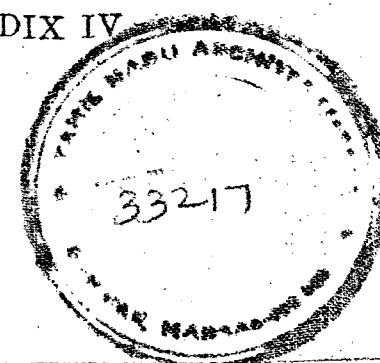

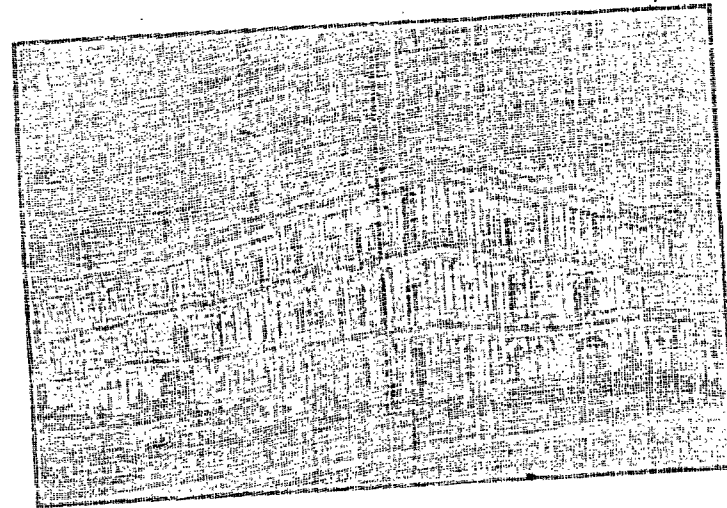

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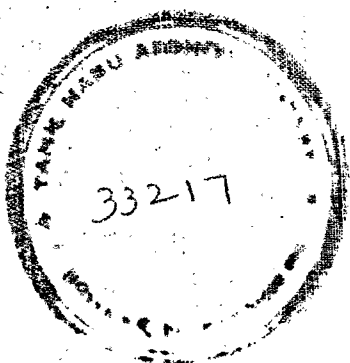

Mr. W. W. Ladden who was elected Mayor on 7-11-33 held the office of the Mayor till 5-11-34 when Kumararajah M. A. Muthiah Chettiar of Chettinad was elected Mayor of Madras by the Council and he continued to hold the office of the Mayor during the year under report.

The ordinary elections under Sec. 55(2) of the City Municipal Act IV of 1919 were held on 11th August 1934 and 8th September 1934. Two out of the ten seats (divisions 13 & 20) were contested. The sitting councillors, Messrs. C. Madanagopal Naidu, M.L.C., and T. Sundara Rao Naidu, M.L.C., were re-elected for divisions 13 and 20 respectively.

M. R. Ry. P. M. Balasubramaniam Mudaliar Avl., Dr. U. Krishna Rao, M. R. Ry. K. Sreeramulu Naidu Garu, M. R. Ry. Gadde Rangiah Naidu Garu, M. R. Ry. Sami Venkatachalam Chetty Garu, M. L. A. Dr. B. S. Mallaya M. R. Ry. K. Venkataswami Naidu Garu and M. R. Ry. T. S. Ramaswami Iyer Avl., M. L. C., were returned unopposed for Divisions 2, 6, 8, 10, 11, 14 21 and 30 respectively.

Two casual elections were held during the year under report for divisions 3 and 14, caused by the resignation of M. R. Ry. Dewan Bahadur P. T. Kumaraswamy Chetty Garu, the sitting councillor for division 3, and by the demise of Dr. B. S. Mallaya, the sitting councillor for division 14. The election for division 3 was uncontested and M. R. Ry. C. P. Subramaniam, the only nominated candidate was elected on 4-8-1934. Casual election for division 14 was contested and Dr. B. Sarvotham Mallaya was elected as a Councillor on 9-3-1935.

1332 voters out of a total electorate of 1659 recorded their votes in two contested general elections viz. 13 and 20. The percentage of voters who exercised the franchise at these elections was 80.3. The number of electors who voted at the casual election for division 14 was 262 out of a total electorate of 297.

On the annual revision of the electoral rolls, it was found that the percentage of qualified electors was 3.3 of the total, as against 3.5 during 1933-34.

REINSTATEMENT.

2. During the year under report no Councillors lost their seats in the Council by failure to attend meetings of the Council for three consecutive months.

EXECUTIVE OFFICERS.

3. Khan Bahadur J. Hussain, Bar-at-Law, continued to hold the office of the Commissioner during the year under report. Mr. Subramaniam Chetty continued to hold office of the Revenue Officer till 15-1-35 when he was granted leave on average salary for one month and 14 days and Mr. S. Kalyanasundaram Aiyer acted as Revenue Officer during his absence. He continued to hold the office of the Revenue Officer during the remaining portion of the year under report. Mr. E. R. Srinivasa chariar continued to hold the office of the Engineer till 29th November 1934 when he was granted leave on average salary for 23 days with permission to avail himself of the Xmas holidays and Mr. I. Kuriyan acted as Engineer during his absence. He continued to hold the office of the Engineer during the remaining portion of the year under report. Dr. C. S. Govinda Pillai, Mr. T. R. Srinivasachariar, Rao Bahadur C. V. Krishnaswami Chetti and Mr. S. Satchithandam Pillai continued to hold the office of the Health Officer, the Special Drainage Engineer, the Electrical Engineer and the Educational Officer respectively during the year under report. Mr. S. Voyvodech held the office of the Officer in charge of Stores and stock verifier during the year under report except during the periods from 16-8-34 to 4-9-34 and from 7-12-34 to 23-12-34 when he was granted leave and Mr. Md. Ali Khan, Chief Foreman, Workshop, was in additional charge of his duties, and from 21-3-35 for 3 weeks when he was granted leave and Mr. Madhusudhana Rao Ag. Chief Foreman, Workshop, was in additional charge of his duties.

MEETINGS.

4. During the year the Council held 12 General Meetings, 4 Adjourned General Meetings, 6 Special Meetings, 1 Adjourned Special Meeting, 27 Ordinary Meetings and 3 other Special Meetings which were adjourned for want of quorum. The average number of Councillors including the Mayor present at each meeting of the Council was 31.6 against 34.5 in the previous year. The percentage of attendance to the sanctioned strength was 70.8 among Divisional elected Councillors, 47.1 among Institutional Councillors, 58.0 among Councillors appointed by the Government as against 76.2, 54.9, and 63.1 respectively in the previous year.

The Standing Committees dealing respectively with (1) Taxation and Finance (2) Works (3) Health and (4) Education met 54, 16, 20 and 26 times respectively and the number of subjects disposed of by these Committees and other special Committees during the year were as follows :-

SPECIAL COMMITTEES.

I

5 Amendment of the City Municipal Act :—

The Council at its meeting held on 26-6-34 referred the Draft Bill to amend the Madras City Municipal Act 1919 to an *ad Hoc* Committee appointed by it for consideration and report. The recommendations of the Committee were placed before the Council. The Council at its meetings on 6th, 7th, 8th, 14th, 15th and 20th September 1934 considered the recommendations. The Bill has not yet been passed into law.

II

Housing Scheme.

The Committee appointed by the Council at its meeting on 15th August 1933 to enquire into and make a report on, the Housing problem in the City, submitted its report. The Council, at its meeting on 9th October, 1934, generally accepted the report of the Committee.

A copy of the Report of the Committee as approved by the Council was submitted to Government and they were requested in general to approve the programme of work detailed in the report and to sanction Rs. 20 lakhs from Provincial Funds half as grant and half as loan to enable the Corporation to make a start to give effect to the several recommendations of the Committee.

The matter is under consideration by Government.

IMPORTANT RESOLUTIONS OF THE COUNCIL.

6 (1) *Medical Services*:—The Council at its meeting held on 27-4-34 passed the following resolution.

“That the patients in the Corporation dispensaries be treated as hitherto without any charge.”

The resolution was given effect to during the year under report.

(2) *Encroachment*:—The Council at its meeting held on 27-4-34 resolved that all recommendations from the Encroachment Officer in regard to objectionable encroachments shall be placed by the Commissioner before the Standing Committee (Works) weekly, who shall inspect the sites within one week and shall suggest to the Commissioner as to whether (i) the building be demolished or (ii) the encroachment be licensed or (iii) the ground shall be sold to the owner.

(3) *Revision of assessment*:—The Council at its meeting held on 17-7-34 recommended to the Commissioner the desirability of suspending the revision of assessment in all cases of new buildings or additional buildings for the next five years.

(4) *Water Supply*:—In Government Memorandum No. 50928-1-A2 L & M., dated 20-12-33 the Government furnished estimates, designs etc., in respect of the partial scheme of the installation of two pre-filters. With reference to this the Council at its meeting on 17-7-34 resolved to call for tenders for the comprehensive scheme.

The resolution of the Council was duly communicated to Government on 29-7-34 with the information that tenders when received will be placed before Government with recommendation for their orders. Tenders have been called for and they are due on 4-9-35.

(5) *Water Supply*:—The Council at its meeting on 30-10-34 accepted proposals estimated to cost Rs. 56 lakhs to set the Madras Water Works on a sound basis.

Detailed proposals for improving the Madras Water Supply were accordingly submitted to Government and they were requested to furnish a workable estimate and scheme for acquiring the lands under the Red Hills in instalments spread over 10 years and to provide necessary funds half as loan and half as grant. Orders of Government are awaited.

(6) *Tramway Improvements*:—The Council at its meeting held on 7-8-34 accepted the following proposals:—

“(1) Double tracking Purasawalkam line except where the road is narrow as in Hunter's Road.

(2) Double tracking Triplicane High Road as shown by Mr. Burkinshaw in the plan, i. e. except near the Aluminium Factory.

(3) Extending existing siding by 50 feet to the north of the park, west to Salvation Army and South of the Nagatha (Ammen) Temple.

(4) Double tracking Whannels Road.

In view of the undertaking given by the Tramway Company that they would carry out the following improvements:—

Carrying out improvements in Wall Tax Road Viz.

(a) Having posts on either side.

(b) Shifting the track line to the centre.

(c) Allowing the Corporation suspension lights on the side posts,

and provide shelters at the Luz, Wall Tax Road, Broadway and at whannels Road if the Corporation gives lands with good title.”

The resolution was duly communicated to the Madras Electric Tramway Co. Ltd., which has taken the matter on hand. Most of the works are now in progress.

(7) *Selection of musicians to sing at the Radio*:—The Council at its meeting on 14-8-34 resolved that in order to assist the Committee in the selection of musicians an expert, out of a panel of not more than six distinguished musicians in the City to be selected by the Committee, be invited to sit with the Committee during rehearsals, and that the expert be paid a fee of Rs. 10/- for each sitting. The resolutions were given effect to during the year under report.

(8) *Widening of the General Hospital Bridge*:—The Council at its meeting held on 11-9-1934 resolved that the Government be informed that in the opinion of the Council the widening of the General Hospital Bridge is an absolute and urgent necessity; that the work should be undertaken without further delay and that the Corporation agrees to bear half the cost of the work.

The resolution was duly communicated to Government and they were requested to view the question favourably and pass early orders. In memorandum No. 3503-C. 34-3, dated 21-1-35, the Chief Engineer to Government has been requested to submit a report about the alternative proposals to widen the bridge to 80 ft. 88 ft. and 100 ft. for consideration by Government as a scheme for 1936-37.

(9) *Ornamental lights before temples, mosques and churches*:—The Council at its meeting on 16-10-1934 passed the following resolution:—

"In view of the great dissatisfaction felt by the authorities of temples, mosques and churches which have not been provided with lights in the several divisions of the city, this Council resolves to request the Commissioner to provide additional ornamental electric lights up to the number of 10 either singly or in pairs in addition to the existing 5 pairs, in such temples, mosques and churches in each division out of divisional allotment in accordance with the suggestion of the Divisional Councillor".

(10) *Teaching of "Hindi" in the Corporation Schools*.—The Council at its meeting on 23-10-34 passed the following resolution:—

"This Council is of opinion that the Government should be addressed again with a view to their revising the rules under the Elementary Education Act, so as to permit the Corporation to include the teaching of "Hindi" in the Corporation Schools".

The Government to whom the resolution was communicated declined to accede to the request of the Corporation (G.O. No. 2488, dated 4-12-33)

(11) *Inclusion of Saidapet within Municipal Limits*.—With reference to Government Memo. No. 7875-1 L. & M., dated 10-3-1934 the Council at its meeting on 23-10-1934 declined to recommend the proposal to include Saidapet within Municipal Limits.

The resolution was duly communicated to Government.

(12) *Providing amenities at the Radio installed in the High Court Beach*.—The Council at its meeting held on 4-12-34 resolved that the Commissioner do take immediate steps to provide the necessary amenities such as Electric Lights, Public Water fountains, Garden seats etc., at the Radio installed in the High Court Beach. Steps have been taken to give effect to the resolution of the Council.

(13) *Conversion of a portion of the Foreshore into playgrounds*.—The Council at its meeting held on 9-1-35 passed the following resolution:

The Council emphatically protests against the decision of the Foreshore Committee to convert a portion of the Foreshore into playgrounds and resolves that a deputation consisting of the following councillors do wait upon His Excellency the Governor to place before him the irreparable damage that will be caused thereby:—

1. The Mayor, 2. Dewan Bahadur G. Narayanaswamy Chetty, 3. Rao Bahadur Dr. C. Natesa Mudaliar, 4. Mr. Abdul Hameed Khan, 5. Mr. Bruce Scott, 6. Mr. R. Madanagopal Naidu, 7. Mr. G. Janakiram Chetty, 8. Mr. M. Damodaram Naidu, 9. Mr. K. Sreeramulu Naidu and 10. Mrs. M. Hannen Angelo.

(14) *Presentation of Civic Addresses*.—(a) The Council at its meeting held on 26th June 1934 resolved to present an Address of Welcome to His Excellency Sir Muhammed Oosman on the occasion of his first visit to Madras after assumption of office by him as Acting Governor of Madras. The address was presented on 28-7-34 in a casket.

(b) The Council at its meeting held on 3rd July 1934 resolved to present an Address of welcome to Lieut Col. Sir Henry Gidney, Kt., M.L.A., on the occasion of his forthcoming visit to Madras. The address was presented on 5-7-1934.

(c) The Council at its meeting held on 7th August 1934 resolved to present a Civic Address of Welcome to Mrs. Sarojini Naidu during her forthcoming visit to Madras. The address was presented on 13-8-34.

(d) The Council at its meeting held on 14th August 1934 resolved to present a Civic Address of Welcome to Mr. N. R. Sarkar, Mayor of Calcutta, on his visit to the City. The address was presented on 27-8-34.

(e) The Council at its meeting held on 9th October 1934 resolved to present a Civic Address to Dr. Rabindranath Tagore. The address was presented on 22-10-34.

(f) The Council at its meeting held on 23rd October 1934 resolved to present an Address of Welcome to Lord Erskine, Governor Designate on his arrival in Madras. The address was presented to His Excellency on 16-11-34.

(g) The Council at its meeting held on 11th December 1934 resolved to present a Civic Address of Welcome to the Hon'ble Khan Bahadur Sir Myan Fazli Hussain Bahadur, K. C. S. I., K. C. I. E., Member of the Executive Council of the Government of India. The address was not presented as the gentleman did not arrive as originally arranged.

REVENUE ADMINISTRATION.

FINANCE.

I. Capital Account.

7. (1) The year opened with a balance of Rs. 23,78,722-6-0 as against Rs. 18,64,544-3-5 in the previous year and this is made up of:—

- (a) Rs. 7,84,600-3-3 for general purposes.
- (b) Rs. 2,02,473-0-7 for Mambalam Scheme
- (c) Rs. 13,37,771-5-1 for the improvement of water supply and drainage.
- (d) Rs. 53,977-13-1 for the extension of Electric lighting.

The Corporation received from Government during the year a free grant of Rs. 2,01,466 for the improvement of drainage and Rs. 56,126 for water supply. A loan of Rs. 9.75 lakhs was received from Government during the year as against 10 lakhs in the previous year for the following works,

3,00,000 for Drainage works
2,00,000 for Storm water drainage
1,00,000 for Housing Scheme
3,75,000 for Electric Lighting Scheme.

The total receipts (inclusive of the opening balance) amounted to Rs. 37,48,846-2-11. The expenditure amounted to Rs. 11,15,110-6-9. The amount spent on Mambalam Scheme was Rs. 65,855-12-10, that on Capital works from the General Account was Rs. 1,89,869-3-1 and that on New Water Supply and Drainage works was Rs. 7,76,710-3-7. The expenditure on the extension of electric lighting was Rs. 14,331-9-3 and that under Advances Rs. 97,006-12-6. The balance at the close of the year was Rs. 26,33,735-12-2. Of this balance, the amount relating to General Account was Rs. 6,94,586-0-2 that relating to Water supply and Drainage Account was Rs. 13,18,653-1-6, to the lighting account was Rs. 4,43,209-6-4 and that to Mambalam Scheme Rs. 1,36,617-3-9 and that under advance Rs. 40,670-0-5.

Ordinary Account.

(2) The balance at the beginning of the year was Rs. 3,25,477-9-5 as against Rs. 6,21,687-7-6 in the previous year. A sum of Rs. 2.10 lakhs required for the purchase of Motor Fire Engine, purchase of additional Tar and for Road reforms &c., was expended during the year, reducing the opening balance to 3,25,477-9-5. The revenue from all sources amounted to Rs. 62,03,193-2-3 as against Rs. 62,02,331-5-9 in the previous year. The receipts under the General Account amounted to Rs. 40,78,991-14-6 (including Rs. 1,25,660-14-6, realised from the sale of land, extraordinary, and sale proceeds of lands at Mambalam) under the lighting account Rs. 4,74,454-5-8 and under the Water supply and Drainage account Rs. 15,02,993-8-6 and under advances 1,46,753-5-7. Towards the above income, the taxation proper alone contributed Rs. 44,96,726-1-6 as against Rs. 44,23,044-5-2 in the previous year. During the year the contribution to the Education fund amounted to Rs. 2,90,000 and the expenditure under extra-ordinary items amounted to Rs. 1,86,481-5-6. The total expenditure, excluding the contribution to the Education fund and expenditure under extra-ordinary items, amounted to Rs. 58,43,765-15-9 against an estimate of Rs. 61,09,850 and against the actuals of Rs. 60,24,945-3-7 in 1933-34. The balance at the close of the year was Rs. 2,08,423-6-5 (Vide appendix I) Rs. 1,95,131-8-11 represents the balance under the General Account, Rs. -19,828-14-7 under the lighting account Rs. -10,478-11-5 under the Water and Drainage Account Rs. 42,769-7-0 under Town Planning account and under advances account and Rs. 830-0-6

Property Tax.

