

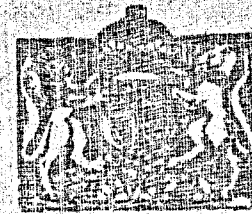

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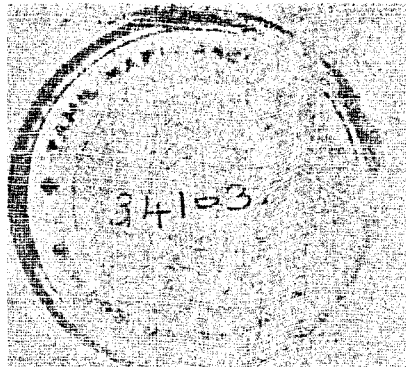

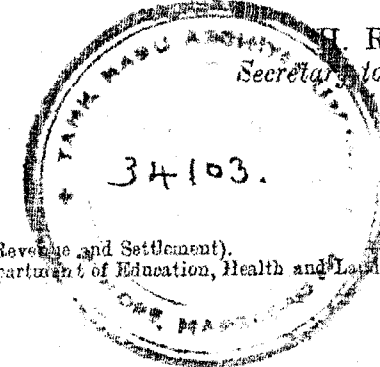

2. The season was on the whole fairly satisfactory from an agricultural point of view. The total area cultivated under ryotwari holdings increased from 20.80 million acres in fasli 1338 to 20.90 million acres in the fasli under review.

3. The current demand under land revenue and cesses during the fasli was Rs. 8,65,50,744. Of this sum, 99.27 per cent was collected within the fasli. The number of processes issued under Madras Act II of 1864 was less than that issued in any of the previous three faslis. The number of sales for arrears of revenue, however, showed an increase of 582 over the preceding fasli.

The Board submits its report on the settlement of Land Revenue in the Madras Presidency for fasli 1339 (1929-30) together with the prescribed statements.

2. *Character of the season.*—The south-west monsoon began early in the districts on the West Coast and gave a fairly heavy rainfall with occasional breaks. In most of the other districts the monsoon was timely and the rainfall sufficient on the whole although it was feeble during July and August. In the latter half of September, the monsoon asserted itself under the influence of a depression off the Malabar coast and a storm in the Arabian sea and gave a fairly copious and well-distributed rainfall. On the whole the south-west monsoon was fairly satisfactory. Freshes came down the rivers Godavari, Kistna and Cauvery in time and continued to be steady and sufficient throughout the cultivation season.

Early in October, with the advent of the north-east monsoon, heavy rains were received on the Madras coast owing to a depression in the Bay of Bengal. Another depression off the Circars caused widespread and heavy rain between the 16th and 18th of October, until the monsoon became established in the Bay by the 30th October. The rainfall during the month was up to or above the average except in Kistna, Guntur, the Carnatic, North Arcot, Salem, Coimbatore and Madura. The monsoon was active in the Presidency (the Circars and the West Coast excepted) in the first half of November under the influence of a depression on the 3rd November in the south of the Bay of Bengal and the unsettled conditions in the neighbourhood of Ceylon between the 12th and 14th of the same month. On the 1st of December, another depression in the neighbourhood of Negapatam caused a well-distributed and heavy rainfall for three days in Cuddajah, the Carnatic and the central and southern districts. In January, excessive rain accompanied by thunderstorms occurred in the south-east of Madras, especially in Chingleput, South Arcot and Tanjore. On the whole, the north-east monsoon was generally up to or above the average throughout the Presidency, except in Kistna, Guntur and Coimbatore. In February, the rainfall was generally above the average, especially in Chingleput, South Arcot, North Arcot and Tinnevely. In March, there were scattered thunder-showers in Ramnad and Tinnevely. In April, the rainfall was below the average except in Vizagapatam, Coimbatore, Madura, Tinnevely and South Kanara, while in the beginning of May, unusual pressure conditions in the south of the Bay of Bengal resulted in a storm on the 6th, which crossed the Bay south of Negapatam on the 7th, causing squally weather along the coast and moderate to heavy rain over the south of the Presidency. The weather conditions were characteristic of the north-east monsoon and the storm was remarkable for the widespread rain it caused, over nearly the whole of the Presidency, on the 8th,

9th and 10th. On the whole, the rainfall in May was generally much above the average, especially, in Cuddapah, the Carnatic, the Central districts and Tanjore.

The sowings of early crops were generally fair or above normal, except in the South, the Circars and the Deccan where they were restricted or below normal. Sowings of late crops were also satisfactory, except in the Circars and the South. The increase in the area was marked in the Deccan.

On the whole, the season for the Presidency was fairly satisfactory as is proved by the fact that both the area cropped and the net area sown were among the highest reported.

3. *Number of ryotwari villages.*—The total number of ryotwari villages in the fasli was 21,955 against 22,079 in the previous fasli. There was thus a decrease of 124 villages in the Presidency. This was the result of a decrease of 129 villages in Malabar and Salem and an increase of five villages in West Godavari, Kistna and Cuddapah. The decrease of 127 villages in Malabar was due to the adoption, during resurvey, of the amsam as a unit in place of the desam, in the Ernad taluk. In Salem, the decrease was due to the amalgamation during resurvey of two villages in the Salem taluk with the neighbouring village. In West Godavari, the increase was due to the resumption of two inam villages in the Chintalapudi taluk. There was an increase of one village in Kistna due to the formation of the village 'Kollair lake' in Chintalapudi taluk during resurvey. In Cuddapah, a village in each of the taluks of Cuddapah and Kamalapuram was split up into two.

4. The land revenue of the Presidency is derived from the following sources:—

- (a) Peshkash or revenue from permanently-settled estates;
- (b) Shrotriyam jodi or quit-rent levied on inam villages;
- (c) Assessment including water-rate on lands held under the ryotwari system; and
- (d) Miscellaneous revenue.

