(LAND REVENUE AND SETTLEMENT)

The Board submits its report on the settlement of land revenue in the Madras Presidency for fasli 1342 (1932–33) together with the prescribed statements.

2. *Character of the season.*—A temporary phase of the south-west monsoon set in early about the middle of May and its regular advance was felt in Malabar only on the 2nd June. It was generally weak in June and strengthened in July, especially in the Circars, Bellary and Malabar, where there were well distributed rains. There was a break in the monsoon after the 10th August, but there were thunder-storms during the rest of the month. At the end of the month, however, the monsoon revived in Malabar. The rainfall in August was below the average in the Circars, Cuddapah, Chingleput, South Arcot, North Arcot, Tanjore and on the West Coast. There were freshes in the main rivers. In September the monsoon generally became weak except in East Godavari (Agency), Kistna and on the West Coast and gradually withdrew after the 25th of the month. The south-west monsoon was, on the whole, below the average except in West Godavari, Bellary, Coimbatore, Madura and Tinnevely.

The north-east monsoon commenced in October accompanied by unusually heavy thunder-storms especially on the West Coast, in the Central districts and in Bellary. It gained in strength in November, when there were two cyclonic storms in the Bay of Bengal; in the last week of the month the rains were so heavy that they caused floods and also breaches in the irrigation sources in various parts of the Tanjore district. The standing crops, however, did not sustain any serious damage. In December the rainfall was below the average except in South Arcot, Salem, Trichinopoly, Tanjore, Ramnad and Tinnevely. There were practically no rains in January and February.

On the 12th and the 13th March there were thunder-storms and excessive rain in Chingleput, South Arcot, North Arcot and Tanjore and between the 9th and the 12th April also there were fairly widespread thunder-storm and rain in the southern half of the Presidency, particularly in Coimbatore, Madura, Tinnevely and on the West Coast. On the whole the north-east monsoon was above the average except in Cuddapah, Nellore, Chittoor and Tinnevely. In May there was an early onset of the south-west monsoon. Widespread and locally heavy rains on the Malabar Coast and in the adjacent districts between the 9th and the 12th May indicated a temporary incursion of monsoon winds in the south-east Arabian sea. The course of these winds was towards the south of the Bay of Bengal and across the extreme south of the Presidency and as a result the weather became unsettled in the centre of the Bay on the 20th. Subsequently the monsoon current established itself in Malabar on the 21st and 22nd and continued strong during the rest of the month. The rainfall in the month was excessive on the West Coast and above the average in most of the districts in the Presidency. The hot weather rains were on the whole, above the average.

Sowings of the early crops were generally satisfactory and the condition of the early crops was fair. Sowings of the late crops were restricted or below normal in the Circars, the Deccan and the southern districts and were satisfactory in the Carnatic. Sowings of the late dry crops were restricted in the Central districts while sowings of the late wet crops were satisfactory in the Central districts, and on the West Coast. The condition of the late crops was generally fair.

3. *Number of ryotwari villages.*—The total number of ryotwari villages in the fasli was 21,630 against 21,607 in the previous fasli (as now revised). The increase of 23 villages in the Presidency was the result of the following changes :—The increase of 2 villages in the Ganjam district was due to the inclusion (1) of the resumed inam village of Siddipur in the Kudala taluk, which has since been surveyed and (2) of a village in the Berhampur taluk which was omitted to be included in previous faslis. There was an increase of 21 villages in the East Godavari district due to the survey and settlement of 21 rented villages in the Polavaram taluk. The increase of 11 villages in the Trichinopoly district was offset by a corresponding decrease in the Madura district, due to the transfer of 11 villages from the Dindigul taluk of the latter district to the Karur taluk of the former district.

4. The Land Revenue of the Presidency is derived from the following sources :—

- (a) peshkash on revenue from permanently settled estates ;
- (b) shrotriyam jodi or quit-rent levied on inam villages ;
- (c) assessment including water-rate on lands held under the ryotwari system ; and
- (d) miscellaneous revenue.

5. *Peshkash or revenue from permanently settled estates.*—The total amount of peshkash payable during the fasli was Rs. 49,91,532 against Rs. 49,91,947 in the previous fasli. The decrease of Rs. 415 is the result of—

6. The quit-rent payable on villages held on shrotriyam or favourable tenure was Rs. 7,52,741 against Rs. 7,52,630 in the previous fasli. The increase of Rs. 111 is accounted for below :—

7. *Holdings.*—The total extent of ryotwari holdings during the fasli was 27,812,461 acres ; which exceeded that of the previous year (as now revised) by 111,727 acres. There was an increase in all districts except East Godavari, Cuddapah, Ramnad, Madura, Tanjore and Chingleput, where there was a decrease of 2,951, 843, 840, 653, 619 and 120 acres respectively. The increase was marked in the districts of Coimbatore (48,751 acres), Malabar (22,187 acres) and Anantapur (12,480 acres). In Coimbatore the increase was due chiefly to the disafforested areas in the Anamalais, surveyed and brought under holdings during the fasli. The increase in Malabar was due to the changes consequent on the introduction of resettlement in the Kurumbranad taluk and the introduction of resurvey accounts in the Chirakkal taluk. In Anantapur, the assignments made, especially to the depressed classes contributed to the increase. The increase in other districts was mainly due to assignments of waste lands to the members of the depressed classes and others and also to the resumption of minor inams. The decrease in East Godavari was due to the exclusion of the holdings in Rameswaram village in the Razole taluk, the demand of which was not settled in the fasli, pending the receipt of orders regarding the localization of mamul wet lands. The small decrease in other districts calls for no remarks.