8. The Property tax for the year under report was levied at the consolidated rate of 15½ per cent on the annual value of buildings and lands in the City as in the previous year with the following percentages fixed by the council for the items comprised in it:—

The Education Tax continued to be collected as before as a surcharge on the property tax at the rate of 1½ per cent for the year under report on the annual value of buildings and lands in the City including the Mambalam extension.

The total percentage of demand was therefore 16½ per annum on the annual value of buildings and lands in the City proper.

As regards Mambalam extension the Property Tax was levied at the consolidated rate of 16½ per cent in the streets mentioned below, as they received the benefit of the water-supply system of the City.

As regards other parts of the Mambalam extension, to which the water supply system had not been extended, only lighting-tax and tax for general purposes were levied, the water and drainage tax being exempted under G. O. No. 1380 L & M dated 12-11-1924. The percentage of demand for the exempted area was therefore 11½ per annum.

*General progress in the annual value:—*The annual value of all buildings and lands in the City as determined under Section 100 of the Act was Rs. 228,10,270 at the commencement of the year. During the year under report 1045 new buildings came in for assessment and their annual value was Rs. 2,82,787. Old buildings 835 in number came in for revision of assessment on account of structural alterations and improvements and there was an increase of their annual value by Rs. 1,79,989. During the year under report 104 buildings of the annual value of Rs. 22,334 were demolished. Thus by the amendment of assessments under Rule 3 Schedule IV of the Act on account of new construction and reconstruction of buildings and on account also of the rise in the rental value of old buildings in certain cases, there was a gross increase in the annual value by Rs. 8,63,296. But there was a reduction of the annual value by Rs. 3,94,353 by subsequent amendments and cancellations. The net result was an increase of Rs. 4,41,690. At the close of the year the annual value increased to Rs. 232,79,214.

Completion of Property tax registers.—Public notice under rule 2 Schedule IV of the Act was given on 1-5-1934 in the leading local daily Newspapers (both English and Vernacular) of the fact of completion of property tax registers of 24 divisions other than those subjected to general revision of assessment Viz. XI (Sowcarpet) XIII (Trevelyan Basin) XIV (Esplanade) XV (Park Town) XXII (Nungambakam) XXVII (Amir Mahal) and the Mambalam extension. A supplementary public notice was given in the same manner of the fact of completion of the property tax registers of these six divisions and Mambalam on 23-6-1934 after completion of the revision of assessment.

Applications for revision of assessments.—The number of applications admitted as valid for revision of the standing valuation in certain cases and enhanced valuation in other cases was 4709 as against 4928 in the preceding year. The Commissioner passed orders in 4422 cases as against 4738 in the preceding year. The applicants communicated their dissatisfaction with the orders passed, in 1167 cases as against 1093 in the preceding year. These 1167 cases along with 753 cases relating to previous year were placed before the Standing Committee (T & F) for decision. The Standing Committee held 16 meetings during the year as against 19 in the previous year and disposed of 1217 cases of which 464 related to the current year and 753 cases related to the previous years. Two appeals preferred by (1) Ura Sreeramulu Chetty (2) Official Trustee to the Small Causes Court in the year 1933-34 remained pending at the close of that year. They were disposed of during the year under report and the assessments were reduced in these two cases. The following are the particulars about them.

Exemption.—In pursuance of the Council's resolution under proviso (b) to section 102 of the Act, exemption from property tax was given in 57 cases as the annual value of the property in each case was less than Rs. 36. This involved a reduction of the demand by Rs. 227-14-0.

Result of revision of assessment.—There was a gross increase from general and other casual revisions of assessments of Rs. 1,19,903-7-3 as against Rs. 1,28,633-10-2 in the previous year. The gross increase on account of general revision of assessments alone in the six divisions mentioned above was Rs. 50,478-3-1 as against Rs. 58,995-14-0 in the previous year. After the disposal of appeals the net increase on account of general revision of assessments was found to be Rs. 37,517-0-3. As a result of the reductions made from both the enhanced and standing assessments by the orders of the Commissioner and Standing Committee on appeals, the net increase was Rs. 56,792-4-7 as against 40,784-9-8 in the preceding year.

Demand.—The gross demand for the year amounted to Rs. 39,36,483-15-9 as against Rs. 38,82,499-1-11. The net demand after reductions and cancellations made by the Commissioner and Standing Committee (T & F) amounted to Rs. 38,73,372-13-1 as against Rs. 37,94,650-1-5 in the previous year.

Collection.—The gross collection amounted to Rs. 32,46,373-9-1 as against Rs. 32,11,631-11-6 in the previous year. The net collection after deducting refunds etc., was Rs. 32,35,661-14-0 as against Rs. 31,97,042-3-0 in the previous year.

Taxes payable by the Government departments.—Against a demand of Rs. 3,88,389 due by the Government for the year 1934-35, a sum of Rs. 3,87,220 was recovered during the year under report. The balance of Rs. 1,160 together with Rs. 1,630 being the arrears for prior periods forms the subject of correspondence.

Taxes payable by the M. & S. M. Ry. Co., Ltd.—Against a demand of Rs. 98,650 due by the M & S.M.Ry Co., Ltd., for the year 1934-35, a sum of Rs. 93,250 was recovered during the year under report. Recovery of the balance of Rs. 5,400 as also the prior arrears of Rs. 1,100 is under correspondence.

Taxes payable by the S.I. Ry. Co., Ltd.—The demand of Rs. 71,960 against the South Indian Railway Company was recovered in full during the year under report.

Taxes payable by the Madras Port Trust.—A sum of Rs. 1,36,982-9-2 was provisionally recovered during the year under report for property and Education taxes. After the gross earnings of the year were settled in the Port Trust Accounts, the demand was settled at Rs. 1,43,073-4-6. The balance due viz. Rs. 6,090-11-4 has since been recovered.

Taxes payable by the special Property List holders.—Out of a demand of Rs. 7,48,150 due for the year 1934-35 from the persons placed in the special list of property holders a sum Rs. 7,06,650 was recovered during the year under report. Of the balance of Rs. 41,500 a sum of Rs. 11,000 has since been recovered. The recovery of the balance is covered by correspondence. There is also prior arrears of Rs. 20,000 due from these gentlemen which amount is also under correspondence. The balance still remaining as well as the arrears of previous years amounting to Rs. 20,000 is pending recovery on account of objection to the demand and claim for remission and other causes.

Remission.—A sum of Rs. 67,927-7-11 was remitted on account of vacancy and other causes as against Rs. 66,749-7-0 in the previous year. Notices of vacancy 4341 in number were received during the year. In 323 cases claims were not admitted. In 1200 cases vacancy lasted between 30 and 90 days and in 2826 cases vacancy lasted over 90 days and moiety of tax was remitted from the demand.

Balance.—The balance outstanding at the close of the year was Rs. 5,69,783-7-2 as against Rs. 5,30,858-7-5 in the previous year. It may be mentioned that the increase in the amount of demand by Rs. 78,723 had its own effect in increasing the balance at the end of the year.

Warrants.—The number of warrants executed during the year was 24 as against 27 in the previous year. There were 694 warrants issued during the year but only in 24 cases they had to be executed. Efforts were made to collect the taxes without actual execution of the warrants wherever possible.

Civil Suits.—The number of civil suits filed during the year for recovery of property tax was 85 as against 186 in the preceding year. 9 cases of the previous year were pending disposal. Decrees were obtained in 63 cases of which 55 related to the suits filed in the current year and 8 cases of the previous year. 12 cases of the current year were settled out of court and the remaining 18 cases were pending decision. The remaining one case of the last year which related to the recovery of Rs. 201-9-1 from the South Indian Athletic Association Ltd., was dismissed with costs on 21-12-1934. But an application has been made to the Full Bench of Small Causes Court for review of the case with the sanction of S.C. (T & F). It has not yet been disposed of. The amount covered by civil suits was Rs. 12,413-12-1.

Percentage of collection:—After allowing for a sum of Rs. 53,564 for assessments levied at the close of the financial year and also allowing for a sum of Rs. 48,142 being the difference between the old and enhanced assessments in respect of appeals pending decision at the close of the year, the percentage of collection to net demand was 88.07 as against 87.01 in the previous year.

Incidence of taxation:—The incidence of tax per head of population is Rs. 5-15-9 as against 5-13-10 in the previous year.

Note:—D. C. B. statement as compared with the corresponding figures for two years is shown in Appendix 1 Table No. 1.

Arrear.

Demand, Collection, Remission and Balance:—The demand outstanding at the beginning of the year was Rs. 10,33,674-15-5. As a result of the amendments made subsequently in the course of the year, the demand went down to Rs. 10,21,554-14-5. The amount of collection under arrears made during the year was Rs. 4,71,860-5-11 as against Rs. 3,44,520-5-9 in the preceding year. A sum of Rs. 1,198-0-7 was remitted on account of vacancy and other causes. The balance at the end of the year was Rs. 5,48,496-7-11.

Percentage of collection:—After allowing for a sum of Rs. 91,114-13-1 covered by civil suits, the percentage of collection to net demand is 50.84 as against 45.67 in the previous year.

Note:—The D. C. B. Statement as compared with the corresponding figures for 2 years is shown in Appendix 1 Table No. 2.

The details relating to each head of tax are shown in Appendix 1 statements III A and III B.

Percentage of collection "Arrear and current" from the year 1922-23 to 1934-35 is shown in Appendix 1 Table No. 3.

General.

The financial conditions presented no brighter aspect during the year under report. They were as bad as before, if not worse. Many applications asking for time to pay the taxes due are in evidence. Even when payments were made the full demand for an assessed item was in many cases not paid at once. Even the well-to-do class of land lords were not able to pay the full amount of their dues at a time and paid it in instalments. Such part-payments increased correspondence and postponed recovery. There was also considerable loss of income on account of vacancy of buildings. There has been a general fall in the rentals of big buildings. Those who looked to house property as a means of investment were greatly affected by it unlike in previous years. A single tenant could not easily be found to take a whole building. To meet this difficulty attempts were made by owners of buildings to make structural alterations so that one block of building may be divided into smaller units. It may sound strange: but there are instances of the ground floor and upper floor of good many buildings (including bungalow type) being asked to be separated into flats. This process of division of assessments helped the owners to let the smaller tenements easily and at the same time secure vacancy remission for the vacant tenements. In spite of these difficulties the construction of buildings as a means of investment appears to have attraction. The development of building sites and the springing up of cottage houses are a feature in the sub-urban areas & one wonders where economic depression comes in. It is seen that 1190 new buildings were built in the year 1933-34, and 1045 in the year under report. Great stimulus for building houses seems

to be given by Co-operative Building Societies to enable even ordinary class of persons to possess a building of their own.

Reduction of the arrears presented a task of great difficulty. The execution of warrants was restricted to cases of real necessity. Civil suits were largely filed during the previous years. But experience has shown that the launching of suits on the obtaining of decrees forms but a small step in the direction of easy recovery but difficulties are experienced mostly in the process of execution. It was therefore found necessary to proceed further with the execution of decrees already obtained instead of increasing the number of filed suits in the year under report. Recoveries were effected in 148 cases by taking the execution proceedings. This accounts for the fall in the number of suits filed during the year under report. The cumulative effect of the different processes adopted in the matter of collection of arrears is reflected in the rise of 5 per cent in the collection of arrears. But for the increased attention paid to collection work this rise in percentage might not have been effected but it is hoped that better results would follow in the future.

Tax on Companies and Profession.

A. TAX ON COMPANIES.

9. (a) *Current:*—The gross current demand under Companies tax was Rs. 2,03,605-0-0 as against Rs. 2,03,295-0-0 in the year 1933-34. A sum of Rs. 2,985/- was remitted on appeals and the collection for the year amounted to Rs. 1,88,803-12-0 as against Rs. 1,86,307-8-0 in the previous year. The balance left uncollected at the close of the year was Rs. 11,816-4-0 as against Rs. 15,177-8-0.

(b) *Arrear:*—The balance of Rs. 25,842-10-0 left uncollected at the end of the preceding year rose to Rs. 26,072-10-0 on account of supplemental assessments. The gross demand was subsequently reduced to Rs. 24,802-10-0 on appeals. The collection during the year was Rs. 8,826-4-0 and the balance left uncollected was Rs. 15,976-6-0.

(c) *Percentage of collection:*—The amounts to be recovered from 94 Co-operative Societies, which are unable to pay the tax, are Rs. 8,475 under arrears, and Rs. 4,460 under current. Excluding these amounts the percentage of collection is 54.14 under arrear as against 47.66 in the previous year and it is 96.03 under current as against 92.46 in the previous year. A note was sent to S. C. (T & F) in the case of these poor Co-operative Societies, but the matter has not been finally decided. Reports are gathered about these societies whether tax can be recovered by filing suits atleast against them. Each case is dealt with on its individual merits.

B. PROFESSION TAX.

(a) *Current:*—The profession tax continued to be levied at 25% over and above the minimum rates prescribed in Schedule IV of Madras City Municipal Act IV of 1919. The gross current demand was Rs. 3,35,402-8-0 as against Rs. 3,43,069-2-0 in the previous year. The gross demand was subsequently reduced to Rs. 3,15,615-8-0 on appeals. The collection under the head was Rs. 2,66,705-4-0 as against Rs. 2,72,508-13-9 in the previous year and the balance left uncollected at the end of the year was Rs. 48,909-15-0 as against Rs. 48,706-4-3 in the year 1933-34.

(b) *Arrear:*—The arrear demand which stood at Rs. 91,504-12-1 rose to Rs. 95,269-12-1 on account of supplemental assessments, and it was

subsequently reduced to Rs. 88,840-7-1 on account of remission and reduction on appeals. A sum of Rs. 37,157-6-1 was realised during this year and the balance left uncollected amounted to Rs. 51,683-1-0. A sum of Rs. 2,299-6-0 was written off by the S.C. (T & F) as irrecoverable.

(c) *Percentage of collection.*—The demands which could not be cancelled before 31st March 1935 for want of information in each case amount to Rs. 1,120 which when added to the actual remission amounts to Rs. 20,907. A sum of Rs. 550 was covered by appeals and a sum of Rs. 4,105 is due by persons who have gone out of the Madras Presidency, and India. Excluding these amounts the percentage of collection is therefore 86.08 as against Rs. 84.87 in the previous year. Under arrears the amounts covered under the above heads is Rs. 9,115. Excluding this sum, the percentage of collection under arrears is 46.55 as against 48.15 in the previous year.

30 appeals went up to the S.C. (T & F) as against 65 in the previous year, 23 cases were decided by them and 7 are pending decision. Of the 23 cases decided, in 8 cases the assessments were reduced and in 15, the assessments were confirmed.

TAX ON CARRIAGES AND ANIMALS.

Current.

10. The net demand under this tax amounted to Rs. 1,04,455-0-0 as against Rs. 89,317 in the previous year.

The number of vehicles and animals assessed during the year under several classes of schedule IV, Part III of the Madras City Municipal Act as compared with the corresponding figures of the previous year is shown in Appendix I—Table 4. The number of free licenses issued during the year under Section 118 is shown in column 6 of the table.

Seizure of cycles.—An attempt was made during the year to seize, under Section 127, cycles which did not bear the municipal number. Cycle discs of different patterns for the 2 half years were manufactured and were directed to be fixed to the axle-nut at the left side of the front wheel of the cycle, for easy verification by the officials employed for the purpose of seizing cycles. Assessors, License Inspectors and Bailiffs were posted in different parts of the City with a view to examining the cycles licensed and unlicensed. The staff was not adequate; yet the vigorous steps adopted resulted in an increase in the number of cycles licensed. During the year under report 26,759 cycles were registered in the two half-years as against, 19,225 cycles last year. There are still many cycles escaping assessment and several cycle owners have had recourse to giving false addresses as living in villages and producing the Village Munsif's certificates or the adjoining Municipalities' register numbers, the tax of the adjoining Municipalities being far less than that of the City licence fee. Better results can be achieved if temporary additional staff is employed. The tax derived from the cycles during the year is Rs. 53,518. But the Council made recommendation to the Government for abolition of the tax on cycles in their resolution dated 11th December 1934 for consideration along with the amendments to the City Municipal Act.

Current collections amounted to Rs. 96,884-0-0 which included Rs. 2,520 received as advance for the succeeding year. The net collections of the year amounted to Rs. 94,364-0-0 which with Rs. 2,253-0-0 prepaid in the previous year for the year under report amounted to Rs. 96,617-0-0. The percentage of collection to the demand for the year was 92.50 against 89.10 in the previous year. There was a balance of Rs. 7,838 left to be collected of which Rs. 2,241-8-0 have since been recovered.

The Government have paid during the year under report a sum of Rs. 1,08,148-8-0 towards the annual contribution of Rs. 3,38,000 fixed in G. O. No. 3250 L & M d/11-7-34 payable to the Corporation of Madras as compensation under section 10(2) of the Madras Motor Vehicles Taxation Act of 1931 for the loss of revenue involved in the Government's taking over the right of taxing motor vehicles.

The statement appended shows the amount of annual contribution received from Government against the maximum fixed during the last four years.

It is hoped that the annual contribution as fixed in the G. O. would be fully paid so that the finances of the Corporation may not suffer.

ARREAR.

The arrear demand at the beginning of the year for vehicles and animals was Rs. 32,031-3-9 which by subsequent amendments and additions rose to Rs. 36,660-3-9. Of this, a sum of Rs. 7,463-8-0 was found on investigation to be erroneous and was cancelled. Thus the net demand was Rs. 29,196-11-9 and of this Rs. 8,589-10-0 were collected & Rs. 2 were written off by S. C. leaving a balance of Rs. 20,605-1-9 at the close of the year. The percentage of collection to demand was 29.42 against 28.20 in the previous year.

TAX ON CARTS AND OTHER VEHICLES WITHOUT SPRINGS.

CURRENT.

11. The demand under this tax amounted to Rs. 47,648 as against Rs. 44,416 in the previous year. The number of carts voluntarily offered for registration was 9277 as against 8457 in the previous year and the number seized under Section 127 of the Act for non-registration consequently fell from 2647 to 2635. Of the 2635 carts seized 2510 were released on payment while 78 carts were let off without payment on proof of non-liability. 40 carts were sold in auction leaving behind 7 carts unredeemed at the close of the year.

