

Annual Statement of
Local Boards



Legislation.—The Madras Local Boards Act, 1920, which was passed into law and some provisions of which were brought into force in advance during the previous year, came into effect as a whole on 1st April 1921. Special legislation was also undertaken requiring every member of a local board, whether elected or nominated, to make an oath or affirmation of allegiance to the Crown before entering on his office as a member. Members who were in office at the time of the introduction of the Act were allowed three months' time to make the oath or affirmation.

2. *Jurisdiction*—(a) *District boards.*—There were 24 district boards on 31st March 1922, excluding the Agency District Board which was under the control of the Commissioner and Agent to the Governor in the Agency tracts.

(b) *Taluk boards.*—The Polavaram Taluk Board (Godavari), and the taluks of Gunupur, Rayaghada and Bissemkatak forming part of the Parvatipur Taluk Board (Vizagapatam), ceased to be under the control of this department and were included in the new Agency District. Three taluk boards, viz., Rajampet, Jammalamadugu and Guntur, were bifurcated at the beginning of the year. The number of taluk boards at the end of the year was 121.

(c) *Union boards.*—Only one union board, Andiyur, in the Coimbatore District, was newly created but was abolished soon after the close of the year. The unions at Andanapet, Koranattukaruppur, Tiruvalanjuli, Talanayar (Tanjore), Moka (Bellary), Ryali (Godavari), Gadidamadugu (Kurnool), and Udayagiri (Nellore) were abolished during the year. The Saidapet union (Chingleput) was converted into a municipality and Gunupur in Vizagapatam was excluded from the jurisdiction of the district board in consequence of the formation of the new Agency district. Thus the number of union boards actually working at the end of the year fell from 588 to 578 and their distribution among the several districts is shown in Annexure A. Except one informal panchayat at Karkal there were still no union boards in South Kanara or in the Nilgiris. In Guntur there were 57, in Kistna 54, in Tinnevely 44 and in Salem 43.

3. (a) *Personnel*—(1) *Sanctioned strength*—(i) *District boards.*—The district boards were reconstituted during the year under the new Local Boards Act, 1920, and the total sanctioned strength increased from 863 to 963. The sanctioned elective strength rose by 122.

(ii) *Taluk boards*—In the case of taluk boards the aggregate elective strength rose from 1,225 to 1,320 and the nominated strength fell from 798 to 702. Many of the taluk boards however remained unaffected pending their reconstitution under the new Act.

(iii) *Union boards.*—The sanctioned strength of the union boards was 5,201 of which 1,744 members were elected.

(2) *Actual strength.*—The actual strength of the several classes of local boards at the close of the year compares as follows with that on 31st March 1921.

(b) *Directing officers*—(i) *District boards.*—The privilege of electing their presidents was enjoyed by two district boards, viz., Madura and Nellore. Except the Nilgiris District Board which had an official president, all the district boards were presided over by non-officials.

(ii) *Taluk boards*.—The number of non-official presidents of taluk boards rose from 96 to 104, of whom 49 were elected against 40 in the previous year.

(iii) *Union boards*.—Of the 578 union boards, 150 had elected non-official presidents. Of the 425 nominated presidents, 395 were non-officials.

4. *Elections*.—The statement below shows the extent to which the privilege of election to membership of local boards was exercised :—

5. *Meetings*.—The number of district board meetings rose from 312 to 321, and taluk board meetings from 1,453 to 1,633. Of the former, one was adjourned for want of a quorum and three for other reasons. No less than 37 taluk board meetings failed for want of a quorum or for other reasons. The average attendance of members was highest in the Nellore District Board (73.5 per cent of the total number) and lowest in the Kistna District Board (52.1 per cent). In taluk boards it ranged from 79 per cent in the South Arcot district, to 45 per cent in the Madura district. Of the 6,863 union board meetings convened, 498 proved abortive. Attendance at these meetings averaged 72 per cent of the total strength in the Bellary district and 20 per cent in Guntur.

6. The Inspector of Local Boards inspected three district boards and eight taluk boards during the year.

7. *Village panchayats*.—Rules were framed under the Madras Village Panchayat Act, 1920, and ten panchayats were constituted during the year. Some presidents of taluk boards were appointed Honorary Registrars under the Act for the area under their jurisdiction.