8. *Assessment.*—The total assessment on holdings was Rs. 591.89 lakhs against Rs. 589.16 lakhs (as now revised) in the previous fasli, showing a net increase of Rs. 2,72,628. There was an increase in all the districts except East Godavari, Tanjore, Ramnad and Madura where there was a decrease of Rs. 9,957, Rs. 2,508, Rs. 631 and Rs. 353 respectively. The increase was appreciable in the districts of Malabar (Rs. 1,30,337), Coimbatore (Rs. 1,61,226) and South Kanara (Rs. 14,806). The large increase in Malabar and Coimbatore and the increase in the other districts as well as the decrease in East Godavari were mainly due to the same reasons given in paragraph 7 above. The increase in South Kanara is due to assignments. The variations in other districts are small and call for no remarks.

9. *Cultivation*.—The total area cultivated in ryotwari holdings was 20·98 million acres against 20·56 million acres in the previous fasli. There was a net increase of 412,142 acres under 'dry' and 9,115 acres under 'wet.' The increase under 'dry' was large in Anantapur (118,293 acres), Coimbatore (101,479 acres) and Trichinopoly (71,480 acres). The increase under 'wet' was marked only in the Anantapur district (11,652 acres). The increase under 'dry' was due to adequate rainfall during the season of dry cultivation. The increase under 'wet' was due to adequate receipt of supplies to irrigation sources and of a larger quantity of rain in the proper season. The total area cultivated during the year including that under 'Miscellaneous cultivation' was 22·01 million acres against 21·54 million acres in the previous fasli. There was a decrease of 297,179 acres under 'waste charged.'

10. *Water-rate and second-crop charge*.—The revenue derived from these sources amounted to Rs. 35·11 lakhs against Rs. 34·90 lakhs in the previous fasli. There was a gross increase of Rs. 3,14,104 in certain districts and a gross decrease of Rs. 2,93,011 in others, resulting in a net increase of Rs. 21,093. The increase was marked in the districts of Kistna (Rs. 58,515), West Godavari (Rs. 35,491), Anantapur (Rs. 33,637), Madura (Rs. 31,452), Trichinopoly (Rs. 29,489), South Arcot (Rs. 24,233) and Guntur (Rs. 20,923), while the decrease was appreciable in the districts of North Arcot (Rs. 1,10,094), Nellore (Rs. 74,512), Chingleput (Rs. 44,740), Chittoor (Rs. 26,867) and Cuddapah (Rs. 20,250). The increase in the districts of West Godavari and Guntur was due to enhanced rates of water cess and the increase in the other districts noted above was the result of the favourable seasonal conditions. The decrease in North Arcot, Nellore, Chingleput, Chittoor and Cuddapah was due to want of either timely or sufficient rainfall during the cultivation season.

11. *Remission*.—There was a total remission of Rs. 26,81,642 during the fasli. As compared with the previous year, there was a decrease of Rs. 5,38,160. The decrease was marked in the districts of Bellary (Rs. 3,25,682), West Godavari (Rs. 1,33,826), East Godavari (Rs. 1,27,424), Anantapur (Rs. 1,09,171) and Tanjore (Rs. 1,07,628). In the case of Bellary, Anantapur and Tanjore the decrease was due to the favourable condition of the season, while in West Godavari it was due to the grant of increment remission to a smaller extent than that of the previous year. In East Godavari the decrease occurred mainly under the head "submersion or inundation." There was, however, a marked increase in the total remissions in the Nellore district (Rs. 1,76,510) and it occurred mostly under "shavi" and "tirvakammi" remissions owing to insufficient rains and short supply of water in the irrigation sources.

(i) *Seasonal remissions*.—The amount remitted under this head during the fasli was Rs. 10,61,876 against Rs. 12,55,822 in the previous year and there was thus a net decrease of Rs. 1,93,946. The decrease was very marked in Bellary (Rs. 3,27,585) and was appreciable in the districts of Anantapur (Rs. 1,09,890) and Tanjore (Rs. 1,05,415). In

Bellary and Anantapur the decrease was, as stated above, mainly due to favourable seasonal conditions, while in Tanjore it was due to the fact that special concessions were granted only in the case of 42 villages of Tiruturaipundi and Mannargudi taluks instead of the whole of the taluks of Tiruturaipundi, Mannargudi, Mayavaram and Shiyali, as in the previous fasli.

(a) *Waste remitted*.—Remission under this head amounted to Rs. 3·44 lakhs or Rs. 13,934 more than in the previous fasli. There was an increase of Rs. 1,20,304 in some districts and a decrease of Rs. 1,06,370 in others. The increase was marked in the districts of Nellore (Rs. 42,051), North Arcot (Rs. 23,688) and Cuddapah (Rs. 19,886). There was a marked decrease in Anantapur (Rs. 62,869). A dry remission of Rs. 88 on an extent of 46 acres of sanded dry lands in the Lalgudi and the Trichinopoly taluks was granted under the authority of G.O. Mis. No. 532, Revenue, dated 6th April 1925.

(b) *Shavi and short crop*.—The total amount remitted under this head was Rs. 2,34,678 against Rs. 5,17,798 in the previous fasli, the net decrease being Rs. 2,83,120. The decrease was marked in Bellary (Rs. 3,03,112) and was due to more favourable condition of the season.

(c) *Tirvakammi remissions* (i.e., remission of the difference between wet and dry assessment on wet lands cultivated with dry crops owing to insufficiency or failure of water-supply) amounted to Rs. 4,23,053 against Rs. 3,45,269 in the previous fasli, showing a net increase of Rs. 77,784. The increase was appreciable in the districts of Chittoor (Rs. 65,608), Nellore (Rs. 60,623) and Cuddapah (Rs. 33,617) and was due to the unfavourable character of the season. There was, however, a marked decrease in Anantapur (Rs. 40,425) and Salem (Rs. 39,607) due generally to sufficient supply in irrigation sources.