The current collections inclusive of Rs. 1,568 received in advance for the ensuing year amounted to Rs. 47,680-6-0. The net collections excluding the advance payment amounted to Rs. 46,112-6-0 which with Rs. 1,144 collected in the previous year towards the demand for the year under, review amounted to Rs. 47,256-6-0 against Rs. 44,212 in the previous year. Demands on 78 carts amounting to Rs. 312 were cancelled, as not liable, while a sum of Rs. 29-8-0 was written off as irrecoverable. There was a balance of Rs. 50-2-0 comprising Rs. 28 being the tax on 7 carts that remained undisposed in the godown and of Rs. 22-2-0 being the irrecoverable balance of 11 out of the 20 carts sold in auction on 27-3-35.

ARREAR.

The demand at the beginning of the year was Rs. 178-2-0 which by subsequent amendments and additions rose to Rs. 226-2-0. 4 carts tax on

which amounting to Rs. 12-0-0 were released without payment of tax on proof of non-liability and Rs. 70-14-0 were written off as irrecoverable. The collectable balance of Rs. 143-4-0 was fully realised, leaving no balance under arrears.

Tax on Timber

12. *Collection*:—The year under report was slightly better than the previous three years in spite of the non-levy of tax on imports by roads and the dullness of timber market. The gross collection excluding the sum of Rs. 2,289-14-7 being the amount of arrear collection amounted to Rs. 1,35,179-13-5 as against Rs. 1,30,561-10-2 of the previous year.

Refunds:—The amount of tax refunded during the year under report on re-exports of timber was Rs. 27,354-14-6 as against Rs. 13,618-7-10 of the previous year. Of this amount the sum of Rs. 526-15-3 only represents refund on re-exports of timber imported during the year under report.

Collecting Agencies:—The relationship with the collecting agencies and the executive continued to be cordial. The sum of Rs. 2,289-14-7 being the tax collected by the collecting agencies during the year of the previous year was remitted during the year. The percentage of remittance to the arrear demand was 100.

Out of the sum of Rs. 1,38,074-2-0 collected on imports during the year a sum of Rs. 1,35,167-9-5 was remitted into the treasury and the balance of Rs. 2,906-8-7 is the amount collected at the close of the year and could not be remitted by 31-3-1935. The percentage of remittance to the current collection is 98.

Duty on Transfers of Property.

13 (1) *Current*:—The duty on transfers of property under Section 93 (g) of the Madras City Municipal Act IV of 1919 was levied at 1½ per cent as sanctioned by the Government (Vide G. O. No. 552 Mis. Ps. dated 24-4-20 and G. O. No. 4081 L & M., Ps. dated 21st September 1926). The gross collection for three quarters ending 30th June 1934, 30th September 1934 and 31st December 1934 amounted to Rs. 94,149-14-0. Out of this, a sum of Rs. 2353-13-0 being 2½ per cent of the collection was credited to the Government for the collection of the duty as per G. O. No. 274 L & M Ps. of 9th February 1922. The net collection therefore amounted to Rs. 91,796-1-0 as against 96,676-2-0 in the previous year.

(2) *Arrear*:—The gross collection for the quarter ending 31st March 1934 amounted to Rs. 25,902-0-0. After deducting Rs. 647-9-0 credited to the Government for the collection of the Duty, a sum of Rs. 25,254-7-0 was realised by way of arrears. Thus the total collection by way of duty on Transfer of Property was Rs. 1,17,050-8-0 as against Rs. 1,26,912-1-0 in the previous year.

ENTERTAINMENTS TAX

14. *Entertainments Tax* was levied on all payments for admission of over four annas to any theatre, cinema, exhibition or circus at the maximum rates specified under Section 3 (3) of the Entertainments Tax Act, and in cases of other kinds of entertainments, the tax was levied at 25 per cent of the admission fee under Section 3 (1) of the said Act.

The demand under this head for the current year was Rs. 85,659-1-5 as against Rs. 83,585-15-5 in the year 1933-34. The whole demand was collected. The percentage of collection during this year was cent percent as against 99.73 in the previous year.

ARREARS:—At the end of the previous year there was a balance of Rs. 807-3-6 left uncollected. The demand for 11 entertainments that were held during the previous year had to be fixed in the course of the year under report as the details for the sale of tickets were not furnished by the proprietors before the close of the year. The demand so fixed in the way of supplemental assessments under arrears amounted to Rs. 403-12-6. The total demand under arrear was therefore Rs. 1,211-0-0. A sum of Rs. 674-1-0 was collected under arrears leaving a balance of Rs. 536-15-0 which amount has to be recovered only by the execution of the court decree. The percentage of collection to demand under arrears is 55.65 as against 79.11 in the previous year. The total income under this head both arrear and current was Rs. 86,333-2-5.

The penal provisions of the Act were not resorted to either for the recovery of the tax or for holding performances contrary to the provisions contained in the Act.

Owing to the introduction of Tamil Talkie pictures there has been a fall in the revenue from dramatic performances as compared with that of the previous year.

In the previous years, the Entertainments Tax payable by the various sports clubs in the City were compounded to a lump sum under Section 3 (4) of the Act. But during the year under report no such compounding was allowed with a view to seeing whether a better income could be realised. This had the desired effect in certain clubs. Unlike previous years, no circus company visited the City. Many artistes of continental fame such as Ragini Devi, Menaka and Udayashankar came to this City and exhibited their talents in the art of dance and this attracted the public of Madras to a great extent.

Revenue derived from Municipal Property and Powers apart from Taxation.

Rent of Municipal Lands and Buildings 1934-35.

15. (i) The demand under this head was Rs. 76,409-12-8 as against Rs. 77,118-15-9 in the preceding year. The decrease in the demand is chiefly due to the relinquishment of lands in Nyniappa Naick Street to Government on 30-9-1934 which yielded an annual income of Rs. 1,292-6-0. The collection was Rs. 63,335-14-8. Out of this, a sum of Rs. 5,922-14-2 was refunded to the Tahsildar of Madras and others being 50% of the rents realised from the lessees of lands in Wall Tax Road and Basin Bridge Road. The net collection excluding the advance rent of Rs. 1,396-11-5 amounted to Rs. 57,413-0-6 against Rs. 61,331-5-8.

The demand for lease of bunks was Rs. 15,025-3-8. The collection was Rs. 14,604-13-8. Out of this a sum of Rs. 213-13-3 was refunded to the bunk holders towards refund of the advance rent etc. The net collection excluding the advance rent of Rs. 401-8-3 amounted to Rs. 14,391-0-5. The total demand under the above heads was Rs. 91,435-0-4 and the net collection excluding the advance rent of Rs. 1,798-3-8 amounted to Rs. 71,804-0-11. The percentage of collection to the demand after deducting the amount covered by Civil suits, etc., is 88.55 as against 88.52 of the previous year.

Arrear.

The demand under this head including bunks was Rs. 15,980-6-9 and the collection amounted to Rs. 11,495-12-2. The percentage of collection to the demand after deducting the amount covered by civil suits etc., is 83.84 as against 83.33 of the previous year.

(ii) The total collections this year arrear and current amounted to Rs. 53,868-1-9 as against Rs. 53,847-14-0 last year. Of this the collections under current amounted to Rs. 49,555-14-6 out of a demand of Rs. 55,019-11-4 (as against the collections of Rs. 47,763-0-5 out of a demand of Rs. 53,429-7-9 of the previous year.) The collections under arrear is Rs. 4,312-3-3 out of a demand of Rs. 10,159-2-9 (as against Rs. 6,084-13-7 out of a net demand of Rs. 10,622-12-3 of the previous year.)

The percentage of collections under current is 90.1 % as against 89.4 % of the previous year. The percentage of collections under arrear is 62.6 % excluding the amount covered by decrees as against 57.2 % of the previous year. A sum of Rs. 2,054-14-3 is covered by decrees and steps are being taken to execute the decrees.

Distraint Fees

(iii) A sum of Rs. 133-12-6 was realised under this head. There were 70 cases against 94 in the previous year.

Income from Licence Fees.

(iv) The income under this head amounted to Rs. 2,08,057-0-8 as detailed in table No. 48 Appendix II against Rs. 2,07,883-14-1 in the previous year. The total number of items dealt with was 31,118 against 32,810 in the previous year.

Grants and contributions.

(v) A sum of Rs. 2,78,118 as detailed below was received from Government as Grants and contributions during the year.

- (1) Rs. 4,219 for the repair of Bridges over the Cooum and Buckingham Canal.
- (2) Rs. 1,600 for the maintenance of Roads in chepauk.
- (3) Rs. 13,607 towards compensation for withholding sanction for the issue of licenses by the Corporation for places used for sale of spirituous and intoxicating liquors.
- (4) Rs. 800 for the maintenance of electric lights in Chepauk.
- (5) Rs. 300 for the payment of batta to pregnant woman in Ramaswamy Mudaliar Lying-in-Hospital.
- (6) Rs. 2,57,592 for drainage and water supply as free grant.

Current.

(vi) *Payment of Water Supply for Non-Domestic purposes*:-The demand under this head for the year was Rs. 6,87,073-6-0 as against Rs. 6,72,821-12-0 last year, and the amount collected came to Rs. 6,10,239-8-0 which included a sum of Rs. 1,373-13-8 adjusted towards the current demand from the payments made during the previous years. At the close of the year, there was an uncollected balance of Rs. 76,833-14-0 as against Rs. 34,436-15-6 in the year previous.

Arrear.

At the commencement of the year, the arrears amounted to Rs. 40,798-13-6 which, on account of subsequent revisions during the year,

was reduced to Rs. 39,188-13-6. Out of this amount, a sum of Rs. 29,202-2-6 was realised while Rs. 329-12-0 was adjusted from the previous years' payments, leaving an uncollected balance of Rs. 9,656-15-0 at the close of the year, as against Rs. 6,361-14-0 in the year previous.

The percentages of collection under both "Current" and "Arrears" are low and this is mainly due to meters being out of commission or defective on account of long service. The consumers dispute the levy of charges based on the average readings and thus put off the collections. Since writing the report, a sum of Rs. 40,000 has been collected both under "Current" and "Arrear."

Grass Farm.

(vii) The grass farm at Tondiarpet was leased for a period of three years from 1-4-34 to 31-3-1937 to Messrs. P. S. Gopala Iyengar and O. Marga Iyer on an annual rental of Rs. 2,135. For the irrigation of the farm, the lessees have been permitted to use the 2 Corporation Pumps on payment of Rs. 75 per mensem. The area of the grass farm is about 80 Caw 16 grds 1200 sq. ft. and that of the market farm is about 17 C 1 gr 438 sq. ft. The poor income in respect of the grass farm is due to the demand for grass being on the decline thereby necessitating the contractors cultivating only a portion of the farm.

The question of filing a suit for the recovery of the amount due by the defaulting contractor late Mr. Bhasyam Naidu, was under consideration.

General Incidence of Taxation.

16. The incidence of taxation per head of population under all taxes was Rs. 6-15-2 as against Rs. 6-13-5 in the previous year.

Deposit Account.

17. (a) This account which exhibits transactions relating to the Corporation Stores and Workshop, the payment made on account of sinking fund for loan raised in the open market and the security deposit of Corporation servants and contractors etc., opened with a balance of Rs. 62,58,043-15-4. The receipt during the year amounted to Rs. 29,59,370-6-4 and the expenditure Rs. 26 26 021-13-1 leaving a balance of Rs. 65,91,392-8-7 at the close of the year.

Ever since the introduction of Flush-out latrines and drain connections in the City, the transactions with parties have enormously increased with the consequent voluminous postings etc., under II Account Deposit. With a view to facilitating the maintenance of accounts, the departments were ordered during this year to maintain subsidiary registers in the form of personal accounts and to have a periodical verification of their figures with the registers maintained in the Central Accounts Department.

Advances.

(b) At the beginning of the year a sum of Rs. 2,98,321-5-0 was outstanding under this head of which permanent advances held by the several officers of the Corporation amounted to Rs. 1,17,675 and miscellaneous advances to Rs. 1,80,646-5-0. The permanent advances are represented almost entirely by the money invested in the stock at Corporation stores and the miscellaneous advances include payment made, on account of amounts for which bills have been sent out, amounts paid on advance, or in deposit but awaiting adjustment. During the year fresh advances were

made to the extent of Rs. 2,42,930-1-7 of which a sum of Rs 125 was made under permanent and Rs. 2,42,805-1-7 under miscellaneous and recoveries and adjustments were made to the extent of Rs. 2,84,430-2-6 of which a sum of Rs. 269-6-0 under permanent and Rs. 2,84,160-12-6 under miscellaneous leaving a balance of Rs. 1,17,530-10-0 under permanent and Rs. 1,39,290-10-1 under Miscellaneous advances or Rs. 2,56,821-4-1 in the aggregate against Rs. 2,98,321-5-0 at the end of the previous year.

Special Government Grant.

A sum of Rs. 700 was received for anti-malarial drainage works from Government out of which there is only a balance of Rs. 24-14-2.

Expenditure-Public Works-Capital and Non-Recurring

Communications (1) Roads-Acquisitions etc.

CAPITAL-ARREAR.

18. Acquisition of land in R. S. No. 664 of Tondiarpet for widening Venkatachela Naick Street sanctioned by the Council in lieu of the acquisition of R. S. No. 578 of Tondiarpet for connecting Pathala Vigneswarar Koil Street with Arathoon Road, was not effected this year as the award was not passed by the Collector. Valuation statement for Rs. 1919-1-4 was received and it was returned to the Collector after acceptance.

As regards widening of Pelathope Street the Council at its meeting held on 12-3-35, approved the recommendation of the Standing Committee (Works) to agree to abide by the conditions of acquisition under the land Acquisition Act.

Current (Non-Recurring.)

Owing to financial stringency, provision was made in the Budget only for two acquisitions each costing below Rs. 500 viz. acquisition of land for widening Kandan Street, Chucklipalayam and acquisition of a pial-projection for widening Ammen Koil Street. These two acquisitions were pending with the Collector during the year under report. Besides the above acquisitions, the following three acquisitions were provided for, in the Supplemental Budget and sanctioned.

(a) Acquisition of land in R. S. No. 2811/4 of Pursawalkam for widening Dada Sha Makhan Street.

(b) Acquisition of land in R. S. No. 3329 of Mylapore for forming "G" Road.

(c) Acquisition of land in R. S. No. 3058/2 part of Tondiarpet for extending Market Lane.

These acquisitions could not be completed as they were sanctioned late in the year.

A sum of Rs. 75,000/- was sanctioned by the Council as the Divisional allotment at Rs. 2500/- for each Division to be utilised for the respective divisions as suggested by the Divisional Councillors. The following are the acquisitions suggested by the respective Divisional Councillors.

(1) Acquisition of land in R. S. No. 2304 part of G. T. for the purpose of a Reading Room-9th Division.

(2) Acquisition of land for connecting Anna Pillay street with Chandrappa Mudali street-13th Dn.

(3) Acquisition of land for connecting Polu Naicken street with Parthasarthy Naidu street-16th Dn.

(4) Acquisition of land in R.S.Nos 510, 511 and 512 of Egmore for widening the street behind the Model lines, Egmore-20th Dn.

(5) Acquisition of land for connecting Avenue Road with Nungambakkam High Road-22nd Dn.

(6) Acquisition of the open land in R.S. No. 2912 of Triplicane-25th-Dn.

Most of the above acquisitions were either pending with the Collector or before the Council for sanction during the year under report.

Arrear.

Acquisition of land in R.S.No.3092 of Tondiarpet was effected during the year at a cost of Rs.799.

Public Works—Expenditure—Normal

19. The expenditure incurred on the reform of roads including cost of departmental quarrying, maintenance of bridges, culverts foot-paths etc, amounted to Rs. 6,99,297 as against the provision of Rs. 7,21,460. leaving a balance of Rs. 22,163 due to unpaid liabilities and savings. This sum of Rs. 6,99,297 includes Rs. 1,09,282. in respect of the special road making contract with Messrs. McKenzies Ltd. The total quantity of blue granite quarried during the year was 8,56,602 cubic feet as against 9,54,981 cubic feet last year, while, that issued from Periamet yard as check-measured on roadsides came to 8,30,354 cubic feet.

The Second Metal Depot in Spur Tank, for which the alienation of land and revenue in favour of the Corporation was sanctioned by the Council on 30-10-34, will, if retained, greatly facilitate the quick transport of metal to the southern portions of the City.

Reform and Repairs of Roads.

Ms. 2-6-113-2 ft. of unmetalled roads were metalled for the first time. The total length of metalled roads in the City at the end of the year

came to miles 358-0-115 yds. including 4 Fur. 28 Yds. 1 ft. of roads newly metalled in Thyagaraya Nagar.

Roads were reformed to a length of Ms. 59 Fur. 3 Yds. 193 while regrading was done to the extent of Ms. 7 Fur. 1 Yds. 37 ft. 2.

The number of squares reformed amounted to 57,370 nearly.

(Vide Appendix II. Table Nos. 35 to 37).

The cost of reform per mile worked out to Rs. 4,054 nearly and that of metalling including materials and laying exclusive of rolling and patching was Rs. 2,41,146.

In many Divisions, reform of roads was done with Laterite. Below is given a comparative statement of Blue granite and Laterite spent on "Reform" and "Repairs" during the year and the year previous.

Tarring of Roads.

The length of roads tarred came to 11 miles 3 furlongs 140 yards 1 foot as against 7 miles 2 furlongs 110 yards 2 feet last year, while retarring was done to a length of 6 miles 6 furlongs 80 yards 2 feet as against 7 miles 2 furlongs 93 yards 1 foot in the year previous.

The total length of tarred roads in the city at the close of the year was Ms. 121 Fur. 4 Yds. 83 ft. $\frac{1}{2}$ as against Ms. 110 Fur. 0 Yds. 162 ft. $2\frac{1}{2}$ at the end of last year.

During the year under review the following roads were reformed with Asphalte and Cement Concrete by Messrs. McKenzies Ltd. the Contractors for road making.

The road referred to in item 3 above was selected by the Council at its meeting held on 3-7-34 in lieu of Wall Tax Road.

A sum of Rs. 109,232/- was paid during the year to Messrs. McKenzies Ltd. in respect of their contract.

Culverts, Foot paths and Bridges.