8. *Management*.—The ordinary charges compare as follows with those of the two previous years—

Of the total of Rs. 12.63 lakhs, Rs. 11.97 lakhs were met from the general revenues of the boards; 85½ lakh was spent on capital works from revenue. The marked rise in expenditure on travelling allowance of presidents and members is mainly accounted for by the fact that in previous years the presidents were officials whose travelling allowance was not debited to local funds. The net cost of management exceeded Rs. 60,000 in Kistna, Godavari, Guntur, Ganjam and Salem.

10. *Roads*.—An important feature of the year's administration was a reclassification of roads as required by the Local Boards Act, 1920. This resulted in an adjustment of liabilities between the several local boards in regard to the maintenance of roads. The total length of roads maintained is reported to be 25,772 miles against 26,150 in 1920-21 (exclusive of roads in the Agency tracts which were included in the Agency Division). The mileage excludes the length of roads and streets in unions which are not parts of district or taluk roads. About 126 miles of road were newly constructed during the year. The total mileage of roads per 100 square miles of area ranged from 63 in the Nilgiris to 11 in the Kurnool district. Particulars are given in Annexure B.

11. *Trunk roads*.—The total length of trunk roads maintained by district boards was 3,039. The maximum grant payable by Government at a flat rate of Rs. 500 per mile would be Rs. 15.20 lakhs. The boards spent Rs. 18.66 lakhs on these roads but only a sum of Rs. 14.25 lakhs was actually disbursed towards this expenditure in the subsequent year (1922-23). The expenditure was considerably below the limit of Rs. 500 per mile in the following districts :—

The trunk roads were reported by the Superintending Engineers to be below the expected standard in Anantapur, South Arcot, Bellary, Kurnool and in some portions of Coimbatore, Tinnevely and Vizagapatam. The Chittoor roads were the best.

13. Tolls were levied at maximum rates in all districts except Guntur (where no tolls were levied) and North Arcot, Chittoor, Ganjam, Godavari and Salem where the rates vary between three-fourths and the maximum.

In the four years for which statistics are forthcoming (1919-23) the number of main gates in all districts increased from 459 to 496 and the number of subsidiary gates from 237 to 317. The creation of subsidiary gates is a device to prevent evasion of tolls and does not impose any additional burden on vehicular traffic. The increase in the number of main gates, however, is a real impost, and complaints are heard that in some areas toll-gates are unfairly frequent. The largest increases were in the following districts:—

On the other hand in the four years ending 1922-23 Coimbatore and Godavari reduced their toll gates by 4 and 5 respectively, Coimbatore from 39 to 35 and Godavari from 16 to 11, and Vizagapatam by no less than 13 (from 33 to 20). The decline in Godavari and Vizagapatam is due in part to the transfer of a portion of the area formerly under their jurisdiction to the Agency District Board. The Guntur District Board still levies no tolls, but accepts a contribution from the toll revenues of municipalities within the district.

Under the new Local Boards Act the maximum toll leviable on a cart was 3 annas against 4 annas under the old Act. As this reduction involved considerable loss of revenue to local boards, the old rate was restored by means of an amendment of rule 26 of schedule IV of the Local Boards Act with the approval of the Legislative Council.

14. *Ferries* realized Rs. 2.74 lakhs against Rs. 3.15 lakhs in 1920-21.

15. *Rest-houses, etc.*—The charges under this head amounted to Rs. 5.18 lakhs, of which a sum of Rs. 3.05 lakhs was met from endowments. Service receipts realized Rs. 0.91 lakh and Rs. 1.22 lakhs were appropriated from general revenues.

Tanjore chatrams.—The main item under this head is that of the Tanjore Raja's chatrams, of which the District Board is the trustee. The income amounted to Rs. 3.57 lakhs and the charges to Rs. 5.78 lakhs. The cost of upkeep was Rs. 1.40 lakhs. A sum of Rs. 1.31 lakhs was spent on free feeding (of 862,098 persons), Rs. 0.35 lakh on elementary and secondary education, and Rs. 0.27 lakh on medical relief. The balance at the end of the year was Rs. 9.56 lakhs, of which Rs. 8.74 lakhs were in investments.