(d) *Injury by floods*.—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 30,446 against Rs. 50,732 in the previous fasli, the net decrease being Rs. 20,286. The decrease was marked in Tanjore (Rs. 14,574) and was due to the same cause as that mentioned under paragraph 11 (i) above.

(e) *Remission of second crop charge*.—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 23,720 against Rs. 7,931 in the previous fasli, the net increase being Rs. 15,789. The increase was marked in Kurnool (Rs. 6,707), Nellore (Rs. 4,924) and North Arcot (Rs. 4,871).

(ii) *Fixed remissions* (i.e., abatement of demand granted for reasons unconnected with the season) amounted to Rs. 6·25 lakhs against Rs. 9·78 lakhs in the previous year showing a net decrease of Rs. 3,53,059. The decrease was due to progressive reduction in the rate and amount of increment remission allowed in connexion with the introduction of new rates of assessment in East Godavari, West Godavari and Kistna districts.

(iii) *Beriz deduction*.—Deductions made from village collections in favour of inamdars and religious institutions amounted to Rs. 9·95 lakhs against Rs. 9·86 lakhs in the previous fasli resulting in a net increase of Rs. 8,845.

12. *Miscellaneous revenue*.—The revenue under this head amounted to Rs. 113.25 lakhs against Rs. 106.58 lakhs in the previous fasli. There was an increase of Rs. 10,18,722 in some districts and a decrease of Rs. 3,51,881 in others, resulting in a net increase of Rs. 6,66,841. The several items are dealt with below :—

Item 1—Jodi and quit-rent on minor inams.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 23.51 lakhs against Rs. 23.40 lakhs in the previous fasli, the net increase being Rs. 11,328. The increase was marked in Chittoor (Rs. 3,937) and in Trichinopoly (Rs. 2,024).

Item 2 (a)—Second-crop charge on minor inam wet lands in ryotwari villages.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 2.58 lakhs as against Rs. 2.10 lakhs in the previous fasli, showing a net increase of Rs. 48,188. The increase was marked in East Godavari (Rs. 56,461) and was appreciable in West Godavari (Rs. 17,635).

Item 2 (b)—Water-rate on minor inams in ryotwari villages.—The revenue under this item was Rs. 15.53 lakhs against Rs. 13.36 lakhs in the previous fasli, resulting in a net increase of Rs. 2,17,159. The increase was marked in West Godavari (Rs. 71,268), East Godavari (Rs. 69,081) and in Guntur (Rs. 49,744).

Item 3—Charge for water in villages in estates including tirujasti and fasaljasti items.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 30.00 lakhs against Rs. 25.10 lakhs in the previous fasli, the net increase being Rs. 4,89,947. The increase was marked in Kistna (Rs. 2,54,100) and in East Godavari (Rs. 1,15,200).

Item 4—Enhanced water-rate on lands irregularly irrigated.—The revenue under this item was Rs. 3.37 lakhs against Rs. 4.21 lakhs in the previous fasli, resulting in a net decrease of Rs. 83,968. The decrease was marked in Kistna (Rs. 38,212), West Godavari (Rs. 17,781), Madura (Rs. 16,291) and East Godavari (Rs. 12,802).

Item 5—Charges levied for occupation (with or without application) of assessed and unassessed lands not assigned. The revenue under this head was Rs. 6.65 lakhs against Rs. 6.41 lakhs (as now revised) in the previous fasli, showing a net increase of Rs. 24,203. There was a large increase in Anantapur (Rs. 12,927) and it was appreciable in Malabar (Rs. 9,776), Madura (Rs. 4,934) and Salem (Rs. 3,886).

Item 6—Charges levied for occupation of poramboke lands.—The revenue derived under this head during the fasli was Rs. 3.95 lakhs against Rs. 4.11 lakhs (as now revised) in the previous fasli, the net decrease being Rs. 15,782. The decrease was appreciable in West Godavari (Rs. 8,296) and in Madura (Rs. 7,867).

Enhanced charges amounting to Rs. 2,04,379 were levied on an extent of 23,301 acres against Rs. 2,10,850 on an extent of 21,555 acres in the previous fasli, showing an incidence of Rs. 9 per acre as against Rs. 10 in the previous fasli. The highest average rates were Rs. 44 in Coimbatore, Rs. 36 in Chittoor, Rs. 33 in East Godavari and Rs. 25 in Chingleput and these were due to prohibitive penalties levied for persistent encroachments on objectionable porambokes.

There were no porambokes to be reclassified in the districts of Malabar and Madras. The work of reclassification is reported to have been completed in almost all the other districts. From the reports it is, however, observed that taram assessment was levied on an extent of 88,057 acres of poramboke lands against 104,060 acres in the previous fasli. Such occupation was extensive in the districts of Guntur (14,167 acres), Salem (10,117 acres), Kurnool (9,077 acres), Anantapur (8,101 acres), Tanjore (6,698 acres), Bellary (6,521 acres) and Ganjam (5,874 acres).

