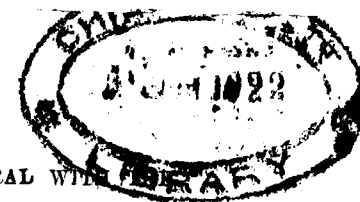

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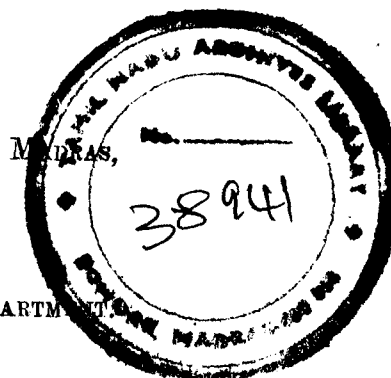

SIR,

I have the honour to submit the annual returns of the Lunatic Asylums in the Presidency for the year 1921.

2. The total population of the three asylums in the Presidency was 892 at the beginning of the year 1921 as against 875 at the beginning of 1920.

3. The admissions including re-admissions were 345 against 340 in the previous year.

4. The total population for the year 1921 was 1,237 as against 1,215 in 1920. The result of treatment in the total population was:—133 cured, 46 improved, 18 not improved, 16 discharged otherwise and 82 died, working out to a percentage of 10.75, 3.72, 1.45, 1.29 and 6.63, cured, improved, not improved, discharged otherwise and died, respectively, as against 10.61, 4.27, 9.8, 7.4 and 9.92 in the preceding year.

5. The daily average strength was 917.29 as compared with 894.79 in the previous year and the daily average sick was 104.30 as against 70.73 in the preceding year.

6. Details as to age, class, sex, etc., are given in statements III to VII.

7. *Criminal insanes*.—There were 36 admissions during the year. Of these 3 had been tried and acquitted, 16 were found incapable of making defence, and 17 became insane during imprisonment. Seven criminals were transferred to the civil section, 14 recovered of whom 9 were discharged to stand their trial; 1 criminal insane was transferred to the Penitentiary. The daily average strength was 147.25 as compared with 160.84 in the previous year.

8. *Escapes*.—There were no escapes during the year.

9. *Finance*.—Statements VIII to X show details of income and expenditure.

10. *Inspection*.—The official and non-official visitors inspected the institutions regularly. The asylums at Madras and Calicut were inspected by Lieut.-Col. H. Symons, O.B.E., I.M.S., officiating Surgeon-General. The service and stock registers have been properly maintained.

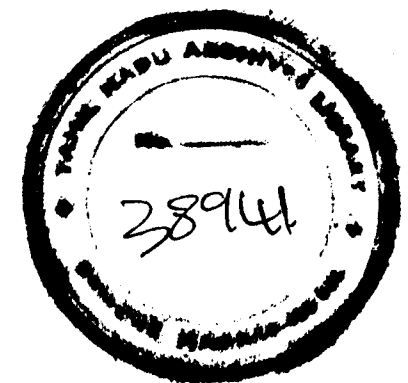