17. There was a decline of Rs. 1.67 lakhs under ordinary charges. But service receipts rose by a lakh of rupees. Local boards increased their contributions for elementary education by 50 per cent, but the appropriation from Government grants fell by Rs. 9.69 lakhs to a figure lower than that of the year 1919-20 (Rs. 27.77 lakhs).

(i) Elementary education.

18. The Elementary Education Act came into force on 1st April 1921. Under this Act provision is made for the creation in each district of a District Educational Council, for the levy of a local education tax and for the introduction of compulsion in suitable areas. Twelve taluk boards besides the Nilgiri District Board availed themselves of the provision to levy an education tax and realized an income of Rs. 60,473 during the year.

19. Hitherto 15 per cent of the total population was taken to represent the school-going population. On an examination of the census tables of 1921 it was found that a more accurate estimation of school-age would be to take four-fifths of the male population of the age group 5-10 and one-fifth of the age group 10-15 as the number of boys of school-age and the whole female population of the age group 5-10 as the number of girls of school-age. It is estimated that, for the Presidency as a whole, 61 per cent of boys of school-age and 91 per cent of girls have still to be provided with elementary education. The proportion of boys yet to be provided for is less than 45 per cent in Kistna, Kurnool and Cuddapah while it is more than 70 per cent in Ganjam, Salem, Trichinopoly, Coimbatore and Vizagapatam. As regards girls the proportion is above 80 per cent in all districts except Kistna, Godavari and Guntur, and exceeded 95 per cent in Trichinopoly, Madura and Coimbatore. (See Annexure C).

20. Particulars of the number and strength of elementary schools for boys and girls are given in Annexures D and E. They show an increase of 1.7 per cent in the strength of boys' schools against 3.9 per cent in 1920-21 and an increase of 12.2 per cent in the strength of girls' schools against 2.9 per cent in 1920-21. The number of boys' schools increased by 64 or by 0.9 per cent. There was a satisfactory increase of 238 in the number of girls' schools, or a rise of 23.5 per cent. The cost of elementary education declined, however, by Rs. 3.7 lakhs.

The above figures are based on the returns received from the District Educational Officers.

21. The figures given in Annexure F show the percentages of children reading in classes I and II to the total number in classes I to V. It will be observed that the proportion exceeds 60 per cent in all districts; in only five districts is the proportion in the two lowest classes of boys' schools less than 65 per cent, while in one in Cuddapah (67 per cent) and in 19 districts the proportion is above 80 per cent, while in Kurnool and the Nilgiris it exceeds 90 per cent.

22. Information regarding the education of backward and depressed classes is defective. The statistics annexed to the report on Public Instruction for 1921-22 show 888 schools for Muhammadans with 51,073 pupils, and 885 schools for backward and other depressed classes with 30,947 pupils.

23. Accommodation continues to be insufficient. Only five new buildings are reported as completed during the year and only one under construction. No less than 5,440 schools were located in rented buildings and the expenditure in 1921-22 in the shape of rent exceeded 2 lakhs.

24. The cost of education per pupil averaged Rs. 9-0-5, the cost in the Nilgiris and Malabar being Rs. 15 and 13, respectively, while in the other districts it ranged from Rs. 7 in Chittoor to Rs. 12 in Bellary and Ganjam.

(ii) Secondary Education.

25. Leaving out of account, the Sanskrit College at Tiruvadi, the number of secondary schools maintained by the local boards rose from 149 to 156 and the number of pupils from 25,965 to 26,893. The strength of the primary department of the secondary schools decreased from 11,899 to 11,164 while that of the secondary department rose from 14,066 to 15,729. Two hundred and seventeen girls studied in the secondary classes and the rest (470) received only elementary education. Particulars are given in Annexure G.

27. Out of 883 pupils who appeared from 35 Board secondary schools for the secondary school-leaving certificate examination, only 308, or about 35 per cent, were declared eligible to undergo the University course.

29. (i) *Medical Relief.*—Particulars of the adequacy of medical institutions in the several districts are given in Annexure I. Two tests have been applied as usual, viz., (1) the number of square miles per medical centre and (2) the population per centre. The averages of the Presidency are respectively 235 square miles and 72,669 souls per centre. Under the former criterion Tanjore heads the list (91). The figure for the Nilgiris is 112. Under the latter, the Nilgiri District Board comes first and Kurnool next. On the area basis Cuddapah and Anantapur are worst equipped; on the population basis, Trichinopoly. Accommodation for in-patients in local board institutions is still defective; Chingleput and Kurnool maintain no hospitals; Cuddapah and Trichinopoly only one each.