Culverts in the 21st, 29th, 20th, 9th and 23rd Dns. were repaired and the repairs to the culvert in Manali Road were done.

The foot-path in General Hospital Road was repaired and that on the western side of Body Guard Road was provided with curbs. A foot-path was constructed in Ebramjee Sahib St. between Thambu Chetty Street and North Beach Road and the repairs to the retaining wall of the foot-path west of South Beach Road, were in progress. A foot-path was constructed in Bells Road at a cost of Rs. 1169.

Napier Bridge was repaired. A sum of Rs. 1,830 was appropriated for repairs to the Wall Tax Road Bridge. Many of the defects pointed out by P. W. D. in respect of the Canal bridges were rectified and the Government contribution of Rs. 4,219 for the maintenance of the bridges was received at the fag end of the year. Pycrofts Road bridge was widened at a cost of Rs. 4522.

The bridge over the Poonthottam aqueduct was widened and a contribution of Rs. 1335 was paid to the Government as sanctioned by the Council at its meeting held on 14-8-34, out of the Divisional allotment of the 30th Dn. for 1933-34.

In G. O. No. 1691 Rlys. dated 4-8-34 the Government stated that, though the widening of the General Hospital Bridge might be desirable, it was not urgent and directed that the further consideration of the proposal be deferred for the time being. On this, the Council on 11-9-34 passed the following resolution.

"That the Government be informed that in the opinion of the Council, the widening of the General Hospital Bridge, is an absolute and urgent necessity, that the work should be undertaken without further delay and that the Corporation agrees to bear half the cost of the work." The resolution was communicated to the Government. In Memorandum No. 3503 C-34 3 dated 21-1-35 the Chief Engineer has been requested to submit a report about the alternative proposals to widen the bridge to 80 ft. 88 ft. and 100 ft. for consideration by Government as a scheme for 36-37.

New Works (Revenue and Loan Funds)

(i) Revenue Funds.

20. Out of Rs. 11,400 applied for, in the Supplemental Budget for the construction of quarters for the Quarry Supt. and the Medical Officer, a sum of Rs. 5,700 only was sanctioned and this amount was appropriated for the construction of quarters for the Quarry Supt. Tenders were called for and the tender of Mr. P. D. Rajabathar Mudaliar being the lowest was accepted and the work is in progress.

Construction of a 22 Bed-Ward and other improvements to Raja Sir Ramaswamy Mudaliar's Lying-in-Hospital were done and the construction of additional stalls (71 in number) round the Fruit Market in China-Bazaar Road was completed this year.

Improvements to the Langs Garden Pail Depot were effected and the construction of a R.C. Waiting Shed and raising of the burning platform in Choolai Burning ground were finished. The Sunni and Borah Burial grounds in the same locality, for which land was acquired last year, were provided with compound wall and barbed wire fencing at a cost of Rs. 4,023. Improvements to the Krishnampet Burial Ground were in progress.

The proposal for acquiring an alternate site in lieu of R.S. No. 2420 of G. T. in Sourimuthu Street for a Reading Room was pending sanction

Bathing Fountains were constructed at Thiruvethi Annmen Koil Street and Mowbray's Road junction of Pilliar Koil Street. Acquisition of land in R. S. No. 3,908/2 of G. T. in Narayana Syrang Garden Street for the construction of an F.O.L. was completed this year.

Construction of a Pig Slaughter House in Basin Esplanade Road was taken up during the year under report. A sum of Rs. 27,000 was sanctioned by the Council towards improvements to the Corporation Workshop as suggested by the Mayor. Out of this provision, Electric motors were installed and a corrugated shed was constructed to accommodate the lorries.

ii. Loan Funds.

Acquisition of the superstructures on the land required for the construction of a Market in Wall Tax Road was in progress.

Other Remunerative Enterprises.

21. *Land Development-Buildings*:—Out of the sum of Rs. 1 lakh received as loan from the Government at the close of the last official year, the construction of Single Room Flats of Tenements in the Harbour Area and Bogipalayam was taken up. During the year 1934-1935, the Government in G. O. No. 5426 L & M Ms. dated 17-12-34, sanctioned a loan of Rs. 1 lakh for "Housing Scheme." The Council on 12-3-35 sanctioned the utilisation of this 1 lakh: (1) on the acquisition of land in the remaining portion of Bogipalayam at an estimated cost of Rs. 46,000 and (2) on the construction of 3 more blocks of 22 tenements each in the Harbour Division at a cost of Rs. 54,000. As this amount was received late in the year, it could not be spent during the year. Necessary preliminaries with regard to the acquisition etc., were in progress.

Improvements to Slums.

22. Construction of Model Lines for the poor in the Harbour Division on the land alienated to the Corporation referred to in the last year's report as being in progress, was completed.

This area in the Harbour Division was one of the most congested slum areas in the City. 112 families were living in about 70 huts. These were evicted and housed in temporary sheds put up for the purpose and the construction of the 1st set of 55 tenements was put on hand. Each block consists of two flats of eleven tenements each. The accommodation for each tenement consists of one Dwelling room of 10'-4½"x10'-4½" with verandahs of 5 feet wide both in front and in the rear, the rear verandah serving as kitchen. Bathrooms and latrines are provided at the end of each block, the water supply for these being from the overhead tank which gets filled up by an automatic electric motor. The latrines and passages are fitted up with electric lights which burn throughout the night during the year whereas the lights in rooms are put out at 9 p. m. automatically. The estimated cost of these tenements was Rs. 50,000. These tenements were opened by His Excellency the Governor of Madras on 11-1-1935.

The acquisition of land in R. S. No. 2252/3 of G. T. opposite to Roschen Cheri, was effected during the year and the land was handed over to the Corporation. The expenditure incurred in respect of the acquisition was Rs. 32,411. The owner of the land filed a suit in the City Civil Court and the payment of an excess award of Rs. 4122-13-0 was decreed over the Collector's award of Rs. 30,625-12-2.

Construction of plinths in Lloyds Road and improvements to the slum in Old Slaughter House Road were in progress.

Improvements to Obrapalyam were effected.

With regard to the improvements of Parthasarthy Kuppam, laying of water mains, construction of bathing ghats by the side of the existing 30 seated latrine and fixing glow lamp posts were completed. Construction of side drains will be taken up soon after the land is acquired. Valuation statement has been received in respect of the acquisition and the award is awaited.

The various stages at which the improvements to the various slums stood at the close of the year, are detailed in Appendix I Statement No. IIA. With a view to improve the slums and the housing accommodation in the City, the Council appointed a Housing Committee to go into the question. This Committee after issuing a questionnaire and inviting public opinion with regard to the Housing Scheme considered the question in all its aspects and placed its recommendations before the Council which approved of them.

The recommendations of the Housing Committee, as approved by the Council, were forwarded to the Government and the reply of the Government was awaited during the year under report.

Mambalam Town Planning Scheme.

23. About 386 grounds of land were sold during the year realising on the whole a sum of Rs. 1,24,607 as against Rs. 1,86,310 for 720 grounds last year.

The following are the major items of works done during the year.

1. Filling up of ponds and old dilapidated wells and levelling of playground.
2. Metalling of roads to a length of about 3.3 miles.
3. Laying of water mains in Streets.
4. Plantation of avenue trees.
5. Construction of culverts at the junctions of streets with main roads.

Construction of new residential buildings in the area continued to be in rapid progress.

Town Planning Schemes.

At the begining of the year, the total number of schemes on hand was 16, which included the General Town Planning Scheme for the Madras City as a whole.

During the year 2 more Schemes viz., "Perambore North area" and "Perambore Military area" were added under sections 9 & 10 of the Town Planning Act and only one (part) Scheme viz., "Nungambakam Western Section Area" Part I was completely prepared and submitted to the Government on 29-3-35. The only other scheme that has reached the publication stage is that of Cathedral Road (South) Area and this is being printed and got ready for publication.

The two other schemes which formed a group with the Cathedral Road Scheme are those of Mylapore Western Section, Lloyds Road Area and they are before the S. C. (W) having been referred to it by the Council.

In the case of Nungambakam Eastern Section Scheme, the schedules have just been revised and the scheme will be submitted to the Town Planning Committee.

In the case of the following 11 schemes, extension of time had to be applied for, as no adequate attention could be paid to these schemes also.

1. Tondiarpet North Section Scheme.
2. " Central
3. " South
4. Kilpauk Garden Road.
5. Jaganathapuram Area.
6. Nungambakam North Section.
7. " Central Section.
8. Thousand Lights.
9. Mylapore South Section.
10. " Western Section.
11. General Town Planning Scheme.

Expenditure—Normal.

24. Repairs and improvements done to the Corporation Buildings are detailed in Statement No. II A in Appendix I.

Expenditure Capital—Water Supply Works

Improvements to the City Distribution System.

25. The works provided for in the estimate for Rs. 2.30 lakhs sanctioned by the Council on 10-1-1933 were continued during the year under report and were almost completed. About 9.82 miles of street mains were laid as against 9.7 miles in the previous year. The total expenditure incurred on this estimate up to 31-3-35 amounted to Rs. 2,10,000, exclusive of establishment charges. The total expenditure incurred on the previous estimate for Rs. 2.50 lakhs sanctioned by the Council on 4-2-1930 was Rs. 2,52,500 inclusive of establishment charges as per completion report placed before the Council. The question of payment of half grant by the Government on the cost of works included in these two estimates is still under consideration by Government.

A further estimate for Rs. 2.50 lakhs covering the works still to be carried out, is now before the Standing Committees and the Council for sanction.

Mambalam—Water Supply

The works provided for in the estimate for Rs. 1.60 lakhs sanctioned by the Council on 28-1-30 were continued and about 1.83 miles of mains were laid during the year. This estimate for Rs. 1.60 lakhs was sanctioned by the Government in G. O. No. Ms. 277 L & M dated 25-1-35, and the liability to pay half grant in respect of this work was also accepted by them. A sum of Rs. 56,126 towards grant has been received as per G. O. No. Ms 1048 L & M d/12-3-35 on expenditure incurred up to 31-1-1935.

Purchase of pipes.

Messrs. Best & Co., Ltd., the Madras Agents to the Mysore Iron Works, Bhadravathi, were entrusted with the contract (Contract M & M No. 7) for the supply of 40500 feet of 4", 5220 ft of 6" and 1224 feet of 7" C. I. Pipes for Rs. 51,670. In respect of this contract the payment made to them during the year, was Rs. 35,467-8-0.

SPECIAL WORKS DEPARTMENT.

GENERAL

26. The progress of work during the year is shown by red dotted lines in the key plans facing this page. The full lines denote the work done previously.

The policy referred to in the last report of executing the drainage work by contract after inviting open tenders is continued except for Storm Water drainage and house connection works which are carried out by direct labour.

Contract Nos. 7 & 8. Of the tenders received for laying intercepting sewers in Napier Park and Tondiarpet areas which were referred to in the last report as being under consideration, those of The General Construction Co. Ltd., and Messrs. G. Seetharama Chetty & Co., were accepted by the Council on 3-7-34 and 24-4-34 respectively. The contractors have executed the necessary agreements and have started work.

Piece-Work Contract No. 10:—Sewer-laying in different areas. Tenders for this work were received on 30-11-34 and were considered by the Council on 19-2-35 when a discussion arose if this work is to be done by contract or by departmental labour. The consideration of the question was adjourned for a further note on the subject. The final decision of the Council on this question is awaited.

The plans and estimates amounting to Rs. 17,26,000 prepared at the instance of the Standing Committee for the drainage of Chetput and Kilpauk and the resolution of the Council approving the estimates were submitted to Government on 13-10-33 and 10-4-34 respectively. After scrutiny by the P. W. D. the scheme has been sanctioned by Government in G. O. No. Ms. 596 L. & M dated 15-2-35, subject to the condition that contract for the execution of the work should be entered into after inviting open tenders based on detailed plans and specification. Accordingly plans etc., have been prepared and tenders invited. These were received on 26-4-35 and are under consideration.

The supplementary estimates for Rs. 1.48 lakhs for the Ice House Road area submitted to Government as required by them in G. O. No. 5,000 L & M., Ms., dated 2-12-33, have since been sanctioned in G. O. No. Ms. 5068 L & M dated 23-11-34. The revised estimates for the other areas have been examined in the light of the instructions conveyed in the above mentioned order (i.e., G. O. No. 5000 L & M dated 2-12-33) and the items representing the additional works in Greames Road and Royapuram have been omitted. The increase in the estimated amount revised in the above manner being less than the 5 percent limit, the estimates were forwarded to Government on 4-10-34 for their information and record. A Supplementary estimate for Rs. 47,600 for Greames Road (sewering Krishnamachary Road) was submitted to Government on 15-10-34 and their sanction obtained in G. O. No. Ms. 986 L & M dated 9-3-35. For Royapuram area, the supplementary estimate is under preparation and will soon be ready for submission to Government.

The appointment of Inspecting Officer mentioned in the last report was made by Government in the person of Mr. A. Vipan in G. O. No. 2560 29 (S) L & M dated 23-5-34, for a period of one month and he took charge of the duties on 19-6-34. The work not having been finished, the period of deputation was extended for 14 days in G. O. No. Ms. 3367 L & M. Ms., dated 19-7-34. He completed the inspection and check-measurement of the work by the beginning of August.

The procedure laid down in para 7 of G. O. No. 2810 L. & M., dated 4-8-31 namely, that inspection and check-measurement of drainage works every year will be done by an Inspecting Officer to be appointed by Government has since been changed in G. O. No. Ms. 2774, L. & M. dated 12-6-34, according to which the work executed by the Corporation during 1934-35 and future years will be inspected and check-measured once in three months by the Executive Engineer, North Presidency Division

