

STATISTICS OF CIVIL COURTS IN THE
MADRAS PRESIDENCY FOR THE YEAR
1932.



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INTRODUCTORY NOTE.

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I.—GENERAL.

Courts.—On the 31st December 1932, the following were the permanent courts in the Madras Presidency :—

The High Court,
The Court of Small Causes of Madras,
The Madras City Civil Court,
29 District Courts (including three for agency tracts),
44 Subordinate Judges' Courts (including seven for agency tracts and one revenue officer exercising the powers of a Subordinate Judge),
1 Special Small Cause Court,
163 District Munsifs' Courts (including 22 for agency tracts and four revenue officers exercising the powers of District Munsifs), and 127 Revenue Courts.

In addition, there were during the year two temporary Subordinate Judges' Courts and one temporary District Munsif's Court. Besides these, there were 11 Subordinate Judges and 18 District Munsifs attached to permanent courts under the Amended Civil Courts Act.

The Subordinate Judges of Chingleput, Chittoor, Coimbatore (Principal), Ootacamund, Rajahmundry (Principal), Ellore, Guntūr, Masulipatam, Madura (Principal), Dindigul, Tellicherry, Calicut, Nellore, Ramnad (Principal), Salem, Tanjore (Principal), Tinnevely (Principal), Trichinopoly and Vizagapatam (Principal), were invested with the powers of Assistant Sessions Judges, during the year. Additional Sessions Judges worked at Coimbatore throughout the year and at Guntūr from 15th January to 8th April 1932, and they exercised civil powers. In addition an Additional Sessions Judge worked at East Gōdāvari from 1st to 28th February 1932 to relieve the congestion of sessions cases pending at the end of 1931. Mr. A. S. Panchapakesa Ayyar, I.C.S., worked as Additional District and Sessions Judge, Guntūr, from 15th January to 8th April 1932. Mr. P. N. Ramaswami Ayyar, I.C.S., reported himself for judicial training and was working as Principal District Munsif, Salem, from 4th January 1932. Mr. P. Rajagopalan, I.C.S., who reported himself for judicial training worked as Additional District Munsif of Bellary till 1st April 1932 and as Subordinate Judge, Bellary, thereafter. The court of the Subordinate Judge of Negapatam was abolished with effect from 27th June 1932.

The statement given below gives the names of Subordinate Judges' Courts and District Munsifs' Courts, in which more than one judge exercised jurisdiction during 1932. In courts where a judge worked only for a portion of the year the period is noted.

2. *Number of suits.*—The total number of regular suits instituted during the year in the courts of the Presidency, including Village and Panchayat Courts, was 646,561 against 627,465 in 1931. For the presidency as a whole, one suit was instituted for every 72 persons of the population as compared with 74 persons in the previous year, and the ratio for the presidency town was one for every 35 persons. Apart from the agency tracts, Ganjam was, as usual, the least litigious district, with one suit for every 259

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persons. The largest number of suits filed was 85,983 in Malabar (North and South—which form one revenue district), and Bellary contributed the smallest number of suits, 6,636.

3. *Nature of Suits.*—The number of suits instituted for money or movable property was 571,613 or 92.75 per cent of the total number as against 93.29 per cent in 1931, when the number of suits of this class was 559,592. The number of suits for immovable property, other than mortgage suits, was 16,040 against 14,702 in 1931. In Revenue Courts the number of suits instituted was 30,282 against 27,623 in 1931. The number of mortgage suits instituted was 23,644 against 20,754 in the previous year. Suits for specific relief amounted to 3,221 against 2,873 last year.

4. *Value of Suits.*—The value of suits instituted during the year, in courts other than Village, Panchayat and Revenue Courts was Rs. 11,65,09,326 or Rs. 55,54,469 more than in the previous year. The average value of a suit during the year under report was Rs. 384. Apart from Revenue Courts but including Village and Panchayat Courts 28.29 per cent of the suits instituted were of the value of Rs. 20 and below against 29.42 in 1931; 66.06 per cent of the suits were between the values of Rs. 20 and Rs. 500 against 64.90 per cent in 1931. The number of suits filed above Rs. 500 in value was 34,194 against 33,485 in 1931. The number of suits triable by Village and Panchayat Courts, but which were filed before the higher tribunals, was 39,182—an increase of 376 over the figure of the previous year.