30. The number of institutions under local board management is returned as 410 (106 hospitals and 304 dispensaries) against 416 in 1920-21, there being six hospitals less than in that year. New dispensaries were opened at Melvisharam (North Arcot), Kottur (Coimbatore), Hiramandalam (Ganjam), Bantumilli (Kistna), Kannambra (Malabar), Ketti (Nilgiris, The), Rajapalayam, Abiramam (Ramnad), Kivalur (Tanjore); one hospital at Villupuram (South Arcot) and a dispensary at Saidapet (Chingleput) were transferred to municipal management. The only hospital in Kurnool was converted into a dispensary. Two dispensaries were closed permanently, one at Thandikudi (Madura) and the other at Kalichedu (Nellore). The other variations are explained in Annexure J. In Malabar the dispensaries at Tamaracherri and Mannarghat had to be closed for a time owing to the rebellion and the women and children's dispensary at Devakotta (Ramnad) had to be closed for five months for want of a lady apothecary.

31. The list in Annexure J does not include itinerating dispensaries which worked with indifferent success in the districts of Godavari, Kurnool, Kistna, Malabar, Nellore, Trichinopoly and Vizagapatam.

32. A large number of the local board institutions do not provide full work for the medical officers in charge and the question of utilizing the services of these officers for affording medical relief to the rural population of the districts by directing them to visit selected out stations in rotation on specified week days engaged the attention of the boards.

Particulars are given in Annexure J. There was a rise in in-patients in thirteen districts and in out-patients in sixteen districts.

34. Institutions for the exclusive treatment of women and children were maintained from local funds in the municipalities of Tiruppattur (North Arcot), Cocanada (Gōdāvari), Vannarpet (Tinnevely) and Vizagapatam and also at Melvisharam (North Arcot), Tūni (Gōdāvari), Devakottai (Rannad) and Bobbili (Vizagapatam).

35. *Staff*.—The staff employed comprised 58 Assistant Surgeons, 345 Sub-Assistant Surgeons and 19 lady medical officers of various grades.

36. (ii) *Preventive medicine—Organization and staff*.—The salient feature of the sanitary administration during the year was the organization of a preventive staff under a trained health officer in five districts, North Arcot, Cuddapah, Guntūr, Tanjore and Vizagapatam. Three of the cholera parties maintained by the Government were disbanded as an experimental measure and the staff distributed among these five districts. The results of the experiment have been most encouraging and the system has since been extended to all districts except the Nilgiris.

37. *Birth-rate and maternity relief*.—The birth rate recorded works out at 26.52 per mille against 25.84 in 1920-21 (revised figure now reported for 1920-21). The rate cannot be relied upon as some districts return incredibly low figures. Instructions have been issued for a more accurate registration of vital statistics. The agency available in rural areas is very defective. The Government hope that the appointment of a separate Assistant to the Director of Public Health for Vital Statistics will result in a more accurate record of vital statistics. Maternity relief has made very little progress as the following figures show :—

The number of recorded births attended by these midwives is slightly less than three per cent and rises above four per cent only in four districts, viz., Bellary, Gōdāvari, South Kanara and Nellore. It is clear, therefore, that the problem of maternity relief in the rural areas has yet to be satisfactorily solved. The average outturn per midwife shows striking variations. For instance, Vizagapatam returns 134 cases per midwife, Gōdāvari 114, South Kanara and Madura 109 each, while the Nilgiri district reports a figure as low as 19, Tanjore 51, Rannad 57 and Malabar 58. Particulars are given in Annexure K.

38. *Death-rate.—Epidemic and endemic diseases*.—Public health generally was not better than in 1920-21 (see Annexure L). The recorded death-rate works out at 19.32 against 19.26 in the previous year. In 16 districts the rate is reported as less than 20 per mille and Rannad gives a figure (12.0) too low to be believed. The returns cannot be relied upon until registration of vital statistics is improved.