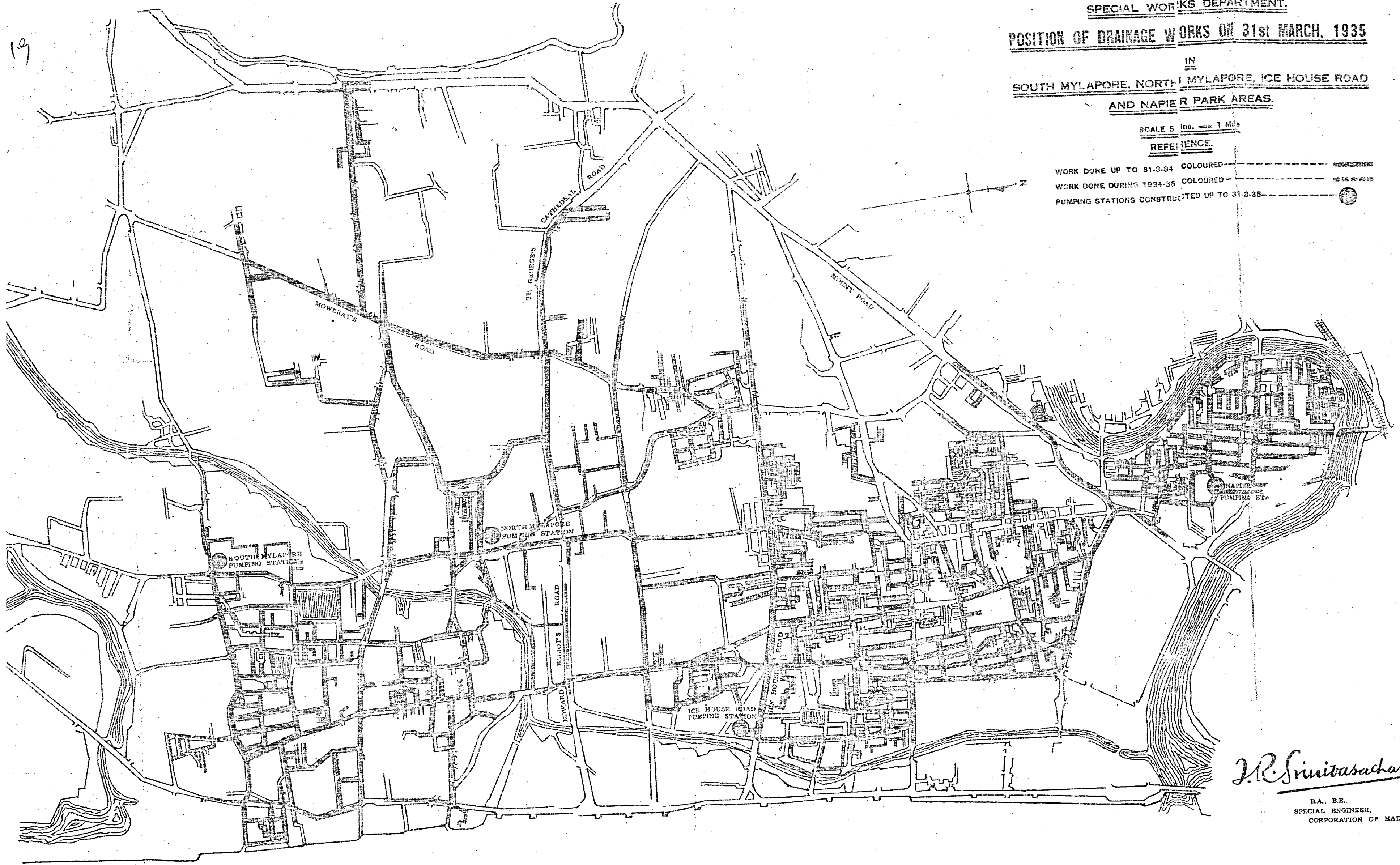

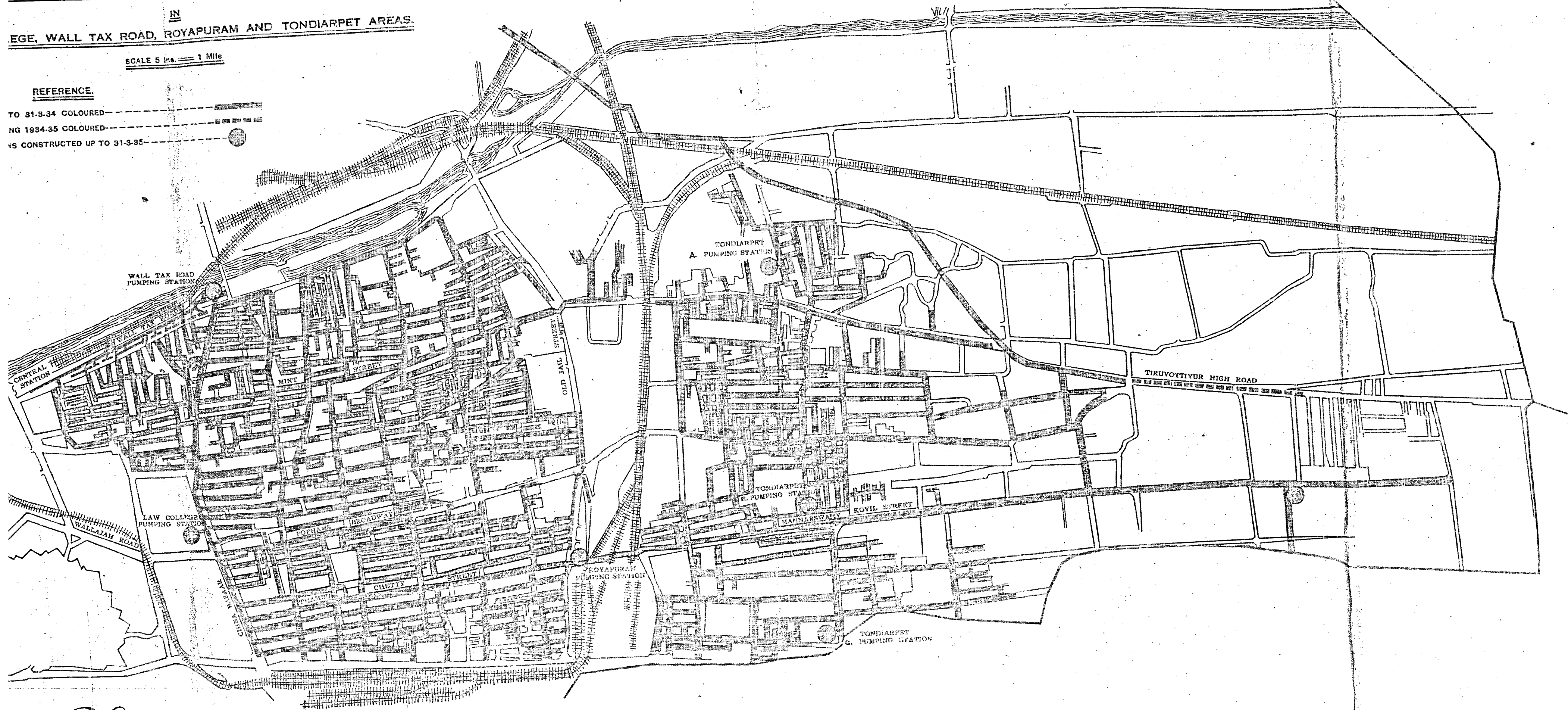

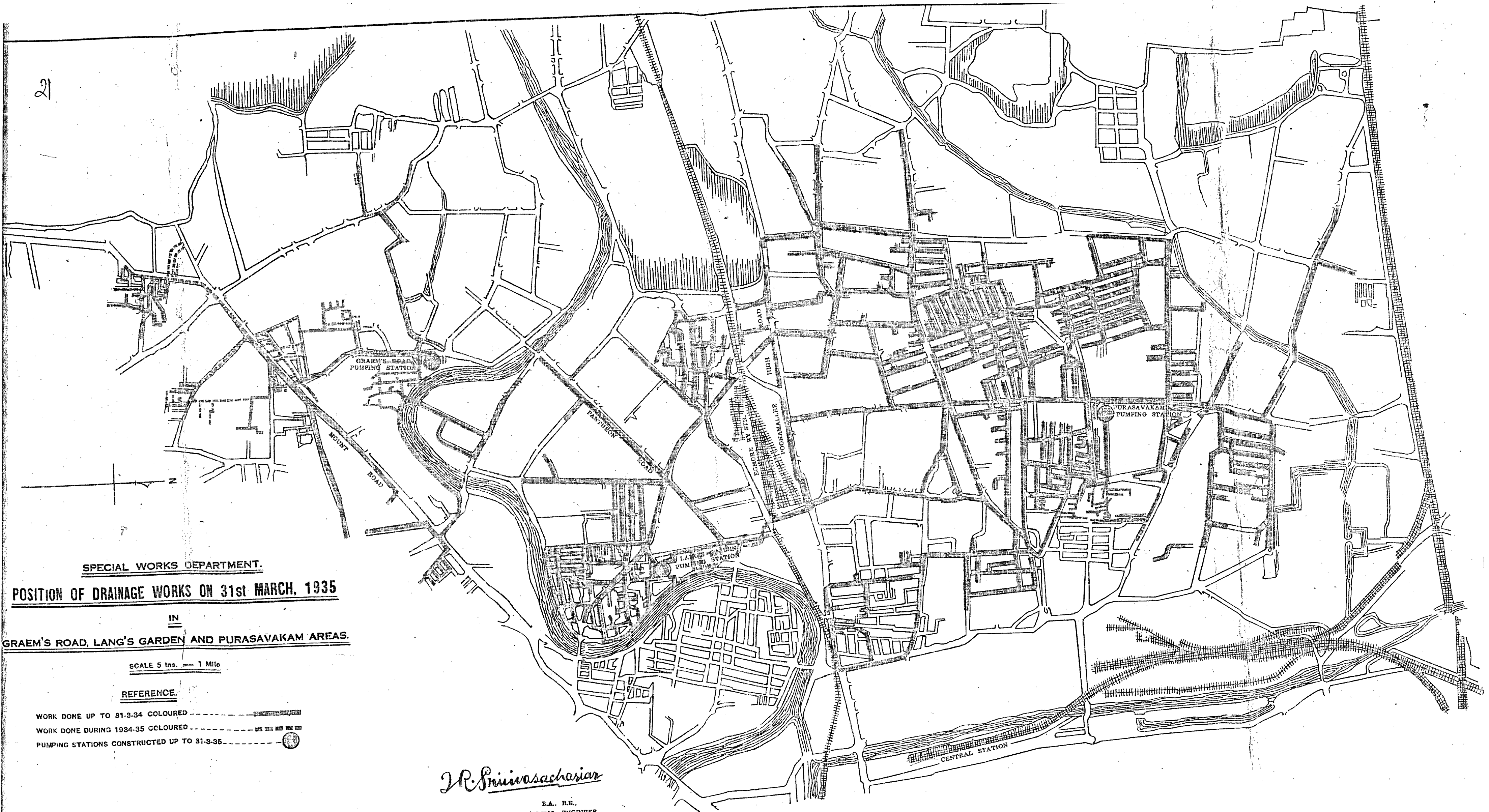

without any remuneration on this account. This is being done every quarter since then.

The final report of Dr. Fowler on the Madras Sewage and Refuse Disposal was received on 19-1-35 and the sanction of the Standing Committee for printing the same was obtained on 22-3-35. The report is in print and will be submitted to the Corporation as soon as ready.

The method of maintenance of Drainage accounts in the Special Works Department was the subject of prolonged correspondence between the Corporation and the Examiner of Local Fund Accounts until it was finally decided by Government in G.O. No. 3287, L. & M., dated 14-8-33 that the accounts should be maintained according to the detailed sub-heads in the estimate as suggested by the Examiner in the place of the old system of accounting of the expenditure under each size of the sewer. In Memorandum No. 38036-2, L. & M. dated 20-10-33, the Government permitted the introduction of the new system of accounts with effect from 1-4-34. In accordance with this direction, excepting for a few works which remained partially incomplete on 31-3-34 and for the completion of which departmental labour has been employed to close the old system of accounts opened prior to 1-4-34, the new system of accounts has been adopted for the rest of the works. This has been made possible as the works are being carried out by contract.

The short expenditure on the works is due to the following reasons:—

- (1) The delay on the part of one of the contractors in commencing the works.
- (2) The difficult subsoil conditions unexpectedly encountered in a few places which retarded the progress of the works considerably.
- (3) The delay in obtaining sanction from Government for some of the estimates.
- (4) The absence of a settled policy regarding the agency for the execution of the works.

It is hoped that in the year 1935-36 a better progress will be shown as most of the difficulties mentioned above are believed to have been overcome.

DETAILED DESCRIPTION OF WORKS

WORKS UNDER EXECUTION

SOUTH MYLAPORE AREA.

Pumping Station:—A silt raising apparatus with appurtenances has been installed in each of the two screening wells. One masonry silt pit and a bin have also been constructed.

Sewer-laying:—As last reported. Five house connections have been given.

Table No. 4 Appendix II gives the quantity of work done and the expenditure incurred.

NORTH MYLAPORE AREA.

Pumping Station:—A silt-bin that remained to be constructed has been completed.

Sewer-laying:—Departmental—As last reported. 4 house connections have been given.

Piece work Contract No. 5:—One length of 6 inch sewer in Lloyds Road has been laid.

Table No. 5 Appendix II gives the quantity of work done and the expenditure incurred.

GREAMES ROAD AREA.

Pumping Station:—A silt raising apparatus with appurtenances has been installed in each of the two screening wells. One masonry silt pit and a silt bin have also been constructed.

Sewer laying:—Departmental—As last reported.

During the period 9 house connections have been given wherever the drains have been repaired and brought to street limit.

Contract No. 2:—Laying of Nungambakkam Intercepting sewer. The 15 inch cast iron sewer in Mount Road at its junction with Lloyds Road has been extended at an average depth of 22 feet to Gopathy Narayanaswamy Chetty Street, the total length being 1247 feet. The soil being slushy to a depth of 10½ feet below invert level, the pipes were supported on piles driven to reach firm ground and work was done by the contractor very carefully without damage to the 18 inch water main running close by.

Table No. 7 Appendix II gives the quantity of work done and the expenditure incurred.

LANGS GARDEN AREA.

Pumping Station:—A silt raising apparatus with appurtenances has been installed in each of the two screening wells. One silt pit and a silt bin have also been constructed.

Sewer-laying:—As last reported. 63 house connections have been given in certain parts of Goyatope.

Table No. 8 Appendix II gives the quantity of work done and the expenditure incurred.

PURASAWALKAM AREA.

Sewer laying work has been practically completed in almost all the streets. During the year 3 house connections in Decaster Road have been given.

Table No. 9 Appendix II gives the quantity of work done and the expenditure incurred.

WALL TAX ROAD AREA.

Pumping Station:—The Pumping Station was handed over to Works Department from 6-8-34. During the year under report, construction of flush-out latrines for the engine staff has been completed. Plans and estimates for gate pillars and gates are under preparation.

Table No. 10 appendix II gives the quantity of work done and the expenditure incurred.

WORKS UNDER CONTEMPLATION.

SOUTH MYLAPORE AREA.

Sewer-laying:—Departmental—41 house connections have been given during the year.

Piece-Work Contract No. 3:—Sewer laying in South Mylapore area. Work was started in Brodies Road and two lengths of 12 inch cast iron sewer at an average depth of 21 feet were completed. The high subsoil water in the trench rendered the work very difficult and slow. To expedite the work, the laying of 9 inch cast iron pipe in the same road was also taken up simultaneously and two lengths have been completed. The soil being bad to a depth ranging from 8 to 10 feet below invert level, the pipes were supported on piles driven to reach firm ground.

Sewer-laying in Periapalli Street, Arulappa Naicken Street, Kanogaroya Malayappa Naick Street was also taken up and completed, the sizes of the sewers being 12 inches and 9 inches. The shallow sewers in Jonagan Street, Lazarus Church Street, Malayappa Naicken Street draining to the main sewer in Kanogaroya Malayappa Naick Street have also been laid. The sewer in San Thome High Road junction with Mada Church Street was also extended to a length of 350 feet towards south to drain the undrained premises.

NORTH MYLAPORE AREA.

Sewer-laying:—Departmental:—At the junction of Barbers Bridge Road and Edward Elliotts Road two lengths of 9 inch sewer and two lengths of 6 inch sewer in the former road and one length of 9 inch sewer and one length of 6 inch sewer in the latter road that remained to be laid have been completed including house connections.

Table No. 12 Appendix II gives the quantity of work done and the expenditure incurred.

ICE HOUSE ROAD AREA.

Sewer-laying:—Departmental:—As last reported.

Piece-Work Contract No. 4:—Sewer laying in Ice House Road area. 12 inch stoneware pipe sewer has been laid in Venkatachala Mudaly Street to Masthura Begam Street at an average depth of 11 feet and 9 inch sewer from the latter Street to Pillayar Coil Street. The shallow sewers draining to this main sewer will be taken up next.

NAPIER PARK AREA.

*Sewer laying:—*Departmental—As last reported.

*Contract No. 7:—*Laying Thiruvatteswaranpet Sewers. Work was started at the end of the year and three advance manholes have been constructed in Richie Street. Further construction of manholes is proceeding.

GREAMES ROAD AREA.

*Sewer laying:—*Departmental—As last reported.

House connections are closely following the sewer laying works. During the year 481 connections have been given. The two main drains that carry the sewage of Nungambakkam village have been trapped and connected to the new sewer in Krishnamachary Road.

*Contract No. 2:—*Laying of Nungambakkam intercepting sewers. The laying of 12 inch cast iron pipe sewer in Mount Road from Gopathy Narayanaswami Chetti Street to Beerkaran Street has been completed and connected to the sewer laid by the department and also the three lengths of 12 inch cast iron pipe sewers that remained to be laid under this contract in Nungambakkam High Road have been completed.

*Piece-Work Contract No. 5:—*Sewer laying in Greames Road area. The 9 inch stoneware pipe sewer in Conran Smith Road at its junction with Ponnusawmy Naicken Street has been extended along the former road and continued to Gopalapuram 1st and 2nd Streets wherefrom the branch Streets in North and South Gopalapuram have been sewered.

The laying of sewers in the streets of Thousand Lights draining to Peters Road and Greames Road was taken up and completed.

The sewer laying in Rasool Omara Bahadur Street Nos. 1, 2 & 3 draining to Whites Road has also been completed.

Mosque Streets Nos. 1, 2 & 3 have also been sewered and connected to the main sewer in Mount Road.

*Piece-Work Contract No. 4:—*Sewer laying in Ice House Road area. Two lengths of 6 inch sewers in Ammen Coil Street draining to Ponnusawmy Naicken Street have been laid.

Table No. 14 Appendix II gives the quantity of work done and the expenditure incurred.

LANGS GARDEN AREA.

*Sewer laying:—*Departmental—One length of 6 inch sewer that remained to be laid in Venkatachala Naick Street has been completed.

Table No. 15 Appendix II gives the quantity of work done and the expenditure incurred.

PURASAWALKAM AREA.

*Sewer laying:—*Departmental—Nine house connections have been given in Angalamman Koil Hutting Ground Street and lane and Sundaram Pillai lanes.

*Piece-Work Contract No. 6:—*Sewer laying in Purasawalkam area—Work was started in Demellows Road from the existing manhole at the junction of Old Slaughter House Road and Demellows Road. Four lengths of 12 inch cast iron pipe sewers were laid to depths varying from 13 to 14 feet. As the soil was slushy the pipes were supported by piles driven to reach firm ground.

Advance manholes have been constructed in Thottikalai Kumarappa Mudaly Street.

Table No. 16 Appendix II gives the quantity of work done and the expenditure incurred.

ROYAPURAM AREA.

*Sewer laying:—*Departmental—As last reported.

*Contract R. M. No. 1:—*Royapuram Intercepting sewers. Sewer laying works in Kanniah Nailu Street offered considerable difficulty owing to the existence of an old masonry sewer which required to be demolished to a length of nearly 800 feet. The sewage in the existing sewer was lifted and pumped along a temporary sewer laid by the contractors at their cost. As the Street is very narrow about a dozen houses were damaged as the sewer trench was very close. To minimise public inconvenience work was continued day and night. Teakwood bearing piles were driven to depths nearly 20 feet below the invert level to reach firm ground for supporting the 30 inch pipes. The work in the whole Street was completed in about four months. After the completion of the sewers the pipe lines were inspected and the sewer connections were given to the existing manholes one at Peddu Naick Street and another at North Wall Road. The two connections were given simultaneously in three nights and days after temporarily diverting the sewage in the side drain.

Pophams Broadway near Vasapmode. One length of 21 inch cast iron pipe sewer was laid during the year. The sewer was taken on the western side of the tram tracks to avoid the existing sewer and Kelly's drain. Precautions were taken to minimize obstruction to tram traffic. The pipes were supported by teakwood bearing piles driven to reach firm ground as the soil was treacherous.

Old Jail Street. 33 inch diameter cast iron pipes were laid to a length of 1301 feet. The alignment of the sewer was taken along the northern side close to the compound wall of the Medical School. A water main 30 inches diameter was met at about 10 feet below ground level at the junction of Broadway and Old Jail Street. The water pipe was supported on bearing piles driven to the bottom and on the top was further suspended by chains fixed to girders. As the alignment was very close to tramway lines, tram traffic was suspended for about four months by arrangement with the Tramway Company. The compound wall of the Stanley Medical School and the quarters of the Resident Medical Officer collapsed during the execution of the work as the sewer trench was very close. The contractors have agreed to make good the damages.

Ibrahimjee Sahib Street. Two lengths of 42 inch cast iron pipes were laid during the year. As this involved crossing the existing sewer at about the same invert level and at an oblique angle, a special manhole of large dimensions has been constructed.

Table No. 18 Appendix II gives the quantity of work done and the expenditure incurred.

TONDIARPET A.B.C. AREAS.

*Sewer—Laying. Departmental:—*As last reported. During the year 8 house connections have been done.

Table No. 19, appendix II, gives the quantity of work done and the expenditure incurred.

TONDIARPET 'E' AREA.

*Contract No. 8:—*Tondiarpet Intercepting sewers. Work was started from the junction manhole near the proposed Pumping Station. Two lengths of 12 inch cast iron pipes were laid. Further work on the south has proceeded to about 1190 feet of 12 inch stoneware pipe sewers at depths varying from 11 to 14 feet. The nature of the soil is sandy, but due

to subsoil water level, the stoneware pipes were supported on a bed of concrete. Work to the north of the junction manhole on the 15 inch sewer was also started, and during the year under report, 989 feet of 15 inch diameter sewer have been laid varying in depth from 15 to 16 feet.

WORKS UNDER DEPOSIT ACCOUNT.

NORTH MYLAPORE AREA.

Brindavanam Conservancy lane has been sewerred at the cost of the residents as requested by them and also the new street between Royapettah High Road and Venkatachala Mudaly Street. The estimated cost of the former is Rs. 2080. and that of the latter Rs. 1790.