In Ganjam a large number of proposals for the transfer to ayan of unobjectionable porambokes were accepted. Increased penalties were levied on the old objectionable encroachments. In Vizagapatam proposals for transfer were disposed of in certain cases, while other cases were pending disposal. The provisions of Act III of 1905 were enforced in almost all cases of objectionable cultivation. In West Godavari single taram assessment only was charged in the case of occupation of unobjectionable porambokes proposed for assignment to the encroachers. In Guntur and Bellary there were unobjectionable occupations mostly by depressed class people and by the long-standing sivayijamadars pending subdivision and transfer to ayan. In Bellary taram assessment was levied for the occupation of unobjectionable porambokes, except in cases which are affected by the Tungabhadra project the assignment of which is prohibited. In Nellore, transfer of land from poramboke to assessed in deserving cases was attended to. In Cuddapah, the reclassification was completed in all the taluks. In Anantapur, the work of the reclassification of poramboke and unassessed lands had already been completed. In Kurnool the treatment meted out to encroachments was no longer lenient and eviction was resorted to in many cases; no penalty was levied in unobjectionable cases and an appreciable extent of 1,067 acres was transferred from poramboke to ayan during the year as a result of inspection by azmoishing officers. In Chingleput steps were taken to assign lands in all unobjectionable cases, such as, occupation of village and cheri-site, for dwelling houses. In objectionable cases, however, eviction proceedings were resorted to. In North Arcot, proposals for the transfer of poramboke to ayan were received and sanctioned during the fasli; eviction proceedings were taken under section 6 of Act III of 1905 in 534 cases during the year, but actual eviction was carried out in 165 cases only. In South Arcot, consequent on the stringent application of the penal provisions of Act III of 1905, the ryots gradually ceased to occupy objectionable porambokes. Drastic steps were taken to put an end to all objectionable occupations by imposing heavy penalties and carrying out eviction proceedings promptly. In Tanjore, the decrease under enhanced charge was due to the effect of the imposition of deterrent penalties in the previous fasli. In Trichinopoly an extent of 263 acres was transferred from poramboke to assessed waste. In Ramnad there were a greater number of encroachment cases than in the previous fasli; the provisions of the Act were observed properly. Only in three instances (2 in Sattur taluk and 1 in Paramakudi taluk) in which debris was removed after eviction and sold in

public auction, the proceeds being credited to Government. Eviction was resorted to in all objectionable cases of encroachments and the imposition of penalties was judicious. In many instances the encroachments were reported to have been vacated on the service of notices. In Tinnevely a heavy rate of penalty as well as eviction was ordered in objectionable cases of occupation. In unobjectionable cases the highest dry rate or taram assessment, as the case may be, was charged and directions were issued to dispose of the cases on darkhast after observing the usual formalities. Temporary licences were issued for unobjectionable occupations of Government land, which could not be assigned permanently. In Coimbatore, the increase in the charges levied for the occupation of poramboke lands was due to favourable season and sufficient supply of water in the irrigation sources. In Salem adequate and proper use was made of the provisions of Act III of 1905. In South Kanara, section 6 of the Land Encroachment Act was resorted to in 92 cases and taram assessment was levied as usual for (i) occupation of liquor shop sites by Excise renters, (ii) occupation of a temporary nature and (iii) occupations surrendered after the issue of preliminary notices under the Land Encroachment Act.

Item 7—Revenue derived from taxed trees.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 3·72 lakhs against Rs. 3·77 lakhs in the previous fasli, the net decrease being Rs. 4,806. The decrease was noticeable in South Arcot (Rs. 1,058).

Item 8—Commission from Estates under Court of Wards.—The amount of revenue derived under this head was Rs. 29,094 against Rs. 34,643 in the previous fasli, the net decrease being Rs. 5,549. The decrease was marked in Ramnad (Rs. 4,822).

Item 10—Sale-proceeds of lands sold.—The income under this head was Rs. 4·46 lakhs against Rs. 3·10 lakhs in the previous fasli, showing a net increase of Rs. 1,35,618. The increase was very marked in Madras (2,44,147) and was mainly due to the cost of lands transferred to the Madras and Southern Mahratta and South Indian Railway Administrations during the fasli.

Item 11—Rents of lankas.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 4·60 lakhs against Rs. 4·82 lakhs, the net decrease being Rs. 22,377. The decrease was marked in Malabar (Rs. 7,988).

Item 12—Quit-rent and ground-rent.—The amount of revenue under this head was Rs. 2·48 lakhs against Rs. 2·38 lakhs of the previous fasli, the net increase being Rs. 10,295.

13. The net ryotwari demand, including water-rate, second-crop charge and miscellaneous revenue, amounted to Rs. 713·43 lakhs against Rs. 698·45 lakhs (as now revised) in the previous fasli. The details for the increase of Rs. 14·98 lakhs are given below :—

16. *Demand and collection of land revenue and cesses (current).*—The current demand under land revenue and cesses during the fasli was Rs. 8,87,72,128. A sum of Rs. 8,41,75,072 or 94·8 per cent was collected within the Fasli and Rs. 11,976 was written off the accounts while Rs. 33,87,686 or 3·8 per cent was suspended or postponed. The percentage of collection during the previous fasli was 98·04.

17. *Demand and collection of arrears.*—The total arrear demand under all the heads amounted to Rs. 19,60,693. A sum of Rs. 17,73,959 or 90·5 per cent was collected (against 72·91 per cent in the previous fasli) and a sum of Rs. 1,11,204 or 6·1 per cent was written off the accounts.

18. The balance outstanding at the end of the fasli including both the arrears and current was Rs. 46,60,610 against Rs. 19,50,036 at the end of the previous fasli. As reported by the Collectors in their demand, collection and balance statements for October 1933, the balance at the beginning of fasli 1343 was Rs. 46,59,418. Up to the end of October 1933 a sum of Rs. 9,97,542 was collected and Rs. 34,456 was written off the accounts. Sanction has since been accorded to write off a sum of Rs. 4 while proposals had been made to write off Rs. 890. The net recoverable balance on 1st November 1933 was thus Rs. 36,26,426. Out of this amount a sum of Rs. 34,22,467 is covered by suspensions or postponements, chiefly in the districts of Tinnevely, the Nilgiris, North Arcot, Vizagapatam, Malabar, Kistna, Anantapur, West Godavari, East Godavari, Bellary, Madura, Trichinopoly, South Arcot and Tanjore. Deducting this amount, the realizable balance on 1st November 1933 was Rs. 2,03,959.