39. *Cholera* mortality showed a heavy increase from 18,890 to 26,153. The districts which suffered most were Tanjore (6,145), Godavari (4,343), Ganjam (3,328), and Kistna (2,450), partly due no doubt to the serious epidemic form of the disease after the Mahamakham and the Pushkaram festivals.

40. *Smallpox*.—Mortality under this head declined from 11,032 to 9,109, the worst affected districts being Ganjam (691), North Arcot (557) and Chingleput (531). Vaccination improved, the number of successful cases rising from 662,185 to 765,201 and the rate per mille from 17.5 to 20.2, a figure too low to afford safety

to the population. In eight districts there was a fall in the rate per mille as compared with the previous year. The highest rate of success (35.4) was in the Nilgiris and the rate exceeded 20 in 15 districts. Revaccination, on the other hand, fell from 37,678 to 22,106 successful cases and only in five districts was there an increase on the previous year's figures. Particulars are given in Annexure M.

41. *Plague* was much less virulent than in 1920-21. The mortality was only half of that of the previous year (6,590) and was accounted for mostly by the districts of Coimbatore (2,548), Salem (2,078), Madura (828), Bellary (530) and North Arcot (396). Particulars are given in Annexure N. Some of the local boards are realizing the importance of developing these non-tax resources and have appointed committees to formulate schemes for their improvement. Coimbatore possesses the greatest number of public markets (124) against 3 private markets; next comes Chittoor with 87 public against 8 private markets. Private competition is strong in Malabar where there are as many as 120 private markets against only 25 public ones. Guntur, the Nilgiris and Nellore are the most deficient in markets. In the matter of cart-stands vested interests are strongest in Tinnevely where there are 83 private and 5 public cart-stands, Madura (73 private and no public) and Ramnad (51 private and 3 public). The number of public slaughter-houses is largest in Vizagapatam (18), while in South Kanara there are none (public or private).

50. *Tree-planting.*—The receipts from avenues totalled Rs. 3.13 lakhs against Rs. 3.57 lakhs in 1920-21. The expenditure rose from Rs. 1.68 to Rs. 2.06 lakhs. In many districts the development of avenues is not carried out systematically. Some boards however have drawn up schemes which they propose to follow steadily. Particulars regarding avenues are given in Annexure O.

51. *Land development.*—Sales of land and buildings fetched Rs. 57,371 of which a net sum of Rs. 29,584 was credited to the Land Development Fund. Guntur was the biggest dealer with sale-proceeds of Rs. 22,642, but of this a sum of Rs. 14,078 was utilized for meeting the charges of survey and repayment of the loans taken for town extensions. Other transactions were in North Arcot and Coimbatore (Rs. 5,475 and Rs. 5,027, respectively). Coimbatore, Kistna and Salem transferred sums aggregating 0.12 lakh from ordinary revenue to the Land Development Fund.

52. *Other remunerative enterprises* call for no comment.

54. The total debits amounted to Rs. 281.25 lakhs against total credits of Rs. 254.95 lakhs, the deficit of Rs. 26.30 lakhs being made good from the opening balance which declined again from Rs. 85.70 lakhs to Rs. 59.40 lakhs.

55. *General revenues.*—The revenue account of district and taluk boards opened with a balance of Rs. 10.39 lakhs. The net revenue from taxes and other sources except service receipts amounted to Rs. 66.59 lakhs. The service charges debited against this account were (a) Ordinary Rs. 100.67 lakhs and (b) Capital Rs. 16.93 lakhs—total Rs. 117.60 lakhs. Thus the deficit in the year's working was Rs. 51.01 lakhs against Rs. 43.93 lakhs in the previous year. Against this a net sum of Rs. 5.41 lakhs was appropriated from the remunerative enterprises account, Rs. 19.95 lakhs from Government grants, Rs. 4.78 lakhs from endowments and contributions and Rs. 10.39 lakhs from the opening balance, leaving an uncovered deficit of Rs. 10.48 lakhs.

56. These figures show that local boards' finances are in a very bad way. The number of deficit boards has arisen from 11 district and 36 taluk boards to 13 district and 56 taluk boards. The postpayment of the trunk road grant, the growing expenditure on services and the incurring of large expenditure on capital works from ordinary revenues are responsible for the increasing deficits. The Government have taken steps in the current year to restore the financial equilibrium of local boards.