The former was started departmentally on 21-4-34 and completed on 28-5-34. The latter work was let out on contract to Messrs. Gannon Dunkerley & Co. Ltd., who started the work on 24-1-35 and completed it on 11-2-35.

Table No. 21 Appendix II gives the quantity of work done and the expenditure incurred.

SUPPLEMENTARY WORKS.

NORTH MYLAPORE AREA.

Necessity for sewerage Luz Avenue Road and Nattu Subroya Mudaly lane was not felt at the time of preparing the estimates sanctioned by Government. As a number of bungalows has since sprung up in the former road and as flush-out latrine connections are to be given in the latter, plans and estimates for sewerage the streets have been submitted to Government for sanction on 21-9-34 and 14-11-34 respectively. Government's sanction is awaited.

ICE HOUSE ROAD AREA

Sewer laying in Royapettah sanctioned by Government in G. O. No. Ms. 5068 L. & M. dated 23-11-1934.

Sewer-laying:—Departmental—House connection works are closely following sewer laying. During the year 314 house connections have been given.

Piece-Work Contract No. 4:—Sewer laying in Ice House Road area. The laying of the main sewers in Royapettah Bazaar Road and Royapettah High Road has been completed. All the shallow sewers falling to these main sewers have also been completed excepting that of Mylapuran Street.

Sewers in Ammen coil Street and Ammiappa Mudaly Street draining to Peters Road have also been laid. In most of the streets the existing sewers which were in a bad condition have been relaid.

Table No. 13 Appendix II gives the quantity of work done and the expenditure incurred.

ICE HOUSE ROAD AREA.

Bandla Venugopala Naidu Street or Hanumanthroyan Coil Street.

Sanctioned by Government in G. O. No. Ms. 3643 L. & M. dated 7-9-33.

Sewer-laying:—Departmental:—As last reported.

During the year 17 house connections have been given to the premises as and when the drains were constructed and brought to the street limit.

Table No. 22 Appendix II gives the quantity of work done and the expenditure incurred.

Necessity for sewerage Nayar Varada Pillay Street, Madhi Hussain lane and Conservancy lane behind Tholasinga Perumal Coil street was not felt at the time of preparing the estimates sanctioned by Government. As a number of houses has since sprung up in the first two streets and as flush-out latrine connections are to be given in the third street, plans and estimates for sewerage the streets were submitted to Government for sanction on 4-9-34, 10-9-34 and 2-2-35 respectively. The final orders of the Government are awaited.

NAPIER PARK AREA.

Extension of sewer in General Patters Road

Sanctioned by Government in G. O. No. Ms. 162 L&M. dated 9-1-34.

Sewer-laying:—As last reported.

Table No. 23 Appendix II gives the quantity of work done and the expenditure incurred.

GREAMES ROAD AREA.

Sewering Krishnamachary Road

Sanctioned by Government in G. O. No. Ms. 986 L&M dated 9-3-35.

Sewer-laying:—Contract No. 2. Nungambakkam intercepting sewers. Laying of 12 inch cast iron pipe sewer in Krishnamachary Road was completed during the last year under this contract. This work has now been separated from the Urgent Works under contemplation as per the above G. O.

Table No. 14 Appendix II gives the quantity of work done and the expenditure incurred.

WALL TAX ROAD AREA.

Necessity for sewerage Amir Singh Lala Lane and Thanappa Chetty Lane was not felt at the time of submission of estimates to Government as they have all along been served by side drains. With the introduction of compulsory flush-out latrines, necessity for sewerage these lanes has been felt and estimates were sent to Government for sanction on 6-12-34. The Sanction of the Government is awaited.

ROYAPURAM AREA.

Necessity for sewerage the bye lanes in Seven Wells Division was not felt at the time of submission of estimates to Government as they have all along been served by side drains. With the introduction of compulsory flush-out latrines, necessity for sewerage these lanes has been felt and estimates were sent to Government for sanction on 26-9-34. Final orders of the Government on the estimates are awaited.

Piece-Work No. 9:—Sewering Rajavelu Mudaly Street. Government Sanction for the estimate of Rs. 2000 for this work was received in G. O.

No. Ms. 2097 L&M dated 1-5-34 and quotations were then invited for a portion of the work. The lowest one that of Mr. T. A. C. Subramanya Chetty for Rs. 937-10-0 was accepted and treated as Piece-Work No. 9. Work was started on 29-8-34 and completed on 15-9-34.

Storm Water Drainage Works.

27. On account of frequent complaints about flooding in several parts of the city, plans and estimates for the following storm water drainage works considered urgent were prepared and submitted to Government in September 1933.

Funds for the works were received only in March 1934 and work in the following areas was put in hand during the year under report:—

SOUTH MYLAPORE AREA

Drain in Kabaleeswarar South Mada Street

A masonry drain 2½ feet wide and 3 feet in depth has been constructed to a length of 60 feet across Kapaleeswarar East Ward Street and beyond this, enlarging to 4' x 3' it is continued along South Mada Street and connected to the culvert at Brodies Road. Inspection chambers at about 100 feet apart and inlets at each cross street have been provided. Total length of the drain constructed is 1249 feet. This will relieve flooding at the junction of Kabaleeswarar East Mada and South Mada Streets.

NORTH MYLAPORE AREA

Brindavanam Street

An open channel 14 feet wide with side slopes 1:1 has been constructed to a length of 590 feet from Royapettah High Road towards East along Brindavanam Street. Further work is in progress. The street side

of the channel is being fenced with barbed wire to prevent the public from committing nuisance in the open drain.

LLOYDS ROAD DRAIN

A tributary drain 5'x4'—3" in depth to drain Gopalapuram and Dewans Garden was started at the lowest end and completed from Sullivans Road to the outfall channel. At about 50 feet apart inspection chambers have been provided and covered with R. C. slabs. Further work will be taken up shortly.

LANGS GARDEN AREA

To relieve flooding around Veerasawmy Pillay Street and Police Commissioner's Office Road, construction of a storm water drain in Police Commissioner's Office Road was started and completed to a length of 969 feet.

PURASAWALKAM AREA

Poonamalle High Road at the junction of Whannels Road and Rundalls Road has been subject to serious flooding during rains. In order to relieve the flooding in this area it has been proposed to construct a storm water drain in Poonamalle High Road from Ritherdon Road junction up to the earthen channel in the church compound. This work was started from the existing culvert at the north eastern gate of St. Andrews Church. The storm water will drain to the existing earthen channel inside the church compound which finally flows into the river Cooum. The total length of drain constructed is 2140 feet out of which only 540 feet remains to be covered with R. C. slabs.

GEORGE TOWN AREA.

Repairs to northern half of Kelly's drain have been completed to a length of 6506 feet. Removing silt, cleaning, grouting and plastering the sides and intrados of the arch are the items of work attended to.

Constructing an additional drain in Pophams Broadway has been completed to a length of 1293 feet.

Twin drain:—Constructing a twin drain has been completed to a length of 521 feet.

11 feet drain along Ibrahimjee Sahib Street:—About 600 feet of the drain has been completed.

TONDIARPET AREA.

To relieve flooding around the Royapuram Church, work was taken up in South Mada Church Street and the construction of drain has been completed to a length of 261 feet.

The construction of a drain in Ghouse Mohideen Pettah Road which was subject to flooding during the rains was taken up and the total length finished is 588 feet. This drain which will in a large measure relieve the flooding of the cherry was extended along Kalmantapam Road as per proposals and completed up to out fall.

Work on the Kalmantapam Road drain was taken up during the year. The alignment of the drain was taken along the northern side of the road. Work was completed up to the sea. The culvert under the Port Trust Railway lines was at a higher level and the Port Trust were requested to lower the same to suit the level of the new drain.

Table No. 25 Appendix II gives the quantity of work done and the expenditure incurred.

FLUSH-OUT-LATRINES.

28. Progress in the construction of flush-out-latrine in private houses continues to be fair. With the entertainment of the additional staff sanctioned by the Council on 24-4-34, the compulsory introduction of the scheme has been extended and is in progress in the following divisions.

Of the divisions mentioned above, 23rd has been practically completed and the 20th, 25th and 26th divisions are nearing completion.

Besides the above compulsory areas, work is in progress in the other divisions of the city also.

The total number of latrines constructed up to 31-3-35 is 5,559 under the Advances Recoverable Account and 3,261 under Deposit Account.

Tables Nos. 26 & 28 Appendix II give details about the work.

During the year 1545 proposals submitted by Plumbers for sanitary installations were examined, the total number of flush-out latrines constructed by Sanitary Engineering firms and private plumbers during the year being 1,177.

Registration of Flush-out Latrine Agreements.

Registration of the agreements executed by parties for payment of the cost in instalments continues to be enforced, the number of agreements registered up to the end of the year being 404.

Collections.

In about 2,200 cases under Advances Recoverable Account the cost of construction with interest has been completely collected. During the year the Standing Committee authorised the writing off of interest dues in about 475 cases where work was carried out in 1930 and 1931, the total amount of interest thus written off being about Rs. 1,979.

Suits.

Sanction to file suits was obtained in about 485 cases during the year, the total number of cases sanctioned up to 31-3-35 being 885. Of these in 185 cases suits were filed, 54 suits were settled out of court and 127 were decreed. 4 suits, under trial, at the close of the year have since been decreed.

The powers of the Corporation to insist on the construction of flush-out latrines in private houses under Section 186 of the Act were contested by a regular suit by the Trustee of Sree Apparswami Temple, Mylapore.

The Corporation defended the suit in the City Civil Court and the appeal in the High Court. The decisions of both the courts are in favour of the Corporation.

Measures adopted.

Only persuasive measures have been employed in getting the parties to comply with the scheme. No prosecution was launched by the Special Works Department during the year. Owing to this reason and to the registration of the agreements which is insisted on, there has not been good progress. With the co-operation of the house owners, it is hoped to complete the scheme within three years and the retention of the additional staff for these three years has been sanctioned by the Council on 3-5-35.

CONTRACTS.

29. The following is a short account of some of the important contracts under execution during the year. For a fuller account reference may be made to Table No. 27. Appendix II.

Contract M & M No. 75:—Wall Tax Road Pumping Station. With the supply of the book of finished drawings by Messrs. Crossley Bros. Ltd., the contract has been closed and the Station handed over to the Works Department for maintenance from 6th August 1934.

Contract M & M No. 84:—Supply of glazedware pipes and specials by Messrs. Lakshmi Ratans Ltd., has been completed and the contract closed.

Contract M & M No. 86:—4 inch diameter stoneware pipes. Messrs. Lakshmi Ratans Ltd., the contractors have completed the supply and the contract closed.

Contract M & M No. 87:—Glazedware pipes and specials. This has been let to The Bombay Co. Ltd., and the articles are being delivered by them.

Contract M & M No. 88:—Light cast iron soil pipes and Specials. The contract has been awarded to Messrs. Raval & Co., and the supply is in progress.

Contracts L & M No. 5 & 5-A:—The supply of 800 Nos. of salt glazed and 200 Nos. of white glazed Water closet pans by The Bombay Co. Ltd., and Messrs. Lakshmi Ratans Ltd., respectively has been completed and the contracts closed.

Contract R. M. No. 1:—Laying intercepting sewers in Royapuram area by Messrs. Gannon, Dunkerley & Co. Ltd., is in progress.

Contract No. 2:—Laying Nungambakkam Intercepting sewer by Mr. K. V. Kuppusamy Chetty has been completed except for minor items.

Piece-Work Contract Nos. 3, 4, 5 & 6:—Sewer laying works in South Mylapore, Ice House Road, Greames Road and Purasawalkam areas are in progress, the respective contractors being The General Construction Co. Ltd., Gannon, Dunkerley & Co. Ltd., K. V. Kuppusamy Chetty and The General Construction Co. Ltd.

Contract No. 7:—Laying Thiruvateeswaranpet Intercepting sewer. The General Construction Co. Ltd., are the contractors and the work is in progress.

Contract No. 8:—Laying Tondiarpet Intercepting sewers. This has been given to Messrs. G. Seetharama Chetty & Co., and the work is in progress.

Piece-Work Contract No. 10:—Sewer laying in different areas. Tenders received on 30-11-34 are under consideration.

Cleaning and Scraping mains.

The length of old incrustated mains scraped and cleaned by Glenfield and Kennedy pressure scrapers during the year was 1.98 miles.

The pipes scraped were of sizes. 4" to 12".

Improvements to the Red Hills Tank.

30. In their Memorandum No. 250141-1-A2 L&M d/7-7-34 the Government forwarded a copy of the letter dated 2-6-34 from the Chief Engineer for Irrigation regarding sanction for a revised estimate for Rs. 1050 for converting the first and second aprons in rear of the Ten vents surplus sluice of the Red Hills Tank with water cushions in lieu of the estimate for Rs. 840. According to this revised estimate for Rs. 1050, the contribution to be paid by the Corporation was fixed at Rs. 494. As a contribution of Rs. 395 against the original estimate for Rs. 840 was already included in the amount of Rs. 6395 already paid in June 1934, to the Executive Engineer, Chingleput Division, there remained a sum of Rs. 99 to be placed at the disposal of the said Executive Engineer. This additional contribution was sanctioned by the Council at its meeting held on 12-3-1935.

Proposals to set Madras Water Works on a sound basis.

At its meeting held on 30-10-34, the Council accepted certain proposals of the Commissioner to set the Madras Water Works on a sound basis. The total amount involved came to Rs. 56 lakhs. The proposals are as follows:- (1) Duplication of conduit roughly estimated at Rs. 6.80 lakhs. (2) Acquisition of irrigation rights for 2nd crop-378 acres of compounded-double crop land to be converted into single crop, estimated at Rs. 2 lakhs. (3) Converting the filters at Kilpauk into rapid or semi-rapid type with Mechanical washing arrangements estimated at Rs. 10 lakhs. (4) Duplicating the pumping main from Kilpauk Pumping Station to the Distribution head at the Shaft estimated at Rs. 2 lakhs. (5) Installation of a complete system of Waste Water Detection including provision for the extension of the metering of the house services, estimated at Rs. 5 lakhs. (6) Installation of 3rd Electric Pumping Unit with Boosters to improve Water Supply in distant places, at a rough estimated cost of Rs. 2 Lakhs. (7) Acquisition of irrigation rights for the first crop under Red Hills Tank.

(a) Ayacut under sluices nos. 1&4 viz. 714 acres at a cost of Rs. 3.47 Lakhs. (b) Sluice Nos. 2&3 at a cost of Rs. 24.5 Lakhs.

Total cost Rs. 55.77 lakhs or roughly Rs. 56 Lakhs.

Items 3 & 5 of the proposals referred to above, are already receiving the attention of the Corporation. Detailed estimates for items 1, 4 and 7 are under preparation. Govt. were informed of the above proposals in this office letter G. D. C. 1556/34 dated 23-11-34 and requested to put forward a workable estimate and scheme for the acquisition of the lands referred to in items 2&7 above by instalments spreading over 10 years and also for providing the necessary funds for the same half as loan and half as grant. The matter is under consideration by the Government Vide their Memorandum No. 12874-1-A2 L&M dated 28-3-1935.

Fourth Pumping Unit, Kilpauk Pumping Station.

The construction of the engine house extension is being proceeded with by the contractors, the General Construction Co. Ltd., Madras. Messrs. Mather and Platts Ltd. Bombay, to whom the contract for the supply of electrical units was entrusted have supplied the necessary materials. The installation will commence as soon as the building work is completed. The Electrical units are likely to be brought into commission by the end of 1935. The question of payment of half grant by the Govt. on the cost of these works is still under the consideration of Govt.

Waste Water Detection Meter System.

Tenders for the supply of Waste Water Detection Meters, Venturi meters and other specials provided for in the sub estimate for Rs. 1 lakh sanctioned by the Council on 6-3-1934, were called for, for submission on 25-4-1935.

Percolating Filters.

The proposals contained in the Govt. Memorandum No. 50928-1-A 2 L & M dated 12-10-33 in respect of the partial scheme for the installation of two more filters (one Percolating Filter and one Patterson's Primary Filter) were considered by the Council which at its meeting held on 17-7-1934, decided to call for tenders for the full comprehensive scheme as recommended by the Commissioner.

Tenders have accordingly been called for and are due on 4-9-35

Waste Inspection.

Water Works Overseers, in addition to their other duties, inspected 63,458 houses and rectified 2257 leaks and defects.

Bursts on Water mains.

A Statement showing the number of bursts that occurred during the year is given in Appendix II, Table No 43.

Consumption of Water.

7727.62 millions of gallons of water were supplied during the year which is equivalent to nearly 32.70 gallons per head per day for a population of 6,47,230.

The maximum daily average consumption per head in any month was 34.55 gallons in December 1934 and the minimum was 31.80 gallons in November 1934.

Appendix II Table No. 45 shows the regulation of pressures on the principal mains.

Kilpauk Pumping Station.

The quantity of water pumped during the year was 7727.62 millions of gallons as against 7439.77 millions of gallons last year. The expenditure incurred on the maintenance of the station including establishment was Rs. 1,84,755-5-2 as against Rs. 1,83,856-15-10 in the year previous.

Private Water Service.

During the year, 1516 new House service connections were laid by licensed plumbers. Of the existing House Service connections, 2498 were repaired, cleaned, attended to, renewed or extended through licensed plumbers and 437 old washers and 449 leaky taps were substituted by new ones.

Out of the connections laid anew, 67 were first class (to be metered) and the rest second class. (unmetered) The total Number of house service connections on 31-3-35 was 44,485 and the total number of meters on house service connections was 2546. 41 meters were newly fixed and 49 meters were removed. The quantity of water used on metered service in excess of free allowance was 54,96,58,700 gals. of which, the supply for industrial purpose amounted to 272486,000 gals. and the consumption in excess of free al-

lowance in metered domestic houses came to 85,432,000 gals. The excess water supplied to domestic premises alone fetched an income of Rs. 1,07,245.

1029 meters controlled the supply of water to domestic premises which consisted chiefly of garden bungalows, quarters attached to Hospitals, Mills, Railways, Police Lines etc.

The total amount realised under "Excess Water Supply charges" came to Rs. 6,40,363-15-1 as against Rs. 6,73,958-10-6 last year and that realised as meter rents was Rs. 7,714-14-0 as against Rs. 8,469-11-8 in the year previous.

This year as no provision was made under "Revenue Account" for the purchase of meters, it was not possible to fix meters to new premises with I class connections and also to replace the existing worn-out meters working for more than 5 years by new ones.