19. *Reconciliation of differences between the collection of land revenue and cesses as shown in the jamabandi and the Accountant-General's statements and over-payments.*—This is carried out month by month along with the reconciliation of figures of expenditure.

20. *Adjustment to local boards of cesses collected during the fasli.*—Land Revenue and cesses are collected together and the distribution of the total collections between "Land Revenue" and "Cesses" is effected in the Collector's office after the compilation of the accounts relating to the fasli year.

Statements showing the amounts collected during fasli 1342 on behalf of local boards, the payments made to them during the fasli and the amounts to be finally adjusted either to their credit or debit are received from Collectors. After verification by the Accountant-General of the amounts shown by Collectors as payments made to Local Boards, the recovery or over payments is being watched by the Board in accordance with the instructions contained in paragraph 3 of G.O. No. 5197, L. & M., dated the 7th December 1926.

21. *Charges debitable to land revenue.*—The charges in the land revenue department are shown in the accounts under the head "22. General Administration." The District Administration charges excluding village establishments amounted to Rs. 101.84 lakhs during fasli 1342. The village service charges (including those of proprietary estates) during the fasli were Rs. 120.07 lakhs. The total charges amounted to Rs. 221.91 lakhs or 25.82 per cent of the total land revenue and cesses collected. It must however be borne in mind that this amount does not represent merely the cost of collecting the land revenue. The land revenue department performs multifarious duties of which the control and collection of land revenue is only one. The village establishment in particular is the servant of all departments of the Government. Moreover a considerable portion of the time of the Collector and his subordinate officials is occupied with magisterial work. While the actual cost of collecting the land revenue cannot be estimated with any degree of accuracy, it is certainly far less than the figure shown above. The fall in charges is mainly due to the measures of economy adopted during the fasli under report.

22. *Processes under Act II of 1864.*—Statement No. 12 gives particulars of coercive processes issued for the realization of Government dues under Act II of 1864. The following extract shows the number of processes of each kind issued during the year, as compared with the figures for the three preceding faslis :—

There is an increase under all heads. This is attributed by Collectors to the continuance of the economic depression and the fall in the prices of food crops.

23. *Demand notices.*—The number of demand notices issued during the fasli is higher than those issued during the three previous faslis.

24. *Distrain or attachment notices.*—There is also an increase in the number of distrain or attachment notices when compared with the previous faslis.

25. There is a decrease of 0.95 in the percentage of the number of distrains and attachment of personal property arising from demand notices when compared with the last fasli. In respect of real property there is however an increase in percentage over that of last fasli by 0.14.

The number of defaulters whose immovable property was attached during the fasli was 36,621 against 28,957 in fasli 1341.

26. *Sale notices.*—Out of 156,149 defaulters whose property was attached only 47.46 per cent paid up the arrears before sale notices were issued as against 51.23 per cent in the last fasli. The number of attachments during the fasli was largest in South Arcot (25,288) as in fasli 1341 (19,434).

27. *Sales.*—The number of defaulters whose property was sold was greater than in fasli 1341 by 1,182. There was an increase in the number of sales of personal property by 1,231. In respect of real property there was a decrease by 49. The percentage borne by actual sales to sale notices in the Presidency is 13.70 against 15.04 in fasli 1341. The percentage of the number of defaulters whose properties were sold to the total number of holdings is 0.19 against 0.17 in the previous fasli. The statement below shows the particulars of sales in fasli 1342 compared with those for the preceding three faslis :—

Value of land sold.—Immovable property of the estimated value of Rs. 7,02,831 was sold for recovery of arrears amounting to Rs. 1,63,263. The sum realized was Rs. 1,50,619. The value of the land was noticeably disproportionate to the arrears in the districts of Vizagapatam, Kistna, Chingleput, Madura, Ramnad and Salem. In Madura where the disparity is more marked than in other districts, property of the estimated value of Rs. 3,29,944 was brought to sale for arrears amounting to Rs. 14,826. The Collector remarks that the reason for this was that the entire holdings of ryots had to be sold in auction even though the value of these holdings was large when compared with the arrears due. The other Collectors make no special mention of this point but the reasons are probably similar to those reported to Government in B.P. Routine No. 2337, dated the 21st April 1927. The prices fetched for lands sold to private individuals amounted on the average to $4\frac{1}{2}$ times the assessment in the case of dry lands and $5\frac{1}{2}$ times the assessment in the case of wet lands. In fasli 1341, immovable property of the value of Rs. 6,87,967 was sold for recovery of arrears amounting to Rs. 93,414. The sum realized was Rs. 1,13,058. The average price fetched for lands sold to private individuals is higher than in fasli 1341 being $4\frac{1}{2}$ times the assessment in the case of dry lands and $5\frac{1}{2}$ times the assessment in the case of wet lands against $3\frac{1}{2}$ and $4\frac{3}{4}$ times respectively.

Extent of land sold.—The extent of land sold to private individuals in the fasli was 9,107 acres under dry and 3,799 acres under wet against 12,628 acres and 4,019 acres respectively in fasli 1341. The total area bought in by Government for want of bidders was 9,739 acres under dry and 2,963 acres under wet against 8,486 and 2,189 acres respectively in fasli 1341.

28. *Process serving establishment.*—Statement No. 13 gives particulars of processes served by the ordinary village agency and by the special establishments and of the fees realized during the year. The total number of processes served by the village agency was 1,229,966 or 163,598 more than in fasli 1341. The number of processes served by the special agency (38,878) was less than in the previous fasli by 6,870.

