SIR,

I have the honour to submit, for the information of Government, the annual returns of the Lunatic Asylums in the Presidency for the year 1918.

2. *Accommodation.*—The accommodation for insanes remains the same as in 1917, except in Calicut where it has been increased by 20, by the provision of temporary buildings, to meet the overcrowding on the male side during at least two months in the year, viz., September and October. Further expansion is very desirable in this place, if the present rate of admissions continue, which is very likely, and anything less than a provision for at least 24 additional patients will be inadequate. The construction in Calicut of a female hospital and dysentery cells, an industrial workshop, improvements in the sanitary condition by the construction of drains, day latrines, and bath sheds, have all been postponed owing to financial stringency created by the war. The accommodation for Civil Indian males in Madras and for insanes in Vizagapatam has been found insufficient by the Surgeon-General during his inspections. The Government have sanctioned extensions to the buildings—vide G.Os. No. 548 W., dated 6th May 1918, and No. 227, L. & M. (Medical), dated 22nd May 1918, respectively.

The hospital accommodation is, for the present, found to be enough.

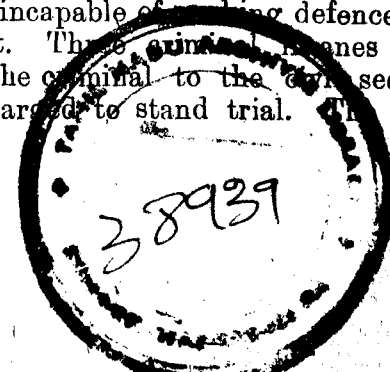
3. *Population.*—Two hundred and eighty-two males and 56 females were admitted during the year. Of these 31 had 5 respectively were criminals. The daily average population was 876.88 and females numbered nearly a fourth of the total. An average of 235 males and 32 females were employed on manufacture; several others were usefully employed in asylum work.

4. *Result of treatment on the total population.*—9.83 per cent were cured, 4.05 improved, 2.31 were not improved and discharged otherwise, and 9.83 died.

5. *Statements III to VII* show details as to class, age, sex, etc., and these offer no points for comment.

6. *Sickness and mortality.*—The daily average sick in hospital was 99.31. The increase was chiefly due to the pandemic of influenza and an unhealthy year, and was pronounced in Madras and Vizagapatam. The notable diseases were malaria, anaemia and debility, tuberculosis and diarrhoea. The causes of mortality are shown in the appendix to Statement VI. Dysentery was, as heretofore, a prominent cause, but tubercle also is in evidence, especially at Madras this year.

7. *Criminal insanes.*—There were 36 admissions as already noted. Of these 3 had been tried and acquitted, 20 were found incapable of standing defence, and 13 had become insane during imprisonment. The criminal insanes were transferred to the Penitentiary and 4 from the criminal to the civil section. Seventeen recovered, of whom 10 were discharged to stand trial. The daily average population was 182.19.



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8. *Escapes*.—One Civil Indian male at Madras and four at Calicut escaped. All the four escapes at Calicut were recaptured by the Asylum servants. The lunatic who escaped at Madras is still at large.

9. *Finances*.—The details of income and expenditure are exhibited in Statements VIII to X.

10. *Inspections*.—Regular inspections were made by both official and non-official visitors. All three asylums were inspected by the Surgeon-General. The service and stock registers have been properly maintained.

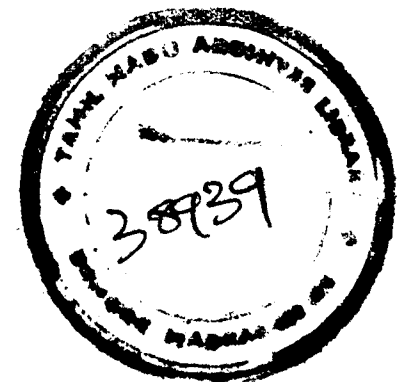