5. *Number of Appeals.*—The total number of appeals preferred in the year under report was 12,253—a decrease of 1,753 as compared with the figure of the previous year; the average for the quinquennium ending with 1930 being 15,719.

II.—COURTS OF ORIGINAL JURISDICTION.

6. *Village Munsifs' Courts.*—The total number of suits instituted in Village Courts was 93,059 against 90,443 in 1931. The largest number was contributed by South Malabar (15,978) and smallest by Ganjam (30). The increase was chiefly noticeable in Tinnevely (1,505). On the other hand there was a decrease of 3,479 in South Malabar. The number of suits disposed of correspondingly rose from 89,051 in 1931 to 91,410 in 1932. The number of suits pending at the end of the year was 9,946 and exceeded 500 in seven districts, being highest in South Arcot, 1,683. The number of suits transferred by District Munsifs to Village Courts under section 20-A of the Village Courts Act was 631.

7. *Village Panchayat Courts.*—The total number of suits instituted in Panchayat

Courts was 220,096 against 213,278 in 1931. The number disposed of was 216,373 against 206,030 leaving 47,423 pending at the close of the year against 43,470 in 1931. The increase in institution was highest in Anantapur, 2,372. On the other hand North Malabar showed a decrease of 1,912 suits in the number instituted. The number of suits transferred by District Munsifs to this class of courts under section 20-A of the Village Courts Act was 111.

8. *Revenue Courts.*—The number of suits filed in Revenue Courts, other than those in agency tracts was 29,763 against 27,333 in 1931. The increase is noticeable in East Godavari (3,089 against 361 in 1931), and the decrease in Ramnad (8,679 against 11,581 in 1931). There was a decrease of 1,186 in the disposal of suits, the decrease being chiefly noticeable in Ramnad, which has disposed of 5,783 suits less than in the previous year. The number of suits pending has risen from 7,484 to 8,292 in 1932, the increase being marked in East Godavari, 1,517 against 158 in 1931. The number of suits pending for over three months was 4,619 against 5,410 in 1931. The average duration of contested suits disposed of during the year was 514 and of uncontested suits 100 days, as compared with 411 and 57 days, respectively.

9. *Agency Courts.*—The number of suits instituted in Agency Tracts was 2,262 against 1,635 in 1931. The number disposed of was 2,207; and 492 were left pending at the close of 1932, against 569 in the previous year. The average duration of contested suits disposed of fell from 277 days in 1931 to 255 days in 1932 and that of uncontested suits rose from 62 days to 95 days.

10. *District Munsifs' Courts.*—The number of original suits instituted in the District Munsifs' Courts, other than those in agency tracts was 80,387 against 83,239 in 1931. Seventeen districts show decreases, the decrease being chiefly noticeable in Guntūr. The fall in the institution of original suits is compensated by the increase in the institution of small cause suits, which is in turn due to the increase in the number of District Munsifs exercising extended small cause court powers. The extended powers were formerly exercised by officers only as long as they presided over a particular court, but now the power is personal. The total number of original suits for trial, including those pending from last year, received by transfer, remanded or re-admitted and excluding those transferred was 127,920 against 136,250 in 1931. The number disposed of was 82,931 against 92,455 last year, and the number left pending at the end of the year was 44,976 against 43,795 in 1931. It is unsatisfactory to note that the number of suits pending increased in spite of a decrease in institution. The decrease

in disposals was noticeable in South Arcot (1,439), South Malabar (913), and Kurnool (741). On the other hand there was an increase in disposals in the District Munsifs' Courts of North Malabar (436), South Kanara (285) and Nellore (85). In Kurnool the number of pending suits increased from 1,277 to 1,659 while in Guntūr it fell from 4,770 to 4,378. The total number of suits pending for over three months was 1,659 against 1,277 last year. The figure decreased by 270 and the figure at 9,999 against 10,269 last year. The districts which show the largest number of one-year old suits are Guntūr (2,055), Ramnad (868) and West Godavari (861). The following statement shows by districts, the number of ordinary suits pending in the District Munsifs' Courts, with the year of institution:—