29. *Costs in civil suits.*—Rupees 29,505 was awarded to the Government as costs during the fasli. Including Rs. 40,445 the revised opening balance, the total demand was Rs. 69,950 of which Rs. 32,507 was collected, Rs. 3,064 written off the accounts and Rs. 399 recommended to be written off. The net recoverable balance at the end of the fasli was Rs. 33,980 made up of the following items :—

30. *Interest on arrears of land revenue*—Statement No. 14.—The total demand on account of arrears of land revenue including the balance at the beginning of the fasli was Rs. 44,883 of which Rs. 18,761 were collected and Rs. 633 were remitted leaving a balance of Rs. 25,489. The balance exceeds Rs. 1,000 in the districts of Ganjam, East Godavari, North Arcot, Tanjore and Ramnad.

31. *Sale of lands under Board's Standing Orders Nos. 15, 16, 21, 22, 45, 90 and 91.*—Under the rules for the sale of occupancy rights in lands at the disposal of Government (Standing Order No. 15) 2,254.12 acres, 5,957 square feet and 3,300 square links of lands assessed at Rs. 3,452 were sold for Rs. 1,09,980; 10.82 acres of tank-bed lands assessed at Rs. 7 were sold for Rs. 70; 38.99 acres and 1,698 square yards of house-sites in towns assessed at Rs. 191 were sold for Rs. 29,564 under Standing Order No. 21; and 671.74 acres of lands bought in by Government at sales for arrears of revenue were resold under Standing Order No. 45 for Rs. 2,426. 8.39 acres of lands which had been acquired for public purposes and were subsequently relinquished were sold under Standing Order No. 90 for Rs. 504. 18.06 acres of lands for which the Railways are not likely to have any further use were sold for Rs. 1,655 under Standing Order No. 91. One cawny, 2 grounds and 2,117 square feet of lands were sold in Madras for Rs. 3,434 under the special rules governing the disposal of vacant lands in the city.

32. *Subdivision of quit-rent.*—No applications were received during the year under Standing Order No. 88 for the subdivision of joint liability of shareholders in whole villages or inams.

33. *Transfer of registry of holdings.*—Transfer of revenue registry falls under the following main heads :—

- (i) transfer made with reference to applications and notices received from Sub-Registrars, and
- (ii) transfer effected on applications and intimations received from parties, village officers and others.

(i) Under the first head 389,681 applications were received during the fasli as against 492,381 in the previous fasli, the decrease being 102,700 or about 20.86 per cent. There was a general decrease except in a few districts where the increase was as noted below :—

The total number of applications of all kinds, including the number pending disposal at the beginning of the fasli was 797,919, of which 704,226 were disposed of during the fasli, leaving a balance of 93,693 (or about 11·7 per cent of the total number) as against 180,751 (or about 22 per cent of the total number) in the previous fasli. Of the total number of applications disposed of during the fasli, 51,626 or about 7·3 per cent were rejected and 4,385 were transferred to Deputy Tahsildars for disposal. The causes of rejection were mainly defective title and failure to produce documentary evidence. The percentage of pendency was marked in the districts of Nellore (32), Vizagapatam (26), Ganjam (23) Guntur (19), Anantapur (16), South Arcot (16) and Cuddapah (14). It is hoped that the pendency will be reduced further in view of the G.O. Ms. No. 2203, Revenue, dated the 29th October 1932, abolishing the issue of notices to parties to put up ridges in cases where there are no marks of enjoyment on the ground and of notices to the joint holders in cases of transfer of the interest of one of them in the joint holding.

34. *Jamabandi*.—The rule laid down in paragraph 2 of Board's Standing Order No. 12 that the settlement of each taluk should generally be conducted by the Collector himself once in five years was complied with in all the districts.

35. *Loans and advances*.—The advances made under the Land Improvement Loans and the Agriculturists' Loans Acts during the year amounted to Rs. 3·47 lakhs and Rs. 6·58 lakhs respectively making a total of Rs. 10·05 lakhs against Rs. 12·38 lakhs in the previous year. The difference was the net result of an increase in eight districts and a decrease in 17 districts. The increase in Vizagapatam, Malabar and the Nilgiris and the decrease in Ganjam, Guntur, Kurnool, Bellary, Chingleput, North Arcot, Salem, Coimbatore, Trichinopoly, Tanjore and Madura were marked.

36. Including the uncollected balance outstanding at the close of the previous year, the amount repayable during the year on account of principal was Rs. 8·29 lakhs under the Land Improvement Loans Act and Rs. 12·67 lakhs under the Agriculturists' Loans Act. Of these amounts, Rs. 6·66 lakhs or 80·3 per cent under the Land Improvement Loans Act and Rs. 10·83 lakhs or 85·5 per cent under the Agriculturists' Loans Act were collected. Sums amounting to Rs. 0·45 lakh under the Land Improvement Loans Act and Rs. 0·33 lakh under the Agriculturists' Loans Act were repaid by the borrowers on account of loans the repayment of which had not fallen due, while Rs. 4,221 and Rs. 3,466 were written off as irrecoverable under the Land Improvement Loans and the Agriculturists' Loans Acts respectively.

37. *Coercive processes*.—The aggregate amount of principal and interest repayable during the year under both the Acts including the balance remaining unpaid out of sums which fell due in previous years was Rs. 29,12,048, of which a sum of Rs. 5,86,455 or 20·1 per cent was collected without resort to coercive processes, and a sum of Rs. 16,80,575 or 57·7 per cent was collected after the issue of demand notices. A sum

of Rs. 1,82,689 was collected after the attachment of property but before sale, while the amounts realized by the sale of movable and immovable properties were Rs. 8,578 and Rs. 22,881 respectively. A sum of Rs. 8,273 was written off as irrecoverable under both principal and interest under both the Acts. The balance outstanding at the close of the year was Rs. 4,30,870. It was very heavy in Bellary (Rs. 1,29,383).

