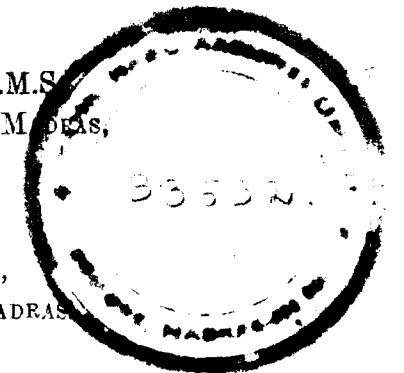

Sir,

I have the honour to submit the annual report on the working of civil hospitals and dispensaries in the Madras Presidency for the year 1926.

2. *Number of hospitals and dispensaries (Statement A).*—At the beginning of the year under report there were 959 medical institutions of all classes in the Presidency. Sixty-nine new dispensaries were opened during the year and 22 were closed. Thus at the end of the year there were 1,006 medical institutions at work in the Presidency, i.e., 63 Government institutions, 22 State Special, 773 Municipal, Local Fund and Rural, 29 private aided, 67 private non-aided and 52 Railway dispensaries. The names of rural dispensaries which were opened and closed during the year are shown in Appendices I and II, respectively, to Statement A.

3. *In-patients (Statement B).*—The total number of in-door patients treated in classes I, III and IV medical institutions of the Presidency during the year was 159,043 against 149,938 in the previous year. The number of in-patients shows an increase of 6.004 per cent over the number treated in 1925. The rise in the number of patients is due to the opening of several new dispensaries in various parts of the Presidency.

4. *Deaths.*—There were 8,052 deaths during the year as compared with 7,838 in the previous year. The death rate was 5.06 against 5.23 in 1925.

5. *Daily average attendance.*—As a result of the increase in the number of in-door patients, the daily average attendance which was 6,059.10 in 1925 rose to 7,078.49 in 1926.

6. *Beds.*—There were 4,478 beds for males and 3,616 for females during the year under review as compared with 4,285 for males and 3,463 for females during 1925.

7. *Out-door patients.*—10,059,359 patients sought out-door relief at the various hospitals and dispensaries of classes I, III and IV as compared with 9,283,281 for the previous year. The total number of both in-door and out-door patients treated during the year was 10,218,402 against 9,433,269 in the previous year.

8. *Statement C.*—The principal diseases among the in-patients were malaria and diseases of the generative, digestive and respiratory systems (excluding pneumonia and tuberculosis of the lungs). Among the out-patients, the diseases most prevalent were those of the digestive system, dysentery, malaria, syphilis (primary and secondary), injuries (general and local) and all diseases of the respiratory system excluding pneumonia and tubercle of the lungs.

9. *Statement D (Statement of infectious diseases).*—Communicable diseases accounted for 1,371,496 patients with 3,671 deaths in 1926. The diseases treated in their order of prevalence were malaria, dysentery, syphilis (primary and secondary) and influenza.

10. *Statement E (Classes and sex).*—Of the patients treated in classes I, III and IV institutions, Hindus were, as usual, the largest number, viz., 7,788,827, i.e., 208 per mille of Hindu population as per census of 1921. Next, in order of numerical strength came the Muhammadans, others, and Europeans and Anglo-Indians numbering 1,230,836 or 433 per mille, 1,145,315 or 622 per mille and 53,424 (or 413 per mille), respectively. There has been an increase under all classes of patients during the year.

11. *Statements F and F-1.*—The total number of operations performed in all classes of institutions was 453,343 on 441,846 patients. Of these operations, 441,846 were principal and 11,500 secondary. The corresponding figures for 1925 were 412,053 on 400,923 patients. The ratio of death per cent to total operated on works out to 0.26 against 0.3 in 1925. The number of operations returned as "major" during the year 1926 was 29,419 with 842 deaths and a calculated death rate of 2.86 per cent against 29,850 with 835 deaths and a calculated death rate of 2.79 during 1925.

12. *Finance.*—The year under report opened with a cash balance of Rs. 13,030 against Rs. 13,689 in the previous year. The total income of the hospitals and dispensaries in classes I, III and IV during the year including the opening cash balance amounted to Rs. 58,92,977 against Rs. 57,64,908 in the previous year. Of the total income the Government contributions towards salaries of Medical officers and otherwise amounted to Rs. 34,60,666. The Local Boards contributed Rs. 13,18,740 and the Municipalities including the Madras Corporation Rs. 6,61,087. The total expenditure for the year was Rs. 58,81,613, of which Rs. 31,46,167 was spent on salaries of Medical officers, nurses and other staff, Rs. 8,45,294 on medicines, Rs. 8,57,072 on diets, Rs. 2,69,877 on new buildings and repairs and Rs. 7,63,203 on miscellaneous charges, etc. The closing balance at the end of the year was Rs. 11,364.

13. *Statement H.*—The year under report opened with an invested capital of Rs. 10,54,864-0-4 and closed with a balance of Rs. 10,45,148-8-8. Rs. 1,153-10-2 was invested and Rs. 10,869-1-10 withdrawn during the year.

GENERAL.