5. *Peshkash or revenue from permanently-settled estates.*—The total amount of peshkash payable during the fasli was Rs. 49,92,767 against Rs. 49,93,691 in the previous fasli. The decrease of Rs. 924 is the result of—

6. The quit-rent payable on villages held on shrotriyam or favourable tenure was Rs. 7,54,587 against Rs. 7,52,857 in the previous fasli. The increase of Rs. 1,730 is accounted for below:—

7. *Holdings.*—The total extent of ryotwari holdings during the fasli was 27.50 million acres which exceeded that of the previous year (as now revised), by 141,443 acres. There was an increase in all districts except East Godavari, where there was a decrease of 5,430 acres. The increase was marked in the districts of Anantapur (50,444), North Arcot (10,755) and Tanjore (9,521). The increase in Anantapur was due to new assignments made during the year, illustrating the growing desire on the part of the labouring classes to own land for themselves. In North Arcot also new assignments were the cause for the increase under holdings. In Tanjore the increase was mainly due to the restoration of lands in the Tanjore taluk bought in by Government in connexion with arrears of loans granted under the Loans Acts, and to the conversion of mohini inam lands to ryotwari tenure. The increase in the other districts was mainly due to assignments of waste lands to members of the depressed classes and others. The resumption of minor inams contributed to the increase in some districts. In East Godavari the decrease is due to the fact that the area cropped more than once, wrongly included in the total holdings during the previous faslis especially in the Cocanada taluk, was excluded therefrom during the fasli under report.

8. *Assessment.*—The total assessment on holdings was Rs. 574.29 lakhs against Rs. 571.65 lakhs (as now revised) in the previous fasli, showing a net increase of Rs. 2,63,218. The reasons

given in paragraph 7 above account for this increase. The increase was appreciable in the districts of Tanjore (Rs. 78,493), Kistna (Rs. 62,427) and West Godavari (Rs. 33,511). In West Godavari, the variations both in area and assessment were mainly due to the resumption of two inam villages in the Chintalapudi taluk, the conversion of included dry lands to wet and the assessment on the lands transferred from poramboke to ayan.

9. *Cultivation*.—The total area cultivated in ryotwari holdings was 20·90 million acres against 20·80 million acres in the previous fasli. There was a net increase of 58,727 acres under 'dry' and 42,483 acres under 'wet'. The increase under 'dry' was large in the districts of Coimbatore (31,657 acres), Madura (25,652 acres), Tinnevely (24,336 acres), Nellore (14,436 acres) and Cuddapah (11,765 acres). The increase under 'wet' was marked in the districts of Tanjore (23,445 acres), Kistna (10,294 acres), Anantapur (8,629 acres) and Chittoor (6,312 acres). These increases were due to the more favourable character of the season. For the same reason, the total area cultivated during the year, including that under miscellaneous cultivation, was 21·96 million acres against 21·95 million acres in the previous fasli. There was also an increase of 45,375 acres under waste charged. In the area cultivated, there was however an appreciable decrease of 40,061 acres under 'dry' in Anantapur and 12,855 acres under 'wet' in East Godavari. The decrease in East Godavari was due to the deficiency of water-supply in the tanks in the upland taluks.

10. *Water-rate and second-crop charge*.—The revenue derived from these sources amounted to Rs. 32·54 lakhs against Rs. 30·14 lakhs in the previous fasli. There was a gross increase of Rs. 3,06,762 in certain districts and a decrease of Rs. 66,452 in others, resulting in a net increase of Rs. 2,40,310. The increase was marked in the districts of South Arcot (Rs. 51,226), Tinnevely (Rs. 38,135), Tanjore (Rs. 30,772), Nellore (Rs. 29,798), Chingleput (Rs. 28,130) and Madura (Rs. 26,305), while the decrease was appreciable in the districts of Kistna (Rs. 40,934) and North Arcot (Rs. 23,864). The increase in South Arcot was, to a large extent, due to the extension of irrigation in the area under the Toludur project in the Vriddhachalam taluk, and to the favourable seasonal conditions of the year. In Tinnevely, the increase under water-rate and second-crop charge was due to the levy of the maximum penalty for unauthorized irrigation of water-rate lands under the Tambraparni system and to the levy of heavy penalties for irregular irrigation of single-crop lands by raising second crop with the water of restricted sources. In Tanjore and Chingleput the increase was due to the more favourable character of the season. In Kistna and North Arcot, the decrease under water-rate was due to the unfavourable character of the season as compared with the previous year.

11. *Remission*.—There was a total net remission of Rs. 22,41,610 during the fasli. As compared with the previous year, there was only a decrease of Rs. 6,501. The decrease was mostly under 'seasonal remissions' due to the favourable character of the season and to the adequate supply of water in the irrigation sources.

(i) *Seasonal remissions*.—There was a decrease of Rs. 2,99,159 in some districts and an increase of Rs. 2,50,524 in others, resulting in a net decrease of Rs. 48,635. The decrease was appreciable in the districts of Anantapur (Rs. 97,782), Cuddapah (Rs. 45,310) and Chittoor (Rs. 33,628) and occurred mainly under the heads 'waste remitted', 'tirvakammi remissions' and 'lands submerged or inundated.'

(a) *Waste remitted*.—Remissions under this head amounted to Rs. 3·43 lakhs or Rs. 26,895 less than in the previous fasli. There was a decrease of Rs. 1,33,169 in some districts and an increase of Rs. 1,06,274 in others. The decrease was marked in the districts of Anantapur (Rs. 38,855); Chittoor (Rs. 27,351); and Cuddapah (Rs. 18,011). There was however a marked increase in East Godavari (Rs. 30,164) and North Arcot (Rs. 29,532) owing to the inadequate supply in the irrigation sources consequent on insufficient rainfall.

A dry remission of Rs. 228 on an extent of 104 acres of sanded dry lands in Lalgudi and Trichinopoly taluks was granted in the fasli under the authority of G.O. Mis. No. 532, Revenue, dated 6th April 1925.