56 Public Fountains, 1 Cattle trough and 8 Bathing Fountains were erected, 3 Public fountains and 2 Cattle troughs were removed during the year leaving 2,557 Public Fountains, 81 Cattle troughs, and 144 Bathing Fountains at the end of the year.

9 Valves, 68 stop-cocks, and 41 meters were fixed during the year.

A Statement showing the rainfall and water level of the Red Hills lake is given in Appendix II, Table No. 47. The quantity of water supplied during the year was 1,28,17,82 394 cubic feet as against 1,38,41,63,721 cubic feet last year. The amount spent in maintaining the lake, filter beds conduits, Kilpauk shaft, fountains, payment for Red Hills water including establishment came to Rs. 2,78,456-13-0 as against Rs. 2,65,707-4-0 last year.

Expenditure Normal-Drainage.

31. Appendix I, Statement No. II A shows in detail the cost of the various works under the above head.

Drainage Pumping Stations.

The expenditure incurred on the maintenance of the Sewage Pumping Stations including establishment, labour etc. came to Rs. 1,99,825-4-9 as against Rs. 1,92,179-6-11 last year.

House Drainage.

The total No. of House Drainage connections done under 11 Account Deposit was 1135 while that done under "Advances Recoverable" was 10.

Administration.

32. The Number of notices issued under the various sections of the Act to prevent misuse of water, unauthorised constructions etc. was 4053 of which the number complied with was 3372.

Permits.

33. 3012 applications were received for construction or reconstruction of buildings and huts, of which 2534 were sanctioned, and the rest were either refused or undisposed of. The total amount collected as licence fees was Rs. 33,225-14-0.

Prosecutions.

34. The number of prosecutions launched was 19 of which 2 resulted in conviction realising a fine of Rs. 3. 9 cases were withdrawn and the rest pending.

Provisional and Final Orders.

The number of provisional and final orders issued was 1955 and 589 respectively;

Encroachments.

35. In pursuance of the Council's resolution that no encroachments in which the concerned parties protest against removal should be removed without the sanction of the S. C. all the cases of encroachments wherein the parties objected were placed before the S. C. and its decision acted upon.

The number of encroachments removed and the number of cases recommended for assignment were 96 and 696 respectively.

Educational Department

36. *General Progress.*—As in the two previous years the Corporation continued during 1934-35 the policy of confining its attention mainly to the maintenance of the existing schools in an efficient condition. However, standards higher than the 5th were newly opened in the five Corporation Schools, shown below.

1. Corporation Boys' School, Strahans Road—Standard VIII.
2. Corporation Girls' School, Vedavinayagar Road—Standard VI.
3. Corporation Girl's School Bazaar Road—Standard VI.
4. Corporation Muslim Boys' School, Chepauk—Standard VIII.
5. Corporation Muslim Girls' School—Thiruvateeswaranpet, Standard VI.

This was done in view of the very keen demand for the higher standards in these schools and of the desirability of maintaining a few higher elementary schools at suitable centres in different parts of the city. The only school opened newly during the year was the one at Ellispuram in the 24th Division. This mixed school was opened as a temporary measure with standards I and II. It was the original intention of the Corporation to treat it as an independent school. But since the District Educational Officer, Madras, who was consulted in the matter stated that, pending the scheme of consolidation and concentration of elementary schools in the city of Madras, it was not desirable to recommend the opening of a separate school, the school was treated, as suggested by him, as a branch to the Corporation Boys' School, Bangaru Naick Street.

According to the statement furnished by the Government Education Department, the total number of elementary schools in the city during the year under report was 384. Of these, 134 were Corporation schools, 20 were managed by the Government, 218 were aided schools, both mission and non-mission, 6 were unaided, and 6 were private and indigenous schools. In the previous year the corresponding figures were 388, 134, 21, 224, 9 and 0. The number of non-municipal schools fell from 254 during 1933-34 to 250 during the year under report. Although the number of Corporation free elementary schools remained the same in 1934-35 as in the previous year, the table below shows signs of steady increase in the

number of children reading in the Corporation schools, and the number of non-municipal schools in the city has gone down from 310 in 1930-31 to 250 in 1934-35, though the total strength of children attending them does not indicate a corresponding fall, especially since the year 1933-34, notwithstanding the Amending Act II of 1932 which permits the levy of fees in aided elementary schools.

It will be seen from the above table that the total number of children under instruction in Corporation Schools during the year increased by 918 in spite of the difficulties as to accommodation experienced in a good number of schools located in rented houses. As per the rough census of children of school going age taken by the Corporation school teachers, there were still in the earlier half of 1934-35, 15,066 children of such age without instruction. For reasons already stated in the report for the previous year, only persuasive methods were adopted to bring to school children of school age. The Council at its meeting held on 23-10-1934 passed the following resolution:—

"That an Attendance Officer on a scale of Rs. 80-5-100 plus Rs. 5 cycle allowance be recruited from the ranks of Headmasters of Corporation Boys' Schools." The Government were addressed accordingly in the matter, but in their G. O. No. Ms. 596 Law (Education) dated 26-3-1935 the Government have stated that they have no objection to the above appointment, provided the Corporation is willing to abolish one of the posts of Supervisors of elementary schools, and the new appointment is created in its stead. The appointment of an Attendance Officer cannot, therefore, be made unless it is decided to abolish one of the posts of Supervisors. But, if at least the present level of efficiency in supervision is to be maintained, it is not desirable to reduce the present strength of Supervisors. It may be further noted in this connection that for a satisfactory discharge of the several duties of the Attendance Officer, he must be given the necessary staff of clerks. In regard to this appointment, there are yet two other problems which confront us, firstly, the problem of providing adequate accommodation for all children who may be compelled to attend school, and secondly, that of finding funds for the additional staff of teachers to cope with the consequential increase which must be anticipated in the number of children in the schools. In such circumstances, the demand for increased expenditure will become more imminent and insistent. Therefore, until the condition of the Elementary Education Fund becomes appreciably stronger, it will not be desirable to take any new steps involving heavy extra expenditure.

Elementary Education:—As shown already, the total number of Corporation Schools has remained the same since 31-3-34 i. e. as 134. The total number of children on rolls in all the Corporation Elementary Schools rose from 33,245 (20,313 boys and 12,932 girls) in 1933-34 to 34,163 (20,914

boys and 13,249 girls) i. e. by 2.8%. The number of boys and girls belonging to the Adi-Dravida and the Adi-Andhra communities rose from 5,107 (3,577 boys and 1,530 girls) on 31-3-34 to 5,174 (3,708 boys and 1,466 girls) on 31-3-35, i. e. by 1.3%. In the case of Muslim children in Corporation Schools the strength in 1934-35 was 5,072 (2,648 boys and 2,424 girls) as against 4,607 (2,506 boys and 2,101 girls) in 1933-34, the percentage of rise being 10% as against the 4.2 per cent fall noticed in the previous year.

Recognition:—The following five schools remained unrecognised by the District Educational Council at the end of the year:—

1. Corporation Boys' School, Ibrahim Sahib Street.
2. Corporation Boys' School, Mount Road.
3. Corporation Girls' School, Kondithope.
4. Corporation Girls' School, Madavaram High Road
5. Corporation Girls' School, Peters Road.

Necessary steps have been taken to remedy the defects pointed out by the District Educational Council, and the early grant of recognition for them is expected in the case of all the above items except (2). Improvements were first effected to the rented building in which the Corporation Boys' School Mount Road was located with a view to meet the criticism of the District Educational Council. But recognition was again refused, and further improvements were demanded. Pressure has been put upon the landlady to carry out the improvements and this work is nearing completion. It is hoped that the District Educational Council will accord its recognition ere long to this school also.

Staff:—On 31-3-35 there were 134 Head-teachers, 943 assistants for secular instruction, 31 assistants for religious instruction, 15 music mistresses, 1 drill and 1 drawing master for Muslim Schools only, and 45 instructors for teaching crafts. All the Head-teachers except one and all the assistant teachers except 7 are fully qualified. Of the 8 exceptions, two have been exempted by the Government; two have undergone training though they have not passed the written test. Of these, one who is not too old has been instructed to re-appear and pass her written test examination and the other is too old to do so. The remaining four are Guzarathi teachers for whom no facilities for training exist anywhere in this Presidency.

The strength of the inspecting staff remained the same as in the previous year. Their work was mainly instructional in character, and was done according to previously approved programmes. The syllabuses for the various subjects were suitably revised.

The Teachers' Association which was started towards the close of the year 1933-34 with the object of quickening the teachers' intellectual and moral progress and improving their professional attainments worked during the year in four groups including the one for non-muslim women teachers. All the teachers are members of the Association, and their attendance at their respective centres is compulsory. A library is attached to each of the five centres, four for male teachers, and one for women teachers. At the meetings of the Association, several educationists delivered lectures on matters educational. Efforts are being made to start a similar branch of the Association for the muslim lady teachers early in 1935-36. Teachers have represented that the grant of a whole holiday on those Saturdays and Sundays when the Association holds its monthly meetings will greatly facilitate their attendance, and the matter has been recommended for the favourable orders of Government.

Adult Education:—The Corporation has been encouraging adult education by permitting private associations to hold night schools in many of the Corporation School buildings. In 1934-35, 38 night schools were thus

working in Corporation buildings. And permission was also accorded to several teachers in Corporation schools to be on the staff of bonafide night schools.

37. *Midday Meals*: The supply of midday meals to poor children attending the Corporation Schools was extended to 82 schools as against 80 last year, and the number of children fed daily was increased from 4,200 to 4,500 from 7-8-1934. The total cost of providing this free midday meal during the year amounted to Rs. 34,378-14-1 as against Rs. 30,314-13-3 in the previous year.

38. *Attendance Committees*: Attendance Committees were constituted in October 1933 for all the divisions in the city, except division 26 for which a Committee was formed in February 1934. Divisions 16, 21 and 29 being extensive in area had two Attendance Committees each. The Corporation is indebted to the Committees for such assistance as they were able to render in its efforts to combat illiteracy.

39. *Physical Education*:—The following playgrounds were maintained from the Elementary Education Fund:—

The Playgrounds at Peoples' Park and Robinson Park were as usual maintained from the General Funds. During the year under report one new playground in the 16th Division attached to the Salem Vijayaraghavachari Park was got ready for public use, the expenditure being met from the General Funds. Further improvements will be made to it in due course. Thus, in all, ten playgrounds were maintained by the Corporation during the year. School children availed themselves of the facilities afforded by these playgrounds.

40. *Reading Rooms*:—Nine Free Reading Rooms, were maintained by the Corporation at the following places for the free use of the public:—

41. The Reading Room which was constructed and got ready for use at the junction of Spur Tank Road and Harrington Road could not be opened during the year, but it was opened in April 1935. In addition to the above, the Corporation subsidised 43 Reading Rooms run by private agencies in the City.

Medical Inspection:—A detailed report on the medical inspection of Corporation Schools will be found in the Annual Report of the Health Officer for the year 1934.

Radio:—A radio was installed in each of the following schools:—

As usual, stories and music were broadcast from the studio at the Ripon Buildings by the music mistresses and one of the supervisors. The Educational Officer also spoke to the children on certain days.

42. *Finance, Capital Account*:—The year opened with a balance of Rs. 38,965-0-2 as against the balance of Rs. 56,596-14-4 in the previous year, and the balance left at the end of the year was Rs. 43,251-5-11 including the sum of Rs. 14,000 being the third and final instalment repaid from the "Ordinary" to "Capital Account. Proposals for the utilisation of this amount have already been sanctioned by the Council, and some of them are being carried out. As already stated in the report for the previous year, a loan Rs. 2,00,000 from the Government had been applied for. But this was not actually granted for want of detailed plans and estimates duly sanctioned by the Council, which did not find it possible, in view of its budgetary position, to avail itself of the loan during the year. There were 53 schools in Corporation buildings, 5 schools in four Government buildings, and 76 schools in 75 rented ones.

Revenue Account:—The balance at the beginning of the year was Rs. 58,164-0-11 against Rs. 73,922-8-6 of the last year. A sum of Rs. 2,85,683-12-0 was realised by the levy of education tax at 1½ per cent, and a sum of Rs. 2,69,742-9-0 was received from Government as equivalent contribution under Section 37 of the Elementary Education Act in respect of the education tax realised during 1933-34, and a sum of Rs. 30,450 as grant under the proviso to Section 37 of the Act. Statements (1) and (3) of Appendix III show the financial position of the Elementary Education Fund and the expenditure on education during the year.

Educational Camp:—The Camp was held for 3 days in December 1934 at Red Hills, under the auspices of the Madras Corporation Teachers' Association. For the first time a sum of Rs. 100 was contributed by the Corporation towards the expenses of the Camp. The Camp was opened by the Hon'ble Dewan Bahadur S. Kumarasami Reddiar, Minister for Education, and was largely attended by the Corporation School teachers. A noteworthy feature of the Camp was that for the first time some women teachers also attended it, special arrangements having been made for their convenience. There was a crowded programme on all the 3 days of the Camp. Distinguished persons, educationists and others, delivered lectures and led discussions on important themes of considerable educational value.

Excursions:—Statement No. 7, Appendix III of the Report indicates the places to which the Corporation School children were taken on excursion during the year.

Boy Scouts:—The number of Scout units in the Corporation Schools during the year was 75 as against 72 in the previous year. Of them, 71 were registered, including one Rover Crew and the remaining 4 units are await-

ing registration. The total strength of Scouters, Rovers, Scouts and Cubs was 1,371, as against 1,200 in the previous year.

During the year under report a Sea Rover Crew was organised under the auspices of the Madras Corporation Boy Scouts Local Association. All the Sea Rovers are ex-pupils of the Corporation Boy's School, Nochikuppam. Another new feature of the Boy Scout Movement in the Corporation is the inauguration of an Employment Bureau for the benefit of Scouts, for which they are indebted to Mr. Allan C. McKay. Through this Bureau one of the Corporation Scouts was able to secure employment in the General Electric Company. Once a month pow-vows preceded by model group demonstrations were held at different centres to raise the efficiency of the groups. The Annual Boys' Camp was held at the Besant Scout Camping Centre, Adyar, in March 1935. Over 200 campers attended.

Girl Guides:—The strength of the Girl Guides (30 Blue Bird Flocks with a strength of about 350 Blue Birds) remained the same as in the previous year. But for the first time a Girl Guide Company consisting of 30 Girl Guides was started in the Corporation Schools. About 30 Girl-Guides were taken on a whole-day excursion to Mahabalipuram. Owing to the reduction of Rs. 1,000 effected in the allotment for "Scouting and Guiding" for the year 1934-35, in order to balance the budget, the activities of this section had to be curtailed during the year.

43. *The Corporation High School, Nungambakkam:*—During the year under report two additional sections were opened in Forms II and V. Consequently, one secondary grade teacher had to be appointed. There were 20 members on the staff of whom 8 were L. Ts.

Provision of additional accommodation:—Increased accommodation was provided by constructing two sheds with asbestos roof and cement flooring at a cost of Rs. 2,300. Besides this, to meet the increasing demand, there was also additional supply of furniture, science articles and library books.

Strength:—The strength of the school on 31-3-35 was 455, as against 338 in the previous year. This includes 24 girls, 72 Adi-Dravidas, 1 Muhammadan and 222 non-Brahmin Hindus. Under rule 92 M. E. R., 182 pupils belonging to backward classes were granted fee concessions. The fee income so foregone by the Corporation and not made good by the Government was Rs. 2,980-6-0. Two children of ex-army men were granted full fee remission, and the fee income foregone was Rs. 52-8-0. In addition to this, the District Educational Officer, Madras, granted scholarships to 10 pupils amounting to Rs. 378. Similarly, the Inspectress of Girls' schools, Madras, granted scholarships to 3 girls to the extent of Rs. 81, and the Commissioner of Labour, Madras, to 9 pupils, the sum spent amounting to Rs. 489.

The total fee receipts from the pupils for 1934-35 was Rs. 133,21-8-0, and the expenditure, on staff, accommodation, furniture, science apparatus etc., was Rs. 18,508-13-2.

Out of the 36 pupils who appeared for the S.S.L.C. Examination 23 came out successful, i.e. 63.9 per cent. The District Educational Officer, Madras, who inspected the School in March 1935 has recorded that "the School work on the whole is very satisfactory, and the staff more than usually keen on their work."

The needs of the institution continue to be (1) the completion of the building scheme for the school and (2) the securing of a playground. Steps have been taken to secure the necessary land required for both the purposes.

Sanitation and Medical Services. HOSPITALS AND DISPENSARIES.

44. *Raja Sir Ramaswamy Mudaliar's Lying-in-hospital:*—The amount spent on the institution was Rs. 32,546-14-7 as against Rs. 31,755-8-9 in the previous year and as against Rs. 35,490 in the Budget. The number of in-patients treated was 3796 and that of out-patients 14796 against 3691 and 13815 respectively in the previous year. Statements showing the Medical and Non-Medical Institutions to which contributions were paid during the year under report appear in Appendix IV Table Nos. 11 & 12.

ELECTRICAL DEPARTMENT.

Street Electric Lighting.

45. The total number of street electric lights on 31-3-35 in the city was 11037 as against 10946 on the same date the year previous to the one under review. The lights consist of 6109-30 watts (about 25 candle power each), 3389-60 watt demi watt (nearly 100 candle power each), 625-100 watt demi watt (nearly 200 candle power each), 1051-200 watt demi watt (nearly 400 candle power each) 1-400 watt discharge lamp (about 1500 candle power), and 132-500 watt demi watt (nearly 1000 candle power each).

744 lamps were fixed and 383 lamps were removed leaving a balance of 361 lamps as additions during the year. The Statement showing the lamps fixed and removed during the year in each division is as per Appendix IV. Table No. 1. The reasons for removing the above 383 lamps are as follows:—

13. 2-500 } watt lamps on the Arc lamp post consequent upon fixing 3
2-30 } flood lights at the junction of Harris Road, Marshalls and Pantheon Rd.
14. 1-500 watt lamp on flood light consequent upon fixing an electric post with 200 watt lamp in South Mada Street, Triplicane.

Total 383

8.14 Miles of L.T. cables were laid during the year. The total length of mains laid by the Corporation for street lighting purposes is 325.25 miles, of which 6.12 miles are three phase H. T. underground cables, 298.47 miles L.T. underground cables and 20.66 miles overhead lines. The statement showing the length of cables laid, the number of lights installed and removed in each year from the commencement is shown in Appendix IV. Table No. 2.