38. *Survey advances*.—The advances drawn by Collectors during the official year 1932-33 under the head "Revenue Survey Advances—Collectors" amounted to Rs. 1,19,830 as detailed below against Rs. 1,10,900 in the previous year :—

Of the total amount of advances outstanding against Collectors including the amounts referred to above, a sum of Rs. 1,11,265 was adjusted during the year, leaving a net debit balance of Rs. 2,59,383 under "Revenue Survey Advances—Collectors."

Under the head "Cost of Survey Marks—Collectors" a sum of Rs. 90,902 was collected during the year leaving a balance of Rs. 9,250 to be realized. The arrear outstanding at the beginning of the year under "Cost of Survey Marks—Survey Officers" was Rs. 94,168. Fresh landholders' bills for Rs. 3,86,511 were received from survey officers during the year. Of the total demand of Rs. 4,80,679 a sum of Rs. 2,38,465 was collected leaving a balance of Rs. 2,42,214. The major portion of the balance is outstanding in the district of Malabar where

there is an arrear of Rs. 1,34,695 to be collected. This amount includes a sum of Rs. 1,13,058 on account of instalment not due in the year. The actual balance for collection at the end of the year was Rs. 21,637 and this has since been reduced to Rs. 4,172.

39. *Effect of recent legislation.*—No new enactment affecting the agricultural classes generally was passed during the fasli under report.

40. *Enhanced water-cess on irregular irrigation.*—The system of publishing a general or collective notice in each village in accordance with B.P. No. 58, Settlement, dated 10th April 1919, is reported to have worked well and the Tahsildars have generally exercised their powers judiciously. The ryots are aware of the rules and make timely representations to the jamabandi officers. The system resulted in the prompt investigation of objections and the consequent reduction in the number of water-rate appeals. In cases where Government water was taken without permission, deterrent penalties were imposed.

41. *Tank-bed cultivation.*—There are no tank-bed lands fit for cultivation in the districts of Madras, the Nilgiris, Malabar and South Kanara. In their Order Ms. No. 1613, Revenue, dated 2nd September 1922, the Government withdrew the special concessions relating to tank-bed cultivation. In Nellore, Anantapur, Chingleput and North Arcot, a few cases of unauthorized cultivation were repressed by penalization. In Cuddapah 655 acres of tank-bed land were cultivated and the revenue derived therefrom was Rs. 1,031. Enhanced assessment of Rs. 1,876 was also imposed for unauthorized occupation. In Chittoor an extent of 229 acres of tank-bed land was cultivated and the revenue derived therefrom was Rs. 320. There was tank-bed cultivation to an extent of 185 acres in the Sattur and Srivilliputtur taluks of the Ramnad district and the condition of the tanks was not adversely affected thereby. In Coimbatore, there was tank-bed cultivation in eight villages of the Coimbatore taluk without any damage to the tanks. An extent of 13 acres and 23 acres of tank-bed land was cultivated in the districts of Tanjore and Trichinopoly respectively.

42. *Examination of village and taluk accounts.*—The maintenance of these accounts was fairly satisfactory and no general errors of a serious nature were disclosed. Such minor defects as were noticed were duly rectified. The Collector of Ganjam has reported that the Revenue Divisional Officer, Ghumsur, would shortly take up the check of taluk accounts in his division. In Anantapur the Revenue Divisional Officers of Gooty and Anantapur have yet to inspect the accounts in their divisions and they have been instructed to expedite the inspection. In Bellary the accounts of all the taluks except Hospet have been inspected. The accounts of Hospet taluk will, it is reported, be inspected shortly. In Chingleput district, the inspection has yet to be completed in the Saidapet and Chingleput taluks.

43. *The taluk and village statistical registers.*—The taluk statistical registers prescribed in the Manual of Taluk Accounts (Special) were maintained in the districts of Malabar, South Kanara and the Nilgiris

and the village statistical registers were maintained in all the ryotwari village of the other districts. The following statement shows the progress made in the writing up and checking of registers up to and during fasli 1342 :—

44. *Minor irrigation.*—Statement No. 19 shows for each district the number of irrigation works in charge of the Revenue Department, the number repaired and the amount spent on them during the official year ending 31st March 1933. It also shows the number proposed for repair during the official year ending 31st March 1934.

45. *Conference with ryots.*—In Ganjam, informal conferences were held at seven selected places by the Executive Engineer for discussing matters relating to irrigation and the local Revenue officers also attended these conferences. Conferences with ryots were held during jamabandi

at Chatrapur, Chicacole, Narasannapeta and Kudala, where the Agricultural Demonstrator lectured on the improved methods of agriculture. In Vizagapatam, ryots' conferences were held by the sub-collectors concerned at the headquarters of the three ryotwari taluks and the grievances of the ryots were heard and action was taken wherever necessary. The Agricultural Demonstrator attended the conference held at Palkonda and gave instructions on the improved methods of cultivation. In East Godavari, the settling officers held conferences with the ryots at the time of jamabandi and the officers of the Public Works Department did so at their convenience. In West Godavari, the Collector held an informal conference with the ryots of the Tamuku taluk on 23rd February 1933 in the Taluk office and certain points of general importance were discussed at the conference. In Guntur, enquiries were made at the time of jamabandi and during the tours of the officers regarding the needs of the ryots and their requests were duly considered. In Nellore, informal conferences were held during jamabandi and matters affecting revenue and irrigation were discussed at these conferences. In Cuddapah, the Collector held a conference with the ryots at the close of the jamabandi of the Cuddapah taluk. All the Revenue Divisional Officers held conferences with the ryots during their tours and during jamabandi. Subjects relating to water-supply, grazing fees, formation of roads, etc., were discussed. In Anantapur, the Executive Engineer, Bellary, accompanied by the Agricultural Demonstrator and the local tahsildars held conferences of the ryots at Anantapur and Singanamala and explained the advantages of raising paddy seed-beds and of transplantation of seedlings. In Bellary, conferences were held by the Chief Engineer and other officers of the Public Works Department at Bellary, Siruguppa, Adoni, Alur, Harpanahalli and Kudligi and subjects concerning the impending Tungabhadra Project and other irrigation matters were discussed. In Kurnool, the Collector held informal conferences with the ryots during the jamabandi of Koilkuntla and Nandikotkur taluks. Similar conferences were held by the Revenue Divisional Officers in all the other taluks except Sirvel. In Chingleput, an informal conference was held at Ponneri by the Revenue Divisional Officer, Tiruvallur, to ascertain the real difficulties experienced in collection work on account of the depression in trade conditions. Irrigation conferences were also held at the headquarters of the Revenue divisions of the district in which the Executive Engineers, the Revenue Divisional Officers and the leading ryots took part. In Chittoor, the Collector and the Revenue Divisional Officers held informal conferences with the ryots during jamabandi and the individual representations made by the ryots were duly attended to. The Sub-Collector of Madanapalle held an irrigation conference at Madanapalle at which the Executive Engineer was also present. In North Arcot, conferences were generally held with the leading ryots immediately after the jamabandi, when lectures were delivered on various subjects such as loyalty, village sanitation, agriculture, Forest village panchayat, co-operation, rural reconstruction, etc., and the ryots in general appreciated such conferences. In South Arcot, informal conferences were held by the Revenue Divisional Officers at their taluk