(b) *Shavi and short crop*.—The total amount remitted under this head was Rs. 1,21,194 against Rs. 1,12,698 in the previous fasli, the net increase being Rs. 8,496. The increase was large in the districts of North Arcot (Rs. 16,316) and East Godavari (Rs. 13,918) due to the unfavourable character of the season, while in most of the other districts there was a decrease.

(c) *Tirvakammi remissions* (i.e., the remission of the difference between wet and dry assessment on wet lands cultivated with dry crops owing to insufficiency or failure of water-supply) amounted to Rs. 6,19,719 against Rs. 6,31,234 in the previous fasli showing a net decrease of Rs. 14,515. The decrease was appreciable in the districts of Anantapur (Rs. 57,194), Cuddapah (Rs. 21,169), Bellary (Rs. 16,609), and Ramnad (Rs. 10,130), while there was a marked increase of Rs. 38,417 in North Arcot, Rs. 35,397 in Godavari East, and Rs. 13,649 in Kurnool. The decrease in the districts noted above was due to the favourable character of the season and to irrigation sources having received sufficient supplies, while the increase in Kurnool, North Arcot and East Godavari was due to the inadequacy of supply in tanks owing to the unfavourable character of the season.

(d) *Injury by floods.*—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 4,725 against Rs. 24,303 in the previous fasli, the net decrease being Rs. 19,578. The decrease was large in the district of East Godavari, due to the fact that a large amount was remitted in the Cocanada taluk in fasli 1338 owing to the loss of produce on account of the inundation of lands by the floods of October 1928.

(e) *Remission of second-crop charge.*—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 36,001 as against Rs. 27,877 of the previous fasli, the net increase being Rs. 8,124. The increase was marked in the district of Kurnool (Rs. 11,448), and it was due to the inadequacy of supplies in the tanks.

(ii) *Fixed remissions* (i.e., abatement of demand granted for reasons unconnected with the season) amounted to Rs. 1.34 lakhs against Rs. 1.31 lakhs in the previous fasli showing a net increase of Rs. 2,870. The increase occurred under all the heads except 'remissions granted on account of irrigation by lift,' 'remissions allowed on gradual introduction of new rates of assessment' and 'remissions of assessment on land assigned late in the year.'

(iii) *Beriz deductions.*—Deductions made from village collections in favour of inamdars and religious institutions amounted to Rs. 9.80 lakhs against Rs. 9.41 lakhs in the previous fasli, resulting in a net increase of Rs. 39,264. The increase occurred mainly under 'allowances to religious institutions (1) in lieu of cash payments and (2) in lieu of inams resumed.' The increase was appreciable in Tanjore, Rs. 19,159 and Rs. 17,232 respectively under the two heads and it was due to the fact that mohini allowances were converted to beriz deductions with reference to G.O. No. 806, Revenue, dated 24th April 1929.

12. *Miscellaneous revenue.*—The revenue under this head amounted to Rs. 119.40 lakhs against Rs. 114.57 lakhs in the previous fasli. There was an increase of Rs. 8,06,010 in some districts and a decrease of Rs. 3,22,897 in others, resulting in a net increase of Rs. 4,83,113. The increase occurred mainly under the heads 'water-rate on minor inams in ryotwari villages,' 'sale-proceeds of lands sold' and 'other items'. The several items are dealt with below:—

Item 1—Jodi and quit-rent on minor inams.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 23.50 lakhs against Rs. 23.59 lakhs in the previous fasli; the net decrease being Rs. 9,603. The decrease occurred in almost all the districts except Ganjam, East Godavari, Cuddapah, Anantapur and Tinnevely.

Item 2 (a)—Second-crop charge on minor inam wet lands in ryotwari villages.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 1.53 lakhs as against Rs. 1.52 lakhs (as now revised) of the previous fasli, showing only a net increase of Rs. 775.

Item 2 (b)—Water-rate on minor inams in ryotwari villages.—The revenue under this item was Rs. 13.85 lakhs against Rs. 13.52 lakhs (as now revised) in the previous fasli, or a net increase of Rs. 32,438. The increase occurred in most of the districts and was appreciable in West Godavari (Rs. 22,276).

Item 3—Charge for water in zamindari and inam villages including tirrajasti and fasaljasti items.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 24.48 lakhs against Rs. 24.40 lakhs in the previous fasli resulting in an increase of Rs. 7,759. The increase was marked in the district of Kistna (Rs. 23,311). There was a decrease of Rs. 9,367 in Nellore.

Item 4—Enhanced water-rate on lands irregularly irrigated.—The revenue under this item was Rs. 6.64 lakhs against Rs. 7.48 lakhs in the previous fasli, or a decrease of Rs. 0.84 lakh. The decrease was marked in the districts of West Godavari (Rs. 32,212), East Godavari (Rs. 27,117) and Nellore (Rs. 26,437). In Guntur there was an increase of Rs. 19,765 due to the extension of wet cultivation and levy of penal charges for unauthorized and irregular irrigation.

Item 5—Charges levied for occupation with or without application of assessed and unassessed lands not assigned.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 7.55 lakhs against Rs. 7.74 lakhs in the previous fasli showing a net decrease of Rs. 18,899. The decrease was large in Anantapur (Rs. 22,155), and Nellore (Rs. 12,370), while there was an increase of Rs. 12,610 in West Godavari and Rs. 9,244 in Kistna. The decrease in Anantapur was due to the smaller extent of sivayi-jama cultivation during the fasli owing to the want of timely rains.

Item 6—Charges levied for occupation of poramboke lands.—The revenue derived under this head during the fasli was Rs. 6.51 lakhs against Rs. 7.31 lakhs in the previous fasli, the net decrease being Rs. 79,118. The decrease was appreciable in Nellore (Rs. 27,482), Kurnool (Rs. 19,545) and North Arcot (Rs. 12,037). There was however an increase of Rs. 9,684 in Guntur, owing to the levy of enhanced charges on account of penalty for objectionable cases of encroachments.