The graph facing this page shows the progress of oil and electric lights in the city of Madras. As the number of electric lights increased, oil lights were discontinued.

Mambalam area lighting:—The Street electric lighting scheme for the Eastern Section of Mambalam is now in progress. 486 lights have been installed so far. Additional lights are being installed as and when the roads are formed.

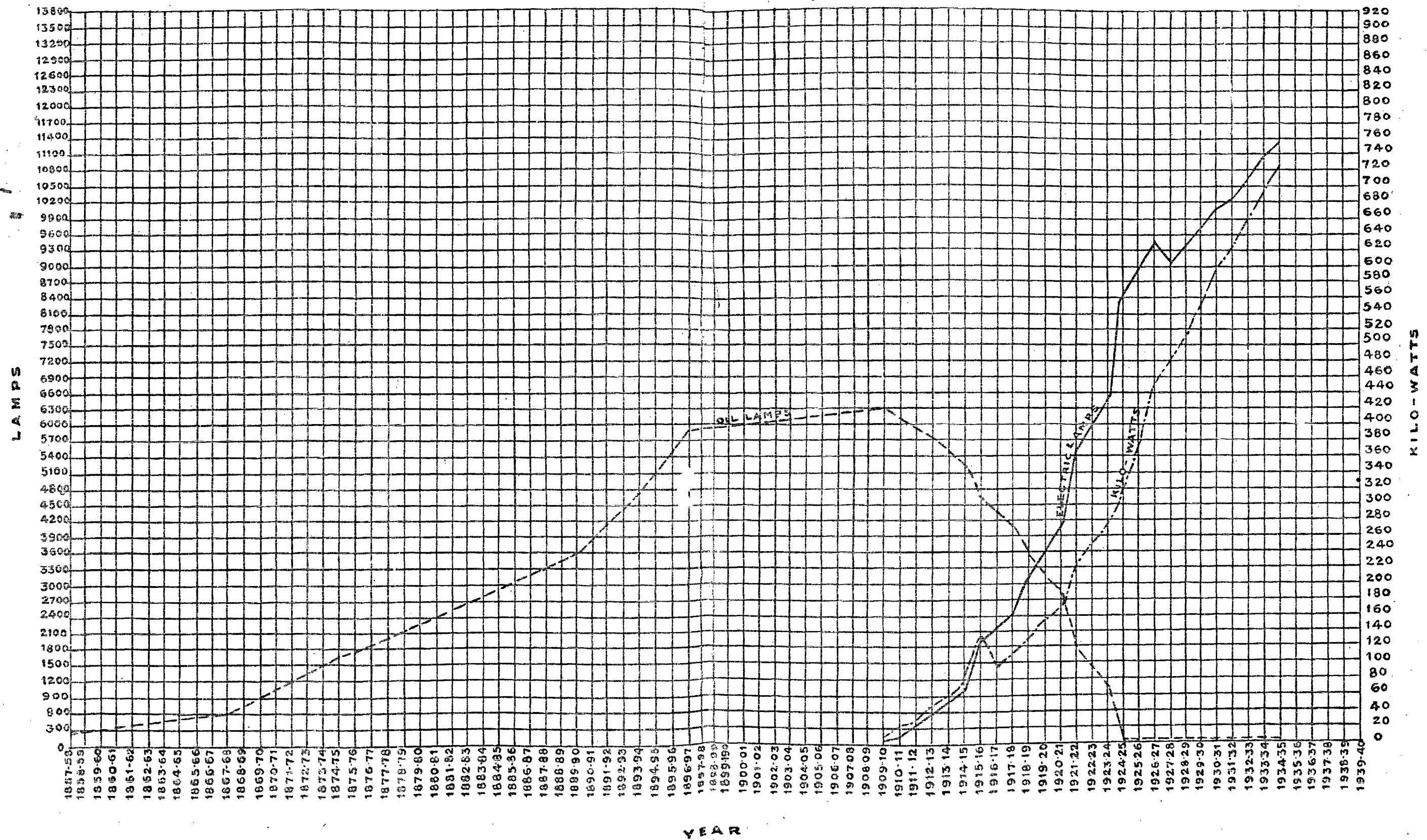
The Street lighting scheme for the western Section of Mambalam at an estimated cost of Rs. 1.5 lakhs has been sanctioned by the Council and approved by the Government. The Scheme will be taken up when the loan applied to the Government is sanctioned. There are at present 61 bracket lights on the Madras Electric Supply Corporation overhead posts and 1 electric lamp post in this area. Besides, there are 32 incandescent oil lamps.

Improvements to Street electric lighting.

The street electric lighting scheme for municipalising the distributory system throughout the city, at an estimated cost of Rs. 12.75 lakhs, is taken on hand during the year under review. When it was announced in the newspapers in March 1934, that a sum of Rs. 5.75 lakhs was provided in the Civil Budget Estimate for 1934-35 towards the first instalment of loan for the said scheme, action was immediately taken to prepare specifications for High Tension cables and Substations' equipment. The communication from the Government about the above provision was received on 4-5-34. Immediately, action was taken to get the tender forms and specifications printed. Tenders for the High Tension cables were invited by advertisements on 16-7-34 and for Substations' equipment on 31-8-34. The Council, at its meeting held on 29-1-35, sanctioned placing an order with the Eastern Electric Light and Power Co. Ltd., Bombay for the supply of 3½ miles of 37/083, 5¼ miles of 19/083, 14 miles of 19/064 and 1 mile of 7/064, High Tension cables at the rates quoted by the Co., in sterling amounting to £ 7853-15-0.1/16. As regards Substations' equipment, the Council, at its meeting held on 3-5-35, sanctioned placing the order with Burn & Co., Calcutta, for High Tension switch gear, with Johnson & Philips Calcutta for Transformers, with Crompton Engineering Co., Madras, for Low Tension switch gear.

Ornamental lights in front of temples, churches and mosques:—The Council at its meeting held on 16-10-34, sanctioned, out of the divisional allotment, 5 pairs or 10 single lights in each division, in addition to the 5 pairs already sanctioned for each division.

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The number of lights installed during the year is 152. The total number of ornamental lights installed up to 1-4-35 is 362. The details are shown in Appendix IV Table No. 3.

Installing lights in the new streets and hutting grounds taken over by the Corporation:—73. lights were installed during the year in the streets taken over by the Corporation as per Appendix IV. Table No. 4. The Council sanctioned a sum of Rs. 20,000/- to provide lights for the streets already taken over from time to time and to apply to the Government for loan.

Traffic control points:—Electric lights on two Traffic Control cement stands (umbrella type) were installed, one at the junction of Mount Road and St. George Cathedral Road and the other at the junction of General Hospital Road and Fort Overbridge.

Electric clocks on street electric lighting posts:—4. electric clocks (2 face) were installed during the year at the places mentioned in Appendix IV Table No. 5.

Roadside Parks:—One ornamental light was installed in D'Monte Road Park, 30th Division and 16 ornamental lights were installed round the pond in People's Park.

Suspension lights:—One additional suspension light was installed at the junction of Mowbrays Road and Lloyds Road.

Advertisement contract:—The contract with Mr. Kalappan for fixing advertisement boards on street electric lamp posts on payment of Rs. 4,000 per annum was in force during the year under review.

Electrocution of dogs:—The electrocuting apparatus is working satisfactorily.

Harbour tenements:—Lights were installed for the 44 Harbour tenements constructed in the 5th division.

General Workshop:—During the year under review, the electrification of the General Workshop was taken on hand and completed. The cost of working the General Workshop with electric motors is found cheaper than the cost of working with steam engines.

Schedule of streets:—The schedule of streets for 60 watt, 100 watt, 200 watt and 500 watt lamps are shown in Appendix IV, Tables No. 6 to 9 respectively.

Broadcasting Service.

46. The Madras Corporation Broadcasting Service, was started on the 1st April 1930. Its usefulness has been evidenced by the large numbers of people that gather round the Loud Speaking centres in the city.

The service is intended only for the City of Madras as a civic amenity to the rate-payers. In addition to transmitting musical programmes in the evenings, the Corporation broadcasts for the benefit of school children from 4 to 4-30 p.m. on school days, special lessons in music and also interesting stories connected with religion, history and education.

Radio Loud Speaking equipments are in operation in the evenings at the following places:—

These sets are put into operation only from 4 to 4-30 p.m. during school days. Similar Radio sets will be installed in the other Corporation Schools as and when funds permit.

Radio sets of indoor type are also installed at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Tondiarpet and in Sir Theagaraya Park, Old Washermanpet.

From the 1st April 1934, musical programmes by professional artistes were broadcast on all days except Mondays, when gramophone music was broadcast. If a Monday happened to be a holiday, a professional musician of repute was engaged for the occasion. European Gramophone Music was broadcast on one Monday each month from 5-30 p. m. to 7 p. m. a license having been obtained from Messrs. Vernon & Co., Madras, agents for the Performing Right Society Ltd., London. From the 1st December 1934, non-professional artistes of repute were engaged on all available Mondays.

During the year under report, several Vidwans of repute gave their performances.

The School programmes consisted of (1) Lessons in Music (2) Interesting stories with morals behind them and (3) Stories from Sacred Books. These programmes were arranged by the Educational Officer, Corporation of Madras.

During the year under review, talks on Social, Educational and Health subjects were continued to be broadcast.

The rate for advertisements on the Radio is Rs. 3 per minute or part of a minute. There is no special concession for weekly or long term engagements. The charges, in cash, are payable in advance at the office of the Electrical Engineer, Corporation of Madras. During the year, several businessmen, Music Sabhas, Dramatic Companies and the Publicity Department of the M. & S. M. Railway Co. made use of the Broadcasting Service for advertisements. This method of advertising by Radio is becoming increasingly popular. A sum of Rs. 1,344—was collected and one third of the amount was remitted to the Government.

The reports sent by the Police Department about missing persons and foundlings were broadcast at the end of each day's programme.

During the year under report 103 ladies and 410 gentlemen took part in the broadcast programmes. The total period of transmission was 838

hours and 51 minutes, of which a period of 90 hours and 45 minutes was devoted to School programmes, 7 hours and 28 minutes to advertisements and 10 hours and 18 minutes to important news. A further period of 4 hours and 40 minutes was devoted to experimental transmissions—2274 songs in 182 ragams, 142 varnams in 30 ragams, 99 javalis in 16 ragams, 71 padams in 25 ragams and 260 songs in 18 miscellaneous tunes, 68 pallavies in 14 ragams and 10 thanams in 7 ragams were sung during the year.

The Council at its meeting held on the 14th August 1934 resolved that in order to assist the Broadcasting Service Committee in the selection of musicians, an Expert out of a Panel of not more than six distinguished musicians in the city to be selected by the committee, be invited to sit with the Committee during the rehearsals. In accordance with this resolution, the Broadcasting Service Committee at its meeting held on the 10th September 1934 selected a panel of six Expert Musicians.

Avenues.

47. The total number of avenue trees at the end of the year was 12,636 of which 945 were fruit bearing ones. 61 ordinary trees were planted and 210 trees were removed of which 19 were fruit bearing.

The expenditure incurred under this head was Rs. 7623.

Public Amenities.—Parks.

48. New Parks were laid out in the following places.

The area around the tank in the Peoples Park was converted into a lawn interspersed with flower beds. Similar improvements will be gradually effected to certain other areas inside the Park. There is need for an increased supply of water owing to the growth in the area to be watered and pumps are therefore being fixed to the existing wells in the Peoples Park to meet this need.

The 16th Annual Flower show was held on 23rd February 1935 at My Lady's Garden, Peoples Park, and was opened by H. E. the Governor of Madras and Lady Marjorie Erskine and was kept open for 8 days, one day being reserved for ladies.

The show was a success: it attracted thousands of visitors. A Directory of the Flower show was kindly printed by Mr. Genesan, Swathantharasangu Press Triplicane, for free distribution to visitors.

The Indian School of Medicine co-operated with the Corporation by fitting up a section of Indian medicinal plants and herbs.

Zoological Gardens

49. The Corporation Zoological Gardens situated in the Peoples Park are in charge of a Zoology Graduate who is the Superintendent. He is assisted by a staff of sergeants and animal keepers. The Professor of Zoology of the Presidency College continued to be the Honorary Visitor to the Zoo during 1934.

The Gardens require extensions and improvements. Owing to financial stringency they have not been taken up.

The expenditure incurred on the maintenance of the Fire Engines including establishment etc. came to Rs. 24,518-1-0 as against Rs. 22,419-3-5 last year.

Supervision and Management.

51. The expenditure under this head amounted to Rs. 5,49,041-12-2 which is 9.1 per cent of total receipts of the year. The portion of this sum spent on Establishment for the purpose of Assessment and collection, amounted to Rs. 2,85,870-12-4 or 4.7 per cent of the total receipts.

Repayment of Debt.

52. The total investment at the beginning of the year on account of sinking funds relating to the several loans of the Corporation exclusive of the Government loans repayable in instalments stood at Rs. 52,53,900 in Government securities and Madras Municipal debentures with a cash balance of Rs. 1,98,203-6-5. During the year under report, an allotment of Rs. 1,30,030 was made to the sinking fund from General Revenues and a sum of Rs. 2,36,918-15-1 was realised as interest on prior investment of the fund. The total cash receipts of the year amount to Rs. 5,65,152-5-6. With this sum, Government securities and Municipal debentures of the face value of Rs. 4,91,200 were purchased at a cost of Rs. 5,10,534-6-10 and Government securities to the face value of Rs. 13,100 were realised by way of conversion of 4 per cent securities of the face value of Rs. 8,64,400 to 3½ per cent securities of the face value of Rs. 8,77,500. The investment at the close of the year at the credit of the fund aggregated to Rs. 57,58,200 in Government Securities and Madras Municipal Debentures with a cash balance of Rs. 54,617-14-8.

Payments amounting to Rs. 6,22,548 were also made during the year towards Government Loan of 34 lakhs out of which Rs. 2,85,810 was appropriated by the Accountant-General towards the repayment of loans and Rs. 3,36,738 towards interest. A further sum of Rs. 14,854, representing the unspent balance of loan was refunded to Government during the year as per G. O. 5475 L & M. 20-12-34. The total amount of loans outstanding at the close of the year was Rs. 170,04,270 and the annual charges for their repayment with interest amount to 12.79 lakhs against the maximum of 27.5 lakhs to which the borrowing power of the Corporation is limited under Section 144 of the Madras City Municipal Act of 1919.

Other Remunerative Enterprises-Workshop.

53. The total value of the works turned out in workshop during the year was Rs. 1,59,105-1-0 as against Rs. 1,62,117-9-8 last year and the

amount earned in the shape of Supervision charges was Rs. 25,385-3-9 as against Rs. 25,897-10-0 in the previous year.

The cost of establishment came to Rs. 15,271-13-8 while it was 16,114-8-0 last year. The expenditure on account of contingent charges such as maintenance of engines, motors, etc, leave allowance to workmen, etc, amounted to Rs. 15,763-0-9 or 10-09% on the value of works turned out. Interest on capital outlay was Rs. 2,885-3-8.

The total receipts fell short of expenditure by Rs. 8534-14-2.

GENERAL STORES

54. Mr. S. Voyvodech held the office of the Officer in charge of stores and stock verifier during the year under report.

As pointed out in the last administration report, the stores was working under the restricted function consequent on the reduction of staff by the Retrenchment Committee. During the year under report, the old system was again introduced and all supplies except in a few cases were centralised at the General Stores as the system of direct supply was found to be defective. But the staff as reduced by the said committee attends to the needs of the workshops and continues to work the full scheme with some amount of strain working from 7 a.m. to 4-30 p.m. (with a recess of two hours from 11-30 a.m. to 1-30 p.m.). The question of restoring the old staff therefore requires consideration.

During this year, Mr. W. W. Ladden, the then Mayor, took up the onerous task of reorganising the workshop and side by side the General Stores also. The following three changes were effected by him in its administration.

1. The working hours were changed from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. [with a recess of an hour from 12 noon to 1 p.m.] to 7 a.m. to 4-30 p.m. [with a recess of two hours from 11-30 a.m. to 1-30 p.m.]

2. Forwarding notes given to workshop at the time of issue of materials and sent along with every material so issued to enable the Gate-Sergeant to check them and pass out, were abolished and issue sheets substituted in their place. These sheets are sent to the Foreman concerned every evening for checking the materials issued in the forenoon.

3. The Stores Officer supervises the workshop (not technically) as well, in addition to his own duties.

The above changes were given effect to from 1-8-34 pending sanction of the Council.

In the case of building, the northern wing of the Stores shed, has been extended and connected to the workshop by means of a doorway.

Purchase :—Purchases of articles were, as usual, made by means of tenders invited at the beginning of the year. The total value of materials purchased under the Hardware Schedule contract amounted to Rs. 1,13,826-5-7 as against Rs. 72,035-3-6 in 1933-34. The total value of articles issued from the General Stores during the year was Rs. 1,29,177-12-3.

Non-Scheduled Articles :—Articles of the kind or description which did not find place in any of the schedules were purchased generally from the contractors who registered their names as Non-scheduled contractors on payment of Rs. 5 each. The total value of articles purchased an Non-

scheduled amounted to Rs. 15,248-1-9 as against Rs. 3,353-0-2 in 1933-34. The amount collected under this head by way of registration fee is Rs. 60.

Auction :—The dead and surplus stock of materials accumulated during previous years, amounting to Rs. 21,173-11-4 was disposed of by auction as per Council's resolution No. 418 dated 30-10-34 and fetched Rs. 3,572-1-6.

Accounts & Audit :—Purchase of articles for the General Stores was made under the advance of One Lakh of Rupees sanctioned by the Council.

There has been considerable reduction in audit objections on account of prompt checking of transactions during the year.

Verification of stock :—Verification of stock in the Stores was made by the Officer in charge of stores quarterly, apart from the annual verification conducted by the Special Officers deputed by the Commissioner. The excess stock of the value of Rs. 249-4-9 was brought into account and the shortage in stock of the value of Rs. 48-2-0 has been recommended to the Standing Committee for being written off.

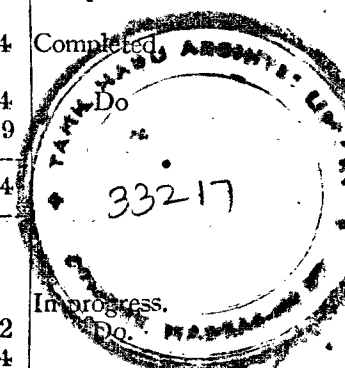