14. *Hookworm disease.*—During the year 1926, the Ankylostomiasis Campaign practically completed its survey into the intensity of hookworm infection in the Tamil, Malayalam and Kanarese districts. The survey is being conducted by means of the dilution egg-count method devised by Stoll. Egg-counts which give an excellent idea of the degree of infection in a given community indicate that by far the largest number of hookworms per person is harboured by people living in the West Coast and particularly in the Malabar District. The number of persons treated for hookworm during the year was 76,587. The drugs generally employed for the treatment of the disease were thymol, oil of chenopodium and carbon tetrachloride. Propaganda work consisted of 978 lectures with lantern or cinema demonstrations to audience aggregating to 112,706 persons.

15. *Smallpox.*—The total number of patients treated for smallpox during the year was 972 with 74 deaths.

16. *Labour cases.*—In 1926, 54,349 normal and 7,501 abnormal cases were conducted by the staff of the various medical institutions in the Presidency as compared with 54,558 normal and 8,227 abnormal cases during 1925. The percentage of death to total delivered was 1.01 during the year.

17. *Appointments for Indian Medical Service and Madras Medical Service Officers and Sub-Assistant Surgeons.*—During the year under report there was no change in the cadre of Indian Medical Service appointments. The number of permanent Civil Assistant Surgeons on duty at the end of the year was 177 as compared with 164 at the end of 1925 and the number of Military Assistant Surgeons on civil duty was 22 against 20 in 1925. The number of junior Government Sub-Assistant Surgeons of less than ten years' service in independent charge of dispensaries was 142, while the corresponding figure for 1925 was 213.

18. *Medical relief in rural areas.*—Up to the end of the year 1926, the Government sanctioned the opening of 297 rural dispensaries of which 225 were opened. The scheme is of enormous potential value to the population of Madras, and has worked satisfactorily on the whole. The main object of the scheme is to encourage private practitioners to settle in rural areas and to make a private practice. As a rule this can only be done by young and energetic medical officers. The unevenness in working the scheme has been very largely a question of the personalities of the medical officers.

19. *Retrenchment in the cadre of Government Sub-Assistant Surgeons.*—The reduction of the staff of Government Sub-Assistant Surgeons continued also during 1926, owing to the employment of private medical practitioners by local bodies in place of Government Sub-Assistant Surgeons. Under Government orders District Boards are now permitted to appoint their own medical officers to Local Fund Institutions other than those at the Taluk Headquarters up to a maximum of one-fourth (or nearest figure) of the number of Sub-Assistant Surgeons' posts at present held by Government Medical Officers in the district.

20. *Report on the scheme for the training of dhais.*—With a view to improving the methods of barber midwives practising in villages which often result in sepsis and death, a scheme formulated by a Committee appointed by the Surgeon-General for the training of dhais was approved by Government during the year. So far the scheme has been introduced only by 19 Local Bodies. Some Local Bodies have not given effect to the scheme for the reason that many of them could not secure suitable candidates for training; others had no funds. At the end of the year, there were 44 dhais undergoing training in the various medical institutions in the Presidency. The scheme is in its infancy and it is too soon to pronounce an opinion as regards its success.

21. *Medical Libraries.*—The District Medical Libraries had 714 members at the beginning of the year and 799 at the close. The number of books available for circulation at the end of the year was 7,464 as compared with 6,824 at the end of 1925. The total receipts amounted to Rs. 15,848-5-11 and the expenditure to Rs. 6,887-10-0 thus leaving a cash balance of Rs. 8,960-11-11 at the close of the year.

22. *Inspection Work.*—The inspection of the Medical Institutions in each district was carried out regularly and satisfactorily by the respective District Medical Officers and Civil Surgeons. The Surgeon-General inspected 18 District Headquarter Hospitals, 2 Civil Surgeoncies and 25 mufassal hospitals and dispensaries. Stock and service books were verified as far as possible at the institutions inspected.

CLASSES I AND II.—These include all institutions maintained by Provincial Funds and under Government management. The fact that an institution possesses endowments or receives contributions from Local Funds or private subscriptions should not be regarded as a reason for not classing it as "State" so long as Provincial or Imperial Funds are practically responsible for all the charges connected with it. Class I—"Public"—are State dispensaries which are open to the poorer classes of the public. Class II are State dispensaries which serve only a special section of the public as indicated in the sub-classification attached.

CLASS III.—Local Fund dispensaries include all institutions which are vested in Local Boards or Municipalities or guaranteed or maintained by Local or Municipal Funds. The fact that such an institution is aided by private subscriptions, or receives assistance from Government in the shape of part of the salary of the medical officer, grants of medicine, or otherwise, should not be regarded as a reason for not classing it as a Local Fund dispensary so long as its existence is practically dependent upon Local Funds.

CLASS IV.—Comprises institutions supported by private subscriptions or guarantee, but receiving aid from Government or Local Funds.

CLASS V.—Comprises institutions maintained entirely at the cost of private individuals or associations. The fact that Government supplies superior inspection or registers should not be regarded as a reason for not treating it as a private non-aided dispensary.

CLASS VI.—Comprises all railway dispensaries whether maintained by State-railways or others.

NOTES.

1. Transfers of dispensaries from one class to another should be noted in the column of "Remarks."
2. Hospitals of the Dufferin Fund should be shown as private-aided or non-aided, as the case may be.
3. Dispensaries of a purely itinerant character should in no case be included in the statement.