Enhanced charges amounting to Rs. 4,25,323 were levied on an extent of 32,670 acres against Rs. 4,34,041 on an extent of 34,918 acres in the previous year, showing an incidence of Rs. 13 per acre against Rs. 14 per acre in the previous fasli. The highest average rates were Rs. 78 in Tinnevely and Rs. 66 in Ramnad, and these were evidently due to the charge of prohibitive penalties in the case of persistent encroachments continued from previous faslis.

There were no porambokes to be reclassified in the districts of Madras and Malabar. The work of reclassification is reported to have

been generally completed in all the districts. From the reports, it is however observed that taram assessment was levied on an extent of 88,366 acres of poramboke lands against 88,050 acres in the previous fasli. Such occupation was extensive in the districts of Anantapur (12,660 acres), Salem (12,206 acres), Guntur (7,563 acres), Bellary (6,978 acres), Tanjore (6,650 acres), Kurnool (5,869 acres), and Nellore (5,797 acres).

In Vizagapatam, proposals for the transfer of certain cases of poramboke to ayan have since been sanctioned and some cases are pending disposal. In East Godavari only ordinary dry rate was charged on poramboke lands occupied during the fasli, either because they were pending inspection by the superior officers, or because the occupation was unobjectionable. In Nellore, deterrent penalties were charged in almost all objectionable cases and eviction proceedings are being resorted to under Act III of 1905. Steps are also being taken to transfer unnecessary bits of porambokes to assessed waste. In Bellary, the Tahsildars have been slow in submitting proposals for the transfer to ayan of porambokes the occupation of which is unobjectionable. The villages in seven taluks of this district are likely to be affected by the Tungabhadra project and therefore the assignment work in those taluks has to be held in abeyance. In Kurnool, the penal provisions of the Land Encroachment Act were freely resorted to in dealing with the occupations and hence the occupations to which the provisions of the Act were not applied were few. In South Arcot, drastic steps are being taken to put an end to all objectionable occupation on porambokes and taram assessment alone is usually charged for unobjectionable occupations in nattam porambokes and cultivation in unreserved forests. In Tanjore, only an extent of 438 acres of poramboke has been transferred to assessed waste for purpose of assignment. No assignments can be made in a major portion of this district until the completion of the Cauvery-Mettur project. The Collector of Trichinopoly reports that he has instructed the Tahsildar of Kulittalai to proceed with the conversion of porambokes the occupation of which is unobjectionable to assessed waste, though assignment cannot at present be made on account of pending irrigation projects. In Salem, the large extent of assessed wastes and poramboke lands on which taram assessment has been charged, mainly relates to the taluks under resurvey and resettlement. The Collector reports that the Tahsildars have been instructed to transfer all the unobjectionable cases to assessed waste as directed in paragraph 3 of G.O. No. 276, Revenue, dated 12th February 1930. The Collectors of the other districts also report that steps have been taken to transfer to ayan the porambokes the occupation of which is unobjectionable.

Item 7—Revenue derived from tree-tax.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 3.85 lakhs against Rs. 3.95 lakhs in the previous fasli, the net decrease being only Rs. 9,529.

Item 8—Commission from estates under Court of Wards management.—The amount of revenue derived under this head was Rs. 42,122 against Rs. 46,707 in the previous fasli, or a net decrease of Rs. 4,585. The decrease was marked in the district of Vizagapatam (Rs. 4,577).

Item 10.—Sale-proceeds of lands sold.—The revenue shown under this head was Rs. 7.19 lakhs against Rs. 5.13 lakhs in the previous fasli, showing an increase of Rs. 2.06 lakhs. The increase was large in the districts of Coimbatore (Rs. 2,42,012), the Nilgiris (Rs. 98,095) and South Arcot (Rs. 31,980). In Coimbatore, the increase was due to the sale of large extents of estates on the Anamalais granted on ryotwari tenure. In the Nilgiris, the increase was due to the large area assigned under the darkhast rules. There was, however, a marked decrease of Rs. 1,12,236, in Kistna due to the fact that there was an abnormal increase of Rs. 1,07,066 in the previous fasli under this head.

Item 11.—Rent of tankas.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 6.42 lakhs against Rs. 6.35 lakhs in the previous fasli, the net increase being only Rs. 6,966. The increase was large in West Godavari (Rs. 12,815) due to the increase in rentals. In Malabar, the increase of Rs. 4,493 in island collections was due to the greater promptness with which the amins made their remittances.

Item 12.—Quit-rent and ground-rent.—The amount of revenue under this head was Rs. 2.30 lakhs against Rs. 2.26 lakhs of the previous fasli, the net increase being Rs. 3,590.

13. The net ryotwari demand including water-rate, second-crop charge and miscellaneous revenue amounted to Rs. 703.82 lakhs against Rs. 693.89 lakhs (as now revised) in the previous fasli. The details for the increase of Rs. 9.93 lakhs are given below:—

16. *Demand and collection of land revenue and cesses (current).*—The current demand under land revenue and cesses during the fasli was Rs. 8,65,50,744. A sum of Rs. 8,59,17,581 or 99·27 per cent was collected within the fasli and Rs. 10,251 was written off the accounts. The percentage of collection during the previous fasli was 99·10.

17. *Demand and collection of arrears.*—The total arrear demand under all the heads amounted to Rs. 9,05,791. A sum of Rs. 5,81,991 or 64·25 per cent was collected (against 65·71 per cent in the previous fasli) and a sum of Rs. 1,16,450 or 12·86 per cent, written off the accounts.

