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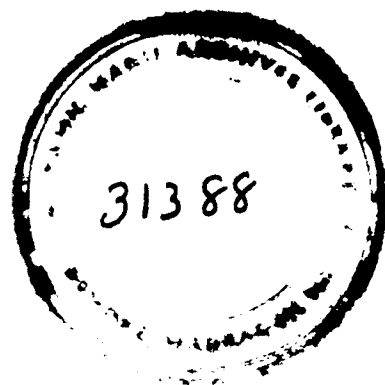
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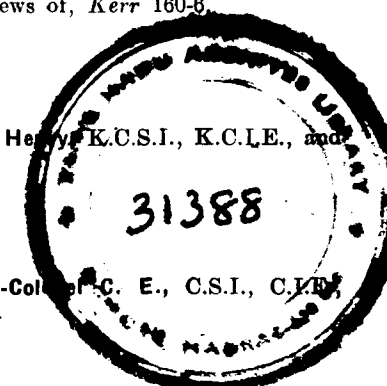
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Selection posts:

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Recommendation re. if higher posts abolished, *I.C.S. Assn.* p. 3 (2); *Kerr* 28, 64-71, 83-9, 145-6, 205, 244-50; *Fawcett* 154-9; *Fagan* p. 51 (6 (a)), p. 52 (6 (h)), p. 59 (4), 2728, 2738-41; *Shoobert* 2719, 2759-64; *Indian (Imperial) Police Assn.* p. 151 (26 (3)).

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Necessary and desired by many Indians, *European Assn.* p. 447 (19); *F. E. James* 3802, 3807-11, 4102-4.

Criticism of proposals, *O'Dwyer* pp. 76-7, 858-67, 893-901.

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Laying down of minimum number, not possible, *Thompson* 4524-5.

Provincial governments should have effective control over existing officers and complete control over future, *All-India Muslim Conf.* and *All-India Muslim League* p. 1477 (VII (f)), p. 1478 (XI), p. 1480 (4); *Abdullah Yusuf Ali* 9825-6.

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Future entrants, appeal against orders prejudicial to interest of, passed by Provincial Ministry, may be made appealable to Governor, *Sinha* p. 245 (14).

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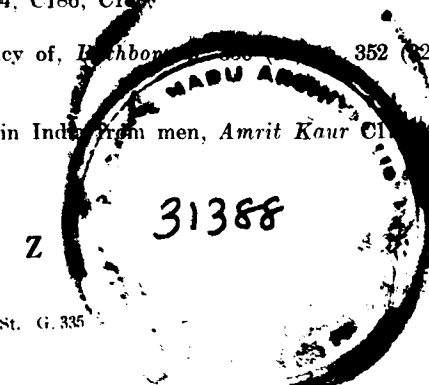
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