As regards small cause suits there was a rise in the number of suits instituted (175,890 against 164,828 in 1931), and a corresponding increase in disposals (174,368 against 157,405 in 1931). At the end of the year the number of suits pending was 28,383 of which 6,751 were over three months' old, the corresponding figures for the previous year being 28,114 and 5,843, respectively. The number of District Munsifs exercising extended small cause powers up to Rs. 300 was 136 against 132 in 1931, 69 in 1930, and 63 in 1929. The number of original suits disposed of after contest fell from 50,998 to 47,010 and the average disposal per court for ordinary and small cause suits was 595 and 1,260, respectively. The question of the revision of standard outturn of courts is still under consideration.

The average duration of contested ordinary suits fell from 317 in 1931 to 308 in 1932, and that of uncontested suits remained the same, 62 days. The average duration of contested ordinary suits exceeded 250 days in 82 courts as against 95 courts in the previous year. Guntūr, Devakotta and Ongole show the highest duration for the disposal of contested ordinary suits (668,648

and 642 days, respectively). Guntūr showed the highest average duration of any district—529 days for contested ordinary suits with seven courts working. Next come West Godavari with 466 days (with five courts working) and Ramnad with 461 days (with seven courts working); while all courts in the districts of Cuddapah, Ganjam, West Godavari, Guntūr, South Kanara, Kistna, Kurnool and Ramnad took over 250 days for the disposal of contested suits. The usual explanation offered for the high duration is the disposal of old suits. The average duration of uncontested ordinary suits exceeded 100 days in nine courts being highest in Sivaganga (120 days), the district average being 92 days.

The average duration of contested small cause suits was 110 days against 102 days in 1931. It exceeded 100 days in 67 courts, being highest in the District Munsif's Court of Narasapur (306 days), with a disposal of 363 suits. As regards uncontested small cause suits, the duration was 53 days against 49 days in 1931. It exceeded 50 days in 64 courts, being highest in the Court of the District Munsif of Narasapur, 186 days.

11. *Special Small Cause Court.* In the Special Small Cause Court, Trinidad, there has been an increase in the number of small cause suits, 6,421 against 5,742 in 1931. 5,915 suits were disposed of against 5,846 in 1931, leaving 1,482 suits pending at the close of 1932 against 922 in 1931. The average duration of contested and uncontested suits was 131 and 59 days, respectively, against 117 and 56 in 1931.

12. *Subordinate Judges' Courts.*—The number of ordinary suits filed in the Courts

of the Subordinate Judges was 3,313 against 3,168 in 1931. The increase was marked in Devakotta 226 against 192 in 1931. On the other hand Guntūr showed a decrease of 46 suits over the figure of the previous year. The disposals showed a decrease of 166 suits, 3,479 against 3,645 in 1931. The statements given below give the number of ordinary suits pending in the District and Subordinate Judges' Courts, according to the year of institution :—

As regards small cause suits, the number instituted fell from 17,009 to 16,455 and the number disposed of from 17,329 to 16,697. The number of suits pending at the end of the year rose from 4,288 to 5,212. Despite the decrease in institution the number of suits pending at the end of the year increased—an unsatisfactory feature. The fluctuation in the institution of small cause suits in this class of courts depends largely on the powers exercised by the local District Munsifs. The number of suits pending for more than three months was 2,286 against 1,889 in 1931. The average disposal of a court of a Subordinate Judge was 88 original suits, 425 small cause suits and 102 regular appeals.

The average duration of contested original suits was 474 days against 455 days in the previous year and 83 days against 79 days in the case of uncontested suits. The duration of contested suits exceeded 250 days in all courts except those at Bellary, Coimbatore (Additional), and Ootacamund. The highest duration was shown by Bapatla (1,025 days for 73 suits), Chittoor (830 days for 39 suits) and Bezwada (638 days for 86 suits). The average duration of contested small cause suits was 169 days against 152 days, last year, and of uncontested suits, 55 days against 59 days in 1931. The duration of contested suits was highest in Narasapur, 459 days for 186 suits.