18. The balance outstanding at the end of the fasli, including both arrears and current, was Rs. 8,30,262 against Rs. 9,04,604 at the end of the previous fasli. As reported by Collectors in their demand, collection and balance statements for October 1930, the balance at the beginning of fasli 1340 was Rs. 8,31,110. Up to the

end of October 1930, a sum of Rs. 4,71,310 was collected and Rs. 12,434 written off the accounts. Proposals had been made to write off Rs. 39. The net recoverable balance on 1st November 1930 was Rs. 3,47,327. Of this amount, the collection of a sum of Rs. 2,39,132 was covered by suspensions or postponements, chiefly in the districts of Bellary, Tinnevely, Ramnad and East Godavari. Deducting this amount, the collectable balance on 1st November 1930 was Rs. 1,08,195.

19. *Reconciliation of differences between the collection of land revenue and cesses as shown in the jamabandi and the Accountant-General's statements and overpayments.*—This is carried out month by month along with the reconciliation of the figures of expenditure.

20. *Adjustment to local boards of cesses collected during the fasli.*—Land revenue and cesses are collected together and the distribution of the total collections between 'land revenue' and 'cesses' is effected in the Collector's office after the compilation of the accounts relating to the fasli year.

Statements showing the amounts collected during fasli 1339 on behalf of local boards, the payments made to them during the fasli, and the amounts to be finally adjusted either to their credit or debit are being received from Collectors. After verification by the Accountant-General of the amounts shown by Collectors as payments made to local boards, the recovery of overpayments will be watched by the Board in accordance with the instructions contained in paragraph 3 of G.O. No. 5197, Local and Municipal, dated 7th December 1926.

21. *Charges debitable to land revenue.*—The charges of the Land Revenue Department are shown in the accounts under the head '22. General Administration.' The district administration charges excluding village establishments amounted to Rs. 110·71 lakhs during fasli 1339. The village service charges (including those of proprietary estates) during the fasli were 123·18 lakhs. The total charges amounted to Rs. 233·89 lakhs, or 27·04 per cent of the total land revenue and cesses collected. It must, however, be borne in mind that this amount does not represent merely the cost of collecting the land revenue. The Land Revenue Department performs multifarious duties of which the administration of the land is only one. The village establishment in particular is the servant of all departments of Government. Moreover, a considerable portion of the time of the Collector and his subordinate officials is occupied by magisterial work. While the actual cost of collecting the land revenue cannot be estimated with any degree of accuracy, it is certainly far less than the figure shown above.

22. *Processes under Act II of 1864.*—Statement No. 12 gives the particulars of coercive processes issued for the realization of Government dues under Act II of 1864. The following extract shows the number of processes of each kind issued during the year as compared with the figures for the three preceding faslis:—

23. *Demand notices.*—There was a decrease in the number of demand notices issued during the fasli as compared with the three previous faslis.

24. *Distrain or attachment notices.*—There is also a fall in the number of distrain or attachment notices when compared with the previous faslis.

25. There is a slight increase in the percentage of the number of distrains and attachments of personal property to that of demand notices when compared with the last fasli. In respect of real property the percentage is lower than that of last fasli by 0.53.

26. *Sale notices.*—Out of 67,396 defaulters whose property was attached 43.57 per cent paid up the arrears before sale notices were issued as against 33.30 per cent in the last fasli. As in the last fasli, the number of attachments was largest in Tanjore (13,790).

27. *Sales.*—The number of defaulters whose property was sold is greater than in fasli 1338 by 582. There was an increase in the number of sales of both real and personal property. The percentage borne by actual sales to sale notices in the Presidency was 12.79 against 8.79 in fasli 1338 and the percentage of the number of defaulters whose properties were sold to the total number of holdings

was 0.09 against 0.08 in the previous fasli. The statement below shows the particulars of sales in fasli 1339 compared with those for the preceding three faslis.

Value of lands sold.—Immovable property of the estimated value of Rs. 2,65,976 was sold for the recovery of arrears amounting to Rs. 46,716. The sum realized was 93,412. The value of land was noticeably disproportionate to the arrears in Chingleput, North Arcot, South Arcot, Tanjore, Madura and Ramnad. The Collector of Chingleput explains that the disparity is mainly due to the fact that in case of default by military assignees, the entire extents assigned are generally attached and the lands are estimated at values obtaining for similar lands in the neighbourhood. In many cases the lands had to be bought in by Government for want of bidders. In the case of South Arcot the Collector remarks that the disparity is due to the estimate of the value of lands sold not being judicious. The Collectors of North Arcot, Madura, Ramnad and Tanjore make no special mention of this point but the reasons are probably similar to those reported to Government in B.P. Rout. No. 2337, dated 21st April 1927. The prices fetched by lands sold to private individuals amounted on the average to 7½ times the assessment in the case of dry lands and 9½ times the assessment in the case of wet lands. In fasli

1338 immovable property of the estimated value of Rs. 3,67,309 was sold for recovery of arrears amounting to Rs. 84,584 and the amount realized was Rs. 97,953. The average price fetched for lands sold to private individuals was considerably lower than that fetched during fasli 1339, being only $5\frac{1}{2}$ times the assessment in the case of dry lands and $7\frac{1}{2}$ times the assessment in the case of wet lands.

Extent of land sold.—The extent of land sold to private individuals in the fasli was 8,483.70 acres under dry and 1,187.92 acres under wet against 11,212.95 acres and 1,493.53 acres respectively in fasli 1338. The total area bought in by Government for want of bidders was 3,669.48 acres under dry and 1,056.75 acres under wet against 4,889.57 and 831.40 acres respectively in fasli 1338.

28. *Process serving establishment.*—Statement 13 gives particulars of processes served by the ordinary village agency and by special establishments and of the fees realized during the year. The total number of processes served by the village agency was 781,673 or 53,137 less than in fasli 1338. The number of processes served by special agency (33,612) was less than in the previous fasli by 5,910.