headquarters, when matters relating to irrigation were discussed with the ryots and necessary action was taken. The Collector himself held a conference at Tindivanam, where leading ryots from all parts of the taluk were present and matters of public interest were discussed and steps were taken to redress the grievances of the ryots. In Tanjore, ryots' conferences were held in all the taluks except Tiruturaipundi, Mayavaram, Shiyali, Arantangi and Pattukkottai and questions relating to irrigation and drainage and the prospective irrigation from the Cauvery-Mettur Project were discussed. In Trichinopoly, the Collector held a conference during jamabandi at the Trichinopoly Taluk office and conferences were also held by the Revenue Divisional Officers during jamabandi at Karur, Kulittalai, Perambalur, and Jayankondasholapuram. An irrigation conference also was held by the Executive Engineer at Lalgudi in November 1932. In Madura, irrigation conferences were held by the Executive Engineer and the Revenue Divisional Officer at Uttamapalaiyam (on 27th September 1932), at Peramai (on 29th September 1932), at Melur (on 4th October 1932) and at Chittampatti (on 5th October 1932). In Rannad, the Sub-Collectors of Rannad and Sivakasi held informal conferences at the close of jamabandi. The Collector (the late Mr. Gray) held a conference of the leading ryots on the day prior to the close of the jamabandi, in which the ryots presented written memoranda of their grievances and most of these questions were taken up in detail, and discussed fully. In Coimbatore, the Sub-Collector, Pollachi, the Revenue Divisional Officer, Gobichettipalaiyam, held conferences at the end of jamabandi. In South Kanara, the Collector held ryots' conferences at Kasargod and Hosdurg during jamabandi and the Sub-Collector, Coondapoor, held two conferences at Udipi and Coondapoor. The public have not taken any special interest in these conferences. The Collector of Malabar reports that the conditions in that district are not generally favourable to informal conferences and that the Revenue officials have, however, kept in touch with the masses as much as possible during their tours. The officials of the Agricultural department have utilized the occasion of jamabandi to hold agricultural demonstrations.

46. *Removal of prickly-pear.*—It is reported that satisfactory progress was made during the fasli in the eradication of prickly-pear through the introduction of the cochineal insects and the Collectors of Ganjam and Rannad report that the prickly-pear has almost disappeared in their districts.

47. *Extent to which the inspection of subordinate offices have been carried out by the Board, Collectors and the Revenue Divisional Officers.*—The reports received from the Collectors show that practically all the subordinate offices were inspected by them and their Revenue Divisional Officers. The Collectors' notes of inspection of the Revenue Divisional offices have on the whole been thorough and the Board has critically reviewed the condition of the office as well as the work of individual Revenue Divisional Officers. The Board has also recorded its remarks on the work of the junior Revenue Divisional Officers whenever necessary.

During the fasli under review, members of the Board of Revenue inspected the offices of the Collectors of Chittoor, Coimbatore, Nellore, North Arcot, Tanjore, Trichinopoly, Ganjam, Vizagapatam, the Nilgiris and the Taluk office, Atmakur, and the Deputy Tahsildar's office, Muthukur in the Nellore district.

The administration of the districts continues to be on the whole efficient. Last year the districts inspected up to the date of the report were included. As it is now proposed to adopt the fasli year, the inspections of these offices which were made during the fasli 1342 are also included in the present report to represent the facts correctly.

48. *Administration of religious and charitable service inams.*—The Revenue Officers have been paying proper attention to the administration of the religious and charitable service inams. Generally in cases of alienation of these inams or cessation of the prescribed service, every facility was afforded to the inamdars for the redemption of the inams alienated by them or for the revival of service as the case might be and steps were taken to resume the inams wherever necessary. The principles underlying Board's Standing Orders No. 54-7 and 8 were observed in connexion with the reassignment of assessment on the resumed inams. 3,025.97 acres of religious and 189.63 acres of charitable service inams bearing an assessment of Rs. 6,971-8-0 and Rs. 377-10-0 respectively were resumed in the fasli on account of the alienation of inams, the cessation of service or the disappearance of the institution. Net assessments of Rs. 5,998-4-0 and Rs. 712-9-0 were reassigned to the working incumbents including the institutions concerned and credited to general revenues respectively in the case of resumed religious inams. Rupees 150-4-0 and Rs. 198-1-0 were reassigned to the working incumbents including the local bodies concerned and credited to general revenues respectively in the case of resumed charitable service inams.