The extension of small cause powers up to Rs. 1,000 exercised by Subordinate Judges is reported to have worked satisfactorily, on the whole. The District Judge of East Gōdāvari, however, submits that it is desirable to revert to the old system as the litigant public feel that they are deprived of the chance of appeal besides having to submit to a summary trial.

13. *District Courts*.—In the District Courts, excluding the courts in agency tracts, 606 suits were instituted against 545 in the previous year, and the average for the quinquennium ending with 1930 being 565. The disposals rose from 435 to 623 and the number pending at the close of 1932 also rose from 792 to 826. The number of suits pending for over one year has however decreased from 359 to 347 in 1932. The average number of days which District Judges were able to devote to civil work was 100 days and the figure ranges from 181 days in Kistna to 35 days in Coimbatore. Most of this time was occupied in civil appellate and miscellaneous work, and the total number of original suits disposed of by all District Judges together, after trial, was 581, of which 455 were contested, the disposals varying from 92 in Kistna to nil in North Arcot.

The average duration of contested suits was 544 days against 398 days in 1931 and of uncontested suits was 106 days against 147

days last year. On the other hand Coimbatore took only 53 days for the disposal of twelve contested suits.

14. *The Madras City Civil Court.*—In the Madras City Civil Court, 1,007 suits were filed against 885 in 1931. The Judge disposed of 945 suits of which 497 were contested, the figures for the previous year being 802 and 408, respectively. The number of suits pending at the end of the year was 532 against 438 in 1931. The average duration of contested suits was 170 days against 178 days and for uncontested suits was 27 days against 25 days in the previous year.

15. *The Court of Small Causes of Madras.*—In the Court of Small Causes, the number of suits instituted was 16,689 against 17,557 in 1931, the average for the quinquennium ending with 1930 being 15,758. The number of suits disposed of was 17,273 against 17,505 and the arrears fell from 2,192 to 1,732. The duration of contested suits was 57 days and of uncontested suits 43 days, the figures for the previous year being 55 and 46 days, respectively. The number of suits for rent filed in the Court of Small Causes has fallen from 1,425 to 1,350 in 1932. The Chief Judge explains this decrease, as being due to the increase in the number of applications for recovery of rent by distress, under Chapter VIII of the Presidency Small Cause Courts Act.

16. *The High Court*.—In the High Court of Judicature there were 613 suits filed against 665 in 1931. The number of suits for disposal, including those pending from last year, together with those received by transfer, and re-admitted or remanded was 1,510 against 1,557 in 1931. The number disposed of was 780 against 679 in the previous year; and the arrears fell from 878 to 730. Of the 780 suits disposed of 478 were contested. The number of suits disposed of by the Master was 163 in 1932 against 210 in 1931. Issues were settled by the Master in 256 cases. The number of interlocutory applications disposed of by the Master was 2,917. The average duration of contested suits was 754 days against 651 days in 1931, and of uncontested suits was 174 days against 125 days last year.

17. *Insolvency Petitions*—(a) *Mufassal Courts*.—The number of insolvency petitions presented to the mufassal courts was 6,473 against 6,334 in 1931. The number disposed of, excluding petitions transferred, withdrawn or not prosecuted, was 4,900 and the number pending at the end of the year was 3,067 against 3,778 in 1931. The number of petitions granted was 4,667 against 3,830 in 1931. The total value of creditors' claims admitted was Rs. 81,43,456 against Rs. 97,26,846 and the amount of assets distributed was Rs. 12,04,349 against

Rs. 11,39,579 in the previous year. The number of insolvents discharged was 713.