29. *Costs in Civil Suits.*—A total of Rs. 33,197 was awarded to Government as costs during the fasli. Including Rs. 42,123, the revised opening balance, the total demand was Rs. 75,320 of which Rs. 31,022 were collected. Rupees 4,702 were written off the accounts. The net recoverable balance at the end of the fasli was Rs. 39,596 made up of the following items :—

30. *Interest on arrears of land revenue (Statement No. 14).*—The total demand on account of arrears of land revenue including the balance at the beginning of the fasli was Rs. 34,888 of which Rs. 11,558 were collected and Rs. 4,257 remitted leaving a balance of Rs. 19,073 against 17,948 in the previous fasli. The balance exceeds Rs. 1,000 in the districts of Chittoor, South Arcot, Tanjore, Madura and Ramnad.

31. *Sale of lands under Board's Standing Orders Nos. 15, 16, 21, 22, 45, 90 and 91.*—Under the rules for the sale of occupancy right in lands at the disposal of Government (Standing Order No. 15) 6,944.82 acres assessed at Rs. 13,388 were sold for Rs. 3,55,296, 13.21 acres, 684 square links and 10,956 square feet of house-sites in towns assessed at Rs. 58-14-0 were sold for Rs. 27,366 under Standing Order No. 21, 9.57 acres occupied by Government

Departments were sold for Rs. 2,069 under Standing Order No. 22 and 368.69 acres of land bought in by Government at sales for arrears of revenue were resold under Standing Order No. 45 for Rs. 5,898. 2.72 acres which had been acquired for public purposes and were subsequently relinquished were sold under Standing Order No. 90 for Rs. 559. Eighty-two cents of land for which the railway is not likely to have any further use were sold for Rs. 1,958 under Standing Order No. 91. In Bellary 4.63 acres of escheated land were sold for Rs. 171 under Standing Order No. 197. Thirteen grounds and 724 square feet of land were sold in Madras for Rs. 283 under the special rules governing the disposal of vacant lands in the city.

32. *Subdivision of quit-rent.* No applications were received during the year under Standing Order No. 58 for the subdivision of joint liability of shareholders in whole villages or inams.

33. *Transfer of registry of holdings.*—Transfers of revenue registry fall under the following main heads :—

(a) Transfers made with reference to applications and notices received from Sub-Registrars, and,

(b) those effected on applications and intimations received from parties, village officers and others.

(i) Under the first head, 372,473 applications were received during the fasli as against 386,091 in the previous fasli, the decrease being 13,618 or about 3.5 per cent. The bulk of the decrease occurred in the districts of Anantapur (2,430), Kurnool (1,855), Godavari West (1,676) and Salem (1,542).

(ii) Under the second head, the number received was 161,079 against 168,299 in the previous fasli showing a net decrease of 7,220. The decrease occurred mostly in the districts of Tinnevely (6,568), Salem (3,838), North Arcot (2,089) and Chittoor (1,985).

The total number of applications of all kinds including the number pending disposal at the beginning of the fasli was 620,078, of these 538,278 were disposed of during the fasli leaving a balance of 81,800 (or about 13.2 per cent of the total number) as against 85,853 (or about 13.6 per cent of the total number) in the previous fasli. Of the total number of applications disposed of during the fasli, 207,117 or about 38.5 per cent were rejected and 5,212 were transferred to Deputy Tahsildars for disposal. The rejections were mainly due to defective title, non-production of title-deeds and failure to remit subdivision fees.

The percentage of pendency was high in the districts of Ganjam (25), Anantapur (21), Guntur (20), Vizagapatam (19), South Arcot (18), Kistna (17), Godavari East (16), Chittoor (16) and

Nellore (15). The Collector of Ganjam reports that periodical reviews are being issued by the Divisional Officers and the Collector for the speedy disposal of the transfer applications. In Anantapur, it is reported that the Tahsildars are submitting monthly progress reports, and that this branch of work is being closely watched. The pendency in Kistna, Guntur and South Arcot was due to the receipt of a large number of applications during the fasli. In Vizagapatam, it is due to the fact, that most of the applications were received in the last month of the fasli and that in some cases, time was granted for the attendance of parties. In Chittoor, the Collector reports that the experimental scheme of verification of revenue registry has been working satisfactorily.

34. The rule laid down in paragraph 2 of Board's Standing Order No. 12 that the settlement of each taluk should be conducted by the Collector himself once in 5 years was complied with, except, in the case of Gudur and Sulerpet taluks of Nellore district. In fasli 1335, owing to the ill-health of the then Collector (Mr. Reilly), the jamabandi was conducted by the Revenue Divisional Officers of Gudur and Nellore respectively, though the accounts were checked by the Collector's office establishment.

35. *Loans and advances.*—The advances made under the Land Improvement Loans Act during the year amounted to Rs. 4.99 lakhs and those made under the Agriculturists' Loans Act to Rs. 9.32 lakhs making a total of Rs. 14.31 lakhs against Rs. 15.24 lakhs in the previous year. The difference was the net result of an increase in 12 districts and a decrease in 13 districts. The increase was most marked in Anantapur and Kurnool, and the decrease in Coimbatore.

36. Including the balance outstanding at the close of the previous year, a sum of Rs. 8.46 lakhs was repayable during the year under the Land Improvement Loans Act on account of principal while the amount repayable under the Agriculturists' Loans Act was 12.55 lakhs. Of these amounts Rs. 7.47 lakhs or 88.3 per cent under the former Act and Rs. 11.40 lakhs or 90.8 per cent under the latter Act were collected. Advances amounting to Rs. 0.84 lakh under the Land Improvement Loans Act and Rs. 0.4 lakh under the Agriculturists' Loans Act were repaid by the borrowers on account of loans the repayment of which had not fallen due, while Rs. 4,454 and Rs. 1,978 were written off as irrecoverable under the Land Improvement Loans and Agriculturists' Loans Acts respectively.

