years, according as the primary security for the loan is in the form of personal security, or of machinery or plant, or of landed property.

39. *Recoveries*.—Of the sums of Rs. 3.58 lakhs and Rs. 5.71 lakhs repayable during the year under the Land Improvement and the Agriculturists' Loans Acts respectively, on account of principal, Rs. 3.04 lakhs or 84.9 per cent under the former Act and Rs. 4.45 or 77.9 per cent under the latter were collected. Advances amounting to Rs. 21,833 under the former Act and Rs. 15,253 under the latter Act were repaid by borrowers on account of loans, the repayment of which had not fallen due, while sums amounting to Rs. 1,197 under the former Act and Rs. 62 under the latter had to be written off the accounts as irrecoverable.

40. *Coercive processes*.—The aggregate amount of principal and interest repayable during the year under both the Acts was Rs. 12,76,429, of which a sum of Rs. 3,40,111 or about 26.6 per cent was collected without resort to coercion and a sum of Rs. 6,16,033 or 48.3 per cent after the issue of demand; a sum of Rs. 74,392 was realized after attachment but before sale, a sum of Rs. 1,243 by the sale of movable property and a sum of Rs. 902 by the sale of immovable property. The balance outstanding at the end of the year was Rs. 2,41,821, the arrears being heaviest in Tanjore (Rs. 64,302), Madura (Rs. 55,321), Chingleput (Rs. 18,684), South Arcot (Rs. 17,418), Anantapur (Rs. 16,314), Salem (Rs. 15,850), Bellary (Rs. 13,993) and Tinnevely (Rs. 11,924).

41. The following statement shows the amount of interest payable by the Local Government to the Government of India for fasli 1328 :—

43. With the aid of loans under the Land Improvement Loans Act, 308 wells capable of irrigating 1,659 acres of land were constructed during the fasli at an aggregate cost of Rs. 88,895 against 237 wells costing Rs. 78,860 during the previous year and 138 wells designed to benefit 869 acres were repaired at a cost of Rupees 28,160 against 94 wells costing Rs. 27,725 in the preceding year. A sum of Rupees 13,185 was spent on the reclamation of 267 acres against Rs. 12,330 in the previous year; Rs. 2,175 was expended on the purchase and installation of an oil-engine and pump in the district of Anantapur against Rs. 15,000 spent in four districts† in the previous year and Rs. 28,755 were spent on 'other improvements' (benefiting about 1,849 acres). The Bellary district showed the largest number of wells constructed and repaired (79) and next to it come North Arcot (66) and Madura (46). Under the Agriculturists' Loans Act, 6,586 head of cattle were purchased at an aggregate cost of Rs. 3,94,213 against 7,408 head of cattle at a cost of Rs. 4,59,873 in the previous year, while 27 houses were rebuilt at a cost of Rs. 24,565 against 61 houses rebuilt at a cost of Rs. 8,390 in the preceding year. The expenditure on seed-grains was Rs. 2,36,607, on a sugar-cane mill in Bellary Rs. 375 and for other purposes Rs. 32,682 as against Rs. 5,874, Rs. 925 and Rs. 65,823 respectively in the previous year. The last item during the year includes the amounts advanced for the maintenance of coffee estates in Salem and Malabar.

44. *Survey Advances*.—The advances drawn by Collectors during the year under the head 'Revenue survey advances—Collectors' amounted to Rs. 60,626 against Rs. 40,342 in the previous year. Of this amount—

Of the total amount of advances outstanding against Collectors, a sum of Rs. 82,512 was adjusted during the year leaving the nett debit under 'Revenue survey advances—Collectors' at Rs. 2,84,926.

Under the head 'cost of survey marks—Collectors' a sum of Rs. 53,692 was collected during the year leaving a balance of Rs. 15,070 to be realized. The arrears outstanding at the beginning of the year under the head 'cost of survey marks—survey officers' were Rs. 1,92,988. Fresh landholders' bills to the extent of Rs. 2,57,983 were received from survey officers during the year. Of the total demand of Rs. 4,51,390 under this head, Rs. 2,74,865 were collected during the year leaving an uncollected balance of Rs. 1,76,522 at its end.

45. *Junior Civilians—Knowledge of vernaculars.*—The reports of the Collectors generally show that their Civilian Divisional Officers possess an adequate knowledge of the vernaculars and are able to dispose of vernacular papers without abstracts and that the progress of Assistant Collectors is satisfactory.

46. *Growth of subletting in ryotwari tracts.*—Subletting is chiefly resorted to by those engaged in professions other than agriculture or by large landholders. It is reported to be on the increase (a) in the Kavali division of the Nellore district owing to the purchase of tank-bed delta wet lands by non-resident well-to-do persons, (b) in the Madakasira taluk of Anantapur district where most of the fertile lands are owned by Brahmins, a non-cultivating class, and (c) in the tracts under the Tungabhadra channels in Bellary; and on the decrease (a) in some other taluks of Nellore, (b) in the Tirumangalam taluk of Madura and (c) in South Kanara, owing to rise in the prices of food grains.

47. *Effects of recent legislation on the people.*—No legislation affecting the people generally was introduced during the year under report except the Anarchical and Revolutionary Crimes Act (Indian Act XI of 1919). The passing of this Act is a topic of discussion only among the educated classes and the masses are not affected by the agitation. The Madras Estates Land Act (I of 1903) and the Madras Land Encroachment Act (III of 1905) appear to have been working smoothly on the whole. The delegation of powers to Tahsildars and Deputy Tahsildars under the Madras Decentralization Act (VIII of 1914) in the matter of charging enhanced assessment under Act III of 1905 and of dealing with cases of irregular irrigation continued to work satisfactorily and contributed to the speedy disposal of cases, to the prompt collection of revenue and to the timely preparation of jamabandi accounts. The Income-tax Amendment Act has not yet become popular and many of the assesses are still to learn methodical ways in the matter of maintaining their accounts. It, however, appears that some of the assesses who have been escaping proper taxation in the previous years have recently been fully assessed to income-tax and that some deserving cases have properly been exempted from it.