(b) *The High Court.*—In the High Court, the number of insolvency petitions presented was 553 against 502 in 1931. The number of petitions disposed of was 274 against 260 last year and the pendency further rose from 4,010 to 4,292. It may be observed that in the mufassal an insolvency petition is treated as disposed of, for statistical purposes, when an adjudication order is made, but in the High Court, a petition is not treated as disposed of until the public examination of the insolvent is completed and a discharge is granted or in the case of summary petitions, where the assets do not exceed Rs. 3,000 and where no public examination is usually held, when the debtor has applied for discharge and a discharge is granted. In addition 78 matters which ranked as interlocutory applications but which were in effect suits, were disposed of during the year. The Master disposed of 2,907 interlocutory applications as against 2,612 disposed of by him in 1931. The number of interlocutory applications pending at the close of the year was 1,711. The number of summonses under sections 7 and 36 of the Act pending at the close of 1932 was 2,031 against 1,967 in 1931. The number of persons adjudged insolvents was 563, and the number discharged was 101. The total amount of claims admitted was Rs. 30,59,395 and the amount paid as dividends to creditors was Rs. 3,86,442.

III.—APPELLATE COURTS.

18. *Agency Courts.*—The total number of regular appeals filed in the Agency Tracts was 65 against 62 in 1931, the average for the five years ending with 1930 being 99. The number disposed of was 61 against 52 in the previous year and the number pending at the close of the year was 21 against 16 in 1931. The average duration of appeals disposed of was 74 days against 79 days in the previous year.

19. *District and Subordinate Judges' Courts.*—In the District and Subordinate Judges' Courts the number of appeals instituted was 9,507 of which 7,736 were regular appeals and 1,771 were miscellaneous appeals, against 10,420 in the previous year, the average for the quinquennium ending with 1930 being 12,438. The number of regular appeals disposed of by Subordinate Judges was 4,014 against 5,185 in 1931 and the arrears fell from 3,583 to 3,136. The number of appeals pending for more than six months before the Subordinate Judges' Courts was 1,848 against 2,222. The average duration of appeals disposed of was 324 days in the case of contested appeals and 239 days in the case of uncontested appeals, the corresponding figures for the previous year

being 379 and 206 days, respectively. The duration was highest in the Court of the Subordinate Judge of Vizagapatam, 558 days for 252 appeals. Next come the Courts of the Subordinate Judges of Kumbakonam with 557 days for 71 appeals and Narasapur, 542 days for 162 appeals. The following Courts of the Subordinate Judges took over a year on an average for the disposal of contested appeals:—Vellore, Cuddalore, Chingleput, Berhampur, Bapatla, Ottapalem, Nellore, Salem, Tanjore and Tuticorin.

As regards uncontested appeals Vizagapatam tops the list with 815 days for two appeals. The largest number of appeals pending was to be found in the Courts of the Subordinate Judges of Vizagapatam (237), Calicut (211), and Cocanada (183) and the number pending for over six months in these courts was 139, 153 and 105, respectively. The number of miscellaneous appeals disposed of by all the Subordinate Judges during 1932 was 293 against 239 in 1931.

The number of regular appeals filed in the District Courts was 6,823 against 7,986 in 1931, and the fall may in part be attributed to the exercise of small cause powers up to Rs. 1,000 by Subordinate Judges. The number disposed of fell from 4,812 to 4,742. The number pending at the close of 1932 was 5,387 against 5,909 last year. The average duration of contested appeals disposed of was 369 days against 333 in 1931 and 227 days against the same number of days in 1931 as regards uncontested appeals. The duration of contested appeals was highest in Vizagapatam, 754 days for 271 appeals. The duration was over one year in the District Courts of Anantapur, South Arcot, Chittoor, Ganjam, East Godavari, Guntur, Kurnool, Madura, Nellore, Ramnad, Salem and West Tanjore.

20. *The High Court.*—The number of appeals from original decrees of courts in the mufassal filed in the High Court was 419 against 595 in 1931, and 468 the average for the five years ending with 1930. The number disposed of was 325 against 329 in 1931, and the arrears rose from 2,282 to 2,376. The number of appeals filed against the orders of the mufassal courts was 527 against 499 in 1931, the average for the quinquennium ending with 1930 being 510. 652 appeals were disposed of and 942 were left pending at the end of 1932; the corresponding figures for the previous year being 544 and 1,067, respectively. 100 appeals were filed against the decrees passed on the original side of the High Court against 109 in 1931, the average for the five years being 114. 115 appeals were disposed of against 124 in the previous year, and the arrears fell from 133 to 118. The number of appeals from decrees of the Madras City Civil Court was 71, the figures for the