37. *Coercive processes.*—The aggregate amount of principal and interest repayable during the year under both the Acts, including the balance remaining unpaid out of sums which fell due in previous years, was Rs. 30,02,355 of which a sum of Rs. 7,92,220 or 26.4

per cent was collected without resort to coercive processes and a sum of Rs. 17,58,299 or 58.5 per cent after issue of demand notices. A sum of Rs. 1,34,197 was collected after the attachment of property but before sale, while the amounts realized by the sale of movable and immovable properties were Rs. 6,483 and Rs. 28,107 respectively. A sum of Rs. 7,567 was written off as irrecoverable under both principal and interest under both the Acts. The balance outstanding at the close of the year was Rs. 2,75,482. It was very heavy in Bellary (Rs. 58,220) and Anantapur (Rs. 49,651).

38. The number of wells newly constructed and the number repaired during the year with the aid of loans under the Land Improvement Loans Act are shown below with the corresponding figures for the previous year :—

The largest number of wells (145) constructed or repaired during the year was in Salem. The numbers were large in North Arcot (140) and Coimbatore and Madura (167 each).

A sum of Rs. 89,886 was spent during the year on the reclamation of 1,738 acres of land against Rs. 93,872 and 2,049 acres in the previous year. The largest amount spent was in Ganjam, Rs. 27,415 on an extent of 720 acres of land. Rupees 1,600 were spent in Salem for the installation of an oil engine to benefit 26 acres of land. Rupees 38,105 were spent on other improvements such as removal of nuth grass, the construction of bunds and the lowering of the level of fields, benefiting 1,324 acres altogether.

The following statement shows the purposes for which the advances made to cultivators under the Agriculturists' Loans Act were utilized during the two faslis—1338 and 1339.

Of the total amount of advances outstanding against Collectors, including the amounts referred to above, a sum of Rs. 1,10,534 was adjusted during the year, leaving a net debit of Rs. 2,35,458 under “Revenue Survey Advances—Collectors.”

Under the head “Cost of survey marks—Collectors,” a sum of Rs. 80,640 was collected during the year, leaving a balance of only Rs. 6,486 to be realized. The arrear outstanding at the beginning of the year under ‘Cost of survey marks—Survey officers’ was Rs. 2,99,007. Fresh landholders’ bills for Rs. 2,00,255 were received from Survey officers during the year. Of the total demand of Rs. 4,99,262 under the head, a sum of Rs. 3,71,633 was collected, leaving a balance of Rs. 1,27,629.

The major portion of the balance of Rs. 1,27,629 is outstanding in the districts of Malabar and West Godavari.

West Godavari (Rs. 25,882).—The Collector reports that a major portion of the balance relates to the wrong debits made in the Vizagapatam treasury and that the Accountant-General’s instructions for the cancellation of these debits were received after the close of the half-year. The balance after cancelling the wrong debits was only Rs. 222–10–9.

Malabar (Rs. 77,163).—The arrears relate to the taluks of Wynad, Ernad, Walluvanad, Ponmani and Chirakkal. In the first four taluks, collections are to be made in instalments. The arrears have since been reduced to Rs. 5,124.

40. *Junior Civilians*.—The reports from Collectors show generally that their civilian Divisional officers possess an adequate knowledge of the vernaculars, and that the progress of Assistant Collectors is satisfactory.

41. *Effect of recent legislation on the people*.—No new enactment affecting the agricultural classes generally was passed during the fasli under report. The Madras Hindu Religious Endowments Act has not been in force for a sufficiently long period to call for any special remarks. The Collector of Cuddapah states that not much useful work has been done as yet, although the people are just beginning to realize the advantages of the Act. The Collector of Bellary is of opinion that people are gradually beginning to realize the importance of the Act. The Collector of North Arcot reports that the introduction of the Village Officers’ Restoration Act has facilitated the prompt collection of land revenue. The Collectors of Trichinopoly and Madura report that the advantages of the Madras Agricultural Pests and Diseases Act are more appreciated by the ryots than in previous years. The Madras Decentralization Act VIII of 1914, which empowered Tahsildars and Deputy Tahsildars to charge enhanced assessment in cases of unauthorized occupation and to deal with cases of irregular irrigation, is reported to have worked satisfactorily and to have facilitated the conduct of jamabandi. The new District Municipalities Act, the Local Boards Act and the Village Courts Act afforded greater opportunities to the people to participate in the administration of local affairs and local self-government than before. In the district of Cuddapah, however, complete success was not achieved in this direction on account of the existence of factions, and lack of co-operation and public spirit. The panchayat courts are gradually becoming popular. The Sarda Act which came into force from 1st April 1930 created a sensation among the people and quite a large number of marriages which would otherwise have been prohibited by the Act were performed before that date. The Collector of Cuddapah however reports that the seriousness of the Act has not been realized by the public, as it has not been enforced rigidly. The legislation about the enfranchisement of devadasi inams and the Hereditary Village Officers’ Amendment Act of 1930 has not yet been generally understood.

42. *Enhanced water-cess on irregular irrigation*.—The system of publishing a general or collective notice in each village in accordance with B.P. No. 58, Settlement, dated 10th April 1919, is reported to have worked fairly well, and the Tahsildars exercised their powers judiciously. In general, the ryots are aware of the rules and make timely representations to the jamabandi officers. The Collector of Nellore is of the opinion that this system resulted in the prompt

investigation of objections and a reduction in the number of water-rate appeals. In cases where Government water was taken without permission deterrent penalties were imposed.