48. *Co-operative Societies.*—During the year (1918-19), 970 societies were registered and the registration of 12 societies was cancelled. Of the number registered, 6 were central banks, 29 were unions, 800 agricultural societies and 135 non-agricultural societies. The total number of societies at the end of the year 1918-19 was 3,676 as against 2,718 at the end of the previous year, 1917-18.

49. *Enhanced water-cess for irregular irrigation.*—G.O. No. 634, Revenue, dated 7th March 1918, directed that ryots who had rendered themselves liable to the imposition of enhanced water-cess for the irregular use of Government water should be given previous notice of their liability. The system has been under trial now for some years in all the districts except Madras, Malabar, South Kanara, Anjengo and The Nilgiris to which it is not applicable. The ryots are now fully aware of the rules. Most of the Collectors have remarked that the system, while making the ryots alive to the consequences of their mistake, has resulted in the prompt investigation of objections and consequent reduction in the number of water-rate appeals. The rules were recently amended in B.P. No. 53, dated 10th April 1919, providing for the issue of a final notice as well, immediately after village account No. 6 is passed by the Tahsildar. This will give further opportunities to the ryots to make timely representations to the jamabandi officers.

50. *Tank-bed cultivation.*—During the year under report the concession to cultivate tank-bed lands with cucumbers and melons was granted in the districts of Gōdāvari, Anantapur, Bellary, Kurnool, Chittoor, North Arcot, South Arcot, Madura, Ramnad, Coimbatore and Salem. In one case in the Rayadrug taluk, Bellary district, the crop was submerged by an unexpected supply of water received in the tank and, in view of the heavy loss sustained by the ryots, the assessment on the extent cultivated was remitted. There were also unauthorized cases of cultivation of such lands in Chingleput, Trichinopoly, Coimbatore and Salem. In the first two districts such occupation was dealt with under the provisions of Act III of 1905, while in the other two districts it was charged with the highest dry rate, though in a few cases in Coimbatore some penalty also was changed in addition. It is reported that the cultivation did not in any way affect the tank beds.

51. *Examination of village and taluk accounts.*—The accounts were found to have been fairly well maintained and to have disclosed generally no serious errors. The defects noticed were pointed out and promptly rectified in most cases.

52. *The taluk and village statistical registers.*—Taluk statistical registers prescribed in the revised manual of taluk accounts were maintained in the districts of The Nilgiris, Malabar, South Kanara and Anjengo. Village statistical registers were maintained in all the other districts except Madras which is not a rural district. The subjoined statement shows the progress made in the writing up and checking of the registers up to and during fasli 1323 (1918-19).

So far as ryotwari villages are concerned, the work was completed or nearly completed for the year under report in all districts except Gōdāvari and South Arcot and the Collectors of these districts are requested to see that the work is completed soon. As regards proprietary villages in respect of which there are heavy arrears, the vernacular copies of the manual of village accounts have already been supplied to karnams and it is hoped that with the introduction of these accounts from the beginning of Fasli 1329 (1919-20) the work will be speeded up.

53. *Minor Irrigation.*—Statement No. 19 shows the number of irrigation works in charge of the Revenue Department, the number repaired and the amount spent on them during the official year ending 31st March 1919. It also shows the number proposed for repairs during the official year ending 31st March 1920.

54. *Conference with ryots.*—In all the districts except Kistna Conferences with ryots were held by Collectors and Divisional Officers during their tours and at the time of the jamabandi.

Notes.—(1) The area and the assessment thereon given in this statement differ from those given in columns 27, 28 and 29 of statement No. 3 against Chingleput, Chittoor, North Arcot, Tinnevely and Malabar. In Chingleput, the variation is due to the exclusion from this statement of these particulars for rented villages; in Chittoor, it is due to the exclusion from this statement of these particulars relating to the Punganur division; in North Arcot, it is due to the exclusion from this statement of these particulars for Arni and Koppam divisions; in Malabar, it is due to the exclusion from this statement of these particulars for lease-hold lands in Cochin. The Collector of Tinnevely has not explained the variation.

(2) The number of ryotwari pattas given in this statement differs from that given in Collector's statement No. 1 against Tinnevely and Malabar. In Malabar, the variation is due to the cause mentioned in note (1). The Collector of Tinnevely has not explained the variation.

2. The Government observe that the season not only was unfavourable from the agricultural standpoint, but also was marked by the occurrence of a widespread epidemic of influenza which, for a time, disorganized society. Deaths from disease among cattle—chiefly due to rinderpest—show a large increase. These two causes may have contributed to the decrease in the area under cultivation during the fasli.

3. Though there has been a decrease in the total number of coercive processes issued during the fasli, the number of sales is still considerably in excess of the number held in faslis 1325 and 1326, though slightly less than the number held in fasli 1327. It is hoped that with the advent of a more favourable season it will be possible largely to reduce this number.

4. The discrepancy between the value of lands sold and the amount of arrears for which they were brought to sale is presumably due to the fact that under existing rules no area smaller than a registered survey number or subdivision can be brought to sale. The marked difference between the value of lands sold and the amount realized at the sales is no doubt to some extent accounted for by the fact that lands for which no purchasers can be found are bought in by Government at a nominal price.

5. Advances under the Loans Acts were over Rs. 2 lakhs in excess of those issued in the previous fasli; the increase naturally being largest in Ganjam where the season was specially adverse. The Government, however, note with regret that only one oil-engine was purchased on loan during the fasli under review.