previous year and the average for the preceding five years being 75 and 56, respectively. 128 appeals were disposed of against 10 in 1931, leaving 144 pending against 201 in 1931. The average duration in respect of each class of these appeals disposed of after contest was 1,724 days, 854 days, 2,367 days and 648 days, respectively. The high average duration of contested original side appeals is due to the disposal of old appeals (11 appeals of 1928, 9 of 1929 and 28 of 1930). The number of letters patent appeals (other than original side appeals) instituted was 100 against 115 in 1931, 228 being the average for the preceding quinquennium. The number disposed of was 162 against 351 in 1931, and the arrears fell from 288 to 226. The number of appeals received against appellate decrees was 1,367 against 1,987 in 1931, the average for the previous quinquennium being 1,832. The number disposed of was 1,838 against 1,919 in 1931 and the arrears fell from 4,984 to 4,513. The number of appeals preferred against appellate orders was 190 against 258 in 1931 and the average for the preceding quinquennium being 199. The number of this class of appeal disposed of was 295 against 222 in 1931 and the arrears at the close of the year fell from 689 to 584. The average duration of contested second appeals disposed of was 1,615 days in 1932. The number of appellate side matters disposed of by the Master (including civil miscellaneous petitions and court-fee references) was 568 against 1,967 in 1931. It may be noted that the powers of disposing of civil miscellaneous petitions on the appellate side, hitherto exercised by the Master, were withdrawn since 29th March 1932, and the Deputy Registrar, appellate side, was delegated with such powers. The Deputy Registrar disposed of 1,508 civil miscellaneous petitions during 1932.

21. *Appeals to Privy Council.*—At the beginning of the year there were 5 applications for leave to appeal to His Majesty in Council pending before the High Court. 29 applications for leave were received during the year. Of the total number of applications for leave 8 were dismissed with costs and leave was granted in 8 applications, of which 3 were not prosecuted for default in payment of security and printing deposit. The number of applications pending at the close of the year was 18. The number of Privy Council appeals pending preparation in the High Court at the beginning of the year was 18 and the preparation of record in 5 appeals was taken up in the year. Seven appeals were despatched to England, 4 appeals were withdrawn in the High Court and 12 were under preparation in the High Court at the close of 1932. In the Privy Council in England 27 appeals were pending at the beginning of the year and 7 were newly received. Of the total of 34 appeals

for disposal, 3 were dismissed with costs, 1 allowed and 2 dismissed for non-prosecution, leaving 28 appeals pending at the end of the year.

IV.—REVISION AND REFERENCE.

22. *Revision.*—The number of revision petitions filed in the High Court was 1,987, of which 910 were for the revision of decisions in small cause suits, as against 1,976 and 769, respectively, in the previous year. The number of petitions disposed of was 2,246 against 2,293 in 1931 and the arrears fell from 3,585 to 3,326. Of the total number of petitions disposed of 77.65 per cent were dismissed as against 82.25 per cent in the previous year.

23. *Reference.*—The number of cases referred to the High Court by the lower courts and the Board of Revenue was 11, the average for the preceding quinquennium being 13. Thirteen cases were left pending at the close of 1932. Of the total of 18 cases for disposal, inclusive of the 7 pending from the previous year, 5 were disposed of, 4 under the Indian Divorce Act and 1 under the Code of Civil Procedure. On the original side of the High Court there were for disposal 35 petitions under the Income-tax Act of which 22 were disposed of, leaving 13 pending at the end of the year. The number of petitions for disposal under the Indian and Colonial Divorce Jurisdiction Act was 5, and all these 5 petitions were disposed of during 1932. Petitions under the Indian and Colonial Divorce Jurisdiction Act are included in Statement No. 9, Part (I), under "Original Matrimonial Suits."

V.—MISCELLANEOUS.