43. *Tank-bed cultivation.*—There are no tank-bed lands fit for cultivation in the districts of Madras, the Nilgiris, Malabar and South Kanara. In their Order, Mis. No. 1613, Revenue, dated 2nd September 1922, Government withdrew the special concessions relating to tank-bed cultivation. In spite of this, 262 acres of tank-bed lands were cultivated in Cuddapah during the fasli and the revenue derived was Rs. 1,626. Enhanced assessment to the extent of Rs. 1,234 was imposed for unauthorized occupation. In Anantapur, general permission was granted for the cultivation of tank-beds with melons and cucumbers in all the taluks. Unauthorized cultivation of an objectionable nature was however penalized, under the provisions of the Madras Act III of 1905. In Nellore, tank-bed cultivation was rigidly repressed in the fasli under report. In cases where the depressed classes and others persisted in occupying these lands, the occupiers were evicted, and, where this was not possible, deterrent penalties were imposed. The Collector of Chingleput reports that stray cases of unauthorized cultivation of tank-beds were dealt with under the Land Encroachment Act of 1905. In North Arcot, where the season was bad permission was granted for the cultivation of tank-beds with melons, etc., in some parts of the taluks of Gudiyattam, Arkonam, Wallajah, and Cheyyar. In Trichinopoly, there was tank-bed cultivation only in two taluks and the extent cultivated during the fasli was less than that done in the previous faslis. There was cultivation of tank-beds in three taluks of Ramnad and the condition of the tanks was not adversely affected by it. The Collector of Coimbatore reports that tank-beds were cultivated during the fasli, in seven villages of Coimbatore taluk and five villages of the Kollegal taluk, and that no damage was caused to the tanks. In most of the other districts there were no cases of tank-bed cultivation.

44. *Examination of village and taluk accounts.*—The maintenance of these accounts was fairly satisfactory and no general errors of a serious nature were disclosed. Such minor defects as were noticed were duly rectified. The Collector of Nellore reports that the detailed examination of the Taluk Manual of Accounts was completed in six taluks and that it is being attended to in the other taluks.

45. *The taluk and village statistical registers.*—The taluk statistical registers prescribed in the Manual of Taluk Accounts (special) were maintained in the districts of Malabar, South Kanara and the Nilgiris, and the village statistical registers were maintained

in all the ryotwari villages of the other districts. The following statement shows the progress made in the writing up and checking of the registers up to and during fasli 1339:—

46. *Minor irrigation.*—Statement No. 19 shows for each district the number of irrigation works in charge of the Revenue Department, the number repaired and the amount spent on them during the official year ending 31st March 1930. It also shows the number proposed for repairs during the official year ending 31st March 1931.

47. *Conference with ryots.*—The Collector of Ganjam arranged for lectures on improved methods of agriculture by the Agricultural Demonstrator. The Executive Engineer, Ganjam division, and the Revenue Divisional Officers held special conferences concerning irrigation and drainage. In East Godavari, conferences with ryots were held at various centres by the settling officers and the Officers of the Public Works Department during jama bandi and at other times, when the representatives of rural bodies communicated freely

with local officials on matters of public interest. The Collectors of Guntur and Nellore report that every opportunity was given to the ryots to represent their grievances at the time of jamabandi and that their requests were duly considered. Conferences were held by the Collector of Cuddapah and the Revenue Divisional Officers, at which subjects relating to sanitation, education, grazing fees, repairs to irrigation sources, formation of roads, etc., were discussed and necessary steps taken wherever required. In Anantapur, no regular conferences were held by the Revenue Divisional Officers except one in the Kalyandrug taluk, where the land revenue policy of Government was explained to the ryots. In Bellary, the Collector held a conference at Hospet when the disposal of water applications and the opening of an additional cattle pound near the Hospet Railway station were considered. The Collector of Kurnool held two conferences—one in Dhone and the other in Markapur. The officers of the Agricultural and Veterinary Departments, who attended the conferences, explained to the ryots the use of iron ploughs and the methods of inoculation for rinderpest; and exhibitions of special varieties of seed grains and manures were given by the officers of the Agricultural Department. In Chittoor, informal conferences were held by the Collector and the Revenue Divisional Officers during jamabandi, when individual requests for repairs to irrigation sources, matters relating to forest panchayats and panchayat courts were put forward. Conferences were held with the leading ryots of the villages in North Arcot by the jamabandi officers, when lectures were delivered on village sanitation, agriculture, forest, village panchayat and kudimaramat. In certain taluks the opportunity was taken to talk to the people about the benefits of British rule and the evils of civil disobedience. In all the taluks of Tanjore, ryots' conferences were held, at which the officers of the Agricultural, Public Works and Co-operative Departments were present; the matters brought forward by the ryots chiefly, related to irrigation and drainage. In Trichinopoly, conferences were held by the Collector and the Sub-Collector, Karur. Lectures were organized on the benefits of co-operative organizations, improved methods of agriculture and the use of chemical manures in conjunction with the bulky organic manures. As Special Officer in connexion with the Periyar system of irrigation, the Collector of Madura held conferences at various centres, where he investigated the grievances of the ryots. In Salem, informal conferences were held by the Revenue Divisional Officers, when the ryots were advised to uproot cambodia cotton plants after cropping and to adopt improved scientific methods of agriculture, so as to derive an appreciably increased yield. At the conferences held by the Collector of South Kanam in the Udipi and Puttur taluks, representations made by the ryots regarding forest matters, extension of

concessions in the reserve, anti-malarial operations and high rate of assessment were communicated to the heads of departments concerned for necessary action. Conferences were also held in the district of the Nilgiris. In Malabar, as usual, the people showed little interest in jamabandi.

48. *Inspection of cattle census (quinquennial).*—A cattle census was taken by the karnams during the year and tested by Revenue Inspectors, Deputy Tahsildars, Tahsildars and in a few cases by Divisional Officers also. It is reported that the overcheck by the Inspecting officers has not disclosed any defect in the work of the karnams and that the enumeration has been on the whole fairly correct.

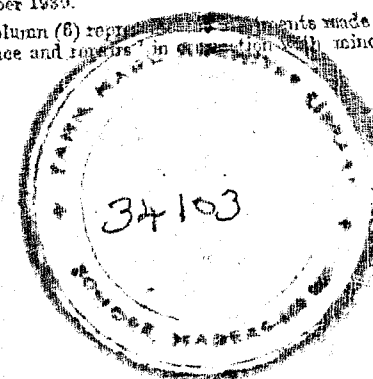