57. The ordinary running charges of the services amounted to Rs. 190.91 lakhs. Service receipts amounted to Rs. 35.67 lakhs. The net cost of the services thus was Rs. 155.24 lakhs, of which Rs. 100.67 lakhs were met from general revenues as stated above. The remainder was made up of Rs. 48.57 lakhs from Government grants and Rs. 6.26 lakhs from endowments and contributions. An appropriation of Rs. 0.51 lakh was made for capital expenditure and a sum of Rs. 0.01 lakh was appropriated from the Remunerative enterprises Account; Rs. 0.04 lakh was met from opening balance, and there was an uncovered deficit of Rs. 0.20 lakh. The proportion in which the expenditure was met from the several sources is given below :—

58. Capital expenditure totalled Rs. 49.14 lakhs, of which Rs. 17.15 lakhs came from general revenues, Rs. 9.09 lakhs from remunerative enterprises, Rs. 0.99 lakh from service receipts, Rs. 0.14 lakh from service account, Rs. 9.55 lakhs from Government grants and Rs. 8.82 lakhs from loans.

59. *Provincial subsidies.*—The opening balance under this head was Rs. 15.42 lakhs and the receipts Rs. 67.93 lakhs. A sum of Rs. 78.07 lakhs was appropriated for services and Rs. 0.02 lakh to the endowments and contributions account; some of the boards surrendered unspent grants to the extent of Rs. 2 lakhs with reference to G.O. No. 366, L. & M., dated 28th February 1921. The year thus closed with a balance of Rs. 3.26 lakhs. The total expenditure from Provincial grants is summarized below :—

60. *Debt.*—The amount of loans outstanding at the beginning of the year was Rs. 30.75 lakhs of which Rs. 19.23 lakhs were due to the Government and Rupees 11.52 lakhs to the public. A sum of Rs. 10.18 lakhs (most of it from Government) was newly borrowed, a sum of Rs. 2.24 lakhs was repaid and the debt at the end of the year stood at Rs. 38.69 lakhs of which Rs. 27.56 lakhs were due to the Government and Rs. 11.13 lakhs to the public. A sum of Rs. 0.84 lakh was paid in the shape of interest. Particulars are given in Annexure P.

61. *Audit.*—The system of audit was the same as in the previous year. There was no sign of improvement in the quality of the accounts maintained by local boards. Audit objections were not promptly answered. Two cases of embezzlement were brought to light. Several instances were noticed of payments to contractors having been made long after check measurement of works, and in an extreme case in Godavari the work was not paid for till over six years after it was completed. In another case in Coimbatore, work was started and payment was made to a contractor six months before he executed the agreement. An extraordinary rush of payments in the last few days of March continued to be a conspicuous feature. The worst feature of the year was the very large number of cases in which boards overdrew their credit on the treasury.

63. The year opened with a balance of Rs. 3.79 lakhs and closed with a balance of Rs. 3.67 lakhs. In Vizagapatam the unions in the aggregate closed with a deficit (Rs. 7,930) as in the previous year. In 12 other districts, union boards reduced their balances, but the unions in the districts of Kistna, Madura, Ramnad and Tinnevely persisted in the habit of hoarding money.

VIII.—MISCELLANEOUS.

64. Donations and contributions from private individuals totalled Rs. 1.28 lakhs, the most favoured district in this respect being Ramnad.

65. The Government realise that the inordinate delay in publishing this review greatly impairs its utility. The accounts for the year 1921–22 were received from the Examiner of Local Fund Accounts only on 13th October 1923. The delay on his part was due to the late receipt of accounts from some of the Treasury Deputy Collectors and the difficulty experienced by him in reconciling discrepancies. The accounts received from the Treasury Deputy Collectors of North Arcot, Cuddapah and Trichinopoly gave the greatest trouble. The discrepancies in the case of the last mentioned district have not yet been completely reconciled. Some of the Treasury Deputy Collectors failed to submit the accounts in the proper form in spite of specific instructions.

Most of the difficulties were obviously due to failure to understand the new form of Local Fund Accounts. The Government have under consideration the question of simplifying the accounts of local bodies.