24. *Execution.*—The total number of applications for execution received in all the courts in the mufassal, except Village and Panchayat Courts was 403,952 against 383,277 in 1931 and 369,310 the average for the five years ending with 1930. The number of applications disposed of was 400,255 against 379,280 in 1931, and 80,881 were left pending at the close of 1932 against 75,366 in the previous year. Satisfaction was obtained in full in 13.23 per cent of the applications disposed of against 13.21 per cent in 1931. Satisfaction was obtained in part in 11.70 per cent against 11.03 per cent last year, and the number of wholly infructuous applications rose from 285,046 to 298,742. The amount realized in execution was Rs. 2,26,34,184 against Rs. 1,98,24,927 in the previous year. The number of debtors imprisoned in execution was 4,544 against 4,505 in 1931.

The number of applications for execution received in the Madras City Civil Court, Court of Small Causes of Madras and the High Court was 19,232 against 19,980 in the previous year. 19,260 applications were disposed of

leaving 1,255 pending at the close of 1932, the corresponding figures for the previous year being 20,388 and 1,282, respectively. Satisfaction was obtained in full in 10·77 per cent of the applications disposed of against 11·11 per cent in 1931; satisfaction was obtained in part in 15·31 per cent against 13·51 per cent in 1931. The number of wholly infructuous applications fell from 15,167 to 14,089. The amount realized in execution was Rs. 8,86,111 against Rs. 7,24,089 in the previous year, and the number of judgment-debtors imprisoned was 259 against 223 in 1931.

25. *Processes.*—The system of supplying process-servers with apparatus for taking the thumb impressions of illiterate persons in token of the receipt of a process has been reported to have worked satisfactorily.

26. *Legal Practitioners.*—At the end of the year there were on the rolls of the High Court 2,519 advocates and 74 attorneys. 154 advocates and 3 attorneys were newly enrolled during 1932. In the mufassal, 4,472 first-grade pleaders and 548 second-grade pleaders renewed their sanads for 1932. No pleaders were newly enrolled during the year, as fresh enrolment of pleaders to practise in mufassal courts was discontinued since December 1931. The fees for the admission of High Court practitioners amounted to Rs. 94,688 and those for the renewal of pleadership certificates of pleaders amounted to Rs. 1,19,793.

27. *Inventories of Valuable Stock.*—Inventories of valuable stock of office furniture have been maintained and checked in all courts in accordance with the provisions of G.O. No. 710, Finance, dated 4th August 1920.

28. *Shorthand Writers.*—District Judges report that the system of dictating judgments to shorthand writers in open court by District Munsifs, facilitates quick disposal, and has worked satisfactorily.

29. *Powers of Veto under the Amended Civil Courts Act.*—The delegation of powers of appointment and punishment to District Munsifs and Subordinate Judges under the Amended Civil Courts Act and the rules framed thereunder, is reported to have worked satisfactorily, on the whole. Some of the District Judges report that they modified some of the appointments made by their subordinates, either on the ground of deviation from the principles of seniority or on communal considerations. The District Judge of Madura further reports that the inevitable result of the selection of the Madras Services Commission candidates for appointment in rotation of communities is to centralise the control of appointment more and more in the hands of the District Judges and that it will result in a loss of power of appointment to the subordinate courts; while the Subordinate Judge of Tenali reports that the system of making appointments

under G.O. No. 686, Public (Services), dated 19th June 1931, is causing inconvenience due to the delay caused in getting a competent candidate through the Collector and suggests that it would be much more convenient if a list of candidates intended exclusively for the Judicial Department is kept with the District Judges.

30. *Inspection of Village Courts' Records.*—The total number of District Munsifs who inspected the records of Village and Panchayat Courts within their jurisdiction was 140 against 149 in 1931, and the number of courts, the records of which were inspected was 6,814 against 6,047 in the previous year, as detailed below :—

In spite of the observations made by Government in their G.O. No. 4126, Law (General), dated 16th November 1932, the District Judge of South Malabar has inspected only 3 courts out of the 14 courts in his district and no explanation has been submitted for this low inspection.

Travelling court-fee examiners have inspected 64 courts during the year 1932. As a result of their inspection, deficits amounting to Rs. 68,511 were pointed out and a sum of Rs. 46,489 was collected during the year.
